Release 2.x to Endure

Lotus Will Continue to Enhance Most Popular PC Program

Contrary to the widespread expectation that 1-2-3 release 3.0 will replace the current release 2.01, Lotus Development Corporation has settled on a two-pronged strategy for keeping 1-2-3 the most popular PC package on the market. Although Lotus refuses to give details, it is expected to introduce an upgrade to release 2.01 this spring, probably before a June debut of release 3.0. "Release 3.0 will be our flagship product for those within work groups needing powerful consolidation," says a Lotus spokesperson. She acknowledges, however, that "there is a segment that needs a product like release 2.x." Recent statements made by Frank Ingari, general manager of Lotus's spreadsheet divi-

sion, imply that the 2.x line will be aimed at users with PCs, XTs, and low-end ATs who create only moderate-size worksheets and don't need 3.0's enhanced graphics and ability to open, link, and consolidate multiple worksheets. Many other 3.0 features are already available in release 2.01. In recent months, Lotus has given registered users utilities to remove copy protection, record macros, perform minimal recalcs, and drive PostScript printers and VGA displays. Additionally, Lotus has instituted a dealer promotion offering Funk Software's Allways graphic/font enhancement with new sales of release 2.x. All 2.01 enhancements are logical candidates for inclusion in any new 1-2-3 release.

HyperCard-Like Package Comes to the PC

Low-Cost Tool Makes Programmers of the Rest of Us

Brightbill-Roberts in Syracuse, New York, introduced an IBM-compatible equivalent of Apple Computer's HyperCard in late February. A \$99 program comparable to that shipped with every Macintosh since August 1987, HyperPad lets users create hypertext data bases, or pads. These are composed of "stacks" of forms whose fields can be linked with similar or dissimilar fields among the same or different pads. For instance, a name field can be linked by a "button" to any of the fields in a series of invoices, thus revealing a history of customer purchases. Hypertext proponents suggest that this nonrelational linking more closely mirrors the way humans think than do other data base schemes. HyperPad is intended for nonprogrammers who want data bases customized to their way of working or for creating training applications in which users can wander from topic to topic at will. HyperPad's object-oriented form painter can be used to cut and paste a screen's worth of fields. That code is written automatically but can be modified for reuse with an English-like scripting editor. HuperPad has lower memory and processor requirements than either HyperCard or upcoming Windows-based competitors, maintains principal Steve Brightbill, because its user interface employs character-based rather than bit-mapped graphics. "You can have hundreds of forms in memory at any time, whereas you can have only a couple of cards in memory on a Mac," he maintains.

Translator Developed

Micrografx Introduces Graphics File "Rosetta Stone"

Any day now, Micrografx will introduce a graphics utility to convert graphics files back and forth between various object-oriented and bit-mapped formats. Micrografx president George Grayson describes the product, code-named Passport, as "a kind of graphics Rosetta stone" similar in operation to several utilities that translate word processing file formats. Initially, Passport will transfer between CGM, Macintosh Pict1 and Pict2, AutoCAD .DXF, and Micrografx's own .DRW formats. Within six months, the Richardson, Texas, firm hopes to add the GEM Draw format from Digital Research and Adobe's PostScript EPS format. "We are going slow because we want to offer as true a translation as possible," says Grayson. "We support CGM the way that Harvard Graphics does

and the way that Freelance does and the way that the ANSII committee specifies." Grayson expects Passport to retail for \$295 to \$395. The utility also will be offered in version 2.0 of Micrografx's Designer, due to ship in March. That version will read object-oriented code and write bit-mapped color TIFF images—a capability scheduled for a future Passport. Eventually, Micrografx hopes to propose a wider-reaching graphics interchange/editing specification to the Windows Presentation Manager Association. Users of Windows and Presentation Manager applications that included the Integrated Document Environment Architecture specification then could "click on" a graphic, and the appropriate graphics editor would pop up.

HP Is Back

Mini Maker Resurrects Its Retail PC Business Although Hewlett-Packard is one of the world's largest computer companies, its name has not exactly struck fear into the hearts of other PC makers. But during the past year, HP has begun to leverage the success of its market-leading LaserJet, ThinkJet, and plotter lines to help PC sales. This struggle began in 1985 when HP began to put together a complete line of Vectra desktops and laptops and convince more of the 2500 dealers who carry its peripherals to take on Vectras. During the past year, HP has more than doubled its number of authorized PC dealers—to 650—and tripled revenues from PCs sold through them. With direct

and system manufacturer sales, HP's overall PC revenues grew 45 percent in 1988, while its unit sales more than doubled. "If you add up the dollars from sales of both our PCs and peripherals through U.S. dealers, we are the number three supplier behind IBM and Apple," asserts Bob Puett, general manager of HP's PC Group. His group claims 5 percent of the worldwide PC business and sets new sales records every month. HP plans to continue to shift its focus away from its mini client base and toward retail. At the end of January, HP announced new 20-MHz and 25-MHz cached 80386 systems and an 80286-based laptop.

OS/2 WordPerfect Ships

Word Processor Advances
Toward
Presentation
Manager

The first OS/2 version of a market-leading, major application will appear this month, as WordPerfect Corporation delivers *WordPerfect 5.0 for OS/2 1.0*. Product Manager Chuck Middleton describes the word processing package as an "intermediate step" toward a Presentation Manager version, due out by year-end. *WordPerfect 5.0 for OS/2 1.0* costs \$549, compared with \$495 for the DOS version; its main advantage is the ability to open more than two document files simultaneously. The company plans to let users upgrade to the PM version for about the price difference between DOS and OS/2 1.0 versions, reports Middleton. The PM release will

abandon the familiar function-key-controlled design in favor of a graphic user interface much like Word-Perfect for the Macintosh. While the new release will generally have the same functionality as the DOS program, an edit mode will reveal documents just as they will be printed, complete with font styles, graphs, and special treatments such as underlines. Also added will be support for a mouse and Dynamic Document Exchange, so that a data base table or spreadsheet range brought into a document will maintain its "live" links with the file from which it was imported.


DeskMate Gains First Publisher

Software
Publishing
Introduces
First Business

Interface

Software Publishing's First Publisher 2.0 has become the first major business product to ship under Tandy Corporation's DeskMate, approximately eight months after Tandy announced plans to license the user interface/desktop utility. First Publisher product manager Jill Groginsky attributes the long lead time to the difficulty of creating a memory management scheme so that both the character-based graphic user shell and the 430K application can fit within 640K. Symantec also has signed on to the specification but doesn't expect to deliver before June. Except for the addition of VGA color support, DeskMate compatibility is the principal enhancement in this version of First Pub-

lisher, which has sold an estimated 200,000 copies since its 1987 introduction. Groginsky says the development will be worth the trouble if it lets the Mountain View, California, company reach the estimated 300,000 Tandy computer customers who use DeskMate regularly (out of 1 million who own it). The program also is showcased in Tandy's 1 million product catalogs and on the shelves of its 600 Computer and Computer Plus stores, and can be ordered through the remaining 6400 or so Radio Shacks. Groginsky expects the first order from Tandy to cover development costs. If First Publisher is successful under DeskMate, other products such as Professional Write could follow.

MicroPro Refocuses

Pioneer Reorganizes, Gains New President, and Rethinks Product Line After three years of sluggish sales for its flagship, WordStar, and the largest operating loss in its history, MicroPro International has replaced President Leon Williams with Chief Operating Officer Gari Grimm, downsized the company, and redirected its marketing activities. Partly due to delay in releasing WordStar 5.0, MicroPro lost \$5.1 million on virtually flat revenues of \$42.3 million in fiscal 1988 and lost \$2.6 million on revenues of \$9.7 million in the first quarter ended November 30. In an effort to cut \$3 million in operating costs, Marc Bailey, executive vice president of sales and marketing, combined existing departments and cut staff by about one-fifth. But he more than doubled the number of direct salespeople to 30 and

launched channel promotions that gained the company 650 new dealers during the last quarter of 1988. (Only 15 percent of dealers had been selling WordStar.) Bailey has refocused marketing to emphasize what he calls "the genius of WordStar"—touch typists don't have to move their fingers off the "home keys" in order to navigate a file or use the most common editing functions. Rather than compete with WordPerfect and Microsoft Word on number of features, MicroPro will emphasize that WordStar offers users the most popular feature set running efficiently on the smallest platform. More than 3 million copies of WordStar have been sold, with 360,000 registered users. A mostly technical revision, WordStar 5.5, was released in February.

OS/2 Enhancements Coming

IBM, Microsoft Draw Blueprint for Operating System A rebuilt file system, an 80386 version, and a move into object-oriented programming are among OS/2 plans outlined recently by IBM and Microsoft executives. Although a release date has not been specified, the upgraded file system will offer faster access, greater usability (including longer file names and the ability to attach other attributes such as author name and revision date), and standardized hooks to a broader range of media (such as CD ROM). A tool kit is expected around midyear for the 80386 version, which will run existing OS/2 packages but will also add 32-bit linear addressing and the ability to run multiple DOS sessions. While OS/2 1.1's Presentation Manager provides a foundation for object-oriented programming, the system software eventually will be

extended to accommodate more complete objectoriented attributes à la Hewlett-Packard's New-Wave environment. Developers will be able to create libraries of reusable objects that combine data and code-boxes, scroll bars, or even applications such as data bases-and can be easily linked together or moved across different hardware platforms. Currently, OS/2 has attracted 200 developers, plus 55 system manufacturers, most of which expect to begin shipping their versions of OS/2 1.1 this month. OS/2 acceptance has been slowed by a dearth of applications, the need for hardware suppliers to create printer and screen drivers, and revelations that typical memory requirements will start at around 4MB, comments Compag vice president of sales and marketing Mike Swavely.

SPI Ships Miris

Integrated Software Developer Prefers Ease of Use to dBASE Standard Software Products International (SPI), maker of the *Open Access II* integrated package, has unveiled a relational data base development system that lets even novice users customize the reports of executable run-time applications. *Miris* ships as a \$795 developers' edition that produces economical code, claims Ron Stevenson, director of product applications. The software also includes a compiler and an unlimited run-time license so that commercial and in-house developers can distribute applications to users who lack a copy of the development system. A \$395 user tool kit, *Stations*, allows

users to customize *Miris* report formats or develop new reports simply by painting them on the screen. *Miris* also includes a word processor, a spreadsheet, and telecommunications and graphics modules. These, Stevenson says, are more capable than similar modules in *Open Access II*. The San Diego firm has sold about 100,000 copies of this high-end integrated package, most of them overseas. *Miris* will be marketed to corporate and commercial developers in the United States, although it will not read native *dBASE* files, and other applications can't read its SQL. ●





The Data in Everything

From word processors to file managers to E-mail to desktop utilities,

data base software is showing up in some strange places.

when you think data base software, you think dBASE—right? Think again. One of the most interesting software packages of 1989 is a data base, but it doesn't advertise itself as such. In fact, it doesn't even claim to be a full-blown application. Instead, Borland's SideKick for Presentation Manager is a great example of how data base concepts will add zip to the next generation's software (see Eric Knorr and Karl Koessel's Preview in this issue).

Borland built SideKick for PM around the novel idea that the user, not the application, owns the information he or she creates. In other words, you should be able to use SideKick Phonebook entries in a direct mail campaign that you run with Borland's full-blown data base, Paradox, or analyze costs in Paradox with data pulled from a SideKick schedule. That's not exactly a radical idea, but it's rare enough in practice. SideKick for PM turns this notion into reality by managing data with a Paradox kernel and saving it in Paradox file format. The item that you store in SideKick today will be available to you in Paradox tomorrow-and vice versa.

Although Borland's leading the pack into a "data-based" future, others are not far behind. Take a look at Microsoft's Word 5.0, Lotus's Magellan (see Eric Bender's Preview in this issue), Traveling Software's ViewLink, and Oracle's recently announced E-mail package, Oracle*Mail. Each of them treats the information on your hard disk as data that should be available to you quickly and easily. All of them have a data base manager growling beneath the hood. And that's just the start. Virtually every application you now use will soon have a data base manager at its core.

How far can this concept go? Ask dBASE creator Wayne Ratliff. With his Emerald Bay project, Ratliff envisioned a family of applications that snapped on to the same underlying data base core and shared information with it. Ashton-Tate has its own version of that idea, promising a future suite of Presentation Manager applications with hooks into its data base server. Somewhat sooner than that, Lotus will embed SQL data base hooks into 1-2-3 release 3.0 and its upcoming graphic spreadsheet, 1-2-3/G.

Such innovation brings its own troubles, of course. Vendors will be sorely tempted to create databased solutions that work well only within their own product line. In this way they'll try to enforce customer loyalty to their (continues)

brand name and squeeze out the competition. Fortunately, that strategy has never been too successful—how many 1-2-3 users also use Manuscript? How many WordPerfect users also use Plan-Perfect? And admirable as Side-Kick for PM is, how many of its users will also use Paradox?

More important, data-based application software will raise a host of management issues you might never have considered before. Your choice of word processor, spreadsheet, or communications package, for example, will depend partly on how well the product fits into your company's data base scheme. And it will give new urgency to a question that gets more troubling each passing day: If I dump this software, can I take my data with me?





laptop products in the November 1988 issue of *PC World* [*Preview*, "Laptops of Luxury"]. However, I would like to clarify for your readers a few of the key differences between the NEC ProSpeed 386 and its sibling, the NEC ProSpeed 286.

The preview implied that other than their dissimilar processors, the two machines were essentially identical. In fact, the ProSpeed 286's different overall design renders it 4 pounds lighter and 20 percent smaller than the ProSpeed 386. And unlike the 386 machine, the ProSpeed 286 offers black-and-white VGA graphics and is designed primarily for battery-powered operation. In addition, the cable-connected Expansion Station for the ProSpeed 286 provides extensive rather than "garden-variety" features, including slots for four standard 16-bit boards and space for one half-height drive.

Thanks for allowing me to clarify these important points and for your continued excellent coverage of the fast-paced laptop computer market.



And as of May 1988, a tilt-and-swivel stand is included as a standard feature of the ZCM-1490. Contrary to the article, the Magnavox Professional VGA has both vertical-size and vertical-hold controls and comes with a two-year rather than a oneyear parts and labor warranty. Had these facts been reported, the Zenith and Magnavox monitors would have received more favorable evaluations.

To Sue, Perchance to Win

But we lose when software companies go to court.

How can we best be heard?

Remember Adam Osborne?
He's the fellow who marketed a low-cost and notably improved version of 1-2-3 a few years ago through his Paperback Software Company. That good idea landed him a sizable lawsuit from Lotus, charging that his program violated 1-2-3's "look and feel."

The Lotus suit, which created an uproar, was filed over two years ago. I ran into Adam recently, and guess what? He was busily preparing for the second round of depositions in his case. The trial date had not been set, and the lawyers were busily working away on the reams of documents needed for the legal labyrinth that lies ahead.

Since the suit was filed,
Paperback has had a tough row
to hoe. It has lost market share,
laid off employees, and virtually
disappeared from the industry.
Whatever the outcome, Lotus's
effort to quash Paperback demonstrates that big companies can
use legal tactics to protect themselves and hinder the little guys,
and in the process slow down the
pace of innovation in the market.

You have to wonder, then, about the motives behind the suit Ashton-Tate recently filed against *dBASE* clone makers Fox Software and the Santa Cruz Operation, which sells the

UNIX version of Foxbase. Foxbase, which is significantly faster and cheaper than the original dBASE, has been on the market for over two years. How come Ashton-Tate took so long to be bothered?

When asked this question recently, Ashton-Tate president Ed Esber reportedly said, "If you robbed us two years ago or if you robbed us yesterday, it's the same thing." True enough, but Ashton-Tate's delayed response would seem to weaken its case. Besides, doesn't it make you wonder if Ashton-Tate is just trying to warn up-and-coming enterprises to stay off its turf? Of course, the suit will send a chilly wind through the whole software industry, as well as lessen the pressure on Ashton-Tate to produce better data base products. PC users lose both ways.

It amazes me that Ashton-Tate doesn't see that Foxbase and other data base programs have helped to make the dBASE language the clear standard. They have put Ashton-Tate in the driver's seat because it is by far the biggest publisher of dBASE. All Ashton-Tate has to (continues)






do to compete effectively is push the standard ahead with more innovative improvements.

IBM has learned this lesson the hard way over time. By trying to force would-be PS/2 clone makers to pay royalties, it has lost what was once a clear leadership position. Nowadays, in an effort to regain that position, Big Old Blue is practically begging manufacturers to make PS/2 clones.

Complicated, drawn-out lawsuits result in huge fees and encourage a proliferation of similar suits. Of course the only clearcut winners in this sort of legal battle are the lawyers. If Foxbase sales dry up as a result of Ashton-Tate's suit, we are encouraging more legal battles. What can users do about this? For one thing, by continuing to buy quality clones (both software and hardware), we can refuse to be intimidated by lawsuits. The thousands of people who belong to dBASE user groups could pressure Ashton-Tate to drop its suit and put more resources into product innovation. They might even create legal defense funds to help Fox Software.

It's my hope that if enough people see that their own best interests are threatened by Ashton-Tate's lawsuit and respond accordingly, Ashton-Tate will feel the chilling effect back in its own corridors. Ultimately we have to decide whether our broad needs as PC users are more important than the narrower interests of self-serving companies that want our business. I don't think there's any contest. ●











A New Kind of Home Computer

What happens when The Manhole meets The PC?

With advanced CD ROM technology, high-end applications stoop to conquer the low-end home entertainment market.

You probably haven't heard of *The Manhole*. That's because it's a Macintosh entertainment program. It runs on top of *Hyper-Card*, the so-called constructionset software that comes with every new Macintosh. And it comes on five 800K floppy disks and requires a hard disk (by the time you read this, it should be available on CD ROM). Not the kind of product the average reader of *PC World* would spend a lot of time thinking about.

But it is the kind of product you should at least be aware of, because it forecasts exciting developments in the PC-compatible-computer business. Those developments will probably be based on a new computer-oriented compact disk format called CD ROM XA, which stands for compact disk read-only memory, extended architecture (and is one of the finest examples of acronymic excess to be found in the computer business). CD ROM XA extends the basic way that read-only compact disks can be designed into personal computers.

Previously, computer designers thought of CD ROM drives as devices that could read data from a 520MB disk. What if maintenance manuals for Boeing 747s, the historical record of stock prices for hundreds of pub-

licly held companies, or even, gasp, every single telephone number in the entire country could fit on a single disk? Such CD ROM disks have actually been produced (with the exception, so far, of the telephone directory, given the vicissitudes of deregulation), to the great delight of Boeing 747 maintenance people and certain financial analysts.

Some designers, bored at the prospect of these disks simply holding tons of tedious data, decided to find a more interesting way to put CD ROMs to use: CD-I. Compact disk interactive is essentially a computer in the guise of a consumer-electronics device, one that looks remarkably like an audio compact disk player with a few extra buttons. Indeed, CD-I devices (which are still in prototype, nearly three years after the initial announcement) contain such computerlike components as a modified Motorola 68000 processor, a new version of Microware's multitasking OS/9 operating system, 1MB of RAM, a serial port for printers or other peripherals, plus colorful, high-resolution graphics and compact disk-quality audio. (continues)

The CD-I innovators (working for Sony and for N.V. Philips, the Dutch consumer electronics company that invented compact disks) envisioned interactive applications where users could wander through simulated worlds, explore talking encyclopedias, and enjoy games with hundreds of scenarios, all controlled with a joystick or a mouse.

Computer designers woke up to CD-I as soon as it was announced and decided (rightly or wrongly) that this new device posed serious competition to computer manufacturers (a group that does not include Philips or Sony, notwithstanding Sony's attempts to enter the computer market). So after two years of intense negotiations and

back-room politicking, most of CD-I's main elements—including the crucial audio and graphics features—have been separated from a specific processor and operating system and freed up to be implemented on any old personal computer. This is CD ROM XA.

Now, of course, some manufacturer has to decide to integrate CD ROM XA into a personal computer (several are rumored to be doing just that, including both IBM and Sony). But it would be hard to imagine what you might do with a computer equipped in this fashion, if it weren't for Apple Computer.

Apple has provided the computer industry with a great demonstration system for the possibilities of CD ROM XA, including a Macintosh with highresolution black-and-white graphics: an integrated sound processor; an optional CD ROM drive; and a standard, mostly object-oriented development system in *HyperCard*. The upshot of having this demonstration system around is an innovative piece of software, The Manhole, the first interactive simulation that even comes close to approximating what might be possible with a computer that integrates optical storage, color graphics, and

Now put The Manhole together with the capabilities of a standard 286-based PC equipped with CD ROM XA for about \$1500 discounted, to be delivered next fall. And they say that personal computing isn't as interesting as it used to be. Hah! .





Multivendor Support Broadens

Novell Focuses on Network Software

Aims to Simplify Operations



The biggest challenge, says Ray Noorda, will be to deliver on Novell's far-flung product promises.

ow fast has Novell grown? This year, the network specialist is likely to sell more PC software than Ashton-Tate.

While the sheer diversity and complexity of the never-ending NetWare product stream might baffle and intimidate all but veteran networkers, Novell remains sharply focused on offering a coherent, open platform for network computing. Net-Ware connects more than 3 million workstations, and in six years it has carried Novell across the \$300 million sales mark.

"Novell began creating universal standards and a universal applications environment before other companies latched on to that concept," remarks Clare Fleig, director of research at International Technology Group in Los Altos, California. For Net-Ware, that consistency has paid off in a loyal following among sophisticated resellers and application software vendors-as evidenced by more than 5000 NetWare-specific products. "Developers can't ignore that marketplace," adds Harry Saal, president of Network General, a network utility firm in Sunnyvale, California.

In addition to its highly lucrative software, Novell offers a broad range of net hardware. The line's profits, however, are disappointing, and Novell is actively slimming down its offerings—taking a \$10.2 million write-down on its inventory last fall. "We're shifting to software a little faster than expected; it's about 65 percent of our business now," says Ray Noorda, Novell's softspoken 63year-old chief executive.

But even as business booms, Novell finds itself in a war of words with other net vendors over the small OS/2 network market. The Microsoft/3Com LAN Manager camp claims that the ability to run the same operating system on workstations and servers will smooth the path into distributed applications.

Unlike its rival, however. NetWare is not optimized for OS/2; instead, the software provides network functionality and performance on a variety of servers (including, in an upcoming release, 80386 machines). It offers basic file/print services for OS/2 workstations, along with a menu of tools and hooks for building distributed applications. In addition, Novell will soon release Nondedicated Net-Ware, which lets OS/2 run on a NetWare server, but Noorda downplays its importance.

IBM is building its OS/2 network software around the Microsoft package, and Microsoft claims that the rapidly developing standard will exclude Net-Ware. Novell retorts that it will support IBM's key interfaces soon after they appear—as it did a few (continues)

Hercules has shifted toward cost-sensitive customers, says Andrew Fischer.

S tarted in a California garage, this company brashly ignored IBM while setting its own industry standard for sharp graphics. And it succeeded in doing just that.

But the similarity with Apple Computer ends there, because in the past two years, Hercules Computer Technology has faded from the spotlight.

During its heyday, the Berkeley, California, company dominated the market for PC add-on graphics boards. In 1982, Hercules introduced the first graphics board that enabled IBM PCs to display sharp, high-resolution graphics on monochrome monitors, and it caught on as a de facto standard.

After Hercules debuted a color card in 1984, PC World readers preferred it to IBM's in the World Class Awards balloting. In 1986, Hercules unveiled RamFont, a hardware/ software combination that enables users to display a rich mixture of text fonts and character attributes without losing the speed of text mode.

Cofounders Kevin
Jenkins and Van Suwannukul, who started Hercules with just \$23,000,
pushed sales to about \$70
million in 1986. Things
were going so well that
Jenkins retired at the ripe
old age of 32. He took his
family to Mexico, where
he bought a boat and a
beach.

But at virtually the same time that Jenkins left, IBM introduced the (continues)

years back with IBM's PC LAN Program, moving faster than the Microsoft licensees.

Still, Fleig sees Novell heading into a brawl in corporate networkingwith IBM. "Novell is not necessarily vulnerable in 1989," she suggests, "but it's probably very vulnerable in 1990 and later, because of the shift to OS/2 Extended Edition, What IBM is doing is huge and strategic-a whole new architecture. Novell has been saving 'We can do the job better than IBM.' That will be a harder sell."

Noorda concedes that IBM will continue to be a major competitor, but he insists that the move toward large and complex corporate environments opens up new ground, especially where the ability to accept non-IBM computers like the Macintosh is concerned. "We're far more flexible than IBM," he contends.

While many see Novell and 3Com as head-tohead adversaries, Noorda says that 3Com, with its heavy concentration on hardware, is not his firm's real competition: "3Com is more a Hewlett-Packard look-alike: we look more like Microsoft and other software firms." Novell does find itself increasingly competing with another hardware vendor —Digital Equipment. Fleig and other observers also see Banyan Systems of Westboro, Massachusetts, posing an increasing threat with its Vines software, which was designed from the beginning for large corporate nets.

Novell's entry-level network contender, NetWare ELS, produced a surge of orders when it was introduced in 1987 and has been upgraded many times since, says Noorda. However, Saal maintains that Novell hasn't made it entry-level in all aspects. Without greater ease of use, he argues, "there's a potentially huge additional market that they're not addressing."

One reason Novell doesn't heavily target the low end of the market, Fleig notes, is that it has painstakingly built up a group of technically adept resellers. "This isn't like selling shoes; you really have to understand the technology," she remarks. But these resellers aren't keen on low-end products.

Overall, Noorda expects Novell to grow between 30 and 50 percent this year. As it becomes more entrenched in corporations, "the marketing issues are getting less complex," he says. Development becomes more critical; "our greatest vulnerability now is execution."

Running a 1500-employee firm from Provo, Utah, has its drawbacks, Noorda agrees, including difficulty in attracting management talent. Part of Novell's response is to distribute resources elsewhere-particularly Austin, Texas (home of the development tools division), and Santa Clara, California (headquarters for the connectivity division). Another part of the solution, he says, is "to simplify the company. Reducing the hardware portion is a great simplification." -E. B.




Nestor Aims to Achieve Neural-Net Recognition

Into the Black This Year?

A fter winning a Nobel Prize for superconductivity research, Leon Cooper joined another Brown University professor to create computer models of the human learning process. That work led Cooper and his partner, Charles Elbaum, to form Nestor, Inc., the leader among more than a hundred start-ups hoping to get rich on neural network technology.

Although it has not turned a profit since it incorporated and went public in 1983, the Providence firm is successfully building applications to solve business problems that elude traditional algorithmic or rule-based expert systems.

Michael Buffa, Nestor's president, credits Yankee frugality for the company's healthy balance sheet, which includes a 9-to-1 ratio of equity to debt. Although losses remain heavy, Buffa expects

to stem the flow of red ink by midyear, unless the company decides to expand its 34-person staff to handle an upcoming military contract. "That may postpone profitability by one quarter, but it's not years away, it's quarters away." Buffa says.

Nestor's first product was a character recognition system that turns letters written on a digitizing pad into machinereadable ASCII characters. Nestor is negotiating a marketing agreement with a large computer vendor, Buffa says, because it's too small to do the job itself.

The firm has also tackled speech and object recognition, process control, financial decision making, risk assessment, and forecasting. In each job, the key to success is the neural net's ability to detect (continues)

PS/2 and put its VGA graphics on every motherboard—eliminating the need for add-on graphics boards.

"Our largest market disappeared," admits Andrew Fischer, vice president of product development. "Early 1987 was certainly the height of our fortunes." While the company declines to reveal sales figures, Dataquest analyst Sohail Malik estimates 1987 sales at \$45 million and figures that they dropped slightly in 1988.

But Fischer insists the 80-employee company is still very profitable. That's because it continues to sell thousands of monochrome boards a month, while competitors focus on the color market. "Color is really a nonessential," Fischer says. A business that wants to run 1-2-3 or WordPerfect with EGA or VGA color, he claims, must spend almost three times as much as it would using monochrome. "That's why monochrome will never go away," he says confidently.

Competitors chuckle at that line of reasoning, saving it shows how far behind the times Hercules has slipped. "They are long gone; we don't even see them anymore or regard them as one of our major competitors," snorts Greg Reznick, marketing vice president at Video Seven in Fremont, California. Though Hercules introduced color boards, it ignored the EGA market and failed to unveil a VGA clone until last fall-long after competitors.

"They missed the boat on the color market," according to Dataquest's Malik, who estimates that about 40 percent of all PC displays are monochrome.

Hercules continues to offer intriguing products, like the Network Card Plus with built-in Apple-Talk capability, which debuted last year. But the company's ability to set standards seems far less certain than in the free-wheeling days when Jenkins, his ever-present sunglasses, and his English bull terrier Pinkie dominated Hercules' marketing efforts.


For now, Hercules is counting on producing profits in three ways: selling even more monochrome cards for the hundreds of thousands of IBM PC compatibles consumers purchase each year, offering its inexpensive (\$299) plain-vanilla VGA board, and trying to establish RamFont.

WordPerfect, Microsoft Word, WordStar 2000, Sprint, Framework III, XyWrite III+, and Samna Word IV take advantage of RamFont. But given the turn toward graphics software, most see RamFont ending up as a low-end DOS product. "It does some nice things in the character-based environment, and we support it for Microsoft Word, but when you get into the graphics environment it doesn't do that much," a Microsoft spokesperson says.

Few, though, count
Hercules out altogether.
"They had a hit, then a
strikeout," says Dataquest's Malik. "But in PC
graphics, they are not
anywhere near the last
inning. The third phase of
graphics is yet to come;
they have another chance."

patterns or classifications in huge volumes of raw data—a task conventional computers fail at miserably (see "Neural Nets: The Dream Machines," PCW, December 1987).

Nestor's core products are the Decision Learning System (DLS) and the Nestor Development System (NDS). DLS is targeted at the financial services industry, where the ability to see patterns in data is of enormous value. (One example: Mortgage defaults in the United States exceed \$2 billion per year, and identifying even a fraction of potential bad loans would aid any mortgage company.) Nestor negotiates a license and royalty arrangement for DLS based on the estimated value of the resulting application.

One DLS licensee is the New York firm of Oliver, Wyman and Company, a management consultant for the credit industry. Partner Peter Carroll says the choice of neural nets "seemed obvious, once we realized they are very good at pattern recognition."

Initially, Carroll says, building a mortgageunderwriting expert system with a neural network is similar to creating a rule-based expert system: The developer asks the human underwriters what data they rely on. However, it's not necessary to know the data's significance or how it's employed. The network scans a data base of mortgage applications and lending decisions, then finds the relationship itself. "The biggest problem is finding data, not training [the neural net] or understanding the concepts," Carroll says.

Outside the financial services industry, Nestor sells its other product, NDS, at \$495 per copy and more. The company also provides customer training and consulting.

Dallas-based BancTec, for example, is using NDS to develop financial document processing systems. The BancTec system reads handwritten numbers on checks, reducing labor needed for check processing by up to 60 percent.

BancTec's document processing division vice president and general manager, Richard Thompson, is reluctant to predict the project's success, but he's satisfied with its progress. Banc-Tec plans beta site installations by midyear. "If it's successful," Thompson says, "it will mean a significant reduction in the number of keystrokes required to process a bank check." —Mickey Williamson

Wang Forms PC Division

Trying Central Phone Support

G ranted, it had sold almost half a million PCs. And its annual PC revenues were reaching \$400 million. But the \$3 billion office automation supplier knew it hadn't really joined the PC parade, and so Wang Laboratories formed a separate PC group last May.

Like its parent, Wang's Microsystems Division will hawk high-powered, well-connected PCs for corporate users. But prices will dip closer to those of mail-order marketers like Dell, says Graham Beachum, Jr., the division's vice president of sales and marketing.

Wang's first 80386based machines rolled out in December with price tags beginning at \$4115 for a system with a VGA monitor. "For Wang, that's aggressive," a spokesperson notes.

The Microsystems Division swiped another mailorder tactic: It will provide product support nationwide from a phone bank at its Drum Hill, Massachusetts, headquar-

ters. In other respects, though, the group will flex traditional big-supplier muscle, fielding a direct sales force of 100. The group will also market through value-added resellers. Both channels will turn over support duties to the Drum Hill operation, Beachum says.

Industry analysts caution that Wang must offer more than cost-competitive products. "Everybody is selling hardware cheap," argues Michael Goulde, director of corporate information solutions at CAP International in Marshfield, Massachusetts. However, Robert Cameron, senior analyst with Dataquest's Boxboro, Massachusetts, office, feels that Wang's ability to sell more than just PCs is attractive because "people like to buy everything from one vendor."

Wang also can tap its comprehensive set of office automation offerings, currently highlighted by the Wang Integrated Image System (WIIS). Based on Wang VS minicomputers, the image system will help Wang sell PCs for use as WIIS workstations, Cameron believes.

Goulde agrees, but criticizes Wang's failure to develop proprietary chips to give its PCs the better-than-VGA graphics that WHS needs.

In networking, however, Wang is already well positioned. "Wang initially viewed PCs as workstations for the VS, and about 65 percent of our PCs have been sold as desktop devices connected to a VS environment," points out Bob Ano, president of Wang Microsystems. Wang will ex-(continues)



(continued from page 61) made his reputation with The Norton Utilities, a package of disk and file recovery routines that have gone a long way toward reducing pain and suffering among personal computer users.

For a few years, Norton gave computer publications as much attention as his *Utilities*. But he turned away from writing in 1987 to devote more time to his "main gig," Peter Norton Computing.

The company has grown to 50 employees and annual revenues of about \$15 million, up about \$4 million from the year before. The Utilities accounts for 80 percent of shipments; sales are growing "at a shocking rate" for the The Norton Commander (a DOS shell utility), The Norton Guides (pop-up reference manuals for computer languages and operating systems), The Norton Editor (a small ASCII word processor for developers), and Dan Bricklin's Demo Program (a prototyping and demonstration tool).

The company, which dominates the world of file recovery in the United States, is expanding into Europe and the Far East—but not without some interesting problems.

The Spanish version of The Norton Commander, for instance, is called El Comandante Norton. "At first," says the unassuming Norton, "I was afraid that it would seem militaristic, but I find there's more of a lilt to saying comandante than saying commander."

As part of its diversification, Norton Com-

puting is dipping a toe into the OS/2 waters—but only a toe. Although the firm was an early player in the OS/2 game with *The Norton Guides*, "we're not making a major, major commitment to it. The question is, who

needs to use OS/2? The needs are in DOS."

When asked about utilities for managing local area networks or multiuser systems, Norton laughs and says only that "you can look for some

very interesting things from us."

Norton's firm is not alone in its niches. But the Commander is "far and away the leading disk management program," says Peter DeWitt, a product manager for Corporate Software in Westwood. Massachusetts. The Norton Utilities has lengthened its lead, he adds, thanks to automated disk recovery and fortuitous delays to a competing program, Central Point Software's PC Tools.

Norton sees his products as targeting the mainstream of the disk recovery market, while Paul Mace Software's *The Mace Utilities* is aimed at techies and *PC Tools* goes for the budget-minded. "It works out less as competition than as market segmentation, which is dandy, because it's really serving the customer very well." —Daniel J. Rosenbaum

tend this original network strategy to include versions of OS/2 LAN Manager and Banyan's Vines network software.

The company also enjoys extensive cross-licensing agreements with IBM, which Beachum says would pave the way for machines compatible with the Micro Channel Architecture. Outsiders expect the firm to launch such products by midyear.

In its bid to sell more PCs, Wang has another powerful weapon: Freestyle, a communications system that lets AT owners use an "electronic pencil" to quickly append written or spoken notes to documents or other files, and then mail the notes electronically. "It's the applications that sell the hardware, and Freestyle has lots of sex appeal and flash," Cameron observes.

Presently, Freestyle continues a Wang tradition of high cost (a fully configured system with PC sells for around \$12,000) and half-steps toward industry standards (it works only with Wang proprietary networks). But Cameron predicts Wang will cut Freestyle's price, and Wang says it will adapt Freestyle for the OS/2 Presentation

Manager. Even more important, the Microsystems Division is developing a Windows ease-of-use extension that accepts unmodified Windows applications—another sign that Wang is ready to play in the open architecture arena. —Edward Warner





Magellan Finds Faster Work Routes

Lotus's navigator gives you clear sailing to any file on your hard disk—

and keeps your disk trim into the bargain.

N ature abhors a vacuum, and so does a hard disk. If you've been running more than one application for any appreciable length of time, your disk is probably stuffed with hundreds or even thousands of files in diverse formats. And when you're in a big hurry to find one file in particular—say, a five-month-old memo—you need a guide like Lotus's Magellan.

Magellan strives for mastery over this world of dissimilar files, helping you quickly find what you need and assert control of everything under the hatches. It's a powerful PC navigation center that lets you rapidly read files from numerous popular applications, search text

via an innovative indexing scheme, and issue snappy DOS commands.

Skimming O'er the Maze

Magellan opens with two windows, split vertically. The one on the left shows a list of files, and the right window, called View, displays the contents of each file-regardless of its format. This almost instantaneous translation can save you substantial amounts of time. You can zip through a crowded directory with one eye on the View window, rather than puzzling over whether you're looking at, say, a WordPerfect or Word document and then loading the appropriate application.

A list of function key assignments is ever-present along the bottom of the screen; a second row pops up when you hit <Alt>. These keys and a judicious handful of dialog boxes are all you need to

know, which keeps Magellan's learning curve low

A status line at the top of your screen displays the exploration path that produced the list of files in the left window. If you want to limit the list, say to 1-2-3 worksheets, you can type in a new path like c:\123*.wks, or sort the list by path, extension, or other parameters. Magellan recognizes DOS wild cards and adds some ingenious file-finding shortcuts of its own:

c:\LOTUS**.wk?, for example, would ferret out every spreadsheet in every subdirectory of the \LOTUS subdirectory on drive C:. Another route is through the Explore function, which brings up a dialog box offering you a choice of file groups. You can select from the many built-in menu choices; you also can define file groups quickly.

Once you've found the proper file, you can enlarge a window or even zoom it to full screen-to find the file size or date. or see the contents in its entirety. Moreover, the package allows you to mark sections of text throughout your disk and gather them together into an ASCII file without disturbing the original files.

If you want to edit or change a file, you can launch directly from Magellan into the appropriate application—assuming it's installed on your hard disk. (Magellan checks your disk at installation and modifies the Launch menu appropriately. As with Explore, you can easily attach packages that aren't already on the menu.) The application comes up with the file already loaded. When you exit that package, Magellan reappears.

Search Me

Magellan adds an innovative text-search capability aimed at overcoming two restrictions on current text-search packages like Microlytics's Gofer: the awkwardness of using Boolean tools, and the limited speed of sequential file searches.

Naturally, Boolean techniques are essential for narrowing searches of massive data bases like those on Dow Jones News/ Retrieval. But Lotus maintains that Boolean commands are not particularly intuitive-an argument supported by many

who find on-line searches only slightly less intimidating than particle physics.

Instead, Magellan employs a "fuzzy searching" technique based simply on a few likely words or phrases. To begin the search, you first pick the file group in the Explore dialog box and then type in a series of words likely to appear. Magellan produces a weighted and ranked list of files expected to produce matches. You can then browse the files via View.

You also can begin your search with a line or marked passage of text. Or you can build a Boolean search on the Explore line with AND, OR, and NOT operators.

Before embarking on a fuzzy search, though, you'll have to index your files. Magellan's indexing scheme accelerates searches and takes minimal disk space, roughly 6 percent of the size of the indexed files. The initial indexing can take a while, depending on the number of files and your hardware configuration. Indexing 651 files on a Compaq Portable II, for example, required a little under 20 minutes. You update the index incrementally whenever you like.

On a large disk containing thousands of files, searches can dawdle. In these circumstances Lotus suggests creating more focused indexes. These indexes also enable you to distribute customized data bases to other Magellan users: You build a group of files, index that group, and then copy all to a floppy disk.

Macros Round the World

Magellan offers command line shortcuts, like starting up with mg *.wks concerning "sales". Additionally, you can write macros via a learn mode or simple commands-so the program opens with worksheets sorted by date, for instance.

The package does not compete with hard disk maintenance utilities like The Norton Utilities, but it does incorporate standard DOS shell capabilities, including tree directory displays plus the ability to copy, delete, and rename files, singly or in batch mode. View also helps you run a tighter ship by letting you instantly view files whose names offer no clue of origin.

Like its namesake, who stepped onto the wrong beach one day in 1521, the precommercial Magellan doesn't always complete its voyages. Support for many popular packages is not entirely implemented. and the software is too RAM hungry to work with many memory-resident packages like Lotus Express, although the company says it will solve both problems with the shrinkwrap version. The package also will face

competition from upcoming offerings like Traveling Software's Papillon. But Magellan looks like a strong and savvy pilot.

SideKick for Presentation Manager

For a glimpse at computing in the nineties,

look no further than Borland's SideKick for Presentation Manager.

We've seen the future: It has stunning graphics, requires at least 3MB of RAM, and does a little less than it once did.

Yes, SideKick for Presentation Manager is here, the first application available for OS/2's Windows-like front end. Now shipping free with IBM OS/2 1.1 Standard and Extended Editions, the program reinvents versions of the original SideKick's Calculator, Notepad, Time Planner (derived from the original Calendar), and Phonebook.


You can't really call SideKick for Presentation Manager a utility. It's a completely rewritten product built around the Paradox data base engine, with the Phonebook and Time Planner employing Paradox's file format. And OS/2 multitasking renders "RAM resident" obsolete; you execute this SideKick like any other program.

Brave New Environment

If looks count, then Side-Kick for Presentation
Manager leaves just about any DOS application—
including most Windows
programs—in the dust.
The attractive user interface makes liberal and intelligent use of icons and fonts, and it's simply a pleasure to use.

As you'd expect of any OS/2 application, installing SideKick is a one-button affair. The program automatically creates a directory and five subdirectories whose files together occupy about 2MB of disk space. It also adds the names of the four Side-Kick applications (as a "Group") to the Start Programs menu and slugs a statement into OS/2's CONFIG.SYS file.

Although the minimum RAM requirement for SideKick with Presentation Manager is 3MB (and that's without the DOS compatibility box), 4MB is recommended. Needless to say, you also need an 80286 machine or better

to run OS/2, and the program itself is available only on 1.2MB or 1.44MB floppies. VGA rather than EGA graphics resolution is also advisable just for deciphering some of the minuscule icons. A mouse is almost a necessity.

More Than a Face-Lift

The Calculator and the Notepad have always been the most popular SideKick applications, and SideKick for Presentation Manager gives each a new face and new capabilities.

The Calculator now looks like a snazzy, high-tech calculator, replete with a host of special function keys and an editable tape. You can "press" the keys with a mouse or

use the keypad; the numbers scroll by on the tape, which can be saved as an ASCII file.

Borland dubs the Calculator a "one-column spreadsheet." Unlike the editable tape generated by SideKick Plus's Calculator, SideKick for Presentation Manager's tape recalculates instantly when you alter entries or operators. You also can save a whole array of tapes for various applications and edit them as required. Additionally, a "memory box" displays the contents of the Calculator's memory, while new business functions let vou calculate payments at the beginning or end of a payment period.

Changes to the Notepad may irk some users. The WordStar-like editing commands have been discarded in favor of Presentation Manager conventions, which include selection of text and commands with the mouse and simple keystroke combinations for cutting and pasting. The Notepad will accustom you to the basic commands for all future Presentation Manager word processorswhether you're ready or

The Notepad supports ASCII documents of up to 64K. It offers tabs and search and replace functions but doesn't accept wild cards. The Presentation Manager's Clipboard —a window for cutting and pasting data between OS/2 applications—performs roughly the same screen-capture tasks as the old *SideKick*'s Notepad. Together, the Clipboard and one or more sessions of the new Notepad can work like a word processor with windows.

The Organizing Principle

Of the four applications, the Time Planner is the most complicated to learn. It offers daily, weekly, and monthly views of your schedule, and lets you attach notes, perform searches, and set appointment alarms.

To record an appointment, you begin by double-clicking on the preferred day and selecting a time period on a graphical "time odometer." Confirming the range creates an entry on the daily calendar, which can hold a frightening 256 appointments per day.

You have a choice of ten tiny category icons to classify the type of appointment—symbols for business meetings, mealtime appointments, phone calls, and so on. One icon indicates that an alarm has been set, while another type shows whether a note is attached (notes are recorded and retrieved via the Notepad).

One of the flashiest features—also offered by SideKick Plus—is a search function that finds unscheduled time based on such criteria as length of the appointment, time of day, and day of the week. You can also search for text strings and go to specified days.

Additionally, the Phonebook can search across multiple fields. In fact, like SideKick Plus's Phonebook, it is actually a rudimentary flat-file data base, providing both form and table views. But Side-Kick for Presentation Manager adds the ability to customize the data entry form and to rearrange columns in the table. You could even turn the customizable Phonebook form into a front end for Paradox for OS/2.

The Phonebook holds up to a billion records and includes a handy speed-dial list for common numbers. Unlike earlier versions, however, it won't let you simply pop into another application, select any number on the screen, and dial it.

SideKick for Presentation Manager lacks the
minimal telecommunications program and the
outliner bundled into
SideKick Plus. These
missing pieces won't bother most SideKick users,
since few switched to the
Plus version anyway.
More important, this big,
hardware-hungry program needs about 20
times the RAM of its immediate predecessor, and

it does less—although with greater ease and elegance. And that, in the near term, is the shape of things to come.

Light Speed

PC LightCard's fiber optic technology lets a host 386 share information with and display bitmapped graphics on a work group's pre-386 PCs. The remote workstations are linked to the host via full-duplex fiber optic cables in a star configuration, allowing a direct run of up to 1000 feet to each remote. The system transfers data at a meteoric 32 Mbps-far outstripping the maximum 10 Mbps of an ether-

net network-and connections are virtually immune from electrical interference or cross talk.

SunRiver is positioning PC LightCard as a lowcost alternative to local area networks, although the system also works in conjunction with a net to access other departmental systems or a mainframe. All users on a Sun-River system share the 386's high-performance features, such as 32-bit memory, a powerful CPU, math coprocessors, and a fast hard disk. And unlike most small multiuser systems, PC LightCard doesn't limit remotes to text-only display.

When workstations don't require host processing, they can be hotkeyed back into the standalone mode, essentially giving each machine a dual personality. Users

love yet tap into the speed and power of programs on the host.

In addition to DOS on the workstations, you'll need a multiuser control program on the 386 system, such as Virtual Systems' Quick Connect, which loads on top of DOS. Other options are PC-MOS/386 by Software Link, Concurrent DOS 386/Multiuser Graphics Edition from Digital Research, VM/386 by IGC, and various UNIX derivatives.

A full-size board, PC LightCard fits into any available 8- or 8/16-bit slot on the remote workstation. All processing is performed by the host, which is outfitted with a SunRiver Fiber Optic Host Adapter in a 16-bit slot. Each adapter draws very low wattage from the host machine and supports up to 4 remotes. SunRiver recommends 4 to 6 remotes for memoryintensive applications such as computer-aided design and as many as 12 for of-

fice applications such as word processing and spreadsheets.

The retail price of a single PC LightCard is \$899; each adapter is \$799. Ready-to-install cable, available from Sun-River in lengths of up to 1000 feet, starts at \$110 for 25 feet. Hardware on the adapter supports remote monitors, including Hercules-compatible monochrome, EGA, enhanced EGA, VGA, and enhanced VGA. Wide-Open Space

PC processing power long ago reached the point where it could provide inexpensive microcomputer

solutions to minicomputer-size problems. But PCs still lag behind minis in storage capacity. If your work group passes around 500K CAD files or taps into multimegabyte transaction-oriented data bases, you may already have faced a difficult choice between an expensive proprietary mini or a PC with a not-so-efficient chain of hard drives.

Storage Dimensions offers another option: two internal PC hard disk subsystems, either of which gives you 651MB of formatted data storage on a single 5¼-inch hard drive. That's almost twice the capacity of most manufacturers' internal 5¼inch drives, and it's all available in a single volume for that really massive data base.

The SpeedStor AT650E (for IBM ATs and compatibles) and the LANStor LAN650E (for ATs on local area networks) each works its magic through an ESDI controller, which replaces your current hard disk controller and plugs into any 16-bit slot on the AT bus. SpeedStor, which runs under DOS or Xenix, lists for \$7395.

LANStor, designed for Novell NetWare file servers, is only \$100 more. Each drive mounts in a standard peripheral bay in your computer.

The drives are tested and formatted for DOS/ Xenix or Novell installation prior to shipping and include a disk-diagnostic and -formatting utility that helps you configure the subsystem for your computer's particular setup. The software breaks the 32MB partition limit of DOS versions earlier than 4.0, allowing anything from 24 partitions to a single 651MB partition. You can even span volumes and have a single 1.3GB partition across two drives. The systems are backward-compatible from DOS 4.0 and work with any well-designed DOS shell.

SpeedStor transfers data three times faster than a standard AT drive and 50 percent faster than the speediest PS/2 drives, regardless of drive size, according to Storage Dimensions. SpeedStor and LANStor achieve an average access time of 16ms and a blazing 15-Mbps

data transfer rate by packing a total of 414.7 kilobits of available user storage under 15 read/write heads. (In contrast, a typical 30MB AT drive has 52.2 kilobits under 6 heads.) Data transfer is especially fast when reading or writing a single large block of data, such as a worksheet.

Many typical throughput-maximizing techniques just can't keep up with these drives. Neither drive includes elevator seeks (which retrieve the closest data first). Nor does either drive include caching, because caching controllers can't keep up with the high data transfer rate.

But then, these drives don't need any help. The only things close to Speed-Stor and LANStor in storage capacity are optical disks. But optical drives' sluggish 104ms average access time and typical transfer rate of 200 kilobits per second make them six to ten times slower. Better Feeding Habits

f you're at all serious about desktop publishing, you're familiar with the scanner drill: Put the



Scan documents at a rate of 10 seconds per page using the optional sheet feeder on Pentax's SB-A4301 Image Scanner.

document in the scanner. wait for the transfer to disk, remove the document, insert a new one, wait for the transfer to disk-it's like raising and lowering the lid on a photocopy machine over and over.

But if your document isn't bound together, you don't have to tolerate that in a copier, and now you don't have to put up with it in a scanner either. Pentax Teknologies' SB-A4301 Image Scanner features an optional document feeder that ends the waiting game. With the feeder attached, the flatbed scanner accepts up to 30 originals at a scanning speed of 10 seconds per page, producing output at resolutions of between 39 and 300 dpi.

Pentax claims that its feeder is more accurate and less likely to skew paper than other brands because it doesn't use rollers. Once inserted, each page rests on a glass platen, and the scanner head moves beneath it to capture the image.

Most scanner heads use mirrors and light bars to reflect images to the scanning lens, but each vibrates at a different rate—a potential source of distortion-and it's relatively easy for a mirror or light to get knocked out of alignment. The Pentax head uses a patented folded optical path, which packs all of its mirrors and light sources into a single unit that vibrates at one frequency and significantly reduces image distortion, the manufacturer claims. Naturally, the SB-A4301 also is better suited for scanning books and large documents in single-sheet mode than roller-type scanners.

If you want to reduce or enlarge an image without sacrificing image quality, you'll find the SB-A4301's dithering feature handy. This lets you simulate gray scales on your laser printer and maintain image quality in much the same way newspaper halftones work-by translating a photo's continuous tones into from 39 to 300 dots per inch.



IBM Token-Ring Network 16/4 Adapter, 16/4 Adapter/A, Token-Ring Network Bridge Program 2.1

IBM has introduced a new version of its Token-Ring Network, with adapters and software that enable the net to run at 4 or 16 Mbps, up to four times as fast as IBM's existing Token-Ring offerings.

The 16/4 Adapter for AT-bus machines and its Micro Channel version, the 16/4 Adapter/A, are built around a CMOS chip that integrates functions formerly performed by six chips in a half-card package. The adapters have 64K of memory on board, compared with a maximum of 16K for earlier LAN models, boosting performance through larger data frames and handling more concurrent sessions on a server. The adapters support frames of up to 18K on 16-Mbps rings and up to 4.5K on 4-Mbps rings, compared with the previous limit of 2K. You can send larger files faster between workstations, facilitating transfers across wide area nets and to mainframes and minis.

The new products also boost throughput with an "early token release" technique, which lets a workstation transmit its token immediately after sending a frame of data, rather than waiting for the frame to return. More than one token can operate on the net at a time, achieving operating efficiencies of up to 95 percent, claims IBM.

While the new cards can run at either 4 or 16 Mbps, they cannot do so simultaneously, nor can speeds be mixed on the same Token-Ring. But you can connect Token-Rings of different speeds through a gateway that's equipped with both adapter cards and is running IBM's Token-Ring Network Bridge Program version 2.1, which forms multiple physical rings into a single logical ring. The 16/4 Adapter/A permits you to change speeds through software, while the 16/4 Adapter requires the use of switches.

Unlike 4-Mbps Token-Rings, which can operate on unshielded cabling, 16-Mbps nets require more expensive shielded cabling.

Both the 16/4 Adapter and 16/4 Adapter/A retail for \$895. IBM also enhanced and repriced its existing 4-Mbps products; an upgraded 4-Mbps MCA adapter is available for \$750, while an AT-bus version sells for \$650. 



Is dBASE IV Worth the Wait?

dBASE IV fulfills enough promises to keep a horde of dBASE clones off balance.

> But some users may balk at its halfhearted SQL implementation and mediocre performance.

he long-awaited dBASE IV may be a catch-up product in the rapidly evolving world of programmable data managers, but it doesn't feel that way. With a few exceptions, the additions are thoughtfully implemented and smoothly integrated, putting the program slightly ahead of such rivals as Paradox and R:base. Yet dBASE IV's reign may be fleeting. Although light-years ahead of dBASE III Plus, it fails to deliver a knockout punch, and competitors are busy preparing advanced versions of their products.

Still, Ashton-Tate has given dBASE programmers what they asked for: the best application programming environment on the market. A new pseudocompiler, a menu-driven application generator that beats R.base's Application Express system, a text editor and animated debugger, and additions to the dBASE command language should help stem the exodus to Clipper, Quicksilver, and Foxbase +. Most nonprogrammers will be pleased also. Although a bit of a stretch for

novices, the menu-driven Control Center offers access to almost every facet of the program, including excellent new reporting and forms-creation modules and a welcome new query-by-example (QBE) capability.

As National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL) benchmarks reveal, however, dBASE is still no speed demon. Although dBASE IV is two to three times faster than dBASE III Plus at nonreporting tasks, Foxbase + 2.1 is 15 to 25 percent faster at straight indexing and updating jobs than IV and 37 to 42 percent faster at updating with an index. When it comes to reporting, dBASE IV is positively ponderous—vastly slower than Foxbase + and about three times pokier than III Plus.

dBASE IV's implementation of Structured Query Language (SQL) is also disappointing, Designed for querying mini and mainframe data bases, SQL was tacked on to dBASE IV to please Fortune 500 and government customers. The rough edges show. Performance suffers due to internal translations from SQL to dBASE equivalents and the pairing of .DBF files with special SQL catalog files.

Fortunately, Ashton-Tate and Microsoft will soon jointly release SQL Server, a new dBASE engine with true relational talents. The \$2495 package will act as a LAN-based processor that works with a SQL front end built into version 1.1 of dBASE IV. Both products are due in mid-1989, and the 1.1 upgrade will be free.

The Price and the Power

If dBASE IV sounds good, dig deep into your wallet. You won't have to convert dBASE III Plus files and programs, but you will need more RAM (640K versus 384K) and about 3.5MB of disk space. The price has jumped \$100 to \$795, and the upgrade costs a hefty \$175-\$30 if you bought dBASE III Plus after February 17, 1988.

dBASE IV is remarkably light on bugs-a welcome change from previous dBASE debuts. One serious glitch is the new help system, which sometimes gobbles up memory and freezes the system. Once repaired, this task-oriented, context-sensitive helpmate should be a winner.

More crucial to dBASE IV's success is the Control Center, an integrated menu system that not only guides you through data entry (the old Assistant's major claim to fame) but offers quick access to all major functions. Instead of a point-and-shoot 1-2-3-like menu system, the screen displays the six categories representing the "objects" that make up any data base-data, queries, forms, reports, labels, and applications. When you open a data base, the Control Center displays a catalog of all associated files, which you can access immediately. To modify a label or run a report, for example, simply select the appropriate object, and up pops a menu. If you're familiar with dBASE-you don't mind memorizing a passel of keystroke combinations-you can quickly create and



link all the elements of an application. Novices, however, will probably long for a traditional menu structure.

QBE the dBASE Way

Another feature that puts dBASE IV's power in the hands of the average user is its QBE mode, a technique popularized by Paradox. Instead of typing a string of convoluted commands at a dot prompt to sift data, you simply fill out a table with the necessary fields and operators. You can use QBE to draw fields from as many as eight files for a single form or report. An update query lets you add, delete, or modify data, but in only one file at a time.

dBASE IV's QBE roughly matches the power of Paradox 2.0's and in some ways is easier to use. For example, to link two tables in dBASE IV, simply select them from a menu, and dBASE provides the linking example. Unlike Paradox, dBASE IV saves disk space by storing queries as small pro-

grams that can rebuild a view on the fly. However, Paradox will find the fastest way to do the query; with $dBASE\ IV$, the order in which you present a multitable query may greatly affect search speed.

Friendly Forms and Reports

Kiss the @Say command good-bye. With dBASE IV, you can create custom data entry forms and reports from within the Control Center without ever resorting to command language. Yet unlike with Paradox and R:base, source code is generated for all forms and reports and can be included and modified for dBASE programs.

To create a custom form, you select fields from menus and arrange them on screen. You can draw lines and boxes, control screen color, and specify error messages and lookup and range verifications. You can search, append, or replace memo fields and display them in a separate window.

If you can live with its foot-dragging pace, you'll find dBASE IV's report writer equal to any in the business. Like Paradox, dBASE IV adopts the band concept, in which horizontal rectangles on the page control the format of related report elements. And thanks to an improved set of printer drivers borrowed from Framework, you enjoy extensive control over fonts, attributes, lines, and boxes. The program also includes four canned formats that produce tabular reports, record-by-record forms, data files, and mail merge reports. They're all customizable, and a handy Quick Layout option pours data into the proper bands automatically.

Programmer's Delight

dBASE IV's collection of built-in programming aids and tools can't be beat. The language includes 240 new commands and functions, most notably, math and financial functions, expanded date and currency formats, two-dimensional arrays, and a floatingpoint data type that eliminates most rounding errors. The new user-defined functions are welcome but limited, prohibiting macros and about 100 dBASE commands.

dBASE IV's text editor shows numerous improvements. It's fast and includes block move, word wrap, and search-and-replace functions. Lines can be 1024 characters long, and file size is now limited only by disk space.

More important, the Applications Generator (ApGen) is finally complete. Although ApGen doesn't paint the footprints on the dance floor like R:base's Application Ex-



press, it's more powerful. As with Express, you can use menus to generate elements such as interrelated data bases, screens, reports, and programs, but ApGen also lets you link elements together into a running application. In addition, you can add custom sign-on screens, define colors and windows, create custom help systems, and take your pick of menu types. If all you need is a quick singlemenu program that edits a file or prints a label or report format, an easy Quick Application option spits out what you need in seconds.

Another big boost is an animated debugger that takes its cue from Microsoft's Codeview. As an application runs, the debugger highlights each line of source code as it executes. You can set breakpoints that control execution, monitor the value of variables and fields, and automatically flip a program into the debugger when a run-time error occurs.


Another welcome improvement is a Foxbase-like pseudocompiler that tosses off speedy binary object files. Unfortunately, it runs only when dBASE IV is loaded. If you want the real McCoy, you'll have to wait for an upcoming .EXE compiler that should be available as an upgrade to the new dBASE IV Developer's Edition. This \$1295 package also includes a royalty-free run-time module. a template language, multiuser testing tools, a linker, drivers, and dBASE IV. An extra \$89.95 buys StepIV ward, a utility that conHRASE IV'S menu-driven report generator may be the best in the business. As with Paradox, reports are separated into different bands for easier creation.




Index four files

Index four files


This benchmark measured the time required to index four files: Account (50,000 records), Teller (1000 records), Branch (100 records), and Transact (1000 records).

Transaction processing without an index




Transaction processing with an index (large history file)

The history file from the previous test was expanded from 2000 to 10,000 records, and then the TP1 benchmark was run with 1000 transactions. The history file therefore ended up with 11,000 records. Updating of the index during transaction processing took longer. Compare these results to the pre-vious two benchmarks' to gauge the difference between updating a small index file during transaction processing and updating a large index file during transaction processing

Report selection with an index

This benchmark reported 1000 records from the account file in index order. Selection criteria were based on an index.

verts Clipper, Foxbase + , and Quicksilver applications to dBASE IV.

Still Waiting for SQL

With the SQL race in full swing, Ashton-Tate had little choice but to offer its own version, based on IBM's DB2. Unfortunately, dBASE IV's SQL implementation is rather crude. You can't send SQL queries from the Control Center, you can't use QBE, and modifying some data structures is impossible. More important, execution is sluggish.

Getting at SQL's power takes some doing. For example, you have to choose between using pure dBASE, which allows you to get at most SQL tables, or dBASE/SQL, which strips out 80 dBASE commands and adds 100 new SQL commands. Either way, execution drags because SQL won't manipulate data

until it references special tables that are linked to source .DBF files. Using SQL in a dBASE program isn't any easier: You must save the SQL code in a separate file, compile it, and then link the files or call the SQL code from another dBASE program.

For Programmers Only?

All told, dBASE IV is a muscular upgrade that matches and sometimes bests the competition. But examine your motives before you buy. If SQL is a must-have, turn to true SQL-based programs such as Oracle or XDB. And novices are better served with friendlier programmable data managers such as Paradox and R:base.

Experienced users who do casual programming will find the choice more difficult.
dBASE IV delivers the goods with a nice mix of flexibility and ease of use, but the price is high, performance is mediocre, and other vendors may soon up the ante. If you need a serious data base programming environment, however, the dBASE language is still the answer, and dBASE IV offers the best way of taming it. Some dBASE clones may be faster, but dBASE IV offers the best line of professional programming tools on the market.

OS/2 Data Bases: First Steps

OS/2 versions of Paradox,
R:base, Dataflex, and InformixSQL vie for top billing as the new

But where's the audience?

sers seem fed up with promises and predictions, yet OS/2's proponents still confidently project great leaps forward in productivity. They say that multitasking will let you complete several jobs in the time it once took to do one, while the *Windows*-like Presentation Manager will make learning new programs a snap. Everyone agrees, though, that until OS/2 applications arrive offering capabilities not available with DOS programs, you might as well stick with DOS.

Some vendors claim the wait is over. Four powerful DOS-based data management tools now boast OS/2 siblings. The OS/2 versions of Paradox, R:base, Dataflex, and Informix-SQL offer the same generous features as their DOS forebears—plus the DOS look and feel, since none of them are written for the newly released Presentation Manager—and each supports multitasking and has access to abundant RAM (see "Getting the Feel of OS/2," PCW, April 1988, for a summary of OS/2 specifications and features).

But don't be deceived by this additional functionality. Most of it comes from the power of OS/2, not from the programs themselves. None of these four packages has been rewritten to take advantage of multithreading, where multiple lines of code execute concurrently within a single application. In theory, multithreading is one of OS/2's strongest features and enables you to run several data base tasks simultaneously—or to split a big job into several concurrent processes—using one application in a single OS/2 session.

Simply put, the only way to execute simultaneous tasks with any of these four programs is to run multiple OS/2 sessions. The OS/2 versions of *Paradox*, *R:base*, *Dataflex*, and *Informix-SQL* are really ports of their DOS multiuser counterparts; each OS/2 session is roughly equivalent to a separate workstation session running on a LAN. Furthermore, these programs employ more or less the same concurrency controls for multitasking as their multiuser forerunners do in a DOS network.

For Developers Only

Is the arrival of these programs a compelling reason to switch to OS/2? Probably not. Their DOS equivalents provide the same functions, and only a handful of power users will find the ability to run some of those

functions concurrently worth the upgrade. Those few who can really benefit from running multiple queries or lengthy reports in the background, for example, might want to convert.

Data base developers, though, are the biggest beneficiaries. Being able to test applications (or compile code) in the background while writing code in the foreground is a productivity boon. And because both data and code are completely portable between the OS/2 and DOS versions of all four programs, developers' hard work can do double duty.

For developers and users alike, lots of memory is part of the price of admission to the brave new world of OS/2. With the ceiling on user RAM suddenly raised from 640K to 16MB, developers have much more room for code; thus all four packages have compiled their various disk-based overlay files into a single RAM-based .EXE file. In addition, the programs load all RAM not occupied by program code with as much oft-used data as possible.

The result is that *Paradox*, the hungriest of the programs, requires at least 3MB of RAM; the rest need a minimum of 2MB. The bright side is that running multiple sessions requires only a little more memory. OS/2 implements *code segment sharing*, never loading more than one segment of the same code into RAM no matter how many sessions are using it. Thus, if you run multiple *Paradox* sessions, only one copy of the program actually resides in memory; each session shares the code.

Still, 2MB to 3MB to get in the door—and an effective minimum of 4MB to 5MB with data—is a high price to pay. Given that these programs are nearly identical to their DOS equivalents, users have a right to expect substantial benefits, such as a big boost in performance. Alas, the benchmarks performed by National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL) show that speed is another sticking point.

Dragging the Workload

To compare the performance of the OS/2 programs with that of their DOS counterparts, NSTL began with three basic bench-



marks: a group-record search, a subtotal, and a two-file join. The lab ran each test as a single session under DOS and then under OS/2. As it turned out, only *R:base* performed the single-session benchmarks consistently faster under OS/2 than with DOS.

This simple comparison, though, doesn't address the advantage most often cited by OS/2 proponents: work throughput. In other words, multitasking several chores concurrently should be faster than performing them one after another.

The problem is, the most likely foreground task under multitasking is data entry—and accurately benchmarking data entry is impossible. Instead, NSTL set up a straightforward comparison by determining how long it takes sequential DOS sessions and multiple, concurrent OS/2 sessions to do the same amount of work.

The upshot is that only the OS/2 versions of *R:base* and *Dataflex* out-muscled their DOS predecessors, and then only in the group-record-search benchmark. The remaining concurrent OS/2 sessions took long-er—often much longer—to do the same work as the single sessions. This sounds like damning evidence, against either these pro-









Methodology
The purpose of these tests was twofold: to compare the speed of four OS/2 data managers, and to compare the execution times of the OS/2 programs with those of their DOS versions. First the tests were executed by the programs' DOS versions with caching. The same tests were then executed (using OS/2's disk caching scheme) by the OS/2 versions of these programs in a

Next came the multitasking benchmarks. All the multisession OS/2 tests were run in the background using the OS/2 DETACH command to load and start the programs (R:base for OS/2 is incompatible with the DETACH command, so the START command was substituted).

The multisession OS/2 tests were run in the background because OS/2 assigns the foreground task priority. Had one session been in the foreground, the background tasks would have taken much lorger, greatly lengthening their overall execution time. In each benchmark recorded here, the tasks had equal priority, and each session ran a task identical to the other sessions' tasks. In all the multitasking tests, each session used a different set of records. Therefore, none of the OS/2 packages' record-locking schemes came into play.

In the first multitasking test (1B), the 1A task was run in three concurrent sessions to see whether performing three times the work simultaneously with the OS/2 versions would take less time than running three consecutive tasks with the DOS versions. To compare how long it takes the DOS and OS/2

versions to search the same number of records, the DOS times listed for 1A repre-sent the result of a single session multiplied by three

For 2B and 3B, the 2A and 3A tasks were each divided into three parts; each part ran in a separate session, doing a third the work of the single-session benchmark. A comparison of the results indicates how long it took to do the same amount of work in single foreground sessions (2A and 3A) versus three background sessions (2B and 3B).

Each program's native report generator produced the test re-ports. However, in 1A and 1B, the code produced by *Dataflex*'s report generator was not the optimal code and would have given unrealistically slow results. The report generator produces editable code, so a "jump in" statement was included for a fair comparison with the other programs.

All tests were conducted on a Compag Deskpro 386/20 with 5MB of RAM and an 80387-20 math coprocessor. Compag OS/2 1.0 was used for the OS/2 tests; Compaq DOS 3.31 was used for the DOS tests. Each test was performed three times for consistency; the times were then averaged.

The OS/2 tests were performed with a 256K disk cache. The PROTECTONLY toggle in the OS/2 CONFIG.SYS file was set to YES, thereby removing the DOS compatibility box. In the DOS tests, the DOS CONFIG.SYS file included the statements FILES=20 and BUFFERS=25. Compag's disk caching software was used to create a 256K cache in extended memory for all the DOS tests. All benchmarks were timed from the first keystroke of the command sequence until the last line selected was printed.

Group Record Search on an Index

grams or OS/2 itself, but several important factors deserve consideration.

To begin with, NSTL's benchmarks test just a few of the many functions of a data management system; your own data base operations may yield faster throughput. In addition, because OS/2 gives priority to the foreground task, you wouldn't notice any slowdown if you were entering data in the foreground-and you might not care how long the background task took to finish.

Finally, it's important to note that both the packages and OS/2 are still in their first generation. Future versions will undoubtedly have better-optimized code, and faster throughput will result. This just underscores, however, that it's premature for end users to consider buying the current OS/2 versions of the four programs reviewed.

Old Dogs and New Tricks

The OS/2 versions of Paradox, R:base, Dataflex, and Informix-SQL are so similar to their DOS counterparts, it's virtually impossible to tell the difference at the front end. Nonetheless, some internal distinctions bear mentioning. The most significant involve the way multiuser concurrency controls have been adapted to the multitasking environment.

Like their multiuser predecessors, all the programs normally execute the least restrictive lock for the shortest period of time with any given command. Thus, if a command needs to prevent other tasks from updating a record, it shouldn't stop them from reading that record. Unfortunately, these defaults don't always prioritize access in the manner you desire.

If a developer decides to override the defaults and take control of file and record locking, much care and forethought must go into application development. Otherwise, the resulting data contention can yield the same dreaded deadlocks and data spagnetti that haunt multiuser applications. (For more on such problems, see "Share the Wealth!" PCW, June 1988.)

Paradox for OS/2

Like the DOS version, Paradox for OS/2 offers an intuitive query-by-example inter-

face, complete with 1-2-3-like menus and tables. And the Personal Programmer, Paradox's application generator, remains an excellent tool for both lay users and experienced developers.

The most important change is in the Paradox Application Language (PAL). A single new command, Session, permits PAL developers to write a front end that initiates concurrent processes, each requiring its own Paradox session. This demands more memory and processing overhead than true multithreading, and you need to write more code, but the benefit is seamless, menu-driven execution of multiple tasks.

Paradox enjoys the same sophisticated set of data locks offered by the multiuser version, including a "prevent full lock" option that allows maximum concurrent access. If a background task updates a record while you're viewing it, Paradox automatically refreshes your screen with the updated information. This auto-refresh exacts a heavy toll on CPU time, but you can enhance performance by setting longer intervals between refreshes.

One of Paradox's strengths in a multiuser setting turns out to be a weakness in a multitasking environment. On a LAN, if you request previously locked data, Paradox tells you which user has the lock. Under multitasking, the program identifies which *lask* has the lock, giving the requester the option to suspend the task.

This notification scheme works fine if a user running the foreground task has made the request; the user can merely answer yes or no. But if one background task competes with another, the requesting task grinds to a halt—at least until the user cycles the background task around to the foreground and makes a choice. It takes a good developer to avoid this gridlock.

R:base for OS/2

R:base for OS/2 profits from all the improvements in the latest DOS upgrade, R:base for DOS. Although not as elegant as Paradox's query-by-example approach, R:base's new prompt-by-example method still delivers powerful, menu-driven querying. Developers can take advantage of sophisticated debugging tools, while the new Developer's Express module speeds application development.

R:base for OS/2 incorporates the same selection of Structured Query Language (SQL) commands as the DOS version. Unfortunately, R:base's partial implementation of SQL is impractical for transaction processing; too much awkward procedural code would be required to supplement the SQL code. Until the program upgrades its SQL capability, R:base users are generally better off using the old R:base commands, which are still available.

The concurrency control features offered by *R:base* aren't as polished as *Paradox*'s, but *R:base* performs better in a multitasking environment. Both programs implement table- and row-level locking in exclusive mode and in shared mode, so other tasks may select data from a table or row but not insert, delete, or update. *R:base* excels, however, by putting requests for locked resources into a queue. After a specified waiting period. *R:base* cancels requests, avoiding the dead stop you risk with *Paradox*'s prompt for user response in a background session.

Another *R:base* plus is its ability to let multiple tasks modify the same record concurrently, provided they don't try to update

Offering multiple sessions rather than support for multiple workstations, R:base for OS/2 supplies the same functions as the DOS multiuser version. the same fields. *R:base* mediates simultaneous record updates by prompting the user to accept the change or overwrite the first task's changes. Of course, if the program queries a background task, the requesting task stalls until the request times out. Developers can turn off this automatic control but must replace it with other processes to ensure data integrity.

Of the four programs, *R:base* is the only one that won't let you run multiple sessions without exiting to the OS/2 prompt. No command equivalent to *Paradox*'s Session is provided. The easiest way to run multiple processes in *R:base* is to start sessions from OS/2's Program Selector.

Dataflex 2.3b

Dataflex, unlike Paradox or R:base, is an unknown quantity for most PC users. It's basically a data management language that has only recently acquired a front end. Among developers, Dataflex is known to be an excellent package for creating complex multiuser applications, mostly because the program was ahead of its time in supporting concurrency controls. In addition, Dataflex applica-

tions and data are portable not only between the DOS and OS/2 versions, but also among CP/M, UNIX, and VAX/VMS versions.

Slick data entry forms are easy to generate with *Dataflex*. The program also offers powerful built-in data validation functions that would require programming in the other three packages. And although *Dataflex*'s report generator isn't as fancy as *Paradox*'s query-by-example mode, it's quite extensive. Simply point to the fields you want on a report; enter selection criteria, breakpoints, and headers; and away you go.

Unfortunately, Dataftex has one serious problem with its report generator. Instead of using an index to find the records to print, it goes sequentially through the file—and that means very slow reporting. Fortunately, unlike most report generators, Dataftex's produces code you can edit, enabling you to optimize reporting. (NSTL fixed the code in its tests, or Dataftex's times would have been unrealistically long.) The company claims the report generator will be improved in the next upgrade.

Another drawback is that *Dataflex* can't perform operations quickly across an entire data file. The other three packages allow you to update all records in a file with just one command; *Dataflex*, on the other hand, requires that you write a small program that loops through all the file's records. This might not slow performance, but it does increase development time for certain applications.

Like Paradox, Dataflex provides a special command, Runprogram Background, for starting other sessions from within the program or a custom application. Once concurrent sessions are loaded, however, Dataflex provides only crude file locking. No automatic locking scheme prevents different sessions from editing the same record simultaneously; the developer is entirely responsible for maintaining concurrency control. The locks kick in as you attempt to save a record, when a message tells you that data has been changed and asks you to confirm that you really want to write to disk.

Of the four packages in the roundup, only Dataflex and Informix-SQL support background transaction processing. To facilitate a

background session with *Dataflex*, you use a special Enter macro that automatically locks all files related to a transaction. Although this implementation is primitive compared to *Informix*'s SQL-based solution, it makes *Dataflex* worth considering for batch-processing tasks, such as those demanded by accounting applications.

Informix-SQL 2.10

Like Dataflex, Informix-SQL comes from a large-system background, sporting both UNIX and VMS versions. Even with the attempt to present 1-2-3-like menus, Informix-SQL is hardly an intuitive program. Its main attraction is its bona fide support for SQL, the nonprocedural data management language of the future. (For an overview of SQL and a review of the DOS version of Informix-SQL, see "Tomorrow's Data Bases Today," PCW, February 1988.)

The promise of SQL lies in its potential for portability. In theory, at least, a single SQL query could retrieve data from PCs, minis, and mainframes linked across a wide area network. Currently, this distributed data base scenario is possible only if the same package is running on all those systems; a standardized SQL is still some years away.

Fortunately, some of SQL's advantages are available right now. Unlike dBASE, R:base, or PAL, SQL employs a nonprocedural engine that optimizes queries. In other words, a user can write a query without having to specify exactly how the query should be performed, such as which indexes to use or the sequence of the proposed operations. For example, you can update records globally across multiple files, without the tremendous programming effort required by procedural languages.

If you don't want to learn SQL, Informix-SQL won't leave you in the lurch. Using menus, you can structure data bases; create data entry, query, and report forms; and even develop menu-driven applications. Translation into the appropriate SQL statements is automatic, though unfortunately, SQL lacks the conditional statements necessary for sophisticated application development. For that you must shell out \$995 for Informix-4GL, an add-on package that consists of a full-featured, fourth-generation programming language.

SQL brings unique capabilities to a multitasking setting, especially if you want to run batch data base transactions in the background. It provides such true relational commands as Commit and Rollback, as well as support for audit trails and transaction logs. Thus, a set of record updates is not committed until the entire transaction has completed successfully. If the process fails midway, because of either locked data resources or failed hardware, the entire transaction can be rolled back and the data restored to its original state.

Commit and Rollback capabilities are a must in environments where data integrity is paramount. Unfortunately for *Informix-SQL*, the other three packages are certain to have their own SQL engines in the near term, so the program's lead in mainframelike processing is temporary. In the meantime, without *Informix-4GL*, *Informix-SQL* has the worst development tools and the hardest-to-use interface of the bunch.

The Developer's Edge

Which upgrade a developer selects usually depends on what package his or her company is already using. After all, everyone wants to avoid having to retrain end users.

Soon enough, though, all these packages will be rewritten for the Presentation Manager, and end users will have to accustom themselves to a new user interface anyway. From this perspective, you're left with such criteria as good concurrency controls, support for background batch processing, and superior performance. Overall, R:base for OS/2 comes out on top. Although its partial SQL implementation can't provide the secure background batch processing of Informix-SQL, the program still offers a platform for developers wishing to explore this realm. In addition, R:base's fine set of concurrency controls is complemented by the highest performance under OS/2.

Whether many developers will want to write OS/2 applications with any of these packages before the inevitable Presentation Manager versions come out is an open question. Due to file and code portability to DOS, most of the programmers who buy these packages will probably use them for DOS application development. The OS/2 versions of Paradox, R:base, Dataflex, and Informix-SQL are complete implementations of their

DOS counterparts, but they're really interim products. Not only will future versions run under the Presentation Manager, they'll also undoubtedly use multithreading. And that means multiple data management tasks—without having to explicitly run multiple sessions. ●

Hot Picks in Small Business Accounting

Need a low-cost accounting package but don't know which one's best for your business?

Two CPAs share their insights on eight popular products.

any people who are shopping for accounting software wonder whether low-cost packages have what it takes to automate their business. As a rule of thumb, low-end software is worth a look if your company does less than about a million dollars in annual sales. Although the best low-cost accounting packages can do a fine job for some larger businesses, at a certain point the extra options and convenience of the high-end systems are well worth the extra cost. Tell-tale signs that your business has outgrown a low-end package include a seven-figure annual gross, more than 200 customer accounts, or more than 300 monthly checks or invoices.

Before you invest in a low-end accounting system, you should be aware of its limitations. As you can see from our Features Evaluation, most low-end general ledgers don't offer power features such as multicompany consolidations; more important, full custom reporting capabilities are rare.

In accounts receivable modules, you're not likely to find great flexibility in billing. Customer-specific billing cycles, trade discounts, and age-dependent dunning notices are usually the province of high-end systems. Accounts payable modules also lack flexibility: 1099 processing and user-specifiable fields for sorting and analysis aren't very common.

Despite these limitations, the best low-end packages can satisfy many businesses' needs at a reasonable price.

How We Evaluated the Software

In searching for the best of the low-priced accounting packages, we looked for products whose quality has been recognized in independent evaluations. We settled on the following eight: 4-in-1 Basic Accounting, The Accounting Partner 3, Accpac Easy Accounting Series, Bedford Integrated Accounting, BusinessWorks PC, DacEasy Accounting, One-Write Plus, and Peachtree Complete II. Although some of these products offer many modules for one base price, this review focuses on the three staples of accounting: general ledger, accounts receivable, and accounts payable.

In judging the packages, we looked especially hard at ease of use. A package's menu system should use plain-English terms, and documentation should be helpful to novices. The data entry process should be intuitive and helped along with useful prompts.

Ralph Soucie and William Flora Error-trapping devices are very important, particularly for inexperienced users; the best programs display account descriptions during transaction entry and prevent the posting of unbalanced entries.

We prefer batch to real-time processing (in which entries are posted immediately to the general ledger), since it makes it easier to correct erroneous entries before they are posted. However, very small businesses may actually prefer real-time systems because they expedite entry.

Even low-cost packages should provide a good audit trail—a system for referencing transactions from the general ledger report to the individual journals. All the packages tested meet this minimum standard, but some use system-generated transaction numbers, which make tracing through the documents less of a chore.


Accounting software should also provide automated year-end closing and preferably maintain full transaction detail for the entire year until you decide to clear out prior detail. This system is more forgiving of ordinary slipups, because it allows you to enter adjustments into the periods containing the original erroneous transaction.

An important related feature is the ability to maintain several open periods at one time. You'll usually need to begin entering a new month's activity before you have all the information needed to close the prior month. Four open periods is a good minimum because it gets you through the IRS filing deadline without having to close out the prior year.

In our opinion, here's how the products reviewed in this article stack up. Business-Works and One-Write Plus top the list both in power and ease of use and are the most expensive of the group. In the second tier are Peachtree and 4-in-1, both very good values although less capable than the leaders. Bedford and DacEasy both include six or more modules in the base product yet are priced below \$250. Bedford is easy to use but doesn't offer many powerful features. Dac-Easy provides depth as well as breadth, but it still presents challenges to the new user. Accpac Easy has the least breadth and depth; it is also inexpensive and quite easy to use. The Accounting Partner 3 offers power but is difficult to learn.

Bedford Integrated Accounting 3.23D

Simple, no-frills *Bedford* is a solid choice for businesses with annual sales in the \$50,000-to-\$250,000 range, especially those that need

a job-cost module. It's not as powerful as *Peachtree* or *DacEasy*, but it's also less intimidating.

Bedford offers six modules—the standard trio plus payroll, inventory, and job cost—for a reasonable \$249. Installation and setup are generally easy, though creating the chart of accounts can be tedious. All account numbers in the program are limited to three digits, which could pose a problem for larger businesses.

Bedford is a real-time system; conveniently, you can make entries to any period of the year. However, you can't keep the prior year open while starting a new year—a serious deficiency, since most users have to wait at least two months to receive year-end adjustments from their accountants.

Although you can print financial statements for any period while the year is open, Bedford's reporting is otherwise limited. Budget and prior-year comparison options are lacking, and financial statements have an ungainly side-by-side design. Bedford Software reports that a new \$99 reporting module scheduled for release in the first quarter of 1989 will add comparison capabilities and graphs.

Despite its lack of on-line help, Bedford's logical menu structure and top-notch documentation should get novices off to a flying start. Overall, Bedford is good choice for businesses that require inventory, payroll, or job costing but whose accounting needs are otherwise basic.

One-Write Plus 2

One-Write Plus aims to closely approximate manual bookkeeping on a pegboard, or write-it-once, system. Though this concept may strike some as overly cute, it is so elegantly implemented that One-Write Plus is the easiest program to use in its class. Add a hefty list of features, and you have a topnotch accounting package for \$250—and PC World's Best Buy award. Excellent accounts receivable and accounts payable modules are also available for \$250 each.

The pegboard metaphor pervades the entire system, providing the same backdrop for all types of transactions. The cash disbursements entry screen looks like a check sitting on a sheet of paper. By scrolling the screen, you can reach as many as 50 expense columns.

One-Write's master module combines a general ledger with receipts and disbursements entry screens to provide true cashbasis accounting. Data entry is extremely efficient, and function keys are put to maximum advantage. You can enter transactions in any period in the current year and purge transaction detail as needed.

The master module prints checks singly or in batches and maintains addresses and other data for more than 100 customers or vendors. The separately priced accounts receivable and accounts payable modules expand those limits to 2000 entries and provide a fully functional accrual system. (Cash-basis accounting is not supported in these modules.) Customer and vendor master files are nicely detailed, and you can add new accounts while recording transactions. You can choose invoice formats for goods or services; billing for professional services is particularly well implemented.

Though you can't design your own financial statements in *One-Write Plus*, the standard statements should be more than acceptable for most users. A \$15 utility called Financial Statement Editor permits editing of the reports. For more powerful data query

and reporting capabilities, Great American Software offers a \$79 product called Datalink.

One-Write Plus's engaging interface and cash-basis capability add up to top value for small businesses. Well-designed accounts payable and accounts receivable modules provide expandability, though One-Write yields some ground to BusinessWorks in overall power.

The Accounting Partner 3 3.0P

The \$349 Accounting Partner is one of the more powerful low-cost packages, but it has a quirky interface. Its market is users who aren't intimidated by computerized accounting and who need strong inventory, purchase-order, and payroll functions in addition to basic accounting. All others should steer clear.

Star Software deserves credit for providing conveniences like multiple pricing codes, a pop-up calculator, and a spreadsheet module. You can also run *The Accounting Partner* on a network, although it's not designed as a multiuser product.

But idiosyncrasies keep cropping up. Entering transactions is problematic, moving within and between input screens is awkward, and if you blunder past a warning message, you can force the system to accept unbalanced general journal entries. End-ofThe well-designed transaction entry screen for One-Write Plus resembles a pegboard system. Fifty columns are available for disbursements.

period processing is particularly arcane and frustrating.

The Accounting Partner's reporting setup is unusually flexible for a product in this price range. DB Partner, a separate module available for \$195, adds extra query and reporting capabilities. Journal listings and analyses of purchase and sales activity are also very detailed. On-line help is adequate, but the manual is perfunctory.

The Accounting Partner's ability to do cash-basis accounting is a significant bonus. But overall, the learning effort this package requires makes it unsuitable for the average user.

DacEasy Accounting 3.0

DacEasy Accounting offers a broad range of modules and some powerful features for only \$99.95, but it's hobbled by an inflexible data base and unorthodox reporting. Although the interface has improved over the years, DacEasy is still not ideal for beginners. On the other hand, DacEasy is one of the few programs reviewed that comes with inventory and purchase-order modules. But if you don't need these functions, you're better off

spending the extra money on BusinessWorks or One-Write Plus.

To its credit, DacEasy offers an impressive array of power features. These include support for an unlimited number of accounts, customers, and vendors; quick maintenance of customer and vendor files during transaction entry; ratio analysis reports; and extremely sophisticated password protection.

But DacEasy may throw the unseasoned user off stride. Closing a period automatically deletes all transaction detail for that period, and for practical purposes (such as printing monthly financial statements) you can have only two open periods. We would also like to see better safeguards in the audit trail; novices can all too easily forget to print journal listings at crucial points.

DacEasy's departmental accounting is inflexible, and its reporting is a mixed bag. Budget and historical comparison capabilities are strong, and the program's multilevel account structure gives you considerable flexibility in grouping account balances. Yet the financial statements' overall format remains primitive. Many DacEasy users will have to resort to the optional \$99.95 Graph+Mate program to produce acceptable reports.

Although DacEasy offers impressive power for the money, it remains an uneven and eccentric product that requires more patience than the unsophisticated user should be expected to muster.

BusinessWorks PC 6.1

BusinessWorks is a slick program that's easy to use but powerful enough to satisfy the needs of many small and medium-size businesses. Its particularly intuitive menu system includes practically every report and feature such businesses will ever need. This combination of powerful features and ease of use merits PC World's Best Buy award.

Installation is smooth, and the system contains plenty of menu choices to get you started in setting up your company's books. You can use your own chart of accounts or one provided by the program. The documenta-

tion contains a useful tutorial based on accompanying sample data.

BusinessWorks is a real-time systemtransactions are posted as they are entered. The program holds up to 25 periods of data, which makes for good comparative reporting. Budgets can be done by department and then consolidated into the company total-a nice implementation. Another feature lists which reports have been printed, so that journals and supporting data are not inadvertently lost prior to closing the period and clearing out the detail.

The accounts receivable module features a full range of reports and options, including invoice printing and finance-charge calculations. Both accounts receivable and accounts payable offer a Flash report, which contains critical customer data in summary form.

BusinessWorks is one of the more expensive packages in this roundup-for \$695, you get general ledger, accounts receivable, and accounts payable modules; or you can purchase the modules separately for \$295, plus \$95 for a mandatory system manager. If you're looking for an intuitive, mediumpriced accounting package that can do just about everything, BusinessWorks should be on your short list.

4-in-1 Basic Accounting 1.0

4-in-1 is a solid choice for small businesses with annual sales in the range of \$200,000 to \$1,000,000. It should appeal in particular to businesses that need its cash-basis posting option and require an impeccable audit trail.

4-in-1 bundles general ledger, accounts receivable, accounts payable, and payroll modules for \$249.95. Its automated installation offers a choice of three master charts of accounts or lets you create your own. Predesigned financial statement formats accompany the master charts.

Transaction entry screens aren't quite as helpful as they might be-only one line of a transaction is visible at a time. But full transaction detail is maintained for the current year-a very desirable feature. If you run short of disk space, detail can be summarized and purged on a date you specify.

The accounts receivable and payable modules have sufficient features and flexibility to satisfy the requirements of most small businesses, though they inconveniently omit lookup capability for account distributions. 4-in-1 is one of two packages tested that allow the user to post subledgers to the general ledger on either a cash or an accrual basis.

4-in-1's financial reporting capabilities, although not extensive, are adequate for small businesses. Documentation is satisfactory

The Accounting Partner 3's invoice entry screen is not particularly easy to follow. Note that the program doesn't supply account descriptions (items 6 and 7).

and well organized, though the package includes neither sample data nor a disk-based tutorial.

Although a good all-around package, 4-in-1 falls somewhat short of BusinessWorks and One-Write Plus in overall power and ease of use. Still, it merits serious consideration because of its useful features and competitive price.

Accpac Easy Accounting Series 1.0A

At \$89, Accpac Easy is the least expensive and least powerful program in this group. Unlike the others, it doesn't provide niceties such as lookup windows or invoice printing. Reporting is less powerful, too—Accpac Easy won't do mailing labels or permit customized financial statements.

That said, Accpac Easy's main advantage is that it's truly easy to get going. Electronic worksheets assist in the orderly collection of data. The menu system is based on the functional areas of a small business—an approach that simplifies the learning process.

Accpac Easy handles up to four open periods at a time. A command queue that batches multiple menu items can be used for such conveniences as printing multiple reports. Another desirable feature allows the user to set up journals with prompts for the

most frequently used accounts, simplifying data entry and improving reliability.

A payroll module is available for \$89. Users receive a \$50 credit per module when they upgrade to *Accpac BPI* or \$75 per module for upgrading to *Accpac Plus*, the vendor's more comprehensive accounting packages. In the interim, the inexpensive, straightforward *Accpac Easy* may be shy on power but is still a good option for small home-based businesses grossing less than six figures.

Peachtree will appeal to companies that need a comprehensive accounting system at a modest price. For \$199, it provides general ledger, accounts receivable invoicing, accounts payable, inventory, fixed assets, job cost, and payroll—more modules than even DacEasy.

Peachtree is generally easy to set up and use. You can assign up to nine source codes to different types of journal entries. But all journals require you to make an offsetting entry, instead of providing it automatically.

The accounts receivable module is full featured and well implemented, including such options as modifiable aging intervals. Pop-up prompt windows for account and customer entries prove very helpful.

Both accounts receivable and accounts payable modules can be run independently or integrated with the general ledger. One note of caution: *Peachtree* allows users to specify whether the program should accept unbalanced transactions or require printing of audit trail reports. If users forget to check these items, they may overlook errors.

The package supports multiple companies and consolidations. Reports are adequate though not extensive. For businesses that require more reporting capabilities, a data query module is available for an additional \$99 (if purchased in bundled form).

Peachtree is marred by two flaws. Its audit trail meets the minimum standards, but because it uses only dates for cross-referencing transactions, you may have to flip through a lot of paper to track down a given transaction if you post from a journal several times in one day. The program also suffers from an annoying inability to have more than one period open at one time.

But if you can live with these shortcomings, *Peachtree* is an excellent deal, offering more modules and features per dollar than any package we know of. It provides a better interface and more modules than many programs at a very low cost.

The Bottom Line

BusinessWorks and One-Write Plus are the best of the bunch. If you need all three BusinessWorks modules, you can't do better for \$695. But if all you want is general accounting, One-Write Plus's master module is an outstanding deal. At \$250, it boasts the best interface and documentation in the group. One-Write's other modules aren't bad, either.

Aggressively priced *Peachtree* is an easily justifiable choice, especially if you need jobcost or fixed-assets modules. 4-in-1 is a good all-around package, especially if you want cash-basis accounting, and at \$249.95, the price is right. However, both lag behind the leaders in features and flexibility.

DacEasy offers many modules and features, but it's slightly quirky. Bedford's six modules are easier to use than DacEasy's but lighter on power. Although Accpac Easy is extremely limited, in terms of price and features it's fine for the fledgling home business. Finally, The Accounting Partner 3, while powerful, is not intuitive enough to be recommended for a general audience.

But what if, among all these low-cost contenders, you can't find a system that is strong in all the right areas? One solution is to go high end. If you want to save money, another alternative is to shore up the weak spots with a spreadsheet or a data base application. If a low-cost system doesn't offer a job-cost module, for example, you can track job costs on a spreadsheet, provided your

needs are relatively modest. Or you can use a graphing package to produce better-looking management reports. As long as the solution isn't a kludge, the money you save could be substantial.



TOPS—The Low-End Link to Macs

Looking for a friendly PC LAN that lets you connect PCs, Macs, and LaserWriters without spending a bundle?

TOPS may be the answer.

hen businesspeople think about LANs, they generally think of two kinds: high-end, full-featured work-group products, like *NetWare* and *3+Share*; and low-end serial LANs that offer little more than file transfer and printer sharing. TOPS (Transcendental OPerating System), a low-cost, twisted-pair LAN from Sun Microsystems, falls somewhere in between.

TOPS 2.0 provides many features of the high-end LANs at a fraction of the cost—and requires neither a costly, dedicated server nor a costly, dedicated network administrator. Its biggest plus is that it lets you connect PCs with Macs and LaserWriters. Its biggest minus is that you can't run multiuser network applications like dBASE, Higgins, or WordPerfect 5.0.

TOPS is memory resident but it's well-behaved; it runs alongside SideKick, SuperKey, and most other popular TSR applications without a hitch. Easy to use and install, its biggest drawbacks (aside from lack of multiuser support) are low speed and an official 32-node ceiling. In fact, if you try to run more than 10 nodes you're asking for trouble.

Within these limits, however, TOPS delivers the goods. Like the big-league LANs, it lets you copy files from one computer to another, access remote data files, run programs that reside on remote computers, share printers, and exchange E-mail. But for most

users, TOPS's main attraction is the way it bridges the chasm between the two leading personal computer platforms by allowing PCs and Macs to exchange files, share printers, and send E-mail. (Unfortunately, neither TOPS nor any other network can enable you to run Mac applications on a PC, or vice versa.)

Up in a Hurry

Setting up TOPS hardware is delightfully simple. Each PC needs a half-length 8-bit network board called a Flashcard, along with a Teleconnector—a small adapter with two standard telephone jacks that attaches to the Flashcard. (If you're looking for a slot-saving alternative, Hercules will sell you a special version of its Graphics Card Plus with a TOPS port added; no additional Flashcard is required.)

Since networking capability is built into every Apple LaserWriter and Macintosh, these components don't need Flashcards; you can attach Teleconnectors to them directly. Then, just link the Teleconnectors with standard twisted-pair telephone cable, and you're networked. (A TOPS network can span 4000 feet—12,000 feet with a \$189 repeater.)

Installing TOPS software is equally painless. On the PC side, you use the menu-

Robert Lauriston driven installation program to copy the program to your hard disk. You may also need to edit a parameters file with a word processor; this procedure is a bit tricky for first-timers and would be far easier to handle if it were part of the installation program. On the Mac, you run the Installer to copy the software to the Mac's hard disk and then drag the appropriate printer files into your system folder with the mouse.

Working on the Net

Logging on to a TOPS network requires no password; you just run a simple batch file. The familiar DOS prompt appears, and you can go right to work as usual.

Although TOPS runs at only 750 kilobits per second (significantly slower than ethernet's 10 megabits), under normal circumstances network access seems as fast as if you were reading data off a local hard disk. Under heavy usage, however, you'll notice performance degradation as the number of users increases.

Accessing remote data or hardware, or making your own data available to others—a procedure known as *publishing*—is done via the simple TOPS menu. Using the menu, you can assign drive letters to remote directories (whether on a PC or a Mac); you can also identify remote printers as ports (LPT1, COM1, and so on) and then install your applications to use those ports automatically. Once you've acquired access to a useful set of remote directories and printers, you can save those assignments to a batch file and load them automatically each time you start up.

Because a TOPS network has no central server, the notion of a network printer requires some adjustment. TOPS allows you to use any printer connected to any PC, assuming the user of that PC has made it available and you have given it a port assignment, as well as any Apple LaserWriter connected directly to the net. (The \$189 NetPrint program is required if you want to print from within DOS applications to an Apple printer.) TOPS provides a print queue that displays a list of jobs waiting to print, client names, and the size of each job.

Some programs available for both the PC and the Mac (such as PageMaker and Micro-

soft Word) can use TOPS to open compatible data files on any PC or Mac on the network. For other programs, TOPS includes a Mac application that can convert most data files—like those created in 1-2-3, WordStar, and MultiMate—to and from foreign formats quickly and effectively.

The Bottom Side of TOPS

Since TOPS does *not* require an administrator, administrative options are minimal. For instance, full network backup is impossible. You can back up your own work, of course, and any published directory can be

TOPS TOPS ITSELF

According to Sun, TOPS 2.1, a major upgrade at no increase in cost, should be shipping by the time you read this. It will offer ethernet and NETBIOS support, full DOS 3.3 file and record locking, WordPerfect 5.0 compatibility, and an option that allows you to install a stripped-down version of the operating system that uses only 90K of memory. Upgrades to previously installed systems will be available for \$30 to \$45.

backed up on any other PC. However, if any directories are unpublished, there's no way for a system administrator to back up the whole network. Security is also a weak area.

Another of TOPS's major flaws is its hunger for memory. It eats 220K of RAM; after loading DOS and TOPS on a 640K machine,

you may be left with as little as 350K—not enough to load large spreadsheets or run RAM-intensive applications. As a solution, TOPS suggests RYBS Electronics' Hicard, which includes a memory management program that allows most TSRs, including

Not the Tops, but Good Enough

If Mac connectivity is not a big issue at your office, or multiuser capability is, you may do better with Novell's entry-level NetWare ELS, which provides higher performance (via ethernet), multiuser support, better security features, and an upgrade path at about the same price. However, NetWare ELS is limited to 5 nodes; theoretically, TOPS can go as high as 32, although 10 or 12 is the practical limit. Moreover, NetWare does not yet talk to Macs

3 + Share does talk to Macs; what's more, it's faster than TOPS and offers full multiuser support. But this power doesn't come cheap. To connect four PCs, one Mac, and a LaserWriter with 3 + Share, you'll pay about \$10,000 (not including the workstation computers and printer), while a comparable TOPS installation comes in at only \$3000. 3 + Share may also require costly attention from an installation consultant, as well as a trained administrator.

TOPS is one of those products that trade off a certain amount of power in return for a tempting price and ease of use. If Mac connectivity is a must and you can forgo multi-

CONS: Slow, small hard drive; meager standard memory; limited device-expansion capacity

When IBM first announced its line of PS/2 computers, it claimed the new Micro Channel bus was the architecture of the future. Many users were not convinced. The new PS/2 Model 30 286 suggests that even IBM may be starting to wonder whether the Micro Channel is the *only* road to the future. The first PS/2 that reverts to IBM's original 16-bit AT bus, this sleek new 80286 system combines the familiar features of the good ol' AT with the compact modernism of the PS/2.

The Model 30 286 (\$3405 with 1MB of RAM, a 1.44MB 3½-inch disk drive, a VGA color monitor, and a 20MB hard disk that boasts its own on-board controller) sports a highly integrated motherboard with built-in VGA; floppy controller; parallel, serial, and mouse ports; and a socket for the hard drive—all packed into a slim silhouette. On the downside, its 10-MHz CPU running at one wait state is a bit underwhelming now that 12-MHz systems are more common. But its most serious drawback is a slow (80ms), low-capacity (20MB) hard disk.

Thanks to the disk caching software that IBM bundles with it, the Model 30 286 performed decently on National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL) benchmarks, despite the slow drive. The system ran neck and neck with the original 10-MHz IBM Model 50 (not shown) and the AST Premium/286 Workstation 243X. As you might imagine, it passed the NSTL Crash Test without a hitch.

The basic system includes a measly 512K of 120ns RAM, a low count considering that many 80286-based machines now come with 1MB of standard RAM. On the other hand,

the well-designed motherboard holds up to 4MB of RAM via two upgrade options—512K (\$215) or 2MB (\$995). There's a socket for an 80287 math coprocessor as well.

The unit's small size necessitates some trade-offs. For instance, there's room for only three 8/16-bit expansion slots; but because IBM has built so much into the system board, the three-slot limit won't be much of a problem for most users.

Other compromises are harder to take. Not only is the Model 30 saddled with a slow, small hard drive, you're stuck with it, and IBM has revealed no plans to offer a faster or larger drive. Furthermore, with hard disk and floppy drives occupying the Model 30's two half-height drive bays, adding a second internal hard disk requires a hard disk on a card, such as Plus Development's Hardcard.

With its thoughtful package of mother-board integration, small footprint, and familiar AT bus, the Model 30 286 could have been a big winner, a kind of latter-day AT. But the old IBM foibles persist. A single hard disk option, and a poor one at that, is unacceptable, and selling an 80286 machine with only 512K is downright silly.

And as usual, the price is wrong; for only \$50 more, you could get the small-footprint AST Premium/286 Workstation with a fast, 40MB hard drive. Still, for many business users, Big Blue's reputation for reliability and service outweighs everything else, and for those poor, benighted souls the Model 30 286 may well be the AT of the nineties.




Two New Systems Race the Competition

IBM's PS/2 Model 30 286 runs neck and neck with AST's small-footprint Premium/286 Workstation 243X on 1-2-3, Word, and dBASE but slips a bit behind on C. Predictably, the 16-MHz Arche Pro-File 286 trounces the 12-MHz Compag Deskpro 286.







All machines were tested with a coprocessor and a disk cache consisting of 256K in extended memory for all tests except the 1-2-3 benchmark. The 12-MHz Compaq Deskpro 286 was configured with a 42MB hard disk and 2.1MB of RAM. The 16-MHz Arche Pro-File 286 was configured with a 40MB hard disk and 3.7MB of RAM. The 10-MHz AST Premium/286 Work station 243X was tested with a 20MB hard disk and 1MB of RAM. The 10-MHz IBM PS/2 Model 30 286 was tested with a 20MB hard disk and 1MB of RAM.

Microsoft Word 4.0

A Microsoft Word macro loads a 35-page, 140-paragraph document and performs search-and-replace and spell-checking operations. The first page of the document is then printed. Although the results of the benchmark depend primarily on processor and memory access speeds, display adapter and hard disk speeds are also contributing factors.

dBASE III Plus 1.1

The dBASE III Plus test measures the time required to prepare and print a report of past-due invoices. The report includes calculated fields and is based on three files: a 500-record customer file, a 1000-record invoice file, and a 2000-record item file. When disk caching is not used, the random access speed of the hard disk is, after processor speed, the most significant factor in this benchmark. With disk caching, sequential read performance becomes more important than random access.

1-2-3 2.01

In this benchmark, a 1-2-3 macro executes a series of recalculations using five different formulas within a 75-by-75-cell matrix. Because there are few screen updates and no screen access is required, the results depend almost entirely on processing and memory access speeds.

Microsoft C 5.0

The Microsoft C benchmark measures the time required to compile and link XUSP, a public-domain program composed of 25 C source code files. The most important factors in this benchmark are processor and memory access speeds. The performance of the hard disk is also a factor; generally, disk caching has little effect.


AutoCAD 9

In this benchmark, a three-dimensional sample drawing is retrieved and displayed using AutoCAD's EGA driver. The zoom function is used to display the drawing from various perspectives; then the full drawing is printed. The results of the benchmark depend primarily on the speeds at which the processor and coprocessor operate and at which memory is accessed. The performance of the display adapter and the hard disk also have some effect.



With more and more 80286 systems running at 16 and even 20 MHz, many business users are finding it harder to justify shelling out the extra bucks for an 80386. The Arche Pro-File 286 tower is a perfect case in point. With its swift 16-MHz CPU and a 28ms hard disk, the Pro-File 286 not only outperforms most 286s, it can give more than one 80386 system a run for the money—especially on CPU-intensive benchmarks like 1-2-3 and Microsoft Word.

Configured with 1MB of RAM, a 1.2MB floppy drive, a 44MB Microscience hard disk, and an EGA board and monitor (VGA is not

currently available), the Pro-File 286 lists for \$4330. Standard features include a ROM-based utility that allows you to install peripherals without setting motherboard jumpers, and support for up to 8MB of RAM accessible at full CPU speed.

No disk caching software comes with the Pro-File 286, but with the popular *PC-Kwik* disk caching program installed, Arche's machine clobbered the 12-MHz Compaq 286 (which costs \$1167 more) in every test. In fact, the Pro-File stuck impressively close to the 16-MHz Compaq Deskpro/386 (not shown) on 1-2-3, *Microsoft Word*, and *dBASE III* benchmarks. Furthermore, it boasts impeccable software compatibility; it aced the NSTL Crash Test without a problem.

The Pro-File's motherboard holds up to 4MB of 100-nanosecond, 1-megabit DRAM chips. In addition, Arche provides an 8/16-bit slot with an extra connector that lets you access another 4MB of RAM (on a proprietary \$240 expansion board) at a full 16 MHz. If you prefer to use this slot for a conventional expansion board, the board will run at industry-standard 8 MHz.

The expansion bus also contains two conventional 8-bit and five conventional 8/16-bit slots. However, once you plug an Adaptec disk controller and an I/O board into two of the 8/16-bit slots and a display adapter into an 8-bit slot, you've got just five slots left open; use the special 16-MHz slot for memory expansion, and you're down to four. That's fine for a desktop unit, but only average for a tower.

Device expandability is outstanding, though. There are four externally accessible half-height bays—two for 5½-inch floppy drives and two for 3½-inch drives—and additional space inside for two full-height 5½-inch hard drives. There's even room for a third full-height hard drive just below the 275-watt power supply.

The Pro-File's ergonomics are excellent. Indicators and power and reset switches are conveniently located on a front panel near the top of the tower. A large digital readout located next to the on/off switch prominently

displays the CPU speed, which is switchable between 16 and 8 MHz.

The little touches are all well done. Setup and configuration are easy thanks to an unusual ROM-based, switchless installation utility. You also get a hardware memory controller that can turn RAM above 1MB into EMS 4.0 memory. DOS 3.3 and GW BASIC come free.

The Pro-File 286 is one of the best 80286 systems we've looked at. Features like switchless setup, built-in EMS 4.0 support, and an 8MB high-speed-memory capacity make it unique—and its 16-MHz CPU makes it one of the hottest AT compatibles we've ever tested. True, it's not cheap. You can buy a lowball 80386 clone, such as the 20-MHz Micro 1 Tower (see The Hardware Shelf, PCW, November 1988), for \$600 less-and get the ability to run programs like Windows/386. But the Arche is obviously a cut above the usual low-end bargain, and intangibles like reliability and good engineering can be worth more than a few dollars saved. -TJ Buers

Hewlett-Packard LaserJet IID

Laser printer

PROS: Prints on both sides of paper, 400-sheet capacity

CONS: Big, heavy, expensive

For several years, Hewlett-Packard's Laser-Jet Series II has been the printer of choice in the business market. Now HP has released the LaserJet IID, a powerhouse designed for high-end, heavy-duty office applications. The 8-page-per-minute (ppm) LaserJet IID retains the handiest features of the Series IIthe convenient toner cartridge, the easy-touse front control panel, the painless paper path, the twin font-cartridge slots. The IID adds duplex (two-sided) printing and an optional envelope feeder, doubles the II's 200sheet paper tray capacity, raises the monthly usage limit from 12,000 to 16,000 pages, and augments the II's six internal fonts with eight additional built-in fonts and ten more included on a Times/Helvetica font cartridge.

The new machine is not cheap; it costs a cool \$4295, compared with \$2695 for the II and \$3799 for Toshiba's 12-ppm PageLaser 12. And its bulk and weight make it hard to move. But the IID's duplex capability and envelope-feeding option will be welcome features at most offices.

The duplex capability lets you print documents using half the number of sheets. The feature works flawlessly, although it slows throughput and causes the printer to emit alarming clanks. However, no current word processors support duplex printing directly; you must turn it on via the front panel or an escape sequence.

Unfortunately, the complicated duplex paper path requires an oversize housing. The IID is about twice as large as the II and, at 74 pounds, weighs nearly twice as much. Moving it to another desk, let alone another office, is a major operation.

The optional envelope feeder (\$350) attaches in about 15 seconds. It works fairly well but, again, cannot be accessed directly





HP LaserJet IID Aces Out Toshiba PageLaser 12


Hewlett-Packard's LaserJet IID is rated at only 8 pages per minute, but it whips the 12-ppm Page-Laser 12 on graphics printing and on NSTL's combination of text and graphics. It trails the PageLaser on text printing with an HPLaser1 driver, but only by a few seconds.

Benchmarks were conducted using a 12-MHz Compaq Deskpro 286 Model 40 equipped with 1,2MB of RAM. Text printing speed was tested using a typical business document created with Microsoft Word 4.0. NSTL tests prove the 8-ppm-rated IID to be a speed demon. It even beat Toshiba's 12-ppm PageLaser 12 on graphics and text-and-graphics benchmarks and trailed the Page-Laser by only a few seconds on plain text printed with an HPLaser1 driver. The tests turned up no software incompatibilities, although it was not possible to use duplex with PageMaker.

The IID comes with 640K of built-in memory—128K more than the II, but still not enough for a full page of bit-mapped graphics. The printer has room for up to 4MB of additional RAM.

Toshiba's PageLaser 12 costs \$500 less and offers an optional envelope feeder. But the IID's extra features outweigh the Page-Laser's cost advantages. If you want a heavy-duty print engine, lots of fonts, duplex printing, and LaserJet reliability, there's only one choice: Hewlett-Packard, the winnah and still champeen. —M. G.

two standouts: the \$445 Intel 2400B and the \$549 MultiTech MT224ES.

Both are more or less Hayes compatible, run at 2400 bps, and use the PS/2's speaker for audio output. But that's where the similarities end. The 2400B is a plain-vanilla modem with basic features and provides neither bundled software nor on-line freebies. The MT224ES, on the other hand, is loaded with extra features.

The MT224ES is, among other things, the first PS/2 modem to offer hardware-based MNP class 5 error correction and data compression. Used together, the techniques can boost the MT224ES's throughput to 4800 bps, provided the modem at the other end of the line also supports MNP class 5. Of course, you pay for the power. The MT224ES runs \$100 more than the 2400B.

The MT224ES includes a version of the popular *ProComm* communications package customized to access the modem's hardware-based protocol features. You also get discount coupons worth over \$400 in registration fees and on-line connect time.

While both modems support the Hayes AT command set, the 2400B does a better job, implementing all but one unimportant AT command. The MT224ES lacks support for 9 AT commands. To compensate, it provides 25 proprietary commands, most of which are related to its hardware-based protocols.

When it comes to assessing the Micro Channel's extended set of serial ports, the Intel 2400B wins hands down. While the MT224ES is limited to dialing out via COM1 through COM4, you can configure the 2400B to access COM1 through COM7 and thereby use a much wider range of serial port devices.

NSTL tests show the 2400B and MT224ES equal the Hayes Smartmodem 2400P in both software compatibility and performance. The Intel is a bit more sensitive to phase and amplitude jitter than the other two, but under normal conditions you'd never notice.



NSTL tested each modem's ability to transmit data occurately over noisy telephone lines using the TAS 1010 VoiceBand Channel Simulator. The system includes the Network Simulator, which mimics public and leased lines, and the Modem Test Unit, which automatically runs desired data back and forth between the test modem and a control Hayes Smortmodem 2400 and calculates resulting data transmission errors. In these tests, 10K simulated test files in 100-byte blocks were received by each examined modem and the block errors measured and reported. All tests were performed in originate mode. Starting values for the

key impairments tested—white noise, phase jitter, and amplitude jitter—were based on AT&T Bell Lobs* 1982-1983 End Office Connection Study. White-noise impairments ranged from 10:1 to 19:1. An impairment was lessened one step at a time to determine the point at which a modem could correct all the errors in a transmitted block. (In the MultiTech MT224ES white-noise test, for example, at the 13:1 signal-to-noise ratio, an average of 97 out of every 100 blocks contained errors. The error rate dropped to 0 at 18:1.)

Phase jitter tests were conducted in the same manner; phase jitter intensities spanned 35 de-

grees to 18 degrees. In the amplitude jitter tests, the intensity of the impairment ranged from a maximum of 35 percent to 19 percent.

Note: The impairments encountered on average phone lines are much lower, and these modems should have no difficulty communicating under normal circumstances. The average signal-to-white-noise ratio is 34:1; phase jitter is 8 degrees; and amplitude jitter, 4 percent.



PROS: Fast, easy to install

CONS: Cannot boot OS/2, slow insertion/ejection process

Removable hard disks offer infinite headroom, data portability, and excellent security (if the data is locked in a safe, no one can fiddle with it). Until recently, however, removables tended to be slow and difficult to install (see "Removable Resources," *PCW*, December 1987).

Plus Development's removable Passport drive is a breakthrough: It's not cheap (the 20MB unit costs \$1250), but it eliminates most of the installation agony. And at 28ms average access time, it is impressively fast, rivaling even the speedier conventional hard drives.

The Passport system consists of a docking unit that mounts permanently in a vacant half-height drive bay; a half-length, 8-bit controller board; and a 20MB or 40MB cartridge—actually a sealed Winchester drive—that slides into the docking unit. It takes 16 seconds for the drive to settle in and spin up to speed. Pressing a button on the face of the unit locks the heads and ejects the cartridge in 12 seconds. The 20MB and 40MB cartridges can be used interchangeably with the same Passport docking unit.

The Passport boasts some savvy features. Convenient switches on the back of the cartridge allow you to designate it as the boot drive, or make it read-only for extra data security. With your choice of controller cards,

the Passport works equally well in AT-bus and PS/2 machines. To speed performance even further, Plus builds a read/write buffer for disk caching right into the controller.

Installing the Passport system takes about 90 minutes, and while it's a fairly simple procedure, it's not for the faint of heart. You may have to move some boards and cables to slide the docking unit and controller board into place. Still, compared with the older generation of removables, the Passport's a dream: no cable switching, no jumper pulling, no major hassle.

The cartridges are engineered to withstand falls from up to 2 feet. In fact, when a cartridge was accidentally knocked off my desk, it showed no ill effects. A fail-safe hardware system called Airlock physically lifts the heads away from the disk's media whenever power is turned off (or fails).

The Plus Passport offers a winning combination of easy installation and excellent performance. If you've been waiting for someone to work out all the bugs before you "go removable," your wait is over. —Paul Meyers



Want to pepper a report with a few charts, but haven't time to master *Freelance Plus* or *Harvard Graphics*? Take heart. The low end of the chart-making scale has a pair of inexpensive packages that can get even a novice graphing within minutes. *PFS: First Graphics 1.0*, a subset of *Harvard Graphics* from Software Publishing Corporation, shines in its editing control over text and chart attributes, and in the quality of its output. But if you want quick and dirty graphs, try the latest version of New England Software's RAM-resident wonder *Graph-in-the-Box*.

Though neither package has any drawing talent, both sport solid charting features. Each program offers variations on six basic graph types and provides reasonable control over colors, line styles, titles, and labels. PFS: First Graphics' forte is word charts, making it a natural for desktop presentations. Graph-in-the-Box's strong suit is grabbing data from applications as easily as painting a worksheet range.

Graph-in-the-Box has long been known for its snap-and-show approach to chart making. Open the package over any application—
1-2-3, say—mark the beginning and end of a data range, and you can put a graph on screen in seconds. The current update of this once toylike program has gained grown-up features, including a much-improved chart selection and 16-color palettes for EGA and VGA displays. (New England's new \$199.95

Graph-in-the-Box Analytic offers even more graph types.) Moreover, Graph-in-the-Box exports files in a wealth of formats—including CGM, PostScript, HPGL, and DIF—so you can slug charts into documents produced with such programs as WordPerfect 5.0, Ventura Publisher, and PageMaker. Graph-in-the-Box also supports some 100 printers and 30 plotters.

By contrast, about all you can do with First Graphics charts is print them; only Software Publishing's Professional Write and Harvard Graphics can use the program's image files. On the import side, First Graphics supports only 1-2-3 worksheet files. Even worksheets from PFS: Professional Plan, Software Publishing's own spreadsheet program, must be converted to .WKS or .WK1 format before you can use them in First Graphics.

First Graphics' main strength is its healthy selection of attractive charts, including overlapping bar, 3-D bar and pie, scatterplot, word, area, and high/low/close charts. Graph-in-the Box's selection is a bit more limited, including clustered bar, vertical area, scatter, step, step-and-filled-area, pie, and mixed charts—with no 3-D effects.

Though it's more Spartan, *Graph-in-the-Box* offers lightning speed and the freedom to change your mind. You can quickly toggle through chart types, colors, and other attributes on a layout screen, then press a function key to see the results. The layout screen also lets you edit titles and axis labels and set scaling. You change the underlying data in a separate, worksheetlike screen, where you can also add new values to a chart. But where *First Graphics* gives full control over fonts, *Graph-in-the-Box* limits users to a default font and text size.

Though options are limited in these packages, both make it easy to customize a chart. First Graphics automatically fills in variables such as days of the week, dates, and so on. Graph-in-the-Box lacks this depth of control, but it offers more line types, fill patterns, and scatter marks. And you can instantly





change a chart's background color, something you can't do in *First Graphics*.

First Graphics gains its most noticeable edge with word charts, which can be bulleted lists or free-form. It comes with five fonts including Roman, Sans Serif, and Gothic, and lets you specify text sizes ranging

Memory-resident Graph-inthe-Box grabs data and displays it in seconds. from 1 to 32 points. You can't mix fonts in the same chart, but you can highlight text in different colors.

If you need to generate word charts for desktop presentations, *PFS: First Graphics* should get your nod. Its richer options and steeper learning curve pay off in better-looking charts. But if you're in a rush, grab *Graph-in-the-Box*. Charting doesn't get any easier. —*Alan Southerton*



Turbo Pascal 5.0 continues this metamorphosis, offering built-in symbolic debugging, expanded graphics support, and the return of version 3.0's overlay capability.

As Turbo Pascal's power increases, so do its price and memory requirements—now 448K, up from 384K. In NSTL tests, Turbo Pascal 5.0's lightning-fast compilation speeds were slower than its predecessor's, but the programs it compiles executed faster.






Turbo Pascal 5.0: Better Than Ever

Turbo Pascal 5.0 compiles a tad slower than 4.0, but its programs execute faster.



Benchmarks were performed on an 8-MHz IBM AT Model 339 with a 30MB hard disk and a monochrome video adapter. Three programs, 8tree and 5ort 1 from the Turbo Pascal 3.01 Database toolbox and Chess from the 3.0 Gameworks toolbox, were used to compare 3.0 to 4.0 and 3.0 to 5.0. Because Turbo Pascal 4.0 and 5.0 use different syntax from 3.0, the Upgrade program provided for 5.0 was used to convert the test programs for use with 5.0.

The Btree benchmark sent all 1000 records of randomly generated data—indexed by customer



code and customer name—to a null printer (a device that simulates an infinitely fast printer, one not slowed by paper or printhead movement). The Sort benchmark read from disk the sample customer file provided with the Database toolbox, sorted the data in memory, and then displayed the records on the screen. Almost all the difference in execution speeds is due to the difference in screen updating routines of 3.0 versus 4.0 and 5.0. The Chess benchmark timed how long the program took to respond to a particular move in a specific situation, with the program's "performance level" set to five.

each version took to compile the test programs' ASCII source code files into .EXEs.

The biggest addition to version 5.0 is symbolic debugging, which lets you execute a program one line at a time and track down errors quickly. The built-in debugger takes over if you hit <Ctrl>-<Break> while the program is running. The code that was executing appears in the edit window, and you can examine and change any of the variables. If the program is in the middle of a procedure or function, you can find out what procedure called it. You can then restart the program where it left off, or continue stepping through it line by line.

To make the program stop every time execution reaches a certain line—just as if you'd pressed <Ctrl>-<Break> there—you set a breakpoint on that line. You can also speci-

fy watch variables, whose values are displayed in a window every time execution stops.

Borland has also brought out *Turbo Debugger* for use with Pascal, C, and assembly language. Unlike *Turbo Pascal*'s built-in debugger, *Turbo Debugger* can trace all .COM and .EXE files at the machine-instruction level and use the 80386 in virtual mode. For \$250, you can get *Turbo Pascal*, *Turbo Debugger*, and the fast *Turbo Assembler*— Borland's first assembly language release—packaged together as *Turbo Pascal Professional*.

Add-on programs aren't the only enhancements to *Turbo Pascal 5.0*. The ability to



create overlays—available in version 3.0 but dropped in 4.0—is back, letting you once again write a program larger than available RAM and load it from disk one piece at a time. In version 3.0, you had to declare overlays as "overlay procedures" or "overlay functions," and they couldn't be recursive. In version 5.0, you can code them exactly like ordinary procedures or functions (including the ability to use recursion) and use the calling program to place them in an overlay or in memory. *Turbo Pascal 5.0* can store overlays in expanded memory, and the debugger can trace overlaid code.

Version 5.0 also has automatic coprocessor emulation, so a single compiled *Turbo Pascal* program can run on machines with and without coprocessors. The program uses an 8087, 80287, or 80387 math coprocessor if one is present. If it's missing, the program uses the CPU to emulate it.

The new version expands graphics support somewhat. It supports the IBM 8514/A in its 1024-by-768-pixel mode and gives you two new procedures, SetRGBPalette and Set-RGBColor, to access the VGA's full range of 262,144 colors.

Turbo Pascal 5.0 does have one really annoying habit. In the editor/compiler environment, as soon as a program finishes running, its output disappears from the screen. You can bring it back by pressing <Alt>-<F5>, but this is an awkward step.

Still, *Turbo Pascal* is unique. It's a versatile, universal package, and no other Pascal

compiler comes close. Plus, good third-party subroutine packages, such as *Turbo-Plus 5.0* from Nostradamus in Orem, Utah, take the headaches out of windows, menus, and file manipulation. Many of us like Pascal because it's simpler than BASIC and less cryptic than C. Unless you're a professional programmer, there's no reason to look to any other language for greater power or efficiency.





create up to eight "managed" (virtual) DOS serial or parallel ports, each with a set of printing parameters. Then you configure each of your applications to use a vanilla text driver (often called ASCII or Standard Printer) to print to one of the ports. *Trading Post* works its magic by intercepting printer output sent to a virtual port and funneling it to the actual port your printer is attached to.

Thanks to a generous series of pulldown menus, installing *Trading Post* is quick work. You configure the managed ports by specifying such parameters as orientation, typeface and size, lines per page, paper bin, and so on. For spreadsheets, you might set up a port (LPT1:, for instance) to print 6-point Helvetica text in landscape mode on legalsize paper. Another managed port might be set up to print your data base reports in 10-point Times Roman in portrait mode on letter-size paper. Finally, you could use a third port to print from programs that speak Post-Script.

After configuring the ports, you tell *Trading Post* what port your printer is attached to, and whether it's connected to a print spooler or network. *Trading Post* can even raise the serial port bps rate from 9600 to as much as 57,600 (if you can find a printer that communicates reliably at that speed). Laser-Tools claims network software that intercepts printer output will work with the program.

Trading Post's biggest failing is that it allows PostScript-clueless programs to print only straight text. Even if your data base package lets you specify boldface or underlining for a text selection, it won't print that way. Everything in the document is in the same font, with no special attributes. Don't expect to print justified text, either; your software thinks it's printing to a dumb printer, not a typesetter.

Trading Post's snazziest feature is the way it lets you set and forget special print parameters for each of your applications. But its biggest benefit is also the most basic one: Trading Post finally lets PostScript owners use their high-end printers with common PC programs. —Steve Roth



from kayaks to pantyhose. It's light fare, but you can't beat the price: \$9.95 a month buys unlimited on-line time for up to six people in one household.

To access Prodigy, you need a \$49.95 start-up kit that includes instructions and the service's custom telecommunications software. An extra \$100 gets you a special pocket-size Hayes 1200-bps modem that plugs directly into a wall outlet.

For a service designed for home computerniks, however, Prodigy demands the hardware of a business PC. It requires a graphics adapter, yet only displays color screens with a EGA card. It doesn't support the VGA and won't run with an IBM EGA card hooked to a monochrome monitor. Worse, it's grievously slow when running on anything less than an AT.

Prodigy's custom software generates video pyrotechnics on cue from the on-line system, so Prodigy doesn't have to transmit its art deco over pokey phone lines. But the program chews up 512K of RAM and won't run with any memory-resident programs. And novices will find downloading information tricky: You instruct the Prodigy software to print it out, then redirect the output to a disk file using DOS commands.

To log on to Prodigy, you just type a user ID and password. Once connected, you're greeted by a screen ablaze with the day's headlines and a blinking icon if you have



E-mail waiting. Navigation is strictly point and shoot. To skip from one corner of the service to another, you summon pop-up menus, or create a path that zips you to predetermined locales on the system whenever you log on.

Information-wise, Prodigy is as light as cotton candy. News stories appear in a flash of crayon-thick letters, and though the likes of Jane Fonda and Howard Cosell will answer questions on line, their offerings are seldom more than a couple of aphoristic lines. Prodigy offers free stock quotes with a 15-minute delay. At press time, the only forums Prodigy offered were the PC Club and the Food and Wine Club, though more were promised.

Finally, Prodigy's private electronic mail facility is Lilliputian. Messages are limited to about 250 words, and you can't edit or carbon copy them, or get word that yours have been received.

Prodigy is aware of its shortcomings, and plans to improve its news coverage and expand its reach. At press time, Prodigy was available only in Atlanta, Connecticut, and parts of California. A dial-up node in the Baltimore-Washington area was planned for spring, with others in New York and Detroit to follow.

Dialing into Prodigy may not be the same as visiting the library at Alexandria, but then it isn't meant to be. For free stock quotes and all the E-mail you want, \$9.95 a month looks like a bargain. If you want video news, though, spend the money on cable TV. -Judy Getts

Relay Gold 3.0

Communications program

PROS: Offers IBM 3270 software terminal emulation; powerful, easy-to-use scripting language

When Relay Gold 2.0 came out in 1987, MIS managers got a smooth telecommunications software link between PCs and IBM VM/MVS mainframes. Used in conjunction with another Relay Communications product, Relay 3270, it supported 3270 emulation with software, thereby eliminating the IRMA card hardware overhead. With Relay running on both ends, users could dial up the company mainframe from anywhere without an IRMA card.

Now Relay Communications has amalgamated Relay Gold 2.0 and its general-purpose communications package, Relay Silver, into Relay Gold 3.0. The program's new features include expanded memory support, multiple sessions, new terminal emulations, and enhancements to Relay Gold 2.0's script language. Relay Gold 3.0 has features on a par with those of Crosstalk Mk. 4 and Smartcom III, but at only 192K of RAM re-

quires far less memory. Alas, despite the addition of a new file compression algorithm, Relay Gold 3.0's file transfer times were quite uneven in NSTL tests, often lagging behind Relay Silver's.

Relay Gold 3.0 shares with version 2.0 a background communications mode that won't crash your system, a flexible scripting language, and an interface that can be used by just about anyone. New in Relay Gold's dialing directory are IBM 3101 terminals, DEC VT/220/240 terminals, and an option for running an IRMA card connected to the mainframe with coaxial cable.

In version 3.0, Relay Gold's scripting language gains some debugging commands and the ability to create pop-up menus for monitoring the progress of file transfers. New commands and functions allow a user to download data invisibly and import it directly into 1-2-3, for example, without ever leaving the spreadsheet. Relay Gold 3.0's English-like scripting language is easier to use than Crosstalk's CASL and offers better error trapping. And its new menuing capability surpasses those of Crosstalk Mk. 4 and Smartcom III.

Relay Gold 3.0's proprietary file transfer algorithm supposedly saves time by compressing files during transmission, instead of before. But Relay Gold 3.0's proprietary protocol performed well only in NSTL file transfers involving errors and delays, which suggests it would work acceptably on noisy phone lines.

With Relay 3270 on the company mainframe you can dial up the mainframe through regular phone lines, a handy feature if your staff includes a field sales force equipped with laptops that don't accommodate 3270 emulation cards.

If you need a telecommunications package to connect PCs with an IBM mainframe, Relay Gold 3.0 would be a good buy. But its slow file transfers make it hard to recommend to anyone who's in a hurry. —Ken Smith





Checking Out Point-of-Sale Systems

Affordable point-of-sale (POS) PC systems are revolutionizing Main Street America. From hardware stores to yogurt shops, retailers are tracking their inventory as they ring up sales, and the dramatically improved flow of information has helped some businesses multiply in size. As in any revolution, some foot soldiers have become casualties, but believers still outnumber cynics.

For well under \$1000, off-the-shelf soft-ware running on PCs plugged into cash drawers and receipt printers automatically captures and records transactions as they happen. Once this seemingly prosaic information is stored, retailers can pull reports detailing everything from the number of pickles sold daily to the bushels of potatoes Customer X bought this year. That means mom-and-pop retailers can manage inventory as deftly as J.C. Penney and Sears.

Well, almost. Many retailers are finding it difficult or impossible to link their new systems to their accounting operations, Getting POS numbers into their general ledgers sometimes requires rekeying the data. Additionally, a few retailers have been shell shocked by glitches in their packages. Inexpensive POS systems are still proving themselves, so finding the right system and the right supplier is critical.

First, the Good News

Sam Feizi of Balboa Office Supply in San Diego is among the satisfied converts. In 1986, with a 32,000-item inventory to manage, Feizi was looking for a POS system that was as fast and easy to use as possible. Chuck Atkinson Programs delivered, Feizi says. "There are no complications, and the program menu is standardized across all modules." He paid \$699 for Atkinson's Quick Register POS program and \$195 for the Quick Check accounting program. He runs them on a Novell network composed of an Epson Equity III Plus file server and four XT workstations.

Feizi says the system has increased his company's productivity at least fourfold—
"probably more." Before POS, his inventory was divided into ten departments and he tracked sales manually. Now the inventory is broken down into 32 departments, and he retrieves information that he just couldn't get before.

Each evening, Feizi pulls a sales-tax report, a cost-of-goods-sold report, and detailed summaries of each department's invoices. He can also break down department sales by item, vendor, and salesperson, as well as by individual customer activity and both daily and year-to-date dollar sales volume. Every month he generates reports on back orders, stock status, and dead inventory. The system generates invoices and posts payments at the point of sale.

About the only thing the Atkinson system doesn't do is general ledger accounting, which is available in most other POS packages but is not yet widely used by mom-and-pop retailers. Feizi, however, would like it: "It would be much nicer to have double-entry accounting integrated with the point-of-sale system." As it is, he spends about an hour a day rekeying data into an accounting program from another supplier.

Feizi had no problem installing his system, although it took three months for three people to convert from a manual setup. Since Balboa Office Supply is also a computer dealer, technical support isn't the issue for Feizi that it is for most retailers.

Support was a much taller hurdle for Dave Cole of Action Hobbies in Tulsa, who admits that he "could hardly format a disk" when he bought *Quick Register* four years ago. Still, he was brave enough to order the software through the mail, after reviewing the company's \$20 demo disk.

After 15 years in business, Cole doubled sales in his first year of automation. "It would not have been possible without the software," Cole says flatly. He runs *Quick Register* on an XT clone.

One off-the-shelf package, *The General Store* by Crichlow Data Sciences, proved so easy to use that it made a computer dealer out of a hardware store owner. Sam Frazier III, owner of Sam's Home Center in Chester, South Carolina, is another retailer who shopped by mail two years ago. He bought the \$1200 software on the basis of price, and runs it on a Novell network using a Wyse AT as a file server and two XTs.

Frazier's main concern was that *The General Store* wouldn't be fast enough on XTs, but he claims the program "pulls up data almost instantaneously, even with an item file of 5 million bytes." Overall, he was so impressed that he began selling *General Store* networks on the side.

Now, the Bad News

According to Frazier, POS software is well worth its one agonizing price—tedious data entry. Other retailers only wish that data entry were their worst problem.

One battle-scarred user recalls only nightmares with her POS system. "I wanted to blow it up," fumes Barbara Lambert, who runs a chain of clothing stores called Cotton Comfort headquartered in Dallas. Just over a year ago, the chain installed an IBM System 36 minicomputer at headquarters and Epson PCs loaded with proprietary POS software in all 16 stores. "About halfway through the project, I realized that the software wouldn't do what we wanted," recalls Kass Larson, then MIS director of Cotton Comfort. Larson began converting to Xtrasoft.

Unfortunately, Cotton Comfort filed for Chapter 11 protection and closed half its stores. New stores will open in 1989 under the name of True Colors, but they will be managed manually and reports will be submitted by fax machines. "That way I can be sure the information is accurate," says Lambert. who was too frustrated with POS systems to try again.

She has a soul mate in Rudy Keller, owner of the Swiss Kitchen gourmet shop in Greenbrae, California. Keller had high hopes for SoftKey Software Products' KeyRetailer, which he bought last April, along with an AT clone, a cash drawer, and a Star Micronics receipt printer. But he soon was complaining, "I can't believe such a program goes out to the public." Keller found so many bugs that SoftKey finally refunded \$500 of the \$2000

purchase price. "I have had days when I would have loved to throw the whole thing out," he grouses.

KeyRetailer upgrades, however, solved many of Keller's problems. "Lots of features in the system are good, and some are very good," Keller says now. SoftKey president Kevin O'Leary, who visited Swiss Kitchen to investigate the difficulties, adds that POS systems take time and training. "What Rudy might have perceived as technical problems are installation issues," he claims.

A Menu for Growth

Venture Development Corporation in Wellesley, Massachusetts, estimates that the retail POS market—including systems for large machines—is growing by 30 percent annually. Venture analyst Leone Johnson says specialty stores are experiencing the highest growth in PC system shipments. But the restaurant industry remains the largest market, and it's one of the first outposts for electronic cash register manufacturers that are making the transition to PCs.

One such supplier, TEC America, released its PC-based FT-40 last summer, selling its first systems to a chain of 175 yogurt shops called I Can't Believe It's Yogurt. The FT-40 lists for \$2995 and includes CPU, monitor, receipt printer, and point-of-sale keyboard. The yogurt chain still offers franchisees a \$4500 electronic cash register, but not one has been ordered since the PC-based system shipped. "It's a function of versatility and price," says Buddy Harvey, the chain's operations director.

The Custom Counter

Like other cash register suppliers, TEC America sells primarily through its distributors, but most specialty retailers don't want to buy that way. Apart from the bold few who order software by mail, most retailers look to buy from value-added resellers of computer systems. Retailers with multiple stores, in particular, usually want resellers to customize programs, notes Jerry Paul of The Flagship Group, a Dallas market research firm.

Customization is particularly important to video stores, since most of their business involves rentals rather than sales. Applause Video of Omaha is a case in point. Working with local reseller Information Management Consultants, Chief Financial Officer Joe Riha developed the Diamond Video Management System, which saves Applause 20 percent in

Each of Applause's 21 stores has a Novell network with three to seven workstations (each with a bar-code reader) and an ATcompatible file server.

When a customer rents a movie, the sales clerk can call up the customer file by video club membership number, phone number, first name, or last name. The clerk uses the bar-code reader to check the package in or out, and each package has a unique bar-code number:

Transaction data is automatically uploaded to ATs at headquarters every night, letting corporate management pull up to 25 different reports the next day. But even Applause's sophisticated system doesn't integrate general ledger accounting.

oking Good Bar Code

To find the right POS system, look first in your own backyard. Call your industry's trade association and attend its annual convention. Broad-based groups like the National Association of Retail Dealers of America in Chicago, the National Retail Merchants Association in New York City, and the Association of General Merchandise Chains in Washington, D.C., are also good sources.



Once you develop a list of prospective suppliers, grill them. Find out the background of the software developer. You want someone with retail experience, preferably in your industry. And you want a system that's been tested by retailers.

Try to speak with retailers similar to yourself, Riha advises. If you operate a regional chain with stores in suburban strip malls, you want to know how well the system operates in that environment. This may take a lot of phone calls, but the up-front research should save you the frustrations Rudy Keller and Barbara Lambert suffered.

Better you should wind up like Jerry Paul's shoemaker. "He uses a POS system to run a two-employee shop, and he loves it!" •

PC AND XT ACCELERATOR BOARDS

DON'T TURN THAT PC OR XT INTO A DOORSTOP! 80286 AND 80386 TURBO BOARDS FROM NEARLY A SCORE OF VENDORS CAN BREATHE NEW LIFE INTO THAT TIRED OLD BOX.

ROBERT LUHN

here are a hundred ways to speed up a PC or XT. You can add more system memory, use RAM disk and disk caching software, get a speedier hard disk, or if you're flush, replace the PC's aged motherboard with a form-fit 80386 motherboard.

But for most PC users, an accelerator or "turbo" expansion board built around an 80286, or in some cases an 80386, delivers the biggest boost for the buck. Some of the faster 286 boardssuch as the MicroWav Super-Cache-286 and AST Hot Shot/ 286-can boost XT operation by 200 to 500 percent; 386-based boards can add as much as 1000 percent. Installation is usually straightforward: Pull out the PC's 8088, pop the turbo board into a slot, and connect it to the empty 8088 socket with a special plug. Some boards, like the 386 HummingBoard, don't replace the PC's CPU but act as highspeed coprocessors. Add a few files, and your PC runs like an AT—and then some.

Just keep in mind that not all turbo boards are cut from the same cloth. Although most of the 286 and 386 boards listed here come with their own RAM and can use a numeric coprocessor, they vary considerably in performance, expandability, and convenience. Before you buy, consider these factors:

How Fast Is Fast? The faster a processor's clock rate (expressed in megahertz, or MHz), the faster the turbo board, right? Yes and no. The number of wait states (the number of processor cycles required to access RAM) can affect throughput dramatically. That's why a turbo board with a 10-MHz 80286 running at zero wait states is faster than a 12-MHz, one-wait-state board. When in doubt, pick the board with the highest clock rate and the fewest wait states.

Warning: Beware of turbo boards bearing "pushed" microprocessors. In their quest for speed (and a quick buck), some manufacturers take chips rated for a given speed and rev up their clock rates. According to Intel, pushed chips may eventually produce erroneous calculations or simply overheat and selfdestruct. Ask the board vendor if the processor is certified by Intel for the advertised speed. Look for the "80286-xx" stencil on the microprocessor; the xxdenotes the maximum clock rate. (For more on pushed chips, see

Consumer Watch, PCW, November 1988.)

Check That RAM Budget turbo boards often rely solely on the PC's sluggish 8-bit memory. You save money this way but sacrifice speed. Look for 286 and 386 turbo boards that pack lots of socketed 16- and 32-bit RAM. For extra zip, pick a board that also includes a memory cache—a high-speed static RAM buffer between the CPU and slower system memory.

How much RAM is enough? If you plan to use stand-alone DOS applications, 1MB is fine. If multitasking environments such as Desqview and Windows are your dish, or you're brave enough to tackle OS/2, you should probably turn to a 386 turbo board that accommodates at least 4MB of high-speed RAM. Users of every stripe should make sure that a turbo board's RAM can be treated as EMS 4.0 memory.

Hardware and Software Compati-

bility Most turbo boards work uncomplainingly in 8088-based systems. But only a handful run in speed-switchable 8088 machines such as the Leading Edge PC, and fewer still in 8086 machines such as the Compaq Deskpro.

Compatibility with DOS applications is generally assured. although loading older, copyprotected programs may be impossible if you can't downshift the turbo board to 4.77 MHz. Some boards may also have difficulty loading 1-2-3 from a floppy disk, running R:base for DOS at high speed, or displaying Microsoft Word documents. Note, too, that 386 turbo boards can't automatically run every 386-specific program out of the box. The Intel Inboard 386/PC, for example, chokes on Concurrent DOS/386. VM/386, and PC-MOS/386 and requires a special version of Windows/386. When in doubt about a board's compatibility, follow the Golden Upgrade Rule: Call before you buy.

The OS/2 Conundrum If you're buying a turbo board to run OS/2, think again. Unlike DOS, OS/2 is extremely hardware specific: Unless a turbo board is very compatible with the IBM PC AT (like the Sota 286i) or the vendor goes to the pains of modifying OS/2 (as Microsoft did for the Mach 20), you're out of luck. At press time, only Sota and Microsoft supported OS/2.

Extras Make a Difference Finally, don't forget the bundled goodies. A disk caching program can make a big difference in overall system performance, as can RAM disk programs and print spoolers. If you want to simplify your system's future growth, check out boards that offer high-density floppy disk drive controllers.

Lasersharp R:base Reports

Use printer variables and escape sequences to print good-looking, formatted reports directly from R:base—

with your HP LaserJet or compatible printer.



Karen Watterson o you remember the hollow feeling in the pit of your stomach when you first looked in your LaserJet printer manual and glimpsed the long, complicated escape sequences that select printer features? If you're like most of us, the first thing you did was install a canned LaserJet driver for your word processing program, and let the driver worry about sending all those codes for font changes, landscape printing, box creation, and so on.

Then you tackled Microrim's R:base, which has no LaserJet driver—or any other printer driver, for that matter. To print a report using custom print options, you must include the escape codes in the report itself.

Fancy Fontwork

Print options that won't change during printout can be set once before you print, via the control panel (if your LaserJet compatible has one), or a printer setup program (if it doesn't). But if you want to do any fancy fontwork in your *R:base* report—or use shading, lines, or boxes—you'll have to master LaserJet escape sequences.

Some escape sequences must be sent to the printer exactly as you see them in the manual; others include a # as a placeholder, indicating that you must fill in a value. However, in no case can you simply type the escape codes into your report; you must translate them into R:base-ese by defining and locating printer variables with Reports Express, R:base's report generator.

Landscape Printing Tutorial

Because data base reports are often tabular, the ability to print them in landscape mode is essential. Your printer manual probably lists the necessary escape sequence as follows:

Select Landscape Mode Ec &110

This means that if you want to print in landscape mode, you have to send the printer the Escape character (Ec) followed by the characters & 110.

To translate this escape sequence into an *R:base* printer variable, follow this procedure:

- From the R> prompt, type
 Reports and press < Enter> to
 bring up Reports Express.
- Choose a data base (unless you already have one open).
- Choose (1) (Edit/Create a report) from the Report Options menu.
- 4. If you already have reports created, select the one to edit. If you want to create a new one, choose (New) from the Choose a report menu. If you choose (New) (or if you have never created a report with this data base), you will be prompted to give the report a name and to select the table or view on which it will be based. Once you do so, you will move automatically into the Report Definition menu.
- Select Expression from the Report Definition menu.
- Select Define from the Expression menu.
- 7. Type land = <27 38 108 49
 79 > and press < Enter > . The numbers inside the angle brackets are the decimal ASCII codes for Escape (ASCII 27), ampersand, lowercase l, the numeral one, and uppercase O.
 - 8. Press < Esc > to redisplay

the Expression menu. Press < Esc > again to redisplay the Report Definition menu.

Now you need to decide where in your report you want the land-scape command to take effect. Since you will rarely want to change page orientation within the body of a report, the main choices have to do with using different options for cover sheets and page headings.

Information to appear on the cover sheet is entered on RH (Report Header) lines; information to appear at the top of every page is entered on PH (Page Header) lines.

Let's assume you want to print page 1, the cover sheet, in normal mode, and the rest of the report, starting with page 2, in landscape mode.

- 9. Select Edit.
- 10. If this is a new report, or if you've previously created a report header, your cursor will probably already be on an RH line; otherwise, check the status line, press <F9> to toggle Expand on if necessary, and use <F7> to create an RH line.

Then type cover sheet text on the RH line(s).

11. When you're finished entering the cover sheet text, press < F8 > to move into the Page Header section. The cursor will be on a PH line. Even if you do not plan to use any page headers, you can still place your printer variable here.

12. To place the variable "land" in the report, press < F6 > < Enter > < Enter > , and then select Land from the Locate variable menu. Press S and E in response to the prompt; there's no need to move the cursor. Type any text you want to appear as a page header, making sure to indent for margins.

13. When you've finished entering your page header text, press < Enter > one or more times to insert blank lines between the header and the Detail section. <F8 > moves you into the Detail section. With the cursor on a D line, press <F6 > to begin locating fields from your data base on the report layout.

14. Press < F8 > to move into Page Footer and Report Footer sections, if desired. You should also define a "reset" variable (see FIGURE 1) and locate it on the last RF (Report Footer) line. This will return your printer to portrait mode at the end of the print cycle.

15. When you've finished, press < Esc > and select Configure from the Report Definition menu.

16. Change the FORM FEEDS After Report Header setting from NO to YES to start landscape printing on a new page.

17. Press < Esc > twice to move to the Report Exit Options menu.

18. Press < Enter > to save changes.

19. Select (6) to exit.

That's it. Now when you tell R:base to OUTPUT PRINTER and PRINT rptname, it will start printing the report; when it encounters the variable "land," it will send the escape sequence that tells the printer to shift to landscape mode. Voilà!

FIGURE 1 lists some escape sequences for selecting fonts and other popular features. You can place these variables on RH or PH lines. You can also place printer variables on Break Header (H1, H2...) or Break Footer (F1, F2...) lines to invoke, or turn off, fonts or effects for new sections.

Creating a Report With Shaded Rectangles and Custom Lines

Suppose you want to jazz up the first page of an otherwise uninspiring summary report of sales data so that it looks like FIGURE 2, complete with shaded rectangles

and custom lines. (You'll need at least a LaserJet Plus for these effects.)

We'll use a combination of three escape sequences: ^EC*p#x#Y To position the cursor at location #,#.

Ec*c#a#b0P To draw a line #

dots wide and # dots high.

(Note: If the value for the first # is greater than the second #, the line is horizontal; if the value for the second # is greater, the line is vertical.)

Ec *c#a#b#g#P To draw a box

dots wide by # dots high with # percent shading and # type of fill.

FIGURE 3 shows pretranslated R:base printer variables for the report in FIGURE 2, based on these escape sequences, "Locatel" positions the cursor at 150,150 (1/2 inch down and 1/2 inch in from the top-left corner; remember, the LaserJet prints 300 dots per inch). "Line1" directs the printer to print a horizontal line 2100 dots (7 inches) long and 3 dots thick, "Box1" draws a 10 percent gray-scale shaded box 2100 by 700. "Line2" prints a vertical line 2700 dots high and 3 dots thick. "Locate2" positions the cursor at 2250,150. "Locate3" positions the cursor at 150,2700. "Box2" draws a 10 percent grayscale shaded box 2100 by 150. "Locate4" positions the cursor at 150,2850.

Creating a Printer Variable With Replaceable Parameters

As an exercise, here are step-bystep instructions for creating one of the variables with replaceable parameters, "locate1." This will position the cursor at 150,150.

Write down the original escape sequence:

Ec * p # x # Y

- 2. Substitute data: Ec * p 150 x 150 Y
- 3. Referring to an ASCII table, convert the characters

 E_C * p 1 5 0 x 1 5 0 Y to decimal ASCII codes:

 27 42 112 49 53 48 120 49 53 48 89
- 4. Using Reports Express, define the expression "locate1" as a TEXT variable by entering the code from step 3: locate1 = <27 42 112 49 53 48 120 49 53 48 89 >

Once you've defined all the variables in FIGURE 3, use Reports




FIGURE 4: Placement of R:base printer variables used to produce the report in FIGURE 2

Express to locate them on RH lines in your report, following the procedure previously outlined for locating the variable "land." Proper location is shown in FIGURE 4.

A Few Final Thoughts

Make sure your printer offers a certain feature before you spend fruitless hours trying to figure out why your escape code isn't working. It won't do any good to send an escape sequence to select 24-point characters if your printer has no 24-point fonts.

Don't let your pride keep you from considering an end run. Since *R:base* lets you send a report to a disk file, one way to customize a report is to save it to a file and then edit it with a word

processing program that has its own LaserJet printer driver:

Finally, don't forget to send a NEWPAGE command (from the R> prompt) after printing a report to eject the final page:

OUTPUT PRINTER

PRINT rptname

NEWPAGE

OUTPUT SCREEN

Be patient, work carefully, and take your time. Creating, locating, and debugging printer variables can be tedious, but the process puts *you* in control of your LaserJet—rather than the other way around. ●

How to Design a Data Base File

Want intelligent answers from a data base? Start by creating an intelligent file structure. A few rules of thumb make it easy.

What you need: any data base management program

f you use a PC to keep records of any kind, you're a data base manager. And unless you want that data base to start managing you, it makes sense to set it up right in the beginning.

This piece will show you how to design a simple, single-file data base that uses a minimum of storage space, is easy to search and sort, and resists careless mistakes. (A future article will cover data bases that consist of multiple, related tables.) The specific examples here

refer to dBASE, but the underlying principles are true whatever program you use, anything from RapidFile to Paradox.

All data base files have a tabular structure. Data is arranged much as it is in a spreadsheet; the column headings are fields, and the rows are records. Designing a data base is mainly a matter of choosing the field names, their widths, and the type of data that goes into them.

Turn Facts Into Fields

Say you've gone to work for the alumni association at your old alma mater, Dragnet University, and you need to track donations to the alumni fund. After a little thought, you decide that to answer the dean's questions, produce reports, and manage a mailing list, you'll need to track a lot of facts about each of the alumni: name, student ID number, class year, address, phone number, degree, department, number of years' membership in the association, yearly income, amount of donation, and donation as a percentage of income.

The items on this list will be only roughly equivalent to the fields in the data base. A few guidelines can help you translate these categories into an array of fields that will yield a bulletproof file structure.

Creating an Optimum Table

When in doubt, break it out! If you're faced with a choice of creating one wide field or several smaller fields, it's always better to choose the latter. It's much easier to combine small fields into a larger expression later on than to split a large field into smaller pieces.

For just the first line of an address on a simple form letter, you'll need no fewer than six fields: Salutation (Mr., Ms., etc.), First, Middle, Last, Suffix (Jr., etc.), and Nickname. With these, you'll be able to customize the correspondence and sort by last name.

It's a character field unless...

Numeric fields are for calculations; date fields are for dates and durations. With few exceptions, everything else should be a character (or text) field.

The classic example is Zipcode.

Though composed of digits, this is a character field, because zipcodes are never used in calculations. (Some data base managers have a special field type for numeric labels.) In the alumni records, Studentid and Phone are also character fields.

Make character fields as wide as necessary but as narrow as possible. Most data base managers reserve the same amount of disk space for each record in a file, whether the fields contain data or not. So watch field length carefully; widening a field even by a character can take up a lot of space in a large data base.

Some character fields must be wide enough for the longest possible entry—name fields, for example. Others can be shortened by means of a coding system. In the alumni data base's Department field you could use ASTR for Astronomy, for instance. This can also cut data entry errors.

For numeric fields: "A little wider, please." Leave some extra room in numeric fields for later growth and for calculations and subtotals. In our example, Income and Donation are numeric fields.

Include a unique field. Every data base needs a field that uniquely identifies a record: a social security number, part number, transaction number, and so on. Having such a field eliminates confusion between records containing similar data and makes it easy to purge duplicate records. (For the alumni association, the unique field is Studentid.) In more complex relational data base designs, the unique field provides a link between related tables.

Avoid redundant fields. Never include fields that can be derived from the entries in other fields. This saves disk space, since you can always calculate the information when you need it. (This rule will sometimes be violated in complex data base designs created under dBASE; other data base managers, such as DataPerfect, provide virtual or calculated fields that are stored separately from the data.) In the alumni group system, you don't need a field for donation as a percentage of income, for example; you can perform the Donation/Income calculation wherever the figure is needed.

Use date fields for durations. Don't use a numeric field to show the number of years of an alumnus's membership; you'd only have to update it every year. Instead, create a field called Joined



For an efficient data table, make character fields no wider than necessary but give numeric fields a little room to grow.


to record the date the alumnus joined the association. Then, whenever you need to know how long a member has belonged, you can calculate the duration by subtracting Joined from the current date.

Provide for subtotals. Be sure to include a field to keep track of specific groups among the alumni, so you can separate them later. With many data base managers, including dBASE III, the best way to count the number of records in many subgroups is to include a numeric field with a value of 1 for every record. Totaling on this field gives the desired counts.

Since Dragnet U.'s dean will want to know the number of members and the total donations by class, state, and degree level, grouping fields for the alumni file would include Class, Degree, and State. A field called COUNT lets you count the members in each category.

Use a comments field for flexibility. The alumni data base can include many facts about the members, including spouse's name, sport, fraternity or so-rority, children, and so on. And it can be handy to identify subgroups with similar interests; aging tennis players may want to help rebuild the field house someday. The trick is to put the facts into the data base without losing track of them.

Many data base managers allow a floating search (in dBASE, the \$ function), which lets you search for a string of characters anywhere within a field. For the alumni data base, create a wide Comments field, enter data using a coding system (for example, "SP-Tennis" to indicate that an alumnus's sport was tennis), then use the floating search to locate all alumni with that sport. dBASE III Plus includes variable-length memo fields, but they can't be searched, so Comments must be a character field, which wastes disk space. By contrast, Professional File and several other packages let you search memo fields.

Moving From the Simple to the Complex

If you've gotten this far, you've completed your assignment. You have set up the alumni data base, and hordes of work-study students are busy punching in data. You may have noticed that since several alumni sent in more than one gift, you've had to enter them in the data base more than once. This is a minor inconvenience for now, but perhaps you're wondering what will happen next year and the year after, as some alumni give a number of gifts. If you don't do something about it, you'll be wasting a lot of space on duplicate entries, and the burden of listing and counting the alumni will worsen.

The problem is that the data base is really storing data about two distinct entities, alumni and their donations, and there is a one-to-many relationship between them. In a future article. we'll extend the single-file alumni association model to a true multitable relational design.

PageMaker Speedup Tips

A few timesaving techniques let you experience that rare PageMaker quality—velocity.

What you need: PageMaker 3.0

Although PageMaker's thorough printed tutorial gives novices a good leg up, regular users may soon lose patience with the program's mouse-dependent, multimenu operations. Coaxing proofs, much less finished publications, out of a laser printer can be equally taxing.

But PageMaker has some underemphasized, and even undocumented, shortcuts that can help. This collection of keyboard, mouse, and LaserJet printer tips shows you how to use PageMaker more quickly and efficiently. All the techniques work with version 3.0, and a few, as noted, will work with 1.0 and 1.0a.

Keys to Success

The most obvious way to accelerate a PageMaker session is to bypass the program's many-layered menus with keyboard shortcuts. As with any Windows program, you can drop down PageMaker's main menus by holding <Alt> and typing the underscored letter of the menu heading. To execute a menu option, just type the underscored letter. But there are lots more speed tricks, and they work with any version of PageMaker.

Select Tools With Function Keys




FIGURE 1: Toolbox function-key assignments

When you're sculpting a page to match your visions, you want the proper tools instantly at hand. Instead of dragging the mouse pointer away from the page to PageMaker's Toolbox, simply select the tool by pressing <Shift> and the appropriate function key (see FIGURE 1). Once you memorize the function key assignments, you can remove the Toolbox and free up valuable screen space.

Change Views From the Keyboard

PageMaker's menus list numerous mnemonic <Ctrl>-key shortcuts that can shoot you to a specific command or dialog box, Tandy® Computers: The broadest line of PCs in America.

skipping intervening menu steps. For example, instead of plodding through the Page menu to change views, <Ctrl>-5, -7, -1, and -2 instantly switch to 50, 75, 100, and 200 percent views, respectively. An undocumented 3.0 shortcut, <Ctrl>-4, even offers 400 percent magnification—perfect for kerning and precise graphics placement. This is one feature that you can't access with a mouse.

Display the Entire Pasteboard The <Ctrl>-W shortcut (Fit in Window view) quickly displays an entire page on the screen—but stray text or graphics on Page-Maker's pasteboard could still be lurking off screen. To get the ultimate aerial view of the pasteboard, type <Ctrl>-<Shift>-W. Because pasteboard leftovers are saved with a document, you can free up valuable disk space by purging such clutter regularly.

Clever Mousework

Liberating your mouse from tedious menu work doesn't mean the rodent can retire. Some of *PageMaker*'s most powerful shortcuts are just a click away. The following mouse tricks work with any version of the program. Use the Second Button Need to zoom in and out like Spielberg? Click the second mouse button, and PageMaker toggles between Actual Size (100 percent) and Fit in Window views. To jump between Actual Size and 200 percent views, hold down <Shift> and click the second mouse button.

Point First, Then Zoom It's easy to lose your place when leaping from one view to another. To keep the same portion of a page in sight, place the pointer on the desired spot, and then select the view from the Page menu or by clicking the second mouse button. This trick works whether you're zooming in or out of a page, but if you get lost, select the Fit in Window view, reposition the mouse pointer, and start over.

Printing Apace

Even if you have a jumbo highresolution screen, the best way to check your design is to print it out. Unfortunately, printing is PageMaker's single most timeconsuming function. Luckily, there are ways to cut printing time, especially when proofing. The following tips all work on LaserJet and compatible printers.

Select Draft Resolution Page-Maker's Macintosh version has a Proof Print feature that speeds printing by suppressing graphic images. Although all versions of PageMaker for the PC lack this text-proofing godsend, you can reduce print time dramatically by reducing graphics resolution. Before clicking the OK button in the Print dialog box, click the Setup button. In the resulting dialog box, set graphics resolution to the lowest setting—75 dots per inch. Depending on the mixture of text and graphics, documents can roll out of the printer in a third of the time. Until you print your final master copy, keep 75 dpi as the default option.

Use Fast Rules PageMaker is an ace at generating and manipulating boxes, column rules, and other line art, but printing out a graphics-laden masterpiece can take hours. If you're in a rush (and you have PageMaker 3.0), select the Fast Rules option in the Print dialog box, and the document will print out in record time. Note: Don't use Fast Rules for final copy if line art is stacked or masked by other elements on the page-everything will show through when printed. Download Fonts Once The Laser-Jet's cartridge and internal fonts are easy to use but limited to a few typefaces and sizes. Most PageMaker users seeking typographic flair soon turn to the wide array of attractive downloadable, or "soft," fonts sold on disk by HP, Bitstream, and other companies.

Before *PageMaker* prints a document that uses soft fonts, it naturally downloads the necessary fonts to the laser printer. Unfortunately, if you print the same document again during the session, *PageMaker* flushes the fonts out of the printer's memory and downloads them all over again.

Luckily, there is a way to download fonts just once. First, jot down the name and point size of the most frequently used

typefaces in your document. Next, select Printer setup in the File menu, and click the Setup button. Select the Fonts button, and when the Soft Font Installer dialog box appears, pick the fonts you need from the list in the left window. Select the Permanent option, and a window appears reminding you that the font will become printer resident. Click OK, exit the Soft Font Installer, and then choose the downloading preference. You can direct PageMaker to download the fonts automatically just for that print session, or alter the system's AUTOEXEC.BAT

file so the fonts are installed whenever the PC boots up.

To make a "permanent" soft font temporary at the end of a session, return to the font list, highlight the font, and select Temporary.

Using these shortcuts speeds and simplifies common Page-Maker operations considerably. For a summary of PageMaker keyboard and mouse tips, consult the "PageMaker Quick Reference Guide" at the back of your Page-Maker reference manual. —Matt Lake

Track Compu-Serve Charges With Crosstalk MK.4

Use Crosstalk Mk.4's CASL script language to keep track of CompuServe costs.

What you need: Crosstalk Mk.4, a CompuServe subscription, and a modem

hen Digital Communications Associates (DCA) introduced Crosstalk Mk.4, it replaced the script capability Crosstalk XVI users had known with a full-blown communications programming language called CASL. (Pronounced "castle," it stands for Crosstalk Application Script Language.) CASL is arguably the most sophisticated script language on the market.

CASL's structure and command set strongly resemble BA-SIC, with some touches of Pascal. Many CASL statements, such as GOTO, JUMP, GOSUB, and IF...THEN, will be familiar enough, but there are many new commands peculiar to communications, such as RECEIVE and UPLOAD. Crosstalk XVI script writers will recognize much of the new language, but nearly half the original commands have been altered, renamed, or dis-

carded. Fortunately, Mk.4 includes a conversion script that translates XVI scripts to CASL. Though far from perfect, that script gives a head start to XVI users who make the move to Mk.4.

This article examines a script called OFFCOST.XTS (see LISTING 1). It logs you off a Compu-Serve session, calculates and displays the approximate connect charge, and stores the figure in a text file called CISCOST.LOG. The script is available on Compu-Serve's Crosstalk Forum, along with other CASL scripts and programming advice from DCA and other users. Type go xtalk and download the file from library 4.

If you type in **LISTING 1**, leave the line numbers off—they are for legibility only. The CASL script assumes that Mk.4, OFF-COST.XTS, and all included scripts are located in the XTALK directory on the C: drive. To run the script, simply type **do offcost** on the Mk.4 command line, or assign the command to a function key.

The Fine Art of Stealing

Stealing is a time-honored programming technique, and CASL is an able partner in crime. OFF-COST's thieving ways become apparent in lines 1 and 2, which use the INCLUDE command to snatch two scripts supplied with Mk.4. The scripts contain procedures and variables that are used later in OFFCOST. Including other scripts not only minimizes typing but keeps programs short and compact.

In *Mk.4* each procedure performs a specific instruction. The procedure can include its own variables and accept arguments

that fill out the instruction. Procedures don't have to be in separate scripts, but keeping a collection of scripts that each contain a single procedure is a handy way to recycle code.

The first included script, XT-PAUSE, contains a procedure that is used to display the session's cost in a window. The procedure (PAUSE) is not called until line 34. If you want to jazz up the window, you can modify the routine by adding CASL windowing commands that hide, move, and zoom windows and paint them in various colors.

The second pilfered script, XTCHRDEF, cuts down on coding drudgery. It defines abbreviated variables for the commands that format the window data in lines 34 through 39. For example, LF stands for linefeed, CR for carriage return, and SP for space.

Calculating Costs

After including the scripts, OFF-COST declares the numeric (line 4) and string (line 5) variables used to calculate and display the cost of the session. The variables' values are set in lines 7 through 23. Line 8, for example, calculates the billing rate based on transmission speed. Lines 9 and 10 determine whether you'll be charged prime/daytime rates or evening/weekend rates. Lines 11 through 13 add phone network surcharges. (If you don't have a CIS network surcharge, change .30 to 0.) Line 14 adds the rate and surcharge, and line 15 multiplies the resulting rate by the session length.

OFFCOST also relies on several of CASL's built-in variables. For example, in line 8, OFF-COST uses Mk.4's ready-rolled SPEED function to determine the transmission speed. In line

17 the ONTIME variable keeps track of a session's length.

CASL also comes with functions that streamline coding.
OFFCOST uses the MONEY function in lines 22 and 23 to insert dollar signs and decimal points. In lines 18 through 23, the STR function converts the numbers to text strings.

Now that the session cost has been calculated, it's time for action. Lines 25 through 32 log you off CompuServe. The WATCH FOR statement in line 27 waits for any of three prompts (Tymnet, Telenet, or CIS) that may signal a log-off, and then issues the BYE command. WATCH FOR is a major improvement over Crosstalk XVI's WAIT FOR, which looks for only one condition at a time. Among other benefits, WATCH FOR's ability to respond to several possible prompts allows it to react to glitches; for example, if line noise garbles a password the first time, WATCH FOR will respond if the password is requested again.

Once the connection is broken, OFFCOST finally calls on the two included scripts. Using the PAUSE procedure in XTPAUSE, OFFCOST opens a window in lines 34 through 39 and displays the variable contents along with some other text. Here's where XTCHRDEF's variable abbreviations pay off.

Lines 38 and 39 combine the numbers stored in the variables into a single variable (INFO) that can be easily saved to an ASCII file. Lines 42 to 44 open CISCOST.LOG, append the data from INFO, and save the file. Because *Mk.4* can read and write to several files at the same time, the FREEFILE variable in line 41 makes sure that data isn't

Scrolling Page-by-Page in DOS

When you read a long ASCII file (such as a READ.ME file) by using the TYPE command at the DOS prompt, you can press <Ctrl>-S to start and stop document scrolling. But there's a better way—a batch file that uses DOS's MORE command to pause scrolling after each screen and then lets you resume scrolling by pressing any key.

First check to see whether your version of DOS has MORE-.COM. A copy of MORE.COM must be in the default drive or, preferably, in a directory in the system's path. If so, enter COPY CON READ.BAT at the DOS prompt, and then type

ECHO OFF < Enter > MORE < %1 < Enter >

Press < F6> and < Enter>
to copy READ.BAT into the
current directory. Then move
READ.BAT to a directory (for
example, \BATCH) that is listed
in the system's path. Now, whenever you want to read an ASCII
file, simply type READ and then
the file name, for example, READ \
CONFIG.SYS.

Run WordPerfect in RAM

WordPerfect uses temporary files to store part of your document if it doesn't fit in available RAM and also for functions such as checking spelling. You can speed up the program by putting such temporary files on a RAM drive. To do this, add the /D switch to the DOS command line when you load the program. For example, if drive E: is your RAM drive, enter WP/D-E:. Remember, when working with a RAM disk, you should save your file frequently to a hard disk or a floppy.

You can also load the entire program into RAM if your PC has at least 384K of RAM available. Load the entire program by issuing WP/R, or combine both these speedup tips by using WP/D-E:/R.

ASCII to WordPerfect Made

Reading ASCII files with Word-Perfect 5.0 produces unwanted hyphens and ill-placed line breaks when lines in the ASCII file don't fit between WordPerfect's margins. Here's a Word-Perfect macro that creates a template with wide margins and turns off hyphenation to produce uncluttered ASCII files.

Press < Ctrl>-<F10 > to start recording the macro, name it, then press < F7 > NN to clear the screen without exiting WordPerfect. Next press < Shift>-<F8 > LJN to display the Print Format menu and turn off right justification. Press < Enter > twice to exit the menu, then < Shift>-<F8 > LMO < Enter > O < Enter > to display the Line Format menu and set wide margins. Press < Enter > twice to return to the document.


Next, press < Shift> - < F8 > LYN
to switch off hyphenation, and
press < Enter > twice to get back
to the document. Press < Ctrl > < F5 > 13 to display the Document
Conversion menu, type in the
ASCII file name, and press
< Enter > .

Finally, press <F1 > <Ctrl>-<F10 > to exit the Document Conversion menu and finish recording the macro.

After using the macro and editing your document, you can restore normal margin and hyphenation settings by pressing <Home><Home><Cursor Up><Home><Cursor Left> and then pressing <Backspace> twice to delete the template format codes.

Advice and information for the computer consumer

Are you shopping for a computer or peripheral? Watch out-some manufacturers use phony FCC ID numbers and ship unshielded hardware.

It's a beautiful spring day, and you're sitting near an open window, working on your new computer. The radio on your desk is playing classical music-but the reception is unusually poor. A taxicab pulls up right in front of the window; you hear the cabbie communicating with the dispatcher. Suddenly, with no warning, your computer reboots.

What's the connection between these incidents? According to experts at the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), improperly shielded PCs can interfere with other electronic devices like radios or TVs and can be affected themselves by transmissions from taxis, police, and emergency services.

By law, every PC must be shielded to limit its radio frequency (RF) emissions. The FCC, which describes its mission as "protecting the electromagnetic spectrum," requires manufacturers to build computers to one of two specifications: Class A or Class B.

Class A regulations affect computers intended for commercial or industrial use only. Class B shielding requirements are much more stringent because they cover PCs that may also be used at home, where they could interfere with radio or television reception. According to the FCC, Class B radiation limits for computers "are designed to protect a TV receiver located 10 meters away with at least one wall between the [computing] device and the receiver."

J. Jerry Freeman, FCC coordinator for computer marketing enforcement in Norfolk, Virginia, says that all computers sold through the mail or through consumer retail outlets should be certified Class B. "I have yet to see an 8088 or an 80286 that someone could reasonably argue should only get Class A," says Freeman. "A machine like a tower 386, which is really intended only for business use, might qualify as just a Class A device."

Nevertheless. Freeman estimates that Class B regulations have only a two-thirds compliance rate. Every machine that passes Class B standards must be plainly labeled as a Class B device and display an FCC ID number, but Freeman says some manufacturers, "mostly offshore," just make up phony ID numbers. Some computers are brazenly sold without any ID number at all, probably in the hope that the consumer won't know to look for it.

Even major manufacturers have sometimes illegally sold PCs while FCC certification is in process. "Until a unit is certified, it may be displayed at trade shows such as COMDEX, but no orders may be taken," says Freeman. That's because FCC tests may require changes to the manufacturer's existing design. To ensure compliance, the FCC hires undercover investigators (continues)

who try to order uncertified units at shows like COMDEX. If they're successful, the manufacturer may be subject to a \$2000 fine.

Given the penalties, why do manufacturers fail to comply? For a simple reason: Getting Class B certification requires extra time and money. The PC has to be carefully designed from the ground up to prevent emissions. Then the manufacturer usually pays an independent testing lab to find out whether the computer meets the requirements. If it doesn't, it has to be redesigned and retested.

When the PC passes the lab tests, both the computer and the lab report must be submitted to the FCC, which performs its own tests. If the PC surmounts this hurdle, it's granted Class B certification, and the FCC requires the manufacturer to freeze the design. All peripherals—keyboards, printers, modems, accelerator boards—must be tested and certified as well. If the peripheral is sold separately from the computer, it must have its own FCC ID number.

According to experts, the faster the microprocessor, the more difficult it is to shield the computer. "When you speed up the PC's clock, the wavelengths of the frequency become shorter and shorter," says Chuck Kendall, director of labs for CK Consultants, a testing lab in Mariposa, California. "Those smaller wavelengths can creep out more easily, especially in AT-type boxes that were designed for a much slower microprocessor."

Because of their speed, it's particularly difficult for 80386s to pass, and not all manufacturers have the technical know-how to shield them properly. "Some people just piece computers together like erector sets," says Kendall. "It's hard on the consumer because all the boxes look alike."

Fortunately, there are ways to make sure a computer has been certified Class B. If there's no FCC ID number on a computer or separate peripheral that's being sold to both business and home markets, you should be suspicious. If there is a number but you don't feel particularly confident about the manufacturer, you can call one of the 36 FCC offices and ask someone there to verify that the ID number is valid.

The FCC also offers a bulletin board called PAL that allows consumers to check FCC ID numbers. Just dial 301/725-1072 with your modem, and type in the number. The system will let you know if and when the computer actually got the FCC stamp of approval.

If you accidentally end up with a Class A machine, it's not necessarily a tragedy. But be forewarned that correcting any interference problems will be up to you.

Paying for a Monitor Twice





Hands-on advice for upgrading PCs, compatibles, and peripherals

Storage to go, the ultimate LaserJet cartridge, and more

Hard Disk on the Run

For most users, portable mass storage means a 1.2MB floppy disk. And for good reason. Portable hard disk drives have a reputation for being fragile, expensive, and hard to install. Why, you may ask, doesn't someone make an external drive that's as rugged as Plus Development's Hardcard but can be attached to any system for a quick storage fix?

As you might guess, someone has. The Plato Hardpac 20 from Sunrise Technology Corporation not only matches the Hardcard 20's price, storage, and access speed, but it is truly portable.

Instead of plugging this booksize drive into a slot, like the Hardcard, you connect it to a Plato controller board that you install in a PC, XT, AT, or compatible system; the company supplies a 3-foot cable, so the Hardpac 20 can purr away just about anywhere on your desktop. Better still, you don't have to install drivers, modify CONFIG.SYS files, or even run your system's Setup program. People on a tight budget who need to share hard disk storage or are interested in backing up all the office PCs cheaply can simply buy extra controllers for their machines (continues)

Block That Static!

Before you pop the top off your PC or slide that hard disk drive out of its box, take these precautionary steps to eliminate static—and to protect your hardware investment:

- Avoid wearing polyester clothing you could easily build up a charge that could destroy the chips on an expansion board. Wear rubber-soled shoes or go shoeless, and don't handle other staticgenerating materials, such as polystyrene or Styrofoam, before upgrading a system.
- Leave hardware in its antistatic packaging until installation time.
- Minimize your chances of building up static electricity by limiting your movements. Keep needed hardware, tools, and software nearby.
- Just before you remove the device from its packaging, ground yourself by touching the fan grill on the back of a turned-off PC that's plugged into a grounded outlet.
- Touch only the nonconductive edges of any device you're handling. With most expansion boards, that means the thick green board the chips are mounted on; with disk drives, the outer metal frame. Whatever you do, don't touch the shiny metal slot connectors or cable connectors on the device. You could give the unit a very expensive jolt. —R. L.

at \$95 a pop. Security-minded users can unplug the drive in about 5 seconds and stash it in the office safe.

Unfortunately, the Hardpac 20 isn't the easiest drive to install. Instead of typing one or two commands to configure the drive, the Hardpac 20 forces you to fuss with FDISK and FORMAT. And though the drive will run off

most systems, you must initially configure it on a true Blue IBM PC XT or risk facing a long, torturous installation session. Another pain: If you want to create a bootable Hardpac, you must first disconnect the XT's hard disk controller and then partition the Hardpac. First-time upgraders should also be wary of the user manual, which occasionally leaves out steps, contradicts itself, and includes a few deadly typographical errors.

As with all such upgrades, park the PC's hard disk if it has one, turn off the system, unplug all external cables, remove the system cover, and ground yourself before touching any component. Place the Hardpac 20 controller board on its antistatic wrapper and locate the jumpers at the 6 o'clock and 9 o'clock positions. If you're installing the board in an XT that already has a hard disk, for example, make sure the jumpers cover the two rightmost pins on each jumper block. (Ignore the accompanying illustration in the manual-it shows incorrect settings.) Pop. the board into a free slot and connect the supplied cable to the board and to the back of the Hardpac 20. Reassemble the system but don't put the cover back on yet-you may have to change jumpers on the controller if it conflicts with other boards in the system.

Slip a formatted floppy system disk containing FDISK and FOR-MAT into drive A: and turn on the computer. The Hardpac 20 will click and whir while the XT goes through its usual motions, stops, displays a message like 'EXTERN ROM CA00', and after 10 seconds finally boots up. (If the system freezes, turn it off and make sure the jumper settings on the board are correct.)

Here's where you must be careful, because unless you're creating a bootable Hardpac (and disabling the XT's hard disk), it's easy to format the wrong drive. Type A:FDISK and then log on to the Hardpac 20 by selecting option 5 (Next Hard Drive) from the opening FDISK Setup Program menu; 'Current Fixed Disk Drive: 2' should appear at the top of the screen. Now select 1 (Create DOS partition), then I again (Create Primary DOS Partition), and finally, answer 'Y' to the prompt asking if you want to devote the entire partition to DOS. When the job's done a few seconds later, press <Esc> and the system reboots.

Once the A> prompt reappears, type FORMAT D:/S to format the disk; in 4 or 5 minutes, the Hardpac 20 will be ready to hit the road. Note: Contrary to the manual's warnings, the Hardpac 20 and the computer you tie it to don't have be using the same version of DOS. However, if the computer already has a hard disk, you can't boot it off the Hardpac 20. The drive also demands a whopping 20 watts at start-up-so those with older PCs and Compaq portables should consider getting more capable power supplies.

The take-anywhere hard disk is clearly an idea whose time has come, and the Hardpac 20 is a pretty fair implementation. Just (continues)

More Fonts at Your Fingertips

If you're like most Hewlett-Packard LaserJet users, you probably find using downloadable (or "soft") fonts a hassle. Yet the LaserJet's humdrum internal Courier and Line Printer fonts don't give a document much visual punch. The quick and easy solution, of course, is to reach for an HP font cartridge. Unfortunately, HP's font cartridges cost an average of \$200 apiece, and no single cartridge holds all of a font's variations (bold, italic, portrait, landscape, and so on). Until now.

Thanks to Pacific Data Products, font-hungry LaserJet users can turn to 25 Cartridges in One!, a single cartridge that packs 103 fonts yet costs only \$399—pocket money compared to the \$5000 tab for the entire HP collection. The equivalent of just about every HP cartridge is crammed into this product, with the exception of bar code characters and some miscellaneous symbols. You can use 25 Cartridges in One! with the Laser-Jet Plus, 500, 500 Plus, and Series II and IID, as well as Canon's LBP-8II. Software compatibility, however, is currently limited to 1-2-3, Microsoft Word, MultiMate Advantage II, and WordPerfect 4.2 and 5.0. Pacific Data plans to supply a Windows 2.03/38b driver free to registered users in short order, followed by drivers for XyWrite, WordStar, DisplayWrite, and Samna Word V. If your program isn't supported and you're comfortable using escape sequences, however, Pacific Data's thorough, illustrated user manual supplies the necessary information.

Using 25 Cartridges in One! is a snap. To access the cartridge's portrait and landscape fonts with Word, for example, copy the supplied PAC25P.PRD and PAC-25L.PRD drivers to Word's subdirectory. Then run Word, load the document, and select either driver as you would any other by pressing <Esc>, selecting Print Options, pressing <F1>, highlighting the driver's name, and pressing <Enter>. To select the typeface and point size, highlight the characters in the document, press <Esc>, select Format Character, tab down to the Font Name option, and press <F1>. A list of available fonts cascades onto the screen. Highlight your

selection, press <Enter>, go back to the Format Character menu, select the font size, and you're ready to print.

No upgrade is completely trouble-free. The font you want may be hard to find, especially if it's one of the eight Courier fonts with the same name but different character sets. You'll find yourself flipping through the user manual's font tables frequently, but that's a small price to pay for this cornucopia. Unfortunately, 25 Cartridges in One! doesn't support WordStar—or the original LaserJet, Canon's LBP-8A1, or other LaserJet compatibles. But for the majority of LaserJet and Canon users, 25 Cartridges in One! is a simple and inexpensive tool that's a bargain by anybody's standards. -Matt Lake





A DOS for All Systems

Q. I have some questions about IBM's DOS 4.0. Will it work on my XT clone? If not, where can I get its MS-DOS counterpart? Will it support my old RAM expansion boards?

Ross R. King Rancho Cordova, California

A. Without knowing the specific components in your XT clone, I can't give a definitive answer. IBM DOS 4.0 does work on IBM PCs, XTs, ATs, AT 286s, PC Convertibles, and PS/2s. Presumably, it works on any compatible system, provided that the system's ROMs are not too old. Most very old clones will not boot DOS 3.2 or later versions without a ROM upgrade.

If your system's manufacturer offers DOS 4.0, you may be better off with that version than with another company's offering: your manufacturer's release would support any special features your clone might have. Call the company and ask if DOS 4.0 will run on your system and if the company sells it. For "generic" clones, manufacturers usually sell what's known as retail MS-DOS, a Microsoft product that's also available via mail order and at your local computer store. In any case, your memory boards will function as they always have-no better, no worse.

Addressing DeskMate

Q. I have read more than once in PC World's Star-Dot-Star column about using ANSI.SYS to redefine keys. I have tried several times, without luck, to create an ANSI.SYS macro to enter my three-line name and address.

After reading Tom Swan's note under "AutoCAD in Comfort" [Star-Dot-Star, PCW, November 1988], I concluded that Tandy's DeskMate program does not recognize ANSLSYS key assignments. However, even at the A> prompt, I get only part of what I want, and it's all on one line. Is there a limit to the size of an ANSLSYS macro?

"AntoCAD in Comfort" included a table of ANSLSYS extended key codes for certain key combinations, Would you please tell me the codes for <Alt>- and <Ctrl>-lowercase letter and <Alt>- and <Ctrl>-number combinations?

A. Almost all word processors take over the keyboard and therefore do not recognize ANSLSYS key reassignments. You need another way to automate entering your name and address into the letters you write. Such a task is usually accomplished using a word processor's macro capability, but Text, Desk-Mate's word processor, doesn't (continues)

do macros. To accomplish the task, make a small Text file containing your three-line address and a blank line, and save it with the single-character name A (DeskMate adds the .DOC extension). Then, whenever you need to insert your address, position the cursor, press <F2> (the Files key), press M to highlight 'Merge', press < Enter > to execute the function, press A to highlight A.DOC on the Files list in the Merge File dialog box, and press < Enter > to merge in your address.

Although DeskMate doesn't recognize ANSI.SYS reassignments, knowing how to make multiline assignments may prove fruitful with other applications. The command PROMPT \$el0: 104; "Your name"; 13; 10; "Your address";13;10;"Your city, state, and ZIP code";13;10;10p will assign your three-line address to <Alt>-<F1>. The :13s and :10s are the ASCII codes for the carriage returns and the linefeeds required to separate your address into three lines and add an extra linefeed at the end of the address.

Since the DOS command line accepts only 127 characters, using a DOS command to make an ANSI.SYS reassignment limits you to 127, minus about 20 for the command itself. But you can assign a string of 192 characters. entered as ASCII codes or within double quotes, to a key: Save the ANSI.SYS reassignment escape sequence in an ASCII filecalled, for example, ANSIKEY —and then issue the command COPY ANSIKEY CON, Because the reassignment string and the assigned key are kept in a static buffer of memory, increasing the number of assigned keys decreases the number of characters that can be assigned. Also, some public-domain versions of ANSI.SYS have larger assignment buffers than that provided by DOS's ANSI.SYS.

Your keyboard doesn't differentiate case for <Alt>-letter combinations; it sends the same code for <Alt>-A as it does for <Alt>-a. The same holds true for <Ctrl>-letter combinations. These, however, are not extended keys; their ASCII codes are 1 through 26. The keyboard does not send codes for <Ctrl>-number combinations. The ANSI.SYS extended key codes for <Alt>-1 through <Alt>-0 are 0;120 through 0;129.

ROM BIOS Drive Support

Q. I read "3½-Inch Drive in a Compaq Portable" [The Help Screen, PCW, August 1988] and decided to put one in my very early model Portable. Installation was fairly simple and the drive works—sort of. Although it can read disks that were formatted to 720K, it can't itself format a floppy to 720K. I've tried the
DRIVPARM and DEVICE =
DRIVEK.SYS commands, but
nothing makes a difference. Is
there something I'm missing?

A. Yes, but you won't find it in the August item. In order for a system's 3½-inch drive to format 720K disks, its ROM BIOS must contain support for that type of drive. I neglected to mention in the August item that your Compaq Portable's motherboard must have revision G or later ROMs. Sorry about the inconvenience. Contact your local dealer for an upgrade.

Nine-Bit Bytes?

Q. While adding RAM to an XT motherboard, I noticed that each bank contains nine chip sockets. Since each 64-kilobit chip contributes a single bit to each byte of RAM, and each byte consists of 8 bits, 8 chips provide 64K of memory. So what's the ninth chip for?

A. The original IBM PC was designed with nine dynamic RAM (DRAM) chips per memory bank, with the ninth chip used for parity checking. Parity checking helps ensure that memory values are valid. It works by setting the parity bit of a particular byte to 0 or 1 depending on the number of 1 bits in that byte. Before a byte is used again, its parity value is checked against that byte's number of 1 bits. If the parity value is valid, processing continues; otherwise the system halts. A better design

would let you try to correct the byte value and proceed or, at least, would continue after warning you of the error.

The PC's parity-checking memory design has been carried over to the XT, the AT, PS/2s, 80386-based computers, and most compatibles. Therefore, when adding memory to 16-bit and 32-bit systems that use DRAM chips, you have to add 18 (not 16) and 36 (not 32) chips at a time, respectively.

DISKCOPY Dilemma

Q. I use an Everex 80386/20 as an AutoCAD workstation under DOS 4.0. It has 2MB of RAM, a single floppy drive, and an 80MB hard disk. However, when copying an almost full 1.2MB disk with the DOS command DISKCOPY, I'm prompted six times to swap between the source and target disks. Why can't a computer with 2MB of memory do a 1.2MB DISKCOPY in one pass?

A. It's not the computer that can't do DISKCOPY in one pass, it's the operating system. Before expanded memory, DOS could use only 640K to hold the operating system, running program,

and the program's data. DOS 4.0 takes at least 64K, and more likely 100K, counting device drivers and other system options. DISKCOPY takes more than 10K. Subtract the 75K minimum total from 640K and you're left with 565K, less than half the RAM necessary to hold 1.2MB of data. That adds up to three pairs of disk swaps.

Conceivably, DISKCOPY could be rewritten to recognize and use expanded memory in order to reduce the number of disk swaps. OS/2, which manages 16MB of memory, could also theoretically do the job in a single pass, but only if DISKCOPY were rewritten to make use of the extra memory. Unfortunately, such consideration of user needs is missing from DOS 4.0, the first DOS version to support expanded memory, and from OS/2.

It's unlikely that you'll see a single-pass DISKCOPY offering from an independent developer of software utilities. That may be good news for your data, though, because you really should use DISKCOPY as infrequently as possible. Since DISKCOPY copies the data in each sector of the source disk to the same sector of the target disk, the program requires a defect-free target disk to ensure that data is not "copied" to a defective sector, which won't retain it. You should use DISKCOPY only to make backup

copies of your program disks.

For copying a few data files from one disk to another, use the command XCOPY A:\ B:\ /E/S, even though you have only one floppy drive; the system will prompt you to switch disks. The /E tells XCOPY to duplicate on the target disk any of the source disk's empty directories. The /S tells XCOPY to duplicate any of the source disk's directories containing files, complete with the files. If the source disk contains no subdirectories, you can use the simpler command XCOPY A: B:.

To copy nearly full 1.2MB data disks, use some of that 80MB hard disk: Issue the command MD C:\TEMP to create a temporary subdirectory. Insert the disk to be copied into drive A:, and enter XCOPY A: \ C: \TEMP /E/S to copy the floppy's files, including those in subdirectories, to the hard disk subdirectory; use XCOPY A: C:\TEMP if the source has no subdirectories. Then, replace the disk in drive A: with a blank, formatted 1.2MB disk and issue XCOPY C: \TEMP A: \ /E/S. Now that you have a backup floppy, issue DEL C: \TEMP to delete the files in the \TEMP directory, press Y to confirm, enter CD C: \ to change to the root directory of drive C:, and use RD C: \TEMP to remove the temporary directory.

If you make such copies often, don't remove \TEMP, just empty it. You may also want to create the batch file DATACOPY. BAT (see LISTING 1) to automate the procedure. DATACOPY.BAT should be kept in a directory listed in your system's PATH and requires that XCOPY is in the \DOS directory of drive C:, that you have a blank disk in the (continues)

same format as the source disk, and that the directory C:\TEMP exists. It also requires a file called YCR, which-consists simply of a Y and a carriage return, in the \DOS directory of drive C:. To create YCR, change to the \DOS directory, type COPY CON C:YCR, press < Enter > , press Y, press < Enter > , press < F6 > , and press < Enter > .

WordPerfect Macro Menu Update

In last month's *Letters* column, reader James P. Hall lamented the fact that the custom *Word-Perfect 4.2* menus described in George Beinhorn's "Macro Menus for WordPerfect" (*PCW*, February 1988) wouldn't work with *WordPerfect 5.0*. We promised an update, and here it is.

The MACROCNV.EXE program included on WordPerfect 5.0's Conversion disk converts a 4.2 .MAC macro's text, cursor keystrokes, and 4.2 functions that are unchanged in 5.0 into the new version's .WPM format. Copy the macros you want to convert along with MACROCNV .EXE to the directory where WordPerfect 5.0 resides. Then enter MACROCNV file name, where file name is the name of a 4.2 macro; you don't need to type the .MAC extension. You could include multiple file names on the command line for a mass conversion, but don't-important information would scroll off the screen after the first few files were converted.

MACROCNV.EXE appends the warning '{;} BAD! ~' after each version 5.0-incompatible command it finds, then cheerfully informs you that some manual editing is necessary. To finish off such a partially converted macro, open it in *WordPerfect* 5.0's macro editor (press <Ctrl>-<F10>, type the macro's name, then press 2 or E), locate any commands marked with the BAD! label, and replace them with the appropriate *Word-Perfect* 5.0 command.

Since the Merge command sequence used in George Beinhorn's pop-up menus article did not change in 5.0, MACROCNV.EXE converts the menus without a hitch. However, in each menu macro, the article omitted an important code required to execute the macros at the cursor position rather than at the end of the document: Append a ^Q (<Ctrl>-Q) after the final ^G^O combination at the end of each menu macro.

Lock a Floppy Drive

I recently learned of a new product that delivers one more way to prevent booting from drive A: (see "System Security," The Help Screen, PCW, February 1989). The Lockette is a lock that you affix to the front of any 51/4-inch floppy drive that uses a lever rather than a door. The device prevents insertion of a floppy disk, which might be designed to bypass system security, or removal of a nonbooting floppy disk, which generates the error message 'Non-System disk or disk error; Replace and strike

any key when ready'. Although it won't stop a hacker with a crowbar, this lock is a simple, effective deterrent to unauthorized access.

System/36 Correction

While developing the solution to rebooting automatically with an alternate CONFIG.SYS (see "Irreconcilable Drivers," The Help Screen, PCW, December 1988), I was unaware that PC Support/36 by default installs a configuration file (for identifying virtual disks, printers, token ring network messaging facilities, and so on) called CONFIG.S36 in the root directory. Therefore, you should not use the file name CONFIG-.S36 as shown in the December item; use another name, such as CONFIG36.SYS, instead. My thanks to reader Russell Zipoff for bringing this matter to my attention.





The Right Stuffer

Are you tired of having to press <Enter> to get past opening screens that demand you 'Press <Enter> to continue'? If so, you can use my program PRESS-.COM to stuff up to 15 keystrokes into your keyboard buffer, letting you write batch file commands to "press" most any key on a typical PC keyboard. For example, to move past the opening display of the Lotus 1-2-3 Access System and execute 1-2-3, use the batch file command PRESS "LOTUS" CR CR "/FR". PRESS interprets the first CR as <Enter>, which causes the text in quotes to be executed just as though you had typed LOTUS <Enter> on the command line. PRESS also interprets the second CR as <Enter>, which starts 1-2-3, and then enters the keystrokes /FR, which retrieve a file.

In addition to quoted characters and CR. PRESS.COM understands the two-letter codes that represent the various keys listed in TABLE 1. (Each code must be in uppercase.) PRESS.COM can also type control keys, indicated by a caret prefix. For example, the command PRESS AC enters a Control C into the keyboard buffer. Other useful examples are PRESS "FOXPLUS" CR F1, which starts FoxPlus and jumps directly to the help screen; and PRESS "LOTUS" CR RT RT CR, which loads the Lotus 1-2-3 Access System,

presses <Cursor Right> twice, and then presses <Enter>, to select the Translate Utility.

tains about 4 milliliters of fluid, lasted for only 25 to 30 pages in NLQ mode. At that rate, printing a few hundred pages would cost a small fortune, and I feared I had bought a white elephant.

After searching everywhere for an inexpensive replacement and rejecting several pen inks that were laced with lacquer to make them dry quickly, I hit upon the perfect solution: waterbased Sheaffer Skrip jet black fountain pen ink. To make a device for injecting ink into the printer's reservoir, I cut off and rounded the tip of a syringe. Since then, I've been using my cheap refill ink regularly with no problems. Even when the printer sits idle for weeks, it prints without missing a dot. If you find another substitute ink, make sure it doesn't dry out or clog up under normal conditions.

The savings from this solution are terrific. A 60-milliliter bottle of Sheaffer ink costs about \$2. The equivalent 15 Epson cartridges would run a whopping \$135! I hope this tip will make other LetterJet owners as thrifty—and as happy—as I now am with my printer.

Editor's note: It's illegal in some states to purchase a hypodermic syringe without a prescription. But if you're on good terms with a local pharmacist or family physician, you may be able to obtain one without a needle. If not, look in a drugstore for a needleless infant's medicine syringe, such as the Apex Medical Corporation's Oral Syringe, which is sold over the counter. Veterinarians and pet supply stores also carry needleless syringes.

Our Nom de Plume, Perhaps?

I've discovered an alternative to this column's namesake, the familiar DOS wild-card specification, *.*. In most DOS commands, you can save two keystrokes by instead typing a plain period, which also means "all files in the current directory." For example, COPY A:. is identical to COPY A:*.*, and DEL. is the same as DEL *.*. (One caveat: In DOS versions before 3.0, the trick won't work in the root directory. There, you can use a backslash instead of a period.) Perhaps you should rename your column just plain Dot?

Editor's note: Technically, a single period stands for the name of the current directory. The trick works because DOS commands like DEL let you specify a directory name as a shorthand way to operate on all files in that directory. Its use, however, is not exactly equivalent to *.* and can cause damage. For example, issuing the comand COPY . will not generate the error message 'File cannot be copied onto itself' but will instead cause files to copy onto themselves, destroying any that are larger than 64K. COPY does not recognize that . \filename and filename designate the same file.

Another little-known shorthand reference is double dot (..), which represents the parent directory. Thus, the command DIR .. lists the files in the parent of the current directory, and DEL .. deletes them. As for our name, we'll keep our lucky stars, but thank you very much.

No Runs, No Hits, No ERRs

In "To ERR Is Inhuman" [Star-Dot-Star, PCW, September 1988; see also "ERRor Correction," Star-Dot-Star, PCW, January 1989], Leon Chalnick describes a macro for eliminating 1-2-3 spreadsheet ERRs. Another method I've found helpful is to copy the statement @IF(@IS-ERR(formula),0,formula) down a column.

This returns zero in each cell if the formula evaluates to ERR; otherwise, it returns the result of the formula, which you can replace with any valid expression. The result can be used as an element in other calculations referring to the cell. Another technique is to use a similar statement to refer to a different cell. @IF(@ISERR(B5),0,B5) returns zero if B5, or any other specified cell, contains ERR, or the contents of B5 if it doesn't.

DEVELOPER'S TOOLBOX

Conventional Surprises

Dozens of new and improved software tools sparkled brightly amid the glitz and glitter at Fall COMDEX in Las Vegas. There were a few surprises, too. For instance, John Otken, developer of the assembler Optasm, gave me an eye-popping advance look at his new linker, *Optlink*, and new debugger, *Optdebug*, which will

be available soon from SLR Systems. The debugger features a clever command that lets you work backward through a program, undoing the effects of previously executed machine code step by step. Other planned Optasm features include 80386 support, faster assembling speed, and teaser versions of *Optlink* and *Optdebug*, making this product worth serious consideration.

Speaking of assembly language, Bruce Barrington and Gary Liming of Clarion Software told me that programmers are now hard at work converting the Clarion language from Turbo C to pure assembly code. The finished effort should add an extra helping of speed and reduce disk space requirements for the company's easy-to-use, menudriven data base-development systems. An impressive demo made clear to me that for getting data base applications up and running in a hurry, Clarion is a dream.

There were new tools for highlevel-language programmers, too. Despite a feeding frenzy at a nearby bowl of Hershey's Kisses, I managed to follow a demo of a fascinating new program design tool, Logic Gem from Sterling Castle. The basic idea behind *Logic Gem* is simple. You plug in logical statements and select a language. Moments later, you receive a source code listing optimized for the decision rules you supplied. Output choices include C, structured BASIC (for example, Turbo Basic and QuickBASIC), interpreted BASIC, Pascal, FORTRAN, dBASE, and English (useful for documenting your code). The program is especially good at cutting through a complex forest (continues)

of nested decision trees, ensuring the logical consistency of multiple IF...THEN...ELSE statements. Serious programmers must get *Logic Gem*. It's a jewel.

Nonprogrammers who need to build DOS menus quickly should pick up Menu Blocks from Bridgeway Publishing. The product isn't new, but its well-designed character graphics commands make building custom menus fast and easy. (Another recommendation: The company makes Fast-Trax, a PC World Best Buy.) Also, because Menu Blocks maintains an internal PATH variable. using the program can eliminate PATH commands in AUTOEXEC-.BAT and other batch files. For designing turnkey systems, Menu Blocks belongs in every developer's bag of tricks.

Likewise, for applying the finishing touch of on-line documentation, all systems developers should be pleased with the features in new releases of PDQ-Help, a text-only version, and PDQPlus, which includes graphics support. These programs help build context-sensitive popup text files that can hold 100,000 keywords, with as many as 1200 lines of associated text per word. For personal programming references, you can order prepackaged files for Greenleaf C and Lahey FORTRAN tool kits. And you can freely distribute a supplied PDQHelp run-time module for adding on-line documentation to your own software. Best of all, PDQHelp's resident module occupies a thrifty 29K. PDQPlus takes up only 39K. If you're seeking an on-line help system, look no further.

Discovering these and other tools at COMDEX meant hiking an estimated 36 total miles of aisles at eight locations, but I'm glad to say the trip was worth every step. New developer's tools promise an exciting future for software and systems designers. What's more, my research provided an unexpected health benefit—with all that walking, I lost three pounds!

NETWORK Q&A

Tips and strategies for departmental networking

PC World launches a new column devoted to LAN users and asks the question, What network operating system is right for you?

David Ferris Communication is the bedrock of business success. Fail to listen to your customers, and you'll quickly find yourself staring at a shriveled bottom line. Fail to communicate in your department, and projects can quickly run aground. To keep work groups and companies in sync, more and more businesses are turning to local area networks.

Yet there's no productivity gain without pain. For most people, linking PCs together into even a small LAN can be a titanic challenge. Just deciding what to buy can keep you up nights: Should I go with Novell or 3Com? Should I opt for ethernet or token ring adapter cards? Can I use a Deskpro 386 for a server? Must I run multiuser software, or will single-user applications do? And what about integrating PCs, Macs, and Wangs on a growing network? Or linking up to a LAN on the third floor or the VAX across the hall?

Network Q&A is designed to answer just such real-world questions from readers. Each month the column will provide nitty-gritty guidance on selecting LAN hardware and software, help readers unravel network snafus, and supply tips for efficient day-to-day operation. Beyond this, Network Q&A will report on new products and trends and shed some light on new technologies.

Network Q&A should be useful to anybody involved with LANs, whether you're a novice

user wondering how to work with a shared laser printer, or an experienced MIS pro evaluating new server technology. However, the column is aimed primarily at first-time LAN administrators of small to medium-size networks, and the managers who work with them.

Q. What type of LAN operating system should I buy?

A. By far the most crucial decision you'll make in selecting a network is the choice of a LAN operating system (LAN OS), the software glue that holds a network together. The leading LAN OS products are Novell's *Net-Ware*, 3Com's 3+, Sun's TOPS, Banyan Systems' *Vines*, and numerous versions of Microsoft's OS/2 LAN Manager. Your choice of LAN OS should be guided by what the network will have to do immediately—and over the next three or four years.

Choosing the right LAN OS is critical for two reasons. First, like any operating system, a LAN OS defines a network's (continues) character and how easy it is to configure, learn, use, and upgrade. Second, changing your LAN OS is extremely difficult, much trickier than changing wiring, adapter cards, or servers. Switching to a new LAN OS not only involves reinstalling all your applications and resetting user access rights but can mean redesigning front-end menu systems, and more. Imagine switching every PC in your office from DOS to UNIX, and you get the idea.

A LAN OS is a must because DOS doesn't know much about sharing printers, modems, storage, and other resources. The LAN OS controls access to these resources and to data and programs on the server. Depending on the LAN OS, directories can be public (open to all users), shared (open to a select group), or private (assigned to one person). The LAN OS also directs traffic, queuing (or "spooling") print requests from networked users. You can expect a LAN OS to come with utilities such as an E-mail program for exchanging short messages within the department, programs that monitor usage, and so on. Before you buy that dream LAN OS, however, consider some other key factors:

Software Compatibility Before you buy a LAN OS, make sure it supports the *multiuser* applications you want to use. Don't be lulled by a vendor's claim that its LAN OS will run almost any *single*-user program off the shelf. Insoluble incompatibilities can crop up; more to the point, single-user programs lack basic file- and record-locking safeguards. If two people try to open the same file, the entire network can crash. For the surest answer

on LAN OS compatibility, contact the company that sells the multiuser package.

NETBIOS Compatibility Make sure the LAN OS is NETBIOS compatible; these standard networking subroutines are used by many important multiuser applications. Most major vendors support this specification, but it never hurts to ask.

Training If you thought DOS was unfathomable, try using a LAN OS. Logging on to the server, sending an E-mail message, and performing other day-to-day tasks can mean typing reams of obscure commands. To shield users from technical intricacies, your technical staff (or consultant) should create a menu system and convenient batch files, write relevant user documentation, and then give everyone a quick tutorial on using the LAN.

Technical Support Don't base your choice of a LAN OS solely on its price tag. Technical support can be a huge expense; remember, too, that it's easier to find qualified staff for some LANs because of their popularity. If you're running a small TOPS network, you may not need much help. But chances are you'll need some in-house staff as well as third-party consultants, LAN resellers, and LAN OS vendors to maintain multiuser software, develop front-end menu systems, and tackle other thorny tasks. In sum, determine the level of post-sale support you'll want—and the LAN OS's popularity—before choosing a network supplier.

Memory Requirements Find out how much RAM the LAN OS commandeers from networked PCs—you may have to upgrade some machines. NetWare and 3+ usually require that each PC cede from 30K to 70K. TOPS, which lets any PC be a workstation, server, or both, takes more: If a PC acts as either workstation or server, the RAM cost is 120K. If it plays both roles, say goodbye to 190K. Don't forget that menu systems and drivers for LAN adapters also soak up memory.

Security Need to protect payroll records from prying eyes? Should certain employees be allowed to read records but not edit them? If you need this level of control, carefully consider a LAN OS's security features. At the very least, the system should control access to files and records and require users to enter passwords when logging on. LANs that can link to the outside world (remote users, other LANs, and large systems) should safeguard access to modems, fax gateways, and microto-mainframe links.

When evaluating security features, keep convenience in mind. 3+ and TOPS users must enter a password for each shared resource (printer, modem, or server) they access. This approach becomes annoying as a LAN grows in size. With *NetWare*, on the other hand, a single password controls access to all peripherals. *NetWare* can also detect and record unsuccessful log-ons, and automatically force users to change passwords at set intervals.

Lay of the LANs

When selecting your LAN OS, it's crucial that you examine how the network will be used. Most networks fall into three categories—personal LANs, isolated work-group LANs, and power

LANs. Determine which category your LAN falls into and then judge how well a given LAN OS meets its needs.

Personal LANs are limited to ten or fewer PCs and are set up primarily for sharing peripherals and data. Users in a work group can share a printer, swap messages via a basic E-mail program, and move data files over the network. If your LAN fits this profile-and you don't expect it to grow much-TOPS is probably the best choice (see "TOPS—The Low-End Link to Macs" in this issue). Although TOPS can cost as much as an equivalent NetWare setup (about \$500 per node), TOPS is much easier to install and use. In addition, it offers the flexibility of peer-to-peer networking: Instead of relying on a single dedicated server that holds all shared files and controls all shared peripherals, TOPS lets any node act as server or server/workstation. This scheme allows shared hard disks and peripherals to be situated throughout the office. TOPS's Achilles' heel? Its limited password-based security and lack of centralized administration tools-critical features if the LAN has to grow.

Isolated work-group LANs are typically single-server setups that support between 10 and 40 PCs, supply considerably more services than personal LANs, and aren't linked to other networks. Typical needs include centralized backup, multiuser data bases, sophisticated E-mail, and a shared library of numerous file types. Although it's tricky to install, NetWare is currently the best option in this category, and its popularity assures you of

finding plenty of support software and knowledgeable technicians to tune up the system.

3Com's 3+ can also serve isolated work groups, but it's not as widely supported and may come with more extras than you want. Versions of *LAN Manager* such as IBM's *LAN Server* and 3Com's 3+Open are also viable options. As more vendors deliver supporting software, these products will become increasingly attractive.

Power LANs are rich multiuser environments that meld hundreds of workstations with other LANs, remote users, and mainframes near and far. 3Com's 3 + and 3 + Open are good bets for power LANs. They streamline internetwork communications and let users access remote servers and peripherals as if they were across the room. The key underpinnings are a name service—a distributed system directory that coordinates multiple servers-and internetwork routing-a facility that optimizes data exchange with remote LANs.

Banyan's *Vines* is another candidate if you need foolproof security, powerful debugging tools, and top-of-the-line internetwork routing. However, you're on your own for installation and maintenance because vendor support is sparse, and third-party services and applications are few and far between.

Take your time evaluating a network operating system; the success of your LAN—and your department's productivity—will depend on it. Above all, avoid choosing your LAN OS based on a quick poll of what other firms use on their LANs. That approach can be a recipe for disaster. ●

Spell Out dBASE Logical Fields

Tired of explaining what T and F stand for in dBASE III Plus reports? If your dBASE reports often display the contents of logical fields, you'll produce more readable output by using dBASE's IIF() function with the Active expression to substitute words for the logical values.

Suppose you have a file called Vendors with a logical field, called Active, containing T or F. In a report column, instead of the Active expression itself, use IIF(ACTIVE, "Yes", "No"). You can also use IIF(ACTIVE, "Active", "Inactive").

This year we'll see implementations of Intel's 80486 microprocessor, with power greater than some mainframes. Of course, you aren't likely to need that much muscle unless you're the kind of person who's installed a particle accelerator to run physics experiments in your basement.

On the other hand, there's nothing to stop power users with enough change in their jeans from claiming machines of this generation as their new personal standard, as we've seen happen with every previous generation of so-called screamers.

There is one potential threat, however, to the rise of the 486 in computerland. With all this power, makers of new 486 systems will be tempted to customize a feature here or optimize a subsystem there, as happened with 386 memory boards, which differ from manufacturer to manufacturer.

If each system maker—rushing to be first with the fastest—designs disk controllers, communications boards, or video adapters that work only with their own particular add-in slot, the resulting lack of standardization could make buyers keep their wallets in their pockets.

So far, hardware standardization appears to be proceeding apace. The industry seems to be settling on two bus designs for the 486 generation: the Micro Channel Architecture (MCA) of IBM's PS/2 systems, and the Extended Industry Standard Architecture (EISA). The latter is being supported by dozens of major manufacturers of compatibles, led by Compaq.

But while most of the industry appears to be heeding the call of standardization, there are still disturbing signs that proprietary thinking may rear its ugly head. For example, at last fall's COM-DEX, Acer Technology displayed a 386 machine with two new 32bit slots-not just for memory boards but for other high-speed peripherals as well. These slots are not compatible with MCA or EISA; boards for this supplier's system will not be interchangeable with those from any other manufacturer.

This strategy isn't likely to catch on. But if it does, and more manufacturers go their own way with proprietary gimmicks, the wide availability of interchangeable add-in PC boards that we now enjoy will be significantly diminished.

To encourage manufacturers of 486-based systems to work toward standardization, volume buyers of microcomputer systems have formed a 486 Standardization Committee. Committee members don't care whether the industry standardizes on a Purple Polka-Dot Architecture, as long as it works.

The consensus seems to be that if no single standard will dominate, having two different standards is much better than having no common ground at all. In fact, although MCA and EISA do almost exactly the same things, the competition between them for market share may even result in some benefits to consumers—lower prices, for example.

But the situation bears watching. Even though most vendors seem to be adhering to standards in the 486 generation, the temptation to introduce proprietary technology is always there. I'm sure that locked away in one of Intel's labs somewhere is a team of hotshot engineers—the types who balance their checkbooks in hexadecimal—furiously designing the 586.
