



Fortunately for her long-term employment prospects, the *CW* mailbox sees a steady stream of horror stories, lamentations, cautionary tales, and—once in a while—words of praise about computer vendors.

The questions Furger selects for her column make it one of *PC World*'s most popular features, but there's much, much more to *Consumer Watch*. For every letter you read in these pages, our *CW* staff researches and resolves dozens. "Consumer Watch gives individual readers some clout," Furger explains. "When we get involved, there's a much better

chance they'll be heard. And the column benefits even people who don't take the time to write. One letter means more people have probably experienced the same problem. If we get five letters with the same complaint, that means a *lot* of people are having difficulties with a company."

Furger and her crew also beat the drum to convince companies to fix policies that take advantage of consumers. "For example," she asks, "if you order a product by mail and pay with a credit card, when do you get charged? If your card gets debited before the product is shipped, it may be legal, but it's not fair."

Does the torrent of complaints suggest that there's an ethics gap among hardware and software vendors? "Thankfully," Furger says, "there aren't that many out-and-out crooks. In most cases, problems arise because companies have grown so fast that customers just get lost in the shuffle. Our job is to keep steady pressure on the industry—to remind them that it's in their best interests to serve the buyer."

Most vendors are smart enough to resolve disputes quickly and fairly. But every so often things go awry. We hope it never happens to you, but if it does, go ahead and get mad—then drop us a line.

Novell Sells Name Service

Multiserver LAN Facility Fixes Major Strategic Shortcoming on NetWare Servers Novell has announced a global name service for NetWare 286 and 386 servers that will simplify both LAN administration and user access to multiple servers' facilities. Billed as only one step toward a full hierarchical naming service, the \$1995 NetWare Name Service (NNS) still greatly simplifies the procedure for addressing workstations or printers in a multiserver environment. It lets a LAN administrator create a domain of up to 400 servers and 5000 users, identifying printers, gateways, and other services so that users can call upon them by name rather than by searching across servers. In the event of a change, the administrator can use NNS's NETCON utility to

update domain and user profile scripts across all servers in a domain simultaneously. Updates can take place after hours, and NNS requires no change to network software currently installed. Vice President of Marketing Mark Calkins estimates that as many as 40 percent of Novell LANs have multiple servers, adding that this segment has great strategic importance for the company. In a similar move, Novell has updated the NetWare Print Server to give up to 8 servers access to a printer and to let users access up to 16 printers attached to DOS workstations anywhere on a net.

Memory Prices Rising?

DRAMs Are
Probably as
Cheap as
They'll Get,
So Buy Extra
Memory
Sooner Rather
Than Later

PC makers are awash in cheap dynamic random access memory (DRAM) chips right now, but some fear demand will outstrip supply this year, driving up PC memory prices or even causing shortages. While the Japanese, who dominate DRAMs, are not likely to repeat the production cutback mistake that touched off the 1988 DRAM shortage, they seem to be underestimating the potential demand of consumer electronics products, says Albert Wong, cofounder of AST Research and founder of AMKLY Systems, a new Compaq-compatible memory board supplier. If a serious shortage occurs, the Japanese will have a strong incentive to supply their large consumer electronics divisions and their own PC operations before supplying U.S. PC makers, agrees In-Stat senior analyst Mike Feibus. Larry Hootnick, president of Intel's Embedded Memory/Controller Group, also expects

growing consumer electronics demand, adding that February's 1-megabit DRAM price of around \$60 per megabyte is probably the all-time low for this cycle. The Koreans, led by Samsung, dumped so many DRAMs on the market this year that prices were halved and the Japanese stranglehold broken. But with prices so low for 1 megabit, some fear that the Japanese may shift production toward the higher-value 4-megabit DRAMs, further reducing 1-megabit supplies in the long term. Intel has expanded its DRAM remarketing efforts through a joint venture with Japan's NMB Semiconductor in order to provide Intel processor clients with a onestop chip supply, says Hootnick. Other U.S. firms also are getting back into unprofitable DRAMs, mostly for defensive reasons, adds Feibus.

PageMaker 4.0 Coming

Aldus Ships
Macintosh Version of Desktop Publisher,
a Precursor
to Windows
Offering

Aldus Corporation has introduced PageMaker 4.0 for the Macintosh, giving PC users a glimpse of what they can expect in the long-awaited Windows-version upgrade. Although Aldus won't comment on specifics of the Windows version, the company has consistently provided common features and functions across platforms and will continue that strategy, says PageMaker product manager Mike Sherwood. The Mac version's most notable feature is the Story Editor, a text window for faster word processing. Also new are a spelling checker and search-and-replace capabilities, as well as the ability to create a table of contents and a multilevel index. These last two, and a new Book feature

for linking multiple publications (or chapters), help with long documents. Aldus has enhanced network support, adding the ability to notify users of changes to a document so that they can update their copies. Support for long documents and workgroup—based creation of publications are features that compete directly with rival *Ventura Publisher*, says International Data Corporation analyst Joan-Carol Brigham, who adds that *PageMaker* still trails *Ventura* in that regard. Aldus insists there will be no word on the PC version until Microsoft announces *Windows 3.0*.

DOS Extenders Standardizing

DPMI Spec to Regulate Multitasking With Large Programs In a move that should enhance DOS applications and provide yet another pillar under the operating system, a group of leading software vendors has "agreed to agree" on a standard for DOS extenders in multitasking environments. Meeting at Intel's invitation, Lotus, Microsoft, Borland, and DOS extender vendors such as Rational Technology and Phar Lap established a committee that will draw up a DOS Protected Mode Interface (DPMI) specification to govern the interaction of large applications with each other, DOS, and OS/2. Memory-hungry applications like 1-2-3 release 3, Borland's Paradox 386, and Ashton-Tate's dBASE IV already employ the wares of Rational Technology or Phar Lap to address memory beyond DOS's

640K barrier. Their adherence to the Virtual Control Program Interface (VCPI) ensures smooth operation in a single-tasking environment. But Microsoft wants an industry standard that prevents conflicts with OS/2, Windows 3.0, and other environments that themselves insist on controlling hardware and how multiple applications access it. For the user, DPMI means that a multitasking environment can run several large DOS extender applications simultaneously by allotting processor time among them so that background applications don't need to shut down when a foreground application is running. An estimated 1 million copies of DOS extender applications are installed.

NEC Shows Laptop

386SX Machine Defines New Market Segment That Replaces Much of 286 Market Customers who might have purchased 17-pound 286-based laptops last year will probably opt for 15-pound 386SX-based models this year, predicts NEC product marketing manager J.T. McDonald. NEC hopes to capitalize on this trend with its ProSpeed 386SX. The SX laptop is similar to the year-old ProSpeed 386 but sacrifices some of the expandability and desktop convenience of its docking station—equipped sibling. Still, it is 2 pounds lighter, it offers a battery life of 3 to 4 hours (compared to the 386's 1 hour), and its \$5999 40MB version and \$6799 100MB version are \$600 and \$900 cheaper, respectively, than comparable ProSpeed 386 models. These advantages, says McDonald,

will realign the laptop market into two core segments—386SXs and notebooks. He expects products like the ProSpeed 386SX to garner that 25 percent of portables users currently served by 286-based equivalents, while only about 5 percent of buyers will opt for full 386-based models. Up to 50 percent of users will be attracted to very small notebook portables like NEC's 4.4-pound Ultra-Lite. But there is a sizable group of middle managers, accountants, software developers, and others who spend half their time on the road and need more power and storage than the notebooks provide but with less weight than full 386s, says McDonald.

IBM Debuts Workstations

Next-Generation RISC Machines and PS/2s Will Run NextStep as Option BM has unleashed a family of technical workstations and servers it claims leapfrog rival machines from Sun, Hewlett-Packard, and DEC by exploiting second-generation RISC chip technology. The new POWER (Performance Optimized With Enhanced RISC) models start with a \$12,995 offering (which IBM touts as "the world's most powerful desktop workstation") and run AIX, IBM's version of UNIX. "These are really hot products," says Amy Wohl of Wohl Associates, expressing the consensus among analysts. "There's a lot of power here, and this is an industry where speed is nearly everything." However, she points out that almost no POWER software is available now and questions IBM's estimate of 1500 third-party applications by year-end. Then, too, IBM must sort out

marketing and distribution for the engineering/scientific arena. IBM's entry into this segment in 1986 with the RT PC gained a pitiful market share, but Wohl expects the POWER machines to make IBM "an important player." Among the graphical environments available, one is based on software from the Open Software Foundation consortium and another is a version of Next, Inc.'s NextStep that IBM also plans to offer on PS/2s under AIX late this summer. Next chairman Steve Jobs says applications can be moved among all three platforms with minimal effort and hopes that IBM's blessing will speed application development. But IBM is keeping its environment options open, even hinting that the POWER machines may offer OS/2 later.



Do you remember the lookand-feel controversy of 1987? Lotus, undisputed kingpin of the spreadsheet market, flattened fledgling rivals Paperback Software and Mosaic Software with a lawsuit charging that their products VP-Planner and Twin illegally copied the screen design, menus, and commands of best-seller 1-2-3. Most observers, including a vast majority of PC World readers surveyed at the time, gave a big thumbs-down to Lotus for using the courts to stifle competition. Lotus fired back that copycat software suppressed innovation, making it less likely that users would continue to get new and better PC solutions.

Three years later, the famous suit has finally come to trial, and Lotus seems poised for an easy victory. Meanwhile, for the rest of the software community, lookand-feel has moved out of the

courtroom and back into the development lab, where the name of the game is to build the next generation of products with unprecedented similarity to one another in form and function. In fact, today the whole notion that users benefit when applications don't look and act alike seems outmoded and faintly ridiculous.

A New World of Coopera-

fion Protecting the look and feel of a software package from cheap knockoffs makes sense in a world of stand-alone applications. After all, if somebody else profits from your research and development efforts, then you might not continue to enhance your product, making it ever more complete and useful—right?

But running ever more powerful stand-alone software isn't the order of the day for most people; nor is buying single-vendor solutions. Instead, the real bang in PC productivity comes from tapping the computer's talents as a powerful communications device. Word processing, spreadsheet, data base, graphics, and LAN E-mail programs-they're all needed to help people analyze and transmit vital business information, and no vendor has the single best tool in all these categories. Still, users must be able to move information easily from

one program to the next. They can't afford the time it takes to learn new applications from scratch or to resolve incompatibilities between programs. And in word processing, Lotus struck the most potent deal of all-a technology-sharing agreement designed to ensure that 1-2-3/G and all other Lotus products built for OS/2's Presentation Manager will work intimately with WordPerfect for PM. (continues)



Microsoft hasn't been asleep in this arena, either. Even while it argues with Apple over ownership of the Macintosh/Windows interface, Microsoft is hard at work with Apple on a common font format that will let users view and print the same document in a consistent way, whether from within a Windows, a PM, or a Mac program. More important, Microsoft is working with leading Windows vendors to establish Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) as a standard protocol to let Windows and PM applications trade information seamlessly. In some cases it will genuinely be hard to tell where one application begins and the other ends, as with Excel and the data base add-in Q + E.

The Law of Open Standards

Legal maneuvers have a way of distracting people from the most pressing matters. In the case of software look-and-feel, the law is pushing the industry in precisely the wrong direction, a point that look-and-feel holdouts like Ashton-Tate should consider. While A-T presses rivals like Fox for control of the dBASE standard, will technology lead users to look elsewhere for an *open* data base standard that ensures all brands of software can work together?

Off to a HeadStart?

I am puzzled by your coverage of the HeadStart III. After you selected this system as a Best Buy in June 1989 [The Hardware Shelf]. November's Consumer Watch stated that none of the software bundled with the system works on any other system. In December 1989's roundup ("12-MHz ATs: Home-Office Alternatives"), John Diebold spoke very highly of this computer, rating it "second best" in the roundup and "almost good enough for a Best Buy." He doesn't mention the software incompatibility. Whose advice should I follow?

Why does a Best Buy from June fall short of the mark in December? PC World's Best Buy is awarded only to the products that represent outstanding value in a category. Not every review has one. When the overall standard of products in a given market rises and prices drop—as was the case with 12-MHz ATs—Best Buys aren't automatically awarded to former recipients.

HeadStart bundles Framework and other programs as a value-added bonus to their customers. This software is licensed for use on one system only and is modified to work only with the HeadStart system. Files produced by the bundled software are compatible with regular versions of the programs. —Ed.

Crossing the Channel

The January 1990 review of MCA compatibles, "Micro Channel Clones Flunk the Test," was a departure from the normal good journalism in *PC World*. You chose to define Micro Channel compatibility not according to standards set by IBM and upheld by MCA vendors, but by the ability to run the entire spectrum of peripherals that work on IBM systems.

Even among IBM products, not every peripheral will run in every combination with every system. Of the dozens of products you tested, only four showed any problems—and that's a better rate than the AT standard achieved. The fact that some boards work more smoothly on IBM machines than on compatibles implies that the boards' designers tested them only on IBM machines.

Your most serious accusation is that American Mitac's MPS 2386 system could not function as a file server with Token-Ring and Arcnet PC 100MCA boards. In our own labs and at customer sites, there has never been a single problem with these products.

I am disappointed by your January MCA roundup. Worse, I'm confused by the change in review standards from your April 1989 review of the Tandy 5000MC.

[In January] you found Grid and Tandy machines incompatible with a Hayes 2400P internal modem. We have verified our design with an external Hayes version. It also works with IBM's modem—who are we measuring compatibility with?

Our engineers have run our design with both the IBM Token-Ring and SMCA Arcnet cards named. Did your reviewers contact anyone here about the alleged problem? I find no evidence of it.

In April you said "Tandy's drive options are much more flexible than IBM's." We achieved that flexibility by using an *industry*-standard rather than MCA-standard connector. How come a noteworthy plus in April is a noteworthy minus in January?

Proprietary memory slots until now have never been considered incompatible. In your April review, you tested a 32-bit IBM memory card, reporting that it "ran as well with the 5000MC as with the Model 80 we stole [it] from." Now, there's a memory incompatibility?

[In January] it appears a good rating could only be earned by a "clone," and that value-added designs are being discouraged. Is this really PC World's intention?

If there are compatibility problems with a system, we want users to find out about them when they read our review, not after they buy the machine. Our view on compatibility is quite simple: If a system is advertised as MCA compatible, it should work properly with MCA peripherals. We do change our compatibility test suites as new peripherals become available.



IBM PS/2 Model 70 and Model 55SX (and in the NCR), but it would not configure ports or interrupts correctly on the Tandy, the Grid, or the American Mitac; there were also errors during the power-on self test. A user who bought a Hayes 2400P expecting it to work in one of those PCs would run into the same problems.

We're glad to hear that Tandy and Mitac were able to make their respective systems work as file servers—but using the installation software provided, NSTL technicians were not. (They had no problems with an IBM PS/2 Model 70.) Again, end users would encounter difficulties. We stand behind the article's conclusion: These systems lack a level of MCA compatibility sufficient to justify recommendation.

Mr. Juge is correct about the wisdom of choosing industry-standard connectors. In our attempt to warn users that they would be unable to install peripherals using a PS/2-style floppy drive connector, we should have explained that they would certainly be able to use AT-style peripherals (which are both abundant and cheaper) without any loss of functionality. We regret the omission.

We know that both Tandy and American Mitac have worked hard to make their systems good values; we hope our tests will help them deliver on that promise by pointing out some problem areas. —Michael Goodwin and Karl Koessel

Power Tip No. 73 (November 1989, page 212) omitted a critical element. The DOS command DIR *. lists subdirectories and files without extensions.





Determine how many bad sectors to tolerate, ensure secure backups, find out how upgrading DOS affects data, convert program disks to 3½-inch format, and build up your LaserJet font library.

Managing Life's Imperfections

Q. DOS's CHKDSK [check disk] command tells me how much storage space is on my hard disk. It reports how much is used—by hidden files, directories, and user files—and how much is unused and available. It also reveals how much is lost to bad sectors.

I understand that formatting divides each hard disk track into 512-byte segments and that an imperfection along a track—no matter how small—renders the entire sector containing the defect unusable. But I wonder just how many bad sectors are acceptable on a hard disk?

A. If you pay \$600 for a 20MB hard drive that has 20 bad sectors, you're being cheated out of almost 30 cents, or what amounts to less than ½0 of 1 percent of your total storage space. Obviously, neither money nor storage is the issue. However, the number of bad sectors is indicative of the quality of the

disk's media and, by extrapolation, its manufacturing.


I would say that a disk that has an average of more than two bad sectors per megabyte is unacceptable. A hard disk with hundreds of bad sectors might live a full and trouble-free life. Statistically, however, disks with more bad sectors are more likely to develop problems.

Not all defects lie within a sector's track (see FIGURE 1, adapted from literature included with Gibson Research's SpinRite hard disk utility)—some are be-(continues)

tween tracks. As the drive heads move back and forth over the disk, they may be jarred slightly out of place, resulting in "drifting" tracks. If a good sector drifts across a defect, it loses its data. It seems to follow that the more bad sectors a disk has, the more defects there are between tracks waiting to cause trouble.

By the way, CHKDSK never sees the bad sectors of modern SCSI drives. The drive handles bad sectors itself, so CHKDSK thinks there aren't any (though the total size it reports will shrink as bad sectors are "masked" out).

Bulletproof Backup

Q. I recently purchased a program called CheckFree to handle all my banking transactions electronically. I realize that backing up my data after each session is essential, since a loss would leave me in the dark about my checking account. However, I'm a new user and not sure of the best way to go.

All I really need to back up are data files that have changed since the last backup. Should I use DOS's BACKUP command, or would you recommend another program?

A. CheckFree data files have a DMS extension. You should also preserve your user ID file, CPB.UID. If CPB.UID and your data files are each smaller than your largest floppy drive, you can simply copy them to floppy disks. Then use DOS's COMP command to verify the copies.

If COMP reports a mismatch, repeat the process.

If the files are larger than your largest floppy drive, you must use a backup program. DOS's BACKUP command is certainly sufficient to do the job. Let's assume your CheckFree files are in the directory C:\CF. First, use the command BACK-UP C:\CF\CPB.UID A:. Then issue BACKUP C:\CF*.DMS A: /A. The /A switch, for add, specifies that this backup should add its new files to those already on the backup disk (so you don't lose the backup of CPB. UID). Don't use BACKUP's /M switch, which causes BACKUP to ignore files that haven't changed since the last backup-you want to back up all your data files.

Other backup programs can be faster and easier to use than BACKUP (see "Fast Floppy Backup," January 1989, and the item on SitBack in Product Outlook, February 1989). Often, they let you save a list of the files to be backed up, enabling you to back up the CPB. UID and DMS files using a single command.

CheckFree 2.0 includes a proprietary backup routine (found on the File Utilities menu) that backs up the essential files (those with DAT, IDX, and UID extensions), prompting you for new disks as needed. The upgrade to the new version is free to all registered CheckFree users.

In any case, I must warn you that most backup programs have one major flaw—they will fail to fully restore your data if one backup disk is damaged. Since you cannot afford to lose your data, you must ensure that you can accurately restore your entire backup. Here's one way to verify your backup: Create a temporary subdirectory and

copy CPB.UID and the data files into it. After verifying the copies using COMP, back up the *Check-Free* directory's ID and data files. Then, restore the *Check-Free* files and use COMP to compare the restored files with those in the temporary directory.

Data Unaffected by DOS Upgrade

Q. I use DOS 2.1 with my hard-disk-equipped PC clone to run a spreadsheet, a word processor, and various other software. All the data files were created under DOS 2.1.

Several programs that I've read about require DOS 3.0 or a later version. Would installing DOS 3.x affect data that was saved under DOS 2.1? Will I be able to access and edit that data once I change to DOS 3.x? What other changes, if any, would I have to make?

A. DOS versions are upwardly compatible—that is, each DOS version can read and write all the formats that previous versions can. You'll have no difficulty accessing, reading, or editing your data. You will, however, have problems installing DOS 3.x or a later version on your hard disk.

When a disk is formatted to be bootable, two hidden system files are placed at the beginning of the disk. Those two files must be the first files in the directory, and one (containing the default system device drivers) must occupy contiguous sectors for the disk to boot. Upgrading from (continues)





DOS 2.0 to 2.1 was fairly easy, since you could use the SYS command to simply overwrite DOS 2.0's original system files with DOS 2.1's.

Unfortunately, you can't do the same when upgrading from DOS 2.x to DOS 3.x because the new version's system files are larger. To make room for DOS 3.x's system files, you must back up your data files and reformat the disk using the DOS 3.x command FORMAT C:/S/V. Then restore all but the system and DOS command files. Finally, copy the new DOS's command files to the hard disk's DOS directory and verify the copies using COMP.

Converting Program Disks

Q. I've purchased an IBM PS/2 Model 70 to replace my XT. How do I transfer my programs, while preserving their installation routines, from 5½-inch 360K disks onto the 3½-inch 1.44MB floppies that my PS/2 uses? I'd like to take advantage of the 3½-inch disks' larger capacity and leave my XT days

Can I just copy the files, or is a more sophisticated procedure necessary?

A. Assuming that you have a relatively small collection of software, your simplest solution might be to contact the manufacturers. 





the programs, many of which may now have VGA support in their installation routines.

But there's no reason you can't make 31/2-inch copies of the versions you have now-unless, of course, they're copy protected. Those that you install by simply copying files to a directory pose no special problems, as long as you have both sizes of drives. Using an external 51/4inch floppy drive or a file transfer program with a link between your XT and your PS/2, you can simply copy the files onto 1.44MB disks, packing as much as four 360K disks' worth of files onto a single 1.44MB disk.

However, programs with installation routines that check for a volume label on each disk are a bit more complicated to transfer. (This type of program prompts

you for specific disks during installation.) In this case you won't be able to reduce the number of disks. And in addition to copying the files, you have to give each disk its proper volume label, which requires DOS 3.0 or a later version.

Unless you have software on high-density disks, you'll never copy more than 360K to each 31/2-inch disk. Save some money by using 720K disks instead of 1.44MB ones. For each 51/4-inch program disk, use the command LABEL A: to learn that disk's volume label. Then put an identical label on a 31/2-inch disk by using the command FORMAT A: /N:9 /T:80 /V (or FORMAT A: /F:720 /V for DOS 4.x) or by using LABEL A: if the disk is already formatted. Finally, copy the files and verify them using COMP.



the right mix of fonts can minimize the disk space needed to store fonts, reduce the time spent downloading, and conserve the use of printer memory. Today's font cartridges hold 2 to 25 times as many fonts as the originals, although higher-density ROM chips render many of the cartridges incompatible with pre-Series II LaserJets. HP's ProCollection cartridge, for example, contains 65 fonts in various point sizes from 3.6 to 14. (HP has consolidated the rest of its cartridge fonts into nine new cartridges, but unfortunately they won't work in early models like yours.)

Another option is Pacific Data Product's 25 Cartridges in One, which packs 172 fonts, in point sizes from 3.6 to 18, into one cartridge. The company also offers Headlines in a Cartridge, which contains 18 Helvetica and Times Roman fonts in 14, 18, 24, 30, 36, and 48 points (though the original LaserJet, the Plus, and your 500 Plus cannot print 36- or 48-point characters or a few 30-point characters). Cartridges with large fonts allow you to free up quite a bit of disk space.

Also take a look at the Everex cartridges. The company's A-to-Z HP-Compatible Multifont Cartridge has 231 fonts (including line-drawing and bar-coding symbols) from 6 to 18 points.

The less-ambitious All-In-One Cartridge contains 114 fonts from 3.3 to 14 points.

Soft font technology has also matured. You can now buy a combination font-generator/fontmanagement program, as well as separately sold typeface packages from which you generate screen and downloadable printer fonts for use with most major word processors, desktop publishing programs, Windows, and some other programs. Font generator programs also allow you to create reduced symbol sets (a subset of a font's characters) to minimize the use of printer memory, which is especially important when using large fonts. The programs' management functions ease selecting and downloading generated fonts.

HP's Type Director generates "matching" printer and screen fonts from any of the company's 27 Scalable Typeface or 5 Scalable Typeface Collections packages. The fonts may be any size from 4 to 200 points in ½-point increments. Type Director is also bundled into HP's Premier Collection, which includes 12 faces.

Using the installation module of Bitstream's Fontware 3.0 Starter Kit with any of that company's 52 Fontware Typeface Packages or 6 Fontware Typeface Collections, you can create fonts from 2 to 144 points in 1/40-point increments. Starter Kits, which include a couple of typefaces, are also available directly from application vendors and often at a discount.





Advice and information for the computer consumer

Shopping around for a dealer who can satisfy your networking needs both before and after the sale? Do a little detective work first, and you and your dealer can have a long and happy life together.

Getting What You Pay For

Time was when dealers eagerly bundled support and service with the sale of PC hardware. They were willing to throw in extras and take a cut in profits if it meant the difference between making a sale and seeing it go to the competition down the street. Not any longer.

Dealers are still eager to make the sale, but service and support have been "unbundled"; they're bought and paid for by the consumer. In theory, the result should be better service, but this isn't always the case. Dealers and vendors alike acknowledge that low profit margins on PC products often result in deficient support and service.

The gap between the support users expect and what they get can prove costly in any situation, but in the area of networking, where smooth operation of all components is crucial, quick and expert assistance becomes even more vital. The key, then, is to investigate the resources and expertise available from individual dealers (see TABLE 1). Shopping around for the right dealer isn't a luxury; it's a necessity.

Rating the Dealers

Until recently, vendors have been leery about recommending one dealer over another. Increasingly, however, they are willing to help ensure a good fit between a buyer's needs and a dealer's capabilities. Even if vendors will only provide the names of area dealers without offering any qualitative distinctions, a few questions can elicit valuable information.

It's not unusual for vendors to rate dealers on their so-called level of commitment to that company's products. Be aware, however, that this "commitment" can reflect anything from the quantity of merchandise sold, to the dealer's investment in hiring and training systems engineers. So just finding out a dealer's rating isn't enough; ask a company representative what a dealer must do to earn that distinction. (continues)

TABLE 1

Getting the Lowdown on Dealers

RATE YOUR SATISFACTION: Spreadsheet Software

Lotus's 1-2-3 continues to dominate the spreadsheet market, with an installed base more than 20 times larger than that of its nearest competitor, according to this survey of 200 large organizations. Competing products fare better, however, in both user satisfaction and purchasing plans. Microsoft Excel's graphical interface and high-quality graphics give it the highest rating in user satisfaction. Borland's Quattro, with one of the smallest installed bases, rates second in user satisfaction and a close third in future buying plans.

Novell, for example, has two levels of authorization. The baseline requirement is that the dealer simply attend training courses and stock demonstration equipment. A second level, called gold authorization, indicates that the dealer has completed additional training and, according to James C. Bills, executive vice president of sales at Novell, is capable of handling more complex networking solutions. Novell rewards gold-level dealers with more direct support, which in turn means better service for the customer when it comes to getting tricky or complicated problems resolved posthaste.

Obviously, these distinctions are useful only if you have access to the information, and Novell is committed, says Bills, "to making sure users know which dealers qualify at the different levels." The information is available through any of Novell's 23 field offices around the United States (for information about the office nearest you, call 800/526-5463).

Competitor 3Com divides its authorized dealers into two categories: Authorized Service Centers and Complete Network Centers. The latter rating denotes dealerships that have invested considerable resources in training what 3Com calls 3Wizards—systems engineers who are experts in 3Com hardware and software.

Carol Rahn, 3Com's services marketing manager, lays out the importance of the distinctions this way: "We offer support to resellers based on their commitment to 3Com. We invest in resellers who invest in service." What that boils down to is that resellers who invest in 3Wizard training receive additional and more timely support from 3Com.

PC manufacturers also claim to be investing heavily in helping dealers provide high-quality support and service. Compag, for example, recently introduced a series of classes for dealers designed to address such emerging areas as client-server computing and new network operating systems, according to Ross Cooley, vice president of sales and service for the Houston, Texas, firm. Cooley acknowledges that some of Compag's new products, such as the Systempro, will require a higher level of support and service because of the types of applications for which they will be used. "Those end users will expect their dealer of choice to be able to support higher-end. more sophisticated applications," says Cooley. Compag is not requiring separate authorization before dealers can sell the Systempro, however, so buyers will have to quiz dealers regarding their level of expertise in dedicated PC servers.

In addition to efforts by vendors, virtually all the national dealer chains offer a variety of technical and educational resources to individual dealers. Consumers can also often get help from the corporate staff of a national dealer chain when shopping around for a local dealer, since the chains are very familiar with the capabilities and resources of individual locations.

At ComputerLand, for example, franchise stores receive one of three ratings regarding networking, ranging from the most basic authorization to what ComputerLand calls its Network Centers of Excellence. To qualify as a Network Center of Excellence, a store must have at least (continues)

five networking specialists and a demonstrated ability to support networking solutions, from design to implementation to support, according to Bill Waas, vice president of service for ComputerLand.

Besides providing information on local dealers, national staff can clarify the corporate commitment to support and service. When you're selecting a dealer, determining the level of expertise available at the national level can mean the difference between resolving a problem quickly and having it drag on for weeks or months.

Whether installing a network for the first time or moving into the brave new world of clientserver computing, users are coming to rely more and more on dealers for assistance, before and after the sale. Some homework up front will go a long way toward ensuring that help will be available when you need it.

SHOP TALK

Wells American Closes Its Doors

PC manufacturer Wells American Corporation has discontinued operations. Repeated calls to the Columbia, South Carolina, company have gone unanswered, but a recorded message says that manufacturing operations have been "drastically curtailed" and refers customers to Compuscience Incorporated of Lexington, South Carolina, for maintenance and repair services. Compuscience can be reached at 803/796-5760.

The South Carolina attorney general's office has received "several complaints" concerning Wells American and is reviewing them to determine if the office will take on the case, according to spokesperson Mark Dillard. Anyone with information that might assist the attorney general's office in its investigation should write to Consumer Fraud Section, Office of the South Carolina Attorney General, P.O. Box 11549, Columbia, South Carolina 29211.

Warranty Starts With Invoice

I purchased a Compaq Deskpro 386S Model 40 from RP Systems of Oak Brook, Illinois, last year. Recently the monitor began to smoke and sizzle. One year from the shipping date had barely passed, but I felt it should be under warranty if I had had actual possession for less than one year.

I called Compaq to learn that RP Systems was an unauthorized dealer and therefore the responsibility to support any warranty lay with them. RP Systems' policy, however, was that the warranty period began when the invoice was issued. What I thought was a gray area was black-and-white to them, and they would not provide even partial compensation for the broken monitor.

But the story has a happy ending. When Compaq learned of the vendor's uncooperative stance, they reviewed my complaint and replaced my monitor at no charge. I can't say enough about Compaq's handling of the matter. Shame on you, RP Systems.

Editor's note: Kudos to Compaq for coming through and providing Mr. Sarno with a replacement monitor. Mr. Sarno's experience, however, illustrates the need to fully investigate all warranties, whether offered by the manufacturer or a reseller. It also points out the value of checking with a manufacturer to ensure that the reseller is an authorized dealer who will have the full backing of the product manufacturer.

More Warranty Woes

Consumer Watch also received a letter from a disgruntled buyer who bought a SmarTeam 2400HC modem and expected its generous two-year warranty to cover parts and labor. When the modem needed to be repaired, however, he discovered the warranty covered only parts; the \$30 labor cost was his responsibility. Limited warranties such as this are not uncommon, but scrutinizing warranties before purchasing a product can help you avoid hidden costs.

Great Monitor, Lackluster Service

I purchased a Zenith ZCM-1490-Z flat tension monitor, primarily because of the rave review it received in your magazine ["VGA Monitors—Cheap and Smart," December 1988] as well as in others. The reviews were accurate: It "puts out the best VGA image money can buy," but not for long. About six months after I got the monitor, the blue color quit, and the screen started to go alternately bright and dim.

I contacted Zenith, and they gave me the address of the closest Zenith Service Center—about 100 miles away. The staff there said repairs would take two weeks—a long time to be without a monitor. (The center doesn't provide loaners.)

Well, 47 days later my monitor still wasn't fixed. The repair cen-(continues)



Zenith responds: On September 19, 1989, our customer service department received a letter from Mr. Pasquale, which was assigned to one of our customer service representatives. The Heath/Zenith dealer informed her they were waiting for a part. The part was expedited and shipped to the service center from our factory in St. Joseph, Michigan. Fast Range Selection With Excel

Here's a quick way to specify a lengthy range when entering a Microsoft Excel range formula, assuming that all cells in the range contain data and that the cell just below the range is empty. Type in the formula, up to and including the open parenthesis, and then highlight the first value in the range. Now, instead of pressing the colon key and paging down to the last value, which takes a lot of time, simply press <Ctrl>-<Shift>-<Cursor Down>. Excel selects the entire range automatically; you only need to close the parenthesis to complete the formula, You can also use this technique to specify a range from the bottom up by highlighting the last value in the range and pressing < Ctrl>-< Shift>-<Cursor Up>.



Electronic Filing Goes Nationwide

Personal Tax Software a High-Stakes Game

MECA's TaxCut Aims to Topple Veteran Leader TurboTax





Like other vendors of tax preparation software, ChipSoft's Mike Chipman (left) and MECA's Dan Schley stress the ways their packages can help users with questions about tax returns.

hipSoft's TurboTax has ruled the world of tax preparation software since it debuted in 1984. Although solid figures are unavailable, even competitors agree that the San Diego firm holds more than a 50 percent share of market.

But TurboTax faces stiff competition this tax season from TaxCut, the latest release from personal finance guru Andrew Tobias (of Managing Your Money fame). TaxCut, a merger of Ask Dan About Your Taxes and PC/TaxCut, has been heavily promoted by codeveloper MECA Ventures in Westport, Connecticut; an arrangement has been made with IBM to bundle the program with low-end PS/2 systems through mid-March.

ChipSoft president

Mike Chipman downplays this marketing blitz, saying that every year one of his competitors tries that approach. "This year it's MECA, last year it was J. K. Lasser," he says.

But observers say Tax-Cut may give TurboTax a run for its money. "The Andrew Tobias name is a big plus for TaxCut," says Mason Rutledge. spokesperson for Egghead Discount Software in Issaquah, Washington. Although the chain carries both packages, he says Egghead staff will probably recommend TaxCut.

Unlike full-blown professional tax software, personal tax packages range from \$70 to \$100. These packages compete over how quickly each incorporates new tax legislation, the number of state returns supported (for an additional price), and the variety of forms and schedules. While these issues remain important, the current crop of packages raises the stakes-particularly by helping users with their tax questions.

TaxCut boasts a builtin expert system based on help from tax attorney Dan Caine. Both Turbo-Tax and Swiftax from Timeworks in Deerfield, Illinois, include a copy of The Price Waterhouse Personal Tax Adviser. J. K. Lasser's Your Income Tax comes with its own tax guide. Softview of Oxnard, California, even hires tax experts to answer calls from users of its MacInTax for Windows.

Links to personal finance packages, which let users easily transfer their day-to-day data, have become a major selling point. Many packages will import files from popular personal finance programs, but TaxCut goes a step further by directly connecting to MECA's best-selling Managing Your Money.

Since 1989 is the first tax year for which individual users throughout the United States can file electronically (using an authorized service), developers rushed to incorporate that capability. Electronic filing costs about \$30 and is available only if you're owed a refund; the promise of receiving a refund in about two weeks is boosting interest in tax packages. "For the first time, the retail channel seems to be pushing tax software," says Softview president Kathy Lane.

As sales increase, Chip-Soft may have to change its strategy. "We haven't given much attention to marketing," says Chipman. "I'm not sure we're going to be able to continue doing that." But he remains confident of his package's position. With over 160,000 copies sold, TurboTax is more mature than competitors and "gives people a sense of confidence," he says. In early returns, TurboTax held its own, becoming in January the first tax program to hit Softsel's Hot. List. -Roberta Furger

Post-VGA Graphics Emerge

But Can Market Support Two 1024 by 768 Display Standards?

A s graphical environ-ments become popular, broad ranks of users will want better-than-VGA displays, and "a 1024-by-768-pixel display with a graphics coprocessor will be the next standard," says Joan-Carol Brigham, director of International Data Corporation's (IDC's) graphics research. A blizzard of products will appear this spring, with some adapters priced below \$600 on the street and some monitors \$700 or below. Everything appears readyexcept a single standard to rally behind.

IBM began offering such displays in 1987, but its 8514/A adapter and accompanying monitor cost almost \$3000 and sold poorly, and developers bypassed the board's recommended software interface. Last April, Texas Instruments (TI) announced an alternate software environment for its

34010 graphics processor, backed by Compaq and many board vendors. Soon after, another major group of suppliers agreed upon a specification for 8514/A-compatible boards.

Both TI and 8514/A camps now are releasing products aggressively targeted at the mainstream. Low stickers partly reflect dropping memory costs. (On a 512K board that shows 16 colors, memory makes up one-third to one-half of the manufacturing cost.) They also reflect progress in silicon manufacturing and what Brigham calls "a premature price war."

On the monitor front, IBM chose an interlaced display (which first draws every other line down the screen, then returns and fills in the others). This approach is cheaper than noninterlaced, and it shows. Other adapters support noninterlaced monitors as well, and both varieties are arriving in

force. Noninterlaced 14-inch displays sell for as little as \$500; at the other extreme lie products like NEC Home Electronics' 20-inch, \$3699 MultiSync 5d. Observers expect 16-inch models to be the most common. Because monitor technology has matured, price drops will be gradual, so the total bill will substantially exceed VGA costs for several years.

IDC sees good growth for both TI and 8514/A adapters, but "I'm not convinced there will be a dual standard," says Scott Huckaby, acting marketing manager for TI's 340 graphics coprocessors in Dallas. He expects TI to get an edge from \$1000 boards built around the new 34020 chip (scheduled for March), which will be three times more powerful. But while suppliers debate benchmarks, other factors remain just as crucial.


In particular, what's IBM's next move? The 8514/A chip set can move up to 1280 by 1024 resolution, but when IBM introduced such an adapter last year, it was aimed at

niche jobs and given minimal publicity. "IBM's next step just might make the clones scurry around for the next two years," comments Andy Fischer, vice president for product management at Hercules in Berkeley, California.

IBM solved the standards problem for VGA by putting it on the motherboard, but making that scheme cost-effective for the 8514/A is hard—partly because the design assumes separate VGA hardware that can't share memory.

The big risks for customers lie in software support and compatibility. Each camp claims support from all major environments and applications, but developers receive wildly conflicting advice about how to tailor their software, and top performance still requires customization for specific hardware. The 8514/A group includes "at least five chip set clones, all reverse-engineered in their own way," notes Brigham. She recommends trying board, monitor, and software together before buying. -E. B.

IBM, TI Go Beyond VGA



Two groups of vendors are pushing display resolutions past VGA to 1024 by 768 pixels. One camp is offering products compatible with IBM's 8514/A adapter, while the other is building products around Texas Instruments' 34010 graphics processor. International Data Corporation predicts that total sales of these high-end products should match sales of VGA boards by 1993. (These figures omit graphics hardware built into the PC itself, like VGA in IBM PS/2s.)





Service and Support Hit New Heights

Policies Reflect Flagging Sales, Complex Products



Now providing round-the-clock technical support, Lotus seeks competitive advantage from service offerings.

C customers are enjoying new options in support as vendors face slowing sales, more demanding users, and more complicated product configurations.

Most vendors expect a mere 10 percent revenue growth this year and are looking for new sources of income. Additionally, they're finding it "harder and harder to differentiate by product alone," remarks Lotus Development chairman Jim Manzi. Meanwhile, emphasis on networks and advanced applications spells increased complexity and incompatibilities in the nineties. Concerns about support, for example, led Lotus to insist on using its own direct sales force for the Notes groupware package.

IBM moved aggressively by selling large customers a 24-hour, sevenday-a-week "help desk." IBM will support not only its own PCs on this toll-free hot line, but also

hardware and software from other vendors. Customers are promised unlimited phone help on multiproduct installation and troubleshooting, and IBM will coordinate with other manufacturers as necessary. Service options vary widely, but a site with 1000 PS/2s could get 8-hour-a-day service five days a week for \$15,000 per month.

Dealers complain loudly about IBM scrapping its three-year-old dealer-only PC support policy and competing for the service business of their most lucrative accounts. But IBM's Allen Hu, director of software service, argues that IBM will service only "host-connected" setups too large for dealers to handle, thereby removing a "major inhibitor" of PC sales.


Three years ago, Ashton-Tate declared righteously that it was high time users paid for support. Today, the company has broadened its free support policy from 90 days to a lifetime of toll-call support per customer. "We were endeavoring to have customers understand and share in the cost of support," explains Chairman Ed Esber, Jr., "but it's clear that in this marketplace, the standard is free support."

Still, the company isn't overlooking those willing to pay for enhanced service. Ashton-Tate tripled the price of its Assist program to \$150 a year, expanded it to 20 toll-free calls with toll-free access to its bulletin board, and lets subscribers go to the head of the phone queue. For \$295, Pro Assist subscribers also get 30 calls to a senior technician and \$116 worth of technical notes. The \$595 Corporate Assist program permits unlimited calls from

two designated contacts and includes the *Close-Up* remote-program-control utility.

John Archdeacon, Aldus's customer service director, comments that 90 days of free support is now standard, which is why Aldus doubled its former 45-day period. It, too, is bumping up prices and features of extended support. Level 1 includes unlimited toll-free phone support for \$89 per product per year, plus a 25 percent discount on major upgrades. For \$149 per year, subscribers get a 40 percent discount plus copies of drivers and in-house technical notes. The \$1000 Corporate Service plan adds training discounts and a free copy of any Aldus product. An optional "900" number lets the user pay \$15 for a call of unlimited length. But Aldus doesn't expect to make money on these services, says Archdeacon; it's happy if revenues cover costs. -Mike Hogan

Notebook PCs' Bright Future



The introduction of several small, lightweight notebook computers has sparked a new market for laptops. The shipment of products in this category, which IDC defines as laptops no larger than 8½ by 11 inches and no heavier than 7 pounds, will more than double by the end of this year. Meanwhile, demand for traditional battery-powered laptops will continue to be high, with steady growth projected through 1991.

PCs: Aging Gracefully

Hard Disk Reliability Climbing

When today's PC completes its five-year depreciation period, will there be much life left in it?

"PC technology is changing pretty quickly, but a lot of applications won't change that much," says Rich Archuleta, director of advanced system development for Hewlett-Packard's personal computer group in Sunnyvale, California. So the issue becomes reliability, and the comments are positive: "You can easily look at a PC as something that works for you for ten years," Archuleta says. "The machine itself will be useful for ten yearsno problem," agrees Dick McDermott, director of service product management at Bull HN Information Systems' Customer Services Organization in Newton, Massachusetts.

The hard disk is the component most likely to fail, notes Dan DeLucca, product manager in charge of micro product services at Sorbus in Frazer, Pennsylvania. Other culprits, in descending order, are the floppy drive, keyboard, power supply, and boards. PC designers have made steady progress on all of these in the eighties, which has been reflected in lower maintenance charges. (For instance, IBM's basic annual service costs \$500 for an AT but \$220 for a Model 50 Z.) Of course, greater dependability comes none too soon-especially in areas like network service, where any downtime is serious.

The longer that PC sits on your desk, the greater the chances that one part or another will begin to give you trouble. Hard drives are often the first component to malfunction, followed by floppy drives, keyboards, and power supplies, all of which generally suffer from abuse by users.



"You can easily look at a PC as something that works for you for ten years," says HP's Rich Archuleta.

10,000 hours of mean time between failure (MTBF). Today reliability has improved dramatically, particularly for high-end drives. "Development of hard disks has been pretty phenomenal-not just the capacity but the reliability," Archuleta says. "We're quoting 150,000 hours very conservatively" for HP's 310MB drives. With normal use. that translates into a lifetime exceeding 17 years.

With hard drives, as with other PC components, engineers have sought to reduce the number of parts. "We've designed out a lot of the mechanical components" and replaced them with digital circuitry, notes Howard Wing, marketing director of Conner Peripherals in San Jose, California. Conner, whose tiny hard disks appear in many laptops, quotes 50,000 hours MTBF on all products and insists that this figure is actually measured in practice.

Today's drives also can better withstand travel abuse. A few years back,

drives for portables were often specified to withstand 2 g's acceleration when operating and 40 g's when shut off, but they're now more than twice as robust, notes Kevin Mankin, director of product development at Zenith Data Systems in Glenview, Illinois. "We've had some interesting letters from people who've left their computer on top of a cab," Mankin says. When the cab rounds a corner and the portable falls, "the case may crack, but the system still operates."

In floppy drives, 3½-inch models are much more reliable than 5¼-inch versions, largely because the media is better guarded from the environment, Archuleta points out. Additionally, recent floppy drives include fewer moving components and a change in some of the materials.

Less Is More

them, greatly boosting reliability. (Intel now offers a chip set that allows you to build a motherboard with only four chips, plus RAM and ROM.) Memory reliability also has soared, with vendors now quoting figures 50 times higher than in the mid-eighties, says Scott Smith, IBM's system manager for PS/2 advanced systems.

A move toward surface-mounting components also helps in engineering more solid boards. And total system reliability is a fundamental goal for the new bus designs—IBM Micro Channel Architecture and the rival Extended Industry Standard Architecture.

Manufacturers now have years of experience in creating solid laptops, and service organizations say that the portable's problems have been successfully solved. Building high-density, low-powerdraw portables has created spin-offs for desktops as well. "Laptops have been a tremendous platform for CMOS chip tech-

nology," says Zenith's Mankin. Low-power CMOS circuitry keeps the temperature down inside the PC, creating more benign conditions for all components.

Standard desktop monitors seem to last indefinitely. Early laptop screens did not, but they have improved substantially. In Zenith's case, the first backlit LCD displays faded to half-intensity in 2000 hours, but today's paper-white LCDs offer 10,000 hours MTBF.

Test of Breed

Most of these innovations are prompted by vendor's brutal but sophisticated tests, whose results are fed back into product design. The major vendors put PCs through drop, shake, temperature, voltage, and humidity endurance tests far worse than the real world inflicts. "We break them in lots of different ways," HP's Archuleta says cheerfully. "It causes a lot of extra work for us, and it drives the engineers nuts once in awhile."

Automated production lines also reflect more mature manufacturing philosophy and practice.
"Testing is about 70 percent of the total effort involved in the factory operation," says Ed Juge,
Tandy's director of market planning. "If we have a breakdown in a part, that computer ceases to exist"—the computer is stripped and all the parts are retested.

Business PCs now typically come with a warranty for one year rather than 90 days, as was common a few years back. However, since failures typically occur in the first 90 days, this "is not a reliability issue at all," Juge cautions. "The extra cost to us is nil."

While vendors all talk about quality, more of them are backing up their claims. "All the big guys really understand how important manufacturing quality is," says Bull's McDermott. "That's what will sort out the market in the next five years." At IBM, quality isn't just a corporate directive, "it's tied to my paycheck," remarks Smith.


But other firms draw the line at more expensive components. While HP, for instance, mandates that surge suppression be built into its power supplies, low-cost clone vendors don't. Customers can easily spot some doubtful parts, like flimsy keyboards or shaky on/off switches. You can see the results of other engineering decisions, like the degree of silicon integration, only by taking off the cover.

As PCs last longer, will more customers swap in more powerful CPUs? Only a small percent of users do that now, and that's likely to remain the case. "Swapping out the processor is a great idea, and we're getting ready to do it in the 386 area, but the majority of the computer cost is in the board," so the economics are often not compelling, notes Juge.

For long PC life, vendors recommend that users follow documentation instructions, move desktops carefully, and regularly clean the box, keyboard, and floppy disk. If you do that, Juge jokes, "it'll last a lot longer than you want it to last."

A ny company would be proud to offer a dramatically improved version of its biggest-selling laser printer at the same price as the original—but Hewlett-Packard's Laser-Jet III is much more than a spiffed-up replacement for the Laser-Jet II. Moreover, at \$2395 it costs \$300 less.

The ubiquitous II has long been the standard laser workhorse in offices around the world. Now comes the LaserJet III, a whole new breed. It combines the best features of the LaserJet with many capabilities of PostScript printing—plus a number of brave new innovations designed to deliver striking improvements in productivity, output quality, and ease of use.

On March 1, HP essentially stopped marketing the familiar LaserJet II. The LaserJet III, available on that same date, does everything the II did and more, in a package that's only slightly larger than its predecessor. In fact, the III is so jampacked with new features, it's hard to know where to begin.

Font Fantasia

Once upon a time, laser printer buyers faced a very simple choice: Either

you bought a fast, inexpensive HP LaserJet (or compatible) with three or four fixed-size typefaces built in, or you bought a pricey PostScript printer with 35 scalable fonts—type families that your word processor or desktop publishing package could print in any size.

The LaserJet III makes this choice unnecessary. While the new printer does not use Adobe's PostScript system, it delivers equivalent capabilities-scalable outline fonts that can be printed in any size from 4-point to 999-point in 1/4-point increments. Two scalable fonts (and two fixed-pitch fonts) are built-in. In June, 108 scalable fonts will be available on various disks (\$199 each) and cartridges (\$399 each). Eventually HP will offer 300 such fonts; third-party font suppliers also will offer wares. Alternatively, vou can buy nonscalable font disks now for \$99 and cartridges for \$99 to \$199-and of course any nonscalable fonts that worked with the LaserJet II will work with the LaserJet III. For those (primarily Macintosh users) who want it, Adobe Post-Script emulation will be available for \$695 within one month of the printer's release date.

Scalable fonts are just the beginning. Until now, while straight text could be printed at full engine speed (8 ppm in the LaserJet II), complex pages involving graphics, multiple typefaces, or special effects took much longer. The LaserJet III delivers radically faster printing (up to 46 percent faster, according to HP) on complex pages, thanks to a faster processor, a better buffering algorithm, and the new PCL 5 printer control language (which includes the HP-GL/2 vector graphics language to support many existing graphics applications) in ROM.

The revamped languages provide astonishingly flexible manipulation of fonts and graphics. Text can be rotated to any angle, landscape and portrait printing can be placed on the same page, and special effects like shadowing, ruling, shading, and mirroring can be added quickly and easily—all using ROM-based routines that execute at full 8-ppm speed.

Jettison the Jaggies

Better yet, print quality—everything from the edges of letters to curved lines—is noticeably sharper and smoother, thanks to the LaserJet III's modified Canon



While the printer maintains the familiar 300dpi standard, dots are printed in 16 different sizes and can be placed anywhere within their coordinate "box," providing resolution that HP describes as roughly equivalent to 4800 dpi. Even without a magnifying glass, you'll note the enhanced output quality of characters and curved lines: no more jaggies.

Variable-size dots are achieved by a process HP calls "pulse width laser beam modulation"—that is, precisely timed laser burns. While the III is not the first printer to use variable dot size, it is the first popularly priced device to do so. HP says that knowing when to modulate is the real trick. The algorithm that uses variable dot size to solve concrete printer problems is proprietary to HP, patent pending.

HP has also capitalized on its prominence in the industry to assure broad software support for the new printer. The company has promised simultaneous releases from leading vendors in every important application category by the printer's March 1 release date. If all goes according to plan, most major word processor, desktop publishing, and presentation graphics vendors will be ready with software that exploits at least part of the III's feature set.

The printer measures 8.5 by 18 by 24.5 inches (almost exactly the same as the II) and weighs 50 pounds. It comes with 1MB of RAM as a standard complement, of which 720K can be allocated as a print buffer. That's a lot more usable RAM than the LaserJet II's 395K. You can expand RAM up to 5MB.

Looking Forward and Backward

Of course, the LaserJet III is fully backward compatible. It uses the same handy toner cartridges you've been using in your II, and it works perfectly with HP-compatible font cartridges, soft fonts, and software drivers—although you won't be able to access the new features from old software.

In June, HP will ship a Formatter kit that upgrades the LaserJet III's it has the LaserJet III's PCL 5 and resolution enhancement. The upgrade, probably best done by a dealer, will cost around \$1100.

1-2-3 Release 3—Text à la Mode

When installed for EGA or VGA, 1-2-3 release 3 runs only in graphics mode, slowing screen refresh and causing compatibility problems with TSRs. To get release 3 into text mode, reinstall it for CGA: In the INSTALL program, select Color Graphics Adapter as your first display and either Enhanced Graphics Adapter or Video Graphics Adapter as your second. (Remember to save your DCF file.) You will then be able to switch back and forth between text and graphics easily with the Worksheet Window Display command. A pair of macros can automate this task further.



LAN Manager Gets Its Second Wind

Microsoft's latest upgrade offers some impressive improvements, including a badly needed speed boost.

arly users of LAN
Manager had a lot to gripe about. They complained that the network operating system (NOS) was slow and RAM hungry and that many features were available only to OS/2 workstations. Administrators said the program was hard to install and awkward to manage. and the security conscious discovered disturbing chinks in its armor. Apparently Microsoft has been listening: LAN Manager 2.0 squarely addresses those complaints. In addition, Microsoft is making a valiant effort to beat NetWare 386 in both

features and performance.

Unfortunately, not everyone can play, because LAN Manager 2.0's hardware requirements are steep. Most of the new features require a 386 server, and while the NOS will run on a 5MB PC. you'll need at least another 4MB of cache memory for acceptable performance. That's quite a bit of RAM compared with NetWare's 2MB requirement, but as RAM prices drop, this will become less of a consideration. PC World will pit LAN Manager 2.0 against Net-Ware 386 in an upcoming issue. Meanwhile, here's a quick rundown of what LAN Manager 2.0 has to offer.

Something for Everyone

The LAN Manager upgrade bestows only a few advantages on users, but they're impressive. For one thing, both DOS and OS/2 applications should get a major speed boost, particularly on systems that are linked to 386 and 486 servers. For another, DOS workstation software will use 60K to 75K less RAM, leaving enough to run even memory-hogging applications like Ventura Publisher. Microsoft has announced that a future release of Windows will let LAN Manager users log in, send messages, and connect to network drives and printers via Windows' Control Panel. Matching software hooks in Windows and LAN Manager 2.0 may mean fancier multiuser and client-server applications as well.

Unlike NetWare 386, which provides peer-topeer printer sharing, LAN Manager won't let you share printers attached to DOS workstations. On the other hand, LAN Manager's OS/2 workstation software includes full peer-to-peer server capability that lets you make your printers, disks, and modems available to one other user. To share with more than one user at a time, you must install server software on the workstation.

Follow the Leader

Many of LAN Manager 2.0's most impressive improvements will be seen only by administrators, and most of these follow NetWare 386's lead. Installation has been sim-

users can no longer access disk data that's stored past the end of a file. (Workstations not running OS/2 can also automatically encrypt user passwords with a 1K TSR.) Even if would-be data thieves succeed in booting the server from a floppy, they will find server files inaccessible. All administrative utilities can now be run from DOS workstations, crucial if few or none of your workstations run OS/2.

But not all of *LAN Manager 2.0*'s new features are mere catch-ups. *LAN Manager 2.0* is the first NOS to let diskless workstations boot OS/2.
In addition, its unique "replication service" en-

ables supervisors to update a single master copy of an application or data base, which is then copied automatically to designated servers around the net.

LAN Manager's own user accounts data base can also be replicated. Supervisors will be able to update the master data base and replicate it for all the servers on the net, allowing users to log on even when their own server is down. But this scheme isn't as convenient for large LANs as Banyan Vines' distributed name service is, since moving a user from one LAN Manager domain (a named group of linked servers) to another still requires supervisors to delete the

user's old account and create a new one manually.

Microsoft May Sell Directly

The rumor persists that Microsoft plans to sell LAN Manager 2.0 directly to end users. This strategy would be a major departure, since the company has never sold any operating system software under its own label. Adding credibility to the rumor is the fact that 3Com is downplaying its role as the largest LAN Manager reseller and increasing its Novell support.

Versions of *LAN Manager 2.0* from DCA, Ungermann-Bass, Olivetti,

NCR, Okidata, and Apricot are expected to ship in the first half of 1990. Since 3Com, Compaq, and Torus need additional time to add in special features, they aren't likely to ship products until the third quarter. IBM plans to ship its *LAN Server 1.2*, which will include some (but not all) of *LAN Manager 2.0*'s features, on March 30.

This upgrade seems sure to please *LAN Manager* users. If Microsoft delivers on its performance promises, *LAN Manager 2.0* should also prove a sound alternative to NetWare. ●



R:base Loosens Up

Easy querying and pulldown menus bring R:base release 3.0 face-to-face with Paradox.

With R:base 3.0, developers get a greatly expanded set of tools for **building** data entry forms, including customizable pop-up windows that can be used with any field.

he graybeard of PC data managers, Microrim's R:base has always earned mixed notices. Loyal developers have long admired its speed, relational prowess, and development tools, but many casual users have balked at its commanddriven interface. Meanwhile, in the battle of nondBASE data managers. Borland's Paradox has taken the lead, thanks to its comfortable Lotusstyle menus and an easyto-use query by example (QBE). With R:base release 3.0, Microrim takes dead aim at Paradox, providing an intuitive interface and a powerful QBE. And developers can sink

their teeth into a full, ANSI Level 2-compatible Structured Query Language (SQL) command set.

The new interface will be an eye-opener for R:base stalwarts—the bare R> prompt is replaced with a series of well-organized pulldown menus, and you can select most options with a mouse or an <Alt>-key shortcut. Tellingly, the new R:base mimics Paradox's use of <F2> for "Do It" and <F6> to check off fields for QBE. Old-timers, however, can stick with the old command line or the Prompt by Example menu.

A whole new bag of tricks is available for designing data entry forms, including auto-numbering fields, a SKIP option that moves to another field if a specified condition is met, and customizable pop-up windows that can be used to display and choose data from any table. For each field, you can set up custom entry and exit routines that could, for example, branch to another field and fill in a value. You can choose a generic "quick form," a custom form, or a variable form (which is not tied to a specific table).

R:base's QBE facility is unmatched. You can select rows from any table, then sort the resulting

output or change its layout. Unlike Paradox, R:base lets you add new rows and edit the results of a single-table query. You can't edit multi-table queries, but you can save them as named views. As always, R:base's extensive set of relational tools lets you append, create, and combine tables based on common fields.

For anyone who ever struggled with R:base's old Reports Express, the upgraded, band-oriented report writer is a dream. One of the most glaring flaws of previous versions-the complete absence of printer supporthas been rectified. The new release ships with drivers for upwards of 100 printers. And refining re-



port variables is much easier; you can pluck date and time stamps, page numbers, breakpoints, and the like from menus without defining expressions.

R:base's menu-driven Applications Express has always earned high marks, and the latest release breaks little new ground. The big news for developers: Microrim has rewritten R:base's command structure to conform to SQL. Unlike with dBASE IV, the code is integral to the data base, so there's no need to pass requests through a time-consuming interpreter. The next release of R:base will extend front-end support to numerous SQL data base servers, including Microrim's own as-yet-unreleased Vanguard.


Unfortunately, with the new SQL commands, some developers may be in for tedious recoding. Microrim provides conversion utilities that will translate most applications, but the company admits that some types of custom code will need to be converted by hand. Also, users will have to contend with a larger RAM demand—520K, up from the current 460K. Other complaints: The editor is still limited to small files, and since release 3.0 is incompatible with the R:base Compiler, users will have to wait for a new version of the debugger and compiler.

Despite these thorns, $R:base\ 3.0$ looks impressive. It appears to have closed the gap on Paradox in the ease-of-use derby without losing its edge as the developer's choice.

Hayes Is First and Fast—With V.42bis High-Speed Modem

In recent years, Hayes
Microcomputer modems
have been known for dependability rather than
innovation. But the company has roared back of
late with price cutting,
aggressive marketing,
new technology, and an
uncharacteristic willingness to comply with de
facto standards.

A good example is the V-series Ultra Smartmodem 9600, which may be the fastest and most compatible modem around. Unlike previous V-series products, which shunned popular standards in favor of proprietary protocols, the \$1199 Ultra 96 incorporates MNP-5 error correction/ data compression as well as speedy V.32 modulation techniques. It will be compatible with all previous Smartmodems.

The Ultra 96 is also the first high-speed modem to add V.42bis data compression. This is no fly-by-night proprietary protocol. It has wide support, with modem vendors from Microcom to Multi-Tech planning V.42bis versions in the coming months.

Use of the V.42bis protocol should triple the Ultra 96's nominal 9600-bps throughput speed, compared to a doubling of throughput with MNP-5 alone. Hayes claims that users may be able to squeeze speeds of up to 38,400 bps out of the modem.

With the Ultra 96 on the high end, Hayes has dropped prices on other products. The V-series Smartmodem 9600 V.42, which also incorporates V.42bis and MNP-5 but lacks the Ultra 96's speedy V.32 modulation, sells for \$999. Hayes's 2400-bps V-series models cost \$649 (see "Nine MNP Modems for Corporate Communications" in this issue). Hayes Microcomputer Products Inc., P.O. Toshiba T3100SX

A Light, Bright VGA Laptop



Toshiba's new T3100SX is a battery-powered version of its T3100e, with an even brighter VGA gas plasma display that shines for 3½ hours on two rechargeable nickel-cadmium batteries at 640 by 400 resolution.

After years of producing high-end AC-powered laptops, Toshiba has come up with a variation of its popular T3100e that works wherever you work—even if you're beyond the reach of a wall plug.

Lowering incidental pixel lighting for a blacker background, Toshiba has given its new T3100SX a VGA gas plasma display that is supposed to shine brighter for 3½ hours on two removable, rechargeable nickel-cadmium batteries. Toshiba claims the

screen's 640 by 400 resolution and 100-to-1 contrast ratio make it even more readable than the display on the company's AC-powered T3100e.

The two laptops share most other features, including the same 12-by-14-by-3-inch dimensions and 15-pound weight. Like its cousin, the 80386SX-based T3100SX can go into sleep mode to save on power, and it turns off altogether after a user-

definable lull. Two expansion slots let you install modem and networking cards without having to resort to a bulky docking station. And although the slots are nonstandard, numerous sources sell modems as well as networking and other cards to fit.

For \$5999 you get 1MB of memory, a 1.44MB floppy, and a 25ms 40MB hard disk (compared to \$4299 for a T3100e with only an EGA screen). A parallel port accepts a second floppy, and two serial ports let you hook up mouse, plotter, or what have you. A port for an external VGA monitor is also included, and you can run both the gas plasma screen and an external monitor simultaneously.

Memory expands to 13MB on the system board with 4MB chips, and the generous software bundle includes DOS 4.1 with expanded memory drivers, Quarterdeck's QEMM memory manager, and utilities for disk caching, print spooling, and other jobs. ALPS LPX 2020

A Laser Printer Built to Keep Up With the Work Group

If you're lucky enough to have one of the new, low-speed personal lasers at your workstation, you may not mind the occasional trip to the coffeepot while you wait for your printer to do its thing. But if like most people you must park your laser printing jobs behind those of co-workers—well, you just can't drink that much coffee every day.

For print-happy work groups, ALPS America offers its LPX 2020, a high-speed, high-volume workhorse. Built around an LED rather than a laser, the printer achieves high throughput for both text and graphics by coupling ALPS's own 20-ppm engine with a controller powered by National Semiconductor's 15-MIPS 32GX32 processor. The unit has backed a standard 2MB of memory, upgradable in 2MB increments to 8MB.

Built for the long haul (35,000 pages per drum, 2 million pages per engine), this 300-dpi LaserJet Series II-compatible is subject to fewer interruptions than HP's entry, thanks to its ability to accommodate two 5000-page toner cartridges simultaneously. You can easily replace the \$440 drum yourself, and \$195 buys you four tubes of toner. ALPS estimates supply costs at 2.3 cents per page.

The LPX employs a flat paper path to reduce jamups, and its two 500-sheet paper trays keep both legal- and letter-size stock

flowing. Paper management options include a \$995 ten-bin sorter that collates individual or paginated sets of up to 75 pages per bin. For an additional \$495, you can get a 1000-sheet jogger that

offsets and stacks documents too big for the sorter.

An optional \$749 serial card lets you link up to eight computers or workstations to the LPX 2020. Easily installed in a drawer that also holds the controller card, the eightuser serial card has 256K of memory and will accept a 2MB daughterboard on which you can store each operator's printer default settings. An optional 20MB SCSI hard disk lets you store fonts right in the printer, essentially giving you a resident font library that doesn't need to be downloaded. The unit comes with 17 portrait and 17 landscape fonts, including Times Roman, Helvetica, and Courier.

Prices are \$7495 for the base unit, \$1395 for a PostScript emulation by Microsoft, \$895 for each 2MB memory module, and \$795 for the 20MB SCSI hard disk. ALPS America, 3553 N. First St., San Jose, CA 95134; 800/825-2577 (sales), 408/432-6000. —Glenn Grant

MegaMate 2.8, Model U4

Doubling Up on 31/2-Inch Floppies

The floppy drive has long been overlooked in the race to make the PC better and faster, but the tortoise is catching up. Highcapacity floppy drives, offering from 2.8MB to 20MB, are coming on the market. Among the first to arrive, Teac-based drives from Micro Solutions and Pacific Rim should find jobs backing up data or transferring data from a laptop to a desktop's 51/4-inch drive.

Both drives can boot PC, XT, AT, 386, and 486 ISA machines and can accept special 3½-inch barrium-ferrite floppies, which they format to a capacity of 2.8MB. Both units are also much faster than the standard 3½-inch drive: Micro Solutions' \$449 MegaMate 2.8 runs at 79ms and Pacific Rim's \$499 Model U4 at 94ms.

The drives come with their own ISA-bus controllers and will read and write standard disks that have been formatted at 720K and 1.44MB. Getting 2.8MB of storage, however, means turning to the new Extended Density disks from Toshiba, which cost \$9.95 each and are available from both Micro Solutions and Pacific Rim.

You may find that these drives are strange terrain to your favorite floppy backup program. On the other hand, Pacific Rim claims it has tested its drive and found it compatible with a few backup software programs, including Sitback, Backit, Intelligent Backup, and the utility in PC Tools.

Graphics Station Card, 8514/A Plus Combo Card

New Graphics Wave Crests—But How Smooth Is the Ride?

These days, most new video hardware is at least compatible with VGA, and plenty of 386 and 486 buyers are moving on to even finer displays. But if you want higher resolution and more colors, get ready for uncharted territory.

The Western Digital's 8514/A Plus Combo Card and Hercules' Graphics Station Card are two notable examples of a new wave of graphics boards with a maximum resolution of 1024 by 768-more than 21/2 times the VGA standard. Both bring razor-sharp images to monitors 16 inches and larger -the ideal screen size for multitasking environments where you want to see multiple applications in their entirety rather than as postage stamps.

Unfortunately, this display resolution lacks a unified standard, and software written for one product won't run on the other. The 8514/A Plus Combo Card is a clone of IBM's three-year-old 8514/A graphics board, while the Graphics Station Card uses Texas Instruments' 34010 graphics coprocessor wrapped in the Texas Instruments Graphics Adapter (TIGA) interface. To complicate life further, IBM recommends that application developers write not to the 8514/A hardware (as most developers are currently doing) but to a software standard called the Adapter Interface. Neither of these approaches has generated enough mainstream business software support to nail down a standard, and speculation runs rampant about new IBM initiatives in both hardware and software.

In the meantime, unlike many of their rivals, both the 8514/A Plus Combo Card and the Graphics Station Card maintain backward compatibility with the venerable VGA. Hercules also covers its bets by targeting a vertical market graphic arts profession-

als. With a \$1499, 2MB RAM upgrade (and at a proprietary resolution of 512 by 480), the Graphics Station can do 24-bit, continuous-tone color, which gives artists a palette of millions of colors and permits subtle shading for photo retouching, illustrations, animation, fine art, and the like. For \$3995, Hercules offers a special bundle with Lumena, a professional graphic arts package from Time Arts.

At a base price of

\$1024, the Graphics Station costs almost \$300 less than the \$1299 8514/A Plus Combo Card, and it does 256 colors at 1024 by 768 right out of the box. Western Digital's board can produce only 16 colors at that resolution, unless you buy a 512K daughter-board. —Eric Knorr

Microsoft BASIC Professional Development System

Not So BASIC—It's for Professionals




Not so basic these days, Microsoft's BASIC Professional Development System has been enhanced with an indexed sequential access method tool for creating relational data base applications, toolboxes for creating interfaces, and faster compilation.

To most programmers, the name BASIC Professional is an oxymoron. BASIC has a reputation as a language for hobbyists and novices—although that characterization may be more valid for the freely distributed BASICA interpreter than for

commercially sold compilers. But Microsoft is gambling that BASIC's very ubiquitousness— even among professional programmers—will breed interest for its BASIC Professional Development System.

Microsoft has enhanced the language in several ways. Among the more interesting is an indexed sequential access method (ISAM) tool for creating relational data base applications. Microsoft's ISAM has its own data engine, which can take the form of either a linkable library or a separate, royalty-free TSR. Oriented to singleuser applications, the ISAM contains no tools for network-based data bases.

Other new features include static arrays in records, local error handling, and extra DOS file-control commands. Toolboxes are included to speed the creation of user interfaces, presentation graphics, and matrix math. The code for three new libraries-numeric formatting, date/time operations, and financial functions-was taken directly from Excel and should behave just like the spreadsheet tools. (see BASIC, p. 100)

Acer's nominee for entry-level stardom aims for maximum integration in a compact 16.2-by-14.2-by-5inch footprint-about the size of an IBM PS/2 Model 55 SX. Both hard disk and floppy controllers, two serial ports, a parallel port, and VGA graphics are integrated into the motherboard, leaving four 16-bit expansion slots free. You also get a PS/2style mouse port and a keyboard socket near the front of the system, a nice ergonomic touch.

The \$2195 price in-

cludes an Acer mouse as well as a 1.2MB floppy drive, 1MB of memory, DOS 3.3, and Windows/ 386. Up to 8MB of memory can be installed on the motherboard, making the 1100/SX a realistic OS/2 option. Two harddisk alternatives-40MB and 100MB internal units. each with an average access time of less than 28ms-are available for \$600 and \$1055, respec-

As in QuickBASIC. BASIC Professional's editor partially compiles your code into pseudocode as you write it: While you program, you're working not on a text file but on the actual running program. That feature increases compilation speed considerably (according to Microsoft, up to 150,000 lines per minute on an 8-MHz AT). The editor can load and save straight ASCII files, so you can

easily go back and forth between this editor and your own favorite.

BASIC Professional runs under both DOS and OS/2, although some features are available only under DOS. It creates programs for either operating system; both the compiler and DOS programs it creates can tap expanded memory. Microsoft claims that BASIC Professional's EXE files are as small and as fast as those from any other professional language.

BASIC Professional comes with Microsoft's

CodeView debugger and a utility for building large, multiple-module applications. It lists for \$495 and is available to registered Microsoft BASIC Compiler 6.0 users for \$195. Meanwhile, AST is betting that computer shoppers will fall in love with its Completely Universal Processor, I/O Designor CUPID-architecture. Despite the frivolous acronym, AST expects you to take its upgrade option seriously. The processor and memory are located on their own board; when you outgrow the system, you can swap in a processor board with a 25- or 33-MHz 386, or even a 25-MHz 486.

The full-sized system box (19.25 by 16.5 by 6.25 inches) leaves plenty of room for expansion, with four free 16-bit slots, one 8-bit slot, and room for five half-height devices. The \$2695 base configuration includes a 16-bit AST VGA adapter, 1MB of memory, and a 31/2- or 51/4inch floppy drive. The lone hard disk option, a 28ms 40MB unit, doesn't come cheap at \$700. And with a 4MB ceiling on the motherboard (with a maximum of 16MB systemwide), the Premium 386SX/16 is a less than ideal OS/2 unit. -Ed Bott

The biggest difference is a special Turbo-Res controller card that fits in an 8-bit slot in your PC. The card packs a proprietary processor and 6MB of memory, enabling its on-board logic to control the speed at which

the laser blinks on and off and the height of individual pixels.

This technology lets the printer cram the equivalent of 1 million dots into a square inch. A 300-dpi printer would fit 90,000 into the same space, so it's easy to see why jagged lines will be smoother and halftones will look more than half right. Printing is snappy, thanks to the controller's use of its high-speed video port to send graphics calls directly to the laser without file translation.

You may have been using a laser printer to make proofs before sending them out for typesetting. Now you can fit the equivalent of a mediumgrade typesetter in that same corner of your office. You can also fit it into your budget if you have \$7495 for an AT-bus version LaserMaster 1000 or \$7995 for the Micro Channel variety. A \$995 option

or LAN file servers, a major bottleneck is the 8-MHz AT bus, which can't move data as quickly as the fastest hard disks. To get around this limitation, lots of companies are working on EISA- or MCA-bus servers. Everex Systems and Storage Dimensions take a different approach: They've sped the old AT bus up to 16.5 MHz. But for that detail, the Everex Step Server, also distributed as the Storage Dimensions FileMaster, is much like any other 33-MHz 386.

Despite the faster bus, which you would expect to be incompatible with existing boards, many popular network interface adapters will work without modification. Everex and Storage Dimensions have certified Ethernet and Arcnet boards from 3Com, Novell, Standard Microsystems, and others to work reliably with the Step Server. Storage Dimensions builds a special SCSI adapter, and Everex produces a multifunction board including Herculescompatible monochrome graphics, two parallel

ports, and two serial ports.

The systems also include one or two high-capacity SCSI drives, one 1.2MB floppy drive, a monochrome monitor, and an extended keyboard, but no Ethernet or Arcnet board. If you need additional disk space, you can daisy-chain external SCSI expansion cabinets that hold up to four full-height drives each. WORM and erasable-optical drives are also available.

The base system, which costs \$11,599, includes 150MB of disk storage, 4MB of RAM, and a 64K high-speed memory cache; the same configuration but with a 320MB drive costs \$12,999. A server with a 320MB hard disk, 8MB of RAM, and a 128K memory cache costs \$14,999; substitute a 650MB disk, and it's \$17,999. The top-of-the-line server with 16MB RAM, a 256K memory cache, and two 650MB drives costs \$28,000.

Alternatively, the DATa-Vault made by Wangtek and distributed by Tecmar can back up 1.3GB at 10MB per minute and packs up to 2.6GB of data on a 4mm tape.

Maynard's MaynStream and Tecmar's
QTOS software let you
back up by drive, subdirectory, and file, and
MaynStream offers password protection. Both require at least 2 hours to
do file-by-file or image
backups for 1.3GB of data.
Both restore at a rate of
5MB per minute for fileby-file backups and
10.9MB per minute for
image backups.

Each also lets you append new backups to the same media without overwriting previous backups, and you can create macros to back up multiple drives after-hours.

Compatible with DOS and UNIX (although untested on OS/2), the MaynStream can read and write to any cassette in DDS format. Tecmar's QTOS works with DOS and OS/2 and has optional drivers for UNIX.

The \$5000 MaynStream 1300-DAT is compatible with PCs, XTs, ATs, and 386s. Both internal and external versions come with their own controller. The \$4995 DATaVault is compatible only with ATs and 386s, and you have to pay \$500 to \$700 extra for the controller. —Susan Lusty

"New Beginning" For Mac-to-PC LAN

Business users with "mixed environment" work groups (PCs, Macs, and Sun workstations) have long had a love-hate relationship with TOPS, a low-cost network operating system (NOS) that provides easy Mac-PC-UNIX connectivity plus menu-driven file and printer sharing. TOPS's big problems have been software incompatibilities and a RAM-hungry nature that often left users scrounging for enough workstation RAM to run common business applications.

The TOPS company calls version 3.0, just out, "a new beginning"-and well it might. Version 3.0 purports to solve all the serious problems that bedeviled earlier versions. It can be loaded with full client/server functionality in only 65K of base RAM; in fact, if 80386 users install a product like Quarterdeck's QEMM memory manager, TOPS will load enough of its modules into high memory to leave a full 537K of usable workstation RAM-more than enough to run memoryhogging applications like Ventura Publisher.

TOPS's justly popular user interface is better than ever; its point-and-shoot setup menu allows users to select only those functions they need (Mac connectivity, printer sharing, and so on). Moreover, the company claims that "all known compatibility problems have been solved," including those with Foxbase.

Pricing of the TOPS 3.0 Network Bundle for DOS (with a free copy of the newly upgraded In-Box E-mail package) is surprisingly low. Current TOPS users (the company claims 600,000) can upgrade for \$125 to \$185 per site (up to 100 users). New users can get the TOPS 10-Pack (the full Bundle for 10 users) for \$995 list. Single copies of the Bundle list for \$249; street prices may be lower.

For some time, PC World has pointed out that the traditional view of peer-to-peer networking as an underpowered little brother of serverbased LANs is badly outdated. In fact, powerful, low-cost peer-to-peer LANs (which let users exchange files directly without routing them through a file server) represent the future of networking. While some high-security, transaction-oriented applications need to run on a server-based NOS like NetWare, most networking needs can be best served by a peer-to-peer LAN.

Mainframe-Strength Software Makes Sense of Statistics

\$PSS has taken two more steps to extend the reach of its enterprise-wide statistical data analysis software with new DOS and Presentation Manager versions of *SPSS/PC +*.

A PC version of SPSS's veteran mainframe software, SPSS/PC + V3.1 provides data- and file-handling routines, some 40 basic statistical functions, and full report writing and plotting. You can enhance these functions with one or more of ten optional modules.

In V3.1, SPSS adds support for Ashton-Tate's Applause II to its current support for Harvard Graphics. Network support has been expanded from IBM PC LAN 1.3 and Sun PC-NFS to include Novell, 3Com, and IBM Token-Ring offerings.

Other updates include the addition of logistical regression to the \$395 SPSS Advanced Statistics option, letting you identify relationships between a dependent variable and a set of independent variables in order to improve performance predictions (for example, predicting which employee characteristics are most likely to result in long-term employment).

The \$395 SPSS Data Entry II option gains password protection, better virtual disk memory management, and programmable pop-up help for inexperienced dataentry personnel.

SPSS/PC + V3.1, which lists for \$795, requires DOS version 2.0, 640K of memory, and a 20MB hard disk. Options are \$395 each.

Meanwhile, the OS/2 version adds a Presentation Manager environment with context-sensitive help and a statistical glossary to the commanddriven interface of SPSS/ PC + for DOS. This version has the full functionality of SPSS's mainframe software, including more extensive data and file management facilities, report writing, and a full programming language with which you can create

customized routines or macros.

Capable of addressing a full 16MB of memory, SPSS for OS/2 lets you work with an unlimited number of variables in extremely large files and conduct simultaneous multiple analyses in Presentation Manager windows.

Initially, SPSS for OS/2 add-ons will include SPSS Advanced Statistics, SPSS Tables for publishing reporting tables, and SPSS Trends for forecasting and time-series analysis—for \$495 each.





E-Mail Fax Option Looks Sharper

MCI Mail has lowered prices and added enhancements to its Fax Dispatch service. If you're looking for a quick, clean way to fax PC-generated documents and can live with send-only service, Fax Dispatch will let you forget expensive PC fax boards and desktop fax machines. Fax Dispatch now transmits a screenful of text (28 lines of 80 characters) to any Group 3 fax in the United States for 50 cents; each additional half page costs 30 cents.

To send a fax message, simply add (fax) at the MCI Mail To: prompt, and the system walks you through all the required addressing information. Recent Fax Dispatch enhancements include an alternate-delivery option. When the line's busy, MCI automatically reroutes your message to a second fax, telex terminal, MCI mailbox, or postal address.

A prompted-addressing setup collects information to be printed (at no extra cost) on a cover page. And on-line error checking validates area codes and checks phone numbers for extraneous digits. Cancellation and receipt confirmation notices are automatically placed in the sender's MCI mailbox.

Letterhead and signature graphics, previously available only for MCI's hard-copy delivery option, enable MCI users to personalize their fax messages.

Seven Sensible Spreadsheets

You don't need megabucks—or megabytes of RAM—to tap the full analytical power of a spreadsheet.

Our survey turns up one exceptional value and several distinguished runners-up.

ow that 1-2-3 release 3 has redefined the spreadsheet, it's finally time for 1-2-3 2.01 holdouts to decide what to buy next. Spreadsheet mavens with hefty hardware budgets who need true three-dimensional and relational data base capabilities will upgrade to 1-2-3 release 3. Users who want great-looking graphs and superior ease of use—and who have the necessary hardware to run Windows—will turn to Excel, a previous Best Buy (see "Power Spreadsheets: A New Standard?" October 1989).

But how about the rest of us? If you recoil at the thought of dropping megabucks into a system that's quick and capacious enough to support 1-2-3 release 3 or Excel, you have a lot of company—and, fortunately, a lot of options. The seven spreadsheets reviewed in this article, Lucid 3-D 2.2, 1-2-3 2.2, Plan-Perfect 5.0, Quattro Pro 1.0, SmartWareII Spreadsheet 1.01, SuperCalc5, and Twin Lev-

el III 3.07, all run acceptably on an 8-MHz AT with 640K of RAM, and some offer sophisticated features that surpass the 1-2-3 2.01 standard.

Not 3-D, More and Less Than 1-2-3

Keep in mind that none of the reviewed products lets you call on a built-in relational data manager, create true 3-D ranges, or (with the exception of *SuperCalc5*) build a worksheet with multiple pages. In spite of the marketing hype about 3-D powers, most of these programs merely offer linking—the ability to reference cells in your worksheet to cells in other spreadsheets in memory or on disk.

SuperCalc5, for example, lets you reference linked external cells in formulas.

SmartWareII and Twin Level III do too—
but you must load each of the linked files in memory to forge a link or update them. Other operations with the reviewed products—chaining worksheets together with links,

linking ranges, and so on—are possible, but the process can be tortuous and error checking a pain. In short, if you really need multidimensional modeling, get a 3-D spreadsheet.

However, if you simply need to handle huge worksheets, don't touch that dial. Almost all these programs automatically stuff worksheets, macros, formulas, and whatnot into available expanded memory—although most support EMS 3.2, not 4.0, so you're limited to 8MB of RAM. Better still, *Lucid*

3-D, PlanPerfect, and SmartWareII Spreadsheet incorporate virtual memory schemes that can swap portions of worksheet data to disk, allowing for massive worksheets limited only by disk capacity. Just remember that virtual memory systems turn your PC Porsche into a Volkswagen.

If compatibility with the 1-2-3 standard is vital—from interface to macros to file formats—tread carefully. Chances are you'll have to rewrite your 1-2-3 macros and kiss off the templates you've invested in. For example, all the reviewed programs can read and write WK1 files, but SmartWareII, Plan-

Perfect, and Lucid 3-D can't run or generate 1-2-3 macros, and SuperCalc5 and Twin offer only partial macro compatibility. Informal tests run with a sophisticated 200-line 1-2-3 2.01 macro managed to stall or crash every non-Lotus spreadsheet we examined, except Quattro Pro.

The conservative choice in terms of compatibility, of course, would be 1-2-3 2.2. But the alternatives are just too good to pass by. Looking for everything Excel offers (without Windows' overhead), plus full 1-2-3 compatibility? Look no further than our Best Buy, Quattro Pro. Need superior data analysis, multipage worksheets, and multiple chart styles? SuperCalc5 is the answer. For people with more specialized requirements, there's PlanPerfect for WordPerfect users new to spreadsheets; the memory-resident Lucid 3-D for casual users who need a capable popup spreadsheet; and SmartWareII Spreadsheet, a powerful stand-alone spreadsheet that can be tightly integrated into the SmartWareII system.

If your applications require heavy-duty number crunching, performance will be critical. Speed trials conducted by NSTL reveal

The new \$495 *Quattro Pro 1.0* is determined to do 1-2-3 2.2 better in every critical area, and it achieves that goal in spades. Its well-implemented user interface, blazing speed, superb graphics, and 1-2-3 compatibility make it our Best Buy.

Quattro Pro's mouse-driven interface runs in graphic or character mode and comes complete with layered pulldown menus, dialog boxes, scroll bars, and a click-to-edit formula bar. You can move and size windows with your mouse, much as with *Excel*. For Lotus vets, 1-2-3-style menus are also available.

It's easy to build linked formulas, and you can copy and move cell entries between sheets, pull data into a worksheet from an external data base, and build graphs that call values from multiple sheets. But there's no true 3-D capability: Ranges are two-dimensional structures limited to a single sheet.

Quattro Pro faithfully duplicates 1-2-3 2.01's flat-file data base, with one important addition: You can link directly to Paradox, Reflex, and dBASE files and extract data from them. No special drivers are required as with 1-2-3 release 3, so setup is simple.

The report writer is flexible and offers well-organized font and color control. It also includes a print preview option (with zoom) Quattro Pro, our Best Buy, has Excel-quality graphics and a Windows-like interface that's sleek and fast. Methodology

A 16-MHz Compaq Deskpro 386S with 5MB of RAM (4MB configured as expanded memory using CEMM.EXE) and a 40MB hard disk was used for benchmarks. Tests were performed using a worksheet containing a three-year cash-flow model, a balance statement, an inventory, amortization schedules for the present year, a data table, and a personnel file consisting of sales, commissions, and projections. Modules were interrelated with interde-pendent formulas, the majority being arithmetic functions and combinations of functions. The calculation mode was set to automatic to take advantage of background and minimal recalculation schemes.

This test measured how long it took to load the test worksheet

This test measured the time it took to move the block C1 to AR93 one column to the left on the test

Ascending/descending dual-key sort

A block of 19 rows and 86 columns containing a list of names, commissions, and associated data was sorted according to commission rates in de-scending order and by name in ascending order.

Capacity

This test measured worksheet capacity by counting how many additional years' worth of data could be added to the worksheet. If an entire year could not be added, an attempt was made to add six months.

When it comes to features and flexibility, however, SuperCalc remains a top-flight competitor. It's strong on 3-D functions, auditing features, and advanced statistical and financial functions, and it can solve simultaneous equations. It also comes with an impressive list of no-cost extras: Funk Software's Side-Ways, Computer Associates' own Spreadsheet Auditor, and their file encryption utility, Privacy Plus. Data management features are limited, however, unless you pony up \$149 for the company's Silverado add-in.

SuperCalc's menu system is similar to 1-2-3's but offers more options at every step.

With Super-Calc5's multipage worksheets, you can build formulas that combine data from several worksheet pages. The formula at the bottom of this screen averages data from ranges on three worksheet pages.

LOOKING FOR SPREADSHEET BARGAINS IN INTEGRATED SOFTWARE

Evelyn Morrison

Integrated software packages offer a sweet deal: For little more than the price of a stand-alone spreadsheet, they give you spreadsheet, word processing, data base management, and communications capabilities—sometimes more. And in today's best packages, quality doesn't take a backseat to quantity.

PC World compared the spreadsheet modules of five popular integrated packages. The spreadsheets in Alpha Works (\$195) and Microsoft Works (\$149) proved adequate for beginners and those with modest spreadsheet needs. Framework III, Enable/OA, and Symphony (all \$695) are aimed at power users, but their spreadsheets may not meet professional demands. One major caveat: Although all five spreadsheets read and write WK1 files, not even Lotus's Symphony can run unmodified 1-2-3 macros.

Alpha Works 2.0: Behind the Pack

Alpha Works is inexpensive and easy to use, but its spreadsheet isn't its strongest point: The graphing capability and @ functions are roughly equivalent to 1-2-3 2.01's. But there's no macro language—imported 1-2-3 macros are filtered out—and no Allways-quality output. The recent 2.0 upgrade adds only a few minor features like math coprocessor support and shorthand text entry.

You can load up to nine spreadsheets simultaneously, though you get
to see only two at a time in fixed-height
horizontal windows. The menus can be
configured as horizontal or pulldown,
and you can use a mouse to navigate
and to define ranges. For common operations, numerous keyboard shortcuts
let you bypass the menus. But there's
no cell linking and, worse, no easy way
to copy between worksheets; you must
use the File Extract command and an

intermediate scratch file. Though you can't load active files into expanded memory, Alpha Works will swap data in inactive modules to expanded or extended memory, or even to your hard disk when you need the RAM.

Alpha Works' other modules, particularly its DBF-compatible data base, may tip the balance in its favor—but for the best spreadsheet in an entry-level package, look to Microsoft Works.

Enable/OA 3.0: Powerful but Hard to Use

Enable/OA's spreadsheet is as powerful as the most advanced stand-alone products. It has multiple-worksheet files, sophisticated number-crunching and auditing capabilities, and background printing. But the program won't let you use a mouse, the various modules are poorly integrated, and it's hard to learn and use.

Each Enable/OA worksheet can have up to 32 "pages," giving you 3-D capability similar to that of 1-2-3 release 3 and SuperCalc5. You can open up to eight worksheets simultaneously, but since there's no mouse support, you must move and resize windows via the keyboard. In addition to the basic 1-2-3 set, Enable/OA has quite a few handy @ functions all its own, including several that link spreadsheets together. You can choose between standard and minimal recalculation. Extensive auditing features include map mode and selective highlighting of dependent cells, referenced cells, and copies of a specific formula. Although you can't run 1-2-3 macros directly, a translation utility is provided.

Enable/OA's charting capability is equivalent to 1-2-3 2.01's. But the program comes with a copy of Perspective II, an impressive 3-D graphics package. Enable/OA includes a menu command

that automatically imports selected spreadsheet data into Perspective.

Explanations of many of Enable/OA's advanced features are missing from the main manuals and can be found only in a printed supplement and in on-line help. Worse, in marked contrast with the other integrated apps reviewed, its spreadsheet is poorly linked to the other modules—they don't even share a common interface. So while Enable/OA's spreadsheet is in many ways the most powerful of the bunch, it's hard to recommend it.

Framework III 1.1: Flexible but Quirky

Framework III's spreadsheet is tightly integrated with the package's other modules and includes some advanced features. Functions, formulas, and graph options are roughly equivalent to what you get in 1-2-3 2.2, but modifying a graph is tricky. The spreadsheet has a powerful macro language but can't run or even translate 1-2-3 macros. There's no background or minimal recalculation. A Framework spreadsheet can have as many as 32,000 rows and columns, assuming you have enough memory. If you don't, data is automatically spooled out to disk, but performance turns glacial.

Framework's interface is odd—for instance, you use the <Insert> key to execute a command—but once you learn its peculiarities, the program is fast and efficient, especially with a mouse. Framework III's "frames," or windows, can be moved, resized, and even nested. You can work with multiple spreadsheets in separate frames and forge permanent links between sheets and graphs. A unique feature is the ability to reference cells by row and column titles. For instance, if row 5 is labeled "Expenses" and column D is labeled "May," you can reference cell D5

as "May. Expenses." Framework III includes FRED, a procedural language that ties the modules together and lets you create sophisticated applications. For simpler macros, you can record and play back keystroke sequences.


Generating a simple graph is easy, but modifying an existing one is tough. When you create a graph, Framework automatically generates a corresponding formula. You make changes to the graph by editing that formula, not by choosing menu options. Graphs are contained in separate frames and can be printed along with your data.

Framework III's FRED language lets you create fancy applications that would be difficult or impossible with other programs. But the spreadsheet's lack of fancy print formatting nixes it for professionals, and it's too complicated for novices.

Microsoft Works 2.0: Entry-Level Champ

The spreadsheet in Microsoft Works is reminiscent of Microsoft Excel but is clearly intended for less demanding tasks. It offers a great mouse interface, background recalculation, expanded-memory support, good graphing capability, and superb context-sensitive help that includes interactive tutorials. On the downside, there's no macro language, 1-2-3 compatibility is limited, you can't link files, and you can't view data and graphs simultaneously. Nevertheless, you really get your money's worth.

Works lets you open up to eight worksheets at once, and you can split each window into two or four panes. You can switch between text mode and graphics display at any time; VGA users can work with up to 60 legible lines. Unlike in Excel, you can't mix fonts in a spreadsheet, but you can make selected cells bold, underlined, and italic.



Microsoft Works' resizable windows and multiple-file capability make it surprisingly powerful for an inexpensive program.

There's also a handy page preview mode that will eliminate surprises at print time.

Works reads WK1 files and writes WKS files. Be warned, however, that string functions are not supported, and 1-2-3 macros are simply ignored. The program's own macros are limited: You can record and play back keystrokes but not mouse movements. There's no macro language or editor. Although you can copy cells and ranges between spreadsheets, you cannot create permanent links between spreadsheets or between spreadsheets and other Works modules.

Works' graphing capabilities are comprehensive, and you can specify mixed bar and line charts as well as dual—y-axis graphs. To print a graph along with your spreadsheet data, you must copy the data to a word processing window and insert a named chart.

Works' spreadsheet is not up to

the standard set by 1-2-3. But its rockbottom price, slick interface, and graphing power make it an extremely attractive product for the beginning and intermediate users it was designed to please.

Symphony 2.0 Plus: Déjà Vu

Unlike the other packages examined here, all of Symphony's modules are based on the spreadsheet metaphor. The spreadsheet itself is functionally identical to 1-2-3 2.01 and shares its limitations: For instance, there's no minimal or background recalculation, it lacks linking capability, and you can open only one spreadsheet at a time. An extensive tutorial is included, and a context-sensitive on-line help system will get you past any rough spots.

You can open multiple windows in a single worksheet and have graphs appear in separate windows. There's no mouse support, so you have to move (continues) Lotus upgraders can choose a strict 1-2-3 menu system that allows the program to run simple 1-2-3 macros—but that's all.

SuperCalc's reporting is extremely flexible, offering font control over individual ranges, multiple print ranges, and multiline headers and footers. However, you can't print a graph and worksheet on the same page. SuperCalc's print preview is characterbased, so proportional fonts aren't rendered accurately, making it difficult to prepare elaborately formatted reports.

SuperCalc offers the greatest range of

graph styles and options in the crowd. It doesn't have *Quattro Pro's* drawing skills, but *SuperCalc's* settings sheets make it easy to set up and modify your graphs because all the options are in one place.

Of all the products in this roundup, Super-Calc offers the best approximation of 1-2-3 3's 3-D spreadsheet. In addition to linking formulas to open or disk-resident files, you can create multipage worksheets with formulas that sum ranges in each page and copy cells from one page to another.

Although SuperCalc is not recommended

and resize windows from the keyboard. Symphony can read WK1 files, but you must use Lotus's Translate utility to save worksheets in WK1 format. Though Symphony shares 1-2-3's macro language, it has different menus, so 1-2-3 macros must be tweaked before they will run properly, and anyone accustomed to whipping off 1-2-3 command keystrokes without thinking may be in for a surprise.

Some of Symphony's shortcomings can be overcome by the many popular 1-2-3 add-in programs available in special Symphony versions. It even comes bundled with Allways, giving it the

widest printing options of any integrated package here. Version 2.2, slated for release in March 1990, is expected to add linking and improve memory management. But if you aren't satisfied with 1-2-3 2.01, you won't be any happier with Symphony.

For Beginners Only

Microsoft Works 2.0's spreadsheet is the most appealing for entry-level users. While not up to the 1-2-3 2.01 standard, it's adequate for those with simple graphing and number-crunching needs.

But none of the integrated apps puts it all together for the heavy-duty business spreadsheet user. Symphony's spreadsheet is no better than 1-2-3 2.01. Framework III's spreadsheet is a close match for 1-2-3 2.2, and Enable/ OA is in SuperCalc's league—but neither has the snazzy output Allways users expect. Serious spreadsheet jockeys will do better with one of the top stand-alones.

as an alternative to 1-2-3 release 3 or Excel, it's a very good choice for hardware-shy users who want a lot of powerful features—advanced statistics, auditing, encryption, near–3-D capabilities—and who don't mind leisurely performance.

1-2-3 Release 2.2

Lotus's successor to its ubiquitous 1-2-3 2.01 makes a few much-needed improvements, but it's a tune-up, not a major overhaul. While users will appreciate the new features—which include an undo command, search and replace, settings sheets, single-cell file linking, on-screen print preview and presentation-quality reports with Allways, a macro recorder, and a worksheet-independent macro library—most of the products in this roundup already offer such fare. And in NSTL tests, 1-2-3 2.2 was sluggish. Compared with Quattro Pro, 1-2-3 2.2 is pretty bland stuff.

A few enhancements improve spreadsheet handling. To provide perspective on its labyrinthine menus, 1-2-3 2.2, like SuperCalc, provides settings sheets that summarize menu choices for reports, graphs, and data management. You can now press <F3> to paste range names into formulas, change the width of several columns at once, or define multiple graph ranges in a single step.

1-2-3 2.2 offers rather basic single-cell linking, on a functional par with *Lucid 3-D*'s or *PlanPerfect*'s, but it's not terribly convenient. Because you can see only one worksheet on screen at a time, you must remember the cell address or range name of the source cell.

Ironically, the most significant new feature isn't from Lotus at all—it's the superb add-in report writer from Funk Software, *All-ways*, which provides an accurate print preview of your worksheet, font control, lines and shading, and drivers for PostScript printers.

Compared with *Quattro Pro* and *Super-Calc*, 1-2-3 2.2's graphs are pretty Spartan. There are a few minor improvements, such as automatic graph layout and the ability to specify a range of cells as the source of leg-

ends. Likewise, macro enhancements—commands for better control of graphs, a keystroke recorder, and an add-in macro library that lets you store macros for use in any worksheet—are well chosen but not innovative.

1-2-3 2.2 is reliable and familiar, but Lotus should have provided this upgrade years ago. Quattro Pro demonstrates that the competition has done more than just play catch-up.

3-D ON A BUDGET: CAN VP-PLANNER 3D DELIVER ON ITS PROMISE?



VP-Planner 3D, Paperback Software's major upgrade to VP-Planner Plus, distinguishes itself from other professional spreadsheets with its exceptional 3-D features, \$295 price tag, and claim of full 1-2-3 compatibility. It also matches 1-2-3 2.2 feature for feature and adds pulldown menus (though no mouse support), a relational data base, superior auditing tools, and extra release 3-like @ functions, graph types, and macro commands. Yet despite its big feature set, the program will run on a 384K, dual-floppy PC.

Several of the programs reviewed in this roundup offer impressive file linking capabilities, and SuperCalc5 even builds multipage worksheets. But based on our examination of a prerelease copy, only VP-Planner 3D equals (and perhaps exceeds) 1-2-3 release 3's 3-D features. 3D has easy-to-navigate multipage worksheets and true 3-D ranges, so commands and formulas can address blocks of cells that span multiple pages. And 3D surpasses release 3.0 by letting you graph and print 3-D ranges, globally reformat selected worksheet pages, and even rotate your view of a worksheet through three dimensions.

Great Graphs, No Fonts

3D gives you lots of options for viewing data and makes graphing a selected block a one-keystroke task. Although you can load only one file into memory at a time, you can open up to six windows and display up to 24 hot-linked graphs at a time. For extra pizzazz, you can call on area, radar, and high/low/close/open graphs; mix types; rotate bars; and add "depth" to chart elements. You can also print sideways and combine graphs and worksheets on the same page. Two big omissions: You can't dress up worksheets with fonts or attributes, and there's no print preview.



VP-Planner 3D can load only one file at once, but it can display several views simultaneously. Here, it displays two graphs with different views of the same data, plus three segments of the worksheet.

Paperback claims 3D is fully file, macro, and keystroke compatible with 1-2-3 2.2 and earlier versions. But until 3D passes the PC World torture test in a review of the released product, be skeptical.

Easy Data Base Access

Another plus is 3D's ability to easily open DBF files and display the data in a table or a handy data-entry form. You can browse, edit, and sort the records; cross-tabulate related files; and even create a new data base from scratch—but you can't update dBASE indexes. Like Lotus, Paperback will help third-party developers design drivers and add-ins that will let you get at data from Paradox, SQL packages, and other sources.

Like VP-Planner Plus, 3D has a builtin relational data base that lets you massage data in many ways. But numerous improvements in 3D ease the task of creating and manipulating data bases. 3D will also include extensive auditing tools, such as cell noting, map view, and macro debugging commands—but only limited formula tracing.

VP-Planner 3D could be an attractive alternative for potential 1-2-3 release 3 and Excel customers. And it will be a steal for VP-Planner Plus customers, since the upgrade will be \$125 or less.

PlanPerfect 5.0

The new *PlanPerfect* is the spreadsheet that *WordPerfect* lovers have been waiting for. Its interface dutifully imitates the word processor's, and it even includes *WordPerfect*'s superlative file manager, which eases the all-important job of staying organized.

PlanPerfect is run via WordPerfect-style function keys, but you can also install pull-down menus or a 1-2-3-style interface. Even so, 1-2-3 users should be prepared for different conventions. To load a file, for example, you press <F5>, select a file, and press 1 instead of typing /FR. Note, too, that PlanPerfect can't run even the simplest 1-2-3 macros.

File linking is disk-based, much as with *Lucid 3-D*, and rather crude. You can open two files and view them together on screen, but you must save the source files before updating values in a target sheet. You can also link ranges, but data is transferred laboriously cell by cell.

PlanPerfect combines a traditional 1-2-3—style flat-file data base with data entry forms. But compared with Twin's or Excel's, PlanPerfect's forms are difficult to set up and use. In addition, you must enter selection criteria at a command prompt, not in a cell, so storing and reusing multiple queries means writing a macro to reproduce the criteria.

Not surprisingly, PlanPerfect's text formatting controls are the most sophisticated in this roundup, and PlanPerfect sports a zoomable print preview identical to Word-Perfect 5.0's. (WordPerfect Corporation will also offer a coupon good for Publisher's Powerpak, which gives Plan Perfect a variety of fully scalable fonts.) The charting function, however, is merely adequate. You can't print graphs and spreadsheets on the same report, and you can't include printer fonts in graphs.

PlanPerfect offers two macro systems: a powerful language similar to WordPerfect 5.0's and an alternative "cell" system that ties macros to a specific worksheet. Neither is compatible with 1-2-3.

More disappointing for WordPerfect users is the lack of integration between the two products. You can't hot-link data between the two products as you can between Excel and

Word 5.0. However, WordPerfect will suck up PlanPerfect worksheets or WK1 files and neatly format them, even inserting the proper tabs and such.

PlanPerfect's audience is clear: WordPerfect users who want a spreadsheet with a familiar interface. Given its mildly frustrating learning curve for experienced 1-2-3 users, sluggish performance in NSTL tests, and lack of outstanding features, it's not recommended for general spreadsheet users.

SmartWarell Spreadsheet 1.01

As a stand-alone program, SmartWareII Spreadsheet offers speed and exceptional programmability. With its powerful macrocum-programming language, for example, you can take user input via a custom data entry screen, pass it to the data base, select and sort needed records, and produce spreadsheet graphs and form letters.

Unfortunately, 1-2-3 users will find Smart-WareII's interface bewildering, its inability to read or write 1-2-3 macros a pain, and its minimal data base functions a major inconvenience. To get the most out of the package, you need to fold it into the SmartWareII integrated family, which includes communications, word processing, and data base modules. But few users will take that step.

SmartWareII's command sequences are obsessively fussy and force you to enter re-

dundant keystroke sequences when a settings sheet or full-screen menu would have been simpler. For example, opening a 1-2-3 worksheet requires at least 15 keystrokes.

SmartWareII sports such power features as heavy-duty matrix and regression features, protected formulas that execute but don't display, and an editor for constructing and debugging complex formulas. The program's macro language is not compatible with 1-2-3's, but it's a full-blown procedural language that can integrate the actions of the other SmartWareII modules.

But there are almost no 1-2-3-style data base functions. Users are expected to load SmartWareII's data base module, import and manipulate data there, and then export the results back to the spreadsheet.

SmartWareII doesn't provide a print preview, but otherwise its report and graphics capabilities are first-class. It's the only program reviewed that permits true three-axis graphs, and you can choose from available printer fonts or compile downloadable laser printer fonts supplied by the company.

Getting the most out of SmartWareII Spreadsheet means making a major commitment to the SmartWareII system. If you need an integrated powerhouse, check it out. Otherwise, keep looking.

Lucid 3-D 2.2

Lucid 3-D is the only reviewed spreadsheet that's memory resident. That makes it convenient, but it's also slow and underpowered for complex models. But this \$99 bargain is perfect if you need a capable, albeit limited, spreadsheet at your fingertips. An excellent auditing feature graphically shows linked worksheets and formula references; you can also append extensive notes. Creating serviceable graphs is a snap—just don't expect to do anything fancy, like graphing discontinuous ranges, adding data labels, or suppressing legends.

In spite of its name, *Lucid 3-D* is not a 3-D spreadsheet like *1-2-3* release 3. As with *1-2-3*, you can only do single-cell linking. But you can display nine linked worksheets in separate windows for better visibility.

Lucid was fastest at loading and saving files but dismal at recalculation, spreadsheet manipulation, and other tasks. Worse, run any two of the separate graphics, WK1 file translation, or macro editor modules, and you may find there's not enough room for

your primary application.

Lucid's unconventional pulldown menu interface may prove an initial inconvenience to 1-2-3 habitués. Copy and move operations, for example, are accomplished with a clipboard. It's an intuitive approach, but 1-2-3 users will begrudge the excessive number of steps required.

It's easy to create macros with *Lucid*'s keystroke macro recorder and to add conditionals by plucking them from a pulldown menu. But if you work in an office dominated by 1-2-3, note that *Lucid* can't read or generate 1-2-3—compatible macros.

Lucid 3-D is a lean, well-executed spreadsheet. If you spend your days deep in an accounting package and need to whip out the occasional "what if," Lucid is ideal. But if your needs go beyond the basics, look elsewhere.

Twin Level III 3.07

Twin Level III is roughly equivalent to 1-2-3 2.2, minus *Allways*. It also has some advanced features—a data base entry form, a slide show generator, and sophisticated multifile connections. But its minimal spreadsheet publishing features, excessive memory needs, and tortoiselike performance make it difficult to recommend.



Twin's pulldown menu interface is keystroke compatible with 1-2-3 and includes the same commands and prompts. But the menus aren't overlapping like Quattro Pro's, so novices can easily lose their bearings. Twin also lacks the reliability and performance of its namesake: It leaves half as much memory available as 1-2-3 2.01 with Undo turned off, and in informal testing, a 200-line 1-2-3 macro that ran perfectly in Quattro Pro crashed Twin and the test PC.

Twin exhibits other quirks, too. It takes several steps to list and retrieve files in a different directory. Files aren't listed alphabetically, you can't get a full-screen list of selectable range names, and when you open a second worksheet you can't even get a worksheet directory. The documentation is poorly organized, and the help screens lack an index.

On the plus side, Twin does multisheet consolidations as easily as SuperCalc. You can name a range in a file, then use that range name as a formula element in another open or disk-resident file. But you can't build a true 3-D range, and you can't move the cell pointer between sheets while building formulas, create data base or graph ranges that span worksheets, or access a range name in another sheet with the {Name} key.

Twin's data base is a clone of 1-2-3 2.01's with an added data entry form that's much easier to set up and use than PlanPerfect's. But the data base does not allow you to extract data from one file into another, preclud-

ing a host of multifile applications.

Twin's report module is almost a spitting image of 1-2-3 2.2's, with a few extras. There's no font control or preview, but you can create text, mix pie charts and horizontal bar charts, and produce 3-D effects (but not true three-axis graphs).

In short, while *Twin* provides some interesting multifile capabilities and is half the price of the competition, its uneven interface and slow performance merit a thumbs-down.

Quattro: The Winner Takes All

The current crop of spreadsheets presents some excellent options for users with special requirements. *Lucid's* stripped-down, memory-resident program is an invaluable accessory for people who primarily use other programs. *WordPerfect* users, on the other hand, can look to *PlanPerfect* for a well-integrated, familiar interface.

But for most spreadsheet users, especially those climbing up from 1-2-3 2.01, only two products get the nod. If you can live with its demerits, SuperCalc5's superb feature set, analytical tools, and approximation of 1-2-3 release 3's 3-D capabilities make it worth a look.

But the overall Best Buy is clearly *Quattro Pro*. It's as reliable as 1-2-3 2.2 yet offers a friendlier interface, superior speed, and outstanding graphics—improvements Lotus should consider for release 2.3 if it wants to maintain its hold on the mass of spreadsheet users. •

But do these systems have what it takes to earn a place on your desktop?

omorrow's business software is already showing up in offices, boasting accessible graphical user interfaces (GUIs) that require heavy-duty processing power to keep from slowing to a crawl. Most of these programs are Windows applications; upcoming Presentation Manager and X Window applications will demand even more muscle.

Devoting greater CPU power to easy-touse GUIs is a healthy trend—one that increases productivity by opening up a wider range of applications to experienced users and by attracting new users who might be intimidated by character-based command conventions. But to get acceptable performance from graphics-intensive programs, you need at least a 25-MHz PC.

In fact, we can expect to see 25- or even 33-MHz 386 systems become the dominant mainstream business machines soon, with 386SXs taking the entry-level position and 486 power being shared by LAN work groups. Clock speeds for 386 systems may level off at 33 MHz, but for now 25-MHz machines offer the best price/performance ratio, thanks to their ability to use less expensive RAM.

The five machines in this review are recent arrivals from major vendors: AST's Premium 386/25, AT&T's 6386/25, NCR's PC925, Toshiba's T8500 Model 25, and Wyse's 386 Model WY3225. Including these, we've reviewed a grand total of eighteen 25-MHz 386s to date; so far only the Dell System 325 and the Micro Express ME 386-25 have received *PC World* Best Buy awards.

Since these machines will spend their best hours on people's desks, not stuck in a closet running a network, we evaluated them as single-user systems. This means that board and drive capacities are less important than a high ceiling for CPU-speed RAM to handle graphics-based, multitasking environments. Moreover, since people will be using these machines every day, well-designed ergonomic features such as a space-saving footprint, easy-to-reach front-panel switches and monitor controls, and simple setup are highly desirable. Fortunately, all the vendors represented here (except Toshiba, which had not settled on a monitor at press time) offer excellent keyboards and sharp, bright VGA monitors.

One of the most impressive entries in the roundup is Toshiba's T8500, a machine primarily designed as a superior desktop workstation. Unique features include a small foot-

print and easy access to expansion boards; moreover, power and reset switches are conveniently located on the front panel. The other standout is AST's Premium 386/25—a larger and more traditional system that delivers outstanding DOS performance at the lowest price in the roundup. However, neither system rated Best Buy honors.

Obviously, performance is a key buying consideration. Among this group, National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL) benchmarks reveal only minor differences in DOS scores. The larger variation in OS/2 benchmarks is probably due to the quality of each manufacturer's version of OS/2, suggesting that a system maker's ability to adapt OS/2 to its specific hardware can have a significant performance payoff.

To maximize performance, all five machines have been designed to take advantage of hardware-based memory caching, and they all include disk caching software as well. In addition, all feature "shadow RAM,"


an important new capability that boosts performance even higher by copying system and video BIOS from slow ROM into faster, 32-bit memory (see the sidebar "Breaking the BIOS Bottleneck").

To make it easier to compare list prices, the machines have been set up and priced in the standard *PC World* configuration: 4MB RAM; a 150MB (or thereabouts) hard disk; at least one parallel port, serial port, and mouse port; a VGA graphics adapter and color monitor; and DOS 3.3 or a later version.

AST Premium 386/25

At \$8990 in the standard *PC World* configuration (but with a 110MB hard disk), the Premium 386/25 is the least expensive machine in the roundup—but it gives you a lot for your money, including impressive DOS performance and a high ceiling for CPU-speed

RAM. Furthermore, you get a painless upgrade path: A simple board swap lets you move up to 33 MHz or even to full 80486 performance. Unfortunately, in its 25-MHz 386 incarnation, neither its OS/2 performance nor its ergonomics will make much of an impression.

The Premium 386/25 is a high-velocity DOS machine, turning in top scores on the *Microsoft C* benchmark—but its overall OS/2 performance was the worst in the roundup. (This system was tested with an ESDI drive, but PCs that are currently shipping come with IDE drives, so you may get different performance from that described here.)

The Premium 386/25's ergonomics are less than dazzling. It's a long reach to the rear of the large chassis to turn on the power switch; even the keylock is rear-mounted. The only thoughtful touches are a front-panel reset button and monitor controls placed conveniently at the bottom of the screen.

The Premium 386/25 has seven slots, and you end up with five of them free. The CPU, the RAM cache, and up to 4MB of RAM live on a CPU board that plugs into a 32-bit slot. (A 33-MHz CPU board, available as a \$2395 option, goes into the same slot; a 25-MHz 80486 upgrade costs \$3695.) Two more 32-bit

slots (which also accept 8/16-bit boards) let you install up to 32MB of additional CPU-speed RAM for a generous total of 36MB—20MB more than even OS/2 can address directly. (UNIX users, however, will find that "extra" 20MB handy.) The 386/25 has room for five half-height 5½-inch storage devices, three of them externally accessible.

Service and support are a mixed bag. There's no on-site service, and the tech support line works only on weekdays and shuts down at 3 p.m. PST—but at least long-distance calls are toll free, and there's an inhouse BBS with a great color interface. As we do for all systems, we placed three test calls to evaluate the quality of tech support. All three of our calls were answered immediately.

If you're looking for a desktop workhorse to give good service well into the 1990s, AST's Premium 386/25 is worth thinking about, thanks to its easy upgrade path, fine DOS performance, and huge capacity for CPU-speed RAM. Despite its unimpressive ergonomics and slow OS/2 scores, its low tariff makes for a tempting price/performance ratio.

AT&T 6386/25 Work Group System

AT&T's 6386/25 boasts excellent performance across the board—in both DOS and OS/2 tests, it turned in the best overall scores in the roundup. Its capacity for CPU-speed RAM is the highest of the reviewed machines, but its 22-by-19-inch box is the biggest of the bunch. Moreover, at \$10,463 in the standard *PC World* configuration, it's a pricey speedster.

The 6386/25's ergonomics are not particularly impressive. The front-panel reset button and easy-to-reach monitor controls are well placed, but the rear-panel on-off switch suggests that AT&T's engineers didn't devote much thought to user comfort.

The 6386/25 can handle 8MB of 32-bit RAM on its Intel motherboard. Two 32-bit slots accommodate memory boards that bring the total for CPU-speed RAM to 40MB. The large case includes eight slots—and you end up with six of them free in the PC World configuration. The AT&T has bays for five half-height 5¼-inch storage devices, three of which are accessible from the front.



number is toll free. Unfortunately, there's no on-site service. Our three test calls were answered after an average of 4 minutes on hold. Twice we received help; the third time we had to leave a message and were called back quickly.

With its excellent performance and generous capacity for expansion slots, storage devices, and CPU-speed RAM, the AT&T 6386/25 will make a good server—if that's what you're looking for. But as a desktop system, its bulky case, unimpressive ergonomics, and high price put it at a disadvantage.

NCR PC925

NCR's PC925 delivers fine DOS performance with good drive and expansion slot capacity, and its SCSI drive interface allows you to address six peripherals easily. But there are two problems: At \$10,694 in the *PC World* configuration, it's the most expensive box in the roundup—and that's with a measly 100MB hard drive. Worse yet, the SCSI adapter is incompatible with *Windows/386*.

The PC925's DOS scores are close to the front of the pack. Running under OS/2, however, its overall performance was nearly the worst in the roundup, due mainly to its lowball score on the disk-intensive *R:base* test.

The PC925's slow SCSI hard disk (NSTL rated it at 29.6ms) is the probable culprit. Our inability to get the test unit to run *Windows/386* was due to an apparent conflict with the SCSI adapter; according to NCR, new units will correct the problem and provide a faster ESDI hard disk option as well.

The PC925's ergonomics are only fair. Although NCR puts the power switch on the front panel (where it belongs), and VGA controls are easy to reach, the system case is large, and there's no front-panel reset button. Moreover, changing the amount of system RAM, or performing even simpler setup tasks like enabling an I/O port, requires fiddling with far too many switches and jumpers.

You can put 16MB of 32-bit RAM in the PC925. The motherboard is host to eight expansion slots, six of which remain vacant in the *PC World* configuration. Two of five half-height 5¼-inch drive bays are accessible from the front, and there's an internal full-height bay as well.

Service and support has its ups (free onsite service, weekend tech support) and its downs (you pay for long-distance calls). We had to leave messages on all three of our test calls; the third was never returned. The PC925's strong DOS scores and SCSI device expansion capacity are big pluses—but these days you'd have to be crazy to pay top dollar for a desktop PC that can't run Windows. At press time, NCR announced plans to ship a new, and much improved, 25-MHz system in late February. Under the circumstances, it makes sense to look for the upgrade.

Toshiba T8500 Model 25

The T8500 is the first desktop entry from this leading laptop vendor—and the company's experience seems to have paid off in a design that boasts a compact footprint, superior ergonomics, and a surprisingly low price (\$9498 in the standard *PC World* configuration), but with an undersized 100MB hard disk. It even comes with a built-in SCSI port so you can connect seven additional peripherals.

The T8500's performance scores are unexceptional but perfectly creditable, falling midrange on both DOS and OS/2 benchmarks. A bottom-place finish in the processor-intensive 1-2-3 test suggests that perhaps the memory-caching algorithm could be improved.

The T8500's ergonomics are outstanding. Its compact footprint (16 by 16 by 4 inches) is no larger than IBM's PS/2 Model 30; the

reset switch, the keyboard port, and a speaker volume control are all on the front panel. Moreover, Toshiba makes it unusually easy to slide in expansion boards through a removable right-hand door that exposes four horizontal slots. As of this writing, Toshiba was not offering a VGA monitor under its own name.

The small cabinet takes its toll in expandability. The motherboard holds only 8MB RAM—the lowest count in the roundup. (When 4MB DRAMs become available, probably early this year, the T8500's RAM ceiling will rise to 14MB.) The machine has only four slots, and even though all of them are left free, that's still a tie for the lowest slot count in the roundup. Worse yet, there are only two externally accessible half-height 3½-inch bays; an internal half-height bay of the same size holds the 100MB hard drive. You can daisy-chain as many as seven exter-





Methodology

All machines were tested with a coprocessor and a 256K extended memory disk cache (except in the 1-2-3 benchmark). Each system was tested with 4MB of RAM. Systems were configured with the following sizes of hard disks: NCR PC925 and Toshiba T8500 Model 25, 105MB; AST Premium 386/25, 110MB; AT&T 6386/25 and Wyse 386 Model WY3225, 140MB; Compaq 386/25, 300MB.

Microsoft Word 4.0

A Microsoft Word macro loads a 35-page, 140-paragraph document and performs search-and-replace and spell-checking operations. The first page of the document is then printed. Although the results of the benchmark depend primarily on processor and memory access speeds, display adapter and hard disk speeds are also contributing factors.

dBASE III Plus 1.1

The dBASE III Plus test measures the time required to prepare and print a report of past-due invoices. The report includes calculated fields and is based on three files: a 500-record customer file, a 1000-record invoice file, and a 2000-record item file. When disk caching is not used, the random access speed of the hard disk is, after processor speed, the most significant factor in this benchmark. With disk caching, sequential read performance becomes more important than random access.

nal devices via the SCSI port, and Toshiba has included a port for an optional external 5½-inch drive.

Theoretically, Toshiba offers the best service and support in the roundup. The company provides free on-site service within 50 road miles of any TRW service center, a toll-free tech support number, and not one but

two BBSs—one in-house and one on Compu-Serve. Unfortunately, that toll-free tech support number could use some work: Two of our three calls were met with a busy signal. We got through on the third call but had to hold for 6 minutes before we reached a support representative.





In this benchmark, a 1-2-3 macro executes a series of recalculations using five different formulas within a 75-by-75-cell matrix. Because there are few screen updates and no disk access is required, the results depend almost entirely on processing and memory access speeds.

Microsoft C 5.0

The Microsoft C benchmark measures the time required to compile and link XUSP. The most important factors in this benchmark are processor and memory access speeds. The performance of the hard disk is also a factor; generally, disk caching has little effect.

AutoCAD 9

In this benchmark, a three-dimensional sample drawing is retrieved and displayed using AutoCAD's EGA driver. The zoom function is used to display the drawing from various perspectives; then the full drawing is printed. The results of the benchmark depend primarily on the speeds at which the processor and coprocessor operate and at which memory is accessed. The performance of the display adapter and the hard disk also have some effect.



While DisplayWrite 4/2 is loading, the keystrokes to start a DisplayWrite macro are entered. The macro loads a 35-page, 140-paragraph document, replaces each occurrence of the word today with tomorrow, uses the built-in spelling checker to look for any incorrectly spelled words (there are none), paginates the document, prints the first page to an IBM Proprinter II, and exits DisplayWrite.

IBM C/2

In this benchmark, processing and hard disk sequential access speeds are the most important factors. The benchmark measures the time required to compile the 25 source code files that make up XUSP, a public-domain USP interpreter.

R:base for OS/2

Processing and hard disk random access speeds are the most significant factors in this benchmark. Disk caching dramatically improves apparent disk access speed. This benchmark measures the time it takes to produce a report based on a three-file join, select, and sort.

OS/2 Multitasking

In two sessions, IBM's C/2 compiles the 25 C source code files that make up XISP. The results of this benchmark are determined by calculating the difference between the first session's starting time and the second session's ending time.

Toshiba is betting that there are users out there who want a compact, capable, ergonomically designed workstation on their desk and are willing to trade RAM, slot, and drive capacity to get it. Given the T8500's low price, SCSI port, and outstanding service and support, that's a bet Toshiba may win.

WYSEsystem 386 Model WY3225

At \$9613 in the standard *PC World* configuration, the WY3225 costs only \$600 more than the bottom-end AST—and you even get a 150MB tape backup unit in the bargain. Moreover, the machine seems to have what it takes to be a top OS/2 performer—but there's a catch: You have to run Compaq

OS/2 to get that performance. The system delivered the worst DOS performance in our roundup, and its ergonomics are anything but impressive.

Wyse claims to offer a proprietary version of OS/2, but since it was unavailable at benchmark time we tested the WY3225 with Compaq's OS/2, which has a superior disk caching algorithm, among other optimizations. The machine ran extremely fast, but there's no guarantee you'll get similar results with Wyse's OS/2—and in any case, we

do not recommend running a system with any but its own version of OS/2. Under DOS, the WY3225 took top spot on the CPU-intensive 1-2-3 test but fell off badly where hard disk performance and disk caching efficiency were critical.

In designing this system, Wyse seems to have given little thought to ergonomics. The WY3225 is bulky, its power switch is in the back, and while a flip-up lid over the drive bays may look great, it's a pain in the wrist when you have to change floppy disks. You'll

BREAKING THE BIOS BOTTLENECK

The current crop of 386-based PCs offers the broadest set of speed enhancements ever included as standard options in desktop machines: fast CPUs, equally fast 32-bit system memory, 25ns memory caches, sophisticated disk caching software, and, recently, "shadow RAM." The latter (which ought to be called simply "BIOS relocation") lets you trade in a small amount of "high" memory (above 1MB) to get major enhancements in performance.

DOS depends on low-level routines stored in ROM (read-only memory) chips to handle basic input/output for the system (BIOS): putting characters on the screen, reading data from the keyboard, writing it to disk, and so on. The routines are called very frequently—often hundreds of times a second—and if they run slowly, throughput suffers drastically.

ROM chips are usually addressed 8 bits at a time at a poky 8 MHz, fast enough for the PCs and XTs for which they were originally designed, but way too slow for today's 32-bit 25- and 33-MHz speedsters. And the cost of developing and producing faster ROMs is prohibitive.

Why not just copy the system BIOS and video BIOS into faster RAM and access them from there? Until recently, that's been impossible because DOS expects to find those BIOS routines at specific addresses between 640K and 1024K.

DOS was written to address 1024K (1MB) of memory locations. When you buy a PC with 640K of RAM, what you get is a motherboard with physical memory whose addresses range from 0 to 640 kilobytes. Although you rarely have to think about it, you also get an extra 384 kilobytes of address

space. Some of these "upper" addresses are used by DOS to access ROM-based system BIOS, hard disk BIOS, video BIOS, and video RAM. If you buy a machine with more than 640K of memory, the extra RAM is given addresses in high memory, starting at 1MB, and is called extended memory.

Since the 80386 chip is able to remap, or "virtualize," memory addresses on the fly, now you can copy system and video BIOS from slow ROM chips to faster 32-bit RAM—as long as the system virtualizes the address. So when DOS (or a misbehaved application) goes looking for a BIOS routine at some specific address between 640K and 1MB, it's automatically sent to fast RAM above 1MB.

Are there any drawbacks to shadow RAM? Of course. One is that shadowing reduces the amount of available RAM. Programs that require nearly a full megabyte of memory (such as 1-2-3 release 3) won't run in "1MB" 80386 systems that, because of shadowing, actually provide less than 1MB. However, most 80386 PCs probably have at least 3MB of extended memory, so devoting 128K or 256K to shadowing is no big deal. Another problem can arise if a newly installed video board tries to relocate its video BIOS to the same high memory the system is using for its relocated system BIOS: The system will refuse to boot.

Therefore it's essential to be able to change the relocation address or to disable shadowing altogether. It's also handy to have the capability to disable video BIOS shadowing while maintaining system BIOS shadowing—or vice versa. Finally, it's essential to regain access to all the high memory addresses when shadowing is disabled; some systems (like Compaq's) won't give it back. —J. D.

have to resort to DIP switch flipping to add or subtract RAM and to configure the I/O ports.

The WY3225 employs a backplane with 11 slots—but by the time you're done installing boards to reach the standard *PC World* setup (including a controller for the tape backup), you're down to 4 free ones. The WY3225's drive bay capacity is fairly standard for a large-footprint desktop model: You get five half-height 5¼-inch bays, four of them accessible from the outside.

Service and support are awful. There's no on-site service, the tech support number is a toll call, and Wyse charges \$45 for each question! (We didn't bother calling.) Wyse suggests you try your local dealer for free tech support. End users with modems can get tech support via an in-house BBS, but it costs a steep \$200 a year.

Arriving at a meaningful price/performance ratio for the WY3225 is not easy.

True, \$9613 (with a built-in tape backup) is a cheap ticket for an outstanding OS/2 ride, so it's tempting to overlook the machine's poor DOS performance and disappointing ergonomics. However, those OS/2 scores are

achieved with another company's version of OS/2. Given all that, plus the unacceptable service and support, we suggest you pass this system by.

Desktop Workhorses

There are no Best Buys in this roundup, but the best bargains clearly are the AST Premium 386/25 and the Toshiba T8500. The Premium 386/25 is relatively inexpensive (\$8990 in the *PC World* configuration) and combines outstanding DOS performance and a huge 36MB capacity for CPU-speed RAM with an easy 486 upgrade path. Its unimpressive ergonomics and slow OS/2 scores are drawbacks. Toshiba's \$9498 T8500 limits memory, slot, and device expansion, but its ergonomics (including a very small footprint) are outstanding—and the SCSI port makes it easy to connect seven peripherals.

Nonetheless, these five systems have to go up against the Best Buys from our previous 25-MHz 386 roundup reviews (June 1989 and August 1989)—specifically the \$8099 Dell 325 (almost \$1000 less than the AST Premium 386/25) and the even cheaper \$6324 Micro Express ME 386-25. Despite a number of winning features, none of the new contenders can match the low prices and superior performance of those two Best Buy winners.

The flip-up lid that covers the drive bays on Wyse's WY3225 may be elegant, but it's not very handy. Fortunately, it's removable.

With 80486 PCs starting to come on line at last, once-exotic 25-MHz 80386 PCs are looking more and more like everyday desktop machines. If you choose wisely, you'll end up with a system whose RAM capacity, speed, and ease of use will make blazing through yesterday's benchmarks a pleasure while it helps to solve tomorrow's problems.



Nine MNP Modems for Corporate Communications

When your business sends files over phone lines, time is money.

> With twice the throughput of standard 2400-bps modems, these MNP-5 alternatives pay for themselves in a hurry.



Judy Getts n their flight from fearsome phone bills and interminable terminal sessions, modem users have turned to file compression utilities such as ARC and PKZIP. Although great for reducing disk glut, ARC and PKZIP have their limits when it comes to communications. You must compress and decompress files manually, and you and your partner need the same utility.

Wouldn't it be nice if modems handled such details automatically? Some canmodems equipped with the Microcom Networking Protocol level 5 (MNP-5) provide much better compression than software methods. Throughput averages about 4800 bits per second (bps) compared to about 2800 bps with PKZIP. Because the modem itself handles all the courtesies of handshakingsizing up its counterpart on the other end of the line-you needn't worry whether your counterpart also has MNP-5. If not, the modem automatically drops down to the highest rate possible with its partner, and it can communicate equally well at 300 bps, 1200 bps, or 2400 bps. Yet in the business world, it's increasingly likely the other modem will be running MNP-5.

MNP also includes superb error correction. With software-based protocols such as XMODEM or Kermit, non-MNP modems can also ensure error-free transmissions, but performance lags because some blocks of data must be retransmitted as line noise increases. In contrast, MNP-5 error correction is so efficient that it actually *improves* performance, even on noisy lines.

All nine of the external 2400-bps modems reviewed here offer MNP-5, but only the Hayes V-series Smartmodem 2400 v.42 also includes V.42/V.42bis, an error correction and data compression protocol recently adopted by the CCITT international standards-setting body. The Smartmodem wins a Best Buy based on several factors, but its V.42/V.42bis support is key—the protocol nearly triples throughput when communicating with a like modem, compared to a doubling of throughput with MNP-5. It's even

slightly faster than the rarely implemented MNP-7 protocol, which builds on MNP-5.

In the coming years V.42/V.42bis will supplant, or at least rival, MNP-5. At press time, all the vendors represented here except Practical Peripherals, Ven-Tel, and Prometheus had announced they would add V.42/V.42bis this year (see the sidebar "V.42 and MNP: Peaceful Coexistence"). Multi-Tech's \$25 single-chip upgrade will probably be typical, but check the upgrade cost with the vendor before you buy.

Who Needs MNP?

The 2400-bps MNP-5 modem is becoming standard issue in the corporate world, but it's not for everybody. If you need a LAN gateway or if you swap hundreds of kilobytes of data a day, a high-speed V.32 modem may be a better choice. Prices range from \$1000 to \$1800, and throughput from 9600 bps to 33,000 bps (see "High-Speed Modems: Files in the Fast Lane," December 1989).

In contrast, if you rarely transfer files, a non-MNP 2400-bps modem will suffice. Many BBS's support MNP, but few commercial online services do. Prices for non-MNP modems range from \$100 to \$300, compared to \$300 to \$700 for MNP-5 modems. And you can always simulate MNP-5—slowly—in software (see the sidebar "MNP on the Cheap"). Finally, if panel controls aren't important and you have a free slot in your PC, consider an internal modem. Internal models of many of these modems are available for about \$100 less.

For most corporate buyers, however, an external MNP-5 modem is the answer. In a few years, 9600-bps modems may become the corporate workhorse, but for now they're overkill for most users. Compared to plain 2400-bps modems, the increased speed of these 2400-bps MNP models can save phone costs and free up your PC. And your MNP-equipped business contacts will appreciate not having to slow down.

FEATURES EVALUATION

Protocols, Not Panel Controls, Give Hayes Best Buy

Fancy front-panel controls are helpful, but hardly crucial to a smart buying decision. Witness the continuing success of the bare-bones Hayes Smartmodem, with its fast V.42bis throughput.

Speed First

In the past, speed and Hayes compatibility almost always separated the winning modems from the losers. But today's competition is so tough that your buying decision may hinge on secondary issues such as the ease of setup and the variety of panel controls and status lights. The warranty and the cost, quality, and accessibility of technical support may also influence your choice (see the sidebar "How PC World Evaluates Service and Support" for more details).

Speed, however, comes first. In National

Software Testing Laboratories benchmarks, the same model was placed on each end of a simulated phone line mimicking average line conditions. Five types of files—text, spreadsheet, data base, TIFF (graphics), and program—were shuttled over the line using MNP-5. The same tests were then run in a simulation of various poor (but not atypical) line conditions, including high levels of static. All nine modems worked as fast on poor lines as they did on average lines.

There were scant differences between the modems in MNP-5 mode—they averaged between 4640 bps for the top-ranked Practical Peripherals to 4530 bps for the Prometheus.

When NSTL tested the Hayes and Multi-Tech with their faster protocols, the gap widened. The Hayes took top honors with a 6379-bps average score using V.42/V.42bis, and the Multi-Tech, running MNP-7, followed at 5948 bps.

Beyond raw speed, Hayes compatibility is key. NSTL checked how well each modem supports the crucial Hayes AT commands and S-registers and thoroughly tested the modems with popular communications packages. Only the Hayes and the Okidata modems were perfectly compatible with the AT command set, but most of the other programs' glitches were minor or involved niche

HOW PC WORLD EVALUATES SERVICE AND SUPPORT

Eric Brown

If you're shelling out \$300-plus for a modem, you want the vendor to guarantee it will work properly. Because most of the modems reviewed rate so closely on speed and compatibility, service and support may end up determining your buying decision.

To evaluate service and support, PC World separately rated four categories: warranty, support cost, support accessibility, and support quality. These criteria were weighted equally and the ratings combined for the final service and support evaluation in the Executive Summaries.

To test support accessibility and quality, PC World called the technical support number three times—in the morning, midday, and in the afternoon. Each company was asked three questions that covered basic information about modem setup issues. The caller's PC World affiliation was not disclosed in any of the calls.

The specific criteria evaluated are described below.

Warranty If a modem is defective, you'll usually find out fairly soon. Still, there are exceptions to the rule, so a long-term warranty that covers both parts and labor is an asset. A one-year warranty is considered fair, two years good, three or more years excellent. A low-cost extended warranty is also a plus.

Support Cost This category takes into account whether the technical support is free and whether the vendor provides a toll-free number. To earn an excellent rating, companies must provide both. The lack of a toll-free number means a fair rating at best.

Support Accessibility To judge the accessibility of technical support, PC World considered the hours the support line is open (40 hours a week is good), the number of attempts required to get through, and the time spent on hold. Extras such as a BBS and fax-based support are also factored in. A callback system, in which the technician calls the user back if lines are busy, is considered a demerit.


Support Quality In this category, PC
World judged the accuracy of the answer to the
three questions. Variables such as the clarity of the
explanation and the courtesy and patience of the
operator were also factored in.

Generally, warranties and support costs were quite good. All but Microcom provided warranties of two years or more, no vendor charged for technical support, and roughly half the companies provided toll-free numbers. However, the accessibility and quality of the support were often disappointing. Only Hayes garnered an excellent rating on quality, and only Hayes and Practical Peripherals earned a good rating on accessibility. More typical were endless busy signals, long periods on hold, and technicians who were poorly versed in the basics of modem technology.

applications. All the modems worked well with Smartcom III, HyperAccess, Procomm Plus, Crosstalk XVI, and Crosstalk Mk.4.

Most users will never need to configure a modem, but some might. If you're setting up a BBS or a micro-to-mainframe link, you may need to tinker with setup commands, and custom LAN gateway software and shaky shareware packages may send you scurrying for your manual. Luckily, most of the modems were fairly easy to set up, and all save the Microcom AX/2400c worked with popular packages without a change of setting. All the modems let you store configuration data in built-in CMOS RAM, and most provide alternative switches.

Bright Lights, Big Switches

Panel controls and indicator lights are often overrated. A good communications package will duplicate the controls and status information provided by a modem. Indicators are more important than controls. From time to time, even the best communications package will lose track of what's going on, and LED lights are handy for monitoring modes such as auto-answer and MNP or determining whether your modem is still on line. Equally desirable is an easily adjustable speaker.

All the modems include two phone jacks and, unless otherwise noted, an on/off switch and a volume control dial. Toggles for switching the data rate and other settings are usually helpful only if you lack communications software. One exception—switching a call between voice and data works better with a button than with software.

Six of the modems offer synchronous modes, useful for communicating with some mainframes; today, however, most mainframes also speak asynchronous. The Multi-Tech and Ven-Tel add security features that make them ideal as LAN gateways.

The following reviews zoom in on the details. Unless otherwise noted, each modem's speed and Hayes compatibility are rated as good.

ATI 2400 etc/e

A bargain at \$299, the ATI 2400 etc/e offers a bounty of panel controls. In addition to MNP-5, it includes V.42 error correction, but


without V.42bis compression (which should be added by the time you read this), V.42 performance was the same as in MNP-5 mode. The ATI is a good value, but poor technical support keeps it from the top.

The ATI's panel controls and indicators are superb—membrane buttons let you redial, change speeds, and switch to synchronous mode. Extra LEDs signify when error correction, answer, and synchronous modes are in use.


The software-based configuration is easy enough, but a few incompatibilities with the Hayes AT command set disqualify it for PC-to-mainframe use: The unit doesn't generate a break signal upon disconnect, so a remote mainframe may not know when you log off; it also lacks the ATY1 long-space disconnect, used by mainframes to end a session.

The review unit also hissed annoyingly. ATI's tech support dismissed this as harmless "resonation from the coil." Other ATI owners that *PC World* contacted reported no such problem.


In contrast with the unlimited technical support provided by the other vendors, ATI's support is available for only two years. Also, there's no toll-free number (calling Canada can add up), and you'll spend ages getting through and waiting on hold. The tech support was disappointing—one technician wrongly insisted that the modem had DIP




Practical Modem 2400SA MNP

One of the advantages of having an external modem rather than an internal model is that you'll always know what's going on—even if your communications package drops the ball. In addition to the standard LED indicators provided by the Hayes Smartmodem, several modems have displays that let you know whether you're running in MNP mode. Panel controls are less important than LEDs, but voice/data and on/off switches are helpful.

Methodology

In the Dirty Line tests (results not shown), the TAS 1010 was set to reproduce conditions found on dirty phone lines. Modems were tested with various combinations of line impairments, including drop-off, white noise, and phase-shift jitter. This test used the same 30,000-byte ASCII file as the Average Line throughput on all tests.

Hayes V-Series Smartmodem 2400 V.42

Hayes is back—and with a vengeance. The modem giant lowered prices, added MNP-5 support (finally), and was the first to add V.42bis data compression. The \$649 V-series is the fastest modem in the roundup when talking to a like unit, Hayes compatibility is a given, and tech support is tops. Add it up, and the V-series wins a Best Buy.

Running V.42/V.42bis, spreadsheet and data base transfers were especially swift, with the latter clocking in at 9091 bps. Also, the unit incorporates protocols used in previous V-series models, so it can link up with them at speeds well over 2400 bps.

Externally, the Smartmodem hasn't aged a day. It mimics its forebears, right down to its eight LEDs, acoustically clear speaker, and heavy metal jacket. Its only flaw is the Spartan interface. Most users won't mind the lack of fancy switches, but they'll miss a volume control knob. Nevertheless, the Smartmodem is a valuable investment in the future.

Microcom spawned MNP, but it no longer fields the best MNP modem. The \$599 AX/2400c was the only modem reviewed that needed to be configured to work with *Procomm*, a task made stickier by dense documentation. All told, it's only a fair value.

Between the turgid manuals and confusing DIP switch procedures, working with the AX/2400c will abrade your nerves quickly. Confusingly, you configure it with a combination of DIP switches (in two different banks), software commands, and a reset button. Fortunately, Microcom's tech support is sharp.

Panel controls are lacking. The AX/2400c provides voice/data and synchronous toggles, but there's no on/off switch. You need a screwdriver to tame the speaker volume.

The AX/2400c is slow to respond to AT commands, and it lacks the ATY1 command used by mainframes. The AX/2400c's proprietary SX command mode can come in handy in some mainframe environments for configuring serial port speed.

Multi-Tech MultiModem 224E7

The MultiModem's MNP-7 compression almost rivals Hayes's V.42/V.42bis—it's slower overall, but the 8108-bps text transfers and the 5000-bps TIFF transfers are the fastest in the roundup. Like the ATI, the \$549 Multi-

Modem also includes V.42, and V.42bis should be available by the time you read this. In sum, the feature-rich MultiModem is an excellent buy, and its security features make it a natural as a LAN gateway.

Configuration is straightforward—you adjust two sets of bottom-mounted DIPs or configure it via software. Tech support is adequate, but you spend ages on hold. Hayes compatibility is fine except for a nonfunctional @ dial modifier, required with some PBX systems.

Controls and indicators are better than most. The LEDs include a speed indicator, but there are no auto-answer or data-terminal-ready lights. You get a voice/data toggle, but you need a screwdriver to adjust the speaker volume.

The MultiModem is well suited as a LAN gateway. Three levels of password protection screen callers, and an automatic callback feature dials up to 30 users. The modem can also be configured remotely.

Okitel 2400 Plus

The Okitel fails to capture a Best Buy as it did in *PC World*'s last 2400-bps roundup ("Smarter Modems," September 1988), but it's still a good deal. Its Hayes compatibility is beyond reproach, and the five-year war-

ranty is generous. Okidata's poor technical support is the only sour note.

The well-designed Okitel is girded in sturdy plastic and offers easy-to-read LEDs. You set up the modem via stored AT commands and rear-mounted DIPs.

Okidata's technical support was hard to reach and fuzzy on details. One representative did not know how to configure the modem for *Crosstalk*, and another gave an incorrect answer regarding voice/data switching.

For the same \$549 price as the 2400 Plus, you can buy Okidata's CLD 2400, which adds security callback features. The CLD was unavailable for review.

MNP ON THE CHEAP

It will probably be easy and inexpensive to upgrade an MNP modem to V.42, but not so a plain, non-MNP modem. Because such a modem lacks basic correction and compression circuitry, you almost always have to scrap it to move up to either protocol.

Fortunately, there's another option. MagicSoft of Lombard, Illinois, has hit pay dirt selling an MNP-5—equipped communications package called MTE to modem vendors, who bundle it with their MNP-deficient wares. MagicSoft also licenses its MNP module to SoftKlone Distributing, which offers it as an option to its Mirror III package. Anyone can buy MTE and dress up an old modem with MNP—you can even upgrade 1200-bps models.

Since automatic handshaking is part of MNP's basic blueprint, using software-based MNP to forge a link with an MNP modem is just as transparent as if two hardware-based—MNP modems were communicating. However, don't expect big gains in throughput. MagicSoft representatives admit that an MTE-equipped 2400-bps modem runs 17 percent slower than an MNP-5 modem, and others claim the difference is even greater.

Don't count on seeing V.42 software. Due to V.42's complexity, it would be tough to duplicate it in software without negating performance benefits. — J. G.

before they buy, but most will find the modem beats out the ATI as their best low-cost bet.

The Practical Modem is easy to set up with AT commands. The manual flounders in technobabble, and the company's tech support is inconsistent. Most technicians were helpful, but one was unaware of the concept of voice/data switching. Panel controls are frugal—there's a full array of LEDs but no extra switches or volume knob.

V.42 AND MNP: PEACEFUL COEXISTENCE

Why buy modems with built-in MNP or V.42 errorcorrection protocols when your communications package includes its own error-checking protocols? Efficiency is the key. Software protocols such as XMODEM often slow performance, but the hardware-based MNP-4 (included in MNP-5) and V.42 not only keep your data pure, they boost throughput by about 20 percent.

Compression schemes included in MNP-5 and V.42bis then squeeze the data to further increase throughput. MNP-5 can double performance, and V.42bis can triple it. Hence, V.42/V.42bis is a shooin to gradually displace the slower MNP.

V.42 error correction has been available from Hayes and some other vendors since it was adopted by CCITT over a year ago. But since V.42 alone is no more efficient than MNP-5, most vendors stuck with MNP. It wasn't until last fall, when V.42bis was adopted, that V.42 took off.

Fortunately, V.42 and MNP are fairly compatible. The V.42 spec requires that complying modems also add MNP-4, so MNP-5 and V.42 modems can swap error-free data. The two cannot exchange compressed data, thus limiting you to a 20 percent speed boost instead of 50 percent. In practice, however, almost all vendors who sell V.42/V.42bis modems also include MNP-5.

Finally, a word of caution: Some unscrupulous salespeople claim their MNP-5 modems are V.42 compatible when they're really not. Their rationale is that the modem's MNP error correction makes it compatible with V.42 modems at a slower data rate. —J. G.

Also geared toward budgeteers, the Promodem 2400G is hardly a bargain. Though performance is respectable, it's the slowest in the roundup. What's more, the Promodem can't pulse dial, it dials slowly, and it occasionally misdials. Also, there's no announced support for V.42. Even at \$299, it's not worth the price.

The Promodem's panel controls are Spartan. The speaker's default setting is faint, and to adjust it, you must turn a small plastic stick, a job that requires the delicacy of a watchmaker. You configure the modem via software, but the unit often remains mulishly unresponsive to AT commands—a sign of poor Hayes compatibility. Prometheus's hard-to-reach tech support personnel sound unhappy; buy this modem and you may join them.

Documentation and tech support are above average, and extra AT commands display modem settings, help screens, and a built-in clock that times your sessions. The speaker is notably clear, and there's a volume control slide. The LEDs, including speed and MNP lights, are very readable.

Ven-Tel 2400 Plus II

The \$499 Ven-Tel 2400 Plus II offers a fiveyear warranty and good Hayes compatibility, and its security features suit it to LAN duties. There are no announced V.42 plans, and you can't adjust the speaker, but it's still a good value.

The Ven-Tel is configured via software or switches, but you must pry the metal cover off the modem to get at the DIPs. Ven-Tel's technical support staff were pleasant but lacked sufficient knowledge of modem basics, such as flow control. In addition, Ven-Tel uses an inconvenient callback system.

Panel controls are a mixed bag—extra LEDs signify modes such as speed and MNP, but the speaker is faint, and you can't adjust the volume, not even via software. The Ven-Tel's password security is on a par with the MultiModem's. You can program the modem to call back users, and you can configure it remotely.

Buying a Hayes modem has always meant buying dependability, but it's been a while since you felt you were getting the sharpest deal. Now that Haves has dropped the price of its V-series and added MNP-5 and V.42/ V.42bis, you can be satisfied on both counts.

Hayes wins the Best Buy, but some of its rivals also make a mark. For bargain hunters, the ATI and Practical Peripherals modems make sense, and the MultiModem is your best pick for network use.

As usual, the modem market is a moving target, and it will remain so over the next year as vendors add V.42/V.42bis. In the meantime, Hayes has set up the bull's-eye that other vendors will aim for.

From the Boston Computer Society, the Capital PC User Group, the Sacramento PC Users Group, the Silicon Valley Computer Society, and the San Francisco PC User Group—a combined membership of over 40,000—we heard about a great many products that intermediate to experienced spreadsheet users are likely to find helpful.

Some of these tools make your spreadsheet easier to use, increase its speed, and improve the look of its printed output. Other utilities address more specific problems, letting you plan projects, maintain a payroll, manage data in dBASE format, or do word processing without leaving your spreadsheet.

Several macro and template collections are also included-surprising choices, given the power users we polled. But according to Hugh McLaughlin of the Boston Computer Society, "Writing macros yourself is like spending \$1000 to save \$400." For Bill Welch of the Silicon Valley Computer Society, development time is a luxury. "When you're constantly putting out fires, you don't get a chance to develop anything for yourself."

We have divided the

recommended products into six categories:

Worksheet Construction Tools simplify the job of building your own worksheets. General-purpose macro collections, data verification tools, and error-checking programs are included in this category.

Print and Performance Enhancements speed screen display, spruce up printed output, and boost overall operations.

Financial Tools include templates and programs for handling taxes, financial planning, journals, and other bookkeeping duties.

Workplace Management Tools bring automated Gantt charts, critical path analysis, and other scheduling and costing features to your spreadsheet.







hen 1-2-3 arrived on the scene in 1983, its graphics were about as good as you could get on a PC. Unfortunately, the graphics capability of the world's most popular spreadsheet stagnated for six years, improving significantly only when release 3 appeared in 1989. Although still lagging behind the competition in some regards, 1-2-3's graphics have finally made the transition from merely functional to presentation quality.

Release 3 users can dress up their graphs with multiple fonts, a choice of colors and hatchings, and a choice of portrait or landscape orientation. More important, you can now easily dash off stock market graphs, area charts, mixed graphs, and even graphs with two y-axis scales. The trade-off for this added pizzazz is a more complicated graphics menu system. But with practice, the menus will soon become second nature, and you'll be rewarded with graphs you can proudly display in a board-room or include in a report.

This article explores some of 1-2-3 release 3's new graphics capabilities and walks you through the steps involved in generating a moderately complicated graph. The graph commands are a superset of release 2.01's, so familiar commands still work. Even release 2 macros designed for creating graphs will work in release 3.

In this example, you'll plot a company's monthly sales volume and show monthly performance relative to preestablished goals. To follow along, set up the worksheet shown in FIGURE 1. Column B contains the monthly sales goals; actual sales figures appear in column C. The cells in column D contain a simple formula that calculates dollar volume as a percent of the goal. Enter the formula +C6/B6 into cell D6, format it as a percentage, and simply copy it to the 11 cells below.

Drawing on the data in **FIGURE** 1, you'll create a "mixed" graph by plotting the actual sales figures as bars and the percent-ofgoal data as a line. Because the scales for these ranges are drastically different, you'll also call upon 1-2-3's dual-y-axis capability to show your sales figures in thousands of dollars on the first axis and as the percent of your goal on the second.

If you have an EGA or a VGA display, you can split your screen vertically and display the graph beside your data. This way, you can watch the graph develop as you create it. In the READY mode, simply move the cell pointer to the middle of the screen (around column D or E) and issue a Worksheet Window Graph command. An empty white window will appear on the right half of your screen; as you proceed with the instructions below, the graph will take shape there, piece by piece.

Assign Data Ranges

The first step is to set the data ranges. In a mixed graph, release 3 plots bars from data assigned to graph ranges A, B, and C, and lines from data in

ranges D, E, and F. Therefore, to graph the sales figures as bars and the percent of goal as a line, you assign them to ranges A and D, respectively.

- 1. In READY mode, select $/Graph\ A$ and enter c5.c17 to specify the A range.
- 2. Select D and enter **d6.d17** for the D range.
- To assign the column A month labels to the X range, select X and enter a6.a17.
- 4. To specify legends for the data ranges, select *Options Legend A* and enter **Sales**. Repeat the process for the data in graph range D, entering **Pct. of Goal** for the legend.

As long as you're still in the Options submenu, you can add a title. Rather than type the text, you can use a cell reference to pick up the label in cell A1. Select *Titles First* and enter \a1. (This technique, although available in earlier versions, has become practical only with release 3, which adjusts the reference


when the cell is moved.)

Another release 3 enhancement lets you add footnotes of up to two lines. To add a footnote, select *Titles Note* from the Options submenu and enter **Prepared** by Sales Management. Footnotes always appear in the bottom left corner of the graph.


Set Up the Graph

So far, you've identified the data to be graphed, assigned legend names, and specified a title and a footnote. Now it's time to tell 1-2-3 what type of graph you want and how it should be formatted.

- 1. Press <Esc> to return to the main Graph menu.
- 2. Select *Type Mixed* to choose a mixed graph.
- 3. Select *Type Features 2Y-Ranges D*. This assigns data range D to the second *y*-axis, which will be scaled to show percentages.



SCREEN 1: Release 3 allows you to display a worksheet and a graph side by side on an EGA or a VGA screen.



SCREEN 2: The final graph shows properly formatted left and right axes and crosshatched bars.

4. Choose *Quit* two times to return to the main Graph menu.

If you haven't been watching the graph in split-screen mode, this is a good time to take a look at your progress. Select *View* or press <F10> to get a full-screen display of your efforts so far. At this point, your graph should resemble the right half of **SCREEN 1**, with a line laid over the bars. Pressing any key returns you to the worksheet.

Next, change the scale formats to improve the graph's appearance. You'll format the left y-axis as currency to correspond to the sales data in graph range A. The right y-axis will be scaled as percentages to handle the percent-of-goal data in range D.

- 1. From the main Graph menu, select *Options Scale Y-Scale Format Currency*.
- 2. Enter **0** for zero decimal places.
- Press <Esc> to return to the previous menu.
- 4. To format the right y-axis, select 2Y-Scale Format Percent and enter 0.
- 5. Choose *Quit* twice to return to the main Graph menu.

Adding the Finishing Touches

Essentially, the graph is now finished (see **SCREEN 2**). However, to polish it for a presentation, you can customize it by specifying colors, fonts, and text sizes.

From the main Graph menu, select *Options Advanced*. This submenu lets you adjust the colors and hatchings of the graph elements and also select fonts, text size, and text colors. In this example, you'll change the bars from solid to crosshatched and then change the title's font.

- 1. Select *Hatches A* to adjust the A data range.
- 2. Cursor through the eight numbers to see each hatching option's description. Select 4 for 'Fine triple hatching'.
- Select Quit to return to the Options Advanced menu.

To change the title's font to Font 1, select *Text First Font 1*, and then select *Quit* five times to return to READY mode. You'll notice that this has no effect on the display; although the menus offer eight fonts in nine sizes,

1-2-3 can display text in only one typeface and, depending on your hardware, one to three sizes. So how does Font 1 look on your printer? Good question.

Relying on the screen when you're putting final touches on a 1-2-3 graph is a little like painting in the dark-you can't see what you're doing. Neither the menu prompts nor the displayed graph match the fonts and shadings that will be generated by your printer. Fortunately, release 3 provides a sample document, showing all possible typefaces and formatting options, which you can print out for reference. To print the sample, from READY mode select /Print Printer Sample Go.

Printing the Graph

Release 3 lets you print or plot a graph without exiting the worksheet. To print the graph from the Print Printer menu, select *Go Quit Image Current*. You can continue to work while the graph prints in the background.

You can also print the graph below the data on a single page. One technique is simply to give the commands to print the worksheet range and the graph without issuing a page eject between them. However, a better method is to name the graph and issue a single command to print both.

- Name the current graph
 "Sales" by selecting /Graph
 Name Create and entering Sales.
 Select Quit to return to
- 2. Select *Quit* to return to READY mode.
- 3. Select /Print Printer Range and enter a1.d17;*sales. The semi-colon separates the two print ranges, and the asterisk tells 1-2-3 that the second range is actually a graph.

4. Select *Go Quit* to print the data and graph.

Lotus has improved 1-2-3's graphics capabilities considerably, but a number of presentation features are still missing. It would be handy to be able to add text and arrows anywhere in the graph, display two graphs side by side, or generate 3-D graphs. Still, release 3 is powerful enough to handle most graphics chores without forcing you to master a separate charting program.

Put It All Together With 1-2-3 File Links

For release 2.2 users, dynamic file links make for flexible, powerful worksheet consolidations. But watch out for some hidden traps.

What you need: 1-2-3 release 2.2

Sooner or later in your work with 1-2-3, you'll need to pull information from one worksheet into another. In 1-2-3 release 2.01 you have to use the File Combine

command. In release 2.2 there's a better way: dynamic file links.


File links are one of 2.2's biggest advantages over earlier releases. Its "linking formulas" let you link a single cell of the active worksheet to the value of a single cell in a worksheet on disk. When you retrieve a worksheet containing linking formulas, 1-2-3 updates the value of the formulas to match the last calculated value of the referenced external cells. This is a big improvement over File Combine Copy, which simply copies the values of external cells into the active worksheet and must be repeated every time you want to update the information.

Links are most useful in consolidations; for example, when you generate a companywide earnings forecast from a set of departmental worksheets, or prepare an annual summary from 12 monthly reports. You can also use links to split spreadsheets too large to fit in memory into several manageable modules.

While file links are the most flexible way to extract information from external worksheets, File Combine Add macros still have their place when RAM is tight. Linking formulas use a lot more space—an additional cell for each value you extract. Using File Combine Add to total a 10-cell range from each of five external files involves only 10 cells in the active worksheet. Doing the same thing with linking formulas would take 60—10 for each file and 10 for the totals.

Forging a Link

Since release 2.2 can load only one worksheet at a time into RAM, a linking formula in the



current worksheet—which Lotus calls the target—references a source file on disk. To link to cell G16 of the external file TOPEKA-.WK1, for example, you simply enter +<<TOPEKA>> G16 into a cell of the current worksheet.

If the disk-bound cell contains a value or label, the linking formula returns the contents of the cell. If the external cell is blank, the formula returns the value 0. When the external cell contains a formula or function, the linking formula returns only the result. For example, if the external cell contains the formula +1+2, the result of the linking formula is simply the value 3.

You can create as many links to as many disk-bound work-sheets as you like. However, you can't just link a block of cells: If you enter +<<TOPEKA>> D4..G8, it will be truncated to +<<TOPEKA>>D4. This means you need a separate linking formula in the current work-sheet for each cell you want to link to in the source. Neverthe-

less, since 1-2-3 adjusts a linking formula's source cell reference when you copy it, you can easily link a whole block of cells. If you copy A1 to A1..E8, A1..E8 will reflect the values of A1..E8 in TOPEKA.WK1. However, any absolute reference is left unchanged—copy + << TOPE-KA>>\$A1 from A1 to B2, and B2 will contain + << TOPE-KA>>\$A2.

As you can see, linking files is easy and straightforward. But traps await the unwary. Heed the following tips and you'll avoid erroneous results, tedious relinking, and other headaches.

Use External Data in Formulas

There's one major deficiency in 2.2's linking power: You can't directly refer to an external cell in a formula. You can work around this limitation by writing formulas referring to cells in the current worksheet that contain linking formulas, which in turn point to the desired source cells.

For example, suppose you want to multiply the value of cell

B6 of the current worksheet by the value of cell G6 in TOPEKA-.WK1. If you try to enter the formula +B6*<<TOPEKA>>G6, 1-2-3 will just beep at you and refuse to accept the formula. Instead, enter +<<TOPEKA>>G6 into an unused cell of the current worksheet, say K15. Then the formula +B6*K15 will produce the desired result.

Don't Change File Names


Avoid renaming files referenced in linking formulas-when you change the name of the source file, 1-2-3 loses the link. If you must change a file name, use Range Search Formulas Replace to update the linking formulas. To change the name of the source file from TOPEKA to SANTA_FE, you would use Range Search, enter a range large enough to include all the linking formulas, enter topeka as the string to search for, choose Formulas Replace, enter santa _fe as the replacement string, and choose All to change all references.

Include the Path When Changing Directories

Logging to a different directory can also break links. If you regularly change the default directory during a 1-2-3 session, always include the full path name of the source file in your linking formulas: for example, +<<C:\123\SALES\TOPEKA>>G16.

You must also include the full path in linking formulas when the source and current worksheets are in different directories. For instance, if your department has a LAN, you may need to link an active worksheet to source files on the server.

Skip the Path When Moving Files

On the other hand, several people may need to work on the same set of linked worksheets. When they're passed from one person to the next, the files will likely end up in a directory with a different name, where linking formulas including the old path name won't work.

There are two ways to solve this problem. The simplest is to avoid using paths in the linking formulas and just put the files in your current default directory. If for some reason you must specify paths, update them with the Range Search Formulas Replace method discussed earlier.

Link to Named Ranges When Source Files Change

When you move data referenced by a linking formula from one cell to another, the linking formula still returns the value of the old cell—now incorrect. To avoid this problem, link to range names instead of cell references. Since range names are moved along with the cell entries to which they apply, you'll be sure to stay linked to the right data even when the external file is revised.

For instance, in the source file TOPEKA.WK1, you would use Range Name Create to name the one-cell range G16 "SALES." Then in the current file, you could replace the formula +<<TOPEKA>>G16 with +<<TOPEKA>>SALES.

When you move the data in cell G16 of TOPEKA.WK1 to another cell, the range name moves along with it, and +<<TOPEKA>> SALES still returns the right value.

Note that when you link to a multicell named range, the linking formula returns the value of only the top left cell of the range—not the sum of all the values, as you might expect.

Recalculate Your Worksheets

In many cases, a linking formula may reference a source cell containing a formula or function.

Unfortunately, 1-2-3 may not return the correct result if the source worksheet is set for manual recalculation—and you forget to recalculate after making changes.

You can easily avoid such problems by always recalculating worksheets before you save them. If your source files come from someone else, be on the safe side and retrieve, recalculate, and save every linked file.


Even with automatic recalculation, false values can easily occur when you have a hierarchy of linked files. Say summary files for each county in Kansas are consolidated by linking formulas in KANSAS.WK1, which in turn contains source cells used by linking formulas in USA.WK1. If you update linked data in a county worksheet, data in USA.WK1 won't be current until you update the linking formulas in KANSAS.WK1 by retrieving, recalculating, and saving it.

Keep Links Up-to-Date on LANs

On a LAN, someone else can edit a source file referenced by linking formulas in your active worksheet. However, changes in the linked external data are not automatically reflected in your worksheet. Before you can update your active worksheet, the other user must first save the source file. Then you use the File Admin Link Refresh command to update the values of your linking formulas.

When 2.2 Just Won't Do

1-2-3 release 2.2's cell-linking facility is a great tool—up to a point. With 1-2-3 release 3 you can refer to external ranges directly in formulas and functions; if an external file is in memory, you can even specify an external range with pointing techniques. If you regularly consolidate large amounts of data, seriously consider the upgrade to 1-2-3 release 3. —Steven Stewart Cobb

form calculations, saving time and eliminating typos.

A function macro is similar to a built-in function such as SUM(), except that the user defines its purpose. It accepts arguments (values or cell references), carries out the operations you've defined, and returns the results. You set up a function macro by opening a new macro sheet, naming the function, and typing in the desired parameters. Save the function macro, and it's placed in the Paste function menu along with Excel's built-in functions.

With a built-in function, you can paste in the function and its arguments by first turning on the Paste arguments check box within the Formula Paste function dialog box. For example, for IF() you get IF(logical_test, value_if_true,_value_if_false). Pasting a function with its arguments in place is useful when you don't remember what they are or what their order is. If you follow the advice in the Excel manual, however, the function macros that you paste into a worksheet won't include their arguments. A second hassle: Every time you use a function macro in a formula, you must reference the name of the macro sheet that holds the function. Luckily, with two littleknown tricks discussed here, you can iron out these wrinkles in no time flat and make function macros as easy to use as Excel's built-in functions.

How to Build a Function Macro

If you're new to function macros, check out this quick overview. If you already know how function macros work, go to the next section, "Setting Up the Sustainable Growth Macro."

Suppose you travel overseas and need to monitor the weather. You're used to reading temperatures in degrees Fahrenheit, but most places you visit use the Celsius scale. Here's a function macro that accepts your Celsius input (the argument), converts it to Fahrenheit, and then returns the result.

To set up this macro, you'll open a new macro sheet, name it, specify the argument using *Excel*'s ARGUMENT() function, type in a formula that uses the argument, name that formula cell, and use the RESULT() function to return the answer. Then you'll open a separate worksheet and actually use the macro.

- Open a macro sheet by choosing File New Macro sheet OK.
 In cell A2, type Convert (the macro's name), and press < Enter>. To name the function macro, select Formula Define name; the program will suggest Convert.
 Select Function at the bottom of the dialog box, and then OK.
 In cell A3, type = argument("Celsius"). This function defines the function macro's argument, Celsius.
- 4. In cell A4, type the Celsiusto-Fahrenheit conversion formula: = Celsius*9/5+32.
- 5. In cell A5, type =return(Fahrenheit) to indicate that the macro will finish here and that it should return the value that is in the cell named Fahrenheit.
- 6. Go back to cell A4 and select Formula Define name. Type Fahrenheit and press <Enter> to name that cell.
- Save the macro sheet and name it temp.
- 8. To use the macro, open a new worksheet, from any cell select *Formula Paste function*, and pick *TEMP.XLM!Convert()* from the bottom of the list.

Select OK, and TEMP.XLM!-Convert() will appear in the formula bar. All you need to do now is type a number representing degrees in Celsius between the two parentheses. To see the function in action, type 20 and press <Enter>. The program will convert the Celsius number and return a balmy 68 degrees Fahrenheit.

Setting Up the Sustainable Growth Macro


SCREEN 1 shows a macro sheet that performs a sustainable growth calculation and illustrates some of the function macro tricks hinted at earlier. Notice that SCREEN 1 is actually composed of two sheets: a macro sheet at the top that contains the function macro, and a worksheet at the bottom that contains financial values and shows the function macro in use.

dBASE IV: Without Assistance



SCREEN 1: The sustainable growth calculation illustrated here can help you expand your business while keeping the debt-to-equity ratio constant, and it demonstrates two nifty function macro tricks to boot.

The function macro calculates the sustainable growth rate, the maximum growth rate a business can maintain without increasing its debt-to-equity ratio. The growth rate is equal to the firm's return-on-equity ratio (calculated by the first three arguments shown on the screen: Margin, Turnover, and Leverage) as reduced by the fourth argument, Dividends (the dividend payout ratio). The calculation is based on the assumption that over the long term, you want sales, assets, and liabilities all to grow at the same pace. The calculation shown in cell D3 of the worksheet will tell you at what rate you can increase sales and have liabilities grow at the same rate.

To set up this application, you'll type in the function macro shown at the top of the screen, perform some basic formatting operations, and name the macro. Then you'll type in the function macro's steps shown in column B, which use ARGUMENT() functions to gather values, a couple of formulas that include those values, and the RETURN() function to send back the calculated result.

The first trick is in cell B4. The formula here enables you to paste the function macro with its arguments. You can use this formula in your own function macros by replacing *Margin* with the first argument you plan to use and replacing the function macro and its arguments in cell C2 with your own.


Next, you'll create the worksheet at the bottom of the screen, entering in cells B2 through B5 the values that the macro will use in its calculations. You'll use the function macro in cell D3 and see the results of the sustainable growth calculation there. Finally, you'll test the paste-with-arguments trick.

1. To open a new macro sheet, choose File New Macro sheet OK.

- Turn off its grid lines by choosing Options Display, deselecting Gridlines, and selecting OK.
- 3. Select Format Font 1 Fonts Helv 8 OK to change to a smaller font so you can see everything. Type the macro label SusGrth into cell A2. Then adjust the column widths as shown.
- 4. To name the macro, go to cell B2, and choose *Formula Define name*. *Excel* will suggest the name *SusGrth*. Select *Function* at the bottom of the dialog box, and then *OK*.
- 5. Enter the description of the SusGrth macro's purpose as shown in cell B2, and enter the macro with its arguments as shown in cell C2.
- Enter the formula shown in cell B3. This formula assigns the value of the first argument to the range name Margin.
- 7. Enter the formula shown in cell B4: = if(isna(Margin),return("="&c2)). This is the formula that pastes the function macro with its arguments into your worksheet. The formula tests for arguments by checking whether the first argument, Margin, is present. If you omit the arguments when you enter or paste in the function macro, Excel will assign the error value NA to the name Margin and return an equal sign and any text-in this case, the macro function with its arguments-present in cell C2.

Later, you'll test this formula by pasting = MACRO.XLM!SusGrth() into the worksheet, deliberately omitting the arguments. The program will obligingly supply = SusGrth(margin,assets_turnover,debt/equity,div_payout%).

8. Enter the formulas shown in cells B5 through B7; those for-

mulas capture the remaining arguments required to calculate the sustainable growth rate.

- 9. Enter the macro's formulas in cells B8 through B10. These formulas calculate the sustainable growth rate.
- Next, enter the documentation shown in cells C3 through C8.
- 11. Finally, to add borders, highlight the range A2 through C10 and select Format Border Outline Left Right OK. Highlight the area B8 through C10, and select Format Border Outline OK. Then highlight cells B2 and C2, and choose Format Border Outline OK. Save the macro sheet as macro xim.

Setting Up the Sustainable Growth Worksheet

Now that you've finished setting up the macro, you'll create the worksheet containing the values the macro will work on, use the macro, and see the result of its calculation.

- Open a new worksheet and size it to fit under the macro sheet.
- 2. Set the font to Helv 8 as you did for the macro sheet, and enter the labels in column A at the bottom of the screen.
- 3. Format cells B2, B4, B5, and D3 for percent using *Format Number 0%* and then enter the values shown in cells B2, B3, B4, and B5. These are typical examples of financial data that the macro will use to perform its calculations.
- 4. In cell D1, type in the label Sustainable Growth Rate.
- 5. Now paste in the function without its arguments. Go to cell D2 and select Formula Paste function. Pick MACRO.XLM!-SusGrth() from the bottom of the list. Select OK, and the func-

tion macro, minus arguments, will appear in the formula bar. Press <Enter>, and the function macro and its arguments appear in cell D2 as shown.

6. Instead of picking the function from the list, you can simply type it in. Go to cell D3 to do so, but this time include cell references for the arguments by typing = macro.xlm!susgrth(b2,b3,b4,b5).Press <Enter>, and the result of the function macro, 36%, will appear. Apparently, this business can grow at a very healthy rate. 7. Finally, select Options Display and turn off the grid lines in your worksheet. Select cells A1 and D1, and add formatting enhancements by selecting Format Font 2 Fonts Helv 8. In the Style box, select *Underline*, and if the Bold check box doesn't contain an X, choose Bold. Then select OK and save the worksheet as sheet.xls.

Function Macros Meet Formulas

The finishing touch is to eliminate the need to supply a macro sheet reference when you use function macros in formulas. The trick is relatively simple: Just define the name of each function macro within your worksheet. Once that's done, you won't have to enter =MACRO.XLM!-SusGrth(B2,B3,B4,B5) to use the SusGrth macro, but only =SusGrth(B2,B3,B4,B5).

With the pointer on a blank cell in SHEET.XLS, choose Formula Define name. At the Name: prompt, type SusGrth; at the Refers to: prompt, type = macro.xlm!SusGrth and select OK.

Having assigned this name in your worksheet to the name of a function macro, you can use it just as you would any standard *Excel* worksheet function. As a test, go to cell D2, press <f2> to edit the formula, and delete *MACRO.XLM!*, leaving behind = *SusGrth(B2,B3,B4,B5)*. Press <**Enter>**, and the same result, 36%, pops into the cell.

Now your function macro is indistinguishable from a built-in *Excel* function. But to avoid confusion, use uppercase and lowercase letters in your function macro names.

POWER TIP NO. 95

Run Windows Apps Inside Desqview/386

If you are a Desqview/386 user, you can still run Windows-based programs. To run an application in its Windows run-time version, simply set up a Desqview task that calls the program by its executable file name, such as EXCEL.EXE. To run Windows/286 within Desqview, call WIN.COM. The problem with Windows/386 is that both it and Desqview/386 want to control the 80386's virtual 8086 mode. The solution? Bypass WIN386.EXE, which controls the virtual 8086 mode, and set up a Desqview task that runs the program WIN86.COM. You can then run Windows applications inside Windows/386 and DOS programs in Desqview simultaneously.



Substituting References for Arguments

When you eliminate the function macro's file name from formulas, you gain an additional benefit. Suppose you've forgotten which arguments a function macro requires. You can remind yourself by pasting in the arguments and then using Excel's Point mode to substitute the desired cell references for the arguments. To see what I mean, follow these steps: 1. Enter = SusGrth() into cell D3 of SHEET.XLS, and press <Enter>. The macro will return the text $value = SusGrth(margin, assets_{-}$ turnover, debt/equity, div_payout%) in that cell, but the formula bar shows only = SusGrth(). 2. To display the SusGrth() function's arguments, turn on Excel's edit mode by pressing <F2>, then press <F9> (Calculate All). 3. Now you can easily replace each argument with its appropriate cell reference. Highlight the argument margin in the formula bar (mouse users can do so by simply double-clicking the argument), then click on cell B2, which contains the value for the profit margin. Excel will replace margin with B2, the cell that contains the value you want. 4. Substitute the cell for the remaining arguments, assets_turnover, debt/equity, and div_payout%. Highlight the arguments in turn, and click cells B3, B4, and B5, respectively. 5. Finally, press <Enter>, and Excel returns the completed formula, as shown in the formula bar at the top of SCREEN 1.

As you can see, function macros are a powerful tool for turning a generic power spreadsheet into a tailor-made analytical tool. And with these tips, your function macros will be easier to create, use, and remember.

Excel Q&A: Ten Common Problems (and How to Solve Them)

With the help of Microsoft's technical support staff, an Excel master offers expert answers to ten perplexing spreadsheet problems.

What you need: Microsoft Excel

even basic questions can require hours of intensive sleuthing in the Excel manual.

After consulting Microsoft's technical support crew—and after reflecting on my years of helping people use Excel—I pulled together ten of the questions most commonly asked by Excel users. The queries range from the simple to the complex, but chances are most Excel users have wrestled with a couple. If you're struggling with formatting, formulas, printing wide worksheets, or just sluggish macros, read on.

Q. How do I round cell values to the nearest multiple of 5 in Excel?

- **A.** Create a formula that divides the value by 5, then rounds that number to the nearest integer. Finally, multiply that value by 5. The formula would take the following form:
- = ROUND(formula/5,0)*5
- **Q.** When I create an area chart, Excel plots all numbers as absolute values, so negative numbers show up as positive. How can I remedy this?
- **A.** To display the negative values on the chart (so the series markers dip below the horizontal axis), you must change the formatting of the chart as follows:

With the chart in the active window, select Format Main chart. Then uncheck the Stacked box under the Format section, and click OK.

- **Q.** I have a worksheet containing very large numbers (like \$60,185,350,000) that I need to round to millions of dollars for display purposes. Yet I also need to reference the exact values in other formulas. How can I get rid of the unwanted digits?
- **A.** You can't use the ROUND function, because it would change the actual values. The only solution is to create a custom number format—in this case, #,##0,,.

Highlight the desired cells in the worksheet, select *Format Numbers*, pick #,##0 from the list of formats, and add two commas on the Format: line. Click *OK*, and the custom format is applied. By not placing any # or 0 to the right of the trailing commas, you're telling *Excel* to show only significant digits in the millions place. Thus 16,568,974 would be displayed as 17.



SCREEN 1: It's easy to create a scatter chart with Excel. Select the data in a worksheet (such as TV.XLS), select a few commands, and pick the chart you want from a gallery of examples.

- Q. I work hard to make my worksheets presentable before I show them to my boss. But sometimes I'm too rushed to properly format part of a worksheet. Is there a quick way to copy formats from one cell to another?
- **A.** Yes. Select the cell with the desired formatting, select *Edit Copy*, highlight the target cell or range you want to copy the format to, and select *Edit Paste special*. Check off *Formats* in the Paste box, click *OK*, and you're done. You can also copy other elements, such as formulas, values, and notes.
- **Q.** I have some survey results, and I need to plot one variable against another. How can I do this in Excel?
- **A.** By creating a scatter chart, otherwise known as an *x-y* plot. Let's suppose you surveyed


- people concerning their years of education and the number of hours per week they spent watching television, and you received the responses shown in TV.XLS in SCREEN 1. To create a scatter chart from this data, type the data into the range A3:B14 in a new *Excel* worksheet. Then
- 1. Select the range A3:B14.
- Choose the Edit Copy command.
- Select File New and then Chart from the dialog box, and click OK.
- 4. Select Edit Paste special.
- 5. Check the Categories in first column box, and click OK.
- 6. Choose *Gallery Scatter*, and select the first example scatter chart in the top left corner. Click *OK*, and the scatter chart will pop onto the screen. At this point you can save the chart, add labels, and further manipulate it.

- Q. Once I've designated a portion of a worksheet as the print area using Options Set print area, I can't seem to reset the print area for the entire worksheet. What am I doing wrong?
- **A.** When you choose *Options Set* print area, Excel assigns the name 'Print_Area' to the selected portion of the worksheet. To reverse the settings, simply select Formula Define name, highlight 'Print_Area' in the subsequent dialog box, and click Delete.
- Q. I've got a really wide monthto-month sales worksheet that compares current- and last-year figures. I'd like to print a condensed version for management that contains only summary figures and omits the detail. However, the Options Set print area command won't let me define a print area consisting of two or more discontinuous ranges. What do I do?
- A. The simplest approach is to hide the columns you don't need. Display the entire worksheet on screen by reducing the font size to 6 points (see SCREEN 2). Let's say you want the summary to contain only 1989 and 1988 totals, along with the percentage increase or decrease.

Select the columns between the labels and the totals (in this case, C through H), and reduce the column width to zero (see SCREEN 3). Then simply choose File Print.

To restore columns C through H to normal width, move the cursor to column C (the cursor will seem to disappear). Press <F8> (the Extend key), then press <Cursor Right> five (continues)

times. Select Format Column width, and enter the desired width.

Q. I recorded a macro that enters a large number of formulas and values into various sections

of a worksheet. But the extensive cell movement bogs down macro execution. Is there any way to speed things up?

A. When you record a macro, *Excel* generates a list of macro commands in a macro sheet.

Every time you move to a cell and enter a value, a formula, or a cell reference (hereafter collectively referred to as *formulas*), both a SELECT() function and a FORMULA() function are added to the list, as, for example:

- = SELECT("R1C1")
- = FORMULA("Employee")
- = SELECT("R2C1")
- = FORMULA("Number")

Each individual function increases the time it takes to complete a macro. SELECT() functions, which move the cell pointer, are especially time consuming.

Fortunately, you can speed things up by editing the macro so that FORMULA() "pokes" formulas into specific cells without using SELECT(). Simply open the macro sheet and replace each SELECT()/FORMULA() pair with a single FORMULA() function that includes the target cell's reference as the function's second argument. The previous example would then read:

- = FORMULA("Employee",
- "R1C1")
- = FORMULA("Number", "R2C1")

If you want to specify the target relative to some other cell (the active cell, say), you can include an OFFSET() function as the second argument of the FORMULA() function, as in:

- = SELECT("R1C1")
- = FORMULA("Employee",OFF-SET(ACTIVE.CELL(),0,0))
- = FORMULA("Number", OFF-SET(ACTIVE.CELL(),1,0)) OFFSET()'s last two arguments specify the number of rows (down) and columns (across) from the first argument, which in this example is the ACTIVE-.CELL() as defined by SELECT().

Q. We have a few Macintoshes running Excel in our office, and we need to move worksheet files between the PCs and the Macs. How do we do this?

A. You can pass PC and Macintosh files via a common directory on a server if your systems are networked, or via floppy disks if one of your Macintoshes has a drive that can read PC disks (Dayna Communications' Dayna-File is one example). Or, if you have a recently manufactured Macintosh IIcx or IIci and Macintosh Operating System version 6.0, you can use either of those systems' SuperDrive floppy disk drive and the Apple File Exchange facility to read PC disks.

Just remember that both PC and Mac Excel files must be saved in the SYLK format using File Save as Options SYLK OK. Also, PC Excel uses a different date system than its Mac counterpart. Before you enter any dates in your DOS Excel worksheets, you must select Options Calculation and turn on the 1904 date system check box. When you move Mac Excel files saved in the SYLK format to the PC, the 1904 date system is automatically set for you.

Q. A financial template I've developed for my staff incorporates formulas that divide existing worksheet values by values the user enters. Unfortunately, when you first load the template, it displays numerous #DIV/0! error messages, indicating an attempt to divide a number by zero. Some new users find the error messages disconcerting. Is there any way to suppress them but still display the computed values once the template is filled in?

A. The trick is to display a space whenever a cell returns any of *Excel*'s error values. For example, if you were dividing 5 by the value of cell B11, you'd use the formula = IF(ISERROR(5/B11), "",5/B11).

The second argument in the ISERROR function, a space enclosed by quotes, ensures that a space is displayed if an error is returned. Once a value is entered in cell B11, the result of 5 divided by the value of cell B11 will be returned. —Ralph Soucie

Listing Your Files by Date

Although a list of files in order by date is useful for checking revisions and doing an audit of your directories, DOS has no direct way of creating one. Luckily, there's a workaround using the SORT command. The following command typed at the DOS prompt produces a list in ascending date order:

dir : sort /+24 : more Make sure that SORT.EXE and MORE.COM are in a directory on your path before using this command.

The +24 starts DOS's sort at the 24th column of the screen, which is where the date begins in a directory listing. Unfortunately, this technique doesn't sort by year. Replacing +24 with +31 will sort by year but not by month or day. You can also sort by file extension using +10 or by file size with +13. The MORE command shows long listings one screen at a time. Adding /r before the /+ will reverse the sort.

Don't forget that you can specify a subset of files; for example, all files that begin with A (dir a*.*). It is also possible to print the list by substituting > PRN for : MORE. The following command prints a list of all the files with the extension DOC in the default directory by date:

dir *.doc : sort/+24 > prn Jim Walters Tucson Computer Society

ever: Using ATTRIB to change attributes for a block of files still requires asterisks.

If you forget to include a destination with your COPY command, DOS is supposed to produce the error message 'File cannot be copied onto itself'. Unfortunately, with some versions of DOS, this doesn't happen with a COPY . command. Instead, DOS attempts to copy the files onto themselves, corrupting any that exceed 64K. Check with a test file on a floppy disk to see if your version is "safe."

WordPerfect's Special Characters Versus ASCII's

WordPerfect can produce an extraordinary range of characters, far outnumbering the extended ASCII character set. Accented letters, foreign characters, and typographical symbols are among those available. If a character isn't supported by your printer's character set, you won't be able to print it at all using *WordPerfect 5.0*; version 5.1 will print it as a graphic.

These special characters are grouped into sets, such as mathematical symbols or the Japanese alphabet. To call up a special character, you could press <Ctrl>-V, enter the set number, a comma, then the character number. For example, to get a lower case n with a tilde (\sim) over it, you could type <Ctrl>-V1,57<Enter>. However, many characters can be composed at the keyboard, obviating the need to remember obscure set and character numbers. To enter ñ, simply press <Ctrl>-Vn~ and the character appears. WordPerfect cannot display every special character. It displays only ASCII, extended ASCII, and, with the proper video setup, special characters from its FRS screen font files; others are represented by square bullets.

The characters and their associated codes can be found in a file called CHARACTR.DOC that is probably in your *Word*- Perfect directory. If you print this document—all 12 sections and 33 pages of it—you will have a ready checklist of what characters your printer supports and what codes call them up [see FIGURE 1].

Speeding Up ProComm-to-MCI ASCII Transfers

Does ProComm Plus seem a little sluggish when it uploads ASCII files to MCI Mail? Pro-Comm's default ASCII transfer setting inserts a 1-second pause at the end of each transmitted line. However, MCI Mail doesn't require a pause to receive data. To alter transfer settings, press <Alt>-S to display the settings menu and select ASCII Transfer Options. Now set character pacing to 5 milliseconds and press 5 to set line pacing to half a second. You'll be pleasantly surprised by the speed improvement.





Run a QuickBASIC program that creates batch-file menus, execute AUTOEXEC.BAT commands once and only once a day, use a script to print Paradox table structures, and learn how NUL can detect files and directories.

Menus by the Batch

I've always been impressed by the shaded-window menus frequently found in commercial software, and I wanted similar results from my batch file menus. So I wrote a *Quick-BASIC* program, MAKE-MENU.BAS [see LISTING 1], to produce batch files that display up to eight menu items. You then edit the batch files to add the commands for each item.

Jim Dawson Ormstown, Quebec, Canada Editor's note: To create a menu batch file, run MAKEMENU-.BAS with QuickBASIC. Answer the prompts for a menu title, the number of selections (from 1 to 8), and the text to display for each selection. When MAKE-MENU asks for an output file name, press <Enter> to create MENU.BAT, or enter a different name.

You'll also need a program called CHOICE.COM, which the MAKEMENU.BAS batch files use to position the cursor and return ERRORLEVEL responses. To create CHOICE.COM, run the DOS DEBUG utility, and type the commands listed in FIGURE 1 (minus semicolons and comments).

Before running a MAKE-MENU batch file, check that CHOICE.COM is in a directory in the current path and that CONFIG.SYS contains the line DEVICE = d:\path\ANSI-.SYS, where d:\path is the optional drive and path for ANSI.SYS. Use a text editor to place appropriate commands after the :CHOICEn labels in the menu batch file, leaving the GOTO START commands in place.

Another Day, Another Boot

The commands in 1ADAY.BAT [see LISTING 2] let AUTOEXEC-.BAT determine if it has run more than once on the same day. (continues)

This allows AUTOEXEC.BAT to issue a subset of its DOS commands and run programs the first time you boot without letting it repeat them if you reboot

later on. You might use this to check an electronic mail box every morning or run a daily diagnostic.

store the current date in a temporary file called 1ADAY.\$\$1. It then tests whether TODAY. DAT exists from a previous boot. If so, the program uses MS-DOS's commands FC and FIND to compare TODAY. DAT with 1ADAY.\$\$1. If the files match, FIND writes the first line of FC's output (fc: no differences encountered) to a second temporary file, 1ADAY.\$\$2. Otherwise, that file will be empty, stopping COPY from creating a third temporary file, 1ADAY-.CHK (COPY won't copy a zerolength file).

If 1ADAY.CHK exists, the date in TODAY.DAT must be current, and the batch file jumps to NEXTBOOTS, leaving the BOOT environment variable blank. If the date is not current, 1ADAY.\$\$1 is renamed TODAY.DAT, and an environment variable BOOT is set to "FIRST," letting an IF statement determine if this is the first boot of the day.

Editor's note: If your DOS version has COMP.COM instead of FC.EXE, replace the batch file's fifth line with the two lines echo N: comp today.dat 1aday.\$\$1 : find "ok" > 1aday.\$\$2 and cls. The CLS erases COMP.COM's 'Compare more files' prompt.

Test the batch file by running it twice. The first time, you'll see a welcoming message. The next time, you won't—proving that the batch file has correctly determined that it's already run today.

Copy the batch file commands into AUTOEXEC.BAT after your PATH command. Make (continues)

sure the path includes the directory containing the FIND and FC (or COMP) DOS utilities. Replace the REM statement with the commands to execute once a day.

Printing Paradox Table Structures

I use a Paradox 3.0 PAL script, PRSTRUCT.SC [see LISTING 3], to print reports of my tables' structures. This script is more convenient than bringing up a table's structure using Tools Info Structure Table, entering a table name, and hitting <Print Screen>. It also produces a neater report.

DEVELOPER'S TOOLBOX

Feasting on a Package for Pros


I want tools that are easy to use, don't cost too much, and increase my productivity. A tall order? Maybe, but it's the rare tool kit or utility that has enough ingredients to fill my plate.

Take programmers' calculators. In the past, I've used SideKick's, but I never could remember which function keys to press for hexadecimal digits A through F, and I disliked the small window that showed results in only one format at a time. So I went back to using my trusty \$10 Sears desk calculator—that is, until I received a copy of Bob Falk's outstanding ProPak 2.02.

In addition to its pop-up integer calculator, this tool kit includes a keyboard
reference that shows BIOS scan codes
and dBASE INKEY() function results in
binary, hexadecimal, and decimal. It
also features an ASCII character chart
that lists color attribute combinations
plus extended ASCII line, box, and math
symbols. And a keystroke recorder
saves commands for later playback—
great for creating program templates
and constructing simple keystroke
macros.

Falk Data Systems' ProPak includes three versions of the program: two 70K resident versions—one of which can be loaded after the original SideKick—and an 85K stand-alone model that's compatible with multitasking software such as Desqview and OmniView. If you have EMS memory to spare, ProPak can store its overlays there to conserve system RAM and improve performance.

ProPak's main course is its calculator, which simultaneously displays signed and unsigned results in decimal, hexadecimal, binary, and octal. Easyto-learn commands let me enter expres-

sions with common arithmetic operators as well as Boolean logic AND, OR,
NOT, and XOR binary shift functions
and operators. And I can use a unique
"change-bits" feature to toggle individual digits in a 32-bit binary integer—
especially handy for testing out I/O
port register values and other packed
bit-field structures. Somebody has finally written a programmer's calculator
with features I can really use.

What's more, supplied with ProPak are 11 programs licensed from Turbo-Power Software's Turbo Professional 5.0 tool kit ("Developer's Toolbox," Star-Dot-Star, January 1989). These include MARK and RELEASE, which remove TSRs from RAM; WATCH, for monitoring a TSR's activity; and DEVICE, which reports on currently loaded device drivers.

All of these tasty tidbits make Pro-

Pak a feast of plenty. But I'd buy it just to get the calculator and keyboard reference. The rest is pure gravy.





compilers. That feature is NUL, which DOS recognizes as a phantom file that exists in every directory, even though the NUL file occupies no disk space and does not show up in DIR listing.

The batch file first tests if parameter %1 is blank. If not, it

checks if %1 refers to an existing file or to the root directory (\). If neither is true, the fourth IF statement checks if %1\NUL exists. If it does, %1 is a subdirectory of the current directory. Otherwise, the parameter is neither a file nor a directory.

Editor's note: This batch file and the original C version operate identically, except for one minor difference. The batch file allows the use of *.* and other wild card specifications. The C program does not. To use WHAT-IS.BAT, type whatisname, and the program will tell you whether name exists as a file or a directory.

NETWORK Q&A

Tips and strategies for departmental networking

Three detailed scenarios will help you provide remote dial-in access to your LAN. The newest of these, featuring Novell's NetWare Access Server, may save you nearly \$14,000.

David Ferris

Q. We have a 30-node network. Four of us use modems to access a remote VAX and to get E-mail from MCI. We also have 5 salespeople who log on to the network from around the country using PC Anywhere to access 5 dedicated PCs in the office. We're about to add 15 new salespeople, and if possible, we'd like to avoid buying 15 more PCs. And as long as we're rethinking our dial-in situation, we'd also like to give everyone in the office dial-out capabilities. Is there an economical way to upgrade and centralize our phone activities?

Mike Smith Houston, Texas **A.** The short answer is, Yes indeed! We addressed dial-out options in last month's column. This time we'll look at the dial-in part of your question.

Keeping It Simple: The Stand-Alone Host

The "stand-alone host" approach you're currently using (in which a remote user dials in to a dedicated PC on the network) is certainly workable. After logging on, the remote user employs a program like Carbon Copy Plus or PC Anywhere III on his or her laptop to run applications on the host PC. Screen changes and keystrokes are relayed over the telephone line.

As long as the number of remote users is relatively small, this system is fine—but costs escalate fast as the remote population increases. Obviously, dif-

ferent LANs have different requirements, but a good rule of thumb is to have one host PC for every 3 remote users. Hence, seven hosts can probably handle the needs of 20 salespeople. Even so, this is an expensive solution, as indicated in TABLE 1. Total cost: \$32,716.

A Better Solution: Clustered Hosts

You can achieve substantial savings using "clustered hosts." In this scenario each user still logs on to a dedicated local host, but these hosts are implemented either on adapter boards (like Cubix's QuickLink) that fit into a file server or bridge, or on a separate chassis (like J & L Information Systems' Chatterbox). A single QuickLink board, for excentinues)

ample, can provide two 80286 CPUs (or four slower 8088 CPUs). TABLE 2 shows the cost of a typical clustered hosts installation: \$28,736. That's a saving of nearly \$4000 compared with the stand-alone host model. You can save even more if you use 8088 CPUs.

Latest and Greatest: Access Server

Novell's NetWare access server, which consists of special multitasking software running on an 80386 or 80386SX PC, is an important new option for NetWare users. Using *PC Anywhere*, up to 15 remote users can dial in to one of these units simultaneously; however, you'll still need a separate modem for every incoming phone line. If you want to install more modems than there are serial ports in the access server, you'll also need one or

more multiple-port expansion boards (such as Novell's WNIM +).

TABLE 3 shows a cost breakdown for the access server scenario. The total is only \$18,898—nearly \$14,000 cheaper than the standalone host version, and almost \$10,000 less than the clustered hosts model.

Things to Consider

Graphics. All these remote dialin schemes handle screen updates via the phone line, and this can be slow. Updating a graphics screen requires the transfer of massive amounts of data-and if the modem is poky, remote users may be stuck twiddling their thumbs. If your applications use graphics, you may want to spend the money for high-speed errorcorrecting, data-compressing modems such as Hayes's new Ultra Smartmodem 9600; with effective data transfer rates of up to 38,000 bps, they can improve response time by an order of magnitude. Reinstalling your applications for CGA, where possible, will speed screen updates as well.

Software Compatibility. Some applications—particularly TSRs, but also software that runs under Windows, uses a mouse, or requires expanded or extended memory—may not run well via remote control. Stand-alone local hosts are least likely to have problems, and clustered hosts are next best; the NetWare Access Server setup seems to have the most difficulties. In each case, dial-in software takes up space on the host, so beware of RAM cram.

How to Decide

Cost may not be the only factor worth considering; expandability may be just as important for a growing company. If you're sure you'll never need more than three dial-in ports, the standalone host approach is probably best. Beyond that number, clustered hosts allow easy growth at reasonable cost. For NetWare LANs the access server offers a high 15-user capacity and low cost per user, but performance degrades badly when more than 5 users dial in simultaneously.

By all means do a pilot installation to check compatibility, the kind of modem you'll need, and so on. And plan for success more often than not, you'll find that demand for dial-in access increases.

TAKING IT HOME

The practical guide to home/office computing

A 286 or a 386? Buy what you need today.

Lawrence J. Magid

Getting ready to buy a new PC for your home office? If you've been following the computer press lately, you may have the impression that XTs and ATs are obsolete. Industry leaders are pushing Intel's 386SX chip as the minimum computing platform because anything less just won't run all that great 32-bit software that's supposed to arrive "real soon now."

IBM and Microsoft want you to have at least a 386SX with 2MB of memory, a 40MB hard disk, and Windows. But the dealer price on a name-brand system with that configuration easily tops \$4000. Some of you may need that kind of power or just want to get in early on what will, after all, be the basic hardware platform of the nineties.

Unfortunately, few companies will pick up the tab for an employee's home system. You may be able to get by with less hardware at home, especially if you have a more capable system at the office. For most people, a 286 system with 1MB of memory and

a 40MB hard disk will do the trick. Dealers in my area sell a brand-name clone, the Epson Equity II+, configured that way for \$1700—\$500 less than Epson's 386SX equivalent and \$2300 less than the industry ideal.

There's no question that we're moving toward 32-bit processors; the question is, when do you buy? IBM, Intel, and Microsoft want you to "invest for the future" today with a CPU capable of running OS/2, Windows, and the more powerful DOS applications.

If you're excited about multitasking under one of these environments or if you use a heavyduty application like the 32-bit version of *Paradox*, you may save money in the long run by spending the extra \$500. But if you're like most people, who use their home machine to polish documents, modify spreadsheets, or log on to electronicmail services, I recommend buying only what you'll need for the next year or two and then putting the rest in the bank.

By the time the "future" arrives, your cheap 286 will have paid for itself many times over in productivity gains and tax savings, and 386 prices will have fallen to the range of today's 286s. Then you could use the savings from your 286 purchase—plus interest—to buy a new 386 motherboard like Orchid's Privilege 386-20, which turns an AT into a 20-MHz 386 for about \$800.

Personally, I don't skimp on

home hardware, but I prefer to put my dollars in a \$600 VGA or multiscan monitor and the largest hard disk storage system I can afford. My copy of WordPerfect 5.1 occupies 2.8MB!

The September and December 1989 issues of *PC World* contain comparisons of 12- and 16-MHz ATs and 386SX systems—all pricier than the 12-MHz system I recommend. Whichever CPU you prefer, get both 5¼- and 3½-inch disk drives so that you can easily move data from any other PC; you should also invest in a modem so you can transfer files between home and office and use on-line information services.

There are plenty of other places to spend precious dollars getting set up at home. You'll be paying for a printer, software, furniture, maybe a fax board or a laptop—all subjects of future columns—and, probably, future shopping trips.




