





Reviewers George Campbell (left) and Daniel Miles Kehoe corge Campbell, author of this month's roundup of communications software, wrote his first computer program in 1963. "It was in FORTRAN," he recalls, "for an IBM 1620 mainframe. I disliked it so much that I didn't touch another computer until 1984." Obviously, Campbell found the PC more to his liking. Since then, he's become a communications expert and a successful author and programmer.

Daniel Miles Kehoe, whose byline appears on our review of seven PostScript printers, has dismantled hundreds—perhaps thousands—of laser printers in his career as a consultant, author, and developer of a Post-Script compatibility benchmark suite.

It would be fair to call either of these reviewers a power user, an industry analyst, even a PC guru. But you won't find these reviews cluttered with industry gossip. Instead, the focus is on the make-or-break information you need to make intelligent buying decisions.

As a reviewer, Kehoe says, "my job is to seek a broad sampling of users' observations about quality and performance and to compare them with my experience. This process has a way of highlighting specific problems." Kehoe's experience turned up a crucial bit of buying intelligence: The popular but finicky

Ricoh engines require a technician's attention every few thousand pages to continue delivering acceptable print quality. That's the sort of information you won't find in a spec sheet or an advertisement.

You can't take a PC communications program apart with a screwdriver, but George Campbell was able to dig into the nine packages in our roundup. The shareware and exshareware products got highest marks, he reports. "Among the commercial packages, I had the sense that nobody on the development team had *used* them. With the shareware products, I felt that the people who designed them used them regularly. It confirmed my belief that some of the best software evolves when one person is in charge of the development process."

The most important part of a communications package? "The user interface," Campbell says. "The ideal interface offers a choice of ways to approach each command. The beginner has plenty of context-sensitive help; experienced users can take advantage of shortcuts. *ProComm Plus* fits that bill well."

In the fitful world of PC technology, intelligence is a precious commodity. Fortunately, our reviewers' collective experience adds up to a perspective that means something to the business buyer. And they've promised to keep up the good work—as long as we promise to stay away from FORTRAN. ●

IBM Bolsters OS/2

Hopes Office
Suite, Operating System
Upgrades Will
Accelerate
Application
Development

In what it called the most sweeping set of software announcements in its history, IBM unveiled a suite of applications for OS/2 Extended Edition workstations, along with upgrades to OS/2. The OfficeVision family exploits OS/2's multitasking and its Presentation Manager interface and will run on OS/2 nets as well as mainframes and AS/400 minis. The network version, at \$750 per workstation, will arrive in September. IBM is providing third-party developers with technical details on how to exploit OfficeVision services such as electronic mail with snap-on applications. OS/2 Standard Edition 1.2, scheduled to ship in September for \$340, makes the Presentation Manager shell less clunky via more extensive use of icons and more direct manipulation of files. OS/2 1.2 lacks 80386-specific

support but incorporates a High Performance File System that handles partitions and files up to 2GB and retrieves files 15 to 200 percent faster than the FAT (File Allocation Table) system. IBM is promising its long-overdue OS/2 device drivers, including those for PostScript printers, with the new release. Scheduled for November, the \$830 OS/2 Extended Edition 1.2 will offer multiuser data base operations on an OS/2 net, an improved SNA gateway, and added net interfaces that boost compatibility with Microsoft's OS/2 LAN Manager. More than a dozen firms (mostly mainframe software vendors) have pledged allegiance to OS/2 and/or OfficeVision, but PC application development is proceeding at its usual slow pace.

Nantucket Leaving dBASE

Compiler
Developer
Charts ObjectOriented
Course Away
From dBASE
Language

At its developers conference in June, Nantucket introduced the fifth version of its popular Clipper dBASE-language compiler, one that signals a new strategic direction for the company away from the dBASE language. The leading supplier of dBASE aftermarket products, Nantucket is "no longer strategically committed to the dBASE language," says President Larry Heimendinger. "We are evolving the company away from dBASE, although we will remain tied to it for the foreseeable future." He blames Ashton-Tate's latest twists in the language for his decision: "It's tough to look at the way dBASE IV manipulates dBASE and feel comfortable about the language." The principal enhancement to Clipper 5.0, scheduled to ship in

September, is a virtual-memory-management scheme with a dynamic linker/loader that eliminates the need for overlay files in *Clipper* applications. But it's the object-oriented elements in the latest version—such as the ability to treat arrays as objects—that signal the new direction, says Heimendinger. Nantucket plans to release a fully object-oriented version before April 1990 that will run under DOS, *Windows*, and OS/2 (in character and graphic modes) and on the Macintosh. Users will be able to link to any *dBASE*-compatible or SQL data base. However, Nantucket will maintain the *Clipper* interface and backward compatibility with prior versions.

Lotus Offers Net Deals

Unified Network Scheme, Release 3.0 Introduction Aimed to Reassert Leadership Lotus, which previously offered only full-priced network deals, has announced a common networking scheme with price breaks. 1-2-3, Symphony, Manuscript, and other mainstream applications will come in three flavors: a standard edition (priced as usual), a server edition with net administration utilities (priced \$100 higher), and a documentation-only workstation edition (priced \$200 less than the standard edition). The server software notifies the net administrator if more users start running the package than have been licensed. Applications will be standardized for Novell, 3Com, Banyan, and IBM nets, says workstation vice president Frank Moss. Under Lotus's "file reservation" scheme, one user can write to a file while others read it, and users can swap the write

privilege. Symphony and Manuscript network packages were scheduled for June shipment, while those for 1-2-3 versions will follow their stand-alone editions by 90 days. That means release 3.0's net offerings will arrive in September (at press time Lotus planned to release its new flagship by June 19). The company hopes that release 3.0, which will come with 24-hour toll-free support, will reinforce its near-monopoly in spreadsheets estimated by InfoCorp to be 68 percent of total worldwide sales last year. Repeated update delays have created a window for competitors like Microsoft, whose Excel ended 1988 with a 4 percent market share. Lotus gave no further word on 1-2-3/ G, although this Presentation Manager edition began appearing in public in May.

Emerson Sells Clones

Consumer
Electronics
Giant Will
Rely on Distribution
Expertise

Another consumer electronics giant has thrown its hat into the broadening ring for home/office computers—and this one's an American company. The \$761 million Emerson Radio Corporation hopes to leverage its size, manufacturing capabilities, and distribution expertise to sell what has become a commodity product in mass merchant channels. Emerson has formed a computer manufacturing concern, Emerson Technologies, and a marketing arm, Emerson Computer Corporation Division (ECCO), both based in Los Angeles. Emerson Technologies' president will be Christopher Daly, while Senior Vice President of Sales and Marketing Larry Metz will head ECCO. Together, the pair played crucial roles in leading Los Angeles start-up Packard-Bell to success in the home/office

market. Emerson already distributes its consumer electronics products through the 24 largest retail outlets, which, Daly claims, account for approximately 80 percent of all consumer electronics sales. It also will apply what it has learned in surface-mount technology, very-large-system integration, and robotics to manufacture both relabeled and brand name products in the United States. Emerson's offerings, expected to ship this summer, include a 10-MHz XT for under \$600, a 16-MHz AT for less than \$1000, and another under-\$1000 model based on Intel's 386SX chip. All will feature DOS 3.3 in ROM. The AT and SX computers will include a voice chip that cues users on installation procedures such as disk formatting.

Hayes Buys JT Fax

Modem Kingpin Finds Quick Way to Add Fax Capability to Its Line In what analysts call an important strategic move, Hayes Microcomputer Products has purchased the JT Fax hardware and software lines of nearby Quadram Technologies and Asher Technologies, both subsidiaries of Intelligent Systems. Key among the line of PC fax boards and enabling software, acquired by Hayes for an undisclosed sum, is the JT Fax Pro96 (see *Top of the News*, *PCW*, May 1989). This device includes a 2400-bps modem and a 9600-bps group III fax board that employs an extended version of the Hayes AT modem command set for sending faxes from standard communications programs. Such multifunction boards represent the primary evolutionary path for modem companies like Hayes, maintains International

Data Corporation analyst Josh Gonze, who calls Hayes's entry "a major turning point on the road toward eventual integration of fax and data modems." The \$125 million firm already dominates a fractured dial-up-modem market with a 20 percent share, says Gonze. "Hayes was skeptical, but they seem to have decided that, yes, there is a market for fax capability tied to a data modem," adds CAP International analyst Judy Pirani. "This gives them sort of a jump start in that market." Hayes will keep the JT Fax staff, and Quadram will continue to provide manufacturing and support during the transition. But the JT Fax Pro96, originally scheduled for May shipment, will be delayed until the end of the year.

Borland Braces

Counters Microsoft Assault With Refocus on C and Pascal

Borland is marshaling its resources to counter an all-out assault by Microsoft on its language business in general and its preeminence in Pascal sales in particular. Borland has stepped up its support for students and teachers, who are largely responsible for Turbo Pascal supplanting Microsoft's BA-SIC line as the entry-level language of choice. Borland's new educational lab pack provides a 10-user license of Turbo Pascal 5.5 for \$300. Additionally, coupons let students buy any Borland language for about one-third the retail price. On another front, Borland has decided to suspend further upgrades of Turbo Basic and Turbo Prolog to shift resources to its Pascal and C products. However, Vice President of Product Management Rob Dickerson insists that bug fixes and support will continue. He

describes the battle with Microsoft as a "two-front war": Both companies are vying for sales of C products to corporate developers, and Microsoft is trying to crack Borland's stranglehold on Pascal programming. Microsoft is offering retailers a three-for-the-price-of-two deal to lower prices enough to woo Turbo Pascal upgraders to its justintroduced QuickPascal. But Dickerson maintains that dealers will prefer Turbo Pascal's higher prices and margins and will push Borland's product. The company is prepared to shift market development dollars to any area where Microsoft makes headway. Market researchers give Microsoft's generally higher-priced products about a 59 percent share of language dollars, while Borland maintains a similar percentage in unit share.







hey say old dogs don't learn new tricks, but these days IBM seems out to prove the adage wrong. A case in point is *OfficeVision*, Big Blue's new software environment for OS/2 (see *Top of the News* and *Industry Outlook* in this issue).

Even with commercial successes like DisplayWrite, IBM always managed to turn out lackluster PC software. OfficeVision changes that. Not only is it the first suite of Presentation Manager applications to arrive from a major vendor, it's also a good example of innovative software design. Further, OfficeVision is an open platform that several big-time developers like Lotus and Microsoft have already pledged to support. So although it's shocking to admit, Big Blue just might have a hit on its hands.

Does IBM Have the Office Vision?

IBM has seen the future, and it runs on mainframes.


With OfficeVision, Big Blue is staking its survival on the union of personal computers and its biggest iron.

OfficeVision comes at the right time in the evolution of PC software. Developers are increasingly concerned about the lack of personality and intuitiveness in the so-called easy-to-use Presentation Manager. Unlike the Macintosh interface, Presentation Manager doesn't simplify computing with familiar metaphors that relate computer processes to everyday office activities. Instead, Presentation Manager is depressingly like DOS with menus. And unlike DOS, there are as yet no tools to let power users extensively customize it.


Compared with the Mac, OfficeVision is more like a statement of direction than a fullfledged PC environment. IBM added some nice bells and whistles to Presentation Manageryou can mail a document by dropping its icon into an electronic in-box, for example. But Big Blue spent most of its energy trying to give its faltering mainframes a new lease on life by making it easier to consolidate information scattered in disparate parts of a large organization.

Big Blue says that with a powerful interface like *OfficeVision*, users can concentrate on analyzing data while mainframes concentrate on providing it. The problem: No other PC vendor seems interested in eking more use out of the mainframe. Instead, they're trying to kill it with data base server technology that promises to make big, expensive iron obsolete (see "Well-Connected Data Bases" in this issue). That's bad news for IBM, which makes most of its money selling large systems. Thus, a PC software project with a decidedly mainframe bent.

IBM clearly views OfficeVision as a laboratory to try out new interface concepts that will one day make their way into Presentation Manager itself. Unfortunately, its focus on mainframes may slow development at the PC end. For example, users won't be able to coordinate information from multiple applications into a single document unless vendors agree on a common method for sharing data. IBM's answer to the problem is an extension of its DCA file format called MODCA (Mixed-Object Document Content Architecture). But Lotus points out that MODCA lacks a (continues)

Nobody should doubt that a lot of potential answers are cooking in Big Blue's R&D labs. For example, IBM bought the rights to the acclaimed Metaphor Data Interpretation System. This makes it possible for users to build applications that involve data base, spreadsheet, and word processor capabilities from scratch using point-and-shoot methods. IBM also has a piece of Steve Jobs's NextStep object-oriented programming environment. If Big Blue does its job right, these powerful technologies can help transform Presentation Manager into a clear winner.

Just as IBM unwittingly sped the demise of centralized computing with the PC, it's possible that *OfficeVision* will drag IBM, kicking and screaming, into the future—a future where mainframes become increasingly less important, even in the largest organizations. Just as with the PS/2, IBM now finds itself in the position of leading the PC industry through technical innovation. But it also runs the risk of letting narrow self-interest get in the way.

The Multitasking Challenge





Obviously HP can't vouch for emulations of its products, but we were impressed during our tests by the HL-8's overall performance and its HP emulation. -Ed.

"Print" to Disk

Q. How can I redirect printer output to a disk file? I have a few programs that don't have a "print to file" option and some others whose printer drivers make very poor use of my printer's abilities. If I could capture printer output in an ASCII file, I could use my word processor's advanced formatting capabilities to spruce up my reports.

A. A retail program like *Print*-Rite (described in Product Outlook, PCW, July 1989) gives you the ability to print to disk, along with a host of other printer control features. But you can find a print-to-disk utility-and other simple, single-task programs offered as shareware or in the public domain. Check out electronic bulletin boards, user group libraries, and shareware catalogs such as PC-SIG's (800/245-6717, 800/222-2996 in California). For example, LPT-DSK.ARC by George Bouche is available on CompuServe. Subscribers can log on, type GO IBMNET, select option 5 for the IBM Software Systems/Utilities Forum, select 3 for Libraries, select 3 again for General Utils. and download the file.

Flattened Outlook

Q. I recently purchased a 386 equipped with a VGA video adapter and a Sony CPD-1302A monitor. I was told that the Sony was a multiscan monitor. However, when I run a program that generates EGA graphics, the display appears vertically compressed, as if only the middle 350 lines of the screen's 480 were being used. On the NEC MultiSync II that I use at work, the same programs fill the entire screen. The Sony handles switching between all other modes—whether text or graphics-without a problem, but the


squashed EGA graphics display is disconcerting. Is there something wrong with my monitor? Dave Thewlis Via CompuServe

A. The Sony CPD-1302A Multiscan is basically the original CPD-1302 slightly modified to accommodate VGA. Both monitors sense frequency changes when an adapter changes modes and automatically adjust the size of the screen appropriately.

However, because the video signal's polarity-not its frequency-changes when a VGA switches to EGA graphics mode, the 1302A is unaware that the screen mode has changed; NEC's original MultiSync has the same limitations. There is no fix for the problem because the monitor's pre-VGA design does not include the circuitry necessary to test polarity. (NEC's MultiSync II was introduced after the advent of the VGA and was designed to handle EGA and VGA graphics with equal aplomb.)

Last June, Sony introduced the MultiscanHG model CPD-1304, which displays both EGA and VGA graphics on the full screen. Coupled with the appropriate video adapter, this monitor is capable of displaying even 1024 by 768 noninterlaced video. (continues)



Which Way Is Up?

Q. I don't know whether to upgrade my XT compatible by installing an accelerator card, replacing the motherboard, or buying a new system. I've already added 1MB of expanded memory on an AST multifunction board to the motherboard's 256K, and I have a 101-key keyboard. I think I need to move up to a 286; I'm not sure whether I need a 386.

I do know I want more memory for programs like Desqview. Also, I need at least 40MB of hard disk storage. Does it make sense to add a hard disk card so I can still use my Seagate ST10-controlled 20MB drive? What about data compression, via

hardware or software, to wring more from my hard disk? Jack Allen Pacific Palisades, California

A. How you choose to upgrade your system depends on your current hardware and the final configuration you'll need to run the programs you want to use. Most upgrade products take you only part of the distance; upgrading further entails replacing them. Some upgrades will affect your current equipment; upgrading one component may require upgrading another. For example, loading up with memory, a modem, an accelerator card, and more drives may necessitate a larger power supply.

Personal computers based on Intel processors, from the original IBM PC to the newest 33-MHz 386s, span a wide range of speed and capability (see **ABOVE**). In general, upgrading a system stops making sense after a certain point. You can keep upgrading, but you'll end up replacing almost every component—and paying for it piece by piece is more expensive than buying a whole new system.

Installing an accelerator card that sports a faster processor, adding a hard disk card, and using data compression software will give you a modest boost in performance and plenty of extra storage for a relatively low cost. You'll get an even bigger boost in processing speed with a mother-board replacement. If you could upgrade with a 386-based accelerator card or motherboard, you could add memory for Quarter-deck's *Desqview* less expensively (continues)





Neither method will accelerate access to your current hard disk, however. If you opt for the motherboard, the board's AT bus will let you install a new hard disk controller for a faster hard disk. Just be sure that the controller card fits inside your XT; many 16-bit AT boards don't, because the XT's case is not as tall as the AT's.

A 20MB hard drive on a card will double your current storage capability, but 40MB hard disk cards are far more cost-effective. Consider also that your ST10 hard disk controller accommodates larger, faster hard drives. Then again, the XT has only two drive bays; unless you use a hard

disk card, you'll have to replace the 20MB drive to get more storage in your XT. Note that swapping out the 20MB drive for a larger-capacity half-height unit would leave room for another half-height device, say a tape backup unit or another floppy drive.

If upgrading the processor is part of a plan to eventually run 16-bit software, such as OS/2, you'll need a high-density (1.2MB 5¼-inch or 1.44MB 3½-inch) floppy drive, which means a new floppy disk controller and a new floppy drive. In that case, I'd advise you to obtain the high-density floppy drive as part of a complete, new system.

Model 30 286 Expanded Memory

Q. I own an IBM PS/2 Model 30 286, and I'm having trouble deciding how best to add memory to my system. IBM sells a Multifunction Adapter that holds up to 12MB, but it requires that the 30 286's motherboard, which accommodates 4MB, have no more than 512K installed. Furthermore, it adds extended memory, and I want EMS 4.0 expanded memory. I'm a student on a tight budget, and since versatility is currently more important to me than speed, software emulation of EMS 4.0 memory may be an acceptable solution. Can you help?

We've been in the networking business 20 years, so you can hook up a PC in a couple of minutes.











A. Because your system is based on a 286, it needs a special chip to manage expanded memory; a 386 has the necessary memorymanagement capability built in. Of course, you can emulate expanded memory by using a thirdparty program, such as Turbo EMS or Above Disk, which swaps data between your hard disk and memory. Using memory configured as a RAM disk speeds up the swapping process. However, in addition to a software emulator's being terribly slow, there are things it can't do that real expanded memory can.

Installing a third-party 16-bit expanded memory board is one way to get the necessary memory management. If you decide

to do that, be sure to get a current board. The older versions were designed to run in an AT's 8-MHz bus, not the 30 286's 10-MHz bus. Furthermore, older cards are so tall that the 30 286's system cover won't fit over them. Don't forget that getting the best performance from multitasking managers, such as *Desqview*, involves reducing mother-board memory as much as possible. And your system won't hold less than 512K.

For my money, your best route to real EMS 4.0 expanded memory is the All Chargecard from All Computers. This tiny circuit board slips in between your system's 80286 processor and the motherboard (a PLCC adapter is also required for the Model (continues)



30 286), adding true memory-management capability. That means that all the memory you have—or add—can be used as expanded memory. You'll be able to put device drivers and memory-resident programs into "high" memory to free user RAM for larger programs and data files, give DOS more than 640K, process more data with programs written to use expanded memory, and finally be able to reap the full benefits of multitasking managers.

The Chargecard does not add memory to your system. I assume you have 512K now. Adding another IBM 0.5MB Memory Module Kit will fill the motherboard; any additional memory will have to be on a memory adapter (read *expensive*). You're probably better off swapping the current 512K (stow it for the future) for a 2.0MB Memory Module Kit; that'll leave room for another 2MB on the motherboard. If you want more than 4MB, you can buy the Multifunction Adapter with one or more 2MB Memory Modules installed, move the motherboard's 4MB to the adapter, and reinstall the motherboard's original 512K.







First-hand dispatches from the Windows front

Why aren't there more games for Windows? Maybe because software developers don't think it's a serious environment yet.

Stewart Alsop

Have you noticed the scarcity of Windows games on the market? Probably not. But to my knowledge, only three Windows-based games are available. This is a real problem for Microsoft and an opportunity for all you closet game developers. Microsoft should welcome more games for Windows, even though it's supposed to be a business environment.

Before I explain why, let me tell you about the games that do exist. The first and cheapest is *Reversi*, which comes with every copy of *Windows* and is a version of the popular board game Othello. The object is to place colored pieces on an electronic board, surrounding the computer's pieces and covering more squares than they do.

Meanwhile, the computer, which is infinitely faster and much smarter than you are, busily surrounds your pieces. After three years of futzing around with Reversi, I still haven't mastered it.

The second game developed for Windows and the first for sale in retail stores was Balance of Power from Mindscape. Created originally for the Macintosh, the program lets you imagine you're the president of the United States or the premier of the Soviet Union and challenges you to meet your goals without starting a nuclear war. Balance of Power is a certified hit, having sold more than 100,000 copies.

The third game, which I discovered only recently, is Windows Backgammon Deluxe from E. F. Dickey. It's a pretty accurate reproduction of backgammon—you play against either the computer or another person. But it's cluttered with dialog boxes, and you'll probably romp through it in no time flat. In easy mode, it's one dumb backgammon player; even in hard mode, I haven't lost yet.

Why Games Are Important

That's it for you game players who happen to use *Windows*. Of course, you might be able to play DOS games by launching them from within the environment (al-

though that tactic usually doesn't work, since game developers tend to play loose with programming rules) or by quitting Windows and then launching the game (which defeats the idea of Windows in the first place). But the dearth of Windows games does a lot to explain why the environment hasn't been too successful in the business world.

It may seem illogical to say that a business environment needs lots of games to succeed. But empirical evidence indicates it does. The three most successful business environments (the Apple II, from 1980 to 1983; DOS systems; and the Macintosh) were blessed with serious, state-of-the-art entertainment software early on when they weren't considered great game machines.

Two imperatives make the development of game software crucial to the acceptance of a new environment—particularly a graphic environment like *Windows*, where you enhance existing equipment instead of buying an entirely new machine.

Game Developers Need Sales

First, it's a simple fact of life that game developers need sales of at least 30,000 to 50,000 units in the first six months of a product's life to turn a profit. business-oriented developers can make a decent living selling under a thousand units a year. So it's fairly easy to get a few business applications for almost any environment.

Now look at Windows. In its first three years, Windows has attracted about 200 business applications, mostly specialized. In that same time, we've seen only three games. Now compare Windows with the Macintosh: Even though Apple actively discouraged game software for the Macintosh in 1985 and 1986because it wanted to position the machine as a "serious" business computer-a number of companies, most notably Silicon Beach Software, became successful by selling Mac games.

Pushing the Envelope

The second reason game software development is crucial to Windows is that game developers push the machinery much harder than business developers. One reason DOS games often crash is that developers have had to play incredible technical tricks to make them exciting. In the process game developers find out things about programming that business developers would never discover on their own.

So what, you ask? First, such knowledge gets disseminated through the industry grapevine and eventually shows up in business products. But more important, smart developers of hardware and operating systems track innovations in games and enhance their own products in response to them. Ultimately, computers get more interactive and fun to use, even with business software. An environment that doesn't accommodate such innovations won't support the really challenging games.

Balance of Power, for instance, suffered in translation from the Macintosh to Windows. The reason: Windows did not allow the developer to create an irregular shape on the screen that the user could activate. So instead of letting users click anywhere within a country's borders on the game map, the developer had to tag each country with a retangular button. This requirement made interacting with the map more difficult and error-prone. Ironically, developers of the latest kind of graphical business software are struggling with limitations like these right now, even though the developers of Balance of Power struggled with them in 1986.

Are We Having Fun Yet?

Windows seems to have satisfied the imperative for unit sales. Microsoft claims it is selling 70,000 units of Windows per month through retail channels (not including copies bundled with computers like the Zenith or the Apricot). That's getting serious. Apple sells about 80,000 Macintoshes per month. IBM alone sells about 120,000 PCs per month. At 70,000 copies a month, you'd think that Windows would start attracting developers, but it hasn't yet. And it hasn't because of the second imperative: Windows is a lousy game environment. If Microsoft wants to win the war for the business desktop, then it has to give Windows the ammunition to win the game wars, too.

Desktop Fusion?

Workstations, PCs Collide

New Software Choices Benefit Users



Sun workstations are broadening their appeal beyond technically oriented customers, claims George Symons.

n presentations to stock analysts, Austin Wing Mayer, Sun Microsystems' director of investor relations, depicts the company as the most brilliant star shooting across the computing universe. Mayer cites both financial and manufacturing statistics to show that traditional minicomputer suppliers are suffering from a bad case of Sun burn.

But the numbers look a little less stellar for Sun's imminent collision with PC market highfliers Compaq, Apple, and Next. Like Sun, Compaq and Apple are among the fastest-growing companies in the history of U.S. business, and their manufacturing capabilities more than match Sun's. Next—well, Next has su-

perstar Steve Jobs, who is determined to prove that lightning can strike twice.

The collision of this quartet could result in the first incidence of fusion on the desktop. And the competition should benefit PC users no matter who wins.

Full engagement won't occur for a year or so, predicts Bill Lempesis, senior analyst at Dataquest in San Jose, California. But PC makers have already declared open season on minicomputer and workstation vendors. Apple, Compaq, and other suppliers like IBM and Zenith are starting to siphon off business for technical workstations, multiuser systems, and

network servers. Prices for the high-speed 32-bit PCs are way below what the DECs and Data Generals can offer. Open architecture provides flexibility that mini/workstation vendors can't match.

Except Sun—which has been flattening the competition with its broadbased UNIX environment and prices that match PCs'. Its ads leave little doubt as to Sun's target; they describe Sun's year-old 386i computer as "the corporate 386" and the company's new RISC-based SPARCstation as (see Workstations, p. 58)

IBM Debuts Office Suite

Hopes to Overcome Slow OS/2 Start

As the second anniversary of OS/2's debut rolled around this spring, IBM and Microsoft were still singing the praises of their next-generation operating system. But they were beginning to sound like an a cappela choir of two.

Most of the proverbial early adopters haven't been adopting. The first round of character-based OS/2 applications have drawn relatively few entries, and sales have been minuscule. Applications built for OS/2's Presentation Manager graphic user interface remain months away, and their prototypes lack some key adjuncts—not just helpmates like OS/2 data base server software, but even (see IBM, p. 60)

Compoq and other PC vendors, along with Apple, Next, and Sun, are joining the battle far warkstation sales. Because each vendor takes a different slant an bundling saftware and hardware, direct price comporisons may not be useful.

"the world's most powerful desktop for the price of a PC."

Similarly, Next, which was launched last October with the dubious charter of bringing \$6500 UNIX machines to colleges, took a hard right turn this spring by inking a \$100 million distribution agreement with Businessland. Next already had impressive technology in its black cube—a Motorola 68030-based computer with 8MB of memory, 256MB of read/write optical storage, and extraordinary object-oriented programming tools on a UNIX platform. Overnight, the Businessland deal gave Next corporate credibility and one of the nation's best sales and support organizations.

Analysts don't anticipate any knockout blows in this contest, predicting instead that each competitor will find a unique role. In addition to broadly accepted architectures and huge libraries of applications, Apple and the PC vendors can leverage their high-volume, low-cost manufacturing; large advertising budgets; and extremely strong distribution channels. "It really isn't efficient for Sun to sell \$7000-to-\$8000 boxes direct," notes Lempesis. "Until Sun's products are sold through major PC resellers they aren't a tremendous threat."

In the past year, Sun moved \$150 million worth of 386i's through its traditional direct-sales force and some 200 value-added resellers, but these sales took few customers from Compaq or Apple, admits

Group Marketing Manager George Symons. However, Sun hopes to expand its user base from 386iand SPARCstationequipped engineers to include financial and administrative personnel.

Connectivity will be the major drawing card. The ethernet-equipped Sun workstations are backed by the vendor's ambitious net and windowing environments. They offer levels of file sharing.

communications support, distributed processing, and multitasking that neither DOS nor OS/2 PCs can match. For instance, the Sun 386i runs multiple off-the-shelf DOS packages simultaneously; OS/2 systems are limited to a single DOS application. Connectivity can also be enhanced when one vendor supplies all the elements, notes George White, president of multiprocessing computer maker Corollary. But the lack of desktop software will challenge both Sun and Next.
UNIX is a solid, open standard for net workstations, but it lacks the productivity software that has put PCs and Macs on so many desks.

While Sun relies on its ability to run DOS packages, Next figures that the highly productive NextStep development environment will let it leapfrog the current software base and make any debate about operating systems irrelevant. "We gave up worrying about operating systems long ago and started focusing on what the user wants from the machine," says Dan'l Lewin, vice president of sales and marketing.

Many top DOS developers like Lotus, Ashton-Tate, and Aldus will port their applications over to NextStep, and IBM plans to offer a version of Next-Step under its 386-based version of UNIX. Ironically, notes Compaq president Mike Swavely, one major impact of the Next and Sun entries might be to help sell UNIX on PCs.

Mapping the PC Market

MapInfo Aims for Mass Appeal

A t New York's Cortland County Fire Department, dispatchers can type an address into a desktop mapping system and instantly discover if a business stores hazardous chemicals or if an invalid lives at that address. The desktop mapping software also helps plan the best routes to a disaster and presents floor plans to guide rescuers, explains dispatcher David Reynolds.

Designed to let users integrate map and data base information to find street addresses, generate reports, and create pin or thematic maps, desktop mapping pack-

ages also aid in many jobs that are a bit more prosaic than fire fighting. Such broad capabilities are sparking quick growth—by some estimates, sales will exceed \$1 billion by 1991.

At the forefront of the buying frenzy is MapInfo of Troy, New York, which wants to bring desktop mapping to the masses the way AutoCAD deliv-(see MapInfo, p. 62)

Given the technical barriers for PM packages and customers' sticker shock at multimegabyte memory upgrades, most software firms have drawn back from full-bore PM development. Instead, they've concentrated on opportunities with DOS and the suddenly popular "DOS extender" tools that allow single-tasking programs to jump the 640K memory barrier.

But IBM hopes to push OS/2 back onto center stage with a new suite of

office automation software and upgrades to OS/2 itself—particularly the proprietary Extended Edition. And with memory costs finally sinking, IBM has begun awarding rebates for purchases of OS/2 plus memory or selected other options.

The new office automation family, OfficeVision, is one of those sweeping Big Blue projects—in this case occupying a thousand developers for about two years. OfficeVision will run on IBM's four strategic platforms: OS/2 nets, AS/400 minicomputers. and VM and MVS mainframes. Debuting in September and requiring OS/2 Extended Edition, the \$750 OfficeVision/2 for OS/2 LANs will include file manager, electronic mail, address book,

phone book, and text editing functions.

OfficeVision is not just an application family but rather an environment with hooks that allow applications from IBM and third-party developers to "snap in" and exploit modules like E-mail. Industry analysts generally applaud both this thrust and the scope of the project, which by late 1990 should bring from 5 to 5000 users the same office services under one interface. "OfficeVision has been thought out really well," says Judith Hurwitz, senior analyst at Patty Seybold's Office Computing Group in Boston.

OS/2 is the desktop foundation for this graphic, multitasking, memoryintensive offering, emphasizes Lee Reiswig, direc-

tor of software strategy at IBM's Entry Systems Division. "It's not possible to build *OfficeVision* the way it is with DOS—even with *Windows* and [expanded memory] or anything else.

"We've been trying to sell an operating system for the past two years, and it's tough to do," Reiswig acknowledges, but applications finally are arriving. "This fall, most leading applications will be exploiting OS/2 in a big way," adds Reiswig. "When we've got enough of them, our emphasis will turn to solutions—capturing hearts and minds."

But while IBM and Microsoft harmonize on OS/2 Extended Edition, Standard Edition appears to lack audible support. "IBM's kind of washing its hands of Standard Edition," Hurwitz says. Other leading PC suppliers, waiting for an 80386-specific version of the operating system, currently give OS/2 little more than lip service. —E. B.

Patent Waters Muddied

Software Coverage Alarms Industry

o stranger to controversy, the U.S. Patent Office has raised a ruckus in recent years by granting patents for software. This spring when Quarterdeck Office Systems received a patent for a way to write multiple applications to windows, much of the software industry spouted doom-and-gloom forecasts.

The turmoil quickly subsided when people received copies of Quarter-deck's patent. "It's a joke—the people who made the dire predictions had never seen the patent," says Jeffrey Tarter, editor of *Soft-letter* in Cambridge, Massachusetts. "The actual pat-

ent is so narrowly constructed that it's unlikely anything infringes it."

Industry concern resurfaced with a vengeance a few weeks later, however, when Xerox took an aggressive stance on requiring licenses for the user interfaces covered by its patents and copyrights. And the Patent Office, which has awarded precious few software patents, appears to be stepping up its issuances.

There's plenty of reason for concern—particularly because patents cover ideas, rather than the expression of ideas as do copyrights. If the idea is

basic enough, there's no way to engineer around it. Moreover, patents may be legal time bombs: patent applications are kept secret, and the process typically takes three or more years, so patents could be infringed unknowingly for years.

"It's a mess and it's getting messier fast," comments Richard Stern, a computer lawyer in Washington, D.C. Stern formerly told software clients to get copyrights rather than patents. which weren't worth the time or the money. "But I don't say that anymore, when the Patent Office just issues any old thing," he says. Stern cautions, however, that "we don't know that these are valid patents—they may well be overturned by the courts."



ered computer-aided design, says President Sean
O'Sullivan.

O'Sullivan and partners conceived *MapInfo* four years ago as students at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. They delivered the product in fall 1987, and in the first full year of sales, MapInfo grossed several million dollars. The 35-person company has been profitable since the software shipped.

Roughly two-thirds of sales go to businesses (particularly utility, distribution, and delivery firms) and one-third to government. A newly formed network of 165 third-party resellers tailors *MapInfo* for specialized jobs such as school bus routing or evacuation management.

Unlike simple thematicmapping packages, Map-Info offers powerful ways to link data bases (including standard dBASE files) with graphics. And unlike traditional geographic information system (GIS) offerings, O'Sullivan claims, it lets users "immediately begin using existing data base information to create maps without an extensive training period." The base package costs \$750 and includes U.S. and world maps as well as national 5-digit ZIP code maps. Other maps of metropolitan and rural areas are sold separately. Locations are identified by street address, ZIP code, city, state, county, census tract, or other userdefined criteria. The data bases can then be queried and the information displayed and manipulated to create maps showing anything from street-level detail to floor plans.

With version 4.0, which shipped in May, customers can share *MapInfo* data bases on a PC net. Map changes can be highlighted for other users, and users can edit different layers on the same map (for example, the water department can study piping diagrams while the fire department reviews street addresses).

"We're oriented toward multiple platforms, multiple operating environments, and multiple data base architectures," says O'Sullivan, who plans to port MapInfo to UNIX and OS/2. However, that move may intensify competition with established vendors of GIS packages. Although they shrugged off MapInfo at first, these rivals, whose PC-based products cost from \$8500 to \$50,000, are now taking note.

The GIS vendors contend that packages like *MapInfo* simply lack horsepower for data analysis and management.

"Once users realize the limitations of desktop mapping products, they start looking for something more powerful, such as the GIS approach, where a data base is built and a map is one view on the data base," claims Jack Dangermond. The president of Environmental Systems Research Institute in Redlands, California, which markets PC ARC/info, Dangermond adds that GIS packages let data bases migrate up to minicomputers and mainframes.

But O'Sullivan doesn't expect to go head-to-head with GIS products, which he says are geared toward selected users in technical vertical markets. "We've got a horizontal, somewhat generic product that appeals to a lot of different applications. There will always be room for the \$90,000 solutions, and for us." —Laura Lang

Developers need to protect their intellectual property rights, but copyrights may not furnish the answer either, despite lawsuits that push copyright coverage to the limits. Ashton-Tate's suit against Fox Software offers one illustration—nobody had previously argued that computer languages could be protected by copyright, "and lots of

law stands in the way," Stern says.

The only conclusions to draw from today's prominent copyright cases are that lawyers are prospering and that "doing a straight knockoff will get you killed," Tarter says. "I suppose the net result is a modest increase in creativity in interface design." (Case in point: In OfficeVision, IBM replaces the familiar trashcan icon with a shredder.)

Stern suggests that revamping federal law might be better than an onslaught of all-or-nothing court battles. "There must be some intermediary solutions," he says. Those seeking a model might look to recent legislation establishing a separate legal regime for chip design. —*E. B.*



or years 3Com and Novell have been volleying back and forth on networking's central court. to the great benefit of the network user. Advanced NetWare 286 was widely considered the network operating system (NOS) of choice—until 3Com came out with 3 + Open, its implementation of Microsoft's LAN Manager. Now, with the thirdquarter release of Net-Ware 386 3.0, Novell aims for a server ace.

Although most NOSs will run on an 80386 server, until now very few have been recoded from scratch to take full advantage of the chip's 32-bit capabilities. Novell is one of the first companies to

do so, and its executives claim that *NetWare 386* is three times faster than its predecessor—and will easily outperform *LAN Manager*—based NOSs like *3 + Open*.

Furthermore, Novell's programmers have taken

this opportunity to remedy problems (like Advanced NetWare 286's complex, time-consuming installation process) and add capabilities. For instance, NetWare 386 permits up to 250 users to be attached to a single server (via four network boards) without significant perfor-

mance degradation—or so Novell claims. (While some NOSs have no official user limit, performance can degrade severely as the number of users grows. If Novell delivers acceptable 250node operation, which it showed *PC World* in its lab, *NetWare 386* will set a new industry standard.)

Installation Without Tears

Novell states that Net-Ware 386 can be installed in under 15 minutes—and although that estimate does not include placing network boards in workstations and the server, generating workstation shells, or configuring printers, PC World did succeed in bringing up the software, fully configured, in 10 minutes flat—without a manual!

The abbreviated. menu-driven installation process avoids several harsher aspects of Net-Ware 286: the overnight disk surface test, the tedious linking of board and disk drivers, and the necessity to reformat the entire hard disk for Net-Ware. With 3.0 you can leave a DOS partition on your hard disk, no linking is required, and surface testing is strictly optional (thanks to advanced error-handling techniques). You also can reconfigure the network without shutting it down.

In addition, you no longer need to guess at the right settings for parameters like disk cache buffers, directory cache buffers, and so on. The NOS optimizes them automatically for changing levels of network activity.

Old Face, New Features

Once NetWare 386 is up and running, you'll notice that most of NetWare

Several NetWare 286 add-ons will come free with NetWare 386, including disk mirroring and the Btrieve data access software. SQL capability, however, will still cost extra.

All software that runs on NetWare 286 will run on the new platform. The NetWare 386 server can be any 386 machine with 2MB of memory and a healthy amount of disk storage. The software handles both DOS and OS/2 workstations, and Novell expects it to take no more workstation memory than does Net-Ware 286—the least gluttonous memory hog among the major network players.

Novell plans to release *NetWare 386 3.1* in early 1990, with simultaneous support for multiple transport protocols. The NOS won't provide global name services, however, until late next year.

At \$7995, NetWare 386 costs more than twice as much as its predecessor



The Deskpro 386/33: A 33 MHz Made From Scratch

The advent of the 33-MHz 386 computer was so predictable that many PC makers designed their 25-MHz models so that they could just pop in a 33-MHz processor and a few PALs later on. COMDEX Spring was awash in these instant 33s, but the Compaq brand name was noticeably absent. While Compaq generally prides itself on being first with PC innovations, it decided to make the Deskpro 386/33 from scratch rather than reheat its 25-MHz desktop. The result is a far more powerful PC, one that could turn your biggest computing job into a cakewalk.

To begin with, the Deskpro 386/33's Intel 82385 cache controller copies frequently requested data into 64K of 25ns cache (twice the size of previous models) so that you don't lose any of the 32 percent speed advantage a 33-MHz processor has over its 25-MHz counterpart. You also can kick the 386/33 into overdrive for graphics and scientific applications; it has separate sockets so that you can use both the Intel 80387 math coprocessor and the even-faster Weitek 3167.

The Deskpro 386/33 ships with 2MB of 80ns interleaved memory on a 32-bit memory board that is expandable to 16MB, as much as OS/2 can address. It is interleaved so that two 4K memory

pages can be addressed simultaneously, giving the new machine a hit rate of 98 percent. And Compaq has added some of the largest, fastest hard drives available and more places to put them.

There's room for three third-height devices fronting the machine's newly styled cabinet and two in the back. But if your application is really a storage hog, you could fill those two drive bays with a single 650MB monster with an average access time of 18ms and a 1:1 interleave ESDI controller whose data transfer rate is 15 mbps, about 50 per-

cent faster than most drives operate. You can fit another of these devices up front under the floppy drive for a belt-busting 1.3GB worth of internal storage. The other hard drive option is an equally fast 320MB ESDI drive. A new version of Compaq's Fixed Disk Expansion Unit will take two more 650MB drives for a total memory potential of 2.6GB.

Normally, the Deskpro 386/33 offers six 8/16-bit and one 8-bit Industry Standard Architecture I/O slots. A floppy/hard disk controller is built into the motherboard, as is a VGA display controller, saving you two slots over prior models. But if you opt for one of the ESDI drives, you'll have to sacrifice an 8/16-bit slot. A 5¼-inch 1.2MB floppy is standard, as are serial, parallel, and mouse ports.

The Deskpro 386/33 comes three ways: The floppy-only Model 84 will be around \$10,500, the Model 320 with a 320MB hard drive will go for around \$15,000, and the Model 650 with the monster drive will sell for around \$19,000. in airline overhead luggage racks. And you can see the display even in sunlight and from odd angles that would defeat LCDs.

It doesn't run off batteries, and the cabinet measures only 16 by 9½ by 8 inches, but the standard configuration includes three 8/16-bit and three 8-bit expansion slots. Even if you install serial and parallel ports, floppy and hard disk drives, and an external color monitor, two 8/16-bit and one 8-bit slot remain unfilled. If you need more, Dolch offers a snap-on expansion chassis with three 16-bit slots, a power supply, and a fan.

You get a generous 4MB of standard RAM, four times the amount in the older 20-MHz model, and you can boost that to a maximum of 8MB without leaving the motherboard.



Inexpensive 4-bit scanners offer only 16 levels of gray, which leaves some images harsh and unnatural. You can get 256 levels of gray—not just more than enough to produce natural-looking images but more than the human eye can distinguish—from 8-bit scanners. But you can't miss noticing the latter's 50 percent higher prices.

That's where the new flatbed Hewlett-Packard ScanJet Plus desktop scanner really starts looking good. It gives you 8-bit scanning with 256 shades of gray but costs only slightly more than its 4-bit predecessor, the ScanJet.


Considering that each square inch of an image scanned at 256 gray shades and 300-dpi resolution occupies 90K of storage, you may hesitate to flex the machine's muscle—until you must read in images that are too light, too dark, or printed in color.

The ScanJet Plus's controls allow you to increase or decrease contrast infinitely, compared with the three-position switch on the earlier scanner, and a new dial enables you to lighten or darken the



Ricoh hopes that ROAP specs catch on as an industry standard and has lined up an impressive list of vendors to get things started. At press time, more than a dozen manufacturers offered controllers for the PC Laser 6000/EX and the 15/EX: Advanced Vision Research, Bell & Howell, Conographic, Destiny Technology, Eicon Technology, Everex, Hanzon Data, Intel, Laser Graphics, LaserMaster, PCPI,

RIPS, Rastek, Tall Tree Systems, and Western Digital.

The controllers cover a broad range of price and functionality. For example, Hanzon's PC Vista board provides 512K of memory, HP LaserJet emulation, printer sharing, and ethernet LAN connectivity for \$499. 



Unjumble Fax, Voice, and Data Transmissions

This is the age of low-cost communications devices that offer instant connections between offices and home offices around the world. But after trying to juggle voice calls, fax, and modem transmissions on the same phone line, you may be driven to spring for an expensive dedicated data line. One alternative is Fax/Phone Switch II.

With this modem-size unit hidden on your phone line, you can run voice, modem, and facsimile off a single line without mixing them up. The best thing about the Fax/Phone Switch II is that it's automatic, requiring no toggling once installed. No buttons or switches mar its gray cabinet; even the internal surge suppressor resets by itself.

The switch incorporates patented sound-recognition algorithms to determine whether an incoming call is voice, fax, or modem; it then connects the appropriate device to the phone line.

The device doesn't rely on

counting the number of rings to screen incoming calls as some switches do. Instead, it puts the burden on callers, with a digitized voice prompting them to say "telephone" to route the call to the phone. For modem or fax transmissions, the accompanying tone signals the switch to bring the appropriate device on line.

At a suggested retail price of \$179, the Fax/ Phone Switch II can pay for itself in dedicated line charges in a matter of months. It works with answering machines, PBXs, key phone systems, and single-line phone hookups. The manufacturer says the unit supports all modem and fax protocols.

The switch doesn't allow you to talk on the phone while using the modem or fax. Nor can you record an incoming message or screen junk fax. You must connect the switch as the first device on the incoming line, or anyone picking up a telephone connected up-

stream from the Fax/ Phone Switch II will interrupt data transmissions on that line.

If you can't connect the switch upstream from everything, you'll have to install a \$50 Line Manager accessory on each extension. Then anyone who picks up the phone during data transmission will hear a busy tone, and transmission will continue unimpeded. A Network Printing Power Play

Pages per minute isn't the only cap on printer throughput. If your printer serves a dozen network users in a graphics-intensive environment, the speed of the printer controller and its available memory can cause significant bottlenecks.

The Silentwriter LC 890XL laser printer from NEC Information Systems pops the top on throughput for multiuser graphics applications with an Atlas controller from Adobe Systems. The Motorola 68020-based Atlas gives the LC 890XL three times the processing speed of NEC's LC 890 PostScript printer, which was built around the 68000 chip, NEC says.

So despite the same 8-ppm printing speed as the LC 890, the new system generates a page of graphics in a fraction of the time. That speed can help keep your group working when several members are preparing a common document, or





DataSaver 600

Low-Profile Power Protection for Critical Missions



Cuesta has put 600 watts/75V of backup power into its DataSaver 600's slimline cabinet so that in the event of a blackout, you have 15 to 18 minutes to safely shut down your computer system.

Buy a standby power unit, and you've bought data insurance, hardware protection, and peace of mind. But in most cases, you've also bought a bulky, weighty box. Some newer uninterruptible power supplies (UPSs) feature a slimmer, more functional design but can protect only a few hun-

dred watts of equipment for a relatively short time.

The \$985 DataSaver 600 from Cuesta Systems cuts the bulk factor down to size and ups the power factor to 600 watts/75V. That boost should give you 15 to 18 minutes to safely shut down a 300- to 600-watt system. The unit is meant for users of

mission-critical applications such as accounting, for CAD/CAM workstations, and for network file servers in engineering, architectural, and medical offices.

At a trim 2.3 inches high, 17.75 inches long, and 15 inches wide, the DataSaver 600 looks more like a power-director device. It fits neatly between your monitor and computer and even provides a keyboard light that helps you see what you're doing if an outage blacks out the room.

A well-thought-out front panel houses the on/ off switch, often at the rear of other UPSs; an illuminated bar graph that shows you approximately how much power is left after the juice stops, in 60watt segments; a charge light that indicates when the unit is replenishing its sealed batteries; and a mode light that shines green when you're on AC power, red on DC (back-up). An alarm sounds when the unit switches to DC, which takes about 2 milliseconds. The lead-acid gel cell batteries can hold a full charge for 60 to 90 days; external lead-acid batteries can be connected to obtain more backup time but not more watts or amps.

No UPS is lightweight, but the DataSaver 600 tips the scales at 38.5 pounds, fairly low for a unit with its capacity. The unit has five AC outlets in back, all with spike and transient protection and noise filtering; three provide uninterruptible power. A circuit breaker protects against overload. 3MB on the LC 890. The added memory increases processing speed, and an optional 20MB hard drive helps in other ways. Unavailable on the older NEC, the hard drive saves you more than a few milliseconds by storing fancy fonts and overlays rather than forcing you to create and download them each time. Another plus: You can turn off the system at day's end without losing graphics stored on disk.

NEC's PostScript emulation is licensed from Adobe and includes helpful wrinkles such as support for the printer's front-mounted control panel, with menus to guide you through setup. You get 35 resident fonts and can also download and use Adobe fonts.


electronic form. But despite scanner advances, OCR remains a dream deferred. Products either have required costly specialized coprocessing hardware or just didn't cut the mustard.

Caere Corporation promises to topple these barriers with OmniPage 2.0, an \$895 software-only version of its card-based page-recognition product. The Windows-based OmniPage 2.0 requires a powerful PC platformspecifically, an 80386 machine with 4MB of memory. But it recognizes text from almost all scanned documents, regardless of the number of columns, kind of fonts, use of bold or italic text, and mix of headlines, graphics, and captions. You then can save the text in one of 16 word processing formats or in a 1-2-3, Excel, or dBASE file.

Throughput will be a tad slower than with Caere's \$2495 OmniPage coprocessor board, which speeds through 40 to 115 characters per second. But OmniPage 2.0 incorporates several advances, such as recognizing pages in landscape mode, which aids the scanning of spreadsheet data and newspapers. The interface has received a face-lift—OmniPage can save graphics portions of a page separately and lets you see results without leaving the application. It can run in the background, and you can edit both graphics and text.

OmniPage requires the aforementioned 386 with 4MB of memory, DOS 3.1 or a later version, and a hard disk with at least 5MB of space free. Caere will continue to sell the OmniPage coprocessing board, with the new software, for AT machines at \$2495. Software upgrades for owners of the Omni-Page board cost \$150. Reflex 2.0

Colorful Views

No one can accuse Borland of messing with a winner. It released *Reflex* in 1985, then left the package to fend for itself for three years. But an easy-to-use graphic interface and multiple onscreen hot-linked views of data show that the time of benign neglect is over.

Version 2.0 of the popular flat-file manager is still resolutely nonrelational and lacks a programming language. But the sweep of the other changes makes 2.0 well worth the wait. The handiest change is also the most visible. You now enjoy up to five windowed views: list, form, graph, mail merge, and crosstab. You can even opt for multiple views of the same data base, although not two views of the same kind. And at long last, Reflex struts its stuff in color.

Reflex 1.0 suffers from some annoying limitations: You can't produce a report or print a graph or mailing labels from your data base file. But in version 2.0, you can access the report view from within a file—like any other view-and graph printing is an integral part of the graph view. Reflex formats mailing labels automatically and prints them one, two, or three across-more, if your printer allows it.

Text handling is greatly enhanced by a built-in mini-word processor that can edit fields longer than 254 characters and create memo fields of up to 8000 characters. The new mail merge view is an electronic notepad on which you compose form letters and pick fields. Thanks to a new disk-based architecture, Reflex files are no longer limited by available memory, so you can create data base files as large as 32MB, with up to 65,000 records.

Finally, Reflex is on clear speaking terms with the outside world. Version 2.0 reads and writes a wide variety of file formats, naturally including Reflex 1.x, Quattro, and Paradox, as well as 1-2-3, dBASE, and DIF. The \$249.95 product requires a hard disk, DOS 2.0 or a later version, and 512K of memory. Upgrades are \$75. 



PostScript Printers— Right for the Office

For attention-getting memos and reports, nothing beats a versatile PostScript printer.

PC World tests seven new machines and finds lower prices and higher performance than ever before.

or many business documents, monospaced Courier plus a handful of proportional typefaces in a couple of point sizes just doesn't cut it anymore. That's why Post-Script printers are beginning to usurp LaserJets as the business printers of choice. Their key advantage is abundant, internal, scalable typefaces—faces you can resize at will. With the LaserJet and its compatibles, you must choose fonts of fixed point sizes—from the meager selection of built-in fonts, from expensive font cartridges, or from hard-to-install soft fonts on disks.

The latest round of PostScript printers holds new attractions for business users. The PostScript interpreter still slows printing on pages that combine graphics and multiple fonts, but thanks to processor-laden controllers, overall performance is approaching the LaserJet's. Moreover, although the average PostScript printer's base price is still about twice that of a LaserJet Series II, loading the HP unit with a comparable amount of typefaces and memory makes the price difference relatively trivial.

In this article, we examine seven new PostScript printers ranging from \$4199 to \$7995 in price: Apple's LaserWriter IINTX, Dataproducts' LZR 1260, GCC Technologies' Business Laser Printer, IBM's Personal Page Printer II, QMS's PS 1500, Qume's Crystal-Print Publisher, and Ricoh's PC Laser 6000/PS.

National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL) ran the printers through a battery of speed and PostScript compatibility benchmarks. A printer's page-per-minute (ppm) rating refers to maximum print engine speed: NSTL's tests indicate that actual

print throughput is a tad slower for text and much slower for complex pages. Print quality (sharpness of lines and type, and tonal range) was evaluated by an NSTL review panel. Finally, since not all software includes a PostScript driver, NSTL tested LaserJet compatibility—a feature offered by all but three printers in the roundup; testing revealed compatibility problems with every LaserJet emulation.

More business applications than ever before support PostScript, but Murphy's Law guarantees that your favorite package will be an exception. Fortunately, a handy utility called *Trading Post* can alleviate the problem by translating printer output from almost any application into simplified PostScript (see *The Software Shelf, PCW*, March 1989).

Apple LaserWriter IINTX

The pricey \$6999 Apple LaserWriter IINTX sets a new standard for PostScript printers. It's surprisingly fast, its print quality is second to none, and it uses the same easy-to-change toner cartridge employed by the HP LaserJet Series II. It even supports an optional 20MB hard disk (\$899) to store extra fonts. Its one serious drawback is the lack of a Centronics parallel port, which means you'll need to become more intimate with the MODE command than you might like.

The IINTX uses the highly regarded Canon LBP-SX engine. Despite some ghosting (intermittent fading in large black areas) and a somewhat limited tonal range, this engine delivers the best print quality in the industry, with crisp, well-formed type and sharp lines.

All the printers in this roundup come with at least 2MB of RAM—enough to print a full

page of 300-dpi graphics (off-the-shelf 512K LaserJets stumble at ½ page). The IINTX comes with 2MB, but desktop publishers who need more memory for unusually large numbers of downloaded fonts can have their dealer upgrade the printer to a huge total of 12MB—the largest capacity of any printer reviewed.

Thanks to its in-board 68020-based controller, the IINTX proves that PostScript isn't just for the idle rich. But its 8-ppm engine is no speedster. NSTL tests show that the IINTX falls in the middle of the pack in both text and complex page printing.

Paper capacity (200 sheets) is a bit low for a busy office, but a variety of large-capacity trays and sheet feeders are available from third parties. Envelope printing is straight-

forward, and LaserJet and Diablo 630 emulation are provided.

You can buy a fully functional PostScript printer for \$2800 less than the Apple IINTX, and the lack of a parallel port may be frustrating. Nonetheless, if you can afford the tariff and don't mind fussing with a serial port, this printer offers a winning combination of speed, reliability, and good-looking output.



Dataproducts LZR 1260

Aside from a \$7995 price tag (a tie for the most expensive in the roundup), Dataproducts seems to have hit on a formula for PostScript printer success: a fast, 12-ppm Toshiba engine; a blazing Motorola 68020 processor; 35 scalable typefaces; 4MB of RAM; and a very high 25,000-page monthly duty cycle.

In NSTL speed tests, this printer came in second—but tests of print quality were less impressive. While gray shades were well differentiated and fine lines crisp, fat dots of toner blurred the edges of some characters.

In its stock configuration, the LZR 1260 holds 250 sheets of paper, but an optional (\$895) multibin sheet feeder adds two more



trays for a total of 750 sheets. An optional (\$1095) envelope feeder accommodates 50 envelopes.

Ease of use is not the LZR 1260's strong suit. While the control panel offers complete control of the printer, using it is a bit complicated. Moreover, the LZR 1260 sticks you with four separate steps to replace con-

Methodology

Complex text and images

Camplex text and images printing was tested using a 1-page Ventura 2.0 dacument that included various sizes af Helvetica, a small scanned image, same line drawings, and a bar chart.

Newsletter text and graphics printing was tested using an 8-page PageMaker 3.0 newsletter that included variaus sizes af Helvetica, and harizantal bar

sumables—the least convenient design in the roundup. The only emulation is for the LaserJet.

Despite awkward maintenance and somewhat underwhelming print quality, the LZR 1260 is a good choice for busy offices—at least where bargain price is not a major issue. Users will appreciate the speed and the paper-handling options, while managers will appreciate the heavy duty cycle.

GCC Technologies Business

Laser Printer

Although the \$4199 GCC Technologies Business Laser Printer is the least expensive of the seven printers reviewed, it comes with 2MB of RAM (expandable to 4MB) and a generous 39 fonts and, like the Apple Laser-

Writer IINTX, supports an optional 20MB hard disk (\$779). However, it's the slowest printer in the roundup, and its print quality can be less than terrific. Worse, it holds only 150 sheets of paper, replacing consumables is an inconvenient three-stage process, and there are no emulations at all.

The Business Laser uses the 6-ppm Ricoh 1060 engine, which is capable of producing extremely sharp, tonally balanced pages. Unfortunately, because this engine needs finetuning at the factory (or by a qualified technician), Ricoh-based printers don't always deliver optimal print quality. Output from the Business Laser was mixed: Fine lines were sharp, but distinguishing dark gray



shades from black was difficult—there is no toner density dial to compensate.

Ricoh rates this engine for a light 3000 pages per month, suggesting that the Business Laser may be most appropriate for small offices, especially where budgets are tight and *all* important software includes a PostScript driver. In light of this machine's slow printing, lack of emulations, and awkward maintenance, managers at larger businesses would be wise to spend a little more for a lot more printer.


At \$4999, IBM's Personal Page Printer II is relatively inexpensive. It includes a generous library of 43 fonts, and emulations for the IBM Proprinter and the LaserJet, and it boasts the three magic letters that many purchasing departments require. However, it's not very fast, ranking among the three slowest printers in the roundup.

In many respects (low paper capacity, light duty cycle, inconvenient replenishment of consumables), the IBM and the GCC Business Laser Printer are virtual clones. They

High speed and a 500-sheet capacity make the QMS-PS 1500 ideal for busy offices—but beware its high price and poor print quality. also share the 6-ppm Ricoh 1060 engine, which, as mentioned, requires expert adjustment. Thus, the review unit at NSTL produced excellent output, while the review unit at *PC World* produced graphics that were consistently light and type that was light and occasionally broken.

worse. The Personal Page Printer II offers adequate speed, a fine selection of typefaces, (probably) good print quality, and the IBM reputation. But remember: Both the \$4199 Business Laser from GCC and the \$4495 PC Laser 6000/PS from Ricoh offer similar performance and features at lower cost.

QMS-PS 1500

At \$7995 the QMS-PS 1500 ties for the most expensive printer in the roundup—but it's not without its charms. It's the fastest printer tested, holds a total of 500 sheets, comes with 4MB of RAM (nonexpandable), sup-

ports a hard disk, and boasts a healthy 15,000-page duty cycle—making it a tempting choice for large networked offices. But in this case, high-speed output merely means that this machine grinds out dark, smeary pages faster. And it totally lacks the ability to print envelopes.

The PS 1500 is easy to use, thanks to its well-designed control panel—but replenishing consumables is an awkward two-stage process during which it's easy to spill toner or scratch the imaging unit. The only emula-

tion lets the printer pretend it's an HP plotter.

A Motorola 68020 processor is a big factor in the PS 1500's blazing performance, but speed can't improve the poor print quality of the notorious Ricoh 4150 engine. Dark grays print so densely they're indistinguishable from blacks, and smeared toner along the edges of characters produces shadows. There is no print density control.

Despite speed and high paper capacity and duty cycle, the PS 1500 is overpriced. With all the good buys on the market, why settle for poor print quality, lack of envelope capability, and limited emulations?

Qume CrystalPrint Publisher

For a printer with a 6-ppm engine, the low-priced \$4499 CrystalPrint Publisher is surprisingly fast on some print jobs (although it slows down on others, due to an unusual controller design). Furthermore, the standard 3MB of RAM (nonexpandable) allows plenty of room for downloaded fonts, and the control panel provides easy access to all printer functions. Unfortunately, that's where the good news stops. Print quality leaves a lot to be desired, you're stuck with a stingy 100-sheet paper capacity, and the printer's duty cycle is a light 3000 pages per month. More-



over, consumables must be replaced often and in three inconvenient steps. There are no emulations and no envelope capability.

Although its Casio engine is rated at only 6 ppm, the CrystalPrint Publisher's fast controller helped the unit outpace every other 6-ppm printer in most NSTL speed tests; on the single-page *Ventura* test it even beat several printers with faster engines. Qume attributes this performance to a specialized Weitek RISC microprocessor.

Print quality, however, is quite disappointing. It was impossible to achieve dark, dense blacks without dirtying the page with excess toner and creating smeared and shadowed type.

The CrystalPrint Publisher uses a clone of the Adobe PostScript interpreter, and while it worked fairly well, NSTL found two minor PostScript compatibility problems. First, one NSTL test file would not print at all (Qume says that problem has been corrected in newer releases of the printer's firmware). Second, the printer does not accept downloaded Adobe typefaces.

However, PostScript compatibility is a moot point. The CrystalPrint Publisher's print quality is simply not good enough for discerning users.

Ricoh PC Laser 6000/PS

Ricoh's low-priced, fully functional Post-Script printer, the \$4495 PC Laser 6000/PS, is virtually identical to IBM's Personal Page Printer II. The 6000/PS uses the same 1060 print engine that Ricoh supplies to IBM (and GCC Technologies); furthermore, in NSTL speed trials, the 6000/PS and Personal Page Printer finished within seconds of each other (that is, toward the bottom). The only significant differences are that IBM includes 43 fonts, while Ricoh supplies 35; IBM offers a one-year warranty at its dealers, while Ricoh offers 90 days on site; and IBM wants \$4999, while Ricoh will settle for \$4495.

PC World's 6000/PS review unit produced the best print quality of the three Ricoh 1060-based printers and had the best tonal range of any printer in the roundup. However, some characters were a bit thin, consistently breaking up and showing jagged edges.

Should you buy the Ricoh 6000/PS, as opposed to one of the other two low-cost Ricohbased printers? It's not an easy call. The 6000/PS has fewer fonts than the IBM and lacks Proprinter emulation—but it costs \$500 less. And while the 6000/PS offers

LaserJet emulation (which the GCC lacks), it costs \$300 more. When you get right down to it, given the importance of fine-tuning the print quality, you probably should not base your selection on brand but should simply pick the unit off the showroom floor that delivers the best-looking output.

Find the Hidden Best Buy

Over a year ago, *PC World* surveyed the field and praised the QMS-PS 810 for its speed and good-looking output (see "PostScript Printers' Progress," May 1988); had it been less expensive, it would have rated a Best Buy. Although the printer has not changed since last year (which is why it is not reviewed here), its price has dropped to \$4995, making it a better buy feature for feature than any printer in this roundup.

Even if this year's catch contains no Best Buys, you'll find some attractive choices. If you're looking for the cheapest PostScript buy-in, GCC's Business Laser Printer delivers full functionality for \$4199—although it lacks emulations. A mere \$296 jump to \$4495 buys you the nearly identical Ricoh 6000/PS, plus HP emulation.



What Price Power?

Four 25-MHz clones deliver lightning performance at rock-bottomprices.

But only one of these speedsters is trouble-free.

n the market for a 25-MHz 80386? Finding big-name-PC prices too steep? You'll be happy to discover there's an abundance of inexpensive generic clones that can make even *Windows/386* and OS/2 run fast enough to behave like decent operating systems.

The four systems reviewed here are clearly commodity items. Three—the Amax PC/386, the Blackship 386/25, and the Zeos 386-25/DT—were selected so we could eval-

ate their motherboards, popular boards found in a number of generic PCs. The fourth, the CompuAdd 386/25, was included because of the manufacturer's growing market share and prominence. Taken together with our last 25-MHz 80386 roundup ("25-MHz Speedsters—A Buyer's Market," PCW, June 1989), in which we reviewed (among others) the Micro Express ME 386-25 (AMI motherboard) and the Hertz 386/25 (Intel motherboard), this article completes our survey of the major 25-MHz motherboards in cloneland. Using our ratings, you can make an educated guess about the performance of other systems that use one of these boards.

Just as with the last roundup, National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL) put the systems through a series of rigorous performance and compatibility tests. With one exception, the systems finished in a virtual dead heat in the NSTL speed trials—and came close to tying the high-priced industry standard, the Compaq Deskpro 386/25.

For price comparison, the systems were set up in *PC World*'s standard 25-MHz configuration: 4MB of 32-bit RAM, a 1.2MB floppy drive, a 150MB ESDI hard disk, at least one parallel and one serial port, a VGA video board and color monitor, a 101-key keyboard, and DOS 3.3 or a later version. All systems included ROM-based setup and support for an 80387 or a Weitek 3167 math coprocessor.

Rock-bottom price is what these PCs are all about. Each system comes in a generic,

full-size AT chassis. The box supports three stacked, externally accessible half-height drive bays and two stacked, internal half-height bays; also standard are a front-panel reset button and a keyboard keylock. The systems lack bundled software, except for an occasional utilities or diagnostics disk, and disk caching is not included. User manuals are lean, at best. Only the CompuAdd 386/25 includes an on-site warranty as standard.

Amax PC/386

Priced at \$6650 in the *PC World* configuration, the Amax PC/386 is the cheapest system in this roundup, but only by \$25. Unfortunately, it seems a bit shaky: Under certain conditions, it locked up.

The Amax PC/386 comes with a Micronics motherboard, revision 3A. As with all the systems in this roundup, a memory board holds all 32-bit CPU-speed memory. The board is expandable to 8MB using 256K-bit memory chips; an optional 8MB daughter-card uses Single In-line Memory Modules (SIMMs) and raises the memory ceiling to 16MB of CPU-speed RAM.

Clock speed is software switchable between 25 MHz, 8 MHz, and 6 MHz, or you can use a slide switch on the back panel to toggle between 8 MHz and 25 MHz. Flipping the switch, however, sometimes locked up the system. On occasion, floppy disk I/O errors caused the PC to freeze as well; it took a power-off reset to restore operations.

The Micronics motherboard supports two 8-bit and five 8/16-bit slots. In our standard configuration, only four slots are left free. Because of a movable serial/game-port bracket, one slot can't accommodate boards with ports.

While the Amax's price is attractive, we can't recommend a PC that locks up so easily. Amax says it is now shipping revision 5A of the motherboard, which is trouble free—so make sure to tell the salesperson you want revision 5A.

\$225 gets you 64K of memory cache instead of 32K, which may speed up such memory-intensive operations as multitasking under OS/2. And although the Blackship uses a Micronics motherboard, it's the improved revision 5A.

Like the Amax, the Blackship sports two 8-bit and five 8/16-bit slots. The two machines also share a 16MB memory ceiling and turn in nearly identical performance. However, upgrading the Blackship is significantly cheaper. For example, a 4MB daughtercard costs \$630 less from Blackship, and an 8MB daughtercard is \$1260 cheaper.

Error-free operation and the low-cost upgrade make the Blackship 386/25 a tempting buy, but keep in mind that on-site service is not available more than an hour's drive from Blackship's Fremont headquarters. The Micro Express ME 386-25 (reviewed in June) shares this failing, but it's considerably faster and sells for hundreds of dollars less.

CompuAdd 386/25

Considering the CompuAdd 386/25's low \$6675 list price in the *PC World* configuration, CompuAdd's free year of on-site service is indeed a generous touch. Unfortunately, the unit we reviewed came in last on all of NSTL's performance tests, and it displayed two major compatibility problems.

First, a conflict between the Adaptec ESDI controller and the system BIOS prevented the CompuAdd 386/25 from running *PC-Kwik*. Second, the system could not access the floppy drive from within *Windows/386*. At this writing CompuAdd is shipping its 386/25 with a Western Digital 10007 ESDI controller, which the company claims solves the first problem, while a new version of the Award system BIOS purportedly solves the second.

The proprietary motherboard holds one parallel and two serial ports. One 8-bit slot and six 8/16-bit slots are built into the board, and you end up with five of them free. A 32-bit memory board supports upgrade options of 1MB to 4MB (in 1MB increments) using 256K SIMMs, or 4MB to 16MB (in 4MB increments) using 1MB SIMMs (SIMM types cannot be mixed).

Despite CompuAdd's growing prominence, the 386/25 review unit we received doesn't make the grade. The cleaned-up version's new BIOS and controller could add up to a sensible buy, especially considering the free on-site service. However, we can't recommend a machine sight unseen.

Zeos 386-25/DT

At \$7135 in the *PC World* configuration, the Zeos 386-25/DT is this roundup's most expensive machine. Furthermore, the system's Mylex motherboard (version 007) has some serious problems.

The Zeos 386-25/DT comes with your choice of an AMI or a Mylex motherboard. We chose the Mylex to round out our survey of motherboards because the board includes several unique features. For example, its memory cache is expandable to 128K—four times larger than the CompuAdd's cache and twice as big as the Micronics motherboards'. NSTL tested the machine with a full 128K cache. More important, in addition to one 8-bit slot, four 8/16-bit slots, and a propri-

etary 32-bit memory slot, the board sports two 32-bit expansion slots that comply with Intel's de facto standard.

The memory board that comes with the system holds up to 8MB in 1MB SIMMs—an underwhelming amount of CPU-speed RAM for a 25-MHz machine. However, you can install an 8MB, 32-bit memory expansion board from Intel in each Intel slot to reach a maximum of 24MB of CPU-speed RAM.

Unfortunately, the Mylex 007 motherboard proved quite problematic. The first one we tested suffered heatstroke within 15 minutes

and died. Its replacement worked better but still occasionally locked up because of overheating. Zeos agrees that the Mylex mother-board is more temperature sensitive than the AMI and says that Mylex is working on the problem.




Zeos Edges Other Clones in 25-MHz Speed Trials

NSTL testing finds surprisingly similar (and highly impressive) performance from four low-priced 25-MHz 80386 systems. The Zeos 386-25/DT takes top honors, but the Blackship 386/25 and the Amax PC/386 are only a hair slower. CompuAdd's 386/25 brings up the rear. None, however, match the performance of Compag's Deskpro 386/25.







Methodology

All machines were tested with a coprocessor and a 256K extended memory disk cache, except in the 1-2-3 benchmark. The Blackship 286/25 was configured with a 170MB hard disk and 5MB of RAM. The Zeos 386-25/DT was configured with a 170MB hard disk and 4MB of RAM. The Amax PC/386 was configured with a 90MB hard disk and 2MB of RAM. The CompuAdd 386/25 was configured with a 160MB hard disk and 4MB of RAM. The Compaq Deskpro 386/25 was tested with a 300MB hard disk and 3MB of RAM.

Microsoft Word 4.0

A Microsoft Word macro loads a 35-page, 140-paragraph document and performs search-and-replace and spell-checking operations. The first page of the document is then printed. Although the results of the benchmark depend primarily on processor and memory access speeds, display adapter and hard disk speeds are also contributing factors.

dBASE III Plus 1.1

The dBASE III Plus test measures the time required to prepare and print a report of past-due invoices. The report includes calculated fields and is based on three files: a 500-record customer file, a 1000-record invoice file, and a 2000-record item file. When disk caching is not used, the random access speed of the hard disk is, after processor speed, the most significant factor in this benchmark. With disk caching, sequential read performance becomes more important than random access.

In this benchmark, a 1-2-3 macro executes a series of recalculations using five different formulas within a 75-by-75-cell matrix. Because there are few screen updates and no disk access is required, the results depend almost entirely on processing and memory access speeds.

Microsoft C 5.0

The Microsoft C benchmark measures the time required to compile and link XLISP, a public-domain program composed of 25 C source code files. The most important factors in this benchmark are processor and memory access speeds. The performance of the hard disk is also a factor; generally, disk caching has little effect.

In this benchmark, a three-dimensional sample drawing is retrieved and dis-played using AutoCAD's EGA driver. The zoom function is used to display the drawing from various perspectives; then the full drawing is printed. The results of the benchmark depend primarily on the speeds at which the pro-cessor and coprocessor operate and at which memory is accessed. The performance of the display adapter and the hard disk also have some effect.



Once those thermal problems are solved, high performance and an expandable cache could make the Mylex an impressive motherboard. Until then, you're probably better off with the AMI-motherboard version of the 386-25/DT—which makes the system \$1000 cheaper in the PC World configuration.

Good and Cheap

Although this roundup produced no Best Buys, it certainly proves that you can get 25-MHz performance without selling the family jewels. It also reminds us of the dangers lurking in the clone jungle.

The Blackship 386/25 is a smart buy, offering low-cost upgrades and no serious problems. Presumably, now that Amax is shipping the revision 5A Micronics motherboard, its PC/386 is also worthy.

We can't recommend a machine we haven't tested, but tests of the Micro Express ME 386-25 (reviewed in the June issue), which uses the same AMI motherboard, suggest that the AMI version of the Zeos 386-25/DT might well have ended up as top-dog clone and the lowest priced.

With complex business software demanding faster hardware, it's refreshing to see that some lowball 25-MHz systems deliver good value. Just bear in mind that shopping on the low end is only for those who are comfortable peeking under the hood. •



Communications Software: Easy Choices

If you're in the market for a communications package, look beyond the old standbys.

Our top picks are packed with features, easy to use, and surprisingly low priced.

ith all the unknowns involved in going on line, asynchronous communications may never be as easy as sending express mail or a fax. Yet, many communications programs complicate the process unnecessarily. Although new features such as data compression, powerful script languages, and multitasking boost productivity, few programs deliver those benefits in easy-to-use form.

Fortunately, you can have your cake and eat it, too. As this roundup of nine communications packages reveals, differences between the functionality of formidable, high-cost heavyweights such as *Relay Gold* and *Smartcom III* and inexpensive, easy-to-use programs such as *ProComm Plus* and *Qmodem SST* are relatively insignificant.

Despite the similarities, the programs fall into three broad groups. Boyan 4.0, Pro-Comm Plus 1.1b, and Qmodem SST 4.0 are low-cost shareware and ex-shareware programs built around a dialing directory. Crosstalk XVI 3.7, Mirror III 1.0, and Freeway Advanced 3.0 vary in functionality, but all support Crosstalk XVI's command syntax. At the high end are Crosstalk Mk.4 1.1, Relay Gold 3.0, and Smartcom III 1.1a—powerful packages targeted at corporate users and developers.

Top Tools for Telecommunications

The best package for you depends on how you use your modem. If you're a BBS habitué, you'll want a centralized dialing directory that can automatically queue and redial numbers. If you commonly send and receive files, look for multiple error-correction protocols. Micro-to-mainframe users need a capable set of terminal emulation drivers.

However, because your needs may change over time, look for a program with a judicious mix of all these features—and more. A built-in text editor is advisable, as is the ability to set up macros to hot key to your word processor. A file manager with full directory support is also valuable. On line, you'll want keystroke macros for automating command input, as well as a capture buffer that saves text that has scrolled by.

In the realm of error-correction protocols, Kermit and XMODEM are essential, but it's nice to have extras such as CompuServe-B and ZMODEM, too. If you plan on using a high-speed error-correcting modem, you'll need a streaming protocol such as

YMODEM-G that error-checks transfers without slowing throughput.


Another must is a script language that you can use to log on to services and transfer files while you're away. A learn mode that records your keystrokes to create log-on scripts is also useful. Programmers will want windowing commands for sculpting custom front ends, and math functions for online financial applications.

A remote option is important if you (and others) need to send files to and receive files from an unattended PC. A first-class remote mode requires that callers supply a password and then guides them with menus once they are admitted. Make sure the package admits those using different programs and gives authorized users access to DOS.

Multitasking support, another time-saver, comes in many forms. Five of the reviewed programs let you start a file transfer, then work in another application while the transfer proceeds in the background. Other programs achieve the same end by running under multitasking environments such as *Desqview* or *Windows/386*. Finally, a few programs aimed at power users let you run simultaneous sessions over Tymnet or using multiple modems.

Speed is important, but as National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL) benchmarks reveal, it depends primarily on your modem. Exceptions to this rule are *Mirror III*, *Relay Gold*, and *Smartcom III*, which boost speed with data compression schemes when connected to matching programs. However, MNP 5 modems can do the same job faster. Background file transfers vary considerably: With a 1-2-3 macro executing in the foreground, *Mirror III* offered the fastest background file transfers.

Ultimately, the critical performance factor is the time required to learn and use the program. If you're constantly slogging through menus or hunting through the manual, your time and money are wasted—thus, the bona fide charm of *ProComm Plus*.



ProComm Plus 1.1b

Datastorm's \$89 ProComm Plus has undergone only minor upgrades since PC World reviewed it in September 1988, but it still wins a Best Buy. Coupling a flexible interface with comprehensive features, ProComm Plus is recommended for everyone from weekend BBS cruisers to corporate communicators.

ProComm Plus offers both a 1-2-3-style command line and mnemonic <Alt>-key shortcuts that summon full-screen menus and pop-up dialog boxes. Easy installation, lucid documentation, and on-line help make it easy to jump in quickly without scouring the manual. The defaults are well chosen, and the program is easy to customize.

Datastorm wisely put the dialing directory at the heart of *ProComm Plus*. You can




easily view and modify parameters, locate entries by keyword or number, and tag entries for queue dialing and redialing. The limited editor lacks word wrap, but a word processor can be summoned by a hot key.

ProComm's extensive list of 13 file transfer protocols and 16 keyboard-mappable terminal emulations ranks with the heavy-weights. *ProComm* notes the time it will take to transfer a file and shows progress



with a bar graph. During PC-to-PC communications, you can split the screen into send and receive windows to simplify on-line chats. The superb menu-driven remote access mode resembles a simple BBS. It offers two levels of security and can lock out callers not on an approved list.

ProComm's BASIC-like script language may not equal Mk.4's CASL or Mirror III's PRISM, but it provides almost everything you need for automating unattended sessions. It lacks powerful math functions but supplies a debugger, conditional and loop commands, and windowing commands for creating custom menus. The learn mode per-



forms capably, and you can set up multiple groups of keyboard macros.

ProComm Plus nearly equals the power of packages twice its price. That, along with ease of use, makes it the best value in the roundup.

A wide variety of terminal emulations has added to ProComm Plus's success.

Qmodem SST 4.0

The Forbin Project's *Qmodem SST* almost beats *ProComm Plus* at its own game. Version 4.0 adds a top-notch remote mode and editor while maintaining its friendly inter-


Communications Packages: A Close Call

There are scant performance differences among these communications packages, save for the fast throughput of the three data-compressing programs—Mirror III, Relay Gold, and Smartcom III—when used with non-data-compressing modems. Mirror III is the overall winner among the programs that provide background transfers.

Methodology

All tests were conducted using a poir of 12-MHz Compaq Deskpro 286s.

A 100K ASCII file is tronsferred using o poir of 9600-bps Microcom QX/V.32c modems, which feature outomotic MNP Level 5 doto compression and error correction. The benchmork file is sent between two systems running the some communications program, using the fostest protocol specified by the vendor for this configuration (usually YMODEM-G).



This test is the same as the 9600-bps test except it uses a pair of Hoyes 2400-bps modems. The benchmark uses the fostest protocol (specified by the vendor) for performance. These 2400-bps modems do not provide error correction, so the transfers were made using an error-correcting protocol.

face. You can pick up this shareware bargain for \$45 or test-drive it for only \$15; a printed manual costs \$15 extra. However, because *Qmodem SST* lacks *ProComm*'s extensive terminal emulations and transfer protocols, it takes second place in overall value.

Like *ProComm Plus*, *Qmodem* relies on a central dialing directory, mnemonic <Alt>-

key commands, and pop-up menus. Unlike ProComm Plus, it has no 1-2-3-style menu, but there is context-sensitive help. You can easily search and sort directory entries, tag them for queue dialing, and attach notes. The customizable WordStar-like editor is the best in the roundup, offering cut and paste and automatic reformatting. Qmodem SST's remote mode matches rival ProComm Plus's.

On line, you get keyboard macros, a chat mode, and a top-notch file transfer status screen, but the list of transfer protocols is mediocre, lacking Kermit, ZMODEM, or CompuServe-B. Fortunately, you can download these protocols from a BBS and add them. Terminal emulations are limited to ANSI and VT 100.

The script language is similar to *Pro-Comm Plus*'s, and the learn mode is the best in the roundup. You can start recording a script from the dialing directory and automatically link it with an entry.

Qmodem SST's low price and easy operation make it a suitable alternative to *Pro-Comm Plus*. But look elsewhere if you need a lot of emulations or protocols.

Mirror III 1.0

Mirror began its days as a cheap Crosstalk XVI clone, but this latest version leaves the old foe far behind. In fact, this edition rivals that other Crosstalk—the powerful Mk.4. For only \$99.95, SoftKlone's Mirror III adds a dialing directory, data compression, background transfers, and a sophisticated script language. If not for a cumbersome on-line interface (and a sloppy manual that fails to

mention the dialing directory), *Mirror III* might best *ProComm Plus* for top honors.

Mirror III suffers from SoftKlone's attempt to retain Crosstalk compatibility while moving toward a ProComm interface. The pop-up menus, hot keys, and context-sensitive help are competent, but when you exit some modules, you're dumped to a Crosstalk XVI-like status screen. On line, you must issue Crosstalk commands—no menus or hot keys are available.

The top-notch directory provides queue dialing and tagging, and as with *Qmodem*, you can add notes to entries and start the learn mode from the directory. The *Word-Star*-style editor is better than most.

Mirror III supplies plenty of error-checking protocols and terminal emulations. Its data compressing protocol is efficient, and MNP compression is available as a \$34.95 add-in. Mirror III also runs the fastest background transfers in the roundup.

But *Mirror III*'s remote mode is limited. There's no password security—your only protection is to prevent remote callers from tapping certain commands, such as exit to DOS. The host mode lacks menus, so callers must issue *Crosstalk* commands.

The program's powerful new PRISM script language is second only to Mk.4's CASL, and it's easier to use. As with structured BASIC, you get plenty of advanced math and windowing commands, and you

can encrypt scripts. PRISM lacks some of CASL's extras, but it lets you run Crosstalk scripts without modification, which you can't do with Mk.4. Debugging is automatic—the editor opens when you encounter a glitch.


Despite its bare-bones interface and disappointing manual, *Mirror III* is highly recommended. *Crosstalk* users can switch horses with their scripting skills intact, and corporate programmers can draw on PRISM, background operations, MNP transfers, and extensive terminal support.

Crosstalk Mk.4 1.1

With its heavy-duty CASL language, Crosstalk Mk.4 is a good choice for corporate programmers who need to create custom applications. The \$245 Mk.4 provides the most extensive list of protocols and emulations in the roundup; and though it lacks background transfers, you can juggle up to 15 simultaneous sessions on Tymnet. The many bugs that marked Mk.4's debut have been eradicated, and the manual is greatly improved. However, the interface is still needlessly complex. Mk.4 bests Relay Gold and Smartcom III in the battle of the heavyweights, but most users will want an easier alternative.

Mk.4's interface consists of CASL-constructed menus tacked on to a *Crosstalk XVI*-like command mode. Unfortunately, the limited light-bar menus are poorly integrated with much of the program. You can use hot keys for some off-line tasks, but once

on line you must choose between menus and CASL commands; and only about half the familiar *Crosstalk XVI* commands still work. On-line operations are further complicated by poor contextual help and the lack of a constant status line.

Mk.4 has no dialing directory to pull entries and parameters into one place. Instead, setup and dialing functions are spread across five menus, with parameters scattered in another eight. The built-in editor is adequate.

If you can endure the interface, *Mk.* 4 delivers a bundle. It offers a wealth of protocols, including ZMODEM, YMODEM-G, and the speedy, proprietary Dart protocol.

Mk.4 excels at terminal emulation, with twice as many on-line disguises as its nearest rivals; its DEC emulations are the best in the roundup. The remote mode, however, is as limited as *Mirror III*'s.

Mk.4's complex CASL language, which holds its own as a stand-alone language, can help smooth the thorny interface. In fact, some CASL programmers have used it to develop a *ProComm*-like interface. Based loosely on BASIC and *Crosstalk*, CASL provides advanced windowing and math functions and a superb debugger.

Boyan 4.0

Like *Qmodem SST*, *Boyan 4.0* is a shareware program with a sweet, swift interface. Yet the \$55 *Boyan* has some rough edges. There is no text editor or predefined scripts for major services, the script language is trying, and the "learn mode" is primitive. Even

with the complete \$65 package (which includes a printed manual), phone support isn't part of the deal. And like *Qmodem SST*, *Boyan* is short on terminal emulations and lacks background transfers. Still, the basic package is sound, offering numerous protocols, a slick file manager, context-sensitive help, and a competent manual.

Boyan opens with a lucid, *ProComm*-like dialing directory. <Alt>-key combinations summon pop-up menus. If a call doesn't connect, *Boyan* adds the phone number to the queue and tries later.

Boyan delivers 12 protocols, including ZMODEM, and its remote host mode rivals *ProComm Plus*'s. However, *Boyan* emulates only VT 52 and VT 100 terminals. *Boyan*'s

script language is as powerful as *ProComm Plus*'s, but the cryptic syntax will put off most users. Worse, there's no true learn mode. You must scroll back through the autocapture buffer and pick out the prompts and responses to build a log-on script.

Boyan's file manager is the best in the roundup; you can copy, delete, edit, execute, and even upload a file. Other extras include keyboard remapping and keyboard macros that can execute scripts.

Boyan can't match Qmodem SST, but it's still a pretty good deal. With a little spit and polish, Boyan could be a contender.

Smartcom III 1.1a

Hayes's \$249 Smartcom III has plenty of sophisticated features, but you have to slog through a baffling interface to reach them. You get extras like data compression and multiple sessions, but terminal emulations are limited. Also, the program wouldn't work with a few Hayes-compatible modems such as Practical Peripherals' 2400SA.

The polished menu- and prompt-driven interface appears friendly at first, but with no hot keys, you soon tire of menu hopping—changing protocols on line takes 13 key-

strokes. Worse, setting up entries is a bear. Lacking a unified dialing directory, *Smart-com III* stores modem parameters in a Connection menu system and emulations and filtering settings in a separate Activity menu system. The idea is to save time by sharing one connection with several activities. Unfortunately, remembering which parameters are stored in which menu is difficult.

Still, Smartcom III delivers some excellent features. The auto-capture buffer is the best in the roundup, the text editor is second only to Qmodem SST's, and the superb file manager nearly equals Boyan's. The remote mode is good, and you get an ample choice of error-correction protocols. You can choose to compress and/or encrypt files for use with any protocol. Compressed files transfer quickly on Hayes V-series modems but are slower than Mirror III's and Relay Gold's on standard Hayes modems. Version 1.1 adds the ability to run two simultaneous sessions on a pair of modems or four sessions on a Hayes V-series X.25 modem (eight sessions if you have two X.25 modems).

On the downside, you're limited to ANSI and VT 100/102/52 emulations. Due to *Smart-com III*'s 512K overhead, background transfers work only with small applications, and the feature is poorly documented.

Smartcom III's SCOPE language almost rivals Mk.4's CASL, offering windowing, a trace mode, and conditional branching and labels. SCOPE's syntax is unconventional, but a helpful script editor lets you select commands from a menu.

Smartcom III provides some unique extras. But its confusing interface, paltry emulations, and incompatibility with some non-Hayes modems hinder its appeal.

Relay Gold 3.0

Like *Mk.4*, *Relay Gold* is aimed squarely at corporate users. Advanced features include efficient data compression and background transfers, a highfalutin script language, and 15 multiple sessions via Tymnet. However, the \$295 price is steep, there are few error-checking protocols, and remote access is limited to other *Relay* users. It's an obvious

choice for linking up with IBM mainframes that also run *Relay*, but most users should look elsewhere.

Relay Gold opens with a well-designed function-key menu, but there are no hot keys. You get a central dialing directory, but to add a new entry, you must copy and edit an existing one. The command-driven text editor is difficult to use and lacks word wrap.

File transfer options are limited to Kermit and XMODEM—you don't even get YMODEM-G. However, if you communicate with another *Relay* user (and that's the idea), you can tap the company's proprietary datacompressing protocol. Background transfers are easy—with *Relay Gold*'s slim 192K RAM overhead, there's plenty of room for other applications.

Relay Gold's main strength is its links to IBM 3270 and VM systems running Relay. When you dial in, you're logged on smoothly and welcomed with familiar menus. Relay Gold's support for 3270 emulation boards is unique to the roundup, but other emulations are limited to VT 100/102/52 and IBM 3101.

The script language supplies near-CASL-like power, but its structure and syntax are quirky. BBS fans take note: The learn mode works only with TTY emulation, so you'll have to hand-tailor ANSI-based scripts.



Relay Gold is the best bet for corporations that link up to IBM mainframes. Beyond this turf, however, it can't compete.

Crosstalk XVI 3.7

Crosstalk XVI's continuing popularity is something of a mystery, since its dated features make it an ill-advised choice. The tenacious veteran still lacks menus and dialing directories, and there's no learn mode or text editor. Even die-hard Crosstalk users should consider switching to Mirror III.

Totally command-driven, *Crosstalk XVI* can be an effective tool once you master its two-character commands. The *Crosstalk* language doesn't match up to *ProComm Plus*'s, but at least it includes a debugger.

Protocols are few, and the proprietary protocol was the slowest in the roundup. Remote options are just as primitive as *Mirror III*'s. Although *XVI* lacks an editor, you can call other word processors.

Version 3.7's new background mode is a mixed bag. Foreground operations zip along, but background transfers drag and often crash. *Crosstalk XVI*'s lack of advanced features might be forgiven—but not with its \$195 price tag and crude interface.

Freeway Advanced 3.0

Kortek's \$139 Freeway Advanced 3.0 is advanced in name only. It lacks macros and predefined scripts, and emulations and remote options are limited. These foibles could be tolerated if not for the tedious, multilayered menu interface. You can bypass the menus and issue Crosstalk commands, but users seeking an easy switch from Crosstalk XVI should look to Mirror III instead.

Freeway's buggy installation utility forces you to copy files manually, and the sketchy documentation is baffling. For example, you're told to press <F8> and <F9> to enter command mode, but only <Ctrl>-<Shift>-X does the job.

Freeway Advanced is menu-driven to a fault, overwhelming you with a barrage of light-bar and pulldown menus. The program lacks hot keys in off-line mode, so even simple tasks require that you plow through layers of windows. Fortunately, once you're on line, you can use <Alt>-key commands.

You divvy up phone numbers into nine password-protected directories, but each holds only 12 entries, and you can't copy entries between directories. Calls can't be queued, but a built-in timer lets you start calls automatically. *Freeway*'s list of file protocols is extensive, but its editor is the weakest in the roundup—you can't edit *Crosstalk* scripts or save and load ASCII files.

Freeway Advanced's background mode is slow. The remote mode is limited to other Freeway users, offers only one level of password security, and bars callers from DOS.

To create a script, you must choose between two poorly documented languages. You must use the cryptic Autopilot to edit scripts recorded in the learn mode, but you have to use *Crosstalk* syntax to create scripts from scratch. The learn mode scripts, often crash because they rely on simple pauses instead of waiting for on-screen responses. Note: Many Crosstalk XVI scripts won't run without modification.

With its limited features and awkward interface, Freeway Advanced fails to live up to its name.

maxim in mind, ProComm Plus wins a Best Buy by delivering a heap of features in an easy-to-use package, and Qmodem SST comes close with a lower-cost package. Mirror III and Crosstalk Mk.4 deliver the greater power, but *ProComm Plus* offers the best balance. Boyan, Smartcom III, and Relay Gold are worth a look for users with specific needs; Crosstalk XVI and Freeway Advanced aren't recommended.

The gap between low-cost, easy-to-use communications packages and heavyweight titans is closing fast. Most users are better off taking the easy way out.



Alpha Four: Easier Than dBASE

Alpha Four reads and writes
dBASE files without the headaches
of dBASE programming.

But its ease of use comes with a hefty price tag.



Scott D. Palmer hen it came out with *Alpha/three*, Alpha Software gave nonprogrammers an elegant, easy-to-use data base manager that adopted the *dBASE* file format as its own. *Alpha Four* doesn't conform to all the characteristics that experts consider essential in

a fully relational data base, but the new program does include relational features that deftly enable multifile data entry and reporting. Users also get unparalleled ease in creating custom menu systems. The program improves on *Alpha/three's* data validation, maintains multiple indexes for each data file, and offers fast, simplified searching.

In capacity, Alpha Four is a far cry from Alpha/three. It can handle 2 billion records per data base (up from 65,536) and allows 128 fields per record and 256 characters per field. Each data base can be associated with an unlimited number of lookup data bases, and lookup tables have grown to 255 rows from 128. You can now have seven index files (up from five), which are updated automatically when you add new records. Index files let you display records sorted on a field without having to do a time-consuming sort operation, so you can search, view, and print any record in any data base almost instantly.

However, *Alpha Four* lacks mouse support and strong macro capabilities, and the program is still quite slow. Moreover, at \$549 *Alpha Four* is relatively expensive: *Q&A* costs \$389; *Professional File*, \$299.

Entering Data the Easy Way

You create a data file in *Alpha Four* the same way as in *dBASE*, by entering a field's name, type, and length in response to on-screen prompts. More sophisticated features, such as calculations, multifile links, and data entry validation, are accessible through *Alpha Four*'s extensive field rules menu. For example, if you want to limit discounts to just your best customers, you can use a field rule to display a zero in the Discount field automatically when the value in the Quantity field is less than 100.

You can enter and edit records in single-record or table view. If you're viewing a table of records and want to change the field on which they're sorted, just pop up a list of available index files and pick a new one. About the only data entry feature missing from *Alpha Four* is the ability to split the screen into windows, a capability found, for instance, in Borland's *Reflex* (see *Product Outlook* in this issue).



Sets and Menus







SuperCalc5: A Giant in 1-2-3's Shadow

Amid all the furor over 1-2-3, Computer Associates has shipped a beefy SuperCalc5.

It's no speedster, but it has worksheet linking and nifty graphics.

f the folks at Computer Associates are feeling a bit miffed, they should be forgiven. *SuperCalc5* shipped in February and offers a slew of advanced features, yet at press time, the spreadsheet world was talking of little besides the split-level upgrade of 1-2-3 (see the 1-2-3 preview, *PCW*, May 1989).

That's too bad, because the number of new features in *SuperCalc5* is impressive, particularly in data entry and editing. It offers linked and multipage worksheets, minimal recalculation, expanded searching, an undo command, and better file format support. In addition to handling 1-2-3 files, for example, *SuperCalc5* now reads and writes *dBASE* files.

But this power comes at a price. In NSTL tests, SuperCalc5 was pretty sluggish. And while Computer Associates claims Super-Calc5 can run on a standard PC, the program's lethargy and big RAM appetite make that claim dubious. The full program uses about 440K of memory, compared to 317K for Quattro and 214K for 1-2-3 release 2.01, though you can save about 65K by disabling the graphics module, minimal recalc, and undo. To handle large worksheets, you really need expanded memory. (The program automatically recognizes up to 32MB of expanded memory.)

Forging Worksheet Links

SuperCalc5's most convenient new feature is its ability to create worksheet links. It can link external worksheets, like 1-2-3 release 2.2 and Excel, and also creates links within a worksheet, like 1-2-3 release 3.0.

If you have a summary file for monthly sales, for example, you can use SuperCalc5's link capability to derive the total sales from a separate worksheet that contains individual sales records. When you load the summary file, SuperCalc5 looks for the linked file—in RAM or on disk—and gets updated information.

Multipage spreadsheets also help make sense of your data. You can look at the relationships between cells, find formulas that refer to incorrect or empty cells, and get a map of your worksheet. And where SuperCalc4 lacked data regression capabilities, SuperCalc5 has them in spades. You can perform not only linear regression but quadratic and cubic as well, and you can have up to 87 independent variables probably more than you'll ever need.

Likewise, SuperCalc4's already solid graphics have become spectacular in Super-Calc5. You can create five types of bar and



RAM-resident package called *Silverado* that adds relational data base features to 1-2-3; at press time, the company was planning to release a version for *SuperCalc5* in November.

Report capabilities are impressive. In addition to the standard litany of multiple headers and footers, horizontal and vertical titles, and customizable borders, *SuperCalc5* supports reams of plotters and printers (including PostScript); it also produces slides. As before, the package includes Funk Software's *Sideways* for unbroken printouts of extra-wide spreadsheets.

When it comes to performance, Super-Calc5's record is spotty. In NSTL tests, it beat 1-2-3 2.01, Quattro, and Microsoft Excel in just one test—loading a worksheet—provided minimal recalc was disabled. On the recalculation and column-move tests, it was more than three times slower than 1-2-3.

Overall, SuperCalc5 serves up an attractive array of features. Its linked and multipage worksheets are great for reporting, and its 3-D graphs and charts are impressive. Finally, such data tools as auditing and data regression make SuperCalc5 particularly appropriate for financial analysis and presentations.

WINDOWS EDGES INTO THE WORKPLACE

Windows isn't just for desktop publishers anymore. Thanks to Windows/386 and a handful of breadand-butter applications, business users of all stripes are taking the first steps toward full-time graphical computing.

For years, Microsoft's Bill Gates has been telling us there would be guys like Rick Bertuzzi. Now, finally, there are.

Bertuzzi is an office manager for Stockton, California—based Shawver Trucking. Every morning his PS/2 Model 60 boots up *Microsoft Windows*, which stays there until the end of the day. He manages the company's books with Microsoft's *Excel*, retouches scanned route maps with Z-Soft's *Paintbrush Plus*, and puts out correspondence with Samna's *Ami*. Bertuzzi is even creating an on-line hypertext rate guide with Owl International's *Guide*. And after struggling with *Windows*' MS-DOS Executive, he fi-



nally masked the environment's uglier side with Publishing Technologies' *PubTech File Organizer* (see the *PubTech File Organizer* review in the *Windows* Special Report in this issue). "I haven't seen a DOS prompt in so long, I've forgotten what it looks like," says Bertuzzi.

So committed is Bertuzzi to *Windows*' graphical approach to computing that he recently retired his copy of *WordPerfect 5.0* in favor of *Ami*. "*WordPerfect* is a fantastic program," he says, "and I'm sure it has a lot of great features that I'm giving up. But moving charts and text between *Excel* and *Ami* and quickly switching between applications is just too good to resist."

A Kinder, More Reliable Environment

Bertuzzi and his co-workers represent a new breed of PC users: people who do the bulk of their computing in Windows. For much of its four-year history, users widely dismissed Windows as slow and fat. If you had to use applications like PageMaker or Designer, you grudgingly endured Microsoft's answer to the user-friendly Macintosh—but only until the task was completed. Then you hied yourself back to the familiar DOS prompt.

But today, Windows has matured to the point that it's catching on as a full-time operating environment for ev-

eryday users. "Early versions of Windows were pretty awful," says Alan Lambert, material control manager for Tiburon Systems, which provides technical support to the U.S. Navy. "But Windows/386 handles DOS applications far better." So much so that the Navy now insists that its PCs run the environment whenever possible to promote a standard user interface.

And standardization is finally putting *Windows* over the top. "Give *Windows* users a new *Windows* application, and they already know how to get a lot done with it," says Bill Bailey, a senior member of Du Pont's consulting team that spe-

cializes in energy management. The group uses Micrografx's *Designer* to illustrate the advantages of the company's energy management systems to clients. "We're not power users, and we don't want to be," Bailey says. "We need to be able to use a program right away, even if we haven't used it in several weeks. *Windows* lets us do that."

Power Windows

This new breed of *Windows* devotees may not be power users, but they do have one thing in common with them: serious hardware. 80386 PCs are the norm, as is 2MB to

4MB of add-on memory. Users also tend to favor *Windows/386* over the standard issue *Windows/286*.

George Roukas, manager of business systems analysis for a Fortune 50 financial services company, notes that while a 386 system requires a bigger investment up front, the possible payoffs can be far bigger. "The benefits *Windows/386* brings in ease of use and superior applications more than offset the cost," he says.

As evidence, Roukas points to a key monthly operating report that traditionally took a director and two business analysts three weeks to churn out. Now, thanks to a cus-

tom *Excel* template and lightning-fast PCs, "the job is done in a couple of days. That's definitely worth the cost of some 386s."

DOS Rules—For Now

Of course, the adoption of Windows isn't universal. Joseph Little, a special assistant at the New Jersey Department of Education, loves Excel but limits his use of Windows to the runtime module bundled with the spreadsheet.

"As far as graphic interfaces are concerned, we're committed to the Presentation Manager," he says. "I know a lot of people advocate *Windows* as a stepping-stone to OS/2, but our expe-


rience has been that every step you take brings along its own complications. We'd rather jump directly to OS/2."

Even Eikon Systems, which developed the *Windows*-based *ClickArt Scrapbook* +, confesses that *Windows* isn't the company's default interface. "It's not a completely supported environment yet," admits Eikon vice president David West, whose company has a vested interest in the success of Microsoft's brainchild. "There's still no good, fast programming editor for developers. And end users still need first-class data base and accounting packages."

Similarly, while you'll find Windows applications on 75

percent of the 120 PCs at Toyota's Georgetown, Kentucky, facility, office automation specialist Larry True says there's little interest in making *Windows* the company's standard environment. "It's a lot faster and easier to type DOS commands than to click around with the mouse," True says. "Our users want the freedom to use whatever works best at the moment."

Many of the users polled by *PC World* are finding that *Windows*—especially *Windows/386* powered by a 386 and with plenty of RAM—works best for them. But the environment still has a long way to go before it wins over a



computing generation brought up on the A> prompt. For every Rick Bertuzzi in this world, there are still plenty of people like Bill Reader.

"I use Windows quite often, and I've experimented with it as my standard environment," says Reader, manager of the information center at Northern Telecom in Richardson, Texas. "But I still feel most comfortable with plain old DOS. When my boss says he wants something now, I panic and get out of Windows pronto—and jump back to the command line as fast as I can."

GRAPHS FOR NUMBER CRUNCHERS

harting packages are like restaurants: They may shine in preparation or in presentation, but seldom both. Xerox Graph focuses on preparing data, leaving drawing and other fancy presentation features to its sibling, Xerox Presents (see the review in "Special Report: Windows," PCW, May 1989). Xerox Graph is for fast, professional-

level on-screen analysis and quick printouts, not for elegant slides.

Scheduled to ship by the time you read this, Xerox Graph is the \$295 Windows version of Cricket Software's Macintoshbased Cricket Graph.

This intuitive program couples a solid set of charts with plenty of numeric functions—enough to do some serious number crunching without cranking up your spreadsheet.

Although aimed at data analysts, scientists, and engineers, *Xerox Graph* makes it easy for anyone to create a chart. You simply enter data in a

built-in 40-column worksheet or import it from, say, 1-2-3, click on the desired data sets, and select one of 12 chart types displayed in an on-screen toolbox. Along with the usual bar, stacked bar, line, pie, and word charts, you get scatterplots, and even polar plots (scatter graphs that plot points from the center of a circle)—perfect for engineers calculating load distribution. Serious data analysts can plot a humongous 2700 data points per chart, compared with Xerox Presents' mere 20.

Xerox Graph's chartediting functions fall short of those offered by Freelance Plus, but you can tap 3-D effects, 256 colors (with EGA or VGA setups), and four scalable Bitstream fonts (Fontware is part of the deal) as well as fit several graphs on a page. You can change fonts and move almost any on-screen object with click-and-drag, Maclike ease.

But data analysis is where *Xerox Graph* struts its stuff. You can transform data with logarithmic, exponential, and trigonometric functions, among others. If you're a

finance maven, you'll love the ability to "fit" data using linear, polynomial, logarithmic, or exponential regression forms. Both linear and logarithmic axes are supported.

Xerox Graph gets a gold star for importing .WKS, .WK1, SYLK, DIF, ASCII, and Cricket Graph 1.2 files, and data via Windows' Clipboard. File export, however, is limited to the Clipboard and Windows metafiles, which leaves most desktop publishers out in the cold.

Printer, plotter, and slide output support is extensive, thanks to Windows. You can even send image files to Autographix slide centers using a built-in telecommunications utility. Unlike with Xerox Presents, however, you can't create "slide shows" on your monitor.

Like most Windows products, Xerox Graph demands an 80386 or fast 80286 system and a minimum of 1MB of RAM. Does it merit your consideration? It can't match the presentation power of a Harvard Graphics or the analytical prowess of a StatPac Gold. But it's cheaper than either of those, offers enough muscle for many number crunchers, and is very easy to use. And that may be worth the price of admission.

A MACRO PROCESSOR FOR WINDOWS

Automate almost anything under the Windows sun with Tempo.

John Walkenbach

C users long ago discovered the advantages of *Keyworks*, *SmartKey*, and other macro processors. Instead of repeating some mind-numbing task over and over, you could automate it by recording your keystrokes as a macro and playing them back at the touch of a key.

Windows users, unfortunately, have been without such handy aids. But with the arrival of *Tempo for Windows* from Affinity Microsystems, you can at last automate tasks in the *Windows* environment

and within any *Windows* application. You could easily create a macro, for example, that opens several applications and automatically positions and resizes the windows to your liking.

Tempo is easy to learn and use, but the \$99.95 premier release will be strictly bare bones, lacking even a macro editor. In addition, macros in the prerelease version examined here couldn't pause to accept user input—a failing the vendor may fix when the product ships in July.

If you've used a DOS macro processor, you'll find Tempo quite familiar. To record a macro, press Tempo's changeable hotkey combination and start typing. When you're done, a dialog box asks you to supply a name and a key assignment. You run the macro by typing its hot key or double-clicking its name from a pulldown menu. A savvy user will be spinning macros in about 10 minutes. If you get stuck, context-sensitive help is available.

Tempo does offer some clever extras. Unlike its more powerful DOS cousins, Tempo records both keystrokes and mouse movements—a boon for desktop publishers and anyone else who manipulates graphics. You can also control playback speed, make a macro repeat, direct macros to call other macros, and so on. To insert such control statements, you merely pause during macro recording and select the function from an onscreen list.


Better still, you can restrict a Tempo macro to a specific application. For example, you could define two <Alt>-U macros one to underline a range in Excel and the other to underline text in Ami. Tempo will sense the context and play back the proper macro. You can also designate "universal" macros that play back in any Windows application. Since macros are stored on disk, there is practically no limit to the number or size of macros you record.

Before you plunk down your money, just remember that you can't edit Tempo macros. And though it works with Windows 2.0 and Windows/ 386, Tempo won't work with run-time versions of Windows or control DOS programs running under Windows' aegis. But if you need macro support in Windows, Tempo is a serviceable product—and for now, it's the only game in town.



icrosoft Windows has always been a weak sibling compared with the resource-rich Macintosh. Pub-Tech File Organizer 2.1 from Publishing Technologies aims to change that. This program fixes Windows' most obvious flaw with an icon-driven front end that mimics the Mac, but in a distinctly different way. And unlike some Windows utilities, PubTech lets novices set up custom desktops in no time flat.

As on the Mac, you manipulate predefined icons that represent disk drives, subdirectories, program and data files, printers, and so on. For example, to print an ASCII file, you drag its icon to the printer icon. Double-click a data file created with a *Windows* application, and *Pub-Tech* loads the two together. Exit *PubTech*, and the entire desktop—icons, window size and placement, and so on—is saved and will be reloaded for the next *Windows* session.

When you first load *PubTech*, you get a pulldown menu packed with utilities, and a group of icons for installed printers, disk drives, and other hardware. Click a drive icon, and a window fills with miniature folders representing subdirectories; click a folder, and all the various files and folders it contains are laid out in apple-pie order. To copy or move an entire folder of files, just drag its icon to the desired destination with the mouse.

Much of this is standard Mac fare, but *PubTech* offers far more control over the desktop environment. With a menu command, you can automatically tile, overlap, and cascade windows; shrink icons to fit more of them on screen; change screen fonts; straighten up a messy desktop; view directories in a hierarchical tree format; or assign a hot key to run any application or .PIF file. *PubTech*

also tosses in an integrated text editor and move, disk copy, and backup and restore utilities, along with *Norton*-like unerase, file find, and text search utilities.

This newest *PubTech* is also a RAM miser. It normally needs 49K, but if expanded memory is available, it shrinks to 18K. Better still, if you minimize a program to an icon on the desktop, you liberate most of its RAM—something *Windows* can't do. Need still more memory? A few quick commands consolidate memory throughout the *Windows* environment.

PubTech sounds amazing, but it just does what Windows should have done in the first place. And for that alone, it's worth the money. —William Urschel





hen PC World reviewed Pioneer Software's Q+E 1.2 in the January Windows Special Report, we felt the program might someday join the august ranks of dSalvage, dQuery, and other classic dBASE utilities. You simply clicked a listed .DBF file, and Q+E poured the data into a neat worksheet format. To view, edit, or build complex queries, you just highlighted the desired columns and selected commands from pulldown menus. You could even view two different parts of the same file and save queries for later use. Unfortunately, Q+E was fatally flawed—it couldn't update index (.NDX) files tied to .DBF files, display linked records from related files, or produce anything but rudimentary reports.

Q+E 2.06 addresses some of the original objections and adds Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) support, which allows other *Windows* applications, most notably *Excel*, to

access and directly query .DBF files. However, this upgrade still falls short, and the program isn't yet a serious tool for *dBASE* users.

For example, Q+E updates only a *single* index file at a time. Although this approach may minimize the need for sorting, most data base applications cross-reference data using multiple indexes. Changing the data in Q+E without updating every related index corrupts the entire application. $dBASE\ IV$ support is also lacking, especially annoying in the case of the new .MDX format, which stores multiple indexes in one file. Q+E won't win awards for easy data entry, either. Finding fields that don't fit in a window means laborious scrolling. Worse, there's no data validation feature for controlling changes to a data base.

On the bright side, Q+E's use of Windows' DDE suggests exciting possibilities, especially for Excel users. For example, you can enter an Excel cell formula that references dBASE data via Q+E. Change the .DBF data with Q+E, and it's immediately changed in the Excel worksheet (at present, this is a one-way facility). You can even link Excel to a Q+E query that selects certain fields and records. The downside: Because Q+E can't consolidate dBASE data (say, sales by region and product), you have to do this summarizing in dBASE.

A final disappointment is Q + E's claim to SQL query capability. The program executes only four SQL commands—Select, From, Where, and Order. The ability to nest commands and the internal optimization that gives SQL its punch are nowhere to be found.

Pioneer Software promises to deliver the goods in the \$149 Q+E 2.1. If Pioneer makes good, Q+E could be a winner. But before you lay down your money, check this space. — $Alan\ C.\ Schwartz$

ith *DynaComm*, Future Soft Engineering brings windowing—and all its obvious benefits—to the tempestuous world of communications. For example, you can edit a file in one window while running a *DynaComm* session in another, stack eight windows (and files) on screen at once, and move data between applications with the *Windows* Clipboard.

Among *DynaComm*'s many features is an ample list of file transfer protocols—including XMODEM CRC, YMODEM, Kermit, YTERM, and Future Soft's own—and eight terminal emulations, ranging from IBM 3101 to VT 220. Modem controls are impressive: You can configure the modem using various command sets and specify the serial port's transmission rate, flow control, and more. Also available is a remote feature that enables you to use *DynaComm* as a bulletin board. True to its *Windows* heritage, *DynaComm* supports *Windows*' Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) protocol, so you could write a script that downloaded stock quotes from Dow Jones and automatically updated an *Excel* worksheet.

At first glance, *DynaComm* looks confusing. Although its button-down interface is well organized and easily understood, with individualized pulldown menus for each communications function, navigating the course is an exercise in windows bureaucracy. Sending a file, for example, involves nearly a dozen steps.

Fortunately, *DynaComm* contains a very efficient script recorder that captures your keystrokes and mouse selections as you progress through this labyrinth of menus. Once the routine is saved to file, you can run it from a pulldown menu using a single mouse click.

The lack of a dialing directory is also a nettling problem because there's no way to view dialing entries alongside their phone numbers, script files, or parameters. *DynaComm* keeps phone numbers and parameters in separate files, which you must load before each transfer. Other bugs and design quirks are more than just annoying. For example, DynaComm sometimes refuses to acknowledge the file you want to transfer, and it often freezes during ASCII and XMODEM transfers when used with $Windows\ 2.1$ (that latter problem can be corrected with a software patch). Furthermore, unless you remember to click the Hang Up option when exiting a service, DynaComm assumes you're still connected. Unlike most communications packages, DynaComm doesn't inform you about a transfer's progress or its completion, leaving you to wonder whether the program has locked up or not.

These problems detract from *DynaComm*'s most significant features, such as total modem control and bulletin board capability, but they're not incapacitating. If you need *Windows*-based communications, this is one program you can't ignore. —*Judy Getts and TJ Byers*

n the networking gold rush, LAN versions of popular data base management systems (DBMSs) are at best a stopgap measure. Today's solution—adding file and record locking to a standalone DBMS—is wearing thin for LAN users. Performance is often slow, and you can't access data on another attached server. MIS chieftains are even more disgruntled. Despite the lure of lower costs, they're hesitant to entrust critical minicomputer and mainframe applications to PC LANs. They fret about chaotic data security and the profusion of programs written in incompatible DBMS languages.

Worry no more. A new genre of data base server packages based on Structured Query Language (SQL) is changing the rules of the gameso much so that corporations are poised to move complex applications from expensive minicomputers to affordable LANs. PC users can enjoy faster performance and greater access to corporate data, and the MIS crowd should be satisfied by more capable security features. If data base servers live up to their promise, minicomputers and traditional LAN-based DBMSs may be things of the past.

SMART SERVERS

The problem with typical multiuser data managers is that each workstation does more than it needs to. With the average LAN pack, the server is a passive receptacle that stores files, while full-fledged data managers on each PC take on all processing and record-locking tasks. Typically, you must copy an entire data base from the server to the PC and process the query locally. In the meantime, other users have to wait in line for that data base.

Data base servers take a more active role. Using a client/server architecture, they divvy up processing chores. The client software on the PC can ask for specific records, letting the server process the query. Because workstation users don't have to copy huge chunks of server data, LAN performance improves, and more data remains unlocked and available to other users. And with a smaller processing burden, client PC users have more RAM (and time) available. You can even get by with low-end ATs, or possibly XTs, at each node, offsetting

the additional expense of the

Another plus: You don't have to standardize on a single front end. For example, with SQL Server from Microsoft, Ashton-Tate, and Sybase, some users will be able to access the server with dBASE IV, and others with Paradox or DataEase. In fact, the front end needn't be a data manager at all. Spreadsheets could call on centralized server data for quick analysis, and word processors could link up for mail merge. Microsoft is preparing a version of Excel that will speak to SQL Server.

The new breed of servers offer specific benefits to programmers and MIS professionals, too. They enforce strict data integrity rules and advanced, centralized datalocking techniques, so applications are better behaved and data more secure. New transactional commands act like a trail of electronic bread crumbs, letting you roll back discrete updating tasks if errors occur. This level of security is essential for transactional applications such as claims processing, in which the server is bombarded with constant updates and queries. And

programmers will no longer have to add potentially buggy dataintegrity and security features to their programs.

With SQL-based servers and the proper communications links, large organizations will be better able to share company data. With most current offerings, you can query multiple linked servers running the same program—and you needn't know where the data resides. Because SQL is spoken by servers, front ends, and most minicomputer and mainframe data bases, you'll soon be able to query larger systems transparently. Yet wide-area distributed processing will require arduous programming. Challenges include reliably updating multiple hosts and translating between the servers' different SQL extensions. Eventually, however, you'll be able to perform relational joins and updates across multiple systems.

CROWDED HOUSE

The data base server field is getting crowded quickly, and the alliances between client and server vendors are Byzantine. In addition to SQL Server, data base servers are available from Gupta Technologies (SQLBase), Novell (NetWare SQL), and XDB Systems (XDB Server). OS/2-based servers from IBM, Microrim, Oracle, and possibly Lotus are due by year's end (see "Vendors Draw Battle Lines for SQL Data Base Servers," Industry Outlook, PCW, July 1989).


SQL Server, based on OS/2 LAN Manager, may be the server to beat. PC World's evaluation of a beta version revealed swift performance and advanced security and transactional logic (see "SQL Server: LAN-Tailored Data Management," PCW, April 1989).

Microsoft can expect tough competition from IBM and Oracle, especially among LANs that need to link up to larger systems. Big Blue's OS/2 Database Manager, an extension of its OS/2 Extended Edition, is due in the third quarter. Oracle's Oracle LAN Server, due by the end of the year, promises links to Oracle data bases on DEC VAX and UNIX platforms. Meanwhile, Novell's NetWare SQL should eclipse Gupta's lead among DOS-based LANs.

CLIENT CONFIDENTIAL

The market for front ends is even more competitive than the server arena: Every major data base company promises a SQL version that will support one or more of the servers—most are due by year's end.

Adding server support is no easy trick. Each front end must provide specific support for the Application Programming Interface (API) and the server's SQL extensions. One of the thorniest issues is how to translate between native data base lan-

guages and SQL. Slow or tedious transactions could negate the server's performance edge.

Because SQL is a set-oriented language, working with tables of data rather than records, setoriented programs such as Paradox and DataEase should prove to be natural front ends. With an upcoming SQL version of Paradox 3.0, you'll make queries as you would in the stand-alone version, by checking off requests on a query-byexample (QBE) table. If the data resides on the server rather than on the local drive, the program will automatically translate the request into SQL, ask the server to process it, and return the answer set. DataEase SQL will use a similar set-oriented process, based on its form-querying function.

Due to the record-oriented nature of dBASE, dBASE compati-

bles have a rougher time of it. Each product takes a different tack, and each has its problems. dBASE IV lets you choose between a SQL and a dBASE command set, but if you choose dBASE, all data must be translated twice, since the answer arrives in dBASE form. Version 1.1 of dBASE IV should streamline this process, offering QBE queries for SQL Server. With the dBXL and Quicksilver versions for Oracle LAN Server, WordTech has devised a hybrid SQL/dBASE language. It supports Oracle's SQL extensions, but some dBASE commands no longer function. Fox Software's upcoming FoxPro data manager will support FoxServer, Fox's OEM version of NetWare SQL due this winter. FoxPro's language will combine full SQL and dBASE command sets. Although thorough, the language may prove unwieldy.

Microrim's upcoming Atlas front

end may offer the best solution, pointing to a future in which front ends will be light, flexible tools rather than extensions of complex stand-alones. Using a graphics-based Presentation Manager interface, the *Atlas* front end is designed specifically for the *Atlas* server. Rather than perform translations locally, the server will handle QBE-to-SQL translations, freeing up the front end for other tasks.

ARE YOU READY?

Who needs a data base server? If your office is dedicated to transactional tasks with frequent updates, such as accounting applications, a data base server makes good sense. It's faster and more secure than a LAN file server and cheaper and more flexible than a minicomputer. Banks, insurance companies, and airlines should be ready customers, as should mail-order, manufacturing, and retail firms.


Data base servers aren't limited to transactional tasks. Any large, busy LAN should enjoy considerable performance gains, and servers are a good solution for departments that want the freedom to choose a variety of application packages to access the same data.

Still, the new servers aren't for everybody—they'll require deep pockets and heavy support. You may need to dedicate a multimegabyte 386 to data base server tasks. Programmers will need to rewrite applications, and LAN administrators will have their hands full fine-tuning and monitoring.

Still, the benefits are clear for transactional environments and for any LAN user who's tired of waiting in line for data.



THE BUSINESS BBS:

BETTER COMMUNICATION ACROSS THE BOARD

nformation may be power, but not if you have to play phone tag to pass it on. That's why businesses that communicate with remote offices, send files and messages internally, or provide customer support rely heavily on courier services and electronic mail. But increasingly they're also using the hacker's conversation piece—the electronic bulletin board (BBS).

Many companies happily run their own bulletin boards, both large and small. Others have discovered that by renting investment space on a commercial board, they can try the BBS idea for a minimal investment. It comes down to a matter of certainty: Unless you have a pretty good idea of what a BBS will do for your company, you're better off renting; you can always move up later on if the BBS pans out.

The Mechanics of Modem Access

Like E-mail, a BBS cuts down on waiting time. Instead of idling on the phone, a user can summarize a problem, send it in, and get a well-researched answer the next day. But only on a BBS can you post the exchange publicly so others can read and use the information.

A number of local area network packages offer BBS-like capabilities, but a true BBS is a remote affair. For strictly internal communications, bulletin boards work best at companies with widely distributed offices and plenty of PCs, modems, and communications software in each office. BBSs open to the outside world—for customer support, say—naturally require modem-toting customers (which explains why BBSs are so popular with computer companies).

In setting up your own BBS, you can choose from such solid, ready-to-use packages as

RBBS-PC, TBBS, Fido, and dozens of others. A business-oriented BBS should be accessible to more than one user at a time and for quick response requires an AT or better as host. But the most important thing to know about running your own BBS is that it takes time. Even if the board is for internal company use only, someone has to fix files and tweak the hardware.

The Merits of Renting

If you like the idea of a BBS but don't want the hassle of setting it up yourself, commercial BBS operators will gladly rent you a space on their boards, often called a restricted access area. Renting saves you the investment in hardware, software, and maintenance. As a bonus, your users gain access to whatever other services the commercial operator may have to offer.

For example, Bob Mahoney runs Exec-PC, a 90-phone-line BBS for hire in Shorewood, Wisconsin. Exec-PC charges a company \$2400 a year for a private area on its board. For \$60 a year, users with full access rights can not only communicate with the company but also participate in 30 public forums and download files from 50,000 shareware, public-domain, and demo programs for PC, UNIX, Macintosh, and Amiga systems.

Out on New York's Long Island, ten phone lines are alive with The Sound of Music (SOM), Paul Waldinger's BBS. A tireless BBS promoter, Waldinger has attracted such companies as Hayes, WordPerfect, Quarterdeck, and AST to his board. Like Exec-PC, The Sound of Music can ease the sting of maintaining a busy BBS yourself. SOM charges companies that use the public-access phone line \$5000 a year. If you want a private number—which you can include in your advertising—the yearly cost climbs to \$10,000. Users pay \$75 a year.

Coke's Nationwide Network

Four years ago, the folks at Coca-Cola Foods in Houston decided there could be more to communication than refreshing pauses out in the hallway. "We were playing massive phone tag trying to keep in touch with our sales managers," says hacker-turned-MIS-manager Cheryl Currid. The company needed to swap sales data and spreadsheets fast, but it didn't have E-mail and

was spending a fortune on courier services.

So Currid got a couple of ATs, a pair of Hayes modems, and a copy of a userware BBS program called *RBBS-PC*. Today the nationwide network links 17 regional sales departments and a couple of plants and carries 3000 messages and 3500 files a year. "The BBS has saved us more than \$300,000 in courier and express charges over the last four years," says Currid, "yet it hasn't needed maintenance in a year and a half"

Despite her enthusiasm, Currid advises approaching a BBS project carefully. Spend time with the documentation, and be prepared for long hours at the BBS's front end. For example, she says, *RBBS-PC* runs right out of the box, but you have to flip a lot of switches to use its many advanced features. "We had to choose 70 or 80 communications parameters," says Currid. "You have to decide things like how many times the phone should ring before the BBS picks it up. It's tedious, but you only have to do it once."




Even a small company BBS can pay dividends without a big investment in time or equipment. While the Coca-Cola Foods BBS zips spreadsheets across the country, an unattended XT in a home in El Cajon, California, takes three calls on a good day. The XT belongs to Michael Reaves, a software engineer who works at Computer Associates, 30 miles away in San Diego. Computer Associates has 6000 employees and recently passed the billion-dollar mark in gross sales. But it doesn't spend a dime on Reaves' little bulletin board. And neither does anyone else.

"It's a freelance project," Reaves says. "I set

it up because of the number of technical questions I was getting." He directs his callers to the BBS to download tips, technical pointers, or handy utilities from the XT's 130MB hard disk. An unattended cottage industry, Reaves' BBS projects a kind of down-home simplicity; it doesn't even have special

BBS software. Instead, Reaves uses ProComm Host, a script file included in Datastorm's *ProComm Plus*.

Calyx: Bypassing the BBS

Despite the Coke and Computer Associates success stories, a BBS can be an uncertain

venture. And a smart company knows enough to shift its resources when things don't work out. Renting space on an existing BBS makes sense when you can't predict the amount of traffic. That wisdom won't be lost on Calyx Corporation, a high-tech Wisconsin company that sells medical and dental software. Two years ago, the firm was considering creating its own BBS. In what may prove to have been a smart move, it gave the job to Exec-PC instead.

"The bulletin board hasn't been used as much as we'd hoped," says Barbara Schnoll, Calyx's marketing director. "We promoted it, but there hasn't been a lot of interest." The BBS has been a bust because Calyx's other support strategies make it redundant. Calyx has a very strong newsletter, Schnoll says, offers free reseller support, and responds to questions within 4 hours. The flow of information at Calyx is so good, nobody needs the BBS.

Investment Dynamics Quits CompuServe

You can set up a company forum on a large public E-mail system like CompuServe or The

Source, but setup and on-line charges can be steep. "We had been using CompuServe, but the cost was incredible," says Tim Stevenson, a systems analyst with Investment Dynamics Corporation. A financial management group in Hartland, Wisconsin, Investment Dynamics issues daily investment advice to its 60 clients, mainly banks and savings and loan associations. Its BBS needs are somewhat unusual: Every morning between 8 and 8:30, the company uploads a single sheet of advisory information; after 8:30, the customers call in and download it.

Initially, the company created its own forum on CompuServe, but when Stevenson saw the costs, he began to have doubts. "Our subscribers would call in on toll-free numbers, which we were paying for," he says. "Also, CompuServe billed us for all the messages posted, whether they were picked up or not." After a year and a half, Investment Dynamics' CompuServe tab was hitting \$4000 to \$5000 a month. Switching to Exec-PC in 1988 paid off: Stevenson figures the changeover saves the company close to \$45,000 a year.

Look Before You Leap

If you want a bulletin board for strictly internal use, setting up your own will produce a system attuned to your company's particular needs. For customer support and public information, it's wise to rent space on an existing board, at least for starters. Predicting BBS usage is next to impossible, and by using someone else's board, you can test the waters without getting more than your feet wet.





rogramming is a complex art; any tool that makes the work easier is bound to win fans. Witness the success of interactive, menu-driven compilers like *Turbo Pascal* and *QuickBASIC* that integrate a basic editor and debugger. For students and occasional programmers, those built-in tools suffice.

But if it turns out that programming is your passion—or worse, part of your job—a few hours with a \$99 integrated programming environment will expose the package's limits. The compiler may be great, and the editor and debugger may offer enough features for crafting small, single-unit programs, but when programs get big and ugly you need industrial-strength tools to keep from getting bogged down.

POWER TOOLS

BASIC and Pascal programmers need all the help they can get.
This collection of editors, tool kits, debuggers, and other utilities can shift your productivity into overdrive.

The most important tool—the hub of all coding activity—is the programming editor. The editors listed here naturally offer basic word processing features such as text wrap, line space and margin adjustments, search and replace, and printing. But it's the extras such as automatic indentation and punctuation matching (which automatically enters closing parentheses and quotation marks) that make pounding out source code for even long programs a breeze. You'll find that most of the editors listed here also let you edit programs for any compiler and often let you launch your compiler or debugger from within the editor.

When you're writing programs, there's no need to reinvent the wheel. Tool kits—libraries of tested routines—give your code a professional boost without forcing you to learn the intricacies of sequential file access or graphics screen I/O. These fast, bug-free data handling routines and sophisticated but friendly interfaces will keep your users coming back for more. Though the libraries often cost more than your compiler, they can cut hours from your programming time.

Debuggers, the third crucial programming tool, are software detectives that help you hunt down and correct errors in your code. A superior debugger should not only handle BASIC, Pascal, and C programs but also tackle TSRs and graphics. When you put your errant program under the magnifying glass, the best debuggers let you execute it a line at a time, skip over certain routines, and open every factor for inspection, from data arrays to memory registers.

Other utilities can patch the holes in the process, especially MAKE programs, which automate compiling and linking of multiple—source-file programs. But choose carefully: Some MAKE utilities support many compilers and handle complicated dependencies; others don't. As with any programming tool, call the vendor and make sure your compiler and the vendor's package will make a good match.

nyone who juggles facts in a business setting has to track many related items of information: employees and the departments where they work, machines and their servicing, and orders and the products involved. Useful though they are, flat-file data bases can't manage such relationships efficiently because they must store all related data in a single file. What's needed is a relational data base-one in which data is stored in separate files (or tables) linked by common fields (or columns). These links allow multifile operations, such as updating several files with a single data entry form or generating a report using data from related forms.

Reunion at Dragnet U.

In an earlier "Tips & Techniques" article ("How to Design a Data Base File," *PCW*, March 1989), we used the case of Dragnet University to illustrate how a flat-file system works. Your assignment then was to automate the Dragnet Alumni Association contribution records. The result was a simple but elegant data base with one record for each alumni donation.

Unfortunately, a problem has developed. Loyal Dragnet alumni tend to make several donations per year; many send a check every month. For each check, you must reenter the donor's name, address, and so on, wasting time and disk space. Moreover, data integrity is at risk every time a variant shows up, as when a per-

son writes his or her name in several different ways.

To make matters worse, the dean has recently instituted the Dragnet Funds program. From now on, each contribution must be earmarked for the Stadium Fund, the Academic Fund, or the General Alumni Fund. The dean now wants you to modify the system to produce two new reports: a daily journal that lists contribution amounts, donors, and funds; and a quarterly directory that subtotals donations by fund and then totals all the funds.

You could change the existing donations file to accommodate these reports—add fields to store the fund name, its chairperson, and so on. But that would produce even more duplication. Or you could set up one record for each alumnus, with fields for DONATION1, DONATION2, and so on. That would make mailings easy, but over time, some alumni make dozens of donations. Besides, how would you keep track of the fund data for the reports?

Separating the Files

The problem is that the data base system is being asked to keep track of three categories of information—alumni, contributions, and funds—that have one-to-many relationships. One alumnus can make many donations; one fund receives donations from many alumni. That calls for a relational solution with three files instead of one: Alumni, Donations, and Funds.




FIGURE 1: The Alumni file consists of all the fields from the Students file (our original flat-file example) except for DONATION, which contained the amount donated. That field was renamed AMOUNT and is now part of the Donations file. Each Donations record contains a STUDENTID field, which links that record to the donating alumnus's record in the Alumni file, and a FUND-ID field, which links it to one of the three records in the newly created Funds file.

The Alumni file should contain one record per alumnus. Fields include a unique STUDENTID,

name, phone number, address, year of graduation, and so on. The Donations file records facts about each donation: DATE. AMOUNT, and the STUDENT-ID of the contributor. STU-DENTID is the key field relating alumni and their donations: Since STUDENTIDs are unique, there is no question about who made which donation. Although multiple contributions mean multiple donation records, they still contain the same STUDENTID. Finally, the Funds file stores the name of each fund (FUND-NAME), the fund committee chairperson, and a unique FUNDID. To relate each donation to its fund, the Donations file also includes the key field FUNDID. (See FIGURE 1.)

Separating the funds, the alumni, and their contributions makes for efficient storage: Each fact is recorded in just one field in one record in one file. For instance, there's no need to duplicate an alumnus's address along with each donation; you enter that information once into the Alumni file, then look it up when needed. That way, when an alumnus moves, you need to update only one record.

The efficiency of this design emerges when the dean asks a question like, Which funds has Oprah Singer contributed to?




FIGURE 2: A relational data base makes it easy to enter, update, and find related data. This figure shows how a query finds linked information in three separate data tables.

FIGURE 2 illustrates what the data base actually does in answering the query. First, it finds Ms. Singer's STUDENTID (727545) in the Alumni file; it then proceeds to the Donations file to find her donations. For each one, it notes the FUNDID

(ALUM). It then goes to the Funds file, which reveals that Ms. Singer has made two donations, both to the General Alumni Fund.

Daily and Quarterly Reports

The daily journal lists donations by DATE. For each donation, the report must look up the donor's name in the Alumni file, based on STUDENTID. Similarly, it can locate the FUNDNAME in Funds based on FUNDID.

The quarterly donations directory reports donations by fund. Starting in the Funds file, it secures the FUNDID of the first fund; then, in the Donations file, it lists the donations with that FUNDID. For each donation, STUDENTID provides access to the donor's name and address.

Note the *many-to-many* relationship between Funds and Alumni: Each alumnus may contribute to many funds, and each fund receives contributions from many alumni. The many-to-many relationship is mediated by the many-to-one relationships between Alumni and Donations and between Funds and Donations. A donation represents a transaction between an alumnus and a fund, so we say that the Dona-

tions file is a transaction file relating Alumni and Funds.


Managing Your Relations

The role of a relational data base manager is to automate data relationships. Typically, that involves opening two or more files at once, indexing one file on the key field (to speed the lookup process), and linking files so that a query in one automatically accesses related records in the other. In addition, most relational programs allow you to easily create views consisting of fields from two or more related files. The ideal is a system of transparent relationships that behave like one big data base: Users simply ask for data by field, without worrying which file holds the records or how the relationships are managed.

Once you understand the relational concept better you'll see the need for relational designs everywhere. Remember the two tip-offs that indicate a relational design is needed: You find yourself reentering the same data in

many records; and you're tempted to add a set of fields—one field for each instance (DONA-TION1, DONATION2, and so on, for example)—for data related to a given record. When either occurs, it's time to move up to a relational data base.


applications takes some getting used to. Moreover, you must confront the infamous DOS 640K RAM limit. This article provides four handy tips to help you make *Desqview* an efficient program manager. In the tips that follow, <Desq> refers to *Desqview*'s user-definable hot key; <Alt> is the default.

Managing 286 Memory

Although Desqview/386 can run applications in Enhanced EMS and EMS 4.0, each window's memory size is basically limited to the amount of conventional RAM left after loading Desqview itself. Depending on your hardware, you may be able to load part of *Desgview* into extended memory and free up some RAM. The Quarterdeck Expanded Memory Manager-386, a utility included with Desqview/386, makes this task seamless and simple for 386-based machines with at least 1.5MB. However, if you use a 286 with an expanded memory card, things get tricky.

Since *Desqview* can load roughly 60K of itself into a 286's extended memory, change 64K of expanded memory to extended memory using your card's DIP switches. Some expanded memory cards require 128K as the minimum reconfigurable unit of memory. Although that may seem like a heavy sacrifice for a 60K gain in conventional RAM, it can mean the difference between a maximum window size of 460K and a maximum of 520K.

To use extended memory, you must first copy the QEXT.SYS device driver from the *Desqview* distribution disk to your PC's boot disk. Now, add the command **DEVICE = QEXT.SYS** to the CONFIG.SYS file so it precedes

any other device driver that uses extended memory.

Desqview has a utility, XDV-.COM, that loads the main program, DV.EXE, putting 60K into extended memory. In order to start Desqview with the familiar DV command, you can rename the XDV.COM utility DV.COM, since DOS will load a .COM file before an .EXE with the same file name.

Using TSRs With Desqview

Terminate-and-stay-resident programs (TSRs) are notorious memory guzzlers that should never be loaded before *Desqview*. Check your AUTOEXEC.BAT file and make sure TSRs are positioned to load after *Desqview*.

If you use TSRs, create separate windows for pop-up utilities such as *SideKick Plus*. Load TSRs such as keyboard enhancers into the same window as the application they work with by creating a batch file that loads first the TSR and then the application. To close the window automatically when you exit the ap-

plication, simply enter 'Exit' as the last line of the batch file.

Now use Desqview's Change a Program feature to change the application's name, including the extension, to that of the batch file. Press < Desq > OCP, select the program you want the TSR to work with, and press < Enter>. Next, press <Tab> twice and enter the new memory size. As a rule of thumb, increase the allotted memory by the amount the TSR requires plus 4K, since windows that open with batch files must load COMMAND.COM (about 3.5K). Press <Tab> to enter the batch file name into the Program box. To make sure the window doesn't close after you load the TSR, press <F1> to display the Advanced Options menu, select close on exit, and press N < Enter > .

A Macro Made to Order

The quickest way to switch Desqview windows is to press the <Desq> key and then the appropriate window number.

However, you must know the order in which the applications are loaded. Here's a start-up macro that helps you remember window numbers by loading programs in the same order every time.

Start in Desgview with no windows open. Hold down <Shift> and tap <Desq> to display the macro menu. Then press = to start the macro recorder and! at the key assignment prompt. Next, type a script name, press <Enter> to begin recording the macro, and start your applications in the desired order. When you finish, hold down <Shift>, tap <Desq>, and press - to end macro recording. Finally, hold down <Shift>, tap <Desq>, and then press **S** to save the macro.

Auto-Zoom Macro

Sometimes it's convenient to have an application start with a full-screen window. The *Desqview* documentation instructs you to use the Window Position option from the Change a Program Advanced Options menu to make windows open automatically with a full screen. This effectively disables the zoom command (<Desq>Z) since it makes Desqview "zoom" from a full screen to a full screen.

A more practical technique is to create an application start-up macro that automatically zooms the window to a full screen. From within the application, start a macro as described previously. At the key reassignment prompt, select any key you won't need within the application. Name the macro "!startup," and for the macro contents press <Desq>Z. Now your application will zoom to a full screen every time you start it, and the zoom command will still function normally. —Lincoln Spector

Ventura Fonts Without Tears

Adding fonts to Ventura with Fontware 2.0 is easier than you think.

What you need: Fontware 2.0, Ventura Publisher 1.1 or 2.0

ntil recently, the LaserJet was limited to its ho-hum internal typewriter fonts, Hewlett-Packard's expensive font cartridges (offering mostly Times Roman and Helvetica), and hardto-use soft fonts. Then along came Bitstream's Fontware, an innovative font generation program that produces almost any size font from a set of master outlines. Because Fontware generates only the exact sizes you request, you'll never eat up hard disk space with megabytes of unused bit-mapped fonts. Fontware even creates matching screen fonts for precise typesetting.

Creating fonts with Fontware isn't particularly difficult, but the process can throw you the first time. This step-by-step article explains how to install Fontware and create and install a single font for Ventura Publisher. You can later follow the same steps to create multiple fonts in one session. If you use versions of Fontware bundled with other programs, you'll find the process very similar.

Installing Fontware

Naturally, *Fontware* must be configured for the character set you plan to use and told where to store its fonts. So before you begin, note what directory *Ventura* occupies and the video setup and printer you'll use.

- 1. Put the Fontware Installation Kit Disk 1 in drive A:, type A:Fontware, and press <Enter>.
- 2. At Fontware's main menu, press <Enter> to select Set Up Fontware.
- 3. Press **<Enter>** to store Fontware in the C:\FONT-WARE directory, or type a different name and press **<Enter>**.
- 4. Specify the directory where *Ventura*'s program files are stored, using the same method.
- 5. Select the video setup by highlighting the appropriate entry on screen, and press **Enter**.
- 6. Select the character set—the letters and symbols that make up a font—for the screen fonts *Fontware* will generate. If you want to save disk space and don't need foreign language characters or symbols, choose VP US; if you need foreign characters, choose VP International.
- 7. Pick your printer from the next list *Fontware* presents. When you're asked to select a character set for the printer, pick the same set specified in step 6. Press <**F10**> to confirm your choices.

Make a Font

With Fontware in place, you can now copy the master outlines to your hard disk and start making bit-mapped fonts. In this example, you'll install the Dutch Roman master outline from the Fontware library disk and use it to create an 11-point font. Fontware automatically crafts both portrait and landscape versions of the font.

Finally, dBASE® and Lotus® have something in common.

Generally, try not to generate lots of screen fonts, especially in large point sizes, because they take RAM that *Ventura* could use. *Ventura* will automatically use one of its own Dutch or Swiss screen fonts when you work—an acceptable compromise for most typesetting jobs. However, screen fonts are a must if you're setting ornate display type or using symbols not found in the VP International character set.

- 1. From *Fontware*'s main menu select Add/Delete Fontware Typefaces, and press <**F3**> to add a new typeface.
- 2. Place the disk labeled "Dutch, Dutch Italic, Dutch Bold, Dutch Bold Italic" in drive A:, and press <Enter>. Then pick Dutch Roman and press <Enter>.
- 3. Press <**F10>** to copy the Dutch Roman master outline to your hard disk, then press <**F10>** again to display the Make Fonts menu.
- 4. Highlight Dutch Roman on the left side of the screen, and press <Enter>. The cursor jumps to the right, where font size is specified. Type 11 and press <Enter>. To create multiple fonts, you would simply type all desired point sizes on this line, separated by spaces.
- 5. If you want an accompanying screen font, press <**F2**> to enter the screen font menu, and follow the instructions in step 4. You can create screen fonts for any or all of the printer fonts.
- 6. To generate the printer and screen fonts, press <**F10**>, then **Y**, and go get a cup of coffee.
- 7. After *Fontware* generates a font, it creates a width table that *Ventura* uses to space and kern the font's characters. When *Fontware* displays the width table name (for the sake of this article, assume the name is

Install the Fonts for Ventura

You can't use the new printer fonts and screen fonts until the new width table is merged with HPLJPLUS.WID, *Ventura*'s standard LaserJet width table. The steps:

- 1. At the DOS prompt, type DIR/P C:\VENTURA*.SF? to list all the LaserJet fonts in Ventura's directory. Make sure the newly created Fontware fonts, AII10IHP.SFP and AII10IHP.SFL, are present.
- 2. Copy the new width table into the Ventura directory by typing COPY C:\FONTWARE\
 HP_L JOOO.WID C:\VENTURA.
- 3. Type **VP** or **VPPROF** to load *Ventura*.
- 4. From the Options menu, select Set Printer Info.
 - 5. Make sure the Width Table

entry reads HPLJPLUS.WID. If a different table is listed, click Load Different Width Table, select HPLJPLUS.WID from the list, and click on OK.

- 6. From the Options menu, select Add/Remove Fonts, then Merge Width Tables.
- 7. From the list of width tables, choose HP_LJ000.WID, and click on OK.

The tables are now merged. and the 11-point Dutch font is available. To confirm installation. set a paragraph of text with the new font. Switch to paragraph tagging mode, tag a paragraph with the Body Text tag, and pick Select Font from the Paragraph menu. The font list should include the 11-point Dutch Roman font. Select it, and watch the text transform. Then give yourself a pat on the back—the entire universe of Bitstream's fonts is open to you. Just be prepared for some long coffee breaks.



Scanning Gray-Scale Images

Scan photos and drop them in your documents without wasting time and disk space.

What you need: a gray-scale scanner, scanning software

f you're like most desktop publishers, adding photographs to a publication is a job you leave to the printshop. Yet with a gray-scale scanner, you can convert photographs into high-quality electronic images, place them in a document yourself, and print complete pages on a laser printer or typesetter. In return for the extra effort, you gain greater control over your work and save money in the long run.

In a previous "Tips & Techniques" article we discussed the ground rules for scanning line art (see "Scanner ABCs," *PCW*, June 1989). This article focuses on scanning images that contain continuous tones, such as photographs and paintings. The illustrations in this article were produced using a Hewlett-Packard ScanJet Plus and HP's *Scanning Gallery Plus*. However, most of the tips also apply to other grayscale scanners and scanner software.

Choose the Right Scan Mode

Gray-scale scanners don't automatically produce gray-scale image files. When you scan an image using the halftone (dithered) mode offered by nearly all scanner software, the result is a black-and-white pattern of dots that can't approach the quality of true gray-scale output. Unless your desktop publishing program lacks support for gray-scale files, use the gray-scale mode when scanning continuous-tone art.

The goal of gray-scale scanning is to create an accurate electronic reproduction of continuous tones, using between 16 and 256 discrete shades of gray. The number of gray shades depends on the amount of information a scanner gathers for each of the tiny points that make up the scanned image; the more bits per point, the larger the number of grays. In line art mode, a scanner generates only one bit per point, while in gray-scale mode it produces multiple bits per point.

Some gray-scale scanners offer more than one multiple-bit scan mode. For instance, the ScanJet Plus provides a choice between 8-bit scans (for 256 grays) and 4-bit scans (for 16 grays), while other scanners offer 6-bit scans (for 64 grays). Choosing the multiple-bit scan mode that captures the most gray-scale information usually yields the best results, especially if you print the image on a highresolution imagesetter, such as a Linotronic, which produces excellent halftones containing 90 gray levels or more.

Eliminate Excessive Grays

An 8-bit scan soaks up more disk space and requires more time to process and print than a 6- or 4-bit scan, by factors of 50 and

100 percent, respectively. If topquality images aren't crucial, choosing a scan mode that captures fewer grays may be worth the savings in disk space and time. And if the original art say, a high-contrast photograph—has only a few shades of gray anyway, a 4-bit image may fill the bill.

If you use a 300-dot-per-inch laser printer, an 8-bit image often contains more gray-scale information than the printer can render effectively. With 300-dpi hard copy, the best-looking half-tones seldom have more than 37 gray levels—well within the range of a 6-bit scanner. True, an 8-bit image provides a larger number of grays from which the 37 grays are selected, but the

difference between an 8- and 6-bit 300-dpi halftone rarely justifies the extra baggage. In most cases, even if you're using an image-enhancement board that produces fine halftones with 64 grays on a LaserJet, such as Intel's Visual Edge, 8- and 6-bit scans of the same image won't be easily distinguishable.

Avoid Resolution Overload

One of the biggest advantages of gray-scale scanning is that you can save additional disk space and processing time by using a scanning resolution rate well under 300 dpi (the maximum for most desktop scanners) and still obtain excellent halftones. Note, however, that this applies only to images that have not been *enlarged* after scanning.

If you use Ventura Publisher or PageMaker to print a gray-scale image on a 300-dpi Post-Script laser printer, the default program settings produce a half-tone screen of about 53 lines per inch (lpi). As long as the gray-scale image was scanned at a dpi resolution at least 1½ times the lpi resolution—in this case, approximately 80 dpi—the final printed image will usually look about as good as it would scanned at a full 300 dpi.

On a high-resolution imagesetter, you can produce excellent halftone screens (between 90 and 150 lpi) using the same formula for acceptable scanning resolution. For example, if you print a gray-scale image at 1270 dpi using a 90-lpi screen, a 135-dpi scan will do just fine; for a 2540dpi image using a 150-lpi screen, scan the image at 225 dpi. Of course, your scanner's resolution options may not match the specific ones mentioned here; in such cases, use the next highest resolution setting.

Use Gray-Scale TIFF Files

Most gray-scale scanners allow you to save images in several file formats. However, only the Tagged Image File Format (TIFF) and Encapsulated Post-Script (EPS) format are capable of retaining the gray-scale information required by publishing programs like *PageMaker* and *Ventura Publisher*. If you have a choice, save the scanned images as TIFF rather than EPS files; the latter usually gobble more disk space.

Save Time With Draft Scans

A final tip: Do a low-resolution draft scan with minimal grays before you perform a final top-quality scan. By using the draft scan with your publishing program during page layout and proofing, you'll waste less time loading the image, displaying it on screen, and sending it to the printer. —Richard Jantz

Safe Saves With 1-2-3 Macros

If you use a macro to save 1-2-3 worksheets automatically, one day you may try to save a file you haven't yet named. Once you start the macro, it will write over the contents of the first file listed in the current directory. To safeguard against losing your data, make the first file a dummy

file. Since DOS sorts the exclamation point before any other characters, call the blank file "!.wkl," or "!blank.wkl." Make sure that the blank file appears in all 1-2-3 directories and subdirectories.

Cutting Paradox Files Down to Size

In Edit mode, *Paradox* saves deleted records. To reclaim some disk space, use the Modify and Restructure commands. First back up the data table and related files. Next, select Modify from the main menu, then select Restructure, and press <F2>. This command rebuilds the table record by record without altering its structure, eliminating deleted records in the process. How much disk space this technique reclaims depends on the number of deleted records.

The Restructure command is most efficient when less than 80 percent of a file is undeleted data. To check the status of a file, use this formula: (number of records) × (bytes per record)/ (size of the file in bytes). If the result is .80 or less, it's a good idea to restructure the file.




Changing Default File Sorts in Professional Write

Professional Write 2.0 sorts files in a subdirectory alphabetically by file name and then file name extension. To change the default sort criteria, press <Ctrl>-G to list a subdirectory, press <F8> to display the Sort Order window, and use <Tab> to highlight a sort criterion—file name, extension, date, or file size. Type 1 to make it the primary sort factor, 2 to make it the secondary factor, and so on. You can repeat the process for all four fields. Wendy Grubnow



Want to know about the tricks memory can play? Read this to find out how much RAM you actually get when you buy a PC.

Memory Lost and Found

Consumer Watch reader Jaime Logreira, who lives in Colombia, got an unpleasant surprise last time he purchased a computer. After reading ads and an item in *PC World*, he bought a Dell System 310, a 386 machine that comes with 1MB of RAM. But when Mr. Logreira turned on the computer and looked at the setup screen, he was dumbfounded by the following message: '640 KB of RAM 0000 KB Extended.' What happened to the rest of the RAM? wondered Mr. Logreira.

It's a good question—and one that requires some background explanation to answer.

On a typical 286 or 386 system with 1MB of RAM, you can expect to get 640K of memory, often called "conventional" or "user" memory because you can apply it to your applications, memory-resident programs, and related files.

Beyond that, many 1MB systems also provide 384K of extended memory. This extended memory, as such, has limited uses with DOS. However, you can take advantage of it with a little effort—for example, by creating a RAM disk to speed up program operations.

Extended memory really comes in handy when it's used as expanded memory (see *The Help Screen*, *PCW*, April 1989). 80386 processors—but not 80286s—have a built-in memory management unit that allows you to use the extended memory as expanded, provided your software supports expanded memory.

Now let's step away from the hypothetical system and consider Mr. Logreira's Dell 386. In the Dell system, as in many others, the 384K of RAM is not available as extended memory. Instead, it's used by the system in a process called *shadowing*, which speeds up ROM BIOS and video ROM functions.

The BIOS is the low-level code that allows the operating system or the applications to interface with the hardware. BIOS code is executed from ROM (read-only memory), which is slow compared with the fast RAM found in today's high-speed PCs. "In the original 4.77-MHz PC, that ROM would respond quickly enough," says Steve Valentor, product development manager for Zenith Data Systems. "But as computer architectures got faster, the ROM was outpaced by the rest of the system."

Shadowing takes care of the problem. The system BIOS code (and in some cases, video adapter code) is copied into faster RAM, thereby speeding up many common operations.

Any 286 or 386 can be shadowed, but don't expect to find shadowing used consistently throughout any manufacturer's entire line of PCs. Hewlett-Packard, for example, shadows only its 286 portable and its 386 machines. Tandon shadows its newer machines, according to Ed Allwein, director of OEM systems; its 386SX, 25-MHz, and 33-MHz systems are shadowed, but not the older 16-MHz and 20-MHz systems. The same is true of many other companies.

Some manufacturers offer the option of turning off shadowing to avoid possible incompatibility problems. "Any time you do a nonstandard thing, it's a good idea also to offer a way not to do it," says Steve Dougherty, product manager for the Everex 386 line, which uses shadowing. "I've (continues)

never seen any compatibility problems, though."

Shadowing is not optional on some systems. For example, although all Dell 286s and 386s use shadowing techniques, only the 286s provide the option of turning off shadowing, according to Dell technical support representative Tom Harrison.

Once shadowing is off, the freed-up memory can sometimes be used as extended memory. But it all depends on the chip set, according to Nelson Chan, product marketing manager for Chips and Technologies. "Some chip sets implement a hardware technique that remaps the 384K of memory," allowing the user to access it, says Chan.

Tandon machines, for example, free up the entire 384K of *(continues)*

RAM when shadowing is off, but not all systems make all the memory available. Mitch Cipriano, Acer's marketing communications director, says 1MB Acer systems use 128K for shadowing, providing a total of 896K of conventional and extended memory. "But even if you turn off the shadowing, you can't access that memory," says Cipriano.

Systems that come with a lot of memory as a standard feature may not use shadowing at all. The Tandy 5000, for example, is a 386 Micro Channel machine that ships with a minimum of 2MB of RAM. "We don't bother with shadowing on that machine," says Tandy senior vice president John Patterson. The company uses other techniques to speed operation.

A Happy Ending for Logreira


Given all these technical twists and turns, it's no wonder Mr. Logreira was confused. When informed of his dilemma, Dell Corporation promised to take steps to avoid future misunderstandings. In a letter to Consumer Watch, Customer Service Manager Laura McDonald stated that the Dell machine's setup screen "will be modified to reflect that the additional 384K is resident and system accessible," although not available to the user. Dell also gave Mr. Logreira the option of returning his system for credit.

Even more important for future buyers, McDonald stated that Dell's ads would be changed to say "1MB of RAM (640K usable)." If Dell carries out this (continues)





Micro 1 Files Chapter 11

Micro 1, a computer company in San Francisco, filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy reorganization on April 25, shortly after the federal district court in Northern California issued a preliminary injunction to prevent the company from doing business.

According to U.S. postal inspector Michael Baum, the injunction was issued after postal inspectors presented evidence of numerous consumer complaints.

Consumer Watch also received dozens of complaints about the

company, most of which concerned prepaid orders that were never filled. Despite our repeated efforts to contact Micro 1, the majority of these problems remained unresolved. As a result, in May *PC World* revoked Micro 1's Best Buy award, which was given in November 1988 for the Micro 1 Tower 386-20MHz.

According to Robert Knechtel, the company's lawyer, Micro 1 filed for bankruptcy with approximately \$2.5 million in debts and only about \$250,000 in assets. Under bankruptcy law, consumers are given priority for repayment up to \$900. Beyond \$900, consumers share with other unsecured creditors in any assets that remain.

Since the bankruptcy filing, Micro 1 has received infusions of capital and installed a new management team. Rick McCabe, the former president, has remained with Micro 1 as director of marketing. Knechtel says that the company intends to file a plan with the bankruptcy court to repay all creditors 100 cents on the dollar, but at press time he expected the repayment process, even if approved, to take four to six years.

Meanwhile, consumers with a complaint against the company should file a proof-of-claim form (available at legal-supplies stores) with the U.S. Bankruptcy Court (Attention: Claims), 450 Golden Gate Ave., 15th floor, San Francisco, CA 94102; 415/556-2250. 


Fable of a Cable

dBASE With All the Trappings

The "Ready, Set, Print" item [*.*, PCW, January 1989] explains how to detect an off-line or nonexistent printer by calling a separate assembly language test routine from within a dBASE .PRG program. However, dBASE III offers a simpler and wider-ranging facility that can trap that and other errors.

For example, the command IF ERROR() = 125 tests for an off-line printer.

Using these functions, you can write a procedure such as ERRTRAP.PRG [see LISTING 1], which traps *all* errors generated by other *dBASE* programs and displays an error number with the appropriate message.

First, suppress dBASE's built-in error trapping by issuing the command ON ERROR DO ERRTRAP. Subsequently, if an error occurs while running a .PRG program file, ERRTRAP prompts you to press R to retry the offending statement or C to continue the program. Calls to ERROR() and MESSAGE() display the dBASE III error number and explanatory text.

New Math for Turbo Pascal

Programming with *Turbo Pas*cal, I missed some favorite math functions from BASIC and FOR- TRAN. So I wrote a *Turbo Pascal 5.0* math unit to modify the language to my liking.

MATH.PAS [see LISTING 2] includes a function to raise numbers to a specified power. Other functions calculate base-10 logarithms, convert between radians and degrees, and compute factorials, permutations, and combinations.

Compile MATH.PAS to disk, creating MATH.TPU. To use the functions in another program or unit, insert *USES Math*; after the PROGRAM or UNIT declaration. Also, add the compiler directives {\$N+,E+} to enable *Turbo Pascal*'s numeric coprocessor and emulator abilities.

Secret Keys for Tandy PCs

My Tandy 1000SX keyboard makes it hard to run programs that use certain key combinations. By experimenting, though, I found several secret keys that do the jobs of others.

For example, SideKick lets you press <Scroll Lock> and then move pop-up windows around the screen with <Cursor Left> and <Cursor Right>.

Since there's no <Scroll Lock> key on my Tandy, I thought I couldn't use this feature. But I discovered that pressing <Alt>-<Break> toggles the words 'Scroll Lock' on and off the screen. When they're on, the cursor keys work as expected.

On most PCs, you can press <Ctrl>-<Insert> to copy marked QuickBASIC statements into a temporary buffer and then press <Shift>-<Insert> to copy the lines to a new cursor position. <Ctrl>-<Insert> doesn't work for me, but <Ctrl>-<Delete> deletes marked text (also placing it in the buffer), and <Shift>-0 (that's the 0 on the numeric keypad) inserts buffered text at the cursor. Then, to restore deleted text, just press <Shift>-0 again at the original spot.

With *XyWrite*'s on-screen help menus, pressing the numeric keypad's 2, 4, 6, and 8 keys instead of Tandy's cursor keys moves the menu selector as ordered.



Editor's note: A lot of people use SUBST but are unaware of the possible conflicts between it and other DOS commands. According to the MS-DOS Encyclopedia (Microsoft Press, Redmond,

Washington, 1988), "The SUBST command masks the actual disk drive characteristics from commands that perform critical disk operations. Therefore, AS-SIGN, BACKUP, CHKDSK, DISKCOMP, DISKCOPY, FDISK, FORMAT, JOIN, LABEL, and RESTORE should not be used on a drive affected by a SUBST command. CHDIR, MKDIR, RMDIR, and PATH commands that include the affected drive should be used with caution. A network drive cannot be named in a SUBST command." So by all means use SUBST. But never use

any of the critical commands with drive substitutions.

DEVELOPER'S TOOLBOX

From Windows to OS/2

By cross-developing applications for Windows and OS/2 Presentation Manager (PM), you now can corner two markets with the same code. That is, you can take advantage of the existing Windows market and at the same time gear up for OS/2. The key is to select your Windows tools carefully. Make the right choices now, and you'll save months of headaches later when you port your applications from Windows to PM. All the tools mentioned this month have source-code—compatible Windows and PM versions available now, or will in the near future.

One of the best of this bunch is Bridge, a batch file processor for Windows/286 and Windows/386. With Bridge, you create "workstations" that combine other applications—for example, Excel and dBASE—in a shell complete with custom pulldown menus and dialog boxes. Bridge is simple to use. Just enter batch file commands with the Windows Notepad editor, then run the file. Yau can also automate this step ta create turnkey Windows systems that

load a preset configuration at start-up.

Bridge's batch commands are much more powerful than DOS's and include the abilities to call subroutines, pass control to other batch files, and use IF and FOR statements. After installing Bridge, I was able to start programming in minutes—the fast-reading tutorial explained everything I had to know.

If you need more power than the stand-alone Bridge provides, you can purchase the Bridge Tool Kit, which includes batch file and dialog box editors plus utilities to encrypt batch files, attach icons, and access Bridge's interprocess control. Because the Bridge Tool Kit is expensive, you may want to start with plain Bridge, which should be adequate for all but the most sophisticated requirements. But it's nice to know the extra power is available should you need it.

For those who plan to develop custom applications from scratch, selecting a language is more difficult. The barebones approach is to use Microsoft C 5.1 (see "Developer's Toolbox," *.*, PCW, October 1988) along with the Microsoft Windows Software Develop-

ment Kit (SDK). This combination requires a thorough knowledge of C and Windows programming—a big reach, even for experienced programmers.

C experts who are new to Windows will find CASE: W just the ticket for getting started. (The OS/2 version, CASE:PM, arrived as I was writing this.) The application generator offers a point-and-click approach to Windows and PM development, letting you design an application out of preformed building blocks. CASE:W and CASE:PM generate C source code that re-creates your application design. After adding custom routines to the stock output, you simply compile and link to create the final product. Fortunately, the complex steps required to accomplish this are fully automated.

If C is not your bag, then you won't find a better Windows development environment than Actor. This language product, which resembles C and Pascal, is purely object oriented, a buzzword you'll be hearing a lot in the coming months. Unlike ather languages such as (continues)

C++, QuickPascal, and the new Turbo Pascal 5.5, all of which feature object-oriented extensions, everything in Actor is an object—from the lowliest character to the loftiest window.

This pure approach to objectoriented programming fits in well with
the added complexity of developing
Windows and PM applications. But it
also requires programmers to learn a
new language, a commitment not to be
made lightly. One way to get some help
is to study the public domain Actor ap-

plication PC-Project, available from Whitewater on disk for \$5 or free of charge through the company's BBS. The disk includes a wealth of objects (called classes in Actor) in source code form that you can extract for your own work. And the program is actually useful—rare for a demo.

With ProComm and ProComm Plus, some monochrome monitors don't display all the text or highlighting on the help screens. If missing text is a problem, try starting the program with the /B option to use ProComm's black-and-white settings. Type ProComm/B and you'll be able to see the status line and all text.




















NETWORK Q&A

Tips and strategies for departmental networking

Connecting a TOPS LAN and a NetWare LAN is easier than linking other incompatible networks—but expect some limitations.

David Ferris

Q. How do you interface two LANs with different LAN operating systems? Can you connect a Novell NetWare LAN running on a 3Com Ethernet with a TOPS network running on Farallon's PhoneNet?

Noshir Contractor Urbana, Illinois

A. Ideally, every LAN in your company would share the same LAN OS so that you could easily share data and peripherals between departments. Yet most companies move to LANs in piecemeal fashion, with one department adopting Novell, anoth-

er 3Com or Sun Microsystems' TOPS, and so on.

What's the solution? You could standardize on a single LAN OS, but that's expensive and disruptive. Or you could wait a year or so for streamlined inter-LAN links to arrive. But if you need connectivity *now*, you can link disparate LANs with a homemade gateway. It's no simple task, and communications are limited, but the results may justify the pain.

Bridging a peer-to-peer LAN OS, such as *TOPS* or IBM's *PC* LAN Program, to a serverbased LAN, such as NetWare, 3+Share, or Vines, is relatively easy. It's much easier than connecting, say, NetWare to 3+, and the bridge is far more complete. However, the link is one-way only (TOPS-to-NetWare), you'll encounter numerous incompatibilities, and you must dedicate a PC to act as a gateway.

Forging the TOPS to NetWare Connection

TOPS networks are attractive because they're easy to set up and use, and they can integrate Macintoshes and PCs. Unlike a NetWare LAN, which depends on a central server, TOPS is based on a peer-to-peer topology. Every workstation on the LAN can share its directories and printers by issuing the Publish command, and can access anyone else's "Published" resources with the Mount command.

rigged with AppleTalk or ethernet cable, but most TOPS LANs use Farallon Computing's twisted-pair PhoneNet cabling and Sun's FlashCard adapters. This example links a PhoneNet TOPS LAN to an ethernet Net-Ware setup, but the approach is similar with other cabling.

To bond TOPS and NetWare
you must dedicate a computer to
act as a gateway. An XT will suffice, but you'll want 640K of
RAM to accommodate both LAN
OS shells. This setup lets TOPS
workstations access as many as
22 NetWare server subdirectories—as long as each subdirectory is mapped to the gateway
PC as a logical drive. Essentially, you fool TOPS into thinking the NetWare directories are
local drives on the gateway PC.

All TOPS users can access NetWare files and printers, but not vice versa. With this setup, TOPS users can even run programs that reside in the mapped directories. (Obviously, however, Mac users can't run PC programs.) TOPS users can access only those directories mapped to the gateway PC; search drives (Novell's equivalent of DOS paths) don't work.




Figure 1: You can set up a TOPS-to-NetWare bridge with a gateway PC that holds both LAN OS adapter cards. TOPS users can access NetWare files and peripherals, but not vice versa, so NetWare users can forget about a free ride on an Apple LaserWriter.

The task requires experience with both LAN OS's. First, place both a *TOPS* FlashCard and an ethernet card in the gateway PC and connect each to its appropriate network (see FIGURE 1). Next, configure the cards to re-(continues)

solve interrupt and other conflicts. This entails running TOPS's SETUP.EXE program. Reboot the gateway PC, install TOPS, and make sure the gateway is properly configured as a TOPS workstation and logged on to the network. Now unload TOPS from memory using TOPS's UNLOAD command. Install the NetWare shell, and log on to NetWare. Map the desired NetWare directories to the gateway PC as logical drives.

Exit *NetWare* and return to *TOPS*. Modify the TOPSKRNL.DAT file, naming the gateway PC and adjusting the drive map to define the *NetWare* logical drives on the gateway as hard drives.

Make sure the proper read/ write permissions are defined on the Novell server. If *TOPS* workstations will be accessing active *NetWare* directories, write a batch file that loads *TOPS*'s XDAEMON utility every time you turn on the gateway PC. XDAEMON updates the *TOPS* directory when *NetWare* files are created or deleted. Finally, use *TOPS*'s Publish command to make the gateway's *NetWare* "drives" (the mapped server subdirectories) available to *TOPS*. To access files on the *NetWare* server, a *TOPS* user Mounts the appropriate logical drive.

especially printing problems—especially printing problems—when you link incompatible LANs. For example, *TOPS* users can't cancel a print request or query the *NetWare* print queue to see when their print job will be done. However, you can smooth out some of these rough spots by writing batch files.


Other LAN OS Links

You can set up similar one-way connections between *PC LAN* and *NetWare*, and *PC LAN* and *TOPS*. But you can't effectively

bridge two different serverbased LAN OSs. For example, if you plugged *NetWare* and 3 + cards into a PC and loaded both LAN OS shells, you'd find yourself looking through a locked window. A single user could load 3+, access a file on the server, save it to disk, reboot, load *Net-Ware*, and copy the file to the server, but there's no sharing of directories or peripherals.

Other alternatives exist, but they're complicated, and the connections are usually limited to file transfers. For example, if you have the 3+Remote option running on a 3Com network, a Net-Ware user can dial in with a modem as a remote user and swap files. Users on both LANs can even share files via a department minicomputer or mainframe by calling in across a communications gateway. However, your PC must play the role of a dumb terminal, limiting access.

The Future Belongs to TCP/IP

Fortunately, tailored connectivity products that don't require a dedicated gateway are on the way. Novell and Sun Microsystems have announced a Net-Ware extension due out next year that will provide a streamlined TOPS-to-NetWare link. Novell's NetWare for Macintosh is shipping now, allowing Macs on an AppleShare network to access NetWare printers and files.

Full two-way file transfers, however, await the adoption of Transmission Control Protocol/ Internet Protocol (TCP/IP), a popular data-routing protocol used on mini and mainframe networks. Current TCP/IP options for 3 +, TOPS, and Vines offer

only limited one-way links, and each TCP/IP port is incompatible with the others. However, in a year or two, implementations promised by Novell and other LAN OS vendors should let users on both ends of a link easily exchange files and access each other's files and printers.

If you can't wait for these options, plunge in now with a homemade gateway. But don't expect seamless integration.

I Will Not Upgrade

David H. Sherman



I started out predisposed to-ward release 3.0; after all, I've used 1-2-3 since April 1984. In fact, I bought my IBM PC XT specifically to use the program and have built many worksheet templates—some large, some small, some that worked, some that didn't. I still haven't used all release 2.01's features, but I've run up against enough limitations to make me look forward to what I thought would be a simple, clear upgrade.

My first clue that Lotus doesn't share my goals came with the initial press reports on the marketing of the new package. Release 3.0 undoubtedly has some good features buried somewhere, but Lotus took too much time explaining "New Platforms" and not enough time truthfully answering questions about 3.0.

My main question is, "How big a spreadsheet can I work with on my XT?" The last answer I got was, "I can't tell you that," followed by, "Be patient."

Since January 1988, I have attended four official presentations of 1-2-3 release 3.0. The first was

sponsored by an Ohio-based training organization three days after the local Lotus representatives received an "alpha" copy. The next was during Lotus Development Week in May 1988. The third came when Lotus repsisted a monthly meeting of the Columbus Computer Society. The fourth and last time was three days before official release to selected beta-testing sites.

Unfortunately, Lotus product development people viewed these meetings as talking opportunities rather than listening sessions. My plaintive "What about my XT?" was ignored again and again, while pretty graphics and 3-D worksheets displayed on 386 machines running OS/2 with 4MB of RAM.

Since the release 3.0 road shows began in January 1988, Lotus has led me to believe that release 3.0 would work within the constraints of a 640K machine. Now the official word is that release 3.0 will need a hard drive, at least 1MB of RAM, and an 80286- or 80386-class machine.

I would have to spend \$3000 to buy the hardware to use release 3.0. I don't have the money, and I don't want to upgrade to a stripped-down release 2.2 with minimal new features after Lotus promised me the moon.



I'm also concerned about the third-party products I use with 2.01. Lotus has added some of those packages' best features to 3.0, and I'm confused as to what impact that will have on my day-to-day use of the add-ins. By providing weak versions of them, will Lotus stifle third parties and end up decreasing 1-2-3's functionality for me?

Lotus's lawsuits against competitors also muddy the waters. Could Lotus be sued for including rivals' innovative features (like 3-D) in 3.0? Sure, Lotus has scared me away from Mosaic Software's *Twin*, but I'm also a little afraid of 3.0 now.

So I've decided not to upgrade to 3.0 nor to recommend upgrading to members of the Columbus Computer Society. Lotus has not listened to users' concerns, has not addressed certain confusing issues, and has further confused issues through lawsuits. I believe Lotus can develop a spreadsheet that is better than its rivals', but 3.0 is not the simple, clean product that I want.


