A Question of Balance



Reviewer Alan Schwartz What separates a master chef from a shortorder cook is not the ingredients they use—it's a sense of proportion. A pinch of salt brings out the subtle flavor in a dish; add a handful and your dinner's ruined.

That same sense of delicate balance is essential in software reviewing as well. Every *PC World* review starts with the same ingredients. We compare a program's features with those of its main competitors, pore over NSTL test results, and cast a critical eye on the user interface. Balancing those three elements is what makes the review process as much an art as it is a science.

In this month's roundup of dBASE clones ("Five Against IV"), finding the right proportions was hardly a problem. In data management, reports author Alan Schwartz, speed is the name of the game. "Users really care about performance," he says. "They seem to find all sorts of ingenious ways to circumvent 'user unfriendliness,' but nothing can overcome sludgy execution." Foxbase + earned a Best Buy recommendation thanks to its lightning-fast NSTL test performance and flawless dBASE compatibility.

But is *Foxbase* too compatible? Ashton-Tate's copyright-infringement suit against Fox Software made headlines and inspired loud cries of foul from the enormous *dBASE* users' community. Schwartz, a longtime *dBASE* developer and the author of our roundup, finds it ironic that Ashton-Tate should sue.

Actually, he argues, "the clone competition helped solidify dBASE as a standard." And by preannouncing dBASE IV, he suggests, the giant may have inadvertently encouraged even more blatant cloning. "The competition had to throttle their urge to innovate, frozen by a dilemma: If they offered extensions and innovation, they would risk being trapped into incompatibilities. Whatever the outcome, it's clear that Ashton-Tate's power to define has become the power to redefine."

Also in this issue: John Diebold ("Portable Power") examines eight AC-powered transportable PCs that let you pack desktop computing muscle with your carry-on luggage. The latest generation of 16-bit VGA boards offer superb performance and a host of extended display modes; the details are in Contributing Editor TJ Byers' review "VGA Boards Raise the Standard." And if you don't like the Windows interface, change it. Judy Getts ("Windows Made Over") says corporate America is doing just that, thanks to a raft of third-party enhancements. You'll find her feature, plus a whole lot more, in our latest Windows Special Report. ●





Leading Edge Enters Chapter 11

Supplier
Plunged Into
Legal Morass

After laying off almost all its 200 employees and suspending PC shipments and user support for two months, Leading Edge Hardware Products is trying to reorganize under Chapter 11 of the Federal Bankruptcy Code. At press time, court-appointed trustee Stephen Gray had asked the court to accept an offer from Reprise Capital of Garden City, New York, to finance the firm's operations. Reprise's ultimate goal, says Gray, is to take over the Canton, Massachusetts, company, whose major assets are its popular brand name and a disputed right to exclusive U.S. distribution of PCs built by Daewoo Telecom. Leading Edge was thrown into Chapter 11 in February by a half-dozen resellers, who objected to founder Michael Shane's planned transfer of those assets to one of his largest dealer/ distributors, PC Systems of Riviera Beach, Florida, in return for \$921,000 and the assumption of dealer liabilities. Instead, the disgruntled resellers, who were forced to pay Leading Edge tens of thousands of dollars months in advance of computer shipments, pulled the plug on the company. Leading Edge shipped somewhere around \$125 million in PCs last year and may owe creditors as much as \$42 million, depending on the disposition of court cases and the disputed ownership of \$15 million to \$17 million worth of Daewoo systems sitting in a Los Angeles warehouse. Gray has sought court injunctions to enforce the distribution agreement, which Daewoo says Leading Edge voided, and to prevent PC Systems from competing for Leading Edge dealers.

Intel Unveils 80486

Hybrid Chip Offers More Power and a Workstation Alternative Intel Corporation extended the life of its popular processor family and struck a blow against competing reduced instruction set computer (RISC) suppliers by announcing shipments of its 80486 processor on April 10. The million-transistor chip is a hybrid of Intel's current CPU design and RISC processor technology, yielding throughput two to three times that of 386 chips running at the same 25-MHz and 33-MHz clock rates, reports Claude Leglise, director of 486 marketing. The 486 maintains binary compatibility with all operating modes, operating systems, and applications for the 386. It boosts performance through a combination of limited RISC processing techniques, an on-chip

8K memory cache, and the integration of floating-point computation formerly performed by coprocessors. In addition, the 486 includes an instruction set designed to better support multiprocessor systems such as Zenith Data Systems' Z-1000. Two or more 486s can be more easily coordinated by the appropriate operating system calls anticipated in future versions of OS/2 and UNIX. The 486 not only responds to challenges to Intel's processor hegemony from RISC-chip makers Sun and Motorola, it also gives PC vendors a better platform from which to compete with minicomputers and technical workstations in computation speed and input/output capacity.

33-MHz Systems Arrive

COMDEX Rife With Faster 80386 Machines and Rumors of More

n an unusual round of COMDEX press conferences on April 10, Everex Systems, AST Research, Zenith Data Systems, and Advanced Logic Resources all beat Compaq Computer to the punch by introducing 80386 PCs running at 33 MHz. It's still unclear how many of the machines will hit dealer shelves before the widely rumored Compaq 33-MHz system does. The new systems will not only boost PC speeds another 33 to 38 percent, observes Everex computer product manager Stephen Dougherty, they'll also let their vendors push even deeper into markets now dominated by minicomputers. The Step 386/33, scheduled to ship by the end of April, will perform at 8.2 MIPS thanks to Everex's proprietary 256K read/write cache. AST began designing its Premium 386/33 back when it

was preparing the Premium 386/25, reveals Larry Fortmuller, director of computer products. To save development time, both systems were designed with plug-in (but not interchangeable) CPU cards that house various coprocessors, 4MB of system memory, and 32K of cache memory. They also contain motherboards with integrated disk controllers and I/O ports. Similarly, Zenith began to design its Z-386/33 at the same time as the Z-386/25, but a new proprietary cache combines with the faster processor to boost the Z-386/33's speed to 8.3 MIPS, 38 percent faster than the Z-386/25. Details on ALR's scheduled 33-MHz model were not finalized at press time. Even the high-end systems are priced below \$12,000, and most should ship by May.

Compaq, Businessland Split

Battle Between Compaq and IBM Spills Over Into Dealer Channel The \$150-million-a-year distribution agreement between Compaq Computer and Businessland ends on April 21 in a divorce unusual for its suddenness and acrimony. Compaq broke off the partnership in a February 20 meeting between the two firms' top executives, stating that it is tired of resisting Businessland pressure for unfair margin advantage over other dealers. Businessland claims that it was merely seeking help in defraying its \$20 million yearly technical training and support bill—help that Businessland is able to elicit from other vendors, according to Communications Manager Beverley Bird. Complicating the issue is the steppedup competition between Compaq and IBM for industry leadership, exemplified by the Extended Industry Standard Architecture challenge to IBM's Micro Channel. Compaq's objection to support

funds is only a "smoke screen," asserts Bird. "What caused the fuss is that we have put a lot of support behind the Micro Channel." That was "the effect, not the cause," retorts Mike Swavely, Compaq vice president of sales and marketing. He maintains that Businessland's high-overhead storefronts and lowball prices force it to seek special treatment from vendors. Swavely feels that a sweetheart deal between Businessland and IBM prompts the reseller to push Big Blue's hardware over Compaq's. IBM recently changed its reimbursement policy, which could increase pressure on dealers to give preference to IBM products. Both Businessland and Compag vow that Businessland customers will continue to receive support for their Compag hardware, but the two firms have not reached agreement over implementation.

PC Paintbrush IV Coming

Best-Seller's Interface Now Resembles Windows and PM **Z**-Soft will release in May the fourth edition of its popular PC paint program, this one with an interface more closely resembling that of *Windows* and the OS/2 Presentation Manager. With *PC Paint-brush IV*, the Marietta, Georgia, firm replaces the proprietary interface known to approximately 1.5 million users with one that President Mark Zachmann calls "99 percent compatible" with IBM's Common User Access standard. "Our research shows that we can cut training time by a factor of five for people used to running *Windows* or PM," notes Zachmann. "That's what standards are all about." While *PC Paintbrush IV* is not a *Windows* or PM application, its similar pulldown

menus and dialog boxes will help even occasional users navigate the program more quickly. Version IV offers the ability to retouch scanned-in photographs by manipulating image brightness, contrast, and tints—helping desktop publishers create electronic halftones. Among other enhancements are gradient color control for displaying a range of shades within an object, and tiling for creating patterns and textures. The new product has greater zoom capabilities and refreshes the screen about twice as fast as old versions, Zachmann claims. It will carry a \$99.95 price tag, \$5 higher than *PC Paintbrush 3.75*, released a year ago.

Fax/Modem Debuts

Quadram's Combo Turns Up the Heat on Communications Market Hoping to garner a still larger share of the exploding market for facsimile products, Quadram will ship an aggressively priced combination modem/facsimile board by the end of April. The JT Fax Pro96 includes a 2400-bps modem and a 9600bps group III fax system for \$495. This is well below the prices of its major competitors-Intel PCEO's \$1290 Connection CoProcessor and The Complete PC's \$899 Complete Communicator. Quadram increases component integration and cuts costs by combining new Rockwell Smartmodem and fax chipsets. Although the product supports the DCA/Intel Communicating Applications Specification for sending faxes from within non-communications applications, Quadram expects most customers to use the JT Fax Pro96's ex-

tension of the Hayes AT modem command set to send both faxes and data via popular communications packages. A memory-resident file-capture utility can be programmed to simultaneously send a file in ASCII, binary, and fax formats. The JT Fax Pro96 incorporates a 6502 coprocessor for background communications processing, but it is backed up by far less memory (16K) than the Intel product, which could mean interruptions for foreground applications. Despite Quadram's commanding 31 percent share of the PC fax-only market, Jan Ozer, Quadram general manager, says that fax providers have to migrate to the faster growing fax/modem market or risk being "leap-frogged." ●







group meeting, somebody invariably asks me what new features will appear in future versions of his or her favorite word processor, spreadsheet, or data base program. Then, without skipping a beat, somebody else complains that software companies seem intent on producing programs that only get more complicated with each successive version.

User confusion? Vendor bashing from folks who want it all? Neither. Though such attitudes seem contradictory, they actually drive home the same point: Despite the years of training and loads of money that users have invested in program updates and hot new hardware, software still doesn't do what people want it to do. And the more complicated it gets, the less it improves everyone's overall productivity.

This little dose of user reality demolishes the "killer app" theo-

ry that's so popular among pundits and other industry types. According to the theory, OS/2 will catch on when users walk into their local software stores and spot a program that's more powerful and exciting than anything they've seen before. They won't just want that programthey'll die for it. Only problem: It says "requires OS/2" on the box. Suddenly, any doubts and misgivings they might have had about this next-generation operating system will magically disappear. They'll plunk down their hard-earned cash for the "killer app"-and for OS/2.

Well, judging by the low sales reported for OS/2 and for the few existing applications that support it, not too many people are on the trail of the "killer app." In fact, I suspect that most of us would be satisfied by software that uses the power of new hardware and software platforms to decrease the complexity that's crept into personal computing, not raise it to new heights. But frankly, even if OS/2 delivers on its ease of use promise, that just won't be enough to justify the costs of 386 technology, graphic interfaces, and large, memoryhungry applications.

Large and small companies alike need software that furthers their business objectives—better customer service, tighter inventory control, shorter product cycles, more effective client presentations. Even if software gets easier to use, it should also help people perform their jobs in a more expert fashion. I don't mean fancy expert systems. But there's no reason users should have to learn desktop-publishing jargon to be able to turn out polished reports. Software must begin shouldering the training and support burden that its growing complexity has created. That is, software should support itself.

A few years ago, a Florida construction firm sued Lotus over an alleged Symphony bug that the company claimed caused it to miscalculate a bid and thus lose \$250,000. Lotus, of course, claimed that the firm made an error in its worksheet. (The case never made it to court.) Nowadays, that same firm might turn to 1-2-3 Small Business Kit for bulletproof spreadsheet models —if one of those templates fit its particular problem. Still, no spreadsheet exists that helps a user build a reliable, intelligent worksheet from the ground up, or spot trends that may not be apparent in the numbers.

That's what I want my nextgeneration spreadsheet, data base, and word processor to (continues)


A Script Log for Smartcom



MCA Is the Only Way

I doubt that it was intentional, but it almost looked like a dirty trick to publish Jim Nech's "Which Bus To Take?" [Another Angle, PCW, January 1989] only a month after your comprehensive survey of MCA add-in products ["Buyers' Guide: Everything You Need to Upgrade Your PS/2," PCW, December 1988]. In the same January issue, Top of the News reports IBM's claim of over 600 available MCA boards. It's pretty clear that Mr. Nech's charge that third-party add-in boards for the PS/2 are unavailable is simply untrue. Don't forget that most PS/2s don't require many common boards (video adapters, serial/parallel ports, mouse ports, extended memory) because those features are included on the motherboard.

Mr. Nech's real gripe with IBM? First, the company charges a royalty for the use of technology it owns (those dirty guys!). Second, IBM didn't "co-

operate" with its competitors to ensure that only one 32-bit bus was offered to the public. But that's the way markets are supposed to work. While everyone's been cheering the Gang of Nine (Compaq, Tandy, Dell, et al.), no one has complained that they are agreeing not to compete or innovate. Somebody should sue them for restraint of trade.

Jim Nech's perspective doesn't make much sense. While quick to chastise IBM's MCA, he overlooks serious problems with the EISA bus.

EISA is another standard. Yes, our old boards will fit, but they won't take advantage of any new features-only EISA boards will. That the EISA bus will accept our old boards is its albatross. If the AT bus's performance is fine with you, relax; like most personal computer users, you need neither EISA nor MCA. But like it or not, high-performance multitasking does call for new bus designs; MCA will certainly outperform any reworked AT bus.

Word Macro a Dead End for Daisy Wheels

I use many of the macros in George Campbell's "20 Macros for Word" [PCW, January 1989]. But one, the <Ctrl>-E envelope template, won't work with daisy wheel printers. Replacing <Esc>PP with <Esc>PPY solves the problem when you are using continuous feed paper. For cut sheet printing (with feed set to Manual in the Print Options menu), the macro command should be <Esc>PPYY.

The first Y prompts daisy wheel users to mount the appropriate print wheel and then press Y to continue. The second Y responds to *Word*'s prompt to

insert a new piece of paper (in this case, an envelope) and then press Y. Without these changes, the macro fails to print the address or close the second window.

Thanks for the correction—we didn't mean to leave daisy wheel users out in the cold. All printer users should heed your tip on using the envelope macro with cut sheets. Either set the paper feed option in the Print Options menu to Continuous, or replace <Esc>PP in the macro with <Esc>PPY. —Ed.

Power Tip Trip-Up

Power Tip No. 28, on page 54 of the January 1989 *PC World*, is inaccurate.

XyWrite does indeed advance automatically to the top of the next blank page when printing a file. Adding FF = 1 to the STARTUP.INT file simply tells XyWrite to advance the page by sending a formfeed character instead of multiple carriage returns.

Perhaps the tip was intended as a way to eject the last page of document, which some printers don't do automatically. If that is the case with your printer, add EJ=1 to the STARTUP.INT file.

any of my columns over the last few years have expressed my great enthusiasm for several new computers and applications that I thought truly propelled the state of the art, making PCs more useful and accessible to more people. As a longtime industry observer, though, I have learned that every advance is only temporary. There are always innovations that render the old standards obsolete no matter how entrenched they seem. In other words, just when you think the personal computing game has stabilized, something manages to upset the applecart.

When Apple first introduced the Macintosh in 1984, for example, the IBM PC dominated personal computing. Personal computers had made major inroads into the business world, PC-clone enterprises were springing up, and it looked as if users had settled on the MS-DOS standard as the only way to compute.

Down for the Count

All's fair in the PC business.

Our friends at Apple may be learning that the hard way.

To the consternation of my DOS-based friends, I was enthralled by the Mac from the get-go. It seemed clear that the little Mac's bit-mapped screen and icon-festooned interface were simply better approaches to computing than the PC's command-heavy character mode. If someone was going to compete with the PC standard, this looked like a viable way to do it.


Industry watchers were astonished that Apple had the chutzpah to introduce a computer that required developing a completely different software base. Some thought Steve Jobs and his team had committed corporate suicide —that Apple would quickly fall from glory. And although we tend not to recall this now, Mac sales did get off to a disappointing start. But once Apple beefed up the machine's speed and memory and added a laser printer, exciting applications in desktop publishing and presentation graphics emerged, leading to healthy sales. In addition, Mac enthusiasts enjoyed the advantage of having a standard interface across applications, so they could save time on routine tasks like printing and saving files. Once you knew how to operate one Mac program, you could pretty much pick up others without reading a lot of manuals. In short, innovation propelled the

Mac and maintained its momentum for four years.

Largely because of the Mac, many personal computer users acquired an insatiable appetite for graphics-based applications. Software developers found they could innovate in the Mac environment much more easily than in the PC arena. Apple responded to the surge of interest with record growth and high profits, and it became the darling of Wall Street.

Meanwhile, the faster, bigger Macs have become increasingly accepted alongside the PC in corporate America; instead of one standard we now have two. Getting these two previously incompatible machines to talk to each other has become a lucrative new business.

Apple shows great skill in repackaging the Mac in ways that expand its market. The SE and the Mac II are both very successful products. But the company has not shown much imagination when it comes to going further with its platform. Faster chips, more memory, and better packaging are nice, but the creative advantage Apple enjoyed originally is rapidly dwindling. (continues)



The truth is that most of the innovation on the Macintosh has come from third-party software developers.

Unlike IBM, which has permitted and even encouraged cloning, Apple has done everything possible to keep its architecture proprietary. This has resulted in high prices and fewer innovations—and that means fewer options for users. Apple has also failed to create a low-cost Macintosh to expand its market share. Today, there are still ten DOS-based machines to every Mac.

Apple CEO John Sculley is very defensive about this fact. When he speaks to groups of computer enthusiasts, he tends to focus on the future of computing rather than on its present, perhaps to obscure the fact that IBM compatibles dominate the business market. Sculley likes to give slick media presentations with nifty ideas about how computing might be done in the future. One such "innovation," Apple's Knowledge Navigator, is mostly a PR gimmick; right now there doesn't seem to be much more to it than the sizzle.

Meanwhile, PC users already have Windows, and soon they'll have the Presentation Manager as well as a multitasking operating environment. By the end of this year, all the Mac's innovative advantages will have disappeared. Instead of maintaining its lead, Apple has merely enjoyed a brief, exhilarating rocket ride.

By now we might have expected the Macintosh to sport the kinds of advanced features that Steve Jobs recently introduced as part of his new NeXT computer. Rather than creating sexy slide shows, Apple should have developed its new Mac IIx with read/write optical memory and a custom digital-signal processor chip. In other words, Apple should have been a moving target; instead, it's been a sitting duck.

Once the PC world catches up to the Macintosh, users will find they can choose their hardware from multiple vendors and have bit-mapped, icon-based, mouse-driven computing as well. Many Macintosh users will find themselves buying PCs, just the way PC users switched to the Macintosh.

Mac aficionados have been telling Apple for years now that it should license the Macintosh to other manufacturers. Software developers know this, and they're building new applications to run under the Presentation Manager. And then-maybethey'll port them to the Mac. They know the PC offers them a much bigger market, and they're excited about that. I have talked to several previously Mac-only developers who tell me they're not only porting their Mac software to the Presentation Manager, they're also targeting new software specifically for this platform.

Apple has had its moment in the sun, but it could soon get cloudy in Cupertino. Meanwhile, I predict that personal computing is about to take another one of those great leaps forward. Let a thousand PCs bloom.

Micrografx is hot. One glance at its visitor sign-in book will tell you: It's chock-full of representatives from venture capital firms, investment banks, Wall Street research departments, major manufacturers, and, of course, Microsoft. Micrografx currently has 140 employees, up from just 30 or so two years ago, and it will likely record revenues of about \$20 million this year.

This feverish activity is a very recent development. Two years ago, Micrografx was that "little graphics software company in Dallas run by those two brothers who are the nicest people you would ever want to meet but what a shame it's never going to make the big time." What happened in the interim? Micrografx's religion became mainstream. This change in the company's fortunes really demonstrates the importance of religion in the PC software business.

The Rewards of True Religion

There's something to be said for a company that has a vision and sticks to it.

That something is success.

I'm not talking about real religion here. I'm talking about being in the software business because you have faith in a technical point of view and are willing to sacrifice a lot to prove that you're right.

Plenty of people in the computer business would have you believe that the path to true fulfillment lies in developing a piece of software that can run on any computer in existence with a flick of a switch. That approach is usually referred to as a portability strategy. Portability is a nice dream because it implies that you can run anything you want on any computer without any pain for either the developer or the customer. Unfortunately, it's a dream that will never be a reality.

As everybody knows, Microsoft Windows has been around for years and has been very slow to attract the kind of application software that would persuade buyers to adopt Windows as a standard. Sure, Microsoft has developed a version of its very hot Excel spreadsheet for Windows, and Aldus has done the same for PageMaker. Lotus Fills the Gaps in Its Spreadsheet Strategy

Are Two 1-2-3s Better Than One?



Release 3.0 finally demanded a new technique to overcome DOS memory limitations, says Frank Ingari.

t all began with Lotus Development's inability to fit 1-2-3 release 3.0 gracefully into 640K of memory. That caused Lotus to miss its 1988 update schedule by a mile, depressed its fourthquarter earnings by about 60 percent, and subjected the company to more than a year of public criticism.

But that failure to deliver may end up strengthening the high garden wall that Lotus has built around its spreadsheet market.

Lotus overcame the 640K barrier last summer, asserts spreadsheet division general manager Frank Ingari, but realized along the way that 3.0 wouldn't please everyone. Instead of trying, Lotus will follow release 3's midyear debut with a major tune-up of the four-year-old release 2.01 (see the Lotus preview in this issue).

Release 2.2 will be far less innovative than 3.0, which ironically may make 2.2 the first choice of the 4.5 million users who have made 1-2-3 the best-selling PC application of all time.

Fashioned by committee using a customer wish list as a blueprint, release 3.0 suffers from the kitchen-sink syndrome that afflicts so many tardy upgrades. The preponderance of ambitious features and Lotus's decision to move from fast assembly language to C (for greater portability) inflated the program's code from 100,000 to 339,000 lines.

Size notwithstanding, early testers found the new revision compelling, insists Ingari, and quickly exploited release 3.0's ability to link up to 256 worksheets for budget consolidation. They also welcomed the ability to pull in *dBASE* or even mainframe files via the Blueprint data access architecture, while the new LEAF programming tools will let them build custom add-ins.


System Price/Performance Resumes Classic Curve

Memory Costs Slowly Declining

onventional wisdom, which assumes that the PC hardware price/ performance ratio improves roughly 15 to 20 percent a year, should reassert itself this year.

Nineteen eighty-eight saw a painful boost in memory prices, and customers often found total system costs dropping only slightly. But now memory prices are slowly subsiding, helping to restore the usual cost trends. "We predict a lot of erosion in system prices in 1989—probably about a 20 percent improvement," comments Dataquest analyst Bill Lempesis. (continues on page 54)

Lotus expects release 3.0 to redefine the spreadsheet as a front-end analytic/reporting tool for networked data bases. That shift will be reinforced by yet another upcoming 1-2-3 release, the 1-2-3/G Presentation Manager package.

Release 3.0's functionality comes at a substantial cost. Technically, the program fits into 640K and runs on an XT. But "every new feature we added led users to want more power and memory," explains Ingari. "What we needed was a way to let power users access more memory."

Lotus nixed an expanded-memory approach as too slow. Instead, it turned to DOS extender software, which lets modified DOS applications address up to 16MB of conventional memory. Unfortunately, that approach requires use of the protected mode of an 80286-based machine.

Faced with the prospect of abandoning its sizable base of PC and XT users, Lotus decided to build a second product that falls between 2.01 and 3.0. Ingari calls the resultant release 2.2 a "fine-tuning and adding of functionality consistent with an 8088." Still written in assembly, the mezzanine program adds only about 30K to the 205K worth of 2.01 code and only a handful of enhancements.

Some of the improvements, such as file linking and cleaner graphics, are less ambitious implementations of 3.0's raison d'être. Others, like an undo facility, a macro recorder, minimal recalculation, and additional screen drivers, are built-in versions of utilities that Lotus has shipped separately for months. Release 2.2 doesn't even implement the latest expanded memory spec (another resounding vote of noconfidence for that technique).

But 2.2 does effectively plug up many of the cracks that gave competitors like Microsoft's Excel and Borland's Quattro entrée into the market. Perhaps 2.2's finest feature is its complete compatibility with 2.01 files, macros, and add-ins.

The volume buyers who drive the market hate to upgrade and retrain users, explains Alex Kask, senior manager in charge of Northeastern micro support at Ernst & Whinney in New York. "It really doesn't pay for us to move to a so-called better product." And individual users, who generally employ less than 15 percent of a program's features, aren't crazy about upgrading either, adds Kask. "If it's doing the job, who cares if there's something better?"

User reluctance to abandon a familiar product has proved a formidable obstacle for Excel. even though that spreadsheet offers a Windows graphical environment, and for Quattro, which sells for half 1-2-3's price. "Lotus isn't feeling much impact in its core market -the Fortune 500 accounts," observes Jeffrey Tarter, publisher of Softletter in Cambridge, Massachusetts. "Those people are absolutely locked in to 1-2-3 because of compatibility issues."

Lotus will counter *Excel's* outstanding graphics with more fonts and chart choices in release 3.0 and (eventually) with 1-2-3/G's full graphical environment. Meanwhile, 2.2 will target the large

installed base of 8088/8086 machines and the expanding home office, laptop, and overseas markets. Says Ingari, "We see a heterogeneous marketplace where the coexistence of hardware levels is the rule." —Mike Hogan

New IBM Honcho Pushes Next-Generation Platforms

Starting to Bring It All Back Home



"All of a sudden you're starting to see the real value of Micro Channel," asserts James Cannavino.

Before taking over IBM's Entry Systems Division last December, James Cannavino ran the heart of IBM's business—building the multimillion-dollar 3090 mainframes that live in glass houses. Now he's overseeing a group that churns out some systems with stickers that barely break \$1000. How similar are the two jobs?

"They're different and they're the same," says the personable 44-year-old Cannavino. The similarities are most obvious in IBM's plans for its large corporate customers, where PCs are being prepped for a leading role in Systems Application Architecture, IBM's grand unification theory. "Under SAA, Entry Systems is really the linchpin for putting things on the desktop," he explains.


Outside corporate America, IBM's PC customers don't get regular visits from the disciplined (continues on page 56)

Many vendors, particularly low-end contenders, "aren't making a lot of money anymore in 286 machines," remarks Lempesis. "They're trying to get aggressive in 386s."

Current street prices for name-brand 16-MHz 80386 machines with 40MB hard drives vary from \$2500 to \$4000, says John Murphy, senior analyst at Wohl Associates in Bala Cynwyd, Pennsylvania. "It will be quite a cutthroat game in this segment," predicts Murphy, who expects prices to drop \$300 or more.

While the first 80386SX-based machines weren't cheap, "there's heavy-duty pricing competition coming for that class of machine," remarks Bruce Stephen, senior analyst at International Data Corporation in Framingham, Massachusetts. Murphy expects the price range to drop from \$2900-\$3300 to \$2200-\$3200 by year end.

Today, 80286-based PCs with a 40MB hard drive and a monitor go for between \$1290 and \$3000. Murphy forecasts that stickers will drop \$400 by 1990; Stephen suggests that prices for high-end models are particularly soft.

Entry-level 8088 systems can be bought for under \$1000, Stephen notes. "A year from now, the price could be \$650 to \$750."

Murphy says that 8088or 8086-based portables with 20MB hard disks and backlit LCD screens now sell for \$1696 to \$2240. He expects prices to drop to between \$1350 and \$2000. Single-floppy versions may soon break the \$300 barrier. Laptop 286s currently range from \$2370 to \$4000, and Murphy predicts they will decline to between \$2000 and \$3500. But 80386-based laptops remain a specialty segment, and he doesn't expect their costs to drop much.

Last year's memory shocker came as plants changed over from 256Kbit to 1M-bit chips and the United States enforced antidumping restrictions on Japanese manufacturers (a "new hope for the dead" plan for the domestic memory industry).


With that turbulence now past, Dataquest sees 1M-bit chips moving back on a classic price curve that will dip from \$17.50 in 1989 to \$3.89 in 1992. Lower component costs take months to trickle down to dealers. Murphy claims we'll know that the normal course has resumed when standard 386 memory configurations begin to climb.

Naturally, customers should watch more than these global trends. "List price isn't always the best barometer," as Stephen points out. "You're seeing more deals being done." In AT-class machines, for example, IBM is getting much pushier than its nominal pricing would indicate. Buyers also can profit by keeping an eye out for companies clearing out stock before new models appear, or simply caught with too much inventory, as happened to Wyse in a big way early this year.

Customers also benefit from quiet upgrades in what's considered standard equipment—two years ago, an AT didn't include VGA on the motherboard and didn't run at 12 MHz. —E. B.

CompuAdd's No-Frills Strategy a Booming Success

Retail Outlets Supplement Mail Order



"We all sell the same commodity," Bill Hayden remarks, so CompuAdd concentrates on low overhead.

rom the industrial carpet in the owner's office to the absence of secretaries, memos, staff meetings, and other trappings of corporate life, nothing at CompuAdd Corporation's low-rise headquarters suggests that it has quietly evolved into a large PC reseller. But \$241 million worth of PCs, peripherals, software, and accessories flowed through its mailorder and retail channels last year.


That puts it on a financial par with crosstown rival Dell Computer, which racked up an estimated \$250 million in 1988 revenues. But the two companies (both founded in 1983 in Austin, Texas) couldn't have more different operating styles.

Marketers in Dell's glossy headquarters concentrate on pitching highend systems to high-end customers, and executives bristle if you call Dell a mail-order house.

CompuAdd founder Bill Hayden happily ships bare-bones Taiwan-built XT clones to home users while wooing big companies with CompuAdd-designed 25-MHz 386 systems. He plans to increase his 15-store retail chain to 40 and enter Canada this year. But he's not stepping back from the (continues)

(continued from page 52) legions of Big Blue direct-sales personnel. Instead, they're likely to buy from ComputerLand—or even department stores, where IBM tested successfully last Christmas season.

But over time, corporate and home users will be getting similar equipment. A decade from now, a typical starter system will be far more capable than today's 386-class PCs, Cannavino predicts. And as telephone networks improve data transmission quality, and online services broaden their appeal, SAA paraphernalia like OS/2's Presentation Manager will be "a natural not just for business, but for the home user, too," he says.

This year, with the Presentation Manager and other OS/2 keystones in place, IBM is waiting for applications to blossom. The company has acknowledged cost concerns about making the transition, and discreetly launched an OS/2 rebate program early this year. But Cannavino says it would be a mistake to offer a new operating system that didn't stretch the technology. Not only is the memory crisis abating, but IBM is starting to pump out 4M-bit chips, he says. "Those fundamental gates are starting to free up."

IBM's hardware platform, the PS/2's muchdebated Micro Channel Architecture, now shows a hand of over 700 cards, including a few intelligent busmaster devices. "All of a sudden you're starting to see the real value of Micro Channel," Cannavino declares.

He dismisses the competing Extended Industry Standard Architecture, saying that rival manufacturers are intent on preserving customer investment in existing AT boards rather than investment in systems. "It's an interesting debate, but they're three years late with that argument." While Cannavino expects other vendors to launch Micro Channel machines. he says IBM won't soften its licensing terms to encourage such entries.

He arrived after a tumultuous year for ESD. The division trimmed thousands from its ranks in Boca Raton, Florida, as it transferred manufacturing to other IBM sites. A flurry of executive departures was capped by division head Bill Lowe, who jumped ship to oversee Xerox's manufacturing and development. And although head-on competition looms for high-end PCs and workstations, IBM headquarters moved ESD's workstation effort into a separate division under Nick

Donofrio, formerly ESD's second in command.

A hands-on, technically savvy manager. Cannavino says he finds excitement at the end-user level. "I'm a home user of DOS, OS/2, and UNIX machines; I install and configure them myself." He's also been known to show IBM products to his neighbors and check their reactions-not, he acknowledges, something he could do in his previous position. "It's hard to take home a 3090-that's six tons full of fun." -E. B.

provides four-fifths of the
company's total sales.

Last year CompuAdd grew even faster than Dell, doubling its revenues and raising its employee count to 560. Hayden predicts that this year the company will take in \$480 million. The 41-year-old former Texas Instruments engineer still owns all CompuAdd stock; expansion has been financed through retained earnings.

The rest of the mailorder industry hasn't shared the bonanza, as predatory pricing and mass-market merchandisers keep paring the ranks. "It's getting better," says Carl Albrizzi, president of Scottsdale Systems, a Tempe, Arizona, mail-order house, "but the whole industry's still hurting somewhat."

For big-league mailorder marketers, the required levels of support, warranty, and service keep climbing. One-year warranties, 30-day money-back guarantees, toll-free telephone support, and optional third-party on-site service contracts are becoming the norm.

"We all sell the same commodity," Hayden says, so cost is critical. "The difference between our price point and our competitors' is based on overhead." Additionally, few mail-order firms can match CompuAdd's depth of nine systems. The company sold Epson, Hewlett-Packard, and less prominent PC brands before restricting itself to its own label last fall.

Besides PCs, the catalog is stuffed with printers, modems, drives, boards, software, facsimile machines, and copiers—"anything that's in an office," says Hayden, who expects increasing competition from office suppliers.

Forced into retailing soon after startup by customers who descended on his mail-order shop, he's found that retail outlets furnished as austerely as his own office—offer higher margins by minimizing advertising costs.

Unlike Dell, which transformed its image into that of a manufacturer who sells direct, "CompuAdd still deals in a commodity mentality," says Bruce Stephen, senior analyst at International Data Corporation in Framingham, Massachusetts. Although CompuAdd shipped 100,000 systems last year, its flood of accessories makes it seem less like a computer maker, he says. But by year-end, Hayden says, CompuAdd will compete with Dell directly for corporate business via outbound telemarketers and top-shelf products. -Mark Henricks

June, the Lotus executives say. June is when the most popular spreadsheet's powerful and power-hungry upgrade will finally slide into shrink-wrap.

1-2-3 release 3.0 delivers three-dimensional worksheets, glossier graphics, bolstered data base facilities, and a host of other enhancements. The latest twist is the use of "DOS extender" technology, which needs at least an AT and probably more than 1MB of memory to thrive.

Soon after it ships, release 3.0 will be joined by release 2.2, which will live comfortably on 8088based 640K machines. This upgrade promises

numerous improvements over 2.01—including speed. (But yes, Lotus will still sell 2.01.)

Power Up

Release 3.0 drags in the heavy artillery for spreadsheet power users-led by clean implementation of three-dimensional worksheets, a boon for easy structuring in general and consolidations in particular. You won't have to learn any new commands beyond <Ctrl>-<Page Up> and <Ctrl>-<Page Down>, which shuttle you between sheets. You can work with up to 256 worksheets at once-from one file or multiple files.

Release 3.0 includes a new .WK3 format but also reads existing 1-2-3 files. Minimal recalculation and background recalculation speed throughput, although it's too early to assess overall performance.


Hitting <F10> lets you see a graph from wherever you are in the program. Charts can now be displayed next to a worksheet or data base, and they'll immediately reflect any changes in the underlying data. The seven basic graph types come in more than 200 permutations, which can be stored in metafile or .PIC format. Control of text and general graph quality is much improved. Moreover, release 3.0 provides PostScript files, print queuing, and named catalogs of print settings.

The data base has been strengthened dramatically. Unlike its predecessor, which basically supports one table of up to 256 fields, release 3.0 lets you join multiple tables. You also can do extracts with calculated or aggregate fields and select records in a less cryptic, more query-by-examplelike manner. In short, you can tap the combined strengths of spreadsheet and data base tools.

Lotus's emerging Blueprint data architecture lets you work with external data bases, too. You can view lists of field names and characteristics, which help you extract only the data you need rather than requiring you to import entire files. Release 3.0 will ship with a *dBASE* Blueprint driver; Microrim, Oracle, and other data base vendors have pledged support.

The program includes a macro recorder, a clever Undo scheme, and added command keywords. For network use, it bundles in redirectable device support and flexible file-locking schemes. To simplify worksheet auditing, you can attach notes to cells or range names and produce a worksheet schematic with symbols for numbers, labels, and formulas.

Release 3.0 runs in 640K, but not quickly, and three-quarters of Lotus customers buy ATs or better. So Lotus has turned to DOS extender technology, which gives a single, slightly modified DOS application access to

up to 16MB of memory via the 80286's protected mode. DOS, the DOS extender module, memoryresident packages, and network software can all fit into the first 640K, while release 3.0 automatically exploits available extended memory.

The release 3.0 package includes both DOS and OS/2 versions, with essentially identical

functionality and documentation.

The 2.2 Engine

Release 2.2 is the fastest 1-2-3, Lotus says. While the program incorporates some release 3.0 features, like minimal recale and a macro recorder, it omits those that demand lots of memory or are prone to incompatibility. It takes about 235K of memory (about 30K more than 2.01) but retains 2.01's file

formats and memory management scheme.

For users who don't need release 3.0's power tools, lack the requisite computing horsepower, or need an application engine, 2.2 aims to be a minimum-pain upgrade. It's also a strong endorsement for add-ins—the add-in manager is a top-level menu choice, and add-ins can load automatically.

You don't get 3-D worksheets, but you can quickly build file links and examine a table of linked files. A Symphony-like macro library manager lets you run macros stored outside the worksheet. New keywords let you run macros that exit 1-2-3, run a batch file, and return to the program, among other options. You can also give macros names of up to 15 characters and exploit a much improved macro debugger.

You can't display both data and charts simultaneously, but release 2.2 offers better ways to dress up charts and removes such warts as overlapping legends. Additionally, setting sheets for graphing and printing speed your work.

The data base is unchanged, and 2.2 embodies neither release 3.0's auditing capabilities nor the glossier reporting offered by Funk Software's *Allways* add-in. However, it does feature boosted network support, a back-one-step undo, and

search and replace. And it warns you if you try to quit without saving changes. All in all, some 2.01 users will have a tricky choice to make.

Alpha Four Normalizes Relations

Adding relational capabilities, Alpha Four lets nonprogrammers generate custom applications entirely through menus.

While dBASE IV steams toward programmer's paradise, Alpha Software's new data base manager is firmly anchored within hailing range of novices. In fact, Alpha Four may be the first fully relational data base that lets nonprogrammers generate fully customized applications without writing a single line of code.

Like its Alpha/three predecessor, Alpha Four reads and writes dBASE files directly, generates reports far more easily than dBASE, and handles complex data base chores behind a deceptively simple menu interface. But where the earlier program was a flat-file manager, Alpha Four lets users access information from multiple data bases simultaneously. Depending on the task, the company says, Alpha Four can finish a job in 20 percent of the time it takes Alpha/three.

Alpha Four can swallow up to 2 billion records

per data base—up from Alpha/three's 65,536— and allows 128 fields per record and 256 characters per field. You can define an unlimited number of lookup data bases for each data base, and lookup tables have grown from 128 rows to 255. Yet Alpha Software hasn't lost sight of its less experienced users: The program comes with extensive online help and a first-rate

tutorial, and it even explains syntax errors in formulas and suggests possible corrections.

From the Many, One

Entering the relational world of dBASE, Paradox, R:base, and DataEase, Alpha Four has joined some pretty fast company, yet Alpha has managed to keep things simple. Users can link up to ten data bases in a "set" (which corresponds

William Rodarmor to a Structured Query Language "view"), then access data from all of the data bases in the set. For example, it's easy to create a report that combines information from customer, invoice, and inventory data bases.

Creating and editing links between data bases is completely visual: With a few keystrokes, you draw and manipulate a tree-like set diagram on the screen. Unlike the query-by-example approach taken by Paradox, Alpha Four displays the hierarchy of the set as you create it.

Alpha Four's big plus is its ability to generate custom applications precisely tailored to specific data management jobs. By rewriting Alpha Four's default menu terminology, you could design a complete accounts receivable tracking system so seamless that users would never realize they were running Alpha Four. And you can rearrange custom menus at any time without affecting the data.

Building a custom application in *Alpha Four* is much like creating an outline in a word processor. Working via the program's unique Application Editor, you specify user menu choices and tie each menu to either a submenu or a macro (which can be created by a keystroke recorder). A Simulation mode lets you test the new menu system and display the macros that

would run at various points. Want to make parts of an application tamperproof? *Alpha Four* lets you protect certain menu options with passwords. To help rookie users, you can write help messages that appear automatically with given menu choices.

Enter (Data) Laughing

Data entry in Alpha Four will feel familiar to Alpha/ three veterans, but new field rules make it far more sophisticated. You can instruct Alpha Four to automatically increment a value in a field each time a record is added or updated, which is handy for invoice numbers. You can also define validation criteria, or instruct Alpha Four to skip a field during data entry, depending on what was entered previously. (For example, if under 'marital status' the user enters 'single', you can instruct the program to skip the next field, 'spouse's name'.)

Lookups are no longer limited by memory, and you can do indexed searches on the lookup data base. To make data entry faster and more accurate, *Alpha Four* can open multicolumn lookup tables on screen in sizable windows anywhere you want.

Alpha/three doesn't let you change records in Browse mode. With Alpha Four you can change and enter records, create multifile browse tables using fields from any data base in a set, and create and store up to 26 browse table layouts per data base.

Finally, screen formatting is both powerful and flexible. Use word wrap in windows and inject color to highlight data you don't want a user to overlook. For example, you can specify that an on-screen sales total blink red if the amount is greater than a specified figure.

Well-Polished Reports

Alpha paid a lot of attention to the report writer, and it shows. You can now define 128 calculated fields per report, up from 20, and nine levels of grouping, up from three. You can create multifile reports using fields from any data base in a set, and include summary values in the formulas for calculated fields. Thanks to what Alpha calls "multi-pass" reports, you can now specify that summary values be calculated before a report section is printed. In the simplest case, this lets you insert a line like 'page 1 of 7' into the report.

Neatness counts, Alpha believes. You can define reports with nonstandard page lengths, specify if and how records should break between pages, and prevent group headers from printing at the bottom of a page.

All this power comes at a price. While *Alpha/* three was priced at \$395



New Processors Pump Up Traveling Toshibas

Toshiba has pumped up its line of portables with a pair of machines that add new levels of price/ performance. The T1600 weighs in at a mere 11.6 pounds, but it's the new Schwarzenegger of Toshiba's battery-powered lineup. The 20-MHz T5200 brings desktopstyle power-boosting techniques to portable computing for those who don't mind camping near an AC outlet. The T1600's sinewy 12-MHz 80C286 easily outmuscles the 10-MHz 80C86 chip in the \$2099 T1200—former speed-title holder among Toshiba's battery-powered laptops, a line now stretching from the \$1249 8088-based T1000 to the \$4999 T1600.

Besides speed, the T1600 offers a 1.44MB floppy rather than the T1200's 720K version, and the new model's 20MB hard drive has an average access time of 27ms, compared with the T1200's 68ms. You can see a difference, too. The T1600 gives you a detachable backlit supertwist EGA screen with 640 by 400 resolution and 16 gray scales, versus CGA on the T1200. Its resolution has been boosted to 640 by 400 by duplicating every seventh scan line. In addition, the T1600 has a pair of serial ports to the T1200's one.

The T1600 comes with 1MB of memory, expandable to 5MB via 2MB modules. And Toshiba wrapped up a loose end by providing a socket for a 10-MHz 80C287 math coprocessor. You won't pick up any extra pounds carrying around the DOS and user manuals—hypertext on-line help comes standard.

If your work doesn't extend beyond the reach

of alternating current, or if your data base and financial-modeling jobs need 20-MHz power, the AC-powered Toshiba T5200 is a better choice. Unlike Toshiba's other portables, the 18.7-pound T5200 has an 80386 CPU and a 20-MHz 80387 math coprocessor option and uses disk caching. The basic configuration includes an 82385 cache controller with 32K of 35ns staticcaching memory.

The 5200's VGA gas plasma display offers 16 gray scales and 640 by 480 resolution. The machine also provides desktop-style expandability with a full-length 8/16-bit expansion slot and a half-length 8-bit slot. (One step down in Toshiba's line, the T5100 has only a proprietary slot for a modem, a networking card, or a connection to an external expansion chassis.)

The \$9499 T5200 has a 1.44MB 3½-inch drive and a 29ms 40MB hard disk. A 25ms 100MB drive bumps the sticker up to \$10,999. The standard 2MB of memory can be increased to 8MB with \$1299 2MB modules. Toshiba America Inc., 9740 Irvine Blvd., Irvine, CA 92718; 714/583-3000. —Mark Henricks

Lantana's Token-Ring Card Masters the Micro Channel

Years ago, as it watched the corporate data processing burden shift downward, IBM concluded that the humble desktop CPU would need a little help from its friends. Big Blue's answer is the PS/2's Micro Channel Architecture, which can offload some of the CPU's work to busmasters—add-in processors that intelligently share the PC's resources.

But as we celebrate the PS/2's third birthday, precious few busmasters are around to lend a helping hand. That makes Lantana's Cypress/2 token ring network adapter a standout.

If you're an MIS director or a PC manager whose networking color scheme is predominantly Blue, the Cypress/2 will let your in-house clients exploit MCA's bus arbitration capabilities to send messages around their nets and still keep crunching spreadsheets or sorting data bases. The Cypress/2 could be especially useful for passing data back and forth between LANs and the company's IBM mainframe (you know what kind of a line forms at that water cooler). (continues)

AST's brightest new star is the Premium 386/25. With 25-MHz clock speed and 32K of zero-wait-state cache memory, the 386/25 could relegate minicomputers and workstations to understudy roles in computer-aided design and engineering, file serving, and financial modeling. The new desktop also picks up speed in its three-lane SmartSlot bus-which includes a 32bit dedicated pathway from CPU to memory, a standard AT bus, and an AST arbitration bus that will allow it to master multiple intelligent coprocessors when and if they are developed.

The 386/25 motherboard holds the ROM BIOS, a controller for three floppies, two serial ports, and one parallel port. The CPU, Intel 82385 cache controller with 32K, 1MB SIMM sockets, and a socket for either an Intel 80387 or a Weitek 3167 floating-point coprocessor are all housed on a dedicated 32-bit card. One 8-bit and two 8/16-bit slots, plus one 8/16-bit and two 8/16/32bit Smartslots, are available for add-ins.

The standard 2MB memory can be expanded to 4MB on the CPU card, with another 16MB of 100ns memory available on each of two optional 32-bit memory adapter cards. Prices start at \$6595 for one 5¼-inch floppy, \$8995 with a 90MB 18ms hard drive, \$9795 with a 150MB drive, and \$11,795 with a 320MB drive.

AST's former top-ofthe-line Premium/386 computers will get the hook, to be replaced by Premium/386C models. The C stands for memory caching, which boosts system performance by as much as 30 percent. Meanwhile, prices are falling by as much as \$2000. The 20-MHz Premium/386C's memory cache is 64K of 25ns static RAM, and its bus architecture is the same as the 386/25's, but the 386C is limited to 16MB of memory on one 32-bit card.

Only the diskless Model 300, priced at \$4195, will survive from the former 386 line. The new line starts with the 1MB, floppy-only Premium/386C Model 300, retailing for \$4395. The Model 340, with a 40MB hard drive, costs \$5495. Units with 2MB of memory and hard drives of 90MB, 150MB, or 320MB capacity list for \$6995, \$7795, and \$9795, respectively.

Finally, the Premium Workstation/386SX is an 80386SX-based machine offering a lower profile (continues)

The Cypress/2 uses the Texas Instruments token ring interface chipset and 2K of memory to relieve the PS/2's CPU of menial networking tasks—jobs like accepting and passing net control tokens and monitoring message addresses. Lantana adds its own discrete logic chips so the on-board processor can act as a busmaster controller.

The 16-bit card transfers data at a standard 4 megabits per second, and the company plans to offer a 16-mbps token ring implementation.

Lantana also sells an optional \$75 daughter-board with software burned into a 32K EPROM module, and a remote-program—loading EPROM that lets you work with diskless workstations.

The Cypress/2, which retails for \$795, comes with installation software and drivers for all versions of Novell NetWare and works with IBM PC LAN drivers. Lantana Technology Inc., 4392 Viewridge Ave., Ste. A, San Diego, CA 92123; 619/565-6400. —Mark Henricks





Letter Quality Laptop Printing

While laptop computers now turn up all over the place, there hasn't been a corresponding boom in laptop printers. Diconix has a pair of 9-pin battery-operated models of unparalleled portability and fair print quality, but they're not necessarily designed for important business letters or full-blown reports.

Now Toshiba, a company that knows more than most about people's extraoffice work habits, has set its sights on bringing you office-quality printing in the field or at home. Toshiba touts its new ExpressWriter301 as the first portable printer with 24-dot letter quality capabilities. The 301 uses nonimpact thermal dot matrix technology to print on thermal, standard, or photocopier paper or transparencies from 4 to 81/2 inches wide.

Weighing in at 4 pounds, the 301 is small enough to fit into many briefcases and office

drawers. Its footprint is a mere 12.2 by 5.5 inches with a 3-inch profile. It runs on either built-in rechargeable NiCad batteries or its AC adapter. A full charge takes approximately 8 hours and is good for an hour of continuous printing at either 42 cps or 60 cps.

Speed Up I/O

Future Computer Systems has introduced a disk caching utility that it claims increases application throughput by a factor of 4 to 60, depending on how disk intensive the application. Fast achieves its speed through a proprietary logic scheme that anticipates what data the computer's CPU will request next, reading it into an area of RAM one track at a time before the CPU asks for it. Rather than update its cache at regular intervals, Fast does so as needed, writing to the cache during the CPU's idle moments. Future's engineers also have found a way to write to cache in 32-bit word increments. even with an 80286.

The company claims a read hit rate of 80 to 98 percent—depending on amount of memory allocated—compared to 40 to 70 percent for standard disk caches. The lower figure could be achieved with as little as 384K, while the upper performance level requires 1MB of memory.

Fast, which sells for \$99, requires DOS version 2.1 or later and about 156K of memory to maintain a 128K buffer in conventional extended memory. 



Portable Power

Need all the power and convenience of a desktop computer on the road?

AC-powered transportables deliver the goods.

he market for mobile computers is really two markets. Some people want temporary computing ability as they shuttle between desktops, requiring little more than battery operation and light weight. But when a computer has to run on a battery, some tradeoffs in performance and expansion capability are hard to avoid. This is bad news for business users who need computers good enough to use all day and portable enough to take home at night. For these users, the AC-powered transportable computer is the answer.

Powerful transportables are more available than ever. To help you make the smartest buy, *PC World* and National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL) have taken a comparative look at the top eight: five 80286s (Compaq's Portable III, the GridCase 1520, NEC's PowerMate Portable, Ogivar's 286, and Toshiba's 3200) and three 80386s (Compaq's Portable 386, the GridCase 1530, and Toshiba's 5200).

Smart shoppers will weigh five characteristics before laying their money down: speed, price, transportability, expandability, and ergonomics.

When it comes to speed, the current crop of transportables perform as well as or better than many desktop systems. By and large, performance on NSTL's benchmarks was directly related to CPU speed—as was price, which ranged from \$6070 to \$9687. With one minor exception, every machine passed the NSTL Crash Test with flying colors.

When you have to lug a machine home every night, you quickly learn the difference between the manufacturer's advertised weight and the actual traveling weight, including modem and power cord. The weights listed here are traveling weights. The 14.5-pound GridCases were the lightest machines reviewed; the 25-pound NEC PowerMate was the heaviest.

All transportable keyboards are not created equal. The smaller the system, the harder it is for the designers to create a standard keyboard. Many machines, like the Ogivar, place familiar keys in unfamiliar locations, and their embedded numeric keypads require you to hold down some special key in order to get <Page Up>, <Page Down>, or a number. A few, like Compaq's Portable III, boast excellent keyboards that are as easy to use as standard desktop units'.

Those who plan to run RAM-hungry applications such as OS/2 and Windows/386 will want to look into CPU-speed memory capacity as well. Most of these systems have special memory expansion slots (or space on the motherboard) to let the CPU access expansion RAM at full speed. Any additional memory has to be installed in standard 8-MHz slots—either built in or in an optional expansion chassis—which slows memory access, degrading performance.

In order to provide meaningful price comparisons, all eight machines (with a few variations noted in text) were set up in the standard *PC World* transportable configuration: at least 2MB of RAM, a 40MB hard disk, one floppy drive, a 2400-bps internal modem, one serial and one parallel port, and DOS 3.3. All eight were socketed for math coprocessors and provided ports for external keyboards, monitors, and floppy disk drives.

The 80286based Toshiba 3200 and the 80386-based Toshiba 5100 share Best Buy honors for portability, performance, and eyepleasing EGA displays.

FEATURES EVALUATION

Top Transportables: Feature by Feature

Among the 80286s, the GridCase 1520 is tops for portability, while the Toshiba takes the gold for its excellent EGA display, full keyboard, and slot expandability. In the 80386 department, the results are surprisingly similar: Grid Systems' 1530 is the easiest to schlepp around, and the Toshiba 5100 impresses with the best display (and the lowest price).

Compaq Portable III

Compaq's 12-MHz Portable III is a solid, reliable, suitcase-shaped machine that features outstanding memory expandability, the best keyboard in the roundup, and Compaq reliability. But it's been out for two years—a long time in this volatile market—and in many ways it's been left behind. (For a review of Compaq's latest laptop, the SLT/286, see *The Hardware Shelf* in this issue.)

At \$7660 and 21.7 pounds (in the *PC World* configuration), the Portable III is neither inexpensive nor light. Its 16-by-8-by-9-inch bulk (1152 cubic inches, or in³) ties for biggest in the roundup, and it offers only CGA graphics. Its 1.2MB 5¼-inch floppy drive also marks it as an older machine; most newer systems use smaller, more reliable 3½-inch drives.

Memory expandability is among the Portable III's greatest strengths. Although only 640K of RAM can be placed on the mother-board, you can add 6MB more via a special memory board to reach a maximum of 6.6MB—all of which can be accessed at CPU speed. An optional (\$199) piggyback unit provides two 8/16-bit AT expansion slots.

Thanks to its 12-MHz CPU and a 26ms hard disk, the Portable III zips along. It took second place on NSTL's performance benchmarks for all the 286 transportables tested.

The III's gas plasma display is so bright that its narrow range of tilt adjustment isn't a limitation, and four distinct shades can be represented simultaneously. Its 400 scan lines present crisp characters in text mode. While its graphics mode offers an AT&T 6300–compatible 640-by-400-pixel resolution, only a few programs (Framework, Windows, and VersaCAD) can use it. Other graphics programs are relegated to CGA resolution, a serious drawback.

The Portable III's large size pays off in the keyboard department; it has the best one in the roundup. The detachable 91-key unit closely follows the familiar 101-key layout, with 12 function keys across the top and a dedicated cursor/numeric pad.

Software includes diagnostics and setup, a disk cache utility, and a memory-resident utility that lets you change color and implement inverse video and boldface on the fly.

The Compaq Portable III was a hot machine in its day, but that day is passing. Its memory capacity and performance are excellent, its keyboard is a treat, and Compaq's reputation for reliability is unquestionable; but given the Portable III's high price, large size, and heavy weight, it's not a smart buy.

GridCase 1520

The GridCase entries are the smallest, lightest transportables in the roundup. A good-looking machine with a low profile, black magnesium case, and bright-red display, the GridCase 1520 was among the first 286 clamshell transportables on the market—and it shows its age in several crucial ways. It's slow, competing with NEC for last place in the roundup, and, as with the Compaq, its crisp 400-scan-line text mode is offset by limited support for its 640 by 400 graphics. Moreover, since Grid's 40MB hard drive takes up both drive bays, you'll have to opt for a half-height 20MB unit unless you're prepared to give up a floppy altogether.

At \$7005 (in the *PC World* configuration, except with a 20MB hard drive/1.44MB 3½-inch floppy combo), the 1520 is less expensive than any machine in the roundup except the

Methodology

The 16-MHz Toshiba 5100 was configured with a 43MB hard disk and 2.2MB of RAM. The 12.5-MHz GridCase 1530 was configured with a 21MB hard disk and 1MB of RAM. The 12.5-MHz Ogivar 286 was con-figured with a 44MB hard disk and 1MB of RAM. The 12-MHz Compaq Portable III was configured with a 21MB hard disk and 1MB of RAM. A Microsoft Word macro loads a 35-page, 140paragraph document and performs search-and-replace and spell-checking operations. The first page of the document is then printed. Although the results of the benchmark depend primarily on pro-cessor and memory access speeds, display adapter and hard disk speeds are also contributing factors.

dBASE III Plus 1.1

The dBASE III Plus test measures the time required to prepare and print a report of past-due invoices. The report includes calculated fields and is based on three files: a 500-record customer file, a 1000record invoice file, and a 2000-record item file.

When disk caching is not used, the random access speed of the hard disk is, after processor speed, the most significant factor in this benchmark. With disk caching, sequential read performance becomes more important than random access.

In this benchmark, a 1-2-3 macro executes a series of recalculations using five different formulas within a 75-by-75-cell matrix. Because there are few screen updates and no disk access is required, the results depend almost entirely on processing and memory access speeds.

The Microsoft C benchmark measures the time required to compile and link XLISP, a public-domain program composed of 25 C source code files. The most important factors in this benchmark are processor and memory access speeds. The performance of the hard disk is also a factor; generally, disk caching has little effect.

AutoCAD 9

In this benchmark, a three-dimensional sample drawing is retrieved and displayed using Auto-CAD's EGA driver. The zoom function is used to display the drawing from various perspectives; then the full drawing is printed. The results of the bench-mark depend primarily on the speeds at which the processor and coprocessor operate and at which memory is accessed. The performance of the display adapter and the hard disk also have some effect.

Data based on tests designed and conducted by National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL). All rights reserved. low-end NEC PowerMate-but it still costs nearly \$1000 more than the NEC. Checking in at a featherweight 14.5 pounds and a svelte 11.5 by 15 by 2.5 inches (431 in3), it includes a 25ms hard disk. You can install up to 4MB of RAM on the motherboard. Two special sockets for ROM chips are built in; ROMs with DOS, Crosstalk, and several other utilities are available.

The 1520's performance reflects its slow clock speed. On the other hand, it's worth noting that it still beats the original IBM Model 50 desktop.

The Grid's 8-by-6-inch high-contrast gas plasma screen is a knockout; it can display four shades, ranging from the blackest black to the brightest red of any screen I've ever seen. The bad news is the limited graphics support.

The 1520's keyboard is the worst in the roundup; it has only 72 keys, many of which have to perform double duty. Dedicated cursor keys and 12 function keys across the top make things a bit easier, but invoking < Page Up> or <Page Down> still requires 2 keys and both hands, and the numeric pad is embedded.

The GridCase comes with a disk caching utility, software for transferring data to and from a desktop machine, and InteGrid, which includes a desktop organizer, a text

editor, a file manager, and a spreadsheet program.

The GridCase is designed for use as a battery-powered laptop or an AC-powered transportable. The power supply/charger has the same size and configuration as the battery pack, which it entirely replaces-no extra pieces or pounds to carry. The Grid's battery life is only 45 minutes, making it far more useful as a transportable than as a battery-powered laptop.

The GridCase 1520 is a beauty, but its functionality fails to match its form. Its appearance, size, and weight are impressive, and its battery option may come in handy for some—but its slow performance, clumsy keyboard, CGA display, and limited drive capacity keep it out of the winner's circle.

NEC PowerMate Portable

The \$6070 PowerMate Portable is the cheapest transportable in the roundup by close to \$1000—but it's also the biggest, heaviest, and slowest, and it has the lowest CPUspeed RAM capacity (640K). Two nice touches are an EGA display and two standard ATstyle 8/16-bit expansion slots.

The GridCase 1530 is the lightest, prettiest, and most portable 386 in the roundup, but its 20MB hard disk and CGA display are below par.

The 10-MHz PowerMate Portable looks as if NEC started out to make a lunchbox but created a suitcase instead. It weighs 25 pounds and takes up 15 by 7 by 11 inches (1155 in³). Its 80286 CPU's speed may be switched from 8 to 10 MHz via keyboard or software. It comes with a relatively slow 35ms hard disk, and a 720K 3½-inch floppy drive.

As you might expect, the PowerMate's comparatively slow CPU and hard disk result in unimpressive performance. It came in last or next to last on every NSTL benchmark.

The PowerMate's 8-by-7-inch backlit LCD display shows sharp blue characters on a silver background. EGA graphics are supported, but only one shade of blue can be generated. This means software that depends on color or shades of gray may produce unreadable screens. DIP switches enable you to reassign colors globally (blue equals on, red equals off, and so on), but you should install your software for monochrome to get the best results.

The keyboard that comes with the Power-Mate is very close to a standard desktop unit. It has 93 keys—more than any of the other machines' keyboards—with 12 function keys, 4 cursor keys, and a dedicated numeric

Ogivar's 286 is fast, light, compact, and reasonably priced and sports an EGA display. Even with its one-shade screen, it makes a tempting package.

keypad, all close to their familiar locations. Unfortunately, the touch is uncomfortably light and clicky.

The software package that accompanies the PowerMate is skimpy, consisting only of a TSR utility that lets you vary screen attributes on the fly (as opposed to the DIP switches, which govern color reassignments at power-up). But the same proviso holds: Software reinstallation will probably be necessary.

The NEC Portable PowerMate is a classic mixed bag. On the bright side, it boasts a very low price, two expansion slots, and an EGA display. At the same time it's heavy, bulky, slow, and limited to 640K of CPU-speed RAM, and the display is seriously flawed by the one-color screen. Still, if you can live with the memory and if low price is your highest priority, this system has undeniable appeal.

Ogivar 286

The Ogivar 286 is a reasonably priced Canadian system with a lot going for it. At \$7100, this racer turns in the fastest scores of any 286 in the roundup. It is also the next to lightest 286 machine reviewed. Only its

problematic display keeps it from being an astonishing value.

The 12.5-MHz clamshell Ogivar weighs in at an easy-to-carry 15 pounds and takes up a middling 14 by 13 by 4 inches (728 in³). Its 12.5-MHz 80286 and 31ms hard drive have a lot to do with its top performance score. The floppy drive is a 720K 3½-inch unit.

The motherboard holds up to 2.6MB of RAM. If you want to reach the 4.6MB maximum for CPU-speed RAM you have to use a 2MB memory board that goes into a proprietary slot. However, since the 2400-bps modem also requires this slot, you must choose between on-board telecommunications capability and large CPU-speed RAM capacity. An optional expansion chassis offers a single XT-compatible slot, but a slow 8-bit I/0 bus is a bad place for memory in an 80286 machine.

The Ogivar's 7-by-7-inch EGA gas plasma display is bright but slightly low in contrast. There are no controls for brightness or contrast, perhaps as a cost-cutting measure. And like the NEC PowerMate's, the Ogivar's screen can show only one color—with all the concomitant hassles. A provided utility permits limited swapping of video attributes, but for best results, install your applications for monochrome.

The 84-key keyboard could be a lot better. It has only 10 function keys and sticks you with an embedded numeric pad. In a bow to Canada's bilingual policy, there's a <Non ASCII> key that toggles 6 alpha keys to produce French punctuation—but unless your word processor and printer are equally bilingual, these keys won't do you much good.

The Ogivar 286 features a ROM-based setup feature, but aside from the color-translation utility you don't get any extra software.

If you need a machine that's light, fast, and inexpensive, the Ogivar 286 could be the system for you. Despite its below-average keyboard and display, it offers an impressive power-to-price ratio.

Toshiba 3200

The midpriced clamshell Toshiba 3200 has been on the market for two years but seems to be holding its own very well, thanks to its excellent EGA gas plasma display, comfortable keyboard, and two expansion slots. And at 20 pounds and 14.5 by 15.25 by 4 inches (885 in³), it's reasonably portable.

With a \$7598 price tag (in the *PC World* configuration), the 3200 is not a bargain-basement system. But the price does include 4MB of RAM—1MB socketed on the mother-board and 3MB on a memory board that slides into a proprietary CPU-speed expansion slot. If you want to expand memory above 1MB you must install the full 3MB. With 1MB, the system costs only \$5499.

Two standard expansion slots (one 8 bit, one 8/16 bit) are built in, but you'll need the 8-bit slot for the modem of your choice. (Toshiba doesn't sell one, but any half-length internal 2400-bps modem will work.) The hard disk has a relatively slow 38ms seek time, and the 3½-inch floppy drive is just a low-density 720K model.

With its fast 12-MHz CPU, the Toshiba 3200's performance scores well toward the top of the 286 pack—even on the processor-intensive 1-2-3 benchmark. The 12-MHz 80286 can be throttled back to 6 MHz via keyboard commands.

The 3200's 7-by-6-inch screen is one of the system's outstanding features. The gas plasma display supports EGA and produces three clearly distinguishable shades of red.

The keyboard is also excellent, thanks to its relatively large size. There are 85 keys, with 10 function keys across the top and a dedicated cursor/numeric keypad.

Toshiba's software bundle proves that good things can come in small packages. Only one application is included, but that's *Metro*, Lotus's powerful desktop manager. You also get the usual diagnostics and setup utilities.

80386 TRANSPORTABLES

Compaq Portable 386

In many respects, Compaq's Portable 386 is virtually identical to its Portable III described in the 286 section—large, heavy, expensive. The two machines have identical hard drives, gas plasma screens, keyboards, software packages, and lunchbox-shaped cases.

On the bright side, the 386 boasts a gigantic CPU-speed RAM capacity, and of course it is a *lot* faster than the III; its 20-MHz CPU gives it the best performance scores in the roundup by a considerable margin. In fact, it runs only a hair slower than a 20-MHz IBM Model 80. Such performance does not come cheap. The Portable 386 has the highest list price in the roundup; in the *PC World* configuration it runs a hefty \$9687.

The Portable 386's unusually high RAM capacity makes it an ideal platform for multi-

tasking. Using a proprietary expansion board, you can load it with up to 11MB of 32-bit RAM, all accessed at full CPU speed.

Like its 286 cousin, the Portable 386's bulk and display shortcomings are disappointing. But if you need outstanding performance and memory capacity, and price is no object, look no further.

GridCase 1530

Like the GridCase 1520 (which it closely resembles) described in the 286 section, Grid's 80386-powered 1530 takes top honors in the portability department. The two machines are tied as the lightest, smallest transportables in the roundup. Both also come with a battery that you can swap with a snap-in power supply.

Unfortunately, however, the 1530 seems to be a simple upgrade from the 1520 and shares its rather serious drawbacks. Moreover, it is stuck with a slow 12.5-MHz CPU, which caused it to turn in the worst NSTL scores of any 80386 transportable tested. Nor is it cheap at \$8255 (in the standard *PC World* configuration, but with a meager 20MB hard drive).

Like its 286 incarnation, the 1530 has an awkward keyboard and a CGA gas plasma display. The 1520's 4MB RAM capacity is duplicated as well, but in a 386 system this is a serious limitation. As noted in the review of the 1520, you are limited to a 20MB hard drive if you want a floppy as well.

In the final analysis, the verdict on the GridCase 1530 is the same as on the 1520: You can do much better for the price. The Toshiba 5100, an altogether superior 386, is available for \$657 less. Unless lightness is your top priority or you simply must have Grid's ROM socket capability, this is a good machine to avoid.

Toshiba 5100

The Toshiba 5100 is a featherweight powerhouse 386, with a fine display and a finer price. It was second-place winner in the NSTL speed trials, as well as the lowest-priced 80386 in the roundup; in fact, it's a bit cheaper than Compaq's Portable III 286. This high-speed system can be yours for only \$7598 (in the *PC World* setup), with *Microsoft Windows/386* thrown in. Aside from a minor problem running *PC Paintbrush*, its only drawback is a low RAM ceiling.

The 16-MHz 5100 is a 15-pound, 12.25-by-3.6-by-14.25-inch (628-in³) clamshell transportable, which makes it one of the lightest and smallest in the roundup. It includes a 26ms hard disk and a 1.44MB 3½-inch floppy drive.

The motherboard holds 4MB of 32-bit RAM. A proprietary expansion slot lets you add an additional 2MB of CPU-speed RAM or a 2400-bps modem—but not both. This is a bit awkward, since you'll probably want a modem, and 4MB is a low memory limit for an 80386 system. An optional expansion chassis that accommodates five standard 8-bit boards is available.

The 5100 is the only 386 in the roundup that offers EGA; it boasts a 7-by-6-inch gas plasma display. Unfortunately, the display is on the dim side; you'll probably want to crank the brightness and contrast controls all the way up and leave them there.

The keyboard suffers a bit from the machine's compactness; the 82 keys are in a fairly unfamiliar arrangement. The numeric keypad is embedded, but there are dedicated page- and cursor-control keys.

Toshiba's software package is good, including the previously mentioned *Windows/386* and a pop-up utility that lets you remap color assignments on the fly.

Despite its relatively low RAM capacity, the Toshiba 5100's impressive price/performance ratio, portability, and high-resolution EGA display make it the single most outstanding value of this roundup. Run, don't walk.

Top Transportables

There are two Best Buys, and interestingly enough, both are Toshibas.

In the 286 event, the clear winner is the \$7598 Toshiba 3200, a machine with two expansion slots, an easy-to-read EGA display, an excellent keyboard, 4MB of RAM, and reasonably good performance at a decent price.

Two other 286 machines placed well but fell short of Best Buy status. NEC's \$6070 PowerMate Portable is surprisingly inexpensive and boasts two expansion slots and an EGA display, but it's large, heavy, slow, and limited to 640K of CPU-speed RAM. The \$7100 Ogivar 286 is the fastest 286 in the





roundup, as well as being quite light and reasonably priced, but its keyboard and display are below par.

In the 386 arena, the big winner is the \$7598 Toshiba 5100. Its CPU-speed RAM capacity is limited to 4MB if you want a modem (6MB if you don't), but it's highly portable, has a fine EGA display, and turns in great performance for a reasonable price.

If you really need high-end 386 desktop power to go, the Compaq Portable 386 is a true powerhouse, with top performance scores and a gigantic 11MB RAM capacity. However, it's very expensive (\$9687) and bulky, and its 640 by 400 graphics mode display has limited support.

Far too often, compromise is a way of life. But with transportables like our two Best Buys, business users who want the best can now get full-powered computers they can carry—without compromising ease of use or performance.

Five Against IV

dBASE IV has raised the stakes for compatible data managers,

> but some dBASE III Plus clones still present a better deal.

fter Ashton-Tate's introduction of dBASE III Plus, three and a half years elapsed without an upgrade, opening a window of opportunity for competitors to jump in. While the giant slumbered, numerous dBASE clones popped up, offering more power and features for less money.

dBASE IV finally arrived last fall, and it was a qualified success (see "Is dBASE IV Worth the Wait?" PCW, March 1989). The new Control Center interface is a breakthrough, the reporting and screen modules are impressive, and Ashton-Tate introduces query by example and SQL to the dBASE world. A polished application generator and other tools strengthen dBASE IV's position in application development.

Why consider dBASE III Plus clones if dBASE IV is so impressive? First, although dBASE IV's performance is much improved, on average it lags behind three of the five programs reviewed here. Second, considering dBASE IV's \$795 price, the clones are a bargain. Third, the knockout blow expected from dBASE IV's introduction of SQL queries turned out to be a stage slap.

dBASE IV dominates the features race, but most of the compatibles reviewed here have held their ground quite well. Fox Software's Foxbase+ is still the speed champ, WordTech's dBXL is inexpensive and offers a friendlier interface for novices, and Versa-Soft's low-cost dBMAN delivers better relational features. The two compilers reviewed here—Nantucket's Clipper and WordTech's Quicksilver—can take advantage of the fact that Ashton-Tate's .EXE compiler has yet to appear.

Foxbase Still Faster

With many applications, variations in program speed may mean the difference between blinking once and blinking twice. With data managers, speed often dictates when you break for lunch.

As tests conducted by National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL) reveal, Foxbase+ continues to lead the dBASE race, running 1.3 to 14 times faster than dBASE IV, depending on the task. dBMAN and Clipper share second place, both running noticeably faster than dBASE IV, which dawdles on reporting tasks. WordTech's products fare less well, with Quicksilver running more than twice as fast as dBASE IV on some tests and twice as slow on others. And dBXL lands in last place, trailing dBASE IV in every area but reporting.

dBASE compatibility is another key issue, especially if you plan to port applications from dBASE III Plus. Only Foxbase+ and dBXL are fully language compatible; dB-MAN comes close, but converting a III Plus application requires line-by-line recoding. Clipper and Quicksilver, like all compilers, choke on some macro expressions and full-screen commands such as Edit and Browse. (None of these clones supports dBASE IV's new commands, but dBASE IV runs any III Plus-compatible program.) All the reviewed clones either use .NDX files or convert them transparently; none supports dBASE IV's .MDX scheme.

One final note when comparing features: The beauty of *dBASE* compatibility is the large assortment of third-party add-ins and turnkey applications you can choose from. Although it's usually best to have all your eggs in one basket—à la *dBASE IV*—it's not a necessity.


Foxbase + 2.1

The fastest program in the roundup, Fox-base+ is so diligently dBASE compatible that you can run complex applications without conversion. Add to the mix a reasonable \$395 price and an optional unlimited runtime module, and Foxbase+ is clearly a Best Buy.

Foxbase+ gets its racy performance from a slick precompiler, automatic memory management, and disk caching. It delivers exceptional scores in disk-cranking tasks such as Index, Append, Pack, and Copy.

Foxbase+'s dot prompt and status line are so much like dBASE's that the program prompted an Ashton-Tate lawsuit. Yet version 2.1 greatly enriches its formerly austere interface, offering a menu-driven command builder that's superior to dBASE III Plus's Assistant. Still, it lacks the power of dBASE IV's Control Center, and novices will find its overly technical help facility rather cryptic.


If reporting is crucial, plan on investing in a third-party add-in. *Foxbase* + 's pathetic

report writer hearkens back to *dBASE III*. Columnar layouts are limited, formatting choices are scant, and you get only two levels of subgrouping. Custom reports and data validation require cranking out program code.

Fortunately, *Foxbase+* makes programming a pleasure. You can change and rerun programs instantly and compile them with-



out leaving the dot prompt. This instant feedback almost makes up for the lack of a debugger. As with *dBASE IV*, *Foxbase* + 's agile screen designer automatically generates dBASE code. *Foxbase* + also includes a unique documentation utility (similar to Wallsoft's *Documentor*) that rounds up technical specs for an entire application.

By letting you set multiple relations from a single file, Foxbase+ can model complex multifile relationships. And thanks to enhanced system capacities—more limited than $dBASE\ IV$'s, but superior to dBXL's or dBMAN's—you can open enough files to make good use of this feature.

A faster, more powerful *Foxbase* is due this summer, but the current version is already a winner. If swift performance and strict *dBASE* compatibility are paramount, look no further.

dBXL 1.2c

WordTech's dBXL offers high-tech training wheels for dBASE neophytes, good dBASE compatibility, and a low \$199 price. Its language extensions deliver spectacular window effects, and it's the only program reviewed that includes business graphics. Unfortunately, memory management is flawed, and it's the slowest program in the roundup except for report selection, where only dBASE IV is slower. All told, dBXL is recommended only for novices looking for a dBASE with a friendly face.

By itself, dBXL's Intro interface is just another clone of dBASE III Plus's Assistant, but coupled with dBXL's superb contextual help system, it's the best interface in the roundup. Intro prompts for every command with pop-up windows, and you can select file and field names from menus and paste them to the command prompt or report writer. Factor in an excellent manual (which includes a tutorial on dBASE skills), and you've got a perfect first-timer's package.

The report writer (only slightly better than that of *Foxbase+*) pales in comparison to *dBASE IV*'s. And given the strength of *dBXL*'s windowing commands, the lack of a

Methodology

All tests were conducted using a 20-MHz Compaq Deskpro 386 with 5MB of RAM, a 130MB ESDI hard disk, and a 256K extended memory disk cache. NSTL used a modified version of TP1, a standard developed out of a real-world situation in which a retail bank wanted to create a system with 10 million accounts, 10,000 tellers, and 1000 branches. The standard unit of transaction selected was debit/credit.

Write records

This test created the files used in the rest of the benchmark tests; 51,100 records were written to three different files. This benchmark shows how quickly the data base can write records to a file.

Index four files

This benchmark measured the time required to index four files: Account (50,000 records), Teller (1000 records), Branch (100 records), and Transact (1000 records)

Append records
After copying 30 percent of the records to three temporary files, the benchmark appended the temporary files back onto the Account file (50,000 records). This benchmark not only tests common operations but serves to jumble the data base, making it more realistic for the remaining tests.

Transaction processing with an index

(large history file) The Transact file was expanded from 1000 to 10,000 records, and then the TP1 benchmark was run with 1000 transactions. The transact file therefore ended up with 11,000 records.

screen designer is a major flaw. The menudriven graphing module, however, is a plus. You can easily create pie, bar, line, and scatter graphs from menus, saving them like report forms to re-execute later. Charts are limited to 20 records at once, and you can't

adjust scaling; but you can export graphics to Ventura Publisher, PageMaker, or PC Paintbrush, and output options are plentiful.

Packed with features like an overstuffed suitcase, dBXL constantly strains at the 640K limit. Open too many windows or run a few TSRs, and you may lose access to the

help function—or even crash-land into DOS. Memory variables, arrays, and procedure-file capacities are also limited.

dBXL has merit as an economical entrée to dBASE. Still, speed and memory problems need to be fixed before it can catch Foxbase +.

dBMAN 5.1

Although it's the most improved package in the roundup, dBMAN still has a way to go. VersaSoft's dBASE challenger offers advanced relational and reporting skills and a precompiler that brings performance to respectable Clipper-like speeds. Yet compatibility is still gap-toothed and the documentation is confusing. Thanks to a \$189.95 price, we recommend it—provided you don't need to convert existing applications.

dBMAN shines in handling complex data relationships. Its powerful Set Relation command is unique in establishing one-to-many relationships, which makes it especially suitable for applications such as invoicing. You can exploit these multirelational skills in reporting. The band-oriented report writer, which splits report components into discrete formatting bands, is the best in the roundup and comparable to dBASE IV's.

dBMAN's manual is poorly organized, and its Assist interface and help system are mediocre. Instead of a floating dot prompt, you get a highly structured command screen—you type commands on the top line while the data displays below.

Speaking to dBMAN is a bit like traveling in Scotland—dBASE syntax is generally understood, but you won't forget you're a foreigner. dBMAN uses .DBF files and automatically converts .NDX files, but other files require separate conversions. Converting III Plus applications is a trial, due to syntax mismatches and proprietary dBMAN environment commands. The screen designer is bare bones, and the new text editor is minimal.

dBMAN's advanced relational skills, topnotch reporting, and low price are attractive. But the program won't win many converts until its incompatibilities are remedied.



Nantucket's \$695 *Clipper* is a speedy compiler cum application development environment that transforms *dBASE III Plus* command files into .EXE programs. In most tests, *Clipper*-compiled files are significantly

faster than $dBASE\ IV$ files, sharing second place with dBMAN. The learning curve is steep, but it's still the best dBASE compiler on the market.

Although Clipper is easier to use than Quicksilver, working with it can still be a struggle. Object files must be linked before they're executed, which slows the writing/testing cycle, and to shoehorn large applications into RAM you have to wrestle with

overlays. *Clipper* includes a sophisticated pop-up debugger, but mastering it takes work.

Still, the gain is worth the pain. Using *Clipper*'s concise commands, you can build professional applications sporting context-sensitive pop-up help windows; light-bar menus; fast-scrolling table lookups; and a fully configurable, windowed text editor.

System limitations are blessedly few. You can create massive records and 64K text strings, and under DOS 3.3 open 255 files in unlimited work areas. (dBASE IV limits you to 99 files in ten areas.) Support for user-defined functions and memo fields is superior to that of the competition, including dBASE IV. Unlike its rivals, Clipper lets you link applications with assembler, C, and other object code without restriction.

Clipper is not for novices, and it will challenge casual programmers. But for dBASE professionals, it's the best compiler around.

Quicksilver Compiler 1.2c

Quicksilver is another dBASE compiler that spits out .EXE files. Paired with dBXL—which uses the same windowing and networking extensions—Quicksilver should produce the snazziest applications in the business. Unfortunately, mediocre performance, an awkward compile cycle, and poor memory management keep the \$599 Quicksilver from fulfilling its promise. Unless you're committed to dBXL, pay the extra \$96 for Clipper.

Due to *Quicksilver*'s memory management flaws, fitting large applications into RAM requires extensive tinkering. Laborious trial-and-error testing is the rule when it comes to determining the maximum number of allowable work areas and memory variables. Compiling is a tedious, confusing affair involving two distinct two-step cycles. After the first cycle, which acts as a precompiler, you can run and debug an application in a run-time module, but performance is exceedingly slow. To optimize and convert the program to an .EXE file, you must endure another time-consuming, two-step cycle. The payoff? Not much. Although *Quicksilver*-

compiled applications can write records three times as fast as dBASE IV's, they're twice as slow on indexing and transaction processing.

As with Clipper, there's no user interface—just DOS-level commands with endless options. Documentation is copious but dry, and it lacks advice on avoiding common pitfalls. The optional debugger has no menus, and you can use it only after the first compile cycle. Yet the debugger will fit into as little

as 360K of RAM, whereas Clipper's debugger requires more.

Quicksilver's command extensions are enticing. But until WordTech boosts performance, fixes memory problems, and speeds up the compile process, Clipper offers smoother sailing.

dBASE Redux

For people who want speedy performance and hassle-free conversions, Foxbase+ is the answer. Although it lacks some of dBASE IV's features, it's the only dBASE clone that offers better overall value. If you're a novice on a budget, check out dBXL, and as long as compatibility isn't an issue, you might like the much improved dBMAN. If an .EXE compiler is a must, Clipper is the best choice.

The dBASE story is far from over. Since dBASE IV is no longer a moving target, expect quick counterattacks from all the clones to set off yet another cycle of one-upmanship —and more value for users. •





VGA Boards Raise the Standard

An emerging high-resolution standard promises to keep VGA hardware at the forefront of video graphics.

> Six new high-end boards vie for Best Buy.

ast December *PC World* reviewed ten VGA boards and came up with some clearcut winners. Since then, a new batch of VGA boards has arrived, sporting 512K of video RAM and 16-bit interfaces for more on-screen colors and improved performance.

Backed by a suite of new performance benchmarks from National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL), this review examines six 512K, 16-bit boards: the ATI VGA Wonder, the Compaq Video Graphics Controller (VGC), the Hewlett-Packard (HP) VGA, the Sota VGA/16, the Tecmar VGA/AD, and the Video Seven FastWrite VGA. All but one of these boards support one or more extended modes, and all claim 100 percent register-level compatibility with IBM's VGA.

The new VGA speed tests measure performance not only in standard, 640 by 480 VGA mode, but also in resolutions of 800 by 600 and 1024 by 768—the most common super-VGA resolutions. Along with the boards in this roundup, NSTL also tested three 512K, 16-bit boards from the December roundup: the AST VGA Plus, the Video Seven V-RAM VGA, and the Paradise VGA Professional (which had won a Best Buy). Interestingly, the greatest speed differences between these boards show up in word processing—especially in scrolling.

To test claims of VGA compatibility, NSTL subjected each board to its little chamber of software horrors. In 800 by 600 mode, the Video Seven FastWrite quickly cluttered *Ventura 1.1*'s Text Styles menu with garbage characters as files were loaded. The Sota VGA/16 experienced screen flicker and border misalignment with *Ventura* in 1024 by 768 mode. And in 800 by 600 mode, Tecmar's VGA/AD extended-mode screens changed brightness as windows were opened or closed in *Windows 2.03*.

ATI VGA Wonder



PROS: Displays extended-mode graphics on VGA and EGA monitors, switchless installation, mouse included

CONS: Expensive (if you don't need a mouse)

ATI has loaded everything but the kitchen sink onto the VGA Wonder. This \$699 board offers a mouse port, a Logitech mouse, a screen saver, switchless installation, and a TTL port that enables you to drive monochrome, EGA, and CGA monitors. It also has a superior set of extended-mode drivers

TJ Byers

In keeping with ATI's one-size-fits-all strategy, the VGA Wonder uses interlacing to display graphics at a resolution higher than VGA, EGA, and monochrome monitors can normally handle. The results are mixed. For example, the 800 by 600 mode flickers badly on an EGA, is close to acceptable on a VGA, and looks surprisingly good on an old-fashioned monochrome monitor.

The VGA Wonder is the only board in the roundup to offer 256-color drivers (although only for AutoCAD). It also excels by offering 16-color, 1024 by 768 drivers for AutoCAD, Ventura, and GEM, along with a 4-color one for Windows. The overall selection of drivers, though, is a bit less extensive than either Sota's or Tecmar's.

The VGA Wonder's biggest drawback is that its mouse is standard equipment. The Wonder costs \$100 more than the Sota VGA/16 for roughly the same features, but it gives you a tad more speed, switchless installation, and some fancy interlacing on a whole range of monitors. Any way you slice it, this board earns a Best Buy.

Compaq Video Graphics Controller

PROS: Good performance, moderate price

CONS: No extended modes or special software emulations of other boards, no TTL output

Despite the Compaq VGC's low \$599 price, it's not a good buy. Like any VGA, the VGC runs software written for EGA, CGA, and Hercules graphics boards, using the register-level emulations built into IBM's VGA standard. But unlike most VGAs, including the VGA Wonder, the VGC lacks software-based EGA, CGA, and Hercules emulations, limiting the board's compatibility with some software. The VGC also lacks extended modes and TTL monitor support. All you get for your money is good performance; for a 512K board, that's not enough.



Hewlett-Packard VGA

PROS: Good performance

CONS: Few software drivers, no TTL output

Apart from speed and a small library of custom fonts, the HP VGA has little going for it. Weighing in at a hefty \$670, the HP VGA lacks a TTL monitor port and has the second-worst selection of extended-mode drivers in the roundup. It offers special software-based emulation for the CGA and Hercules boards, but not for the EGA.

The catalog of extended-mode drivers is limited to *AutoCAD*, *Cadvance*, and *Windows 1.03*, although Hewlett-Packard claims new drivers are in the works. For now, though, you're paying a steep price for a little more speed and a lot less software.

Sota VGA/16



PROS: Good extended-mode driver support, mouse port, custom fonts

CONS: Fair-to-middling speed

The \$595 Sota VGA/16 offers nearly all the features of the ATI VGA Wonder. It includes a generous assortment of extended-mode drivers; software-based emulation of the EGA, CGA, and Hercules graphics boards; plus custom screen fonts, a font editor, and a TTL port. A Microsoft-compatible mouse is a \$99 option and comes with a mouse controller chip that plugs into the board.

The Sota VGA/16 ties with the Tecmar VGA/AD in offering the best selection of extended-mode drivers in the roundup, including an impressive 1024 by 768, 16-color graphics mode for *Windows 2.0*, *GEM*, *Ventura*, and *AutoCAD*. The adapter also offers 800 by 600, 16-color drivers for the same applications.

The Sota VGA/16 is an excellent VGA adapter at a good price. It doesn't perform as many interlacing tricks as the VGA Wonder, and it's a bit slower, but the VGA/16's mouse port, rich driver set, custom fonts, and low price add up to a winner.

Tecmar VGA/AD

PROS: Displays extended-mode graphics on VGA or EGA monitor

CONS: Unimpressive performance

The \$695 Tecmar VGA/AD has all the extras: a generous collection of drivers, TTL output, software-based emulations of yesterday's video boards, and the ability to display high-resolution graphics modes on monitors that weren't designed to do so. About all it lacks is a mouse port. Unfortunately, slower performance than the Sota VGA/16's and a price \$100 higher keeps this board a hairsbreadth away from being a Best Buy.

Like the ATI VGA Wonder, the VGA/ AD supports 800 by 600 and 1024 by 768, 16color graphics on either a VGA or an EGA monitor. Of course, the interlacing required to perform this trick also creates screen flicker.

When you compare the VGA/AD's driver selection with the Sota VGA/16's, it's pretty much a standoff: The VGA/AD supports more versions of *Windows*, but unlike the Sota VGA/16, it lacks support for *GEM*. Both have 1024 by 768 drivers for *Windows 2.0*, *AutoCAD*, and *Ventura*, but thanks to better-written drivers, the VGA/AD is faster at that resolution.

This feature-laden board is a little pricey, but not without reason. It boasts an excellent set of features and drivers, in addition to its nonmultiscan, extended-mode displays. A bit more speed and a lower price, and the VGA/AD would have equaled the Sota VGA/16.

Video Seven FastWrite VGA

PROS: Fast screen refresh, five-year warranty

CONS: Expensive, hardware incompatibilities

At \$758, the Video Seven FastWrite VGA is the most expensive board in this roundup—and far and away the fastest. In addition to raw speed, you get a screen saver, a plethora of extended-mode drivers, and a whopping five-year warranty.

The FastWrite VGA is almost identical to Video Seven's V-RAM VGA board, reviewed in December. However, the FastWrite uses standard DRAM chips and costs \$250 less than the V-RAM VGA, and it's almost as fast.

The FastWrite has more extended-mode drivers than any other board in the roundup, and it's the only one with drivers for *Windows/386*. However, the FastWrite's only 1024 by 768 driver is a two-color one for *Ventura*.

High price aside, FastWrite's main difficulty is that it refuses to work with several popular PCs, including the HP Vectra QS/16, the Mitsubishi 386, and the AMT 286—a conflict relating to these systems' use of "shadow RAM" (whereby the system BIOS is copied into main memory). At this writing, Video Seven has just begun offering a free upgrade in the form of a replacement chip to alleviate the problem; all new boards will have the chip already installed. All indications are that this will be a good fix, but play it safe and try before you buy.

Displaying the Future

The blue ribbon for this roundup must be shared by two boards: the ATI VGA Wonder and the Sota VGA/16. Both offer a mouse port, TTL output, and software-based emulations of EGA, CGA, and Hercules graphics boards. Overall, the VGA/16 has a better selection of drivers, plus a solid set of custom screen fonts and a font editor, while the VGA Wonder has a slight edge in speed and offers

the roundup's only 256-color driver. Another ATI advantage is extended-mode capability on VGA, EGA, CGA, and monochrome monitors—though the image quality is necessarily spotty.

If you have a mouse, save a hundred bucks and buy the Sota VGA/16. If you need a mouse—or you need to stick with your old monitor for a while and are willing to try your luck with interlacing—then your best bet is the VGA Wonder.

The runner-up is the Tecmar VGA/AD. It offers interlacing tricks similar to the VGA Wonder's and costs the same, but slower performance and the lack of a mouse and a mouse port keep it from matching the VGA Wonder's outstanding value. If you find this board at a good street price, though, you can't go wrong.

Finally, consider the 512K, 16-bit Paradise VGA, one of last December's Best Buys.

NSTL TEST REPORT

Where VGA Speed Matters

Along with the six boards reviewed in this issue, we tested three boards from last December's roundup: the Paradise VGA Professional, the AST VGA Plus, and the Video Seven V-RAM VGA. The benchmarks revealed few significant differences in performance—except in the Microsoft Word scrolling tests, where the two Video Seven boards ran noticeably faster.

Methodology

These performance benchmarks were conducted with the VGA boards installed in a 12-MHz Compaq Deskpro 286 Model 20 with a 20MB hard disk and an 8-MHz 80287 coprocessor. A 256K extended memory disk cache was used for the Auto-CAD, Microsoft Word, and WordPerfect tests. The Excel tests were run under Microsoft Windows/286 version 2.1 with HIMEM.SYS installed. The Compaq disk cache was not installed for the Excel tests, which do not include any disk access. All four tests were conducted in standard, 16-color, 640-by-480-pixel VGA mode. The AutoCAD and Excel tests were also run in 800-by-600-pixel and 1024-by-768-pixel modes, but only on those boards that supplied the appropriate drivers.

Microsoft Word 4.0

In text mode, a Microsoft Word auto-execute macro loaded a 2430-line document, scrolled line by line to the end, and exited to DOS. The test was rerun in standard 25-line graphics mode and in 43-line graphics mode.

WordPerfect 5.0

A WordPerfect auto-execute macro loaded a 2430-line document, scrolled line by line to the end, and exited to DOS.

AutoCAD Release 10

The AutoCAD benchmark consisted of three parts, all of which were written in AutoCAD's script language. The first script loaded and displayed a drawing of the space shuttle Columbia, and then displayed three views of the drawing, zooming in on each one. This sequence was repeated 18 times. The second script ran the same sequence with the grid function turned on using Ve-inch spacing. The third script loaded a sample drawing of a robot, added several wireframe donuts, and displayed five views of the drawing, each at a different magnification. This sequence was repeated four times.

Microsoft Excel 2.1

An auto-execute Excel macro loaded a worksheet of 36 rows by 46 columns and set the on-screen font to 8-point Courier. The macro then moved the worksheet one page to the right, one page down, one page left, and one page up. Next, the macro scrolled one cell at a time to the rightmost column of the matrix, to the lower right, to the lower left, and then back to the upper right.

FORGING A NEW STANDARD

Most graphics boards, whether VGA or EGA, have a couple of special extended-resolution modes for specific programs such as Windows, AutoCAD, and 1-2-3. The most popular of these modes comes in at 800 by 600 pixels, a resolution supported by every board in this roundup except the Compaq VGC. The problem is, you must install a special software driver for each software package supported, and there's a good chance your monitor can't handle the higher resolution anyway.

At this writing, NEC and a consortium of graphics companies are creating a new video standard that will overcome these obstacles—the 800-by-600-pixel, 16-color Video Electronic Standards Association (VESA) standard.

Why should you care about this effort? Because most VGA boards already support the VESA

Though it lacks a TTL port and can't match the driver selection of the VGA Wonder or the VGA/16, the \$599 Paradise board is close to 50 percent faster than either the ATI or Sota board in the *Microsoft Word* benchmarks.

Though the quality and quantity of drivers vary widely, remember that all the VGA boards in this roundup (with the exception of standard's resolution, as do most multiscan monitors, such as the NEC MultiSync. If NEC and its cohorts are successful, users who want 800-by-600pixel resolution will be able to forget about installing drivers and simply select VESA as a display option in most new software packages' installation routines.

Usually a multiscan monitor is required to display 800 by 600 pixels, but two VGA boards—the ATI VGA Wonder and the Tecmar VGA/AD—use interlacing to bring this resolution to standard VGA monitors. Interlacing alternates display lines with every other sweep of the electron guns, enabling standard VGA monitors (which normally top out at 480 lines) to simulate 600 lines. An unfortunate by-product is enough flicker to make the scheme unacceptable to many users. —TJB

Compaq's) are ready for tomorrow's VESA standard (see above). If you want a sharper image without spending a bundle—Windows users and Presentation Manager fans take note—the VESA standard may be your ace in the hole.

Compaq's SLT/286 is the only portable computer currently on the market—with or without a battery—that boasts a VGA display. Nor is that all the good news. This blazing new battery-powered system is exceedingly small, delightfully light, and fast—the fastest 286 laptop we've tested. However, at \$8316 (with 2MB of RAM, a 29ms 40MB hard drive, a 1.44MB 3½-inch floppy drive, and a 2400-bps internal modem), it's also quite expensive. If you can live without battery operation, you can get a 16-MHz, 80386-based Toshiba 5100 for about \$700 less (see "Portable Power" in this issue).

Although it's thicker than most clamshell-style units, the SLT still measures a diminutive 13 by 9 by 4 inches. Packed up with both the external power supply and the battery, it still weighs in at only 16.6 pounds. Battery life is outstanding; Compaq claims 3 hours, but in actual use the machine was still chugging away after nearly 4.

The SLT's 80C286 CPU runs at 12 MHz, and RAM can be expanded to 4MB on the motherboard. If two 8/16-bit expansion slots are on your wish list, you'll need to spend another \$999 for a deskbound expansion unit (called a docking module).

The SLT/286's performance is stunning. Not only does it take first place among all the 286 transportables tested by National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL), it even beats the Compaq Deskpro 286. It passed the NSTL Crash Test without incident.

The SLT/286's 8-by-6-inch, white-onblack, fluorescent backlit VGA screen is slightly streaky, but it displays 12 distinct shades of gray—an unusual abundance. The removable keyboard has a solid touch, and while the numeric pad is embedded in the alpha keys, it toggles on and off with a press of the <Num Lock> key.

The SLT/286 comes with utilities for disk caching and EMS 3.2-compatible memory management. Performance, portability, and especially the beautiful display are tops. The SLT's only significant drawback is its high price, but in this instance, price and value are directly related. —John Diebold

Methodology

Both machines were tested with a coprocessor and a disk cache consisting of 256K in extended memory for all tests except the 1-2-3 benchmark. The 12-MHz Compaq SLT/286 was configured with a 43MB hard disk and 4MB of RAM. The 12-MHz Compaq Portable III was configured with a 21MB hard disk and 1MB of RAM.

Microsoft Word 4.0

A Microsoft Word macro loads a 35-page, 140-paragraph document and performs search-and-replace and spell-checking operations. The first page of the document is then printed. Although the results of the benchmark depend primarily on processor and memory access speeds, display adapter and hard disk speeds are also contributing factors.

dBASE III Plus 1.1

The dBASE III Plus test measures the time required to prepare and print a report of past-due invoices. The report includes calculated fields and is based on three files: a 500-record customer file, a 1000-record invoice file, and a 2000-record item file. When disk caching is not used, the random access speed of the hard disk is, after processor speed, the most significant factor in this benchmark. With disk caching, sequential read performance becomes more important than random access.

1-2-3 2.01

In this benchmark, a 1-2-3 macro executes a series of recalculations using five different formulas within a 75-by-75-cell matrix. Because there are few screen updates and no disk access is required, the results depend almost entirely on processing and memory access speeds.

Microsoft C 5.0

The Microsoft C benchmark measures the time required to compile and link XLISP, a public-domain program composed of 25 C source code files. The most important factors in this benchmark are processor and memory access speeds. The performance of the hard disk is also a factor; generally, disk caching has little effect.

AutoCAD 9

In this benchmark, a three-dimensional sample drawing is retrieved and displayed using AutoC'AD's EGA driver. The zoom function is used to display the drawing from various perspectives; then the full drawing is printed. The results of the benchmark depend primarily on the speeds at which the processor and coprocessor operate and at which memory is accessed. The performance of the display adapter and the hard disk also have some effect.

Ricoh PC Laser 6000

LaserJet-compatible printer

PROS: 1MB RAM standard

CONS: Slow, expensive

The HP compatibles keep on coming. Three new low-end laser printers have appeared on the market—from Acer, Fujitsu, and Ricoh. All three are rated for relatively light duty (3000 pages per month, compared with the HP LaserJet's 5000), and all three offer HP compatibility (although Ricoh charges extra for it). Beyond that, they have very different capabilities and prices.

Acer LP-76

At \$1995, the Acer LP-76 lists for \$700 less than a LaserJet Series II. Thanks to its Ricoh 1060 print engine, it also produces better-looking output—sharper lines, more consistent blacks, and better tonal range. Unfortunately, the Ricoh engine uses flimsy plastic parts and probably won't last as long as a LaserJet's.

On many other counts, the Acer LP-76 compares favorably. Although toner, developer, and photoconductor cartridge must be replaced in three separate operations, the process is simple. Acer offers the same six resident fonts as the LaserJet II, plus 21 proprietary font cartridges. The printer's 512K of RAM can be upgraded to 4.5MB (same as the LaserJet II), the control panel is easy to use, and LaserJet II emulation seems solid. Moreover, Acer's guarantee is outstanding: During the first four months of the one-year warranty, on-site repair and adjustment are free.

Text printing speed is not one of the Acer's strong points; at only 6 ppm, it's significantly slower than the LaserJet II (rated at 8 ppm). But the Acer is much faster on graphics, and it outpaced the LaserJet II (results not shown) at printing mixed text and graphics as well.

Should you buy the Acer LP-76 instead of the LaserJet Series II? As usual, the answer is a clear-cut maybe. If your office printing

Fujitsu RX7100

Although it is a LaserJet compatible, Fujitsu's new printer is not, strictly speaking, a laser printer at all—it's an LED (lightemitting diode) printer. Like the LaserJet, it combines toner, developer, and imaging drum in one convenient cartridge. Other intelligent design features include a paper-exit tray that flips out of the way when not in use.

At \$2395, the Fujitsu RX7100 lists for \$300 less than the LaserJet. (A dual-tray model costs \$2555—still less than the single-bin LaserJet II and far less than any other dual-bin laser printer.) It comes with 640K of RAM, and while that's not enough for a full page of graphics, you can expand memory to a generous 4.6MB.

Like the LaserJet Plus, the Fujitsu has only three resident fonts; 32 proprietary font cartridges are available, but only 17 claim compatibility with HP LaserJet software drivers. Documentation is decent, and the six-button control panel is a good deal easier to use than the one on the LaserJet II.

The bad news is that the Fujitsu is slow. The engine is rated at a poky 5 ppm, and to make matters worse, the printer's controller processes both text and graphics at a snail's pace. In all four NSTL tests, the Fujitsu RX7100 ran last.

Simple text printouts looked fine, but getting acceptable results with pages that combined text and graphics was a problem. No amount of fiddling with the print density dial produced an acceptable balance. In many cases, fine lines and the edges of letters showed fat jaggies.

Should you buy the Fujitsu RX7100? Its low price and intelligent construction are admirable, but they don't make up for snail-like speed and disappointing print quality.

Ricoh PC Laser 6000

At \$2495, Ricoh's new printer beats the price of a LaserJet II by a mere \$200. Worse, it is significantly slower than the LaserJet II, and you pay an extra \$199 for LaserJet emulation, wiping out any price advantage.

POWER TIP NO. 49

How to Recover the LaserJet's Last Page

Sometimes the HP LaserJet prints a document sans the last page. The LaserJet requires a formfeed line command in order to print a page and some applications don't automatically add the command. You can print the missing last page by pressing the On Line button on the control panel (to toggle the printer off line) and then pressing the Form Feed key.

Ellison Kwan San Francisco, California Ricoh supplies the same print engine to Acer, and in some respects the printers are similar. Both offer excellent print quality, and both run at the same relatively slow 6 ppm on text-based tests. In NSTL's graphics benchmarks, the Ricoh PC Laser 6000 proved a bit slower than the Acer, but mix in text, and the Ricoh is 50 percent slower.

The printer comes with a megabyte of memory, enough to handle a full page of graphics, but tops out at only 2MB. It provides only four resident fonts—one more than the Plus and two fewer than the II. Ricoh offers a scant 11 proprietary font cartridges.

In most respects, the Ricoh PC Laser 6000 is little better than mediocre: Documentation is OK, front-panel controls are adequate, and the warranty is ordinary. Considering the machine's slow performance and LaserJet-compatible price, it must be considered an also-ran. —Daniel Miles Kehoe





Methodology

Benchmarks were conducted using a 12-MHz Compaq Deskpro 286 Model 40 equipped with 1.2MB of RAM. Text printing speed was tested using a typical business document created with *Microsoft Word 4.0*. Graphics printing speed was tested using a 1-2-3 graph. *PageMaker* version 1.0a was used to test the printers' ability to produce text and graphics on the same page. Timing began when the command to print was issued and ended when the last page came to rest in the output tray.

Plain text, TTY driver

This benchmark timed the printing of 20 pages of plain text without enhancements or formatting using Word's TTY printer driver.

Plain text, HPLaser1 driver

This benchmark timed the printing of the same 20 pages of plain text using Word's HPLaser1 printer driver.

Graphics

This benchmark timed the printing of a 1-2-3 stacked bar chart using the Hewlett-Packard LaserJet Plus driver with the high-density option.

Text and graphics

This benchmark timed the printing of an 8-page newsletter containing text and graphics—various type sizes and fonts, a scanned photo, and a line drawing—using the HP Series II printer driver.

Freelance Plus 3.0

Business graphics program

PROS: Expanded charting and drawing, new data-linking and desktop presentation features, scanned image support

CONS: Doesn't support gray-scale images, no slide-service-bureau support

As a business graphics program with integrated charting and drawing tools, *Freelance Plus* has always been popular, especially with 1-2-3 users (see "Business Graphics Roundup," *PCW*, July 1988). A charter member of the Lotus family, it offers a familiar interface and hassle-free importing of 1-2-3 worksheet and graphics files.

Yet Freelance Plus hasn't wrested the business graphics crown from Software Publishing's Harvard Graphics, and it also faces competition from newcomers like Ashton-Tate's Draw Applause (see The Software Shelf, PCW, October 1988). Its interface and tree-structured menus make creating charts on the fly harder than with Harvard, and it can't match the blended shades or spiffy special effects available from Draw Applause. On the plus side, its chart/editing features equal Draw Applause's and are stronger than Harvard Graphics', which still lacks the ability to zoom in on a chart.

Freelance Plus 3.0 gives Lotus loyalists new charting power, a nifty data-to-chart linking feature, improved drawing tools, scanned image import capability (although not for gray-scale files), and competent desktop presentation. However, the program isn't much faster than version 2.0, and it gobbles up more RAM (up from 384K to 640K) without supporting expanded memory. And unlike competing programs, Freelance Plus still doesn't use an overnight slide service bureau like MAGICorp.

Freelance Plus's new charting features include area, bar/line, high/low/close, and table charts, as well as 3-D effects for bar and pie charts. The program also packs new axis options, automatic boxes and drop shadows for headings and legends, and support for


new fonts, including Bitstream outline fonts.

A big productivity plus in version 3.0 is dynamic links between a chart and its external source file. Retrieve any chart, and it's automatically updated with the latest data from the source file. And you can view linked data in a spreadsheet or data base file while you're still in *Freelance Plus*.

For chart editing and enhancement, Free-lance Plus's excellent drawing tools are better than ever, with new alignment, snap-to-object, and curve-smoothing commands. For nonartists, Freelance Plus 3.0 now includes nearly 900 symbols and maps (many in color), as well as templates you can use as backdrops for diagrams, organization charts, and other text charts.

Thanks to Freelance Plus 3.0's new TIFF import capability, you can dress up a chart by incorporating scanned images—a nice snapshot of the CEO, say. But Freelance Plus supports only non-gray-scale TIFF images made with Hewlett-Packard's popular Scanning Gallery, so you'll have to settle for a dithered black-and-white image. And Freelance Plus doesn't display the image itself, just a rectangle bearing the name of the TIFF file. You can move, resize, flip, or rotate a TIFF file as you construct a chart, but you have to print it out to proof the results. With the recently released Xerox Presents, on the other hand, you can conveniently display scanned images on screen as you work (see the review in the special Windows section in this issue).

Once you create a series of charts, you can use Freelance Plus 3.0's new Portfolio module to organize and batch-print presentations, and use its versatile Screen Show module to script and display desktop slide shows. For the more visually demanding, Freelance Plus's .GX2 slide files are compatible with the newest version of Show Partner F/X, a dedicated presentation package (see The Software Shelf, PCW, August 1988). Output file formats include EPS, TIF, and CGM, plus you can print VideoShow and HPGL

plotter files to disk for importing into Ventura Publisher and PageMaker.

When 1-2-3 release 3.0 finally arrives, Freelance Plus users are guaranteed to hit the ground running because Freelance already supports Lotus's new three-dimensional worksheets. You'll be able to import not only .WK3 files, but also data from a row or column from one or more consecutive release 3.0 worksheets.

Freelance Plus is a fine first choice as an all-purpose business graphics program, and version 3.0 is a solid upgrade. But users accustomed to friendlier interfaces may prefer such Windows-based programs as Micrografx's Graph Plus, Zenographics' Pixie, and now Xerox Presents. —Richard Jantz

Peter Norton may still be wearing the smile of a hard disk utility champ, but a pair of serious contenders would love to wipe it right off his face. Like *The Norton Utilities* (see *The Software Shelf, PCW, April 1989), Mace Gold* and *PC Tools Deluxe 5.0* are useful enough for shuffling files, but they're vital if you suddenly need to retrieve data from an accidentally formatted disk drive (see "How to Recover From Hard Disk Disaster" in this issue).

Mace Gold and PC Tools offer many of the same valuable features as Norton's package—and add some important extras. Both can undelete files and unformat disks, lock out bad disk sectors, back up and restore quick-

ly, and unfragment files. The new versions are notable upgrades, and $PC\ Tools$ ' nifty desktop utilities make 5.0 a watershed release.

Mace Gold offers a memory-resident "vaccine" designed to protect files against computer viruses, protection against data loss due to power failure, and application-specific features that let you restore some dBASE and word processing files that wouldn't be recoverable at all without a sophisticated understanding of their file formats. PC Tools, on the other hand, offers mouse support, a set of memory-resident desktop accessories that resemble those in SideKick Plus (but require only 40K of RAM), and a DOS shell reminiscent of Norton Commander (see The Software Shelf, PCW, August 1988 and January 1989, respectively).

Apart from its vaccine program, which offers two levels of virus protection, *Mace Gold*'s most impressive feature is a memory-resident program called Power Out Protection that regularly copies the entire contents of your computer's RAM to a hidden disk file. If the lights go out, you can restore programs and data to RAM in their exact state at the time of the last automatic memory snapshot—even if you were using an application.

PC Tools shines in the usefulness of its desktop accessories. The notepad is practically a full word processor, with search and replace, a spelling checker, and various formatting options. An appointment calendar includes daily and monthly calendar views, appointment alarms, and a to-do list. The Desktop's data base module reads dBASE files directly and searches for specific records, though you can't display records in rowand-column format. The Desktop also includes macros, outlining, basic telecommunications, a calculator, and a clipboard.

Of the two packages, *PC Tools* is noticeably better integrated. Like previous versions of *Mace Utilities*, *Mace Gold*'s main menu options are limited, so you often wind up working from the DOS prompt. If you call *Mace Gold*'s file sort program from the main menu, for example, it sorts only the current



directory; to sort other directories, you have to run the utility from the command line. And *Mace Gold's* unfragment program doesn't tell you if your disk actually needs optimizing; that's handled by another utility (Fragchk), which must be invoked separately.

By contrast, the individual *PC Tools* utilities display a full range of options no matter how they're invoked. From its point-and-shoot menu, for example, the Compress optimizer matches the functions of *Mace Gold's* Remedy, Sortd, Sqzd, Fragchk, and Unfrag utilities. *PC Tools* even offers a special pull-down menu to which you can add utilities—and even non-*PC Tools* applications—that aren't listed on the main menu.

Mace Gold and PC Tools both have "safe" format commands (which don't erase data) to replace DOS's FORMAT command, as well as mirror programs to back up your file allocation table for easier unformatting. Their disk optimizing modules are similar, though they'll feel slow as mud if you're used to a stand-alone program like Vopt or FastTrax (see "Hard Disk Housekeepers," PCW, June 1988).

Mace Gold is a much-improved product, but despite its power-failure and virus-protection features, it's essentially a collection of separate utilities. PC Tools is a more smoothly integrated whole, enhanced by its well-conceived desktop and shell programs. The important thing is that you have one of

the packages on hand when trouble strikes your computer—as eventually, it surely will.



Methodology

All tests were performed on a 12-MHz Compaq Deskpro 286 with a 20MB hard disk and 1.1MB of RAM. MicroEMACS 3.9, a text editor written in C, was used to test the C compilers. MicroEMACS is a public domain version of EMACS, an editor long popular among programmers and noted for its powerful macro capability. The execution speed of a set of MicroEMACS's macros was used to compare the quality of code generated by the compilers. Compilations were optimized for speed. There was no significant difference between the source code used for the compilers.

Size of .EXE

The size of the executable file produced by a compiler.

Compile Time

The amount of time that it took to compile MicroEMACS from the command line and from within the integrated environment.

.EXE Performance

Three macros were used to test the execution speed of each compiler's resultant .EXE (executable) file. The first macro, Scroll text, loaded MicroEMACS's 1472-line source code file (MAIN.C) and scrolled from the top line down to the end of the file. Explicit calls to the "update-screen" macro command were made to reflect each scrolling operation on the screen. The second macro, Search and replace, loaded the same MAIN.C file and replaced all occurrences of if with nstl. Screen I/O was minimized for this test. The last macro, Cut and paste, performed several "kill-region" operations; "kill-region" deleted a block of text while copying the block to the scrap buffer.

It's a multiple-window editor in which you write, compile, debug, and execute programs. When an error crops up in a program you're running or compiling within the environment, a pop-up window displays an error message and you're whisked back into the editor, with the cursor on the line where the error occurred. This kind of context sensitivity drastically cuts the gap between program idea and bug-free product. One glaring omission: Although you can write programs that use a mouse, *Turbo C* itself doesn't.

Until recently, Microsoft's QuickC debugger had a distinct advantage over Turbo C's. With version 2.0, Turbo C rights the imbalance and adds several debugging conveniences that even QuickC 2.0 doesn't offer. Turbo C 2.0 lets you step through source code execution a line at a time; set breakpoints; define watch variables and watch expressions; trace into or skip over functions; and view program code in C, assembly language, or a mixture of both. With QuickC 2.0, by contrast, you can view program code only in the source language; viewing mixed source and assembly, or pure assembly, language requires Microsoft's CodeView debugger.

Turbo C also supports the "tiny" memory model (in which code and data must fit in 64K) and can produce small, fast .COM files directly. Furthermore, the entire Turbo C 2.0 library is available from within the integrated environment. Finally, Turbo C 2.0 provides a command-line compiler that feels somewhat faster than QuickC 2.0's.

Turbo C 2.0's new linker is speedy but incomplete. It doesn't support overlays and can't link object files created with Microsoft's C or FORTRAN compilers. Like QuickC, Turbo C 2.0 can't compile programs for OS/2, a task best left to the more capable Microsoft C 5.1.

If you're already programming with *QuickC*, stay with it; converting your programs to *Turbo C* is a big job if they have DOS-dependent calls and use graphics—those Borland library functions differ significantly from Microsoft's. Otherwise, it's a tough call. *QuickC 2.0* has lots of new fea-



General purpose CAD

Each new release of *AutoCAD* poses reviewers a dilemma: Do you praise it for all the spiffy new features, or pan it for not fixing old problems? *AutoCAD Release 10* is typical: an impressive list of commands that are not always implemented in the most useful way.

Release 10 boasts three major new features: multiple windows, expanded 3-D drawing power, and object "handles"—numbers that uniquely identify objects for use in data bases. Other goodies include an improved command for changing the attributes of entities, a tutorial, an expanded-memory version of Autolisp (AutoCAD's programming language), quadratic and cubic B-splines, dynamic zooms, and a Zoom Previous command that can back up through ten prior zooms.

AutoCAD can now display four nonoverlapping windows (called viewports) in a dozen preset combinations. Each window can be zoomed, panned, or regenerated independently, though you can't move windows around the screen or resize them. Only one window is active at a time, but switching windows takes just a click of your pointer button.

The main drawback is that you can't use one window as an overview for controlling the views in other windows. For example, you can't pick a point in an overall view of a drawing, and zoom in on it with another window. Also, you can't add, delete, or rearrange windows in mid-command, as you can in some other programs.

Object "handles" are a hot new feature that makes *AutoCAD* more useful for parametric design and analysis. The Handles command assigns a unique, permanent identification number to each distinct object (line, circle, block, and so on) in a drawing. The number can be read by programs written in Autolisp or used to identify objects included in a .DXF exchange file.

The most dramatic change from AutoCAD 9 is in 3-D capabilities. The new 3-D entities consist of extruded and ruled surfaces, surfaces of revolution, tabulated cylinders, surface patches, and 3-D polylines, plus some standard parametric objects such as spheres, domes, cones, cubes, pyramids, and toroids.





AutoCAD 10's automatic hidden-line removal produced this realistic view of typical 3-D structures. Three-dimensional curves can also be created by fitting a B-spline to a 3-D polyline.

The 3-D user interface is based on what Autodesk calls the User-Defined Coordinate System (UCS), local coordinates that you generally attach to angles and surfaces. You work mainly on 2-D surfaces defined by the coordinates, even though the overall drawing is three dimensional. This is logical and fairly easy to understand, but setting up the many UCS's in a complex drawing requires a lot of effort.

While you can draw most 3-D shapes fairly easily with *AutoCAD 10*, the editing system and some drawing functions appear only partially integrated into the 3-D world. You can only hatch, fillet, dimension, and draw certain shapes in the *x-y* plane of the current UCS. Perspective views can't be zoomed or panned, and you can't pick editing or drawing reference points in these views either.

Compared with release 9, 10 is about 20 percent slower at regenerating the screen and 15 percent faster at redrawing the display list. This probably represents a slight decline in performance if you work with large files, but anyone using *AutoCAD* professionally is likely to need a 386 machine in any case.

It's too bad that many of *AutoCAD 9*'s shortcomings carry over into *AutoCAD 10*. You still can't select objects by layer or by color, for example, unless you construct special commands using Autolisp filters. Dimen-

sion editing remains clumsy, and the program's associative dimensioning is only effective when all the affected dimensions are in the same dimension format.

Lesser problems also persist from earlier versions. *AutoCAD*'s fillet and chamfer commands still trim off both original lines, whether you want to or not. There is no intraline text editing, nor is there any way to keep a drawing layer visible but not editable.

Autodesk clearly concentrated on adding new 3-D features this time around, and release 10 still shows lots of rough edges. If you really need 3-D drawing, AutoCAD 10 offers far greater capabilities than earlier versions, though it still isn't as well integrated (or as expensive) as competitors like CADkey or Computervision's Personal Designer. And if your work is largely 2-D, you will be better off with Evolution Computing's FastCAD or Manufacturing and Consulting's Anvil-1000MD. —Steven Lord



This dBASE record may look tortured, but dSalvage can realign the offset data with a single press of the arrow key. Publishing, Ltd., Pittsford, New York, 1985). He's also the author of dSalvage, a lifesaving utility that automatically diagnoses and repairs damaged data files. dSalvage speedily recovers files suffering from damaged or missing headers (those vital sections that describe the file layout), garbage characters, displaced records, and even files accidentally obliterated by dBASE's powerful Zap command. In fact dSalvage fixes everything except damaged .DBT memo files. Version 1.43 is compatible with dBASE IV files provided they don't have memo or floating-point fields, or more than 128 fields per record. If your lost dBASE data is still intact anywhere on disk, dSalvage can resurrect it.

Using dSalvage is simplicity itself. Even if you've never looked at dSalvage before the moment you desperately need it, you can analyze and diagnose a traumatized .DBF file with a single function key. When dSalvage detects one or more types of damage, simple instructions tell you how to fix things fast. And when using the utility, it pays to follow orders. If dSalvage tells you to press <Enter><F3><F5>, don't ask questions—just do it.

The dSalvage menu will satisfy most casual users, and the software and manual offer lots of technical help if you want to explore .DBF files at the byte level. dSalvage provides a header editor, record editor, and bytestream editor, which together allow

manual editing of any .DBF file, regardless of its condition. On-line help is also available, along with a terrifying assortment of damaged practice files.

At press time, Heiser was set to release version 1.44, which he claims will be completely compatible with *dBASE IV*. He is also working on *dSalvage Professional*, a new \$199.95 package that includes a powerful new sector editor, a hex editor, and a manual unzapper that lets users compare data across clusters when rebuilding large files with partly overwritten data.

dSalvage's user interface isn't particularly polished and its classification of damage types is quirky, but when your data shows up intact, all is forgiven. The package is like insurance; you buy it hoping you'll never have to use it. But if you ever do, dSalvage is definitely the right tool for the job.



Depending on your whim and budget, you can now add custom pulldown menus to Windows' opening Executive screen, endow Windows with more powerful icons and folders, or turn Windows into an object-oriented environment with the power to integrate and hot-link data from DOS and Windows applications. If you think Windows is confining—and hard to sell in your training-conscious company—think again.

Adam Rostoker, executive director of the Windows Presentation Manager Association, calls such products crucial to the future of Windows. "Windows is a super operating environment for many things, but there's not a lot of functionality straight out of the box," says Rostoker. Cheryl Currid, manager of departmental computing services for Coca Cola Foods, concurs, noting that without add-ons, Windows won't fly in the corporate world. "These products make [Windows] work the way end users want it to work," says Currid.

Curing the MS-DOS Executive Blues


Windows' functional limitations begin at the MS-DOS Executive, a glorified DIR listing that forces users to sift through subdirectories looking for the right executable file. If users aren't DOS savvy, training them can be problematic.


William Bailey, senior consulting engineer for E.I. du Pont, says the company's engineering department adopted *Command Post*, from Seattlebased Wilson WindowWare, to take the edge off the Executive. *Command Post* is a cheap shareware program that lets you add pulldown menus, tile or stack windows, and use a screen blanker.


"We like the product so much," says Bailey, "that when Microsoft showed us their latest version of *Excel*, we showed them *Command Post* and said, "This is what *Windows* should do out of the box."

Windows cum Macintosh

If you need something more—say, full-screen menus, custom icons, folders that replace subdirectories, and other Mac-like aids—hDC's Windows Express tops the list (see the review in this section). Coca-Cola's 386-workstation users have given the program a solid thumbs-up. "Our users love the icon-driven front end," says Currid. "With Windows Express you can create icons and colorful







Beyond Batch Language

Perhaps the most exciting Windows tools are emerging in the field of application integration and development. The program of choice among many micro managers is Bridge, a super Windows batch language from Softbridge Microsystems of Cambridge, Massachusetts. Bridge not only lets inhouse developers create job-specific user interfaces, it also enables Windows and DOS applications to swap messages and data on a single system or LAN.

Manufacturers Hanover Trust uses Bridge as the sinew for its futuristic network of 1000-plus 386 PCs-all running Windows. With Bridge, account executives need never know they are using Excelthey see only graphs and figures. Nor are they aware they're switching to a word processor when they click the 'Write a Memo' option on a menu. In short, changing applications is totally transparent. "Users don't need computers," says Art Block, vice president of end-user automation support at Hanover. "They need information. They need to write letters or do credit analysis. The most technical term on our menus is Exit."

Making NewWaves

Meanwhile, Hanover and other corporate Windows enthusiasts eagerly await the arrival of Hewlett-Packard's NewWave object-oriented application development environment—and for good reason. With NewWave, you will be able to hot-link data between DOS and Windows applications on 80286 computers; automate complex environment-wide tasks with a powerful macro language; and even create interactive, on-line training programs.

NewWave's secret lies in treating elementscharts, text, worksheets—as discrete objects and keeping track of where they're stored and what source applications created them. With this system, you could easily build a document that incorporates customer addresses from dBASE IV, accounts receivable numbers from Excel, and a company logo from PageMaker. To update the document, you'd





simply click the numbers (to load Excel and the appropriate worksheet) and change the data. You can link data in any number of files by copying the object's icon wherever you want. The implications for both stand-alone and work-group computing are tremendous. American Airlines was so impressed with NewWave that it plans on making the program the centerpiece of an integrated office system that links the company's wide area network to 14,000 American employees worldwide.

Unfortunately, NewWave requires hefty amounts of disk space and RAM. And though business users are enthusiastic, developers are a bit leery. Crafting applications for Windows is tough enough; modeling them to take full advantage of NewWave's talents requires more time and money than many companies can spare. Paul Grayson, president of Micrografx, has admiring words for NewWave but bluntly notes, "NewWave applications are at the bottom of our list. Windows, Presentation Manager, and Mac applications come first."


HP plans to ship NewWave by the end of 1989, and nearly a dozen vendors have pledged to support it-including Microsoft, with a NewWave version of Excel. Other developers, however, remain skeptical about whether HP has the marketing clout to make the environment take off. No matter. According to sources at Microsoft, future versions of Windows will undoubtedly incorporate NewWave concepts. In the meantime, users will be flocking to other addons that finally transform Windows into a helpmate and a multitaskmaster.





Word processor




Until the ultimate Windows word processor comes along, a friendly, albeit limited, alternative is at hand: Ami. Samna Corporation's first Windows entry won't beat WordPerfect or PageMaker at their respective games. But for \$199

you get a lean, clean, intelligently designed word processor that's ideal for letters, memos, brief reports, newsletters, and other short projects that need to incorporate graphics and fonts.

Compared to NBI's *Legend*, a bulky, slow word processor cum desktop publisher, *Ami* is positively sprightly, thanks to a speedy character-only draft mode dedicated to text entry and editing. When you're ready to insert graphics, flow text into multiple columns, or perform other desktop publishing tasks, you merely click an icon to flip into the slower graphics-

oriented layout mode.

Like many desktop publishing programs, Ami holds graphics and special text items (such as captions and headlines that stretch across several columns) in Ventura-like frames that can be sized, moved, and stacked. Creating a frame is straightforward: Click an icon, hold the mouse button, and pull to stretch out the frame's boundaries, then pour an image or text file into the frame. By default, body text automatically flows around a frame, but you can also flow it above, below, or even through a frame.

If the thought of formatting a document chills you, chill out—
Ami comes with 25 Ventura-like style sheets that control mar-

gins, columns, line spacing, fonts, type size, and more. Merely highlight the text, click a style (such as 'Centered Headline') listed in an on-screen box, and the text is transformed. Of course you can format text on the fly with keyboard shortcuts, but if you work via the menus and style sheets, Ami displays a dynamically changing sample of the text in a special window—a feature that saves time when sculpting a document's look. A static page-preview function is also available.

If you've used *Windows Write*, *Ami*'s draft mode will seem familiar, although you'll find some notable improvements. Text is more readable, and scrolling and paging are a little peppier. (Moving from the bottom of a long document to the top, however, can slow *Ami* to a crawl.) The interface is also efficiently designed. Click one of the icons lining the left side of the screen, and you can instantly change views, create frames, modify styles, print, and so on. The program also offers innumerable <Ctrl>-key shortcuts for aligning and enhancing text and selecting important functions.

Just remember that Ami is no substitute for a full-fledged word processor. It offers cut and paste, search and replace, various page views, and a 130,000-word spelling checker. But that's about it. It lacks multiple document windows, mail merge functions, a footnoting capability, a table generator, a thesaurus, macros, and index and table of contents generation. Editing is also a drag, because the easiest approach means issuing <Ctrl>- and <Shift>-key combinations to perform such basic functions as move and copy.

Those searching for heavy-duty desktop publishing prowess should also look elsewhere. *Ami* is missing kerning, tracking, and similar typographic controls, along with any kind of drawing tools for creating simple graphics or touching up imported ones.

Given Ami's limits, you'd probably use your powerful stand-alone word processor for most work and import your creation into Ami for last-minute editing, layout, and formatting. Unfortunately, Ami will only import (and maintain formatting for) ASCII, Samna Word, Word-Perfect 5.0, WordStar 2000, and AdvanceWrite text files; graphics files are limited to TIF and .PCX formats. Ami also has the annoying habit of mistaking hard hyphens for soft ones if they ap-


pear at the end of a line in an ASCII file. Samna pledges to provide registered users with free filters for *Microsoft Word* and most versions of *WordStar* in the near future.

Still, Ami is one of the best word processors currently available to Windows users. If you want to create more complex documents and have macros, mail merge, automatic table generation, and more at your disposal, wait for the mid-1989 release of Ami Professional. It may just give WordPerfect, Word—and Microsoft's rumored Windows-based word processor—some real competition.—Patrick Marshall



Harvard Graphics and 35mm Express when it comes to generating great-looking output (see "Business Graphics Roundup," PCW, July 1988) but also can simultaneously produce speaker notes and audience handouts. If the PC is your projector, Xerox Presents will even display images unattended in slide-show fashion and toss in "wipes," "fades," and other special effects.

Crafting a presentation image is a matter of flipping open menus and following the prompts. You load one of many supplied style sheets (complete with dummy text and graphics that you merely replace), type in vertically or horizontally aligned text, and import graphics or create your own with Xerox Presents' capable drawing tools. Every item is treated as a separate object, so you can easily forge compound images and resize and overlap them on a PageMaker-like snap-to grid. The program supplies 256 colors and patterns to dress up your images.

Building a table is similarly simple: You specify size, number of rows and columns, justification, and fonts in an on-screen form, then type in the data, directly import a .WKS file, or shovel data in with the Clipboard. To graph the data, however, you must copy it to another module with the Clipboard. Once there, eight different graphs (some in 3-D) can be produced, and you can spruce up the image with some of the best clip art around.

Xerox Presents also wins high marks for readily accepting ASCII, DIF, .WKS, .CGM, .PCX, SYLK, TIF,

For many users, the toughest part of learning *Windows* is figuring out how to run a program from the MS-DOS Executive. If you agree that double-clicking on an executable file name is pretty archaic—or if you need to simplify *Windows* operations for office users—you're a candidate for hDC's *Windows Express*.


An upgrade to the company's *ClickStart*, *Windows Express* lets you mask *Windows*' less-than-friendly opening screen with a custom full-screen hierarchical menu system complete with icons and help windows. The menu system revolves around "folders" that group together common applications. For example, a folder might contain *Pixie*, *Designer*, and *Windows Graph*. Click this folder's icon, and up pops a submenu listing the applications; click the icon for an application, and it runs. Since folders can hold other folders, there is no limit to the complexity of the menus.

You build menus by filling out a simple on-screen form for each menu item. To add *Word* to a menu, for example, you'd supply the program name, the location of the executable file, loading parameters (such as /K), an <Alt>-key alternative for nonmouse users, and a password. You can even direct *Windows Express* to display a list of data files by extension every time *Word* runs. Select one of the fifty icons provided—or modify one, pixel by pixel, with a supplied icon editor—and you're done. You can tie a custom help screen to a menu option along the way by clicking an icon in the form and entering your on-line caveats in a pop-up text box.




Constructing menus is simple enough, but designing and testing a menu system that lists a dozen programs can take an hour, because you must fill out a form for every single item. With the Norton Commander, you merely create a single text file that lists all menu options and the commands they trigger-an approach Windows Express would do well to emulate. hDC should also consider beefing up security. Although Windows Express offers password protection for folders, programs, and even itself, you can easily defeat

the system if you know how to start
Windows without Windows Express.



When Adobe introduced *Illustrator* for the Macintosh in 1987, thousands of frustrated artists were set free. At last a package had arrived that made professional-quality microcomputer-based illustration a reality. *Illustrator* for the PC won't make quite the same splash—it doesn't match the powers of the latest Mac version, it's incredibly slow, and in the business-oriented PC market, *Micrografx Designer* dominates. But professional illustrators and serious desktop publishers who produce logos, artistic renderings, and technical drawings will find the package alluring.

Illustrator's strength is its ability to control Bezier curves. Using an on-screen pen, you draw connected lines and curves that form the outline of an image, then grab the outline at various spots to precisely adjust the final shape. The technique takes some getting used to, but it's remarkably effective.

Because *Illustrator* treats all elements like objects, you can scale, skew, stack, and rotate curves, boxes, graphics,

and text. If perspective drawings, fancy typography, and airbrush-like special effects are your meat, *Illustrator* is the best choice.

Artists grappling with detailed technical drawings will especially appreciate the program's tracing functions. Import a piece of clip art, a scanned image, or a Paintbrush graphic as a template, and Illustrator will adroitly trace it and create a curve-based image that you can endlessly manipulate. If you convert a .DXF CAD file with a supplied utility, the file will automatically be turned into an Illustrator object. (The original bitmapped images, however, cannot be edited or printed.) The startlingly sharp result can be

printed out on any PostScript device or saved as an EPS file and used by *PageMaker*, *Ventura Publisher*, and other page layout programs.

Just keep in mind that *Illustrator* is not for casual users. Although you get some basic symbols, borders, and letterforms, the program itself generates only ovals and boxes—whipping up a pie chart would be pretty tricky. And tapping *Illustrator*'s special effects and high-resolution output requires a pricey PostScript printer.

Illustrator for the PC has one great strength: the ability to control Bezier curves.

Artists should also note that the PC version can't do complex masking with multiple objects and lacks a "blend" tool to smooth transitions between different shapes and colors. You can specify gray percentages and CMYK color values, but *Illustrator* can't generate four-color separations or even preview an illustration in color.

Illustrator is also unbelievably slow. Switching from edit to preview mode on a 6-MHz AT can take several minutes, and cutting and pasting an image can easily top 30 seconds. Serious users interested in preserving their sanity will quickly opt for an 80386 system with gobs of expanded memory.

If you've got the hardware,

the time, and the need, *Illustrator* is the best tool of its kind. Otherwise, seek out simpler draw programs. —*Steve Roth*

MORE POWER TO YOUR PRINTER

Printers are essential to every PC-equipped office—so why aren't they easier to use? Here's a Buyers' Guide to tools that help you get the most out of your printer.

nyone who's tried to turn a file into hard copy knows that the interface between PC and printer leaves a lot to be desired. To help you overcome some of the most galling printer problems—delays, tricky interfaces, poor output—we've rounded up a passel of useful products in five key categories. Intelligent buffers and spoolers re-

printer's hidden talents. Font management utilities make it easy to mix and match resident fonts, cartridge fonts, and downloadable soft fonts. Finally, there's a grab bag of device emulators to help enhance the appearance of your output.

INTELLIGENT BUFFERS

If you do a lot of printing, you know how a backlog of print jobs can tie up your machine. A printer buffer will give you the extra RAM to set your PC free. Most buffers provide a minimum of 64K, but some can accommodate up to 4MB for big print jobs.

Buffers costing less than \$75 are usually sequential: Files are printed in the order received, and the user has little or no control over the process. However, the *intelligent* buffers listed in TABLE 1 provide much more control. Most interpret emlisted are stand-alone boxes. Only three (Simp-LAN, ShareSpool, and Laserspool) are add-in boards that fit in the LaserJet's optional I/O slot. Just one product, Mega-Print, fits directly into a PC's expansion slot.

Most buffers provide several ports for input and output and support a variety of PC, printer, and port combinations. Options to consider include upgradable memory and daisy-chaining (which lets you connect several buffers).

SPOOLERS

For a less expensive alternative to buffers, try a spooler (see TABLE 2).

Spoolers line up print jobs in a queue, either on a hard disk or in RAM.

RAM spooling is fast, but RAM is expensive, and print jobs larger than the buffer will still cause delays; hard disk spooling is

slower but can accommodate more and larger print jobs. Only three of the products listed—

Torq, LaserTorq, and SpoolMaster—spool to RAM.

Typically, spoolers are single-user tools, but if you invest in cabling, some spoolers will direct output from eight or more PCs to as many printers. Extra features include the ability to set print job priority and to pause printing.

PRINTER CONTROL UTILITIES

If you're tired of typing intricate escape codes into your documents, consider a printer control program. This type of utility features plain-English menus that can let you easily embed codes in documents to change print quality, type style, character pitch, justification, and margins. Some of these programs offer a potpourri of extras, such as the ability to manage fonts, edit text, print sideways, and serve as print spoolers.

E-Z-Set

Orbit Enterprises *E-Z-Set* is a setup utility for LaserJets and compatible printers. The menudriven program also enables you to select cartridge fonts, change the number of printed lines per page, and switch between landscape and portrait modes. List price: \$49.95. Requires 128K.

LaserControl

FONT MANAGEMENT UTILITIES

Many users like to spruce up their output with cartridge or downloadable fonts, but using them can be tricky. The font management programs listed here streamline font selection and make it easy to load soft fonts into printer memory. Typically, they provide more font management capabilities than the printer control utilities, such as allowing you to embed fonts directly in your document. Most let you work with at least two fonts; some permit use of portrait fonts in landscape mode. Before buying one of these utilities, however, make sure it supports your printer, fonts, and software.





uring the process of creating and upgrading 101 Macros for Lotus 1-2-3, I developed a few favorite macros—some because they solve nagging problems, others because they include unique programming tricks.

In this article I'll share macros for 1-2-3 release 2 that are both useful and tricky. You'll find macros that let you sum and underline a column of numbers, instantly hide any number of columns, view and make changes within a hidden column, visit a remote location and return quickly, change the width of a group of columns, and judge the width of a print range before printing.

Perhaps more important, you'll also discover new ways to use @ functions and macro commands, as well as learn some handy tricks employing a bogus subroutine name and 1-2-3's little-known ability to interrupt command sequences to accomplish interim tasks.

Even readers who aren't familiar with 1-2-3 macro programming can use these routines. Simply type in the macro code as shown in the figures. Then, with the cell pointer on the macro's name (for example, /S), use the /Range Name Labels Right command and press <Page Down> <Enter> to name the ranges. To use the macros, place your cell pointer where you want the macros to run; then press <Alt> and the appropriate letter key.

You may want to save these macros in a new worksheet file called MACROS. Then, to use the macros in other files, simply retrieve another file, move to a blank area, and select /File Com-

bine Copy Entire-File MACROS. Since range names are lost using /File Combine, rename all the ranges using Range Name Labels Right <Page Down>.

@Sum Macro: <Alt>-S

Instead of summing a column manually with @Sum, use the <Alt>-S macro starting two rows below the column you want to sum (see FIGURE 1). The macro moves the cell pointer up one cell and uses the @Repeat function to create a dashed subtotal line, which is one character less than the column width. Then the macro moves the cell pointer back down one cell and types the @Sum formula, including the range. This macro saves you 11 to 18 keystrokes with every use.

Hide Columns Macro: <Alt>-H

Hiding columns in a worksheet is useful, especially for printouts, but hiding noncontiguous columns can be tedious because you have to use the Worksheet Column Hide command repeatedly. Instead, try <Alt>-H, which allows you to select and hide any group of columns at once.

The first line of the macro starts the Worksheet Column Hide command (see FIGURE 2, top), which generates the prompt 'Columns to Hide:'. The macro interrupts that command with a {get} to collect your next keystroke at the cell named HKEY.

If the keystroke entered into HKEY is <Esc>, four <Esc> commands will back you out of the command line and the macro will quit. If the keystroke is

<Enter>, indicating that you accept the column offered at the prompt, the macro branches to the range named HSKIP.

Otherwise, the first character you hit is stored in HKEY, which the macro reads. This *self-modifying* technique is faster than setting up HKEY as a subroutine using {branch} and {return} commands. The {?} pauses for the other keys you press (such as new range of columns) until you press <Enter>, at which point the macro continues at HSKIP.

At HSKIP, the cell pointer is moved one cell to the right, just beyond the columns to be hidden; the {let} command creates a place marker in the cell called HERE. The cell pointer is then moved back one cell to the left.

and a \sim (<Enter>) completes the Worksheet Column Hide command.

Then the macro goes to the address saved in the cell named HERE (your place marker cell), and the branch command starts the macro all over again—until you press <Esc> or <Ctrl>-<Break> to stop it.

View Hidden Columns Macro: <Alt>-V

Having gone through the trouble of hiding columns, having to "unhide" and "rehide" them simply to make minor changes can be even more frustrating. Use <Alt>-V instead (see FIGURE 2, bottom).

The {menubranch} command in this macro generates a menu

with two choices: View (view all hidden columns) and Rehide (rehide all columns marked as hidden). Note that these menu items and the respective text below each item should be typed into adjacent columns. If you select View and then press <Esc> when you see the ERROR message, the hidden columns will be revealed, identified at the top of the screen by an asterisk after the column letter. The macro accomplishes this with a handy trick. The Copy command is used to show the hidden columns; then it's interrupted by an error-generating command—in this case, a subroutine call to the bogus range name CTRL _BREAK. Oddly enough, this maneuver allows you to make entries in the hidden columns.

To make the hidden columns disappear again, press <Alt>-V and select Rehide. The macro repeats the Copy command to return the asterisked columns to their hidden state.

Go-Return Macro: <Alt>-G

This navigational aid not only remembers where you were before you visited a remote location, it also remembers the remote location. You can jump back and forth instantly between the two sites simply by pressing <Alt>-G and then <Enter>.

When you press <Alt>-G, you are offered a previous cell address; you can either accept that address, point to a cell and hit <Enter>, or enter a new destination.

The magic of this macro is another interruption, this time to a {goto} command (see FIGURE 3).

The {goto} in the first line of the macro tells the cell pointer to go to the "remembered" address (GLAST), but this command is interrupted before it is completed. If you press <Enter> to accept the offered address, the address is saved in GLAST2

while the address of the current cell is stored in GLAST, where it acts as a place holder. The Go-Return macro can then return to that same cell the next time you use the macro.

If, instead of accepting the address that's offered, you type in or point to a new location, the current cell address is saved in GLAST before the {goto} command is completed.

After the {goto} sequence executes, the macro conveniently adjusts the destination cell toward the center of the screen. This is accomplished with the {up 3}{left 2} commands just before the final {goto}{GLAST2} instruction.


Note that you'll get a beep if the cell is in column A or B, or in row 1, 2, or 3.

Width of Columns Changed Macro: <Alt>-W

To quickly change the width of a group of columns, try <Alt>-W (see FIGURE 4). Simply respond to the prompt 'Enter the revised column width' and then, at the prompt 'Which columns?', highlight the columns you want changed and press <Enter>.

The trick here is using Range Name Create to create a kind of

prompt. Creating a range named 'Which columns?' lets the macro simultaneously identify the purpose of the range and prompt you for a range to enter. Note that the range is created, deleted, then re-created in case the range named 'Which columns?' remains from a previous use of this macro that was interrupted with <Ctrl>-<Break>.

The column widths are changed with a {for} loop that repeats the Worksheet Column Set-Width command for each column you highlighted.

Judge Width of Print Range Macro: <Alt>-J

<Alt>-J is an efficient way to determine whether the data you want to print will fit on the paper (see FIGURE 5). This macro initially displays the last print range selected. You can press <Enter> to accept that range or press <Backspace>, select a different range, and then press <Enter>. The width of the range, in characters, will display at the top of the screen.

One important note: When you create this macro, type the range names on the left side and use the Range Name Labels Right <Page Down> command before typing the rest of the macro. Otherwise you won't be able to type the macro line that is adjacent to the name J_MENU; the macro line is a formula that references the range name JWIDTH.

This macro begins by creating a place marker for the current cell in the cell named JHERE. Then it issues the Print Printer Range command and pauses until you either accept the range offered or enter a new range. This command sequence is inter-

rupted while the windows and panels are turned off and the macro highlights the range again, saves the address of the lower right cell in JADDR, then adds two periods and the upper left cell's address to the address in JADDR. Then the macro exits the Print command line and establishes a new range called JRANGE, using the range saved in JADDR.

At this point it's relatively easy for the macro to go through a {for} loop that adds up the widths of all the columns in JRANGE with subsequent passes of a {let} command, which saves them in JWIDTH. That done, the macro recalculates the underlying string formula in the cell named J_MENU.

The macro then goes to a cell that is guaranteed to be blank since it is one cell below the {end}{home} location (this ensures that no distracting entries appear in the edit line) and calls up the menu J_MENU. This illustrates another handy trick: The {menubranch} command generates a highlighted, single-

choice menu to provide what looks like a two-line prompt. The macro then returns the cursor to the cell you started the macro from (which is saved in JHERE).

The <Alt>-J macro not only displays the width of the new range in characters, it takes advantage of the Print Printer Range command's capability to "remember" the range when you select that command again.

Getting the Most Out of 1-2-3

If you've written and used macros before, these routines should make valuable additions to your macro library. If, on the other hand, you're just beginning to explore the world of macros, these tips and tricks may help you realize more of 1-2-3's potential. ●

Integrated Applications

Integrating Microsoft Works

With Microsoft Works, data-moving macros pave a fast track to integrated power. A few well-chosen keystrokes now can save hours of tedium later.

What you need: Microsoft Works

icrosoft Works' individual modules are capable enough, but using macros to transfer data between them really unlocks the package's power. This article will show how to write Works macros that quickly move information between the data base, spreadsheet, and word processor. It also explains how to create a macro that greatly speeds chart making.

How to Record and Save Works Macros

If you haven't used Works macros, this quick exercise will get you started. First install the separate macro program MSKEY.COM and load it; then run Works. Invoke MSKEY by

pressing <Alt>-/. To begin recording a macro that is triggered by <Ctrl>-N, for example, press MR (Macro Record), then <Ctrl>-N. Type your first and last names. End recording by pressing <Alt>-/, and then ME (Macro End). Now, whenever you press <Ctrl>-N, you should see your name spelled out.

To save your macros, you must write them to a disk file. Press < Alt>-/FS to invoke MSKEY's File Save command. Then type a name for the file in which you'll store your macros. If you later want to list the macros for reference, press < Alt>-/FL (File List).

Create a Cut-and-Paste Macro

If you frequently cut and paste data between modules, a simple macro can automate the transfer. In this example, we'll move worksheet figures into a word processing file.

In any worksheet, press <F8 > to extend the cursor, and mark the cells you want to copy. Press <Alt>-/MR to begin recording the macro. Call it <Ctrl>-C (for Copy).

Press < Shift > - < F3 > , the spreadsheet's Copy command. Press < Alt > -W to pull down the Window menu. Press < Alt > -/MF (the fixed length command) to instruct the macro to record the number of characters you will enter next. (When the macro executes, it will pause for input after it pulls down the Window menu.) Type the number that corresponds to the word processing window where you want to put the worksheet data, then press < Alt > -/MF to mark the end of the field. Whatever number of characters you type, the macro will expect all future answers to the Window prompt to be of the same length. Press < Alt > -/ME to end recording the macro.

To use the macro, mark the cells you want to copy, press < Alt>-/ to invoke MSKEYS, then press < Ctrl>-C. This leaves you in the destination file but still in Copy mode; to complete the operation, put the cursor where you want to paste the data and press < Enter>.

Moving Data From the Data Base to the Spreadsheet

In this example, we'll use a macro to quickly extract some employee travel expense data from a data base and move it into the spreadsheet. The macro uses the data base's Report option to summarize each individual's monthly expenses; then the macro writes the data to disk, and brings it into the spreadsheet module.

Before you start, create a dummy TEMP file in the data base. Then open a new data base file and set up columns for Name, Month, and Cost. Enter a dozen lines of sample data with January, February, and March expense figures for four employees. Create the report shown in SCREEN 1, then select it from the Reports menu.

Press < Alt>-/ and MR to begin macro recording, and name the macro < Ctrl>-R (for Report). Press < Alt>-RA to pull down the Reports menu.

Now press < Alt > -/MV (MS-Key's Vfld, or Variable Length Field, command) to instruct the macro to record all keystrokes until you press the <Enter> key. Unlike the previous macro, this one's prompt will expect future responses to vary in length.

Now enter **TEMP** as the report's temporary file name. You'll be asked if you want to overwrite the existing Temp file; answer yes. (This way, when you run the actual macro later, it will automatically overwrite older Temp files.) Press <Alt>-/MV to mark the end of the variable field. Press <Enter> to complete the file name entry. Press <Alt>-FO (File Open); type Temp as the name of the file to open, and press <Enter> to open the file as a spreadsheet. Press <Alt>-/ME to end macro recording.


Grabbing Data Series for Charts

Charting data in *Microsoft*Works is straightforward, but
highlighting data series can be
tedious. With this macro, you
can grab data for each series
with a single keystroke. The
macro is especially powerful because it pauses each time you select a new data range.


The macro is designed to use the Temp report data in the spreadsheet (see SCREEN 2). With a different data layout, the macro keystrokes will vary slightly.

Open the Temp worksheet and enter Chart mode by pressing < Alt > -CD. Position the cursor at the top of the sequence of data you want to enter as successive series in the chart. Press < Alt > -/MR to begin recording, naming the macro < Ctrl > -G (for Grab). Press < F8 > < Cursor Down > < Cursor Down > to extend the cursor and select the three cells of the first series (Johnson's January through May expenses, in the example), then press <Esc > to end the Extend mode. Press < Alt > -D to enter the Data menu

Now press < Alt>-/MF to instruct the macro to record the number of characters you will enter next. Press 1 to indicate

that this is the first series. Then press < Alt > -/MF again to mark the end of the field. Press

<Cursor Down > four times to
move to the first cell of the next
series. Press < Alt > -/ME to end
recording.

To test the macro, press <Ctrl>-G several times. Each time the macro executes, it should open the Data menu and prompt you for the series number (1 through 6); when you type the number in, the macro should jump to the next series, ready for the next number.

Hard Disks

How to Recover From Hard Disk Disaster

An expert offers cures for everything from deleted files to unbootable drives

What you need: a floppy with the same DOS version as your hard disk, a hard disk utility package

f we always did what was good for us, we'd use the preventive maintenance programs in *The Norton Utilities, PC Tools*, or *Mace Gold*. We'd do daily backups, run CHKDSK, optimize the disk regularly, park the heads, keep the computer environment clean, and run low-level formats (see "How To Prevent Hard Disk Disaster," *PCW*, February 1989). But since we don't always do what's good for us, this article is designed to help you get out of tight spots.

As in all troubleshooting, it's best to work from the simple to the complex. If there's an easy way out, such as restoring your backup, take that route and skip the heroics. And if a major hardware disaster strikes, get professional help. Certain services can recover data even from charred computers whose heads have crashed (see the sidebar "Friends in Need").

Erased Files or Subdirectories

If you inadvertently erase a file or delete a whole directory, don't fret-but don't write any new information to disk, either. If your disk isn't too fragmented. you can retrieve your files with an unerase utility provided by Norton, Mace, or PC Tools (see The Software Shelf in this issue). This is possible because neither DEL nor ERASE really erases data; they just remove information from the File Allocation Table (FAT) that tells DOS where the pieces of the file are (see "Understanding CHKDSK" in this month's Help Screen). All but the first letter of the file name remains intact, so you should be able to recognize it.

If you have to recover a lot of files, take advantage of the utility's offer to print a list of the deleted files it can recover. Recover the smallest files first; reassembling the pieces of a large file could overwrite the smaller files before you get to them.

Optimizing a disk regularly makes complete file recovery more likely because it places each file in contiguous sectors. Tracking down severely fragmented files may require a sector editor; both *Norton* and *Mace* offer one. Want to practice? Run the tutorial in *Norton Utilities* Advanced 4.5 (see The Software Shelf, PCW, April 1989).

Accidentally Formatting Drive C:

Just as DEL doesn't really erase your data, only the information on where to find it, DOS's FOR-MAT command constructs a gridwork but doesn't write information within it. Instead, it writes zeros over the FAT and root directory, leaving the data area untouched—including sub-

directory information such as file names, the starting cluster for each file, and file size. With the subdirectory information, *Norton* and *Mace* can rebuild your FAT using their disk scanning, unerase, and root directory recovery utilities.

Cross-Linked Files

Ever find you can't open a file, even though it's listed in the directory? Try running CHKDSK/F. More often than not, the file has become cross-linked with another, which means two files are listed as having information in the same cluster. Since each cluster must be assigned to a unique file, one of the file's cluster locations is wrong and must be corrected.

Write down the names of the cross-linked files. Copy the files to a floppy disk, and load or run each of the copies to find out

which one is corrupt. If the bad file is a .COM or .EXE file, replace it with a trustworthy backup; never use a potentially corrupted application. If it's a data file, delete it to remove the crosslink, then use your disk utility's unerase feature to rebuild its FAT entry and recover the original file.

Directory Sectors Go Bad

Sometimes your directory listing looks scrambled, or files you *know* are there aren't listed. Or when you try to access your files, DOS whines 'File allocation table bad' or 'General failure reading drive C:'. The best solution is to run *Norton* or *Mace*, which offer

easy-to-use utilities for restoring your directory sectors. If these programs are still on your shopping list (and not on your disk, where they belong), here's how to run DOS's RECOVER command to laboriously retrieve at least some of your files.

RECOVER can't restore file names or extensions, file size, original date and time stamps, or file attributes. But it can salvage file data and keep you from writing to bad spots on the disk.

Using BACKUP, COPY, XCOPY, or some other copy/ backup utility, salvage what you can by copying onto floppy disks all the files you can still access on your hard disk. Print out a directory for each floppy as a checklist to work from. Now take a deep breath, and type DEL *.*. Boot from a floppy and enter A:RECOVER C:. RECOVER creates a separate file in the ROOT directory for each chain it finds. It names the first chain FILE0000.REC, the second chain FILE0001.REC, and so on until it reaches the root directory's capacity limit (which varies for different disks).


Once it hits that limit, RE-COVER gives you a 'WARNING—directory full' message. Copy all the recovered files onto floppies, and then erase those files from the hard disk. Run RE-COVER again until it runs out of files to create. Be sure to copy each batch of recovered files and number the floppies in case you overwrite different chains that have the same file name.

Now that you have all these FILEnnnn.REC files, what do you do with them? If you don't have Norton, you have to TYPE or open each one in an application to identify and then rename it—a laborious task. (Remember to delete trashed program files and simply restore the original application in its entirety.) Norton and Mace restore file names and attributes; DOS's RECOVER is a last resort.

The Disk Won't Boot

If you get any kind of 17nn error during your computer's power-up sequence, your disk controller is probably in trouble, and you should have your computer professionally serviced. But if DOS tells you 'Disk boot failure', 'Non-system disk or disk error', 'Bad or missing command interpreter', or 'Error loading operating system', try booting from a floppy.

Transfer the two invisible system files to the hard disk with

SYS C: and restore COM-MAND.COM using COPY. Then try rebooting. If this doesn't work, it might be because the system doesn't recognize DOS as bootable. Run the *Mace* or *Norton* nondestructive equivalent of DOS's FDISK to set the status of your DOS partition to bootable. If you still can't boot, try running *Mace*'s or *Norton*'s unformat utility to try to rebuild your FAT and root directory.

If you give your hard disk regular attention, you may never encounter the problems listed here. Otherwise, consider yourself lucky if you never have to use that backup you make every night before going home (right?). Buy a hard disk utility package —and get acquainted with it before disaster strikes. —Nancy Canning

COMPare DOS File Copies

When you use the DOS COPY command to copy a file from one disk to another, DOS flashes the message '1 file(s) copied'. But that doesn't necessarily mean that the new file matches the original. Using the VERIFY ON command in your AUTOEXEC-.BAT file or adding the \V switch to a COPY command checks the version COPY stores in RAM against the new copy on disk. Even then, however, there's

still a chance the copy isn't accurate.

To make sure a copy's exact, use the COMP command (or FC in MS-DOS) to compare the original against the copy. If COMP is in a directory listed in your PATH command, you can simply type COMP and then press <F3><Enter> right after COPYing to make the comparison.

Quick dBASE Duplicates

When working in dBASE III Plus, it's often necessary to create a record that duplicates several fields in an existing record. To avoid excess work, you usually copy the record and edit the duplicate as desired. Otherwise, you're stuck using dBASE's unwieldy duplication command, SET CARRY ON.

Here's a simple program, DUPREC.PRG, that uses a single function key to duplicate records:

SET TALK OFF
ERASE Temp.dbf
COPY next 1 to temp
APPEND from temp
? "RECORD DUPLICATED"
SET TALK ON
Include the following line in
your CONFIG.DB file:

F2="Do C:\db\Duprec;"
Now, all you need to do to duplicate the current record is press <F2>. The message 'RECORD DUPLICATED' will flash on screen to confirm that

Making Moves With DOS

Some disk management utilities move files easily from one subdirectory to another, but DOS lacks a single command for this function. You can use a short batch file that teams the COPY, DEL, and COMP commands to move and verify your files. At the DOS prompt, enter the following lines:

COPY CON move.bat
COPY %1 %2
COMP %1 %2
PAUSE: If files DO NOT compare ok,
press <Ctrl>-<C> & terminate
batch job
DEL %1


Now, press < Ctrl>-Z (or <F6>) and then < Enter> to save MOVE.BAT. Move MOVE.BAT to any subdirectory listed in your system's PATH command.

MOVE.BAT in effect creates a MOVE command for DOS. To use it, type MOVE followed by the source file name and its destination (with or without a new file name).

MOVE.BAT pauses before deleting the original file, flashes a message telling you how well the original file and copy compare, and asks if you want to compare another file. Press <N>, and if the copy was successful, press any key to continue. If the status message shows any discrepancy between the files, press <Ctrl>-C to terminate the batch file and try again.

Advice and information for the computer consumer

What do you do when a company refuses to resolve your complaint? Here's a report on arbitration and its increasing popularity for resolving business computer disputes.

Falling Between the Cracks

It's an ironic situation. An unresolved business dispute can be too costly to write off as a loss, yet not worth the expense of a full-scale court battle. Disputes ranging from \$10,000 to \$100,000 often fall into this category—and represent a serious setback for cost-conscious companies.

Fortunately, businesses can initiate another method of dispute resolution; arbitration. Two

prominent nonprofit organizations—the American Arbitration Association (AAA) and the Better Business Bureau (BBB)—offer arbitration services as an alternative to going to court. The AAA tends to take big-ticket commercial cases, while most Better Business Bureau branch offices are oriented toward smaller consumer disputes.

With the courts booked years in advance and attorney fees skyrocketing, arbitration is becoming increasingly popular, especially in the computer industry, according to AAA president Robert Coulson. "Arbitration is private, so dirty laundry doesn't have to get washed in public," says Coulson. "Also, it's cost effective and final."

The AAA and the BBB follow similar arbitration procedures: At the request of one of the parties involved in a dispute, the organization issues a list of possible arbitrators—impartial professionals who have agreed to participate in a case. Each party to the dispute can then request specific arbitrators. The AAA pays arbitrators a per diem fee, unlike the BBB, which relies on trained community volunteers.

Depending on a case's size and complexity, from one to three arbitrators are selected. Then the parties present their arguments at a scheduled hearing. (In business-to-business cases, lawyers may be present.)

Once both parties have been heard, the arbitrator considers the evidence and issues a decision, usually within a specified time. The AAA charges the participants a fee depending on the amount in question, for example, 2 percent for cases under \$25,000. The BBB's consumer services, meanwhile, are free. With both organizations, arbitration is legally binding, and typically there is no appeals process.

Although details of the arbitration proceedings themselves are usually confidential, a recently publicized multimilliondollar case between IBM and Fujitsu offered some insight into arbitration's benefits. Back in 1982, IBM alleged that Fujitsu's operating system software violated IBM's copyrights. After early attempts at negotiation failed, two AAA arbitrators decided in 1988 that Fuiitsu owed IBM more than \$833 million in licensing and access fees, of which \$237 million was outstanding.

Here the benefits of arbitration seem obvious. Unlike a typical jury, the expert arbitrators—a Stanford law professor and a computer systems professional—were able to understand and settle complex computer issues, which included developing a working definition of software compatibility.

The confidentiality of the hearing itself, impossible in a public court of law, allowed IBM and Fujitsu to maintain the secrecy of their operations and their programming code. Final-(continues)

A Quick Fix for Business Computer Complaints

In January, the Better Business Bureau of Eastern Philadelphia initiated a special program called Computercare. According to Frank Dressler, president and CEO of the Eastern Philadelphia BBB, the program is aimed at resolving business-to-business disputes in the \$20,000-to-\$100,000 range in which computer systems don't perform as expected.

Computercare is a joint venture of the BBB and Weinberg Associates, a computer consulting company. Chairman Sandy Weinberg describes his company's services as a combination of diagnostics and mediation.

Here's how it works. The injured party lodges a complaint with the BBB along with a \$200 filing fee. Then a representative of Weinberg Associates meets with the complainant to assess the problem, identify which parties should be involved in mediation, and estimate fees. Fact finding and mediation cost \$1000 per day plus expenses.

Once all the parties agree to the process, a fact-finding team determines what the technical problems are and who is at fault. The mediator then attempts to negotiate a settlement; if that doesn't work, the problem goes to binding arbitration.

Weinberg estimates typical fees at \$2000 to \$5000 for cases between \$50,000 and \$100,000. "The alternative is legal action, which is time-consuming and costly," says Weinberg. "Juries often don't understand computer problems and don't have the ex-

pertise to solve them. Also, we can provide what both sides of the dispute really want—a functioning solution."

ries of excellent magazine reviews and a very favorable response at COMDEX, Micro 1 experienced an unprecedented volume of business. We developed a slight back order, and several orders were delayed. We also experienced delays with our 12-MHz machines because the last batch of 12-MHz mother-boards we received were not compatible with our standard 1:1 interleave controller. We were therefore on hold until the vendor could rectify the problem."

Check With the Factory First

An authorized Epson dealer recently sold me an Equity 286 computer installed with a 40MB hard drive, and an 8-bit hard drive controller instead of a 16-bit controller.

I discovered this by accident a few weeks after I bought the computer. When I confronted the store manager, he admitted the unsuitability of the 8-bit controller but declared he was required to use it to stay competitive. He suggested that a 16-bit controller could be installed for an additional \$124. When I asked for a refund, he insisted on a 15 percent restocking fee, which would amount to about \$240.

My next avenue was to appeal to the manufacturer. Epson agreed that the installation was incorrect and said that their factory-installed units use a 16bit controller. They were solicitous, but that was all.

Editor's note: Consumer Watch forwarded Mr. Brash's complaint to Epson. In a phone interview, an Epson spokesperson said the dealer had been asked to replace the controller for free. The spokesperson also confirmed that Epson's factoryinstalled units ship with a 16-bit controller but emphasized that the dealer had not violated any Epson policies by installing an 8-bit unit.

Mr. Brash's example illustrates that it's a good idea to cross-check the specifications of a factory-installed PC before purchasing a unit locally.

Slow Support at Video Seven

The October 1988 issue of PC World ran a news brief on the V-RAM VGA graphics board by Video Seven. After buying the board, I wasn't able to install it. I wrote to Video Seven, and after waiting one month for an answer, I attempted without success to contact them using their 800 number. The only time Video Seven returned a call was after I left a message stating that I wanted my money refunded. Unfortunately, I wasn't the one who answered their call, and I wasn't able to reach them when I called back.

Next I sent a certified letter to Video Seven, but I still didn't receive a response. Video Seven claims a five-year warranty; at this rate it will be five years before I get an answer.







Why you shouldn't format 720K disks to 1.44MB, associating with the DOS 4.0 shell, understanding CHKDSK, and how to upgrade 8086-based PCs.

Twice the Storage, Half the Confidence

Q. I have found I can use a

1.44MB drive to format a 720K

(double-density) 3½-inch floppy
disk to 1.44MB. Although sometimes FORMAT takes a few tries
to complete the process, I have
not had any problem reading
data stored on such disks, and
double-density disks are substantially less expensive than
the high-density variety. Am I
running any risk by doing this?
Charles Douglas Knechtel
Seattle, Washington

A. Yes. Both 3½- and 5¼-inch double-density disks have a different magnetic coating than their high-density cousins. The high-density coating is designed to accommodate the weaker magnetic field that high-density drives use when writing the denser format (see "The Medium Is the Mess," *The Help Screen*, *PCW*, December 1988).

Because double-density disks are not made to hold this weaker signal, they usually contain a large number of bad sectors. (The repeated attempts to format those sectors, which won't hold data, is why the process sometimes takes so long.) Although the drive won't use those bad sectors, it will use sectors that are only marginally better. Those marginal sectors will go bad a lot sooner than they would if they held a stronger signal. And there's the risk-when such a sector goes bad, you may not be able to recover the rest of the file to which it belongs. Except as an intermediary for transferring files, a high-density format on double-density media is a false economy.

Associate With DOS 4.0

Q. "DOS Lives!" [PCW, October 1988] described a feature of the DOS 4.0 File System that I can't use: the ability to associate files. According to the article, if a data file is associated with a particular program, you can simply highlight the data file's

name and press <Enter> to automatically exit the DOS shell, run the associated application, and open the specified data file. It sounds great, but I can't do it.

After pressing <Tab> to move the selection cursor from the File System's Directory Tree into the Filename Area, I can use the cursor keys to highlight the name of a program (the first step in associating). But when I go to the Action Bar and open the File pulldown menu, the Associate item is unavailable—the A in Associate is replaced by an asterisk, and trying to execute the command just produces a beep. I'm working with an IBM XT 286 with a monochrome graphics (Hercules-compatible) monitor.

A. Because DOS 4.0 does not directly support Hercules graphics, its Select program installed the DOS shell program in text mode. (Adding the parameter /TEXT to the @SHELLC command of DOSSHELL.BAT will force a graphics-based system into text mode.) Although similar in layout, the DOS shell's text-mode interface and its graphics-mode counterpart differ in a number of ways. For example, in graphics mode an icon appears to the left of each file name. When moving through the list of file names with the cursor (continues)

keys, the user of the graphicsmode interface sees that the icons are not highlighted, suggesting that there's one more step to selecting a file name. In text mode, however, no icon is visible.

In either mode, mouse users simply click on the file name instead of using the cursor keys. In graphics mode, the icon is then highlighted; in text mode, a triangle called the selection symbol appears in the empty space to the left of the highlighted file entry. Click on the file name again, and the icon or selection symbol toggles off.

To select a file name without a mouse, simply cursor to the file name and press the <Space> bar. When the selection symbol or highlighted icon is present, you can select the Associate item from the File menu. In fact, you can select several file names and choose an action for them all: Just cursor to the first file name, press the <Space> bar to tag it, move on to your next choice, press the <Space> bar to tag it, and so on.

Note, however, that Associate is meant only for programs that can accept a data file name as a command-line parameter. For example, most word processors can load a document automatically when you start the program; to load a document called SALES-RPT into *WordPerfect*, you would simply enter WP SALES-RPT at the DOS prompt. "DOS Lives" should have said that .SET files (not worksheets) can be associated with 1-2-3.

Understanding CHKDSK

Q. I regularly use the CHKDSK command to check my hard disk, but I'm not sure what to do

when it turns up a problem. On rare occasions I have received the message 'x lost clusters found in y chains.' If I then run CHKDSK/F, I'm left with y FILExxxx.CHK files in the root directory. These files usually contain little that I recognize, and I have no idea how to make them usable. As a result, I generally just erase them, which would seem to defeat the purpose of creating them.

How can I make better use of CHKDSK?

Alan R. Schwartz Brattleboro, Vermont

A. First let's review the basics of DOS's disk structure. FOR-MAT divides the disk into allocation units called clusters and builds the file allocation table (FAT). The FAT contains a code for each cluster indicating whether that cluster is available, in use, or bad (not to be used because it can't reliably record data). FORMAT also reserves disk space for the root directory.

When you save or copy a file onto the disk, DOS scans the FAT until it finds the code indicating an available cluster. Then the file (or as much as will fit) is written into that cluster, and that cluster's FAT entry is changed to indicate that the cluster is in use. The process is repeated if the file is larger than a single cluster. If, for example, a file begins in the third cluster, then the third entry in the FAT will contain a code indicating either the third cluster is the file's last, or the number of the cluster holding the next part of the file.

Finally, DOS places an entry in the directory. That entry contains the file's name and extension, the date and time the file was saved, its size, and so on. It also includes the number of the file's first, or starting, cluster. In this manner, the FAT tracks cluster use and "chains" together a file's clusters.

As you've found out, sometimes a chain of clusters can get lost. Because no directory entry points to the start of the chain, DOS can't access the chain or make the clusters available for new data. This often happens when the user turns off the PC or reboots without first exiting an application properly, which prevents it from closing a data file and updating the directory.

When you issue CHKDSK /F' to recover lost clusters and respond with a Y to the prompt that asks if they should be converted to files, CHKDSK creates directory entries (FILExxxx .CHK) in the root directory that point to the beginning of each lost chain. If you instead answer with an N, it won't create .CHK files, but sets the lost clusters' FAT entries to zero, which frees the clusters for use. In other words, answering N has the same effect as creating and then erasing the .CHK files. A .CHK file containing part of a program, graphic image, or spreadsheet file is generally unrecognizable and unusable, but sometimes you'll find lost data base records or portions of that epic you've been writing.

CHKDSK will also uncover cross-linked files. Two files are cross-linked when the FAT says they have a cluster in common, which is never correct. It could be that one file's FAT entry should indicate the end of that file but instead points erroneously to a cluster used by the other file. Or perhaps the FAT (continues)

entry that links one file to the other is wrong and should instead point to a different cluster, which is now orphaned (because its FAT entry marks it as used but no FAT or directory entry points to it).

If CHKDSK uncovers files with cross-linked clusters, use the COPY command to make duplicate files with new names and then erase the cross-linked files. Check each of the new files and fix what you can. Remember to check any FILExxxx. CHK files; they may hold portions missing from the cross-linked files.

CHKSDK will also inform you about other directory- and FAT-related disk problems. If you use the /F parameter, CHKDSK usually takes appropriate action; on rare occasions, you'll be required to make the fix. Hopefully, you'll never have a problem like CHKDSK being unable to read or write the FAT (or its duplicate). Such a problem stops CHKDSK cold and is the province of disk recovery utilities (see "Recovering From Hard Disk Disaster" in this issue).

Besides discovering the amount of free RAM and disk space, CHKDSK can also check whether a file is contiguous; just follow CHKDSK with the name of the file (the wild-card characters * and ? may be used). A noncontiguous, or fragmented, file can degrade system performance because moving the drive head back and forth across the disk to read the scattered parts of a fragmented file takes longer than reading a contiguous file of the same size. With floppy disks, all you do to make files contiguous is copy them onto another disk. The only painless way to

make your hard disk files contiguous is to use a disk optimizer program.

Another use of CHKDSK is to list the names of all the files on a hard disk, with each file name preceded by its directory. Although the DOS command TREE /F generates a similar listing, CHKDSK /V omits empty directories, prefixes every file name with its path, and generates a more compact listing. To list only those files and directories that contain a particular string of characters, you can pipe CHKDSK /V's output to the DOS FIND filter (for example, CHKDSK /V : FIND ".BAK"). However, this method takes longer than using a utility dedicated to the task (see "A Turbo Pascal File Finder," PCW, April 1989).

Feeling 86'ed

Q. Your "Buyers' Guide: EMS 4.0 Memory Boards" [PCW, January 1989], like so many other articles, covers converting and upgrading 8088-based systems. I have two 8086-based Compaq Deskpros, each equipped with 640K of memory, two 360K floppy drives, and a 20MB hard disk.

Both systems are in excellent shape, though they are not worth much in today's used market when compared with what I paid just three years ago. They'll never equal the performance of my newer AST 386, but if they could be upgraded cheaply, I think they could still be quite useful. Is there anything special involved in upgrading 8086-based systems as opposed to 8088-based PCs?

New UL 1449 Guide to Surge Protection Provides First Objective Standards

UL 1449: The New Watchdog

Until recently, there was no standard to go by in selecting a surge protector. Consumers had to make choices based on little-understood technical specifications that had nothing to do with the performance of a surge protector.

Booting Around the Clock

"If You've Got the Time" [The Help Screen, PCW, December 1988] suggests removing the DATE and TIME commands from AUTOEXEC. BAT on systems with an on-board clock. While this eliminates the need to press <Enter> at boot time, it doesn't let you verify whether your clock is working, which it might not be if the battery runs

down! When this happened to me, I noticed the problem only later, after inspecting new file dates in a directory listing. Then I found a hands-off way to use the DATE and TIME commands.

First, create a file containing a single blank line and name it ENTER: At the DOS prompt, type COPY CON ENTER<Enter> <Enter><Ctrl>-Z<Enter>. Store the file in your boot disk's root directory, and change the DATE and TIME commands in AUTO-EXEC.BAT to:

ECHO OFF DATE < ENTER ECHO ECTAECKECTA TIME < ENTER ECHO EC[1AEC[KEC[1A

The symbol E^C in the ECHO commands represents the Escape character (ASCII 27). With some word processors-Microsoft Word, for example—the Escape character can be entered by holding down the <Alt> key while typing 27 on the numeric keypad. [Most word processors do not allow you to enter the Escape character directly from the keyboard; see the editor's note that follows.] The <ENTER after DATE and after TIME automatically passes the contents of the ENTER file, which consists of nothing more than a carriage return, to those commands. The ECHO lines issue ANSI.SYS commands that erase the messages beginning 'Enter new...'. Together, the batch commands cleanly display the date and

time-and you never have to touch a key.

Editor's note: WordPerfect users can press <Ctrl>-V and then <Esc> to enter an Escape; WordStar users type <Ctrl>-P followed by the left square bracket ([). If your word processor or editor doesn't provide a way to enter an Escape, you can use EDLIN from your DOS disk. In EDLIN, the Escape character is entered by pressing <Ctrl>-V followed by the left square bracket.

Note that the A's and K's in the ECHO commands must be uppercase and that the ANSI-.SYS driver must be loaded at start-up.

If you boot from a floppy, it should contain the ANSI.SYS file from your DOS disk and a CONFIG.SYS file that includes the line DEVICE = ANSI.SYS. If you boot from a hard disk, ANSI.SYS can be in any directory as long as the CONFIG.SYS file's DEVICE command includes the appropriate path. For example, with ANSI.SYS in the \DOS directory, you would use $DEVICE = \DOS \ANSI.SYS.$

Cursors—Foiled Again

On my system, switching between Microsoft QuickC and the stand-alone M editor leaves the cursor hanging in midair. (continues)

RCURSOR.C [see LISTING 1] restores the cursor to its normal shape—a blinking underline—with a call to a BIOS video routine. After compiling, store RCURSOR.EXE in a directory listed in your system's PATH and enter RCURSOR to stabilize the cursor before switching editors.

original cursor and fails to restore it—an oversight that RCURSOR handily fixes. Before compiling the program, run CSTYLE.C (LISTING 2) to find the correct settings for your default cursor, and replace the 11 and 12 in RCURSOR with the values that CSTYLE.C lists for ch and cl.

Pascal Redirections

After reading Richard Baxter's "What You See Is What You Print" [Star-Dot-Star, PCW, November 1988], I wanted to share a similar Turbo Pascal routine of mine. REDIRECT.PAS [see LIST-ING 3] redirects output to a file or to the printer, just like the BA-


where filename is the name of the file or device—MYFILE.TXT or LPT1, for example. Call procedure RestoreCRT to route output back to the display.

Diagnosing a Virus

With the recent surge in computer viruses, I decided to add some lines to my AUTOEXEC.BAT file to alert me to potential infections [see LISTING 4]. Some viruses attach themselves to COM-MAND.COM, thus spreading to freshly formatted system disks, and these commands help you spot a change in file size-one of the first symptoms of a virus attack. Two cautions: Make sure you're using a virus-free COM-MAND.COM copied from a DOS master disk, and remember to change the file size in the batch commands after upgrading to a new DOS version.

Editor's note: From DOS, type DIR \COMMAND.COM and replace the 25307 in LISTING 4's ECHO command with the correct file size for your system. If the DIR in the batch commands returns the wrong file size, press <Ctrl>-C at the PAUSE. Then, reboot with a write-protected copy of a DOS master disk and, assuming the infected drive is C:, enter the commands SYS C: and COPY COMMAND.COM C:. If this doesn't get rid of the virus, you may have to reformat your disk and restore files from backups.

Pipe Dreams

Contributor James Reynante shows how to run multiple DOS commands from within *Microsoft Word* ("DOS Sojourns," *Star-Dot-Star*, *PCW*, August 1988). Often, you can also string DOS commands together using a pipe (†). For example, to change directories and run a program, issue <Esc> Library Run and enter CD\DIRECTORY | PROGRAM.

Editor's note: You can use this tip in Microsoft Word, from DOS, or at the 'Run DOS Command' prompt (in programs that have one). Just separate multiple commands with a vertical bar. For instance, to delete all .BAK files and list a directory to the printer, you can type DEL *.BAK + DIR > PRN. The

original suggestion of starting a new copy of COMMAND.COM is still a good one, however, as that method lets you stay in DOS until you issue the EXIT command.

Command Line Calculator

Dave Bushong's tip ["BASIC Pipe Lines," Star-Dot-Star, PCW, December 1988] about using a DOS pipe to BASIC or GW BASIC for simple calculations is a delight. To make the process even easier, I created a single-line batch file named CALC.BAT [see USTING 5]. Enter commands such as CALC 22/7, and the batch file clears the screen and neatly prints the answer.



CD ROM to the Rescue

Every month I sweep off the desk and start pulling this column together. Before long I'm practically buried alive in avalanche-prone drifts of user manuals, notebooks, references, and printouts. A few months ago, while surfacing for air, my eye caught a rainbow-colored flash from a silver disk on a shelf far across the tundra. Oh yes, that's the new Microsoft Programmer's Library (MSL) CD ROM, I thought, before I burrowed back down into a heap of paper.

Now I simply press <Alt>-<Left Shift>, and up pops a menu (optionally mousedriven) ready to let me explore over 20,000 pages of indexed and cross-referenced technical information on Microsoft C, OS/2, Windows, MASM, MS-DOS, BA-SIC, Pascal, and FORTRAN, plus mouse and CD ROM interfaces. Among the 48 on-line tomes are the entire MS-DOS Encyclopedia, Ray Duncan's Advanced MS-DOS, Augie Hansen's Proficient C, and Richard Wilton's Programmer's Guide to PC and PS/2 Video Systems.

Let's put this into perspective. One CD ROM can hold 660MB of data—equivalent to about 300,000 double-spaced pages. If you were to start on (continues)



MSL supports most popular editors, including Brief, Epsilon, the Microsoft Editor, Turbo C, Turbo Pascal, VEdit, Microsoft Word, WordPerfect, and WordStar.

With so much information on line, I almost hate to leave the office. So I installed the remote-access pcAnywhere III on my PC there, which is connected by a serial cable to a Macintosh Plus running PC MacTerm in the living room. With this software combo, I can now access MSL at any time—even on the Mac. Although windows pop up a bit slowly at 9600 bps, response

time is quite acceptable. Best of all, having 200,000 pages on line sure beats a mountain of books and paper toppling onto the floor.



NETWORK Q&A

Tips and strategies for departmental networking

Customizing a LAN operating system requires planning, training, and sweating the small stuff.

David Ferris

Q. Our marketing department will be setting up its first LAN in a few months, and (lucky me!) I've been chosen as administrator. It will be a single-server Ethernet LAN running Novell's NetWare, linking 14 PCs and two LaserJets. We'll be running several multiuser applications, including a data manager, and we plan to set up an E-mail system.

We have an installer coming in to lay the cables, and our dealer is formatting the server and installing the adapter cards, but beyond that I'm in charge.

Should I install the LAN operating system or should I hire

an expert? How do I get up and running quickly without putting a drag on productivity? George Camey Kansas City, Missouri

A. If you can afford it, hire a NetWare expert to install your LAN operating system (LAN OS). The process is time-consuming and requires technical expertise. Yet, even if an outsider installs your LAN OS, the real work begins with you, the LAN administrator. You'll need to customize the multiuser environment for the particular needs of your department.

The key elements of launching a successful LAN are design, documentation, and testing. Many administrators give short shrift to LAN design, overlooking such critical issues as server directory structure and security access control. This neglect costs dearly later, when the structure must be redesigned.

One of the biggest productivity drains is the time users spend adapting to a multiuser environment. Developing intuitive menu-driven front ends and writing lucid documentation can save everyone a lot of time and trouble. You should also test every application rigorously to make sure it works with servers, adapter cards, printers, and other components.

So where do you begin? Here are ten basic steps toward a happy LAN:

Step 1: Go to school. As a LAN administrator, you should

take three to five days of LAN OS instruction. Look for classes that cover server directory design, memory management, login scripts, multiuser applications, backup, archiving, and recovery.




FIGURE 1: Before you begin creating subdirectories, sketch out your server's hierarchy on paper. Here's a broad outline for a typical NetWare server; the final version will be more elaborate, detailing access rights and showing additional subdirectories. The Share directory (where users can place files for public inspection) is organized into five subdirectories that correspond to user groups that share interests and access levels. The Workstation (WS) Configuration and DOS directories could be simplified if the PCs share the same components and DOS version. Batch is a library of utilities available to particular users or groups according to access rights, whereas Public holds utilities and menu front ends that are open to everyone. The Users directory holds each user's private work directory and, in this case, directories shared by specific groups.

Step 2: Design the system. Lay out the LAN server's directory hierarchy on paper (see FIGURE 1). The process is similar to organizing your PC's hard disk, but much more complex. Before you get started, poll the future LAN members. What files, programs, and peripherals do they need to share?

NetWare requires several basic directories, but you'll need many more. At the very least, the root directory will have a user directory with subdirectories for each user's personal files and directories for DOS, batch files, and applications. If your PCs have different configurations (for example, some with Hercules displays and others with EGA), you should create a workstation configuration subdirectory for each PC.

Your LAN blueprint should describe the access control for each directory: Is this directory read-only for some users and read/write for others? Who is allowed to update files? Organize users with equivalent access and update rights into user groups. Try not to overload each directory with too many subdirectories. If you already have the multiuser applications you plan to (continues)

Typical Server Hierarchy

install, check their installation instructions to make sure they jibe with your basic design; this can save a redesign later. Aim for perfection the first time, because changing the structure later will mean revising menu systems and batch files.

Step 3: Write log-in scripts. By now, the cabling, adapter cards, and LAN OS are installed, and it's time to put your paper plan to the test. Using NetWare's Filer utility, define the server directories, user names, passwords, user groups, and access rights. Go ahead and define all your users, but for the first few weeks, you should hand out passwords only to a few savvy users. This testing staff can help you iron out bugs.

Next, write one or more log-in scripts using the SYSCON utility. Similar to DOS batch files, these specify what happens when someone logs in. A typical log-in script checks for waiting E-mail, notifies users accordingly, and sets up search directories similar to DOS PATH directories. If you've organized your LAN into user groups, you may want a separate script for each group. Otherwise write one master script and create a custom script for yourself and other special personnel.

Step 4: Plan a backup strategy.
The server should be equipped

with a 60MB to 150MB tape cartridge backup drive. Make sure the tape vendor's backup software works with both your drive and *NetWare*, and that it saves

NetWare's security data (known as the "bindery").

Now decide on a backup strategy. A typical game plan: Every day, save all files that have been altered, and once a week, back up the entire system. Keep four weeks' worth of backups, and every week recycle the oldest tapes.

Step 5: Install applications.

Start with an easy program, such as a word processor or an E-mail package. Your main tasks will be creating the required directories, filling them with executable files, and developing a batch file containing setup instructions. Programs often force some unwelcome compromises. For example, some packages decontinues)



mand to save files in a directory containing executable code, even though it's best to define such directories as read-only. Other packages insist that you alter your server's entire structure. Usually, you have no choice but to acquiesce—or change applications.

Step 6: Keep on testing. Once you install an application, ask your testing staff to help you put it through its paces using all your peripherals. Getting your printers to work correctly is a common stumbling block.

No matter how hard you try, the best-laid LANs almost always require some tinkering. After you install each package, be prepared to change the directory structure and access rights, and to modify log-in scripts, user groups, batch files, and search paths.


Step 7: Install a data manager.

Once the simpler applications are running smoothly, move on to a trickier program, such as a data manager. Make sure you have a true multiuser data manager that prohibits users from locking horns when updating records in the same file at the same time. Modify your existing data base applications with special multiuser commands included with your LAN-based data manager. These include commands that lock records, define time-out periods, and set field passwords.

Step 8: Set up batch files and menus. To shield users from arcane network commands, develop a good menu system that allows users to point to the options they want. These can be as simple as 'Run 1-2-3' and 'Switch to local printer', or as complex as 'Enter new purchase order'.

Plan the hierarchy of screens that will appear on the menus, and write some DOS batch files that define what happens when the user chooses an option. Then lay out the menus with a good menuing package that lets you paint the screen interactively. Buy a third-party menu package, such as Cybertek's *Pro Menu* or LAN Systems' *LAN Shell*. Avoid *NetWare*'s menuing utility—it's slow, buggy, and limited.

Step 9: Write the documentation. It's a good idea to train a substitute administrator who can step in while you're away. To make sure all goes smoothly, you'll (continues)





need to document your day-to-day tasks. Describe the server's file structure, access control, user groups, backup regimen, menu system, and batch files. You should also detail the setup of each multiuser application. If your cablers haven't provided you with a map of the physical wiring of the LAN, draw one up.

Next, write documentation for the end users. Because you've designed most of the LAN environment, the *NetWare* manuals won't be much help. Cogent documentation will also cut down on the number of questions you'll have to answer every day.

A good user manual should start with such basics as how to log in and what to do if you forget your password. It should also cover menus, batch commands, printers, network utilities, and each application.

Step 10: Train the users. Once your LAN is set up and tested, prepare a few short classes for users. Schedule several hands-on sessions with novices.

And now, the moment of truth—bringing the users on line. Productivity will slow somewhat at first, so try to pick a slack period. The better you've prepared the LAN (and its users), the faster the office will get back to business as usual.

The Tool Doesn't Make the Artisan

've just read my mail so I can relax—at least until tomorrow's delivery. Then I will once more face the prospect of opening a letter or a flyer created by a desktop publisher.

If tomorrow's mail is like today's, it will be an amalgam of seven pieces of clip art and ten typefaces—an extravagant display of bold and italic type parading across the page, drawing attention to nothing at all. As I wad it up and loop it toward the wastebasket, it's small comfort that desktop publishers currently lack the full panoply of publishing tools.

I have nothing against software tools that allow the novice to do something new—or to do something that formerly required professional help. After all, I use my computer to prepare my taxes *sans* accountant, although I run a small printing and design business.

But I don't fancy myself an accountant and haven't set myself up in business as a tax preparer. Just because I bought a tool that lets me do a job that once cost me a small fortune, I don't bill myself as an expert in that field.

The craft does not reside in the tool, yet for some reason would-be desktop publishers don't seem to appreciate that. Granted, I've met many with solid backgrounds in graphic arts who use desktop publishing software to lower costs and improve their efficiency and aesthetic control. Still others attend seminars and read extensively, and are genuinely open to suggestions.

But judging from the material that finds its way into my mailbox, there are plenty of amateur desktop publishers who forget that the word *design* has several meanings, one of them being "deliberate planning."

Maybe that's a little harsh; it isn't as though those mediocre desktop publishers are deliberately planning mediocrity. They simply don't know any better. But many apparently feel that since they know how to write and have seen fliers or newsletters all their lives, they should be able to put them together themselves.

To add to the problem, most desktop publishing tutorials fail to offer the kind of help they could. Generally, they tell the reader how to do something (choose a column width for a newsletter, for instance) with little or no explanation of the judgments on which such decisions are based. Such instruction may help with the job at hand but not necessarily with the next one—

for the simple reason that each publication is different.

So what's the solution? Software developers and book and magazine publishers should improve the instructional level of their material. In particular, they should give the novice designer fewer how-to's and more how-comes. Even experienced designers may benefit from being reminded of the fundamentals of graphics, and of the traps that we all fall into when we get forgetful or lazy.


If you're new to desktop publishing and lack a background in graphic arts, begin reading things from a design perspective. Critique your junk mail, study print advertisements, and subscribe to traditional graphic arts periodicals.

Most of all, remember that you're learning your craft in public. Every poorly designed piece you create is there for the whole world to see. And it may end up in my mailbox.


