

#### **Out of the Blue**



Senior Editor Eric Knorr, ready to hit the road with IBM's Best Buy PS/2 Model P70 hat on earth has gotten into IBM? Plenty, to judge by the amount of coverage Big Blue earns in this issue. Lately, the giant from Armonk has found itself playing technology leader to the PC industry. East Coast Editor Eric Bender covers that beat: This month's preview of IBM's 486 upgrade board ("IBM Kicks Off the 486 Race") and our in-depth feature on the OfficeVision family of applications ("Organizing the Global Office") bear his byline.

But the biggest IBM story this month is that Senior Editor Eric Knorr has finally found a PS/2 worth raving about. The 20-MHz, 386-based, transportable PS/2 Model P70 is a winner, he reports. "The gas-plasma VGA display is the best you can get in any transportable today. People who scoffed at the PC Convertible's display will be amazed. And the pricing is great. If you configure a desktop Model 70-121 and a Model P70 identically, the portable costs \$2000 less!"

Another forward-thinking touch: The Model P70's minimum memory configuration is 4MB, room enough to run OS/2. Technical Editor Karl Koessel calls the system "the best desktop machine IBM ever built—who cares that it's in a transportable package?" He suggests that Big Blue's ability to supply its own cheap RAM may account for the aggressive pricing.


Cutting-edge technology and a great price—are these the first signs of a new IBM? Don't get your hopes up just yet, Knorr warns. "While it's a great value, the P70 is a winner in a shrinking area of mobile computing: big, heavy, powerful, AC-powered boxes. The real future is in powerful, battery-driven laptops, and whether IBM can turn out a contender remains to be seen."

If the Model P70 were a desktop machine, it would take its lumps for subpar performance and limited expandability. But Big Blue's engineers instead transferred their desktop technology to the luggable format, where tradeoffs in performance and expandability come with the territory, says Knorr. The result? "What would be mediocre performance in a desktop system translates into a very fast transportable."

So, is the Model P70 a happy accident—or the first in a streak of crowd-pleasing PS/2s? We'd prefer to think that new president James A. Cannavino has infused IBM's PC division with the competitive drive needed to regain its role as a leader in PC technology. If that's the case, maybe we won't be so surprised the next time we see an IBM system with power and a fair price tag.

#### **IBM Shows 486**

Targets
Compaq 386
Market With a
486 Upgrade
That Won't
Arrive for
Months

Running three-page Wall Street Journal ads to herald a 486 board upgrade for its 386-based PS/2, IBM reminded readers of its two-year-old promise to leapfrog the competition with PS/2 technology. The June ad finished by affirming that "the frog has landed." But IBM's PS/2 486/25 Power Platform (see the preview in this issue) won't arrive before the fourth quarter when Intel finally ships the 486 microprocessor, and industry analysts promptly slammed IBM for once again unveiling a product well in advance of shipment. Some see the move simply as a ploy to boost sales of the Model 70-A21—which has suffered from manufacturing delays and hard disk problems-and to appear to reclaim technology leadership from Compaq Computer. The 486-equipped Model 70 outran Compag's Deskpro 386/33 in demos. But with only three add-on slots and 120MB worth of hard drive

compared to the 386/33's eight slots and 1.3GB of storage, the Model 70 may not be adequately equipped for life in the new fast lane. While Compaq still won't discuss machines before ship date, at least half a dozen vendors are expected to deliver similar products within weeks of IBM. Some already one-upped IBM with their own premature 486 announcements. AST unveiled two 486 boards that promise greater performance by exploiting external cache memory and the more flexible expansion options in AST's high-end 386 line. Priced at \$2995 and \$3695 for upgrades from 33-MHz and 25-MHz models respectively, the AST offerings undercut the Power Platform's \$3995 price tag. Ultimately, say analysts, systems will be built from the ground up to truly exploit the 486's unique capabilities-and those models won't start arriving until next year.

#### **Adobe Challenged**

PostScript Developer Faces
Heightened
Competition—
Even From Its
Best Customer

Adobe Systems faces unprecedented challenges to its dominance of the page description language (PDL) market, although its PostScript standard, entrenched on half a million printers, seems secure. This year Adobe's highly profitable business has been assailed by a gang of PostScript imitators, including an offering from BIOS king Phoenix Technologies. In July, Apple disclosed plans to sell its 16.4 percent stake in Adobe, now worth about \$91 million, which it purchased in 1984 for \$2.5 million as part of a joint development agreement. Apple plans to release competing technology scalable fonts and text-layout services in the Macintosh System 7.0 operating system, and a Post-Script alternative for future printers. With 29 other manufacturers selling 50 PostScript devices, Adobe should stay highly profitable through yearend, maintains Marketing Director Pat Marriott. The company earned \$14.5 million for the six

months ended May 31 on revenue of \$53.6 million. But since the Apple LaserWriter accounted for 29 percent of this year's PostScript sales, the breakup will grow painful as Apple's new offerings are released in late 1990. Other printer vendors complain about Adobe's high licensing fees; Hewlett-Packard says they represent the main impediment to making PostScript standard equipment on its popular LaserJet. (HP offers a PostScript add-on for \$2795—\$100 more than the list price of the LaserJet itself.) Many customers, while deterred by PostScript printers' high cost, won't settle for a clone, explains QMS executive vice president Don Parker: "If it doesn't say 'Adobe,' many customers turn and walk out the door." But like Apple, other major manufacturers plan to challenge Adobe with their own PDLs. IBM and Microsoft are evolving one from OS/2's Presentation Manager.

#### **HP Overhauls Fonts**

Drops Prices, Targets Individual Applications Hewlett-Packard slashed prices on its LaserJet font line this month and repackaged 26 offerings into nine cartridges that more closely reflect user needs by application. The font line was formerly arranged by typeface, explains Product Manager Jane Eandi. Now products include cartridges that address the specific font management features in WordPerfect and Microsoft Word as well as cartridges aimed at spreadsheets, form creation, barcode usage, presentations, text formulas. and for-

eign character sets. Each cartridge contains three times the fonts of its predecessor and sells for \$195, compared to as much as \$330 for prior offerings. HP previously released the ProCollection "supercartridge" (see *Product Outlook*, *PCW*, July 1989), which includes 65 general office and spreadsheet publishing fonts for \$300. The new cartridges fit the LaserJet Series II and IID printers, but not the older LaserJet or LaserJet Plus.

Aiming to bring PostScript color printing into mainstream office use and undercut its main rival, QMS is offering a \$9995 version of its ColorScript 100 thermal transfer printer. The Model 10 is less capable than the ColorScript 100 Model 20, introduced in April 1988 and used mostly by graphic artists for prepress proofing. But the Model 10 is also \$15,000 cheaper. About half the size of its predecessor, it comes with only 4MB of memory (but is upgradable) and offers letter-size printing with a legal-size option (compared to the Model 20's 11-by-17-inch output). QMS executive vice president

Don Parker predicts that this price/feature combination will prompt departmental work groups and corporate graphic services to apply PostScript color printing to desktop presentations, business graphics, and desktop publishing applications. He estimates that the Model 10 will sell five to ten times the Model 20's 1000 annual units. The printer also undercuts the ColorScript's principal competitor, Tektronix's \$13,000 Color Phaser CP thermal printer, which is equipped with a PostScript clone. QMS cut costs by including less memory and a smaller controller and omitting a hard disk.

#### **Dynabook Debuts**

Analysts
Underwhelmed,
Say Original
Concept Still
Unrealized

Dynabook Technologies, a San Jose start-up founded by two prominent venture capitalists and ex-Tandon president Dan Wilkie, has taken the wraps off an elegant modular portable bearing the same suggestive name. Built around a 16-MHz 80C286 and scheduled to ship in August, the Dynabook 286 thinks thin. Only 0.3 inch thick, its backlit supertwist LCD is the skinniest on the market. It fits atop a CPU module that is a mere 1.4 inches deep. And a clever docking station provides all required desktop connections. But the 2-to-4-hour lead-acid battery adds 0.4 inch in thickness and 5.4 pounds in weight, so when equipped for travel, the

Dynabook hits the scales at 14 pounds—three times the weight of the NEC UltraLite. In size and price, the Dynabook 286 is more akin to Compaq's SLT/286; with 20MB and 40MB hard drives, Dynabook models sell for \$5195 and \$5795, respectively. While analysts applaud the Dynabook 286's well-considered features, they find it a far cry from the handy little do-all device originally dreamed up by computer scientist Alan Kay. "They should be shot for using the name," grouses InfoCorp analyst David Carnevale, who sees the UltraLite as a better role model. "In the next few months we'll see some real Dynabooks."

#### FoxPro Is Coming

Data Base Manager Sports New Interface Fox Software will ship the third iteration of its popular relational data base manager by the end of September for an as-yet-undetermined price. Fox-Pro features a new character-based windowed interface consistent with that of Foxbase + Mac. It also is several times faster than Ashton-Tate's dBASE IV, with which it is completely command

and file compatible, claims Fox marketing director Richard Ney. "We are trying to break away from that clone image," Ney says. And the quicker the better: Last November, an early preview of *FoxPro* prompted Ashton-Tate president Ed Esber to file a look-and-feel lawsuit before Fox could change the interface, Ney claims.

#### **CompuServe Buys The Source**

Telecomputing Pioneers Merge Another chapter in the saga of personal computing closed in August as CompuServe bought fellow online information service provider The Source. Both began linking early personal computer users over telephone lines in 1979, providing bulletin board and SIG opportunities as well as special data base offerings. However, while CompuServe thrived, The Source subscription list dwindled to 53,000. Source subscribers will be offered a \$20 usage

credit should they opt to join the 500,000 Compu-Serve users. A customized menu will acquaint Source members with CompuServe navigational commands. An electronic information service provider since 1969, the Columbus, Ohio-based CompuServe was more diversified than The Source and better-positioned to take advantage of a range of PC opportunities, explains CompuServe spokesperson Rich Baker.





Earlier this year when Intel announced the 486 chip, I pulled out a bunch of old press clippings from Compaq's Deskpro 386 debut in late 1986. Three years ago almost nobody anticipated the raging success 386-based PCs would enjoy-least of all IBM, which launched its PS/2 strategy the following spring with systems based on the 286 chip and a 286 operating system, OS/2. Everyone assumed that 386 systems would find limited use only as CAD workstations, LAN servers, and toys for the power hungry-not as the emerging office standard they've become.

Well, history's about to repeat itself—with a twist—if IBM has anything to say about it. Determined to keep Compaq from stealing the thunder again, Big Blue made a point recently of being the first major PC manufacturer to announce a 486 system. And IBM doesn't see it merely as a LAN server or a CAD workstation, either. Instead, it's an

upgrade to Big Blue's most popular 386 PC, the desktop 25-MHz PS/2 Model 70-A21 (see the 486 preview in this issue).

Beyond sheer power lust, why would anyone want a 486 desktop PC? IBM is betting that users will be as excited about 486 systems as they were over the first 386 PCs. But that's a tall order. PCs based on the 386 captured users' minds and pocketbooks because they made revolutionary advances over mainstream, business-class ATs. They were twice as powerful, delivered new capabilities unknown to the 286, and promised to run both existing software and software not yet invented. There aren't too many times in life when you can play it safe by buying the most exciting product around. But here was one such occasion.

Intel has been pitching the 486 as a smooth extension to the 386 processor line, and that's true. Just like 386 PCs, 486 systems will run old DOS software as well as software created for the 286 or 386. But 486 PCs also have a revolutionary side that can't be ignored. In *PC World*'s preliminary testing, IBM's Model 70 upgrade ran DOS business applications about twice as fast as the original 386 configuration.

And that represents more of a floor than a ceiling for 486 performance. You can expect that a system equipped with high-performance intelligent peripherals will do much better. In fact, as Compaq has been suggesting all along, the 486 may provide the first solid rationale for dumping the AT standard in favor of a high-speed PC bus like the Micro Channel or EISA.

The 486 is revolutionary in other, less obvious ways, too. Many developers seem intrigued that the 486 will make math coprocessors standard equipment in a whole new generation of PCs. Most math coprocessors today are used to put some muscle into spreadsheet or CAD operations. But a math coprocessor could just as easily speed up a graphical environment like *Windows* or Presentation Manager and give it some extra touches, like scalable fonts.

Finally, the 486 is likely to foster a revolution in PC pricing that will put 386 systems within reach of almost every business user. Just as 386 PCs sent the cost of 286 technology into a nosedive, 486 systems are destined to drive 386 prices sharply down. Within a year, you can expect that 20-MHz 386s will be standard isue in most companies. (continues)







#### **BASIC Benchmark Brouhaha**

Thank you for choosing *Quick-BASIC 4.5* as a Best Buy [Languages Special Report, *PCW*, April 1989]. However, the conclusion about *QuickBASIC*'s performance should not have been

based on a single benchmark. There is insufficient data to support the claim that *Turbo Basic* is faster in general. If NSTL used thorough published benchmark suites—we have found ones with 35 to 48 benchmarks covering areas like graphics, math, file I/O, looping, and sorting—they would find that *QuickBASIC 4.5* beats *Turbo Basic 1.1* in 65 to 74 percent of cases.

The best way to test a compiler is to write a real application with it, but the most popular BASIC compilers don't use identical syntax. They support common source code only at the level of BASICA-a small fraction of the compiler's total features. Our benchmarks use this common subset so that we can run the same code on all products. We believe the test we ran fairly characterizes the realworld performance of these products.

While the review "Five Against IV" [PCW, May 1989] is otherwise fair. I was disturbed by one comment: Alan Schwartz states that converting dBase III Plus applications to dBMAN 5.1 requires "line-by-line recoding." I know there are a few incompatibilities, but the conversion does not require line-by-line recoding. The entire SBT Accounting Software Library, with over 10MB of source files, needs less than five syntax changes from dBMAN 5.1. That is an insignificant conversion effort.

dBMAN 5.1 has more than 130 enhancements over dBASE III Plus, incorporated from the suggestions of heavy-duty exdBASE developers. Was the point of the article to identify the Best Buy in data base managers or the one most compatible with dBASE III?

Both the FastWrite VGA and the V-RAM VGA now come with 16-color, 1024 by 768 drivers for Windows 2.0, Windows/386, and AutoCAD. You can download these and other new drivers from Video Seven's 24-hour bulletin board (415/656-0503).—Ed.







Format double-density disks in a high-density drive, preserve PIF files when reinstalling Windows, expand abbreviations automatically in just about any program, and create smart batch files that return to where they started.

# **Double-Density Format**

Q. I am responsible for several compatibles equipped with 1.2MB (high-density) 5½-inch floppy drives. They can read 360K (double-density) disks, but I don't know how to make them format disks to 360K. Can you help? And while we're on the subject, how do I format a 3½-inch disk to 720K in a 1.44MB (high-density) drive?

M. H. MacKay Reading, Pennsylvania **A.** Assuming the 5¼-inch drive is drive A:, use the command FORMAT A: /4 to format disks to 360K. To get 720K disks from a 3½-inch drive, use FORMAT A: /T:80 /N:9.

A word of caution: Although it doesn't happen frequently, 360K 5¼-inch drives may have trouble reading information written from a high-density drive to a double-density disk. Also, avoid formatting high-density disks to 360K. It's my experience that 360K drives are almost never able to read information written from a high-density drive to such a disk.

# When PIFs Go Poof!

Q. I recently upgraded my system's video adapter from an EGA to a VGA and discovered that I had to completely reinstall Windows for it to recognize the change. Although reinstallation appeared to proceed without any problems, I found that Windows had erased every one of my program information (PIF) files and installed its own collection of default PIF files instead.

Windows didn't care that the PIF directory already had PIF files. SETUP didn't ask me if I'd like the existing PIF files renamed, perhaps with the extension .OLD as it does for WIN-.INI. It just wiped away all PIF modifications I had made and

didn't even mention the changes after the fact. I had to rebuild my PIF files one at a time. Did I do something wrong? Is there some way to run SETUP so it doesn't destroy existing PIF files?

A. Using a PIF file is the recommended method for starting a standard (non-Windows) application under Windows. PIF files, which always have a .PIF extension, inform Windows about how each PIF's associated application uses the screen, system memory, drive directories, and other system resources, enabling Windows to run the application properly. Tinkering with PIF files is a necessary (albeit frustrating) part of fine-tuning Windows for your system and applications.

It is inexcusable for a program to brazenly discard an entire set of files you've created. And it's unfortunate that you don't have a backup of your PIF directory (which would allow you to simply restore your PIF files), but understandable if you normally exclude program files from your data backup.

To save you from the same grief the next time you reinstall Windows, log on to the PIF directory and use the DOS command ATTRIB + R \*.\* to make the files read-only. SETUP will not be able to erase or replace your PIF files. After the rein-(continues)

stallation is complete, log on to the PIF directory again and use the DOS command ATTRIB -R \*.\* to remove the files' read-only attribute so that PIFEDIT can edit them.

For an extra measure of security, you can, like some *Windows* users, keep a copy of all your PIF files in another directory (for example, PIFBAK). That would allow you to simply copy those files into the PIF directory after reinstallation.

If you're reinstalling Windows for a new mouse or display adapter only, you can shorten the process by pressing <Ctrl>-X when prompted about printer or plotter installation. Ignore the message about Windows installation being incomplete, and re-

name WIN.OLD (in the Windows directory) WIN.INI.

### **Abbreviated Existence**

Q. Several years ago I purchased a program called Jot, which is described by its vendor, Beacon Software International, as a typing accelerator. It works with other programs, watching the text or data that you are entering and automatically spelling out any "abbreviations" it recognizes. For example, the keystrokes ASAP (followed by <Enter>, <Space>, or any punctuation key) would be expanded to as soon as possible. Jot is memory-resident and works well with other programs; I've used it with WordPerfect, 1-2-3, and several others.

Jot performs flawlessly on XTs and IBM's original 6-MHz ATs but simply does not work on faster (8-MHz and up) units. I'd like to get a new version that will work on the faster machines, but the vendor appears to have vanished. Can you offer any assistance?


**A.** Beacon Software's *Jot* is the enhanced version of Productivity Software International's original PRD + (also called *Productivity Plus*). Written by the same programmer, *Jot* was easier to install, easier to use, and had greater capacity. finements, including its easy-touse interface. # **Round-Trip Batch Files**

Q. We're sure there's a way that a batch file can trap the current disk drive designator (A:, C:, or whatever) and that drive's current directory. With those capabilities, a batch file could change disk drives and/or subdirectories, perform its task, and return the user to the original drive and directory. We've looked everywhere, without success. Can you help?

A. The batch file TO&FRO.BAT, shown in LISTING 1, demonstrates the technique. The batch file works by creating a second batch (continues)

file, GETBACK.BAT, that contains the commands needed to return to the default drive and directory. The example assumes that drive C: has a subdirectory called \UTILITY, that the current default drive has a subdirectory called \NEWDIREC, and that there's a disk in drive A:. It also uses the @ symbol and the CALL command, features of DOS 3.3 and later versions: users of earlier versions must omit the @ and substitute the command C:\COMMAND/C for CALL.

TO&FRO relies on a small text file called C:\UTILITY-\CDSPACE. Create that file from the DOS prompt: Type copy con c:\utility\cdspace, press <Enter>, type @echo off, press <Enter>, type CD and a space, press <Ctrl>-Z, and press <Enter>. CDSPACE is a template comprising the first one-and-a-half commands of GET-BACK.BAT.

After turning the echo off, TO&FRO creates GETBACK- .BAT as a copy of CDSPACE. The >NUL at the end of the COPY command redirects the message '1 file(s) copied' to NUL (a reserved name for a nonexistent device, which simply accepts and discards input), keeping the message from cluttering the screen. The next line uses the CD command to report (not to change) the current default directory. But instead of displaying the full path name on screen, that line's double greater-than symbol instructs DOS to append CD's output to the end of GET-

BACK.BAT. Construction of GETBACK.BAT's second command, which TO&FRO will use to return to the original directory, is now complete.

Next, TO&FRO.BAT builds the command that will restore the original default drive. First, the command CD\ logs on to the drive's root directory. Then, another CD command is used again with the double greater-than symbol to add the name of the default drive's root directory as GETBACK's third and final command. The name of the root directory will work as a drive command because DOS ignores the backslash that trails the drive designator.

Then, just for show, TO&-FRO.BAT changes to a new directory and then to drive A:. After a pause, TO&FRO.BAT calls GETBACK.BAT, the batch file it created, to change back to the original drive and directory.





# First-hand dispatches from the Windows front

Why is the most popular category of Windows software made up of stuff that modifies and "improves" Windows itself?

Stewart Alsop

Some time ago, in another life, I wrote a column about my worst nightmare—reviewing DOS shells, those little programs like *Norton Commander*, *Xtree*, and others that try to make the operating system more usable for human beings.

The problem is that every programmer thinks he or she can design a better user interface than the operating system's creators did. But every programmer has a different idea of what's good, leading to a situation where the differences themselves become the problem. The worst part is, every shell programmer religiously believes his way is

right and that he should convert every industry analyst and writer to his point of view. I call that Shell Hell.

Shell Hell is back, only this time it's moved from DOS to Windows. The basic urge represented by those DOS shells—to improve upon Microsoft's work—hasn't been blunted by Windows' supposed ease of use. Instead, the single most popular category of Windows software belongs to programs that "fix" real or perceived problems in Windows itself.

The fundamental problem these programs try to solve is that the MS-DOS Executive the Windows program used to manage files and navigate directories—isn't very exciting for a modern graphical interface. Perhaps Microsoft deliberately underpowered it so customers could differentiate their systems. Or perhaps Microsoft was too busy working on OS/2 or on Windows' memory management. But MS-DOS Executive doesn't do anything DOS doesn't already do, and DOS doesn't do very much beyond some simple file management.

So far, I've come across six Windows shells: PubTech File Organizer, Command Post, Windows Manager, NewWave, Clearview, and Prompt. It's impossible to evaluate these products without using them for some time, since you can use only one at a time, and you don't discover their eccentricities until you run

into those odd situations that tax any program. So I haven't yet evaluated *Clearview* from Wang Labs or *Prompt* from Access Software. But here's what I think of the rest.

# PubTech: Too Close for Comfort

The first Windows shell I used was PubTech File Organizer. Given my Macintosh experience, I thought that PFO's Mac-like approach would be just right. Icons on a desktop represent files and programs. You launch programs by clicking on an icon or selecting an associated file from a directory listing.

But PFO lacks the Mac's coherent way of doing things. For example, double-clicking sometimes installs an icon onto the desktop and sometimes launches a program. There's probably a rule explaining when it does which, but I never found it (being an aggressive nonreader of manuals).

Other Windows users I've spoken to about PFO swear by it; they've probably never used another graphical shell and aren't confused by PFO. In addition, PFO works best if you disable the MS-DOS Executive (by changing a line in the WIN.INI file). But I'm uncomfortable giving up a standard part of Windows, even if it is substandard. (continues)

# Command Post: Windows-Friendly

Command Post is probably the least intrusive and most widely used Windows shell around. A shareware product, it enhances the MS-DOS Executive by adding four new menus and some other features. The Windows menu lets you activate and arrange windows. The CmdPost menu invokes several utilities. The Desktop and Applications menus are entirely user defined through an editable text file. You also get a desktop clock and screen saver.

I like Command Post primarily because it is friendly to everything else. Since it is an extension of the MS-DOS Executive, it doesn't interfere with other programs. And it doesn't throw what you've already learned about Windows out the...window.

# Windows Manager: Desktop with Utility

My other favorite Windows shell is hDC's Windows Manager. I like it because it adds the concept of desktop utilities to Windows. Desktop utilities are small programs that help you manage your desktop or disk or time or whatever. Macs include several such "desk accessories" for installing new fonts or utilities and choosing network resources such as printers or servers. Windows Manager adds all this to Windows (and fits in quite well with Command Post). It comes with seven utilities, including the visual memory map I asked for in PC World's July issue.

A lot of people say you don't need special ways of handling utilities in a multitasking environment, since utilities are just little programs. But I've discovered it's useful to organize utilities in a consistent fashion so you always know where to find them. That's what Windows Manager does.

# NewWave: Software That Thinks Like You Do?

Users still can't get their hands on the infamous and muchheralded NewWave, the program that caused Apple Computer to sue HP and Microsoft. The environment is now in beta testing and will become available this fall. NewWave is overkill if you use existing Windows programs and want some new file-management features. But if you use NewWave applications (which are Windows programs modified to use some of NewWave's special features), you will discover a entirely new way of working with a computer.

NewWave is object oriented. That means the system keeps track of how programs, data, and resources work with each other. When you use NewWave programs, you never see "software" and you never see files. Instead you see compound documents.

Think of how you read documents on your physical desktop: Your brain automatically goes into word processing mode when you read text and into graphics mode when you look at pictures. NewWave is similar. If a document includes both text and graphics, you actually use the text editor to change the text and the drawing program to change the graphics. But it looks like you're just editing the document. Even though the document is made up of different kinds of data managed by different pieces of software, it all looks and acts the same.

You can also ask *NewWave* to remember what you do; it will keep a journal of your actions that you can play back to automate recurring activities. HP calls these journals *agents*, which is really a fancy word for what users have been calling macros or scripts ever since Lotus delivered 1-2-3 release 1A.

# Wanted: Computing Without Rules

I'm sure I'll get a couple of angry letters from readers who use other shell programs or who actually think the MS-DOS Executive is fine. All right, already! My main point is that a successful system approaches similar tasks in a consistent way. The whole idea of graphic interfaces is to help users spend less time worrying about the computer and more time worrying about work. And the biggest time waster of all is trying to remember exactly how you're supposed to do something that doesn't quite fit the rules. In fact, as NewWave seems to promise, the biggest time-saver will be the system that doesn't ask you to remember any rules at all.



# **Check Those LaserJet** Codes

If your LaserJet prints parts of a control code at the beginning of a document, you've probably entered the code incorrectly. The printer tries to execute all escape sequences it encounters, but if the commands aren't in its lexicon, it treats the codes as printable data. This always occurs if any part of the escape code is missing. Watch out especially for applications that use a special key sequence to enter an escape code (for example, WordStar uses <Ctrl>-P[). In short, double-check your codes.



# dBASE Community Rocked by Developer Discontent

Separated by a Common Language



Nantucket's Larry Heimendinger will slowly move Clipper away from the dBASE language.

arry Heimendinger had just unveiled the new version of *Clipper*, Nantucket's dBASE compiler, when an earthquake rocked the floor and set the chandeliers rattling.

"I told you that this is a fabulous product," cracked the Nantucket chief executive, looking skyward. The thousand developers in the audience must have concurred, because all but a handful were still in their seats a few minutes later when a large aftershock rolled through the hall. But then, the hardened veterans of last vear's disastrous dBASE aftermarket don't scare easily.

They were in Los Angeles on a mission: to find a way to survive and thrive with dBASE next year. Many had also packed the Valley West dBASE User Group's dDay developer/user fair, which drew 500 attendees the weekend before. The strength of both events testifies to the popularity of the dBASE language. An estimated 90,000-plus dBASE language programmers have built some 10,000 commercial applications and untold thousands of in-house applications.

But as the *Clipper* conference showed, interest

does not equal satisfaction. Lawsuits, delayed dBASE updates, and profit dives for add-on developers and Ashton-Tate alike have sent shock waves through the community. There are more than a few scuffles among dBASE devotees these days, and dissatisfaction with Ashton-Tate's plans

spills from every conversation.

"Ashton-Tate has been shooting itself in the foot for a long time," declares Tripp Micou, director of the 1500-member dBASE Language User Group of the Boston Computer Society. "Now it's starting (see dBASE, p. 56)

# Caere Package Redefines Desktop Text Recognition


Saving 'Disenfranchised' Data

n text recognition, the road to success is paved with failed vendors. It's not that users like to retype information. As Caere chairman Robert Noyce points out, "you seem to spend most of your time with a personal computer just putting data in." The problem has

been creating technology that's good and cheap.

Better known for pioneering integrated circuits and cofounding Intel, Noyce put Caere together in the mid-1970s. The original target was point-of-sale systems, and the big question, says (see Caere, p. 58)

(continued from p. 55) to point the gun at its head."

Unlike user-driven applications such as 1-2-3, and despite Ashton-Tate's claim to be the only legitimate custodian of the language, dBASE has long depended upon the kindness of strangers for its vitality. Early on, thirdparty developers and consultants got behind the product and pushed its inscrutable dot prompt past other technologies. These evangelists continue to expand its features, but many are experiencing a crisis of faith.

"We're here because we're dissatisfied with the industry leader," asserts Christopher Edgar, an insurance industry consultant and head of a Hartford, Connecticut, Clipper user group. "We're trying to find other ways to serve our companies and clients because we aren't getting support from Ashton-Tate."

Heimendinger claims that many of the 3 million dBASE users would be surprised to learn that their applications were not developed with dBASE itself, but in Foxbase, Clipper, or another dBASE language—compatible product.

Nantucket and Fox Software, the most prominent third parties, have charted courses away from the language in order to free themselves from Ashton-Tate's technical, legal, and marketing turbulence. Fox, located in Perrysburg, Ohio, will make its new FoxPro a radical departure in terms of interface

and command set. Los Angeles—based Nantucket is turning toward object-oriented programming (OOP). Its newly-launched Clipper 5.0 is only the harbinger of a full-blown OOP product planned for early 1990, which will offer the ability to switch back and forth between OOP and conventional procedural techniques.

Ashton-Tate's inability to ship dBASE IV froze sales for third parties last year, says Heimendinger. When finally released, the package was slow, buggy, and a glutton for memory. The product is still languishing on distributor shelves; Ashton-Tate revenues dropped 39 percent from the first quarter to the second quarter (ended June 30), with an accompanying \$15 million loss. Third-quarter prospects are no brighter, since version 1.1 has been delayed from April to possibly as late as September.

dBASE IV is big and slow, observes data base lecturer Adam Green, because Ashton-Tate tried to grab yet more market share by jamming in too many of the add-on features offered by thirdparty products. Ashton-Tate chief executive Ed Esber counters that users asked for all those features, and asserts that developers' motives "are not to promote the dBASE language but rather to promote their own economic well-being."

Some of Nantucket's own third parties lodge a similar market-gobbling complaint against *Clipper Tools*. But while Nantucket tries to work out its differences with third

parties, Ashton-Tate has "dammed up the river," declares leading dissident Tom Rettig of Tom Rettig Associates in Beverly Hills, California.

Heimendinger claims that more than 100,000 copies of *Clipper* have shipped. But with only \$1.4 million in profits on \$17 million in 1988 revenues, his company is not about to snatch market dominance from the \$307 million Ashton-Tate. Still, the Torrance, California, giant will have to deliver a


clean version 1.1 if it is to bring developers back into the fold.

"They own the hands of the data entry people and the main body of users, but they have lost the hearts and minds of programmers," insists Green. "If it weren't for compatibles, dBASE would be losing market share very fast, because all those who left for the compatibles would have left the language completely."

# DOS Extenders Flourish as Vendors Reduce Conflicts

But Microsoft Balks at Standard



hree years ago, small software houses quietly began to release DOS extender tools, which give developers a clean way to break the DOS 640K memory barrier on 80286 and 80386 machines. The tool suppliers expected only a limited window of opportunity; when OS/2 arrived, "we thought we would have to go on to other things," recalls Ben Williams, vice president at Rational Systems in Natick, Massachusetts.

But it hasn't turned out that way, and DOS extender technology has been embedded not just in a trickle of specialized engineering packages but in major applications: 1-2-3 release 3, AutoCAD, Paradox, Foxbase, and many others.

DOS extenders tailored for the 386 cannot only exploit full 32-bit processing power (which OS/2 won't begin to do until next (see Extenders, p. 60)




Noyce, "was whether the technology had reached the point of being practical. The final answer was no," he adds, laughing.

"I've never started a company that stuck to its original concept," Noyce remarks, and Caere went off to prosper in other niches, first with handheld scanners and then bar-code equipment. But two years ago, Caere's engineers embarked on another quest for a text recognition hit. Last year the Los Gatos, California, firm produced one.

Caere's OmniPage doesn't boast a 100 percent recognition rate-no text recognition system does, even dedicated systems that cost tens of thousands of dollars. But it can read text from an extremely wide variety of scanned documents at up to 115 characters per second and save the text in several popular file formats. Unlike many textrecognition packages, OmniPage doesn't require users to "train" it on a given document. It employs Windows for ease of use and gives quick feedback on its progress.

OmniPage costs \$2495 with a coprocessor board for ATs, \$895 in a soft-ware-only version for 386s with 4MB of memory. Caere president Robert Teresi agrees that such a 386 doesn't come cheap but points out that "you can use it for other tasks—unlike the board."

"Caere has reshuffled the industry with a product that can handle many, many kinds of documents quite effectively at a desktop price," says David



Most customers use OmniPage for office duty, not publishing, notes Caere's Larry Miller.

Marshak, senior analyst at Patty Seybold's Office Computing Group in Boston.

While Caere expected desktop publishers to lead early OmniPage adopters, it found 70 percent of users doing general office duty, says Larry Miller, director of office products. That means the system is quickly finding its proper niche in the paper chase—handling the "economically disenfranchised" data that you can't file physically but

may need a month or a year from now. "Remember the last scene in *Raiders of the Lost Ark*—that huge warehouse?" asks Miller. "That's where résumés go."

All-terrain text recognition remains a daunting technical challenge for new entrants, but Caere faces strong rivals in California-based veterans Calera Recognition Systems (formerly Palantir) of Santa Clara and Xerox Imaging Systems of Mountain View (which

grew from Kurzweil Computer Systems and Datacopy). Both firms now offer PC text-recognition hardware-andsoftware packages for under \$3000.

"In this market, vendors generally team up," notes Cathy Dingman, analyst with CAP International in Norwell, Massachusetts, and such partnerships may make or break text-recognition suppliers. OmniPage received instant prominence by debuting a Macintosh version alongside Apple's first scanner; Seybold's Marshak now sees a need for deals with IBM and other major players.

Teresi cautiously predicts that in two years OmniPage could double Caere's sales, currently in the \$18 to \$20 million range. "Caere has been around the track; it has a lot of scar tissue," Noyce adds. "The surprising thing is that it's had a positive cash flow for years." —E. B.

# DCA Broadens Offerings as IRMA's Star Fades

Gateways Replacing Emulation Cards

pigital Communications Associates built a \$200 million-plus empire by cobbling together a diverse line of communications gear—everything from Crosstalk software to high-speed modems. But last year, when financial results suddenly turned shaky, DCA's second-ranking executive left, and rumors of a


buyout raced along Wall Street, analysts blamed one culprit: IRMA.

Launched in 1982, IRMA was the first hardware/software combination permitting a PC to emulate an IBM 3270 mainframe terminal then the most common desktop hardware for corporate computing. IRMA both opened the market and became an enviable cash cow, accounting for more than two-thirds of DCA's revenues and profits.

Last year, though, IBM focused on 3270 board sales for the first time. "DCA was caught asleep at the wheel, and it really lost a good bit of market share," says Leslie Lord, an analyst with International Data Corporation. Her figures show IBM selling 155,000 boards, DCA only 138,000.

"Perhaps there was a little arrogance on our part," says Howard Laff-(see DCA, p. 60)

year), they can be multitasked via Quarterdeck's popular Desqview/QEMM combo. But the various suppliers of DOS extenders and 386 control environments took different approaches to memory management—raising the possibility that applications might squabble as unhappily as memoryresident packages do. To avoid such a mess, Rational, Phar Lap Software, Quarterdeck, Lotus, and others wrote a specification last spring that covers the way both DOS extenders and expanded-memory control packages use 386 memory.

The one hitch is that Microsoft—a major force thanks to DOS and Windows/386—failed to endorse the standard. "We very much need

Microsoft to get on board," says Frank King, Lotus's vice president for software products. "From the customer's point of view, it would be nice to take this issue off the table."

Microsoft will take an alternate approach to extended memory this fall in a major revamp of *Windows/386*. However, it's talking with the 386 standards group, and, says Rational's Williams, "if

there is a way for us to support *Windows* products, we will."

Resolution of this issue will affect more than a few customers, and for more than just a year or two. "The practicalities have to outweigh OS/2's elegance or claims to perfection," says Williams. "It's hard to imagine something that will make people stop running DOS." —E. B.

ler, president of DCA's personal computer communications group.
"We've learned our lesson." Among changes, he cites the new IRMA 3 board, which cuts costs, runs DCA or IBM emulation software, and fits



Although analysts doubt this last feature matters much, they generally predict IRMA 3 will win back market share. But DCA's problems "are more than market share shift," says Eric Buck, vice president at Donaldson, Lufkin and Jenrette in New York. "The market for micro-tomainframe links is fully matured—in a steady and irreversible decline."

IDC's Lord is more optimistic, predicting 5 percent compound annual growth in shipments for the next five years. But she agrees that a fundamental technological shift is under way, with PCs beginning to connect to mainframes through network gateways rather

than individual emulator boards. "It's just more economical," says Lord, who forecasts that unit sales of such gateways will grow at a 27 percent annual rate.

Networks are old news to DCA, which began offering gateway products three years ago. In early 1988 the company undertook a massive development project for a powerful OS/2 LAN Manager gateway. This turned into a joint effort with Microsoft, which will license the technology to other suppliers. The first version should arrive late this year.

"They're betting the bank on the success of this next-generation product," Lord says. She cautions, however, that "it depends on the success not only of OS/2 but of *LAN Manager*, and that market hasn't heated up yet." When it does, DCA will but heads with IBM, 3Com, and Novell.

Even if the DCA gateway does well, Buck notes, it won't make up for IRMA sales if the cost to connect ten users runs around \$12,000 via IRMA but only \$4000 via a gateway. "This is not incremental business but something DCA has to do if it wants to hold on to a quarter of the business."

Meanwhile, DCA continues to search for another star. A move into veryhigh-speed modems and other wide-area-net products hasn't met expectations, in Buck's view. Neither has the 1987 purchase of Fox Research and its 10Net LAN. Fox's aggressive entrepreneurs "were going to be Novell and 3Com killers, and we let them run hands-off for the first year," Laffler says. "They found that those two companies were very formidable." 10Net now targets overseas markets and securityconscious buyers with its fiber-optic hardware. "That's a decent little niche, but not a big revenue-gathering business," remarks Buck.


So although DCA's strategy seems sound, "there's been some stumbling along the way," Buck says. Fortunately for the company, during the next few years IRMA will remain "a nice comfortable market," says Lord. "It's taking some risks, but I think DCA is on the right track." —E. B.







# IBM Kicks Off the 486 Race

IBM jumps the gun on 486 announcements-

but can expect tough competition by the time its upgrade actually arrives.



ow much will PCs built around Intel's new 486 microprocessor cost, and how will they perform compared to to-day's top-of-the-line 80386 models?

Surprisingly, the first specific answers come from a company that hasn't led the PC performance parade in recent memory. IBM will charge \$3995 for a 25-MHz 486 upgrade to its PS/2 Model 70-A21 386 machine, and claims the upgraded unit will crank through tough number-crunching tasks twice as fast as a 33-MHz 386 PC with a math coprocessor.

Now for the reality check: Intel hasn't actually finished building the

486 yet. IBM, which now typically unveils its fastest PCs months before they ship, doesn't expect to deliver until the fourth quarter. However, the company claims that the 486 is close to final form and backed up that claim in June by showing more than 20 prototype systems running application software.

The 486 chip runs all the same software as the 386 without modification, and the prototype IBM machines act just like extremely fast 386s. The chip itself provides two to four times the raw performance of the 386 at a given clock speed (and while the 386 is likely to top out at 33 MHz, Intel plans to eventually boost the 486 clock to 50 MHz).

### Take a Card

In addition to a built-in memory cache, cache controller, and 387 coprocessor, the 486 includes a host of power features that system manufacturers are not likely to exploit fully for awhile. On the other hand, vendors can leave their 386 architectures almost untouched-an approach that IBM's upgrade takes to an extreme. The PS/2 486/25 Power Platform is a computer on a card that includes the 486, a crystal, and a sprinkling of logic chips; it replaces the 25-MHz CPU card that plugs onto the A21's motherboard (slower 386 PS/2s can't accept this upgrade).

You don't need cardsharp skills to install the Power Platform. Dealers can make the swap in a few minutes without tools by pulling off the cover, taking out the floppy and hard disk drives, removing a structural piece and the hard disk interface, replacing the processor card, and then reversing these steps. Finally, two BIOS chips are upgraded and the system software is reconfigured (the 386 card goes back to IBM).

According to our preliminary tests, business applications run up to twice as fast at they do on the original A21. IBM claims the production units will perform identically to the prototype; further engineering will merely correct a few dozen remaining glitches.

IBM has cut the A21's starting price to \$8995, so an upgraded base system with a 120MB drive will list for \$12,990. By comparison, a Compaq Deskpro 386/33 with an 84MB drive costs \$10,499. Pricing estimates for future 486 systems range upward from \$10,000; the chip itself costs system vendors \$950 in bulk.

Not surprisingly, IBM expects to ship a standalone box at about the same time the upgrade appears, although no details were provided at press time. Why, then, an upgrade announcement in June? IBM says the company aims to let customers know about an important benefit. Rivals insist that the gambit is intended to bolster the A21. which took a long time to ship in volume and then suffered from an acknowledged defect in 15 percent of its hard drives. Competitors also note that the A21's limitations-a maximum of 8MB of memory on the motherboard, a meager three slots, and a hard disk that's sluggish compared to its peersmake it a less than perfect springboard for the 486.

Of course, the first vendor to disclose plans to reach the next performance plateau is not always the first vendor to ship. With the 486 arriving ahead of schedule and in unexpectedly polished form, other manufacturers may be expected to react quickly. AST, for instance, announced a similar upgrade two weeks after IBM. Compaq leads the 386 market, but every other major player is also in the blocks, and we'll probably see a photo finish.

When the dust settles and the noise from the marketing crowd sub-



# Crosstalk Spiffs Up Its Interface

Crosstalk for Windows delivers most of the power of the popular communications package


-with a stylish, easy-to-use interface.

ommunications, the last refuge of bit-twiddlers, cries out for Microsoft's Windows environment. A mouse is quicker than a keyboard for selecting parameters or phone-book entries. And once you've established a communications link, Windows multitasking lets you get back to other work even when files are still coming down the line.

Future Soft Engineering's DynaComm has been the sole entry among Windows communicators (see the review in the Windows Special Report, PCW, August 1989). But DCA/Crosstalk's Crosstalk for Windows, whose features and interface are slightly more advanced than those of DynaComm 2.0, should have appeared by the time you read this.

In functionality, Crosstalk for Windows is closer to Crosstalk Mk.4 than to Crosstalk XVI, but it lacks Mk.4's numerous terminal emulations and support for multiple ses-

sions. Its script language, though sophisticated, is a subset of *Mk.4*'s CASL programming language. Non-*Windows* users should note that *Crosstalk* lacks a run-time version, so they'll have to buy *Windows*.

# **Easing Into Windows**

Crosstalk for Windows is much simpler to use than its progenitors. You select entries from pulldown windows with a mouse or by entering the first letter. Common menu selections and on-line tasks are duplicated with function keys. As with *Dyna-Comm*, you can assign text macros or scripts to function key combinations, with assignments displayed in a template at the bottom of the screen.

While *DynaComm* greets you with a bewildering array of top-line menu selections stretch-

ing across the screen, Crosstalk for Windows presents just six pulldown windows. You normally use four: File, Edit, Actions, and Setup. Surprisingly, four main menus are enough, and even if you ignore the function key shortcuts, you rarely get lost in submenus or dialog boxes. The other two menus provide on-line assistance.

The Users menu is an alternative to the function key template. The Help menu, unfortunately, is topic oriented and not context sensitive.

Setting up and managing phone-book entries is far easier than with the other versions of Crosstalk and more advanced than with DynaComm. However, it could stand to be even easier. Unlike DynaComm (and the other Crosstalks), Crosstalk for Windows provides a dialing directory, but it's limited to displaying the names and descriptions of entries. You can open an entry and dial from this menu with a few mouse clicks, but to view or modify phone numbers or other parameters, you must go elsewhere.

The File menu lets you easily create or open a phone-book entry and modify simple parameters such as bps rate. To change more complicated settings, you turn to the Setup menu, where parameters are logically ordered in submenus. Each contains a host of welldesigned dialog boxes. When no entry is open, you can use these controls to modify global settings for future entries.

In range of parameters, Crosstalk for Windows almost matches Mk.4. It offers extensive flow control and modem options, plus extras such as color and font settings and function key macros. Its list of error-correcting

protocols matches Mk.4's, except for its lack of ZMODEM; you can call on XMODEM and YMODEM, Kermit, Crosstalk, DART, and CompuServe-B. Terminal emulation options are more modest: Only 5 are offered, compared with Mk.4's 25. The VT 102, VT 52, IBM PC (ANSI), IBM 3101, and VIDTEX emulations are plenty for most users, but DynaComm offers a few more.

On line, Crosstalk for Windows behaves admirably. Unlike Mk.4, it presents a constant and informative status line, and the interface is the same as the off-line display. Unlike DynaComm, it accompanies error-correcting file transfers with a detailed status display.

When exchanging ASCII text, you can choose from four textcapture options, ranging from normal ASCII to a graphics screen snapshot, and you can add headers and footers to printed documents. When uploading files, you receive directory support, and you can quickly cut and paste text with the Clipboard or with Windows' Notepad editor. The program lacks its own editor, but you can call the Notepad by mouse or function key, and you can view a session by playing back the package's capture buffer.

# **Sophisticated Scripts**

To automate communications, you can easily attach scripts to phonebook entries. Thanks to a long list of preset log-in scripts that includes AT&T Mail, MCI Mail, CompuServe, and Delphi, most users won't have to learn the *Crosstalk for Windows* script language. A Learn script for recording log-ins is also available, but a bug kept this from working in the beta version.

The script language lacks some of CASL's extras such as sophisticated windowing and mathematical commands, but it's much more advanced than Crosstalk XVI's language. It provides a builtin compiler and enough windowing extras to let you design your own dialog boxes. Most CASL scripts should work with a little help from the handy automatic debugger, and a translation script is provided for Crosstalk XVI scripts.

The script language also sports a few Windows-oriented additions. Like DynaComm, it supports Windows' Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) protocol for swapping data between Windows applications. As a back end for DDE, the script language could automate communications from within any Windows program. A sample script updates an Excel spreadsheet with data downloaded from a background Dow Jones session.

Crosstalk for Windows doesn't roar into the Windows world ready to dominate overnight, but it's



### Zenith Rolls Out Biggest Little Weapon in the Lap War

Forget the battle for the desktop. The most intense action these days is in the portables market, where competition is raging over the space in your briefcase. NEC fired the first shot with its ultrathin, ultrafunctional UltraLite. Zenith has come back with very, very light artillery—a tiny new addition to its popular "sPort" series called the MinisPort.

A notebook-size laptop with an 8-MHz 80C88 CPU and a backlit 80-by-25-character LCD, the MinisPort caters to the same smaller-is-better crowd as the UltraLite. But there's one big difference: the MinisPort's 2-inch floppy drive.

Like the UltraLite, the MinisPort comes with 1MB of RAM, expandable to 2MB. Both machines use memory over 640K for a battery-backed RAM disk, and boot by default from DOS 3.3 in ROM. But while the UltraLite features custom-made ROM cards containing popular applications, the MinisPort's removable medium of choice is the 2-inch, 720K "flopette." Zenith says the 2-inch drive is strictly a backup device for the RAM disk. so don't expect software on flopette anytime soon. Programs and data find their way to the RAM disk via optional 31/2inch or 51/4-inch external drives; an external 2-inch drive for your desktop PC

is due this fall. Alternatively, you can use the MinisPort's ROM-based, modified version of LapLink, Traveling Software's serial communications program that copies itself to the host system.

The 6-pound, \$1999 MinisPort is a full \$1000 cheaper than the Ultra-Lite and about a pound heavier. The prototype seemed good and solid particularly the keyboard. The touch of the full-size keys seemed better than most laptops', and the 80-key configuration uses a special "function" key to effectively emulate a 101-key layout.

Zenith conservatively estimates a 3-hour battery life for the MinisPort—with full backlighting, moderate disk access, and perhaps a session or two with the optional 1200-bps internal modem. A pop-up utility lets you set the backlight time-out, configure the built-in serial and parallel ports, and switch from CGA-resolution LCD to an external CGA-compatible monitor.

This classy, thought-fully designed machine makes a convincing claim on your workspace—be it desk, briefcase, or lap. Zenith Data Systems, 1000 Milwaukee Ave., Glenview, IL 60025; 800/842-9000.

Looking ahead is never easy, especially if you're fairly certain that at some time in the future you'll be held accountable for budgeting decisions made today. Symantec's 1-2-3 add-in, Budget Express, seeks to reduce the strain

on release 2.x users by providing convenient tools for budgeting, consolidation, and what-if analysis.

Like many add-ins, Budget Express does a little bit of everything, but its main contribution is spreadsheet outlining. Just as you can expand

and collapse subheadings in a traditional outliner, Budget Express lets you hide and unhide worksheet columns and rows to help you see the forest instead of the trees. For example, you may want to see the Business Meals column under Travel & Entertainment while you are entering data, and then hide it while examining budgetwide summaries and subtotals, either on screen or in print.

Of special interest to managers is the ability to consolidate worksheet files whose rows and columns are laid out differently—a task that 1-2-3 release 2.01's File Combine command can't accomplish. Other capabilities include writing your own ad hoc specifications for consolidations and saving those specifications for later use.

### Pioneering OS/2 Communicator Runs Multiple Sessions



HyperAccess/5 supports OS/2's ability to run multiple communications sessions with true background operations.

OS/2 is off to a slow start, largely because of the new operating system's complexity. Nowhere is the difficulty more apparent than in developing communications applications, which are particularly sensitive to timing and interrupt issues. Leading manufacturers of communications software have been slow to take up the challenge, but Hilgraeve started two years ago and now offers HyperAccess/5, one of the first communications packages to tap OS/2's multitasking capabilities.

HyperAccess/5 supports OS/2's ability to run multiple communications sessions and provides true background operations through processor time slicing. Taking advantage of OS/2's multithreading feature, the package can start other applications as child processes. It even lets you determine how much CPU processing power to devote to different background sessions

through an easy menu setting. The protectedmode program is character based; a full-fledged Presentation Manager version is due out this fall.

For those not yet ready to make the transition to OS/2, the company ships a DOS version that can be run in character mode or under *Windows* or *Desqview*. The DOS version provides all OS/2 features except multitasking.

Either way, you get

point-and-shoot menus and a much broader array of options than with Hilgraeve's other communications product, *Hyper-Access 3.2.* You also can run *HyperAccess/5* with commands, even remapping the entire keyboard if you like.

HyperAccess/5 automates communications sessions three waysmacros, command learning, and scripts. Macros simply record keystrokes and characters. Command learning enables you to record frequently used command sequences and automatically generates scripts to run them, complete with pauses for user input and access to other menus; an editor for learned scripts is included. For complex communications, HyperAccess/5's 150-command script language supports Boolean operations, math commands, conditional branching, and subroutines. The program automatically compiles scripts to speed execution.

HyperAccess/5 emulates a wide variety of terminals and offers ten file transfer protocols including the proprietary HyperProtocol. If you communicate with another HyperAccess/5 user, the program automatically compresses files to accelerate transfers and then decompresses them at the destination. Hyper-Access/5 supports up to 250 passwords for remote users, so you can dole out individual access privileges such as directory access, read-only status, and overwrite capability. Remote HyperAccess/5 users can also control the operation of the host machine.

HyperAccess/5, which lists for \$199, requires 350K and either OS/2 1.0 or a later version or DOS 2.0 or a later version. Additionally, you can enjoy easy what-if analysis with the program's goal-tracking feature. Simply select a calculated cell—Total Revenue, for example—then choose a target value. At this point you can make changes in any of the cells that affect Total Revenue; the program keeps score and lets you know when you reach the desired value. The

original values can also be restored.

A number of keystroke savers simplify budget creation. Budget Express automatically inserts month names across the top of your worksheet and generates totals without requiring you to write out @SUM formulas. Menu options make it easy to analyze the percentage of change between data columns or rows and to determine running totals.

Finally, Budget Express offers a little virtual memory management hocus-pocus that eases the memory crunch on a big worksheet by optionally "hiding" parts of the file to disk. 

### SX Desktops—386 Power On Time, Under Budget





The broad-beamed box of the Dell System 316 offers maximum expandability, while Mitsubishi's MP386S saves desktop space—and both offer the power and economy of the 386SX chip.

Can't decide whether to opt for an 80286- or 80386-based computer? If so, 80386SX-based machines from Dell Computer and Mitsubishi Electronics promise you the brawn of a 32-bit processor at prices that compete with 286s'.

Both machines incorporate Intel's 80386SX chip, which offers 16-MHz clock speed and the ability to drive 32-bit software. Neither has the kind of upscale price you may associate with 386 hardware.

If immediate expandability is your concern, the broad-beamed box of the Dell System 316 beckons. Bays on the front accommodate five half-height storage devices. Inside, you'll find six 8/16-bit slots as well as two 8-bit slots. One of the 8/16-bit slots is taken by a video adapter, but a disk controller, serial and parallel ports, and the keyboard interface are all

packed on the system board.

For those more interested in desktop space than expansion, Mitsubishi's MP386S makes better sense. The 15-by-15-inch cabinet holds six 8/16-bit slots; the floppy controller, the parallel port, and a pair of serials all sit

on the motherboard. Hard disk and video cards will, however, eat into your available slots. The slim cabinet can house a modest three half-height storage drives.

The basic MP386S comes with a respectable 2MB of RAM, to which you can add 2MB on the main system board, another 4MB on a daughterboard, and 8MB using a 16-bit slot-a total RAM capacity of 16MB. Standard features include a 101-key keyboard. 80387SX coprocessor support, DOS 3.3, and GW BASIC 3.2. Entrylevel Models 610 and 615, with a single 1.2MB, 51/4inch or 1.44MB, 31/2-inch drive respectively, are priced at \$2995. Models 640 and 645 have a 40MB 27ms 51/4-inch hard drive, raising the price to \$3995.

By comparison, Dell's

basic System 316, with a single 51/4-inch or 31/2-inch floppy, a 29ms 40MB hard drive, 1MB of RAM and a monochrome graphics display, runs \$2999. You can get another 1MB of memory for a reasonable \$200. Like the MP386S, the System 316's memory tops out at 8MB on the motherboard, and 8MB more can be added in an expansion slot. Dell doesn't bundle any software, but the plush warranty includes a 30-day money-back guarantee, next-day deskside service, and one year parts and labor. 





With five new services for 3+Open, 3Com becomes the first vendor to deliver a fully functional OS/2 network operating system that runs on a single OS/2 server.

386 computing, bringing the benefits of 32-bit software at a lower price. IBM, one of the last major vendors to join the parade, now offers the PS/2 Model 55 SX—the first SX machine to sport the computer giant's muchdiscussed Micro Channel Architecture.

The 55 SX comes in the low-slung Model 30 form factor—16 inches square and 4 inches high. The base system features 2MB of RAM (expandable to 4MB on the system board and 16MB total), a 1.44MB 3½-inch floppy drive, serial and parallel ports, a mouse port, a VGA port, and three 16-bit expansion

slots. IBM offers two models, one with a 39ms 30MB drive for \$3895 and the other with a 27ms 60MB drive for \$4295.

Depending on the application, Big Blue says, the 16-MHz 55 SX performs up to 42 percent faster than the 10-MHz 80286-based Model 50Z (which lists for \$645 less than the Model 55 with equivalent hard disks) and 15 to 25 percent slower than the 386-based IBM PS/2 Model 70 running at the same clock speed. 



### In Stocks, Timing Is Everything

MoneyWon would like to add a third tooth to the old saw about there being nothing certain but death and taxes—namely that stock prices will go up and they will come down. By the company's reckoning, 75 percent of all stocks' prices fluctuate more than 50 percent a year. This constant movement provides users of its new program, MyWay, with profit opportunities.

Offering neither technical nor fundamental analysis, MyWay won't tell you which stocks to buy. But it will tell you when to buy and sell them and in what quantities. The crux of MyWay is a common stock-buying technique called averaging down, in which you reduce the overall cost of your portfolio and your risk by buying small quantities of an otherwise attractive stock during the inevitable periods when its price falls. You sell appropriate amounts with the equally inevitable price rises.

MyWay keys off these stock-price fluctuations, constantly reassessing your position within the context of your investment objective of capital security or rapid growth. MyWay can be particularly helpful if you practice fundamental analysis, which tends to focus closely on the parameters of an individual stock but may miss the impact of broad market movements. Money Won recommends that you stick to only "well-established companies that have been on the market for some time" read those selling \$100 million and up.

MyWay lacks a word processor, data base manager, and other add-ons available with more elaborate stock-trading packages. Neither is it a personal financial management program that will help manage your budget. checkbook, or bank accounts. But it numbers each trade and maintains a history file for tax purposes. It also keeps track of the total number of shares on hand, their current value, and shares traded to date with aver-



WordStar 5.5 offers expanded menus, the ability to import a full page of graphics, style sheets, and a print preview mode.

WordStar was the first heavy-hitting word processor, a product that helped make the PC an everyday office tool. Subsequent newcomers like Microsoft Word and Word-Perfect surpassed it in features and popularity years ago, but WordStar is rising again. The latest incarnation from Word-Star International (formerly MicroPro) offers a broad range of visual embellishments, including expanded menus (à la IBM's Common User Access Interface), graphics import capabilities, and style sheets.

At the heart of Word-Star's graphics-handling talents is a link to Inset, a screen grabber bundled with the program. Once Inset hauls graphics into a document, they can be cropped, expanded, rotated, scaled, and inverted. WordStar offers a line-drawing feature that can create variable-width

lines, rectangles, and circles. You can further embellish graphics with text, fill patterns, and clip art and edit at the pixel level. The preview mode lets you take a gander at both graphics and text on screen before printing.

If you use WordStar to produce a steady stream of documents, you'll appreciate 5.5's style sheets, which give you a menu of format attributes so you can save commonly used styles and attach them to specific portions of text. Style sheets let you automatically change fonts, character height, and line spacing; reset margins and tabs; and justify text. Style sheets also set print attributes such as boldface, underlining, and italics.

WordStar 5.5 provides several predefined styles for body text, titles, hanging indents, paragraph indents, and footnotes; those and style sheets of your own creation are kept in a library for quick access.

The package handles an expanded range of document formats and languages thanks to Star Exchange, a document conversion utility for DisplayWrite 4 1.0, Microsoft Word 4.0, MultiMate Advantage II 3.6, WordPerfect 5.0, and WordStar 2000 3.0.

WordStar 5.5 also broadens your output capabilities. For example, your laser printer can incorporate 255 fonts in a document, including Bitstream fonts in sizes up to 72 point. When you use different type styles and sizes, 5.5 automatically calculates character height and leading. Additionally, a typewriter mode lets you print envelopes and quick and dirty documents directly to the printer.



ButtonWare's PC-Type II beefs up its spelling checker and mail merge, while PC-Calc + adds statistical and financial functions.

**B**uttonWare has updated its word processor and spreadsheet, *PC-Type II* and *PC-Calc* + respectively. New features in the \$89.95 *PC-Type II* include

an improved spelling checker with a 100,000word dictionary, and both horizontal and vertical screen splitting. You also can work with ten files open in up to four windows simultaneously.

PC-Type II offers mail merge with more flexible searching than PC-Type+, it supports a wider array of file formats, and it includes a wider variety of editable macros. Also added are a pop-up calculator and extensive context-sensitive help.

tures on a scanned-in face, or not-so-fine ones, such as tints for the entire image. A split screen lets you edit at the pixel level on one side and view the resulting big picture in the other. There are more than a dozen new options for enhancing the words that accompany your images, including outline fonts, 3-D shadow effects, and automatic text justification.

While files can now be output in TIF as well as PCX format, the program still doesn't do a perfect job of converting its bitmapped raster graphics to vector format. Nor can *PC Paintbrush IV* compete with draw programs. However, if you scan many images that need to be touched up after they're in your system, *PC Paintbrush IV* is a clean version of an old standby with new power in many of the right places.





## IBM's Lovable Luggable

It's big. And it's not pretty.

But the new PS/2 Model P70 386 transportable is the best value IBM has delivered in ages.



Eric Knorr ou were expecting maybe another substandard laptop like the PC Convertible? Guess again. IBM's Micro Channel-based PS/2 Model P70 386 is a mobile 20-MHz powerhouse with the highest-resolution flatscreen display available, plus ample accommodations for RAM, mass storage, and expansion boards. But it's the price that makes the P70 the transportable to beat.

The AC-only P70 costs \$7695 in its base configuration. That may sound steep, but not for a portable with 4MB of RAM, a 60MB ESDI hard disk, and a monochrome gas plasma VGA display; \$600 more adds a 120MB ESDI hard disk. In contrast, the 20-MHz Compaq Portable 386 starts at \$7999 with an AT-style 40MB hard disk, an EGA display, and a mere megabyte of RAM. Incredibly, the P70 is also much cheaper than its 20-MHz desktop counterpart, the PS/2 Model 70-121. Load both systems with a 120MB hard disk and 4MB of RAM (and a monochrome VGA monitor for the Model 70-121), and the P70 costs nearly \$2000 less.

There's no trade-off in performance, either. In National Software Testing Laboratories' tests, the P70 matched the Model 70-121's scores almost point for point. That puts the P70 near the bottom when compared to most 20-MHz 80386 desktops but slightly ahead of Compaq's speedy Portable 386 (see "Portable Power," *PCW*, May 1989).

Measuring 5 by 18 by 12 inches and weighing nearly 21 pounds, the boom box-shaped P70 is no lightweight. Moreover, it's downright homely compared to such sleek clamshells as the Toshiba 5200. But like the 5200, the P70 boasts a spectacular, high-contrast (150-to-1) display that measures 10 inches diagonally and supports the VGA's 16 shades of gray (orange, actually). Next to the screen resides a 3½-inch 1.44MB floppy drive, which

pops up to accept or eject disks.

When you batten down the P70 for travel, the keyboard snaps on to cover the display and floppy drive. The full-size, 101-key unit has a response as sure as any desktop PS/2 keyboard's. It's detachable, and the cord is long enough for kicked-back computing.

The P70's large memory capacity is a key attraction. You can load the system with 16MB of 32-bit RAM, 8MB of which is accessible at CPU speed. Four motherboard sockets hold 1MB or 2MB SIMMs (Single In-Line Memory Modules), and you can mix and match them for numerous memory configurations. Kudos to IBM for selling the machine with two 2MB instead of four 1MB SIMMs so you don't need to discard SIMMs to raise CPU-speed RAM above 4MB.


Should you really want a 16MB system to go, you can plug as much as 8MB into the





Traveling computers generally trade speed for mobility, but not the 20-MHz PS/2 Model P70. Not only is it a hair faster than its desktop counterpart, the PS/2 Model 70-121, it edges out Compag's industry-standard 20-MHz 80386 portable.





The zoom function is used to display the drawing from various perspectives; then the full drawing is printed. The results of the benchmark depend primarily on the speeds at which the processor and coprocessor operate and at which memory is accessed. The performance of the display adapter and the hard disk also have some effect.

P70's 32/16-bit slot using IBM's 32-bit Micro Channel memory board. As with all Micro Channel machines, however, the expansion bus runs at 10 MHz; memory there will be accessed at half speed. Of course, you can use the 32/16-bit slot for purposes other than memory-it will accommodate any 32- or

16-bit Micro Channel board. The other slot holds only 16-bit, half-length Micro Channel boards, which are rare. You'll probably use it for IBM's optional (\$449) 2400-bps internal modem, which is cut to fit.

A door on the back of the P70 hides a recess containing a mouse port, one parallel and one serial port, and a video interface for an external VGA monitor. A proprietary interface connects to an optional 5¼-inch, 1.2MB floppy drive that goes for \$495. In addition, the recess provides access to the rear brackets of expansion boards.

IBM's support materials, predictably, are excellent. The well-illustrated manual walks you through everything you need to know in remarkably few pages, and IBM's bootable Reference Diskette does its usual stellar job of making testing and configuration a breeze.

The P70's 4MB minimum of CPU-speed RAM makes the machine OS/2 capable right out of the box. At this writing, if you opt for OS/2, IBM is sweetening add-on memory deals for all 80286 and 80386 systems. You get a \$100 rebate per add-on megabyte (up to 4MB) if you license IBM OS/2 Standard Edition, and \$200 off if you license Extended Edition or LAN Server.

No matter how you configure it, the P70 is a deal. It's not the fastest 20-MHz transportable—that honor will likely belong to the (as yet untested) Toshiba 5200, which has memory caching—but it beats a comparably configured 5200 by nearly \$3000 and offers the same dazzling display. The P70's sole drawback—its bulk—is off-set by excellent memory, mass storage, and board capacities. Subtract one 32-bit Micro Channel slot, and the P70 doesn't just resemble the Model 70-121 desktop, it is the Model 70-121—in a sturdy, mobile package with a Best Buy price. ●

## **Word Closes the Gap**

With page preview and improved graphics handling, Microsoft Word 5.0 matches WordPerfect feature for feature.

Is Word good enough to take the lead?

hy is a superb word processor like *Microsoft Word* only a fraction as popular as *WordPerfect?* It's partly a matter of taste: Users seem to love *WordPerfect*'s function-key-driven interface, while many find *Word*'s nested menus annoying—though you can easily sidestep most of them. And people still think *Word* is slow, even though version 4.0 changed all that. But the program's most obvious problem is that it always seems to be a version behind *WordPerfect*.

The latest *Word* matches and in some ways surpasses its archrival. *Word* 5.0's biggest catch-up efforts are page preview and graphics import, which debuted in *WordPerfect* 5.0 over a year ago. Other long-awaited *Word* 5.0 features include autosave, autopagination, an integrated spelling checker, and improved tabs and subdirectory support.

Word 5.0 really sets the pace with its new bookmark and annotation features, both of which promote smooth handling of documents on a LAN. Not coincidentally, there's no separate network version of Word 5.0; any copy can be installed on a network server, though the package's price remains \$450 (Node Packs, which consist of documentation only, are \$195 each).

Word 5.0 also runs under OS/2, where it looks and acts just like it does under DOS. When you install the program using the new,

improved setup routine, you're simply offered the option of OS/2 installation. Under DOS, you'll discover that 5.0 occupies 384K—the same as WordPerfect but 64K more than Word 4.0. And like WordPerfect, Word 5.0 adds expanded memory support.

### **Almost Desktop Publishing**

The most glamorous *Word 5.0* feature is the ability to import and view graphics. Using the Library Link Graphics command, you can import .PIC, .PCX, TIF, or HPGL plotter files, along with PostScript and *Windows* Clipboard files.

As with WordPerfect, you can freely position images and have text automatically wrap around them. You can also size a graphic, add a caption, and surround it with a box using one of four border styles. Both programs offer background shading for boxes as well as line-drawing functions, but only Word 5.0 lets you alter a rule or box instead of making you delete it and start over. And vertical rules are a snap in Word.

Overall, however, Word 5.0's graphics features can't equal WordPerfect 5.0's. Unlike the other guy, Word can't crop or rotate images after you import them (though a separate utility lets you do this before you im-

George Campbell port). Furthermore, WordPerfect includes 30 clip-art images, while Word forces you to find your own.

Word 5.0's page preview abilities parallel those of PageView, Microsoft's \$50 add-on. You can display one or two full pages complete with graphics, headers and footers, page numbers, and illegibly small text. Neither Word nor WordPerfect supports text editing in this mode, but at least WordPerfect offers a zoom function. Word doesn't support kerning either, whereas WordPerfect offers limited kerning of large-size fonts.

Earlier versions of *Word* could create multiple columns but not show them on the screen. *Word* 5.0 lets you see columns in preview mode, but it also offers a new Show Layout function under the Options menu to display columns in the normal editing window. The only drawback is that columnar editing slows scrolling and cursor movement.

### Marking the Spot

Word 5.0's bookmarks may coin a new buzzword: relational word processing. When you select and name a bookmark—which can be any text element in a document—it's almost like assigning a field name. At the simplest level, bookmarks are handy time-savers when you're moving around in long documents: Execute the Jump command and enter a bookmark name, and you return instantly to that bookmark position.

The real power of bookmarks lies in linking documents. For example, if you select and name a list of addresses in a source document as a bookmark, other documents can import that bookmark using the Library Link Bookmark command. Thereafter, changes in the source document's address list are instantly updated in the other documents.

Bookmarks also help cross-reference passages of text within a document. If you reference a passage in a document by bookmark name, *Word* replaces the name with the page number when the document prints. (For more information on bookmarks, see "Link-



ing Files With Word 5.0" in the How To section of this issue.) You can also cross-reference footnotes, paragraphs, and items in a series—such as tables, figures, or sections.

Word 5.0's new annotation feature, which targets group document processing, closely resembles footnoting. It's a snap to insert your personal annotation marks in text; Word then sends you to the end of the document, where you key in footnotelike annotations, which are numbered sequentially. With the Window Split Footnote command, you can scroll text and annotations in tandem for convenient group document review.


### **Changed by Popular Demand**

For many users, the most important improvements in *Word 5.0* won't be high-profile features like graphics support, page preview, or bookmarks. They'll be things like automatic file saving (at a user-defined interval) or a new archiving function that lets you collect groups of files by date and time for floppy backup. And if you're tired of having to







remember path names when loading a document from someplace other than your work directory, Word 5.0 now lets you easily navigate directories and drives from the Transfer Load Filename prompt.

Word 5.0's macro language adds AND and OR to its logical operators, plus improved variables, data types, and string manipulation for better interactive macros. You also get a file containing 40 macros for everything from printing envelopes to creating an index. And while WordPerfect can handle 26 <Alt>-key macros, Word can store over 1000 <Ctrl>-key macros per glossary file.

Users looking for vast improvements in macro editing, however, will be disappointed. Unlike WordPerfect, which lets you insert commands from a pick list, Word 5.0 still forces you to type them, complete with pesky chevron characters. In addition, macros execute more slowly than in WordPerfect.

Word's spelling checker was overdue for an update, and 5.0's delivers. Now you can check and replace a single word in context



tradition by letting you mix portrait and landscape modes in the same document, and improves PostScript support by supporting all fonts in sizes from 2 to 127 points. In addition, the program adds support for more than 50 new printers.


Word 5.0 has undergone too many commonsense tweaks to mention here. The most obvious is that all global options have been moved from the Windows menu and consolidated under the Options menu. Users who like to customize their interface will appreciate enhanced color control over text, menus, and borders. Most welcome, though, are the improved tabs: You can now change tabs on the ruler with either the cursor or mouse, and see the text change instantly.

### A Personal Choice

The 5.0 versions of both *Word* and *WordPerfect* present new opportunities. Neither comes close to replacing *PageMaker* or *Ventura Publisher* for desktop publishing, but both can now crank out a simple in-house newsletter. *WordPerfect*'s graphics capabilities give it a slight edge in this department.

Word 5.0's trump card is superior groupdocument handling. As more and more users find themselves networked, features such as numbered annotations and document linking through bookmarks will show their true benefits. In the meantime, Word users will relish the long list of small improvements, but Word 5.0 adds page preview, which displays both text layout and any imported graphics. A two-page view is also available.



## The 32-Bit Question: 286 or 386SX?

Cheap, high-speed 80286 systems are tempting performers.

But we've seen some low-priced systems with a future—and they're built around the 803865X.

nce it was easy to figure. You could save money and buy a relatively slow 80286-based system, or pony up bigger bucks for a fast 80386 that would run multitasking software like *Windows/386*.

But now that systems based on Intel's 80386SX chip provide support for tomorrow's software at yesterday's prices, and high-speed 80286 systems deliver 16-MHz performance and up, buying smart has become more complicated.

To help you make the best decision, *PC* World pitted four 16-MHz 80286s (the Arche Rival 286-16, the Everex Step 286/16, the Mitac Paragon 286/VE, and the Wyse PC286 Model 2116-01) head-to-head against four 16-MHz 80386SXs (the ALR FlexCache SX386Z, the Club AT 316SX, the Everex Step 386is, and the NCR PC916SX).

The primary issues in making a buying decision between an 80286 machine and 80386 machine running at the same clock speed include the speed of the math coprocessor, OS/2 efficiency, and the ability to run 32-bit software.

Intel licenses AMD and Harris to make 80286 chips but not 80287s. So while these third parties have released 80286s that run at clock speeds of up to 25 MHz, the fastest 80287 available has been Intel's 10-MHz chip, hobbling potential system performance for CAD and other math-intensive applications. (Other options are emerging; see the sidebar "A Chip off Intel's Block.") No such problem hampers the 16-MHz 80386SX, because Intel released it with a matching 16-MHz 80387SX.

As for OS/2, speed benchmarks run by National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL) reveal that 16-MHz 80286 and 80386SX machines deliver roughly equivalent performance. (With several exceptions, noted in text, each machine was tested with the version of OS/2 provided by its vendor.) The main limitation here is CPU-speed memory capacity, since OS/2 needs at least 4MB of such memory (6MB is better) to adequately run many applications. Interestingly, some

John Diebold 386SXs have less CPU-speed RAM capacity than some 286s.

The crucial difference between the two chips, and the computers based on them, is their ability to run 80386-specific software, such as *Windows/386* and the forthcoming 32-bit version of OS/2. None of this software will run on an 80286 system at *any* speed, thus ruling out the multiple DOS sessions and efficient access to extended memory that 32-bit applications offer.

To level the playing field, we priced each machine in this roundup in a standard *PC* World configuration: 2MB of CPU-speed RAM, at least one floppy drive, one 40MB hard disk, a VGA video board and VGA color monitor, at least one parallel and one serial port, a 101-key keyboard, and DOS 3.3 or a later version. All but one (the NCR PC916SX) come in a small-footprint case.

#### 16-MHz 80286 Systems

The four 16-MHz 80286 computers in this roundup all cost \$4967 or less in the *PC* World configuration—and so do two of the 80386SX systems. The Everex Step 286/16 is the fastest machine in the roundup, though it lagged noticeably behind the 80386SX machines in the *AutoCAD* tests. Most of these systems outperform the original SX machine, the Compaq Deskpro 386S (see "Compaq and IBM: Faster, Top to Bottom," *PCW*, October 1988).



#### Arche Rival 286-16

The Arche Rival 286-16 is a bit of a nonentity in this fast crowd. While it provides a comfortable 8MB ceiling for CPU-speed RAM, plenty of slots, and a two-year warranty, it delivers unexciting performance at a midrange price (\$4490 in the *PC World* configuration).

The proprietary motherboard holds 4MB of RAM; another 4MB can be installed by way of a special memory slot and a proprietary expansion board and accessed at full CPU speed.

The Arche Rival's board capacity is above average. You start out with six 8/16-bit slots and two 8-bit slots; after installing all the boards necessary to reach the *PC World* configuration, you are left with five 8/16-bit slots free—a good count for a small-footprint system. The Rival's case has three half-height 5¼-inch device bays, two of which are accessible from the outside.

Club AT 316SX makes a very smart buy thanks to low price, high capacity for CPU-speed RAM, and strong performance.

#### 386SX Systems Deliver Top Value at 16 MHz

Club AT's 316SX offers premier memory bus capacity and ample space for expansion boards at a rock-bottom price. The Everex Step 386is is somewhat pricier (and significantly stingier with CPU-speed bus RAM capacity) but boasts sizzling performance. Moreover, as the table shows, 80286 systems no longer enjoy a significant price advantage.

The Rival's performance scores fall toward the bottom of the chart, however, on both the DOS and OS/2 tests. Arche doesn't have its own version of OS/2, so we had to use several third-party versions, including Tandy 1.0 and

IBM 1.0, to complete the test suite; Compaq OS/2 1.0, our usual "generic" OS/2, would not boot. (To avoid potential compatibility problems, we advise against using any system with a version of OS/2 not specifically supported by the vendor.)

The Rival comes with more than the standard extras, including disk caching, switchless setup, and an unusual two-year carryin warranty. It also delivers lots of slots, all at a price that won't make your accountant blanch. But you can find better performance—as well as 32-bit capability—elsewhere for the same price or less.

#### Everex Step 286/16

For the fastest system in this roundup, the Everex Step 286/16 comes at a surprisingly low price—a mere \$4197 in the *PC World* configuration. The only troubling aspect is the machine's cramped 4MB CPU-speed RAM ceiling.

The key to the Step 286/16's speed is its use of RAM chips fast enough to be accessed at true zero wait states without interleaving or paging. Although the 4MB limit on CPU-speed RAM may be low, expansion capacity is high. The motherboard holds six 8/16-bit and two 8-bit slots; in the *PC World* configuration you still have five 8/16-bit slots free. The case has space for three half-height 5¼-inch device bays, two of which are externally accessible.

The Everex Step 286/16 turns in truly blazing performance. It takes top spot on



every NSTL DOS benchmark except *Auto-CAD*, where its 10-MHz coprocessor puts it at a disadvantage. Its OS/2 scores (using Everex OS/2 1.0) are almost as strong.

Despite the bargain price, Everex isn't stingy with extras, which include QuickStep (Everex's version of the excellent *PC-Kwik* disk-caching utility), setup routines built into ROM, and a one-year, on-site service contract.

The Everex 286/16 is a tempting choice, even for an 80286. Not only is it the speed champ, it's also one of the cheapest systems we looked at and comes with free house calls. Only its low 4MB CPU-speed RAM limit is disappointing. Ironically, the best argument against buying the Step 286/16 is its 386SX sibling, the Everex Step 386is, which costs a mere \$300 more.

Everex Step 286/16 turns in top speed scores, but its SX twin will run 80386-specific software and costs only \$300 more.

#### NSTL TEST REPORT

Although the hard disk access rate plays a small part in this benchmark, processing and memory access speeds are the most significant factors. Memory architecture affects memory access speed: Systems that require additional memory in standard

While DisplayWrite 4/2 is loading, the keystrokes to start a DisplayWrite macro are entered. The macro loads a 35-page, 140-paragraph document, replaces each occurrence of the word today with tomorrow, uses the built-in spelling checker to look for any incorrectly spelled words (there are none), poginales the document, prints the first page to an IBM Proprinter II, and exits DisplayWrite.

#### R:base for O5/2

Processing and hard disk random access speeds are the most significant factors in this benchmark. Disk caching dramatically improves apparent disk access speed. This benchmark measures the time it takes to produce a report based on a three-file join, select, and sort.

#### IBM C/2

In this benchmark, processing and hard disk sequential access speeds are the most important factors. The benchmark measures the time required to compile the 25 source code files that make up XUSP, a public-domain LISP interpreter.

#### Mitac Paragon 286/VE

American Mitac's Paragon 286/VE is an impressive piece of hardware—except for its performance. At \$4137 (in the *PC World* configuration), it's the least expensive 80286 in this roundup. It comes with one 1.2MB 5¼-inch and one 1.44MB 3½-inch floppy drive, simplifying data transfer between formats. It also boasts a motherboard with built-in


I/O ports, a floppy controller, and a VGA board.

The Paragon can address a generous 8MB of CPU-speed RAM, making it a possible OS/2 contender; unfortunately, its OS/2 speed scores (using Compaq OS/2 1.0) were in the bottom half of the pack. It did somewhat better running under DOS, where it placed a little above the mean.

#### Microsoft Word 4.0

A Microsoft Word macro loads a 35-page, 140paragraph document and performs search-andreplace and spell-checking operations. The first page of the document is then printed. Although the results of the benchmark depend primarily on processor and memory access speeds, display adapter and hard disk speeds are also contributing factors.

#### 1-2-3 2.01

In this benchmark, a 1-2-3 macro executes a series of recalculations using five different formulas within a 75-by-75-cell matrix. Because there are few screen updates and no disk access is required, the results depend almost entirely on processing and memory access speeds.

#### AutoCAD 9

In this benchmark, a three-dimensional sample drawing is retrieved and displayed using Auto-CAD's EGA driver. The zoom function is used to display the drawing from various perspectives; then the full drawing is printed. The results of the benchmark depend primarily on the speeds at which the processor and coprocessor operate and at which memory is accessed. The performance of the display adapter and the hard disk also have some effect.

#### dBASE III Plus 1.1

The dBASE III Plus test measures the time required to prepare and print a report of past-due invoices. The report includes calculated fields and is based on three files: a 500-record customer file, a 1000-record invoice file, and a 2000-record item file. When disk caching is not used, the random access speed of the hard disk is, after processor speed, the most significant factor in this benchmark. With disk caching, sequential read performance becomes more important than random access.

#### Microsoft C 5.0

The Microsoft C benchmark measures the time required to compile and link XUSP. The most important factors in this benchmark are processor and memory access speeds. The performance of the hard disk is also a factor; generally, disk caching has little effect.

vice capacity. The motherboard sports five 8/16-bit slots and one 8-bit slot; with the hard disk controller occupying one of the 8/16s, you end up with a total of five slots free. The case has room for four half-height drives—one more than any other 80286 in the round-up. Three of the bays (two 5½ inch and one 3½ inch) are accessible from the front.

The Paragon's low list price doesn't in-

clude disk-caching software, but you do get a package of extended-VGA drivers, along with a disk-partitioning utility and expanded memory management software.

Despite its relatively unimpressive performance, the Paragon 286/VE's low price, comfy RAM ceiling, double-format floppy drives, four-bay device capacity, and integrated motherboard add up to excellent value—for an 80286.

#### Wyse PC286 Model 2116-01

At \$4967 in the *PC World* configuration, the Wyse 2116 is the priciest 286 in the roundup. Unfortunately, its price is not justified by its sluggish performance, and its slot count is below average.

The 2116 sports an eight-slot backplane design (six 8/16-bit slots and two 8-bit slots) in which the CPU, support chips, and RAM are mounted on a special processor board that occupies one of the 8/16-bit slots. You can place up to 4MB of 100ns RAM on the processor board, but that's the limit for CPU-speed memory.

The slot and device capacity of this system could be better. With the processor board taking up a slot, only four 8/16-bit slots are left open in the standard *PC World* configuration. The case accommodates three stacked half-height 5¼-inch drive bays, all externally accessible.

If you're looking for speed, look elsewhere. The 2116 came in last or next to last on every NSTL DOS test. It did a little better running Wyse OS/2 1.0, placing in the middle of the pack. The extras, too, are underwhelming, considering the price of the system: You get disk-caching and setup utilities, period. In short, there's little to recommend this system. Given its high cost, low

4MB ceiling on CPU-speed RAM, substandard slot expandability, and poor performance, you could do a lot better.

#### 16-MHz 80386SX Systems

The more 80386-specific software that comes down the pike, the more obsolete 80286 systems will become. Soon, compatibility with these high-powered 32-bit applications offering access to gobs of extended memory (without OS/2) will make the SX the entrylevel 386 system of choice.

SX machines cost almost as little to make as 80286s. The most obvious reason is that the 80386SX chip is in the 80286 price range. Also, the chips have the same number of address lines (24), allowing similar memory designs. More important, the 80386SX, like the 80286, accesses data 16 bits at a time, and thus SX motherboards need only half the data lines of full-blown 80386 motherboards. That means the 386SX motherboard is cheaper to build (due to fewer data lines); more to the point, manufacturers can turn out an SX motherboard with only minor alterations to an existing 80286 design.

Price is the SX's only advantage over a bona fide 80386 machine, and (except for those rare individuals who need more than 16MB of RAM) performance is its only mi-



When the two chips run 32-bit instructions at the same speed, the SX is only half as fast at moving 32-bit instructions and data in and out of the CPU; fortunately, such transfers occur infrequently in most 80386-specific programs, so the penalty is slight. And the savings are significant. In the *PC World* configuration, prices for these 80386SX systems range from \$3179 for the amazing Club AT 316SX to \$7339 for the less impressive NCR PC916SX.

#### ALR FlexCache SX386Z

At \$5337 in the *PC World* configuration, the ALR FlexCache is the roundup's secondmost-expensive system. Its DOS performance is good, however, thanks to memory caching; you can expand CPU-speed RAM to a comfortable 8MB; and you get a healthy drive capacity for a small-footprint case.

The SX386Z uses a six-slot backplane design, with five 8/16-bit slots and one 8-bit slot. The processor board (which is socketed for a coprocessor and up to 8MB of CPU-speed RAM) and the VGA board take up two 8/16-bit slots, leaving four slots vacant—not much, even for a small-footprint system. Device capacity is better, with one 3½-inch bay and two stacked 5¼-inch bays that are all accessible from the front; another 3½-inch bay sits inside.



The SX386Z's performance is impressive. It's the only system in the roundup to use memory caching, which results in near–zero-wait-state average memory access. In the DOS trials, the FlexCache took a strong third overall, coming in second on the CPU-intensive 1-2-3 and AutoCAD tests. It didn't do quite as well under Compaq OS/2 1.0, placing slightly above the middle of the pack.

The extras with this system, though, are first-class. ALR includes *Super PC-Kwik* disk-caching software and ROM-based setup and diagnostic routines.

Although hardly a bargain-priced system, the FlexCache SX386Z delivers value for the bucks: strong performance, good device expandability, and a comfortable 8MB ceiling for CPU-speed RAM. Nonetheless, smart buyers should consider the faster (and less expensive) Everex Step 386is, or the slower (but much cheaper) Club AT 316SX before making a decision.

#### Club AT 316SX

This system seems too good to be true. Given its 16MB capacity for CPU-speed RAM (the largest in the roundup), respectable performance scores, and astonishingly low \$3179 price (in the *PC World* configuration), you may be left shaking your head in disbelief. The system's only disappointment is its limited device capacity.

Club uses an Everex motherboard (not the same one used by either Everex system reviewed here) that holds 2MB of 100ns RAM. In addition, two special slots run at 16 MHz when filled with Everex's proprietary 8MB memory boards. (Although you can install up to 18MB, 80386SX CPUs address only 16MB.) If not used for memory, these slots can hold standard 8-bit expansion boards.

This switch-hitting makes the slot situation a bit complicated. Since the mother-board has six standard slots—four 8/16-bit and two 8-bit—plus the two special slots (not used in our configuration), you'll end up with two 8/16-bit and three 8-bit slots available.

The 316SX case houses three externally accessible half-height bays. With the floppy drive installed in one and a noisy full-height hard drive occupying the remaining two,




there's no room for a tape backup unit or a second floppy drive.

The 316SX turns in performance that would be welcome at any price. In the DOS events it placed in the top third of the pack. It did even better under Compaq OS/2 1.0, taking a strong third overall—including top spot on the *R:base* benchmark. (Unfortunately, Club does not yet provide its own version of OS/2.)

Moreover, given the 316SX's low price, you might expect cheesy construction, but the workmanship seems generally high-class. Cost-cutting is apparent only in the lack of extras: All you get in the way of software is a ROM-based setup routine, and the user manual is thin and distressingly elementary. Setup requires going under the hood and juggling motherboard jumper blocks to set base memory and monitor configurations.

Still, when it comes to the basics—price, performance, and RAM capacity—the Club AT 316SX delivers outrageous value. For

such a low price, many will be willing to put up with limited device expandability and clumsy setup.

#### **Everex Step 386is**

The Everex Step 286/16 and Step 386is are virtual twins. They share top performance and, unfortunately, a low 4MB limit on CPU-speed RAM. (Slots and drive bays are described earlier in the Step 286/16 review.) About the only things they don't have in common are their CPU and price.

Although Everex won't let users make the upgrade themselves, the company has essentially pulled the 80286 out of the Step 286/16 and plugged in a daughterboard holding an 80386SX CPU, an 80387SX coprocessor socket, and various support chips. Some people have questioned the speed and reliability resulting from this strategy, but many engineers feel that the method is both safe and cost-effective. The Step 386is's price certainly proves the cost-effective part: In the *PC World* configuration, it costs only \$4497, just \$300 more than the Step 286/16.

#### A Chip Off Intel's Block

A new company called Integrated Information
Technology (IIT) has developed a product that
busts the 10-MHz speed limit for 80287 coprocessors. Dubbed the IIT-2C87, this chip boasts full pin
and software compatibility with Intel's 80287 and
comes with a 10-MHz or 20-MHz certification.

At press time we were unable to procure a production unit of the IIT-2C87 and so could not run formal tests of software compatibility. However, informal performance tests of a preproduction unit revealed that when we replaced an Intel 80287 with an IIT-2C87 in the Everex 286/16, our standard AutoCAD test (which relies heavily, though not exclusively, on numeric coprocessing) ran more than 20 percent faster.

The reason for the increased performance is twofold. First, the IIT-2C87 taps into the CPU's clock signal, causing it to run (in this case) at 16 MHz instead of 10. Second, the chip's additional registers enable it to execute the same floating-point instructions in fewer cycles. If IIT has its software compatibility act together, users—especially CAD users—will have one less reason to snub 80286 systems that run at 16 MHz and above.

While the system is a bit slower than its 286 twin, the 386 is still places first, second, or third in every DOS and OS/2 test (using Everex OS/2 1.0), ranking second overall. Low RAM limit aside, the Step 386 is boasts high performance, low price, and Everex reliability, making it a good value.

#### NCR PC916SX

At \$7339 in the *PC World* configuration, the NCR PC916SX is not only the most expensive system in the roundup, it's also the largest and slowest. The only bright spot here is the best slot and device capacity of any machine in the roundup.

The PC916SX has a backplane design with the CPU, 1MB of 80ns RAM, and a coprocessor socket all residing on a processor board. Another 4MB of CPU-speed RAM can be installed via a daughterboard that attaches to the processor board, raising the systemspeed RAM ceiling to 5MB.

The PC916SX's large case leaves room for plenty of boards and drives. You get six 8/16-bit and two 8-bit slots. In the *PC World* configuration, you are left with four 8/16-bit and two 8-bit slots free—the highest capacity of any SX in the roundup. In addition, you get a full-height internal 5¼-inch drive bay, plus three half-height, 3½-inch drive bays, all ac-

cessible from the front panel. You'd expect this kind of capacity from an AT-size chassis.

The PC916SX turned in highly disappointing performance scores, however, coming in next to last overall in the DOS trials and last under Compaq OS/2 1.0. (Although NCR sells its own OS/2, it would not boot on NSTL's test unit, apparently because of a BIOS conflict.) Neither BASIC nor disk-caching software is included, and the owner's manual lacks an index. Plenty of room for boards and drives does not make up for this system's disadvantages and high price.

#### **Low-Priced Tickets to the Future**

If you don't plan to venture beyond light-duty word processing, single-file data management, or occasional telecommunications, an 80286 should keep you satisfied for some time, and in this case, two of the 80286 systems we reviewed are tempting. The Everex Step 286/16 tops them all in sheer performance. And the Mitac Paragon 286/VE, with its low price, twin floppy drives, and generous expandability, is equally hard to resist.

Given the relatively low prices of SX systems, however, it's silly to buy a system that rules out 80386-specific software. Three SX machines stand out: the very inexpensive Club AT 316SX (\$3179), which offers a high 16MB ceiling for CPU-speed RAM, excellent slot capacity, and very respectable performance; the Everex Step 386is (\$4497), which costs more and addresses only 4MB of CPU-speed RAM but is exceptionally fast; and the pricey ALR FlexCache SX386Z (\$5337), which offers an 8MB CPU-speed RAM ceiling, excellent device expandability, and respectable performance.

Systems based on the 80386SX have fulfilled their promise of providing 32-bit capability at AT prices. At the 16-MHz level, there's little reason to consider anything less. ●





## LAN E-Mail Delivers the Goods

Today's network E-mail programs are easier to use and learn—

and that can mean the difference between efficient messaging and frustrated users.



Robert Lauriston evolving quickly. Since *PC World*'s last LAN E-mail roundup ("LAN E-Mail: Power to the Work Group," *PCW*, November 1988), prices have dropped, and the range of messaging features and remote links has expanded.

The competition is intense. Groupware packages such as *Higgins* and *WordPerfect Office* have upped the ante by adding sched-

uling and project planning to LAN E-mail chores (see "Groupware: E-Mail Meets Scheduling," *PCW*, July 1989). To add further pressure, LAN operating system vendors are now selling highly competitive proprietary E-mail options (see the sidebar "Proprietary E-Mail Alternatives"). As a result,

the third-party products reviewed here play to the large *NetWare* marketplace. Novell offers Action Technologies' MHS (Message Handling Service) free to *NetWare* users. However, this message-passing back end can't be used for E-mail without a third-party front end.

To get ahead in this crowd, a third-party E-mail package must dish up an interface that's easy to learn and use, while offering top messaging features and connectivity. Three of the five programs reviewed here deliver the goods. cc:Mail's cc:Mail 3.03, Da-Vinci Systems' DaVinci eMail for DOS 1.0, and Consumer Software's The Network Courier 2.0 all offer better E-mail features than groupware does—and usually at a lower price. Offices with complicated scheduling may prefer groupware, but most LANs will be better off with straight E-mail.

The other two programs reviewed, Enable Software's Higgins Mail 2.2 and Transend Corporation's Transend PC Complete 4.1, aren't recommended for most users, largely because of their intractable interfaces. All the programs—except Transend, which requires NetWare—are compatible with all NetBIOS LANs.

#### **Crucial Tools**

Because everyone from novices to power users must tie in to the E-mail loop, an intuitive interface is essential. The top three packages—DaVinci, Network Courier, and cc:Mail—shorten the learning curve with competent help systems and welcoming interfaces. However, with all the programs save DaVinci, routine tasks often require tedious menu hopping.

Messaging features are fairly similar in all five programs, with tasks patterned on standard memo and postal procedures. There are in-boxes and out-boxes, and you can attach formatted files—including graphics and program files—to outbound messages. You can send copies to individuals or distribute mail according to lists created by you or the LAN

administrator. Return receipts let you know your message has been read, and priority mail is flagged for immediate attention. You can also forward and reply directly to mail.

Greater disparities exist in mail management. Only three of the programs let you save files in subject folders, a handy organizational scheme that keeps your in-box manageable. And only two include bulletin boards that provide limited, on-line conferencing. Some programs let you select and display sets of messages grouped by date, sender, or subject, and some let you sort on labels so messages display in a certain order.

The programs' text editors are all fairly crude, but there are differences. For example, some lack block operations. All provide word wrap, but only *DaVinci* and *Transend* retain both hard and soft returns so paragraphs don't merge when revised. All import ASCII files, however, so you can use an external word processor.

If you can't stand being out of touch for even a moment, you can call upon memory-resident options. Except for *Higgins*, the E-mail programs pop up over any application, allowing you to read or send mail on the spot. And except for *Transend*, the programs include smaller TSRs that flash a message or beep when mail arrives.

For some users, connection to the outside world is all-important. Each of the vendors sells options that let remote modem users swap mail with LAN users, and vice versa, via a dedicated gateway PC. The same gateway also supports direct and remote two-way links to other LANs running the same package. If the E-mail program is MHS compatible, you can exchange mail with other LANs running MHS-based E-mail. You can also buy gateway options to on-line services like EasyLink, Telemail, and MCI Mail, and mainframe E-mail systems such as IBM's PROFS. You can even buy a fax gateway.

However, gateway prices vary greatly. For example, DaVinci's interLAN routing is free, and remote modem access costs \$250 per user. Yet, a similar setup costs \$495 plus \$95 per user for Network Courier, \$1295 plus \$295 per user for cc:Mail, and \$1595 plus \$395 per user for Higgins Mail.

If connectivity is crucial, the safest bet is a package that provides both custom gateways and MHS. Today, only cc:Mail meets

those requirements, but other vendors promise MHS options by the time you read this, and *DaVinci* will sell custom gateways by year's end.

#### DaVinci eMail for DOS 1.0

A character-based spin-off from DaVinci Systems' DaVinci for Windows, DaVinci eMail for DOS takes first place on the strength of its elegant, easy-to-use interface. At \$295 for five users and \$995 per server, it's also affordable. DaVinci is an excellent value, especially for Novell LANs, but its lack of message folders denies it a Best Buy.

A slick menu-driven utility makes installing *DaVinci* a snap. On *NetWare*, it even sets up mailboxes, creates address lists, and automatically updates *DaVinci* as new users join the net. All program functions are available in the 100K RAM-resident module.

DaVinci's interface is the best of the lot, clearly benefiting from its Windows heritage. It sports pulldown menus, optional mouse control, and keystroke shortcuts to bypass menus. For instance, to delete a file you simply highlight the file name and press <Ctrl>-D; unlike with cc:Mail, you don't have to slog through submenus to find key features. The excellent context-sensitive help provides hypertext-like cross-referencing.

Messaging features are superior. DaVinci's the only program that lets you customize handling defaults such as priority and return receipt. Other singular extras include the ability to reply to a message while viewing it and to password-encrypt messages.

Mail management is a mixed bag. You can easily tag messages and attachments and delete or save them en masse. And you can select mail for display by sender, subject, date range, and handling options. However, *Da-Vinci* lacks folders and bulletin boards.

DaVinci's text editor is as good as they come in this roundup. You get true word wrap and block operations, and you can copy text between messages through a clipboard. Another plus—you can save message drafts for later editing.

DaVinci lacks custom gateways, but it provides MHS and interLAN routing at no extra charge. For more links, you can buy diverse third-party MHS gateways that DaVinci Systems resells and supports. Remote modem access costs \$250 per user.

DaVinci sets new standards among E-mail packages for ease of use, and NetWare administrators will like its easy maintenance. If you can live without folders, go for it.

The 1-2-3-style menus on The **Network Couri**er's main panel provide quick access to key features. The R on the right side of the inbox indicates that a return receipt was delivered to the sender.

ing lists, and adds unique extras such as fulltext message searches. At \$295 for 6 users and \$695 for 100, prices are competitive. It just misses besting DaVinci for top honors.

Network Courier's interface is much improved, making it easier to select menu items, such as address lists. The 1-2-3-style command-line menus are intuitive and logical, and the context-sensitive help is thorough. Basic functions are only a keystroke away, and mail is quickly tagged with the <Space> bar for batch processing. However, less-common functions such as maintaining folders are buried under four menu levels.

The menu-driven installation program works well, but some tasks are not fully explained. You can read, compose, and send mail from within other applications with a 78K TSR, but you can't use folders.

Messaging features are abundant-you can choose from five priority levels and call on electronic phone message forms. But the text editor is weak. You can't perform block operations or save drafts.

Network Courier's comprehensive mail management provides nested folders (folders within folders), bulletin boards, and global processing of mail and attachments. It's the only program reviewed that lets you perform full-text searches on messages stored in folders. You can sort messages by sender, subject, or priority, but you can't restrict the display to a subset of mail.

At press time, Network Courier 2.0 lacked connectivity options. However, version 1.0 offered exhaustive options, including remote dial-in, interLAN routing, and gateways to MCI Mail, PROFS, and other systems. Those options, plus MHS, should be available for 2.0 by the time you read this.

Network Courier is a sound choice. The text editor needs work, but the program's superb mix of features makes it a winner.

#### cc:Mail 3.03

Colorful cc:Mail has proved successful thanks to a mix of solid messaging features and intriguing extras such as a graphics editor and a screen snapshot utility. Version 3.03 should continue that success with its RAM-resident mode and expanded connectivity. Its pricing scheme (\$695 for 25 users or \$1290 per server) is reasonable for medium-size LANs but expensive for small and large networks. The program's keystroke-happy interface nudges it to third place in this roundup, but it's still a good deal.

You navigate cc:Mail's flexible, pop-up menus with cursor keys or first-letter commands. Yet the menu hierarchy can be confusing, burying some key features in submenus. Basic tasks require numerous keystrokes; for example, to delete a message, you have to open it, close it, select Delete from a menu, and then confirm a prompt.

Some menu options are ambiguous—the difference between 'read inbox messages' and 'retrieve messages' is not immediately apparent. Still, the program is straightforward once you get the hang of it, and it provides context-sensitive help.

The installation utility isn't menu-driven, but it's easy enough for most. One plus for administrators: cc:Mail guards against data corruption with its own fault-tolerant routines. You can load a 77K messaging TSR, but it won't let you thumb through folders or use graphics.

Although you can't send priority messages, *cc:Mail*'s messaging is otherwise superb, providing blind carbon copies and other extras. Mail management is top-notch: You get folders and bulletin boards, and you can search by sender, subject, and date range.

cc:Mail's editor skimps on certain basics but provides some nifty curios. You can't cut and paste between messages or even move a

word at a time, but you get block operations and search and replace. Unlike its rivals, cc:Mail lets you add colors and shaded highlights to text.

More useful is the ability to take a screen snapshot, annotate it, and attach it to a message. This feature allows support staff to check out errant applications from their own desks. Another exotic extra: a simple graphics editor, complete with shapes, fills, and



display text. It seems a bit out of place, but the company plans to use it as a fax viewer in a future release.

cc:Mail's connectivity options are the roundup's most comprehensive. Remote modem access costs \$295 per user. Other links require the \$1295 cc:Mail Gateway, which includes MHS support and interLAN routing. Custom gateways are available for EasyLink, Telemail, and PROFS.


cc:Mail's menu system cries out for hot keys. Yet the program's solid feature set, MHS compatibility, and screen snapshots make it an attractive buy.

#### Higgins Mail 2.2

A subset of the *Higgins* groupware package, *Higgins Mail* can't hold its own as a dedicated E-mail program. It's plagued by the same interface flaws as *Higgins*, yet it lacks the sophisticated features that make *Higgins* worthwhile. Despite a few clever touches, it's difficult to use, the text editor is weak, and it lacks a messaging TSR. At \$495 per 20 users, it's costly for large LANs.

Installing *Higgins Mail* is easy, but the administrator's program is confusing, and you can't run it while the E-mail program is in use. The utility includes some *Higgins* options, such as a sort key, that don't work with *Higgins Mail*.

Some items on Higgins Mail's main menu are mystifying, and moving around is awkward. Message types on the upper right let you prompt the addressee to action.

Higgins Mail's poorly organized command-line menu system follows few standards and requires even more keystrokes than cc:Mail. You can't navigate using cursor keys, and menu titles are cryptic. To edit a field, such as the subject, you must drag through a separate menu. Worse, you're often forced to confirm defaults on three minor menus before you reach a basic function.

Higgins Mail's buggy help system is irritating. Sometimes it's context-sensitive,

sometimes not. Sometimes it brings up a single, cryptic word; other times, nothing at all.

Higgins Mail's messaging features are complete, and some appealing novelties await you. You can send phone message forms and employ a second, "public" password that lets a proxy read any mail except that marked private by the sender. You not only can tag mail as urgent, you also can request a specific response, such as comments, action, signature, and editing.

However, the clumsy interface makes messaging cumbersome. For example, when you reply to a message, copies of any attachments you received are returned as well.

Matters aren't helped by *Higgins Mail*'s limited text editor. It can't save messages as ASCII files, has no block operations or automatic reformatting, and limits you to 120 lines per message.

Message management is a bit better but doesn't include folders or bulletin boards. Instead, you select mail by date range and manually assigned keywords, using Boolean operators to refine the search.

Connectivity options are thorough but expensive. For interLAN routing and a foot up on other options, you must buy *Higgins Exchange* for \$1595. You can then integrate modem users at \$395 per remote PC. Other modules include a fax link and gateways to PROFS, SNADS, and 3 + Mail.

Higgins Mail adopts Higgins' bad habits without giving you the productivity payoff. If you need scheduling, consider Higgins but pass Higgins Mail by.

#### Transend PC Complete 4.1

Unlike its rivals, Transend PC Complete provides a single mail center for both LAN E-mail and local modem communications. But this innovative approach is undermined by an odd interface and a lack of central administration. The problem is, Transend isn't a true multiuser program but rather a single-user program you can link to other Transend nodes with MHS. At \$229 per station, Transend is the most expensive program of the group. A LAN E-mail—only version costs \$295 per five users, but its lack of key features makes it a poor choice.

Because it's not a LAN application, installing and administering *Transend* is a headache. You must install the program (and a serial number file) on each PC. You can load the entire program as a TSR, assuming you have a whopping 172K to spare.

Transend's eccentric function-key interface is cumbersome, with endless confirmation prompts and nonstandard commands. For example, <Enter> and <Escape> give way to <F1> and <F2>. Priority and return receipt options are hidden away in submenus, and on-line help is limited to a simple function-key map.

LAN messaging features are weak, lacking public mailing lists and bulletin boards. You can save mail to folders, but you can't sort or select. On the bright side, *Transend*'s editor offers block operations and true word wrap.

The centralization of LAN and modem messaging has its merits. You can mix LAN-based and external E-mail remote users on a single address list, so you don't have to switch between separate programs and mailing lists. As a dedicated E-mail program,

Transend's strength is its prefab scripts for swapping mail on Dialcom, HPDESK, MCI Mail, OnTyme, and Telemail. You can add other scripts with a flexible macro language. Communications features, however, are fairly

#### **PROPRIETARY E-MAIL ALTERNATIVES**

Originally, third-party LAN E-mail packages compensated for the incomplete E-mail utilities available from LAN OS vendors. Times have changed. With the notable exception of Novell, which no longer sells an E-mail utility, the major LAN OS vendors provide excellent, extra-cost E-mail options.

AT&T, Banyan, and 3Com offer their network users proprietary E-mail programs that match third-party programs on features and price. They all offer strong message-handling options, file attachment capabilities, public and private mailing lists, folders, and pop-up alarms. And they excel at connectivity—you don't have to dedicate a workstation as a gateway. Banyan and 3Com packages are also compatible with MHS.

Connectivity is the strong suit of AT&T's PMX/ Starmail (\$995 per server), which runs on Starlan LANs. It can swap mail with other Starmail LANs as well as with E-mail systems, including UNIX Mail, PROFS, and AT&T Mail. Unlike Banyan and 3Com products, Starmail can run as a TSR.

Banyan Mail (\$995 per server) runs on Banyan Vines networks. LAN administrators can take advantage of Vines' StreetTalk name service data base for streamlining interLAN routing. You can easily track and update user accounts across a wide area network. Add the \$1495 PC Dial-In to your network, and remote users get full network access.

3Com's 3+Open Mail (\$1190 per server), which runs on 3+Open, allows DOS, OS/2, and Macintosh workstations to share a single mail server. Like Banyan Mail, 3+Open Mail shares a name service with 3+Open for easier administration and interLAN routing. It has superior mail management features, letting you sort or select by date, sender, subject, or full text search. 3+Remote (\$195 per PC, \$1500 per server) provides remote access. —R. L.

limited. Emulations are confined to VT 100, and error-checking protocols to XMODEM and Kermit.

Third-party MHS connectivity products are available, but unlike DaVinci Systems, Transend Corporation does not sell or support them. Remote modem users can call in to the LAN, but each remote user needs a copy of MHS (\$100) plus a copy of *Transend*.

Transend PC Complete is not a reasonable choice for exchanging LAN E-mail. Its only niche is tiny LANs where users are tired of switching between LAN E-mail and communications packages.

#### **Easy Wins It**

Because today's LAN E-mail packages have fairly similar feature sets, ease of use becomes premium, especially considering the increasing sophistication of groupware and proprietary competitors. With this in mind, DaVinci eMail for DOS takes first place. DaVinci's intuitive design, low cost, and built-in MHS set it a notch above the rest. The Network Courier and cc:Mail take a close second and third place, respectively. Higgins Mail and Transend PC Complete just don't measure up.

A LAN E-mail Best Buy has yet to arrive, but several packages have come a step closer. When one manages to combine an easy interface, top-notch mail management, and strong, affordable external links, a clear winner may emerge.

# PROGRAMMING FOR NONPROGRAMMERS

WRITE A COMPLEX PROGRAM FROM SCRATCH? WITH THE HELP OF OBJECT-ORIENTED APPLICATION

GENERATORS, IT MAY BE EASIER THAN YOU THINK.

our work is as unique as your fingerprints, but most business software is designed as "one size fits all." So although your beloved spreadsheet or word processor may seem as flexible as Roger Rabbit, sooner or later your reach will exceed its grasp.

Of course, you *could* write your own formfit applications; but for most of us, that's no more realistic than building our own car. And hiring a professional programmer is just too expensive. So we end up modifying a favorite program piecemeal with macro processors, utilities, and assorted add-ons.

But this year's crop of object-oriented application generators for programmers and nonprogrammers alike—*HyperPAD*, Cause, Layout, SplashCard, and others—may change all that.

These menu- and icon-driven tools build applications around self-contained objects. Objects essentially combine actions (such as printing) with data elements (such as records or files); they can be copied, modified, and used over and over again like building blocks (see "The Object Is Software Design" in the Languages Special Report, *PCW*, April 1989). So instead of typing lines of code, you snap objects together visually and get instant feedback. Most of these

generators come with basic objects like buttons, menus, scroll bars, and dialog boxes, along with builtin flat-file, math, financial, and drawing capabilities.

The aim, of course, is instant gratification. Professional programmers can quickly build complex billing packages. In-house developers can slap together interactive training programs or data base front ends. Individual users can construct DOS shells, daily planners, or electronic Rolodexes. Some of the packages even feature relatively sophisticated (and easy to tap) animation functions, paving the way for interactive information publishing on the PC.

# FROM THE MAC TO YOU

Much of the inspiration behind this boomlet came from Apple's *HyperCard*. Included free with every Macintosh, *HyperCard* lets nonprogrammers build applications, complete with sound and graphics, around on-screen cards that are linked in "stacks." *HyperCard* users have generated hundreds of thousands of stacks, solid proof that the masses will program if the right tools are at hand. Some PC packages surpass *HyperCard*'s talents and may match its popularity, especially if they're bundled with the hardware.

The first out of the gate was Brightbill-Roberts's *HyperPAD*, a text-mode *HyperCard* work-alike that's touted as a complete desktop environment (see the preview "A HyperCard for the PC," *PCW*, June 1989). *HyperPAD*, says company president Steve Brightbill, "is like the line from 'Saturday Night Live': It's a floor wax *and* a dessert topping!"

Like HyperCard, HyperPAD works with stacks, called pads, that are flat-file data bases of full-screen pages. To build a pad, you link buttons, scrolling fields, and other objects to another page, object, or program. You can, for example, quickly build a central pad with buttons that launch all your DOS applications. You can conjure up more complicated packages by delving into HyperPAD's PADtalk script language. Moreover, the company supplies two dozen pads, ranging from a calculator to a powerful appointment tracker.

The flies in the ointment? *HyperPAD* can't do graphics, and you can't compile pads into a standalone application. Distributing your wares means buying copies of the *HyperPAD Reader* or paying a fat site-license fee.

Maxem's Cause, which shipped shortly after Hyper-PAD, is also a character-based program that can run on a dual floppy PC. However, Cause isn't centered on pads or stacks but on tasks. Although you work with menus and icons to create buttons, windows, menus, and dialog boxes, building an application involves defining resources (data files, windows, reports, and items the program will use) and connecting them to Cause's built-in functions (file management, display, math, and others) via "steps." Some newcomers find the process a bit forbidding, but those with a little programming experience under their belts may love Cause.

They'll certainly appreciate *Cause*'s ability to swap files and recompiled applications with its Mac version,


match fields from different files, and exploit multiple indexes. Although relational multifile joins are beyond *Cause's* abilities, you could create a billing program, for instance, that worked with multiple files. Nascent publishers also note: For \$100 more, you can compile and distribute unlimited numbers of stand-alone applications. Maxem naturally wants to act as publisher for these packages, which it dubs Effects.

Although professional developers represent a lucrative market, the potential profits to be reaped from the masses are irresistible. Matrix Software's Layout, which shipped in May 1988, is a case in point. Layout was originally positioned as an auxiliary tool for programmers, and it can generate code in Quick-BASIC, Turbo Pascal, and other languages. But an upgrade shipping at press time targets everyday users. Company president Vince Garofalo says the idea isn't to create applications that sell 2 million copies but "to let 2 million people build their own applications."


Layout applications can incorporate graphics and sound and run as stand-alone packages. The software incorporates a script language and script recorder as well as hundreds of pages of on-line help and tutorials. Like its peers, Layout can be tapped for report writers, training programs, front ends, and more. Its central metaphor, however, is a flowchart. You string actions together using an extensive library of functions plus "black box" objects—canned routines that provide sophisticated data management, communications, and other functions—and Layout graphically maps your application's progress.

# ALONG THE WINDOWS WAY


With its graphic interface and tight links between packages, *Windows* is a natural home for easy-to-use program generators. As you might expect, some of the offerings closely mimic *HyperCard*. These generators need a fast 80286 or 80386 system with lots of

memory, but they offer high-test graphics and, in some cases, animation and full relational powers.

One of the most ambitious entries is Spinnaker Software's SplashCard, a true HyperCard clone slated for release this fall. SplashCard duplicates HyperCard's feel and functionality (including sound and graphics integration) and not only runs existing HyperCard stacks but generates Mac-compatible stacks. One notable bonus: SplashCard's two-way Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) support. You could easily link a SplashCard population-distribution map of the United States to an Excel worksheet holding the relevant data, and link that to an Excel chart; change the data anywhere, and every element updates instantly.

SplashCard will incorporate an extension of Hyper-Card's HyperTalk language, but it may not offer learn-mode recording—a surprising omission that would force the program's nontechnical audience to turn to the script language far too often. A developers' version that creates stand-alone applications is slated for early 1990 release.

Not the last or least of this genre is a hush-hush program called ToolBook coming from Asymetrix, a Bellevue, Washington, firm started by Microsoft cofounder Paul Allen. A source close to the company indicates the package will provide a completely menudriven, point-and-click, object-oriented development environment not unlike SplashCard. ToolBook uses a HyperCard-like page and book approach and will likely include animation, a draw module, the ability to incorporate graphics from a variety of sources, an English-like script language, and, best of all, script recording. For example, you could quickly draw a planet and its moon, literally drag the moon through a sample orbit, and save the result in a script; click a button, and the moon would take a spin all by itself. Such easily tapped powers—and the Microsoft connection-should win ToolBook widespread publicity and perhaps some heavyweight bundling deals with PC hardware makers.

Of course, not all the action is limited to standalone program generators. Internal programming languages that are the core of data managers, spreadsheets, and other off-the-shelf applications are also feeling the heat.

One of the first programs to adopt an objectoriented approach is Precision's *Superbase 4*, ported from the GEM environment. This forms-driven, fully relational data manager sports appealing features: query by example, DDE support, icons that control everything from playing back applications to scrolling, and the ability to integrate images into relational forms. Perhaps just as important, says Precision president Dan Browning, *Superbase 4*'s BASIC-based programming language leverages the power of the forms. Commands like Open Form achieve results that would otherwise require 100 lines of code. "Before, you had to pay somebody \$100 an hour to write the software for you," says Browning. "Now, with a little study, you can write this stuff yourself."

## A SEPARATE NICHE?

With their visual appeal and point-and-shoot operation, these packages are fun to push around. Fundamental program building can be grasped quickly by anyone who's written a macro or a batch file. And with a little sweat, you can choreograph some fancy footwork for your applications. But don't be taken in by claims that you can "throw away the idea of ever writing code again!" Be prepared to sit down with pen and paper and plot out your program's logic and then grapple with a script language.

And, of course, you still need some serious motivation to create a full-blown application—after all, why mold your own accounting masterpiece if you can buy DacEasy and live with its limits?

"Users generally want ready-to-use applications," comments Bill Higgs, vice president for software research at InfoCorp. The new application generators "are implementing tools, not implemented solutions." While the underlying object-oriented architecture is powerful, Higgs feels the technology may go the route of expert systems and be incorporated into mainstream applications—à la SuperBase 4.

Broader solutions will come from emerging environments like OS/2 Presentation Manager and from the cross-application languages being drafted by Microsoft, Lotus, Ashton-Tate, and other major players. Such applicationwide languages will allow users not only to reshape a program's look and operation but to link it dynamically to other applications. You could, for example, write a simple program that would open a spreadsheet while a data manager was running and transfer and format accounts payable information for September.

For this scheme to work, though, "applications as well as the operating system must understand objects," says Ray Kanemori, Microsoft's BASIC product manager. That leaves OS/2 and Windows in—and DOS out. A bigger hitch may be vendors' unwillingness to open their "common" language to all comers. Says Ed Belove, Lotus's vice president of corporate software development, "In three years, you'll see an incredible mishmash of different options." Microsoft, for example, has been evasive about publishing specs for its rumored Macro BASIC.

But while Macro BASIC and its kin remain obscure objects of desire, the demand for customizable software mounts. And millions of users have enjoyed a taste of programming. "In a sense, every spreadsheet offers programming for nonprogrammers," says Belove. "Some people will cross the line, others won't." Programs such as *HyperPAD* and *SplashCard* will swell the ranks of those who cross the line.

Object-oriented programming has come to Pascal. Not only does Borland International's new *Turbo Pascal* 5.5 support it, but so does a serious competitor—Microsoft's just-debuted *Quick Pascal* 1.0.

Both new compilers support object-oriented programming (OOP), a way of attaching procedures to data types that helps organize complex programs (see "Pascal Gets Two Object Lessons," *PCW*, July 1989). OOP allows a program to label different object procedures—called *methods*—with the same name to handle different data types, a capability called *polymorphism*. For example, a graphics program can use one method to display a dot and another to display a

circle. Both methods may be named Display, without confusing the compiler.

Further, one data type can inherit variables and methods from another data type and override inherited methods with new ones. (For example, a circle has everything a dot has, plus a radius, so the procedure that displays it must be different from the one that displays a dot.) Inheritance, along with polymorphism, contributes to the modularity and reusability of program code, increasing programmer productivity.

While Quick Pascal's OOP syntax adheres closely to that of Apple's Object Pascal—the de facto OOP Pascal standard—Turbo Pascal implements objects differently. Whereas all objects are created at run time in Quick Pascal, Turbo Pascal objects can be created either at run time using the New keyword, or at compile time with a var declaration.

Any *Turbo Pascal* object can be *bound*, or attached, to its methods either at compile time or at run time. This compile-time, or early binding, capability gives Borland's compiler a distinct advantage over Microsoft's. If an object is both created and bound at compile time, OOP remains as efficient as conventional Pascal procedure calling; otherwise there's a performance penalty, which *Quick Pascal* users will have no way to avoid.

# QUICK PASCAL: BANKING ON BEGINNERS

Microsoft has made a logical decision to support the sizable installed base of *Turbo Pascal* users. Apart from its OOP extensions, *Quick Pascal* is remarkably compatible with *Turbo Pascal* 5.0, cloning not only the language but also all the *units* (*Turbo Pascal* pro-

Quick Pascal treats one of the cloned units like a black sheep, however. Microsoft provides a Graph unit that's highly compatible with Borland's, but the documentation doesn't mention it—it's not even in the README file. Instead, Microsoft wants you to use MSGraph, a Pascal version of the Microsoft C graphics library.

The compilation benchmarks compared the time it

MSGraph is the better of the two libraries, however. You can set VGA palettes even in text mode and access more information about the video adapter. Quick Pascal's editor lets you use a mouse and is easier to customize than Turbo Pascal's, but it feels sluggish. It mimics WordStar by default and includes configuration files that allow it to emulate Brief, EMACS, and other popular editors. Its most attractive feature is the ability to edit multiple files in separate, cascading windows; this alone may persuade you to use Quick Pascal for the otherwise vexatious task of editing a unit and the main program at the same

time. And *Quick Pascal*'s editor, unlike *Turbo Pas- cal*'s, doesn't hide the output screen when a program finishes running, but politely waits for you to press a key.

# TURBO PASCAL: STILL TOPS

Despite a serious challenge from Quick Pascal, several features make Turbo Pascal the superior product. Turbo Pascal normally compiles to memory rather than to a slower disk drive; Quick Pascal compiles only to disk. If you need more help tracking down program errors than is offered by Turbo Pascal's built-in symbolic debugger, an updated \$150 Turbo Debugger fully supports the new OOP extensions and is bundled with Turbo Pascal and Turbo Assembler in the \$250 Turbo Pascal Professional package. While

Quick Pascal does integrate a symbolic debugger, Microsoft's more powerful professional debugger, CodeView, can't debug Quick Pascal programs.

Only *Turbo Pascal* offers smart linking, which omits any procedures the program doesn't use from the compiled code before creating the final .EXE file. *Quick Pascal*'s .EXE files always include entire units, making the files bigger and more memory-intensive.

With pulldown menus and WordStar keystroke conventions, Turbo Pascal's editor is nearly as easy to use as Quick Pascal's. However, unlike Quick Pascal's, it lacks mouse support and won't let you edit multiple files simultaneously.

## STILL WAITING FOR ...

Both compilers leave several things to be desired. For example, neither can generate *Windows* applications or programs that fully support a mouse.

Nonetheless, *Turbo Pascal's* powerful array of features clearly earns it a Best Buy. Chief among the program's advantages is early binding capability, which boosts productivity by letting you attach methods at compile time. Add smart linking for smaller .EXE files, plus a powerful add-on debugger, and *Turbo Pascal* still stands as the Pascal compiler to beat.





# A TURBO PASCAL OBJECT LESSON

CREATE A HANDY FILE-CONVERSION PROGRAM—

AND LEARN SOME USEFUL TURBO PASCAL TECHNIQUES ALONG THE WAY.

## MARTY FRANTZ

WHAT YOU NEED: TURBO PASCAL 5.5

Although WordStar 3.31 has gone the way of the passenger pigeon, files created with it-or with version 4.0-may still be valuable to you. The program WSTOASC-.PAS, presented in LISTING 1, converts WordStar-formatted files into ASCII text that any word processor can digest. You can compile and run WSTOASC as is, but its main purpose is to illustrate the object-oriented programming capabilities of Borland's new Turbo Pascal 5.5 (see "Turbo Pascal Meets the Quick Challenge" in this Special Report).

To create WSTOASC.PAS, type the listing in a text editor, load it into *Turbo Pascal 5.5*, and compile it with the Destination set to 'Disk' to create an .EXE file. To run WSTOASC.EXE at the DOS prompt, enter WSTOASC followed by a space and the name of the *WordStar* source file, another space, and the name of the ASCII destination file (a drive and/or path may, of course, prefix either file name). If the name of the destination file is the same as an existing file's, WSTOASC will

overwrite the existing file, so be careful.

# PROGRAMMING THE OOP WAY

The theory behind object-oriented programming (OOP) is that programs are easier to write, debug, and document when procedures and the variables they act on are combined into a new data type called an object. Once an object is created, it can be easily plugged into other programs, saving coding time. Turbo Pascal 5.5 objects bear a striking resemblance to records, but they contain procedures and functions instead of fields. As with records, you must first declare object types, then create instances, or actual object variables, of those types. The WSTOASC program creates two object types, one called ASCII for ASCII files and one called Word-Star for WordStar files. When the program runs, InFile is an instance of a WordStar object, and OutFile is an instance of an ASCII object.

In Turbo Pascal 5.5, the procedures and functions contained within an object are called *meth*ods; they define the kinds of messages the object can understand. Executing a method requires passing the method name, along with necessary parameters (such as the name of the file to open) to the object. For example, the command InFile.OpenFile('MYFILE-.WS') would instruct the InFile object to open the file MY-FILE.WS using the OpenFile method.

The real power of OOP lies in an object's ability to inherit much of its nature from another object. For example, the Word-Star object is a descendant of the ASCII object and automatically possesses the OpenFile, Close-File, GetAChar, and PutAChar methods. The coding is simplicity itself-WordStar = object (ASCII). But since WordStar files set the eighth (high) bit to 1 and contain soft hyphens, the WordStar object must use a different GetAChar method. This GetAChar method overrides the method inherited from the ASCII object; it turns the eighth bit from 1 to 0 and transforms soft hyphens into hard ones. In effect, GetAChar performs all of the actual file conversion.

# INSIDE THE CODE: STILL PASCAL

With object and variable declarations and procedure and function definitions out of the way, WSTO-ASC.PAS's main program block starts by testing the number of parameters (the source and destination file names) entered on the command line. If two exist, conversion proceeds; if not, the program calls the Instructions procedure and displays an appropriate error message.

Next, the program opens the input and output files (Assign statements in the ASCII.OpenFile and ASCII.CreateFile methods link them to InFile.fp and OutFile.fp. respectively) and copies the input file to the output file a character at a time. WordStar.GetAChar tests the incoming characters for soft hyphens (ASCII \$le hexadecimal), which it replaces with hard hyphens ('-'). The Boolean AND operation with the hexadecimal number 7F (binary 01111111) converts the eighth bit to 0 and leaves the remaining seven bits unchanged. When WordStar.GetAChar reaches the end of the WordStar source file, both the source file and the destination file are closed.

# CUSTOMIZING WSTOASC.PAS

Turbo Pascal 5.5's object-oriented nature makes maintaining and modifying programs easy. For example, if you want WSTOASC.-PAS to strip out WordStar's dot commands, you need only insert the necessary code into the WordStar.GetAChar method. Or, substitute different object types that transform other word processor file formats for the WordStar and ASCII types. Simply use the same method names—GetAChar and PutAChar—and leave the main program alone.

# AN INTRODUCTION TO HYPERPAD PROGRAMMING

A VETERAN DEVELOPER OF MAC STACKWARE OFFERS A STARTER COURSE FOR PC USERS.

WHAT YOU NEED: HYPERPAD Like Apple's revolutionary Hyper-Card, Brightbill-Roberts' Hyper-PAD is an inexpensive, objectoriented application development tool that appeals to a broad range of users. If you need a quick custom DOS shell, an electronic phone book, or a billing system, HyperPAD is the tool to use (see the preview "A HyperCard for the PC," PCW, June 1989). This tutorial will show you how to set up a basic HyperPAD application and then attach scripts created with PADtalk (HyperPAD's Pascal-like script language) to the application's control buttons.

HyperPAD applications, or pads, consist of pages, or screenfuls of information. Building a HyperPAD application is essentially the process of linking one page of information to another using a button. For example, you might choose to link pages in a pad sequentially from beginning to end. Or you could create a central page with buttons that lead to individual pages. This article describes a random access layout: Controls on each page can take you to any other page in the pad.

# SOME HYPERPAD BACKGROUND

HyperPAD applications function on several levels: the pad level, which primarily consists of the main pad script; the background level, composed of elements shared by a group of pages (a pad may have more than one background page); the page level; and finally the button level. While you create many pad elements (such as the look of a page, and the size and visual attributes of buttons) using interactive menu commands, specific pad and button behavior must be defined in a PADtalk script.

Each script, whether for the pad level or for a button or *check box* (a variety of button), consists of *handlers*, which are similar to procedures in Pascal or SUBs in BASIC. Pad- and button-level handlers can call each other, just as standard programming language procedures do.

# MAKING EFFICIENT LINKS

Turn most people loose with HyperPAD, and they'll start creating buttons, check boxes, and other control objects pell-mell. This presents few problems in small applications because the number of buttons (and the PADtalk scripts that make them work) is small. But as you add pages to an application, direct links from one page to another can proliferate. As an absurd example, if each page of a 9-page pad contained links to every other page, the pad would contain 72 buttons and therefore 72 scripts. Placing these direct-link buttons on the background page, which automatically makes them part of every page, reduces the number of scripts to nine. But the problem still remains: As your pad grows, you must add more buttons to the background.

One solution is to give each page a two-part name and let a combination of check boxes and buttons tell the pad how to find pages, much the way you move to a worksheet cell by specifying the row and column. For a 9-page pad, this would require only six buttons; by extension, eight buttons could address 16 pages with two-part names, and nine buttons could handle 27 pages using three-part names.

# ► PROGRAMMING THE PAD

The following sample pad creates the structure for a foreign language phrase book organized by language (Japanese, French, German) and topic (At Work, At Home, At School). It consists of 9 pages—one for each language/ topic combination. Three buttons and three check boxes give the user access to any page of the phrase book, illustrating the programming technique just described.

Check box scripts call a padlevel handler named Pick\_ Language (see FIGURE 1) to reset the check box display on every page of the pad. Pad buttons read a value stored in a global variable by Pick\_Language and use that information to find the correct page.

# 1. CREATE A NEW PAD

Starting at *HyperPAD*'s Home pad, press <Alt>-<Space> to display the menu and choose *New* from the File menu. Type a name for the new pad (such as LAN-GUAGE) and click on 'Ok' or press <Enter> to create the new pad; *HyperPAD* presents you with a blank page.



# 2. DISPLAY THE PAD'S BACK-GROUND LEVEL

To make the control buttons and check boxes available on every page of the pad, choose *Back-ground* from the Edit menu; *HyperPAD* should display 'BKGND' at the bottom of the screen.

# 3. CREATE THE THREE TOPIC BUTTONS

To create a button, choose New Button from the Objects menu. HyperPAD places a button on the screen that you can modify and reposition. Double-click the button or press <Enter> to display the Button Info box. Label the button At Work, then press <Enter> (or click 'Ok')—don't change any other settings. Repeat this process to create At Home and At School buttons; size each button by grabbing a corner, and arrange them as shown in FIGURE 1.

# 4. CREATE THE THREE LANGUAGE CHECK BOXES

A check box is a type of button that can be turned on or off, or from PADtalk's point of view, set to True or False. Create three check boxes named Japanese, French, and German, just like you create a button but with one difference: Select *Check Box* in the Button Info dialog box. While you're there, deselect *With Edge* and *Auto Hilite* to turn those features off. Size the check boxes to a single line each and arrange them as shown in FIGURE 1.

# 5. DRAWING LINES

To separate the button "control panel" visually from the rest of the page, choose *Line* from the Tools menu, move the cursor to the line's left starting point, hold down <Shift>, and either drag the mouse to the right or press

<Cursor Right> to draw the line. At the right end, move left to display the last character of the line. Place the cursor on the middle of the line and draw this pad's vertical line.

# 6. CREATE AND NAME THE PAGES

Now that you've created the buttons and check boxes on the background page, you must create the pages they will take you to. Deselect Background in the Edit menu to leave the HyperPAD background. Press <F6> to display the Page Info dialog box, then name the page Japanese At Work and press <Enter>. Press <F3> to create a new page, then <F6> again to name it Japanese At Home. Create seven more pages named Japanese At School, French At Work, and so on. Each page should display the background buttons created earlier.

# 7. SCRIPT THE APPLICATION

The final task is to add the scripts that make the pad, the button, and the check boxes work. To enter the pad script, Choose Pad Info from the Objects menu, and select Script to display HuperPAD's script editor. Type in the openPad, openPage, and Pick\_Language handlers as they appear in FIGURE 1. Don't forget the final semicolon at the end of each line (except following the Begin statement). When you're finished, choose Save and Return from the editor's File menu to compile the script.

To add scripts to the check boxes and buttons, choose Background from the Edit menu, then Selector from the Tools menu. Double-click on a button to display the Button Info box. Select Script, and enter the appropriate script from FIGURE 1. When you're done, choose Save and Return from the editor's File menu, then deselect Background from the Edit menu to leave the HyperPAD background. Finally, select Browse from the Tools menu to leave HuperPAD's programming mode.

## UP AND RUNNING

To see your application in action, select Home from the Go menu and reopen the LANGUAGE application using File Open. Click a check box, then a button, and HyperPAD should go immediately to the correct page in your pad. You can then select Text from the Tools menu and add text appropriate to that page. Select Tools Browse to return to running the pad. Now that you know this technique, you can incorporate it into other pads you write, and even combine it with other linking patterns.

# ORGANIZING THE GLOBAL OFFICE

Big news for big business—IBM launches its ambitious OfficeVision environment and polishes up the OS/2 Presentation Manager

Mondello rode herd on 1000 programmers for two years to bring off the project, and *OfficeVision* spin-offs will advance the state of the art even for customers who don't need to pull far-flung offices into a corporate global village. Key among the spin-offs are upgrades to OS/2, whose graphic user interface, large memory addressing, and multitasking capabilities provide the desktop glue for the new environment.

OfficeVision is the first application family born within Systems Application Architecture, IBM's grand unification theory, which mandates common applications, user access conventions, programming tools, and communications links. In keeping with the glacial pace of SAA development, OfficeVision elements will trickle in rather slowly, and third-party developers must modify their own packages before OfficeVision reshapes the landscape.

# Suite Success?

The software will run on the four strategic SAA platforms: OS/2 networks, AS/400 minicomputers, and mainframes running the VM and MVS operating systems. Even the PC versions won't come cheap—you'll need OS/2 Extended Edition with at least 7MB of memory, and you'd better figure on running it on a fast 386. Less functional versions will be delivered for DOS PCs or dumb terminals hooked to the big machines.

OfficeVision initially will offer approximately the same baseline capabilities as IBM's entrenched mainframe office automation systems—Professional Office System (PROFS) and Distributed Office Support System (DISOSS)—which it will replace in the long run.

The first programs will begin arriving this month for OS/2 local area networks. *OfficeVision/2 LAN* will include electronic mail, file system access, and address

book and phone book functions. In first quarter 1990, a follow-up release will add a calendar, a document library, a file cabinet, and decision support modules (reporting, charting, data entry, and data import/export), plus a first crack at a "composite" (text/graphics/image) editor. The price is \$750 per OS/2 workstation. A subset of this suite for DOS, using character-based windows, will be available for \$210.

In early demos, OfficeVision/2 LAN showed IBM's progress toward packages that exploit OS/2's graphic user interface and smooth interplay between application modules. Once you've finished an E-mail message, for instance, you can drag it over and drop it in an out-box, and the message is in the mail.

The software also shows that IBM isn't going for world-beating form on features just yet. The calendar, for instance, is fairly rudimentary, and there are no hot links to funnel data between modules.

# Snap-On Tools

Analysts emphasize that focusing on such details misses the main point. *OfficeVision* is an impressive global solution, says John Murphy, senior analyst with Wohl Associates. "It's an umbrella that everyone will shelter under."

More than an application family, *OfficeVision* is an environment that's open to all comers. This fall IBM will begin to release a set of application program interfaces (APIs) that will help developers build advanced user interfaces, tap office functions like E-mail, and manage system resources. The result is what IBM has dubbed snapon applications, which play as full members of the family.

At OfficeVision's kickoff this spring, more than a dozen software firms pledged allegiance and displayed prototypes. Most of the firms were mainframe houses (and several claimed to be pushing into OS/2 more quickly than their PC peers). Lotus revealed a glimpse of its not-yet formally-announced 1-2-3/G and promised an OfficeVision version. Microsoft tied its not-yet formally-announced Excel for Presentation Manager to OfficeVision's mail

yet formally-announced Excel for tion Manager to OfficeVision's in facility. WordPerfect issued a verbal endorsement. IBM hadn't briefed smaller software vendors, but most of them quickly made encouraging noises about the new environment—as would any-

one planning to sell into Big Blue shops.

Cleaner, Brighter OS/2

By emphasizing OfficeVision, is IBM pushing the garden-variety OS/2 Standard Edition onto the back burner? That's the way it struck many observers, although an updated Standard Edition is expected to ship this month. This version lacks the much-awaited support for the 80386 chip, although it does contain

some significant tweaks.

For throughput, the \$340 Standard Edition 1.2 features a replacement for the FAT file system. The new High Performance File System handles partitions and files up to 2GB and offers a performance boost of 15 to 200 percent over FAT. You can set up partitions for both file systems on your disk and then boot in OS/2 or DOS.

Along with extra polish, the DOS compatibility box now supports a subset of DOS 4.x and frees up about 30K more memory. IBM addressed the glaring lack of device drivers by promising a PostScript driver within 1.2 and other drivers, notably for LaserJets, from third parties very soon. Standard Edition 1.2 adds a built-in on-line hypertext help system for OS/2 commands. Developers can get their hands on a \$650 combined tool kit/technical reference guide.


But the most striking enhancements are those that make OS/2's Presentation Manager shell a bit less clunky: more direct manipulation of files in general, more

# **NEW OS/2 PLATFORMS**

IBM hopes that four OS/2 platforms due to arrive in the next six months will quicken the slow pace of OS/2 application development. OfficeVision is both an application family and an environment that independent software houses can exploit.

OfficeVision/2 LAN is an OS/2 network suite that provides E-mail and other office functions via an iconic interface. PC applications such as 1-2-3 and Excel will be modified to fit neatly within IBM's new office environment.

The improvements reflect advances in SAA's Common User Access scheme, the soon-to-be-beloved blueprint for user interfaces, which now reflects some of IBM's own experiences in building *OfficeVision*. This year's CUA comes in three basic flavors: object-oriented workplace (which builds on Presentation Manager, emphasizing direct results when handling icons via a mouse), graphical (Presentation Manager, or a DOS subset with character-based windows), and entry (for dumb terminals).

As the Presentation Manager shell and *OfficeVision* applications demonstrate, new frills like multilevel menus and cascading windows can greatly simplify use. Application vendors are adding further gloss; a prime example is 1-2-3/G's trick of lending windows a handsome three-dimensional appearance. Not all problems have been solved—the Presentation Manager mouse apparently still acts like it's underwater—but progress is being made.

# **Broader Extensions**

The corresponding OS/2 Extended Edition 1.2 will arrive in November for \$830. Its Database Manager is finally out of the gate in the SQL server race with Remote Data Services—multiuser SQL support on the OS/2 LAN Server local area network. The Database Manager also gains a slew of developer enhancements plus a Presentation Manager look for its Query Manager.

IBM continued to fill in the gaps for its endlessly diverse communications environments with an SNA gateway for up to 254 workstations, greater support for AS/400 and System/36 minis, the ability to run mainframe bit-mapped graphics, ethernet connections, yet more LAN Server APIs (bringing IBM closer to lockstep with the Microsoft/3Com LAN Manager), and a host of other options.

Additionally, Extended Edition acquires an SAA procedures language, an update of IBM's veteran REXX that can act as a general-purpose or macro language. Over time, the language may evolve into a helpful tool for nonprofessional users.

# Okay, Who Bites?

Sparking another round of debate about adopting OS/2, the May announcements highlighted a deepening schism between large corporations and other customers.

This year's truism is that DOS is not going away. Recent months have seen a surge of support for packages that employ "DOS extenders" for added memory—the most dramatic example being 1-2-3 release 3. Simultaneously, many Windows packages are waiting in the wings, with an upcoming version of Microsoft's environment expected to smash the DOS memory barrier this fall. "We hear more about Windows than we do about Presentation Manager, from both software vendors and end users," reports Wohl's Murphy.

But Frank Ingari, vice president of Lotus's spreadsheet division, insists that "corporate customers who are going to invest serious dollars in a PC application are thinking seriously about Presentation Manager." Ingari explains that many such customers are creating runyour-business applications where OS/2's painstakingly drawn architecture will pay off. "That's a qualitative change, and it will give Presentation Manager a home in the corporate environment," Ingari says.


Unsurprisingly, IBM executives echo this refrain. And James Cannavino, president of IBM's Entry Systems Division, maintains that within a year or two, higher-density memory chips will wipe away worries about memory costs. Customers today who plan crucial projects for DOS or *Windows*, he says, are opting for "short-term actions." ●

# The On-Line Edge

**S** taying on top of the competition used to mean reading trade journals, attending an annual convention or two, and generally keeping an ear to the ground. These days savvy businesspeople also keep their hands on the keyboard.

On-line data bases provide competitive intelligence about everything from a company's balance sheet to an entire industry's prospects. This information is comparatively cheap, extremely wide-ranging, and, in the hands of someone who knows how to use it, enormously advantageous. The trick is to find the data bases that have the information you need.

At last count, over 4000 data bases were offered through more

than 500 on-line services. The scope of these sources is vast—from data as current as 90 seconds ago to information stretching back years, decades, or even centuries.

This Buyers' Guide lists my top picks for data bases that will give you an edge in the increasingly competitive business arena. These rich sources will be a good point of departure for answering three key questions: Who are your competitors? What are your competitors doing? And who are your customers? For details on the cost of accessing this information, see TABLE 1.

# D&B Dun's Market Identifiers, D&B Million Dollar Directory

One of many Dun & Bradstreet information products, Dun's Market Identifiers provides detailed information on over 2.25 million public and private U.S. companies. To qualify for a listing, a company must have five or more employees or at least \$1 million in sales. To find competitors, you simply search on the basis of the government's Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Code and a business description. The data base will tell you, among other things, each firm's sales figures for the last three years, how many customers it has, its facilities' square footage, and the name of its main bank.

The D&B Million Dollar Directory offers similar information, but here the key qualifier is a net worth (as opposed to sales) of \$500,000 or more. The data base offers information on over 160,000 firms, including hard-to-find facts about many privately held companies.

# WHAT ARE YOUR COMPETITORS DOING?

Once you've identified the specific firms you want to investigate, the following data bases and on-line services cover the fiscal records and the business-oriented publications you need to analyze your competition's financial background and business history.

Publicly held firms are the easiest to probe, since by law they must make periodic reports to the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), but a surprising amount of data can be found on many privately held companies (and individuals) as well.

If your quarry is particularly elusive, you'll have to use your imagination. Determine what kind of publication (newsletter, newspaper, trade journal, general interest magazine, and so on) is most likely to cover what you're interested in. Then concentrate your efforts on data bases that offer that kind of material.

# ABI/Inform, ZBusiness Dateline

ABI/Inform and Business Dateline are two of the most remarkable data bases available. ABI/ Inform offers instant access to over 400,000 articles from 800 international business journals and magazines. Information comes in a manageable. concentrated abstract that neatly summarizes all the important facts, figures, quotes, and other information covered in the source article. Titles range from American Salesman and High Technology Law Journal to Fortune and Forbes.

Business Dateline focuses on more than 180 regional business publications and 14 daily newspapers. Titles include Crain's Cleveland Business, Memphis Business Journal, and the Greater Baton Rouge Business Report. In addition to covering local issues and carrying detailed stories on major firms located in the region, the data base includes information on start-ups and familyowned and closely held firms, as well as facts about the people who own them.

Getting financial information on public companies is easy (see the Disclosure data base described below), but privately held firms are not required to publish their financial data. However, many companies disclose this kind of information to Dun & Bradstreet in order to establish a credit rating. It's that information, minus the credit report, that's the basis for Dun's Financial Records Plus. The data base covers over 1.5 million U.S. businesses, 98 percent of which are pri-





vately held. DFR reveals, among other things, up to three years of financial statements and key financial ratios for each firm.

And when any of the 4500 or so government agencies has a "procurement action" totaling between \$5000 and \$100,000, depending on the agency, it is legally required to submit a standardized synopsis of its needs to the Department of Commerce for publication.

Using this data base, you can discover within seconds whether the federal government is in the market for whatever it is you sell and, if it is, where to send your proposal. CBD is available on Dialog, and with that system's "current awareness" feature, you can even have a search conducted auto-

matically for \$1.50 per day. The results will be sent to your electronic mailbox, where you can pick them up at your convenience.



# **BEFORE YOU LOG ON**

On-line information retrieval is not a skill you can expect to acquire overnight, any more than you'd expect to master 1-2-3 or dBASE in a 1-hour session. To cut costs, it's a good idea to practice on a low-cost data base or use cheaper after-hours options. Try to make your search requests as specific as possible to keep charges down. Investing the time to refine your online search skills will help you find vital information fast and keep costs to a minimum.





ending in .COM, .EXE, or .BAT—are files that make things happen. Batch (.BAT) files are the only executable files you can write using nothing more complicated than a line editor or word processor.

A batch file is a series of DOS commands written as an ASCII file and saved with a .BAT extension. When you call the batch file (by typing its name and pressing <Enter>), the commands basically execute in the order you entered them (advanced batch files can branch).

There are so many clever batch file techniques, we could fill this entire issue with tips and still not cover the lot of them. This article introduces a few basic concepts; for more ideas, see *The Help Screen* in this issue.

#### **Shortening Paths**

One chief batch file benefit is not having to remember exactly where things are on your hard disk. For example, to change to the C:\FILES\WORKING\ CLIENTS\DATABASE subdirectory, you could use a batch file called DATA.BAT containing the line CD C:\FILES\ WORKING\CLIENTS\ DATABASE. This kind of batch file functions like an autopilot, and if you write one for every subdirectory on your hard disk, you'll never have to type in another long path name again.

A variation on this theme can save you time by loading applications quickly and easily. Say you've got 12 applications, each in a different subdirectory, and you want to be able to call them from anywhere on the hard disk. One solution is to put all 12 subdirectories on the search path. (The PATH statement—usually part of your AUTOEXEC.BAT file-gives DOS a list of subdirectories in which to search for executable files it can't find in the current default subdirectory.) The disadvantage to this approach is that DOS wastes time searching through up to 12 subdirectories before finding the application you want.

To speed things up, you can create a \BATCH subdirectory just below the root; this is where you'll put all your batch files. Put this subdirectory first on the search path by rewriting the PATH statement in your AUTO-EXEC.BAT file.

Now, write a batch file for each application. Suppose you have *WordStar 5.5* (installed as WS55.EXE) in a subdirectory called C:\WRITE\WS55, and your text files are located in C:\WRITE\TEXT. Write a batch file called W55.BAT with the lines:

CD C:\WRITE\TEXT C:\WRITE\WS55\WS55

When you want to run Word-Star, just type W55 <Enter>. DOS looks in \BATCH, finds W55.BAT, and runs it, which moves you to C:\WRITE\TEXT and then runs WS55-.EXE from the C:\WRITE\WS55 subdirectory. Write simi-

lar batch files for all your applications, and you'll be surprised how quickly they can be up and running.

#### So Nice You Can Do It Twice

Sometimes you may wish to load applications two at a time with the same batch file. For instance, if you normally load a keyboard macro processor like *ProKey* along with *WordStar*, you could automate the process by adding *ProKey* to W55.BAT. That file would then look like this:

CD C:\WRITE\TEXT

C:\PRO\PROKEY

C:\PRO\WS.PRO/R C:\WRITE\WS55\WS55

This would move you to C:\WRITE\TEXT, load *Pro-Key* from the C:\PRO subdirectory, read in the file where you store your macros (WS.PRO), and then run *WordStar*:

#### Batch to Batch

You can arrange for batch files to load other batch files in one of two ways. You can simply include the name of the second batch file as the last line of the first batch file. Or, if you want batch file number two to execute in the middle of batch file number one, and then have batch file number one continue, use the CALL command that's included in DOS 3.30 and later versions (users of earlier DOS versions can substitute C:\COMMAND/C for CALL).

Suppose you're the type who likes to clean up a directory before loading an application but doesn't like writing the same lines over and over. First, create a batch file called DEL\_BAK.BAT with these lines: DEL \*.BAK DEL \*.TMP

Now DEL\_BAK can do your housecleaning for you. For example, to delete all .BAK and .TMP files in the C:\WRITE\TEXT subdirectory before loading WordStar, you could rewrite W55.BAT as follows:
CD C:\WRITE\TEXT CALL DEL\_BAK
C:\PRO\PROKEY

C:\PRO\PROKEY
C:\PRO\WS.PRO/R

C:\WRITE\WS55\WS55

#### **Working Without a Net**

Brave (or foolish) folks can use batch files' ability to take input from other files to disable DOS's cautious 'Are you sure?' messages. For instance, if you often use the DEL A:\*.\* command to delete files from floppy disks and don't like having to confirm this request every time by typing Y, create a batch file called DEL\_A.BAT with the line DEL A:\*.\* < C:\BATCH\YES.

The < is the redirect symbol. It tells the batch file to take input from a file—in this case, the YES file in the C:\BATCH subdirectory. To create the YES file, simply use your word processor (in ASCII mode, of course), type Y<Enter>, and save the file.

From now on, when you issue DEL\_A, DOS will delete all the files on the disk in drive A: without asking you whether you're sure. So you'd better be sure.

#### **Just the Beginning**

These suggestions are merely the tip of a large and useful iceberg. See your DOS manual for more details on batch commands, and watch Star-Dot-Star and Tips and Techniques in PC World for the latest ideas from our readers. And if you come up with a whizbang batch file, send it in; sharing one is even more fun than writing one.





Word Processing

#### Linking Files With Word 5.0

Assembling complex documents is a cinch with Word's powerful bookmark and documentlinking commands.

What you need: Microsoft Word 5.0

n most offices, it's common practice to create documents that contain text culled from other sources. Now you can automate the process with *Word 5.0*'s bookmarks and the Library Link Document command.

Both features sprouted from seeds sown in *Word 4.0*. The Bookmark command is an enhancement to *4.0*'s Jump command, which enables you to move to any document page. With *5.0*'s bookmarks, you can tag and name portions of text and then jump to any of them instantly.

Library Link, which hauls spreadsheet data into a Word file, now has an addition called Document that lets you pull in specified (bookmarked) text from any Word file. In tandem, these new features enable you to create links between two files. Although the links are static, you can update them easily. As an example, this article shows you how to forge links between line items in a price list and price quotes in a customer letter.

#### **Bookmark Basics**

First create the price list shown in SCREEN 1: Center the first line (<Alt>-C) and underline the second line completely (<F10> <Alt>-U). While the second line is still highlighted, press <Esc> to access the main menu, F to display the Format menu, and K to stamp the text with a bookmark.

Word prompts you to name the bookmark. Bookmark names can contain up to 31 characters, including hyphens, underscores, and periods (but not spaces). Enter heading and press <Enter>.

Type in the line items and then highlight the first item's entire line with <F10>, issue <Esc>FK, and enter the bookmark name bear. Repeat the process for the second and third item lines, using the bookmark names booky and error, respectively, and save the list as PRICE.DOC.

Now you can use the Jump command to find the bookmarks. Press <Esc>JK, type in heading (or press <F1> to display a

list of bookmarks), and press <Enter>. Word zips to the bookmarked text.

You can also delete, rename, or move a bookmark. To delete a bookmark, jump to it, then press <Esc>FK. Leave the bookmark name field blank, and press <Enter>Y to confirm the deletion. To rename a bookmark, delete the old bookmark, press <Esc>FK, and enter the new name. If you want to attach a previously used bookmark name to a new piece of text, just highlight the new text, press <Esc>FK<F1>, select the bookmark name, and press Y. The old text will no longer have a bookmark.

### Linking Documents With Bookmarks

Bookmarks are handy, but they really shine when teamed with *Word 5.0*'s document link feature.

Split open a second window and create the letter shown in SCREEN 1: Simply type in the first paragraph; the remaining information will be inserted once you create links with the price list. Then, to link the first line of pricing information, the heading, press <Esc>LLD to activate the Library Link Document command. Type in the name of the price list document PRICE.DOC (or press <F1> to choose its name from the directory).

At this point, pressing <Enter> would link the entire document. However, we want to link a single element from the price file. So press <Tab> to move to the Bookmark field, then press <F1> to see a list of the bookmarks in PRICE.DOC. Select 'heading', and the bookmarked text appears at the cur-

sor location with all character and paragraph formatting intact. To add the items from the price list, just repeat the process for each bookmark, or create a macro to do this.

Note that the text you've imported from the price list includes hidden-text markers. If you don't want to see the markers, choose Options and select No in the Show Hidden Text field. Finally, save the finished price quote letter, LETTER..DOC, in the same directory that contains the price list file.

#### **Updating Bookmark Links**

Naturally, you'll need to update the links when you change the price list. To do so, modify the prices in PRICE.DOC, and save that file. Next you need to highlight the text you want to update, including the hidden codes (use <Esc> Option and select Yes in the Show Hidden Text field to reveal the codes). Select the entire letter with <Shift>-<F10>. Then, press <Esc> LLD to

open the link. Leave the Filename and Bookmark fields blank, and press <\*Enter>. Word finds each linked section that has been modified, displays it, and asks if you want to update the text. If you press Y, the changed text appears on screen.

Unfortunately, *Word* doesn't allow global updates, but here's how to create a macro that updates all the links in the sample price quote letter.

With the cursor in the letter document, press <Shift>-<F3> to begin recording, then press <Shift>-<F10> to select the entire document. Type <Esc>LLD to open the link. Press <Shift>-<F3>, type UpdatePrices.mac^ at the prompt, and then press <Ctrl>-U<Enter>. Save the macro by pressing <Esc>TGS<Enter>.

This macro will be useful the next time you want to update the letter with changes made to the price list. From the letter document, press <Ctrl>-U; then just press <Enter> to begin updat-

ing. At the prompt, press Y to update data or N to move to the next bookmark.

#### **Word Marks the Spot**

Bookmarks and document links come in handy for many tasks. For example, you can link legal documents or business letters to one file containing boilerplate text. When you change a boilerplate, you can quickly update the documents as well. You can also transfer text that uses line-draw embellishments, distinctive fonts, or even graphics for use in special report formats. Word 5.0 streamlines the process of weaving documents together.

than you have to learn a new set for the next. For example, to leave AT&T-Mail, you type QUIT or EXIT; on BIX, Compu-Serve, Delphi, or GEnie, it's BYE; and on MCI Mail, EXIT. (On a BBS, the log-off command can be anything from A to X.) Even after you learn these commands, it's easy to confuse services and issue the wrong command.

Fortunately, you can adapt your communications software so the same function key combination performs the same action in all your services. This article shows how to assign uniform commands to function keys in *Crosstalk XVI*—and its clones, *Mirror I* and *II*—for maximum on-line efficiency.

#### **A Command Assignment**

In Crosstalk XVI, you can assign commands to any function key without interfering with the program's operation (see FIGURE 1). If you use <Shift>, <Ctrl>, and <Alt> keys, 40 function key assignments are possible. Note that Crosstalk XVI assigns log on information to some of the <Ctrl>-key combinations; we'll tell you how to check them before you change assignments.

Crosstalk stores function key assignments in the command files for the various on-line services it lists on the main menu. Any string or command can be assigned to a key, including control characters, carriage returns, and delays.

The trick is to assign the same *type* of command to the same function key for all your favorite services. For example, if you assign each service's XMODEM upload command to <Shift>-<F9>, you won't have to re-



member whether to type UP MENU, 5, or UP. And *Crosstalk XVI* automatically loads the appropriate command file each time you dial up that service. You can also use function keys to issue commands to *Crosstalk XVI* in local mode, rather than to the on-line service; for convenience, you may want to use the <Alt> keys for this.

#### Using Crosstalk's FKeys Command

To assign or change function keys for a given service, load its command file by typing the service's number from the list on the main menu. When *Crosstalk* begins the dial-up process, press <Esc> <Esc> to halt the script file and clear the command line.

Crosstalk XVI ships with some function keys already assigned for most services. To display them, type FK (for Fkeys) at the command prompt. (To view <Ctrl>, <Shift>, and <Alt> commands, follow the FK with a space, and C, S, or A, respectively.)

Crosstalk XVI provides four special characters for use in function key assignments: `issues a carriage return; ^ is a control character, displayed when you press the <Ctrl> key; ~ causes a 1-second pause; and @ sends local commands to Crosstalk XVI.

To make an assignment, type **FK** followed by a space, the number of the function key to be assigned, and the command sequence you want assigned to it.

To assign the BYE command to <F1>, for example, type FK 1
BYE' and press <Enter>. Control characters don't normally require a carriage return, so to assign ^S and ^Q (pause and start text commands on most services) to <F5> and <F6>, respectively, simply type FK 5 <Ctrl>-S <Enter> and FK 6 <Ctrl>-Q <Enter>.

To assign a command to a <Shift>, <Ctrl>, or <Alt>function key combination, type S, C, or A followed by the function key's number. (Typing FK S1 defines <Shift>-<F1>, for example.) To set up <Ctrl>-<F5> to issue Delphi's delete command, type FK C5 Del' and press <Enter>.

After you assign function keys for a given service, save the assignment in the service's command file by typing **Save** followed by the name of the file (the same name that you selected from the main menu): for example, Save Cserv.

The same steps also work in Mirror I, II, and—with some variation in command structure —III. Crosstalk Mk.4 users can assign function keys by pressing <Alt>-K and entering the definitions in the window, using the syntax and special characters described here.

One final tip: It helps to cluster your commands by category. Assign the most often-used commands to straight function keys; those dealing with E-mail to <Ctrl>-function keys; miscellaneous commands to <Shift>-function keys; and local Crosstalk XVI commands to <Alt>-function keys. The result is a tailor-made front end that will make life simpler in a complex on-line world. —Michael A. Banks

#### Hassle-Free Fonts for WordStar

Downloadable soft fonts are easy to use with WordStar 5.0—once you learn how to install them.

What you need: downloadable soft fonts, Hewlett-Packard Laser-Jet or compatible

ne of WordStar 5.0's biggest advantages is the ease with which it lets you use HP LaserJet—compatible soft fonts, such as those sold by HP or Bitstream, to improve the quality of printed text. Not only does WordStar 5.0 justify, center, and calculate line breaks for proportional type, it makes changing fonts (and mixing them on the page) a breeze.

Unfortunately, before you can use soft fonts you have to install them—a confusing three-stage process involving two standalone utilities provided with WordStar 5.0, LSRFONTS and PRCHANGE. First, you have to create a font information data base with LSRFONTS. Then PRCHANGE uses the data base to install the fonts in your laser printer driver (.PDF) file. Finally, you create a DOS batch file to download the fonts to the printer.

To begin, use DOS to copy the third-party fonts from disk to a subdirectory on your hard disk. Creating a FONTS subdirectory beneath your *WordStar* program directory (usually \WS5) is an obvious choice; for the purposes of this article, we'll assume that's what you've done.

### Creating a Font Information Data Base With LSRFONTS

1. Run LSRFONTS. A screen will list the current directory (\WS5) and announce: 'Searching for LaserJet font files. Please wait...' Presently another message will appear: 'There are no font files in the current directory. Enter a new directory to search.' Type C:\WS5\FONTS <Enter>.

After a few seconds, the Available Third-Party Fonts screen will appear. You'll see a list of your font files on the upper half of the screen. On the lower half

- will be a series of headings: symbol set, point size, p/l (portrait or landscape orientation), pr/fx (proportional or fixed), and so on. As you cursor through the list at the top of the screen, the associated font attributes will appear at the bottom.
- 2. Press < Enter> to select (or deselect) the fonts. When you're done picking the ones you want, press < F10>. Remember, though, printer RAM limits the number of fonts your printer can handle. And the larger a font's size, the more RAM it uses.
- 3. You'll see a message that reads, 'Writing font information to database. Please wait...'
  Presently you'll be asked to name the "font group" for the data base. The name doesn't matter; you'll use it only once.
  The default name is a time/ date stamp; to accept it, press <Enter>.
- 4. A message will announce the successful creation of the data base, and you'll be asked if you wish to exit the LSRFONTS program. Press Y to return to the DOS prompt.

#### Installing Fonts in WordStar With PRCHANGE

- Run PRCHANGE. From the main menu, select 'Modify PDF settings', and press <Enter>.
   This will let you install the fonts in your printer driver.
- 2. You'll be asked to select a .PDF file to modify. Select your LaserJet driver by cursoring down to it and pressing <Enter>. Type in the directory where it is located (C:\WS5 is the usual choice), and press <Enter>. Now you'll see the PDF Modification menu.

- 3. Select 'Add or remove fonts', and press <Enter>. You'll see a list of all the fonts currently included in your .PDF file, and you'll be asked if you want to change them. Press Y.
- 4. Now you'll see a menu asking you to select the type of font to change. This part is tricky, because at least three options may seem pertinent. Be steadfast: Select 'Add or delete third-party laser fonts', and press <Enter>.
- 5. After a few seconds, a line will appear at the top of the screen: 'Add fonts (+), delete highlighted fonts (-), change associated fonts (enter).' Press +. The screen heading will change to Purchased Soft Fonts, but instead of a list of fonts (as in the previous screen), you'll see the name of the data base you created with LSRFONTS. Press <Enter> to select it, and then press <F10>.
- 6. Now you'll move to the Available Typefaces screen, which lists all the typefaces you included in the data base. You won't see pitch or orientation, just abbreviated names: Helv, Tms Rom, and so forth. Select the ones you want, and then press <F10>.
- 7. You'll find yourself in the Available Type Sizes screen. Available type sizes will be listed on the top half of the screen, with complete information (font group, width, proportional, orientation, and so on) listed below. Cursor to the type sizes you want, press <Enter> to select them, and when you're done press <F10>.
- 8. You'll return to the 'Select the type of font to change' menu. Select 'Return to previous menu', and press <Enter>. You'll be back in the PDF Modification menu.

#### Creating a Batch File to Download the Fonts

Now you've successfully installed the selected soft fonts in *Word-Star*—but they won't do you any good unless you can get them into the printer at print time. That requires a DOS batch file, which you can create from within PRCHANGE.


- Select 'Create download batch file' from the PDF Modification menu, and press < Enter>.
- Enter a batch file name (such as DOWN.BAT) when prompted, and press <Enter> again.
- 3. Type in the name of the directory where your *WordStar* files are kept (C:\WS5) and the name of the directory where your font files are located (C:\WS5\FONTS), and press <\f10>. The batch file will be created.
- 4. Select 'Return to Main menu', and press <Enter>. Select 'Quit and save changes', and press <Enter>. You will return to DOS. That's all there is to it.

#### The Payoff

To use your new soft fonts, run DOWN.BAT to load the fonts into the printer. Then run *Word-Star 5.0* and open a file. To select a soft font, press <Ctrl>P=, and a menu will appear listing the fonts you've just installed. Cursor down to the one you want, and press <Enter>.

Now you can start typing your text. WordStar will handle justification, line breaks, and centering perfectly. If you change your mind later, simply change the font and press <Ctrl>-B to reformat the text correctly. Although the normal text-processing dis-

#### Do-It-Yourself Clipper Functions

Create a simple userdefined Clipper function that lets you include popup menus in your data entry screens.

What you need: Clipper (any version)

ore than just a dBASE-compatible compiler, Nantucket's Clipper is a hothouse for data base application development. With its strong support for user-defined functions (UDFs), Clipper lets you custom craft resusable tools that extend the dBASE language. These tools are particularly useful in customizing data entry screens.

UDFs are like any other function, except you create them yourself. A UDF is a program module that can be called by the main program from anywhere in a command line, followed by any parameters that must be passed to it. The UDF performs calculations or lookup tasks, for example, and then passes the results back to the procedure that called

it, using the Return command.

called CENTER() that centers a line of text. To call it from within a program, you would use: ? CENTER(field\_name,85)

As with all UDFs, CENTER() starts with the Function command to identify itself, followed by a list of acceptable parameters. The first parameter, estring, is the text string or statement that you want to center. The second, clenth, is the length of the line you want it centered in. Clenth is optional; without it, Clipper defaults to 80 columns. Next comes the Private command. It's always a good idea to use this command to make sure the UDF's variables don't corrupt the outside application.

CENTER()'s fourth line saves, to a variable called cblank, a number corresponding to half the width of the line minus half the length of the cstring text. Finally, the Return command inserts the appropriate number of blank spaces (cblank) followed by the text string (cstring).

#### Popping Up a Menu

Now for a more complex example. Say you're designing a data entry screen where, for one field, the user needs to select an entry from a pop-up menu. You don't want to hard code menu choices into the program, because non-programmers need to be able to change the choices easily. In-

stead, choices should reside in another data base file, indexed on the choices field.

LISTING 2 shows DBF\_MENU(), a UDF that pops up a scrollable menu of choices from one field in an alternate data base. It returns the contents of that field for the record that the user selects. To add DBF\_MENU to a program, you would embed a line of code such as CATEGORY; = DBF\_MENU(12,45,23,67,; "MENU", "CATEGORY",; "NEW\_CAT", "Pick One")

In the above example, the numbers are the coordinates of the corners of the menu box.

MENU is the name of the alternate data base from which you're drawing the data, and CATEGO-RY is the name of the two data bases' common field. NEW\_CAT is the name of another internal UDF you can call upon. Pick One is the title that appears at the top of the menu.

The PARAMETERS command in LISTING 2 follows this structure. The first four parameters (t, l, b, and r) are the corners of the menu box (the numbers 12, 45, 23, and 67 in the above example). Base is the data base containing menu options. Mfield is the data bases' common field: In the original data base, it's the field to be replaced; in the menu data base, it's the list to be displayed. User\_func is the name of an optional, internal



UDF that DBF\_MENU() can call to perform other operations. If you don't want to call another UDF, assign a 0 to this parameter. Title is an optional title to be placed on the first line of the menu.

The second section of DBF \_MENU() handles the physical design of the menu window. It saves the text that will sit behind the window to a variable called winbuf, clears the window area, and draws a box around it. Later, in the fourth and last section of the UDF, the original text will be restored to its place.

In the third section, DBF \_MENU() makes use of a native *Clipper* function called DBEDIT(), which displays data in table format. By displaying only one field in one column, DBF\_MENU() uses this table as a vertical menu. Because DBEDIT() lists data via arrays, DBF\_MENU() must declare a one-element array containing

the name of the mfield variable to be listed.

If you are going to use DBF \_MENU() to help edit existing records, you will want its menu to pop up already pointing to the current selection. You could set a relationship between the two data bases, but such a relationship, existing in your application at large, beyond the protected world of your UDF, could prove problematic. It's better to use the SEEK command, which finds the record that matches the current record.

In this example, DBEDIT() functions as a command, allowing users to scroll through options. When the user presses <Enter>, DBF\_MENU() returns the field contents for the selected record.

DBEDIT()'s behavior can be affected by an optional user-defined function passed to it as a parameter. DBF\_MENU() sends the internal user\_func UDF directly to DBEDIT() for that purpose. This allows you to include

such features as the ability to add a new item to the menu or to abort the selection process. For more information on using internal UDFs, see the DBEDIT() section of the *Clipper* manual.

You could create similar UDFs for popping up notepad windows, producing custom menus, or enhancing calculated fields. A good personal library of user-defined functions can go a long way toward easing the task of Clipper development. —Lincoln Spector



#### Helpful hints from members of the nation's user groups

#### A Batch File That Flicks Word's Switches

Microsoft Word 4.0's start-up switches offer handy options, like setting screen characteristics or reloading the last file you worked on. The simple batch file in LISTING 1, W.BAT, displays some of Word's most helpful start-up switches and automates their use.

To create W.BAT, load Word and type the information shown in LISTING 1. Then name the file W.BAT and save it unformatted. Now whenever you type W at the DOS prompt, Word displays a handy list of switch options. The switches speed things up too—instead of typing WORD/L to reload the last file you worked on, for example, simply press W L <Enter>.

Also, to load Word in default mode, or to load a file automatically from the DOS prompt, you must bypass W.BAT altogether. To load a file, type WORD drive:\path\filename.

#### Fast Recalcs for 1-2-3 Ranges

Using 1-2-3's Calc function to recalculate a range in a large spreadsheet can be time-consuming. For quick range recalcs when automatic recalculation is off, use the Copy command. Just select Copy and enter the relevant formula cells in both the Copy FROM and Copy TO ranges. When you press <Enter>, the program copies the range onto itself, recalculating all the included formulas in the process.

### WordPerfect Merges With dBASE III Plus

WordPerfect can't use standard dBASE files for mail merge. However, you can save dBASE III Plus data as an ASCII file, which WordPerfect can then import as a secondary merge file. The routine in LISTING 2 simplifies the job by inserting WordPerfect's secondary merge codes into a dBASE Alternate file, making translation a one-step process.

You have to insert the names of your own files and fields in LISTING 2. If you don't want certain records in the Alternate file, insert an IF...SKIP END-IF statement directly after the DO WHILE line.

Now press <Ctrl>-<F9> to start the WordPerfect merge, and enter the name of the Alternate file at the secondary merge file prompt.

#### Advice and information for the computer consumer

Do computer monitors emit harmful radiation? Most experts agree that current evidence is inconclusive—but agreement stops there.

#### The Radiation Enigma

Controversy has raged for years over whether the low-frequency radiation emitted from computer monitors poses a risk to health. The concern stems from reports of more than a dozen clusters of miscarriages and defective births among workers who used computers during pregnancy. Research into the effects of low-frequency radiation on mice and chick embryos has also produced disturbing, though controversial, results.

In 1988, a study published by the Kaiser Permanente Medical Care Program in California added fuel to the fire. In the study, women who used video display terminals (VDTs) more than 20 hours per week during the first trimester of pregnancy were 80 percent more likely to lose their babies through spontaneous abortion than women who did not use VDTs.

But the link between VDTs and pregnancy problems remains uncertain. Dr. Robert Hiatt, coauthor of the Kaiser study, says that the miscarriages may have been caused by stress or poorly designed workstations rather than electromagnetic radiation.

And there's the problem in a nutshell: While ionizing radiation such as X rays is known to be dangerous, no one seems to know for sure whether the nonionizing, low-frequency radiation emitted by computer monitors is harmful. Nor is it clear whether the duration or intensity of exposure makes a difference. Add to this the fact that 12 to 15 percent of recognized pregnancies end in miscarriage anyway, and you have a recipe for doubt. This uncertainty has created a storm of controversy over what should be done now, while further research is under way.

"As a policymaker, I would say that there's insufficient evidence to warrant changes in regulations," says Dr. Hiatt. "As a physician, if a patient who had had several miscarriages came to me, I would say go ahead and transfer to another job for a while."

Industry trade groups, such as the Computer Business and Equipment Manufacturers' Association (CBEMA), say that fear is unwarranted. "All we know now is that there's no conclusive data, and it looks like there's no harm done," says Maryann Karinch, manager of communications at CBEMA.

But many workers' groups say that they'd rather be safe than sorry. "By and large, people who say the information is inconclusive say that we should do nothing," says Sharon Danaan, research director for 9 to 5, a group representing 14,000 clerical workers. "We say research is very slow, so why not take simple precautionary steps?"


Unions such as the Communications Workers of America and the Service Employees International Union (SEIU) have negotiated a number of contracts that include clauses allowing pregnant women the option of transferring to noncomputer work.

But according to SEIU lobbyist Kathy Skrabut, such transfer rights are hard to win. "The nature of clerical work these days, especially in data processing, is single task-oriented," she explains. "We find the worst abuses in the insurance and airline industries, where a reassignment for a pregnant employee just (continues)

boils down to more computer work."

Many workplaces don't even offer this luxury. IBM, for example, has no policy for transferring pregnant workers to other jobs. "If a female employee requests a transfer, every effort would be made to assure her of her safety," says IBM spokesperson Theo Chisholm. "If she still requests a transfer, the question of alternate work assignments would be handled between her and her supervisor."

#### **Avoiding the Rays**

Given the uncertainty of the research, it's no wonder there's little consensus about what to do. For managers who want to protect their employees from possible low-frequency radiation dangers, one much-publicized option is to invest in products (such as shields) that claim to reduce the radiation emitted from computer monitors. But choosing among these products is more difficult than it sounds.

That's partly because computer monitors emit two types of radiation: electric field (E field) and magnetic field (H field), and no one is certain whether one type is more dangerous than the other. "The feeling is that if there's a negative effect, it's more likely to result from the magnetic field, but that's not firmly established," says Dr. Michele Marcus, a specialist in environmental and occupational hazards at New York's Mount Sinai School of Medicine.

Not a single monitor shield on the market completely suppresses both types of radiation, according to industry experts. Companies such as Kantek (212/925-7850) and NoRad (800/262-3260) make shields that they claim will suppress all of the E field but only part of the H field. Acco International (800/222-6462) and Sun-Flex

(800/321-1659) both make shields that block only the E field. Other companies, like I-Protect (213/215-1664), produce shields that aren't designed to block low-frequency radiation at all—instead, they claim to block X rays, which already require shielding under federal law. Even more confusing, some shields simply block glare or discharge static via a ground wire but don't offer protection from anything else.

Instead of buying a shield, concerned consumers might consider a flat-screen LCD monitor offered by Safe Computing (800/222-3003). Executive Vice President Allen Nitschelm claims that the \$995 monitor blocks both E-field and H-field emissions.

Before buying any radiationshielding product, however, consumers should investigate it carefully. In what is clearly a warning to consumers, most of the manufacturers contacted for this article complained that their competitors deliberately mislead consumers about the capabilities of their products. Industry expert Louis Slesin, who publishes VDT News, says that "there's a lot of loose talk" about what shields can do. To avoid lowfrequency radiation from monitors altogether, taking a break from computer work might be the safest solution.





Not being in a major metropolitan area, we shipped the printer directly to Toshiba for repair. Three months later, I discovered that Toshiba had neither repaired nor returned the printer because the company would not honor our purchase order, even though it more than amply covered the cost of repair. We either had to accept COD shipment or fill out a credit form. To make a long story short, the credit check took seven months.

It was all downhill from there. In June 1988, three of the Toshibas failed. From past experience, we avoided Toshiba and went to a local authorized repair center. The printers were returned after a month, unrepaired. We decided to try another repair shop recommended to us, in Illinois. The printers were shipped in October 1988, and as of February 1989, we still hadn't received them back. We were told that all three had the same problem. Toshiba had advised the repair center that the necessary parts were unavailable, and there would be a six-month wait!





The OmniKey also includes contemporary extras, from a separate cursor pad and a <Pause> key to duplicate <Enter>, <Ctrl>, and / keys. A welcome bonus: Flip a switch on the back, and the keyboard can work with either PCs and XTs or ATs and 386s. The company also offers the OmniCruise keyboard accelerator for \$7.95 and a \$25 adapter for IBM PS/2s.

Northgate's user manual is painstakingly precise, although it fails to note that the keyboard's X/A switch configures it for XT or AT computers, respectively. No matter. Adding the OmniKey to your system is a snap. Turn off your PC, plug in the OmniKey keyboard, set the X/A switch, turn the computer on, and you're in business. If the system beeps or displays a keyboard error, chances are you set the switch incorrectly. Turn off the PC, flip the switch in the opposite position, and turn the PC back on.

Like most replacement keyboards, the OmniKey may have trouble with older 80286 compatibles originally designed with 84key keyboards in mind. For example, scrolling on an NCR PC8 is a bit jittery, and the OmniKey's <F11> and <F12> keys aren't recognized by macro processors such as *Keyworks*. Northgate acknowledges that some original 8088 PCs—notably from Zenith, Tandy, and Dell (formerly PC's Limited)—may balk at the OmniKey altogether. Although that's hardly Northgate's fault, the company nevertheless offers a 10-day, noquestions-asked return policy. Now that's the *only* way to upgrade.

#### The Last System Battery

In the year 3 B.A. (Before AT), PC and XT users had to reset DIP switches every time they changed monitors or added a new disk drive to their systems. Then along came the AT, and with it, the revolutionary concept of storing system setup information in a battery-powered CMOS chip on the motherboard. The only problem? The lithium (continues)

battery that keeps the data "alive" in the chip eventually dies, taking the setup information with it. You have to not only put in a new battery (which will die 2 or 3 years down the line) but boot the computer with a floppy system disk (since the hard disk is no longer recognized), and run the AT's Setup program again.

You can end this ritual for a not-so-paltry \$49.95 with the Last-Bat, a rechargeable system battery from Accumation. The company claims that the Last-Bat will probably outlast your computer and accordingly offers a lifetime warranty. So maybe \$49.95 is a deal after all.

Replacing the old system battery with the Last-Bat takes only 15 minutes, in spite of a user manual that omits detailed steps. The tools of the upgrade: a screwdriver to remove the computer's lid, and a flashlight. Park the system's hard disk, turn the system off, unplug all external cables, ground yourself properly, and remove the cover. Locate the system battery at the back of the computer. On most ATs and 386s it's a 1-inch-square black or gray box mounted on the inside of the backplane above the keyboard connector. Remove the battery's motherboard connector, then pluck the battery from its perch. (If the battery is built into the motherboard, make sure the battery is removed or the Last-Bat won't work.)

Installing the Last-Bat means reversing this process, with one key difference. Since the Last-Bat recharges when your machine is on, it must naturally tap into the computer's power supply. Take one of the power supply's white female connectors and mate it with the Last-Bat's matching male connector. (If there are no free power supply connectors, don't fret. Pull out the floppy disk drive's power cable, plug it into the Last-Bat, and plug the Last-Bat's special power connector into the disk drive.)

At this point, you'd expect to peel the paper off the Last-Bat's adhesive backing and stick it inside the system case just above the keyboard connector. But the Last-Bat is twice as big as most system batteries and may prevent the system cover from sliding shut if it's placed too high on the case. Make sure there is proper clearance, mount the Last-Bat, and then replace the cover. Although the manual correctly warns you not to stick the Last-Bat onto anything hot. the accompanying illustration wrongly shows it secured to the computer's power supply! Ignore the drawing and follow the manual's written instructions.

Reassemble the system, turn it on, and you now have a lifetime system battery. If you're buying the Last-Bat because your system battery recently expired, you'll naturally have to run your Setup program one last time—at least until the next upgrade.

#### Full-Page Monitor on a Disk


Back in September 1987 I examined a clever little video enhancement board from Aristocad called the Kicker. By plugging the Kicker into an EGA board driving a multiscan monitor, you instantly doubled *Ventura*'s displayed page length. The downside? The Kicker cost \$195, was hell to configure, and worked with only multiscan monitors.

This time around, Aristocad has not only cut the price, it's automated the installation; added *Microsoft Windows/286* to the fold; and embraced almost all EGA, VGA, and multiscan setups. Better yet, you don't need to open up the back of your computer: The Kicker has become *The Soft Kicker*, a \$99 program that largely matches the Kicker's talents and adds some new features to boot.

Aside from giving you full-page display (instead of the one-third most of us live with), The Software Kicker offers Ventura users panning (speedily displaying any part of a page without redrawing the screen or fussing with scroll bars), an on-screen magnifying glass, and a full-page view at the click of a mouse. An extra \$40 buys you The Soft Kicker Plus, which gives Windows/286 users panning and a full-page, 1024-by-1024-pixel black-and-white display.

Installing *The Soft Kicker* for *Ventura* is painless. Pop the disk into drive A:, type Install, and answer a few prompts about your video setup. When you first load *Ventura*, you can't see any menus. But roll the pointer to the top of the screen and the top

of the page quickly flows into view. Click the right mouse button and the entire page is displayed (three-quarters of a page on an EGA setup), along with a magnifying glass linked to the pointer. You can perform any operation in this sky-high view, then zoom back to any place on the page by clicking the mouse again.

Installing *The Soft Kicker Plus* for *Windows/286*, however, is a pain because you must reinstall *Windows* from scratch. (For tips on how to partially reinstall *Windows*, see this month's *Help Screen*). Since this Microsoftordained process will write over existing system files, copy your current WIN.INI and .PIF files

to a different subdirectory before you start. Then run Windows/286's Setup program. When you're asked to specify your display adapter, pick Other, slip the The Soft Kicker Plus disk into drive A:, and pick the appropriate 1024-by-1024 blackand-white EGA or VGA driver, or one of the color drivers aimed at Excel, Micrografx Designer, and PageMaker users.

The Soft Kicker is a perfect upgrade for Ventura users. But you might think twice about Plus—it's too expensive, doesn't support Windows/386, and lacks a magnifier. However, keep an eye peeled for Aristocad's forthcoming Excel More, which does for Excel what The Soft Kicker does for Ventura.







Use dBASE to create merge files for Word, display the date and time automatically, make WordStar macros for special symbols, reverse names in dBASE files, pop between WordPerfect subdirectories, neaten your disks, fix a busted pipe, and boost system performance with a five-pack of utilities.

### Merging From dBASE to Word

I prefer to use *dBASE III* to prepare data files for *Microsoft Word* Print Merge operations. This eliminates data entry errors when merging fields that contain commas (as in Mr. John Doe, Jr.) because *dBASE* can automatically place double quotes around individual fields—a tedious job to do by hand. After using *dBASE II* to create a

.DBF file containing the names and addresses, I create the merge data file with a simple one-line command at the dot prompt:

COPY TO DELIM.TXT DE-LIMITED WITH "

To use the result in a Word
Print Merge, add a line at the
top of DELIM.TXT that lists, in
the order in which they appear,
the names of the fields embedded
in your form letter or other
merge document. Separate the
field names with commas, and
end the line with a carriage
return.

#### **FINDing the Date and Time**

Like Bob Farland ["Booting Around the Clock," Star-Dot-Star, PCW, May 1989], I wanted my AUTOEXEC.BAT file to display the current date and time while skipping the 'Enter new...' prompts. I found a combination of the ECHO, DATE, and FIND commands that accomplishes this without requiring you to install ANSI.SYS or create a permanent file containing a carriage return and linefeed. If you're running DOS 3.0 or a later version, add these two lines to AUTOEXEC.BAT:

ECHO.:DATE:FIND "C" ECHO.:TIME:FIND "C"

Make sure that FIND.EXE is on your boot disk or in a directory included in a preceding PATH statement. The ECHO. command issues a carriage return and linefeed, which the pipe operator (!) transfers to the DATE and TIME commands' 'Enter new...' prompt. The latter commands' output is then piped to FIND, which displays only the line containing "C", with this result: Current date is Mon 5-10-1989

Current time is 11:22:46.12 If you're still using DOS 2.0 or 2.1 (in which ECHO. doesn't return a blank line), you can use an

alternative command that's only slightly slower:

ECHO: MORE: DATE: FIND "C" ECHO: MORE: TIME: FIND "C"

One final note: If you try any of these tips on a floppy disk, uncover the write-protect notch. When DOS encounters piped commands, it must create temporary files on the current drive.

#### WordStar Macro Symbology

I often need to type the plus/minus (±) and degree (°) symbols using *WordStar 4.0*, so I made two macros to automate the task.

To create the macros, press <Esc> to bring up WordStar's shorthand menu. Then type ?PPlus/Minus and press <Enter>. Hold down the <Alt> key while you type 241 on the numeric keypad, and then release the <Alt> key. Press <Enter>. Next, type DDegree and press <Enter>. Hold down the <Alt> key while you type 248 on the numeric keypad, and then release the <Alt> key. (continues)

Finally, press <Enter> <Enter> Y.

You can use a similar technique to create macros for other symbols in the extended ASCII character set, listed in most DOS manuals. However, your printer may not reproduce the same symbols on paper—check your printer's documentation to be sure.

Editor's note: Some printers may require you to change some switch settings to enable extended ASCII characters. Also, if you are using WordStar 5.0 with pulldown menus enabled, select the Other/Shorthand Macros command instead of pressing <Esc>. Then, enter the macro keystrokes.

#### **dBASE Name Games**

Recently I had to print out checks from a *dBASE* data base holding nearly 700 names. In examining the file structure, I noticed that all the names were listed last name first, as in, "Marschand, Steven E." Since I didn't relish retyping 700 names, I wrote a program to reverse the last and first names. After processing a copy of my data base, it was a simple matter to print the checks.

REVERSE.PRG [see LISTING 1] uses the AT() function to locate a space between the first and last names. After this, other string functions such as RIGHT() and SUBSTR() separate the two names. Then, STORE, TRIM(), and REPLACE commands remove the comma and reassemble the NAME field in the correct order.

Editor's note: To try this program, make a copy of a name-and-address data base (or create one from scratch) containing a character NAME field with data in last-name-first order, and name it XNAMES.DBF. Enter and save REVERSE.PRG. From the dBASE dot prompt, type USE XNAMES < Enter > followed by DO REVERSE < Enter >. Type LIST NAME to see the results. Don't perform this surgery on your only copy of important data—the changes are permanent.

#### **WordPerfect Presto Chango**


If you frequently change subdirectories in *WordPerfect 5.0*, there's an easy way to return to the previous directory: Just enter a double List Files command by pressing <F5> twice. This logs you on to the previous directory and even restores the original cursor position.

David M. Charles Oakdale, California Editor's note: For a demonstration of how to use this timesaving tip, start WordPerfect 5.0. I'll assume the current directory is C:\WP50. From the document display, press <F5> and enter a new directory name, such as C:\WORK. When you see WORK's contents, retrieve a file or press  $\langle F7 \rangle$  to return to the main document screen. Now, press <F5> twice. Presto, you're back in C:\WP50! By experimenting, I discovered that selecting option 7 (Other Directory) switches you back to C:\WORK.

#### **Neatness Counts**

Having grown tired of messy disk labels with dates and notes scrawled everywhere, I finally hit on a solution. First, I bought some glue-down photo corners and 3-by-5-inch index cards from an office supply store. Using a blank index card as a positioning guide, I attached four photo corners to the front of my disk (continues)



sleeves. Next, I put a fresh label on each disk, with titles like Word Processing #1, Data #2, and so on. I wrote these same titles on the index cards, and then slipped the cards into the corners on the sleeves. Now when I update files or need to add a note about a disk, I jot it on the card instead of the label. When I recycle the disk, I can replace the

card without having to peel off the old label. This practice not only eliminated my messy labels, it even forced me to organize my disk collection.

#### **DEVELOPER'S TOOLBOX**

#### One Five-Pack to Go, Go, Go

Until I started using Multisoft's PC-Kwik Power Pak, I thought I had squeezed every ounce of power from my ALR 386/2. But I was wrong. This collection of five RAM-resident utilities has boosted my system's performance more than I ever dreamed possible.

Built around an intelligent memory manager, Power Pak oversees from 64K to 16MB of expanded, extended, or main memory, doling out bytes on demand to a disk cache, a print spooler, a RAM drive, and a display accelerator. The fifth utility, a stand-alone keyboard enhancer, pushes the keystroke-repeatrate pedal to the metal. By sharing one memory pool, Power Pak's utilities cooperate to put free RAM to the best possible use.

You might think so much power would gobble up main memory. But Power Pak's utilities are amazingly thrifty, taking as little as 10K and never more than 64K (32K on my system). For the extended-memory disk cache buffers, Multisoft recommends an additional 64K to gain a "noticeable improvement" and 128K for an "impressive improvement." I let Power Pak take over every smidgen of my system's 1280K extended RAM. The result was an astounding kick in performance.

Installation is totally automated.

With no help from me, Power Pak determined how much and what kind of

memory was in my computer and set its own parameters. This allowed me to start using the utilities immediately. Later on, when I had time to read the manuals, I was able to fine-tune various parameters for top efficiency.

Soon after Power Pak's installation, the wonders began. My hard drive's inuse light, normally more active than a firefly on a summer evening, now flashes only occasionally. I no longer have to wait while lengthy documents print. My display and keyboard zip along like roadsters on high octane. My cursor zooms. And if text flies by too fast to see, I can always press <Scroll Lock>, activating the screen accelerator's ReView feature to retrieve data that has scrolled away.

Of the five utilities, I'm getting the most benefits from the disk cache, which stores previously read disk sectors in RAM, thus reducing disk accesses. For example, one morning I read my MCI Mail, logged on to a Xenix multiuser system, copied files to floppy disks, deleted old backup files, jotted a few notes, and wrote most of this column. After a few hours, I asked Power Pak for a status report and discovered that of 4640 disk operations, 3961 read the disk cache rather than the hard disk. The acceleration this produces must be experienced to be believed.

The print spooler is also proving its worth. Unlike the DOS PRINT com-

mand, Power Pak's spooler works with any printer and software combination by intercepting characters sent to the serial or parallel output port. The characters are stored in memory and then fed to the printer in the background while you continue working. When the spooler needs more RAM, it borrows memory from the disk cache—a sensible plan that optimizes throughput. To conserve RAM, the spooler compresses text in memory. And according to the manual, you can set up two separate spoolers, which might be useful on systems connected to both a dot matrix and a laser printer.

In these days of megabyte, megabuck software, it's refreshing to find great stuff like Power Pak—a set of super utilities for a fair price. They don't come much better than this.



PCW, May 1989], has at least one major disadvantage when used to load applications. You lose the ability to temporarily exit to DOS from within the running application.

For example, typing CD C:\123 | 123 changes you to the C:\123 directory and runs 1-2-3 without any evident problems. But if you start 1-2-3 this way, exiting temporarily to DOS with the /System command causes DOS to hang. Your only option at this point is to reboot. You can avoid such busted pipe commands by dividing them into separate lines, such as:

CD \123

123

This is a whopper of a DOS bug—no doubt the result of COMMAND.COM's attempt to simulate multitasking features like pipes within the confines of a single-tasking operating system. I've yet to find any programs that, when started with a pipe command, still allow you to duck out to DOS. I tried six programs, and they all crashed. If anybody's got the solution to this one, please send it in and we'll print the answer in a future column.







#### Tips and strategies for departmental networking

NetWare 386 versus OS/2 LAN Manager: Do you need one of these powerhouse LAN operating systems? If so, which one?

Q. Our NetWare 2.15 LAN has bulged to 38 nodes, and the performance degradation has gone from noticeable to annoying.

Just as we were set to boost performance by moving to OS/2

LAN Manager, Novell announced NetWare 386. Now what do we do? Is NetWare 386 as powerful as LAN Manager?

**A.** Novell's announcement of *NetWare 386 3.0* (due in the third quarter of 1989) is causing a lot of second-guessing among potential *OS/2 LAN Manager* buyers. Designed to take advantage of the 80386 chip, *NetWare 386* will

be more than twice as fast as the current 286-based *NetWare* and should support more than twice as many users. It will also provide greater file capacity and powerful print and security features. Based on early observations, it appears to broadly match the power of *LAN Manager* (see the *NetWare 386* preview, *PCW*, August 1989).

Still, LAN Manager may be your best bet. Microsoft sells LAN Manager to OEMs, who often add enhancements when they resell it. Versions are available from 3Com, IBM, Ungermann-Bass, InterLAN, Standard Microsystems, Torus, Apricot, and Corvus, and others are due from AT&T, DEC, Hewlett-Packard, NCR, Olivetti, and Tandem. 3Com's 3 + Open is thefront-runner, offering sophisticated support for wide area networking (see "Seven Top LANs: A Hard Look at Ease of Use," PCW. June 1989).

Why consider LAN Manager? First, it's a lot cheaper: \$2995 for 3+Open compared with \$7995 for NetWare 386. It also offers superior connectivity options. Support from IBM, Microsoft, and other major companies has attracted numerous developers. It's also likely that LAN Manager will be required for many future LAN applications.

Both LAN OS's deserve consideration by anyone looking for more speed, security, and flexibility. If you decide on *NetWare 386*, avoid converting until six months to a year after the ship

date, so others can iron out the wrinkles. In the meantime, you can boost *NetWare 286* speed by adding server RAM or dedicating a PC as a print server.

#### What's New in NetWare 386

NetWare 386 has a lot to recommend it—especially for Novell customers. Entirely rewritten for the 80386, it's a superb choice for large, single-server LANs with limited links to other systems. The following outlines some key issues to consider. Where applicable, NetWare 386 features are compared to LAN Manager's, but this column is not intended as a product review.

#### **Upgrading from NetWare**

**286.** It will be much easier to upgrade to *NetWare 386* than it will be to move to *LAN Manager*. All your *NetWare 286 2.1*x applications (except server-based Value Added Processes, or VAPs) will run without modification. Novell provides a utility that automatically backs up all files, including bindery, security, program, and print queue data; reformats the server; and copies the files back. The catch? The utility works only with *NetWare 2.1* or later versions.

At press time, Novell supported only its proprietary server (sold by Samsung), the Compaq Deskpro 386, and all 386-(continues)

#### NetWare 386 Versus 3 + Open: Pros and Pros

NetWare 386 and 3+Open (3Com's version of LAN Manager) compete closely in security, print spooling, users per server, storage and memory capacities, installation, and maintenance. However, in some other key areas, each has its advantages.

based IBM PS/2s. The initial list of supported server adapter boards is limited to Novell Arcnet and Ethernet and IBM Token-Ring. More systems and boards should be supported by the time you read this.

Fortunately, you can use existing *NetWare 2.1* workstation shells and adapters, although you may need to modify the shells slightly and replace some *2.1* utilities. To avoid possible glitches, you can install *NetWare 386*'s new shells, which also take up 65K RAM.

Performance. Since NetWare 386 takes advantage of the 80386's faster 32-bit instructions and data transfers, it should be two to three times faster than NetWare 286. Most likely, it will outpace LAN Manager, which is not optimized for the 80386.

Users per server. NetWare 386 theoretically supports 250 users, up from 100 with the 286 version. Practically, a NetWare 386 server should support about 80 PCs without noticeable degradation, compared to a typical limit of 40 for NetWare 286. LAN Manager claims support for 1000, but the real-life limit is closer to that of NetWare 386.

**Storage and memory.** With *NetWare 386*, volume size has increased from 256MB to 32 tera-

bytes, and files can be as large as 4GB. Realistically, the disk limit is more like 2GB to 4GB, but that's still more than enough for the vast majority of LANs. Volumes and files can span as many as 32 physical drives, with a theoretical maximum of 100,000 files open at once. When a file or volume runs out of space, it automatically spills onto another drive.

Novell claims support for up to 4GB of server RAM, but the true-life limit is more like 5MB to 10MB. Yet you can get by with 2MB of RAM instead of the 4MB required by *LAN Manager*.

Print Spooling. Print support now matches *LAN Manager*. Administrators and users are notified of completed jobs, paper outages, and printer errors. And *NetWare 386* has a few tricks of its own. Whereas *LAN Manager* doesn't allow local printers to be shared with other users on the LAN, *NetWare 386* lets users share 16 local printers.

**Security.** NetWare's security appears to come close to LAN Manager's. Administrators can block access to files instead of just directories. Passwords are now encrypted to guard against snoopers.

#### Installation and mainte-

nance. NetWare 386's installation process is simplified. To streamline maintenance, you can now install and remove drivers and print queues while the LAN is operating. NetWare 386 is even self-tuning. To improve performance, it monitors network traffic and automatically adjusts memory assigned to hash tables and buffers.

**Applications support.** To compete with *LAN Manager* for developer support, Novell is mimicking its rival by publishing its operating system specs. This fall the company will release its application program interfaces (APIs), a common set of subroutines.

Publishing its APIs is a welcome improvement, but compatibility may be a problem. So far, Novell has indicated it will support only 10 LAN Manager API calls (Named Pipes, which control interapplication communication) out of a total of 127. Because Novell's set differs from LAN Manager's, many LAN Manager applications will have to be rewritten from scratch for NetWare 386. It's doubtful that developers will do this, especially for tomorrow's server-based applications.

#### LAN Manager's Connectivity Edge

Up to this point, NetWare 386 more or less matches LAN Manager. But when you look at connectivity options, LAN Manager has the edge.

**Linking multiple servers.** It's much easier to link multiple *(continues)*

servers with the top LAN Manager version, 3 + Open. With its distributed name service, the program lets you manage multiple servers and other network resources easily from one spot. Because NetWare~386 lacks this capability, maintaining linked servers is a hassle, requiring synchronization at each server.

External connectivity. LAN Manager also has a head start on intersystem connectivity. It provides links to minis, mainframes, and UNIX machines with NetBEUI, XNS, ISO Transport Class 4, and TCP/IP transport protocols. Novell, in contrast, initially will support only its own SPX/IPX transport, and will add Mac support in version 3.1, due in the first quarter of 1990. Other links await subsequent revisions.

#### **The Battle Commences**

Thanks to a huge installed base (and what looks to be an excellent 386-specific upgrade), Novell will probably keep most NetWare users from migrating to LANManager. For NetWare users who don't need links to other systems, NetWare 386 is a reasonable choice. However, if forced to choose, I would go with LANManager. In my opinion, its superior connectivity and support by major vendors make it a better bet for the long term. Most important, if developers choose to support LAN Manager (and I think they will), future serverbased software will require it.

Should ZIP replace ARC as your electronic bulletin board's file-compression utility of choice? I think not, and here's why.

There are many good programs that compress and uncompress files so BBS users can save time and phone charges when downloading software, but *ARC* from System Enhancement Associates (SEA) has become the de facto standard.

The controversy over BBS compression programs arose when developer Phil Katz distributed a competing program called *PKARC*. SEA sued Katz and succeeded in getting him to take *PKARC* off the market and stop marketing programs with "ARC" in the name.

Now Katz has developed a compression program called ZIP, and some BBS system operators are starting to use it. ZIP's compression ratio is admittedly slightly better than ARC's-by 5 to 10 percent—and the program is faster than ARC. The problem is, it's inefficient to maintain files on a bulletin board in more than one format. Before this controversy, users needed only ARC to access the whole world of BBS software. Now they must keep track of at least two compression programs and

formats—a real problem for novices.

Bulletin boards are accessed by users of many machines and operating systems: ARC is available for CP/M, DOS, UNIX, XENIX, Atari ST, Tandy, Commodore, Amiga, Apple, VAX VMS, and many other popular operating systems. ZIP is available for DOS; I know of no other implementations. Score: ARC 1, ZIP 0.

For those wishing to implement the program on yet another system, the *ARC* source code is available free; the source code for *ZIP* is not. Score: *ARC* 2, *ZIP* 0.

ARC is reliable. It's had several years of extensive use, whereas ZIP is new, and bugs are bound to remain. Since this is not unreasonable for new code, I won't count it against the program. But it should be of concern to heavy users of ZIP.

As I mentioned, *ZIP* does produce smaller files than *ARC*. But a user of several bulletin board systems would need copies of both programs, and together they would probably take up more space than the savings from using *ZIP*. To be fair, though, this one goes to *ZIP*. Score: *ARC* 2, *ZIP* 1.



ARC's backward compatibility is proven, while ZIP is compatible only with itself. Since the program is new, a user must consider any claims about future backward compatibility to PKARC and PKXARC as just that—claims. Score: ARC 3, ZIP 1.

Moreover, I find *ARC* more user-friendly than *ZIP*. I feel comfortable with *ARC*, uneasy with *ZIP*. Perhaps this is unfair, but at least it's honest. Score: *ARC* 4, *ZIP* 1.


Finally, I see *ARC* as the IBM of compression programs: It will be around for a long time and support will be available. New programs, such as *ZIP*, will continue to be introduced, and each will do something slightly better than *ARC* does. But *ARC* will also continue to improve and will ultimately remain the de facto standard.

It may not be the hottest thing since sliced bread, but *ARC* endures, and I've got good reasons to stick with it. ●
