For Associate Editor Michael Goodwin, the editor of this month's cover story on SX notebooks, portable computing suddenly became, as he puts it, "a lifeline." Mike was scheduled to write the notebook article himself. But last winter a motorcycle accident left him in the hospital for a month with a badly injured foot. One of the first things Mike asked for (after a plea for some noninstitutional food) was—you guessed it—his laptop.

A true PC addict, Mike says he felt immensely better as soon as he managed to set up the laptop and log on to E-mail. Back at the office, we were reassured to hear from Mike about his recovery and sent back many messages of encouragement.

With Mike still recuperating, we turned to longtime contributing editor TJ Byers, who gamely stepped in at the last minute to write the roundup. TJ comes from a hard-core electronics engineering background (in the mid-1960s, TJ was a junior engineer on NASA's Surveyor project). However, both editors take the user's view when it comes to evaluating hardware.

TJ has no problem turning a laptop inside out to see what makes it tick, right down to the component level. But with all of today's cutting-edge notebooks offering enough performance, memory capacity, and hard disk storage for even *Windows* applications, TJ believes the most important buying criterion is simple: "It just has to feel right. By that, I mean the keyboard and the screen." Mike agrees, with the accent on the keyboard; the closer a laptop keyboard comes to desktop-style layout, the happier Mike gets.

Laptop Lifeline

Both editors also put service and support high on the list. According to TJ, on-site service isn't as vital with notebooks as it is with desktop PCs because "there's nothing a repairperson can fix." All the vendors offer a better alternative: "If something fails, you can call the company, give them your credit card number, and they'll overnight you a new system. Most companies will also try to recover data off the failed system when you send it back."

The Zeos Notebook 386, the sleek black notebook on our cover, offered the best balance of feel, service, price, and performance, earning it a Best Buy. Still, TJ has a wish list for future notebooks and some pretty shrewd predictions of what's to come.

"One thing I'd like to see is a standard notebook expansion slot," says TJ. "For notebooks to really replace desktops, you need a wide selection of boards so you can add special capabilities when you need them." And of course, there's color. "It'll be a while before you get color in a battery-powered notebook. The color display's power consumption is just too high."

Engineers are already working on this problem, TJ says, reducing power requirements overall by consolidating as many components as possible onto a single chip. This new level of integration will also provide greater reliability—and even lighter, thinner notebooks, which will probably arrive late this year. As TJ says, "The more mobility the better."



Multiple Master technology gives graphic artists new opportunities and saves disk space because a single font can generate a huge range of type. It also solves nagging problems like the worksheet or letter that doesn't quite fit on one

page—you can condense or expand type to fit the space without lowering type quality.

But the biggest benefit, says Adobe chairman John Warnock, is that users who may not have fonts in common will be able to share documents. With Multiple Master support, your software can automatically generate a compatible font, so the document a co-worker sends you prints out correctly the first time. Publishing maven Jonathan Seybold calls Multiple Masters a "landmark" in typography.

Although Apple and Microsoft haven't announced a similar capability for their rival TrueType technology planned for *Windows 3.1* this fall, analysts expect it. Adobe's technology "is pretty cool," says Dennis Adler, manager of Microsoft's effort. "We can see how this can be done in True-Type, although I don't envision [it] coming out really soon."

TANDY SHOWS CHEAP CD ROM

Boost to Multimedia



Tandy Corporation has announced the first low-priced

CD ROM drive that meets the basic Multimedia PC requirements established last year. Unveiled in March, the Tandy CDR-1000 lists for just \$399.95. The low price and fast data transfer speed make the drive significant, says Nick Arnett, chief analyst for Multimedia Computing. "Tandy will be a leader in setting the pricing of future products," predicts Arnett.

While the internal drive has a relatively slow seek time, it has a sustained data transfer rate of 150KB per secondroughly twice the effective transfer rate of comparably priced drives. That's particularly important when dealing with storage-hungry data types such as audio, video, and animation. Correctly structured applications that reduce seeks among data tracks will be able to take advantage of the fast transfer rate of the low-priced platform, says Radio Shack's Ed Juge.

Cheap CD ROM drives are critical to getting multimedia computing off the ground, and a raft of new drives is sure to follow the Tandy announcement, predicts Arnett. Several hardware and software products have been held up by delays in the release of Microsoft's multimedia extensions to Windows 3.0, which provide the software foundation for Multimedia PCs and are not expected out until the middle of the year. "We'll see a significant number of announcements once the extensions ship," says Arnett.

MICROSOFT BUYS E-MAIL

Consumers Software Fills a Strategic Need

Microsoft has filled one of the last major gaps in the industry's broadest application line by acquiring the assets of Consumers Software, maker of the electronic-mail package *The Network Courier*.

The software giant takes over *Network Courier* versions for DOS, *Windows*, OS/2, and Macintosh networks. Microsoft will evolve an integrated client-server architecture that emphasizes X.400 services on PC servers and *Windows* on workstations and merge in *Microsoft Mail* for the Macintosh.

A Windows version of The Network Courier 2.1, ex-

pected in April under the Microsoft label, will help Microsoft push its Windows line as an integrated suite, notes office systems vice president Jeff Raikes. Then the technology will be broadened to perform other functions in "mail-enabled" applications. "People have used mail to send messages between users," says Raikes. "Ultimately it will be a store-and-forward mechanism for moving objects between systems."

The deal comes hard on the heels of Lotus's acquisition of E-mail leader cc:Mail and is applauded for many of the same reasons. International Data Corporation analyst David Atlas says Consumers'

technology and Microsoft's marketing presence make a good combination for capitalizing on a large market opportunity: IDC predicts the world's 3.7 million LAN E-mail boxes will skyrocket to 47 million by 1995. "Messaging will be part of almost everything you need to do," predicts Eric Arnum, editor of the Electronic Mail and Micro Systems newsletter.

As demands for capabilities like image handling and fax gateways expand, "the independent suppliers with 15 programmers will be hard-pressed to keep up," adds Arnum. "Lotus and Microsoft have the staff and the willingness to do everything." Small suppliers also lack presence in international markets, where Lotus and Microsoft will lock horns this year.

HP, Lotus Team Up on New Product Type



H e w l e t t -Packard's Corvallis, Oregonbased calcula-

tor division and Lotus Development are reportedly planning the late April introduction of a new class of PC—one occupying the ground between pocket organizers like the Sharp Wizard and notebook PCs. Although not much larger than a Wizard and relying on the same solid-state storage and memory, the new product, code-named Jaguar, is said to be far more capable.

The DOS-compatible PC is based on an NEC processor running about two and a half times as fast as an XT. Jaguar is expected to sell for under \$800 and will come equipped with the new DOS 3.22 as well as with 1-2-3 and a Lotus-designed set of desktop utilities in ROM.

Sources familiar with the product say this 11-ounce PC has a slightly smaller, sleeker profile than Poqet Computer's Poqet PC, plus a similar non-backlit, 40-character display and QWERTY keyboard. Like

the Poqet, Jaguar folds up to fit in a suit coat or purse and provides more than 60 hours of operation on two penlight batteries.

However, Jaguar is not meant to be a laptop replacement, as the Poqet was originally billed. Instead, it is intended for executives, managers, and salespeople who may need to download and alter a spreadsheet or report during a meeting or sales call and to keep up with their E-mail on the go. Jaguar is expected to gain impetus from the in-

stalled base of 14 million *1-2-3* users, whose ranks are increasing at the pace of 100,000 a month.

Meanwhile, Poqet director of marketing/communications Jerry Purdy reports that this is precisely the market into which the Poqet PC has migrated during the past year and that agreement among vendors on solid-state storage media standards has significantly increased the availability of low-cost storage and ROM applications for this class of machine.

COMPAQ SUES DELL OVER ADS

Texas PC Leaders Start Shoot-Out in U.K. Corral



s it valid to compare the price of a mailorder PC with

the list price of one sold through dealers? That's one of the issues to be aired in a United Kingdom lawsuit that Houston-based Compaq Computer has filed against rival Dell Computer of Austin.

Compaq claims Dell's ads in U.K. journals are "deceptive and misleading." A similar U.S. ad describes a \$3899 Dell 325D as "top of the mark" while calling the comparably configured Compaq Deskpro 386/25 next to it "top of the mark-ups." But Dell quotes a \$7499 list price for the Deskpro, complains Compaq spokesman John Sweney, when it knows dealers always sell for a lot less. (International Data Corporation's PC street price survey shows discounts of up to 42 percent on Compag models-before customers begin haggling.)

Such broad comparisons overlook many Compaq features and engineering pluses, says Sweney, who adds that businesses willingly pay more for a Deskpro because of Compaq's reputation for compatibility, reliability, and service.

Dell CEO Michael Dell defends the ads, noting that computer press reviews find Dell's lower-priced products "equivalent and often superior in overall performance, quality, reliability, and customer satisfaction. We find it interesting that Compaq has chosen to file a claim only now, when we have become larger, more successful, and apparently more of a competitive threat."

With 1990 sales of \$546.2 million, Dell has become one of the most successful PC suppliers in any channel. The \$3.6 billion Compaq is not threatened, but analysts give Dell ads partial credit for Compaq's decision to provide direct service to end users.

At press time, Compaq had not yet filed U.S. charges, but there are precedents for it under U.S. law, says Esther Roditti Schachter, a New York computer law specialist.

IS MICROSOFT PLAYING FAIR?

Cooperation Between Systems, Applications Divisions Draws Complaints From Developers



Microsoft is being investigated by the Federal Trade

Commission for possible antitrust violations, although the FTC has not yet released the bill of particulars.

Microsoft believes the investigation is an outgrowth of a November 1989 press release about an agreement between the Redmond, Washington, software giant and IBM to limit the utility of Windows in order to differentiate between uses of DOS/Windows and OS/2, IBM's favored systems solution. If that is true, the investigation will close quickly because Windows has been a runaway success and OS/2, to date, a dismal failure.

But developers say they hope the FTC is looking into the close cooperation between the Microsoft Systems and Applications Divisions. They allege that Microsoft uses its virtual system software monopoly to advance its applications sales at the expense of its competitors and system clients.

Developers asked for anonymity because of their nearly

complete reliance on Microsoft for system software direction and assistance, but they provide a litany of complaints about advantages enjoyed by Microsoft Applications. Most proceed, say these competitors, from Microsoft's habit of developing what ostensibly are systems advances such as OLE (Object Linking and Embedding) in the Applications Division, hard-coding them into Microsoft applications, and then releasing the specs to its systems clients too late for them to bring their own applications to market in the same time frame as, say, Microsoft Word or Excel.

"Somehow there seems to be a strong synchronization between what their system group proposes and what their application group is about to announce," complains one large developer. "Is the end user served by negative competition of that sort?" asks another. "Does that generate innovation or slow innovation?"

The competitive imbalance grows keener, say developers, as they are forced to give up on OS/2 and sign onto Microsoft's DOS/Windows alternative.



Multimedia: What's It Good For?

That's a question a lot of software developers are asking themselves these days. The answer may surprise you.

s the best PC program a generalpurpose tool that users can adapt to their own needs, or is it a targeted business solution that gets a specific job done right?

If you've ever debated this point with a friend, you already know the answer. While specialized solutions like custom accounting or order entry can give you the information you need to keep your business humming, it's general-purpose tools like word processors and spreadsheets that turn people into PC lovalists.

Trouble is, general-purpose tools take too much effort to learn and provide too little help in cracking specific business problems. As a result, many people never really master the tools, while others never pick them up at all.

Software industry guru David Liddle terms this problem the "software sandbar": too few users stranded with the same old programs. Liddle, who heads IBM's new Patriot Partners software project, jokes that while users struggle to master the PC's "Big Four" categories—word processors and spreadsheets, spreadsheets and word processors—they're missing out on applications that could unleash their business creativity.

What we need is a new kind of PC

software that combines the business knowledge contained in most custom applications with the power of general-purpose tools. Liddle and others in the software development community are banking on a host of new technologies to help forge this link between business knowledge and PC power, making it possible at last for users to push off the software sandbar under their own

steam. Prominent among these new technologies is multimedia, which brings sound, animation, and vast volumes of information to your PC (see "Multimedia Gets Down to Business").

Multimedia: Off the Software Sandbar

Most software in the first wave of multimedia falls into one or the other of two broad categories: huge reference data bases of information geared to specific professions, and training materials. While multimedia might end up spawning its own "Big Four" applications—reference and training, training and reference—developers are hard at work figuring out innovative ways to harness its special capabilities.

You won't find many real-life examples of breakthrough multimedia business programs today, but entertainment programs like SimEarth from Maxis demonstrate what's possible. SimEarth lets you build your own planet, using information stored in its earth-science data base plus a Windows-like interface with a rotating globe and sound effects that show you the impact of your choices. Imagine if the program were instead called SimBudget, and it led you through the process of building a five-year plan!

Wanted: Multimedia for Everybody

If multimedia is going to turn everyone's PC into the ultimate smart machine, then some things are going to have to change pretty quick. First, everyday software will have to develop multimedia talents. Imagine how nice it would be if voice messages or moving images were a natural part of any computer document, whether produced with a word processor, a spreadsheet, or a business graphics package. Windows programs will pick up this capability for free when a multimedia version of that environment appears later this year.

More important, developers are going to have to start building software with multimedia in mind. If your spreadsheet had the knowledge to help you build bulletproof budgets, then you'd probably turn everyone in your office (continues)

into a budgeteer. Likewise, if your E-mail package could handle your voice mail, too, then you'd probably spend less time transcribing messages and more time acting on them.

Multimedia's no silver bullet for all that ails PC software. But it can shift the balance of computing power toward the center of the PC universe, away from the opposite poles of canned, inflexible solutions and broad, unwieldy tools.

PCs Into Plowshares

Now for the bad news: As you may have guessed, tomorrow's multimedia software is not likely to run on yesterday's XTs or ATs. Nor does it really make sense to push those obsolete computers down the organizational chart, onto the desks of secretaries and clerical workers who should also have access to multimedia. To take advantage of this new technology, they're going to need at least VGA-equipped 386SX PCs.

If you wonder what to do with all the underpowered iron that'll be lying around your office, International Data Group, *PC World*'s parent company, has an answer for you. Recently IDG established the East-West Education Development Foundation to place old PCs in the hands of students in Eastern Bloc countries. Font Reaction

After reading your January review "Easy Fonts for Great-Looking Documents," I purchased Atech's *Publisher's Powerpak* for evaluation. When used with *Word 5.0*, the program doesn't support box shading and line drawing. This greatly reduces the value of the package for producing fliers or newsletters, and I don't use 30-point typefaces in my general correspondence.

Mr. Middaugh is correct: Powerpak won't work with Word's box and line drawing functions, which can be a problem if you produce fliers and newsletters with Word. Still, Powerpak is the only program that produces onthe-fly printer fonts for Word, and given its low price, we still consider it a Best Buy. —George Campbell

Corrections and Clarifications

Our January fonts review ("Easy Fonts for Great-Looking Documents") states that ZSoft's *SoftType* has slower print speeds than *Adobe Type Manager* and can't accept third-party font outlines. Subsequent testing showed that *SoftType* was significantly faster than *ATM* in printing long documents and can in fact accept a variety of fonts from other vendors. *PC World* regrets the errors.

Products like SoftType are designed for different purposes than on-the-fly font scalers like ATM. With SoftType you can design your own typefaces and export font outlines for use with ATM. The trade-off is that you must create fonts ahead of time and store them on disk—consuming a considerable amount of time and disk space. For example, creating one typeface in four styles and seven sizes required 15 minutes and 1.5MB. If you later decide you need additional fonts, you must switch from your current Windows application to SoftType, create the fonts, then switch back to your application to use them. Most users will find it simpler to use an on-the-fly program, but SoftType offers impressive tools for power users who need a variety of fonts and want to customize their own.

Our February *Product Outlook* item on Microrim's *Personal R:base* contained a misleading statement about its application compatibility. Applications generated by both *Personal R:base* and *Professional R:base 3.1* are fully cross-

compatible, but programs and data files generated by prior versions of *R:base* are not compatible with either program. *PC World* regrets any misunderstanding. Call Microrim at 206/649-9500 for information on conversion programs.







Run Windows on 386SX systems, take a laptop overseas, modify a blinking cursor, install print spoolers for both your printers, find out how much video display memory you have, derive the last day of the month with 1-2-3 and Quattro, and easily copy high-density disks with a single drive.

SX Versus DX for Windows

Q. A salesperson told me that a 386SX will run Windows 3.0 but that you need a 386DX [the full-powered 80386] to transfer data between programs. He said this is because data transfer requires the DX's 32-bit external data bus, and the SX has only a 16-bit bus. Is this true?

Donny Kennedy Wauwatosa, Wisconsin

A. You'd better look for a less imaginative salesperson. *Windows* runs just fine on systems based on either proces-

sor. Internally, both 386 CPU chips are the same, and any software that runs on one will run on the other. In fact, an SX and a DX running at the same speed (16 MHz or 20 MHz) perform all their internal functions at the same speed.

The only scrap of truth in his spiel is that the 386DX's external data path is 32 bits wide, while the 386SX's is only 16. That means a DX-based computer (that is, one with a 32-bit memory bus) can transfer data to and from memory—and sometimes to and from the hard disk and other peripherals—twice as fast as would an identically configured SX system. When you, or Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) links, move or copy data between programs in Windows, it's transferred from one place in memory to another. For that reason, data transfer between programs is slower on an SX-based system, but it's not impossible.

Because both processing and data transfer speeds affect a computer's performance, DX-based systems are faster than SX-based systems of the same clock rate. Also, manufacturers often use slightly slower hard disks in SX systems, which contributes to the DX-based system's performance edge.

Transferring data 32 bits at a time to and from 32-bit *peripherals*—such as those you might use in a 32-bit EISA or Micro Channel architecture expansion bus—does require a 386DX (and/or the rarely incorporated 32-bit DMA chips), but such transfers are not of much significance for a single-user system (though they might be for a network server).

International Laptop

Q. I'm taking my laptop with me on a European trip and want to recharge it

using 220-volt outlets. I own one kit that converts European current for hair dryers and another that I've used for camera equipment. Would either of these be suitable?

Albert Winson Vista, California

A. Probably not. The small solid-state converters designed for blow dryers and other small appliances don't step 220-volt power down to the 110 volts your laptop needs. Instead, they cut off the first and third quarter of the alternating current's sine wave. The resulting current is halved—but the peak voltage isn't reduced. The high peak voltage doesn't bother a travel iron's heating element or an electric shaver's motor, but it will zap a laptop's (or any solid-state device's) sensitive circuits.

The only laptops that can safely use solid-state converters are those that, instead of plugging directly into the wall, use removable batteries and an external charger. The batteries and charger won't be bothered by the higher peak voltage.

Other laptops require a stepdown transformer, which consists of two intermingled coils of wire, making it larger, heavier, and more expensive than its solid-state cousin. If your laptop has an external power supply, there may be another alternative: Most major laptop manufacturers offer 220-volt or dual-voltage power supplies.

Stop That Blinking Cursor

Q. Do you know of any utilities or a DEBUG procedure that stops the cursor from blinking?

Christopher Kocks Niles, Michigan (continues) A. There are numerous utilities that change the size and shape of the cursor (including CURSOR.COM, which comes with *WordPerfect*, and the *Norton Utilities*' Control Center). But there's no way to stop the cursor from blinking; that's set in hardware. Video board manufacturers can't change their hardware to permit a nonblinking cursor, as it would limit their boards' compatibility with the IBM PC standard.

Multiple Print Caches

Q. I've got two printers attached to my computer: for bills, a daisy wheel attached to the serial port, and for accounts receivable reports, a dot matrix attached to the parallel port. I have a print-spooler utility, but when I try to print to both printers simultaneously, jobs go to the wrong printer or switch back and forth unpredictably. Can you help me?

Bernard D. Sommers Maitland, Florida **A.** We haven't seen any single-user print spoolers that can handle two print queues. Most won't even let you load the program a second time with different settings. Two that do are *PrintCache* (formerly *LaserTorq*) from LaserTools and *PC-Kwik Power Pak* from Multisoft. Both companies' telephone support personnel are experienced at helping users set up exactly the kind of configuration you describe.



Display Memory Readout

Q. I recently purchased a 386 clone with a super-VGA video board. My invoice shows 512K of video RAM, but Norton Utilities 5.0's System Information utility reports only 256K installed. The salesperson who sold me the system says that DOS can recognize only 256K. Is this true?

Carl Gussgard Fremont, California

A. Actually, DOS can't tell display memory from normal memory; it depends on a routine in the system's BIOS to report the amount of display memory. The 256K limit comes from IBM's EGA board, on which IBM's VGA and its clones are all based. Because the EGA board holds a maximum of 256K of display memory, there's no standard way for a program to find out whether your VGA board has more than 256K RAM. 



NETWORK Q&A

Advice for Local Area Network Administrators With Microsoft Windows Workstations

Keith Nickerson

Q. What's the bottom line on using Windows' swap files on a network? I've been given conflicting advice. It seems that a permanent swap file can be set up on a local hard disk, but what about diskless workstations? And what's the difference between a permanent swap file and a temporary swap file?

A. Windows' swap files do indeed offer a bit of a challenge for LAN administrators. When you're running Windows 3.0 in 386-enhanced mode and get low on memory, Windows can swap currently unused information from memory to a swap file on your hard disk, swapping it back to memory later, when it's needed. (You can run Windows in 386-enhanced mode only on 386 and 486 systems with at least 2MB of RAM.)

A permanent swap file remains on your local hard disk until removed (you cannot set up a permanent swap file on a RAM disk or a network drive). You create, change the size of, and remove a permanent swap file using Windows' Swapfile utility: Start Windows at the DOS prompt with win/r to force it into Real mode, select File Run, and enter swapfile; program help screens clearly explain the rest of the process. Because permanent swap files aren't fragmented, they're faster than temporary ones, but they take up disk space even when you're not running Windows.

If you don't have a permanent swap file, Windows automatically creates a temporary one in your \WINDOWS directory when you start the program in 386-enhanced mode. (It's deleted when you properly exit Windows.) That's fine if you're running Windows off a local hard disk, but if you're running a shared copy of Windows off a server, the swap

file is created on the network drive; accessing it increases traffic over your network wire, diminishing overall network performance. To avoid this degradation, you must reconfigure *Windows* to force the swap file to the local hard disk. The easiest way is to add <code>PagingDrive=c:</code> on a line by itself under the [386Enh] section of SYSTEM.INI.

When running Windows on a workstation without a hard disk, you must disable the swap file entirely by adding Paging=no on a line by itself under the [386Enh] section of SYSTEM.INI. Windows will no longer be able to free up memory by swapping and will be limited to whatever physical memory exists on that machine. If the system doesn't have enough memory to run your Windows programs without swapping to disk, your only option is to add more memory or a hard disk.

Q. Our network users run Windows at their workstations, and this setup is proving to be advantageous. They no longer have to deal with DOS to run their programs; they simply double-click the appropriate icon.

My problem is that for administrative purposes, I need to move an application on our LAN to a different directory. How can I do this without having to modify (via Program Manager's File Properties command) the command line associated with that application's icon for every user?

A. The best way to avoid that tedious task is with a shared program group (GRP) file. A GRP file contains the command lines, along with other information, for the icons in a given Program Manager group. After moving the application in question to its new network directory, create a master program group containing that and any other

shared application you want to include. Move the resulting GRP file to a sub-directory on your file server, flag it "Shareable Read-Only," and give only yourself Modify rights to the directory. Then edit the [Groups] section of the users' PROGMAN.INI files to reference the shared GRP file(s). FIGURE 1 shows an example of how the result might look for a network with four shared groups.


Note that workstations with different video modes may not be able to share Program Manager GRP files. If your network has some systems with EGA boards and others with VGA boards, for instance, you'll need to maintain two sets of GRP files.

Another inconvenience to the shared GRP files approach is that all users see the same icons in that program group. If you limit some users to certain applications, they may be confused by the appearance of icons for programs they can't run. You can get around this by creating GRP files for work groups or classes of employees and adding them only to the appropriate users' shared PROGMAN.INI files.



Monitors and radiation: New units offer lower emissions, but research issue goes unaddressed

potential carcinogenic effects of extremely-low-frequency (ELF) emissions (see the figure "Toward Even Safer Monitors"). The current crop of low-emissions monitors do not meet these guidelines, but most makers say future units will comply.

But "the real issue has never been properly addressed," cautions Louis Slesin, editor and publisher of *VDT News*, referring to the lack of definitive research into whether VDTs' ELF emissions pose a serious health risk. He argues that the new low-emissions monitors may even serve to further delay a detailed review of the issue.

Despite the lack of information, many manufacturers believe it makes good business sense to provide low-emissions monitors. "It gives people a choice," says Pam Himmell, NEC product manager. In the future, Himmell predicts, lowemissions modifications will be "just another item on a features checklist."

IBM was first to introduce a lowemissions color monitor in the United States: the 8515 Color Display. Since then a host of other manufacturers have followed suit, among them NEC, American Mitac, and Qume (see the table "Your Low-Emissions Choices").

A Good First Step


New Choices in Low-Emissions Color Monitors

Responding to users' growing concern about the potential health hazards associated with video display terminals (VDTs), several leading manufacturers have introduced low-emissions versions of their popular PC monitors.

When Consumer Watch last reported on low-frequency electromagnetic monitor emissions (December 1990), only one manufacturer offered a general-purpose low-emissions unit. Today consumers can choose from a variety of monitors that often cost only slightly more than unmodified units.

The new units support the initial reduced-emissions requirement established in Sweden, covering very-low-frequency (VLF) emissions. The Swedish standards were recently expanded in response to growing concern about the

Toward Even Safer Monitors



The current crop of low-emissions monitors comply with the original safety guidelines for very-low-frequency (VLF) magnetic emissions established by the Swedish National Board for Measurement and Testing (MPR) in 1988 (red bar). This year MPR will release a new and more stringent set of guidelines that also covers extremely-low-frequency (ELF) emissions.

IBM PS/1

Because the PS/1 system starts from ROM, it fails to recognize changes that software applications make during installation to the CONFIG.SYS and AU-TOEXEC.BAT files on your hard disk. To correct the problem, go to the DOS shell's 'Customize How System Starts' menu, and select the option that tells the system to read both files from disk rather than from ROM. If software still won't install correctly, choose the option that requires the system to boot from disk at all times, and reinstall that software. Then restart the system to boot from ROM. Additional information is available through the PS/1 Users' Club on Prodigy.

IBM PS/2 8513 Display

Models of the 8513 12-inch color monitor manufactured before 1988 have been found to gradually lose their ability to focus. The problem makes itself known over time; the more frequently the monitor is used, the sooner the defect will be encountered. (Some users may not have noticed the problem because their eyes adjust to the out-of-focus display.) Owners of 8513 units that cannot be made to focus properly can receive a new unit free of charge from IBM.

studies, the roughly 50 million current users of VDTs in the U.S. are still left hanging as to the real dangers posed by sitting in front of a display.

"The good news is that [we'll soon] have low-ELF terminals," Slesin says. "The bad news is that we still don't know the risk ELF poses."

Compatibility Problem Leads to Finger Pointing

Several months ago I purchased an Intel 287XL math coprocessor for my 20MHz Dell System 220 computer. Intel claimed the chip would work in any 286based computer up to and including 20-MHz systems. Prior to purchasing the chip, I called Dell technical support. They said they saw no reason why the chip would not work but added that they had not installed one in a System 220.

After I installed the chip, Intel and Dell diagnostics revealed that it would not perform long division correctly. Dell's technical support recommended I install Intel's 80287-10 math coprocessor instead. Intel, however, claims the (continues)



287XL is 50 percent faster than the 80287-10, and I want the extra speed. Intel's support was only slightly more helpful.

It seems as though my inquiries have yielded nothing more useful than a lot of finger pointing. Perhaps you can help.

Editor's note: We contacted Intel and Dell about Mr. Solot's problem. Here's what we found out: Some early Chips and Technologies chip sets (governing interface I/O and memory) caused incompatibilities when used in conjunction with some high-speed 286 systems (12 MHz and above). The problem was identified early on by C&T and has been corrected. Early-model high-speed 286-based systems, however, could have the faulty chip set that causes compatibility problems.

Dell has changed the design of the System 220 to incorporate the new C&T chip set. The company has also replaced Mr. Solot's system board to correct the incompatibility. According to Dell representative Lisa Rohlf, the problem affects only System 220s with system boards classified as earlier than "A12." Customers experiencing compatibility troubles will receive a new system board free of charge if the computer is still under warranty. If the warranty period has expired, customers will be required to pay only an installation cost of roughly \$60.

Intel offters a diagnostic program that identifies compatibility problems between system boards and math coprocessors. The program can be obtained by dialing in to the BBS at 503/645-6275 (8 bit, 1 stop bit, no parity). The math coprocessor test contains two files: CHKCOP.EXE and a READ-ME file. The diagnostics program is also included with the 287XL.





The Keyboard Was the Culprit

My problem concerns a 386 file server running Novell's NetWare 286 version 2.12. I have three 286 workstations and also use the server as a workstation.

Initially, the system worked very well and actually exceeded expectations, but I have since had problems with the server's keyboard. The current problem (sluggish response, erratic keystrokes, and blinking keyboard lights) isn't apparent at the DOS level or in the console command mode of NetWare ELS. The server keyboard is the only one affected, and then only while an application is

loaded and running.

My dealer claims the problem lies with Novell's software since it occurs only when NetWare is loaded. Novell's response (after being contacted directly) was to send me back to my dealer.

bought a complete package from his dealer that included NetWare and some PCs that the dealer assembles and resells. But because of the way nondedicated NetWare (where the server can also be used as a workstation) handles interrupts, some clone keyboards do not function properly in this environment. We have provided Mr. Mootsey with information on a company, NMB Technologies, that sells keyboards certified by Novell to run in nondedicated mode.

We strongly suggest that dealers concentrate on products that are Novell certified to simplify ongoing support. Novell will support NetWare on any platform, but if the problem is hardware related and the hardware is not Novell certified, the responsibility falls on the dealer to work with the hardware manufacturer to resolve the problem.

Mr. Mootsey's dealer has chosen to resell computers that have not been certified by Novell and so has taken risks from a support standpoint.





Does It Make Sense to Rent a PC?

Take a quick look through the yellow pages of your local telephone directory or the business section of any major metropolitan newspaper, and you'll find dozens of advertisements for PC rentals. Companies are springing up daily to meet the short-term computing demands of businesses and individuals. But why rent when the cost of even name-brand systems is relatively low, stretched out over five years?

It's a matter of simple economics, say executives from nationwide PC rental companies and business managers who've opted for this solution. As corporate budgets get tighter and companies cut back on capital expenditures, renting PCs can be more cost-effective than purchasing a system outright—if you need the hardware on a short-term basis.

A Compaq Deskpro 386/25, for example, has a suggested retail price of \$8999 when equipped with a 110MB hard drive and 1MB of RAM (memory expansion units are sold separately). You can rent a comparable unit for around \$600 per month (prices will vary depending on location). Although you won't get the tax advantages of depreciating the equipment over five years, you also don't have to struggle with getting approval for a major expenditure, and you can write off the rental price as a business expense.

Flexibility is a key issue when renting equipment. You can obtain hardware within 24 hours to meet any short-term or eleventh-hour need: peak work loads, temporary staffing changes, or delays in getting your own equipment repaired. Systems arrive preconfigured and ready to run. Rental agreements typically include complete service, including technical

support and 24-hour product replacement should equipment fail. Some national firms, such as Businessland Rents, will even set up small networks and send an on-site technician to handle any problems (for a fee, of course).

Most national PC rental companies stock just about every type of hardware—from desktop and laptop computers to monitors, printers, plotters, and high-speed modems. Rentals are available for daily, weekly, or monthly use and can include from one to several dozen units. Many firms deal only in top-of-the-line equipment, although systems and peripherals from second-tier companies are usually available.

Product availability, price, and service vary among rental companies, so shop for the best deal, just as when buying PC hardware. Some companies build systems to order, while others are limited by the configurations they have in stock. In general, nation-

al firms with large inventories are better equipped to handle custom configurations or unusual orders, but don't rule out local firms. Competition is tight, and they may be more willing to negotiate rental terms than their larger competitors.





How Far Can Excel Ride Windows?

Spreadsheet Clash Improves User Choices

Lotus Users Stick by 1-2-3 but Await Windows Version



Lotus will lose customers unless it ships its Windows spreadsheet soon, warns Home Mutual Life's Howard Brenner.

Putting its muscle behind the impressive Excel 3.0, Microsoft has kicked off another intense round of competition in spreadsheets—a contest that's already giving users lower prices, cheap upgrades, and free add-ins.

Chairman Bill Gates declares that *Excel 3.0* will ensure Microsoft's dominance in *Windows* spreadsheets this year despite upcoming entries from Lotus and Borland, and he cheerfully predicts that a majority of new PCs will be running the graphical environment by year-end. To help that along, he is offering *Excel* for \$99 to *Windows* seminar attendees and for \$129 direct from Microsoft.

Lotus is firing back by bestowing \$20 copies of its newly acquired *Ami Pro*, a \$495 *Windows* word processor, on purchasers of 1-2-3 release 3.1. Upgrades from release 3.1 are only \$49 for six months after purchase. Meanwhile, on the low end, Borland continues to

give the \$495 *Quattro Pro 2.0* to anyone with \$100 and proof of *1-2-3* ownership.

Lotus's lead keeps weakening. Marshall Moseley, software analyst with Dataquest in San Jose, California, says that its share of all personal computer spreadsheets slid from 54 percent to 47 percent in 1990. Quattro climbed from 3 percent of unit sales in 1989 to 14 percent. Excel's gains were modest—from 12.6 percent to 14 percent—but that was before Excel 3.0 hit shrink-wrap.

This year, Moseley predicts, *Excel* will carve more market share from 1-2-3, as will *Quattro Pro*. But the real losers will be character-based alternatives such as *SuperCalc 5* and *Lucid 3-D*. "Low-end [packages] will disappear," says Moseley.

1-2-3 Loyalists Hard to Budge

Lotus keeps cranking out versions of its franchise product; 1-2-3 3.1 fills a major gap with

its built-in spreadsheet publishing facilities, and release 2.3 is expected soon. But Lotus's greatest strengths are the 7 million copies sold and a loyal user base that won't switch overnight, even when competing packages may be richer in features and easier to use.

"I'm very happy with the functionality of 1-2-3 release 3.1," says Tim Arnold, senior engineer with Redpath Engineering in Mesa, Arizona. "Now I can give output that looks as good as *Excel*'s did, off the spreadsheet I was using before."


"We're very entrenched," says Billie Kjeell, director of the Irvine, California, computing center for Fluor Daniel. "The cost to this corporation if we moved to *Excel* or *Quattro* would be astronomical."

To many 1-2-3 users, all the giveaways and discounts are irrelevant. The *Ami Pro* offer

is "a nonissue," says Benjamin Goldfarb, manager of information services at StarKist Seafood in Los Angeles. "There are too many issues in changing shrink-wrapped software beyond free [packages,] such as training or the learning curve."

The same goes for Lotus's guaranteeing 3.1 buyers \$49 upgrades to any new release within six months of purchase. "That's a nice gesture," says Goldfarb. "We want the upgrades to go as smoothly as possible. But that's just a part of our decision to stick with Lotus."

Still, half the users of release 3.1 run it under Windows, and corporations are clamoring for 1-2-3 for Windows, expected this summer. "If Lotus doesn't get its Windows version out, people will move over to something else," warns Howard Brenner, executive vice president for Home Mutual Life in Baltimore. "That doesn't mean [the alternative] is a better product. [Windows is] just the environment people want to work in." -Mark Henricks

IBM Backs NetWare as Network Alternative

Falling-Out With Microsoft Triggers Novell Alliance

This was not quite business as usual for IBM.

IBM's February agreement to resell Novell's NetWare, and help integrate the bestselling network system software into its grand computing scheme, promises to ease headaches for many corporate customers.

But slapping a Big Blue logo on a product that competes head-on against a key IBM offering is hardly standard practice. And the move publicly acknowledges a deepening rift with system software partner Microsoft.

Analysts agree that the step boosts IBM's control of its networking future. "Strategically, it's important for IBM to move away from Microsoft," says David Marshak of Patricia Seybold's Office Computing Group in Boston.

Big Blue Skies for NetWare

Since 1987, IBM has been pushing customers toward

OS/2 LAN Server, based on Microsoft's LAN Manager, as the foundation for local-area networking. IBM will continue to develop LAN Server actively; the Novell alliance simply acknowledges NetWare's entrenched position, says Jim Cannavino, head of IBM personal systems. "The vast majority of our customers will have both in their shops," he explains. "We will support both products equally."

The two firms will collaborate to make NetWare and LAN Server work together (for example, giving users a single log-in for both) and to meld NetWare more smoothly into IBM's overall Systems Application Architecture (SAA) blueprint for distributed computing. One crucial part of the agreement: Novell promises to offer a full-blown NetWare for OS/2 next year. "Our strategy is to make OS/2 a unifying platform," declares Cannavino. "Our commitment

is as strong as ever."

"The need for integration and coexistence is clear," says Lee Reiswig, assistant general manager for programming, IBM desktop systems. Solving today's fiendishly complicated networking problems requires plenty of cooperation among vendors anyway. Adds Reiswig, "If we had to have all these relationships, why not benefit financially?"

While many customer needs overlap, Reiswig points out that the products offer different strengths. LAN Server was meant to be a cornerstone for SAA networks and for OS/2 applications developed in-house. Novell provides higher performance, links to other machines like the Macintosh, and fault tolerance and will add multiprocessing support in the future.

However, plenty of questions about specific product plans remain. "I don't think IBM and Novell have got all their ducks in a line," says Michael Goulde of Open Systems Advisor in Boston.

Separating From Microsoft

The announcement came two weeks after Microsoft all but danced on the grave of today's OS/2—touting the brand-new operating system it will invent under the name OS/2 3.0 and encouraging developers to write applications for *Windows* rather than for OS/2. These actions infuriated IBM. While executives stoutly deny it, "a lot of this move is personal," one analyst says.

With IBM's product focus broadening, and with 3Com, the largest supplier of *LAN Manager*—based packages, essentially withdrawing from that business, *LAN Manager*'s position has been bat-


tered. "3Com's already bailed out, and IBM and Hewlett-Packard are doing similar things," observes Marshak. "Microsoft won't stem the NetWare tide this year."

But the Novell deal "doesn't change our direction," insists David Thacher, senior product manager for the *LAN Manager* line. "To us it doesn't look like a huge shift; it's a very pragmatic step in response to customer requests."

Novell's NetWare retains a firm hold on the PC-based-network software market, according to International Data Corporation. Sales of OS/2 LAN Manager-based offerings are climbing but not at Novell's expense. IDC estimates last year's worldwide market at 6.5 million users.

"Microsoft has begun an enormous drive to launch *LAN Manager*," notes Thacher, who expects Microsoft to reach its goal of 600 high-end resellers by midyear. In recent months, Microsoft's network product group has hired hundreds of employees—substantiating the \$1.5-billion giant's commitment. —*E. B.*



Go, Microsoft Vie for Backers in Computing's Next Wave

will hit the market, debate is rising over the future of pen-based computing, which promises to bring greater ease of use and portability to PCs for managers and professionals. The combination of a pen interface and an extremely lightweight package also should bring computer power to businesspeople who've been left behind in the PC revolution.

Go Corporation and Microsoft are busily lining up hardware and software backers for PenPoint and *Pen Windows*, their respective environments (see "PenPoint Puts It in Writing," March 1991). Go's elegant built-from-the-ground-up solution represents a complete departure from conventional ways of working with a computer. Microsoft, on the other hand, is playing catch-up by adapting *Windows 3.0* to exploit a pen interface.


Both Go and Microsoft are beating the drums to get software developers moving on the all-important process of writing applications. But users shouldn't expect to see finished hardware and software until year-end at the earliest.

New Breeds of Users?

Everyone is wrestling with uncertainty about how the products will be employed once all the pieces come together.

Go executives contend that most users of pen-based systems will be people who either can't or won't use today's PCs. Microsoft takes a more evolutionary view, arguing that most customers will be looking for a highly portable supplement to their desktop system.

In the first few years, the biggest market for pen-based

systems is likely to be field representatives—from sales professionals to delivery personnel—for whom today's laptops are largely inappropriate. Form software will play a critical role; packages like Slate Corporation's *PenApps* for PenPoint and Borland's *ObjectVision* for *Windows* are among the form-oriented tools that will provide an easy way for field representatives to capture data.

PenPoint should enjoy distinct technical advantages over Pen Windows among these early adopters. Pen-Point's Notebook User Interface spares users the worry of such typical PC issues as file location and directories. Its more intuitive approach should appeal to users who aren't familiar with desktop PCs, making PenPoint's incompatibility with existing software less of a concern. For many of these users, "Windows doesn't mean anything," points out Bill Lempesis, publisher of The Lempesis Report in Pleasanton, California.

Further down the road, however, mobile managers and

executives—including both PC veterans and novices—will make up a large segment of users of pen-based systems. Here *Pen Windows* may well be the system of choice, says Andrew Seybold, associate director of Dataquest's microcomputer systems service. "For individuals who are computer literate in the *Windows* environment, *Pen Windows* will be the ideal traveling companion," he notes.

Microsoft argues that *Pen Windows* will offer an entry into pen-based computing without making users shed their existing applications. "The problem of having a new platform is that the platform doesn't exist until application software is available," says Pradeep Singh, group product manager for *Pen Windows*. "We've solved that problem."

But an existing operating system retooled for pen input can't do the job, maintains Jerry Kaplan, chairman of Go in Foster City, California. "The pen isn't just another input device," says Kaplan. "The pen is the point."


Backing Both Horses

"The two companies will be fighting a battle for the same turf," says Ken Dulaney, director of advanced systems marketing at Grid Systems in Fremont, California. Many software and hardware companies are hedging their bets.

Grid and NCR, the two hardware suppliers that have been most public about their plans, will offer products capable of running either PenPoint or *Pen Windows*—letting users decide which of the two operating systems will best (see Pen, p. 66)

(continued from p. 62) meet their needs.

But Mountain View, California, start-up Momenta Corporation, one of the first public backers of *Pen Windows*, currently has no intention of supporting PenPoint. Marketing Vice President John Rizzo describes the firm as a "systems company," noting that an initial offering planned for delivery early next year will be a hardware/software combination, including software tools, pen-optimized applications, and handwriting algorithms.

While Go includes IBM among its most vocal backers, Microsoft has lined up some of the biggest laptop suppliers. Toshiba, NEC, Epson, and Sharp have all endorsed the *Pen Windows* environment (although none gives any product details).

Pen-based systems will be 386SX-based. Grid plans to offer a hard disk, but NCR will include only flash memory and battery-backed RAM storage for increased portability. (Pen-Point can work well without a hard disk, *Pen Windows* may not.) Early penbooks should weigh in at about 5 pounds, measure 9 by 12 by 1 inch, come with at least 4MB of RAM, and retail initially for between \$4000 and \$5000.

Penning Innovative Applications

Startups PenSoft and Slate are leading the development of pen-specific applications and expect to release finished products when the pen platforms are available at year-end. Both companies played a key role in the January Pen-Point unveiling but in addition may offer *Pen Windows* versions.

PenSoft's personal information manager is a showpiece for packages that pull together the many advantages of a pen-based system. It allows for single entry of most information and enables users to establish links between different types of data in different applications. The software will incorporate E-mail and be fully programmable, so corporations and resellers can customize applications.

Go has also lined up major players including WordPerfect, Lotus, and Borland. WordPerfect intends to provide a version of its franchise word processor for PenPoint, but Product Marketing Director Royce Bybee emphasizes that the company is still determining which features are most appropriate and what new tricks make sense in a pen-based environment.

"It's clear you're not going to create a 20-page document on a pen-based system" says Bybee. He adds, though, that pen-based systems will be invaluable for editing documents, taking notes, and creating short letters or memos.

Microsoft, meanwhile, is lining up its own list of followers, including Da Vinci Systems and Polaris Software. And all the major software houses are studying *Pen Windows* very seriously.


Customers Watch and Wait

Despite all the speculation, the ultimate place and power of pen-based technology remain largely unknown. Several large corporate users express interest in the technology, but because the new platforms may offer an edge on the competition, they're mum about specific plans.



IBM Notebook Worth the Wait

What weighs less than ten pounds, runs 386-specific software at 20 MHz, and comes with 2MB of RAM, a 60MB hard disk, and the world's best notebook keyboard?



IBM's new 20-MHz PS/2 Model L40 SX notebook comes with an external keypad—standard.

e who laughs last, laughs best. IBM has been slow coming to market with a notebook PC, but now that the PS/2 Model L40 SX is here, it's clear that the company hasn't been twiddling its Big Blue thumbs. While this system is a bit on the heavy side, it looks like a real winner. And the pricing is reasonable—at least compared to Compaq's and Texas Instruments'.

The Model L40 SX is designed to work flat out, full-

time, with no compromises and no cut corners. Its 20-MHz CPU will speed through even big *Windows* applications. Its standard 60MB hard disk is large enough to hold all the programs, worksheets, and graphics files you're likely to need. And its 18MB of installable RAM (you decide how much is extended and how much is expanded) means you can load all the memory you (or *Windows*) will ever require.

Its keyboard is the finest we've seen on a notebook—or

on a full-sized laptop, for that matter. There are *no* emulated keys. You get a fully standard PS/2 layout: Cursor keys (in the familiar inverted T), page keys, control keys, and 12 function keys are all dedicated and all located right where your fingers expect to find them. The touch is terrific, and you can even turn the key click on or off.

Do you enter a lot of numerical data? Then you've got one more reason to like the L40 SX: A 17-key external keypad comes standard with the sys-

tem. Do you use a mouse? Then you'll be pleased to learn there are two PS/2 mouse ports, one at the rear of the machine and the other on the keypad.

Small, but Not That Small

All these features take steel and plastic. And in a genre where some machines tip the scales at 6 pounds traveling weight (that's PC, battery, AC charger, and power cable), IBM's 9.7-pound notebook is far from the lightest.

Nor at 2.1 by 12.8 by 10.7 inches is it particularly small. In fact, this 288-cubic-inch machine is bigger than any of the systems reviewed in "386SX Notebooks: Portable Powerhouses" in this issue. Of



course, if three years ago someone had offered you a 20-MHz, VGA-equipped, hard disk laptop that weighed only ten pounds, you'd have expected a proffer of the Brooklyn Bridge to follow closely.

Batteries: Bad News, Good News

Another concern for travelers: Neither battery life nor recharge time is particularly impressive. IBM claims "a maximum" battery life of 3 hours. Presumably, that means 3 hours with the benefit of inconvenient, power-saving features like hard disk time-out. If you hate waiting for the hard disk to power up every time you need to read in another data file, you'll probably turn off the power-saving featuresand battery life will drop accordingly.

IBM reports an *extremely* slow 8-hour recharge time with the standard AC charger; some machines we've tested do the job in 1 hour. If you use the optional quick-charger; you

can expect a full recharge to take 2.5 hours—still not very fast.

On the bright side of the battery issue, the Model L40 SX comes standard with two rechargeable batteries; exchanging them is easy, so under normal circumstances you can expect to keep working for up to 6 hours away from the power plug. A built-in standby battery keeps the system running while you change batteries. And a helpful LED power gauge located just below the screen gives you a constant readout of how much battery time is left.

Big-Screen Success

The display is a crisp, high-contrast, monochrome VGA unit with up to 64 shades of gray (depending on the VGA mode you're using). The more gray shades a notebook can deliver, the more capably it can render color applications into readable black, white, and gray versions. The display measures 10 inches diagonally—one of the largest

screens you can get. Fluorescent sidelighting makes text and graphics stand out nicely, and you can adjust contrast and brightness with two handy sliders on the side of the screen.

Just below the screen, a row of slick-looking system status icons keeps you advised about keyboard mode (Caps Lock, Num Lock), fax modem operations, floppy and hard disk activity, and temperature and humidity conditions that preclude safe operation. The system is designed to run in temperatures between 41 and 95 degrees Fahrenheit, although floppy disk access below 50 degrees is not recommended.

Extra Touches

IBM's engineers have devoted a good deal of attention to ergonomics, which means a lot if you expect to be using your Model L40 SX every day. For one thing, the external power jack (which you're likely to need often) is fully accessible, not hidden behind a nail-breaking hatch cover as is so

often the case. There are three hatch covers on the back of the notebook, but they all operate smoothly and easily. They cover the mouse port, serial and parallel ports, the battery, connectors for an external VGA color monitor, and an AT-bus connector that may attach, someday, to a docking station.

While that docking station has not even been promised officially, several neat options are available now. A 2400-bps fax modem and the quick charger are for sale immediately. A Trackpoint option that aims to combine the convenience of a mouse and a trackball in a single device will be available "soon."

There are also plenty of tempting standard "extras," like a leather case, power-on password protection, and a "server" mode that allows the system to be turned on so other users can access the hard disk while the keyboard remains locked.


You can run all the setup options from a menu-driven utility—or you can use one of three batch files that automatically configure the system for travel (with all power-saving features enabled), for office use, and for printing. The Model L40 SX comes with a one-year warranty, and an onsite service option is available through your local IBM dealer for \$95 a year.

While the Model L40 SX comes in at half the weight of earlier PS/2 portables, a glance at its notebook competitors shows IBM is still emphasizing power first and portability second. And rivals like Tandon's NB/386sx will take a noticeably smaller bite out of your checkbook. But a solid design and thoughtful touches make this the first Big Blue machine that most of us really would take on the road.

Tandon Clones Laptop Winner

Tandon rolls out a Compaq challenger with a few more features for a lot fewer dollars.



The NB/386sx brings you all the features of the best-selling Compaq LTE 386s/20—20-MHz power, VGA graphics, and a notebook footprint—but for thousands less.

ven if it weren't the only 386SX notebook PC shipping in quantity in early 1991, Compaq's got-everything/doeverything LTE 386s/20 still would be the standard by which other notebooks were measured. But of course, this exalted status makes it a sitting duck for everything that comes after.

In mid-March Tandon rolled out its NB/386sx with a full set of features, aiming to knock the LTE off its perch. Most striking is a list price \$1000 to \$3000 lower. But there's more than that to the NB/386sx.

Consider the NB/386sx a poor man's LTE. It offers the same buff-colored case with the same 8½-by-11-by-2-inch dimensions. You get the same 9-inch-diagonal, black-on-white VGA display with 16

shades of gray. In fact, the NB/386sx includes all the main ingredients of Compaq's no-compromises standard setter—20-MHz 386SX, 3½-inch floppy, and your choice of 30MB or 60MB Conner hard drive.

But the NB/386sx also has room for 16MB, rather than 10MB, of fast system-board memory. It weighs 6.5 pounds with battery compared to the LTE's 7.5 pounds, and Tandon even throws in a soft leather carrying case.

Price-Less

Then there's that huge disparity in price. The list on the NB/386sx's 30MB version is \$3495—a little more than half Compaq's \$6499. Of course, Tandon sells direct, while your retailer may sell you an LTE for as low as \$4600.

The NB/386sx fits sideways into half your briefcase, al-

though the 1.6-pound charger is bulky. The NB/386sx recharges very quickly—in about 2 hours—and the AC adapter overrides the automatic screen-blanking.

Hit the suspend button to put the NB/386sx to sleep when your computing is interrupted; resume where you left off minutes or days later. The battery gives you up to 3 hours between charges. An extra battery is both cheap (\$59.95) and conveniently sized and shaped (like four D cells laid end to end).

The NB/386sx's full-travel keyboard feels as good as the LTE's, but that's not saying much. A small footprint forces the keys a little too close together, compared to those on slightly larger notebooks like the Toshiba T2000, and the <Cursor Up> key is squished in where your fingers expect to find the shift key.

Desktop Replacement

Compaq's notebook shines brighter in its expansion unit, which houses more slots and storage. The NB/386sx's unit is a simple box, housing a 62-watt power supply and four 16-bit slots—one taken by the adapter for the 100-pin connector. But the expansion unit still turns the NB/386sx into a desktop equivalent—for \$299, rather than the \$1499 the LTE's unit costs.

No, Tandon doesn't provide the same comfort level as Compaq, even though Tandon is a heavyweight in Europe with a balance sheet that would make any PC maker proud. But Tandon aims to break into the United States market big with the NB/386sx. Check out this machine before the supply runs out...or Tandon wises up.

Mice on the Move

Microsoft's BallPoint Mouse and Logitech's TrackMan Portable aim to assist the traveling Windows user.



Microsoft's BallPoint clamps easily to the side of virtually any notebook. Logitech's TrackMan Portable, shown standing, works well with laptops and desktops.

With more than four million users, the Microsoft Mouse is hugely popular—except when you take it on the road, where it and its kin can be a pain in the hand. (Ever try to run a *Windows* application with a laptop actually in your lap?)

As notebooks sell in evergreater volume, mouse makers are heeding the call to create a new breed of mice-togo. Microsoft and leading rival Logitech have done just that with Microsoft BallPoint Mouse and Logitech Track-Man Portable.

Both of these devices are

trackballs—they're designed like an upside-down mouse with a ball in a socket; you move the ball with your fingers. They attach to any side of your portable with springloaded clamps (BallPoint's are exceptionally slick) and detach easily for desktop maneuvers. You adjust the clamps to tilt the mice for hand size and comfort.

BallPoint has two buttons on each side; you set them for right- or left-handedness via software. The device comes with a bundled 20-inch cable and 400-dot-per-inch (dpi) default resolution. You can adjust this via software in small increments from 14 to 1400 dpi.

BallPoint plugs into 9-pin and PS/2 mouse ports.

TrackMan puts secondary buttons on the front and the main button on the side. You switch hand preference manually with the main button. A 24-inch cord sits in a canal underneath the mouse. Resolution defaults to 200 dpi, but it can be adjusted via software to between 50 and 15,000 dpi. TrackMan supports 9-pin and 25-pin serial ports and the PS/2 port interface.

Both devices are much smaller than a regular mouse or trackball; TrackMan is slightly larger at 2½ inches high and wide. Both are too big simply to mount on your notebook and forget about until needed, but each comes with a convenient carrying case.

Windows Wanderers

Both mice guarantee compatibility with the Microsoft Mouse, install easily, and support *Windows 3.0*.

BallPoint's Compass software includes the DOS Control Panel, which allows you to adjust sensitivity and acceleration, and another utility that lets you designate which buttons are primary and which are secondary, and enable or disable the drag-lock feature. The Windows Control Panel is the Windows equivalent.

TrackMan Portable's MouseWare 6.0 includes the Mouse Control Center for Windows and a DOS version as well. MouseWare lets you set sensitivity, double-click speed, orientation, drag-lock option, and button functions. The software also creates menus so you can use a mouse with such leading DOS appli-

cations, as 1-2-3 and WordPerfect. Additionally, MouseWare 6.0 includes an enhanced cursor that improves visibility for DOS applications on portables.

Both mice are well designed; you'll prefer whichever feels more comfortable to you. They come at a slight cost premium over standard models, and some die-hard mousers may never feel comfortable driving a trackball. But many others will be pleased with these two for the road.

Dell's 320N has first-class notebook features, backed up by one year of on-site service and toll-free support.

Dell has jumped into the hot notebook market with both feet: a 20-MHz 386SX and a 12-MHz 286. And to make sure that users on the go never have to stop going for long, the company is adding a new wrinkle to its already first-class service/support package: a one-year on-site service contract that includes next-day system replacement wherever required. A technician will even come to a hotel and transfer your data to the replacement's hard disk, if possible.

At 8½ by 11 by 2 inches, these new VGA systems are among the smallest notebooks you can buy. Both are 6.4-pound featherweights with battery (only 7¼ pounds with the AC adapter/charger) and can easily handle memory-hungry applications like *Windows*, thanks to a comfortable 5MB RAM ceiling. Dell promises 3 to 4 hours of battery

operation. A spare battery is \$79.95.

The keyboards are terrific, featuring a layout that's close to a desktop unit's: dedicated cursor keys in the standard inverted T, plus dedicated page and function keys. The System 320N SX comes with either a 30MB or 60MB hard drive;

Prices are OK but not earth-shattering. The 386SXbased 320N with 1MB of RAM and a 30MB drive is \$3399. Make it \$4396 in the standard PC World configuration (5MB of RAM, a built-in 2400-bps modem, a 30MB hard disk, and DOS)—roughly in the middle of the price range for comparably configured SX notebooks (see "386SX Notebooks: Portable Powerhouses" in this issue). The 212N is the place for the price consciousyou can get one with 1MB of RAM and a 20MB hard disk for \$2399.

In any case, prices have to be considered in the context of Dell's record of good design and solid service and support.

Epson's New Equity Lineup Easy to Get Into for Upgrades

We have met the 486, and most of us have decided that a fast 386 or 20-MHz 386SX system offers a better price/performance balance for most applications. Epson is taking advantage of a pause in the ten-year-old chase after everfaster processors to revamp its successful line of personal computers, focusing on aesthetics, convenience, and some aspects of PC performance that support faster processing speed.

The new Equity lineup extends from a 12-MHz 286 to a 486-equipped EISA system. But clearly, the center of interest lies somewhere between its Equity 386SX/20 Plus and Equity 386/25 Plus—each equipped with an ISA bus. Small-footprint PCs are the

rage today, but that doesn't mean you want to sacrifice expandability. Epson meets that challenge through extensive use of SMT (surface mount technology) and VLSI (very large scale integration) and with a case design that allows easy access for expansion or repair.

Except for the tower design of the 486/25 version in the Epson EISA Series, the systems share a common case—about 15 inches wide by 17 inches deep by 6 inches high. Just turn the rear knob, and you can lift off the top and faceplate. Then you or your dealer can lift out the hard drive and power-supply chassis, making it easy to add or remove a drive from one of the three half-height bays. You

also have complete access to the motherboard for snap-in SIMM memory upgrades. In addition, the three 8/16-bit slots and the one 8-bit I/O slot are in easy reach in case you want to add, say, a modem or network card.

All those slots are available for expansion because all standard functions are embedded in the line's common mother-board, starting with controllers that support two floppy drives in any 3½-inch or 5¼-inch combination; two fast 40MB or 100MB IDE drives; and embedded serial, parallel, and mouse ports.

The Equity 386SX/20 Plus has a super-VGA controller that gives you 16 colors at 800 by 600 resolution, and includes the new Edsun Laboratories

Continuous Edge Graphics chip to smooth out your display's "jaggies" and provide a palette of more than 740,000 colors at an "apparent" resolution of at least 1536 by 1280. The Equity 386/25 Plus provides an extended VGA resolution of 1024 by 768 and will acquire CEG capability this summer. Both the Equity 386SX/20 Plus and the Equity 386/25 Plus ship with 2MB of memory expandable to 16MB (the 386SX/20 Plus can take only 14MB of that on the motherboard) and 32K of 25ns cache memory for no-wait performance.

Both the tower and the desktop have extended VGA graphics and a card that plugs into the system board: You can plug a 33-MHz 386 or a 25-MHz 486 card into either Epson EISA Series model.

In single-floppy configurations, the Equity 386SX/20 Plus is \$2299: It's \$3449 with a 100MB hard drive. The 386/25 Plus is \$3499 and \$4999 with a 100MB hard drive. The Epson EISA Series will be launched in June, and prices have not yet been set.

IDE hard drives can be added: \$759 for a 25ms 40MB and \$1479 for a 25ms 100MB.

A 13-inch color VGA monitor is available for \$599, while an extended VGA color multiscan monitor with resolution up to 1024 by 768 can be had for \$689. Add another \$95 for DOS version 3.3 or \$125 for DOS version 4.01, and you'll get a copy of Windows 3.0 thrown in free. —Mike Hogan





Fingertip Mouse Control Without Leaving Your Keyboard

Mice have always been something of a keyboard aside, but with the increase in mouserun programs, Cherry Corporation figures that it's time for your mouse to join your other keys.

Of special interest to touchtypists, Cherry has dropped a mouse onto the panel of the new 101-key keyboard that it calls the MouseBoard. You'll find it where most keyboards put their arrow keys. In fact, the arrow keys on the Mouse-Board do double duty—sort of. Push a mouse button on the bottom right corner of your MouseBoard, and it activates the MousePanel on which those keys sit, letting you mouse around the screen without your fingers having to leave the comfort of the



With the MouseBoard, you never have to take your fingers off the keyboard to navigate graphical screens.

keyboard.

The entire MousePanel moves about 16 millimeters up and down and from side to side so that you can slide your onscreen pointer around just as you do when you roll a mouse. You can adjust the speed or sensitivity of the Microsoft-compatible mouse movement

on a scale from 0 to 10. The mouse gives precise control with slow movements but can still zoom across the screen. Push the mouse button with its LED again, and the mouse keys turn back into the four arrow keys. But you still enjoy the panel's freedom of movement that lets you move quick-

The \$349 MouseBoard comes with installation software and drivers for PC, XT, 286, and 386 machines. It also works on an IBM PS/2, but a \$10.96 PS/2 adapter cable is required. Function keys run across the top in the 101-key keyboard format. —Susan Lusty





terrupt foreground tasks. The program keeps you aware of incoming faxes—as well as the status of outgoing ones—via an unobtrusive one-line display or a beep. An automatic activity log lists faxes sent and received along with time, date, address, and other pertinent information. You can schedule transmissions to occur at a later time or date.

You can't edit with Multi-FaxPC, but you can view fax files and cut portions of them to save to a PCX or TIFF file for later insertion into other files. That capability lets you attach logos, signatures, and cover sheets to your faxes.

The new MultiFaxPC board performs all necessary fax functions, but you may find actually sending a fax somewhat more awkward than with Intel's new SatisFaxtion board. Like SatisFaxtion, MultiFaxPC lets you fax any file created by an application that supports the Epson



MultiFaxPC combines a fax with a high-speed modem on a single board—for only about \$100 more than you'd pay for the modem alone.

FX-80 printer, but MultiFax-PC lacks Intel's TSR capability, preventing you from sending a fax from within that application. Instead, there is a multistep process in which you switch back and forth between Multi-Tech's fax software and the DOS prompt.

More cumbersome than the SatisFaxtion method, Multi-FaxPC's doesn't support the CAS standard for applications that include faxing in their menus. But if you can't afford the conventional and/or expanded memory that lets SatisFaxtion perform its magic, you may not mind the extra steps. Likewise, you also get a

much faster modem than SatisFaxtion's 2400-bps variety.

For nonfax files, the Multi-FaxPC's V.32 9600-bps modem supports V.42 error correction and MNP-5 and V.42bis data compression. The modem works with all popular communications software, but Multi-Tech throws in *Qmodem SST* for good measure.

The MultiFaxPC lists for \$999, a good value considering that today's V.32 modems alone cost nearly that much. It requires DOS 2.0 or a later version, 512K of RAM, a hard disk, and any full-length 8- or 16-bit slot. —Art Wilcox

Star Micronics LaserPrinter 4

A Different Clone

When the HP LaserJet IIP hit the streets in September 1989 as the first sub-\$1000 laser, it caused a small revolution in the printer market—and shots are still being fired. The latest salvo comes from dot matrix maven Star Micronics. Its LaserPrinter 4 has two features that separate it from the me-IIP crowd: support for HP cartridges and a fast RISC processor.

The 300-dpi LaserPrinter 4 lists for \$1495, so you can probably find it for about the same price on the street as the IIP. It uses the same 4-ppm Canon engine and features a

similar small-footprint design. It's also the only clone printer that accepts IIP-compatible font cartridges. Star sweetens the deal by throwing in a free cartridge containing 151 bitmapped fonts.

What sets this printer apart is its 10-MHz Intel i960 RISC processor, which is significantly faster than the IIP's poky Motorola 68000. Star claims the LaserPrinter 4 prints graphics files more than 30 percent faster than the IIP, thanks to the processor's ability to speed throughput.

But RISC really becomes a factor when crunching calculation-intensive PostScript files. That's one reason Star plans to offer a \$399 Post-Script-compatible board, complete with the standard 35 scalable font outlines. Figure another \$299 for the required extra megabyte of RAM, and you still have the cheapest RISC-based PostScript clone on the market.

The printer comes with 1MB of RAM (compared to the IIP's 512K), which Star claims is enough to handle a full letter-sized page of graphics. But if you want to download buckets of fonts, mix multiple fonts and graphics, or print legal-sized pages, you'll need more memory—and RAM is strictly proprietary. A 2MB upgrade costs \$499, a 4MB board \$999.

Like the IIP, the Laser-Printer 4 has 14 resident fonts and handles the usual paper categories, including envelopes, labels, and transparencies, via a 50-sheet fold-down tray. An optional 250-sheet cassette is available for \$195.

Turbo Pascal for Windows, Borland C++

Borland Tools for Doing Windows

Windows 3.0 has become everybody's favorite programming environment, but Windows programs are as hard to write as they are easy to use. Microsoft's Windows Software Development Kit (SDK) is a mammoth collection of manuals detailing close to 600 functions and parameters, leading some wags to suggest that the reason Windows programs are so good is that only the best programmers ever complete them.

Borland takes up that challenge with Turbo Pascal for Windows, a \$250 integrated development environment (IDE) that offers many of the advantages that helped TP for DOS make programming easy and affordable. If you're a competent Pascal programmer-especially if you're familiar with the object-oriented extensions to the language that Borland introduced with Turbo Pascal 5.5—TP for Windows should make writing Windows programs a straightforward proposition.

One of the toughest jobs is creating your program's interface, but you'll be a step up if you're familiar with Turbo Pascal. Included in the package is Object Windows Library (OWL) for working with the Windows interface. OWL is similar to Turbo Vision, the highly structured object library that comes with TP 6.0. Unfortunately, OWL isn't compatible with Turbo Vision, so you won't be able to convert your TP 6.0 DOS-based programs to Windows just by recompiling the code. But you do have a familiar paradigm in which to work. If you prefer, TP for Windows also comes with a version of the Whitewater Group's Whitewater Resource Toolkit, a utility for creating Windows interfaces.

There's also a version of the Turbo Debugger that can debug your *Windows* programs. Unfortunately, the debugger itself is text based, illustrating the complexity of programming in the environment. (Not even Microsoft has been able to create a source-level debugger that works in *Windows*.) Borland's debugger flips into *Windows* mode when you view your program screen.

Armed with these utilities, you should be able to create great *Windows* programs without having to spring for Microsoft's \$500 *SDK*. To Microsoft's credit, it has let Borland license the one essential part of the *SDK*, the resource compiler, and integrate it into *TP for Windows*.

While TP for Windows is intended at least in part for amateurs, $Borland\ C++$ is definitely a professional tool. The word Turbo has been dropped from the name—the first Borland language product without it—because Borland felt that C programmers associate the name with non-professional tools. $Borland\ C++$ replaces $Turbo\ C++$ $Professional\$ but not the regular $Turbo\ C++$.

Unlike TP for Windows, $Borland\ C++$ is not a Windows program. Its character-based IDE runs under Windows as a text program. But when you compile, C++ gives you the option of creating either a DOS or a Windows application.

New features in this \$495 kit include 386 protectedmode compiling, precompiled headers (so you don't have to compile all your headers repeatedly), a built-in assembler (like the one in *Turbo Pascal 6.0*), and unlimited undo and redo. *Borland C++* comes with the same version of the Turbo Debugger as *TP for Windows*, along with the *Whitewater Resource Toolkit* and the integrated resource compiler. —*Lincoln Spector*



Windows Scanner Comes Easily to Hand

Maybe you're a little short on dollars. Maybe you're a little short on desk space, or maybe you want to be able to scan that rounded left-hand column on the right-hand page of the *Encyclopaedia Britannica*. Under many circumstances, one of the hand-held scanners from the Niscan/GS family may be a better fit than a desktop alternative whose price can run as much as eight times higher.

Hand scanners have always bowed to their larger cousins in terms of registration quality and the size of the swath they cut. But some recent advances in software can compensate for an unsteady hand and let you knit together the pieces of a large scanned picture.

Nisca lists four flavors of hand scanners. The barebones \$369 Niscan/GS also comes in a \$399 Windows 3.0 version; both offer 8-bit image scanning in 256 shades of true gray, achieved through hardware controls rather than simulated in software. For an additional \$200, Nisca includes OCR-enhancing software: The Niscan/GS OCR costs \$569, while the Niscan/GS OCR for Windows lists for \$599.

Any of the scanners can bring photos, line art, and logos via IMG, PCX, and TIFF files into the most popular publishing, word processing, and paint/draw programs—including PageMaker, WordPerfect 5.1, Microsoft Word, and PC Paintbrush. The Niscan/GS scanners let

you grab art in 4.2-by-11-inch swipes at speeds that decrease and file sizes that grow as you move from resolutions of 25 to 400 dots per inch. Scan at lower resolutions if you're in a hurry, hurting for hard disk space, or want artsy grainy image effects.

All models come with the usual array of prescan controls and postscan darkroomstyle editing tricks such as image flipping, posterization, and touch-up. The non-Windows models use GEM-based ScanXpress software for prescan controls and postscan image editing, while the Windows models use Image-In's Scan&Paint scan-control and paint program and Image-In's Plus postscan gray-scale editor.

But newsletters and such do not live by pictures alone. Niscan/GS OCR automatically identifies blocks of text. Then its Cat Reader Professional software takes the text down in ASCII and menu-selectable WordStar, WordPerfect, and Microsoft Word text formats in 8- to 24-point type at up to 50 characters per second. Cat Reader also includes a built-in text editor and 50,000-word spell checker.


But here's where the value of the Windows 3.0 multitasking environment really comes to the fore. Niscan/GS OCR for Windows lets you use Scan&Paint to scan graphics into one window and edit with Image-In's Plus. Then, in another window, you use the bundled Perceive Personal by Ocron to bring text into a WordStar, WordPerfect, Word, or ASCII file in 8- to 36point type at up to 150 characters per second. Meanwhile, your newsletter or other DTP application is in a third window, into which you can bring





Web Network Operating System

Peer-to-Peer Network Boasts Speed, Security, Ease of Use

AN installation and maintenance have long been the province of techies. Certainly, they're not tasks for which the average manager or smallbusiness owner has the time or the expertise. But the Web peer-to-peer network operating system has been designed for just such nontechnical users in small to mediumsized work groups.

The installation process is simplified from the start by Web's support of Novell's IPX (International Packet Exchange). This protocol lets the peer-to-peer OS operate with any network adapter that ships with a NetWare driver; most do, including token ring, ethernet, and ARCnet cards. Better still, the OS reads the parameters needed for setup, such as interrupts and memory locations, directly from those adapters. Web is indifferent to network topology, so you can go with ring, bus, or star.

Users interact with Web via the Station Manager, which runs as a TSR or a stand-alone and is the way to set up and access network files, shared devices, and E-mail. Web makes all drives and files available to all users from any workstation and displays available resources on screen in a tree format. You can even back up the entire network from any station.

You or the network administrator can also use the Station Manager to set access levels: station, drive, directory, file, and device. Print management includes print spooling for both serial and parallel printers, plotters, and other external devices. Both the person sending a file and the owner of the device can start, stop, and remove the spooled file from the device's queue. You use the Station Manager, from DOS or from within an application, to manage the queue and local devices.

A rather rudimentary memory-resident messaging system creates mailing lists but lacks basic LAN E-mail features such as copies, blind copies, attachments, and the ability to file incoming messages into folders. It also lacks support for the MHS messaging system supported by Novell LANs, so you can't communicate with co-workers beyond the bounds of your own network.

The system takes up approximately 55K of conventional memory on each workstation and requires an additional 6K for the NetWare driver. The product costs \$495 for a 5-user license, \$995 for a 15-user license, and \$1495 for a 30-user license. —Cheryl Goldberg



386SX PORTABLE NOTEBOOKS: PORTABLE

These seven tiny SX laptops offer blazing speed, gorgeous screens, and up to 80MB of hard disk capacity. The catch? Too little battery life for a cross-country flight.

If you've put off buying one of the new featherweight notebook PCs because they're too slow, their screens too coarse, or their hard disks too small, you've just run out of excuses.

The latest 386SX notebooks run every bit as fast as their desktop counterparts and boast surprising RAM and hard disk headroom. Yet they're no bigger—and a good deal lighter—than a ream of paper.

This amazing combination of power and portability is a real boon for those who run on-screen presentations or use *Windows 3.0* on a flight from San Francisco to Chicago. They're good news for anyone, in fact, who's become used to 386 speed at work and expects the same on the road.

In just a few short months, notebook PCs have evolved from 8086 systems with distorted CGA graphics to 386SX speedsters with impressive VGA displays and room for at least 4MB of RAM. Nor has light weight been traded for power: Notebooks are holding steady at between 6 and 9 pounds—including battery, hard disk, modem, and AC adapter/charger.

The one disappointment is battery life. Lightweight machines always have this problem, and the power-hungry SX CPU makes matters worse. Not one of these notebooks runs more than 3 hours on a single charge. That's much too short for a coast-to-coast flight unless you pack extra batteries or compromise performance by turning on power-saving features.

For your shopping pleasure, we've selected seven of the top 16-MHz and 20-MHz 386SX notebooks and put

them to the test. Portability and battery life are still the most important buying issues, but performance varies widely enough that you should pay close attention to the benchmark results. And unless you plan to use your new SX notebook as a paperweight, a keyboard that's close to standard is essential. You'll want to look at RAM capacity, screen size, and price as well (see the sidebar "Buying Smart" for details).


With one exception (the 6.8-pound TI TravelMate 3000), all these systems weigh in between 8 and 8.5 pounds. Each boasts a bright monochrome VGA screen with a standard 1.3:1 aspect ratio and has a built-in 3½-inch floppy. And all turn in performance that's on a par with their 386SX desktop equivalents. Naturally, the two 20-MHz notebooks in this roundup (from Compaq and Texas Instruments) run circles around the five 16-MHz systems—and are priced accordingly.

Zeos's Notebook 386 is our Best Buy, thanks to its compelling combination of speed, above-average battery life, near-standard keyboard, and very low price. Two other systems come awfully close: Everex's Tempo LX (which is virtually identical to the Zeos, but a bit more expensive) and Compaq's faster—but pricier—LTE 386s/20.

As usual, we priced all the notebooks in the same *PC* World configuration: 4MB or 5MB of RAM, a 20MB hard disk, a built-in 1.44MB floppy drive, at least one parallel and one serial port, a 2400-bps internal modem, and DOS. Exceptions are noted in the individual reviews.

Bargain hounds, beware: These are not cheap sys-

tems. On average, these 4MB to 5MB SX machines cost about \$2000 more than the 1MB 8086-based notebooks we reviewed in October 1990, although only about \$750 more than 1MB 286-based systems. We think the extra performance and the ability to run 386-specific applications are worth the extra bucks.

ALR Venture 386SX

PROS: Low price, great keyboard

CONS: No internal modern, battery hard to change


With a street price of only \$2955 in the *PC World* configuration (with 5MB of RAM, but no modem) the ALR

Venture 386SX is the least expensive SX notebook reviewed. It boasts a superb keyboard and capable 16-MHz performance. This notebook won't hold an internal modem, though, and you need a screwdriver to change batteries—unfortunate, since battery life tops out at the usual stingy 21/4 hours.

Recharging the battery takes a while—the manual says 1 hour, but in informal tests, recharge time approached 3 hours. The charger lacks a charge-in-progress indicator, leaving you to guess when the battery is fully charged.

The keyboard is one of the best we've seen on a notebook PC. There are dedicated cursor keys in the standard inverted-T pattern and full-sized control keys, and the page control keys are dedicated too. Only the

Compaq's 20-MHz LTE 386s/20 runs away with performance honors, and you get a mouse port and a hefty RAM ceiling. But the keyboard isn't so hot, and the price is way high.

numeric keypad and <F11> and <F12> keys are emulated, forcing the user to press a second key at the same time.

The screen is the smallest of the lot, measuring only 8.4 inches diagonally. However, the image is sharp, you get 32 shades of gray, and you can change from normal to inverse video via a front-panel switch.

Technical support is good, even though you have to pay long-distance charges. Techies are available 9 hours a day. We called three times and got an immediate response on our first call; we left messages on the other two, and ALR got back to us within 20 minutes.

ALR's Venture 386SX has some problems, but they're not critical. Yes, it's hard to swap batteries, charging takes a while, and the screen is a little smaller than average—but none of these is a deal breaker. As for the missing internal modem, you can always plug a pocket modem into one of the two serial ports. So while the Venture 386SX misses a Best Buy, its rock-bottom price, good speed, and excellent keyboard make it quite appealing.

Compaq LTE 386s/20

PROS: Blazing speed, small size

CONS: Expensive, inferior keyboard

Compaq's 20-MHz LTE 386s/20 is far and away the fastest machine in the roundup and one of the smallest. It also delivers the longest battery life (2¾ hours) and the highest RAM capacity (10MB). These specs help explain its 8.4-pound heft and \$6616 street price (in the *PC World* configuration, with a 30MB hard disk)—the highest price in this review.

The LTE 386s/20 has fine battery features—including the longest life in the roundup. Recharge takes only about an hour and a half, and it's easy to swap batteries.

Unlike previous LTE keyboards, this one has good feel, and the control keys

Buying Smart

If you're planning to pack your portable down airplane aisles or into clients' offices, there's no such thing as too light or too small. That's the whole notebook idea. But as notebooks increase in power, they need to be evaluated less as laptops and more as familiar desktop PCs.



PORTABILITY

Don't settle for anything heavier than 10 pounds

"traveling weight"—the total for PC, battery, modem, and AC charger.

Since the weightiest of these SX notebooks is a mere 8½ pounds, you can clearly beat our recommendation.



BATTERY

Ideally, you should demand at least 3 hours of

life, but the best of these power-hungry SXs offers only 2³/₄ hours in full-featured mode. Recharge time of 1½ hours or less is another big plus—as is an indicator that lets you know when the recharge is complete.



SCREEN

All these notebooks deliver VGA graphics with

a standard 1.3:1 aspect ratio (which means no egg-shaped circles).

Screen sizes range from 34 to 47 square inches—the latter is about the equivalent of a 9-inch CRT. Look for the biggest screen you can

afford, and with 16 or more shades of gray. The more gray shades your notebook can display, the better color graphics will look on the monochrome screen.



KEYBOARD

Emulated keys slow typing and increase errors.

Look for dedicated cursor keys in the familiar inverted T, and dedicated page-control and function keys. As with any keyboard, responsive feel is important too.



PERFORMANCE

To take full advantage of 386-specific applications

like Windows 3.0, you'll want a CPU speed of at least 16 MHz—but 20 MHz is better. Hard disk speed is nearly as important, so look for average access time of less than 23ms. Happily, all but one of these machines (the Twinhead) have it.



EXPANDABILITY

Most 386-specific applications need a lot of

RAM. We consider a 4MB ceiling a reasonable amount, with 10MB none too much. You should also look for support for an internal modem so you don't have to pack one of those so-called pocket modems. A hard disk option of 60MB or bigger means you're equipped to run Windows.

Finally, an expansion chassis lets you connect easily with a network or specialized peripherals when you're off the road.



SERVICE AND SUPPORT

To compare tech support, we made three

blind calls to each vendor, asking a fairly technical question, and noted the time it took to get an answer.

Compaq owners must go through their local dealer—with quality of support varying from one location to another.



PRICE

We base our cost comparisons on street price.

For every machine (except those, like the Zeos, that are sold direct), we call as many as five PC dealers in each of eight cities (Boston, New York, Atlanta, Chicago, Dallas, Houston, San Francisco, and Los Angeles) and ask for a quote in the standard PC World configuration. Results are averaged.

Because the systems in this roundup are so new, we were able to get reliable street or direct-sale prices only for Compaq, Everex, and Zeos machines. We estimated street prices for the remaining systems by applying the discounts offered by dealers on similar products from the same manufacturer to the new machines' list prices. —TJB

are nice and large. But the page keys are still emulated, and the cursor keys remain in a maddening L-shaped layout. The screen is relatively small (38 square inches), but its image quality is excellent, with 32 shades of gray to help render colors in monochrome. Switching from text to graphics, however, may require careful adjustment.

Service is handled via Compaq's network of dealers. Reader surveys indicate that most users rate Compaq's support quality very highly, but of course service will vary from one dealer to the next. Compaq has recently added a central, toll-free number, but it will answer only very basic questions.

Compaq's LTE 386s/20 is clearly

aimed at users whose needs are above average. Performance is outstanding, the 10MB RAM ceiling is 4MB higher than the nearest competitor's, there's a mouse port, and options include a 60MB hard disk and a \$1499 docking station. While the LTE's 8.4-pound weight, non-standard keyboard, and premium price keep it out of the winner's circle, it's

probably the machine to buy if you plan to multitask more than four memoryhungry *Windows* applications.

Everex Tempo LX

PROS: Low price, fabulous screen

CONS: Relatively bulky

At a street price of \$3248 in the *PC* World configuration (with 5MB of RAM), Everex's 16-MHz Tempo LX is pleasantly inexpensive. Battery life is above average, performance is good, and the system comes with a great screen and a decent keyboard. But at 8.4 pounds and 244 cubic inches, it's also one of the heaviest and largest notebooks in this lightweight company.


The Tempo will run for 2 hours and 35 minutes on one charge, tying with the Zeos Notebook 386 for second-longest battery life. Moreover, it ties for the fastest recharge time in the roundup: only 1 hour.

The large screen measures 9½ inches diagonally and displays the sharpest, crispest LCD monochrome VGA image we've seen. However, like the Compaq, it requires careful adjustment when you're switching from text to graphics. It delivers 32 shades of gray, but only in the rarely used, low-resolution MCGA mode. In most cases, 16 shades is all you'll get.

The keyboard is better than most. Its feel is good, the dedicated cursor keys lie in the standard inverted T, and page keys are dedicated too. A few control keys are located oddly.

Technical support is quite good—although it requires a toll call. Technicians are on duty 11 hours a day, and all three of our queries were handled immediately.

The Everex Tempo LX has three strong selling points: a reasonably low price, a good screen, and a lightning recharge time. These highlights are dimmed somewhat by the notebook's size and weight, but it's still a reasonable choice.



If you buy Everex's inexpensive Tempo LX, you'll get good performance—plus a screen that's a pleasure to use. Moreover, recharge time is exceptionally fast.



At only 6.8 pounds, the 20-MHz TravelMate 3000 from Texas Instruments is portability champ, and its screen is big and bright. But there are keyboard and battery problems.

Death of the Desktop

The new generation of SX notebooks is making existing laptops virtually obsolete. Will these systems replace your desktop PC as well? Not quite yet. But they're getting closer than anyone could have guessed even a year ago.

Engineers still need to beat three major technical obstacles: lack of color, relatively low-capacity hard disks, and limited expansion options.

A solution to the color problem is almost here. Gorgeous, light-weight, LCD color screens are already available on several AC-powered laptops, and most engineers think it won't be more than two years before these units can lower their power consumption to where they'll run on battery power. Of course the price (currently about \$2000 extra) will need to drop too.

Likewise, large hard disks are simply a matter of time. Recently, 60MB hard disks in low-power, 2½-inch form factor have appeared. As soon as the state of the art reaches 120MB—probably within the year—this obstacle will evaporate.

Expansion boards are another

matter. Aside from sockets for a modem and memory upgrade, a square millimeter of free space inside a notebook is tough to find. The solution? A "docking



station," which offers plenty of room for more mass storage, network boards, and other devices. Slip your notebook in one of these when you get back from the road, and you can hook into the office LAN or any other desk-bound device. Three of the notebooks in this roundup have a connector that's designed to slide into a docking station, although only Compaq is currently shipping the station.

The desktop isn't dead quite yet. But once the color problem is solved, you may have a tough time justifying buying one machine for the road and another for your desk. —TJB

dard configuration, and page control keys are emulated. The 34-square-inch screen ties for the smallest in the review, and while it claims 64 shades of gray—the largest number in the roundup—they're available only in text modes (where they won't do you much good).

The technical support number is toll-free and operates 10 hours a day, and support quality seems good. Our calls were returned by a Samsung technician in 7 to 17 minutes.

The NoteMaster 386S/16N is certainly usable. But its small screen, short battery life, nonstandard keyboard, and long recharge cycle suggest you can do a lot better.

Texas Instruments TravelMate 3000

PROS: Fast, outstanding portability

CONS: Expensive, poor keyboard, short battery life

At a mere 6.8 pounds, Texas Instruments' TravelMate 3000 is by far the lightest and smallest machine in the roundup—and its fast 20-MHz CPU makes it second only to Compaq's LTE 386s/20 in performance. Moreover, it boasts a comfortable 6MB RAM ceiling. Unfortunately, the rest of the story isn't so rosy: The keyboard needs an overhaul, battery life ties for the worst in the roundup, and recharging is slow and unusually troublesome. And a \$5038 street price (in the *PC World* configuration) makes this one pricey package.

Typical battery life is only 2 hours—and recharging takes well over 4 hours. Worse yet, when you're finished charging the battery, it has to cool off for 30 minutes before you can use it! Your only defense will be a stockpile of charged batteries.

As for the keyboard, the touch is mushy, and sometimes you have to hit the keys hard to make contact. Page keys are emulated, and the function keys are so small, they're mere slivers of their former selves. And you may find

Samsung NoteMaster 386S/16

PROS: Mouse port, free copy of Windows **CONS:** Short battery life, inferior keyboard

Samsung's midpriced 16-MHz Note-Master 386S/16 has little to recommend it aside from a free copy of *Windows 3.0* and the mouse port to go with that program. For a \$3798 street price (in the *PC World* configuration, with 5MB of RAM), you get a relatively heavy machine with one of the smallest screens,

shortest battery lives, and longest recharge times in the roundup. The keyboard is jinxed by a nonstandard layout and too many emulated keys.

Battery life is one of the NoteMaster's biggest problems. You'll start seeing low-battery warnings after approximately 2 hours, and it takes 4¼ hours to recharge fully. The AC charger jack is located inconveniently behind a nail-breaking snap cover.

The keyboard could be a lot better, too. The cursor keys are in a nonstan-





The ALR Venture 386SX, the Somsung NoteMoster 386S/16, the Everex
Tempo LX, and the Zeos Notebook 386 were tested with 1MB of RAM; the Texas Instruments TravelMate 3000 and the Twinheod SuperNote 386SX/16, with 2MB; and the Compaq LTE 386s/20, with 3MB. Because each test was designed to run in 640K of RAM, memory size should have no effect on the benchmorks, with the exception of the *Porodox* test. The ALR, the Everex, the Samsung, and the Zeos were tested with a 20MB hord disk; the Twinhead, with a 40MB hord disk; and the Texas Instruments, with a 60MB hard disk. Eoch computer was tested with the vendor's version of DOS.




On the bright side, the TM 3000 comes with a 45-square-inch screen that's close to the largest in the roundup,

and it supports 32 shades of gray. Image quality is excellent, and the controls are conveniently located at the right of the screen, along with a normal/inverse video switch.

TI's technical support number is toll free, but you'll have to leave a message.

However, each of our three calls was returned within 20 minutes. Nor was the technician satisfied with leaving a message on our answering machine: He made repeated calls until he got us on the line live.

The TravelMate 3000 could have

been the perfect traveling companion. Its light weight, small size, large screen, fleet performance, and outstanding technical support are very appealing. There's even a built-in mouse port. Unfortunately, serious problems with its battery and keyboard prevent us from recommending this notebook—especially given its high price.

Twinhead SuperNote 386SX/16

PROS: Inexpensive, large screen, 80MB hard disk option

CONS: Slow, poor battery life

Twinhead's 8-pound SuperNote 386SX/16 notebook runs only \$3450 on the street (in the *PC World* configuration)—one of the lowest prices in the roundup—and it's also one of the smallest and lightest machines here. Moreover, it comes with the biggest screen of any SX notebook we've seen and offers an 80MB hard disk option. But that's where the good news ends. The Super-

Note 386SX/16 is the slowest system in the roundup, its battery life ties for the shortest, its 4MB RAM ceiling is the lowest, and its nonstandard keyboard layout resembles the Compaq LTE's.

More battery blues: Not only does power run out after a brief 2 hours, but the low-battery signal starts beeping annoyingly after 1 hour. And at 21/4 hours, battery recharge time is only average.

The keyboard has a good feel, but page keys are emulated, and the cursor keys are arranged in the L-shaped "Compaq-style" layout. At 47 square inches the screen is quite large, and colors are rendered in 32 tones of gray. There is no room for an internal modem, but Twinhead does sell a pocket modem that you can connect to either of the two serial ports.

Technical support is excellent: toll free, and available 12 hours a day. All three of our queries were answered immediately.

A rock-bottom price, a big, crisp

screen, and solid phone support are good—but not good enough to recommend the Twinhead SuperNote 386SX/16. In this highly competitive market, last-place performance, short battery life, a quirky keyboard, and a missing modem don't add up to a smart buy.

Zeos Notebook 386



PROS: Low price, terrific screen, good keyboard

CONS: Relatively bulky

At \$3195 (in the standard *PC World* configuration, with 5MB of RAM), the Zeos Notebook 386 is one of the least expensive SX notebooks on the street. Moreover, except for a few cosmetic differences and a street price that's \$53 lower, it's identical to the Everex Tempo LX. That means this 16-MHz, 8.4-pound system is large and heavy for a featherweight, but it delivers good speed, an excellent display, better-than-average battery life, and a good keyboard—all at a very low price.

The only significant differences between the Zeos and the Everex lie in the layout of the keyboard—and most of those changes are improvements. Unlike on the Everex keyboard, all the control keys are where they belong, and all 12 function keys are dedicated. The only regrettable modification is the emulated page controls.

Technical support is second to none, with toll-free, 24-hour, 7-day-a-week telephone help. Every one of our three calls was answered immediately by a live person, even at very odd hours.

While 8.4 pounds is relatively hefty for this roundup, it's still amazingly light compared to the best laptops of even a year ago. No other notebook here offers as tempting a combination of decent performance, excellent screen quality, good keyboard, quick recharge, and an internal modem—all at a very attractive price. This may not be the perfect portable, but it's a perfect mix of trade-offs, and a worthy Best Buy. (continues)







How we rate notebook computers

We rate notebooks based on information in the Features Evaluation and the PC World Test Report, combined with our opinions of quality, reliability, and user benefit.

Portability rates size and traveling weight (including PC, battery, modem, and AC adapter). To receive an Excellent rating, a notebook must be under 300 cubic inches in size and have a traveling weight of less than 10 pounds.

Battery life also rates battery-charging features. We require at least 3 hours of battery life (with battery-saving options disabled) for an Excellent rating.

Screen groups ergonomic features that make staring at the PC for hours as pleasant as possible. To rate an Excellent, a notebook's screen must have

VGA resolution, standard 1.3:1 aspect ratio, at least 16 shades of gray in graphics mode, and 40 square inches of screen area.

Keyboard covers features that make it easy to switch back and forth between a standard desktop keyboard and that of the notebook. Dedicated cursor, control, page, and function keys in the standard IBM 101-key keyboard layout, plus desktop-quality touch, will yield an Excellent rating.

Expandability combines the total amount of installable RAM, plus options like an internal modem, a large hard disk, an expansion chassis, and a mouse port. To earn an Excellent rating, the notebook must support at least 6MB of RAM, a 40MB hard disk option, and an internal modem.

Performance scores are calculated by comparing each notebook's test scores to those of the other notebooks and of a spectrum of 16-MHz

803B6SX desktop PCs. To earn an Excellent rating, a notebook must excel in at least three-quarters of the benchmarks.

Service and support includes the length of the warranty, quality of documentation, quality and availability of phone support, support hours, and other support services. A notebook with at least one year's full warranty, a toll-free tech support number, long support hours, and good support quality merits an Excellent rating.

Price refers to street price. An Excellent rating means a notebook's price is in the lowest third of the price range for this roundup.

Overall value takes into account all of the above criteria with emphasis on portability, battery life, keyboard, price, and speed.

Buying Smart: Data Base Managers

When you shop for a data manager, the list of considerations is long and fairly complicated. Below, we've explained the key issues with as little jargon as possible, in order of importance for typical applications—but the ranking will vary depending on the job at hand.



EASE OF USE

Whether you're doing a once-only query or

writing a huge application, you'll want a friendly interface. Look for clearly designed menu systems, uncluttered displays, on-line help, and good documentation. Programs that maintain a consistent interface no matter what activity you're engaged in help reduce training and support.



INTERACTIVE USE

A program needs more than just a pretty inter-

face to be an effective interactive data manager. Even if you depend on programmed applications, you'll want the flexibility of ad hoc queries and on-the-fly reports. Look for competent tools for browsing, querying, entering, and editing data.

A spreadsheetlike table view for browsing data is a must—you should be able to display more than one table on screen at once. The best programs let you choose selected fields to display and let you display multiple table views whether the tables are related or not.

For finding information on the fly, you con't beat a query-by-example (QBE) facility. QBE lets you ask questions by simply checking off the fields you want and entering the criteria for your searches. Look for the ability

to relate files on the fly as you create a query, so you're not limited to the fields and records defined in whatever form you happen to be working with at the time.

Also essential are file-level data validation rules, which control what type of data can be entered, such as multiple-choice text fields ("Mr.," "Mrs.," "Ms.," "Doctor") and ranges for number and data fields. All these programs let you validate in your applications, but only a DBMS with validation capabilities built into the data file structure can guarantee that the same rules apply whether you're entering data in a custom form, through an application, or on the fly.

Most users will want the ability to assign and save relationships with a file. Otherwise, you'll have to redefine the link every time you want to relate a particular set of tables.

Other data entry features to look for include calculated fields (which automatically run a mathematical operation when you enter data) and auto-incrementing fields, used for consistently numbering orders and customers. Referential integrity—the automatic updating of linked values in related files—is required to prevent corrupting related information.



APPLICATION DEVELOPMENT

All the programs provide application generators that generate code based on existing forms and reports. You can rarely use an application generator to write all of a program's code, but it can save a lot of tedious coding when you write more complex programs.

Make sure the underlying language is robust. In addition to standard programming functions such as complete support for conditional statements and control structure commands, look for commands that make it easy to produce windows, menus, and other interface objects.

A good, interactive debugger is also important. This helps you catch errors by displaying code, application, and changing memory variables (temporary holding areas of RAM used to store data) on the same screen as you step through the code. Once you've written applications, you'll want to distribute them among your co-workers. You do this by means of a run time—a version of the DBMS that can be used only for running your applications. Purchasing a royalty-free run time lets you distribute applications freely.



FORMS AND REPORTS

As the gatekeepers for data entry input and

printed output, forms and reports are crucial. All the programs offer form generators that let you freely paint the screen, moving fields where you want them. Look for one that lets you set relationships for data entry and editing from within the form (for example, allowing you to embed fields from more than one table). You will probably want a form generator that lets you view multiple detail records for a master record—for example, with the order header on top of the screen and the scrolling line items on the bottom.

For ease of use, a report writer should be band-oriented, providing separate sections of the screen for the top of the page, the beginning of the summary, records, the end of the summary, and so on. The more closely formatted elements resemble

the final printout, the fewer drafts you'll have to print to get the look you want. The report generator should also let you set up calculated fields (all the reviewed programs do) and define relationships without having to do a query first.



PERFORMANCE

The bigger your data base and user base, the

more important performance becomes. See the PC World Test Report for the results of our benchmarks, and see "Five Problems in Search of a Data Base" to see which tests are more important to your applications.



MULTIUSER CAPABILITIES

All the programs work

on a LAN, but some offer better multiuser controls. Automatic, hasslefree file and record locking are essential for networking. File locking places various levels of restriction on a file (table) to prevent loss of data or compromised data integrity. Record locking protects data by allowing only one user to change a particular record at a time. Most products provide several file-locking levels, from full locks (total lockout) down to prevent-write locks (others can look but can't touch).

The program should permit only one person at a time to edit a record but should enable other users to browse, query, or report on the same data at the same time. One problem most of the reviewed DBMS's share:

They won't let two people add or save a new record in the same file simultaneously. —C. R.

Sometimes you really should demand the best of both worlds—especially if you're called upon to select your office's data base management package.

If your work group does heavy data entry, you'll want a programmable data manager that enables you or a developer to create custom multiuser applications. Perfect for standardized jobs like order entry, mailings, and inventory, custom applications protect your data base from errors while making it easy for employees to enter data and run preset reports.

On the other hand, managers and other authorized users need to be able to run ad hoc queries and reports unanticipated by a developer. For that you need a DBMS with good *interactive* features: flexible querying, forms design, and reporting tools, as well as a simple interface that's ready to use right out of the box. Otherwise, you may have to wait until the programmer arrives if you have a sudden desire to know the status of orders by region, overtime by department, or cash flow by quarter.

PC World compared six multiuser, relational data managers that claim to live in both worlds: powerful languages and development tools for work group applications and easy-to-use front ends for ad hoc manipulation. Only Borland's Paradox 3.5 excels all around, winning a Best Buy for its superb combination of programming and interactive features.

Why You Need Programming

Not everyone needs a fully relational, multiuser, programmable DBMS. If your data base needs are simple, such as managing a list of contacts, you'll probably prefer a data manager without a programming language, like Q&A or $Professional\ File$ —generally, they're cheaper and easier to use.

But aside from the inability to create more than simple applications, nonprogrammable data managers have other limits, usually in the area of relational and multiuser capabilities. Whereas the programs reviewed here are all flexible at relating data, letting you easily generate a query, form, or report from multiple files simultaneously, most nonprogrammables won't allow you to relate a record in one data table to many records in another. And whereas the DBMS's in this roundup offer roughly equivalent multiuser features, many nonprogrammables balk when more than one user tries to access the same file or record concurrently. The result is headaches as your needs change and your data base grows. (For a closer look at nonprogrammables and other data base alternatives, turn to our accompanying decision tree, "Know Your Options"; for a discussion of relational issues, see *Data Basics* in this issue.)

In evaluating these programs, we've considered six key buying issues: ease of use, interactive features, application development tools, report and dataentry-form generators, performance, and multiuser features. Because the importance of each criterion will vary according to your needs, we've laid out five common scenarios for using these programs (see the sidebar "Five Problems in Search of a Data Base"). Find the one that most closely parallels your situation, and use it as a guide to decide which DBMS best fills the bill. For more details on key buying issues, see "Buying Smart: Data Base Managers."

Advanced Revelation 2.03

PROS: Powerful form generator, file-level controls

CONS: Confusing user interface, no bandoriented report generator, slow queries

Born to help developers create sophisticated transaction-processing applications, *Advanced Revelation* adds a full set of interactive tools to its formidable programming language. Yet the interface is confusing, and some key development tools are missing. Other deficits include slow querying, an antiquated report writer; and a high price. Unless

you're a professional developer who needs maximum programming flexibility in creating applications, *Advanced Revelation* is only a fair value.

In performance, $Advanced\ Revelation$ is a mixed bag. It came in dead last

in the multiuser gross-sales query test. However, it proved much faster in its strong suit—processing transactions.

Exploring the obscure menu structure is like wandering through a maze. Even a simple task like creating a data file is a mystery at first. Table views aren't configurable—you can't display just a few fields, for example—and you can't set relations from inside the QBE (query-by-example) facility. The file structure is a plus, however: Every field

type and validation tool you'll need can be built directly into a file.

The form generator is first-class; you can even use it to create new files or hook your own programs into the fields. But the report writer is the only one in

the roundup without a band orientation—you can create a variety of reports, but not easily.

Similar to BASIC, Advanced Revelation's programming language is the most powerful (and difficult) of the bunch. Advanced programmers will enjoy the added flexibility of manipulating arrays to create a custom file format. And if you really want to get down and dirty, you can integrate C or assembler routines in your applications.



DataEase guides you through the process of creating a complex relationship step by step, explaining each option clearly as you come to it.

Yet development tools are surprisingly deficient. The debugger won't let you view variables as they change or even toggle between your code and program. And while an *Advanced Revelation* run time is available, you can't—as you can with the other programs reviewed here—distribute unlimited cop-

ies of it with your applications.

Advanced Revelation is too knotty for interactive use or simple programming. Even professional programmers may be turned off by the slow query speed, poor debugger, and lack of a free run time. For most developers and nearly all managers, better options exist.

DataEase 4.24

PROS: Great forms, file-level controls, excellent multiuser capabilities

CONS: Difficult report generator, no debugger

DataEase is a friendly, competent DBMS with a top-notch form generator, but it still has some growing to do. Programmers will lament the lack of a debugger, LAN users will be disappointed by the slow multiuser queries, and just about everyone will struggle with the difficult report writer. But in the end great forms overcome all flaws—if your programming needs are modest, your data bases aren't too big, and multiuser access isn't too heavy.

Rather than bombard you with menus, *DataEase* walks you through the options a step at a time. This makes the program easy to learn but slows you down once you're accomplished, unless you type commands in directly via the advanced user interface.

It's easy to create forms, and with them data files. When you create a field, a dialog box pops up showing you every possible configuration option.

Querying is a breeze—you select records via a variety of criteria, and you can toggle freely between form and table views. *DataEase* makes relating data almost foolproof. You can link files using any field or group of fields that match in two forms.

The report writer has some serious flaws. You'll have to insert group or page footers into report formats manually, and placing detail items and summary fields precisely can be tricky. One nice touch: You can easily create a report that mimics your data-entry form.

DataEase's development environment is the most limited in the roundup. It's OK for creating simple applications without programming, and if you must program, DataEase prompts you through the process. The SQL-like language itself is suitable—as with Paradox, it's only slightly less powerful than its rivals—but DataEase doesn't in-



DBMS Alternatives

Is a programmable DBMS right for your situation, or would a nonprogrammable data base, a SQL server, or another alternative be a better fit?



Nonprogrammable DBMS. Designed primarily for single-user applications and mailing list data bases, programs such as Q&A, Professional File, and PC-File are semirelational, providing lookup tables to simulate many-to-one relations between tables. Others, such as Alpha Four, come close to the relational pawer of the programmable DBMS's reviewed here but lack tricks such as the ability ta edit mare than one table at a time.

No matter how relational the program, when your data bose approaches a certain level of camplexity, it will require programming. Some nonprogrammables after menu-driven application generators that record and piece together forms and reports that you create interactively. These are fine for forging simple applications, but you'll need a true programming language for most business applications. Also, most nonprogrammables lack flexible file- and record-locking schemes, and many provide no network support.

Contact management program. Based on a data base core, contact managers are designed far sales professionals and athers who need to keep track of phone cantacts. They pravide data entry forms with predefined and user-defined fields for taking notes on each call. Most include text search and scheduling madules, and same include time and billing and praject planning features (see "Buyers' Guide: Contact Management Software," February 1991).

Development environment. If your applications are complex and you need to automate a dedicated function such as order processing rather than freely extract and manipulate data, consider a dedicated development tool like Clipper or Clarion. They lack user frant ends for on-the-fly queries and reports, but they offer powerful programming languages and a full set of development tools. The main draw is an EXE compiler. Compored to the

run-time versions offered by most DBMS's, compiled EXE pragrams use fewer files, consume less disk space, and usually run faster.

SQL data base server. If you're planning a large, complex transaction-processing application in which records are constantly updated and accessed by a horde of data entry clerks, consider a SQL data base server such as SQL Server. Such a program is better at handling simultaneaus multiuser access than a standard DBMS (SQL servers are faster on a large, busy LAN) and has better security features, including transaction rollback, which, in the event of a crash, returns a data base to its previous status. You can use a variety of applications (including three of the DBMS's reviewed here) as front ends for querying the central SQL server. On the downside, even the best data bose servers are difficult to install and maintain, and they require castly hardware ta run properly.

Five Problems in Search of a Data Base

What are you using your data base manager for? These programs have a wide variety of uses, and the best solution for one office may be the worst for another. Here are five typical scenarios, along with the most relevant features and performance issues and the programs that fit the bill.

Shared Billing

Scenario: You and a few coworkers in a customer service or accounts payable department need to enter and look up customer billing information on a network. No one wants to learn programming, and hiring a consultant would exceed your budget. Everyone must be able to create queries and reports without interrupting data entry.

Key features: Relational table view,

has a dozen or so people, all of whom enter leads in a common data base for generating mailings and individual action reports. Many of the sales representatives are computer novices, and they must be able to enter and search extensive notes.

Key features: Good programming environment, strong multiuser features, text file support

Key tests: Multiuser transactions

Recommendation: FoxPro, dBASE IV

Large-Scale Inventory/ Invoicing

Scenario: Your mail-order company needs a system to handle inventory, order taking, shipping, and billing. While all of these functions must be automated, managers need to be able to access the data freely for creative analysis. The volume of data entry is heavy.

Key features: Fast multiuser performance, first-rate multiuser capabilities, excellent programming environment, powerful QBE

Key tests: Multiuser transactions

Recommendation: No single product reviewed fits perfectly, so expect some compromises. Only Advanced

reviewed fits perfectly, so expect some compromises. Only Advanced Revelation provides the programming power to do this heavy transaction environment justice, yet it lacks the interactive tools managers require. Another possibility: a multiapplication solution, perhaps built around a SQL data server (see "Know Your Options").

Large-Scale Integrated Accounting

LAN-based accounting system that will be accessed by over 20 local employees. The system must also interact with branch offices, most of which use simple data managers that save data in the dBASE DBF file format.

Key features: Powerful programming language, direct dBASE-file access
Key tests: All multiuser tests
Recommendation: FoxPro

clude a debugger, so you'll have to try to catch mistakes as your application speeds by in real time.

When it comes to multiuser capabilities, *DataEase* is tops. It's one of only two reviewed DBMS's that allow two users to enter new records simultaneously in the same table.

If you want quick and easy—yet fully relational—forms and reports, and your programming needs are modest, *DataEase* is a good solution.




Like the proverbial camel, *dBASE IV* has the look of a program designed by committee—and the committee left out a few important humps. Despite a confusing interface and middling speed,

however, *dBASE IV* has a lot going for it: top-notch form, report, and application generators; superb QBE; and an industry-standard language and file format.

dBASE IV 1.0 was slow, buggy, and memory hungry, but version 1.1 has answered most of those complaints. In addition to requiring less RAM than before and being as bug-free as its rivals, dBASE IV now ships with a special disk cache that speeds throughput. In most



tests, it performed reasonably well, but it was quite slow at transaction processing.

The program's menuing system is still cumbersome and confusing at times, with options popping up in menus where you'd least expect them. Most of the flaws in *dBASE IV*, however, pertain to the aging dBASE file format. There's no way to put data validation, calculations, relational settings, or just about any other specifics in a data file. Simply stated, unless you're the only user of a simple, single-file system, you shouldn't update a *dBASE IV* data base without going through a front-end application.

If you're just looking at data, dBASE IV is a jewel, with a versatile table view and a superb fully relational QBE that toggles easily between the table view and a topflight report generator. It's simple to report on related files, summarizing information and specifying complex calculations with a minimum of effort. The form and report generators both produce editable dBASE code, making reports easy to alter.

dBASE really shines as a programming environment. The application generator is versatile and the debugger

quite good. And since the language and file formats are industry standards, they're well supported by third-party utilities.

If you need to enter or update data without having to create applications, look elsewhere. But *dBASE IV* makes querying a snap, and it's a good choice for application development.

PROS: Fastest in roundup, GUI-like interface, dBASE compatible

CONS: Nonrelational form generator, no QBE, no file-level controls

FoxPro leads the pack in three important areas: performance, development tools, and ease of use. In our benchmarks, FoxPro was the overall leader, excelling in the multiuser tests. FoxPro's adherence to the dBASE file format and lack of QBE make it less useful for ad hoc data manipulation than Paradox, dBASE IV, or R:base, but if application development is your top priority, FoxPro is the best tool for the job.

The *FoxPro* interface is a smooth, text-based imitation of a graphical display, with pulldowns, pop-ups, adjustable windows, scroll bars, and the best mouse support in the roundup.

Hobbled by its dBASE file format, *FoxPro* lacks file-level data validation—you can add validation via programming, but you can't safely enter data directly if you bypass the application.

Still, some of *FoxPro*'s interactive features are excellent. You can set up your work environment by pointing and

Methodology


All single-user tests were performed on a 20-MHz Compaq Deskpro 386/20e with 4MB RAM and a 110MB hard disk. Multiuser tests were performed using a Compaq Deskpro 386/25 server with 10MB RAM and a 300MB hard disk, and 24 8-MHz 286 Eltech System 1800 PCs with 640K RAM and 20MB hard disks as workstations. To enhance performance and simulate normal use, we placed each user's private directory on the server. Six tables were created with each product: a 25-record salesperson table, a 1000-record customer table, a 25,000-record orders table, a 250,396-record parts-ordered table, a 2000-record parts table, and a 500-record vendor table. We assumed the existence of an imaginary seventh table for storing city, county, state, and ZIP code fields with a primary index on the ZIP code field. This action minimized duplication in the customer, orders, and vendor tables and made it necessary for each product to maintain secondary indexes on the linking ZIP code fields. We also created a 10,000-record transaction table to simulate a user performing data entry. This table was composed of customer information, shipping address, name of part ordered, and number of parts. Tables were linked by assigning each salesperson multiple customers, by having each customer place multiple orders, and by having each order composed of multiple parts. Each part ordered was linked to a parts table and a vendor. Single-user tests were run



clicking to open data files, set relations, and specify expressions for selecting records. These setups can be saved for future use, and you can view related files in multiple windows. But *FoxPro* is the only DBMS reviewed without a QBE facility. In its place, there's a tool for piecing together queries from dBASE commands—a paltry substitute.

The disappointing form generator is only partially relational—you'll have to program to get more than simple one-to-one relationships. Although it works with a mouse, it lacks the wonderful *FoxPro* interface. On the other hand, the report generator is fully relational and easy to use.

As a programming environment, *FoxPro* is unsurpassed. The program provides objects such as windows, dialog boxes, and scroll bars and lets you easily build them into your applications. The debugger is the best of the bunch. The application generator is the only weak point—it uses the same difficult interface as the form generator.

FoxPro is a great development environment and seems to be getting better. Version 2.0, promising better form and application generators, QBE, and a true EXE compiler, could be out by the time you read this.





The *Paradox* report writer is above average, letting you create calculated and summary fields without programming. You can set up relations easily, but you can't cut and paste freely between report bands, which makes design changes difficult. One unique plus: You can graph your data, using a variety of graph types. You can also create crosstab reports to help you pull statistical

trends from your data.

As a development environment, *Paradox* isn't as powerful as *FoxPro* but is a lot easier to use. The language is designed around *Paradox*'s interface, letting you ease into programming once you master interactive use.





R:base makes building applications so easy, you may not need a developer to create them. It boasts a powerful programming language and superb report and form generators, and its pleasant interface and superb QBE make it second only to Paradox as an interactive data manager. R:base's slow transaction processing makes it a poor choice for large, multiuser applications, and the program lacks a debugger, but it's a good choice overall.

R:base's mouse support and wellorganized pulldown menus are buttressed by helpful prompts and superb documentation. But you may have to wait a while after you pick a command—the program can be sluggish.

Data validation tools are extensive,

even though you can't format data at the file level. The inability to view nonrelated multiple tables on screen mars otherwise top-notch interactive skills.

The *R:base* report generator is much like dBASE IV's—it's easy to set up fields and report on related information. You have to hassle with variables and special expressions to create summary and calculated fields, but this makes R:base reports more flexible. Like Paradox, R:base provides statistical cross-tab reports.

If *R:base*'s superb application generator can't create the application you need, you can turn to the powerful programming language. The lack of an interactive debugger, however, means longer and more frustrating development time.

LAN support is fairly good, except that *R:base* is the only DBMS reviewed that won't let you create or change a report or form while the data file is in use. However, R:base is unique in that two users can simultaneously modify different fields in the same record.

If you don't have scores of users up dating a data base, and if creating forms and reports easily is a top priority, R:base can fill your needs handily.

Watching the Data Flow

For the all-around Best Buy, nothing beats Paradox's combination of interactive and programming features. If creating applications is your top concern, *FoxPro* is a good choice. If your development needs are simple and speed isn't an issue, DataEase and R:base make good interactive data handlers.

Conventional wisdom told us there were two kinds of data managers: multiuser monsters that require programming, and simple, limited flat-file ones. But programs like *Paradox* prove the choice between automation and improvisation needn't be a choice at all. €

One reason multimedia has become so hot recently is that Microsoft and IBM have put their stamp of approval on the technology by announcing versions of *Windows 3.0* and OS/2 that support it. With just a few hardware upgrades (see the sidebar "Multimedia Made Affordable"), the average *Windows* or OS/2 user will be able to run applications that incorporate sound, video, and animation.

Vendors are banking on the fact that adding these effects to applications will help combat information overload. "We have far too much information to deal with in the time we have available to make decisions," suggests Richard Hoakum, whose San Francisco company, Hoakum Associates, has been producing interactive video presentations for ten years. "Today, data has to be packaged in a form that gets to you faster. Ultimately, the feeling or emotion that the data conveys may prove more important than the dry data itself," he adds.

REAL-WORLD APPLICATIONS

To get a sense of what these multimedia applications for *Windows* will look like, *PC World* talked to a number of developers and early adopters of multimedia technology. We also looked at a number of projects created and under development for the PC, the Macintosh, and the NeXT machine. While the latter two are more advanced platforms for multimedia development, they indicate what *Windows* users can look forward to.

INTERACTIVE TRAINING

Almost all the software and hardware vendors contacted believe that training will be the hottest multimedia application, at least in the immediate future. "The initial use of multimedia primarily is going to be in business education," says Ed Juge, director of marketing at the Radio Shack division of Tandy, which is due to release an inexpensive machine and upgrade kit for multimedia sometime this spring.

Multimedia PCs can provide "justin-time" training, where a large amount
of material is stored on a CD ROM and
accessed as needed. For example, if
you're a marketing manager who does
sales forecasting twice a year, you might
want a refresher on cross-tabulation
just before preparing your findings.
Just-in-time training saves the time and
expense involved in sending executives
to off-site training centers.

Multimedia software allows users to tailor training programs to their individual needs. To provide this capability, software developers use a technology called hypermedia to create interactive applications. With such software, a user can click with a mouse (or other pointing device) on a word or graphic anywhere on the screen and access video, sound, text, a graphic, or numbers offering additional information on the topic. Hypermedia gives the trainee control over both the sequence and the content of training material.

Herbert Cotter, director of multi-

media marketing development for IBM, describes a future training system that would be available over networked workstations, with gigabytes of information stored on large optical storage devices. "Users would be able to bring up on demand any topic they needed help on," he explains. Such systems might feature a videotape of an expert talking about a subject and include questions and an-

swers about the material. Individuals could branch through the training program, requesting additional information on material they didn't understand or skipping irrelevant sections.

One simple training application is already up and running in the Schenectady, New York, offices of General Electric's Industrial and Power Group. If a Macintosh IIcx user has a problem, Mac troubleshooter Steve Rosen works it through on his system and prepares a "tape" of how to fix it using the screen-recorder program *MediaTracks* from Farallon Computing of Emeryville, California. He then sends the captured sequence over the network to the employee needing assistance. Farallon also offers the MacRecorder sound system, which works in conjunction with *MediaTracks* to add sound, so users can record explanations to go along with the screen tapes.

Microsoft is already preparing training lessons for its own programs, though the company has made no specific announcements. "Microsoft will do things like provide animated lessons. Training for a spreadsheet might, for example, show someone circling numbers that will be changed. This type of training could make users want to learn and make learning easier," says Melinda French, group product manager of the Entry Business Unit. As a first step in that direction, Microsoft already offers the hypermedia-based *Productivity* Pack that teaches users about the functionality of Windows (see the review of Microsoft Productivity Pack for Windows in this Special Report).

IMPROVED COMMUNICATIONS

A speaker's tone of voice usually helps people understand the intent of a statement. It's not surprising, then, that multimedia developers are working on ways to allow users to attach voice comments to applications such as spreadsheets, data bases, text documents, or E-mail.

Steve Jobs's NeXT system has had this capability from its introduction—in early models, voice could be recorded via a plug-in microphone and the latest models have the microphone built-in. Admation's *Live Wire* uses this feature of the NeXT machine as part of a sophisticated system for live conferencing over a network. Users can select other participants from a list—each of whom





Northern Telecom's hypertext-based Skillpath system makes it easy for employees to find information about the company's many products. The system consists of three data bases: one for products, one for manufacturing locations, and one for marketing locations. Because the system takes advantage of hypertext's navigational capabilities, users can jump from one data base to another by clicking on the appropriate icon. Each picture on the main menu, shown in SCREEN 1, takes you to a different part of the system. Icons on the Power Map bulletin board lead to information about various product lines; books on the shelf deliver you into the manufacturing and marketing data bases or give you access to reference material; items on the end table lead to training materials; and the TV leads to an overview of the entire system. Once inside a data base, such as the product information file shown in SCREEN 2 (the user has selected the photo of the product by clicking on the camera icon at the right of the screen), you can access marketing information (SCREEN 3) and factory information (SCREEN 4) by pressing the dollar bill or the factory icon, respectively. Clicking on the boxes at the bottom of the screen takes you to information about the company's other product lines.

will appear in an on-screen window—and can transmit text, voices, and images to them. The package can also save a report of the conference, including images and icons for voice attachments.

The three newest Macintosh models also come with built-in chips and operating system software that support sound, and a number of applications that support voice annotation have been introduced recently for the Mac. Ashton-

Tate's FullImpact spreadsheet, Full-Write Professional word processor, and a number of E-mail packages such as CE Software's QuickMail, WordPerfect's Office Mail, and Microsoft Mail are just a few examples.

Although the PC is not quite as advanced as these other platforms, Da-Vinci Systems is showing a prototype of its *Windows*-based *DaVinci eMail* that can transmit sound as a binary attach-

ment to electronic messages. The system will ship after the release of the multimedia version of *Windows*, which will provide the drivers for the sound boards necessary to support the voice annotations.



tions that include video, animation, music, and voices.

Northern Telecom, for example, has developed such a sales presentation to razzle-dazzle the topmost information system executives who make the checkbook decisions on Northern Telecom's networking and telecommunications equipment.

"Each group brings their own problems and issues, "says Leigh Kahan, manager of media development at Northern Telecom.

The solution to such diversity was about four hours' worth of video clips of experts addressing numerous points, plus assorted maps and charts that displayed various network configurations, all of it stored on seven laser disks behind the scenes. These elements are tied together by *Authorware Professional*, a Macintosh-based authoring package. (Authoring software is high-level programming language that developers use to put together multimedia applications.) A *Windows* version of *Authorware* has been announced and should be available by the time you read this.

The presentation is shown on two 4-by-6-foot televisionlike monitors. Using a remote control device, the presenter can quickly access appropriate multimedia materials using *Authorware*'s hypertext capabilities.

If you want to create your own presentations to run on a standard 286 (or above) machine with VGA graphics, Brown-Wagh Publishing offers Ask-Me 2000, one of the few low-end multimedia packages available for the PC. The \$495 package is an authoring system that allows a nonprogrammer to create a multimedia presentation that includes even digitized video. Creating the digitized video is as simple as recording video with a camcorder and digitizing it with a product such as Jovian-Logic's \$895 SuperVia video capture board. You can play back the video in an Ask-Me presentation on any VGA system. Although Ask-Me runs the video at 4 frames per second rather than the broadcast rate of 30 frames per second, the quality should

suffice for many applications.

Greg Bennion of StudioGraphics in Redwood City, California, for example, has used *Ask-Me 2000* for all manner of presentations, from exhibits at trade shows, to an interactive training system for Chevron about shipping hazardous chemicals, to a demonstration for new parents on childproofing a home. SOUPED-UP DATA BASES

Looking up information via a data base has never been easy. Although *dBASE* no longer requires that you use complex dot commands just to perform a simple query, learning its Command Center user interface is no picnic. And while picture data bases that can store and retrieve images have been available for a number of years, images could never be kept in a data base with other data. Powerful new hypermedia data bases

are changing all that.

One firm that has already implemented such a data base is the big accounting firm of Ernst & Young. The company is using a proprietary hypertext-based relational data base system called HyperMAS running on PCs to support its CASE (computer-aided software engineering) methodology, which helps clients plan, analyze, design, construct, and implement new information systems. When clients have a question while reading through the methodology material, they can simply highlight an item with the mouse and request additional information. For example, highlighting 'critical success factors' segues the reader in seconds to other explanations or uses of the term without losing the reader's place in the original material. Because the alternative for clients is querying high-priced Ernst & Young consultants, the system offers substantial cost savings.

Northern Telecom has developed a similar hypermedia-based system, written in *Authorware Professional* and run on Macintoshes, to help keep its employees up-to-date on an ever-growing and increasingly complex product line. This data base also includes video demonstrations of how some of the products work.

COMPLETE BUSINESS SOLUTIONS

Systems that combine multimedia with a whole suite of linked *Windows* applications are even more impressive. Louis Berman, president of Braintree Ltd. in New York City, has combined multimedia with a *Windows* Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) facility to create a super data base application that may portend powerful future applications.

Berman has come up with an application for orthopedists that combines a data base, graphics, and a DDE link to *Microsoft Word* into a system that ultimately produces reports for insurance companies. "Doctors are not willing to sit down and do paperwork," said Ber-

S

man. His application spares the doctors the chore of filling out insurance forms, while ensuring that the forms are filled out completely.

Berman's system guides a clinician or trained secretary through a series of branching questions that ultimately provide all the data the forms require. The response for each question is either a multiple-choice selection or a click on a drawing of a skeleton. For instance, the program's question 'Where does it hurt?' might be answered with a click on the upper portion of the leg. The program fills in the medical language, strings responses into sentences where necessary, and prints out the form.

The PC-based system uses db-Vista from Raima Corporation of Bellevue, Washington, to store data and graphics. ToolBook 1.0 from Asymetrix, running under Windows 3.0, links data—the name of a bone or the medical name for a particular problem, such as a bone chip—to the corresponding portion of the drawing in a hypermedia fashion. Toolbook was also used to program the DDE link between the data base and predefined Microsoft Word style sheets, which match the insurance forms so that data can be pulled into the forms automatically.

Berman plans to incorporate some of the new multimedia features when the multimedia extensions become available. "Eventually we'll pull in video and sound as narration," Berman says. "We could show the doctors telling the clerks what they should know, say, about the tibia."

Berman's and the other applications we've illustrated here represent the beginning of a fundamental shift in the way PCs present information. Instead of using only text, PCs can use the most appropriate means to get a point across. And just as a picture is worth a thousand words, sound, animation, and video will improve communication by another order of magnitude.



All of the new multimedia software would be of little value if the hardware necessary to run it were out of reach for most users. Microsoft and Tandy have therefore defined a minimum standard configuration for running multimedia applications. The system consists of an IBM PC/AT (Intel 80286, 10 MHz) with 2MB of RAM, a 30MB hard drive, 8-bit VGA graphics, enhanced audio, and a CD ROM drive. (Because multimedia applications contain graphics, they tend to require the hundreds of megabytes of inexpensive storage space found on a CD.) Some multimedia developers argue that you really need an Intel 80386-25 machine with 4MB of RAM and all the other enhancements. Whatever base platform you elect, the only new investments required for multimedia are the CD ROM drive and the audio board.

Vendors who have announced plug-and-play systems equipped with all the necessary hardware and the extended Windows 3.0 user interface include Zenith Data Systems, Fujitsu, NEC, Olivetti, CompuAdd, and Tandy. Media Vision has announced a \$1299 upgrade kit, expected to ship by the time you read this, that includes a sound board and a CD ROM drive. At the time this article went to press, none of these systems had shipped, though Tandy says its may be available by the end of the summer.



TAKE a forms package, add some smarts, throw in links to common data bases, and you have *ObjectVision*—a visual application generator.

Programming "for the rest of us" has been hyped for years, but few products have ever delivered the goods. Apple's HyperCard and Asymetrix's ToolBook are a start—graphical mini-flat-file data bases that use a card-and-stack metaphor. But even these point-andclick programs require programming to be useful, and structuring an application can be confusing. If you are a power user who wants something a bit easier to grasp and a bit more intelligent—which includes links to work group-sized data bases to meet your growing application development needs—then Borland's ObjectVision may be the ticket.

ObjectVision applications are essentially intelligent forms that can pull

in and manipulate data from a variety of sources. You design a form by plucking objects—fields, lines, boxes, and graphics—from menus and placing them on the form with a mouse. Once they're in place, you pick a field type from a separate menu that includes text, numeric, date, pop-up menu, and button options. In addition, you can mask fields and require users to fill them.


What separates *ObjectVision* from data base form generators is how it embeds intelligence in a form. Instead of writing formulas or procedural statements and attaching them to the desired fields, you create *decision trees*—visual representations of the logic you'd express in, say, a 1-2-3 macro or a *dBASE*

program. A decision tree linked to a field can calculate values, validate entries, prompt for data, automatically fill in fields, pull up subsidiary forms, and much more. Decision trees can be far better than spreadsheets for such decision-support applications as loan approval forms, project planners, and cost estimators.

Although you'll find decision trees easier to deal with than @ISERR functions or IF...THEN statements, they're not for novices. Borland has made only an incremental improvement in its visual approach to programming. Creating a basic tree is mostly a point-and-click affair, and you can paste in functions and arguments from on-screen lists à la Excel. But there's no palette of common conditions to pick and choose from you have to know the basic rules of Boolean expressions. In short, decision trees are good for visualizing relationships, but actually developing applications can be tough sledding.

As a data base front end, *Object-Vision* is pretty flexible. It reads and writes *dBASE*, *Paradox*, *Btrieve*, and ASCII data, and it reads data from any *Windows* program supporting Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE). Better still, multiple *ObjectVision* users can access networked data base files at the same time—*ObjectVision* adheres to stan-







dard file- and record-locking protocols.

In some ways, *ObjectVision* suffers in comparison with classic data base management systems and new, more powerful forms-oriented programs like Xerox's FormBase. A form can be linked to multiple tables and can pull a record from one table and match it to multiple records from another however, corporate users will be dismayed to learn that ObjectVision can't link directly to SQL data bases. You can't control color fields, as in most forms programs, or the fonts used to fill in the forms created with *ObjectVision*. Moreover, ObjectVision doesn't automatically clear fields during data entry, and defining field validation rules is difficult. Programs like FormBase do all of the above without hassle.

Borland plans to remedy these shortcomings in future releases, so it pays to wait. But if you want to check out a new and perhaps better way to create personal applications, *ObjectVision* costs \$495; a run-time module should also be available about the time *Object-Vision* ships. \equiv



artists, and graphics dabblers have been itching for a one-stop program that could run a scanner, manipulate the resulting images, or even let you create pictures from scratch.

Enter ZSoft's Publisher's Paintbrush 2.0, a trailblazer that should meet these challenges—and then some. Publisher's Paintbrush 2.0 offers all the paint and image enhancement tools currently found in its DOS cousin, PC Paintbrush IV Plus, including support for a range of scanners and handy options for retouching scanned color and gray-scale pictures.

So why dump the powerful IV Plus if all you need to do is manipulate images? For starters, Publisher's Paintbrush comes with a set of electronic darkroom effects. IV Plus is also limited to 8-bit images with 256 colors or

gray levels; Publisher's Paintbrush 2.0 lets you retouch photo-realistic 16-, 24-, or 32-bit images (in both TIFF and TARGA formats) that pack more than 16.7 million colors. The program's customizable color palette works with highend HLS (hue-lightness-saturation) color as well as standard RGB systems.

Publisher's Paintbrush 2.0 is also a little easier to use, though programs in this genre aren't for neophytes. ZSoft has cleaned up the interface, relying on logically nested menus and movable toolbox-style windows. You can't customize the toolbox as in Micrografx Designer, but you can display specific tools.

The paint tools are on a par with IV Plus's—you get a blend paintbrush, smudge spray can, and so on. But there are some key enhancements. All tools

now work at all zoom levels, and special effects such as Filter Blend (for smoothing and softening colors) have customizable parameters. There's also a Lasso tool for creating irregularly shaped cutouts and Clone, which replicates all or part of an image. The program accepts PCX, GIF, and MSP graphics files, plus 24-bit color TIFF, TARGA, and BMP files.

But what really makes *Publisher's* Paintbrush 2.0 stand out is its deft multiple windowing capability. You can load up to eight different images in separate windows and cut and paste between them, or display eight views of the same image—a godsend when you're retouching gray-scale images. For example, you can display 100, 800, 1600, and 3200 percent views of the same area in different windows, automatically centering the selected area in each window. Even Xerox's Gray F/X doesn't offer this kind of editing flexibility.

And Gray F/X doesn't run under Windows or offer color support or paint tools. If any of these are must-haves or if you just need a paint program for all seasons—Publisher's Paintbrush 2.0 demands your consideration. ZSoft confirms the package will ship by March 1991 for \$495; registered users of most ZSoft products can make the switch for \$75 to \$275. €

Microsoft's *Productivity Pack for Windows* ably bridges the learning gap for old and new users alike. It features a step-by-step tutorial with attractive graphics and hands-on exercises. A novice can spend 3 hours and gain a thorough understanding of *Windows*; more seasoned users can enhance their knowledge with the advanced sections. *Productivity Pack* also includes two help files that provide on-line trouble-shooting as you use your applications.

Productivity Pack is designed to hold your hand, but if you're even slightly familiar with Windows, you may balk

at where it leads you at first. You must install it outside *Windows*, and when you run the tutorial it won't let you run other *Windows* programs—a strange way to demonstrate multitasking.

The tutorial consists of hands-on lessons grouped into six categories, each one featuring a character from history or literature as your guide. The lessons are more or less dull, depending on whether you're amused by cutesy story lines. For instance, Cleopatra shows you how to use the Clipboard while cutting and pasting paragraphs from a royal proclamation; Sherlock Holmes, uttering the occasional "by Jove," asks you to help him organize his clues using the File Manager.

The tutorial emphasizes hands-on

practice and progresses logically from elementary to advanced levels. Novices should follow the lessons in order, but experienced users can use the Control function, a pop-up list of commands, to jump around the tutorial.

The two help files that come with *Productivity Pack* supplement your standard *Windows* help files. Trouble-shooting Tips covers 19 common problems related to networks, printing, and memory. Working Smarter contains advice on making *Windows* more efficient and fun to use.

Productivity Pack compares favorably with other options for learning Windows. Its tutorial is comprehensive and certainly much cheaper than classes, and the interactive hands-on approach should appeal to everyone. All in all, Productivity Pack for Windows is an effective way to bring Windows users up to speed.



COREL DRAW was an overnight

success—and small wonder. It was quick, easy to use, welldocumented, compatible with a number of graphics file

formats, and a whiz at manipulating type. But for many advanced users, Corel's drawing tools were less precise and its transformation features less powerful than Micrografx Designer's.

Corel Draw 2.0 solves both problems. For example, you can create pointby-point Bézier curves with the pencil tool-a must for complex drawings. Designers and business presentation types will love the ability to design custom dotted and dashed lines, arrowheads, and patterns. For gradations and transitional effects, a Blend command can transform one color into another, transmute graphics or even text, and make transformations follow a curve.

For 3-D effects, the Perspective command lets you scale one or two corners of an object independently of the others, so the object appears to recede. Conversely, Extrude makes objects seem to leap off the page. You can even make objects look as if they were viewed through a fish-eye lens.

If you spend a lot of time drawing detailed illustrations, take heart. You can display grids on screen, specify horizontal and vertical increments independently, and move the origin—and call on PageMaker-like nonprinting guidelines and adjustable rulers.

Type handling, of course, is Corel's forte. Version 2.0 adds 51 scalable fonts (for a total of 153); since Corel can convert any of its fonts into Adobe Type 1 format, accessible by most Windows applications, you may never need to buy

another typeface. And at last, you can import ASCII text and create text blocks of up to 4000 characters.

Corel also throws in 750 clip-art images and 3000 symbols. Another utility, Corel Trace, converts scanned images into editable vector graphics almost as well as Adobe Streamline and even accepts TIFF and TARGA images with 16.7 million colors.

Of course, Corel isn't perfect. Unlike Adobe Illustrator, Corel can't precisely control the creation of Bézier cusp points—the corners associated with one or more curved segments. And there's no true masking feature—you punch holes to let objects underneath show through. But these are minor problems. The first Corel was a Best Buy, and 2.0 follows in its footsteps. \blacksquare

PACKRAT—the graybeard of Windows personal information managers (PIMs)—is now in its third major release and, like good wine and

Windows, it's improved with age. Not only has Polaris Software streamlined the program's interface, but PackRat now makes excellent use of Windows' Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) facility. In the PIM pantheon, PackRat is a compromise between the customizable but obdurate Current and the amiable if somewhat limited DeskTop Set.

Users familiar with earlier versions of *PackRat* will find the same flexible scheduler that automatically checks conflicts and makes repetitive scheduling easy. Professionals who do time billing will love *PackRat*'s easy-to-use phone log. Set up billing rates for a client, and *PackRat* will automatically compute the charges and report cumulative totals. An expense tracker, a mini-project manager, and other minidata bases are part of the deal. But the

best news is *PackRat*'s revamped interface, a graphical daily schedule with icons at the top representing other modules. You can remove unwanted modules, and you can pop up a monthly calendar at any time.

PackRat's integration has also been beefed up. Like Current, PackRat lets you link items in different modules with a point and a click. You could, for example, attach project tasks and other items to a name, then later view all the items by summoning the person's phone book entry. Unfortunately, all linking has to be done manually—you can't highlight a phone book entry and then set an appointment with the appropriate phone number automatically linked to it, as you can in DeskTop Set.

PackRat really taps DDE's potential. For example, with its special mac-

pros: Cleaner interface, excellent phone log and scheduler, strong DDE links with Word for Windows, network version available

cons: Inflexible keyword searches, minimal DDE links to Excel, manuals poorly indexed and missing new features

ros, *PackRat* adds a Find Name in Pack-Rat option to *Word for Windows*' Insert menu, so you can search through *Pack-Rat*'s phone book and insert names and addresses into a document. You can't edit *PackRat*'s DDE macros, but Polaris promises new macros for *Excel 3.0* and other DDE-supporting applications.

Of course, *PackRat* has a few wrinkles. You can't perform a keyword search for an appointment while the day's schedule is on screen. And though *PackRat*'s slick phone log will compute billings, it can't recalculate old entries if you decide to up a client's rate.

But if you want to load a DOS program with a different active directory, display it in a window, or dictate multitasking priorities or memory use, you'll need a program information file (PIF). Windows generates PIFs for some popular DOS applications automatically; for others, you select the application and create the PIF from scratch. In either case, you merely double-click the PIF Editor icon in the Accessories group, fill in the form, and save it.

If you're running *Windows* in 386-enhanced mode, you may need to create an Advanced PIF. Click the Advanced button in the basic PIF Editor window, and a more detailed form appears (see **SCREEN 1**). Here are some tips to turbocharge your programs.

TIP 1 Dedicate the CPU to your program. When a DOS program runs

slowly in enhanced mode, it's usually because *Windows* is doling out processing time to other applications running in the background. The solution: In the basic PIF Editor window, check the Exclusive box. You can still switch instantly to the other applications, but they'll be asleep in the background until called.

plications, give your DOS program more processor time. Under Multitasking Options in the Advanced PIF dialog box, increase the Foreground Priority to at least 400 (1000 is the maximum). Note: The number affects the ratio of processor time provided to the foreground and any background applications. If the foreground program is set at 100 and two background applications at 50 each, the total priority is 200—and your foreground program would get half the CPU time (100:200). It's not a precise system, so experiment.

TIP 3 Run the program full screen. Simply click *Full Screen* in the basic PIF Editor window. If you run a DOS program in a window, *Windows* will snatch some CPU time for itself.


gram drags its feet, make sure the Monitor Ports boxes in the Display Options section of the Advanced PIF dialog box are unchecked. If you use text and graphics programs together (such as 1-2-3 and Allways), run them full screen, select Video Memory's High Graphics button, and check Retain Video Memory. This reserves enough memory for an EGA or VGA graphics screen or multiple text screens.

TIP 5 Dole out RAM sparingly. In the Advanced PIF dialog box, enter the maximum RAM the program can have in the KB Limit field in the Memory Options section. The KB Required field dictates how much EMS or XMS (extended) memory must be available before Windows will open the program. In most cases, you can put 0 here.






f you're a doctor or lawyer, engineer or architect, graduate school prepared you to hang out a shingle and go into business for yourself. What it probably didn't teach you was how to run that business. Luckily, there are a host of programs, known collectively as *vertical market* software, that are specifically designed to

help professionals manage money, clients, and projects. Vertical market programs are tailored for a particular business or profession. They use

familiar terminology and solve problems common to a specific field. But you won't find them at your local software hut; they're available only from manufacturers or resellers, and at considerably higher prices than their off-the-shelf cousins. However, getting the same level of functionality from horizontal programs takes a lot of work, and even then you may not get exactly the right features (see the sidebar "Have It Your Way: Developing Custom Business Applications"). Vertical programs give you the tools you need right out of the box—and to many professionals, that's worth the extra cost.


This buyers' guide covers 46 products that are designed to help consulting engineers and architects, lawyers, medical professionals, realtors, and retailers do business. (These categories were chosen based on statistics about *PC World* readers who run small businesses.) All work on systems from XTs on up and require a hard disk.

While their features may vary widely, most vertical packages have a similar structure. Typically, they revolve around a data base for storing client information, and most provide a full-fledged accounting system or links to established accounting packages such as SBT's Accounting Library or Computer Associates' Accpac series. Many of

cost system and add modules as your business expands.

In either case, the key features are ease of use, end-user support, and flexibility. The best systems offer pop-up menus, convenient lookup tables, and context-sensitive help. Solid technical support is a must; most vendors will provide a short period of free support, then charge a flat yearly fee or a percentage of the product cost. You should be able to add more users easily or adapt the program to fit your needs—though you'll probably have to pay extra for custom modifications.

Pricing schemes are generally complex, depending largely on the number of users and types of modules you select. In most cases we have provided



them also include a word processor for creating reports and correspondence, an appointment scheduler, or a library of standard forms. Need software the whole office can use? Most packages come in both single- and multiple-user versions.

The programs covered in this guide are either integrated or modular systems. Integrated systems usually consist of different components or modules between which you can move seamlessly. Modular packages are typically a series of standalone programs; they allow you to start out with a lower-

price ranges, starting with the cost of the base product or module (such as accounts receivable) for a single user and ending at the cost of all modules for an unlimited number of users. Prices for network versions, where different, are noted.

Vertical software is a large investment, so be sure to get advice from colleagues, trade associations, and industry-specific user groups. If possible, call support lines and check out the quality of service. Have the vendor give you names of customers you can talk to about the product. And be sure to try before you buy.

While most vendors offer "slide show" demo disks, it's better to test-drive a trial version of the package limited to a specific time frame or number of accounts. Vendors sometimes charge from \$25 to \$100 for trial packages, but they usually credit the cost of the demo if you buy the full-blown program. Spending a little money now can save you big headaches later.

CONSULTING ENGINEERS AND ARCHITECTS

Sweating the details of a project and tracking its costs are daily business for consulting engineers and architects. Most programs are therefore built around project management and accounts receivable modules. The top packages offer an array of powerful accounting modules and let you create links between them, so that entries in, say, the jobcosting module also show up in the general ledger. All packages listed here can be used by either engineering or architectural design firms. Key features to look for include the ability to provide cost estimates, analyze staffing needs, produce extensive reports, and prepare proposals.

Acci PMAS

Acci PMAS can help architects and engineers manage a wide array of projects. You can produce invoices and statements and create reports on job cost, work in process, and accounts receivable. A unique "man-hour" feature shows the number of hours scheduled by each class of employee—a good way to gauge staffing needs. Payroll, payables, and general ledger modules are also available. LAW FIRMS

Critical to any legal firm's existence is the ability to manage its caseload. At minimum, case management software should provide a data base for storing all information relating to each case. More sophisticated packages offer conflict-of-interest protection (to ensure the firm doesn't represent opposing parties), an expert-witness data base, and a docketing module for tracking case activity. Most programs include simple word processors for producing standard boilerplate documents, and the better ones link directly to WordPerfect.

Equally important to attorneys is time and billing. Features to look for include the ability to produce client statements, adjust billing rates,

manage trust accounts, and analyze profitability. If the product provides separate modules for case management and time/billing, they should link seamlessly. Watch for password protection, audit trails, and network features such as file and record locking.

Client Management System

he fantasy runs something like this: You turn on your computer, and up pops a brilliantly designed package with thoughtfully placed pop-up menus, full mouse support, and compelling reports. Everything you need to do to run your business, it does—effortlessly. Of course, you can customize it at a moment's notice.

Sound too good to be true? It is. Yet that's what many people expect when they hire a programmer to create custom software for their business. Translating your ideas into a workable program can be a time- and money-consuming process. A good dBASE programmer will run from \$65 to \$100 an hour, and even a relatively simple programming job can take 40 to 60 hours.

That's why many users opt for an existing vertical package. Vertical software is usually stable and bug-free. Once you get past the learning curve, you can use it right away. And if you need minor modifications, most vendors will customize their packages for an additional fee.

Still, vertical programs are fairly limited in the kinds of changes they allow. If you can't find a package that has all the features you need, or if you want one you can easily modify later on as your business grows, hiring a programmer is your best choice. Here are a few tips to guide you along the path to software salvation.

Getting a programmer to write your dream software is like hiring a contractor to remodel your kitchen. There are three rules: (1) It always takes longer than you think; (2) it'll need to be tweaked because you'll want "just one more change"; and (3) it'll cost more than planned because of the tweaks.

The crucial issue, according to Advanced Data System's Ken Green, a Southern California FoxPro programmer, is determining exactly what the software has to do. "Without a comprehensive list," says Green, "you can't make the decision [to choose a custom program] or even be in the position to evaluate the software."

Once you've decided on a custom-made system, you need to pick a programmer. First, get a list of recent clients, and ask them about their experience with the programmer. Then, ask for the names of at least three established applications, and either try them yourself—most programmers will lend you a copy—or visit the installed site. Finally, demand a reasonable schedule from the programmer, but be flexible when you ask for changes. If he or she regularly misses deadlines, however, it's a sure bet the software will be just as disorganized.

It's important that you get a contract, even if the programmer is your brother-in-law (especially if he's your brother-in-law). Have an attorney who specializes in the field put together an agreement laying out the project, the time parameters, and the payment schedule. Ideally, there won't be any disagreements, but it's a good idea to specify the resolution process in the contract. "Binding arbitration is usually the best choice," says California attorney James Wiens. "It's generally quick and cheap."

Another issue is determining who owns the source code, the language that guides your software. Generally, it's a good idea to own the code, in case you need to alter the program later and the original programmer is unavailable. If you decide you want to sell your custommade package as a vertical system (where do you think these things come from, anyway?), you'll need to cut a royalty deal with the programmer. In any case, it's best to iron out the rules with an attorney by your side.



The next step is listing the specific tasks you'd like the software to accomplish. Ideally, the program should work the way you do. But, remember, even the world's greatest programmer doesn't know your business—you need to explain everything. As each feature will add to the cost, decide what features you must have, and what you can live without.

Most users know what they want but, unaware of program design rules, ask for features that conflict with each other. "On one hand, customers want infinite flexibility for changing data," says Green. "At the same time, they want rigid rules to ensure an order is entered according to their specific business procedures."

After the software is delivered, get ready for what Green terms the "disappointment phenomenon." That's when you realize that the long-awaited solution to all of your business problems...isn't. Resist the temptation to stuff the programmer into the nearest floppy drive. Remember, no software, not even an expensive commercial product, satisfies every user.

Choosing between vertical and customized software is mostly a question of time and money. Only after careful deliberation, rigorous examination of trial software, and thorough interrogation of former customers will you be able to make the decision. And even then, it's a tough one. —S. B.

Practice management for the health-care professions consists primarily of tracking patients, mailing statements, and churning out endless insurance claim forms. 





hen Wolverine World Wide told its salespeople to "get a SHINE," the 108-year-old company, best known for its line of Hush Puppies, wasn't asking them to polish their footwear samples. Rather, SHINE (Shoe Information Network) is the name the Rockford, Michigan-based Wolverine—which sells shoes, boots, gloves, and other outdoor products—gave its laptop and minicomputer network. The system has reduced by 90 percent the turnaround time for fulfilling shoe orders to retail stores, saved sales representatives hours of paperwork, and helped the reps keep track of order status.

"The shoe business is a service business," notes sales representative Bob Marcum. "Wolverine sells more shoes by making sure that stores have stock on hand. The quicker you can get shoes to the stores, the quicker they can be sold."

But the associated paperwork took quite a chunk of a sales rep's time—some 10 to 12 hours per week, says Richard Lizotte, an account executive in Sarasota, Florida. So the paperwork was often left for times when sales reps were not out selling—usually weekends—and that delayed orders.

Researching the status of orders was another onerous task. Checking on the fate of a single unfulfilled invoice, for example, might require a minimum of 15 to 20 minutes on the phone while the customer service rep at headquarters looked up the information. "Most of the sales reps just didn't do that," says George Hanson, Wolverine's system manager. As a result, reps often came to sales calls unprepared to answer shipping questions, and customer service suffered.

AN OPERATIONAL OVERHAUL

Wolverine clearly needed to streamline its order entry and sales support. Much of the data salespeople needed about accounts receivable, accounts payable, credit lines, customer profiles, order status, shipment dates, and so on was already stored on the corporate data base (now on an IBM AS 400 minicomputer). But Wolverine had no way to distribute that data to sales reps in a timely fashion. The company also wanted an automated method for collecting orders from reps.

When Hanson began researching off-the-shelf software, he found that the only method available for routing the necessary information was via attachments to electronic mail files. "We would have had to go in manually, create a dummy memo, and attach the messages by hand," Hanson explains.

To obtain a completely automatic system, Hanson had to develop SHINE in-house. The result of his efforts was a system that combines the corporate data base, data bases for each salesperson, and E-mail facilities. The system also automates the exchange of data between sales reps and corporate head-quarters. The E-mail system currently connects more than 300 employees, including factory and warehouse workers as well as sales reps and office clerks.

Since the sales force spends most of its time on the road serving customers, Wolverine equipped each representative with an 8086-based laptop from Zenith Data Systems or Toshiba and a portable printer. Each laptop has a 20MB hard disk and a 2400-bps modem. Regional managers have 286-based laptops with 40MB hard disks.

Each rep's laptop contains a data base of information on his or her territory, including credit information, order status, and

customer inventory position. The managers' data bases include all the data for the reps in their regions.

Because most of the reps have no computer experience, SHINE's user interface was designed to be highly intuitive. For example, a rep can look up credit information on a customer, then press a single key to find the stock number for a shoe that customer wants to order. "It's a very sophisticated system, but it's easy enough to learn that we can train them in a two-day session," Hanson says. Passwords and other connection information are built-in.

LAPTOPS PHONE HOME

Every other day, each sales representative dials into the server located at headquarters. Named Connexion HQ, the server is a 12-MHz 286-based PC with a 40MB hard disk, a multi-serial-port card, and four 9600-bps modems. (The high-speed modems can talk both to the laptops and to 9600-bps modems in the factories.) Connexion HQ acts as an E-mail server and a gateway to the corporate data base on the minicomputer. "The phone transmission is completely automated," Hanson explains. "The connection takes 2 minutes or less per day."

The process that makes the data transfer invisible to sales reps is complex. Any updates to the corporate data base on the minicomputer are exported in ASCII format via a file transfer program and sent to the Connexion HQ server. At the server, a





parsing program runs through the changes and routes them to the appropriate salesperson and regional manager. When the salesperson calls in for E-mail, the updates are automatically deposited in a prespecified subdirectory on the laptop. There the local data base (which is written in the Clarion programming language) picks up the data and deposits it in the appro-

priate files or fields. The process works in reverse to upload orders to the corporate data base.

All this didn't come cheaply: Hanson estimates hardware costs at \$400,000, with software development costs for SHINE at \$150,000 to \$175,000. On the other hand, Hanson says it would have cost \$50,000 per year for E-mail alone, had the company gone with a public E-mail service.

PINPOINTING THE BENEFITS

So what does Wolverine get for its money? While the advantages are difficult to quantify precisely (Hanson estimates that the system is pretty close to breaking even), the sales force has realized a number of benefits from the network.

Most important is the improved turnaround time between taking orders and shipping shoes. Previously, the lag could be as much as ten days; now, if the sales representative places the order before 2 p.m., the order may get shipped that same day.

The salespeople can now also provide a much higher level of service. If a rep calls into headquarters for account information before visiting a customer, he or she can tell the client the status of the order and even warn of delays before they occur.

The reps also save money on phone bills. "One sales rep says he saves \$250 per month on phone bills now because he isn't playing phone tag to answer customer questions. He generally has the information right there on his laptop," Hanson says.

Some of the most impressive savings in paperwork involve orders for chains, which often place "program" orders (multiple orders for the same products) for each store. "I have one chain with 35 stores, 6 programs of shoes per store, for a total

of 210 orders," says Lizotte. Because of SHINE's "copy" feature, he now fills out 6 orders rather than 210.

Because orders are sent directly to the minicomputer, Wolverine has been able to reduce the office staff responsible for keying in orders from 11 to 4. The remaining staff key in orders that come directly from customers.

UNEXPECTED GAINS

Ease of communication has led to subtle improvements. "Sales reps find it easier to tell the main office about problems. In the past, they might not have done so because it was too much trouble," says Rick Edmondson, a regional manager. And the main office can ask the sales force how well a new pattern or stock number is selling, says Hanson.

Another benefit came when Wolverine provided its salespeople with *PFS:First Choice*, a simple integrated package that includes word processing, spreadsheets, and graphics functions. Many of the salespeople have discovered that they can back up their sales claims with information from the data base. Using *First Choice*, they can present the supporting data to customers in professional-looking documents, complete with charts and graphs.

Upgrades

hether you're upgrading a floppy-based PC, replacing a crashed hard disk, or swapping a small hard disk for a bigger one, the task of installing a hard disk may someday fall to you. Don't panic—it's a relatively easy task.

Your best bet is to buy what's called a hard disk upgrade kit, containing a drive, a controller card, cables, installation hardware, *and* an instruction manual (which could be worth its weight in gold if you run into problems). Nearly every mail-order PC-and-peripherals house offers these kits, which generally

run between \$50 and \$100 more than the disk alone. We strongly recommend that you purchase one of these kits rather than attempt to match a hard disk and a controller yourself.

For the purposes of this article, we'll assume you're installing a 5½-inch 120MB hard disk in a conventional AT-type PC running PC-DOS 3.3.

▶ 1. Install the Controller and the Hard Disk

The controller is an expansion board that slides into a slot on the PC mother-board. Use the slot closest to the drive bay. If that slot is occupied, move the board that's there. Remove the old controller card if necessary.




FIGURE 1: Plug the controller card into an open slot, preferably the one closest to the drive bay. The hard disk slides into the drive bay on rails.

The hard disk slides into a drive bay or cage in your PC (see FIGURE 1). Drives come in two sizes, half-height and full-height, so make sure the bay is tall enough for your new drive. (Two vertically stacked half-height bays can hold a full-height drive.)




FIGURE 2: Two ribbon cables connect the controller card to the hard disk. Align the color stripe with pin 1 of the connectors. A third cable connects the hard disk to the PC's power supply.

➤ 2. Identify and Connect the Cables

Two flat ribbon cables connect the hard disk to the controller card. The cables are different sizes, and it's impossible to confuse them. However, with four connectors on the controller, hooking the cables to it can be confusing.

The 34-pin connector closest to the back of the board is for a floppy drive cable (see **FIGURE 2**). You'll use the second 34-pin connector and the 20-pin connector next to it for the hard disk.

Ribbon cables have a red or black stripe along one edge, identifying pin 1 of the cable plug. Locate pin 1 on the controller board's 34-pin connector (it should be closest to the front of the PC and will probably be marked "1"). Place the 34-pin cable connector so the stripe aligns with pin 1; press it into place. Repeat for the 20-pin cable.

Now connect the ribbon cables to the edge connectors of the hard drive. Most drive connectors have a locating key that prevents you from plugging the cables in backward. If your connectors don't have a key, use the color stripe to line up the plug with pin 1 of the hard disk's connectors.

Some 34-pin data cables have three plugs: one that mates with the controller card and two that match the edge con-

nector on the hard disk. The middle plug is used only when two hard disks in the system are running off the same controller card. Since our controller is serving only one drive, ignore the middle plug and use only the two end plugs.

Now you need to connect the power cable, a four-wire affair ending in a white plastic plug. Look for a spare power cable coming from the PC's power supply or motherboard and plug it into the 4-pin power connector at the rear of the hard disk. This connector is shaped so the cable goes in only the right way.

Most hard drives have a jumper that tells the controller whether it's the first or second drive. Refer to the drive's installation manual, and set the jumper in the first-drive position. If you don't have that information, assume it's set correctly; however, if the drive doesn't work, your first call should be to the vendor to double-check the jumper position.

If you removed an old disk controller card for this upgrade, you'll need to reattach the ribbon cable for your floppy drive to the rear 34-pin connector on the new controller, as noted in **FIGURE 2.**

➤ 3. Update the Drive-Type Table

Now you must tell your PC what type of drive you've just installed. Most PCs use a standard set of drive types, and most drives come with a drive-type number stamped on the case. For example, Seagate's popular 20MB drive is usually type 2.

Since this is the only hard drive in the system, it will be drive C: (or fixed disk 1). All you have to do is run the PC's setup routine, type in the new drive-type number, save the configuration, and reboot the PC. Depending on the PC, the setup routine may be initiated from the keyboard—usually by pressing <Ctrl>-<Alt>-<Enter>—or by running a software program that came with your PC. Check your user manual for details.

If you can't find the drive-type num-



ber, your setup routine may provide a list of drives identified by manufacturer and model, which you can select from. In a worst-case scenario, some setup programs let you enter cylinder, head, sector, and precompression parameters into a generic-drive table. These parameters are usually in the hard disk owner's manual or stamped on the case.

If you can't identify the drive type or don't see it in your PC's drive-type table, contact your dealer or the drive manufacturer. Do not guess at the drive type or choose randomly from the drive-type table. You probably won't do any permanent harm, but some wrong settings can damage a hard disk.

▶ 4. Partition the Hard Disk

Now you need to create a primary DOS partition on the hard disk. Remember, we're using DOS 3.3; there are slight differences with other DOS versions.

Reboot the PC with the DOS floppy

Low-Level Formatting

Most hard disks come low-level formatted from the factory. Lowlevel formatting creates the read/write tracks on the blank magnetic surface of the disk.

Unfortunately, high temperatures, impact during shipping, or the like may result in your disk arriving sans a low-level format. If you run FDISK and get a 'No fixed disks present' error message, there's a chance that the lowlevel format is missing.

Often the utility disk that comes with the hard disk (or the PC) contains a low-level formatting program. Several inexpensive commercial programs like SpeedStor do low-level formatting too. —TJB

in the A: drive. When you see the DOS prompt, type fdisk and press < Enter>. From the first menu, choose option 1, Create DOS Partition. A new menu will appear. Once again, select option 1, Create Primary DOS Partition. When asked if you wish to use the maximum size for a DOS partition and make it active, choose Y. Finally, press any key to restart the system.

You have now created a primary DOS partition of 32MB, the largest you can create with DOS 3.3, which both you and your system will recognize as drive C:. Drives referred to by letter are logical drives, as opposed to the physical

hardware itself. One physical drive can consist of many logical drives.

► 5. Creating Additional Logical Drives

To create three or more new logical drives, start FDISK, choose option 1, Create DOS Partition, and then choose option 2, Create Extended DOS Partition. The screen now shows how much of the disk has been used by the first partition and how much is available. Press < Enter > to use it all.

Now press < Esc>, and enter the number of cylinders for the next logical drive. You may create as many logical drives as you wish—at least until you run out of alphabet letters or disk space.

A logical drive's size is determined by the number of cylinders you assign to it. In our example, a total of 614 cylinders account for 120MB of disk space, making each cylinder worth 195K; 164 cylinders equal 32MB. The number of kilobytes per cylinder varies depending on the disk design. Fortunately, FDISK's readout shows the total number of cylinders, so if you know how many megabytes your hard disk holds, you can figure out how many cylinders to use for each logical drive.

Before you leave FDISK, make sure drive C: is the active partition—otherwise you can't boot from it, even after it's properly formatted.

► 6. Formatting the Drives

Before you can use the partitions, you need to format them with the FORMAT command found on your DOS floppy. If you use the /S switch, as explained below, it will install the operating system too, so you'll be able to start the computer from the hard disk.

Since this is the only hard disk in the PC, enter format c: /s at the DOS prompt, and press <Enter>. (Be careful! If the new drive is the second hard disk, this

command will destroy all the data on your C: drive.)

Ignore the warning message, and proceed with formatting by entering y and pressing < Enter>. Repeat this procedure for each logical drive, substituting the appropriate drive letter and eliminating the /S switch (since you need to install the operating system only on the booting hard drive, C:). For example, format d: < Enter>.

► 7. Modify the CONFIG.SYS File

Finally, use a text editor in ASCII format (or use DOS's EDLIN command), and add the following line to your CONFIG.SYS file: **lastdrive** =x (where x is the letter of the last logical drive in your machine). Example: LASTDRIVE = F.



Words Into Print



Word Processing

Tips for getting the most out of your word processor

This month: Get organized with your word processor's outlining features, master WordPerfect indentation, and control Word's hidden text display.

George Campbell

ffective writing starts with organized thinking. You can block out a letter or memo in your head, but anything longer generally needs more planning. The traditional topic outline, like the framework for a building, is hard to beat as an organizational tool. Creating an outline before you start can save you the pain of extensive rewriting later. Once the outline is finished, you can concentrate on expressing yourself clearly, using the topics in the outline to stimulate your thinking.

Most word processors, like *WordPerfect*, have simple outliners that are essentially numbering schemes. This type of outliner lets you move elements around without having to renumber the headings and all the subheadings below.

Once the outline is finished, however, you'll probably need to open a new file for the text and refer to a printout or an on-screen version of the outline when necessary. If your word processor lacks the ability to expand and contract outlines, including actual text in them is more difficult.

Word and Word for Windows offer more outlining power, letting you build your document directly upon the outline. You can expand and contract Word documents to show all or part of the text or just the outline. To reorganize a document, you simply contract it, move the headings around, then expand the document again. Since selecting a heading selects all related text, you can edit and reorganize complex documents without extensive scrolling and searching. Word can even create a table of contents from outline headings.

If your word processor lacks an outliner, or if you want more outlining power, you can buy a stand-alone outliner such as *GrandView* or *PC Outline*. These provide even more outlining tricks than *Word*.

Outlining Strategies

Here are some basic steps for creating outlines. *WordPerfect 4.0* and *5.0* keystrokes are used as examples, but the procedure is similar in most other word processing programs.

First, select a numbering format. The standard format (I. A. 1. a.) is usually fine, but lawyers and engineers may prefer legal or technical numbering (1 1.1 1.1.1). To choose a different numbering style in *WordPerfect*, press <Shift>-<F5>d, then select a style from the menu or create your own.

Next, turn on your program's outlin-

Hiding Word's Hidden Text

If you want to insert nonprinting text in *Word 4.0* and *5.0* for notes or comments, hidden text is a perfect solution. To hide text, select the text, then press <alt>-E. (To return the text to normal, select it and press <alt>-<Space>.)

To make hidden text display on the screen or disappear with one keystroke, create this *Word* macro. Follow these steps on a blank *Word* screen:

- 1. Press **<\$hift>-<F3>** to start recording.
- 2. Press < Esc>o < Cursor Right> < Space > < Enter >.

- 3. Press < Shift>-< F3> to end recording.
- 4. Type Hide.mac ^, press an unused <Ctrl>-key combination like <Ctrl>-H, then press <Enter>.

To display or hide hidden text in any document, you can simply press the <Ctrl>-key combination. To hide or redisplay the hidden text markers that remain, press <Esc>o<Cursor Right><Cursor Down>, then press n to hide the markers or a to display them, and press <Enter>.

ing mode. In WordPerfect, press <\$hift>-<F5>oo<Enter>. Now you're ready to enter the first major topic. The typical outline uses chapter titles as first-level entries, with section headings as the second level. Next, you can add subsections and individual paragraphs, as well as other levels for more detail. WordPerfect supports eight indentation levels, but four is enough for most purposes.

After typing the first entry, press < Enter>, then issue the command to indent one level. (In WordPerfect, press < Tab>.) Type the next entry, and press < Enter>. WordPerfect stays at the current level unless you tab to a lower level or move to a higher one by pressing < Shift>-< Tab>.

WordPerfect also allows you to include text other than headings. To do this, backspace over the number that WordPerfect proposes, then type the text. Most programs let you change an entry's ranking in the hierarchy. In WordPerfect, move to the beginning of



WordPerfect 5.1's Tools menus let you control all aspects of an outline's structure. When you move a heading, you can move the subheadings with it.

an entry, then press either <Tab> to demote the entry or <Shift>-<Tab> to promote it.

You can also move, copy, or delete

entries in the outline. In most word processors, selecting a heading also selects all subheadings and normal text you've included. To move an entry in WordPerfect, press <\$hift>-<F5>om, move the selection with the cursor keys, then press <\$hift>-<F5>oc, move the block, and press <\$hift>-<F5>oc, move the block, and press <\$hift>-<F5>od, then press y to confirm. WordPerfect will automatically renumber all of the entries.

Once the outline is finished, use it to help shape your document. Working from a printed copy of the outline is fine, but if your program can display multiple documents, you may prefer to work with it on line. In *WordPerfect*, press <\$hift>-<F3>, retrieve the outline file, then press <\$hift>-<F3> again and load the main document. Then, whenever you want to switch between the outline and the document, simply press <\$hift>-<F3>.

WORDPERFECT SHORTCUT

Perfect Indents

WordPerfect 5.0 and 5.1 offer four keystrokes for indenting paragraphs in different ways. You can use them on existing text or before typing.

- To indent just the first line of a paragraph, use the <\itagle ab>
 key. The rest of the lines will align with the left margin.
- To indent an entire paragraph, press < F4>. All text will move right to the next tab setting. For a wider indentation, repeat the command.
- To indent both sides of a paragraph, as for a long quoted passage in a document, press
 <Shift>-<F4>. If you want to


produce even narrower blocks, repeat the keystroke.

• For a hanging indent (first line flush left, following lines indented), first type the paragraph, then move to the first character of the paragraph and press <Shift>-<F4>, then <Shift>-<Tab>.

Each of these keystrokes indents to the next tab stop. To alter tab positions, press < Shift>-< F8>It. To remove any of these indents, move the cursor to the first character of the paragraph and press < Back-space>. -G. C.





Practical tips for building better worksheets

This month: the missing link




FIGURE 1: The highlighted formula in the sample worksheet (bottom) carries forward the balance of an unopened worksheet (top) by addressing first its file name, REG-0491, then the appropriate cell name, BALANCE.

Richard Scoville

he data values you enter into a worksheet often originate in another spreadsheet file. Instead of making you rekey them, 1-2-3 release 2.2 lets you create a linked formula that draws data directly from a cell in an unopened file on your disk. In this month's column we'll build the simple checkbook register shown in **FIGURE 1** to demonstrate linked formulas and other template techniques.

Daisy Chains and Consolidations

Linked formulas find application in two general situations: consolidations of several worksheets into a single summary worksheet and "daisy-chain" templates. A daisy chain is a series of templates in which the closing value(s) of one file becomes the opening value(s) for the next, as in our checkbook register example.

Building the Model

To build this month's template, begin in column A and set the width to 5 spaces:

Select /Worksheet Column Set-Width, type 5, and press < Enter>. Similarly, set column B to 7, C to 28, and columns D, E, and F to 10 spaces. To display numbers with commas and decimals, use /Worksheet Global Format followed by a comma, type 2, and press < Enter>. Then, enter the labels shown in A1..F4 of FIGURE 1. To enter the double line shown in row 14, enter \= in cell A14, select /Copy, press < Enter> followed by a period, use < Cursor Right> to highlight cells A14..F14, and press < Enter>.

In cell F5, enter the formula +E5 for the opening balance. In F6, enter +F5-D6+E6 to calculate the next balance, then copy that formula down the column: Select /Copy, press <Enter> followed by a period, use <Cursor Down> to highlight the range F6..F13, and

press < Enter>. In cell F3, enter the following formula so that the closing balance shows at the top of the register: @index(f5..f14,0,@count(c5..c14)-2). (This formula treats the balances in F5..F14 as a one-column table. The @INDEX function gets the final balance from the table's leftmost column (0). @COUNT() calculates the row number for @IN-DEX from the number of items in the register calculated from the number of entries in the description column.) To identify the closing balance with a range name, move to F3, select /Range Name Create, type balance, and press <Enter> twice.

Finally, enter the check register data into A5..E13. Since the check numbers and dates are labels composed of digits, prefix each one with an apostrophe. To

Linking Worksheets by Formula

SPREADSHEET TOOLBOX

Look Before You Link With Look&Link

If you're a 1-2-3 2.x user whose template applications are beginning to span multiple files, you've probably been frustrated at not being able to see the file you're trying to link to. Look&Link, a \$99.95 add-in from Personics Corporation, lets you pop up a window on your worksheet and display a diskresident spreadsheet in it. You can travel freely around the pop-up worksheet; function keys <F5> and <F3> let you review and move to named ranges.

Once you've found what you're looking for, you can easily copy it to the current worksheet à la

1-2-3's File Combine command or create a linked formula. By swapping the screen- and diskresident files, you can even duck into the other file to make changes. And if you're still using release 2.01, the Link part of Look&Link will let you create linked formulas without upgrading to the new release. In short, Look&Link is a specialized, uniquely useful addition to your tool kit. —Richard Scoville

Look&Link \$99.95; Personics Corp., 63 Great Rd., Maynard, MA 01754; 800/445-3311, 508/897-1947 (fax) Reader service no. 612 make room for more items, put the cell pointer on row 14 and add rows with /Worksheet Insert Row. The closing balance formula expands to accommodate the new rows. Each time you enter a new item, copy the previous balance formula into the new row to keep the balance current. You may want to build a macro to insert the rows and copy the formula.

The Linked Formula

Save the completed worksheet with a file name that identifies it as the check register for April 1991: Select /File Save, type reg-0491, and press < Enter >.

May's register will take its opening balance from April's closing balance with a linked formula. First, clean out the data values from April's file: Put the cell pointer on A7, select /Worksheet Delete Row, highlight A7..A13, and press <Enter>. Then select /Range Erase, highlight A6..E6, and press <Enter>. Move to cell E5 and enter the linking formula +<<reg-0491>>balance (REG-0491 is the name of the source worksheet file). Now you're ready to enter data for the new month, inserting rows and copying the balance formula for additional items as described above.

In release 2.2, a linked formula may consist of a single cell reference only: You cannot include any calculations within the linked formula, and your formulas may not refer to a multicell range in the other file. As we've done in our example, be sure that you always assign a range name to the cell that will be referenced by a linked formula; range names are easier to remember than cell addresses, and if you move the referenced cell to a new address, the range name will still find the correct value. Each time you retrieve a file containing a linked formula, 1-2-3 returns to the source file and rechecks the value of the referenced cell. And that means less cross-checking for you. \@

Sorting Your Data by Columns Ralph Soucie


Though most *Excel* worksheets contain records arranged by rows, you may need to arrange data by columns—if your data is organized like the Features Evaluation table in a *PC World* review, for example. Let's say you have a worksheet containing a list of ratings for each of several candidates for a job. The candidates' names are displayed in the first row of the worksheet in columns B through H, and the ratings are shown in rows 2 through 10 in the columns below

To sort the list, use the

mouse, or hold down < Shift> and use the cursor keys, to select all the cells that contain data—B1 through H10 in this case. Don't select cells containing titles or other labeling information. Choose Data Sort and select Columns in the Sort By box. In the 1st Key box, replace the row number in \$B\$1 with the row address you want to sort by (row 1 contains names; rows 2 through 10, ratings). Choose Ascending for alphabetical sorts or Descending for highest to lowest ratings. Press < Enter > to carry out the command.

Tips and techniques for managing your data

This month: Getting data from relations

Steve Cummings

hether you know it or not, you probably use a relational data base. Your company's data management system is likely to be relational because, for all but the simplest data-handling needs, nothing else is practical. Most people within an organization needn't know how their data is structured; when they print an invoice, they don't care that the customer's name comes from one data table and the products ordered from another. But if you're planning your company's or department's future, you want to be able to query data creatively, and that requires knowing how your data is organized.

A relational data base is one that can link data from two or more tables via a common field or fields. (A *table* is a simple data structure—usually a single file—with records and fields much like the rows and columns of a spreadsheet.) For example, if the customer and invoice

tables share a Customer ID field, you can easily find an invoice's customer or a customer's invoices.

Multitable Invoicing

Why use a relational data base? Consider a basic invoicing system. At a minimum, you need information on customers, inventory, and sales. Stuffing all of this data into a single table would be a nightmare of redundancy and potential error.

Suppose each record in the table corresponds to a different invoice. Every time customer Jones buys a Gizmo, you'd have to reenter Jones's full name and address and the Gizmo's unit price. When you delete a new customer's or-

der, you lose all record of that person. And what happens when customer Jones buys a Gizmo, a Whatsit, and a Flopnik? A single table always limits the number of line items (products being sold) you can include in a single order.




FIGURE 1: By keeping your data in four separate but linked tables, you can create an invoicing system that's more powerful, more flexible, and easier to use.

Now consider a four-table relational system (see FIGURE 1). You still have an invoice table with a record for each order, but that table now needs only three fields: invoice number, customer ID, and transaction date (you can also include shipping and payment information). When you print an invoice, your data base takes the name and address from the customer table, the products ordered from the line item table, and the product descriptions from the inventory

PARADOX SHORTCUT

Preparing an Embedded Form

Celeste Robinson

Before you can create a relational invoice form in *Paradox 3.0* or a later version, you have to make a multirecord line item form to embed in it. Start by using *Form Design* to create a form in your line item table.

Place the fields and their prompts in the upperleft corner of the form design screen. Use Field Place Regular Prod ID repeatedly to place all of the table's fields, except Invoice no., next to each other on line 2, starting at the beginning of the line. Once the fields are placed, type labels in the first line, directly above the fields.

You're now ready to turn this into a multifield form for enter-

ing, editing, and viewing multiple line items. Press <F10>, and select Multi Records Define.

Move the cursor to the beginning of the second line (where the line of fields begins under the prompts), press <Enter>, move the cursor to the end of the last field, press <Enter> again, move the cursor down five lines, and press <Enter> yet again. Then save the form with a DO-IT!

When you create the invoice form, use *Multi Table Place Linked* to insert your multiline line item form. Any line items entered in this form will be relationally attached to the correct invoice.

Relating to Your Invoice

dBASE SHORTCUT

View From a File

Relating two *dBASE* files is a multistep process. You first open the files in different work areas, making sure that the child file is indexed on the relationship's key field (the field the two files have in common). You then set the relationship. The command syntax looks something like this:

USE Customer INDEX C—custno SELECT 2

USE Invoice INDEX Invno
SET RELATION TO custno INTO;
Customer

Thanks to dBASE VUE (view) files, you needn't go

through this routine more than once. To create a VUE, type CREATE VIEW filename. This brings you to a menu-driven view-creation screen. Because you've already created a relation, all you need do is select Exit Save. From then on, recreating your relation is a simple matter of typing SET VIEW TO filename.

CREATE VIEW can do a lot more than this. For example, you can use it to set filters and to pick which fields from the two data files will be displayed. table. This system lets you keep customer and product information in their proper places, and attach any number of line items to an invoice in what is called a one-to-many relationship.

Getting Versatile

You don't need to know the data structure to print an invoice, but with such knowledge you can print queries and reports that the data base designer never thought of. Suppose you want to see your dollar sales, by state, for a given business quarter. A relational system makes this easy.

Since you'll be sorting your query by state, start with the table that stores your customers' addresses—the customer table. In relational jargon, this is now the *parent* table, the one that other tables (children) will relate to. To access the product sales information in the line item table, you first link the invoice table to the customer table by the customer ID field, then link the line item table to the invoice table via the invoice number.

With these links established, use your data manager's query tool or report writer to select invoices recorded during the business quarter in question. You can then display or print each state name along with a subtotal (unit price times quantity) for the line items related to that state.

That's only the beginning. From the same tables, you could see which products are your best-sellers, tell whether volume sales bring more revenue than single-item sales, and—with one additional field in the invoice table—identify your best salespeople. You can use a relational data base without knowing how it's structured, but you'll get much more out of it if you do.





Expert advice for creating high-impact documents and presentations

This month: streamlining data charts, and producing sharp printouts with Harvard Graphics

umbers don't lie—but as any presentation pro knows, the story they tell can vary, depending on how you present it. Whether you're showing off soaring sales figures or proving why your department deserves a bigger slice of the corporate pie, the fastest way to do it is with data charts.

Every presentation package from *Harvard Graphics* to *Microsoft Power-Point* lets you create a variety of charts, each good for showing specific types of data. For example, area and line graphs are best for plotting cycles or trends in data such as stock prices; bar graphs help compare data from different time periods, such as monthly sales or quarterly earnings; and pie charts excel at showing proportional relationships like market share.


But simply knowing when to use a particular chart isn't enough—you've got to get your point across quickly. Data charts generally take longer for an audience to absorb than text charts, especially when they're displayed as 35mm slides or overhead transparencies. The key is to make them as telegraphic as possible: Show the big picture in the chart, and save the details for handouts. Here are some tips for streamlining your presentation's data charts.

• When possible, show trends rather than details. For example, in a bar

chart with two sets of annual data—sales and expenses, say—show data by quarters rather than months. The fewer bars in a chart, the easier it is to understand.

- Treat chart titles as headlines, using active verbs to convey your message. The title "Worldwide Sales" identifies a chart, but "Worldwide Sales Explode" tells a story. Use subtitles, set slightly smaller, to expand on your message.
- Add brief units of *floating text* to explain crucial chart data, and link it to the data using a line or arrow. For exam-

In this Harvard chart, the information is there but the message is obscured, thanks to a bland title and data values that are hard to decipher.

NUTS & BOLTS

Better Printing With Harvard

Harvard Graphics 2.3's broad range of color palettes makes it easy to improve the look of your 35mm slides. But a palette that looks great on screen can still produce poor black-and-white laser printouts. The reason? Some palettes may convert different colors to the same shade of gray, making it hard to distinguish between, say, adjacent bars in a cluster bar chart.

Fortunately there's an easy solution. When you want to print, simply switch from your current palette to *Harvard*'s default palette (HG23.PAL), which

is optimized for color-to-gray conversions. Here's how to do it.

- 1. Open *Harvard* and retrieve the chart.
- 2. At the main menu, press < F8 > to display the Current Chart Options menu. At Palette file:, delete the current palette, type HG23, and press < Enter >.
- 3. Press < Ctrl>-P to display Print Chart Options, select Quality: High and Color: Yes, then print the chart.

Finally, to keep your original color palette intact, don't save the chart before exiting from *Harvard.* —*R. J.*

ple, "New product launch" might point to a sharp increase in production costs on a line chart. Make this text larger than the chart's labels but smaller than its subtitle, and put it in a box to make it stand out.

- Avoid rotated or vertical text. Use horizontal labels in line and bar charts to identify values or categories on each axis (the horizontal and vertical lines that define a chart's coordinates). Keep labels brief by using abbreviations (such as \$ for dollars).
- Avoid redundancy. If you list the year in the chart's title, you don't need to repeat it in the labels.
- Use the brightest color or boldest pattern to highlight important data in area, bar, and pie charts (or the thickest line width for line charts). Place a *legend*, or key, that identifies the colors, patterns, or line widths in a box above or below the plotted data.
- For complex charts where numbers are especially important to your audience, show the actual values (numerical data such as percentages) in-

side or near the plotted data, as shown in the figure. You rarely need to display all the data; in a line chart, for example, you can get away with just the high and low values.

- To emphasize upward trends (such as rising profits) in line or bar charts, place the vertical (y) axis line on the right side instead of the left. If your chart displays the actual values, you can probably eliminate the y-axis altogether.
- Eliminate unnecessary elements in line and bar charts, such as grid lines. If possible, use tick marks (short hash marks along the *y*-axis), or include the actual values themselves.
- Use a clip-art image *only* if it reinforces the chart's content. For example, it's appropriate to add a world map to the background of a chart displaying international sales data. You also might want to place your company's logo on the top or bottom of all your slides. But be sure to use graphic images consistently, or they'll disrupt the flow of your presentation.

Self-Stick Wallpaper for Windows 3.0

Tired of the same old blank walls? Windows 3.0's desktop lets you customize the background (pattern) and the display (wallpaper). First, scan your company logo or digitize a favorite photo, edit the results with Windows Paintbrush, and save the graphic as a bit map. Make sure the file name ends with the extension .BMP, copy the file to your main Windows 3.0 directory, and then run the Control Panel utility from Program Manager's Main Group. Next, select the Desktop icon, and choose the bit map's file name from the Wallpaper section. You can select the Center button to display a single copy of your artwork midscreen, or choose Tile to replicate a pattern to the far corners of your display. To reset the display to its original background, set Wallpaper to [None].





On-line resources for business and professional users

This month: Track down vital commercial information on CompuServe, and punch up show biz business via Baseline.

Judy Heim

CompuServe Information Service (CIS) is the biggest and most popular on-line service around, but its very size can be a problem. You suspect the information you need is available on CompuServe somewhere—but you can't remember where, and who has the time or money to hunt for it?

Here's a guide to a few obscure but indispensable CIS data bases and services. Unless otherwise noted, they're available at the basic hourly connect rate of \$12.50, plus \$1.50 per month for maintenance. All the data bases and message forums (also known as Special Interest Groups, or SIGs) are easy to access and use.

Q. I want to start a home business. Where can I turn for help?

A. The Working at Home Forum (type go work) offers a wealth of advice on running a home-based business, from setting up voice mail to handling type-setting, accounting, and mail order on your PC. The International Entrepreneur's Forum (go usen) specializes in business ventures, offering insight into launching a business. Both SIGs are populated by friendly experts who are happy to answer questions.

Q. Where can I find free government information on business topics?

A. Type go infousa and head to the amazing Information USA run by Matthew Lesko, an expert who can help you extract free advice from the government. This data base includes addresses, phone numbers, and descriptions of publications and programs ranging from Department of Agriculture information to low-interest home-buyer

loans in each state. As a bonus, you get Lesko's columns on topics like "The Care and Feeding of Bureaucrats" and "The Art of Getting an Expert to Talk."

When you know what you want, you can order the most frequently requested publications on line. Just type **go gpo** to access the U.S. Government Publications service.

Q. I want to bid on government contracts for goods and services. How can I get the latest on what Uncle Sam is looking for?

A. The Commerce Business Daily (go combus) includes the full text of that newspaper, plus other government publications that provide up-to-the-minute scoops on federal contracts. You can search by subject, agency, ZIP code, or announcement type. There's a \$2 surcharge for the search plus another \$2 for each entry displayed.

ON-LINE SHORTCUT

The Voice-and-Data Shuffle

Remote access to office E-mail used to be a snap until your company signed up with a new long-distance carrier like Allnet that requires you to give an operator your long-distance access code—verbally—after you have begun dialing the number. How do you maneuver your modem through these negotiations? Try this: Load your communications software, and move to the blank terminal screen. Using your telephone keypad, enter the first part of the number. Tell the op-

erator the access code over the phone. Then, as soon as the operator hangs up, set the receiver aside (but don't hang up!), and return to the PC. Type ATDI, followed by any numbers that remain to be dialed, and press <Enter>.

This trick will work only if your modem and phone can share the line, so be sure to carry a Y-plug, which snaps into the wall jack and gives you two jacks from one. — J. H.

Baseline: Backstage Business On Line

There may be, as the song goes, no business like show business, but for all the glamour, it is a business—and a fast-moving one at that. Now, thanks to Baseline, a unique on-line service devoted to the film and TV industry, you can keep up-todate by the minute. Over the last nine years, Baseline has become indispensable to production executives (who use it to track weekend grosses) and line producers (who can find contact numbers for actors and technicians). It's also a vital resource to videotape retailers, entertainment reporters, film programmers, researchers and librarians, theater owners, and entertainment lawyers.

Baseline's 30-plus data bases cover people, products, and news, and there are E-mail and chat areas. Most of Baseline's information is available elsewhere, but it's scattered among various sources, and paper reports lack the immediacy of Baseline's online data.

Talent hunting is Baseline's main charter—over 400,000 directors, writers, technicians, and actors are listed. Enter a name, and you'll see a list of film and TV credits, awards and nominations, a brief biography, an agent's phone number, and—most important for a harried production executive—whether he or she is available for work.

You can also type in the title of a film, a TV series, or even an episode of a series and get complete credits, the name of the distributor, and a readout of Oscars, Emmys, Tonys, and other awards and nominations as far back as 1970. More than 60,000 titles are included.

A tremendous variety of entertainment news and data isavailable, most of it updated daily: everything from domestic box office grosses and listings of festivals and conferences, to a selection of full-text stories from the latest video and broadcasting newsletters. Do you need a schedule of theatrical film releases for the next six months by title, date, and distributor? You'll find it in Release Schedule. Are you interested in upcoming novels available for acquisition? Look into This Week's Rights. Owners of videotape stores will find the Video Grosses data base useful for its sales and rental figures dating back to 1979. And there's lots more.

Baseline's colorful menudriven interface is a pleasure, and the new version of its proprietary log-on software lets you use a mouse. The price is reasonable—you'll pay a one-time-only \$497 fee; after that, charges range from nothing to \$3 per minute, depending on the service and time of day.

If you're in The Biz, Baseline is a show you won't want to miss.

Baseline II, Inc., 838 Broadway, New York, NY 10003; 800/242-7546, 212/529-3330 (fax) Reader service no. 602 **Q.** How do I access the latest U.S. Census data on manufacturing, retail sales, business, and housing?

A. All 1990 U.S. Census data is available on line, and it's free (**go cenduta**). Menus make it easy to search this huge data base by topics such as agriculture, foreign trade, and population. You can download data, but no hard copy is available.

Q. Where do I go for a list of all the ZIP codes in New Jersey where household income tops \$50,000 a year and residents put a cellular phone at the top of their wish list?

A. The Neighborhood Demographics service offers a number of data bases that combine census data with market research to offer intimate glimpses into buying patterns of American households (go dem) and neighborhoods (go neighbor). Generally you enter a ZIP code, SMSA number, or Nielsen or Arbitron neighborhood number and then select information from a menu. But be prepared to pay—reports range from \$10 to \$100 each, and some data bases are accessible only if you have CIS's Executive Service Option with its \$10 monthly minimum.

Q. I'm planning a trip to Peru. Is it safe?

A. Type go state for the latest State Department travel briefings.



A full-blown server-based network costs a bundle when done right. Add to this the cost of training and ongoing support (sometimes 2 to 3 times the original investment). Undaunted, businesses bite the bullet every day—effectively turning over their entire computer operations to a LAN expert forever. But many, in seeking a less costly alternative, fall into the trap of false economy.

We say "neither is necessary." Why? How?

Systemizers

Connectivity and networking solutions abound. And with them come traps of all kinds. Unless you're a teflon-coated decision maker (or a job hopper), the solution you choose today should remain appropriate tomorrow. Let's look at where you can go wrong—and right.

First, consider printer sharing boxes. They're a fine short-term solution when you have two or three computers occasionally needing access to a single printer. If you buy a LAN, you will always be accountable to it, like a state and federal sales tax on every change or addition you make related to your computers.

Not that there aren't inexpensive networks available to snare the penny wise. Some are downright cheap. But, should you build your business around them? Cheapo networks teach harsh lessons in false economy.

You see, some low-cost LANs boast they occupy very little memory (RAM), yet to realistically accomplish what the LAN is supposed to do, it really uses as much or more RAM as any other LAN. The truth is: *all* LANs occupy a rather substantial amount of RAM, and you will likely find yourself either having to add RAM to your PCs (if you can)—along with memory management software, or dumping some of your other software overboard.

An even harsher lesson in false economy comes later, when you buy a multi-user software package (e.g. a database to be shared) and discover it is only guaranteed to be compatible with a server-based data-sharing LAN, usually Novell's[®]. Oops! Old LAN overboard!

Most probably just need to share printers and other peripherals like plotters, modems and fax machines. Perhaps everyone would also like to exchange E-Mail and maybe even pass data files between PCs electronically.

Paradox Picture Formatting

Paradox's Picture command lets you format your input. For instance, it can automatically capitalize the first letter of each word you enter in a field. To set up this format, View the table and put the cursor on the field you wish to format. Press <f9> to edit, then <f10>. Select Valcheck Define and press <Enter>. Select Picture, type *{!*?[]}, and press <Enter> <f2>. Now, Paradox will automatically capitalize the first letter of any word entered in that field.

Faster Batches, Quicker Copies

Using repeated ECHO statements to display long messages slows batch file execution. It's more efficient to have the batch file use DOS's TYPE command to print small message files on screen. This method has the bonus of allowing you to create attractive, centered screens that include borders, arrows, or anything else that can be made with ASCII characters. Also, instead of beginning nonprinting comment lines with 'rem', turn them into labels by starting them with a colon.

Use CPY.BAT to speed copying of files from the default disk drive to another drive by copying only those files that don't exist on the second drive: Type for &&f in (%1) do if not exist %2%%f copy %%f %2. You invoke CPY.BAT by typing cpy followed by a space and the file and directory specifications. For example, cpy *.doc a: copies all DOC files from the default drive to drive A:. Keep

in mind that path names won't work with CPY.BAT unless corresponding directories exist on both disks.

A Batch File to Get You Started

You can use a bunch of short, individual batch files to start separate applications. However, each file costs you 2K to 4K of disk space (depending on your disk's cluster size) even though its directory listing says it's a few bytes long. START.BAT [see LISTING 1] shows how to combine start-ups into one batch file. It has the proper structure to start *Excel* and *Word* and return to the \JUNK directory (which must exist, of course) after exiting. You can easily modify this batch file for your own applications. Store START.BAT in a directory listed in your PATH command (\BATCH, say).

Each group of code executes the appropriate directory changes, setups, and program files. The parameters %2, %3, and so on permit passing switches and other program parameters.

LISTING 1: START.BAT combines the start-ups for Microsoft Word and Excel in one file.

It's always wise to store data files separately from program files. In the Word example, DOC files are stored in the \WORD\DOC directory and program files in the \WORD directory. Hence, \WORD\WORD %1 %2... provides the path to WORD.EXE and executes it while keeping \WORD\DOC as the document directory. To start Word and load the last edited document, type start word /l at the DOS prompt.

Remove TSRs for a Secure Backup

To achieve maximum data security, remove RAM-resident programs before running your backup program. Many backup utilities, such as PC Tools Deluxe's PC Backup and Symantec's Norton Backup, use the computer's DMA controller to simultaneously read from and write to floppy disks. The DMA controller handles disk access, freeing up the microprocessor for other tasks and thereby improving system performance. But any TSRs, including the TSRs in *PC Tools* itself, may interfere with the DMA controller's performance. Thus, files you think are backed up and verified may actually be unreliable. You can never be too secure, so if your AUTOEXEC.BAT loads TSRs, boot your computer using a DOS system disk before backing up.

Crank out repetitive commands with a 1-2-3 macro, write

QuickBASIC programs that locate their home directories, put the moves on DOS, enter dashing

WordPerfect text, and get something for nothing in dBASE.

Repeat Business

When you need to repeat a few keystrokes in 1-2-3 but won't need to repeat them in the future, writing a full macro may be more trouble than it's worth. To simplify the job of creating throwaway commands, I wrote a macro that records keystrokes and plays them back a specified number of times.

To create the macro, enter the text in FIGURE I, being sure to preface \R and \P with an apostrophe ('). Then use /Range Name Labels Right to create range names from the cells in AA1 through AA17. To see how the macro works,

move to a blank cell and press <Alt>-R to begin recording. Type the keystrokes you want to repeat, then press <F10> to stop recording. Move to another cell, and press <Alt>-P. Enter the number of repetitions, and press <Enter>. The macro will then type your keystrokes as many times as you've specified.

Editor's note: The macro is limited to 480 characters, but the number of keys it can store may be less, as some keys take more than one character. For example, <Cursor Down> is represented as {DOWN}.

Where Am I?

In a sense, a running BASIC program is lost—it doesn't know its name or its path, a fact that poses a problem for programs that must access files in their home directories. I solved that problem by taking advantage of a little-known

DOS feature.

When DOS runs a program, it stores the program's path and name after the last environment string. For a BASIC program to find its roots, it must locate the Program Segment Prefix (PSP), which is attached to the program at run time. From the PSP, the program can find out the directory from which it was loaded. It's then a simple matter to lop off the path, attach the file names you need, and use the results to access data in the program's home directory. I've included a sample program [see LISTING 1] that shows how this is done.

BASIC with the /L parameter so that the Quick Library QB.QLM, which contains support routines needed to call DOS functions, is also loaded. The program uses one of those routines, CALL Interrupt, to locate the PSP.

In the listing, comments beginning with an apostrophe explain how the program works. The second line, however, is not a comment but a command to include QB.BI, which defines Reg-Type, a structure that stores pseudo register values to pass to DOS and to receive information back.

Good Moves

I often move files from one directory to another. Since I don't want duplicate files cluttering my disk, I created a batch file, MOVE.BAT [see LISTING 2], that copies and deletes files with one command.

To avoid accidentally deleting important files, I built safeguards into the batch file that ensure a safe and happy move. Errors are reported if the destination file already exists, if you mistype a file name, or if you specify a nonexistent directory.





Editor's note: Copy MOVE.BAT to a directory in the current PATH. Then type move file dir, where file is the path and file name of the file to move and dir is the destination. For example, MOVE NAMES.DAT C:\BACKUP moves NAMES.DAT to C:\BACKUP and then deletes the original file. If you attempt to move a file to a nonexistent directory, MOVE.BAT will ask for confirmation before creating the directory. MOVE.BAT has its limits; because it looks for '%2\%1' when error checking, the batch file can't move a file to the root directory.

I added a PAUSE command that lets you press < Ctrl>-C after copying if you want to save the original file. If you don't want this option, remove the first PAUSE and the three preceding ECHO statements.

Dashing Through the Text

I like to give my *WordPerfect* documents a professionally typeset look by using em dashes—like these—in midsentence. Enter the keystrokes in **FIGURE** 2 to create an em dash macro.

To use the macro, press <Alt>-M. You'll see a hyphen on screen, but what's (continues)



actually stored is the code [-:4,34], which selects symbol 34 from the fourth character set. For a professional look, don't insert spaces around your em dashes. Just butt them against the text that comes before and after the dashing dash.

Editor's note: WordPerfect provides about 1500 symbols in 12 character sets, and this macro is a good guide for creating macros for the others. If your printer doesn't support a character, WordPerfect 5.1 will print it as a graphic, assuming you have a graphics printer. So before using these symbols, press <Shift>-<F7> to bring up the Print/Options menu, and set Graphics to Medium or High.

If you're using version 5.0, however, you may not be able to print em dashes or certain other special symbols. If you have trouble printing em dashes, try 3,8 in place of '4,34'.

If that doesn't work, you need to investigate which symbols your printer can handle. The value pairs represent a character set and symbol number, respectively. To get a complete list of available characters—and see how they look on your printer—print the CHARACTR.DOC file provided with WordPerfect. (This file is named CHARMAP.TST in some versions.)

Something for Nothing

In "Losing Your Memo" (Star-Dot-Star, November 1990), we described a way of loading dBASE data when a DBT memo file is missing and presumed unrecoverable. Two readers have since suggested an alternative method. Just create a zero-length file with the same name as your DBF file and the DBT extension. Although the file contains nothing, it fools dBASE into thinking the memos are intact and therefore lets you load your DBF file.

To create the empty file, enter the command type > filename.dbt at the DOS prompt. Type carefully; if the DBT

file still exists, the command will erase it. After typing the command, you'll get an 'Invalid number of parameters' error; don't worry about it. Thanks to Jean Heriot of St. Thomas, Ontario, Canada, and Tim Erikson of Delavan, Wisconsin, for showing that you can get something for nothing.

DOS Windows Front and Center

If you maximize a DOS application's window and then move it with the mouse, it's hard to center that window perfectly at the top of the screen. But don't sweat it-Windows will do it for you. Select the maximized window, and press <Alt>-<Enter> twice. This pops the window into text mode and then back to graphics mode, which compels Windows to automatically recenter the window at the top of the screen. The positions of inactive windows are not affected by this trick.

DEVELOPER'S TOOLBOX

PC-Tags, You're It!

don't rave too often, but I'm raving about *PC-Tags* from Moderne Software. Like the dictionary, *PC-Tags* is one of my most heavily used reference tools.

PC-Tags generates an indexed data base of all a program file's subroutines and many data-type declarations. I use it to prepare indexes for Pascal, C, and assembly language, but it can handle BASIC, dBASE, and Modula-2 as well.

After indexing a set of files, I load my editor with code, place the cursor on any procedure, function, or subroutine name, and press < Ctrl>-A. In a flash, up pops that routine in a separate window. I can then use my editor's cursor keys to investigate how the code works. This simple hypertextlike capability is tremendously useful in debugging, when I need to understand exactly what a library routine will do, and for browsing public-domain listings when a function call's purpose is unclear.

PC-Tags provides search macros for popular editors including BRIEF, Ep-

silon, Multi-Edit, KEdit, Sage, and ME. Because those products search via macros, PC-Tags doesn't steal even 1 byte of memory from my editor or compiler.

To search directly from DOS, other editors, or integrated environments like *Turbo Pascal* and *Turbo C*, I run a supplied TSR. This technique isn't as good as using a macro, since it takes about 17K, but that's a small sacrifice given *PC-Tags*' benefits as a reference tool.

Speaking of great references, I've grown tired of lugging around the excellent but oh-so-heavy manuals for *Microsoft Windows' Software Development Kit (SDK)*. Of course, when I'm away from the office I can use the *SDK*'s online help. But searching on line is exasperatingly slow when all I need is a quick reminder.

The Quick Reference Card for Microsoft Windows 3.0 from Cooper Software took care of that problem and has melted pounds from my luggage. The foldout cardboard accordion lists all 597 SDK functions and parameters. I

especially like the table of *Windows* messages. The *Quick Reference Card* retails for \$14.99, but for a limited time it has an introductory price of \$9.99.

Over in the DOS landscape, I'm digging through a mountain of C code in the 46-disk *Library of PD/Shareware C Utilities* from EMS. Although I have other C collections, I'm impressed with this one's quality. Included is a directory in *dBASE III Plus* format, plus a search utility that lets me hunt for files by name, category, vendor, and other fields. With over 400 files covering a wide range of applications such as disk management, data base, communications, and general-purpose programming tools, the EMS library is a bargain hunter's dream.



TAKING IT HOME

The practical guide to home/office computing

More bytes for your buck

Steve Bass

It's harder all the time to get all the software I need on my home machine. Like most people, I have less computer at the house than at the office, and it has to serve the entire family. For example, my wife needs space for *WordPerfect* and some esoteric, megabyte-gobbling scientific software.

I've thought about buying one of those big, fast hard disks. But I didn't want to break down and do something crazy (like spending money) before exhausting every alternative. Besides, it's too much hassle swapping drives and backing up and restoring all those files. Instead, I've found easier and less expensive ways to stretch my old 30MB Seagate and 40MB Plus Development HardCard.

Like so many good things, one of the best space-saving solutions comes from a bulletin board—*PKZIP* and its companion, *PKUNZIP*. The concept is simple: *PKZIP* lets you take rarely used files and make them much smaller. When you need to use them, you decompress them with *PKUNZIP*. You'll see more data compression with text and data base files than with EXE and COM files. These and other shareware archiving programs are available through most user groups and bulletin boards for under \$50. But the downside to

PKZIP is having to *PKUNZIP* files before you access them.

Another shareware program, *PK-LITE*, solves that problem. It squeezes EXE and COM program files *and* decompresses them on the fly into memory—pretty slick. Because the files are smaller, they even load more quickly. Generally, the larger the original file, the more you save—my 187K *WordStar* COM file was reduced 21 percent, while my 271K *cc:Mail* program was cut a dramatic 52 percent. Unfortunately, *PKLITE* won't work with programs that have internal overlays, such as *Fox*-



Pro; you're warned before proceeding. But because *PKLITE* is shareware and you can try it before you buy, the financial risk is small.

If you have a little more to spend, you can get still greater compression. Stacker is a commercial product that compresses everything on your disk—applications and data—into files on a new, logical drive. Then, Stacker compresses and decompresses files so quickly that you aren't even aware that it's working (except for program overlays). On average, Stacker gives you a 2:1 compression ratio, effectively doubling your available disk space—great

for desktop machines and indispensable for laptops.

Stacker can be bought as software only or as a software/hardware combination. Most people can get by with just software. Stacker's half-size coprocessor card increases access speed, but you'll notice it only on XTs and slower ATs. You can try the software first and add the hardware later. Used as a device driver, Stacker takes 21K of RAM versus 30K used as software only; either can be loaded into high memory with a memory manager. Installation was painless, but because my disk was almost full, the compression took about an hour to complete.

PKZIP/PKUNZIP and PKLITE are both produced by PKWare; too bad there's no way to integrate them to create a single, seamless solution. Stacker, on the other hand, offers a complete answer—and with dealer discounts, it will cost you only a little more than the shareware.
