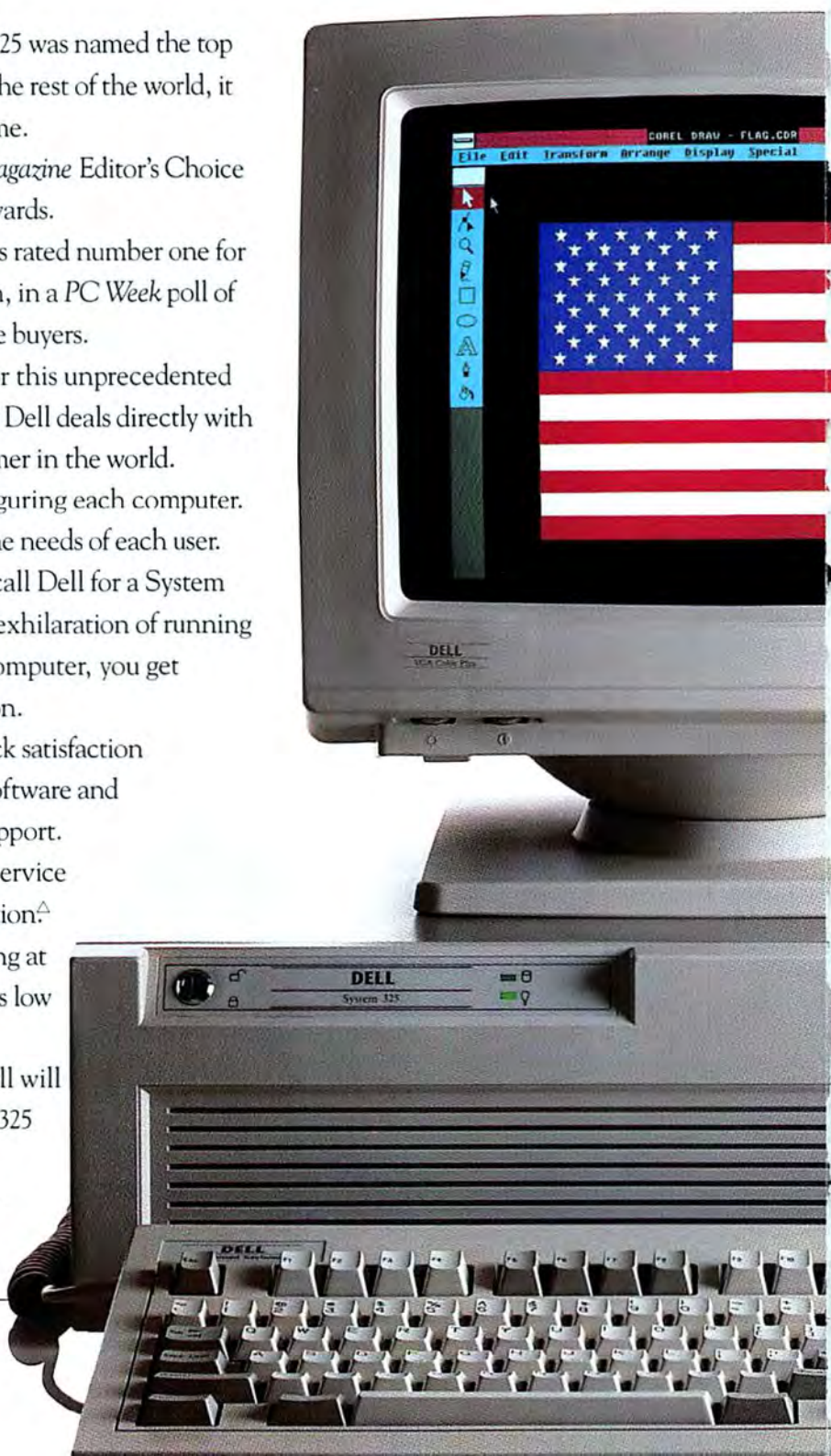

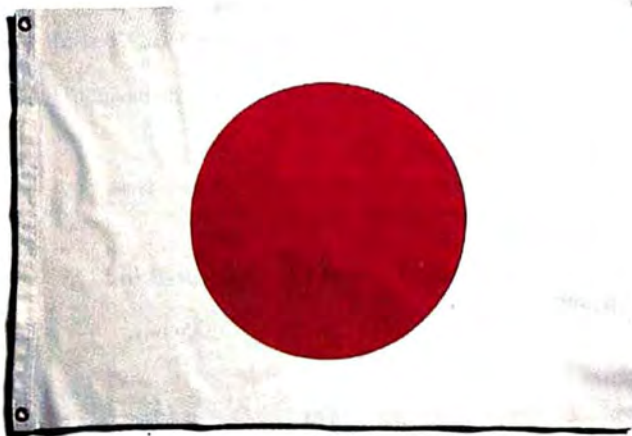

The authors are longtime *PC World* contributors—George Campbell delivers word pro-

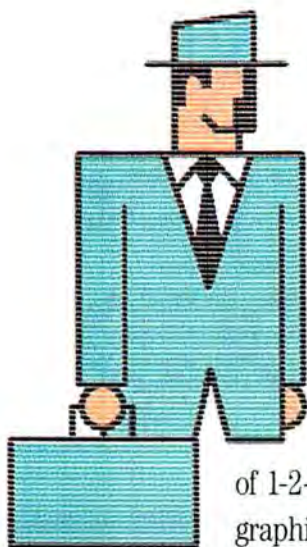

SPA Confronts Pirates

Software Publishers Are Mad as Hell and Ready to Sue Over Illegal Copies

If your company has unauthorized copies of software, you may be asked to open your hard disks to inspection by the Software Publishers Association (SPA) within 48 hours or face a lawsuit. The 609-member organization is stepping up efforts against piracy with airline commercials, letters to chief executives offering a choice of disk audit or lawsuit, and a toll-free hot line for turning in miscreants. In the past 18 months, SPA collected more than \$500,000 in settlements from 34 companies unable to provide the necessary purchase records. Those firms had to destroy the purloined software, contribute its full retail value to the SPA enforcement fund, and buy new copies—thus paying double for software. Fines generally range between \$25,000

and \$50,000, but some have exceeded \$100,000, reports SPA general counsel Mary Jane Saunders. "We insist on the two-for-one penalty payment because an important principle is involved," she adds. "Otherwise people would just use software until they got caught." While agreeing with the principle, Micro Manager Association board member Stephen Rood points out that it's often difficult to match software installations to purchase orders. But Saunders responds that SPA has easily demonstrated systematic piracy in the companies targeted; SPA gets 20 piracy reports a day, mostly from disgruntled employees, on its 800/388-7478 toll-free line. SPA self-audit kits also are available through that number.

IBM Products Released

IBM Touts Expandability of Floor-Standing PS/2 Models; Baby Laser Attacks LaserJet IIP

IBM has revamped its line of floor-standing PS/2s and also introduced a personal laser printer that should prove a worthy contender against Hewlett-Packard's LaserJet IIP. The new PS/2s range from a 386SX-based Model 65 SX, which costs \$5295 with 2MB of memory and a 23ms 60MB drive, to a 25-MHz 80386-based Model 80 priced at \$13,195 with 4MB of memory and a fast 12.5ms 320MB drive. Instead of raw processing power, Big Blue is pushing expandability: The machines offer seven free slots and up to six bays that can accept more than 1.2GB of storage. The long-awaited SCSI Micro Channel bus master adapter comes standard; it boosts disk throughput and offers connections to third-party SCSI devices. IBM is positioning all of these machines as PS/2-based network servers.

None comes close to Compaq's Systempro in processing power, but one that does—a 486-based prototype that IBM has been showing for months—was absent from the announcement. Meanwhile, IBM started playing hardball with HP by introducing the LaserPrinter E, a compact desktop unit that matches the LaserJet IIP's \$1495 list price and, at 5 pages per minute, is 25 percent faster. It can be upgraded to 10 ppm for \$1099 more. For \$948 above the base price, the LaserPrinter E can be turned into a \$2443 PostScript printer. Completing a busy day, IBM announced shipment of the Presentation Manager version of OS/2 Extended Edition with its multiuser SQL engine and of the OS/2 network software, *LAN Server 1.2*.

Font Plans Revealed

Standards Battle Looms as IBM/Adobe, Microsoft/Apple, and Hewlett-Packard Stake Out Turf

The three major camps creating scalable type fonts for *Windows* and OS/2 revealed more of their plans at Seybold's publishing conference in March, but the issue of which standards will prevail is by no means decided. IBM parted ways with frequent partner Microsoft by licensing Adobe's PostScript Type 1 font technology for OS/2 and other strategic platforms. The decision reflects customer investment in PostScript and IBM's plans for "view-and-print-anywhere" capabilities throughout its major product lines. However, Microsoft's OS/2 solution is TrueType, a part of the TrueImage page description language being developed with Apple. A similar PostScript-versus-TrueType battle is shaping

up over *Windows*, with Microsoft reporting that it may get TrueType into *Windows* as early as year's end. Adobe is expected to launch a PostScript-based rival long before that—when *Windows 3* arrives. Meanwhile, Hewlett-Packard's new LaserJet III includes a third alternative based on Agfa Compugraphics's Intellifonts. This approach is not as ambitious technically as TrueType or PostScript, but it still meets most PC users' needs and will benefit from HP's laser printer marketing muscle. HP is creating software that will install Intellifonts for OS/2 and *Windows*.

Two Silicon Valley start-ups are developing sub-systems that will let you buy a single-CPU computer and add up to three processors as you need them. NexGen Microsystems, partially funded by Compaq Computer, is working on a new CPU and a new bus architecture to be offered to system makers and sold to end users in NexGen's own four-CPU system—perhaps by year's end. Next month, S3 will introduce separate CPU, memory, and I/O subsystems that also let PC makers produce modular and easily upgraded systems. Both S3 and NexGen build supersets of the connection between the CPU and the I/O bus, enabling system makers to attach ISA, EISA, or Micro Channel buses more cheaply and with improved performance. Both insist they will run off-the-shelf OS/2

and DOS software. But while S3 initially will use Intel 386 and 486 processors, to which a Reduced Instruction Set Computing (RISC) processor can be added later, NexGen uses its own chip, a partial RISC processor that the company claims will be twice as fast as a given clock speed of any Intel chip. Vice President of Marketing Peter Janssen insists that NexGen can achieve software compatibility without licensing or reverse-engineering Intel designs. Both vendors would benefit from a future version of OS/2 that will run applications on multiple CPUs. Currently in the PC world, only UNIX can control multiple processors, although both Compaq and Novell have announced multi-processing versions of LAN operating systems.

New DisplayWrite Debuts

*Word Processor Shows
Surprising
Market
Strength*

IBM Desktop Software has rolled out a new version of *DisplayWrite*, a program that has quietly ranked third or fourth in PC word processor sales in recent years. *DisplayWrite 5 for DOS* boasts 35 new features including a command line interface, better file-handling capabilities, a page preview, improved mail merge and file import functions, and split-screen editing of two documents with cut and paste between them. International Data Corporation (IDC) estimates that *DisplayWrite's* installed base of 800,000 was about equal to *Microsoft Word's* last year, trailing *WordPerfect's* 4 million and *WordStar's* 3 million. But *DisplayWrite* gets far less respect, says IDC analyst Nancy McSharry, because its features haven't matched up well

with the others. It enjoys high sales but a low retail profile, she adds, because "75 percent of the product is sold through IBM's own potent direct-sales force." Product Marketing Manager Randy Hujar denies that *DisplayWrite* is being buoyed up and insists that most U.S. sales go through resellers. Recent agreements with Softsel and Ingram/Micro D will broaden distribution, and the new features may help boost sales. *DisplayWrite* comes in three \$495 versions aimed at different audiences: *DisplayWrite 5/2 for OS/2* with a page-composition option, version 4.2 for 8086-based systems, and *DisplayWrite 5 for hardware* at and above the 286 level.

Kaypro Files Chapter 11

*Declining
Sales, Financial
Troubles
Take Their
Toll*

Kaypro Corporation, one of the last survivors from the days of CP/M-based computing, has sought Chapter 11 protection from its creditors. Long plagued by declining market share, an eroding dealer base, and component problems, the Solana Beach, California, company ended the last three years in the red. Sales plummeted from \$72 million in 1988 to \$21.8 million in 1989, and Kaypro lost more than \$19 million. A key component of the reorganization plan will be an effort to increase the number and quality of its dealers. Their number eroded from 1100 to several hundred because of poor support, admits new chief executive Roy Salisbury. "As a firm gets into trouble, you look for

places to cut, and one of the first places to look is service and support." Salisbury brought in his own management team in February. No members of the Kay family are involved in day-to-day management, although founder Andrew Kay remains chairman of the board. Salisbury promises several new products beyond the just-introduced 386SX system and vows to help dealers provide better support to the 500,000 Kaypro users. But many observers are skeptical about his ability to turn things around. "There are a number of hurdles they'll have to overcome," says IDC analyst Bruce Stephen. "They seem almost insurmountable." ●

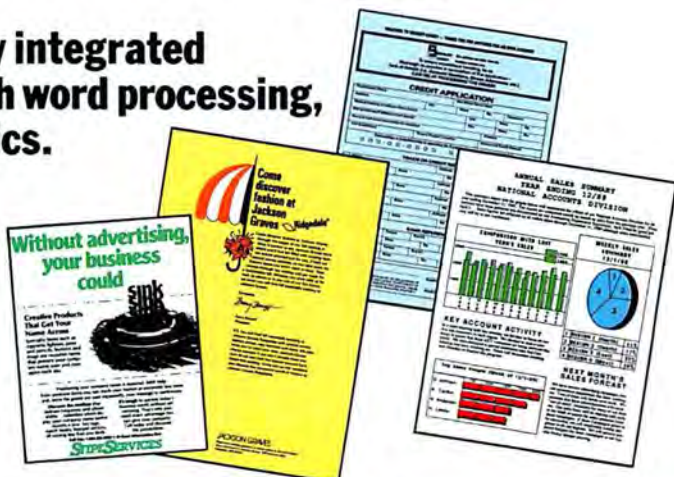

I don't know if I'm at a publishing conference or a computer conference," complained one voice at the Seybold seminar on professional publishing recently. That's where IBM announced its decision to provide Adobe PostScript font technology in the software that powers most of its systems, including OS/2's Presentation Manager (see *Top of the News* in this issue). Microsoft made news there too, taking the wraps off plans for its own page description language and font manager, which it had announced about six months earlier at another Seybold conference. (See "Now It's—Font Wars!" *Richard Landry*, November 1989.)

Once upon a time, only desktop publishers worried about fonts or about page description languages—the software that translates complex type and graphics formats into commands a printer understands. Those days are gone forever. Today's leading word processors have

the desktop publishing power to create attractive business documents—witness our review of three top *Windows* word processors in this issue. Other products like *Excel*, *Quattro Pro*, and even *1-2-3* with *Allways* show that fonts and graphics can give a new twist to any form of business information.

But It's No Picnic Unfortunately, today's font-and-graphics technologies don't have what it takes to win over most PC users. PostScript is the big leader, boasting support from most PC software packages. But PostScript printers are slower and more expensive than garden-variety LaserJets, thanks to PostScript's big appetite for printer horsepower and Adobe's high-priced licenses. Font-creation programs like Bitstream's *Fontware* and Hewlett-Packard's *Type Director* can give a LaserJet some of PostScript's pizzazz, but they take a lot of time to set up and they consume huge amounts of hard disk space, too. PostScript cartridges and clone software are price-conscious alternatives, but speed and compatibility issues can trip you up. (See "PostScript the Hard Way" in this issue.)

IBM and Microsoft are banking on the next generation of PC software to solve some of these

problems. With font and printer controls built right into *Windows* and *Presentation Manager*, it will be possible to create high-impact documents and spreadsheets without a lot of advance preparation or hassle. We'll be able to share information more easily among co-workers too, despite differences in the kinds of systems or software we happen to be using. Maybe even more important, programmers will take advantage of typography and graphics to make tomorrow's PC programs easier to use. Correct use of typography will become part of the programmer's craft, just like it's part of the successful desktop publisher's bag of tricks.

Still, there's one thing wrong with this rosy picture: IBM wants to go with the proven standard in Adobe PostScript; Microsoft, meanwhile, has teamed up with Apple to create what it believes is a better version of PostScript, with font technology that gives vendors new ways to make typography flexible, inexpensive, and easy to use. For the moment, neither side seems willing to budge on the issue, so this difference of opinion has all the makings of a full-blown battle over the future of PC software.

I noted the "advice" from Microsoft and IBM in February's *Industry Outlook*—"choose OS/2 if your machine has more than 2MB of memory and 30MB of

Thank you for a generally accurate report on SoftKlone's *Mirror III LAN* [*Product Outlook*, February 1990]. I would, however, like to point out one serious mistake. You state, "In the case of *Mirror III LAN*, you must also dedicate a gateway PC to communications tasks." While this is entirely true, it incorrectly implies that *Procomm Plus Network* does not have the same requirement. Both *Mirror III LAN* and *Procomm Plus Network* can use an asynchronous communications server (ACS) to allow modem sharing. The most common configuration of an ACS requires a dedicated PC to handle communications.

Second Look: LAN Storage

At PC World we make every effort to ensure that our reviews are accurate and our conclusions valid. Much to our embarrassment, "LAN Storage: It Doesn't Come Easy" (December 1989) contained factual errors that led to a number of faulty conclusions about several hard disks manufactured by Storage Dimensions. PC World regrets the errors, and we apologize for any problems our review may have caused our readers and Storage Dimensions.

After the original review appeared, we reexamined three of the Storage Dimensions products. Here are the conclusions we reached in our second look.

Storage Dimensions LANstor LAN335E

National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL) NetWare tests showed that the NetWare-only LANstor LAN335E was the fastest of the ten-drive roundup, but here at PC World we were never able to get it to boot as a file server. Considering its apparent unreliability, short one-year warranty, and poor documentation, we rated it only a Fair value overall.

Statements by Storage Dimensions and Novell led us to blame the drive's problems on a bug in the drive's "nonstandard cold boot loader" software. After the

review was published, Novell told us that the loader could not possibly have kept our drive from booting, and that the problem was most likely caused by a corrupted NetWare system file. In addition, we erroneously described the loader as a "patch," an alteration to a program. In fact, the loader simply starts NetWare and then removes itself from memory. NetWare's operation remains unchanged, and its operation should not be affected in any way.

Our inability to boot the drive kept us from awarding it the Excellent mark it deserves for its exceptional performance. It was 20 to 30 percent faster than the other manufacturers' drives in NSTL's multiuser data base tests, and it showed superior performance in the other NetWare tests as well. True, the LAN335E is not compatible with NetWare 2.0a, but since 2.0a users probably aren't interested in such large hard drives, we've upgraded the compatibility rating to Good for this drive.

These changed ratings make the LAN335E a Good value overall. If your dealer will install and stand behind it, it deserves

serious consideration for heavily used file and multiuser data base servers.

Storage Dimensions LANstor LAN320S

We found the NetWare-only LANstor LAN320S relatively easy to install and highly expandable—you can add SCSI boards and drives for up to 4GB of disk storage. But on the basis of its short warranty and a mistaken belief that it was not Novell certified, we rated it only a Fair value overall.

Novell initially told our editors that it had not certified the NetWare compatibility of the LAN320S. During the final fact-checking process, however, a Novell spokesperson confirmed that the drive-controller combination we reviewed (the Maxtor 4380S

dicted by the unchanged text and Executive Summary. We've upgraded the compatibility rating to Good for this drive as well.

In the NSTL tests, the LAN320S came in second only to the LAN335E, and it was 13 to 18 percent faster than the other manufacturers' drives in the multiuser data base tests. We've upgraded its performance rating to Excellent.

If you need a huge amount of storage on a single server, a herd of LAN320S's is a good value, provided you can count on your dealer for installation and support.

Storage Dimensions

SpeedStor AT320S

We found the SpeedStor AT320S highly expandable (up to 2.2GB per server with daisy-chained drives). However, it was slow and had a short one-year warranty. Those factors, plus an editing slip-up that led us to give it a Poor rating on installation, resulted in an overall rating of Fair.

For the same article, we also reviewed a different drive, the

SpeedStor AT335E, which requires a tortuous installation process. A description of that process was inadvertently included in the AT320S review, which led to the drive's receiving a Poor rating on setup and installation. In fact, the AT320S's automated installation utility worked smoothly, and the drive did not require a low-level format. The drive should have been rated Good on setup and installation.

You can't format the AT320S as one bootable partition with DOS 3.31 or 4.0; instead, you have to create a small, bootable C: drive and a single large D: drive. On that basis we rated the AT320S's compatibility merely Fair, but since this configuration is really just a minor inconvenience, the compatibility rating is also raised to Good.

Despite the upgraded ratings in these two categories, with its average speed and short warranty, the AT320S remains a Fair value.

Buying Considerations

To merit a Best Buy, a hard disk must combine low price, top performance, easy installation, and good product support, and it needs to back up its claims of reliability with a long warranty. In our earlier review, no product put together the whole winning package. Since the very expensive Plus Impulse was the only drive nonexperts could be confident of installing successfully, we recommended that smart buyers leave installation to their dealers. (A Good rating on setup and installation indicates that professionals should be able to install the drive in a few hours.)

Despite their upgraded ratings, these Storage Dimensions drives still don't meet our Best

Buy criteria. The LAN335E deserves serious consideration for running busy multiuser data bases, and for those with unusually large storage needs, daisy-chained LAN320S drives offer up to 4GB of storage in a single NetWare server. But for most LANs, the Priam Innerspace 330-E remains the best choice of the drives in the original review, thanks to its superior three-year warranty.

POWER TIP NO. 100

Turbo Pascal: And Or What?

If you are getting error messages when compiling a Turbo Pascal program and the compiler stops at a line that looks perfectly good to you, make sure the operators in that line are being processed in the correct order. Boolean operators such as OR or AND are often problematic, especially when one (or more) of the Boolean terms is a mathematical expression. Liberal use of parentheses, even when redundant, will help ensure that the compiler reads a line the way you intended it to be read. For example, instead of 'if Num1 = 8 or Num1 = 4 then', use 'if (Num1 = 8) or (Num1 = 4) then'.

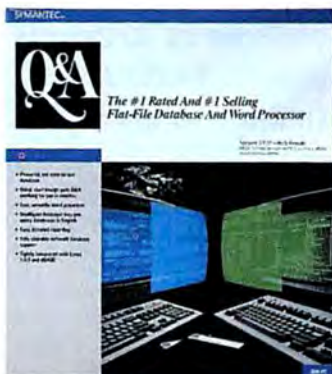

The Straight and Narrow Upgrade Path

Q. *I have a floppy-based PC that runs DOS 2.0. How can I copy DOS 3.2 from my neighbor's hard disk so that I can upgrade my DOS version?*

*Celia A. Hayes
Scotia, New York*

A. There's really only one way to upgrade your DOS using your neighbor's version: illegally. DOS, like all software, is the

product of much labor, and it is licensed for use on only *one* system at a time. To copy it for use on another system is a violation of copyright law. It's theft.

Of course, there are legal ways to upgrade your DOS. If you're using MS-DOS, you can purchase a new version from the vendor that sold you your PC. Since Microsoft's current licensing policy allows a vendor to sell DOS only with a system or as an upgrade to a version that the vendor sold with a system, your vendor is the only one who can supply you with a new version of MS-DOS.

You can also upgrade to a recent version of PC-DOS. IBM allows vendors of its products to sell its PC-DOS to all comers. You can use PC-DOS even if your PC isn't an IBM system. However, the BASIC and BASICA interpreters included with PC-DOS require a ROM-based BASIC kernel, found only in IBM systems. They won't work in a non-IBM PC.

Drives Me Crazy

Q. *I'm in the market for a PC, and I'm confused by some of the terms I see in ads. What's the difference between an ordinary hard disk and an RLL (Run-Length Limited) hard disk? What's the difference between a hard disk and a Hardcard? What are ESDI, SCSI, and IDE devices, and which is best?*

A. Let's begin with some hard disk basics. A hard disk subsystem consists of one or more metal platters—each coated with a magnetic medium—spinning in unison at 3600 rpm in a metal box, as well as three crucial electronic circuits and a way to attach everything to the computer. The controller circuitry controls the disk, the data separator circuitry produces the proper electronic signals from the magnetically stored data, and the bus adapter circuitry communicates those signals to the computer. Generally, the drive itself, like a floppy drive, is held in a device bay, while the electronics are on a board in an expansion slot.

Hard drives and their electronics have become so small that manufacturers can integrate the actual hard disk and the controller electronics all on a PC expansion board that fits in the space of one to one-and-a-half PC slots. (No hard disk cards have been made yet for Micro Channel-based systems, which use smaller expansion boards.) Some manufacturers simply slap a standard hard disk onto an expansion card. Plus Development Corporation, however, designed its award-winning Hardcard from scratch (and trademarked the name as well). Ease of installation has made hard disk cards popular.

concentric tracks. Therefore, disk storage is the product of the number of platters, tracks per platter, and recording density (or bits) per track. An "ordinary" hard disk's controller stores data using a technique called MFM (Modified Frequency Modulation), which stores bits of information by changing the polarity of the magnetic field along a track.

RLL (Run-Length Limited, also known as 2,7 RLL) is a data-encoding technique that enables a drive to store about 50 percent more data than MFM. ARLL (Advanced Run-Length Limited, also known as 3,9 RLL) packs even more information, doubling MFM capacity. Although you can replace an MFM drive's controller with an RLL or ARLL controller, the higher-den-

sity formats can cause problems for some older-technology MFM drives. Virtually all popular drives made today use RLL or ARLL encoding techniques and don't advertise the fact. However, reliability, durability, and speed are more important than encoding techniques.

The ST506/412 industry standard used by the original IBM XT and AT placed all the electronics on an expansion board. By moving the data separator circuitry onto the drive itself, ESDI (Enhanced Small Device Interface) provides much faster throughput than the old standard. Also, an ESDI drive is easier to initialize because, unlike its predecessor, it holds configuration (number of heads, cylinders, and so on) and bad sector information on the drive itself

in a standardized form that the controller can read. Currently you can install up to four ESDI controllers in a PC, each of which supports two drives.

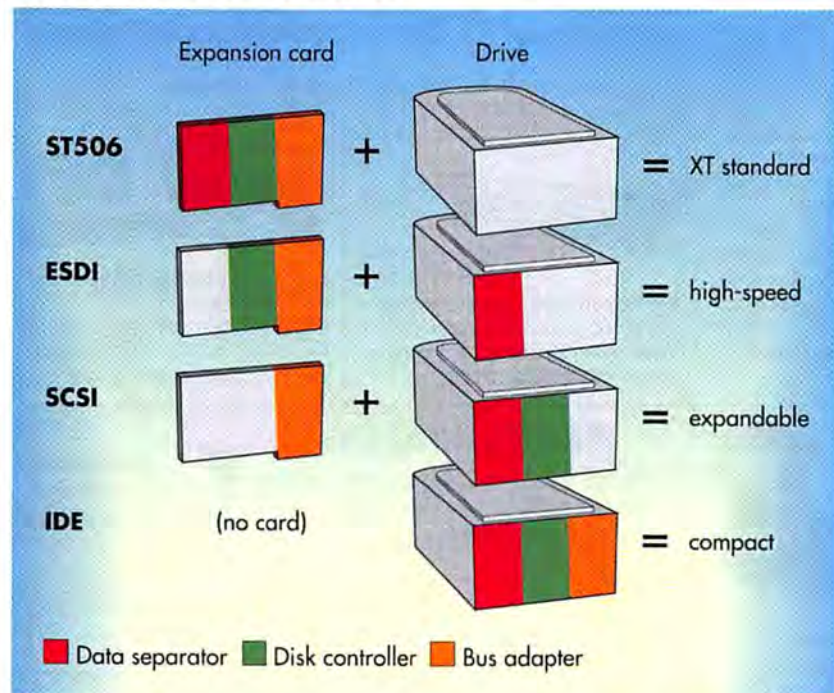
SCSI (Small Computer System Interface) drives are designed to connect to a SCSI adapter. The SCSI standard enables manufacturers to design devices that include their own controllers and that can plug into any SCSI adapter, whether it's in a PC, a Macintosh, or whatever. A SCSI drive, therefore, has both the controller and data separator circuitry on the drive. Theoretically, up to seven SCSI devices (each with eight logical units) can be daisy chained to one SCSI port adapter. Practically, however, not all SCSI devices are compatible, so mixing hard drives with other devices isn't always possible.

In a single-user environment, there's currently not much difference in performance, expandability, or reliability between ESDI and SCSI drives. On a network server with multiple drives, however, SCSI may provide greater throughput than ESDI because the individual embedded controllers enable the system to retrieve data from several drives simultaneously.

Shaped to fit into a device bay, an IDE (Integrated Drive Electronics) drive, like the Hard-card, has all its electronics embedded in the drive. This type of drive could be cabled directly into a computer's expansion bus, but that would waste a slot just as using a separate controller does. Instead, IDE drives are used only in PS/2s and other systems that provide an IDE connector on the motherboard.

Format Failure From F>

Q. I'm puzzled. I've been using a 120MB hard disk—which I've divided into four 30MB volumes (C:, D:, E:, and F:)—for several months now without incident. But the other day I tried to create a bootable disk in drive A: by using the command `FORMAT A: /S` at the `DOS F>` prompt; I received the message 'Insert DOS disk in drive A: and strike ENTER when ready'. I pressed <Ctrl>-<Break> instead, changed to drive C:, and reissued the `FORMAT` command successfully.

My system boots `DOS 3.3` from hard disk drive C:, and its `PATH` includes the `C:\DOS` subdirectory, which holds `FORMAT` and the DOS disk's other files. Why won't my system format a disk when C: isn't the default drive?

A. Your `PATH` enables DOS to find and run `FORMAT`, but `FORMAT` looks only at the root directory of the default drive for the hidden system files that it needs to copy in order to make the newly formatted disk bootable. Since drive F: doesn't have those files, DOS prompts you to insert a disk with those files (that is, a bootable DOS disk) in drive A:.

Maybe someday Microsoft will improve `FORMAT` so that the command will, if necessary, read the system environment variable

`COMSPEC` to learn which drive holds `COMMAND.COM` and then check that drive for the hidden system files.

More ZMODEM for Procomm Plus

Q. *Procomm Plus* and *DSZ* [which adds `ZMODEM` support to *Procomm Plus*] work great if you're calling one of the big boards [like *CompuServe*; see "ZMODEM for Procomm Plus" in last February's Help Screen]. When using rural phone lines, `ZMODEM`'s error recovery is occasionally a real blessing. However, because *Procomm*'s host mode doesn't offer `ZMODEM` as a protocol option, I'm unable to use `ZMODEM` when calling friends locally. Do you have any suggestions?

A. Not for the current version. Datastorm promises the next version will include `ZMODEM` protocol for both host and terminal modes but can't say when it will appear.

While we're on the subject, I'd like to pass along reader Alexander Goldfinger's method of integrating *Procomm Plus* and *DSZ*:

First, create the batch files `ZMODEM-U.BAT` and `ZMODEM-D.BAT` (see LISTING 1), replacing 'c:\pcplus\dnloads' (continues)

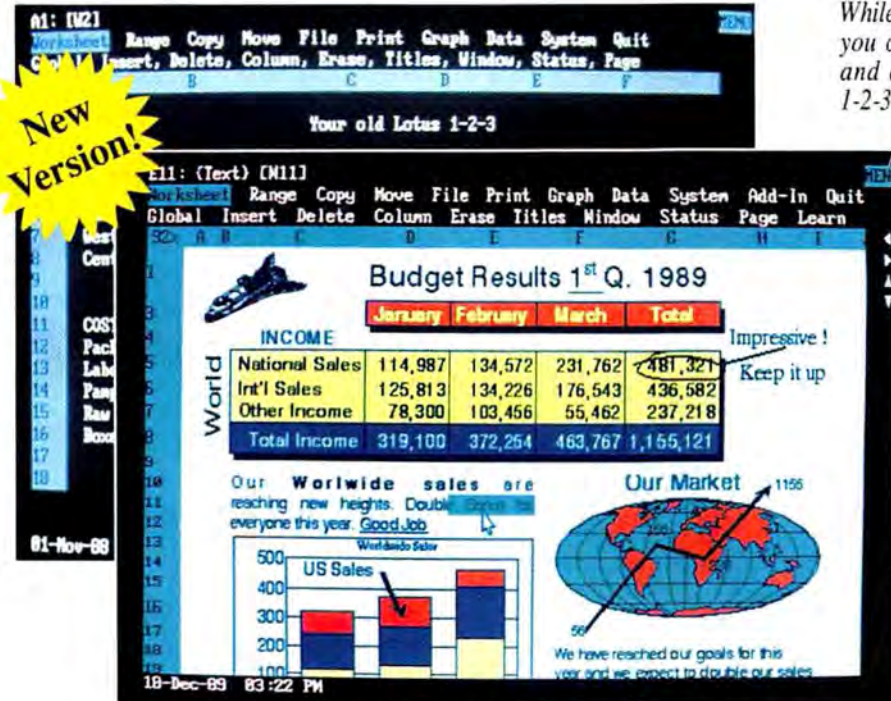

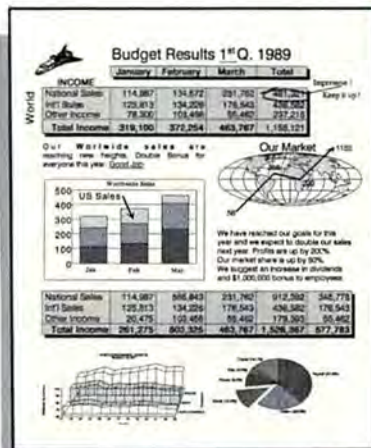

Start Procomm Plus, press <Alt>-S to bring up the Setup screen, and select Protocol Options. Select an unused menu letter and enter **zmodem-u**. Repeat for **zmodem-d**. Return to the Setup screen and choose *Save Setup*. Bring up the Dialing directory with <Alt>-D, highlight the name of a BBS that uses ZMODEM, and press R to revise it. Press <Enter> eight times and select *Ext 1* for the protocol. Repeat for all dialing directory entries for which you want ZMODEM protocol used. Now when connected to those BBS's, Procomm will automatically use ZMODEM.

Perfect Upgrade

In March's *Help Screen*, the cost of upgrading from WordPerfect 4.2 or 5.0 to WordPerfect 5.1 was incorrect—it's \$85. While we're on the subject, I'd like to remind readers about WordPerfect Corporation's commendable school donation "experiment": This upgrade package currently includes a license request form and a letter explaining that the purchaser is encouraged to donate his or her 4.2 or 5.0 version to an elementary or secondary school. Upon registration, the school becomes a fully licensed user.

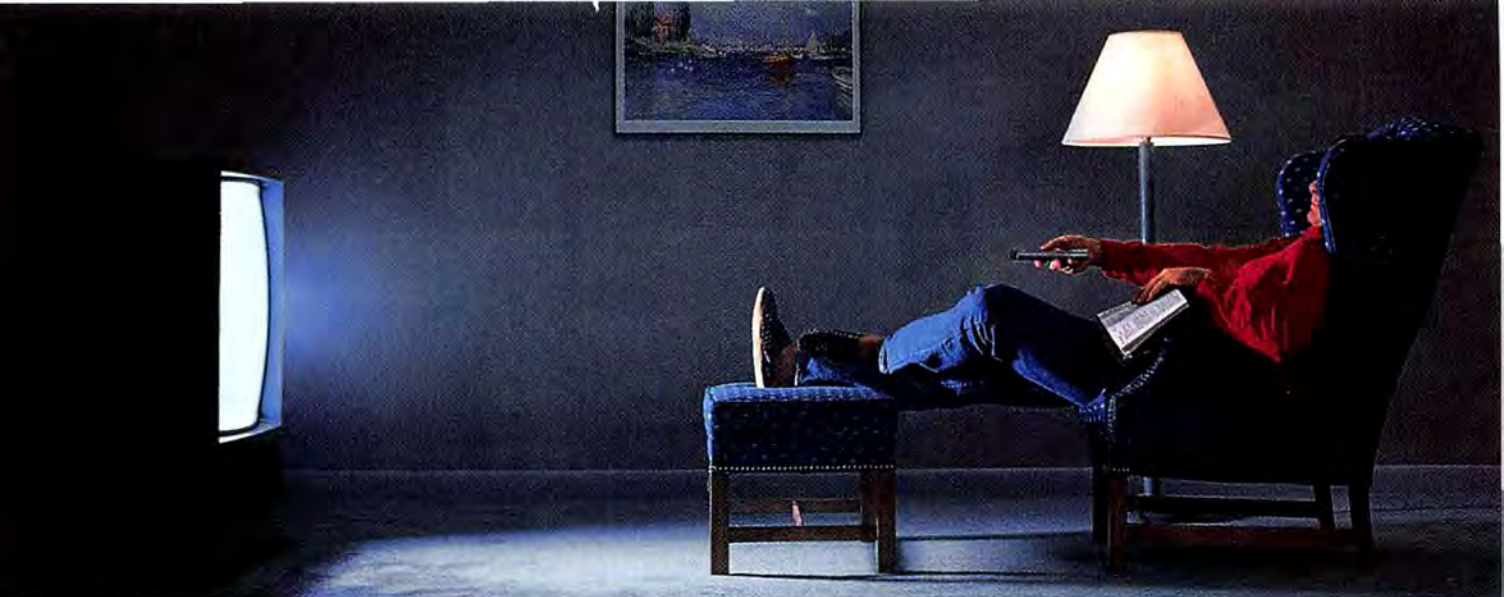

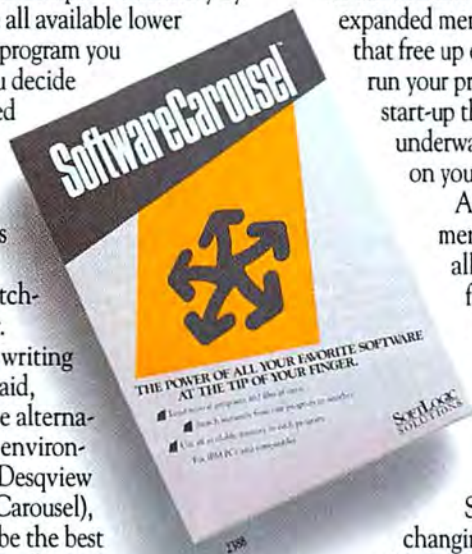

Advice and information for the computer consumer

Paying by credit card gives you extra protection when PC hardware and software don't live up to your expectations.

What to Do After You've Said "Charge It"

When you're buying PC hardware and software, it pays to use a credit card. In fact, doing so may mean the difference between paying for an unsatisfactory product or an item you never received and getting a full refund.

Let's say, for example, you order a PC for a great price only to find that it's DOA. In the best of circumstances, all you should have to do is notify the seller of the error in order to get either the right merchandise or a re-

fund. But what if you can't get the problem resolved? What if you return the item, but your account never gets credited, or you can't return the unwanted merchandise because no one returns your calls?

Well, provided you've made a reasonable effort to straighten things out, you're covered under some little-known but powerful laws that fall under the Consumer Credit Protection Act.

Billing Errors

One of your options is to identify the charge as a *billing error*. Billing error provisions cover a variety of circumstances, including correcting charges for items you do not *accept*. This term means more than simply refusing delivery of a product, according to Howard Strong, a Southern California attorney and author of *Credit Card Secrets You Will Surely Profit From* (The Boswell Corporation, Beverly Hills, California, 1989).

"Acceptance...means that [the product] met all the requirements of your deal with the seller," he says. So if you order a 20-MHz 386 but receive a 16-MHz system, or if the PC you ordered gets delivered in three weeks despite the salesperson's guarantee of 48-hour delivery, you probably don't have to accept it. And if you don't, you're well within your rights to declare the charge a billing error, says Strong.

A phone call to your credit card company should provide you with all the information you need

on how to correct a billing error, but these are the guidelines.

- You must notify the credit card company *in writing* of a billing error within 60 days of when the statement was mailed. Your letter must include an explanation of why you consider the charge a billing error.

- Your account number should be referenced in the letter, which must be sent to the address specified for all billing inquiries. Note: This may be a different address from the one to which you send your payments and is usually listed on your statement.

- Strong suggests sending the letter by certified mail, return receipt required, so you have proof of when the letter was sent and received.

Once the letter is received, the credit card company has two options: It can correct the bill within 30 days, or it can notify you in writing that it is investigating your complaint and will resolve the problem within 90 days or two billing periods (whichever is shorter).

It's up to the credit card company to prove that the contested item is *not* a billing error. Once you've sent the original letter, you aren't required by law to do anything further to invoke your rights, according to Strong.

Following the proper procedures doesn't necessarily mean that the item will be re-

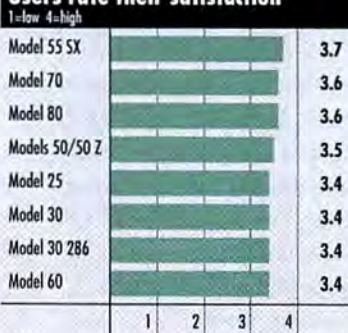

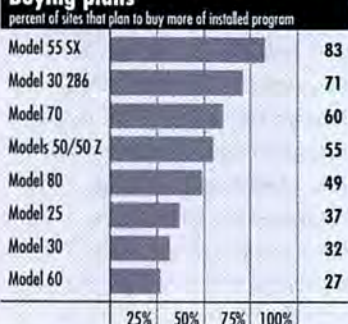
Installed base at survey sites

moved from your account, however. You might get additional letters asking for more information, or on further investigation the credit card company may disagree with your assessment and hold you liable for the charge.

"If the credit card company does not agree with you, you can fight on to get the error fixed," says Strong. "Fighting on" can mean anything from launching a full-scale legal battle to writing the government agencies that oversee the activities of credit card companies.

Stopping Payment

But what if the 60-day time limit on notifying the credit card company has come and gone, and you've lost the right to have your account credited under the billing error provisions? Your next line of defense, according to Strong, is the good-faith stop-payment rule, which can be used *anytime* after an item is charged.

Under this section, if you receive incorrect or faulty merchandise and have tried to correct the matter with the seller, you have the right to stop payment on the charge. (Having done so, you must, however, make every effort to return the merchandise.)

Although the law states no time limits, there are some noteworthy caveats: You must have attempted to settle the problem *before* making any portion of payment. Also, the good-faith stop-payment rule applies only to purchases that are over \$50 and are made either in your home state or within 100 miles of your billing address. But Strong says the distance limitation

doesn't necessarily apply to items purchased over the phone or by mail.

Citing a noted authority in contract law, Strong says the location you are in when you buy something over the phone is the place of purchase. If you order from home, you're obviously within 100 miles of your billing address.

"The same rule applies when you mail a stamped letter. The place of purchase is where you mail the letter," he adds. Be aware that this is Strong's interpretation, however, and one that not everyone agrees with.

According to Strong, your rights under the good-faith stop-payment provision are absolute and do not depend on your providing any additional information to or having further correspondence with the card company.

All you have to do is make an effort to work the problem out with the seller. If those efforts are fruitless, you then notify the card company *in writing* of your desire to stop payment.

In a *charge-back*, the card company takes back the money it had earlier credited to the merchant's account and sends a note to the merchant saying "solve this problem," explains Strong. "If you eventually get your problem resolved and tell the card company so, the company gives the seller back the money. If you do not resolve your problem, the company does not charge your account and the merchant gets nothing."


Even if the card company can't get the money back from the seller, "you still get *your* money back," says Strong. In the case of bankruptcy, for example, the credit card company should absorb the loss.

The final weapon in your credit card arsenal is the 60-day stop payment. This works much like the good-faith stop but, as the name implies, must be done within 60 days of when the bill is mailed. Here the dollar and distance limitations do not apply.

The card company must either credit your account within 30 days or include on your next statement a notice that you are not required to pay the disputed amount. Your account must be credited within 90 days or the card company must inform you why it is not being credited.

So which option should you use? While Strong says your rights are stronger under the billing error provisions of the law, he advises that when in doubt, "use both your billing error and stop-payment rights." And document all conversations and correspondence with both the card company and the seller.

Whichever option you use, the bottom line is that you're refusing to pay for an item. If the credit card company agrees with your assessment and deducts the disputed amount from the seller's account, you may find yourself hounded by an angry merchant. And should the card company disagree with you, it too can make things rough for you, including reporting you delinquent on your account (although it must also state that the charge is in dispute).

But Strong says such dire consequences rarely occur, noting that 75 percent of the time things get cleared up to the customer's satisfaction.

SHOP TALK

Schemers Indicted for Mail Fraud

Nearly three years after postal inspectors first became aware of a computer scam perpetrated by CompuSystems of Beverly Hills, California, the owners of the bogus company have been indicted for mail fraud, according to Burbank, California, postal inspector Gary Austin.

Approximately 400 people lost an average of \$450 each after responding to ads placed in several computer publications for discounted hardware and software.

The owners "never had any intention of selling anything," says Austin, adding that the suspects ran ads offering products at 25 percent less than the prices in other, legitimate ads.

Unfortunately for the victims, however, Austin estimates that there's only a 50 percent chance of anyone recouping their losses.

If any money is collected, Austin says his office will return it to the victims based on a percentage of their loss.

Samsung's Slow Response

In September 1988 I ordered a Samsung Multisync monitor. While still under warranty, the monitor failed.

I took the monitor to Tandy Customer Repair Service in Tulsa and was advised that repairs would take four to six weeks. Later, however, it was determined that the monitor was not repairable. Tandy sent it back, and I returned it to Samsung for a replacement, which I received 83 days after the first one failed. The replacement was not in as good condition as my original monitor, and now, nine days later, it too is defective.

I called Samsung and was ad-



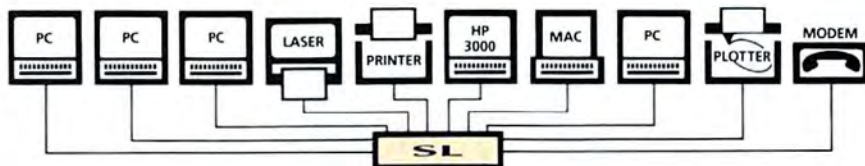

Pushing Into Overseas Markets

PC Vendors Prepare for Leaner Times

Clone Makers Struggle to Stand Out From Crowd

The easy times are gone. Virtually every PC manufacturer has been hit by lower profits and forced to reevaluate its strategy.

Symptoms of the slowdown are everywhere. No-name, no-bankroll clone makers are declaring bankruptcy. Two of the major players, Wyse Technology and Zenith Data Systems, stumbled through 1989 and went on the auction block. Apple and IBM are cutting staff, and even the usually high-flying Compaq is seeing its earnings dip.

The vast majority of familiar companies are getting squeezed into the second tier between the market leaders and the no-name-clone makers, says Bill Lempesis, a senior analyst with Dataquest in San Jose, California. Struggling to distinguish themselves, second-tier firms stress marketing and distribution, vying for shelf space and offering promotions. But slick marketing campaigns alone won't do the trick—companies need to find niches, says Lempesis.

At Everex in Fremont, California, that means stressing high-performance systems, while Wyse stakes out a claim in

the multiuser system category. At Dell Computer in Austin, Texas, it means pursuing the fast-growing laptop market plus offering systems integration and other value-added services, says chief executive Michael Dell.

Everywhere, it means tightening the belt. "During a boom period, companies basically just have to manage growth," says Bruce Stephen, an analyst with International Data Corporation (IDC) in Framingham, Massachusetts. "When things slow down, it tests their business basics. There are still a few companies in the second tier who are vulnerable."

One PC maker that's managed to switch gears is AST Research. The Irvine, California, manufacturer had a dismal fiscal year ending June 30 but achieved a solid turnaround over the next two quarters. Jim Ashbrook, senior vice president of marketing, attributes the gains to clamping down on expenses and divesting itself of noncore product lines.

In contrast, Everex continues to offer a huge array of systems and peripherals. "Our strength historically has been in engineering and in our channel of distribution," says Alan Bushell, vice president of operations.

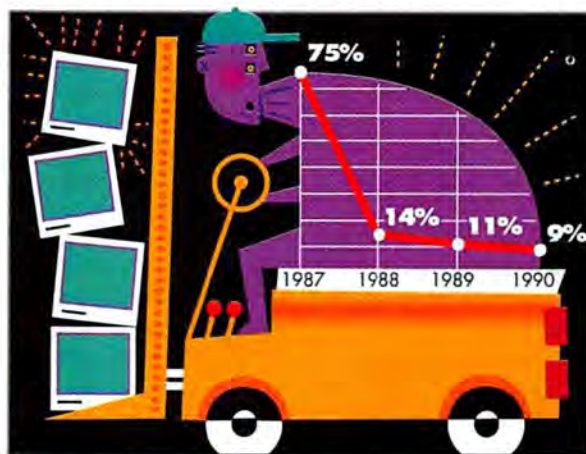
The company sells only to dealers and value-added resellers, and stocks little finished inventory, adjusting production day by day to meet phoned-in orders.

including Dell and Everex plan to capitalize on hot products like laptops. Lempesis cautions, however, that many laptop entrants will be plagued by the same distribution limitations that hamper sales of desktops.

IDC's Stephen says purchasers worried about the long-term viability of their supplier should play it safe by sticking with market leaders. Beyond that, though, he says it's a

good time to buy: "You're getting more bang for your buck." And leaner times mean good news for some consumers whose suppliers now increasingly emphasize value-added features, such as cost-effective upgrade solutions and increased service and support. —Roberta Furger

Ink Jets Take Over—Quietly

HP's DeskJet Is Runaway Leader



Unlike its 24-pin dot matrix competitors, Hewlett-Packard's DeskJet Plus produces laserlike output.

Nothing shabby about today's 24-pin dot matrix printers—they're quick, the type quality is fine for business letters, they're aggressively priced, and you almost need a sledgehammer to break them. But Hewlett-Packard's black-and-white ink jet printers are rapidly taking sales away from the 24-pins, thanks to their much quieter operation and laserlike text and graphics.

HP's ink jet sales are growing even faster than its laser sales; the millionth HP ink jet sale was recorded early in 1989. Hewlett-Packard's dump-dot-matrix crusade began two years ago with the DeskJet, its first 300-dot-per-inch model. HP still sells this model, but a better deal is the year-old DeskJet Plus. Offering 2-page-per-minute speed and stronger font support, the Plus sells on the street for \$500 (after a \$150 rebate available through June).

DeskJets target "people who are ready to move

away from dot matrix printers but are constrained by price from moving to lasers," says Duane Schulz, product marketing manager at HP's Vancouver, Washington, division. This market translates into small business and home use where print volume isn't important and high-quality text and graphics are desired. In addition to ten built-in fonts, DeskJets accept font cartridges and downloaded soft fonts; says Schulz, "the average user buys one font cartridge."

High-resolution ink jet sales will grow 50 percent this year, and HP enjoys more than 90 percent market share, says Marc Boer, analyst with BIS CAP International in Norwell, Massachusetts. Boer and other analysts doubt that HP will be seriously threatened soon. The strongest challenger to date, Canon's Bubblejet, lacked laserlike features such as sheet feeding, remarks Jim Upham, director of electronic printer

service at Dataquest. Canon could challenge again, but for other vendors, adds Upham, "ink jet technology is much more difficult to copycat than a basic laser engine."

Meanwhile Epson, Panasonic, IBM, and other 24-pin printer manufacturers are not focused on HP's challenge. "They're having enough trouble [competing] with 9-pin suppliers," Upham explains. "But if 24-pins go upscale, they'll have to go head-to-head against DeskJet features." Dot matrix printers could be redesigned for fancier fonts and graphics, but they'd have to support other standards like DeskJet or even LaserJet languages.

Dot matrix models still hold the edge not just on draft-quality speed but on cost of ownership—ink jets run silent but not cheap. A replaceable ink cartridge (which includes the printhead) lists at \$20 and gives roughly 500 double-spaced pages. Schulz says the average cost of ink jet consumables is 5 cents a page—higher even than laser printers' 3 to 3.8 cents. On the other hand, most DeskJet users print in small volume, so cost of consumables isn't a major factor. On the reliability front, HP quotes a mean-time-between-failure rate of 20,000 pages and offers a three-year warranty.

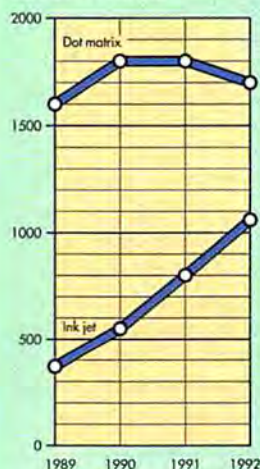
BIS CAP expects that by year-end, HP will introduce a cheaper DeskJet positioned against 9-pin printers, with continuous-feed paper. At the top of the line, though, DeskJets already bump into the LaserJet IIP (thus the \$150 rebate).

"HP's willing to take lower margins in order to assure its lock on the low-end marketplace," comments IDC analyst Sharon Kern.

Future ink jets could support higher resolutions and gray-scale output, but analysts expect HP to concentrate development efforts on two other fronts. The first is a successor to the DeskJet's water-soluble ink, which runs if you wet the paper and smudges with too much handling. Second is development of color models with higher resolutions than HP's PaintJet. Schulz says resolution itself isn't a problem; the challenge is "to do really high-quality color on plain paper." —E. B.

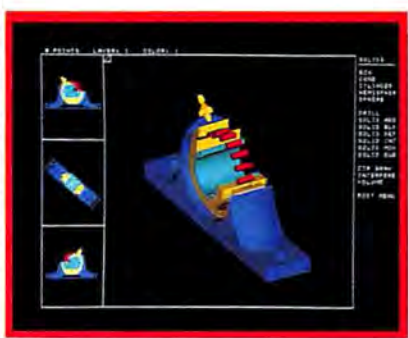

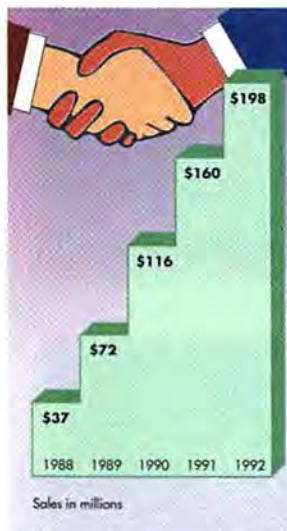


Contact Managers Find New Calling in Business

Highly Structured Software Moves Beyond Sales Jobs

Selling contact-management software to computerphobic salespeople is your classic high-risk/high-opportunity business venture. The scores of companies in this niche are small and undercapitalized, with one exception—Contact Software International of Carrollton, Texas. With more than 30 employees and 80,000 installations of its \$395 *Act* program, Contact substantially outdistances its rivals and even sees its package on some best-seller lists.

Contact Trackers Hit Stride



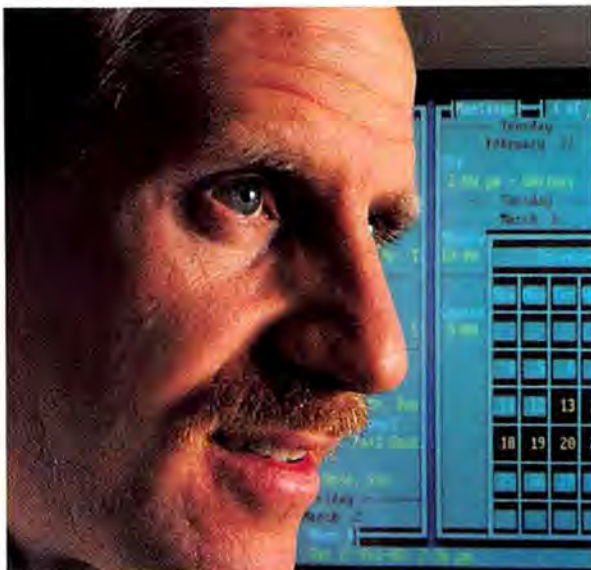
PC-based contact-management software helps you schedule calls to or meetings with clients and track the results. Market Intelligence Research Co. predicts steady growth for these packages, which are gaining ground among salespeople.

President Pat Sullivan was a retail computer salesman in the early 1980s when he created *Act*'s predecessor as a *Symphony* template, designed primarily to prepare sales bids. Colleagues liked the way it helped track leads, follow up on contacts, and manage sales calls. Sullivan started a business with a colleague to offer the templates, but soon they decided contact management was the way to go. In 1986 they raised venture capital to produce the first *Act*.

When it appeared in early 1987, the market was already crowded with similar products, and *Act* lacked the necessary auto-dialer. But Sullivan had dollars for advertising and quickly found wide distribution. Not long after *Act 1.1* debuted in late 1987—complete with auto-dialer—it took the leading role.

A prototypical contact manager, *Act* helps schedule and track calls and builds a data base of notes from calls and meetings. An alarm prompts you to make preplanned calls, signalling you even from within other applications. The software also includes E-mail and fax capabilities plus a word processor for follow-up letters or telemarketing scripts.

While *Act* may sound like a personal informa-

tion manager (PIM), it resembles PIMs only superficially. Most PIMs are more free-form, while the contact manager is a highly structured data base. Additionally, most PIMs are simply not contact oriented—lacking auto-dialers, for instance.

The sales profession has steadfastly resisted the spread of computers, so the next *Act* will add a text-based windowing interface expected to make it easier to learn.

Act also lacks a network version. Sullivan says his strategy has been to appeal to individual salespeople who buy it retail, but competitors with network versions say this deficiency has made *Act* easier to follow. "We get many customers converting to us from *Act* just because they can't get a network version," says Thomas O'Flaherty, president of Richmond Technologies & Software, of Burnaby, British Columbia. Richmond's *Maximizer 2.0* is among *Act*'s biggest competitors.

But most observers tie contact management's rise in popularity not to networks but to the recent surge in laptops. "If you'd asked me three years ago if this was going to happen, I'd still have been skeptical," says Harry Gilliam, president of Sales & Marketing Systems of Vienna, Virginia, who has marketed *SalesCTRL* contact management software since 1983. "But [the market] has really turned in the last 18 months."

Invented by salespeople for salespeople, *Act* now finds 70 percent of its users in other fields. After all, everybody has contacts, and if you're dealing with over 100 regular contacts, paper becomes unmanageable. "It's wonderful to get a call from a guy two years after you last talked to him and instantly look up everything you said," says Sullivan. —Mark Henricks

How designers of the '40s saw the '90s.

UNIX on the Desktop?

Target Is Would-Be OS/2 Users

After conquering the academic, government, small multiuser, and technical workstation markets, this year UNIX is trying to elbow aside OS/2 as the next-generation operating system.

As Microsoft and IBM struggle to finish a polished version of OS/2 for the 80386 chip, UNIX offers a ready-made alternative. AT&T's veteran system software offers multitasking and multiuser operation, and for years it has fully supported the 80386 plus an extremely broad range of other CPUs. UNIX also has responded well to face-lifts—in the form of friendly, powerful user environments from Sun, the Open Software Foundation, and even Steve Jobs's Next (see "Tough Times for Next"). In short, say UNIX proponents, it boasts many of OS/2's most promising features, and it does so today.

One vocal UNIX evangelist is The Santa Cruz Operation (SCO) of Santa

Cruz, California, which makes a healthy profit selling Xenix (the Microsoft-developed version of UNIX for PCs) as the basis of multiuser systems for small companies and professional offices. At one SCO Xenix installation, the *Las Vegas Sun*, some 60 employees work at terminals hooked into several Compaq Deskpro 386s. The system handles virtually all the newspaper's accounting needs and supports its circulation and advertising departments, says administrator Bernie Johnson. The *Sun* installed its system over three years ago after evaluating minicomputer and PC network alternatives. "It was the most cost-effective and the most flexible," says Johnson.

SCO estimates that it sells 100,000 such systems each year. Cofounder and vice president Doug Michels expects the multiuser market to grow, but he also sees opportunities in desktop PCs. SCO

moved into that market in January with Open Desktop, a version of SCO UNIX that features Open Software Foundation's Motif environment and built-in data base and communications managers. Michels divides potential Open Desktop adopters into two categories: those who have standardized on UNIX and are looking for the most appropriate hardware platform, and those committed to PC hardware who are choosing between OS/2 and UNIX to connect all their systems.

The Harris Corporation of Melbourne, Florida, settled on Open Desktop's network server upgrade for its new Compaq Systempro. Twenty in-house programmers are running Open Desktop on their Compaq Deskpro 386/20s for both development and general business applications. "We didn't consider OS/2," says John Dewey, manager of systems integration services for Harris's information management group. "We are extremely committed to open standards, and OS/2 doesn't fit that environment. And with the Open Desktop's DOS merge

function you can run multiple DOS sessions better than you can in OS/2."

But most users want to see plenty of applications from PC software vendors. Although several firms (including Ashton-Tate and Lotus) have committed to UNIX, "Open Desktop still has a real challenge to get vendors to write for the environment," says Judith Hurwitz, an analyst with Patricia Seybold's Office Computing Group in Boston (see *UNIX*, p. 70)

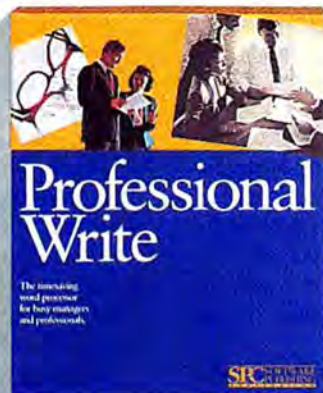

ton. The ongoing dispute between Sun and the Open Software Foundation, in which each is pushing its own environment, "holds people back; it makes UNIX look like an unstable environment," Hurwitz says.

"UNIX and OS/2 are each best for different

markets," maintains Mike Swavely, president of Compaq North America. Although Compaq is a strong supporter of UNIX, Swavely says "its place is in the multiuser arena, not on the desktop. Companies that believe UNIX can substitute for OS/2 on the desktop as a single-user [operating system] will be very disappointed." Swavely and

Hurwitz agree that PC software companies that develop personal productivity applications have given OS/2 greater priority.

"The only place where the market is the same is in the networking arena," Swavely says. Here is the so-called minicomputer replacement market being touted by Compaq and other high-end PC manu-

facturers. When Compaq introduced the SystemPro last year, the new server debuted not just with LAN Manager and NetWare but with a multi-processor version of SCO UNIX. With the SystemPro, says Michels, "you can think about 100-user systems—markets that we couldn't penetrate with the older product line." —*Roberta Furger*

Tough Times for Next

IBM Endorses NextStep—Sort Of



The Next Machine earns raves from developers, but customers aren't buying Steve Jobs's elegant desktop.

Lights! Camera! Steve Jobs!

Apple's colorful founder has gotten plenty of publicity for his Next start-up and its elegant Next Machine. Jobs also has gathered financial backing from entrepreneur H. Ross Perot and Canon, Inc., a blessing of sorts from IBM, and a distribution agreement with Businessland once expected to total \$100 million.

Only problem: Next machines are barely moving.

"They are gaining some acceptance in the academic market, but sales through Businessland have been very slow," says Peter Teige, senior analyst with InfoCorp in San Jose, California. InfoCorp estimates that Next shipped 5000 machines from July through December, 1989, and volume hasn't climbed much this year.

Built around the Motorola 68030 CPU (which also powers the latest Macintoshes), the Next machine has a very high resolution

monochrome screen, a digital signal processor for audio and other tasks, removable erasable-optical drives, and other impressive features. It comes with NextStep, a dazzling object-oriented software environment, and has a \$9995 list price that compares well with its rivals'.

"But the Next machine's potential is extremely muted by a lack of software," comments Paul Zagaeski, senior analyst with the Yankee Group in Boston. While Ashton-Tate, Lotus, WordPerfect, and others are working on NextStep packages, Teige questions the level of commitment:

"I don't know why anybody would write commercial applications for a platform that has no installed base." Jobs broke out of that catch-22 situation with the Macintosh. But the Mac was unique in ways the Next Machine—which must compete with rival desktops tackling similar problems in similar fashion—is not.

IBM has endorsed NextStep and will offer it on the new POWER workstations and on PS/2s un-

der AIX, but analysts caution that Next should not expect too much from this deal. "IBM is just offering it as an optional interface," notes Amy Wohl of Wohl Associates in Bala Cynwyd, Pennsylvania.

Another IBM partner whose business edge also lay in software rather than hardware—Metaphor Computer—recently pulled out of hardware altogether. No one expects Next to do that, because Jobs is going for broke again—building his own highly automated factory and hiring plenty of employees. As one software executive puts it, "Next will be either a 50-story building or a hole in the ground."

Zagaeski thinks it will be difficult for Next to go public soon or raise more venture capital ("I doubt there are a lot of angels out there asking, What hole are you going to throw the money down this year, Steve?"). But Next's pockets should be deep enough to produce a next-generation machine and await a round of packages this fall. "I don't think you should count Steve Jobs out," Zagaeski says. —*E. B.* ●

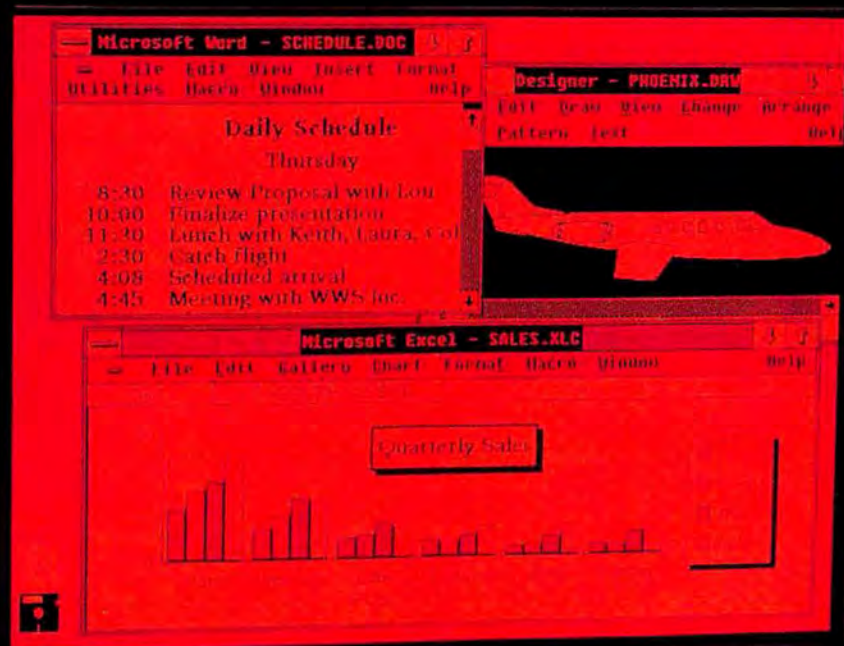

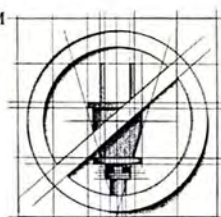

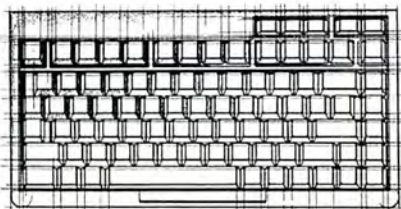

Wingz Soars Into the OS/2 Picture

Informix brings flashy graphics and powerful object-oriented tools to OS/2

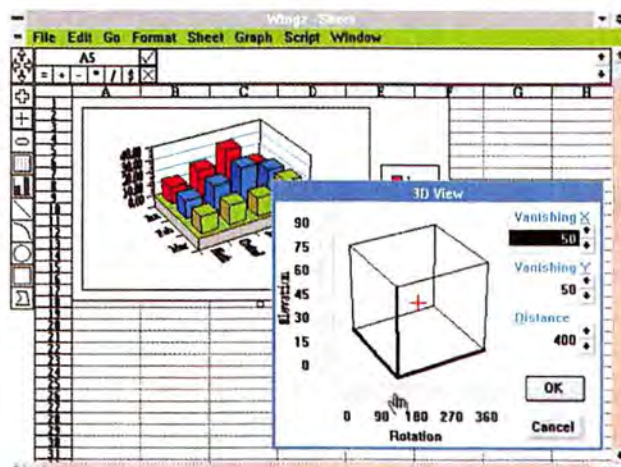
—but it doesn't quite match its rivals' spreadsheet facilities.

A dark horse has entered the OS/2 spreadsheet race. Informix Software is readying its *Wingz for OS/2 Presentation Manager* and could set up a rousing three-way rivalry with *Excel for OS/2* and *1-2-3/G*. Informix promises a *Windows 3.0* stablemate as well.

In the past year, *Wingz* has emerged as a favorite among Macintosh users, and the PM version retains its most desirable characteristics: stellar graphics and a powerful object-oriented scripting language. In fact, the PM incarnation is practically identical in terms of interface, commands, and functions. It also shares many features with *Excel*—an added inducement for *Excel* users to switch.

PC World previews are informal assessments of products that at press time were still in the development stage. Complete reviews—including features evaluations and performance testing—will appear only after a product is officially released.



Wingz' spectacular 3-D graphics capability includes bar, line, contour, surface, and wireframe charts. You can rotate a graph in 3-D space to get the optimal presentation perspective so crucial data isn't hidden.

A Well-Stocked Toolbox

Wingz distinguishes itself with its knack for incorporating user-defined objects into a spreadsheet environment. The list of objects includes charts, text fields, graphics images, and buttons (which can initiate a script). Objects can be placed any-

where in the worksheet and grouped to form a new object. You build objects via tools in a toolbox that's always present on the left side of the screen.

The button tool is ideal for developing user-friendly applications, since you can execute a set of commands contained in a *Wingz* script simply by clicking on the button.

The text tool provides simple word processing capabilities and even lets you create custom help windows, complete with scroll bars; you have full control over margins, line spacing, fonts, and type sizes. (Like all *Wingz* objects, the text windows can be moved and resized.) Unlike *1-2-3/G*, however, *Wingz* doesn't let you preview type in various fonts and sizes.

But *Wingz'* most compelling component is its unsurpassed graphics. The package boasts nearly two dozen graph types, including three-dimensional bar and line charts, mixed charts, and dual *y*-axis graphs. For scientific applications, you can display impressive surface, contour, and wireframe charts.

Creating a graph couldn't be simpler. Highlight the data you want to graph, click on the graph tool, and use the mouse to create whatever size window you need. The chart

appears almost instantly and is hot-linked to your data. The graph settings are easy to change, and you control most aspects of the graphs (through menus). You can even reorient an image in three-dimensional space to prevent key data from being hidden, a common problem.

Additionally, you can dress up your work with graphics files (either OS/2 Metafile files or bit-mapped graphics via the PM clipboard) from other applications.

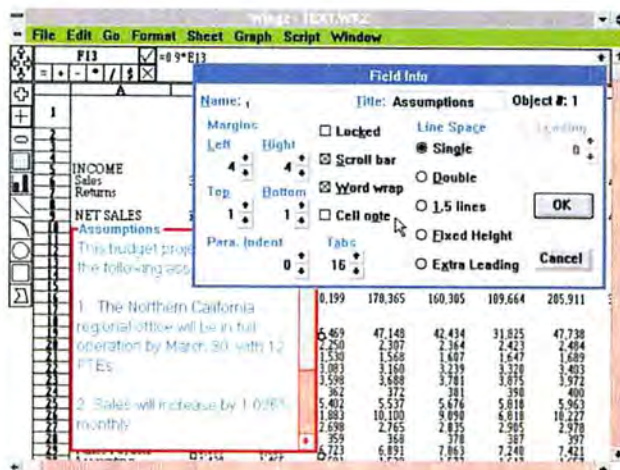
The Windowed Worksheet

Naturally, *Wingz* includes most of the features that define high-end spreadsheets: minimal recalculation, support for different files in separate windows, and the ability to mix and match fonts and type sizes. Its display is strictly WYSIWYG and includes a page previewer, but it lacks *Excel*'s handy magnifying glass icon to zoom in on part of a page.

If your style demands multipage worksheets à la 1-2-3/G, *Wingz* will be a disappointment. You can reference cells in other worksheets and even use those links in formulas, but you can't access data on disk since all supporting worksheets must be opened before the links are activated. Also lacking is the foolproof point-and-click cell-linking process available with both *Excel* and 1-2-3/G. These limitations, Informix says, will be remedied in a future version.

Analytical types will be impressed with the number and variety of built-in functions. Besides the inventory of about 150 spreadsheet functions, an additional 175 functions are available in the scripting language. If you still aren't satisfied, you can develop your own.

The product can communicate with other applications through the Clipboard and supports Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) links (which must be tailored on each end). *Wingz* has its own file format, but it can read and

write 1-2-3 WKS and WK1 files as well as DIF, SYLK, and ASCII formats. Although the pre-release version could not handle *Excel* files, the commercial release should be able to.

Writing Scripts

Like HyperCard's HyperTalk, the *Wingz* scripting language is meant for programming tasks that run the gamut from simple keystroke playback to sophisticated menu-driven applications. A script editor is supplied, and the scripts are compiled for improved speed. During compilation, errors are highlighted, and you're returned to the appropriate spot to make your corrections. You can also readily create simple macros with the product's learn mode.

The Fill feature is particularly handy, since it works not only with numbers but with certain words that convey serial information. For example, if the first cell of a 12-item range contains 'January', the *Wingz* Fill command will insert the remaining months with only a few mouse clicks.

Wingz definitely outstrips the competition in auditing. You can quickly select all cells of a particular type—for example, text, formulas, or blanks. In addition, you can highlight all cells that depend on a particular cell (or all cells on which a target cell depends). In either case, you have your choice of all or only direct precedents or dependents. You can also highlight all cells that are not referenced or formulas that reference blank cells—both likely candidates for errors.

Other error-handling features include an auto-save command that will store your work at any desired interval, and a single-step undo that will reverse the effects of many commands. On-line help is available and can remain on screen while you work.

Wingz also has data base capability, but it's for strictly run-of-the-mill queries of record- and field-oriented data. Both *1-2-3/G* and *Excel* (with *Q + E*), with their external data base access, seem preferable for those who like to use their spreadsheet for data base chores.

Waiting for Polish

Like *1-2-3/G*, *Wingz* sports cascading menus: Submenus appear auto-

matically as you drag the highlight bar down the vertical menu. (In some places, however, a dialog box would be a more efficient method of making selections.) The mouse interface also features a four-way directional icon that moves the cell cursor to the end of the current cell block.

You can use the mouse to point to a cell or range when building a formula, and a set of operator icons including +, *, and \$ (for making a reference absolute) is also available. In addition, you can pick @ functions and dummy arguments from a pulldown list.

The beta release lacked a keyboard interface in

several areas, requiring the use of a mouse—apparently to maintain full compatibility with the Mac version. By the time *Wingz* hits the streets, it may well be more accommodating for those who prefer to use keystrokes.

This product lacks a few niceties that *Excel* and *1-2-3/G* users take for granted. For example, row height does not adjust automatically to accommodate larger type sizes. And if you use file linking, you'll certainly miss the equivalent of a command to open all supporting worksheets.

By and large, however, *Wingz* is ready for the race. As OS/2 becomes more prevalent, the most pressing problem facing

spreadsheet users will be choosing among the three top-notch contenders. *Excel* offers a smooth upgrade from the leading *Windows* spreadsheet.

1-2-3/G may pack the most analytical power—especially with its Solver goal-seeking utility. *Wingz*, with limited file linking and lack of multi-page capabilities, carries a slight handicap in handling worksheets but will probably emerge as the clear leader in graphics and presentations. ●

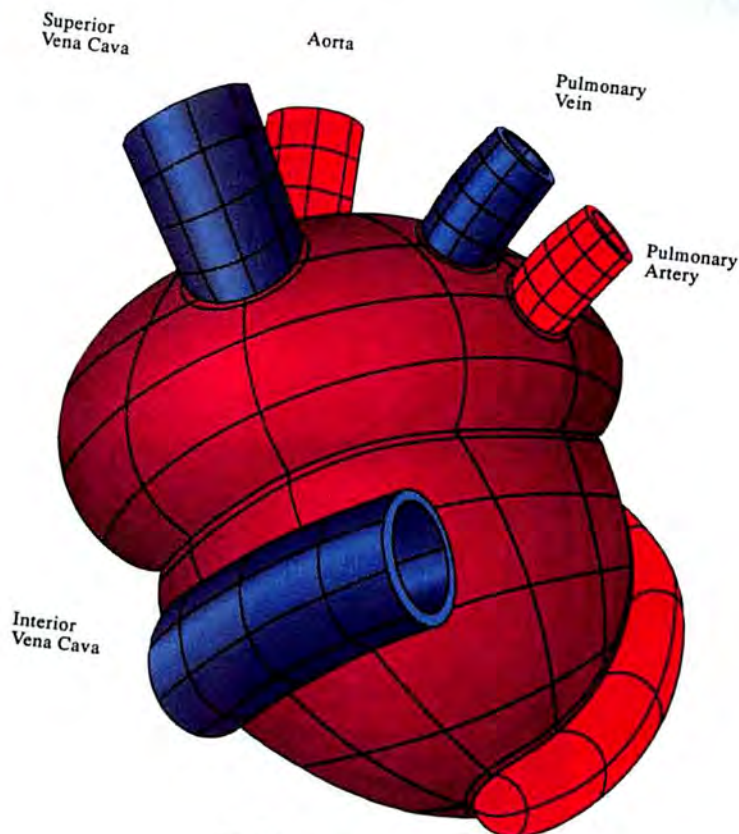

SX Machines Turn Up the Clock

Dell and NCR debut the first desktops built around the new 20-MHz SX chip.

Intel's 80386SX processor lets computer manufacturers build inexpensive PCs that run all 386 software; the only drawbacks are a slight cost in speed and a 16MB limit on addressable memory. Low pricing on these systems has made them popular in entry-level business roles, and sales have skyrocketed in recent months. One result of the new machines' success has been the death of the original 16-MHz 386. Now, with Intel's recent release of a 20-MHz SX chip, the 20-MHz 386 clearly is destined for the same fate.

Dell and NCR were quick to get the 20-MHz SX bandwagon rolling. Dell's entry is a full-sized box that affords plenty of expandability for anyone willing to sacrifice desk space. NCR has kept its system small and concentrated on packing it with features.

Dell's Expansion Plans

Dell's 320LX comes in a full-sized case with six



20-MHz systems like NCR's PC386sx (left) and Dell's 320LX offer speed close to that of a standard 20-MHz 386, but at a significantly lower price.



8/16-bit ISA slots, two 8-bit slots, and five disk bays—three of them front accessible for floppies and tape drives. With a parallel port, two serial ports, a hard disk connector, and a floppy controller built into the motherboard, only one slot—for a video card—must be set aside to run the system. It's doubtful that most users need this much expandability; neither is the

320LX a likely choice as a file server or CAD workstation. The larger size has allowed Dell to hit the market sooner, but if you don't need the extra slots or drive bays, you're giving up desk space for nothing.

The motherboard has two sets of four SIMM memory sockets; each set accepts either all 256K or all 1MB modules. The 320LX can address a total of 16MB, but for more

than 8MB you'll need a standard memory card in a 16-bit slot, which degrades performance.

With a 40MB hard disk, VGA, and 1MB of RAM, the 320LX costs \$3199—only \$300 more than Dell's similarly equipped 16-MHz SX offering. In order to keep the price down, Dell dispensed with memory caching. The RAM is in-

terleaved, which speeds things up somewhat, but not as much as a cache would. According to Dell, the system is about as fast as an uncached 20-MHz 386. (Almost half of the 20-MHz 386 models now available in the market are outfitted with a cache.)

The 320LX's construction is sturdy, with none of the badly fitting parts or sharp edges found in some cheap clones. The motherboard is essentially the same as that of Dell's full-sized 16-MHz SX; only the CPU and oscillator have been changed. A socket for a 20-MHz 80387SX coprocessor is provided, but that chip wasn't available at press time.

Although it certainly could serve as a business workstation, the 320LX is packaged for individuals, including novices. It comes with its hard disk formatted and the operating system (your choice of DOS 3.3 or 4.01, OS/2, or UNIX) already installed. The exceptionally well-designed documentation uses abundant graphics to explain everything from installing a hard disk to using directories.

NCR Thinks Small

NCR's 20-MHz PC386sx is a compact, elegant PC designed for corporate life. Four of its five 8/16-bit ISA slots are mounted horizontally, parallel to the motherboard. The drive bays are in a long,

narrow cage that lifts out easily without need of a screwdriver, giving easy access to the drives themselves and the motherboard beneath. Although both 5¼- and 3½-inch floppy drives are supported, the narrow hard disk bay fits only a 3½-inch drive. A built-in external port plug makes it easy to add an external floppy drive or tape backup.

As with the Dell, the motherboard contains a 20-MHz 80387SX socket, and controllers for a hard disk and two floppy drives—with the floppy controller also supporting tape backup drives. The NCR has one parallel and two serial ports, and the setup program allows you to configure their assign-

ments. The back of the computer sports a volume control and the external floppy port. The keyboard interface is compatible with PS/2s rather than ATs, so if you buy a third-party keyboard, you may have to pay extra for an adapter. Security-minded users will breathe easier with four levels of ROM-based password protection and the ability to prohibit booting from a floppy.

The PC386sx has four sets of two SIMM sockets each on the motherboard. In addition to 256K and 1MB modules, the sockets accept 4MB SIMMs. Like all SX systems, NCR's PC386sx is limited to 16MB of memory. The NCR also comes with 16-bit, 256K VGA Plus on the motherboard, upgradable to 512K. Capable of generating up to 1024 by 768 resolution if memory is added, the PC386sx's video interface includes the standard VGA auxiliary video connector.

The PC386sx comes with a 16K cache, controlled by the Intel 82385SX-20 chip. NCR claims that the PC386sx offers performance comparable to that of a full-fledged, cached 20-MHz 386.

All these extra features add to the cost. With a 40MB hard disk, 2MB of RAM, and VGA, a PC386sx lists for \$4695—nearly half again as much as its Dell rival. This price difference may not be as severe as it sounds,

however, because the NCR offering will sell on the street for much less, while the Dell list price is for real. In comparison, NCR's 16-MHz SX machine goes for \$3795.

Promising significant savings over its full 32-bit cousins with little speed penalty in most applications, the 20-MHz SX looks toward a bright future. We should expect many vendors to follow suit, offering a good price/performance ratio at the low end of the 386 market. ●

T1000SE, T1000XE, T1200XE

Notable Notebooks Spotlight Ergonomics, Screen

The Toshiba T1000SE, T1000XE, and T1200XE aren't the last word in notebook technology. But they offer an appealing combination of small footprint, light weight, and aggressive pricing as well as an emphasis on good ergonomics and screen quality.

The T1000 series, with its 9.54-MHz 80C86 CPU, is Toshiba's answer to the much-heralded Compaq LTE, while the 80C286-based T1200XE is a hard drive version of Toshiba's T1200 meant to go head-to-head with Compaq's LTE/286.

Both T1000 models weigh about 6 pounds, and they have the same footprint. The principal difference between the \$1699 T1000SE and the \$2699 T1000XE, aside from price, is that the T1000XE has a 25ms 20MB hard drive, while for the T1000SE you must rely on a standard 1.44MB 3½-inch floppy or an optional 5¼-inch external drive. Both have DOS 3.3 and the *Lap-Link* file transfer utility in ROM so that you can download to a desktop.

The T1000SE is for people who write a few memos and use simple spreadsheets; the T1000XE can handle more demanding applications. And if you need still more speed and memory, the 12-MHz T1200XE expands from the standard 1MB of RAM to 5MB

and offers both a 3½-inch floppy and a 20MB hard drive. Although just 7.5 pounds, and only an inch deeper than the 12.4-by-10.6-by-2-inch T1000s, the \$3999 T1200XE is meant to be a battery-powered desktop PC equivalent.

The rival Compaq machines are equipped with both 3½-inch floppy and hard drives, and the LTE/286 has a docking station that lets you do some serious expansion. But in addition to parallel and serial ports, all the Toshiba machines have a 100-pin connector that is the gateway to a future 16-bit ex-

pansion bus. For now, a 2400-bps modem sized to fit the Toshiba modem slot is the only option.

The T1000 Toshiba ships with 1MB of memory. By plugging in two 1MB cards, you can expand to 3MB—triple the capacity of the Compaq offerings. The cards lack batteries, so you can't use them for storage, but all the Toshiba machines have an auto-resume feature that will let you turn off the machine and save a RAM disk as-is for as long as seven days on fresh nickel-cadmium batteries.

The T1000SE and XE share the same 9-inch di-

agonal supertwist nematic LCD with double-scan CGA (640 by 400), while the T1200XE has a slightly larger and brighter version of the same—all sporting twice the vertical graphics resolution of the Compaq machines.

A well-sculpted 82-key keyboard has the feel of a desktop keyboard and eight cursor control keys—features unusual for portables in this class. Standard Architecture (EISA) powerhouses from Acer and AST. Both machines use Intel's 25-MHz i486 chip, take advantage of 32-bit software, and

Kyocera Q-8010

Do-It-All Printer Sidesteps the PostScript-LaserJet Debate

Desperately seeking a be-all printer for your network? The Kyocera Q-8010 could be just the answer for your work group. This \$6995 PostScript machine not only prints at a fast 10 ppm but also offers solid LaserJet Series II emulation with three printer ports (serial, parallel, and Apple-Talk) that can be preset, eliminating the hassle of switching emulations via software.

The Q-8010 is fast with graphics as well as with text, thanks to an on-board CPU, a math coprocessor, and judicious use of RAM. It comes with 5MB of RAM (expandable to 6MB), 4MB of which is dedicated to composing two pages at a time. The other megabyte or two can be devoted to downloading fonts.

Along with speed you get a 10,000-page monthly duty cycle (nearly twice that of the LaserWriter IINTX), 35 standard PostScript fonts, and the ability to use Type 3 (but not Type 1) downloadable fonts from Adobe. If 35 fonts aren't enough, Kyocera sells three font cards with 4 fonts each for \$325 per card.

The Q-8010 printer not only emulates up to 16 different LaserJet cartridges, it lets you call on a variety of scalable fonts. The fonts include the equivalent of the LaserJet's standard internal set, Times Roman and Helvetica, and some headline fonts such as Century Schoolbook. To use scalable fonts in HP emula-

tion mode, you must have a Q-8010-specific driver for your application; Kyocera claims that WordPerfect and others will have drivers soon.

The Q-8010 is limited to a single 250-sheet paper tray in standard configuration and lacks an envelope feeder. However, it prints manually fed envelopes and transparencies, and a legal-sized paper tray is available for \$78.95. A print drum lasts about 10,000 pages and costs \$179.95 to replace, while a \$36.75 toner cartridge is good for 3000

64MB. Like the AST machine, the Acer offers five half-height drive bays, and the 6.3-by-20.9-by-16.5-inch cabinet has six 32-bit EISA expansion slots. You'll lose one to a video adapter and, if you choose either one of the optional ESDI drives, another to a hard disk controller.

The AST Premium 486/25E EISA comes with just 2MB of RAM upgradable to a respectable 36MB, and no external cache. Its 6.25-by-19.25-by-16.5-inch case sports seven EISA 32-bit slots, but after you've added the CPU card and a video adapter, you'll only have five available—four if you go for the optional 320MB ESDI drive.

The 1200 has a 230-watt power supply and features a 12-month warranty that includes 4 months' on-site service. If your only problem is that spreadsheet recalcs take too long, Aox also makes cached 20-MHz and 25-MHz versions of the MicroMaster 386. A 25-MHz 486 is in the works—architecturally identical to the 386 model, sans external cache.

Each upgrade board takes a 16-bit MCA slot and holds up to 4MB of directly accessible, CPU-speed 32-bit memory. The Aox boards support up to 15.5MB of memory, but memory not on the Aox board is accessed at the PS/2's 10-MHz bus speed. There's a socket for an 80387 math coprocessor, which will help pare power-hungry applications down to size.

This is about as significant an upgrade as you can make. But Aox has

the blessing of IBM, so plugging in a MicroMaster won't affect your Big Blue warranty. The company says it has tested the boards with a wide range of operating systems and applications. Compatibility problems have come up only on

the hardware side, when other third-party MCA boards are installed, Aox says.

You need at least 1MB of on-card memory in addition to the external cache, but Aox doesn't sell it: You have to get it from your reseller or by

mail order. Without memory, the MicroMaster 386/33 retails for \$2495. The 20-MHz and 25-MHz 386 models are priced at \$1495 and \$1795, respectively. The 486/25, out later this year, will cost \$4695 without memory. Aox Inc., 486 Totten Pond Rd., Waltham, MA 02154; 800/232-1269. —Mark Henricks

486 With Frills

Tandon's 486/25 dresses up the already imposing i486. An EISA bus, extra caching memory, and a write accelerator are big pluses if you're running demanding network software or power-hungry operating environments.

Tandon engineers have decided that the i486's internal 8K memory cache is nice but not big enough; they've added a 64K high-speed external memory cache on the motherboard to run the 486 more effectively in fast burst mode. Data, of course, flows two ways, and the Tandon's PowerPoster write accelerator works like cache memory but in the other direction, accepting data from the 486.

This is one of the first desktops built around the i486 and EISA from the ground up. To make the match work, Tandon came up with a new memory manager for the 486/25. You can split up to 256MB of system memory into 16K pages. Each page can be marked as cachable or

not, write-protected or not, or devoted to shadow RAM.

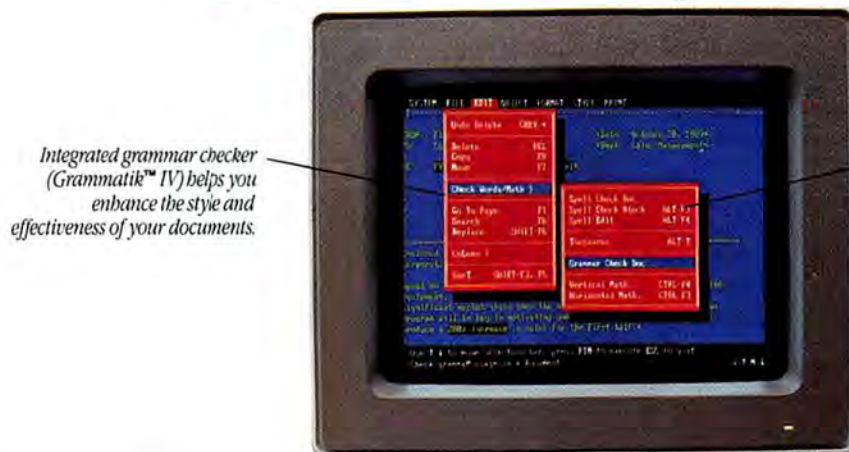
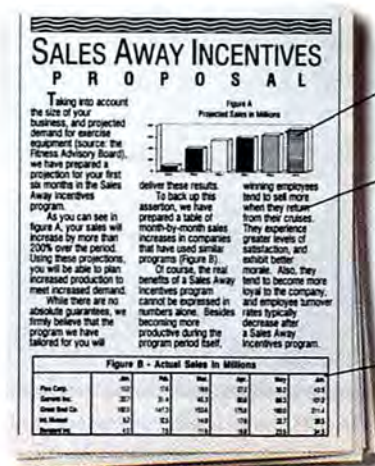

Faxit for Windows

Fabulous Pop-Up Faxes—From Windows to the World

With fax rapidly replacing much paper mail, the ho-hum default fonts you get from the software bundled with most fax boards just don't cut it anymore. Good news for *Windows* users: Alien Computing's *Faxit* software lets you send off font- and graphics-rich facsimiles of your documents. And Alien is extending *Faxit* capability to many boards that don't yet support the DCA/Intel Communicating Applications Specification

(CAS) protocol.

Consuming between 32K and 100K of memory when in use, *Faxit* pops up over any *Windows* application, letting you convert your document, complete with graphics and *Windows* or Bitstream fonts, into 200-by-100-dpi or 200-by-200-dpi Group III fax output. *Faxit* masquerades as a *Windows* printer driver, but instead of merely redirecting printer output as some of its counterparts do, *Faxit* rasterizes your file directly from *Windows*' graph-

ics commands. Thus you avoid the time-consuming two-step translation process, and aspect ratios are more precise.

Faxit's capabilities extend far beyond the file conversions offered by some fax boards. You can control the entire fax process, including selecting recipients from a dialing directory, printing and viewing faxes, and setting up unattended, timed transmissions. You can even receive faxes in the background.

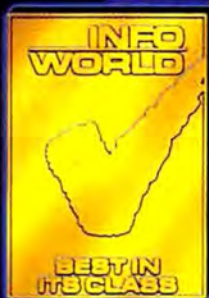
These benefits previously were limited to CAS-compatible boards such as the Intel Connection CoProcessor, but *Faxit* now supports the Xerox/Datacopy MicroFax. By midyear it should also work directly with fax boards from Panasonic, Relisys, OAZ, Brooktrout, Hayes, GammaLink, and The Complete PC.

The Regal SX puts 32-bit computing, a gas plasma display, and 40MB of memory in a luggable box that's as much as \$3000 less than similarly configured portables—and adds a money-back guarantee.

Low-priced 386SX machines have sometimes seemed slow in coming, but the Regal SX transportable from Micro Ex-

press signals that the wait is over. For \$2499 you get a 386SX with 1MB of RAM on the motherboard (expandable to 8MB on

the motherboard and 16MB overall), an easy-to-read EGA gas plasma display showing four scales of gray, and a hefty 40MB hard disk. That puts the 20-pound portable's price tag as much as \$3000 below that of some comparable SX desktops.

A special key lets you cycle through various color-to-gray-scale translations so you can run color-based applications without reinstallation. If you've put your desktop publishing business (or annual report) on hold until PostScript printer prices drop to humane levels, get set to go back to work. Texas Instruments' MicroLaser PS35 offers true Adobe PostScript for only \$2999 list.

Considering that a \$6000 price tag is not unusual for a PostScript laser printer, you might expect the PS35 to be short on features. Its 6-ppm Sharp engine is 2 ppm slower than average, but this 300-dpi printer includes 35 scalable outline fonts and comes with a standard 1.5MB of RAM, expandable to 4.5MB.

An internal paper tray accommodates 250 sheets and handles six sizes of paper as well as transparencies, invoices, labels, and envelopes. Offices with heavy printing loads can add a second 250-sheet tray. What's more, with a small footprint and a low 33-pound weight, the MicroLaser PS35 is desktop ready.

The \$189 print drum has a 40,000-page life, and the \$149 developer kit is good for 20,000 pages. A separate \$69 toner kit needs to be changed every 3000 pages. That puts the per-page consumables price at 3.5 cents with 5 percent ink coverage, only slightly higher than the

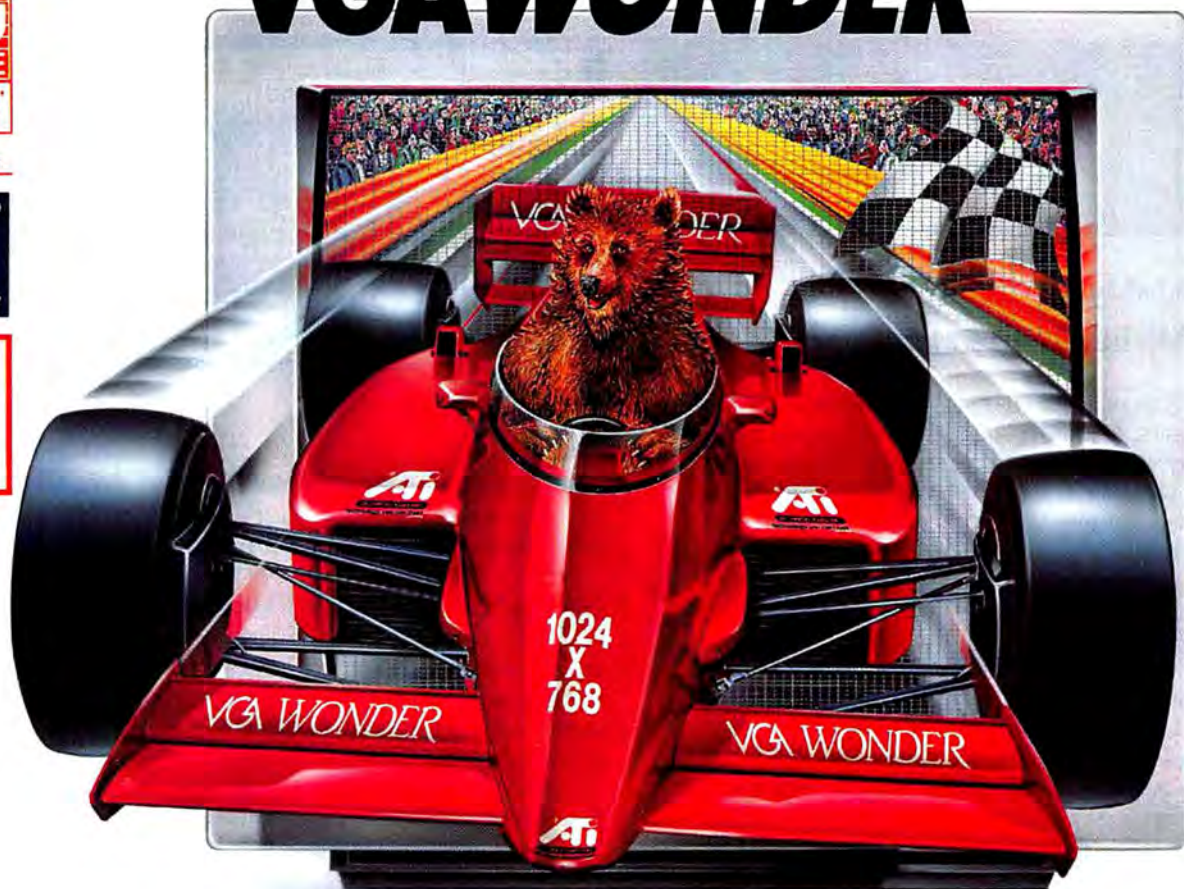

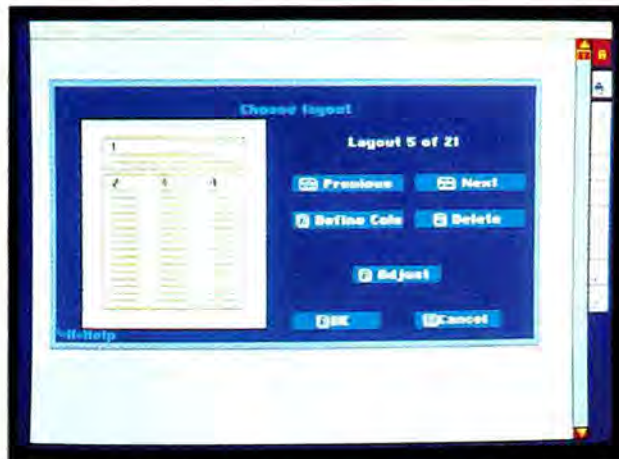
A Publisher With Extra Punch

For many beginning and casual users, *PFS: First Publisher* was the first desktop publisher. It still often plays that role, but the bar has been raised on the quality of business documents. Software Publishing Corporation hopes to meet the challenge with version 3.0 of its popular product, which offers near-instant font creation capabilities and better-looking output.

Few *First Publisher* customers want to become DTP mavens, so SPC's challenge has been to increase capabilities without boosting complex-

ity. New context-sensitive help and the addition of color to the interface go part of the way. A layout gallery of 21 geometric elements that lets you quickly format any of three paper sizes in landscape or portrait mode also helps. Text can flow through these boxes and rectangles and wrap around art.

But fast fonts are the real news in version 3.0. The addition of Bitstream's *Speedo* lets you scale Fontware version 3.0's Swiss and Dutch fonts from 9 to 70 points virtually on the fly. Since

you can get fonts any time you want, you won't have to painstakingly install and then manage them in various sizes. *First Publisher 3.0* also has five other Bitstream text and headline families in 22 fixed point sizes. Picture-Perfect Word Processing

Thanks to Windows, today's top word processors are helping users reach maximum productivity in no time.

Here's why Ami Pro and Word for Windows are your Best Buys right now.

By now the concept of a word processor-cum-desktop publisher is yesterday's news. Every major word processor from *WordPerfect* to *MultiMate* has layered on high-end formatting features such as style sheets, font support, and graphics manipulation. But these character-based programs share one serious flaw: They can't display a realistic replica of the final printed page. Most offer a static page preview that shows columns, fonts, and graphics, but you must exit to the character world to do any work.

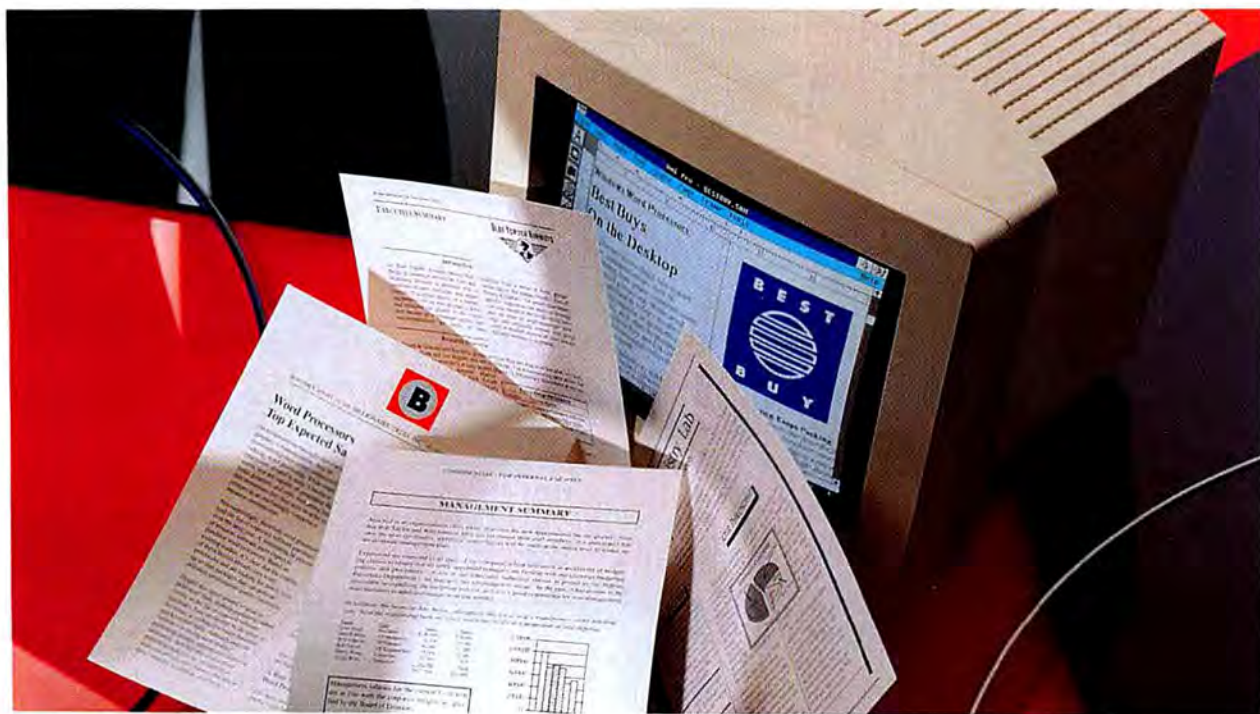
Now, thanks to *Windows*' graphical interface, this barrier has fallen. Samna's *Ami Professional*, Microsoft's *Word for Windows*, and, to a lesser extent, NBI's *Legend* offer word processing power that rivals that of *Word* and *WordPerfect*, plus the true-to-life display of a desktop publishing program. They also add enough page layout tools to handle many publishing tasks.

If you're a regular *Windows* user, one of these programs is for you. If you're not yet wedded to *Windows*, one of these packages may make you switch. They're easier to use than high-end character-based word processors, and formatting is somewhat superior. If program standardization and minimal training are your key buying criteria, the uniformity that *Windows* applications like these offer can pay off.

Just remember that *Windows* packages are slow. In National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL) tests, *Ami Pro* was the speed champ and *Legend* brought up the rear, but none of these programs rivals text-based word processors in speed. To keep your sanity, you'll need at least a 12-MHz 80286 system; an 80386 with a fast hard disk and a minimum of 2MB of RAM is recommended.

On the plus side, the programs' honest page displays eliminate formatting guesswork, and shortcuts such as style sheets, dialog boxes, and icons help you work faster in

the long run. If you rarely use graphics or fancy formatting, stay with your character-based word processor; if precise layout controls are critical, hang on to your desktop publishing program. But for everyone else, why *not* a *Windows* word processor?

Stylish Word Workers

In many ways, the contenders are three peas in a pod. They all cost \$495, include run-time *Windows*, and display the spitting image of printed output, including graphics, fonts, and column formatting. If the slow screen refresh drives you crazy, you can switch to faster, monofont draft modes.

As with all *Windows* programs, you either use a mouse to access pulldown menus or turn to keyboard shortcuts. To format text, you click on paragraphs and select preformatted styles from menus. You can easily create your own styles, and override styles with on-the-fly formatting.

Formatting options are more advanced than in these packages' DOS counterparts, but there's not enough here to satisfy publishing professionals. Except in *Legend*, kerning (changing the spacing between individual letters) and tracking (modifying letterspacing en masse in a block of text) are fairly primitive, and snap-to-grid functions are lacking. None of the programs offers layout controls to match *PageMaker*'s. But their graphics manipulation beats character-based programs hands down. Just open a frame, import the image, and move and resize it.

You won't sacrifice editing tools, either. All the programs offer the basics, from mail merge to footnotes, plus spelling checkers and outliners. They also provide long-document features such as index and table of contents generation.

Ami Pro and *Word for Windows* are clearly a step ahead, though, delivering such extras as bookmarks, a thesaurus, network support, and group-writing features. You can

add hidden notes (annotations) that pop up on request, and track multiple revisions with *Word for Windows*' redlining feature. Powerful macro languages and support for Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) let programmers customize the programs and exchange data with other *Windows* applications. Less technical users can also record macros, but DDE

links usually require programming. A final note: At press time, only *Word for Windows* could run safely under the new *Windows 3.0*. Samna promises a free 3.0-aware upgrade to *Ami Professional* after 3.0's release, and NBI will add 3.0 support in a new version of *Legend* expected later this year.

Ami Professional 1.1

Ami Professional offers more desktop publishing tricks than *Word for Windows*, and it's no slouch at editing, either. Samna's entry lacks Microsoft's redlining, equation editing, and menu customization, but it compensates with drawing and charting. It's also a bit easier to use, especially when you're building tables or manipulating graphics. Factor in *Ami Pro*'s first-place speed, and it's clearly a Best Buy.

Ami Pro's interface is somewhat more flexible than *Word for Windows*, and the manuals and context-sensitive help are helpful and well designed. A sidebar menu displays icons for common options, such as adding frames and printing. You can select 12 icons from a list of 48 to customize the sidebar according to your whim. Compared to *Word for Windows*, the icons are larger, their layout is less cluttered, and they don't steal from the editing space.

You can choose from five views: a fast draft mode, three graphics modes in various magnifications, and a facing-page preview. *Ami Pro*'s major flaw: You're limited to one document window at a time.

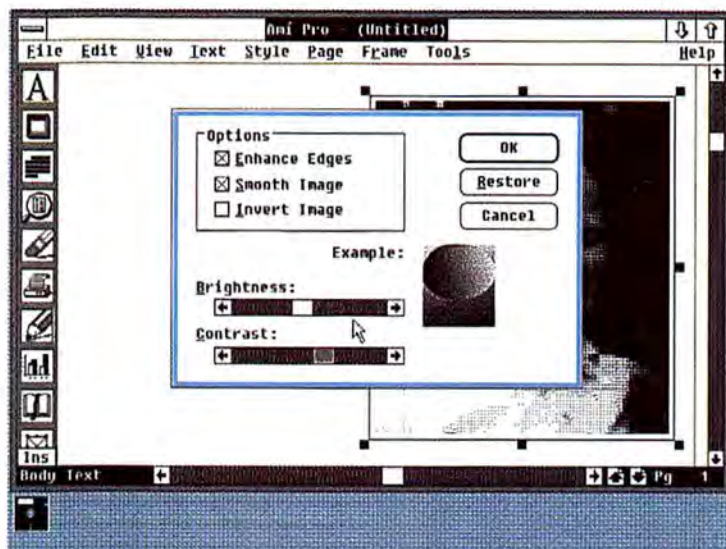
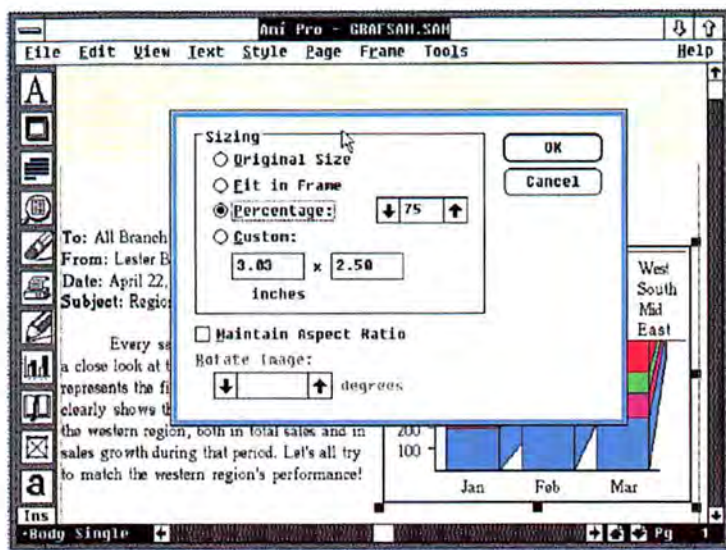

The outliner isn't integrated, so you can't rearrange a document by moving the outline headings. The four-level undo command is superior, but mail merge is less capable. Whereas *Word for Windows* can draw upon tabular data, *Ami Pro*'s mail merge requires comma-delimited, fixed-length, or DIF data files.

The BASIC-like macro language isn't for novices, but it lets you create complex conditional macros or custom dialog boxes, and it offers extensive on-line help. The program lacks *Word for Windows*' slick debugging tools, however, and you can't customize

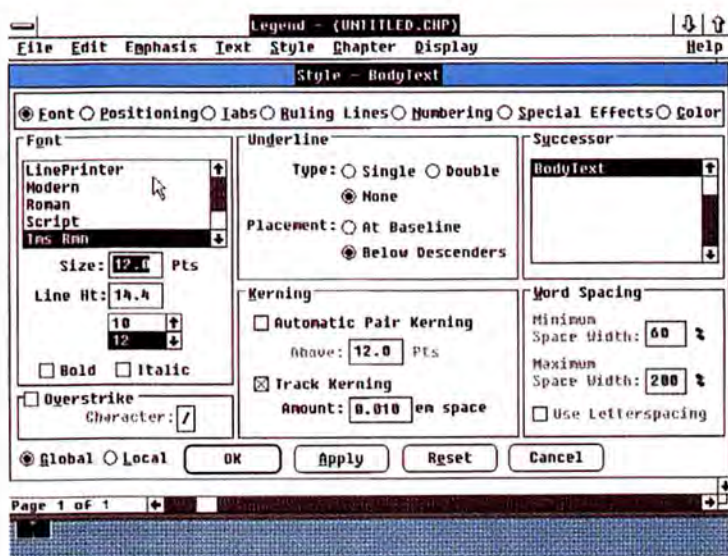

Learning *Legend* is a chore. On-line help isn't context sensitive, and the program switches confusingly between two main menus, one for editing and one for framing. No icons are to be found.

Basic text editing is easy, and you can customize the screen to any magnification. You can't split the screen into windows, however, and the draft mode is marred by a status line that flashes at every keystroke. Advanced features are missing—there are no macros, bookmarks, DDE links, or group-editing tools; there's no thesaurus; and the import/export routines are limited.

Like *Ventura Publisher*, *Legend* forces you to create frames for text, including any text that fails to match *Legend's* default format. Selecting fonts requires two menus, one for type family and another for size. Styles are



inextricably linked to the document, so it's all too easy to change styles and save the document, thus overwriting the original style sheet. You can swap styles between documents, but the process is awkward.

Legend's style-editing dialog box allows one-step control over all aspects of style. *Legend's* letterspacing controls are superior to the other programs'.

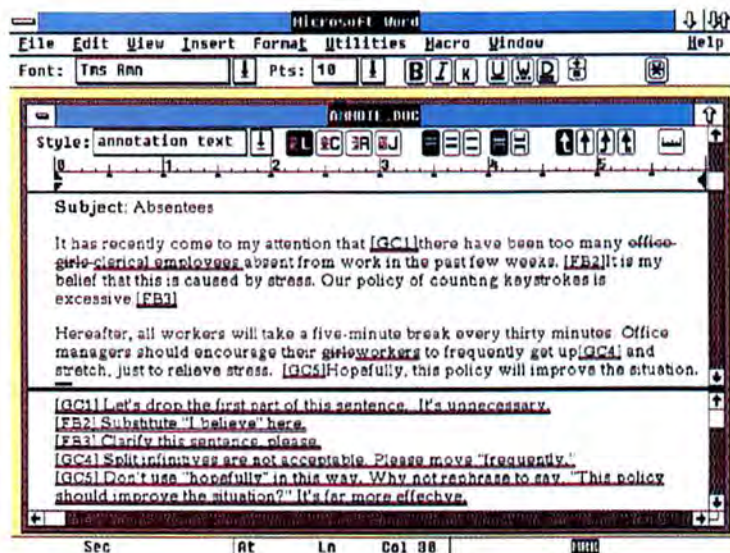

Legend is competent at manipulating graphics—you can easily size, crop, and position images and quickly link frames so text flows from frame to frame. There's a handy drawing program but no charting. Tables are a snap to create, but they can't contain graphics, and the lack of math functions limits their usefulness.

Word for Windows offers superb group editing. The bottom window shows initialed pop-up notes, and above that sits the redlined text marked to show deletions and additions. The upper ribbon and ruler lines provide icons of formatting shortcuts.

Here and there, *Legend* shines. It offers a handy snap-to-grid feature, which simplifies frame alignment, and its kerning and tracking tools are tops. Unfortunately, *Legend* is stranded in a no-man's-land: Its layout and typographical skills can't match *Page-Maker's*, and its editing skills can't compete with those of *Ami Pro* or *Word for Windows*.

Word for Windows 1.0

Microsoft's long-awaited *Word for Windows* lacks some of *Ami Pro's* slick graphics extras, and it's slower and slightly more difficult. But it offers group-editing functions and more advanced editing tools, and its DDE links and macros are also superior. All told, it shares the Best Buy with *Ami Pro*.

The program is fairly easy to learn, thanks to an interactive tutorial and precise manuals. Context-sensitive help is outstanding, but its tiny font makes you squint. Don't expect *Word* experience to help out much in training—users of the DOS-based *Word* will have to learn new hot keys and create new style sheets and macros.

Word for Windows lets you open up to nine document windows, but it has fewer view options than its rivals. You can choose a full graphics view, a somewhat faster galley view that won't display graphics, and a fast draft view. There's also a preview mode that dis-

plays facing pages, but it lacks magnification options.

In text formatting, *Word* almost matches *Ami Pro*. Optional icon bars, called *ribbons* and *rulers*, sit above the editing screen. The ribbon covers character functions such as fonts and enhancements, and the ruler covers tabs, styles, and margins. If there's more than one function per icon, a menu drops down. The numerous formatting icons make on-the-fly formatting easier than with *Ami Pro*, which reserves its icons for more complex functions. *Word's* superb, integrated outliner includes its own ribbon.

Style sheets are easier to create and apply than in *Word 5.0* but not as easy as with *Ami Pro*. You create styles via dialog boxes or by using an existing formatted paragraph as an example. Styles are two mouse clicks away instead of *Ami Pro's* one, however, and dialog boxes don't display format changes.

The table editor is feature rich but harder to use than *Ami Pro's*—you set cell sizes and borders in a dialog box rather than with a mouse. However, creating multiple-column formats is a snap.

Word for Windows can't match *Ami Pro's* easy interactive graphics manipulation. You don't dump an image into a frame and then

move it around; instead, you pull a picture into a box, then fill out a dialog box to move and size it. You can't rotate an image or import PCX files, either. You won't find any drawing or charting modules, and border types are limited.

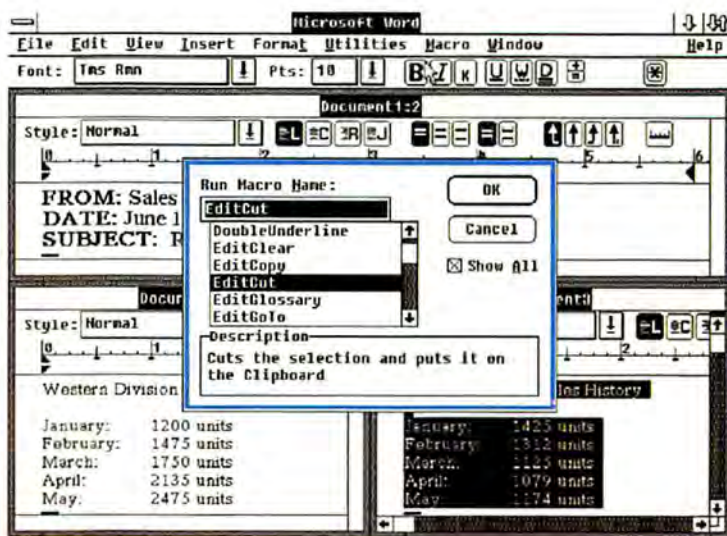
Editing features are top-notch. The mail merge lets you draw upon data from tables. You can even insert special fields and commands that include variables and conditionals, prompt for user input, run macros, or create equations. Group-editing tools, such as redlining and annotations, also shine. The program's superior document summaries let you track revisions and search files.

Word for Windows' powerful, BASIC-like macro language isn't for novices, but you can sculpt custom menus and dialog boxes, or add macro commands to menus. And unlike with *Ami Pro*, there's an interactive debugger complete with break points, a step mode, and solid error handling. You'll definitely need the help, because tapping the program's two-way DDE requires macro programming.

Despite its gaps in graphics handling, *Word for Windows* is a winner. Its malleability and editing tools make it the top choice as a corporate word processor.

The Look of the Future

Windows now offers the two best word processors in the business. As long as you can afford the high-end systems required to keep them humming, you'll find *Ami Professional* and *Word for Windows* to be a major evolutionary step in the right direction. Choosing

between them is the hard part. *Word for Windows* best fits a corporate environment requiring mail merge and group-editing tools. If you need a heavier dose of desktop publishing, *Ami Professional* is the ticket. Both are Best Buys.

Performance is still a problem, but realistic page displays and graphical shortcuts make up for it. Someday you'll probably be using one of these programs or something quite like it, so you might as well jump in now. ●

PostScript the Hard Way

These low-cost emulators can turn your plain-vanilla printer into a PostScript clone. But be prepared to wrestle with incompatibilities—

and then settle in for a long, long wait.

It's hard to resist the allure of PostScript—its scalable fonts and sophisticated graphics capabilities have made it a standard for desktop publishers. And with applications from word processors to spreadsheets supporting it, now virtually anyone can add PostScript pizzazz to his or her documents. But for millions of LaserJet owners, upgrading to PostScript has meant ditching their investment for a PostScript-compatible printer or buying an expensive add-in board.

Now, with the help of PostScript-compatible emulators, you can generate PostScript effects on a variety of laser, ink jet, and even dot matrix printers at a fraction of the cost of, say, an Apple LaserWriter. But can an emulator deliver Adobe PostScript compatibility and convenience at a bargain price?

To find out, we examined five products that promise to bring PostScript to your LaserJet Series II. Custom Applications' *Freedom of Press*, LaserGo's *GoScript Plus*, Pan Overseas' *PreScript Deluxe*, and QMS's *UltraScript PC Plus* are all software emulators, while Pacific Data's *PacificPage* is a plug-in cartridge. Prices for full, 35-font versions range from \$299 to \$695, but three of the packages also come in 13- or 25-font versions for less than \$200—truly PostScript on the cheap.

We put the emulators through a rigorous series of speed and compatibility tests and found that none merits a Best Buy. While all the products handled simple text documents adeptly, some had problems with common functions like creating fill patterns and curves. On the other hand, a couple of the emulators were able to digest meaty PostScript files even an Apple LaserWriter IINTX couldn't stomach. Of the five, *Freedom* is clearly the compatibility champ.

Other factors also keep a Best Buy at bay. Hidden hardware costs for system and printer RAM can be substantial, some emulators make you exit your application to print a file, and printing can be agonizingly slow. If you need only occasional PostScript output and

already have the hardware, consider one of these products. But serious desktop publishers and users starting from scratch should probably invest in a PostScript printer.

Limits of PostScript Compatibility

Simply put, Adobe's PostScript page description language tells printers how to place text and graphics on a page. PostScript printers interpret these commands and compose each page in their own memory using a high-speed processor; PostScript emulators do the job with your PC's processor and memory, then send a bit map of the page to your non-PostScript printer. (One exception: The *PacificPage* cartridge does the job at the LaserJet, using the HP controller.)

At a minimum, a PostScript emulator should successfully print PostScript files created with *PageMaker*, *Ventura Publisher*, and other PostScript-compatible applications, and it should be able to produce such effects as reversed, stretched, and rotated type. While all the reviewed emulators meet these criteria, none can interpret all PostScript commands—something that may limit your ability to create complex images.

All the products emulate version 47 of PostScript and provide equivalents to Adobe's library of 35 fonts from Bitstream, Compugraphic, and other top vendors. Except for *PreScript*, all can use third-party downloadable PostScript fonts, but only *Freedom* can handle Adobe fonts—perhaps the truest measure of PostScript compatibility.

Before You Buy

The two biggest considerations are PostScript compatibility and ease of use. Beyond this, the things that separate a cheap PostScript emulator from a true PostScript printer are speed, cost, and hardware re-

quirements. Unfortunately, no single product excels in every category.

And while these emulators will work on a LAN, they're far from ideal. No vendor guarantees compatibility with all network printer drivers or certifies its product for use on a server. The PacificPage cartridge is an economically attractive solution for networked LaserJets, since you need only one unit per printer. But the cartridge doesn't automatically switch back to the HP's PCL mode, a shortcoming that may cause non-PostScript documents queued up behind yours to vanish into oblivion. LAN users

should approach these emulators with caution.

Compatibility We tested each emulator—and an Apple LaserWriter IINTX—using documents created with *Adobe Illustrator*, *Corel Draw*, *Microsoft Word*, *PageMaker*, and *Ventura Publisher*, then fed them ten "torture" files designed to tap PostScript's robust graphics commands. All the products handled simple text documents with ease, but tests with complex graphics occasionally produced imperfect curves, jagged lines, or incomplete images. Only *Freedom* printed all the torture files—something even the LaserWriter couldn't do. The other emulators

choked on one or more of the tests (see the sidebar "PostScript Clones Survive the Compatibility Torture Test").

Configuration and Use Installing the PacificPage cartridge is easy: Just plug it in. The rest of the emulators require you to copy files to disk and select printer, port, paper size, and other settings as prompted. To change settings in *Freedom* or *GoScript*, you have to rerun the setup program. Only *PreScript* (running under *Windows/286*) and *UltraScript* let you reconfigure on the fly from handy pulldown menus.

Printing can be a bigger pain. With *Freedom* and *GoScript*, you must print files to disk, exit your application, and then send the files to the printer from DOS. But *UltraScript*, *PreScript*, and PacificPage work transparently: Simply install your programs for a PostScript device and print.

Speed If you want quick PostScript output, look elsewhere. Even the fastest emulator, PacificPage, is two to ten times slower than an Apple LaserWriter IINTX. Worse, because most emulators use the PC to process PostScript code, your system is frozen until the composed image is sent to the printer. PacificPage frees up your PC relatively quickly, but you'll still have to wait until your application finishes downloading the file to the printer.

Hidden Hardware Costs Although three of the products work with an 8088-based PC, for even reasonable performance you'll need a fast 286 or 386 with at least 1MB of extended memory, several megabytes of hard disk space, plus 1MB to 2.5MB of printer RAM. A math coprocessor is also recommended for processing graphics files with *Freedom* or *GoScript*. Unless you already own most of this equipment, these low-cost emulators may not be much of a bargain (see the sidebar "Solving the PostScript Equation—The True Cost of Emulators").

Printer Support Obviously, all the products work with the Series II—and that's the end of the story for PacificPage. (Pacific Data also sells a \$449 cartridge for the IIP.) *PreScript*'s meager printer list includes only PCL-compatible lasers and the DeskJet Plus. The other three all support dot matrix and ink jet printers, but only *UltraScript* and

Freedom support full color output—and *Freedom* adds support for thermal transfer printers and film recorders.

Freedom of Press 2.2

At \$495, Custom Applications' *Freedom of Press* is relatively expensive, but it's also the most versatile and polished performer in the roundup. It will run on an 8088 PC with 640K, supports the widest range of output devices, and offers top PostScript compatibility. If you could just load it and print from inside applications, *Freedom* would easily rate a Best Buy. Still, business users and occasional desktop publishers should find *Freedom* a worthy choice.

What really distinguishes *Freedom* is its superior accuracy in interpreting PostScript commands. It proved almost flawless in compatibility tests, printing several files the LaserWriter couldn't handle but stumbling over a complicated mandala image. And it's the only product that lets you use downloadable Adobe Type 1 fonts—a clear indication of PostScript compatibility.

Freedom tied for second with *UltraScript* in speed tests, thanks to the test system's math coprocessor, which made printing graphics-intensive documents two to three times faster. To squeeze more speed from your LaserJet, Custom Applications also

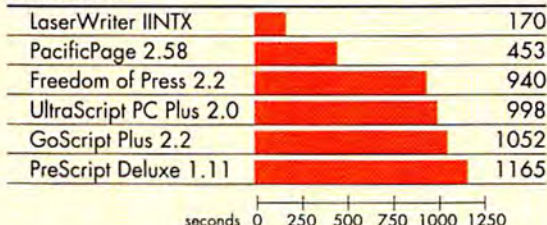

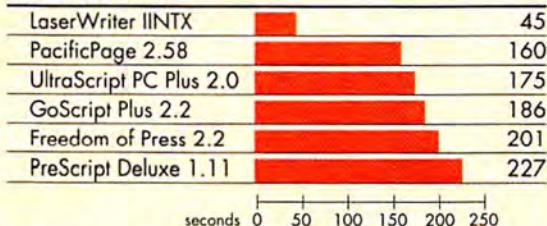

None of these emulators is a speed demon, but some are faster, simpler, and more compatible in certain situations. If you just need PostScript fonts, pick the PacificPage. For graphics, Freedom of Press and UltraScript PC Plus are the clear choices.

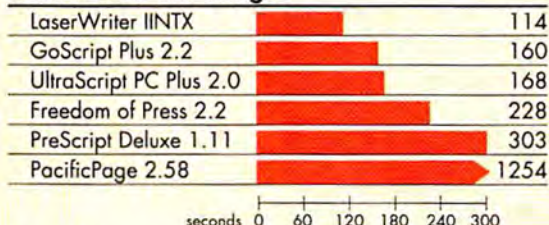
Methodology

PostScript emulator tests were conducted on a 20-MHz Compaq 386 with 5MB of RAM, a coprocessor, DOS 3.31, and a 60MB hard disk. A Hewlett-Packard Laser Jet Series II with 4.5MB of RAM installed was used as the printer for the PostScript emulators. To eliminate an application's effect on printing time, all output was captured to a RAM disk and then copied to the printer. Timing began when the command to copy was issued and ended when the last page came to rest in the output tray. Processing times were included for all products. Compaq's expanded memory manager (CEMM.EXE) was set for 3.5MB in tests of Freedom of Press 2.2 and GoScript Plus 2.2. GoScript Plus 2.2 was tested using its virtual memory setting. PreScript Deluxe 1.11 and UltraScript PC Plus 2.0 were allocated 2.5MB and 3.5MB, respectively, of extended memory during installation.

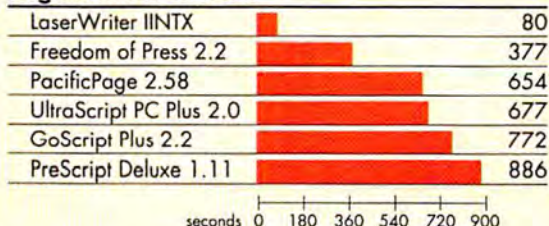
Plain text

sells Freedom Fast, a \$150 accelerator cartridge that plugs into a Series II font slot. For maximum performance, 512K or more of expanded memory in your PC is recommended.

Although *Freedom* forces you to copy print files to the printer, supplied batch files for popular programs like *Ventura* and *Microsoft Word* will do the job for you and then delete the files. A bar graph displays *Freedom's* progress as it interprets the Post-

Script commands. Reconfiguring the program is a snap: A batch file prompts you for new printer, port, and other settings.

Custom Applications claims the next version of *Freedom* will let you print from within applications. But even now, *Freedom's* reasonable hardware requirements, broad printer support, and excellent compatibility make it a solid value.

GoScript Plus 2.2

LaserGo's \$299 *GoScript Plus* is the cheapest emulator in the roundup. Like *Freedom*, it supports ink jet and dot matrix printers and can run on a 640K PC (though at least 1MB of expanded memory is recommended). But *GoScript* is slow, can't print within applications, and isn't as reliable as *Freedom* at translating PostScript graphics commands. If images play a major role in your documents, stay with *Freedom*.

GoScript's PostScript compatibility is limited. While the program has no problem producing text, it doesn't support PostScript's Setscreen command, which customizes the shape, frequency, and angle of halftone cells. As a result, *GoScript* balked at printing complex halftone patterns, and it rendered bit-mapped graphics slightly darker than other programs, causing a subtle loss of detail. On the other hand, it printed some sophisticated wave patterns the LaserWriter couldn't handle.

GoScript is no speed demon, finishing fourth overall in our tests. And this sluggish performance doesn't come cheap: A math coprocessor, 1MB of expanded memory, and

3MB of hard disk space are recommended, along with 1MB or more of printer RAM.

Like *Freedom*, *GoScript* forces you to print files to disk, then operate from the DOS prompt. Printing multiple copies or changing printer settings means typing a string of DOS switches. And while *GoScript* offers pop-up menus for easy configuration, you'll have to define parameters like virtual

POSTSCRIPT CLONES SURVIVE THE COMPATIBILITY TORTURE TEST

Daniel Tynan

Just how compatible are these PostScript emulators? To find out, we strapped the products to the rack and force-fed them a series of PostScript-language torture files. Then we took the same files and attempted to print them on an Apple LaserWriter IINTX.

The files were designed by Ross Smith, a desktop publishing consultant and the author of *Learning PostScript: A Visual Approach* (Peachpit Press, Berkeley, California, 1990). Each pushed the emulators to the limit, testing their ability to handle PostScript commands used to create complex curves, halftones, gray-scale images, layered text and graphics, and other sophisticated effects.

Overall, the PostScript emulators did reasonably well—and in several cases they printed complex images the LaserWriter couldn't handle—but some failed at basic tasks like creating pattern fills and smooth

curves (see sample output on the following pages). Of the five emulators, only *Freedom of Press* was able to print all ten files—with one notable gaffe—without crying uncle. The rest all failed to print at least one of the tests, which means if you want to print elaborate designs created with programs like *Corel Draw*, *Adobe Illustrator*, or *PC Paintbrush IV Plus*, you may run into problems.

As these torture tests show, not all PostScript interpreters are created equal. If you only need to produce simple text and graphics, any of these emulators should do fine. But if you want to get fancy, not even the granddaddy of PostScript devices, the Apple LaserWriter, can guarantee success.

memory size, then reconfigure them if *GoScript* runs out of memory while interpreting a file. In fact, if you don't have enough conventional memory available (about 550K), you may encounter files that *GoScript* can't handle.

GoScript is easily the most affordable way to get PostScript—a 13-font version sells for only \$149. And at press time, LaserGo announced *GoScript 3.0*, which includes a menu-driven interface and a VGA preview mode. But until the program's PostScript compatibility and performance improve, wait and see.

PacificPage 2.58

Pacific Data Products' \$695 PacificPage stands apart from other emulators for several reasons. It's the only plug-in PostScript cartridge reviewed, it requires the most printer RAM (2.5MB), and it works only

with the LaserJet Series II. But it's also the easiest emulator to install, you can print from within applications, and it doesn't care if you use a dual-floppy PC or a 33-MHz 386. For offices that share a Series II, PacificPage is the most economical choice.

PacificPage's PostScript compatibility is good but not outstanding. Like *GoScript Plus*, PacificPage consistently produced high-quality text, but it had trouble interpreting some PostScript graphics commands, resulting in ragged curves and imperfect circles. Still, you're not likely to encounter these problems printing everyday documents.

As the overall speed champ, PacificPage was twice as fast as its nearest challenger at plain text but was woefully slow at printing a complex *Ventura* file. But because PacificPage composes pages in the printer, it returns your PC to work more quickly than the other emulators, making it seem even faster. And PacificPage doesn't require a math coprocessor or a lot of system RAM—good news for users on a tight budget.

Installing PacificPage couldn't be simpler: Just slide it into the Series II's font cartridge slot. Then install your applications for a PostScript printer and print. To return to PCL mode, simply run a batch file or turn off the printer and yank out the cartridge. Just remember that if you use PacificPage on a

SOLVING THE POSTSCRIPT EQUATION—THE TRUE COST OF EMULATORS

Daniel Tynan

How cheap is a low-cost PostScript emulator? When you factor in costs for system and printer RAM, plus performance extras like a math coprocessor, it's still cheaper than a PostScript printer—but not by much. We compared the roundup's top program, *Freedom of Press*, with an add-on board for the HP LaserJet Series II and with Texas Instruments' inexpensive MicroLaser PS35, both Adobe-licensed PostScript devices. As the table shows, *Freedom of Press* is two-thirds the price of the TI printer, but only about \$150 cheaper than the upgrade kit. Of course, if you can live without the extra hardware—or already own it—the cost savings increase dramatically.

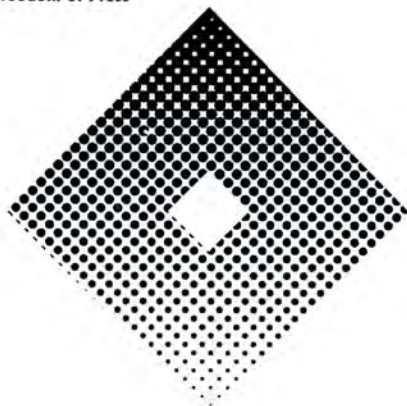

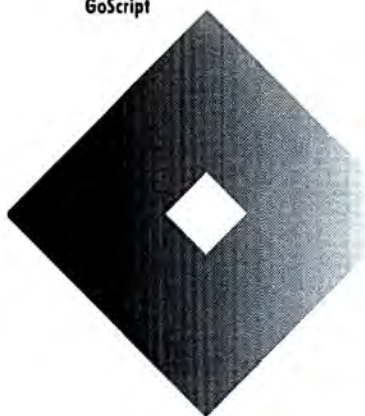

networked LaserJet, switching modes while someone else is printing can garble their output.

PacificPage is a solid deal, and it's the only emulator reviewed that lets you put the emulation where it belongs—in the printer. But if you need PostScript output on anything other than a LaserJet II—or if you tackle complex graphics—look elsewhere.

As the newest kid on the PostScript block, Pan Overseas' \$395 *PreScript Deluxe* is promising but awkward. Though fairly inexpensive (a 13-font version sells for \$195),

it's the only program that won't accept any downloadable PostScript fonts, and it works only with PCL-compatible printers. Worse, it combines stiff hardware requirements with mediocre compatibility. The only plus: You can print from within *Windows/286* or DOS applications.

PreScript's PostScript compatibility is spotty. The program did fine on most everyday applications and survived some of the toughest torture tests. But it glitched on several others, producing jagged curves, dark bit maps and tints, and incomplete images.

In speed tests, *PreScript* finished dead last three out of four times. However, informal tests indicated that *PreScript* is second

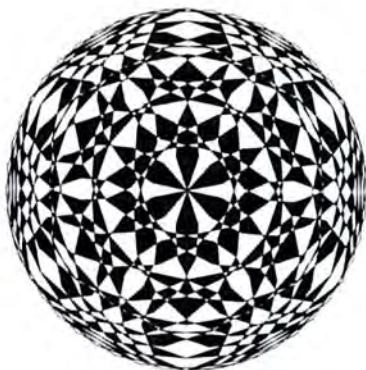

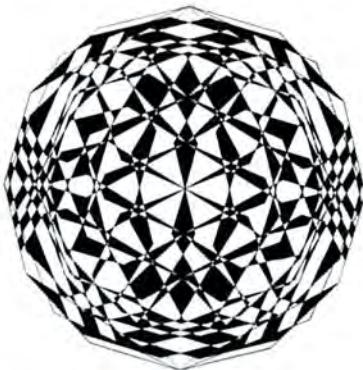

UltraScript produced octagonal patterns instead of circles; Freedom of Press printed a different pattern entirely; and PreScript printed half of the mandala perfectly, then threw up its hands in defeat. But the Apple LaserWriter IINTX, which was unable to handle the image's large number of line segments, produced nothing but an error message.

only to UltraScript when printing inside applications. Still, you'll have to pay a hefty hardware price: The program requires an 80286 or better with at least 2MB of extended memory, plus 1MB of printer RAM.

PreScript loads directly into extended memory above 1MB and runs in the 80286's protected mode. As a result, it can address up to 16MB of memory—great for processing huge files—and print in the background under Windows/286 (but not Windows/386).

Using PreScript is a breeze: Load it, then run your application and print. To switch back to PCL mode or change settings under Windows, you select options from a menu; with DOS applications, you must exit and run an included utility. However, PreScript won't print some documents unless you issue a <Ctrl>-D command to flush the printer's output buffer.

If Pan Overseas improves the program's PostScript compatibility and resolves its other complications, PreScript could be a con-

tender. Until then, UltraScript offers an easier and more reliable option for printing within applications.

UltraScript PC Plus 2.0

QMS's \$445 *UltraScript PC Plus* comes closest to blending the convenience of Pacific-Page with the compatibility of *Freedom*. It works transparently within applications, can be configured from pulldown menus, and comes with 47 fonts. (A 25-font version sells for \$195.) But *UltraScript* requires a 286 with extended memory for printing inside applications, and its printer support and compatibility don't quite match *Freedom*'s.

UltraScript is fairly fluent at interpreting PostScript. In application tests, the program was equal to *Freedom*, handling everyday documents with aplomb. But it failed to print two of the more ornery torture tests and printed a slightly flawed version of the mandala.

In speed tests with a math coprocessor installed, *UltraScript* tied for second with *Freedom*. In tests run without the coprocessor, however, *UltraScript* proved far faster than its rival in printing complex pages. And from inside applications, *UltraScript*'s printing speed is tops, but you'll need at least

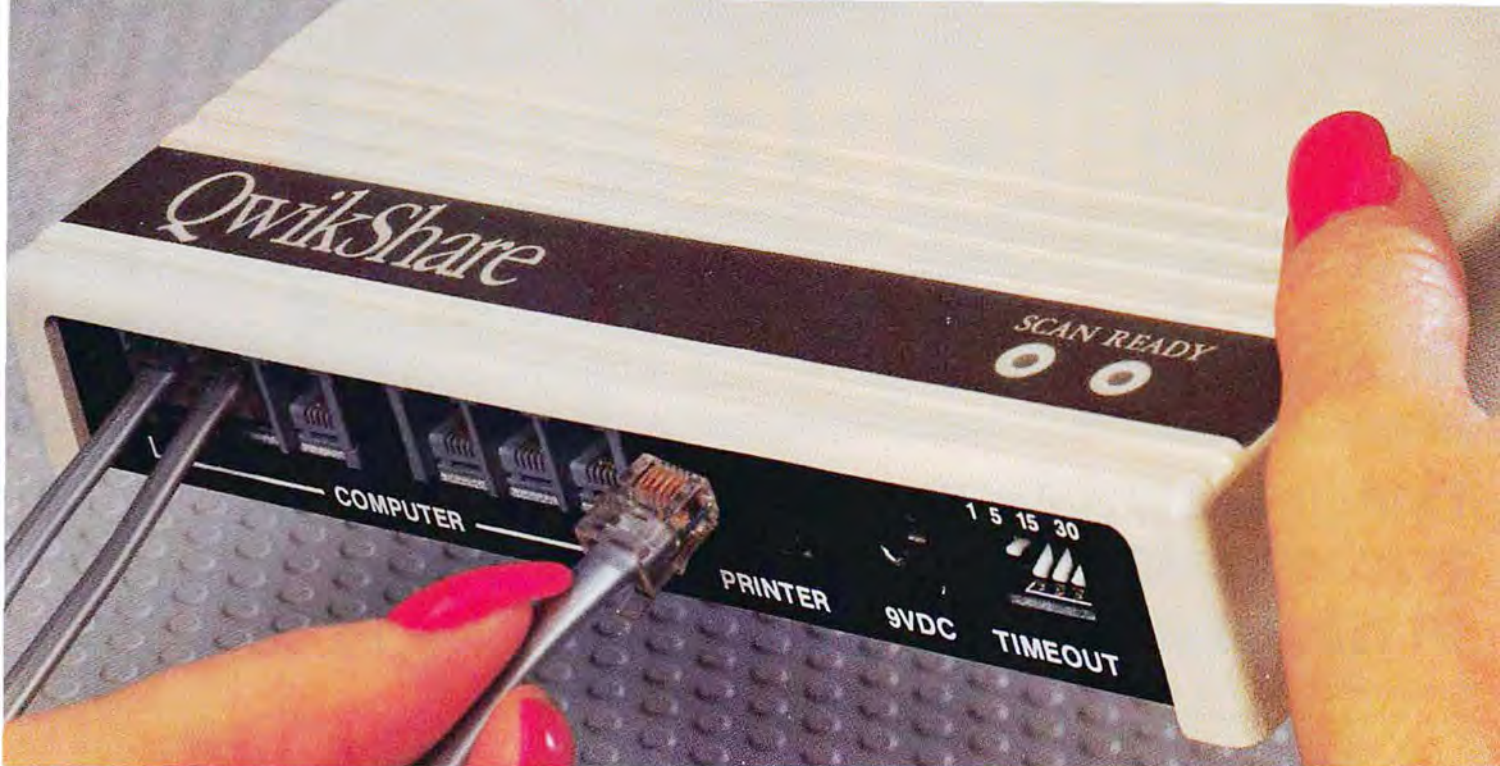

800K of extended memory; you'll also need 4MB of hard disk space and 1MB of printer RAM.

Like *PreScript*, *UltraScript* can work inside applications, print in the background, and run under *Windows/286* but not *Windows/386*. But *UltraScript* also works well as a stand-alone program. From pulldown menus you can choose printers, resolution, and paper size on the fly, and scroll through subdirectories to locate the file you want to print. LAN users take note: To use *UltraScript* on networks like NetWare 286, you need to configure it for a DOS printer port—a fact not laid out in QMS's manual.

UltraScript is the only emulator besides *Freedom* that supports full-color output on ink jet and dot matrix printers. Version 2.1, announced at press time, adds support for even more printers and resolution-enhancement boards.

UltraScript is a flexible and easy-to-use program with solid PostScript credentials, but that's not enough to beat *Freedom's* superior compatibility and slimmer hardware requirements. But if you use a 286 and prefer the convenience of transparent printing, *UltraScript* is a smart buy.

Final PostScript

Users who want PostScript mainly for its text-handling finesse should find any of these emulators acceptable. Beyond that, the differences are graphic. If you're sharing a LaserJet Series II and money's tight, the PacificPage cartridge is good news. Otherwise, the class acts are *Freedom of Press* and *UltraScript*, which provide reliable PostScript output to the widest range of printers. While *UltraScript* takes the prize for ease of use, *Freedom's* superior compatibility rating and lower hardware costs give it a slight edge.

Still, these emulators' sluggish performance makes them suitable for only occasional use. If you require a daily diet of high-quality PostScript output, go with a PostScript printer. Otherwise, some of these products provide solid deals; next time around, they may even earn Best Buys. ●

Winning Colors

Looking for the key to attention-getting overheads and handouts?

Our review of six color printers turns up a pair of Best Buys that transform everyday work into works of art.

Color catches the eye and adds vitality to overhead projections and sales brochures. Carefully chosen colors can make a graphic element leap out at your customer and drive home a point. If your business or department uses presentations (on paper or overhead transparencies) to sell products or services, a high-quality color printer could be a smart investment.

In the past, businesses used color printers primarily for proofing page layouts and technical graphics before sending them out for professional printing or to avoid taking up large blocks of time on a plotter before the pages were perfect. Recently, thanks to lower prices and better software support, these printers have found a new primary business function as tools for creating high-quality presentation materials.

We looked at six color printers—two ink jets and four thermal transfers—that are aimed largely at the growing presentation markets: the \$2495 Hewlett-Packard PaintJet XL, the \$3800 Mitsubishi G330-70, the \$9995 NEC Colormate PS, the \$9995 QMS ColorScript 100 Model 10, the \$8245 Seiko CH-5504, and the \$7590 Tektronix Phaser CQ. *PC World* Best Buy honors went to the PaintJet XL for its speed and low price and

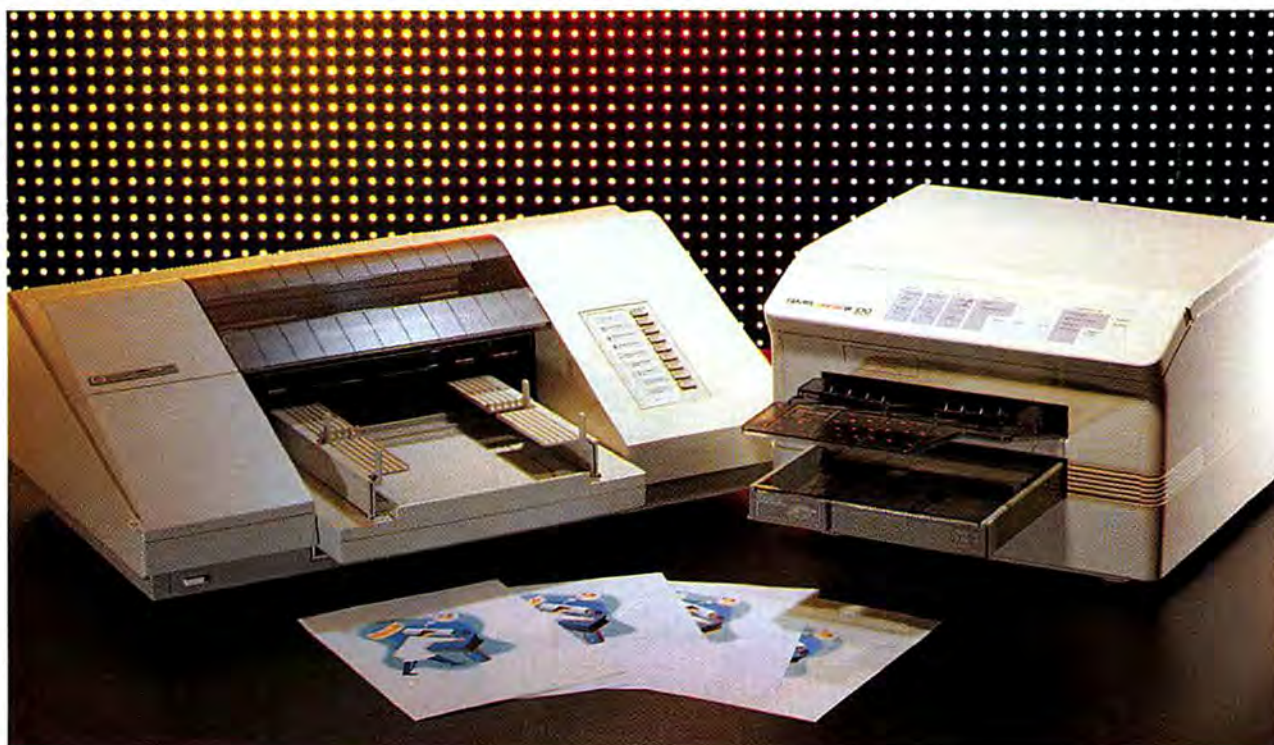
to the ColorScript 100 for the fine quality of its PostScript output.

None of these color printers is intended to replace a laser printer. For one thing, expensive, coated paper is required for sharp images, and its shiny surface makes text-filled pages difficult to read. Furthermore, top-quality, 300-dpi (dot-per-inch) thermal transfer printers use smaller dots than lasers and thus produce thinly lined, anemic-looking characters that are hard to read. Moreover, special paper and inks bring the cost of using one of these printers to as much as 67 cents a page, compared to about 3 cents a page for the HP LaserJet Series II.

Color Considerations

If color makes sense to you, a number of factors will probably influence your buying decision. First and foremost is output quality; you want the best-looking color documents your budget will allow. If you plan to create flyers or handouts, you want to be able to print multiple copies of a page without hanging up your computer. Software compatibility is important, of course, but with the programs we looked at here, it wasn't much of a problem.

Output Quality Thermal transfer printers offer the best-looking output, but they're expensive to buy and to use. Color ink jet output is not as sharp or as vivid, but it can still look quite good—and it's a lot cheaper. Color dot matrix printers are also available, but low-quality output knocks them out of the running.

Printing Multiple Copies Color output can't be duplicated on a standard copying machine, so if you need copies, you'll probably have to print each page multiple times. Some non-PostScript-compatible printers can do so without tying up your computer; some can't. Fortunately, most color graphics programs have a driver that can order a PostScript printer to hold a page in memory and print multiple copies (freeing the computer for other tasks). All the PostScript-compatible printers reviewed here can do this trick.

Software Compatibility Most professional presentation packages support color printers—one way or another (see the sidebar "Why Your Favorite Software Isn't Color-Blind Anymore"). Four of the printers reviewed here come with PostScript or PostScript-compatible interpreters, so any application that supports color PostScript—and that includes virtually every major color graphics program—can drive them. The HP PaintJet XL isn't PostScript compatible, but it's specifically supported by the vast majority of graphics programs. Support for the Hewlett-Packard Graphics Language (HPGL or HPGL/2) is important if you're going to use your printer for preplot proofing. The Mitsubishi sidesteps the compatibility issue by

using a software-independent video interface.

Speed None of these printers is a speed demon. Most thermal transfer printers have to roll a page through the print engine four times—once for each color—and even ink jets are slow compared with a laser. We had National Software Testing Laboratories (NSTL) test five of the six printers and found that the HP PaintJet XL ink jet was the fastest, with the thermal NEC Colormate PS a distant second. Because of the Mitsubishi's video interface, NSTL wasn't able to test it

comparatively. But it was very quick, printing a screen in under 80 seconds.

Other Issues A large and expandable selection of fonts is handy for designing presentations, and in this regard the four PostScript printers have a definite advantage. Paper handling is a particular challenge for thermal printers, which run each sheet through the engine four times; a printer that can do this without jamming will save you a number of headaches. Memory capacity is especially

important for PostScript printers—a 300-dpi device, for instance, needs at least 3MB to create a bit-mapped page from PostScript code. To download additional fonts, even more memory is required.

Buying a color printer is a major investment. By paying attention to the features you need most, you can make it a profitable one.

Hewlett-Packard PaintJet XL

The \$2495 HP PaintJet XL, a *PC World* Best Buy, is a fast, inexpensive ink jet printer. Its output isn't as bright and sharp as the ther-

mals', but it's still perfectly presentable. The HP came in first in every NSTL speed test, printing, for example, a simple pie chart in under half a minute. Moreover, virtually every graphics program has a driver for it.

The PaintJet's 180-dpi output is quite acceptable; colors look muted and borders fuzzy only when compared to output from a thermal color printer. The PaintJet's black text printing is also better than average, reaching 24-pin dot matrix quality.

Because the PaintJet XL can print a full page without holding it in memory, the print-

er's low 512K of RAM produces only one serious drawback: The XL can't print multiple copies without tying up your computer. At press time, HP was preparing a \$995 HPGL/2 plotter-emulation cartridge with enough on-board RAM to remedy this problem. However, current PaintJet drivers don't support this feature; until they do, it will be accessible only through a plotter driver or custom escape sequences.

The XL is quite easy to use. Each of its four ink cartridges (one for each color) contains its own printhead, so every time you replenish one color of ink, you also replace that color's nozzle. The 200-sheet cassette has the largest capacity in the roundup and is adjustable for letter- and legal-size paper and transparencies. You get only 3 internal fonts, but for \$225 you can buy an optional font cartridge with 20 more.

The HP's colors could be more vivid, but they're still attractive—and its speed, compatibility, and low price more than compensate to earn it a Best Buy.

Mitsubishi G330-70

The \$3800 Mitsubishi G330-70 is a video printer: It prints directly from the screen rather than via an application's printer driv-

er; it can't, for example, print a *PageMaker* document. Multiple copies of the same screen can be printed easily via an option on the printer's control panel. Unfortunately, the G330's 150-dpi color output is unacceptably fuzzy.

A video printer is easy to use and frees you from software compatibility concerns. Simply plug the printer into your video port, plug your monitor into the printer, and press two buttons to print the image that's on your screen.

Aside from blurry output, however, the G330-70 has another major drawback: Since it prints *everything* on the screen, including menus and icons, it's best used only with programs that have a "show screen" feature for filling the entire screen with your graphic.

In any case, poor output limits the G330's value for professional-looking presentations. You can do a lot better for the money.

NEC Colormate PS

The brand-new \$9995 Colormate PS features an Adobe PostScript interpreter and delivers crisp, 300-dpi output with vivid colors. It's the fastest thermal transfer printer we tested, printing the pie chart in just over a min-

ute. You get 8MB of RAM standard, as well as a SCSI port to accommodate an optional 20MB hard disk for storing fonts. Its major failing is a tendency to jam.

The Colormate is so new that software drivers are still scarce. Fortunately, one PostScript driver is usually pretty similar to another, and the Colormate worked fine with drivers for the QMS ColorScript and the Tektronix Phaser CQ—both fairly common. And since it's a PostScript printer, multiple copies are not a problem.

Paper handling is the NEC's biggest weakness, and not only because of the jamming (which lessened in severity as the printer warmed up). Additional problems: You can't print on anything larger than letter-size paper.

Still, if top-notch color output is your highest priority—and you don't mind keeping an eye on the paper path—this printer gives you a lot for the money.

QMS ColorScript 100 Model 10

At \$9995, the QMS ColorScript 100 Model 10 ties with the Colormate as the most expensive printer reviewed. Also like the NEC, it has a thermal transfer engine that creates beautiful, color-saturated, 300-dpi, Adobe PostScript output; there's even a SCSI port for an external hard disk. Although it comes with only 4MB of standard RAM (4MB less than the NEC), its passable paper handling nudges it past the NEC for a *PC World* Best Buy.

WHY YOUR FAVORITE SOFTWARE ISN'T COLOR-BLIND ANYMORE

If you buy a color printer, will you be able to use it with your favorite graphics programs? Increasingly, the answer is yes. Software drivers that work with the PaintJet XL have been common for years, and within the last year drivers for the newer color PostScript printers have begun to appear in significant numbers, at least in professional graphics packages.

Ashton-Tate's *Applause II*, Software Publishing's *Harvard Graphics*, and Digital Research's *GEM* line of graphics programs all have capable color PostScript drivers. Lotus's *Freelance Plus* doesn't have one yet, but at press time a driver was being prepared for release.

If it seems odd that popular graphics programs like *PageMaker* and *Corel Draw* are absent from this list, it's because, as *Windows* applications, they use printer drivers written for the operating environment rather than for the individual applications. And as of this writing, Microsoft has yet to ship a color PostScript driver with *Windows*.

In November of 1989, Microsoft *did* make a color PostScript driver available—but it has not yet been included in the shipping product; you have to call and ask for it. The good news is that it's free. The driver will be bundled with future versions of *Windows*.

There is an alternative, however. Since 1988, a *Windows* color PostScript driver has been available from Micrografx, the publisher of *Designer*, *Draw Plus*, and other *Windows* applications. According to Brad Mercoe, program manager for printer drivers, "There's demand from our users, so we've made a definite commitment to support color." Micrografx sells the driver, which works with any *Windows* program, for \$199.95, in addition to bundling it with its own *Windows* applications.

A year ago, finding a graphics program that would talk to a color PostScript printer was a considerable challenge. Today, between Micrografx and Microsoft, *Windows* users can choose between drivers, and it's a safe assumption that if your favorite non-*Windows* graphics program doesn't already include color PostScript support, it will soon. —W. N.

Like all the PostScript printers here, the ColorScript can easily manage multiple copies. However, every once in a while it sucks in finished sheets from the output tray as it retracts the current page for another pass. (You can prevent this by removing completed pages promptly.) An adjustable paper cassette holds 100 sheets of letter- or legal-sized paper.

You'll pay top dollar for this Best Buy, but it's worth it. Most of the time the ColorScript works smoothly—and it always produces great color output.

Seiko CH-5504

The Seiko CH-5504 comes in several configurations. We looked at the fully equipped \$8245, 3MB, PostScript-compatible unit that promised to offer multiple-copy capability and the widest software support. Its 300-dpi color output is on a par with that of the other thermal transfer printers reviewed, but its cramped 3MB memory ceiling and clumsy, software-based PostScript emulation are serious drawbacks.

PostScript "compatibility" comes in the form of CAI's *Freedom of Press* program. To use this program, you must first print to disk, then exit your application, and then run

Freedom of Press to interpret the file and send it to the printer. (For a complete review of this program, see "PostScript the Hard Way" in this issue.)

The CH-5504 features solid paper handling, cutting its own letter- and legal-size sheets and transparencies from rolls (and saving you the trouble of switching trays). The cut sheets are indistinguishable from packaged paper.

This printer gives you good-looking output, but its awkward PostScript support and meager memory diminish its value. You can do better.

Tektronix Phaser CQ

The \$7590 Phaser CQ is a two-part package that includes Tektronix's ColorQuick 216-dpi ink jet printer and color PostScript-compatible Phaser Card. Although the Phaser CQ offers the cheapest color PostScript compatibility we've seen, the ColorQuick's print quality isn't worth the price.

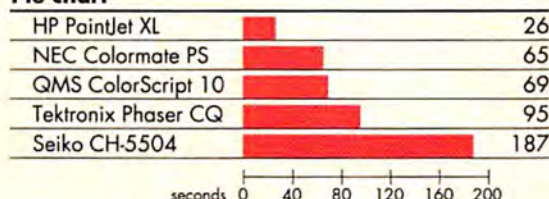
While the CQ produces noticeably sharper color output than HP's PaintJet, the other ink jet reviewed, the difference doesn't merit an additional \$5000. Like the PaintJet's monochrome text, the ColorQuick's rivals that from a good 24-pin dot matrix. Thanks to its PostScript emulation, however, printing multiple copies with the Phaser CQ is much simpler.

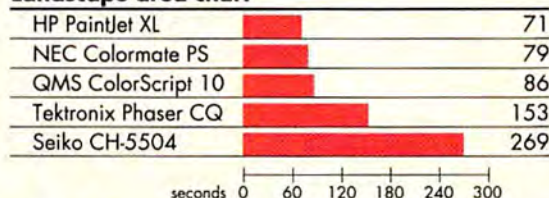

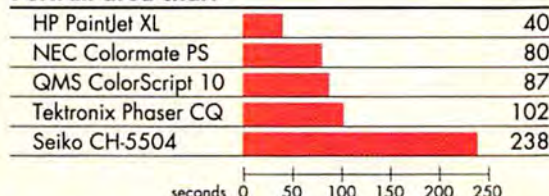

An Excel pie chart with one exploding slice is printed in high resolution.

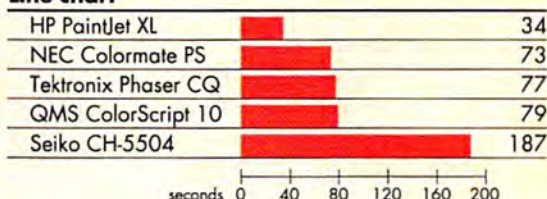
Landscape area chart

An Excel area chart with color fill is printed in landscape mode.

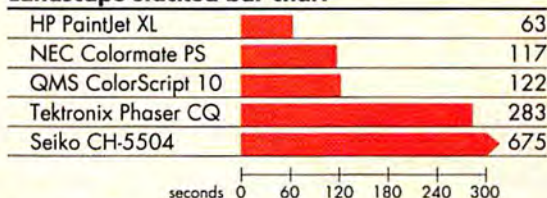
Portrait area chart

An Excel line chart with color fill surrounding the font within the header is printed.

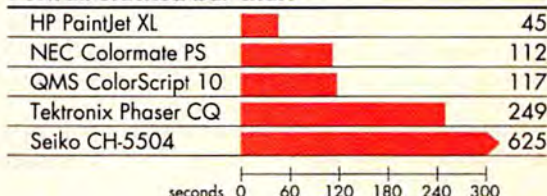

The ColorQuick manages paper-handling chores with aplomb. An adjustable sheet feeder will handle letter, legal, or 11-by-17-inch sheets, and you can purchase an optional tractor feeder for fanfold paper. Ink handling is messy, however, and can lead to rainbow-colored fingers and stained clothes. Furthermore, the Phaser Card takes up a slot in your PC, and you'll need 3MB of free disk

space for supporting software.

Still, the Phaser CQ's main drawback is its price, which is much too high for ink jet quality. If you want great-looking color PostScript, you're better off paying \$2400 more for the QMS, and if you want a bargain, the HP is a better one.

The Best Buys in this roundup are at the top and bottom of the price range. On the low end, the \$2495 HP PaintJet XL makes the grade with fine, slightly muted colors, broad software support, and a tempting price tag. The \$9995 QMS ColorScript offers excellent 300-dpi color output, Adobe PostScript, and dependable paper handling.

A good color printer is a significant investment, and if you're not careful, you can get less than you bargained for. If you choose well, however, you can acquire a tool that will make your output shine. ●

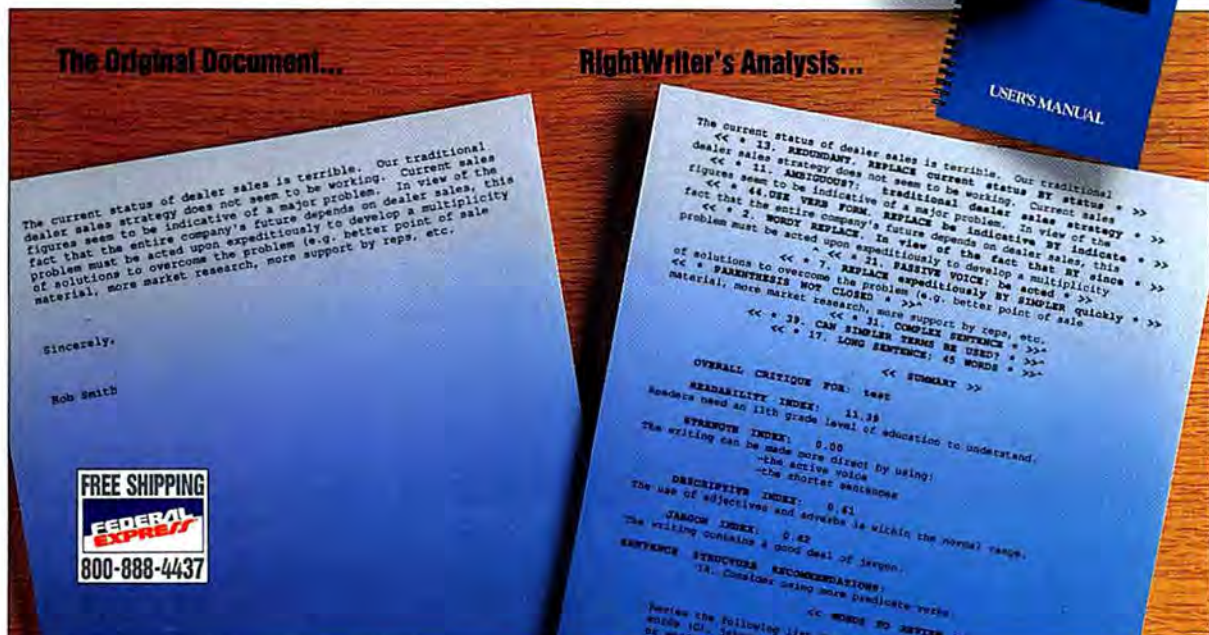

Smart Monitors, Smart Buys

As color video standards continue to evolve, intelligent multiscan monitors are becoming indispensable.

With three Best Buys to choose from, there's something for every budget.

TJ Byers



Does your favorite application need super-VGA color graphics to run at its best? Is a sexy 8514/A monitor too pricey for your pocketbook? Do you want to keep an upgrade path open to future video standards? Do you need to cycle one monitor between different PCs with different video boards? If you answer yes to any of these questions, then your smart buy is a multiscan monitor.

There are at present five widely used kinds of color graphics boards: CGA (320 by 200 resolution), EGA (640 by 350), VGA (640 by 480), super-VGA (640 by 480, 800 by 600, and sometimes 1024 by 768), and 8514/A (also 1024 by 768). Unlike conventional VGA monitors, which work only with standard VGA boards, multiscans also work with one or more of the other board types. (For more information on graphics boards, see "Buyers' Guide: Look Sharp With a Super-VGA Board" in this issue.)

To find the best multiscan values, *PC World* tested nine monitors: the Amdek AM/738 Smartscan, the Leading Technology 1432M, the Mitsubishi FA3415, the Nanao FlexScan 9060S, the NEC MultiSync 2A and 3D, the Panasonic PanaSync C1391, the Relisys RE5155, and the Seiko CM-1440. The Best Buys are the bargain-basement Leading Technology (\$495), the exceptionally sharp Seiko (\$899), and the \$1049 NEC MultiSync 3D, which sets a new standard for multiscan flexibility.

Only about half the multiscans in this roundup work with all five board types. All work with both VGA and super-VGA boards and can display CGA and EGA graphics as emulated by these boards; however, several can't display 1024 by 768 super-VGA mode. Those that can will also accommodate IBM's 8514/A board. Most (but not all) work with CGA and EGA boards.

Multiscan Buying Issues

For most people, the main reason for buying a multiscan monitor is to support super-VGA for applications like *Ventura Publisher* or

anything that runs under *Windows*. In fact, if you want to run 800 by 600 super-VGA mode, a multiscan is your only choice. (There are no dedicated super-VGA monitors.)

A second group of users who want even higher resolution will find that the combination of a multiscan monitor and a 1024 by 768 super-VGA board is a good way to get 8514/A resolution and save money in the process. IBM's dedicated 8514 monitor costs \$600 to \$1100 more than these multiscans, and it doesn't deliver any better resolution.

A third group of users—mostly PC support types—will appreciate the multiscan's ability to work with a variety of video boards. With dedicated (single-mode) monitors, every time you swap components, you have to find a monitor to match the board. If you have a multiscan, you just plug it in and get back to work. But note that three of these multiscans work only with analog boards (VGA, super-VGA, and 8514/A). If you need a monitor that will work with digital CGA and EGA boards too, choose accordingly. (Multiscans with digital capability usually handle IBM and Hercules monochrome boards too, but a cheap mono monitor is more appropriate.)

Multiscan monitors may have difficulty maintaining the size or position of the image on the screen as the video mode changes. This problem occurs most often when you switch between applications, but it can also occur as you shift into graphics mode to view a spreadsheet graph or preview a page in your word processor. Usually the image can be corrected with the monitor's controls, but having to constantly adjust the display can be very annoying. Multiscan monitors eliminate this hassle by adjusting the image automatically, but most multiscans aren't flexible enough to auto-size *all* video modes properly—and not all adjustment circuitry works equally well.

Multiscans Are Still Monitors

Despite their unique capabilities, multiscans are still monitors. That means you still need to consider basic monitor buying issues like these:

Size and Viewing Angle All these monitors sport ample 14-inch screens, a good size for general use. And all but the Mitsubishi come with tilt-and-swivel bases that let you adjust the screen for comfortable viewing and minimal glare.

Dot Pitch Just because a monitor boasts 800 by 600 (or higher) resolution, there's no guarantee that the image will be sharp and readable. Sharpness is directly related to *dot pitch*, the distance between the tiny phosphor dots on the screen's inner surface. The

smaller the dot pitch, the sharper the image (all other things, like focusing electronics, being equal). On a 14-inch screen, .31mm dot pitch is fine for 800 by 600 super-VGA and lower resolutions. However, at 1024 by 768, pixels overlap, causing an unacceptably dull and blurry image. A monitor with .28mm dot pitch gives a significantly sharper image at that resolution—but you'll pay a higher price.

Product Irregularity Theoretically, all examples of a particular model should display identical images, but in reality the quality of individual monitors varies. To be sure you don't get stuck with a lemon, check the unit for focus, brightness, sharpness, image

placement, and color accuracy in all the modes you need *before* you buy it.

Price Happily, multiscans aren't much more expensive than single-mode monitors. In fact, one of our Best Buys costs no more than many dedicated VGA monitors.

Amdtek AM/738 Smartscan

PROS: Trackball controls

CONS: Analog only, .31mm dot pitch, no manual VGA adjustment

The \$835 Amdtek AM/738 (also sold as the Wyse WY660) is a medium-priced, analog-only monitor. Although it's capable of displaying 1024 by 768 graphics, its .31mm dot pitch makes it a bad choice for those modes. The AM/738's size and position controls don't work in VGA mode, which can be frustrating if the factory setting is off. Auto-sizing works for all standard VGA modes (including CGA and EGA emulation); 800 by 600 super-VGA requires manual adjustment.

One nice touch: The brightness and contrast controls are large trackballs conveniently located on the right side of the cabinet along with the power switch. The size and position controls are located on the back of the cabinet, but they seldom require adjustment.

The AM/738 is quite expensive for an analog-only monitor with .31mm dot pitch. It's a poor value.

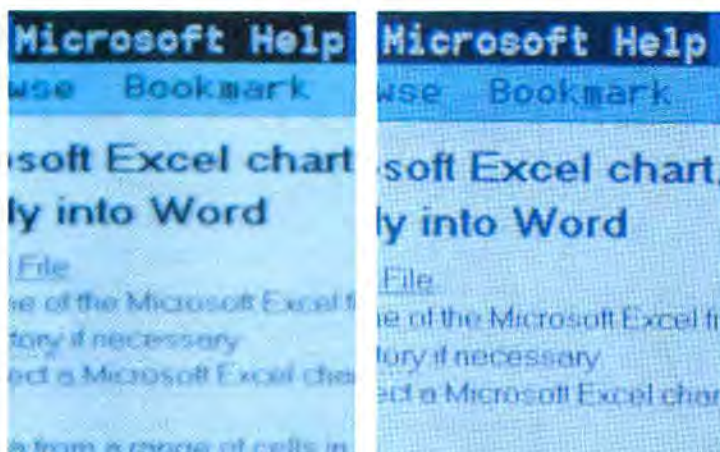
Leading Technology 1432M



PROS: Very low price

CONS: Size controls hard to reach, .31mm dot pitch

At \$495 the Leading Technology 1432M is the least expensive monitor in this roundup. Moreover, it supports the full range of modes from CGA through 1024 by 768. Auto-sizing works only from CGA to VGA, so you have to adjust super-VGA manually. That's a bit of a pain, since the controls you need are a gorilla's reach away on the back panel. The brightness and contrast knobs are on the front.



The 1432M looks great in 800 by 600 mode, but at 1024 by 768, small fonts (like those used in some *Windows* help screens) are very hard to read. Though its awkward controls and limited auto-sizing are less than ideal, you'll have to pay \$500 more to do much better. The 1432M's combination of rock-bottom price and support for 800 by 600 modes makes it a Best Buy for super-VGA seekers on a tight budget.

Mitsubishi FA3415

PROS: Supports all boards, .28mm dot pitch

CONS: Expensive, limited auto-sizing, tilt-and-swivel base and analog cable cost extra

The Mitsubishi FA3415 boasts a sharp, .28mm dot pitch image and can handle everything from monochrome and CGA to 1024 by 768 super-VGA, but its auto-sizing is limited—and at \$1015 it's one of the most expensive monitors in this roundup.

The auto-size range extends from CGA to VGA but not beyond. However, 1024 by 768 images are close enough to the size of VGA that you may not notice the difference. The 800 by 600 image, on the other hand, requires manual adjustment. Screen size and position controls are conveniently located under the screen, alongside the brightness and contrast controls. The digital/analog mode switch is located on a back panel.

Capable as it is, the FA3415 is still the most limited of the three .28mm dot pitch monitors in this roundup, yet it costs about the same as the others. It's not a great deal.

A 1024 by 768 super-VGA image that is blurry and unreadable on the .31mm dot pitch Leading Technology 1432M (left) is much sharper on the .28mm dot pitch NEC 3D (right).

Nanao FlexScan 9060S

PROS: Supports all boards, .28mm dot pitch

CONS: Expensive

The costly \$1059 Nanao FlexScan 9060S supports all video modes from CGA to 8514/A, has automatic digital/analog mode selection, and displays a crisp image thanks to its .28mm dot pitch. Moreover, its auto-sizing works well over the entire spectrum of video modes. All the screen controls are conveniently located directly below the screen.

This is, in fact, an extremely impressive monitor—but since the superior NEC MultiSync 3D costs about the same, it's not your smartest buy.

NEC MultiSync 2A

PROS: None

CONS: Expensive, .31mm dot pitch, no digital board support

The MultiSync 2A is an analog-only monitor that supports only two modes: standard VGA and 800 by 600. The 2A was NEC's attempt to capture a share of the burgeoning VGA monitor market by offering super-VGA capability at a VGA price—but times and prices have changed, and the 2A hasn't. It still sells for \$799, significantly higher than several full-range .31mm multiscans. It's a very bad buy.

NEC MultiSync 3D



PROS: Supports all boards, "remembers" screen adjustments, .28mm dot pitch

CONS: Expensive

The ultimate multiscan monitor comes from NEC, manufacturer of the original multiscan, the MultiSync. The \$1049 3D is pricey, but it boasts a sharp, .28mm dot pitch image and supports every standard video mode from CGA to 1024 by 768. It will even memorize screen settings for other modes.

Everything about the 3D is automated, from digital/analog selection to auto-sizing.

It can distinguish between Paradise and Orchid 800 by 600 graphics and size each accurately—a feat no other multiscan monitor can match. In the rare instance that the 3D doesn't size a mode correctly, push-button controls located behind the front-panel cover plate make it easy to adjust the display. The 3D even "remembers" screen adjustments for as many as nine modes and restores them automatically the next time you switch to that mode.

Although you can get super-VGA support for less, the 3D is the most versatile multiscan monitor you can buy. If you crave super-VGA, plus plug-and-play performance in an office with a wide variety of video boards, this is the monitor for you.

Panasonic PanaSync C1391

PROS: Convenient controls

CONS: .31mm dot pitch

The \$899 Panasonic PanaSync C1391 is limited for a midpriced multiscan. It supports both digital and analog boards and goes up to only 800 by 600 resolution. It lacks auto-sizing beyond standard VGA, but since super-VGA requires only minor manual adjustment (and all screen controls are conveniently located under a front-panel plate), this problem isn't too serious. However, given its large dot pitch and limited range, the PanaSync is too expensive.

Relisys RE5155

PROS: None

CONS: Limited auto-sizing, needs frequent adjustment, .31mm dot pitch

The \$799 Relisys RE5155 is a digital/analog multiscan monitor that handles everything up to 800 by 600 super-VGA. Auto-sizing is claimed for CGA through standard VGA, but in practice the horizontal position requires frequent adjustment in all modes. Although that control is easy to reach, the constant fiddling is no fun. The RE5155 is not recommended.

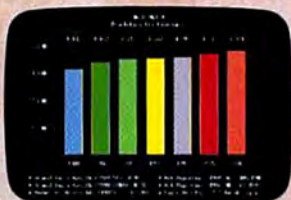

CONS: No digital board support

The \$899 Seiko CM-1440, a *PC World* Best Buy, is a flat-screen Trinitron monitor whose razor-sharp .25mm dot pitch gives it the crispest image in this roundup. With the exception of brightness and contrast, which are located on the right side of the cabinet, all screen controls are on the back of the monitor. However, they seldom need adjusting because its smooth, accurate auto-sizing extends from VGA to 1024 by 768.

Unfortunately, the CM-1440 can't handle digital boards, but most people won't care. If you're looking for a monitor to run 800 by 600 and 1024 by 768 super-VGA today, or if you plan to run VGA now and upgrade later, the CM-1440 is the Best Buy for you.

A Bevy of Best Buys

Whatever your reason for wanting a multi-scan, there's a Best Buy here for you. If you need only VGA and 800 by 600 super-VGA, the \$495 Leading Technology 1432M is a great value. For 1024 by 768 super-VGA today—or an upgrade path for tomorrow—the super-sharp \$899 Seiko CM-1440 can't be beat. And if you need a monitor that will work with any video board in your office and support the full range of video modes, the NEC MultiSync 3D justifies its \$1049 price.

The multiscan monitor, once a luxury item, has become an indispensable commodity. So long as PC video standards continue to evolve, multiscans will remain a crucial part of smart PC buying strategies. ●

Although still in their infancy, OfficeVision and NewWave Office promise great benefits to users and corporations alike.

WOULDN'T IT BE great if you could forget about all the arcane syntax and idiosyncrasies associated with different hardware and software? Instead of worrying about what you named a file, whether program A was compatible with program B, and whether the information you needed was on a PC or a mainframe, you could simply concentrate on the job at hand, pulling graphics into a word processing file or sending off a report to asso-

ciates throughout your company. The task of getting incompatible applications and files to work together would be done for you, behind the scenes.

That's the promise IBM and Hewlett-Packard hope to make good on with their "next-generation office systems," mammoth suites of server-based applications and services. Built upon graphical user interfaces, *OfficeVision* from IBM and *NewWave Office* from HP may ultimately eliminate not only the barriers between you and your PC but other obstacles as well, allowing co-workers who use different applications over various operating systems and platforms to share information.

Both *OfficeVision* and *NewWave Office* include applications and services such as resource sharing on the network, electronic mail, word processing, and tools to access corporate data bases. Added to these basics will be your

favorite PC applications, which will ultimately hook into one of the two environments (see the sidebar "Lining Up Developers").

IBM and HP claim that *OfficeVision* and *NewWave Office* have something for everyone. For corporate management information systems (MIS) and data processing departments, the packages provide a mechanism for integrating PCs and larger systems. And for PC users they offer the prospect of being able to take advantage of all of a corporation's resources from the comfort of familiar applications and a graphical user interface.

The PC Connection

It's no coincidence that a graphical workstation is at the heart of both *NewWave Office* and *OfficeVision*. HP and IBM are trying to eliminate some of the difficulties of working with disparate applications and interfaces by building upon the PC's two most promising graphical environments, *Windows* and *Presentation Manager*.

"The importance of the desktop metaphor is that it takes the capabilities of the PC and makes them usable, without forcing people to become computer literate," says Robert Holmes, a computer technology evaluation analyst with South-

ern California Gas (SCG) in Los Angeles.

Paul Grayson, CEO of Micrografix in Richardson, Texas, cites the friendlier interface as the prime benefit of *OfficeVision* and *NewWave Office*. "Current PC users have to understand programs, files, and hard disks," he notes. "These environments try to eliminate some of that."

HP has made significant advances in this area with *NewWave*, which is central to *NewWave Office*. HP's object-oriented environment links data to its executable files, so all the user needs to do is click on a document, and up pops the file and the application. *NewWave* also features *agents*, which work like sophisticated macros to automate tasks across applications. IBM has made enhancements to *Presentation Manager*, but it still has work to do before its environment will be truly comprehensive and intuitive, says Judith Hurwitz, editor of *UNIX in the Office*, a newsletter published by Patricia Seybold's Office Computing Group in Boston.

IBM's Vision

IBM was the first on the scene with *OfficeVision*, which runs across all of Big Blue's operating systems. The PC LAN component, *OfficeVision/2 LAN Series*, runs under IBM's *OS/2 LAN Serv-*

Lining Up Developers

Recognizing that the success of their products depends upon the availability of a critical mass of supporting third-party PC applications, IBM and HP are racing to get developers to commit to *OfficeVision* and *NewWave Office*. But resources are spread pretty thin these days, and even when developers jump in early and announce support for such far-reaching environments, actual product availability is often years away.

When IBM introduced *OfficeVision* in May 1989, officials from both Lotus and Microsoft shared the platform, announcing plans to integrate their spreadsheets with the environment. In Lotus's case, this means a *Presentation Manager* version of the spreadsheet, *1-2-3/G*, which will access *OfficeVision* services, as well as a main-frame version. Microsoft is focusing on integrating its PM version of *Excel* into the *OfficeVision* environment.

WordPerfect Corporation of Orem, Utah, also plans to give its customers access to *OfficeVision* services through the PM version of its word processor. Accord-

ing to Chuck Middleton, director of OS/2 development, the product will be "*OfficeVision* aware" in the first PM release.

Besides those who have announced specific products, any PM developer is a candidate for moving its application into the *OfficeVision* environment. None of the developers will have to make good on promises of support any time soon, however, because the full application program interfaces (APIs), which are necessary to write for the environment, won't be available until release 2 begins shipping.

In its literature, HP lists more than 30 *NewWave* developers, most of which are *Windows* developers porting their applications. And that's where HP has encountered problems. Developers that aren't working on *Windows* products aren't likely to be doing anything in the *NewWave* environment either.

Microsoft pledged support for *NewWave* early on, and according to Rich Tong, product manager for *Excel*, the company will be moving its spreadsheet to *NewWave*. No availability dates have been

announced, however. Adobe Systems of Mountain View, California, is also on the list of *NewWave* developers but, according to spokeswoman LaVon Collins, isn't ready to announce products.

Several *NewWave* products have hit the streets in recent months, however, including *Dynacomm* from Future Soft Engineering, Micrografix's *Graph Plus*, and *Ami Professional* from Samna. Lotus recently said it is creating a "shell" for 1-2-3 release 2.2 (HP created one for release 2.01) so *NewWave* users can access and update spreadsheets from within the environment. The add-on will continue to be bundled with *NewWave*, however, rather than sold as a separate product from Lotus.

One move that might increase interest in *NewWave* is HP's plan to offer a PM version of the environment. Mike Webb, *NewWave* developer manager, is working with PM developers and says that some who skipped *Windows* in favor of PM development may offer PM-*NewWave* versions of their applications. —R. F.

er. While some services are available for DOS users, the principal workstation is a 386 PS/2 equipped with OS/2 Extended Edition.

David Marshak, a Seybold analyst, describes IBM's approach as a "two-phase attack" in which it introduces the full LAN product in stages. With release 1, which began shipping last September, you get the E-mail system, an address book, a word processor, a telephone dialing utility, and a filing system. Release 2, scheduled for limited availability in August, adds decision support tools for data analysis and manipulation, group calendaring, and a composite word processor (which lets you add a graphic to a document but doesn't allow you to size or edit it). Release 2 also lets E-mail users grant someone else access to their messages. Built into the operating system are IBM's data base and communications managers.

Riding the NewWave

NewWave Office will be available on three platforms: MPE, the operating system for HP's mini-computers; UNIX; and OS/2, under *LAN Manager*.

NewWave Office brings some *NewWave* capabilities, such as object sharing, to the local area network. (*Objects*, in HP's parlance, refers to either data or executable files.) Other services include electronic mail (with connections to IBM and 3Com mail systems), access to remote data bases, and networkwide sharing of peripherals.

Although PCs equipped with *NewWave* are the preferred workstation for *NewWave Office*, standard DOS PCs, dumb terminals, and Macs are also supported. HP has pledged to port *NewWave* to both Presentation Manager and UNIX (using the Open Software Foundation's Motif graphical user interface), but it hasn't announced a release date for either version.

Support for Entry-Level Systems

One of the key differences between *OfficeVision* and *NewWave Office* is the level of support provided for entry-level PC users.

Because HP has selected *NewWave* as the workstation environment of choice, corporations can include all their 80286-based PCs in an integrated office environment. Add the company's commitment to moving *NewWave* to both PM and UNIX, and analysts say *NewWave Office* has a clear advantage over *OfficeVision* when it comes to offering companies a smooth migration path.

"*OfficeVision* really wants you to move to OS/2 and a 386 machine," says Seybold's Hurwitz, "but

NewWave Office will let you start out with DOS PCs, using *NewWave* and *Windows*.”

Although *OfficeVision* supports DOS workstations, users and analysts agree that it's an inelegant implementation. “The DOS interface to *OfficeVision* hasn't impressed me,” says SCG's Holmes. “There's very little there. You get E-mail, but it's awkward in comparison to the PM interface. I'm surprised they didn't choose *Windows*.”

IBM is not unaware of such criticism. The company is evaluating a variety of customer requests, and “the number one request is *OfficeVision* on *Windows*,” says Mike Early, manager of IBM's office systems market development. However, Big Blue has not committed to providing such a product.

Targeting Big Systems

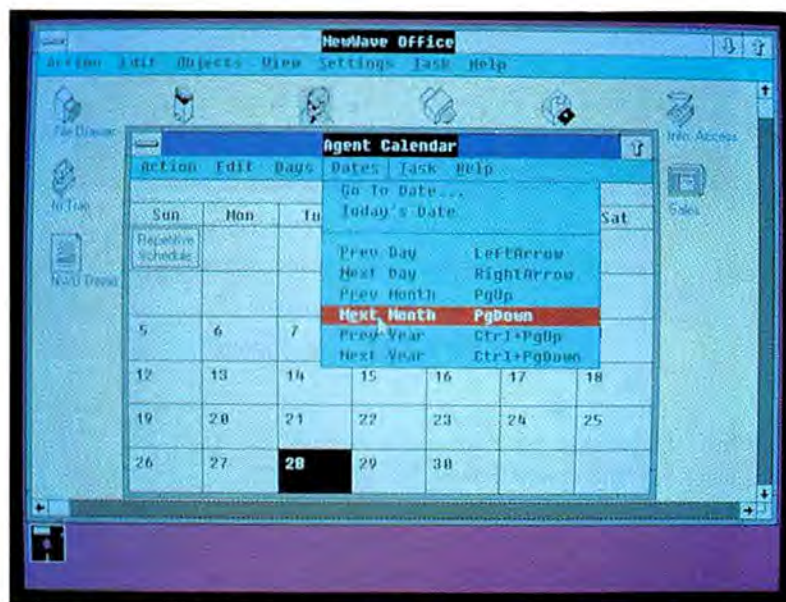
While individual users will focus on the interface enhancements these products offer, corporations will be most intrigued by the concept of linking systems of all sizes.

“*OfficeVision* and *NewWave Office* let companies tie together their information systems and provide a common interface and access method, regardless of platform or operating system,” says Micrografx's Grayson, whose company is devel-

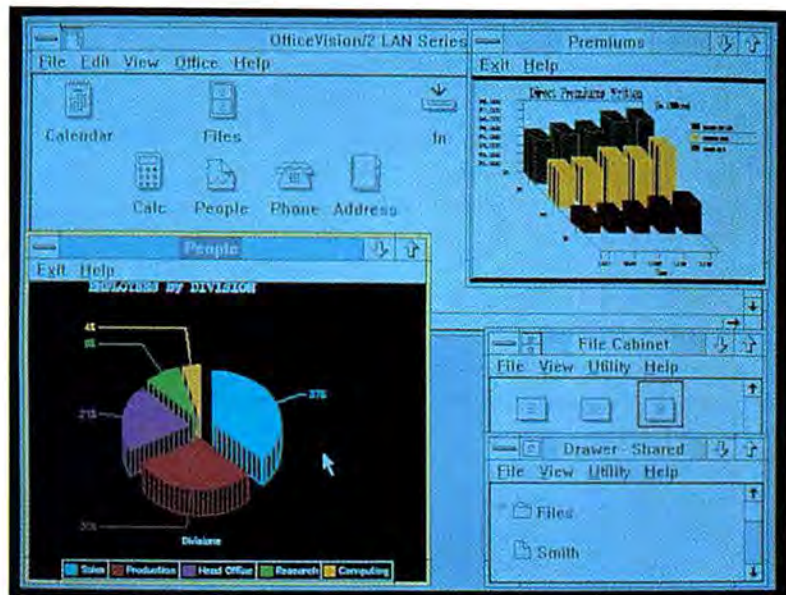
oping applications for both environments.

At the most fundamental level, though, *OfficeVision* is designed to link users of IBM's systems. HP takes the concept beyond its own minicomputers and Vectra PCs, both recognizing and supporting the multivendor environment that exists in many corporations today. *OfficeVision* "takes customers down a proprietary lock-in route to IBM; ours is clearly not a lock-in route," asserts Ruann Ernst, director of marketing for HP's information systems group.

But IBM is beginning to recognize the need to hook into other systems, adds Seybold's Hurwitz.

With the file cabinet facility in OfficeVision, users can store files locally or on a network server, then use the Library utility to search, file, copy, delete, or update documents.

"IBM has always looked upon itself as an island, but even it is realizing it has to be more open," she says, pointing to a deal with SoftSwitch that will allow companies to exchange E-mail between *OfficeVision* and other office systems.

Barriers to Implementation

The capabilities afforded by *NewWave Office* and *OfficeVision* do not come cheap, however. Both demand a substantial investment in hardware, and many companies may balk at the depth of the commitment required and the thought of upgrading PCs to fit into the complete *OfficeVision* or *NewWave Office* environment.

"We're talking about a tremendous upgrade in either case," says Seybold's Marshak. He estimates that *OfficeVision*'s OS/2 Extended Edition workstation requires at least 7MB of memory and a 386 system. The *NewWave* workstation is slightly less demanding but still needs at least 3MB of RAM.

Another limiting factor is that both *OfficeVision* and *NewWave Office* are based on immature platforms. Neither product is complete yet, and neither IBM nor HP can boast a comprehensive set of PC software applications to hook into their respective environments.

Pioneers are likely to find themselves unwitting beta testers who have to suffer frequent bug fixes and updates. Given these realities, even companies with significant investments in IBM or HP hardware—the target group for both new environments—will move cautiously into either of the environments. And reaching beyond these core customers may be difficult for both companies, given the investment required.

But while implementation will be slow going, the two products are worth close attention. Although only in their infancy, *NewWave Office* and *OfficeVision* provide a first glimpse of the way many PC users will compute and share information in the future. ●

POINT AND CLICK WHAT-IF

Graphics programs are a dime a dozen in the Windows world. But what about an intelligent graphics package?

John Walkenbach

A revolution is brewing, and Bell Atlantic's *Thinx* just might lead the charge. Imagine playing out business scenarios by manipulating images—instead of rows and columns or fields and records—and displaying your conclusions with presentation quality graphics.

That's the idea behind *Thinx*, an unlikely creation that blends *Micrografix Draw*-like tools with elements from spreadsheets and data management programs. You start by drawing objects that represent entities, such as employees. Each object can be assigned such attributes as name, salary, and depart-

ment, which you define in data base record-style forms. To interrelate objects, you build formulas in a form by clicking on the objects and inserting functions such as SUM, AVG, and ABS. With a few mouse rolls, you can then move, copy, group, and otherwise associate objects to quickly see the impact of different configurations.

Thinx's marriage of image and data will appeal to a wide audience—especially those who hate fiddling with spreadsheets and data bases. For instance, a designer could arrange office furniture in a floor plan and get instant

feedback on the cost of a particular layout. A hotel manager could assign attributes to hotel beds—cost, size, date acquired, and so on—and easily determine which rooms have king-sized beds that are more than three years old, calculate the cost of replacing them, and even ask *Thinx* to pinpoint their locations. *Thinx* would also be perfect for creating a dynamic organization chart to assess the budgetary or resource impact of personnel reassignments or cutbacks.

Of course, *Thinx* can't provide the kind of sophisticated financial analysis *Excel* can. Output is limited to totals popped into an on-screen box or printed in a simple tabular report. But no other package lets you visibly manipulate data and assumptions with just a few clicks of a mouse.

Building complex *Thinx* models, however, can be a major undertaking. Fortunately, you can hot link *Thinx* data to *Excel* via Dynamic Data Exchange, or tap 1-2-3 or dBASE files. And don't fret if you're not an artist: You can use vector-based clip art and images created with other popular draw programs, or you can incorporate objects from other *Thinx* projects. The program's built-in macro processor also automates various chores.

Keep in mind that this preview is only a sketch. *Thinx* will probably be significantly enhanced by the time the \$495 package ships in mid-1990. More features and interface changes are in the offing, including a *Windows 3.0*-specific version. But if only part of what's promised is delivered, *Thinx* could be one of the most innovative products of the year. ●

A PROCOMM FOR WINDOWS?

One of the first shareware communications programs for Windows promises Procomm-like talents for a puny price.

Wanted: a solid shareware communications program for *Windows*—a point-and-click *Procomm*. Data Graphics' *Unicom 1.4*, which should be available by the time you read this, shows signs of meeting the qualifications.

Unicom can't match commercial packages such as *Crosstalk for Windows*—its host mode is weak, and it lacks a learn mode, a capture buffer, and Dynamic Data Exchange support. But based on the prerelease *Unicom 1.4* examined by *PC World*, the program seems promising. It features an elegant dialing directory and extensive error-checking protocols, handles 300-bps to 19,200-bps communications, and boasts an enhanced script language. Another

big plus: You can download the program from CompuServe and other on-line services for free or get a manual, a disk, and unlimited support from the company for a mere \$60.

Unicom's interface is surprisingly slick. The pulldown menus are well organized, and you can click on-screen buttons to perform common tasks such as dialing, downloading, and hanging up. On-line help is only a mouse click away.

The superb central dialing directory is similar to *Procomm Plus's*. It offers queue dialing options and displays queue dialing options and displays queue names, numbers, parameters, and script files. It's easy to set up an entry—click a command and fill in the

dialog box. Global defaults encompass everything from flow control to pacing, and you can easily modify them from a single menu.

You'll have to write your own log-on scripts, however—none are included, and there's no learn mode to record log-ons. Fortunately, *Unicom's* new Pascal-like script language rivals *Procomm Plus's*. It provides 35 easy-to-use commands that let you automate on-line tasks, size and move windows, and even redesign dialog boxes. A trace mode eases debugging.

Unicom's transfer protocol list matches commercial offerings: You get XMODEM, YMODEM, ZMODEM, Kermit, CompuServe B, and Quick B. However, terminal emulations are limited to ANSI-BBS, VT 52, and TTY. *Unicom's* remote host mode is limited, too. There's no chat mode, and security consists of a single password shared by all callers—especially risky since callers have full access to your system.

Unicom 1.4's status line tells you when it's connected but not when it's downloading ASCII text or printing. Status displays for protocol transfers are much better—a box shows progress with a moving bar and other indicators. Background file transfers are much improved over 1.3's: Although the screen flickers a little, foreground and background application performance don't appear to slow significantly.

Unicom 1.4 brims with promise. All you'll need is DOS 2.1, *Windows 2.03*, and a spare 80K of RAM. (A *Windows 3.0*-specific version will be released before year-end.) If a host mode isn't important, *Unicom* could be that solid—and cheap—shareware communicator *Windows* users have been waiting for. ●

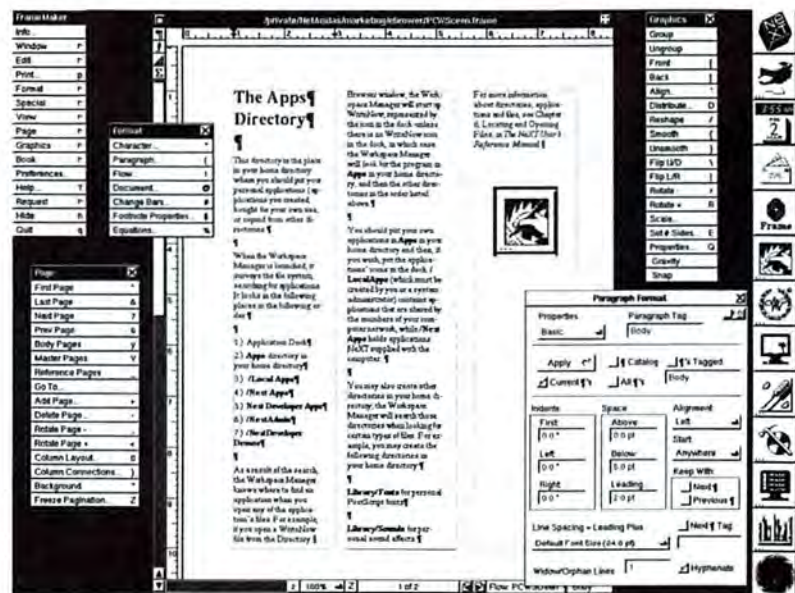

When a powerful new computer like the Next appears on the scene, everyone asks, What can we do that we couldn't do before? Will new programs dazzle or disappoint us?

One of the first dazzlers to debut on the Next is *FrameMaker 2.0*. Previously available only for Sun workstations, this advanced desktop publishing package takes full advantage of the Next's 8MB of standard RAM and multithreaded operating system (OS) to deliver fleet performance and a bulging grab bag of features. Moreover, *FrameMaker's* use of the Next's Display PostScript and PostScript printer gets as close to true WYSIWYG as anyone

could wish—although printing is a bit slow.

But it's *FrameMaker's* use of the Next's multitasking OS that makes it a publishing powerhouse, especially for long documents. You can open multiple chapters and move text, paragraph styles, master-page layouts, and so on between them. Multiple chapter files can be combined into a book with impressive ease—and pages, figures, footnotes, and indexes can be renumbered automatically. Best of all, unlike *Ventura Publisher*, *FrameMaker* saves the original chapter files with their original numbering just in case you change your mind. Variable text can also be inserted in footnotes, headers, or body text, so you can update data (such as part numbers) in a flash.

You can run other applications at the same time you're using *FrameMaker* and employ a built-in screen capture utility to pull text and graphics into your document. Pulldown, "breakaway" menus can be moved anywhere on screen (or even off screen) to clear space for your document. And with Next's digital signal processor, you can even attach spoken comments to documents—audio Post-it notes that remind your co-workers to take action.

Like *Ventura Publisher*, *FrameMaker 2.0* uses a frame/master-page approach that depends on style sheets, paragraph tags, and master pages to simplify page layout and design. Both programs provide drawing tools and let you adjust leading, kerning, text flow, graphics handling, and so on—but in *FrameMaker*, almost every feature offers greater control and is easier to use.

Consider the two programs side by side. *Ventura* limits you to four basic views (reduced, normal, enlarged, and facing pages), while *FrameMaker* lets you set the display anywhere between 25 and 1600 percent magnification—in 1 percent increments. (The pages are editable at any size.) Moreover, thanks to the Next's sharp 16-inch MegaPixel display, you can read normal text even when page display is cranked down to well below 80 percent.

Ventura doesn't offer search and replace or a spelling checker. *FrameMaker* can search for fonts, paragraph tags, headers, footers, footnotes, cross-references, variables, and markers as well as text—and replace many of them. *FrameMaker's* full-featured spelling checker pinpoints not only misspellings and repeated words but nonstandard hyphenation, extra spaces, and unusual capitalization. These are key features if you're up against a tight deadline and need to make last-minute changes.

Ventura lets you rotate text; with *FrameMaker*

both text and graphics can be flipped, reversed, and rotated (but only in 90-degree increments). You can switch from portrait to landscape mode in *FrameMaker* with a single click and print both orientations on the same page.

If you need to match the lengths of two adjacent columns of text, *Ventura* forces you to adjust the leading between lines by entering numbers in a table and viewing the results; with *FrameMaker*, you simply click *Feathering*, and column length adjusts automatically.

Ventura lets you cross-reference text only in the same chapter; *FrameMaker* allows you to link cross-references across chapters or unrelated files. After you edit referenced documents, you simply run the update feature to correct all page references.

FrameMaker accepts ASCII text and formatted DCA, *WordStar*, *Word*, and *MacWrite* files, among others. However, until these programs run on the Next, you'll have to import text files via the Next's serial port—not an appealing prospect. Luckily, creating text with *FrameMaker* is so easy that many people may use *FrameMaker* for word processing as well as desktop publishing. Getting additional PostScript fonts won't be a pain: Adobe sells an optical disk with eight fonts for \$495.

Scientists and technical writers will be pleased to discover that *FrameMaker* includes a powerful Equations Palette that lets you create scientific notation by clicking on the symbols you need. There's even a fairly sophisticated scientific calculator so you can check your work and generate examples. The recently repackaged *Ventura* offers an equation generator too, but it's a lot harder to use.

Of course, *FrameMaker* isn't perfect. There are minor but annoying display bugs, and on one occasion the program simply refused to import a graphics file. And though *FrameMaker*'s menu system is relatively intuitive, there are so many menus, sub-menus, and options that it's easy to get lost. Unfortunately, the keyboard shortcuts are about as mnemonic as *WordStar*'s keyboard commands, so most users will stick with the menus.

Another glitch: Sometimes when you issue a *FrameMaker* command, nothing happens. There's no disk-shaped cursor, no 'Please wait' message, and no screen activity. Sometimes the command executes after a while; other times you could wait forever. While this is typical of the Next, *FrameMaker* could use a few 'Busy' messages.

The biggest drawback is that the Next can't

easily reach out and touch the outside world. Since the system isn't DOS, OS/2, or Mac compatible, you have to import data, TIFF images, and so on, via the Next's serial port—or generate what you need with another Next-based program.

The other major sticking point: Using *FrameMaker* means shelling out close to \$14,000 for a Next computer with its matching 400-dpi printer. If desktop publishing is your company's main source of income—or its biggest chore—this may well be a justifiable expenditure; *FrameMaker* is one of the most powerful and friendly desktop publishing programs around, and the Next is a network-ready machine perfect for work-group publishing. However, for offices where DTP is a sometime thing and budget entries for expensive new hardware are closely questioned, it makes sense to stick with *Ventura* or *PageMaker*. Don't forget that future *Windows* and OS/2 versions of these stalwarts may provide many Next-like goodies for a fraction of the cost. ●

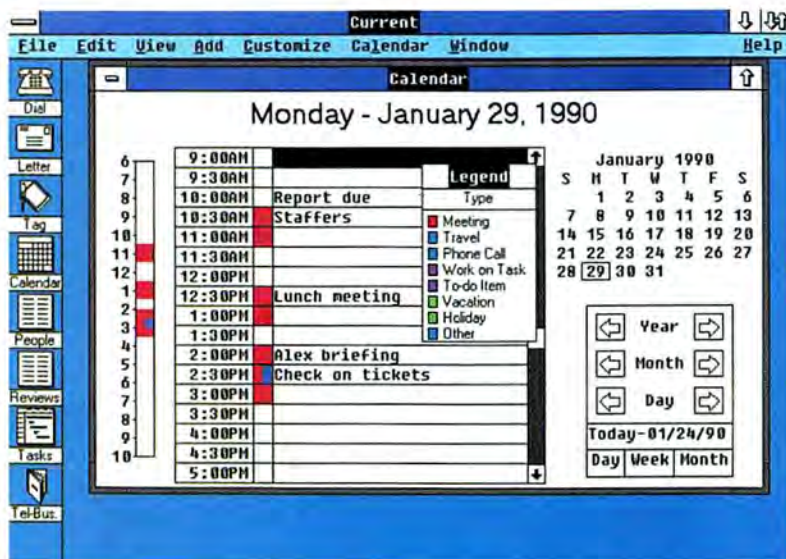

Personal information manager

PROS: Customizable data entry forms, views, and interface; links categories; capable calendar

Current's daily agenda is easy to cruise through with a mouse. What's more, the calendar's color coding makes it a snap to see not only open blocks of time but what types of activity your filled blocks are filled with. Double-clicking on any entry brings up the full details on that appointment.

Personal information managers (PIMs) seem to be two steps behind the times. Some PIMs make you shoehorn data into electronic replicas of traditional desktop tools: Appointments must be entered and viewed in a calendar, phone numbers in a phone book, and so on. Others, like *Lotus Agenda*, are quasi-programming languages that force you to create practically every data structure such as a calendar. The former programs are easy to use but rather limited; the latter are so flexible, you can spend weeks making them work.

Current, from IBM, aims for the middle ground. Like *Info-XL*, *Current*'s home base is a capable calendar complete with alarms and cyclical scheduling, complemented by a nifty phone book and a to-do list. *Current* also comes with an auto-dialer that can dial a number in any module, a mail-merge function that can use document templates, and a simple task/project manager with a Gantt chart. Yet like *Agenda*, *GrandView*, and other unstructured PIMs, *Current* doesn't lock data into one mold. You enter data once, assign it to a category

(such as Expense or Person), and then display it in a variety of views. Tasks, for example, can be listed, viewed in phone book form, or represented in a Gantt chart.

Current's edge, however, is its malleability. If you don't like the supplied categories and views, you can create your own. Another big edge: You can link categories so that data is accessible from more than one place. For example, you could connect a customer report to a sales rep list, so that clicking the Company field in the report popped up details about the rep's success with that client. *Current* lets you use the same cross-referencing technique to post data automatically in another category. You can create a custom report that filters data from a given category and print any on-screen view. To gussy up reports, you can set margins and pick fonts and attributes from menus.

The final edge is the *Windows* interface. Along with the standard pulldown menus, you get an icon bar that lists views, forms, and basic functions such as dialing and printing. You can add custom forms and views to the icon bar or to a pulldown menu. Clicking an icon instantly displays the form or view; naturally, you can keep a number of items on screen at once and flip between them with a mouse click.

Just keep in mind that if you're new to data management concepts, mastering *Current* isn't a stroll in the park. You won't struggle with *dBASE*-type problems—*Current* feels like an end-user programming tool such as *HyperCard*. But you will have to set up the fields in a new category and link categories. Things aren't made any easier by over 700 pages of dense documentation that misses the forest for the trees. A quick-start booklet that supplied a solid conceptual overview would be a big plus. However, *Current*'s context-sensitive help system is a boon. Select *Help*, pick the bothersome command, and *Current* will supply ample guidance.

Still, creating a new *Current* category is relatively simple. You call up a blank form and pick from as many as 13 field types, such as text, date, numeric, currency, telephone number, calculated, and image (PCX or TIFF), and add radio buttons that perform simple functions.

However, stringing a line between two categories isn't for novices. You must first connect the categories, then link items in the categories to one another. The first part involves establishing two links that tell *Current* that category A (such as Tasks) is linked to B (Person) and that B is linked to A. A line will appear in each category's data form

that represents a window into the other category.

Once that's done, you link items. You can create an automatic rule, for example, that says, "Every time John Smith appears in the Contact field of a record in the Task category, assign that task to John Smith." Load John Smith's record in the Person category, and you'll see every task assigned to him. Double-click on any of Smith's listed tasks, and the task record is displayed.

If you want to create exceptions to the rule, you must make the link manually: Load the Task category, display the desired record, select the Assign Task menu option, and then choose the person from the displayed list. Either way, forging links is relatively complicated.

Of course, you don't have to define everything in *Current*. The calendar is relatively powerful: You can enter dates in a wide variety of formats, including next Thursday, next month, or the third Friday of the current month. *Current* also allows cyclical scheduling, although this feature is poorly documented and underpowered. You can enter a recurring appointment for, say, every Monday between two specified dates. But *Current* doesn't recognize "every second Tuesday of the month." *Current* also offers an alarm feature, although the user manual never mentions it. You can set alarms to go off before appointments, and the alarms will pop up over other *Windows* applications. But unlike with other PIMs, you can't set the alarms to go off only for selected appointments; if the alarm function is on, it rings before *every* appointment.

The other prefab *Current* categories and views are pretty bare bones. The Project category has a field for project name and description and comes with preset connections to the Person, Task, Travel Expense, and Company categories. The Task category will record a description and the start and end dates for a task, and it provides three radio buttons that you click to note if the task is planned, in progress, or complete. Select the Gantt chart view, and the tasks are instantly displayed in graphical fashion.

The phone book view resembles its printed equivalent right down to the tabbed pages, and it can also log phone calls. The Person category that it draws on can store comments and even salutations. Better still, highlight a name and click the Letter icon on the icon bar, and the name, address, and salutation are automatically entered into a letter template for you. *Current* can import or export data in *Excel*, *dBASE*, ASCII, and DIF formats.

Current still has a few kinks, however. The pro-

gram offers a serviceable dialer, for example, but it can't recognize modems attached to COM2. And *Current*'s outliner is so crude that it's not worth loading. *Current* also doesn't support *Windows*' Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) facility, which would be handy for keeping figures updated via an *Excel* worksheet. Users will also be annoyed to discover that a category is limited to 2000 records—thus the phone book would top out at 2000 names.

Despite the steep learning curve and various glitches, *Current* is an impressive program that's flexible without being formless. If all you need is a simple scheduler or phone log, *Current* is too complex and too expensive. But if you use *Windows* and need to customize your electronic desktop—and you aren't afraid of a little programming—*Current* is well worth the money. ●

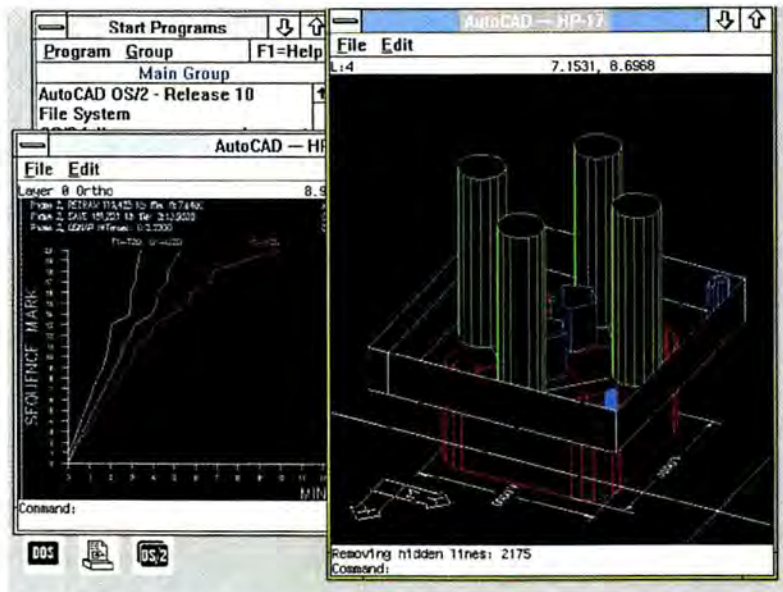

Review



Under Presentation Manager, AutoCAD looks and operates much the same as the DOS version. But it's much slower.

AutoCAD is still far and away the most popular CAD package. It's the strongest 2-D drafting package for the PC, fortified by hundreds of third-party vertical applications. The program also runs on many platforms, from DOS machines to Macintoshes to Sun, Apollo, and DEC workstations.

With *AutoCAD* release 10 for OS/2, Autodesk adds the ninth environment to the list. The package runs under Presentation Manager (PM) but maintains the same basic feel across all platforms. You also benefit from the major improvement in all versions of release 10: true 3-D wireframe and surface modeling.

The problem with release 10 for OS/2 is that it's

slow—25 percent slower than the DOS version (under UNIX, the program is 40 percent *faster* than the DOS version). CAD users crave performance (even the fastest system takes time to update a complex drawing), so this failing may stop many from even considering the OS/2 version.

OS/2's poor performance is partly offset by multitasking. Running multiple *AutoCAD* sessions can eliminate time-consuming file loading when you work with multiple drawings. In addition, you can run a sluggish task (such as plotting) in the background while working on another task in the foreground.

The exceptional feature offered by release 10 for OS/2 is the Applications Development System (ADS). ADS is a high-level programming environment that will be included in all versions of release 11 except the standard DOS version. Very few *AutoCAD* users will be writing C programs, but for developers, ADS is a must-have.

Like all versions except the DOS version, release 10 for OS/2 has a limited selection of drivers for digitizers, plotters, printers, and video displays. PM itself adds little to the mix; few hardware vendors are supplying high-resolution drivers for PM.

Typical DOS-based *AutoCAD* systems already have enough RAM, display resolution, and hard disk capacity to run release 10 for OS/2. But why suffer the speed penalty? If you want multitasking, you'd be better off switching to the faster SCO UNIX version, which has similar hardware requirements and the excellent Open Desktop windowing interface. Fortunately, if your needs change, Autodesk's enlightened upgrade policy lets you switch to any other environment for a reasonable fee. ●

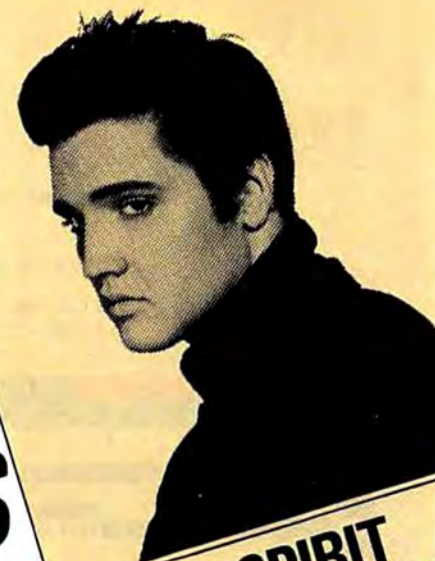

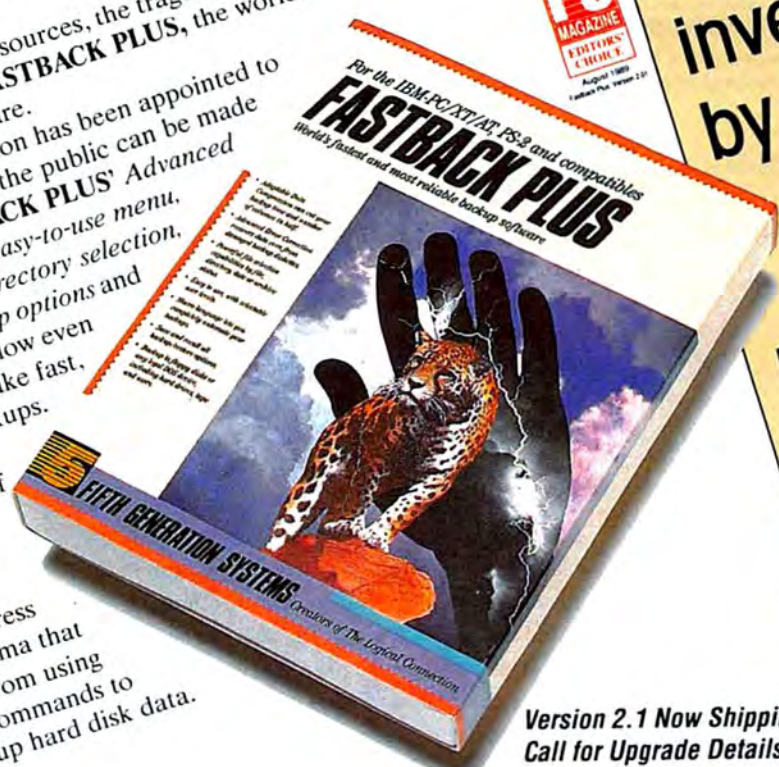

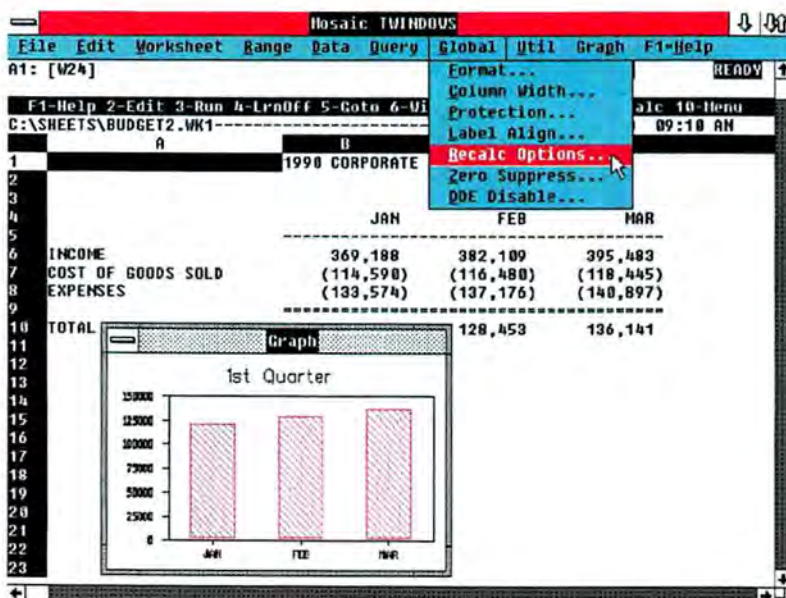
TWINDOWS 1.0

Spreadsheet

PROS: Custom @ functions, dual-axis graphs, DDE support

Review



Twindows claims to be 1-2-3 compatible, but its menus differ quite a bit, and it can't run 1-2-3 macros. And unlike Excel, it can display only one graph at a time.

In the world of Windows spreadsheets, *Excel* used to be the only game in town. Now Mosaic Marketing is trying to up the ante with *Twindows*, a spreadsheet aimed at 1-2-3 vets who are eyeing the Windows interface.

But *Twindows* doesn't even come close to matching *Excel*'s power and flexibility, much less qualify as a 1-2-3 clone. It runs like it's stuck in molasses, and it frequently crashes. This is one program that's not ready for prime time.

Twindows isn't all bad news. As in 1-2-3 release 2.2, a worksheet can reference cells in an external file. And as in *Excel* (but not 2.2), you can define custom @ functions, display cells in different colors based on their values, mix line and bar charts, and plot graphs with dual y-axes. You can also funnel in data via DDE using @ functions.

But these niceties aren't enough, especially when *Excel* is only \$150 more. Unlike *Excel*, *Twindows* can display only one graph at a time, and you must manually update the worksheet link when numbers change. Print options are limited to a single typeface and size, with no shading or lines. And the "preview" option is misnamed, since it

merely shrinks the displayed text.

Memory management is a pain. To use anything but conventional RAM, you must have an EMS board installed. The program can't use extended memory converted by *Windows* or any other emulator, which leaves many *Windows/386* users out in the cold. Worse, if you want *Twindows* to access EMS, you must load *Windows* with the /N switch. This kicks *Windows*' code out of expanded RAM into conventional RAM, where it eats up memory that could be used by other applications.

Twindows isn't much of a 1-2-3 clone either. It can read and write WK1 and WKS files but lacks 1-2-3 keystroke and macro compatibility. *Twindows* includes most 1-2-3 commands but puts them in different menus and uses different keys to invoke them. Pointing techniques used when building formulas in 1-2-3—such as <Home> and <End>—don't even work.

Worse, *Twindows* macros must be created in learn mode, because *Twindows* records keystrokes and mouse movements as uneditable "messages." Since *Twindows* stores absolute screen positions rather than commands, a macro can bomb if it's run in a window whose dimensions have changed. Of course, since *Twindows* sometimes dumps you to DOS or the MS-DOS Executive for no good reason, this point may be moot.

A 1-2-3-compatible *Windows* spreadsheet is a great idea, but *Twindows* doesn't cut it. Mosaic claims that a version to be released in mid-1990 will translate 1-2-3 macros, improve output, and offer 3-D file linking. But until *Twindows*' serious flaws are repaired, *Excel* is still the only game worth playing. ●

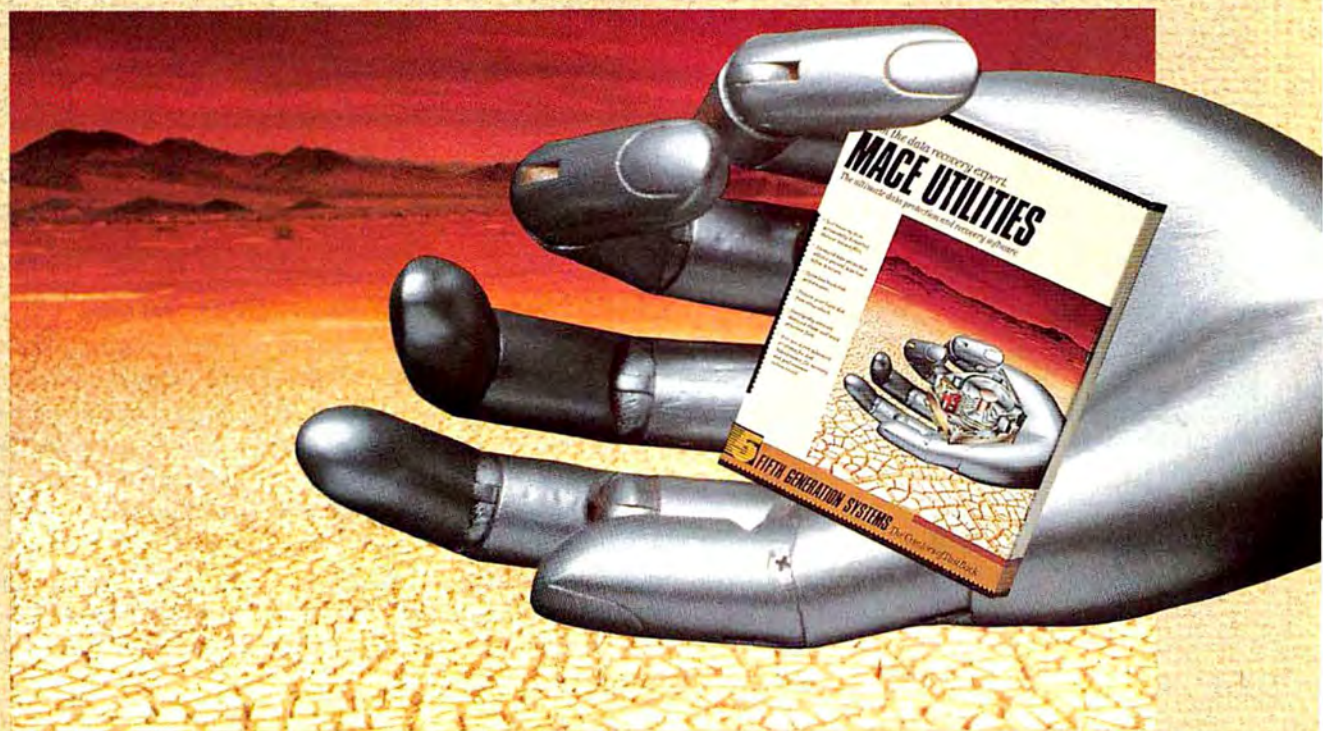

INTRODUCING THE NEW MACE UTILITIES VERSION 1990

The data protection program for the next decade



In the past there were two kinds of hard disk utilities: the kind that were *powerful* and the kind that were *user friendly*. But not both.

In Marketing 101, the first rule you learn is to match your product or service to the right market. After all, a child-care center in a retirement community won't yield much of a profit. But to make the right match, you need the right demographic data.

Unfortunately, most businesses don't have the time or expertise to sift through the mountains of market data that might make the difference between profit and loss. Thanks to Equifax's *Infomark Express*, you won't have to. The company packages a slew of U.S. census and proprietary market data for particular metropolitan areas with an interactive program that lets even managers quickly generate useful demographic reports. If you need to profile a population right down to the neighborhood level, *Infomark* is the tool.

To run *Infomark*, you point at an area on an on-screen map, zoom in to the desired area, select a report, and print. The map can show regions by census tract, ZIP code, or county boundary, along with major roads, highways, cities, and shopping

centers. You can also select a population within a given radius—say within 3 miles of a potential store location—or mark out an irregularly shaped region.

Reporting is *Infomark*'s forte. There are six standard demographic reports (on median income, age, and so on), which range from a trend report that shows 1980 census data, current-year estimates, and five-year projections to a report that shows potential consumer spending in ten categories, including retail sales and restaurants.

The Vision report is particularly intriguing, since it profiles the number of households that fall into various life-styles. These categories, such as "Pools and Patios" or "Sun City," are a handy way to pinpoint consumer income and spending patterns.

Infomark prints out reports in the background pretty quickly. But if numerous census tracts are displayed, screen redraw can slow output. You can't print thematic maps that display regions in different colors based on, say, median age. Note: *Infomark* isn't Windows 3.0—"aware," so it won't be able to tap new memory and color features, although a future version will.

But these are quibbles. *Infomark* is so straightforward that novices can become experts in a few hours. For small- to medium-sized businesses, *Infomark* is a breakthrough in demographic data retrieval and analysis. If you need to find the right market—and if you're competing with well-heeled corporations—*Infomark Express* could make the difference. ●

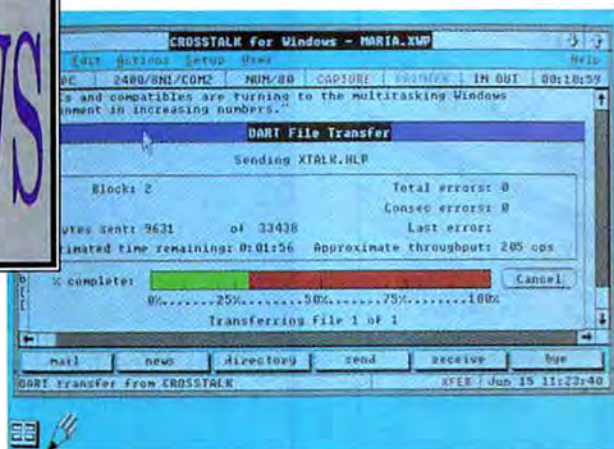

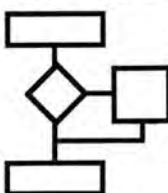

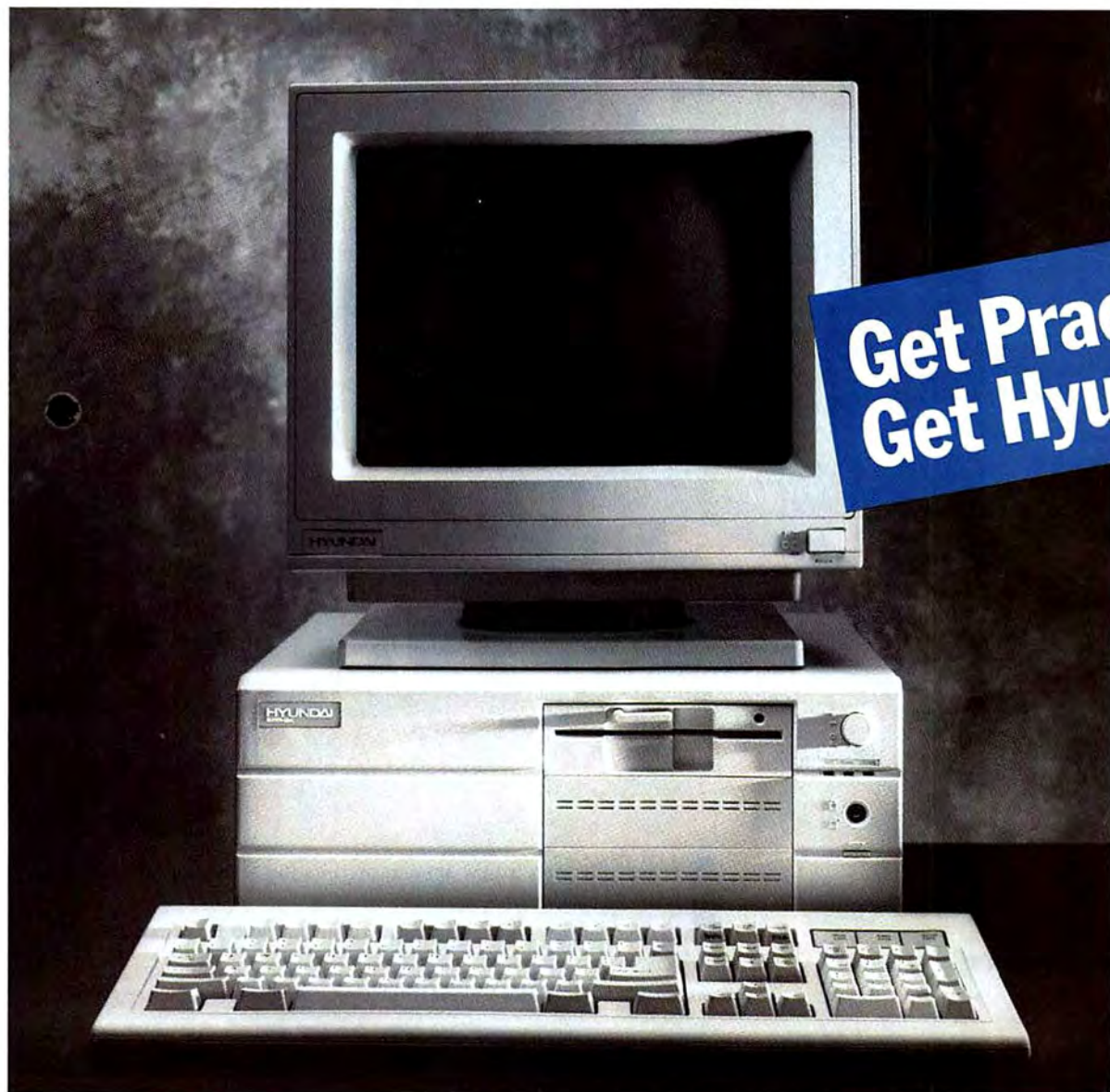

WITH A SUPER-VGA BOARD

LOOK SHARP

If you're buying a new system or thinking about a graphics upgrade, there's no reason to consider anything less than a board compatible with IBM's Video Graphics Array (VGA) standard. While VGA resolution is only 37 percent sharper than Enhanced Graphics Adapter (EGA) images, VGA screens *look* much better—especially when displaying text. You also get a 256-color mode (with a 262,144-color palette), a vast improvement over the EGA's 16-color maximum.

VGA boards are now commodity items, and manufacturers must use price, performance, and extra features to differentiate their products. The most basic (and usually the cheapest) models do no more than IBM's original VGA: 16 colors at 640 by 480 resolution, 256 colors at 320 by 200, and emulation of the EGA, Color/Graphics Adapter (CGA), and Monochrome Display Adapter (MDA). Some higher-priced boards speed up performance for certain applications.

Many VGA boards also improve on the standard by offering higher-resolution modes and more colors; however, none of these so-called super-VGA modes has broad application support. Unless the board manufacturer provides a software driver for your application, you probably won't be able to use the board's super-VGA mode.

This guide lists VGA boards

to suit every taste, from inexpensive clones to boards with a slew of extra features. The emphasis is on super-VGA modes—but bear in mind that they cost more and require both a multi-scan monitor and software support. Today, plain-VGA components should cost no more than EGA, but extra capabilities quickly raise the price.



FOR SOFTWARE, A COMPATIBLE AFFAIR

It's unlikely that any board listed here will have compatibility problems with software written for IBM's VGA—and that includes almost all mainstream business applications released in the last year and a half. People don't always upgrade their software, though, which is one reason for VGA's backward compatibility with older graphics standards.

Today's VGA boards have their act together, but dealers don't always sell the latest revision. Some early boards were unreliable emulators, while others generated too much electromagnetic radiation for home use, interfering with radio and TV signals. The best way to ensure you're getting the latest and greatest board is to check the number listed in the table indicating manufacturer name and revision against the VGA chip's number on the board you want to buy. If they don't match, chances are that the board in your hands is an earlier version—and less capable than the current one.



WHEN BOARD AND PC CONFLICT

Certain VGA boards simply won't work in certain PCs. The problem usually stems from a performance enhancement trick

known as BIOS relocation. (For a discussion of BIOS relocation, see the sidebar to "Five at 25 MHz: The System Standard Rises Higher," April 1990.)

If the system and the VGA board both try to copy their BIOS's into the same location in memory, the PC won't boot. Thus, the ability to disable the VGA's BIOS relocation feature is essential. Some cards also let you change the video BIOS relocation address so that both relocation schemes can coexist.

The speed of a system's I/O bus can also cause problems. A handful of fast PCs let you switch the I/O bus from the standard 8 MHz to 12.5 MHz. However, not all the boards listed here run at that speed; the ones that don't may prevent the system from booting or cause it to crash. If this happens, you'll have to turn the I/O clock back to standard speed.



SPEED AND OTHER RED HERRINGS

Manufacturers may boast about their board's fast performance, but in fact it's difficult to detect differences in speed when running most applications in standard 640 by 480 VGA mode. In *PC World's* May 1989 tests ("VGA Boards Raise the Standard"), we discovered the greatest speed differences when scrolling text in *Microsoft Word*.

In the super-VGA modes, however, things get more interesting. When a board is shuffling pixels around the screen at 1024 by 768 resolution (the highest super-VGA resolution) instead of 640 by 480, screen refresh can take much longer. In that mode, the most significant performance

factor is the quality of the vendor's software driver.

Often, but not always, 16-bit boards are faster (and more expensive) than 8-bit boards. More important is whether or not the board uses video RAM (VRAM). VRAMs are memory chips with special architecture that's well suited for video cards, and they cost twice as much as regular RAM. Any manufacturer that includes VRAM on board is serious about speed and all-around quality. In this guide, only ATI's VGA Wonder VRAM, Headland's Video Seven V-RAM VGA, and Vermont Microsystems' VGA use VRAM.



NAVIGATING THE SUPER-VGA MAZE

The applications you want to run should be the key factor in your VGA purchase decision. For word processing, spreadsheets, data bases, and other text-based applications, basic VGA capability is all you need. But if you regularly use *Windows*, CAD, or other graphics-intensive software, a super-VGA board offers a tempting balance of high resolution and reasonable price.

This guide lists super-VGA drivers for the most widely supported applications and at the two most popular super-VGA resolutions, 800 by 600 and 1024 by 768. Super-VGA drivers come on a disk with the board; each driver requires a separate installation procedure.

Windows and Presentation Manager users who stick to their respective environments will profit with least effort from super-VGA. Instead of installing a different driver for each application, they can install just one

environmental driver; then any program that runs under the environment will have access to the enhanced resolution.

If you plan on running software at 1024 by 768, make sure you get a multiscan or high-resolution monitor that can handle it (see "Smart Monitors, Smart Buys" in this issue). Also, remember that at this resolution, performance counts. The only way to tell whether screen updates will be bearable or excruciatingly slow is by testing the board with the program you want to use.

Speed isn't the only thing affected by driver quality. A poor driver may produce a misaligned image, brightness changes, garbage characters, and flicker at the top or bottom of the screen. With some applications, users also complain that text looks squashed at super-VGA resolutions. To correct this, some board manufacturers supply special screen fonts that demand yet another installation procedure.

An industry consortium called the Video Electronic Standards Association (VESA) is attempting to rationalize super-VGA resolutions by creating two new standards. The organization has published two specs: VESA 1 (800 by 600 at 16 colors) and VESA 2 (1024 by 768 with an unspecified number of colors).

The idea is to get software developers to write to the VESA specs. VESA 1 and VESA 2 would appear on software installation menus the same way VGA, EGA, and the like do. Software support from vendors would not only eliminate sometimes complicated driver installation but would also result in faster, bet-

ter-written drivers. Unfortunately, little support has yet appeared.



HARDWARE ON THE HORIZON

It's no coincidence that super-VGA boards top out at 1024 by 768. That resolution was established by IBM's high-end 8514/A graphics adapter, released at the same time as the VGA. Many in the industry believe that 8514/A represents the next mainstream graphics standard.

A competing group of board makers is attempting to establish a different 1024 by 768 standard

built around the TI 34010 graphics coprocessor and its Texas Instruments Graphics Adapter (TIGA) programming interface. Running at 1024 by 768, both 34010 and 8514/A boards deliver much better performance than super-VGA boards; in fact, most are considerably faster at that resolution than VGAs in standard 640 by 480 mode.

However, there's no guarantee that the 34010 and 8514/A boards will run VGA software: Many require a VGA board in an adjacent slot connected by a pass-through cable that plugs into the VGA's monitor port. When you

need to run a program outside the small circle of supported applications, you must switch back to the workaday VGA.

It makes no sense to buy 8514/A or 34010 boards costing several times as much as basic VGA in the hope that software support will come later. Software considerations must come first. If your application requires a sharper image than standard VGA boards can provide, one of the super-VGA boards with an appropriate driver may be all you need. ●

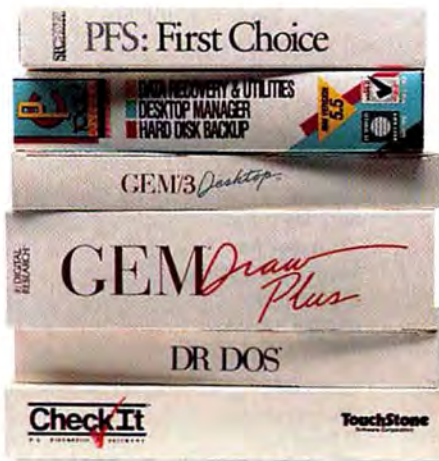

Electronic bulletin boards are a great way for companies to link up far-flung employees or provide low-cost customer support, but setting one up is usually a hassle. This isn't the case with *Maxihost*, a versatile shareware BBS that almost anyone can use.

Originally known as *Minihost*, a simple remote-access communications package, *Maxihost* is now a single-line BBS that supports 15 transfer protocols and a virtually unlimited number of callers. While it lacks the sophisticated teleconferencing, program libraries, and expandability of programs like *RBBS-PC* or *The Major BBS*, *Maxihost's* ample security features and easy setup make it ideal for small companies looking for a way to exchange messages and swap files. Setting up a *Maxihost* BBS is as simple as editing the pro-

gram's configuration file, *MAXI-HOST.CNF*. All you need is a copy of the program, a word processor, a Hayes-compatible modem, and a hard disk. This article explains how to create message conferences, add users, and establish security procedures—basic principles that apply to the setup of virtually any BBS.

Laying the Groundwork

First, you'll need to set up your modem: Make sure that auto-answer is disabled and that the data-terminal-ready and carrier-detect modes aren't forced on. Depending on the modem, you must either flip DIP switches or edit the *INITSTRING=* line in the configuration file. For example, you'd use *initstring=at&d2v1q0e0s0=0&c1&j0&t5l3b1m1&w* with a

Hayes Smartmodem 2400.

Next, create directories for *Maxihost* files, and modify your CONFIG.SYS and AUTOEXEC.BAT files:

1. At the C> prompt, type `md c:\maxihost <Enter>`.
2. Copy the program's files into the new directory.
3. Type `md c:\maxihost\public` to create a subdirectory called PUBLIC for callers to access when they log on.
4. Make a subdirectory for uploading files; call it `c:\maxihost\upload`.
5. To display color BBS screens, you need an ANSI driver installed. Make sure ANSI.SYS is in the \DOS directory. Then load CONFIG.SYS into your word processor, and add a line reading `device = c:\dos\ansi.sys`.
6. Load AUTOEXEC.BAT into your word processor, and add `;c:\maxihost` to your PATH command. If you're dedicating a PC to full-time BBS duty, you may want *Maxihost* to load at start-up. If so, add `cd c:\maxihost` to the end of AUTOEXEC.BAT.

Configuring Maxihost

Maxihost's settings are contained in a text file called MAXIHOST.CNF. Changing settings is straightforward. For example, to increase the BBS's top modem speed from 2400 bps to 9600 bps, simply load the file into a word processor and change 'BAUD = 2400' to **BAUD = 9600**. *Maxihost* provides a default value for each setting, but you can easily

How MATCHLEVEL Works

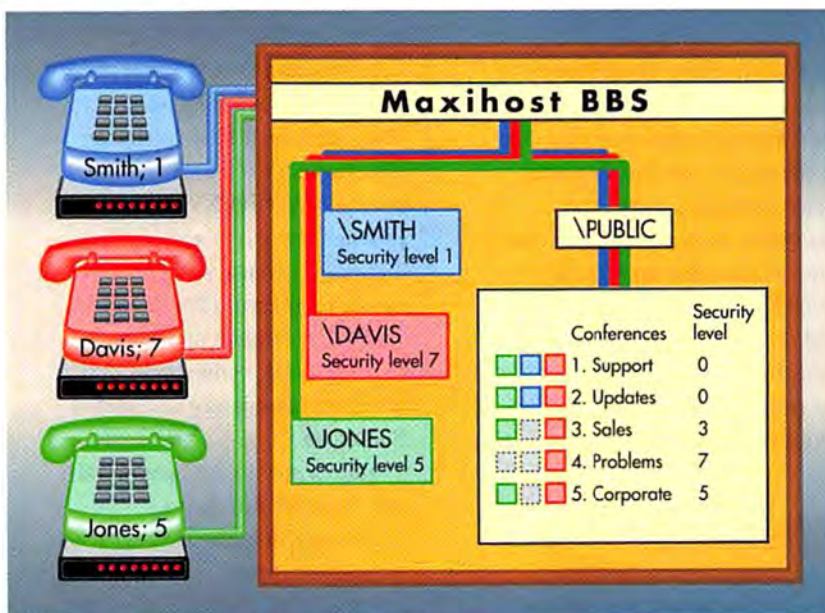


FIGURE 1: *Maxihost* lets you set up private subdirectories for selected users. When you set **MATCHLEVEL = y**, each user can access only that subdirectory whose security level matches his or her own. However, access to public message conferences is unrestricted by **MATCHLEVEL**. For example, while Jones is unable to get into Smith's directory, he can still access any conference with a security level of 5 or less.

change each setting's default value to suit your needs.

The following sections explain how to set up an on-line conference, add users, and assign security levels. But first you must tell *Maxihost* where to find your PUBLIC and UPLOAD subdirectories.

1. Start your word processor, and load MAXIHOST.CNF.
2. Find the line that begins with 'START =', and add the directory's path, so that the string reads **start = c:\maxihost\public**.
3. Locate 'UPLOAD =', and type **c:\maxihost\upload** immediately following the equal sign.

► Create Message Conferences

Public message conferences let BBS users exchange information on specific topics. *Maxihost* lets you create up to ten E-mail conferences; simply add a **CONFERENCE =** line to the configuration file for each. The line must include a unique ID number, the conference name, and the security level required to access the conference. You can add an optional 25-character description. For example, to create a forum where customers can get answers to technical support questions, type **conference = 1;Support;0;Tech Support Hotline**.

► Add Users

You can set up *Maxihost* to accept a virtually unlimited number of callers or restrict the system to a specific set of users. To limit BBS access to named users, set the `CLOSEDSYSTEM` = line to `y`. To add users to a closed system, simply append their names to the user directory at the end of the file. The entry should contain a name and a password, indicate whether the user wants color screens, and include his or her security level and an optional phone number—that the BBS can call back—for example, `user = Tom Jones; password:y;5;555-1234`.

► Assign Security Levels

Assigning security levels for users, directories, and conferences is vital to BBS setup. *Maxihost* lets you define 32,767 levels, but you'll probably need only a few. First, make a list of everyone who will be calling the BBS and what each person will need access to. Give callers access to only the directories and files they need to use. Next, keep callers from snooping around your hard disk. The `DEFAULTS` = setting controls access to non-BBS drives and directories. If you assign `DEFAULTS` = the highest security level (the default is 9), only you will have full access to your files.

Assign lower security levels for BBS directories, drives, and files by adding `PROTECT` = entries. For example, type `protect = c:\maxihost\upload;3` to limit access to the `UPLOAD` subdirectory to users with a security level of 3 or higher.

► Private Access

Assigning private subdirectories to selected users lets you control access to sensitive information; users can jump to their directories to download (but not upload) important files.

To ensure privacy, you'll need to give users a unique security level, plus the ability to change directories. You'll also need to set the `MATCHLEVEL` = line to `y`, which lets users access only directories whose security levels match their own. (The `MATCHLEVEL` command applies only to directories; conferences and menu commands are unaffected. See **FIGURE 1**.)

Here's how to set up a private directory for Mr. Jones.

1. Create a subdirectory with `md c:\maxihost\jones`.
2. Open `MAXIHOST.CNF`, and set `MATCHLEVEL` = to `y`.
3. Assign the user's unique security level to the subdirectory by adding another `PROTECT` = line. Type `protect = c:\maxihost\jones;5`. (The number 5 is Mr. Jones's unique security level.)
4. To enable Jones to jump to his directory, locate the `MENU` = `CHANGEDIR;n` line, and assign a security level of 5 or less.

With `MENU` = , you can assign security levels to all *Maxihost* menu functions.

Security Specifics

Maxihost provides a slew of useful security features. Want your BBS to hang up after users log on and then call them back? Set `CALLBACK` = to `y`. To keep a detailed log of caller activity, set `LOGFILE` = to `y`. And if you want the system to track failed log-on attempts and lock out names that have been submitted unsuccessfully, set `USERLOCK` = to `y`.

You can even thwart "demon dialers" who ferret out computer phone numbers by dialing every number in an exchange. Setting `RINGBACK` = to `y` means users must call the system, hang up, and call back again to connect to the BBS.

Create Custom Screens

Though *Maxihost* comes with introductory and bulletin screens, creating your own screens helps personalize the BBS. You'll need an ANSI screen painter like *TheDraw*, a popular shareware package that lets you add color, graphics, fonts, fill patterns, and animation to your screens.

Once you've created the introductory screen, be sure to save it in both graphics (ANSI) and text (ASCII) formats, to accommodate non-ANSI terminals. Save the ANSI version as `welcome.g00` and the ASCII version as `welcome.t00`, then copy both into the `MAXIHOST` directory.

Bulletins are a good way to broadcast general information about the BBS. To run multiple bulletins, you'll need to create a menu screen that lists each bulletin name next to the number the caller must press in order to read it. Save an ANSI version of the menu as `bulletin.g00` and an ASCII version as `bulletin.t00`, then create ANSI and ASCII versions of each bulletin. If a caller must press 1 to read a bulletin, use file extensions `G01` and `T01`; if the caller presses 2, use `G02` and `T02`, and so on. Copy all bulletin files into the `MAXIHOST` directory.

Remote Control

Maxihost is also a remote-access package. Using `TRAPDOOR.BAT`, users can call in to the BBS and run up to nine applica-

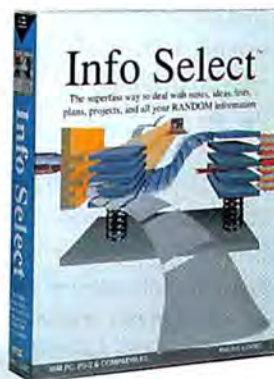

tions. However, TRAPDOOR won't work with programs that write directly to the keyboard or to screen memory, such as *Microsoft Word*. To use such programs, you'll need a copy of a shareware package called *Doorway*. *Maxihost's* documentation file, MAXIHOST.DOC, provides information on how to integrate the two programs.

No-Fuss Upkeep

All that's left is to load *Maxihost*. While the program attends to callers, you can press <F1> to get the lowdown on system configuration and security levels. Some settings, including modem controls, can be toggled on and off from the main menu, saving you from having to reedit the configuration file.

Rules of good BBS housekeeping dictate that you periodically clean out the system log and update the user name, password, message, and upload list files. You'll also want to keep an eye on the upload directory for potentially troublesome files. Otherwise, a *Maxihost* BBS is as easy to maintain as it is to set up. ●

ASCII Characters as Easy as 1-2-3

1-2-3 doesn't make it easy to use the PC's extended ASCII character set, preferring its own LICS (Lotus International Character Set). Here's how to make release 2.2 use extended ASCII characters.

Type **install** at the DOS command line, and press <Enter>. Select **Advanced options**, then **Modify current driver set Text display**. From the large list of display options presented, select **Universal text display -ASCII-no LICS**. Next, select **Return to menu Save changes**. If you wish, type in a new name for the changed driver set. Then press <Enter> twice and select **Yes** to exit **Install**.

If you saved your driver set under a new name, load 1-2-3 with **123 drivename**. Use the

@Char() function to display a character; for instance, @char(218) will produce □.

For an on-screen reference of ASCII characters and their codes, select **/Data Fill**, enter a range of **b1.b223**, a start of **33** (characters 1 through 32 are not displayed in 1-2-3), a step of **1**, and a stop of **255**. With the cell pointer at A1, type @char(b2) and press <Enter>. /Copy the contents of 'a1' to a2.a223. Printing this worksheet will show you which of these characters your printer supports.

Return of the PC-File Clones

Bob Levine's method of duplicating *PC-File* + data base formats [*User Group Tips*, October 1989] works well, but there's a simpler way. An easier method uses DOS's COPY command. *PC-File* keeps a data base's structure as a separate file with an HDR extension. If you COPY the HDR file, giving it a new name with the same extension, *PC-File* will see the new HDR file as an empty data base with the same structure as the original.

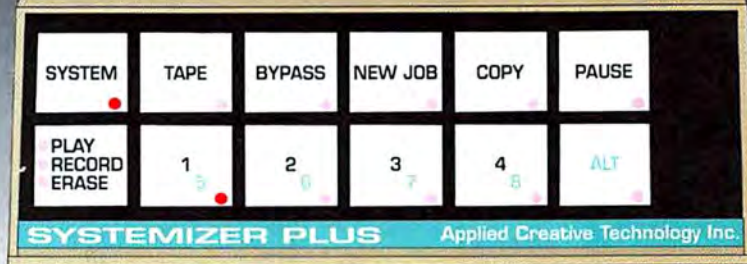

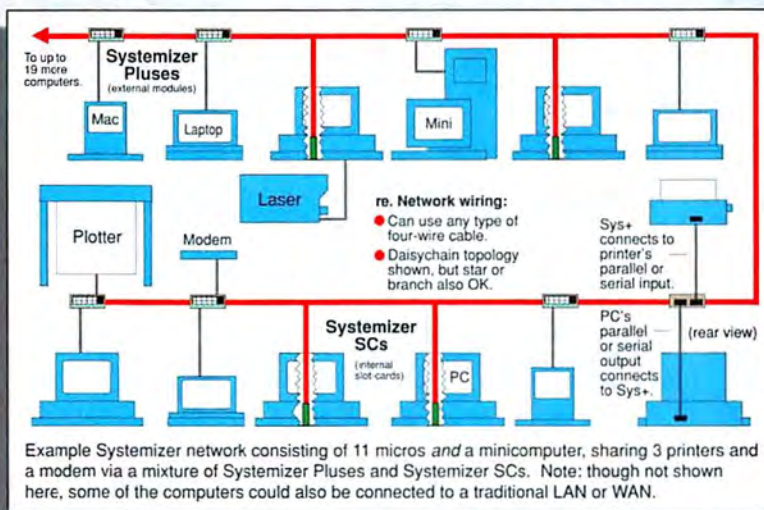

Spreadsheets (A..Z)



Practical tips for building better worksheets

This month: getting started with Allways

Richard Scoville

As a PC educator, I'm distressed by the growing spreadsheet "gadget gap." The programs get ever more powerful and complicated, and while these advances are vital for a few complex projects, most spreadsheet users benefit far more from simple tricks and techniques that ease everyday tasks. Face it: Most of us are less concerned with matrix algebra and radar charts than with getting the right answers quickly.

In this column, we'll focus on practical ways to build better spreadsheets. Given its market domination, *1-2-3* will claim the lion's share of our attention, but

we won't overlook other programs. Each month we'll also feature a useful *Excel* tip and take a look at a different spreadsheet utility or add-in.

Allways Prepared

Printing reports was once the bane of *1-2-3* users, who struggled with baffling page breaks, arcane setup strings, and mysterious print borders. But the situation improved two years ago, when Lotus started bundling Funk Software's *Allways* with *1-2-3*.

Allways lets you combine text and graphs in reports, which you can dress up with fonts, lines,

shading, boldface, underlining, and color. Equally important, it saves time and paper by showing you how your reports will look before you print them out (though it doesn't show page headers or borders).

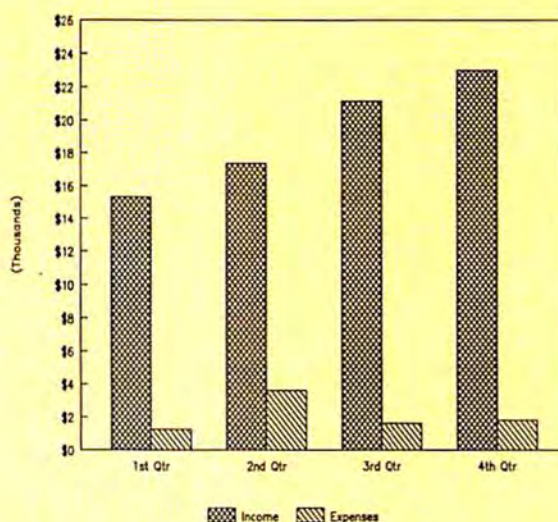


FIGURE 2: Our *Allways* make-over transforms FIGURE 1 into this attractive, laser-printed report.

To get you started with *Allways*, we'll go step-by-step through a make-over of the "before" worksheet shown in **FIGURE 1**. The result will be the flashy "after" report of **FIGURE 2**.

If you haven't yet installed *Allways*, see your *1-2-3* or *Allways* manual for instructions. Execute the */Add-in Attach* command, select *ALLWAYS.ADN*, choose 7 to assign *Allways* to

SPREADSHEET TOOLBOX

Seriously Impressed

For \$150 *Impress 2* gives *1-2-3* 2.x users more report tools than *Allways* does: You can add labels, arrows, shapes, and even drop-shadows to graphs, and graphs can be hot-linked to change as your numbers do. But that's not all: *Impress* also gives *1-2-3* a terrific-looking *Excel*-like graphical interface that lets you use a mouse to move around, enter commands, select ranges, and size rows and columns.

Impress can wrap text as you type, and reformatting is easy. You can also change fonts and attributes within a block of text (though not so easily). *Impress* handles even complex

1-2-3 macros smoothly, but a bit slowly. However, when a macro has paused for data entry, you can't use the mouse.

Impress isn't going to elbow aside *Quattro Pro* or *Excel*, both of which offer easy pull-down menus, one-click row or column selection, more flexible graph editing, and a host of other advantages. But *1-2-3* users who want snazzy graphics or a mouse interface should take a close look at *Impress*.

<Alt>-<F7>, and choose *Quit*. Then create the P&L.WK1 worksheet as shown. Next, using standard 1-2-3 commands, create a graph resembling the one in **FIGURE 2** and save it to a file as P&L.PIC with /Graph Save.

Now you're ready to get down to work with *Allways*. Invoke it by pressing <Alt>-<F7>.

Allways at Work

You typically begin creating an *Allways* report by setting overall page characteristics. To mimic the report illustrated, select /Layout Margins Left, set the left margin to 1.5 inches, set the bottom margin to .5 inch, and choose *Quit* to return to the Layout menu. Select *Titles Footer* and enter :# to center the page number at the bottom of the page, then select *Quit* twice.

Now add the shading and lines for the totals. Select /Format Shade Light, highlight the range A8..E8, and press <Enter>; repeat for rows 18 and 20. Then move to B7, select /Format Lines Bottom, and highlight B7..E7. To display just the line, reduce the height of row 7 to zero points: Select /Worksheet Row Set-height, type 0, and press <Enter>. Repeat on row 17.

The next step is to jazz up the fonts (*Allways* lets you use up to eight in a single report). With the pointer on cell A1, select /Format Font, highlight *Triumvirate 20 point*, and press <Enter>. Repeat the process on cell A2, but choose *Triumvirate 14 point*. Execute /Format Font again, select *Times 10 point*, highlight B4..E4, and press <Enter>; repeat for A5..A20. To make room for these larger labels, use /Worksheet Column Set-

Projecting Future Values

Excel's TREND() function uses statistical techniques to make projections based on actual values in a worksheet. It's most useful when you've recorded results over a period of time and want to predict future results.

To try TREND(), enter the sample sales figures below into an *Excel* worksheet.

Select the range *B10:B12*, type the formula =TREND(*b1:b9,a1:a9,a10:a12*), and press <Ctrl>-<Shift>-<Enter> to enter the formula as an array. Projected values for the next three months appear in cells *B10:B12*. The first argument of the TREND function, *B1:B9*, points to the actual figures; the second, *A1:A9*, selects labels for those figures; and the third, *A10:A12*, selects labels for the projected values.

width to adjust the width of column A to 20 characters.

Now insert the graph you've created into the *Allways* report. Position the cell pointer on B21, select /Graph Add, choose P&L.PIC, highlight the range A21.E46, and press <Enter>. If instead of your graph you see just a gray box, select /Display Graphs Yes Quit. Note that this graph is not dynamically linked to your spreadsheet data. When you change the spreadsheet, you must update the PIC file with /Graph Save and update *Allways* with /Graph Settings PIC-file, or else the graph in your *Allways*

report will be inaccurate.

Finally, print your masterpiece. Select /Print Range Set, highlight A1..E46, and select Go to send your report to the printer.

Pretty easy, wasn't it? Novices may want to read through the steps again and review the 1-2-3 manual, especially on the subjects of print borders and headers and footers. ●

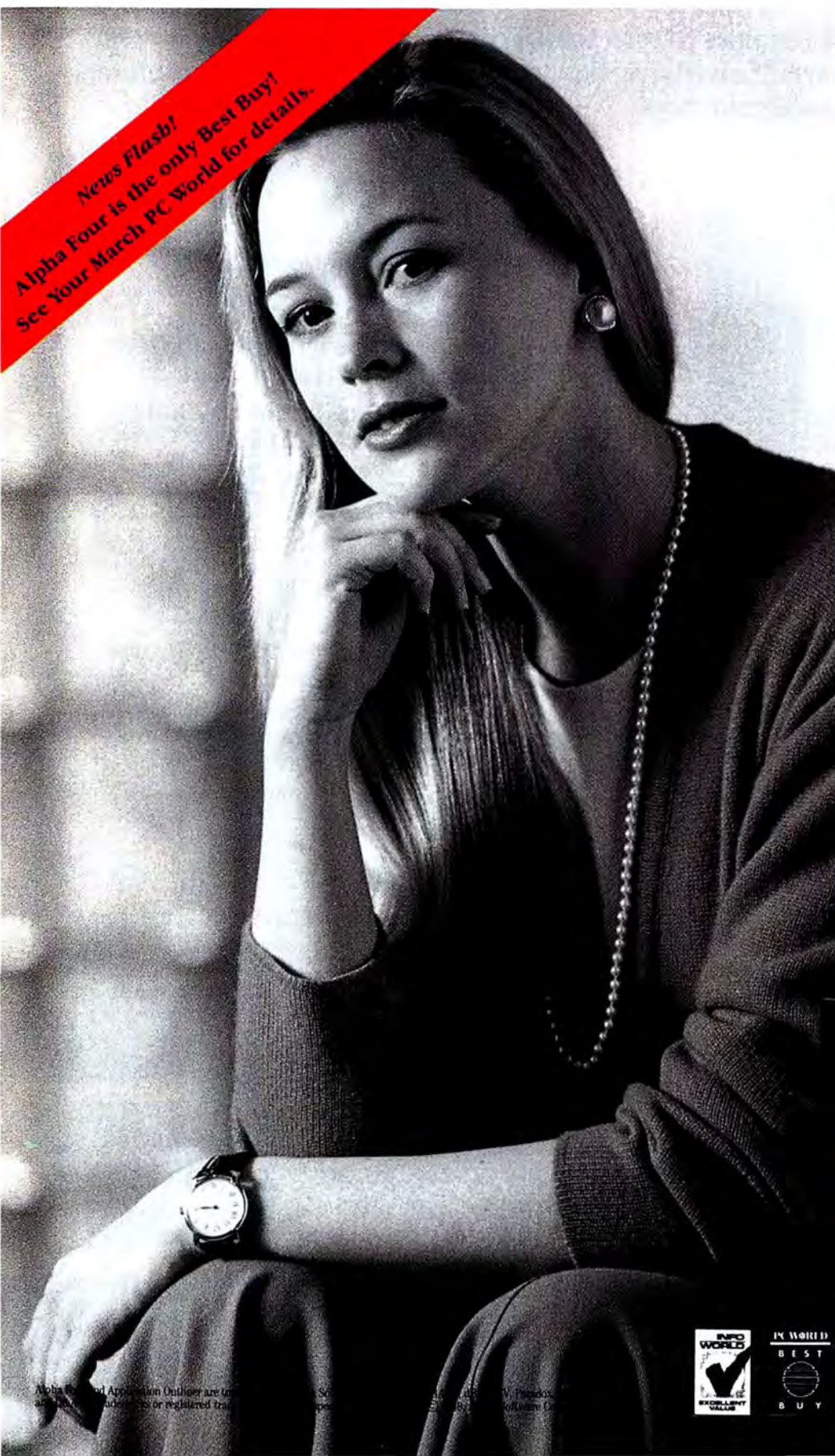

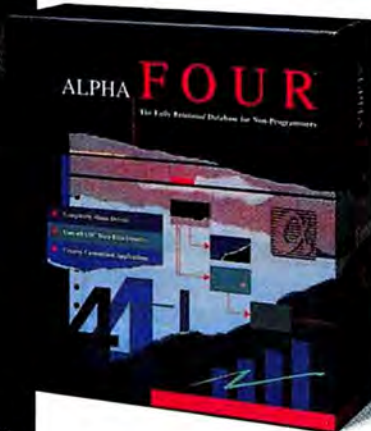

Tips for getting the most out of your word processor

This month: Design snaking columns with WordPerfect

Everybody wants to be the master of their word processor, but few people really are. Who has the time to learn all the features of a *WordPerfect* or a *Word*? As programs and manuals grow more complex, the going gets rougher.

Words Into Print will cut through the clutter and give you the information you'll need to produce high-impact documents quickly. In future columns you will find tips for creating style sheets, organizing dictionaries, downloading fonts, and more. Usually, *WordPerfect* will be the example program, but the lessons should be helpful with other programs as well.

Each month you'll also find tips and macros for *Word* and *WordPerfect*, and I'll answer letters about your toughest word processing problems. Multiple-Column Magic

Putting more than one column on a page can add impact to documents. Columnar text is easy to read, and it lends itself well to integrated text boxes and graphics. *WordPerfect* supports both snaking, newspaper-like columns, where text flows from column to column, and parallel

WORDPERFECT SHORTCUTS

Easy File Conversion

Follow these steps to create a *WordPerfect 5.1* macro that converts files from other word processors' formats:

1. Press **<Home>** **<Ctrl>** **<F10>**, and type **convert**.
2. Press **<Enter>**, type a description, and press **<Enter>** again.
3. Press **<Delete>** to erase the {Display Off} code.
4. Press **<Ctrl>** **<F1>** to add a {Shell} code.
5. Type **cconvert** to call up the conversion program.
6. Press **<Space>**, and type a path to the directory where you would normally find the files to be converted. For example, to convert *Word* files, you might type **c:\word\docs**.
7. Press **<Ctrl>** **<Page Up>** to see the command list, move the

cursor to {PAUSE}, and press **<Enter>**.

8. Press **<Space>**, and type a path for the output files.

9. Press **<Ctrl>** **<Page Up>** **<Enter>** to add another {PAUSE} code.

10. Press **<Space>**, and type an input file code for the foreign word processing format; for example, type **b** for *Word*. See page 93 of the *WordPerfect 5.1* manual for a list of codes.

11. Press **<Ctrl>** **<v>** **<Enter>** **<F7>** to save the macro.

To convert a file, press **<Alt>** **<F10>**, type **convert**, and press **<Enter>**. Type the input and output file names, pressing **<Enter>** after each.

WORD SHORTCUTS

Creating a Column Macro

Many of the tips that will appear here in the coming months will involve the creation of *Word* macros. Here's how to create a macro that formats a *Word* 4.0 or 5.0 document in snaking columns:

On a blank *Word* screen, type the following without pressing <Enter>. Type the actual characters, not the keystrokes they indicate:

<ctrl esc> fdl <tab>

«pause Enter the number of columns»
<enter>

Word encloses macro keystrokes in angle brackets (< >) and commands in chevrons (« »). To type the chevrons,

press <Ctrl>-[and <Ctrl>-].

When you finish, press <Shift>-<F10> to select the macro, press <Esc> c, and enter a name for the macro (for example, *snake.mac*). If you want to assign it to a keystroke, type a caret (^) and press a <Ctrl>-key combination.

Test the macro and, if it works, press <Esc> tgs <Enter> to save it. If you need to edit the macro, load it onto a blank screen by pressing <Esc> i. Type the macro's name followed by a caret (^), and press <Enter>. After editing the macro, save it as described above.

columns, in which blocks of text sit side by side but flow independently from page to page. This exercise focuses on snaking columns.

To start, open a text file, and move the cursor to where the first column should begin. Press <Alt>-<F7> 13 to open the Column Definition menu. The default column type is Newspaper, so you can skip the first entry. To enter the number of columns, press 2, then type 3 to select three columns, and press <Enter>. You can use up to 24 columns, but beyond 4, the text becomes hard to read.

You can opt to skip the remaining entries, as the half-inch default for the width between columns is perfect for a three-column format, and there's no need to change the column mar-

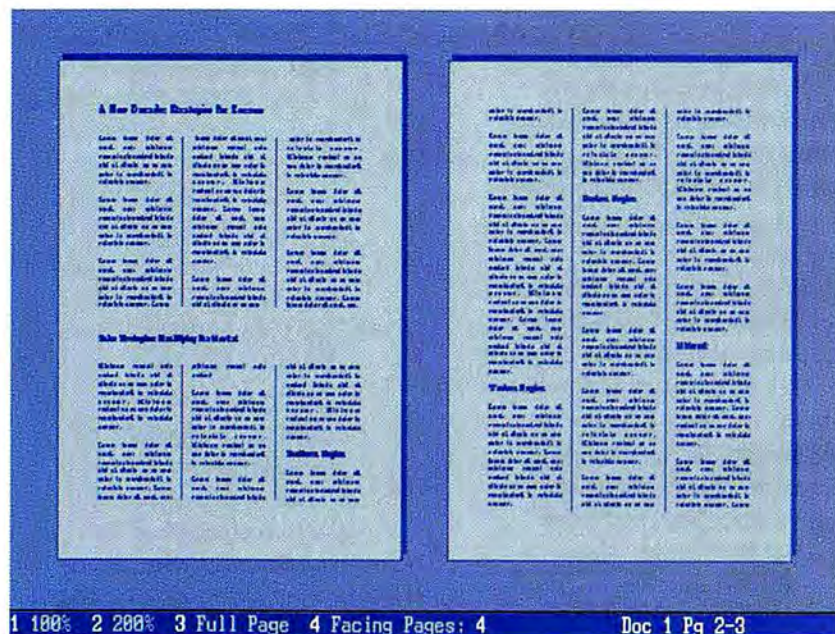
gins. If you want to, however, you can set unequal column widths here, a feat impossible in most word processors.

Press <F7> and then 1 to save the settings and turn on the columns. If you press <Cursor Down>, the text should appear in columns on screen. If it doesn't, press <Shift>-<F1> 267y <F7> to turn on the column display mode, and press <Cursor Down> again to refresh the screen.

You can continue editing the text as usual. To move from column to column, press <Ctrl>-<Home> and then the left or right cursor key. With 5.1, mouse users can simply click on a new spot.

Turn-Ons and Turnoffs

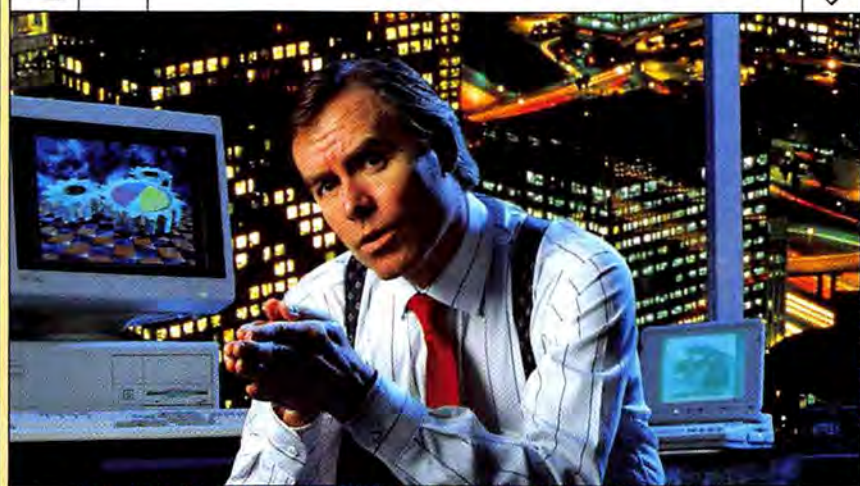
In some documents you'll want to change from multiple columns to another format, such as when you add a full-width headline. To turn off column formatting, move the cursor to the start of a new line and press <Alt>-<F7> 12. If you don't place the cursor at the start of a line, *WordPerfect* will push you to the next page. Next, enter a headline, press <Enter>, and then press <Alt>-<F7> 11 to turn the columns back on.

The problem with changing columns in midpage is that the columns aren't balanced. The only way to format equal-length columns that are on the same page as other column formats is to balance them by eye. To do this, move the cursor to the point where you want to start a new column, and press <Ctrl>-<Enter>. This forces the text to the top of the next column. Then press <Ctrl>-<Enter> again at a new point to start the third column. To determine the right break points, you can count the number of lines in the text to be balanced and divide by the number of columns. Don't balance the columns until you've completed all your other editing and formatting.

Separating Columns With Lines

If you want, you can enhance readability by adding vertical lines between columns:

1. Press <Alt>-<F9>5 to open the Graphics Line menu.
2. Press 2 for Vertical Lines.
3. Press 1 to select Horizontal Position, then 3 for Between Columns.
4. At the prompt, press <Enter> to place the line after the first column. To place a line after the second column, repeat these steps but press 2<Enter> for the second line.
5. If you're using multiple formats, you'll also have to specify the lines' vertical positions and lengths. For example, to create a line starting at the top of the page but ending at the bottom of a short column, select *Top* for

the Vertical Position field, and enter the length of the line in the Length field. To find out the length of the line, return to the editing screen; move the cursor to the last line of the truncated column, and check the inch counter at the bottom right of the screen. To view the lines, press <Shift>-<F7>6, which turns on the page preview mode.

Once you set the columns, you can still edit using the normal tools. The only exceptions: You can't include footnotes or 5.1's tables inside a column. It's a small price to pay for a polished page. ●

Tips and techniques for managing your data

This month: how and why to design a relational data base

Alan Schwartz

Welcome to *Data Basics*, PC World's new column on the fundamentals of relational data bases. In the coming months, you'll learn how to build efficient, error-free data bases, design effective forms and reports, and perform other data management tasks. Although the examples in this column use the still very popular *dBASE III Plus*, users of other data managers should also find *Data Basics* useful. This month's column looks at the basics of designing relational links.

Why Relational?

Why use a relational data base? Say you're tracking tool rentals for Acme Home and Garden Tool

Supply. If you put data regarding customers, transactions, and tools in a single table, you're asking for trouble. Adding a record for each customer and each of the tools rented involves entering the same data over and over, which wastes time and disk space. Also, a single table leaves no room for human error—if a customer's middle initial is entered one day but not the next, you can't generate accurate reports. And if you add multiple tool fields to each transaction, you'll have trouble reporting by tool. The solution is to keep customers, transactions, and products in separate tables and place relational links between them.

When two tables have a relational link, moving to a different record in one table (the parent) causes a matching record to be selected in the other (the child).

This way, while you're working on a particular transaction, the current record in the customer table will always contain data for that transaction's customer. The relational link requires that the two tables share some data in common, typically—although not necessarily—a single field.

In *dBASE*, where each table is its own data file, you could name the tables *CUSTOMER.DBF*, *TRANS.DBF*, and *PRODUCT.DBF*. Before a relation can be set, the child data file must be indexed on the field that will link it to the parent. The actual link is then created using the *SET RELATION* command. For example, to build a relationship from *TRANS.DBF* to *CUSTOMER.DBF*, you would enter commands similar to the following, assuming that both data files

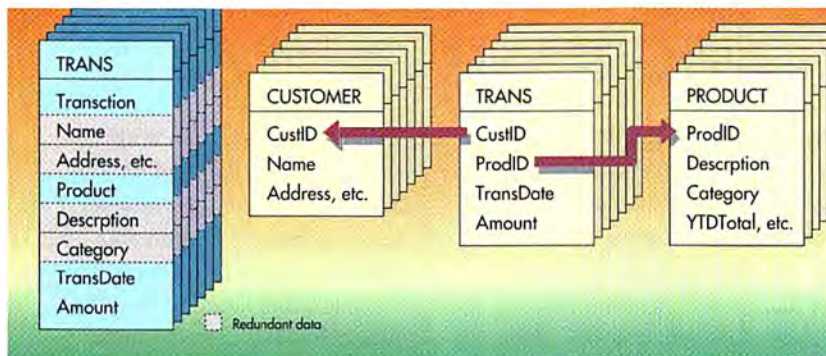

have identical fields called CustID:

SELECT 1

USE Customer INDEX Custid

SELECT 2

USE Trans INDEX Transcust, Transprod

SET RELATION TO CustID INTO Customer

Then, every time you went to a different transaction, the current customer record would be the one whose CustID field was identical to the current transaction's CustID field. Thus, the command **? CUSTOMER-> Name** returns the name of the current transaction's customer. This principle applies to all data base activities, including work with screens, lists, and reports.

The fields used for linking tables need not have the same name, nor must their data always be 100 percent identical. *dBASE's* Exact option is one way to control how precisely these fields must match. With Exact off (the default), a transaction with a CustID of 'AC-1' could bring up a customer whose CustID was 'AC-12'; Exact on would produce only an exact match. Whether you should have Exact on or off depends on the situation, but you should always be aware of its status. You turn Exact on or off with **SET EXACT**.

To include the customer name

and the product for each transaction, you'll need to set relations from TRANS into both other files. *dBASE III Plus* allows only one relation per parent, but it can be tricked into thinking one file is the parent when actually another is, as shown here:

SELECT 3

USE Product INDEX ProdId

SELECT Customer

SET RELATION TO Trans-> ProdID INTO ;

Product

SELECT Trans

SET RELATION TO CustID INTO Customer

Exporting Fixed-Length ASCII Files

It's sometimes convenient to turn your data into a fixed-length ASCII file, resembling a table layout. Unfortunately, *Paradox's* Tools ExportImport commands won't let you do that unless each record contains only a single field. Fortunately, there's a workaround—you can export text to a fixed-length ASCII file by generating a report.

1. From the main menu, select *Report Design*, pick your table, and enter a report number. Select *Tabular*.

2. Delete all lines from the report specification except the one containing field masks, shown with 9s for digits and A's for characters. To delete a line, place the cursor at the beginning of the line, and press **<Ctrl>-Y**.

3. Press **<F10>**, select *Setting PageLayout Length*, press **<Backspace>** twice, and press

C<Enter> to set page length to continuous.

4. Press **<F2>** to save the report specification.

5. Select *Report Output*, and select the table and report specifications created in step 1. When prompted for the destination of the report, choose *File*. Enter a file name, and that's it!

Paradox can't import fixed-length text files, but Borland provides a separate utility for that job. Flimport, which comes on Pprog disk 6 in *Paradox 3.01* and later versions, easily does the trick. If you have an earlier version, you can call Borland technical support at 408/439-1236 for a free copy.

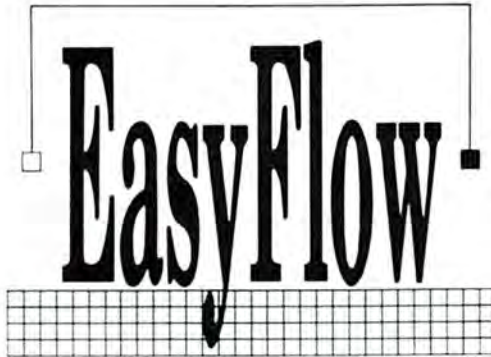

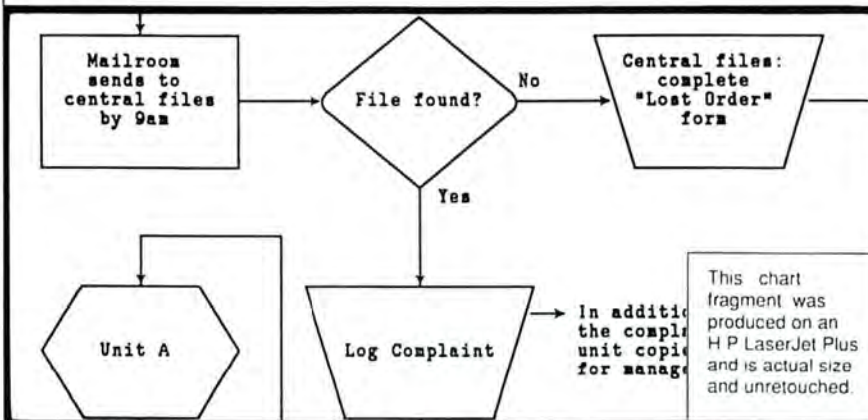

For all practical purposes, TRANS is the parent in both relations. But since the relation to PRODUCT is set while the CUSTOMER data base is selected, dBASE allows a second, more conventional relationship between TRANS and CUSTOMER.

Such trickery isn't needed in dBASE IV, Foxbase, FoxPro, or Clipper. Those programs allow multiple relations to be set in one command, as in SET RELATION TO ProdID INTO Product, TO CustID INTO Customer, making any of them a better tool for setting up relations.

Of course, people often rent more than one tool at a time, requiring a one-to-many relationship between TRANS and PRODUCT. But we'll save that discussion for another time. ●

Expert advice for creating high-impact documents and presentations

This month: Avoid the gray-page syndrome, and set custom page sizes with Ventura.

These days, if a business document lacks typeset-quality polish or graphics pizzazz, it simply won't be remembered—or even read. But if you're among those who are expected to churn out tantalizing newsletters, reports, and slides, you know how hard it is just to meet a deadline, let alone produce attractive output.

The purpose of *The Art of Persuasion* is to teach you how to produce compelling documents and presentations—in terms you won't need a graphic arts degree to understand. The tips and techniques presented here will

focus on popular desktop publishing applications like Xerox's *Ventura Publisher* and Aldus's *PageMaker*, as well as widely used presentation graphics packages such as Lotus's *Freelance*. But even if you use different software, the underlying design

principles should still apply.

In the months to come, we'll examine topics such as the proper use of fonts, scanning and manipulating graphics, formatting long documents, and handling type. We'll also provide tips for mastering business graphics,

NUTS & BOLTS

Customizing Page Size in Ventura

Like all desktop publishing programs, *Ventura Publisher* provides a standard selection of page sizes for producing different-sized documents. But you can also create custom page sizes using *Ventura*'s Sizing & Scaling option. This allows you to use the crop-marks feature to indicate where to trim pages. You can also print text or graphic elements that extend, or *bleed*, off the edge of the page—giving your document greater visual impact.

Here's how to create a customized 5.5-by-8.5-inch page size for use in a typical documentation binder. You'll reduce the size of the page frame (the printable area) and center it on an 8.5-by-11-inch page:

1. Open the Chapter menu and select the *Page size & layout* option. Make sure the document is set for a letter-sized (8.5-by-11-inch), double-sided format with portrait orientation.

2. Select *Frame* mode. Open

the *Frame* menu and choose *Sizing & scaling*.

3. Enter **05.50** inches for *Frame Width* and **08.50** inches for *Frame Height*.

4. To offset the page frame from the left side of the paper, enter **01.50** inches for *Upper Left X*. To offset it from the top, enter **01.25** inches for *Upper Left Y*. The page frame is now reduced to a 5.5-by-8.5-inch page and centered in the middle of the paper.

5. When you're ready to print the pages, select the *Print* option's *Crop marks: On* setting, and *Ventura* will print four sets of crop marks.

If you want to create a bleed effect, just move the frame that contains the graphics or text until it overlaps the edge of the 5.5-by-8.5-inch page. Or, you can use the *Graphic* mode's box-text tool to contain the overlapping text. In either case, any text or graphics that extend over the boundary of the reduced page will print to the edge. —R. J.

Getting Out the Gray

such as spicing up drab bar charts, using clip art effectively, and managing a successful slide show. This month's column starts off by showing how to use white space to make your documents more readable.

White Space: The Final Frontier

If you think of white space as little more than the blank area on a page, your documents may suffer from the notorious gray-page syndrome. But treat white space as an active part of good design, and you can make boring pages much more appealing and easier to read. White space is even more important with long, text-heavy reports that lack graphics or other elements to break up the page.

Often, desktop publishers hesitate to use white space because of the extra paper and printing costs. But if your document is so dense with ink that nobody

wants to read it, you've wasted even more money. When you place less text on each page, your document can be read faster—and the added white space

can take up surprisingly little room. Here are a few techniques for lightening up gray pages.

► Break long titles into two or three lines. This technique is also effective with *headers* and *footers* (information on the top and bottom of a page that identifies the page's contents).

► Insert at least one extra line space between *subheads* and the paragraphs below and above them (subheads are miniheadlines within a body of text). Usually, you'll want more space above than below.

► Add subheads to lengthy documents whenever possible.

► Add extra *leading* (vertical spacing) between lines of text. How much you add depends on the type family, type size, and publication style. As a rule of thumb, you should add 2 to 4 points to the type size. For example, most default formats use 10-point type with 12-point leading (10/12) or 12-point type on

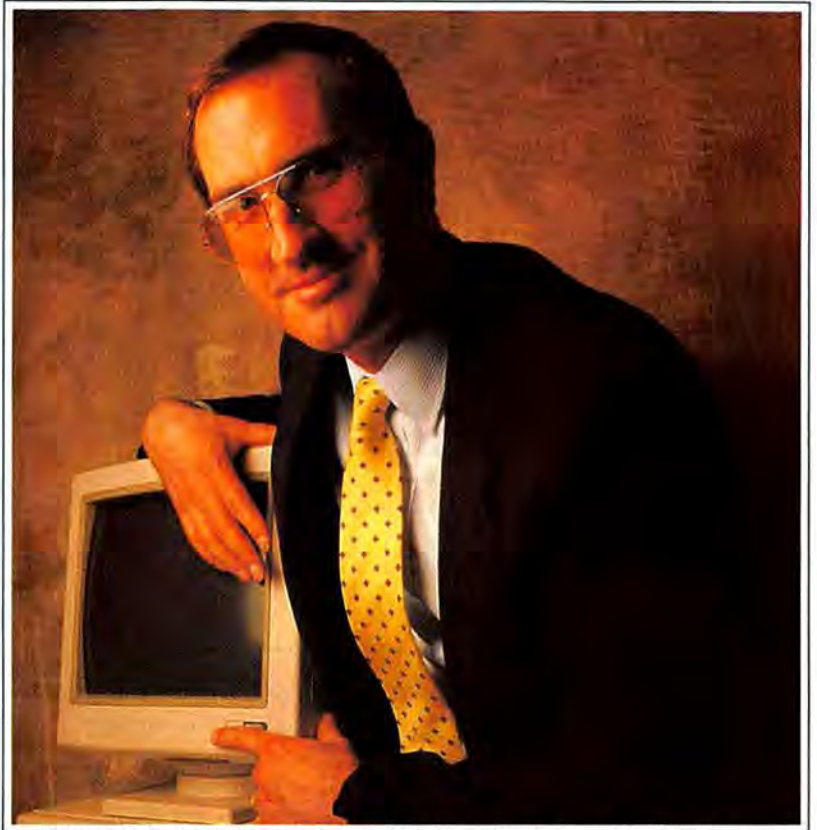

14-point leading (12/14). To add more white space, you can stretch that to 10/14 or 12/16.

► Use unjustified text (text with an uneven, "ragged right" edge) to add white space to the right side of the page.

► Use wider margins. With some documents, you can add $\frac{1}{8}$ inch to each margin without changing the page count. If document length is less important, you might widen the left margin to as much as 1.5 inches, as shown in **FIGURE 1**.

A wider margin is also an ideal place to put subheads, section numbers, graphics, and *pull quotes* (short text excerpts that emphasize key points in a document). In future columns, we'll explore those and other design techniques that increase the readability and impact of your documents. ●

Free Checking

Having grown tired of waiting for the ponderously slow CHKDSK to tell me how much free disk space and memory my PC had, I wrote a fast Pascal program, FREE.PAS [see LISTING 1], to display a similar report. It lists the percentage and size of

Because CHKDSK tests a
disk's integrity and can recover
lost clusters (groups of disk sec-
tors holding data but not linked
to any file), it runs more slowly
than FREE, which doesn't per-
form these extra duties. Also,
when reporting 'bytes used',
FREE includes space occupied
by directory information, user
files, and any lost clusters—
items that CHKDSK reports sep-
arately; therefore, the two pro-
grams may not produce identi-
cal reports in all cases.

Updating the Perfect Envelope

Among the utilities on the Pow-
erBase *.* disk that I received
when I subscribed to PC World
was a WordPerfect 4.2 macro for
printing envelopes. Because I
use WordPerfect 5.0, I needed to
update that macro before it
would work for me.

To re-create my version, re-
trieve or enter a letter into Doc 1
and insert two hard carriage re-
turns before and after the ad-
dress, which can have any num-
ber of lines. The salutation must
contain the word *Dear*. Next,
create the macro by entering the
keystrokes listed in FIGURE 1. To
run the macro, press <Alt>-E
while you have a letter on screen
and an envelope in the printer.
The macro has worked flawlessly
for me—I hope it will help other
WordPerfect users.

DEVELOPER'S TOOLBOX

Three Tools Are Better Than One

Is it true that all good things come in threes? Soon you can decide for yourself, when Borland releases *Turbo Debugger & Tools 2.0*. From the looks of an advance copy, this troika of debugging, analyzing, and optimizing accessories will be the unequaled productivity tool kit of the nineties.

The package's mainstay is a re-modeled *Turbo Debugger*, which now supports a mouse. Finally I can set program options and bring up, resize, and move *TD* windows simply by pointing, clicking, and dragging. I can also click on source-code lines to set breakpoints to halt a program so I can examine variables. I can still run *TD* from the keyboard, but using a mouse almost makes debugging fun!

On second thought, debugging is never fun—but it is less painful with *TD*'s new Traceback capability, which can run code in reverse. Traceback has a few limitations—for example, you can't step back through an interrupt call. Unlike *TD*'s macro recorder, the new keystroke-recorder option can save all keystrokes and mouse-click positions in a disk file. This lets you record debugging activity up to a perilous bug, then replay the action to just before Pauline tastes locomotive grease, so you can rescue your program in the nick of time and track down the villainous bug.

Other new features include resident, symbol-loading, and table-relocating commands that facilitate debugging TSRs and device drivers. In addition to the 80386 protected-mode support of earlier versions, *TD* now utilizes an 80286 system's extended memory.

The most intriguing tool is the new *Turbo Profiler 1.0*, a performance analyzer that Borland is billing as the world's first interactive profiler. *TPROF*, which has *TD*'s look, feel, and mouse

support, lets you monitor areas (modules, loops, and statements, for example) to locate code that performs most of a program's grunt work. Identifying that code and optimizing it with assembly language or improved algorithms lets you boost performance with a minimum of effort. *TPROF* can't optimize code for you, but it can show you where reprogramming will do the most good.

Both *TD* and *TPROF* can handle output from *Turbo C 2.0*, *Turbo Pascal 5.x*, and *Turbo Assembler* (all versions). An included utility program can convert Microsoft CodeView debugging information to *TD* format, so you can also use *TD* to debug Microsoft-language programs. You can even debug code from any compilers that create a MAP file of public symbols and line numbers.

Turbo Assembler 2.0 has also undergone a major spit and polish. Now an "n-pass" assembler, *TASM* can streamline jump instructions by stripping out NOP (no operation) placeholders inserted during previous passes. The *MASM*-

compatible *TASM* now supports 80486 instructions and features improved high-level-language interfacing.

With its three powerful programs, *Turbo Debugger & Tools* raises the art of software development to new heights. Don't hesitate to buy these tools!

Defined', press 1 (1Y in version 5.1) to replace the existing macro, or press 0 to start over with a letter other than E. If you press <Alt>-E to print an envelope but printing doesn't begin immediately, type <Shift>-<F7>4G—WordPerfect's print job Go command.

If you're using WordPerfect 5.1, you'll have to make one slight change: Line 14, '<Enter><Enter><Enter>,' requires two extra <Enter>s.

This is just one of many WordPerfect envelope macros floating around. You can find another—one that requires you to place the cursor at the start of the address—in the MACRO-.WPK file that comes with 5.0 and 5.1.

Passing the Time With BASIC

When choosing a command or a program, I prefer to pick the fastest one. So to help me measure the time that passes while

a command executes or the time I spend in an application, I developed a BASIC program, ELAPSED.BAS [see LISTING 2], and a batch file, TIMER.BAT [see LISTING 3]. To use them, type timer plus a command: for example, timer dir or timer quattro.

Editor's note: Change 'basica' in line 6 of TIMER.BAT to gwbasic if your version of DOS came with GW BASIC. Better yet, if you have QuickBASIC you can compile ELAPSED.BAS to improve performance and prevent the screen from clearing. If you compile the program, replace the sixth line of the batch file with elapsed and copy both files to a PATHed directory. The DOS utility programs MORE and FIND must also be in a PATHed directory.

SUB Standard

To create a standard way to list subdirectory names in a direc-

tory, I wrote SUB.BAT [see LISTING 4]. This batch file pipes DIR's output to the FIND filter twice—once to locate lines containing '<DIR>' and again to eliminate current (.) and parent directory (..) alias entries. The result is then piped to MORE, making a long listing pause until you press a key.

NETWORK Q & A

Tips and strategies for departmental networking

Bridging the gap between a PC network and a Macintosh LAN is easier than you think.

David Ferris

Q. Our CPA firm uses two kinds of desktop computers. The 5-person accounting staff works on PCs, and our 25 customer-service reps use Macintoshes. We'd like to connect the Macs and the PCs so the reps can enter billing information on their Macs and the processing can be done on the DOS side. How should we proceed?

A. Connecting Macs and PCs is easier than you think. But study the options before making a decision, because there are several ways to skin this cat—and some are a bit problematic.

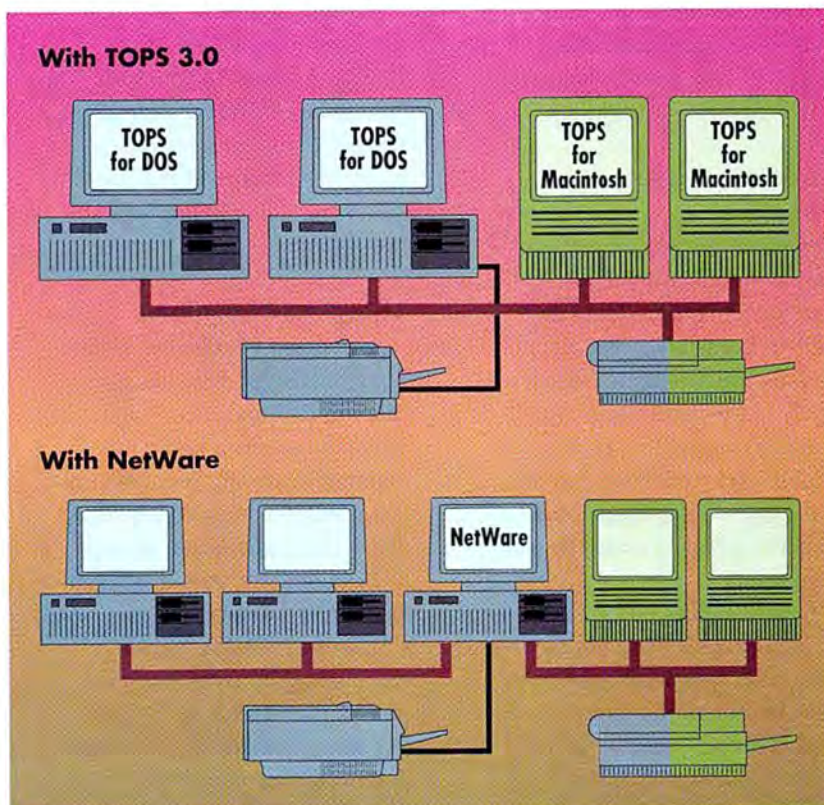
Connection, Please

The most important reason for forging a Mac-PC LAN connection is probably electronic mail: In many networked offices, E-mail is proving to be the single most important productivity tool on the LAN. But E-mail works only if everyone is on the net, re-

gardless of computer type.

File sharing across the Mac-PC barrier is a big plus. For example, advertising copy can be prepared on a PC using *Microsoft Word* and then sent to a designer who uses *PageMaker* on the Mac to format the text and

Connecting Macs and PCs



In the TOPS peer-to-peer LAN (at top), all workstations are connected by LocalTalk. A separate copy of TOPS is needed on each system. Both PCs and Macs can print to the LaserWriter (attached directly to the LocalTalk cable), but only PCs can print to the PC workstation's LaserJet.

add graphics. Or, as in your case, data from a Mac can be processed on a PC.

Some network operating systems (NOS's), like TOPS 3.0, and some applications, like *Foxbase*, let Mac and PC users access the same data file at once. Unfortunately, barring the use of unwieldy coprocessor boards or slow, expensive emulation software, there's no way to run Mac applications on a PC or vice versa.

Printer sharing is another benefit of Mac-PC connectivity. With the right network software and printer utilities, PCs can send output directly to networked Apple LaserWriter printers, taking advantage of their PostScript capabilities. (Going the other way—Mac data to PC printers—is trickier.)

Hardware and Software Strategies

As always, you'll need both hardware and software to make a Mac-PC connection. Macs have built-in LocalTalk ports, but unless you use a dedicated 3Com or NetFrame network server (both of which come with a built-in LocalTalk port), you'll need to install a special LocalTalk board in your PC server to make the Mac connection.

Once the Macs and PCs are linked physically, you can choose from a number of software solutions to cement the connection. If you need a server-based LAN for centralized backup and tighter security, NetWare version 2.15C (or later) includes support for Mac-PC integration without requiring you to run any extra software on the Mac or on the PC server. Dayna Communications offers a specially adapted

version of NetWare called DaynaNet that's optimized for easy installation on a mixed network. *3 + Share* also supports Mac connectivity, but it requires additional software on both the Macs and your PC server.

If you want a peer-to-peer Mac-PC solution, TOPS 3.0 (now bundled with the powerful *InBox* E-mail package) provides an easy-to-use, menu-driven interface and leaves you plenty of workstation RAM. The only disadvantage of TOPS is that you'll need to install a separate serialized copy on each PC and Mac. If you're not in a rush, you may wish to put off buying TOPS until Apple releases Mac System 7.0, due sometime in 1990. It's supposed to include most of TOPS's features, so you won't have to buy TOPS for your Macs. System 7.0 promises to link easily to a number of PC-side NOS's, including TOPS for DOS and NetWare.

Things to Consider

Application Platforms If you plan to transfer data files from Macs to PCs and back, you'll make things much easier for yourself if you buy "twinned" applications like *Microsoft Word*, *PageMaker*, and *Excel*, whose PC and Mac versions create compatible file formats.

If it isn't possible to use twinned applications, you may need a third-party utility that converts file formats across platforms. The current market leader is *MacLinkPlus* from Data-Viz. TOPS 3.0 comes with a similar application that converts most data files (such as those created in *1-2-3*, *WordPerfect*, and *dBASE*) to and from "foreign" formats quickly and effectively.

In the worst-case scenario,

you would need to find a common file format to bridge the Mac-PC gap. DCA-RFT format is best for documents, WKS is best for spreadsheets, and TIFF and EPS (Encapsulated PostScript) are best for graphics.

Naming Conventions File naming is much more flexible on a Mac than on a PC. Names can be up to 32 characters long, spaces are allowed, and uppercase and lowercase are differentiated, whereas DOS requires an 8-dot-3 format and no spaces. As a result, when you list the contents of a Mac folder (Apple's equivalent of a DOS subdirectory) on your PC, a Mac file called 'John Smith's Presentation' may display as 'JOHN_SMI.THS'. To make things easier, it's a good idea to ask all your Mac users to rename their "shareable" files (as well as all files you want to back up on a PC server) using the stricter PC format.

Printer Access Before you decide on a network software package, check how it handles printers. For example, TOPS lets PC users print on networked Mac printers, but not vice versa.

Architecture Choices At the moment, NetWare's approach to multiplatform integration is the most elegant one available, since all software required to translate between Mac and PC network protocols runs on the PC server. No special software is needed on the Macs, which means Mac users can simply use the Chooser to select a NetWare server just as they would an AppleShare server. *3 + Share*, on (continues)

the other hand, forces Mac users to run special 3Com software, which may conflict with Mac applications that expect to find standard Apple network software hooks (APIs). While TOPS also requires special Mac-side software, version 3.0 claims 100 percent support of Apple APIs. Its ability to run *Foxbase* provides convincing proof of this claim.

TAKING IT HOME

The practical guide to home/office computing

All quiet on the home front

Lawrence J. Magid

Until recently, I dreaded turning on my home PC. No, I don't mind working at home, but the unit I have is so noisy that I sometimes find it hard to think.

This complaint may seem niggling at first, but a noisy computer can really slow down your work flow. A noise level acceptable in a busy office can be bothersome at home—especially late at night when the kids are in bed and I'm catching up on work.

Computer noise has two sources: The main culprit is the fan on the power supply, followed by the hard disk. Virtually all standard PC power supplies are made in Asia with an eye toward economy rather than noise suppression. If you want quiet, you'll probably have to pay extra. But I've found a great, inexpensive line of power supplies: PC Power and Cooling's \$149 Silencer 220 for ATs and 386s, and the \$129 Silencer 150 for XT's.

As their names imply, these products generate 220 and 150 watts of power, respectively. Using larger fans that rotate at a slower speed than do the high-speed fans typical of most systems, the Silencer 220 and 150—36 decibels (db) and 40db, respectively—are 69 to 84 percent quieter than conventional power supplies. The Silencer 150 also keeps your machine 50 percent cooler than standard XT power supplies. (ATs already run that much cooler than XT's.)

Most users would consider 40db comfortable, says PC Power and Cooling president Doug Dobson. Installation is easy—I was able to replace my old power supply with the Silencer 220 in about 20 minutes.

As for hard disks, ask your dealer to check the data sheets. If decibel levels aren't listed, call the manufacturers. If they don't know, you may want to think twice about buying those brands. Of course, you could just ask the dealer to move the equipment into a quiet room or let you return the system if it proves too noisy.

Most hard drive noise is due to drive platters' speed of 3600 rpm. A newer 3½-inch drive is generally quieter than a 5¼-inch one because it has less rotating mass, and its bearings, case, and shock mounting are designed to cause less vibration.

You'll find a 20MB Seagate 225 in most XT's and a 40MB Seagate 251 in most AT's—both are 5¼-inch drives. Seagate claims

that the drives' sound levels are unrated but that its new 3½-inch ST1144 series is rated at 40db. The 3½-inch models cost about \$30 more. Another option is a Micropolis drive, rated at 42db. If your dealer won't install the drive of your choice, buy your machine without a hard disk and install one yourself. It's easy.

With time, some disk drives also begin to emit a high-pitched squeal, generally caused by the disk's static discharge wire. This tiny wire (or small metal tab) rests against the disk's spindle to draw off static electricity. You could lubricate the area around the wire with a little synthetic grease. (Do not use regular grease.) But since the disk must first be backed up and removed, I suggest asking your dealer or repair service to do it.

I haven't yet upgraded my hard disk, but I have made it less noisy by tightening the chassis screws and placing a foam pad between the monitor and the system unit. I also moved my office from a spare bedroom to a quieter area of the house. So, all's quiet on the home front now—except when my 3-year-old visits my office. ●
