Neural Networks Shop for Software

reat software for \$50? Suspend your disbelief. Hundreds of programs sell for little more than the price of a movie videotape or a music CD, and we're not just talking about shareware. There are just as many bargain gems from major commercial publishers. Low-priced offerings range from databases to personal information managers to Windows enhancers to programs that create business cards, build presentations, and improve disk performance.

Why aren't more of these bargains better known? Because of the work involved in unearthing them. Our search for the best software bargains started with 4MB of product listings and then reached to electronic bulletin boards, PC user groups, and a wide selection of retailers. We fed these produet listings and many of the programs through a pair of massively parallel neural networks trained for years to recognize good software. One of these neural networks was dedicated to identifying the best \$50 Windows applications. Its name is Scott Dunn. The other concentrated on DOS programs. Its name is Steve Bass. Contributing Editors Scott and Steve came away from this experience with overloaded dendrites and fractured social lives. Thanks to them, you'll come away knowing about some inexpensive programs that make your PC more useful than ever.

Would you grab a couple of these bargain software packages, if only your hard drive had more free space? You should read "Buyers' Guide: 200MB Hard Disks." Manufacturers' specifications of seek times and transfer rates say nothing about how drives will affect your daily business computing. We tested 14 drives to see how they affected the performance of real application programs. Benefits were huge on some programs and trivial on others. Contributing Editor George Campbell sum-

marizes the findings of the PC World Test Center and demystifies the other issues involved in buying a new hard disk either locally or direct.

Not long ago a \$2000 notebook fully outfitted for *Windows* was unthinkable. This month we test 20 such notebooks and report on 6 others that arrived too late for review. The price of our Best Buy notebook from September 1992, the Dell Dimension NL25, has dropped almost \$1000 in five months—yet

7 other Windows notebooks in this roundup sell for less than the Dell.

Two Views of Usability

This month's notebook review is another example of how the PC World Test Center is incorporating usability testing into our review process. Rather than use robots to press keys and test battery endurance, we asked real PC users to follow a script driving real applications. As a result, we not only got more realistic measures of battery life, but we also gathered extensive feedback from ten users on keyboards, screens, and pointing devices. The observations about keyboards were illuminating. Preferences in keyboards varied enormously. So instead of telling you one editor's opinion of which keyboard felt best, we provide enough information to pick the keyboard that suits your preferences.

For his Business Fixtures column, Thom Foulks continually examines products to determine which should become fixtures in your business. Thom's viewpoint complements our large group product reviews, in which we give a host of products an intense,




systematic, but necessarily time-limited workout to bring you current comparative ratings. Thom's longer-term product usage often enables him

to make observations that escape the notice of a conscientious reviewer who tests a dozen products each month. For example, Thom's early annoyance with Delrina's WinFax Pro 3.0 corroborated the findings of our February review of Windows fax programs, in which our panel of newcomers to fax software rated Delrina's program strong in features but weak in usability. But over time, Thom's annoyance gave way to enthusiastic endorsement of WinFax Pro 3.0 as the fax program by which all others should be measured. Thom also reports his observations on Micrografx's ABC FlowCharter 2.0, MSI's Cachét optical disk drive, SWFTE's Typecase 11, and Richmond Technologies & Software's Maximizer for Windows.

In Search of Large Hard Drives, Investing in NT, Sorting Out CPUs

From Here's How to Hard Drives

Thank you for the December issue, the most informative issue of *PC World* I have yet received. I like the new nofrills, professional look of the magazine as well. Special kudos go to whoever made the decision to expand the "Here's How" section.

I do have one suggestion. I see lots of reviews of monitors, CPUs, and entire systems. However, I have yet to find a review of hard drives or caching controller upgrades.

Editor's response: We review 200MB and larger hard drives in this issue's buyers' guide. And you can look forward to a comparison of caching hardware and software in the June issue.

What About that New Window?

The December issue's "Windows NT: A DOS for the '90s" was a very thought-provoking piece. I'm not a Windows fan, but Scott Spanbauer made me want to take NT for a test run. I wouldn't mind buying all the hardware to run the thing either, since it sounds like NT will solve some of my basic problems.

But Spanbauer says that NT's support for DOS will be limited. If I read the article correctly, only the major DOS applications will run under NT.

My company has invested thousands of dollars in a customized DOS database for our credit department. We've also invested big bucks in NetWare. Is all that investment lost with NT?

Frankly, I've been led to believe that OS/2 would be better for us since we wouldn't have to throw out what we already have. Am I wrong?

Editor's response: Whether your application will run under Windows NT really depends on how it interfaces with DOS. According to Microsoft, if the application avoids direct BIOS calls and doesn't bypass the operating system

when accessing system hardware, it should run under NT. It's too soon to tell how Windows NT will actually perform and what its hardware requirements will be when released. OS/2 may work for you, depending on what hardware and software you currently use—users I've heard from are either ecstatic about OS/2 or infuriated by it. For now, MS-DOS is still the best DOS.—Scott Spanbauer

Cheaper to Toss the Computer?

Just a compliment for an excellent December issue. I especially appreciated "The Complete Guide to the New CPUs," particularly the information that Cyrix was considering coming out with an upgrade for 386SX computers. I'd like to see a more in-depth article on this subject and what Cyrix is planning. Many people bought 386SXs because they were good entry-level machines before the Windows power drain. Offended Cartographers

n December's "What's Next," Mike Hogan has done a disservice to the American Automobile Association and its cartography department. He implies that AAA maps provide inaccurate information. AAA road reporters, each of whom drive between 50,000 and 60,000 miles annually on North

American roads, collect information on mileage, interchange signs and designs, exit numbers, rest areas, gas, food, lodging, and travel restrictions. Their current data is integrated into all appropriate cartographic products on an annual basis.

Furthermore, the comparison of hard copy to digital maps is mixing apples and oranges. Each product has a specific functional niche. Paper maps in and of themselves do not predict distance, travel time, and the fastest route. They serve as an inexpensive, multipurpose, geo-referential tool for human beings. An occasional traveler can hardly justify the expenditure of more than \$100 on software, not to mention the cost of a portable computer, when a \$3 map will do. That would be like hunting a duck with a cannon.

The Hidden Costs of PC Purchases...and More

onsumer Watch routinely receives letters from mail-order shoppers who were charged restocking and/or shipping fees for incorrect or damaged orders that they later returned for a refund. Here's a sampling of some recent letters, along with some guidelines to follow so you can avoid similar charges.

Return to Sender

purchased a 486 computer with an SVGA monitor from Vektron International, a mail-order firm in Grand Prairie, Texas. The system came with a 14-day money-back guarantee. I paid United Parcel Service \$308.92 (Canadian) in brokerage fees and customs duties for the computer, and within hours I realized it was defective.

I contacted Vektron for assistance, and the company issued an RMA [return merchandise authorization] number so I could ship the system back (for \$62). I received the computer replacement (paying another \$38.58 in brokerage fees) and found there was another problem with the machine. I informed Vektron of the problem and asked for another RMA number. When they were late in providing this, I told them I wanted to return the whole system as part of their 14-day money-back offer.

I received an RMA number and shipped the whole unit back (for another \$81.06). Several weeks later I discovered that Vektron issued a refund to my credit card and deducted a 20 percent restocking fee and an additional 5 percent for shipping and handling.

My total for the transaction was \$1136.92, and I don't have anything to show for it.

n February 1992 I ordered a \$1000 scanner from Peach Computer Systems of Norcross, Georgia. When it ar-

rived, I discovered it was defective. I was advised by the manufacturer to return the scanner to the dealer for replacement.

I contacted Peach Computer Systems and received an RMA number. I asked when the new scanner would be shipped and explained that I had a project to complete that required the scanner. I was told the new scanner would be shipped as soon as the defective one was returned. I later found out the unit had been back ordered, so I de-

cided to cancel the order and request a refund. I then ordered the scanner from someone else.

When I received my credit card statement, I found that Peach Computer had deducted \$227.05 from my refund as a restocking fee. I called Peach Computer to dispute the fee since the scanner had been defective from the start, but the company said it always applies restocking fees and shipping and handling charged on returned items.

Editor's note: We attempted to contact both Vektron International and Peach Computer Systems on behalf of Corat and Wrislet. Phone lines for Peach Computer Systems had been disconnected, however, and we were unable to obtain any additional information about the company or its policies.

We did, however, receive a response from Vektron International's sales manager Eric P. Robb, who said, "I sympathized with Mr. Corat's frustrations, but I feel that Vektron has lived up to its obligations with this customer." Accord-



ing to Robb, the chances of something being damaged in shipment are "much higher" for Canadian customers because of the increased distances

involved. The charges deducted from Mr. Corat's refund, according to Robb, were for shipping and handling, and a 20 percent restocking fee for returning a system more than 30 days old. "I believe these to be quite standard in the industry. They are not meant to defraud customers."

Certainly Vektron is not alone in levying a restocking fee on returned merchandise or in requiring customers to pay shipping charges. But as both readers' letters indicate, you can easily wind up spending a fairly hefty sum of money on such charges without any product to show for it.

While restocking fees and shipping charges are reasonable when a customer returns an item simply because it does not meet his or her needs, such charges are not appropriate when the returned item is defective, incomplete, or not what the customer ordered.

Many companies, if prodded, will return shipping or restocking fees for defective items. Not all are so inclined however, so ask about a firm's policy *before* you place your order. Then get the information in writing so you have it to refer to later should the need arise.

Gateway 2000: An Uneven Service Record

G ateway 2000 has grown more rapidly over the past year than virtually any other mail-order PC company. The steady flow of *Consumer Watch* letters about the company attests to its increasing dominance in the market and to some of the difficulties the company has had in keeping up with its growing customer base.

Not all letters are negative, however. In addition to the letters of complaint and requests for assistance from Gateway customers, we also regularly receive letters praising its service.

First, the Good News...

wish to let you know of the good service I received recently from Gateway 2000. I was having a problem with the internal clock in my home PC and called Gateway the next day from work. The technician I spoke with agreed to call me back when I got home in the evening and work with me to identify the problem. He talked me through the procedure, which took a couple of hours. He was very patient throughout, providing assistance without making me feel like an idiot.

... Now the Bad News

recently tried to call Gateway 2000, and despite several attempts, I was unable to get through to a sales representative or get one to return my calls. They may be good, but they aren't that good.

This is what happens when you call Gateway for support: You dial the 800 number, and the phone is answered by a computer that tells you how important you are. You're then placed on hold for about 5 minutes, and an operator comes on the line and asks how to direct your call. When he or she transfers you to technical support, your call is placed in the queue, where you remain on hold for 15 minutes before you are re-

ferred back to the operator, who tells you that all the lines are still busy and offers to take a message and have a technician call you back. Well, you figure, it's the only way you are going to get through to these people, so you leave all the information. But guess what? They never call back. It took a week before I heard anything from Gateway, and the only reason I did was because I called again.

The only way around this mess is to get very mad on the phone and ask to be transferred to the CEO's office. People then start to get things moving for you. You should by no means say "technical support" when the operator asks where to transfer your call. If you do, you'll have a long wait.

"Unfortunately, the response time in returning calls has fallen below our normal company and customer expectations. We are aware of the problem, however, and we are working daily to improve our response times.

"Ted Waitt, president of Gateway 2000, recently solicited customer suggestions through our quarterly newsletter, *The Gateway Monitor*. He will personally be reading all of the responses (though he cannot respond to each concern personally). All of the information received will be compiled into a database for analysis. The result will be a report card for the company that includes the top 10 or 15 problems customers wrote about, along with various suggested solutions. We will then involve employees from all levels in the company to decide how to make improvements.



Bundled Software Doesn't Qualify

A fter reading in the December 1992 issue of *PC World* that Macromedia would upgrade users of *Action* version 1.0 to release 2.0 at no additional charge, I called the company to request my upgrade. I was told, however, that since my copy of version 1.0 came bundled with my CD ROM drive, I did not qualify for the free upgrade. Instead, I would have to pay \$79.

I do not think this policy is fair, since the price I paid for the CD ROM drive covered

all hardware and software, including Macromedia's Action 1.0.


recently ordered a system from Gecco Computers of Tempe, Arizona, which was to be paid for within 30 days of receipt. After three weeks, the system finally arrived with the wrong hard drive, wrong case, and a defective monitor. Back went everything to Gecco to be fixed. Over the next few weeks I called several times to check on the status of the system and was repeatedly told "it's being shipped today."

When I didn't receive the computer I

called again, and Gecco's phone lines had been disconnected, so I surmised they had gone belly-up. A phone call to the Better Business Bureau confirmed this suspicion.

Here is my dilemma: Gecco finally sent me the system back, and apparently after they had shut down. Why would they? It's not paid for, and it seems unlikely that the company intends to honor its appealing two-year parts and labor warranty or the promised on-site service (both of which can be obtained only by calling Gecco's now disconnected phone lines).

I can't reach them by phone, and no one is responding to my faxes.

Editor's note: It's likely that Susser's experience was the result of some of the confusion surrounding Gecco's last few weeks in business. The Arizona-based mail-order PC manufacturer, which had been in business since 1987, shut down its operation late last year after running into severe cash-flow problems, explains Gecco vice president Eldon Thomas.

According to Thomas, the firm suffered a sharp decrease in sales during the first weeks of December (shortly after Compaq and other major players slashed their prices) and, being "cash strapped," did not have the funds to continue in business. Thomas says that all but 20 to 25 orders were filled and that company principals are working with creditors in an attempt to resolve financial obligations without having to declare bankruptcy.

Unfortunately, owners of Gecco systems are not so fortunate. The company does not have any plans to continue its warranty coverage, and although the firm did offer onsite repairs through Idea Servcom, Thomas says that this service will not be available any longer.

Gecco is not the only PC company to stumble or fall in battle, however. For example, Cumulus, a PC mail-order firm based in Ohio, was placed in receivership at the end of last year, and Everex, a high-performance PC manufacturer in Fremont, California, recently filed Chapter 11.

Given the turbulent times and the likelihood of additional shakeout in the next few months, we offer a reprise of our *Consumer Watch* tips for PC buyers. Although some of the suggestions require effort on your part, the time that you spend researching a purchase may mean the difference between getting the product you order and being left empty-handed.

- Know who you're buying from. Look for companies with a proven track record that have demonstrated some longevity in the market. Call the company's local Better Business Bureau to see if complaints have been filed against it. Check system reviews for evaluations of both performance and service and support.
- Don't pay cash. Use a credit card or pay COD. You'll have little or no recourse if you pay by check, but stand a good chance of getting your money back if you charge the purchase and never receive your order.
- Evaluate the companies' return and service policies. Buy only from those firms that have 30-day money-back guarantees and that offer comprehensive service and support, such as 24-hour technical support and on-site repair service.
- Document everything. Request written confirmation about pricing, warranty coverage, and return policy before you place your

order. Keep a record of all your phone conversations, including the name and title of the salesperson who takes your order.

Verify availability and ship dates. Companies that can't ship an order by the promised date are required to notify you of the delay. If you don't receive an order on time and haven't heard from the company, contact your credit card company and let them know of the delay. If your credit card has already been debited, cancel the order and notify your credit card company.





Tricks for Painless Scheduling

his month our mission to bring you tales from the front lines of computing takes us to Roth Aymond, director of information systems for the Louisiana Legislative Auditor. Aymond oversees the computing needs of some 200 in-house and field staff who monitor the state's financial heartbeat. His experience includes 12 years working with IBM mainframes and PCs. Because Aymond is a government auditor, he did not accept payment for this article. —Ed.

A Thorn in My Side

Scheduling software is supposed to make the common task of setting up meetings more efficient, but it doesn't always work that way. In my office, we took a few detours before finding the right package and establishing the necessary rules to make group scheduling work for us.

Here's how it happened: Two years ago, when I became director of information systems, our office was making the transition from a Wang minicomputer with terminals to a collection of PCs connected to a Novell network. Since we were losing the Wang Office scheduling system, which was very competent, my predecessor chose a new program with group scheduling capabilities: Polaris's PackRat.

But we had big problems right from the start: PackRat was slow, too complex for most of the staff, and we couldn't put more than 70 users on it. This last restriction was a particular problem because we have 90 users in our home office in Baton Rouge, working off of three servers, and a wide area network that connects two field offices. We also have almost 100 field employees who need to be tracked. Polaris released a PackRat upgrade that promised to be more to our liking, but the company wanted to charge \$99 per workstation, and we felt we shouldn't have to pay more for what didn't work

correctly to begin with. That's when I decided to make a switch.


I'm skeptical when it comes to software. I've seen too many demos where the program runs perfectly only because it's on a stand-alone 486. Try it on your network, and it runs like a dog. So I've established a few policies I follow before making a big purchase. If the software costs \$150 or less, I buy a single copy and beat up on it for a month. If it costs more than \$150, I ask the vendor to give me a free

one-month trial. If the company won't, I don't bother with the product. In evaluating Campbell Services' OnTime for Networks, I called several companies that had used it to make sure they were satisfied, and when Campbell offered a free evaluation copy for a ten-user network version, I decided to try it.

I was looking for a package that would be easy to learn and would schedule our diverse users efficiently. Along with the capability to check people's schedules and report back automatically, our ideal software choice would update the availability of a room or equipment and would be accessible to remote users.

Access on the Road

We found that OnTime met our requirements, although for employees who work outside the office, the scheduling could be better. People in our two branch offices can update their schedules via the wide area network and be scheduled for meetings as though they worked in the Baton Rouge office. For our field employees, we have set up toll-free telephone lines that allow them



to use Norton-Lambert's Close-up, a remote access package, to update their OnTime calendars.

But updating data that way is proving to be painfully slow. We are waiting for a new "reconciliation" feature that will allow remote OnTime Roth Aymond, director of information systems for the Louisiana Legislative Auditor

users to keep current copies of their calendars while they travel, and then complete two-way updates when they dial into the network. It would also be advantageous if the package worked seamlessly with *cc:Mail*, our E-mail system. That way people could RSVP for a meeting via E-mail and their calendars would then be updated automatically.

We quickly discovered that if you want scheduling to work, you have to require employees to keep their calendars up-to-date. It's also critical to decide which employee gets clearance to update the schedule for a room or equipment. For example, anyone can sign up to use our page scanner when it's free, but with conference rooms, accidental conflicts would be unaccept-

able. We avoid that by putting one person in charge of making changes to the conference room calendar.

The downside is that it takes a while for everyone on the network to put away their Day-Timers and get used to scheduling on their PCs. Still, it's much better than handling scheduling the old-fashioned way. We've paid about \$10,000 to license 200 users, but the convenience in managing our roving employees is worth it.

Truer Flush-Right Alignment in 1-2-3

In Power Tip No. 256 (August 1992, page 290), Shane Devenshire offered a 1-2-3 macro that right-aligned labels by inserting spaces. But if you used his macro, then reduced the width of your column and used it again, the macro didn't work.

This one will: in an unused part of your worksheet type {let @CELLPOINTER ("address"),@TRIM(@CELLPOINTER ("contents"))], then select /Range . Name . Create to name the cell \R. In the cell below it, type [edit][home] (del); below that, type '@REPEAT (" ",@CELLPOINTER("width")@LENGTH (@CELLPOINTER ("contents")))&" (don't forget the starting apostrophe); and below that, type (end)"(calc) . From then on, pressing <Alt>-R when in a label cell will insert enough spaces to make it appear right-aligned, even if it already has more spaces than it needs. Jim Carter







THERE'S A NEW 0S/2

Improved Windows support with 25 percent faster performance and seamless integration, more drivers, and enhancements for mobile computing make OS/2 2.1 worth a look.

S/2 2.1 offers more power and reliability than its predecessor, and it can do almost everything *Windows 3.1* can with comparable ease and speed. Due to ship in the second quarter, the operating system could prove to be a technical tour de force for IBM. But while IBM expects novices and



alike to flock to this new product, industry experts contend that the technical enhancements aren't significant enough to warrant a mass migration. Another key deterrent: the continuing dearth of mainstream 32-bit applications that fully exploit OS/2.

There is little disagreement that OS/2 2.1 will be popular with existing OS/2 users, primarily developers, engineers, and other technical types who work with mission-critical applications. But IBM isn't content with selling to existing users. John Patrick, vice president of sales and marketing for IBM's Personal Software Products division, says Big Blue expects that even devoted Windows users will switch to OS/2 because it offers advanced capabilities in a more crashresistant, robust multitasking environment.

IBM also expects to attract novices, who

will prefer the product's intuitive, Macintosh-like interface. Beginners will like the drag-and-drop features and the ability to manipulate documents from the desktop without first entering an application, proponents say. Although the previous version also had these features, the new product's ease of use combined with its ability to run DOS, *Windows 3.1*, and OS/2 applications will make it attractive.

Analysts counter that even if OS/2 2.1 is a superior product, it won't overcome the barriers to widespread acceptance. Users' resistance to upgrading their hardware will be one major issue. To run OS/2 in a spritely manner, you will need a 486-based PC with at least 8MB of RAM and a hard disk that's 100MB or larger. To install the product, you will need time and patience. Although the basic setup isn't difficult, installing the OS from 19 or so disks can take about 40 minutes. This factor may deter some users and MIS departments from converting their systems to OS/2, says Jeffrey Silverstein, editor and publisher of the Software Industry Bulletin in Stamford, Connecticut.

Windows also enjoys more support from software vendors. In a survey of widely available applications, Jeffrey Henning, senior analyst at BIS Strategic Decisions, a Norwell, Massachusetts, market research firm, found that Windows programs outnumber OS/2 applications six to one. Many of the OS/2 applications are developers' tools, of little interest to end users. Moreover, the OS/2 products designed for end users don't offer significant advantages over their Windows counterparts, Henning says.

These issues may limit OS/2 2.1's success in the near term. Henning expects OS/2 2.1 to attract some 400,000 new users in 1993, increasing the total number of OS/2 users to about 1.5 million, compared to 13.7 million for *Windows*. The new users will be mainly from large companies that buy strictly from IBM. One such buyer is Wayne F. Dunn,



News Monitor

NEW FROM COMPAQ: The popular Pro-Linea line is getting local bus graphics and 1024 by 768 resolution in early March as part of a massive new product sweep by the Houston, Texas, PC maker. A new 66-MHz 486DX2 Pro-Linea, also with local bus graphics, will be introduced along with three new Contura notebooks. All three notes will use the 486SL-25 CPU. One of the two color notes uses active-matrix technology; the others use an improved passive-matrix technology. Compaq is also enhancing its Deskpro/M. New models will come with 8MB of RAM rather than 4MB, and some Deskpro/i models will be preconfigured with ethernet controller cards. Pricing was not set on these products at press time.

DELL AND IBM CUT PRICES: PC price cutting continues. In February Dell slashed \$50 to \$500 from portable and desktop PCs across several product lines, including some new 486s announced in December 1992. Among notebooks, the biggest price drop was on the 3.6-pound 320SLi: Previously \$2548 with a 20-MHz i386SL processor, 4MB RAM, and 120MB hard drive, it now lists for \$1999. The 325NC, a passive-matrix color notebook with a 25-MHz i386SL processor, 4MB RAM, and 120MB hard drive, went from \$2949 to \$2549. Among desktops, the 486SX-based, upgradable 425s/L and 433s/L models with local bus video dropped \$200 to \$300, depending on configuration. New service options include 7-day, 24-hour tech support.

manager of end-user support for the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority. Dunn plans to convert about 400 *Windows* and DOS-based systems to OS/2 2.1 by September. Almost all these units are IBM PS/2s. He'll provide users with the requisite 486 power either by replacing existing units with new PS/2s or by upgrading the CPUs with a 486 Micro Channel card.

Windows Module

Improved *Windows* support is the key addition in OS/2 2.1. At press time, the operating system was still in beta. The following


is an overview of the *Windows* features that are expected in the final version of 2.1.

The Windows module is actual Microsoft Windows 3.1 source code that has been modified to run on the OS/2 kernel. IBM claims that it can run both standard and enhanced modes. OS/2 2.0 included Windows 3.0 code, but that version was not able to run enhanced mode, which Windows 3.0 itself could run.

The Windows 3.1 components let OS/2 2.1 run more Windows applications than OS/2 2.0, including programs that require the enhanced-mode and Windows 3.1

features. The new operating system can run Windows applications seamlessly in an OS/2 window. This capability means that it's now possible for you to display Windows, DOS, and OS/2 applications in reduced views, which makes for easier monitoring and more efficient cutting and pasting.

This seamless capability also lets you place integral *Windows* programs such as File Manager and Program Manager on IBM's graphical desktop, the Workplace Shell. As a result, you won't have to waste time opening OS/2's *Windows* module in order to use these features—you simply double-click an icon located in the same place as the OS/2 icons. In addition, users

trading up to OS/2 will be able to launch DOS, *Windows*, and OS/2 programs and manipulate files by using the *Windows* tools with which they are already familiar.

The improvements to the graphics engine address a key complaint that users have voiced about O2/2 2.0—slow *Windows* performance. In OS/2 2.1, IBM claims, it has improved *Windows* performance by approximately 25 percent over the last version, and a company spokesperson reports that beta users are finding no perceptible difference between running *Windows* applications under OS/2 2.1 and running those same applications under *Windows* 3.1.

Portable Power in a 2.5-Pound Package:

The DTR-1 from Dauphin Technology weighs one-third as much as today's average notebook, yet it boasts much the same functionality. Powered by a 25-MHz Cyrix 486SLC chip, this portable 2.5-

There's also an optional internal ethernet adapter, and a 9600-bps internal fax-modem is standard. You can take advantage of the unit's pen right from the start—a slimmed-down version of PenWare's PenCell spreadsheet software is included.

The internal battery lasts 2 hours. An external battery pack that also serves as a screen cover pops on to add 8 more hours, the vendor says. If you need additional storage, Dauphin also offers an external version of its 85MB DynaDrive removable-cartridge hard drive. Tips to Maximize Modem Speed

ith street prices dropping below \$300, high-speed V.32 and V.32bis modems that send and receive data at speeds up to 57,600 bits per second (using data compression) are becoming increasingly popular. However, customers are finding that getting the extra speed may not be as simple as installing the modem and loading a new driver. Using a slow *Windows* communications driver, an outdated serial port,

speeds beyond 20 kilobits per second. Owners of these systems may want to buy high-speed serial boards, typically priced at \$200 or less, from companies such as Hayes, UDS Motorola, and DigiBoard. Windows 3.0 users may finally want to upgrade to Windows 3.1, which includes an improved communications driver that supports the 16550 UART chip necessary for high-speed data links. Another solution is to upgrade to a communications program that supports

the ZMODEM protocol, which has a number of error correction and speed enhancements that can give you faster file downloads.

Beyond the system bottlenecks, high-speed modem users are finding they must pay a stiff premium for 9600-bps access to on-line services like CompuServe and GEnie—typically twice as much per hour as for 2400-bps access. "What upsets me is that we pay a high price for higher-speed modems to find the only thing we save is time," says CompuServe member Jim Wesley, a civil engineer from Linden, New Jersey.

A CompuServe spokesperson says that 9600-bps service costs more because users "receive information twice as quickly" and hence are on line for a shorter period.

But users of high-speed modems can save themselves some money if they use an on-line service correctly, advises Moen. Among his suggestions: Unless you are downloading files, you will find that it's a good idea to stick to the 2400-bps line to

read mail and browse the service. One additional solution: You can turn to a communications program such as Mustang Software's *QmodemPro*, which automatically downloads your E-mail, or to off-line tools such as *AutoSIG*, which is free, or the \$79 *TAPCIS*—utilities that automate on-line navigation of conferences, message capture, and file downloads on CompuServe.

Tips for optimizing high-speed modems

- If your PC's serial port is limited to 20 Kbps and you use an external modem, buy a high-speed serial board, typically priced under \$200.
- For faster file transfers, use the ZMODEM
 protocol
- Cut on-line services' hourly charges by using offline readers in programs like QmodemPro and CompuServe Information Manager for Windows.
- If your on-line service's 9600-bps line costs extra, use it only to transfer files. Use the cheaper 2400bps line to browse the service.
- Windows 3.0 users should upgrade to Windows 3.1, with its enhanced communications driver.

or an ill-chosen protocol can make your high-speed modem perform more like the 2400- or 1200-bps slowpoke you replaced.

Getting the most from your high-speed modem may require additional hardware and software upgrades, says Rick Moen, a BBS systems operator and member of the San Francisco PC Users Group. For example, many XT, 286, and even some 386-class PCs have serial ports that can't handle

Among the first to respond was IBM, which cut the price of its ThinkPad 300, a 25-MHz 386SL notebook with 4MB RAM and an 80MB hard disk, to \$1999 from \$2375. The 120MB model went from \$2575 to \$2199. Prices of IBM PS/ValuePoints also dropped between \$70 and \$140.

MICROSOFT CHANGES DOS 6.0: While it grapples with a patent infringement suit, Microsoft Corporation has made several changes to its DOS 6.0, including removing a small piece of data compression technology. It took out the compression option called Max-Compress soon after Stac Electronics lodged a patent infringement suit on January 25. Stac claims Microsoft infringed on two patents in DOS 6.0's DoubleSpace data compression utility.

Microsoft has temporarily removed MaxCompress while it examines the suit, says Collins Hemingway, manager of systems public relations at Microsoft. The MaxCompress option allows 5 to 6 percent more compression than the standard compression utility, with a trade-off of slower speed, he says. Most of DOS 6.0's compression capability remains. (Microsoft could decide to reinsert the option before DOS 6.0 ships at the end of March or make it available later.) The company also made two DOS 6.0 changes unrelated to the suit: It removed one feature that allowed auto-installation on a network and another that permitted auto-installation of clients on Microsoft Mail.

Split your compute time between two sites? A 3½-inch optical disk in your pocket offers a floppy's portability (without the serial-transfer hassles) and greater capacity than even a removable hard drive. What more could you do to improve LapLink, the venerable file transfer utility from Traveling Software? How about peer-to-peer file transfer over a Novell network? Add dragand-drop. Toss in unattended file transfer, background transfer under Windows, and an interface that displays files and directories graphically and makes LapLink easier to use. Keep the price at \$169.95, and you have yourself a sure hit.

Rather than cram a collection of file and disk management utilities into *Lap-Link V*, Traveling Software has opted for quality. Several

enhancements, including network support, both broaden and simplify file transfer. You can exchange files with other *LapLink V* users on a NetWare network, bypassing the file server. Using NetWare's IPX communications protocol, *LapLink V* transfers files directly between PCs on a network, freeing up the server for other tasks and conserving its disk space.

Certainly you don't want everyone on the LAN to have unlimited access to all your files and directories. Perhaps you want your Sales directory open to all, but your Budget directory open only to senior management. LapLink V's beefed-up security lets you specify who has rights to your computer, which drives and directories they can open, whether they can copy or only read files, and whether they need a password in order to perform these tasks.



PENTIUM PCs POSTPONED: The March introduction of systems based on Intel's Pentium microprocessor has been delayed, and few Pentium PCs will be available until early summer. Intel has asked vendors to wait until late May to introduce Pentium systems, but the company will unveil technical details of the chip in March when it begins shipping the CPU to system makers. Intel says the delay is designed to fill the distribution network and avoid huge backlogs, but analysts say Intel and PC vendors also need the time to improve manufacturing yields.



a laptop and a desktop. With this feature, *LapLink* will ensure that your frequently revised spreadsheets, documents, and presentations on both your computers contain the most current versions.

While LapLink is designed for file transfer, it makes a pretty tolerable file manager as well. It makes it possible for you to erase entire directories—complete with subdirectories and files—using the Delete command. And LapLink V's tree mode displays a hard drive's directory structure graphically, making it easier for you to track down subdirectories and files.

LapLink V comes in two flavors. The \$169.95 single-user version includes cables for connecting two PCs via the serial or parallel ports. The \$99.95 network version, LapLink V for NetWare, designed for the MIS professional or LAN administrator who wants to set up peer-topeer file transfer on the network, does not include cables.

However, both the single-user and the network version work across networks running Novell NetWare 2.2 or 3.11, and both of them will transfer your files over modems.

While LapLink V's list of new features is impressive—especially the built-in LAN support—we found this version's ease of use particularly noteworthy. The menudriven interface, Windows-like drag-and-drop features, and graphical file and directory icons make transferring files less daunting for the neophyte and even simpler for the LapLink veteran.

Hotels Offer PC Services in Battle for Guests

Frustrated by hotel rooms that don't offer telephones with data ports? Ever forget to load the spreadsheet file for your presentation on your notebook before leaving the office? According to hotel managers and travel planners, downtown hotels are fighting hard for business customers after a two-year financial slump, and many are moving to offer services that make computing on the road easier for their guests.

Travelers can make the most of the situation by price and feature shopping, says Jerry Aransky, vice president of industry relations at Thomas Cook Travel in Cambridge, Massachusetts. "People are not yet willing to pay extra for computing services, but often they will book because of it. The hotels need [these services] as a marketing tool," he says.

Deals Abound in Software Price Skirmish

he inevitable aftershocks of last year's PC price war are rocking the software market. Rather than invest hardware savings in software, buyers are trying to ratchet down expenditures for mainstream business applications to maintain the traditional ratio of 20 to 40 percent of the system's cost. "For folks who now spend \$1000 to \$2000 on their system, that means a lower software threshold," says David Watkins, Borland vice president for product marketing.

In an all-out effort to seize a bigger share of those tighter budgets and grow their market share, several companies, including Borland, have temporarily slashed prices. Others offer upgrades from competitors' products at a fraction of list price. And increasingly, new Windows software is coming to market for hundreds of dollars less than older DOS versions.

The software price war began

copies, a staggering number considering its estimate that in 1992 *all* databases sold a total of 1.2 million copies.

Borland returned fire with both barrels. Aiming first at

Access, Borland released Paradox for Windows with an introductory \$139.95 price tag (the offer expires April 30). Recognizing that it should have been just as aggressive with Quattro Pro and Quattro Pro for Windows, Borland slashed their prices to \$99.95 each for the same period. The showdown on the software shelves has users wondering

which way they should turn for the next deal.

Not so fast, says Software Publishing Corporation CEO and chair Fred Gibbons. He


> suggests the competitive dynamics at play between Borland and Microsoft do not apply to all companies and does not expect the Borland/Microsoft price battle to spread.

> Nonetheless, Gibbons and other vendors may have to react. "When we are dealing with accounts [that make] thousands of pur-

chases, we're going to play hardball on price," he says...

Most sales of these new products are for evaluation, says Eileen Rudden, vice president of product marketing at Lotus, and no similar deal is in the works for 1-2-3, she says.

Not that there aren't plenty of deals for the careful shopper. "I can't remember a time when I said, 'Oh, there are no specials attractive to vendors, says Rudden, because they increase the overall number of applications sold. "On a dollars-per-desktop basis, because software suites increase our market penetra-

out there," says Rose Hultgren, director of marketing at Texas reseller Software Spectrum. Hultgren, who has been "managing the [software price] chaos for some time now," says her company handled 14,000 different software titles last year.

Hultgren recommends buyers consider such alternatives to pure price cuts as software suites, where bundles of products are offered at a discount, and competitive upgrades, where owners of product A can switch to a new version of product B at a greatly reduced price. Suites are ideal for first-time buyers; competitive upgrades are supposed to be restricted to registered owners.

Such deals are widely available. Last year Lotus offered SmartSuite, a half-price bundle of the Windows versions of Ami Pro, 1-2-3, Freelance Graphics, and ec:Mail. Suites are more

tion, we don't lose money on them," she says. Microsoft, too, plays the suites game. Microsoft Office for Windows includes Word, Excel, Picture Publisher, and Mail, all for about 11/2 times the cost of Word alone. Info-Corp software analyst Chris Le Tocq predicts that as software integration and compatibility issues become more important, many companies will team up (as in Borland and WordPerfect's WinWin discount suite of WordPerfect for Windows and Quattro Pro for Windows).

So while Borland's David Watkins says you'll never see Paradox for Windows at \$139 again, remember these deals help the vendors as much as you and are not going away. Says Hultgren, "Marketing makes the market better. It's databases now, and it could be spreadsheets next."





Paperless 1 consists of a flatbed scanner, an external optical drive, a half-length SCSI card, and all the cabling, software, and documentation you need to install the system on a PC.

Paper documents are converted to digital via a 400-dpi Pinnacle flatbed scanner. Scanned images are stored on Pinnacle's PMO-650 optical drive, the virtual file room for the P1 system. The drive uses removable 600MB disks.

We ran the Paperless 1 off a Compaq Deskpro 386/25e using a late beta version of Pinnacle's *Windows* software. Despite solid documentation and in-

> formed tech support, installation was typical for a SCSI device—difficult. Once installation was complete, the P1's module-based software proved simple to use.

We started by defining users and access privileges in P1's Administration module, creating open areas for public documents while controlling access to personal file cabinets and the like. P1's password and access options also let us customize user rights. Next we created our filing system in the Template module. Under P1's loose file-cabinet metaphor, we defined templates that associate files with search data such as origin, date, and topic. These templates would become the base of P1's retrieval and storage functions.

The flatbed scanner proved a quick, competent performer. Unfortunately, the lack of a preview option forced us to scan, view, and then rescan some documents to achieve optimal results. Documents were then filed using the associations created in our templates. Unfortunately, scanning and filing required our system's full atten-








A Familiar Interface

Those who use other Lotus products will recognize a familiar interface. Several features from Lotus spreadsheet and word processing programs make an appearance here also. More than 100 SmartIcons provide mouse-click access to functions such as sending mail, formatting text, and displaying unread messages.

An improved search facility lets you build queries for words, phrases, and numbers using query by example, Boolean operators, and proximity operators (find a word within the same paragraph as another word). The product is now able to search across multiple databases and includes full-text indexing for faster searches of large databases.

Many improvements involve database functions. You can automate data entry with lookup features that read an input value and import or display related data from a predefined database or keyword list. But although

Notes can retrieve data from other sources, you can't use its forms to update other databases or keyword lists, as you can with many database programs. The @Prompt command enables corporate developers to build keyword lists.

Notes' work-flow-automation can track documents and route them automatically to the right people. For example, the command @MailSend allows developers to create applications that send documents or E-mail automatically when specified events occur. Say a sales manager wants to sign off on every order taken by members of the sales staff. After a salesperson completes an electronic Notes order form, a preprogrammed @MailSend command automatically forwards the document to the sales manager.

Document management and editing receive careful attention in *Notes 3.0*. For documents with sensitive information, the program offers password protection, which lets you prevent access to certain sections of a doc-

ument by staff who must access other parts. A version manager makes it possible for users to modify a document and automatically retain a copy of the original. This feature keeps track of just who made which changes, and when.

In this latest incarnation, Notes manages to deliver improvements both in power and in ease of use. The product represents a definitive step forward for work group applications.

NEC's Image Line: Speed-Demon 486 Systems



NEC'S NEW IMAGE PC, available in three 486 models, offers local bus graphics, improved hard drive performance, and a ZIF socket.

NEC's Image Series trio of fast 486 systems sports an improved proprietary local bus for enhanced graphics performance; a zippy hard drive; and an upgrade path to Intel's Pentium technology.

In fact, the defining word for the Image systems is *fast*. These machines raced through PC World Test Center *Windows* benchmarks. In overall performance, the top-of-the-line 66-MHz 486DX2 Image was the fastest 66-MHz 486DX2 we've ever tested—14 percent faster than the next leading competitor, Dell's 486L/66.

To achieve this high-octane performance, NEC goosed several of the PC's subsystems. The most critical improvements were to the second-generation proprietary local bus, which now offers a 32-bit pipeline between the processor and the graphics controller. The NEC

local bus is scalable, so it can match the speed of any Over-Drive processor you add to the system, including the Pentium, the vendor claims. (VESA standard local buses have a speed limit of 33 MHz.) So say goodbye to waiting in *Windows*.

The video enhancements don't stop with speed. The PCs have 24-bit color (16.8 million colors at 640 by 480 resolution).

NEC also improved throughput, adding a chip set that eliminates one of the three wait states the CPU previously required to read from and write to memory. NEC also optimized the system for use with the latest IDE controllers. A device driver lets the disk controller accept chunks of data eight times larger than those accepted by controllers used on the Power-Mate PCs. NEC says users will see a 30 to 35 percent improvement over its previous systems on disk-intensive tasks such as database searches and reading and writing large files.



Both support the popular scanner-to-software interfaces— TWAIN, and Pixel Translations' ISIS—and work with a wide range of imaging, OCR, PC fax, and forms processing programs.

The 610 measures 11.6 by 4.2 inches—smaller than a loaf of bread. A built-in automatic document feeder holds ten legal-size pages and adjusts to handle items as small as business cards. To scan, you insert documents vertically into a slot on top of the device. The product can scan images in 8-bit gray scale (256 shades of gray).

The vendor claims the product can scan 6 pages per minute at 300-dpi resolution. To accelerate scanning, the 610, like the 1210, connects via cable to an ISA bus interface card with direct memory access capabilities. This feature lets the scanner

SCSI holds extraordinary promise: One card, the host adapter, can serve as the conductor for a symphony of peripherals. But the reality of installing SCSI and adding new devices can be one of computing's more frustrating challenges.

No longer. Adaptee and Future Domain promise to make the move to SCSI relatively painless.

Adaptec's AHA-1540C SCSI host adapter makes installing SCSI a breeze: There are no jumpers and no guessing which SCSI ID numbers are available when you install a device. Everything is software driven except the act of placing the board in a slot.

NOT ONLY IS 1-2-3 3.4 FASTER and easier to install, it lets you select data with a mouse and use the <Delete> key to erase a cell or range.

A host of little improvements by Lotus in 1-2-3 3.4 add up to a major enhancement. The program is now a little faster than release 3.1+ and has a few more features, and its operation is a bit more streamlined. Sum these changes, and you'll find 1-2-3 3.4 easier to use and more efficient than its predecessor.

Many of the improvements in the \$595 3.4 are designed to save aggravation and keystrokes. For starters, a simplified installation program lets you install 3.4, selected add-ins, and utilities all at once—3.1+ had three installation programs. The new setup program also lists the amount of disk space each add-in or utility requires and shows how much space is available.

Compatibility Cleanup

Lotus has also simplified some of the compatibility requirements that hampered 3.1+. In particular, 3.4 doesn't require special command line switches or other configuration tweaks to work with DOS 5.0 or with systems powered by Intel's 486SX or IBM's SLC chips. Moreover,

an improved memory management system should allow users to run 3.4 under Windows with minimal aggravation.

Other enhancements borrow from 2.4, the first release to incorporate SmartIcons. Release 3.4 includes 90 SmartIcons. which, with a mouse click, execute common spreadsheet commands, such as printing, graphing, adding a range of numbers, formatting numbers, and boldfacing, italicizing, and centering text. An icon editor, not available in 2.4, lets you attach macros to your own icon creations. Other simple but invaluable features let you select data with a mouse and use the <Delete> key to erase the contents of a cell or range.

SmartIcons aren't the only improvement designed to speed you through your work. The Settings Sheet now shows the current setting for options associated with certain tasks, such as printing or graphing.

An improved debugging feature, also borrowed from 2.4, helps you locate glitches in your macros. When you run a macro in Step mode, the program displays each instruction on the bottom of the screen as it's executed. Previously, when a macro choked on some code, the product displayed an error message and left you to scroll across the screen to the macro, where you then had to hunt through the instructions for the error.

More Power to You

Lotus claims 3.4 is about 25 percent faster than its predecessor. You'll experience improvements when loading the program, loading large files, paging up or down, recalculating, and printing. Users with 286 and older 386SX systems will notice the speedup the most.

Lotus continues to improve the spreadsheet's charting capabilities. New features let you create 3-D line, bar, pie, and area graphs; add drop shadows to bars on a graph; and place a table of data underneath a chart.

Tweaks to the Backsolver allow it to support simultaneous changes to multiple variables, which provides a quicker, more

efficient way to test what-if hypotheses. The Backsolver in 3.1+ lets you adjust only a single variable.

An updated DataLens, which lets you read and write to external databases, includes drivers for dBASE III, dBASE IV, and SQL Server and also an improved driver for Paradox. Release 3.1+ lets you read and write to Paradox and read, but not write to, dBASE III. Finally, the product adds more printer drivers for popular devices and can support landscape printing on dot matrix printers.

Remote-control utilities that let you control your office PC from your home PC or notebook aren't new, but Fifth Generation Systems' \$149 Here & There brings some fresh touches to the genre, including a clear menu-driven design that simplifies two-way remote control, the capability to remotely access network drives, and a way to perform background file transfers while running other DOS applications.

The program requires 65K of RAM, but you can avoid RAM cram by installing only the software modules you're likely to use; for example, remote printing requires 3K of RAM, mouse support needs 2K, and so on.

A hot-key combination loads Here & There. Then you're greeted by a simple menu selection, including choices for connecting to a remote PC, editing your list of remote PCs, transferring a file, terminal emulation, and other options.

As with any remote package, Here & There gives the remote user complete control over the host PC. You can run DOS programs remotely—and even run Windows programs from the host, provided you have a copy of Windows installed on the remote PC. Graphical environments such as Windows typically require lengthy screen redraws, so a high-speed modem (9600 or 14,400 bps) at both ends will save time and money.

Here & There provides a number of helpful features that make your remote session more productive. You can transfer files between PCs while running other DOS applications and redirect printer output.

Here & There lets you access your office LAN so you can, for instance, pull database or spreadsheet files off a network drive or use the network printer. Also, you can use the program's chat mode to exchange messages with the user of the host PC, useful for training or tech support. At any time dur-

ing your remote session, each PC can switch roles—a simple menu selection makes the host the guest and vice versa.

Here & There costs \$149. It requires DOS 3.3 or higher, 640K of RAM, 1.2MB of disk storage, and a modem.


Color printer prices dropped steadily during the past two years and should continue their descent in 1993. Vendors are expected to add more low-priced models to their existing lines, according to industry analyst Bill Flynn at BIS Strategic Decisions. Of the three common types of color printers—dye sublimation, thermal transfer, and color ink jet—color ink jets and thermal transfers will offer good values as printer companies raise quality and lower prices, Flynn says. Dye sublimation printer prices should remain stable at around \$10,000.

Dot Matrix Printers: Down but Not Out


Units in millions







Quality doesn't always come with a price tag. Two experienced bargain hunters pick 45 top low-priced programs to round out your suite of mission-critical applications.

veryone loves a bargain, and the software world is full of them—if you know where to look. In this day of \$795 applications, it's nice to know that you can still buy a program for less than a meal in a good restaurant.

To discover the finest in inexpensive software, we checked out BBS's, talked to user groups, asked retailers, and slogged our way through over 4MB of product listings sent to us by *PC World*. Finally, we went red-eyed examining the programs that seemed likely candidates. One of us (Steve) checked out the DOS programs, while the other (Scott) remained in *Windows*.

The programs we unearthed fall into just about every category imaginable: utilities, communications programs, personal information managers, and even spreadsheets. Some of the programs are *shareware*—software that's distributed free but that you're expected to pay for if you decide to keep it—but most are commercial packages that you can buy shrink-wrapped at your local computer store.







Shareware on Line

If you've never tried shareware, you're in for a treat. Instead of marketing through traditional distribution channels, shareware authors make their software available on a trial basis through electronic bulletin boards and mail-order companies. After you evaluate the program—usually about 30 days—the author expects you to send payment and register it, or stop using it and delete the files from your hard disk.

But Is It Safe?

First, a word about viruses: A lot of people worry about getting computer viruses from shareware. While there's some danger of picking up a virus that way, it's not overwhelming. Shareware distributors all scan their programs for viruses as a matter of course, but it wouldn't hurt to scan them again yourself. Then again, it's probably a good idea to scan new shrink-wrapped software as well, since viruses have been known to get into commercial software houses as readily as shareware ones.

For instant access to shareware, we've listed the more popular on-line services and BBS's across the country. You can access them with any modem. If you'd like to find all of the shareware and free programs discussed in this article in one place, check out PC World Online, where they're all kept together in the Featured In April folder.

Most of these files are available in the compressed ZIP format, and you'll need PKWare's PKZIP compression utility to unzip them. Any BBS that offers shareware will offer PKZIP, itself one of the most popular shareware programs of all time.

Unconnected Options

All's not lost if you're without a modem. Many shareware distribution companies will send you unregistered shareware, either on floppies or CD ROM, for a modest price (CDs tend to be more expensive but come with hundreds of programs). Just remember, when you "buy" shareware from one of these companies, you're paying only a distribution fee; you're still expected to register any program you decide to keep.

And don't forget your local user group.

Many maintain shareware libraries, and larger groups obtain programs directly from the author. The neat part about user groups? You can usually get expert advice by talking with the shareware librarian. To find a user group near you, call the Association of Personal Computer User Groups' locator number, 914/876-6678, or check out Consumer Watch in the October 1992 issue of PC World.

Finally, you can get shareware directly from the authors, either by mail or through their BBS's. That way, you'll be sure to get the most current versions.





for \$2000 or Less

Sometimes you don't need a PC, but those times seem fewer and farther between. For your mobile computing pleasure, this review presents 20 affordable 386 notebooks—and some outstanding values.

ith today's heavy workloads, fewer professionals can afford the luxury of turning off their computers at the end of the day and leaving their work behind. With notebooks at hand, PC users now work at home, out of town, and even during commutes.

The key to efficient computing on the go is desktop replacement: You need the power, memory, video, and disk capacity to run all of your applications—including *Windows* programs—on the six o'clock commuter special as well as in the office.

On the other hand, you don't want to break your budget on a second machine. So we cast our net wide for this review, seeking every affordable 386-or-better notebook we could get. We hauled in a mixed harvest, mostly composed

of 25-MHz models using Intel's 386SL and 386SX and AMD's 386SXL CPUs, but we were even able to come up

with a couple low-priced Cvrix 486SLC-25s. (See "Mobile Computing Picks Up" for more inexpensive notebooks we couldn't get in time for review.)

Fortunately, prices have plummeted over the last several months. The Dell Dimension NL25, which earned a Best Buy in both this review and September's notebook roundup, cost \$2746 last fall. But just six months later, its price had been slashed by almost \$900 to \$1848—and this kind of drop is the rule rather than the exception.


The average price of the notebooks in our roundup came to just over \$1800 on the street-ready to travel, with at least 4MB of RAM, a 60MB hard disk, a 1.44MB internal floppy drive, a 2400bps modem, DOS 5.0, Windows 3.1, and a mouse or trackball. Only 5 of 20 notebooks cost more than \$2000, and one of those four, the Aspen Aquiline Personal 486, is a Cyrix 486SLC-25. The Arche NP-201 was the least expensive in our roundup, with a street price around \$1500. News from the price front will continue to get better in the months to come, as competition forces 386 prices down even further.

Speed On the Go

As you might expect, the Cyrix 486SLCs were the fastest systems in our tests, although the speed differences between them and the fastest Intel 386SL systems were barely perceptible. While still capable, the AMD 386SXLs and Intel 386SXs formed a noticeably slower group. The 386SL chip's integrated memory cache controller gives it an edge over the AMD 386SXL. This feature makes it easy for motherboard manufacturers to add an external memory cache, and all the 386SL notebooks here provide one. With the AMD chip (or the Intel 386SX), motherboard manufacturers have to add a controller chip to support a cache-a problem considering the shortage of real estate on notebook motherboards. As a result, none of the 386SXL (or 386SX) models came with a RAM cache. The Cyrix 486SLC has an internal 1K memory cache integrated right into the chip.

To test these portables, the PC World Test Center used the same tough applications suite we regularly employ to benchmark desktop iron. It includes the PC World Test Center's Windows 3.1 applica-

tions tests (Freelance for Windows 1.0, Word for Windows 2.0, Excel 4.0, and Paradox 3.5 for DOS run from Windows). In addition, we run the BAPCo SYSmark92 test, which uses desktop publishing, presentation graphics, software development, spreadsheet, and word processing applications (for more details see the PC World Test Center Report).

Cutting the Cord

Some users will purchase a notebook to serve as a movable desktop they can easily tote from electrical outlet to electrical outlet. But for most buyers, battery life is crucial. To extend it, notebooks provide a variety of power-saving features. These include timeouts (for

Best Battery Life



With a range from under 2 hours to over 6 hours, battery life was a telling factor in this review. Nevertheless, most of these notebooks managed real-world battery life of close to or over 4 hours. The standouts are the top three with 6, 5%, and 5 hours, respectively. The Compudyne 386SL's 4 hours and 42 minutes is also good.

Best Price



Since we asked vendors to send our notebooks below a certain price, it isn't too surprising that there's little price variation in this review, except at the low end. Arche man-

aged to send us a fully configured notebook for just over \$1500, and the rest of our top five made it under \$1700, with the Swan 386SX/25 just missing a Best Price spot at \$1703.

In the end, there wasn't a huge value difference between the top notebooks in this review. The range from first to eleventh was relatively small and the six

notebooks after our top five—the Micro Express, ZDS, Arche, Toshiba, BCC, and Swan 486/SLC-25—were only a few percentage points away from being Best Buys.

example, turning off the hard disk or the screen's backlighting when it hasn't been used for a while) and default off settings (for the serial and parallel ports, for example), which require a software command to turn on. All these notebooks have a sleep or suspend mode that activates during work pauses to reduce CPU power consumption. When you wake your machine, it goes back to work right where you left off. In addition, many have a sophisticated feature that enables the CPU to doze between keystrokes.

Intel and Microsoft have cooperated in producing the Advanced Power Management (APM) specification, which promises to offer a greater level of power saving. Notebooks with this feature have an APM-compatible BIOS, *Windows 3.1*, and a special chip set to monitor system activity. Over half the notebooks here support the specification, but even with the *Windows 3.1* APM driver installed, we couldn't find a specific correlation between this feature and extended battery life in our user tests. We suspect that the full impact of APM won't be seen until applications such as *Excel* and *Quattro Pro* are rewritten to take advantage of the specification.

Battery life has a big effect on how long you can work before you have to plug back in. So the PC World Test Center tested each notebook's battery life by having human operators simulate work sessions. Our method fully tests all power-saving factors, including CPU timeouts between keystrokes and the effect of periodic saves.

With power saving set to a moderate level, actual battery life varied from a low of around 2 hours to a heady high of more than 6 hours—with more than half of the systems managing to run for about 4 hours. The Zenith Data Systems 625nl Model 85 kept computing for more than 6 hours, and the Best Buy Dell Dimension NL25 ran for more than 5½ hours. With these two notebooks and a half-dozen others (including the Best Buy Acer and Compaq models), you can swap a spent battery for a fresh one without having to quit your applications and power down.

All the systems reviewed except one use standard nickel-cadmium batteries; nickel metal-hydride batteries come with the Cube 325NTX Model 80 and are optional on the Compaq Contura 3/25 Model 84/w+. Nickel-cadmium batteries must be fully discharged frequently; otherwise, the power-management system will provide only the useful life equivalent to your last charges. This memory effect cuts deeply into the amount of time you can work with your notebook unplugged. You can however, top off nickel metal-hydride batteries before they run down without losing capacity. One of our notebooks, the AcerAnyWare V386SL, comes with an AC adapter designed to eliminate the nickel-cadmium memory effect.

Key Features

One of the biggest differences between a notebook and a standard PC is the keyboard. To fit the smaller form, manufacturers resort to nonstandard configurations and emulated keys that require you to hold down a special key to, for example, turn a cursor key into

Best Performance



Despite the different processors used in these notebooks, there wasn't much range at the top of the performance rankings. Eight systems were within 10 percent

of a Best Performance spot, and even some of the slower AMD 386SXLs are in that group. After our top five, the next seven were the Dell, Acer, Chaplet, Blackship, CompuTrend, Toshiba, and CAF.

Best Service and Support



Service and support is getting better and better; all of these companies provide adequate service policies.

Indeed, with IBM and Compaq moving to three-year war-

ranties, previous standard one-year warranties are starting to look a bit anemic. Even so, the differential in service and support is smaller than we've seen in the past.

<Page Up>. The fewer key emulations and the closer to standard the layout, the easier it is to go from keyboard to keyboard.

While we describe keyboard feel in the individual reviews, we'll leave you to decide what you like. Our battery testers also rated keyboards. They were unable to agree on the best keyboard feel

and key travel. This area is definitely one of personal preference. Since the keyboard is your interface with the PC, it's always a good idea to tickle the keys before you commit to a final purchase.

Many of the notebooks featured fine keyboards, and all had the cursor keys configured in the standard inverted T. The Dell Dimension NL25's keyboard really stood out: It had no emulated page or function keys,

and its large keys and intelligent layout made it a pleasure to use.

A Maze of Mouse Tracks

The notebooks took several approaches to mouse design, varying from built-in trackballs to clip-on trackballs to hand-held miniature trackballs to standard mice. Manufacturers located the built-in trackballs centrally above the keyboard, slightly to the left, all the way to the right, and in the lower-right corner. Aspen placed its Aquiline Personal 486's ball dead center on the front edge of the case. Mouse button placement was just as inconsistent; you have to use two hands to effectively operate the trackball on the Aspen and Cube models. And southpaws should note that placement is not always ideal for left-handed operators.

We asked for usability feedback from our team of ten battery testers, and we also formed our own opinions. We all preferred the standard mouse—as provided with the Best Buy Dell Dimension NL25—when we had the luxury of working at a desk. In the tight quarters typical of a commuter train, however, we preferred the large clip-on trackballs that came with two of our Best Buys, the AcerAnyWare V386SL and Compaq Contura 3/25 Model 84/w+. For open-the-case-and-work convenience, however, it's hard to beat the built-in trackball on the Best Buy Compudyne Slimline 386SL/25 and 386SXL/25 models.

Memory and Storage

While all the notebooks in our review come with at least 4MB of memory, if you're a *Windows* power user, you will want to push that up to at least 6MB. All the systems here allow at least that much memory expansion, except for the Aspen Aquiline Personal 486, which draws the line at 5MB. Two of our Best Buys, the AcerAny-Ware V386SL and the Compaq Contura 3/25 Model 84/w+, give you a roomy 12MB memory ceiling, and the Cube 325NTX Model 80 lets you grow to 16MB of RAM.

Vendors sent us notebooks with hard disks ranging from 60MB to 120MB, with the latter representing the largest notebook option now available. If you're planning to use a lot of *Windows* applications, you should buy a notebook with the largest hard disk you can get. If you really need the space, you can also use a real-time compression utility such as *Stacker* or *SuperStor*:

Expandable Notebooks

PCMCIA slots add a new dimension to notebook expandability and a great deal to the capabilities of any notebook that has one. You can use these connectors to plug in any number of options, including flash memory cards, modems, LAN interfaces, and even removable hard disks. While the AcerAnyWare V386SL is the only notebook here that has one of these connectors, you'll be seeing more and more PCMCIA slots on notebooks in the near future.



The ultimate expandability option for a notebook PC that you'll be pressing into service in your office is a docking station. They usually come with one or more 8/16-bit expansion slots and a charger. And some even include desktop benefits such as a SCSI host adapter and drive bays. The Best Buy AcerAnyWare, the Aspen Aquiline Personal 486, and two Best Buy Compudyne models all offer optional docking stations.

Painless Portability

Our research tells us that the size and weight of a notebook, while important, is not an overwhelming factor in your buying decisions. The heaviest notebook in our review, the Toshiba Satellite T1850, weighs less than 9 pounds ready to travel with modem, AC adapter, and pointing device. The lightest systems were the Cube 325NTX Model 80 and the Chaplet-manufactured Blackship, Chaplet, and CompuTrend, which tipped the scale at just over 6½ pounds. The notebooks made by Chaplet were the smallest as well as the lightest, but even the Aspen and Toshiba, the biggest models overall, had footprints that were slightly larger than the tiny Chaplet's. The

The AcerAnyWare V386SL provides everything you've told us you want most in a notebook: low price, good speed, high portability, long battery life, and a good keyboard and screen. This system, with its 25-MHz Intel 386SL processor and 64K external memory cache, is a solid performer, just missing the top third overall and placing fifth on the graphics-intensive *Freelance* test. Battery life is respectable at over 3½ hours, and you can put in a fresh battery without shutting down your applications. APM support should translate into even better battery life when APM applications become available. To make this notebook even more attractions

Micro Express NP925 had the largest footprint, about an inch longer and wider than the Chaplet models.

Getting the Picture

We found the display quality and screen size remarkably consistent among the products. All the screens display either 32 or 64 shades of gray, and all are monochrome VGA with backlit or sidelit LCDs. While there are minor variations in screen size, we were unable to perceive much differences in either apparent size or image quality. We did notice a lot of differences in screen adjustment, and we noted them in the individual reviews.

If you are running a demonstration, or if you're using your notebook as a desktop replacement, you may want to hook up to an external monitor for color output and a larger display. Almost half the notebooks in our roundup also let you feed 1024-by-768 output to a super-VGA monitor. And nine notebooks let you output simultaneously to your LCD screen and an external monitor, a real help when you're running a demonstration and it's hard for you to see the external display.

Service With a Smile

You get a tech support line and at least a 12-month warranty with all these notebooks; only Arche, CAF, and Chaplet make you pay the toll. Unlike standard PCs, where a repair can often be effected by swapping out, say, a defective expansion card, notebook breakdowns usually require replacement or shipment to a service center. On-site providers typically try to recover your data and usually give you a replacement notebook. Four notebooks in this review come with free or low-cost on-site service or replacement. But your primary concern with notebook service is quick repair turnaround, whether through on-site service or express delivery.

Length of protection matters too, and Compaq's 36-month warranty is the best you can get. Because of its new support policies, Compaq netted the finest overall service score.

The Prime Picks

After we tested them, carried them around, and wrote this article on them, we selected our five Best Buys. The AcerAnyWare V386SL's superb expandability and design earned it top billing. Fine battery life and expandability brought Compudyne's Slimline 386SL/25 and 386SXL/25 in next, with the 386SL/25 boasting excellent speed. The Dell Dimension NL25 has a balance of solid performance, great battery life, and our vote for best screen and keyboard. Finally, the Compaq Contura 3/25 Model 84/w+'s speed rivaled the two 486SLCs, and Compaq rated tops in service and support.

When you live with 20 notebooks for a month, you get to know them pretty well. And we felt as comfortable task-switching with Windows on the subway as we did exchanging E-mail from our kitchen tables. You can go out and buy a loaded 33-MHz 486DX desktop system right now for \$2000 or less. At the same price, these notebooks are the state of the art in portables. A \$2000 notebook doesn't give you a color display or a 250MB hard disk, but the next time the boss stops by at 5:55 demanding your report by 9:00 the next morning, you'll know they're worth it.


tive, Acer incorporates new charger technology it promises will obviate the memory effect with its nickel-cadmium batteries.

The \$2073 price is not the lowest you can find, but you do get a big 120MB hard disk for your money. Furthermore, this system has the best expandability in our review. This is the only notebook in our roundup that has a PCMCIA slot, and Acer provided a PCMCIA modem (reflected in price) to fit. You can also use the slot to connect to a range of peripherals, such as flash memory cards, LAN interfaces, or removable hard disks. The system can take up to 12MB of RAM. And for desktop-level expandability, Acer's optional expansion chassis includes a built-in charger, two 8/16-bit expansion slots, and a SCSI-2 interface.

This notebook won't put a big dent in your shoulder, either; its traveling weight is a reasonable 7 pounds, 12 ounces. We liked the keyboard. Its layout is logical, only <F11> and <F12> are emulated, and the keys have medium travel and minimal click. The easy-to-use Logitech external trackball clips on either side to accommodate right or left handers.

Acer doesn't give you on-site service, but the company does have an excellent 24-hour repair turnaround policy. Although the support technicians were a little slow responding to our calls on the toll-free line, their advice was sound. When we added Acer's hefty scores for design and expandability, we got the best overall rating of the 20 notebooks in this review, and Acer earned a blockbuster Best Buy.

If you asked us what's attractive about the Arche NP-201, we would give you three answers: price, price, and price. Believe it or not, this AMD 386SXL-25 notebook has a street price of \$1507! That would save you over \$100 on the cost of the next cheapest system, the Chaplet NBC 386SL-25. And even at this low ante, Arche managed to deal out a 120MB hard disk with our test system. True, performance is just so-so, like the other AMD 386SXLs; the Arche lacks an external memory cache. But its super price hoists it up to eighth on our list of overall values.


The Arche NP-201 has decent battery life at around 3 hours. The

keyboard has a cushioned action, which is great if you want to take silent notes in a meeting. And the layout is terrific, with no emulated function or page-control keys. For a pointing device, Arche threw in a Keytronics serial mouse. That's ideal for working on the desktop, but not very practical on the armrest of an airline seat.

The documentation is outstanding, including photographs illustrating how to install such hardware as a modem or more RAM. We can't say as much for service and support, unfortunately: You pay the toll for technical support calls, there's no on-site service, and the company's four-day turnaround policy is the longest in our review. If your bottom line is based on price, however, Arche is the best bargain here and doesn't sacrifice performance.


This large, black notebook has a cushioned finish that gives it a leatherlike elegance. On the other

hand, the Aspen Aquiline Personal 486, at 8 pounds, 10 ounces, is the second heaviest system here. But this system will impress you with the outstanding speed of its 25-MHz Cyrix 486SLc processor. This notebook not only placed first in overall performance, it was tops on the *Word for Windows* test and BAPCo SYSmarks, and no lower than third on any single test. This performance doesn't come cheap, however—at \$2270 direct, this is the most expensive notebook in our review. Fortunately, a 120MB hard disk softens the bite of the hefty price, as does a port for an optional scanner. In addition, you get a generous 12MB RAM limit. The extra storage and memory capacity could prove useful if you have reams of data.

Aspen provides a nice keyboard. It rivals the full travel, positive feel, and click of a Lexmark IBM PS/2 keyboard. You get all 12 function keys, although you have to put up with emulated page keys and an unusual trackball setup. The company had good intentions in placing the ball dead center on the front edge of the case, but the result is equally inconvenient for both left- and right-handers. To use it effectively for dragging or sizing, you have to lift both hands off the keyboard; one hand to click the buttons and the other hand to roll the ball.

The Aspen posted a respectable battery life of almost 3 hours. Its service rates as excellent, with an outstanding one-day turnaround policy and toll-free support including Saturdays. A heavyweight in more ways than one, the Aspen Aquiline Personal 486 will give you speed, speed, and more speed—and if you don't mind this system's extra cost and weight, it's worth considering. But you can find good performance and much better expandability and portability among the members of our Best Buy list.

This nice-looking, dark-gray notebook is based on an AMD 386SXL-25 processor. Performance is its Achilles' heel; only three systems posted slower scores on overall performance. And while its \$1990 price is reasonable, it's not outstanding considering that Austin included only a 60MB hard disk.

The keyboard has a positive feel, with the click and key travel comfortable to many desktop users. Unfortunately, you'll have to put up with some emulated page and function keys. The trackball, offset to the right at the rear of the keyboard and surrounded by four mouse buttons, is somewhat awkward to use, especially when you have to click and drag.

The Austin earned a good battery rating, running for almost 4 hours. Another weighty concern when you're out on the road is portability, and here the Austin also did commendably. At 7 pounds, 12 ounces, this system is easy to carry.

Service and support policies are good. Although there's no on-site service, the company promises to turn repairs around within two days. Toll-free technical support is available seven days a week, 24 hours a day. However, Austin's advice too often strayed away from the mark, and the company took longer than usual to respond to some of our support queries.

Though it doesn't stand out in any particular area, the Austin still rates as a solid middle-of-the-road value. If you want better performance, however, you can easily find it elsewhere.







back tray, even in cramped quarters. And the solid, 4-hour battery life is conducive to extended travel.

The system is based on an Intel 386SL-25 processor, and it comes with a 64K external memory cache. Its performance ranked an impressive fifth overall, and it was particularly speedy on our *Windows* test suite. It managed the second best score on the *Excel* test and third on both *Word for Windows* and the graphics-intensive *Freelance* test.

The keyboard has a nice medium travel and a slightly soft feel, but BCC chose to squeeze the special-function key down to half the size of the ordinary keys. You get all 12 regular function keys, but the page control keys are emulated. BCC provided an external Thumbelina trackball from Appoint, which is very portable but somewhat awkward to use. Our test panel had trouble getting used to this device, and so did we.

The BCC has a good price and good performance, plus a respectable 80MB hard disk, with a 120MB option available. Service and support is decent: There's no on-site service, BCC provides a three-day turnaround policy, and while support is toll free, it's unavailable on weekends. This system isn't at the very top of our list, but you might consider it if you spend a lot of time in the air. Otherwise, you'll find your best bets further up the list.

Mobile Computing Pace Picks Up

There are several other notebooks available for around \$2000 or less that we were unable to get in time for this review. In addition, a multitude of products were announced at Fall Comdex a bit too late for inclusion. The most impressive newcomers

are from AST, Gateway, Panasonic, and Texas Instruments. New products also emerged from Canon and Keydata.

The AST Power Exec EL is the latest version of the Power Exec 3/25SL. It now includes a removable, upgradable hard drive, a PCMCIA version 2.0 slot, and an optional expansion chassis. The Texas Instruments TravelMate WinSLC uses TI's own (Cyrix-designed) 486SLC-25 processor and has a great screen. A wide range of options is available with the TI, including LAN inter-

face adapters, a SCSI module, and a high-speed internal fax-modem. The Panasonic CF-1000 is another intriguing model. It uses AMD's low-power AMD386SXLV-25 and you can exchange the floppy drive for an additional battery pack, doubling battery life. Panasonic claims up to an 11-hour battery life. Without modem and pointing device, it weighs 5 pounds, and an expansion chassis is also available.


The Canon Innova 386NX uses an AMD 386SX running at 33 MHz and is also offered in special bundles with portable versions of Canon's Bubble-Jet printers. The Keydata Keynote 486SLC-33 uses the fastest version available to date of the Cyrix SLC.

Gateway 2000 originally shipped us its AMD 386SXL-25-based Nomad 325SXL for this review. Gateway subsequently decided to replace the 325SXL with the Nomad 425SXL, which features a low-power-consumption version of the Intel 25-MHz 486SX processor. Although we were unable to get a unit in time to review the new system, its initial specs look attractive. It ships with 4MB of RAM, an 80MB hard disk, Microsoft Works for Windows 2.0, DOS, Windows, an external trackball, and a modem for around \$2100.

The Blackship BLK 386SL/25 NB is one of three virtually identical notebooks in this review. The other two systems are also manufactured by Chaplet: the Chaplet NBC 386SL-25 and the CompuTrend Premio SL Notebook. Beneath their charcoal gray exteriors, these Intel 386SL-25 systems share some attractive characteristics.

For one thing, these machines take the portability crown hands down, with their trim dimensions and feather-light 6 pound, 10 ounce traveling weight. For another, their prices are among the best you'll find. At \$1649, the BLK 386SL/25 NB is the fourth least expensive notebook in our roundup.

None of these Chaplet-made systems is a sterling performer. In fact they clustered together toward the bottom of the rankings of the 25-MHz 386SLs. Only the ZDS 625nl Model 85 ranked lower in this processor class. You can undoubtedly chalk up the Chaplets' mediocre speed rating to their 16K external memory cache—all the other SLs had 64K caches. Worse than the unimpressive performance, in our estimation, is the short 2-hour battery life, which is about as poor as you will find in this review. For a full 6 hours of work you'll need to drag around an extra two batteries, negating the system's weight advantages.

You get a decent-sized 80MB hard disk, and the Blackship keyboard has a nice, clicky feel. The dedicated page navigation keys are lined up on the right side of the keyboard, and only the <F11> and <F12> keys are emulated. The <Caps Lock> and <Tab> keys are quite small, but not so small that they interfere with effective touch typing. The recessed trackball is located on the upper right of the keyboard, with buttons on the right, hard to reach for lefthanders. It was easy enough to move the cursor around on the screen, but the mouse button placement made it difficult to click and drag.

Service and support are adequate. The company provides a twoday service turnaround policy and toll-free technical support. The main drawbacks we found in Blackship's support policies were the lack of weekend support and some imperfect answers to our queries from the technical support staff.

The Blackship BLK notebook is only a midrange performer, but if you spend as much time as we do on the road, with a laptop hanging from your shoulder, you'll appreciate this system's light weight. And the Blackship's price is reasonable too. However, if you're looking for a bargain, the slightly slower AMD 386SXL Arche NP-201 costs well over \$100 less, provides a 120MB hard disk, and gives you an extra hour of battery life.

This notebook comes with a textured, charcoal gray finish and a distinctive appearance that belies its bargain price. At \$1638 on the street, the CAF AquaLite-II is the third least-expensive PC here and the fastest AMD 386SXL-25 system. Still, this system was noticeably slower than our top Intel 386SL-25 contenders.

Generally, the CAF is quite a nice traveling companion, weighing in at a mere 7 pounds, 4 ounces. Battery life is decent at 3½ hours, and you can put the system in suspend mode and swap in a new battery without powering down. Our AquaLite-II came with an 80MB hard disk, and there's a 120MB option as well.

We liked the keyboard, with the exception of the undersize <Tab> and <Backspace> keys. CAF provides an external Genius mouse, which would be great for desktop use, especially teamed with the optional numeric keypad. If you're augmenting the built-in screen with an external display, you can pipe out full SVGA output and simultaneously watch the display on the notebook's screen.

When it comes to service and support, you could do a lot better. The CAF AquaLite-II has no on-site service, you pay the toll on your technical support calls, there's no weekend support, and the turnaround policy is three days. CAF does offer one service advantage: If you have trouble on the road, you can take your notebook to any authorized dealer. Bargain hunters will be attracted to this trim little unit—it isn't a bad deal. But if our money were at stake, we'd pay another \$200 for a Dell Dimension NL25.


The Chaplet NBC 386SL-25 is a dead ringer for the Blackship BLK 386SL/25 NB and the CompuTrend Premio SL Notebook—and for good reason. Chaplet manufactured all three models. You get the same tiny dimensions and light weight (6 pounds, 10 ounces) as with the other two Chaplets. But with its \$1634 street price, the Chaplet NBC 386SL-25 is the least expensive of the three and is second only to the Arche NP-201 in our lowprice sweepstakes.

All three of these look-alikes feature an 80MB hard disk. In addition, all three Chaplets had small 16K external RAM caches and slower performance scores than any other Intel 386SL system here except for the ZDS 625nl Model 85. And although this system's battery life was marginally better than the Blackship's, it was still way too short for our taste.

If you like a clicky keyboard, you'll enjoy the NBC 386SL-25. Unfortunately, the built-in trackball suffers, as did the Blackship's, from the awkward position of its control buttons.

The service doesn't match up to what CompuTrend and Blackship offer. There's no on-site service option like CompuTrend's, and you have to pay the toll on your service calls; Chaplet doesn't even provide a dedicated support line for its dealers. Chaplet's low price may attract you if you're looking for a lightweight bargain. But you can save over \$100, get a bigger 120MB hard disk, and boost your battery life simply by buying the Arche NP-201 instead.

Compaq notebooks have a reputation for speed, and in this case it's well earned: The Contura is third fastest overall, and the two faster systems were both 486SLCs. At that, they barely edged out this speedy Intel 386SL. The Compaq came in third on BAPCo SYSmarks, third on the disk-intensive Paradox benchmark, and fourth on Word for Windows. This kind of performance and service protection doesn't come cheap, however: The Contura costs \$2170 on the street with an 80MB hard disk.

The battery kept this average-size notebook running for a solid 4 hours, and with the auxiliary battery installed, you can put in a fresh power pack without shutting down. The keyboard is laid out reasonably well, but you'll have to put up with emulated page keys along with an emulated <F11> and <F12>. The feel is very stiff and positive, with hardly any key travel. It takes some getting used to, but that silent touch is really handy if you want to take notes without distracting Ms. or Mr. Big. The large, external, clip-on trackball is the next best thing to a standard mouse.

As with all Compaq computers, the documentation is super; it even gives you ergonomic advice. If you need to load up on memory, this system lets you have up to 12MB of RAM. Additional options include an external charger, nickel metal-hydride battery pack, and a car adapter. This high-class notebook might not please a bargain hunter, but great performance and unparalleled service and support made believers out of us. It thoroughly deserves a Best Buy award for its all-around merits.

Late List Prices

As we report in our review, competition from notebooks based on the new Intel 486SL CPU is causing vendors to offer better and better deals on their 386-based units. The average price drop over a two-month period was well in excess of \$100, and the price on the Best Buy Compudyne Slimline 386SL/25 plunged by an impressive \$400-making an already good deal a lot better. Two notebooks actually rose in price: The Swan 386SX/25 went up \$10 to cover a change to a more expensive modem, and CAF implemented a procedural \$5 increase. With aggressive pricing the rule on these affordable portables, don't be surprised if they become even less expensive in the months to come. All of the Best Buys, apart from the Dell Dimension NL25, dropped in price significantly, confirming their top ranking.





Compudyne provided two notebooks for this review, and both earned our Best Buy

award. This Intel 386SL-based system is virtually identical to its AMD 386SXL-based sibling; the SL, however, earned a higher rating with its better performance and battery life. It was the fourth fastest notebook overall, nipping in right behind the quick Compaq Contura. But at \$2227 with an 80MB hard disk installed, it's the second most expensive system here.


Battery life is great at about 4½ hours. If you want to swap in a fresh power pack, however, you'll have to shut the unit down first. Portability is average at 7 pounds, 14 ounces.

When it comes to expandability, the Slimline 386SL/25 gets mixed reviews: A 6MB RAM ceiling is none too generous, but if you want your notebook to do double duty on your desktop, Compudyne does offer a docking station that will accept from one to seven standard 8/16-bit peripherals and up to five internal drives.

Compudyne's support policies are pretty good: a two-day turnaround policy and 13 hours of daily toll-free technical support. Since Compudyne is the CompUSA house brand, you have the unusual advantage of being able to take your notebook to any of the company's superstores for service.

Terrific performance, a powerful array of features, and long battery life add up to a solid Best Buy for the Compudyne Slimline 386SL/25, a top-notch traveling companion if we ever met one.

As we mentioned in the review of the Slimline 386SL/25, this Best Buy notebook is a close match to its stablemate. They share the same case, screen, service and support, and many features. But the differences are important. For one thing, at \$2027,


this notebook costs \$200 less. It is also considerably slower, with performance squarely in the middle range, although it runs close to the head of its AMD 386SXL class.

Battery life is good at almost 4½ hours, though the Slimline 386SL/25 holds a half-hour edge. Like the other Compudyne, this notebook includes an 80MB hard drive, but you can get a larger 120MB optional drive for either.

The two Compudynes have identical keyboards, with a positive, clicky action. And we liked the Compudyne's trackball best of all the built-in units. It's convenient for left- and right-handed users.

The distinction between these two Compudyne Best Buys is clear. If top performance is essential, and you don't mind paying \$200 more to get it, the Slimline 386SL/25 is the machine for you. But the more economical Slimline 386SXL/25 is still a solid deal.

The CompuTrend Premio SL Notebook is the same basic notebook as the Blackship and Chaplet models in this review. As with the other Chaplets, you get a 25-MHz Intel 386SL processor and an 80MB hard disk. Each of the other two models wound up with a top five rating for price, but CompuTrend tacked on more than \$100, which caused the company's \$1775 Premio Notebook to miss top price ranking. CompuTrend achieved a top-five service ranking, with some of the fastest query response times, accurate advice, and two-day turnaround for repairs. On the downside, however, there's no weekend support, and you have to pay \$80 for a year of on-site service.

Performance is not a strong point, as the 16K external memory cache keeps the Chaplet models from matching the performance of most other 25-MHz 386SL contenders, each of which has a 64K cache. Battery life was the worst of any system in our roundup at under two hours—although only slightly shorter than that of the Chaplet NBC 386SL-25 and the Blackship BLK 386SL/25 NB.

The biggest attraction for all the Chaplet notebooks is the svelte exterior and light 6-pound, 10-ounce weight. The clicky keyboard with only the <F11> and <F12> keys emulated will attract many, and road warriors will appreciate the internal fax-modem. But don't forget that the built-in trackball, with its poorly placed control buttons, is less than optimum.

Service and support stood out with CompuTrend, although this vendor's price was noticeably higher than the Chaplet's or the Blackship's. As we suggested earlier, if you're hunting for a bargain, you can save cash, wind up with a 120MB hard disk, and get an extra hour of battery life with the Arche NP-201 instead.





A lot of thought went into the design of the Cube 325NTX Model 80. The keyboard has large keys, with none of the page or function keys emulated. This was the only system that came with nickel metal-hydride batteries, giving it very quick recharge times. Battery life was mediocre, however, topping out at a mere 2½ hours.


The 325NTX Model 80 has an 80MB hard disk; a 120MB drive is optional, and Cube gives you 16MB of RAM capacity—tops in this review. Further, this notebook is easy on your shoulder, weighing a mere 6 pounds, 10 ounces. The bad news is that the Cube is one of the slowest notebooks here, tying for second slowest on overall performance. It came in dead last on our *Paradox* test.

The Cube mouseball requires two hands: While your right hand controls the ball, your left must click the two mouse keys on the other side of the keyboard.

Screen quality and size were consistent among these notebooks, but the Cube display stood out as one of the best, with crisp, clear images. What's more, Cube's service and support policies are very good. Although there's no on-site service, Cube will pay Federal Express to pick up your notebook, and promise to repair and return it in 24 hours. You get toll-free technical support even on weekends.

What's right with this notebook is really right, and the easy portability and fine display provide plenty of allure. If speed and battery life are at the top of your list, however, more than half the notebooks in this review have more to offer.


\$1699 price. But when they get their hands on the keyboard, they may stumble on its poor layout. The biggest problem is the awkward stretch to hit <Enter>, which causes errors.

High on the list of detractions is this AMD 386SXL system's poor performance. It tests slowest overall and last on all the individual benchmarks except for *Paradox*, where it was second to last.

The Darius's 60MB hard disk is the minimum configuration; you can also buy it with a 120MB drive. Other expandability options: You can plug in a modular 16-bit ethernet adapter, SCSI adapter, fax-modem, or second serial port to either of the two battery slots. In our tests, we found that the Darius lived up to its 3-hour battery life billing, and you can double that if you use both battery slots.

Service and support are sound. You get toll-free technical support (weekdays only). The vendor promises to turn your system around within two days. Darius deserves credit for a fine price and a versatile design. Unfortunately, its slow performance and bad keyboard design put it close to the bottom in overall value.



The NL25 missed the top five in performance by the barest of margins, placing close to the upper third on every benchmark except BAPCo and best on the disk-intensive *Paradox* test. And you don't have to trade off fuel economy for the extra horsepower. The Dell's long 5½-hour battery life is second only to the ZDS 625nl Model 85. When your battery runs low, you can put your notebook on standby and slide in a fresh battery without needing to power down.

Dell didn't spare any of the other amenities, either. In our opinion, its keyboard layout is best of all the notebooks in the review. It has large, well-placed keys, no emulated page or function keys, and a fairly silent, cushioned action. Dell provides a standard mouse, which is super on a desktop albeit difficult to use on the train.

Dell's built-in screen, with its clear, crisp graphics and text, stood out in a crowd where good displays were the rule. The fine display quality made the screen seem even larger than it actually was. Solid service and support includes a year of on-site replacement of your notebook for \$99 and 18 hours daily of toll-free support.

What did we find to criticize on this notebook? Well, the closedcase alarm sounds loudly even when the Dell Dimension NL25 is plugged in, the screen adjusters were a little stiff and hard to move, and the largest current alternative to the 60MB hard disk is only 80MB. But those are quibbles—if you want a quick, inexpensive notebook that can travel coast-to-coast on a single battery, the Dell is your clear Best Buy.



If you're happiest working with a desktop PC, you'll love the Micro Express NP925. This handsome black notebook gives the impression of being bigger than it is, putting the desktop user at ease with a spacious keyboard layout. In exchange for the fine keyboard, you do give up some portability. The NP925 has the largest footprint in our review and weighs 8 pounds, 12 ounces.

But Micro Express didn't ignore travelers. The battery life is exemplary, providing over 5 hours of computing with the dual battery pack installed. Service is good enough to place second out of 18 vendors in this review. You get a 15-month warranty, a two-day turnaround policy, and a notebook user's dream: 24-hour, 365-day-a-year, toll-free technical support. When we called, we got outstanding responsiveness and accurate advice.

Performance, as with the other AMD 386SXL systems, was only middling. But for the \$2000 price, you get a big 120MB hard disk and a fax-modem. Expansion options for this PC include a scanner package, ethernet or SCSI adapters, an extra serial port, and a voice-mail package. Just a little more speed would have earned the NP925 a Best Buy in this review. But if your typing suffers when you use a compromise keyboard, the NP925 makes a smart buy.

Like Compudyne, Swan sent us two notebooks for this review. The 386SX/25's model name implies an Intel processor, but the unit's CPU is actually an AMD 386SXL-25.

This nice-looking charcoal gray unit has a single-handed easyopen design; you simply pull up on the front tab, and the case pops open. The Swan's keyboard is intelligently laid out and has the full travel action of a desktop keyboard. Service and support is a strong point of all the Swan desktop computers, although the notebook units are backed with just a one-year warranty and no on-site service. In addition, the company has no stated repair-turnaround policy. Fortunately, the toll-free technical support was good.

This notebook comes standard with a 60MB hard disk, but you have the option of buying it with a 120MB drive. Don't expect top performance from this machine—it ties the Cube 325NTX Model 80 for second to last overall. The bargain-hunter's price makes it attractive, but when you look at the anemic performance, you'll be much more drawn to its 486SLC stablemate.

Methodology

We drained the notebooks' batteries and then fully charged them. We set the power-saving options on each notebook, where possible, to best fit this profile: doze mode timeout, 1 minute; sleep mode timeout, 3 minutes; LCD timeout, 1 minute; CPU timeout, 1 minute; modem and serial ports disabled; low battery alarm enabled. Ten office workers with varying skills typed documents for regular intervals in Word for Windows, saving files periodically. We kept the notebooks rotating among our pool to drain the batteries evenly. We repeated the tests twice for accuracy and report the times elapsed between turning the notebooks on and when they shut themselves off.



The systems in this review are arranged in order of overall speed, with the fastest at the top and the slowest at the bottom.

All the test results are in seconds except for the BAPCo test results, which are given in number of scripts executed per hour.

Methodolog

All systems tested were configured with 4MB of RAM (with the exception of the two Compudyne notebooks, which received with 6MB of RAM installed) and DOS 5.0. If we had to install Windows ourselves, we performed the program's default installation. We configured Windows on every one of the systems with a Hewlett-Packard Laserdet III as the default printer, disabled the Print Manager, and attached a null printer to LPT1. Using the vendor-supplied video drivers, when provided, we set the resolution to 640 by 480 pixels in 16 colors. Finally, we loaded the test applications, test files, the scripts necessary to automate testing, and Microsoft Test (automation software).

Freelance for Windows 1.0

We start by loading a single-page starter file (built from a standard template included with the Freelance program) containing a U.S. map with each state as a separate object. Then we enter preformatted text on the page in preset headings, add a second page, and enter text as bulleted items. We add three more pages—each containing a single 3-D bar chart—and import data from a WK1 file. Next we add a sixth page containing four 3-D pie charts and preview a slide show using a vertical-louver fade effect between each slide. We apply various views to the presentation and then preview the slide show four more times, applying a completely different fade effect between slides with each preview. Finally, we save the presentation to disk to complete the test.

Word for Windows 2.0

We spell-check and scroll through a 27-page document; create, format, print, and save a single-page business letter; and open another document, add a single paragraph, then preview and print it out.

Excel 4.

We perform several data extracts; build and format an extensive financial statement from scratch and print it; then open a mortgage analysis, and scroll, move blocks, change the interest rate, print-preview the statement, and finally save the file.


Running the program in a DOS window, we perform an extensive variety of data entry, record searching, and updating tasks. Then we generate reports against a simple customer list to simulate a typical activity generated in the use of a business database application.

BAPCo SYSmark92

We run a scripting program that automates all the applications run in the test from start to finish. It loads common database, desktop publishing, presentation graphics, software development, spreadsheet, and word processing applications and executes a variety of typical tasks with each. The following software packages are used in this test: Aldus PageMaker 4.0, dBASE IV 1.1, Harvard Graphics 3.0, 1-2-3 3.1, Microsoft C 6.0, Microsoft Excel 3.0, Microsoft Word for Windows 2.0, Paradox 3.5, Quattro Pro 3.0, and WordPerfect 5.1.

Unlike its 25-MHz AMD 386SXL sibling, the Swan 486/SLC-25 is a real scorcher. This 25-MHz

Cyrix 486SLC notebook came in second overall, just slightly behind the Aspen Aquiline Personal 486. The system placed first on the *Freelance* test, second on BAPCo SYSmarks and *Word for Windows*, and no lower than fourth on any individual benchmark. And you can get this great performance at a surprisingly reasonable price—just \$1953 direct.

Battery life is also good; batteries kept the notebook running for 4½ hours. What's more, you can install a fresh one with the notebook on standby. Portability is good, too; like its sibling, the Swan 486/SLC-25 weighs just 7 pounds, 10 ounces.

Either of the Swan notebooks lets you run the internal screen at the same time as the external display, but not in SVGA resolution. Case design, keyboard, mouse, hard disk, and service policies are all identical to the Swan 386SX/25. Although this Cyrix 486SLC-based notebook didn't make it into our top echelon, its outstanding performance, and under-\$2000 price make it hard to resist.

The Toshiba Satellite T1850 is the only notebook using an Intel 386SX-25 in this review. The system's performance was mid-pack, comparable to that of the AMD 386SXLs. You can probably chalk this up to the lack of an external memory cache. Battery life, however, was a solid 4 hours.

At \$1999, it's a moderately priced machine and comes with an 80MB hard drive. RAM is expandable all the way to 12MB. Toshiba service and support policies are excellent. Furthermore, you can get service for your notebook from any authorized Toshiba dealer.



Toshiba's screen seemed particularly nice, and the company throws in *Ultrafont* software to help improve screen readability. Additional options include an external battery charger, car adapter, and internal proprietary fax-modem. Traveling weight is a hefty 8 pounds, 14 ounces, which gives it the dubious distinction of being the heavyweight of this review.

What blemishes the Toshiba's picture? Its heft, mainly. The company has earned a devoted notebook clientele, and if you don't mind the weight, this system is well worth considering.

The ZDS 625nl Model 85 brought us the closest we have ever come to getting a full day's work done on a single battery. This smooth, white Intel 386SL-25 notebook managed to run for an amazing 6 hours off a single power pack. That's almost half an

hour more than the next best system, the Best Buy Dell Dimension NL25, and over 2 hours more than the average in this review. These phenomenal results show that ZDS's arduous work on extending battery life has really paid off. Even the internal modem ZDS supplies is "rest-aware," meaning it goes to sleep when not needed. And when your battery pack runs out of juice, you can swap in a fresh one without switching off the system.

At \$1858, the 625nl Model 85 is priced right, too. Performance, however, was mediocre, even with a 64K external memory cache—particularly on the *Excel* test. This was the slowest 386SL-based notebook we tested, falling far behind the Compaq Contura Model 3/25 84/w+ and even further behind the parade-leading Cyrix 486SLC notebooks. This system is also a bit heavier than most at 8 pounds, six ounces.

The keyboard is really nice with no emulated page or function keys, full travel, and a good feel. And ZDS provides its own standard mouse. The ZDS also features an enhanced parallel port, letting you team it up with some parallel-to-SCSI adapters and get performance comparable to a plug-in card. That's great news if you want to add an external CD ROM for multimedia. More and more, notebook vendors are including these enhanced ports, so if you think you'll need one, check before you buy.

Although this notebook doesn't break into the ranks of the Best Buys, it's still a very good value. If long battery life is a must, the ZDS 625nl Model 85 really delivers. The system's 6 hours of battery life sets a standard for other notebook vendors to live up to and shows us that it shouldn't be too long until we can get a full 8-hour day's worth of work out of one of these notebooks.







Local bus systems put peripherals on the same high-speed thruway with CPU and memory. But are the speed benefits really significant? If they are, which standard should you bank on? By Michael Desmond

his year's secret ingredient for high-performance computing is local bus technology.

Compared with other hardware advances, such as new CPU architectures or optical storage schemes, this one seems long overdue. And its arrival heralds an important advance in PC architecture.

Over the past few years, PC technology has leapfrogged itself. Rapid advances in processor power have outpaced the decade-old ISA expansion bus, and even enhanced bus standards such as EISA and Micro Channel have fallen behind. The disparity can leave high-powered CPUs spinning their wheels while hard disks, video boards, and other peripherals send and receive data along a slow, narrow path. Local bus systems break this bottleneck by taking peripherals off the expansion bus and connecting them directly to the CPU bus, opening a wider, faster pipeline between the CPU and peripherals. Compared to the ubiquitous ISA bus, with its 16-bit data path and 8-MHz clock speed, local bus systems speed data along 32 bits at speeds as high as 50 MHz. The results are

throughputs as fast as 130MB per second, more than six times faster than ISA's 20MB-per-second limit.

In PC World tests, local bus systems consistently place in the top 10 to 15 percent of systems we review. True, it's not clear that local bus is the key factor in this strong performance, since the cutting-edge peripherals and controllers used in the systems also boost performance. But if you want to be ready for such demanding future applications as full-motion video, high-fidelity sound, or multitasking with the likes of Windows NT, you'll probably need the enhanced speed and capacity that local bus provides.

Which local bus should you choose? Today you have three basic options, all of which put local bus capability on the motherboard alongside traditional ISA, EISA, or Micro Channel slots. A number of manufacturers (including NEC, Dell, and Hewlett-Packard) have developed proprietary local bus systems, most of which integrate local bus video on the

motherboard. But two emerging standards one already manifest in many new machines, one just coming to market—continue the PC tradition of open

architecture, offering standardized slots into which you can plug the high-speed local bus peripherals of your choice.

The first standard, known as VESA local bus (VL bus) and developed by the Video Electronics Standards Association, is built into a wide range of systems from firms such as Gateway 2000, Zeos Int'l, and Hyundai Electronics. The second standard, called Peripheral Component Interconnect (PCI), was developed by Intel as a high-end alternative to VL bus and will feature systems from major players such as



Extending the CPU-memory bus with a local bus gives a system a high-speed connection for high-performance peripherals and lets the system retain an ISA, EISA, or MCA bus for less-demanding devices.

Standard ISA architecture



uct Group at Dell Computer, explains, "We saw no reason to put anything on the local bus except video. Given that we have integrated high-performance video on the local bus, we saw no reason to add the expense of VL expansion slots."

This may be a good strategy for the short term, but proprietary, slotless options have serious limitations. Although manufacturers currently have trouble demonstrating the benefits of putting a hard disk controller on the local bus, future mass storage products may well exploit the increased throughput-and proprietary systems will lack the slot to accommodate them. Moreover, the pace of video technology will likely leave today's local bus video controllers a generation behind within a year; and when the video controller is hardwired to the motherboard, it cannot be replaced.

VL Bus: First Among Standards

The VESA local bus standard was designed as a low-cost, quick-to-market solution. As a result, VL-compliant computers and add-in cards cost little more than their conventional ISAonly counterparts. The standard is attracting plenty of vendors, as board makers from ATI to Western Digital are selling-or will soon introduce-graphics adapters, disk controllers, and LAN cards that comply with it.


But VL's cost-conscious design makes some significant trade-offs. No more than two expansion boards can run on a VL bus; running three peripherals requires that at least one be integrated into the motherboard. And each additional local bus peripheral degrades performance.

VESA chair Tom Ryan contends that VL's peripheral limitation does not hurt the usefulness of the standard, and he says the architecture is well suited to its mission. "It doesn't seem to be a problem at the moment. You're not going to put your I/O port on the VL bus," says Ryan. "And we're not putting LAN on the local bus, because ethernet is constrained by other factors."

Others see VL as a standard with distinct limitations. Citing technical compromises in the VL bus design, PC Graphics Report editor Fred Dunn sees a short life span for the new standard. "There seems to be a consensus among the system manufacturers that VL is a shortterm solution, and that PCI will be here in the long term."

Aside from limitations on the number of peripherals, VL has trouble with the close signal loading and timing tolerances of processors running faster than 33 MHz, where things happen so fast that even minor variances degrade performance. According to engineers, the simple, unbuffered VL design results in processing delays, called wait states, when speeds climb past 33 MHz.

The VL bus may fall short of perfection, but our tests show that the first VL systems are turning in remarkable scores. The \$2995 Gateway 2000 486DX2-66V is a case in point. With an ATI Graphics Ultra Pro VL bus adapter and VL IDE disk controller, the Gateway turned in excellent performance on both our graphics-rich Win-

dows test suite and our diskintensive database retrieval test.


The low-cost performance of the VL standard has caught fire with system vendors, as firms from Acer to Zeos have introduced VL computers. In fact, some vendors have gone so far as to build VL bus into all their ISA-based machines.

"As soon as we introduced our VL line, we discontinued our ISA line," says Rick Apple, vice president of marketing for Zeos Int'l. "There's nobody who doesn't want local bus. And we're not charging any extra for it."

PCI: Foundation for the Future

Most industry experts would back up Rick Apple's claim that VL is more than adequate for today's computing needs. But many agree that upcoming computing challenges—one, two, five years in the future—will demand a more sophisticated and expandable standard.

Unlike VL and proprietary bus schemes, PCI puts a complex managing layer between the CPU and peripherals to streamline data transfers and present a uniform bus interface. Often called an "intermediate" bus, this layer buffers signals, letting PCI support ten periph-



faster than EISA's or Micro Channel's. And like those older buses, PCI supports a burst mode that shoots large chunks of data across the bus in a flash—especially useful in quickly displaying a high-resolution image with millions of colors.

When it comes to the speed of individual tasks, however, neither VL nor PCI will enjoy a clear advantage, predicts Michael Slater, editor of the installation and determine interrupt settings and software defaults. Similarly, PCI's buffered design doesn't run faster than 33 MHz, avoiding critical timing problems and ensuring consistent adapter designs. The result is a more stable interface between peripherals and bus.

Still, the functionality and complexity of PCI carry a price. The cost of silicon to control the bus will likely inflate sys-

> tem pricing at least until sales volume brings premiums down to

earth. And the late arrival of many peripheral makers into the PCI camp could make board selection sparse for several months, raising prices further.

Mike Schmidt, marketing manager for Gateway 2000, says PCI must define itself to overcome VL's lead in the market. "It will be interesting to see how it works into a cost-benefit analysis. VESA is a very low-cost, high-benefit option. PCI is going to have to match that if it

is going to replace VESA."

PCI enjoys some big-name support, and even VL boosters are hedging their bets by beginning development for Intel's architecture. ATI has been developing products for both VL and PCI, and IBM will likely put VL architectures on its low-cost Value Line systems while going with PCI on its PS/2 products. Even staunch VL players like Hyundai, Gateway, and Diamond say they are keeping a close eye on PCI development. And with an addin card design finally approved by the PCI special interest group, the standard is attracting interest from peripheral makers. With the line between who supports VL and who supports PCI blurring, buyers will have even more hardware options.

erals (but a maximum of five add-in cards) and maintain maximum performance at high clock speeds. In addition, PCI supports bus mastering, which enables intelligent devices to take control of the bus and accelerate high-throughput, high-priority tasks.

While PCI's maximum sustained throughput on 33-MHz systems is lower than VL's—120MB per second versus VL's 132MB—it's still three times

Microprocessor Report newsletter. "The choice between VL and PCI is not really a performance question. I think you will be able to pick PCI systems that are faster than VL systems, and VL systems that are faster than PCI systems."

Where PCI shines is in its sophisticated design and ease of use. Intel's standard offers features such as auto-configuration, which lets the peripheral adapter interact with the system at

Applications for Tomorrow

If local bus is the future of computing, which applications will the local bus serve? Full-motion video is the most commonly cited beneficiary—but few users can imagine it being a vital application, even with the recent introduction of Microsoft's Video for Windows. The real benefits may not surface until Windows NT and OS/2 applications begin to take advantage of the environments' multitasking capability. When smart applications perform such tasks as sending and receiving faxes, backing up files, and formatting documents in the background, you may need a local bus system to keep the applications running at their potential.

Designed to accommodate the 64-bit data path and high clock speeds of the Pentium processor, PCI is poised to become the definitive standard for next-generation computing. PCI's support for as many as ten peripherals, bus mastering capability, and standard bus interface make it an excellent platform for several peripherals performing multiple tasks

simultaneously.

"If you look at the list of people supporting PCI, of course we have most of the major OEMs and vendors," says Intel's Mike Bailey, who is marketing manager for the PCI division. "But we expect a lot of the people who make add-in cards to jump in now. It's to be

expected. VL is certainly out there, so it would be almost foolish for somebody not to support VL. But we feel that is in the interim."

Still, the strength of both standards will depend on the quality and selection of peripherals built around them. For end users choosing between VL and PCI, that means looking beyond standards and

throughputs and considering the selection of boards made to each standard.

Confusing as it can be, local bus technology presents a winwin situation for buyers. Even the most limited proprietary systems can improve graphics performance and open the road to emerging multimedia and video-based applications. VL bus and PCI can only build on that improvement, opening opportunities for effective multitasking, faster disk access, and high-speed LANs. For anyone considering a new PC, either standard opens a vital path to future applications.







200 MB Hard Disks

It's true: Data does expand to fill all available space.

Put off the inevitable and choose one of the 14 produc

rying to run Windows and its applications on a 40MB to 80MB hard disk is a lot like trying to squeeze six passengers into a Ford Fiesta. It just won't work. You're either going to have to buy a bigger car or someone's going to have to walk.

If you're feeling the hard disk pinch these days, a 200MB to 250MB hard disk could be just what you need, letting you and your data breathe a sigh of relief. But why choose a 200MB to 250MB drive rather than a less-expensive 100MB to 120MB drive?


For starters, as "How to Stuff a 120MB Hard Drive" shows, Windows requires a lot of space. Windows system files take up 12MB or so, Windows apps consume another 15MB each, swap files require 4MB, and then you need room for those massive TMP files. Of course, even when you're running Windows, you still need to accom-

modate DOS and those DOS applications you're still using. Add some fonts, clip art, assorted utilities, and data files, and you've got a pretty crowded hard disk.

And that's just today. Tomorrow's operating environments, such as Windows NT, will make even greater demands. Dataintensive applications, such as multimedia, voice mail, fax software, and next-generation graphics programs, with their multimegabyte data files, will make the space crunch that much worse.

But assuming 200MB to 250MB is the right size for your current and future storage needs, which drive would be right for you? To help you decide, we gathered every 200MB to 250MB internal hard drive we could find that is available to the public through mail-order or retail channels. We excluded external models because internal

installation makes the most sense for the average business user with the average business user's cramped desk.

In the end, we found fourteen drives that qualified. While we weren't out to decide once and for all which drive is best, we wanted to look at these drives, and find out what it would be like to actually work with one every day.

A Question of Cost

he price of mass storage has dropped dramatically over the past few years. Once expensive specialty items, 200MB to 250MB drives are now priced like commodities. The least expensive drive here is the 213MB Maxtor IDE drive, which lists for \$419; the most expensive is Core International's 230MB 3SHC230, which lists for \$1395. (Core has a newer, cheaper drive that wasn't available in time to be tested.)

In addition to looking at list prices, we also checked street prices. For drives available through mail-order (the most popular sales channel for new drives), we calculated average mail-order prices. For those that aren't advertised, we've used vendor estimates. Once again, the Maxtor IDE drive was the least expensive, at \$385 on the


street, while the Core International drive, at \$950 on the street, was the steepest. But remember: our street prices are only estimated averages—you could find these drives for less if you look hard.

These raw prices are not, however, the best way to judge hard drive value; you should consider the price per megabyte. Based on list price, the cost per megabyte of the fourteen drives we examined ranges from \$1.97 to \$6.07; calculated with the street price, the range is down around \$1.96 to \$4.13. Compared with 100MB to 120MB units, these spacious hard drives are a bargain; all else being equal, a 200MB to 250MB drive should cost at least 30 cents per megabyte less than a 100MB to 120MB drive.

Performance in the Real World

rive speed has always been important, but now it's critical. That's because today's typical user relies heavily on graphics-based applications, running in an environment like *Windows* or OS/2. Both application and data files are larger than ever, and graphical user interfaces use your hard disk as virtual memory, swapping data freely between your hard disk and RAM.

Unfortunately, drive speed is a tricky thing to judge. Vendors pub-



lish a confusing variety of specifications, from average seek times to data transfer rates, and it's hard for the average buyer to know which number to note. That's why the PC World Test Center did some testing for you.

Our benchmarks were completed with the drives installed in a Compaq 386DX-25 with a standard ISA data bus. While the ISA bus is the most common, we also know it's not optimal for speed. Users with equivalent EISA or MCA bus machines (equipped with the appropriate host adapters) should, in theory, get better performance than we did. Also, local bus host adapter cards for these drives are just now coming to market and will take advantage of fast, direct access to the CPU to improve data transfer times.

Using many of the applications you use every day, PC World put these drives through their paces, performing typical operations on typical data files. The test report shows the results of two separate test suites. For the Windows figures, which represent elapsed time, lower numbers reflect better performance. The BAPCo scores, on the other hand, represent the number of times the system executed a test each hour, so higher numbers mean better performance.

Theory Versus Reality: Which Specs Count?

e found that the two most common vendor measurements of drive speed-average seek time and data transfer ratehad very little to do with actual performance. Average seek time gauges the time it takes the drive's heads to move from one data sector to another. The drives we tested have average seek times ranging from 12 to 16 milliseconds. But when we compared each drive's performance scores against the average seek time, we found no correlation. The Quantum drives, for example, whose 16 millisecond seek times are among the slowest here, were among the fastest in actual use.

Data transfer rates represent the speed at which data can be transferred from the drive platters to your system's memory. For the drives in this buyers' guide, these figures range from 1.4MB to 3MB per second. A related measurement, the burst transfer rate, measures the transfer rate for a block of data small enough to move to system memory in a single burst; this figure ranges from 4MB to 10MB per second.

Like average seek times, data transfer rates bear little relationship to real speed. In theory, drives with higher data transfer rates should perform particularly well in Windows, which requires the system to hustle lots of information from the disk to the system. However, while the Quantum Hardcard has the lowest data transfer rate drive here-1.4MB per second-it performed better than any other in our graphics-intensive Windows tests.

Though average seek times and data transfer rates turned out to have little to do with everyday performance, two other vendor specifications did: platter rotation speed and cache size.

While speeds of 3600 RPM were once the norm, today's drives now spin all the way up to 4500 RPM. Faster platter rotation should mean faster data transfer, because the drive can read a track of data more quickly, and it should also mean a faster average seek time, because the platter needs less time to get the desired sector under the read-write head. These theories are borne out in reality: If you sort these drives by overall speed, you'll find that the faster drives tend to be the ones with faster rotational speeds; it isn't an absolute rule, but the correlation is close.

How to Stuff a 120MB Hard Drive

Why do you need a 200MB to 240MB hard drive? Take a look at the chart below. While 120MB might take care of your immediate needs, what about two or three years down the road, when software and data files will both be bigger? A 200MB to 240MB drive will give you plenty of room now and in the future.

The match is even tighter between the size of a drive's on-board cache buffer and its real-life speed. Once again, if you sort these drives according to our test results, you'll find that the fastest drives are usually the ones with the largest caches. The reason is simple. The larger the cache, the more likely the desired data is in it and reading from the cache is many times faster than reading from the disk.

Cache sizes for these drives range from 64K to 256K. In addition to reading the data requested by your operating system, "readahead" (or "pre-fetch") caching also collects the data from the drive sectors that follow, assuming that they'll be called on next. 

until there's a pause in operations before writing to the disk itself.

Remember to keep our performance numbers in perspective. Overall, in both the BAPCo SYSmark92 rating and the *Windows* test suite, there's only about an 11 percent difference between the slowest and fastest drives. Some applications show a greater sensitivity to hard drive performance than others. In the BAPCo database tests the range between first and last place climbs to 29 percent. Similarly, the BAPCo software development and graphics tests show a 19 percent and 16 percent performance difference, respectively. In the *Excel* section of the *Windows* suite, the difference between the slowest and fastest drives was 16 percent. If you're using one of these applications, you should benefit from the added speed; otherwise, a faster drive won't help you boost your overall performance that much.

The performance winners? In the *Windows* benchmarks, the Quantum Hardcard EZ turned in the best overall performance, with the Conner Peripherals Cougar drive placing second, followed by the other two Quantum drives and the Seagate ST3283A. In the

BAPCo SYSmark rating, the Conner drive topped the list, with the Seagate ST3283A coming in a close second, followed by the three Quantum hard drive entries.

Compatibility Factors

nless you must have the fastest possible drive, performance is unlikely to be the only factor in your buying decision. Most buyers should also consider the drive's interface. Fortunately for today's buyers, the interface wars of the past are gone, leaving just IDE (integrated drive electronics) and SCSI (small computer system interface) drives in this size category.

So which interface is right for you? In our lab tests, we found that the type of interface had little impact on performance—the SCSI drives were a bit slower than the IDEs, but not enough that you'd notice in actual use. Where the interface really comes into play is in matching a drive to your system, which in turn depends largely on what kind of drive you already have.

Most systems sold today come with IDE connectors either built

in to the motherboard or on a card in one of the expansion slots. If that's the case with you, you'll want to get an IDE drive to replace or supplement the one you're using. Because every IDE drive is compatible with every IDE connector, replacing a new IDE drive is a simple matter of screwing it into the drive bay, attaching the cables, and reconfiguring your CMOS setup. Adding a second drive is only slightly more difficult.

SCSI drives are another story. There are two good reasons for buying one. If you're already using a SCSI drive, you'll want to replace or supplement it with another SCSI drive. You'll also want to go with SCSI if you plan to add several different storage

devices (including more hard disks, CD ROMs, and for optical drives) to your system.

Unfortunately, installing a SCSI drive is notoriously tricky. The problem is that DOS and other common operating systems require a translation layer between a SCSI drive and the rest of the system.

Because different adapters use different translators, your SCSI adapter and each SCSI device in your system must use the same translator. The solution: Take care to check with the vendors of your system and the new devices to be sure they'll be able to communicate with one another.

You'll also have to buy a new adapter if you're replacing one of

the older drive typefaces (such as MFM, RLL, or ESDI), or if you want to switch from IDE to SCSI or vice versa. If you already have an IDE drive installed in your system, you won't need a new adapter. Vanilla IDE adapters start at less than \$50, while their SCSI counterparts should cost about \$50 more.

STORAGE HARD DISKS

Remember that an *adapter* is not the same as a *controller*. All drives these days come with the controlling electronics built right in; all you need to connect the drive to your system is an adapter or motherboard connector. The main reason to buy a new controller is to improve your system's performance with a *caching controller*. A caching controller supersedes the drive's small on-drive cache with its own, larger cache (1MB or more). The result: increased data access speed, particularly for database or graphics apps. In system reviews, we've found caching controllers to be the single best way

to boost performance, better even than added RAM or graphics accelerators. IDE caching controllers with 1MB of cache start at around \$200 and, as with plain adapters, SCSI models should run you about \$50 more.

What about installation? Since all these drives are 3½-inch, half-height or smaller units, you shouldn't have any problem fitting them into your machine. If you'll be using a 5½-inch drive bay, though, you'll need a low-cost bracket to fit the smaller drive into the larger bay. Many vendors now include an installation kit, containing everything that you might need for the installation project, with every drive. For an even simpler installation, the Quantum Hardcard slips right into an empty 16-bit slot in your PC and comes with setup software.

At one time, energy consumption was a major factor, but today's drives use much less power than older units; if you have a 200-watt or better power supply, you should have no problem. Installation of any of these drives typically takes half an hour or so, with partitioning and formatting adding a bit more time.

How Long Will It Last?

ou need a drive that will stand the test of time, since a drive that breaks a year after you buy it costs far more than one that lasts for several years. But how can you tell which drive's going to hold up?

One measurement is the drive manufacturer's mean time between failure (MTBF) rating. This figure is based on a statistical estimate of how long a typical drive will last without failing; the estimate is based on the failure rates that occur when the drives are operated under exorbitantly hostile conditions (such as high temperatures.). Considering that the MTBF figures of these drives range from 100,000 to 250,000 hours, you can see why real-life numbers are hard to come by; 100,000 hours is more than 11 years.

If you want some indication of how long a drive will last, check the length of the warranty. The warranty period represents the manufacturer's confidence level in the drive. Among the drives in this buyers' guide, warranties range from one to an astonishing five years (from Core International).

Check with your dealer about the specifics of the service contract. When does the warranty period begin—when you buy the drive, or at the time the dealer bought it from the manufacturer? Quantum has one of the best warranties in the industry: If your drive fails

while under warranty, you get a refurbished unit and the warranty period on the replacement unit restarts.

The point is that warranty policies can vary from dealer to dealer for the same drive, so shop carefully. For example, you may pay less for a given drive at one dealer than another, but the lower price may mean a shorter warranty period. (For more advice on hard drive service and support, see March 1993's Consumer Watch column.)

Warranty is not the only thing that varies according to where you buy your drive. Price, technical support, and other elements of cus-

> tomer service change as well, depending on whether you buy through mail-order, from a local dealer, or, in at least one case, from the drive-maker itself.

Mail-order is the most popular channel for selling hard drives. In fact, a few mail-order firms (such as Computer Products Corp.,

DC Drives, Hard Drive Super Source, Hard Drives International, Mega Haus Hard Drives, and Storage Devices Inc.) sell nothing but hard drives. These vendors have the advantage of offering a wide range of models, plus their support staff is tailored specifically to the hard drive customer. General mail-order vendors may have competitive prices, but their support will probably not be as thorough as a specialist's. The downside to buying mail-order is that getting warranty service or a replacement can take some time. Also, mail-order companies may not be much help if you have trouble installing the drive; being talked through the procedure over the phone is much harder than having a service technician at a store do it for you.

That kind of hands-on help is the major advantage of buying from a local dealer. If you're at all nervous about taking off your system's ease, this could be a compelling argument in favor of buying locally. A local superstore will likely offer better prices than a smaller shop; superstore prices may, in fact, be better than mail-order vendors'. Smaller retail outfits offer the advantage of personal service. The problem with all local dealers, from superstores on down, is that few of them are likely to offer the same choice of drives you can get via mail-order.

At least one drive manufacturer, Quantum, sells direct to end users. Unfortunately, they do so at the full list price. Buying direct from the manufacturer does have the advantage of direct access to first-hand technical support.

No matter where you buy, be sure you're getting all the hardware and manuals you need. Because hard drives were originally sold to system vendors only, drive manufacturers did not develop the kind of end-user amenities, such as documentation, that other peripheral-makers gave their buyers. Be sure to ask the vendor what comes with your new hard drive: Do you get assembly instructions? What about mounting hardware? You should also be sure that the warranty period is what you want, and that, if you have any problems, you'll be able to replace the defective drive quickly.

Making the Choice

ome drives we tested combined reasonable price, good performance, and reliability and stacked up at the top of the list. The Conner Gougar CP-30204, for example, performed well in our tests and has an attractive price. The mid-priced Quantum Hardcard bested the others in the Windows performance tests and offers the installation plus a two-year warranty. The other two

Quantum drives also offer good performance, reasonable prices, and that same two-year warranty. The Maxtor IDE and SCSI drives' low overall cost and cost per megabyte make them enticing if you're on a budget, even with their limited one-year warranties and mid-range performance figures.

Another way to decide on the right drive for your system: Check out what everybody else is buying. According to market research by IDC, Maxtor and Quantum each commanded 23 percent of the 1992 U.S. market for 200MB to 299MB hard drives. Conner followed with 17 percent market share, Western Digital held 15 percent and Seagate trailed with 9 percent. Other market research firms come up with different figures, but those same five vendors led the market as a whole.

Our experience at PC World supports the IDC findings. Of the 150-plus desktop systems we've reviewed over the past six months,

almost 30 percent used Maxtor hard drives. Another 20 percent used Quantum drives, while 15 percent each used Conner, Seagate, and Western Digital.

While the PC World Test Center's measurements demonstrated some performance differences among drives of this capacity, the ranges weren't as large as you might expect from the raw manufacturer's figures, and they seem quite unrelated to prices. Whichever of these 200MB to 250MB drives you choose, you'll get acceptable performance, plus plenty of space for your applications and data, now and in the future.

Methodology

We installed the drives in one of four Compaq Deskpro 3/25i's. Each system was configured with 4MB of RAM. For IDE drives, we used the systems' integrated Compaq IDE adapter; for the SCSI drives, we used whichever adapters the vendors supplied. We used FDISK and FORMAT to prepare each drive for the maximum available space provided by FDISK. We then loaded DOS and various applications. For the FC World Windows test suite, we activated Windows' SmartDrive 4.0 disk caching software, using the default settings. Per Microsoft documentation, we enabled SmartDrive's double-buffer setting for all SCSI drives.

Excel 4.0

We perform several data extracts; build and format a financial statement from scratch and print it out; and open a mortgage analysis, then scroll, move blocks, change the interest rate, print-preview the statement, and save the worksheet.

Word for Windows 2.0

We spell-check a 27-page document, then scroll through it. We create, format, print, and save a single-page business letter. We open an existing 9-page business proposal, add a new paragraph, print-preview each page, and then save the document under a new file name.

Freelance for Windows 1.0


We load a single-page starter file (built from a standard template included with Freelance) containing a U.S. map with each state as a separate object. Then we enter preformatted text on the page in preset headings, add a

second page, and enter text as bullet items. We add three more pages, each containing a single 3-D bar chart from data imported from a 1-2-3 Wk1 file. We add a sixth page containing four 3-D pie charts and preview the slide show using a vertical-louver fade effect between slides. We apply various views to the presentation and preview the slide show four more times, applying a different fade effect between slides each time. Finally, we save the presentation file to disk.

Paradox 3.5 In a DOS Window

Running the program in a DOS window, we access a customer database. We browse existing records, add new ones, and query, search, and sort the data. Finally we generate a report and save it to an ASCII file.

colleague once illustrated the irony of the fax machine by saving there are times when overnight mail would be faster. The hang-up is usually the company fax handler, a harried assistant who sends everyone's documents between performing other tasks and sometimes takes ages. My friend discovered that with a fax-modem and software, her computer could serve as a personal fax machine. Now she wonders how she got along without a fax-modem.

Despite our colleague's experience, these modems aren't the fax panacea. For example, a fax machine is actually easier to use for documents that don't begin life on a computer. To send these documents with a fax-modem, you would first have to scan them. Yet fax-modems have unique conveniences. One of the most popular is group faxing, where the computer performs the mind-numbing task of sending the

same fax to many people. Computer fax systems also keep records of

sent and received faxes, and let you schedule faxes for later transmission without tying up a machine with pages. Perhaps best of all is the ability to fax the file you're working in-usually from your application's Print menu. Nothing beats the simplicity of a fax machine, but for certain tasks, nothing beats the convenience of a computer fax system.

Fax convenience at a good price is easier than ever to find. Faxmodems for less than \$300 didn't exist three years ago, but for this guide, vendors answered our call with 107 candidates. All types are represented here: externals, pockets, expansion cards of varying lengths, and proprietary internal cards for portables. The speed of the products ranged from 2400 bits per second (bps) for modem-tomodem data (nonfax) communications to 9600 and 14,400 bps for both fax and data. Even a few of the new "credit-card" PCMCIA

modems squeezed in under our price limit. The prices listed are manufacturer's suggested retail; you'll find most of these modems for \$250 or less on the street.

Which Fax-Modem for You?

few years ago, your choices in a faxmodem were few, and they ranged from fair to abysmal. All that is changing rapidly. Modem chip makers now offer fax-data chips at little or no extra cost over their data-only counterparts, so modem manufacturers by the dozen started popping them into their new products, and emerging computer fax standards make mixing and matching modems possible. Multiple conventions still plague the computer fax world (see the sidebar "Fax-Modems and Fax Software: Trials of a Young Marriage"), but the upshot is this: More fax-modems work with more fax programs

Before you install fax-modem system, make sure you have the computer for the job. Whether you decide on a DOS or

than ever before.

Fax-Modems and Fax Software: Trials of a Young Marriage

C-fax technology is young and restless. Several years ago, fax-modems worked only with software specially written for them, and many an off-brand modem still spurns all fax programs except the one it comes with.

The Class I standard was the first serious attempt to match fax-modems

and programs, but uneven Implementation still keeps some Class I modems and programs from talking to each other. Furthermore, Class I systems place almost all the fax processing burden on the computer, which often means you can't use your PC while it's

sending or receiving. Class II was meant to clear up ambiguities and push some of the processing load onto the modem. Manufacturers clamored for the new protocol but the standards agencies dallied, so chip ble. Meanwhile, Intel stepped in with its Communications Application Specification (CAS), which dozens of faxmodem and fax program vendors adopted, mostly in addition to Class I, Class II, or both.

makers, hardware manufacturers, and software developers plunged ahead with a pre-ratified Class II specification, liberally doctoring the recipe with their own features. The result is that Class II modems and programs, while more efficient than Class I, are less compatiLike Class II, CAS shifts some fax processing to the modem, freeing the computer to do other things. Expect CAS to fade from the scene, however, over the next few years. It is not a true standard, and its prime backer, Intel, has declared its intent to support the T.611

Windows fax program, we recommend at least an 80MB hard drive.-fax files are graphics files that can gobble up more than 200K of disk space for each page sent or received. If you opt for a Windows fax program, we recommend at least a 386DX computer with 4MB of RAM.

Your next consideration is software, the most important part of a computer fax system. You're rarely stuck with the fax software that comes with better fax-modems these days, so shop around. Find the fax and data programs that appeal to you and best suit your needs. Given the choice, we recommend fax software for Windows. These programs come replete with features such as on-screen viewing and editing of faxes, the ability to print the fax on your

> printer, and optical character recognition, which converts your fax into a document editable by your word processor.

The next step is to make a decision between an external and an internal fax-modem. Feature for feature. fax-modem cards usually cost less

than external models, and they don't clutter your desk. However, you can easily install an external modem and quickly swap it between computers, and its status lights keep you informed on the state of your connection.

Buying a fax-modem for a portable PC raises different issues. You have three types of portable modems to choose from: an external pocket-sized unit that can run from a battery, an internal proprietary modem card that plugs into the bus, and, most recently, the PCMCIA (Personal Computer Memory Card International Association) 2.0 modem card, which looks something like a fat credit card.

Unlike those for desktops, proprietary modem cards for portables tend to be more expensive than the pocket variety because they have to be specially designed to fit into the smaller proprietary expansion slots in laptops and notebooks. Not only do you pay more for an internal portable modem card, but you probably won't be able to use it in a different portable PC. Still, they have their advantages-there's one less thing to remember to pack for a trip, and you can't forget it in a hotel room. Also, it has no battery to conk out while you're transmitting a long report.

standard, which the company believes will eventually supersede CAS.

Which fax convention should you choose? Your trade-off is top performance versus broad compatibility. If you send many faxes each day but can't afford to have your computer tied up, or you want to take full advantage of multitasking by using a Windows fax program, then choose a Class II or CAS modem. Be prepared, however, to be restricted to a smaller pool of compatible modems and software, and, in the case of CAS, to have manufacturer support for it slowly ebb away. If you want to equip a large work force with a variety of computers and fax-modems, then Class I products make more sense. The good news is that Class II finally became a formal standard last November, so new Class II products should be much more compatible than previously.

In the final analysis, don't take a manufacturer's word that its fax-modem will work with any program that shares the same convention, even Class I. Ask the vendor if the company has tested the modem with the fax program you want. Even if the vendor says yes, make sure you have a moneyback guarantee. The only way to know you've got a good match is to see it for yourself.

If you have a late-model portable computer with a PCMCIA 2.0 slot, you may want to opt for the latest marvel of miniaturization—the credit-card size modem. Most such modems conform to the PCMCIA 2.0 standard and work with any computer that has the appropriate slot, which dozens of portables have. Credit card modems are expensive, however; all PCMCIA modems listed here offer only 2400 bps for data and 9600 bps for fax. And their phone jack adapters are one more thing to remember for the road.

Life in the Fax Lane

he next issue is speed. Picking the right fax speed is easy enough: you have a choice of 9600 or 14,400 bps. The vast majority of the fax machines in use today are 9600 bps, so most likely that's all the speed you'll need for the next few years.

Whether you go with the faster faxmodem depends on your data needs, since fax-modems are available in only a few combinations of fax and data speeds. If you are a casual BBS browser, a 2400-bps data/9600-bps fax-modem is an option—it lists for as much as \$200 less than a 9600/9600-bps fax-modem. If you send lots of data files, however, consider jumping right to the top and purchasing the fastest modem available: 14,400/14,400 bps. Often these list for just slightly more than their 9600/9600-bps counterparts.

Choosing the right data speed can be tough. Not only do you have three to choose from-2400, 9600, and 14,400 bps -but you also have a selection of data compression techniques, which can boost your throughput, and error-control techniques, which keep your data from becoming corrupted during transfers.

Soon 9600-bps will

become the most common data speed in modems, but there are situations in which 2400 bps is appropriate. For example, if you need to outfit a large team of users, such as a field sales force, and each sends only a few pages of text files each day, such as daily call reports, then 2400 bps is up to the task and makes good economic sense.

The table lists the six most popular error-control and data-compression standards and protocols. Like XMODEM and its kin, these error-control methods ensure that the file being transferred doesn't arrive corrupted, but even better, they protect it automatically. No modem should be without at least one of the two error-control conventions listed here. Try to purchase a modern with V.42, because it includes MNP 4 and tosses in a lesser-known but still prevalent protocol called LAP-M. If you're planning to send a lot of data over cellular phone, consider an MNP 10-equipped modem.

Data compression squeezes data down in the sending modem and expands it in the receiving modem, resulting in faster transmission rates. Beware of some vendors' outlandish data speed claims, however, Boasts of 38,400 bps or 57,600 bps are only peak, not average, speeds. A 9600-bps modem with V.42bis four-to-one data compression attains 38,400-bps throughput in bursts, but the average speed is much slower and depends on the type of file you send. Text files, for example, compress less than spreadsheets, so their average rate is less. In the table, the peak compression ratios are noted in parentheses for each of the data compression standards and protocols listed. The greater the ratio, the greater the peak compression and the better the throughput. V.42bis offers the greatest compression, followed by MNP 7 and MNP 5.

Making the Right Match

inally, you have to make sure your modem works with your set of communications programs. That's usually not an issue for data; virtually all data communications programs and modems work together without a hitch. However, getting fax programs and modems to match can be tricky, as "Fax-Modems and Fax Software" explains.

You may find other modem details are important. Does the modem have a power switch? All internal modems turn on and off auto-

modems turn on and off automatically; some pocket modems do, too. In a pocket modem,


a pocket modem, automatic power on/ off means never running down your battery because you forgot to switch off the modem. Does the modem have two

phone jacks? A second jack lets you keep the modem and phone hooked up at the same time, so you don't have to constantly hook and unhook phone lines. Some modems are set up so that one jack shuts down when the other is busy so that a transmission will not be ruined if someone reaches for a phone attached to the modem.

The final consideration for buying a faxmodem? Now is as good a time to buy as any. Faxing from your computer is not only easier than ever, it's affordable.





DRAW Programs

Need quick and easy graphics to dress up your reports and presentations? Our roundup picks the best low-cost Windows draw programs for business users.

dding a flow chart to a business proposal or a logo to a report can make a difference by selling your ideas and making a good impression. The fact is, drawings, clip art, logos, maps, and diagrams aren't just pretty pictures, but extra touches that help you persuade, pitch, and polish.

To help you add graphics to your work easily, we evaluated the new crop of seven Windows draw programs aimed at those of us who didn't graduate from art school. These entry-level packages cost under \$300 and are ideally suited to busy managers who have never used a draw program and need to create graphics with minimal fuss. In addition to standard drawing and text-handling features, most of these programs come bundled with

art images. Compared with CorelDraw and other high-end draw packages, the newer programs trade such advanced features as precise color control for ease of use and affordability.

In addition to rating each program's features, we invited a business user to help test ease of use, which counts for 50 percent of the total score. Charles Goodwin, a market research manager in San Francisco, is a typical *PC World* reader: He's familiar with *Windows*, but he's a novice at PC draw programs, and he creates reports and presentations on a regular basis. We asked Goodwin to use each pro-

gram to create a simple flow chart that required various drawing and text tools, symbols and clip art, and a custom logo. We also challenged each program to produce a pictorial map. This map tested more advanced drawing features including fitting text on a path, point-by-point curve editing, gradient fills, and editing clip art.

How They Compare

Our testing yielded one clear winner: Micrografx's Windows Draw 3.0 Plus OLE, which combines exceptional ease of use with the best balance of basic and advanced drawing features. Three other programs—Computer Support's Arts & Letters Apprentice, Aldus' IntelliDraw, and Shapeware's Visio—earned honorable mentions. Apprentice couples business charting and a huge supply of clip art with drawing ease of use. IntelliDraw and Visio aren't as versatile at creative artwork as some of the other programs, but they excel at structured drawings—such as flow charts, technical diagrams, and floor plans—where precision is crucial.

Autodesk's Instant Artist and SoftKey Software Products' Key-Draw Plus for Windows—the two least expensive packages reviewed—are fine for producing simple graphics for letterheads, signs, flyers, and newsletters, but they're less effective for general-


purpose business illustrations. By comparison, Software Publishing's Harvard Draw for Windows has sophisticated features reminiscent of those in high-end draw packages (and it used to be priced accordingly at \$595). Harvard Draw is more difficult to learn and use than most of the others, so it's not the best choice for beginners—but the low price of \$249 may make it hard to resist.

Drawing Essentials

Our test documents were designed to pinpoint the most important features in a draw program. However, the program that best meets your needs always depends on the specific tasks you plan to perform. For example, finding a program with the most intuitive drawing and text tools may seem top priority, but if you spend most of your time revising the same images month after month, easy editing and manipulation of objects may be just as important. Likewise, if decorative spot illustrations for documents are at the top of your list, look for programs with a wide selection of clip art.

Drawing and Text You need a basic set of tools to get started with any graphic, and every program reviewed has them. All these programs enable you to create circles, ellipses, rectangles, squares, lines, and

blocks of type. All but *Instant Artist* have freehand drawing tools and the capability to edit an object's outline using control points—both of which are vital when creating free-form objects such as the curves and polygons used in our pictorial map test document.

All business drawings include text, and several niceties can make throwing words around easier. First you'll need a good selection of fonts, which all the programs except *IntelliDraw* and *Visio* provide. Second, working directly with text on a drawing is always faster than using a separate text editing window—as you must with *Apprentice* and *Instant Artist. IntelliDraw* and *Visio* are the only programs that let you automatically attach text labels to geometric objects, a capability that is particularly useful for creating flow charts. But these were also the only two programs that didn't let us automatically fit text on a path—making it harder, for example, to create the curved "10th Annual Publishers' Conference" banner on the map test document.

Object Manipulation When you edit a drawing, perhaps the most convenient feature of all is the capability to group objects together as a single object that can be resized, copied, rotated, or flipped. The better programs also let you lock objects to prevent you from accidentally moving or changing them.

To help you draw objects to scale and accurately align them, all these programs provide *snap-to* grids, which are grids that objects line up against as if magnetized. However, only *IntelliDraw* and *Visio* can join separate objects (such as the test flow chart's geometric shapes and connecting lines) by providing handy attachment tools that work like glue.


Drawings often require several revisions. Most programs help you make changes easily by letting you copy attributes from one object to another. *IntelliDraw* and *Visio* go even further, enabling you to make global revisions by using master shapes. Change a master shape, and every copy of that shape in your drawing changes accordingly—particularly useful for complex drawings such as a flow chart or floor plan.

All of the reviewed programs except Instant Artist and Visio pro-

vide two more exotic design features: the capability to reshape text outlines and an option that blends shapes. Stretch a text character's outline into an abstract shape, and you may have the basis for a new logo. Blend two objects, and you achieve an effect similar to morphing in television commercials, only with still images showing the transformation from one object into another.

Drawing Resources Clip art makes it simple for graphics novices to create lively documents while expending minimal effort. Apprentice, Windows Draw, and Harvard Draw provide the most images (well over 1000), while IntelliDraw and Visio offer the least (about 300). Quantity isn't everything, however, the detail, the number of categories, and the aesthetic quality can vary greatly from program to program. The greater the detail, the more professional clip art images look and the more easily they're edited. Windows Draw excels on all these counts.

All but Apprentice let you preview the clip art on screen—a real time-saver, since loading an image into the work area may take several seconds. You may also want to import clip art from other applications, but more likely you'll want to export your drawing to another type of document—say, add a logo to a word processing document. Harvard Draw, IntelliDraw, and Visio support the widest selection of import and export file formats.

Arts & Letters Apprentice 1.11

PROS: Competent drawing tools, plentiful fonts and clip art

CONS: Inefficient text editing, limited import/export filters, can't lock objects

Apprentice is a good entry-level draw program with an easy-to-learn interface. Along with providing all the drawing tools required to complete our tests, Apprentice has the largest library of clip art in this review, a large stock of useful fonts, and a built-in charting feature for bar graphs, pie charts, and other business graphics.

Putting Apprentice to work was straightforward, once we learned how to use its symbol library and text-entry tools. Instead of drawing standard geometric objects by hand, you scroll through Appren-

tice's library of predrawn symbols—rectangles, circles, triangles, polygons, and more—to choose an object. This requires a few more steps than simply selecting a draw tool and dragging an object to create it, but nonartists may consider this feature to be Apprentice's greatest strength. Working with text is a bit more awkward, since Apprentice makes you use dialog boxes to enter and edit text and adjust letter spacing and kerning.

Apprentice shines, however, in artful effects, such as fitting text on a path, using gradient fills, reshaping text outlines, and creating intermediate images to transform one object into another à la M. C. Escher. That's no surprise since Apprentice is actually a scaled-down version of Arts & Letters Graphics Editor, a high-end draw program. Even though Apprentice, with its drawing tricks galore, isn't quite as easy to use as Windows Draw, it's a strong choice for creating business illustrations with pizzazz.

The High-Priced Brand

If you're serious about creating professional graphics, you might want to invest in a high-end *Windows* draw package such as Corel Systems' *CorelDraw* or *Micrografx Designer*. These provide state-of-the-art drawing features and come bundled with better graphics tools, including more fonts and clip art, than their low-end relatives. For example, *CorelDraw 3.0* comes with 256 fonts and 12,000 clip art images, and it includes charting, bit-mapped painting, auto-tracing, and presentation graphics modules—making it a virtual one-stop graphics solution.

The trade-off in using a high-end draw program's sophisticated

features and bundled bonuses is a higher price and a steeper learning curve. For example, Adobe Illustrator 4.0, Designer 3.1, and Computer Support Corporation's Arts & Letters Graphics Editor 3.12

For maximum precision, 3-D object rotation, and other niceties, you'll need one of the high-end draw packages.


all cost \$695, Aldus Corporation's Aldus Freehand 3.11 and CorelDraw 3.0 are \$595, and Gold Disk's Professional Draw 1.1 is \$495. In addition, high-end draw packages are aimed at graphics professionals, not novices. Learning to use their powerful and versatile drawing and object manipulation features is more difficult than learning to use the smaller tool palettes provided by the low-end draw programs.

In Living Color

The key feature that characterizes high-end draw packages is their advanced color capabilities. These include the capability to generate color separations for full-color printing jobs, color trapping controls to ensure proper alignment of overlapping colors, and multicolored gradient fills for rainbow effects. High-end draw packages such as *CorelDraw* also sport more features for precision work; repetitive drawing aids, such as duplicating one shape many times around a pivotal point; more curve editing tools; and 3-D object rotation, including light source direction control. All this makes them more equipped for realistic pictorial representations, such as architectural renderings, technical diagrams, and other complex illustrations.

Most high-end draw packages also offer more special effects than low-end packages, such as placing blended objects along an editable path, importing an image and using it as a fill pattern, applying any fill inside text characters, and fitting text within shapes and around objects. Special effects like these increase the many ways in which you can enhance virtually any artwork.

Still, you don't have to learn how to use all the features just to add a few improvements to your business drawings. Considering the extra fonts and clip art you get with them, as well as the more sophisticated features, you may find that a high-end package is the best investment for your present and future graphics needs.

Harvard Draw 1.01 for Windows

PROS: First-rate drawing tools, abundant fonts and clip art

CONS: Complicated interface for inexperienced users, can't open multiple files

Harvard Draw for Windows features extensive drawing and manipulation features and a truckload of fonts and clip art. Its auto-trace capability, which converts scanned graphics (such as a business logo) into editable objects, is terrific. And the program is a good bargain: Although its sophisticated draw tools are more on a par with graphics powerhouses such as CorelDraw, at \$249 Harvard Draw costs less than IntelliDraw or Visio and only \$100 more than Windows Draw does.

But be forewarned: *Harvard Draw* is no entry-level package. Although it was certainly capable of producing our test documents, we had to refer to the manual often and climb a substantial learning curve. Goodwin, our tester, recognized the program's power, but felt it suffered from "an overly complicated interface, where features are buried in multiple layers of menus and dialog boxes."

In short, *Harvard Draw* is a professional draw program at an entry-level price, so it's a better choice for technical illustrators and other experienced graphics users than for busy managers who need to produce only an occasional business illustration. But if you have the time to master its powerful tools, *Harvard Draw* is capable of delivering the highest-quality graphics in this roundup.



Instant Artist 1.0 for Windows

PROS: Provides ready-made drawings, text perspective effects

CONS: Meager drawing tools, inefficient text editing, limited import/export filters

Instant Artist from Autodesk is designed to serve novice graphics users with modest needs. The program's biggest attraction is a variety of ready-made signs, banners, letterheads, envelopes, greeting cards, and business cards that are suitable for small-business owners and entrepreneurs. But as soon as we left these behind and tried to produce our test drawings, we were on an uphill climb.

Like Apprentice, Instant Artist makes you use a separate dialog box for entering text, and provides predrawn symbols instead of standard point-and-click tools. Unfortunately, Instant Artist is also the only program here lacking freehand tools and object control points; it left us hamstrung when we tried to draw trapezoids and free-form objects. Even custom arrows weren't easy to produce.

On the plus side, *Instant Artist* performs a number of eye-catching tricks, including fitting text on a path and text perspective effects. But unless you're very enthusiastic about *Instant Artist*'s predesigned drawings, you'll probably want a more versatile and easy-to-use draw program.


IntelliDraw 1.0

PROS: Strong drawing and manipulation tools, advanced automated features **CONS:** No bundled fonts, limited text handling

IntelliDraw and Visio really belong in a league of their own. Neither program is as well-suited as Windows Draw for projects that require fancy text effects and a wide variety of clip art. But with their automated features, both are excellent choices for producing structured drawings such as our test illustrations.

IntelliDraw distinguishes itself from Visio with more powerful and plentiful drawing and manipulation features. One example is the unique Symmetrigon tool, which lets you draw half an object while the tool symmetrically completes the other half. On the other hand, IntelliDraw isn't quite as easy to learn as Visio. You can select IntelliDraw's short menus option to hide the program's more advanced features, but its numerous tools and floating palettes can confuse drawing neophytes.

Goodwin found *IntelliDraw*'s automated features ideal for creating and positioning the elements in the test flow chart. *IntelliDraw* surpasses all other packages in alignment by enabling you to align objects diagonally, and to space objects an equal distance apart. Better yet are *IntelliDraw*'s automated features (shared by *Visio*) for attaching text to an object, connecting objects, and using master




INTELLIDRAW FEATURES FLOATING PALETTES full of automated drawing tools, but graphics neophytes may find it intimidating.

shapes to make global changes to an entire drawing.

If you need to produce precision drawings, *IntelliDraw* is a godsend. Be prepared, however, to buy additional fonts and clip art and to set time aside to learn this powerful, feature-rich program.


KeyDraw Plus 3.0 for Windows

PROS: Good drawing tools, text perspective effects, plentiful fonts
CONS: Cumbersome text editing, unimpressive clip art, can't lock objects

KeyDraw Plus for Windows, the lowest-priced package in our roundup, combines solid drawing tools with mid-range charting features for bar graphs, pie charts, and the like. But if your graphics involve much text, using KeyDraw Plus can be a frustrating experience. Our tester summed up the program's text-handling capabilities in two words: "tremendously unintuitive."

Although you can type text directly on drawings, KeyDraw Plus doesn't support word wrap—or even carriage returns. After you've carefully positioned lines of text, it's difficult to edit or resize them,


or to link text blocks to other objects. KeyDraw Plus simply doesn't handle text with the ease you'd expect from a Windows program.

KeyDraw Plus is a perfectly acceptable drawing tool; it was fine for creating the logo and for manipulating objects in the test drawings. It also packs fancy drawing features for creating distortion and text perspective effects similar to those in high-end draw packages. Far less impressive, however, was KeyDraw Plus's clip art, which was not as polished or businesslike as other collections.

KeyDraw Plus fills the bill for budget-conscious novices, but most users should spend more for a draw partner that handles text better.

Windows Draw 3.0 Plus OLE

PROS: Intuitive interface, excellent drawing tools, plentiful fonts and clip art CONS: Can't open multiple files, can't adjust kerning

Windows Draw's impressive combination of powerful drawing tools and excellent ease of use earns it our Best Buy award. The package handled our test documents with aplomb, proving to be the best choice for the average business user who wants to produce quality graphics without breaking a sweat. Goodwin was hooked almost immediately.


Windows Draw includes all the standard tools entry-level users need, plus such extras as control point editing, gradient fills, fitting text on a path, object blending, and more. It comes with plenty of quality fonts (both True Type and Adobe Type 1), and you can edit text easily within drawings. It provides versatile object manipulation features, a generous clip art library, and unbeatable service and support (24 hours, plus limited weekend hours).

Windows Draw is a scaled-down version of its high-end cousin, Micrografx Designer; but its interface is much simpler to use. Select drawing, text, zoom, color, or fill icons at the left side of the work area, and the button bar changes to show all the appropriate suboptions. As you drag across icons and menu options, a hint line at the bottom of the screen displays context-sensitive explanations.

Windows Draw doesn't pack all the drawing tricks that Intel-

liDraw and Visio provide. But with an interface that won't quit, and a strong array of drawing and text tools, it's still the best all-purpose business graphics tool.

Visio 1.0

PROS: Intuitive interface, easy drag-and-drop drawing tools
CONS: No bundled fonts, limited text handling

Like *IntelliDraw*, *Visio* is best at producing technical diagrams and other no-frills business graphics—particularly those comprised of shapes and interconnected lines or arrows. What sets *Visio* apart is the way it incorporates predrawn symbols into its interface.

Visio comes with a series of stencils that contain common shapes, connectors, and symbols related to specific jobs, such as maps, flow charts and floor plans. With a stencil window open, click the object you want and drag and drop it on your drawing. Visio's clever use of drag-and-drop stencils makes it possible for nonartists to complete a drawing without ever using the standard tools.

Thanks to Visio's stencils, it was even easier to produce most elements of the test drawings than it was with IntelliDraw. The program also provides automated tools such as object connection and master shapes to expedite the creation and revision of structured drawings. But Visio's lack of fancier features and its lack of bundled fonts or extensive clip art made it harder to do the pictorial map.

Visio's excellent ease of use makes it the perfect program for managers who need to make a flow chart or marketing diagram in a hurry. But if you also want a package full of clip art and capable of flashy type and more creative graphics, stick with Windows Draw.



Tip of the Month

FAST TASK SWITCHING: Mnemonic shortcut keys are easy to use and carry you directly to your open programs. You can also use them to launch programs when you're in Program Manager. Here's how to set them up: In Program Manager, select an icon and press -<Enter">Alt>-<Enter. -<Alt>-Cah Alt>-W for Word for Windows and Ctrl>-Alt>-E for Excel. Remember to use a key that reminds you of the corresponding program. Now click OK and repeat the process for each program for which you want a shortcut key.

If you've assigned a program a shortcut key but the key doesn't switch you to the application, try switching to Program Manager and then pressing the shortcut key. To give Program Manager a shortcut key, drag PROGMAN.EXE from File Manager to the Start-Up group and assign its icon a shortcut key.

Be careful when you assign key combinations. When a program



you've assigned a shortcut key is open, no other program can use that key combination for a different purpose—so don't assign combinations that another program can't do without. Also, avoid assigning the same shortcut key to more than one program.

Scan Photos to CD ROM

I'm looking for a service that will digitize photographs and put them on a CD ROM. Know of a source?

U. M. Rao, Freehold, New Jersey

A Until recently that was a fairly expensive proposition, but Kodak's new Photo CD scanning service makes it cheap and easy. You just drop off your slides, negatives, or undeveloped film at a local photo shop, and a few days later you get back a CD containing extremely-high-resolution scans of your pictures. (Kodak uses Polaroid's Digital Photo Scanner to digitize the photos.) The cost is around \$1.75 per image.

Unless you bought your CD ROM drive very recently, it probably won't be able to read Photo CDs until you upgrade its drivers. Some older models can't read them at all. To find out if your CD ROM drive can play Photo CDs, or for the location of the drop-off point nearest you, call Kodak at 800/242-2424, extension 53. If Kodak tells you your drive doesn't support "multisession" Photo CDs, don't worry about it—that just means you can't

send your CDs back to the lab to have them append additional images.

Older graphics and desktop publishing programs won't recognize the Photo CD format. Until you upgrade to Photo CD-compatible versions (dozens are now available), you'll need a copy of Kodak's *Photo CD Access* utility. It lets you copy and paste images from the CD using *Windows'* Clipboard or save the images in TIFF, PCX, BMP, and other popular formats.

How Big Is My Drive?

O I bought my PC with a 120MB hard drive, but DOS's CHKDSK says it's 119MB, Norton Desktop for Windows says it's 117MB, and the setup display when I start my computer says 114MB. What should I believe?

Frank Johnson, New York

A The discrepancy arises in part because disk storage values are rounded, but the real culprit in this case is linguistic: Basically, the term MB is used three different ways. To computer engineering types, MB stands for megabyte; 1MB is 1,048,576 bytes (2²⁰) and equal to the square of a kilobyte (KB or K), which is 1024 bytes (2¹⁰).

Sometimes MB is used to mean million bytes. For example, you referred to CHKDSK's output as 119MB, but CHKDSK displays 'total disk space' in number of bytes (written out to the 1's place). Hard drive and system manufacturers usually refer to hard drive storage the same way you did, by rounding the number of million bytes. Furthermore, manufacturers tout a drive's unformatted capacity. When you format a disk, some of its space is used to track its use, and sometimes some space is locked out as bad; the remainder is the available storage space (which CHKDSK inaccurately refers to as 'total disk space'). Thus the discrepancy between the vendor's claim and CHKDSK's report.

Sometimes *MB* is used to mean 1000K, or 1,024,000 bytes. For example, 1.44MB floppies hold 1,474,560 (1.44 times 1000 times 1024) bytes (of which only 1,457,664 bytes are available stor-

age space). The Disks panel of System Summary in Norton Desktop for Windows' System Information tool shows 117MB, but if you select Summary• Disk, you'll get a value of '117,xxx K' in the All Drive Summary.

The 114MB reported by your system setup is the closest to the hard disk's actual size in megabytes, but, of course, that figure is also rounded. Since you know how to view your system setup, you can find the number of cylinders, heads, and sectors; the drive's unformatted capacity is the product of those three numbers times 512 (the number of bytes per DOS sector). If you then click on the C: drive icon in Norton's All Drive Summary, you'll get a C Drive Summary that lists, among other numbers, the 'Start of Data'. The product of that number times 512 is the amount not used for storage. Adding that number to CHKDSK's 'total disk space' should also yield the drive's unformatted capacity in bytes.

Run HyperCard Stacks in Windows

I'm looking for a Windows program that does more or less what Hyper-Card does on the Mac and can read HyperCard stacks.

A There are a number of HyperCardlike multimedia development tools for Windows. While none of them can read HyperCard files directly, you can use Heizer Software's ConvertIt to translate applications (or as Claris calls them, stacks) created in HyperCard 2.1 or earlier to ToolBook 1.5 format.

If you can wait a while, conversion may be unnecessary. Claris has already released Windows versions of FileMaker and ClarisWorks that use the same file formats as their Mac counterparts, so HyperCard on the PC may not be very far off.

Write-Protect Files

1 often "recycle" my documents, cutting sentences and paragraphs from older drafts as I compose a new one. My problem is, I sometimes forget which document I'm in and accidentally save a chopped-up version of an old draft. I then have to interrupt my work to restore the full version from a back-up. How can I avoid this mistake? Dana Handler, Los Angeles

A One way is to make scratch copies of the old files and cut from them instead. I usually name such files SCRATCH.1, SCRATCH.2, and so on. That way, the file name on screen is a constant reminder that I'm in one of the old files, not the new one. Also, if I forget to crase such files after I'm through using them, the next time I browse their directory, those names remind me to delete them.

Another trick is to make the old files read-only. Most apps will let you do anything you want to a read-only file except save it. To make a file read-only at the DOS prompt, enter the command ATTRIB +R filename.ext, where filename.ext is the name and extension of the file (or files, if you use wild-card characters) you want to make read-only. Before you can delete or change a file, you must remove its read-only status: At the DOS prompt, use ATTRIB -R filename.ext.

To make files read-only using the DOS Shell or Windows File Manager, tag the file(s) in the File pane, select (in the Shell) File•Change Attributes or (in File Manager) Properties, and then select Read only•OK.

Delete a Non-DOS Partition

When my dealer set up my hard disk, he configured it as two logical drives. The C: drive is a standard DOS volume, but the D: drive uses a special



driver to let it exceed DOS 3.3's 32MB limit. Now that I've upgraded to DOS 5.0, I'd like to repartition my disk as one big C: drive, but FDISK won't delete the D: partition. Can you help? Morris Matthews, Sandy, Utah

A When FDISK punks out, I generally use *The Norton Utilities*' Disk Editor. Its plain-English partition table display makes it very easy to delete a non-DOS partition. (Remember to back up completely—changing and deleting partitions make disk data irre-

trievable.) To tackle more difficult problems, I use Ontrack's Disk Manager. It can handle tricky tasks, like formatting drives with more than 1024 cylinders to work with DOS 5.0, or determining the proper CMOS setup parameters if you've lost the documentation for your drive.

You can also zap the drive by using DOS's DEBUG. (Most drive controllers have a lowlevel format utility in ROM that you can initiate at the DOS prompt using




FIGURE 1: ACCIDENTAL WORKSHEET ERRORS, as in cell F13, occur easily when formulas reference extra cells.

DEBUG, but you must know the utility's ROM address.) You can use DE-BUG to erase the partition table by entering the commands in Figure 1.

Enlarge DOS's Type-Ahead Buffer

When my programs are busy performing some time-consuming task, I often continue entering further commands. Unfortunately, I can type only about 15 characters before DOS beeps to tell me its keyboard buffer is full. Then I have to wait for my program to catch up. Is there some way to enlarge the keyboard buffer?

There are many utilities around that will increase the size of DOS's 15character keyboard buffer. Some are part of software bundles, like WordPerfect Office's RP.EXE and Super PC-Kwik Power Pak's KEYSAVE.SYS. (Neither The Norton Utilities nor PC Tools offers one, though.) At least a dozen shareware and freeware key buffers can be found on line. Shareware guru Michael Callahan, a.k.a. Dr. File Finder, recommends KBFIX2, 128KEY, and BIG-BUF. You'll find them in the Featured in April section of the PC World Online software library; many more key buffers can be found on CompuServe.

Configuring LPT and COM Ports

I purchased a pair of one-parallel, dual-serial boards and want to install both of them. I have searched through a stack of manuals and computer books for information on how to set up multiple I/O boards and have found nothing. How do I do it?

A In theory, what you want to do is a fairly simple matter. Set the jumpers on one board for LPT1, COM1, and COM2. That means the parallel port (LPT1) is set to interrupt IRQ7 and address 378; the first serial port (COM1) uses IRQ4 and 3F8; and the second serial port (COM2) gets IRQ3 and 2F8. (Those are the normal factory settings for single-parallel, dual-serial boards.) Configure the other board's ports as LPT2 (IRQ5 and 278), COM3 (IRQ4 and 3E8), and COM4 (IRQ3 and 2E8).

If you have other expansion boards that contain their own serial port, such as an internal modem, you'll have to disable the duplicated serial port on your I/O boards.

You may also have to resolve other hardware interrupt conflicts before you can use all the ports. Because very few

people have two parallel ports, IRQ5 is a popular default setting for many expansion boards, and IRQ3 is a very common default for network adapters. If you have boards set to either of those IRQs, you'll have to reconfigure them to use IRQ2, IRQ10, IRQ11, IRQ12, or IRQ15 (the other interrupts are already used). Mouse drivers generally won't work on a port with a shared interrupt, and some (notably Microsoft's) work only on COM1 or COM2. A workaround is to install an InPort or PS/2style mouse port board, which can coexist with four COM ports, (Note that there are also serial "bus" mouse port boards, which won't help because they take up one of your COM ports.)

Even if you have no hardware conflicts, you're likely to encounter software problems as a result of your COM ports' shared interrupts. It's often impossible to access the devices attached to COM1 and COM3 simultaneously, and the same goes for those on COM2 and COM4.

DOS 5.0 on Low-Density Disks

I recently bought a copy of the MS-DOS 5.0 upgrade. The problem is that my old XT can't read the upgrade's high-density disks. Does that mean it won't work with PCs and XTs? If it will work, how can I install it?

A DOS 5.0 will work with older systems, but double-density disks are available only by special order. To obtain them, call Microsoft at 800/227-4679 or 206/882-8080. The new disks will cost you \$20.

SPREADSHEETS Q & A

Is Half a Sum Better Than None?

n the November column, I responded to a question from Diane Pearson about how to set up a grand-total formula using *Excel* that excludes the rows containing subtotals. The goal was to make the formula easy to modify when you insert or delete new rows. My method was to hide the subtotal rows and then, while building the SUM() function, use Formula•Select Special (shortcut key <Alt>-<Semicolon>) to select just the visible cells to total.

Many readers have written in to suggest a more elegant solution: Sum the entire column (the values and the subtotals) and divide the result by 2. Simple? Yes. A good idea? Not necessarily. The problem with this approach is that it leaves the worksheet open to careless errors later. Look at Figure 1. The NOW version in columns A:B illustrates the suggested solution (the formula in B11 is =SUM(B2:B9)/2). The LATER version in columns E:F shows what could happen later if an unsuspecting user inserted a couple of rows and added formulas (in F6 and F11) to calculate the item averages. The SUM function has stretched to include the inserted rows, and the average in F6 is now included in the sum.

On a small worksheet like this, with dummy data values like these, you notice the problem instantly. In a larger worksheet, though, the grand-total for-

> mula might be out of sight when you insert the averages. And with real data values, you might not even notice a small change in a large formula.

> Unless there is a compelling reason not to, formulas should contain references only to the data values they require.

1-2-3 Rank Order

For my work with 1-2-3, I need to rank order a rather lengthy list of items. I realize that I can sort the list, but I need to retain the items' original order and simply fill in the ranks in the next column. Should I use a macro to accomplish this task? Gerald Butz,




FIGURE 2: THIS MACRO ASSIGNS RANK ORDERS to a list of values without changing their original order.

A If the list of items is long, you're right a macro is your best bet. A serviceable one is shown in Figure 2 (but perhaps some of our readers can suggest refinements?). Note that the macro approach described here is appropriate for 1-2-3 and, with modifications, for *Quattro*; *Excel* users can call on the RANK() function to calculate ranks directly.

To set up the macro, enter all the labels shown and use /Range Name . Create to name cell B1 \R and cell B13 \R_1. To run the macro, put the cell pointer on C1 (the first number in the list) and press <Alt>-R. The macro checks to make sure the list has at least two items. If so, it inserts a couple of temporary columns, makes a copy of the original data, sorts the copy, and numbers the sorted values in descending order. Then it uses lookup functions to map the ranks back to the data, thereby preserving the data's original order. (To see how this works, use the Step function-<Alt>-<F2>—to walk through the macro step-by-step.)

Here are the details:

/rncRANK-{d}- creates a temporary range name, RANK, that covers just the first two cells in the list.

{if @count(RANK)<2}{branch \R_1}. If there are fewer than two numbers in RANK, there's nothing to do, so this statement branches to RANK to cover the full list of numbers to be ranked.

/mcRANK-{bs}.{end}{d}- extends the range name RANK to include all the items on the list.

{r}/wic{r}~ inserts two temporary columns.

/cRANK~~ copies the original data into the first blank column.

/dsd.{end}{d}~p~a~g sorts the copy of the data in ascending order.

[r]/df[bs].[l]{end}[d][r]~@rows(RANK)~1~1~. This statement moves to the next blank column and uses /Data•Fill to number the sorted list. The keystroke sequence {l]{end}[d]{r} extends the fill range so that it's the same length as the sorted list. The start number is @ROWS(RANK), the number of items in the original list; the step value is -1, so the list of ranks decreases incremen-



Master Class: Control Charts

Striving for quality improvement (QI) is a standard practice in many manufacturing organizations, and the tools they use can easily be applied to service industries as well.

Let's say that your health clinic has identified long waits as the chief source of complaints from patients. Your quality improvement team has decided to monitor the waiting room for three weeks to find out the length of a typical wait and to discover any special causes. (A process that operates without special causes is "in control." Special causes make a process unpredictable and thus difficult to manage.) You decide to randomly sample six patients each day and plot the waiting times on an X-bar chart like the one shown in Figure 1a.

An X-bar chart is a line chart that allows you to identify the effects of special causes on a process. In our example, it shows the mean (average) values of a series of random samples from a

process, together with the mean of the sample means (the dashed line at about 41), an upper control limit (at 67), and a lower control limit (at 16). If the process is in control, over 99 percent of the sample means will fall between the control limits.

This month I'll show you how to set up the control chart in 1-2-3 release 2.x, but the same calculations and basic charting tricks work in Quattro and Excel, too. Begin by entering the data shown in A4..G19 in Figure 1b (you can enter the dates as labels—just begin each entry with an apostrophe). In N4..N19, enter a series of labels ('· -) to use as graph data labels.

Enter the following formulas into I4..M4, then copy them into I5..M19. Since 1-2-3 2.x doesn't provide a function for standard deviation, the formula in cell I4, (@VAR(B4..G4)*@COUNT(B4..G4)/(@COUNT(B4..G4)-1))^0.5, calculates it: It multiplies the sample variance by the sample size, divides by the sample size minus one,

then takes the square root by raising the result to the power of 0.5. In 1-2-3 3.x and Quattro, use the formula @STDS(B4..G4); in Excel, use =STDEV(B4:G4).


The formula in J4, @AVG(B4..G4), calculates the sample mean, and the one in K4, @AVG(\$J\$4..\$J\$19), yields the average of the sample means. The dollar signs in the latter formula ensure that copies of the formula will refer to the same range of values.


The formula in L4, +\$K4+3*@AVG(\$I\$4..\$I\$19) /0.9515/@SQRT(6), calculates the upper control limit. That's the grand mean (K4) plus three times the estimated process standard deviation. The constant 0.9515, based on the sample size, is taken from a standard QI text. The formula for the lower control limit, +\$K4-3*@AVG(\$I\$4..\$I\$19)/0.9515/@SQRT(6), in L4 is almost identical.

Once you've copied the formulas, you're ready to set up the graph. The trick here is to use the constant values in K, L, and M to position the mean line and the control limits, but display dashed data labels instead of the regular graph lines. Select / Graph • X and paint the range A4..A19. Select A and paint the range J4..J19. Similarly, set the B range to K4..K19, the C range to L4..L19, and the D range to M4..M19. Select Options • Format • B • Neither, repeat the command for data series C and D, and select Quit. Now, select DataLabels • B, paint the range N4..N19, and select Center. Repeat the command for data series C and D, and select Quit to return to the Options menu. Add text using the Titles options, and you're done.

Use the same approach in *Quattro*. In *Excel*, you don't need the data labels; just format the straight lines to dashes using the Format Patterns dialog box.

The chart reveals one day when the waiting times are out of control: January 18. Now, let's see: Was that the day the clinic's PC crashed?

tally to 1. Thus the smallest item gets the largest rank.

{r}@vlookup({1 3},{1 2}.{end}{d}{r}{abs},1)~. In the next column, this statement enters a VLOOKUP() function that looks up the rank of the first item in the original list in a table formed by the sorted copy of the items and their descending ranks. {abs} makes the table address absolute, in preparation for the next command.

/c~.{1}{end}{d}{r}~ makes one copy of the lookup function for each item.

/rv[end]{d]~~ converts the lookup functions into numbers.

{I}/wdc{I}~ deletes the temporary columns—the sorted copy of the list and their ranks—and leaves only the final ranks.

{1 2} repositions the cell pointer where it was when the macro began.

/rndRANK~ deletes the temporary range name RANK.

Spreadsheet Toolbox

Since most people who develop custom applications with Excel 4.0 aren't trained programmers, the niceties of documentation and context-sensitive help often take a backseat to simply building the application. But documentation and on-line help are more than just window dressing, because they answer your users' questions for you.

There's no way that mere software can fully automate the documentation process, but Doc-To-Help, a set of Word for Windows templates from WexTech Systems, comes about as close as you can get. You start by writing a user manual based on one of the templates, using its built-in heading styles, tables, and special index and glossary macros. Then, after you've proofed the manual, Doc-To-Help compiles it into a HLP file that works with the Windows help engine, WIN-HELP.EXE. In the final hypertext document, headings become "jump" words, index entries become search keywords, and glossary entries appear as pop-up definitions.

From there, all that remains is to link the help file to your Excel application, using the tools explicitly provided by Excel's macro language. You can use the HELP() function to replace the regular help file with your own, and you can make specific context-sensitive help topics appear from custom dialog boxes, menus, and tool bar buttons.

Doc-To-Help puts professional-looking documentation and help within the grasp of every Excel macro writer. Use it and your users will thank you.

Excel Graph Templates

In my job, I often need to create a series of 50 or more *Excel* charts from a set of data files. The graphs must all have the same basic format, including axis scaling, title and axis font, and legend; they differ only in the data. How can I avoid having to set the formatting and other options in each new chart repeatedly?

A If you have a single chart layout to duplicate during one work session, you can apply formatting from the previous graph to the new one using the Gallery menu's Set Preferred and Preferred commands. If you need several different standardized formats, or if you simply want to save a standard format for later use, you'll need to create a chart template.

To go the Preferred route, start by

setting the formatting on the first chart just the way you want it. Select the chart type from Gallery menu, attach text to the axes, choose fonts, set the color and appearance of the series, and so on. Insert, format, and position the legend. Then select Gallery . Set Preferred. As soon as you select a new data series and create a new chart, choose Gallery · Preferred, and the new chart will adopt all the formatting of the original, minus added text or arrows.

If you need to create charts in several different standardized formats or to save the format for a new work session, your best bet is to create a chart template. Set up your first chart and save it as a template: Make sure you're in the chart window, and choose File Save As. In the File As Type list box, choose Template. Enter a file name and click OK.

USER GROUP TIP

Portable Printing

Ever need to print a 1-2-3 file from a printer that isn't attached to your computer? And the computer the printer is attached to doesn't have 1-2-3? The trick is to print the data and printer codes together to a file. First, use 1-2-3's Install program to install the printer you'll be using. If you've inserted a printer code with the Print . Printer . Options . Setup command or placed one in a cell, you'll need to change that as well. To print the file, place a floppy in your A: drive (B: will do), select / Print . Encoded, type A: and a file name (no extension), and press < Enter>. Then walk that floppy to the computer you need to print it from, put the floppy in, and type COPY A:\ filename.PRN /B LPT1, where filename is the file on the floppy disk. The printout will look just as though you had printed it from 1-2-3.

Fixing a WordPerfect Cursor Problem

Q I use WordPerfect 5.1 for DOS and want to change the shape of my cursor. I've tried the CURSOR.COM program in the WordPerfect directory, but it doesn't work. I see my selected cursor shape in the WordPerfect title screen, but when the program gets to the editing screen, the cursor reverts to the standard underline character. What am I doing wrong?

WordPerfect's CURSOR.COM program, which is fully described in the manual, is generally a terrific way to change your cursor's shape. For example, a block-shaped cursor is easier to see on laptop screens. As you've discovered though, CURSOR.COM may not work in all cases. While not all displays can handle cursor changes, the fact that the cursor you chose shows up in the title screen demonstrates that your display can use other cursor shapes. What's happened is that you've selected a text screen type that can't handle the cursor change. You need to let WordPerfect select your text screen type automatically instead. To switch to automatic display selection, press <Shift>-<F1>DTA <F7>. From now on, your cursor should retain the settings you selected.

USER GROUP TIP

Quick WPWIN Text Selection

It's easy to quickly select text with the mouse in WordPerfect for Windows. To select a word, click on it twice. To select a sentence, click three times. Want the entire paragraph? You guessed it—click four times. To select everything from one point to the end of the sentence, hold down <shift> and click three times at that point, or four times for everything from that point to the end of the paragraph.

Going Home in WordPerfect for Windows

I recently switched to WordPerfect
5.1 for Windows after years of using various DOS versions of WordPerfect.
Since I also use other Windows programs, I bit the bullet and selected the CUA (common user access) keyboard. Everything's working okay, but I really miss the way the DOS version used the <Home> key in combination with the cursor control keys to move around in a document. Is there a way to get this back without giving up the rest of the new keyboard?

After years of doing the same things, it's tough to change. WordPerfect knows that and offers a built-in solution. To go back to your old <Home> key combinations, start WordPerfect for Windows, then select File • Preferences • Keyboard. If no keyboard file shows up in the Name field, select Create, click the Home Key Works Like DOS WP 5.1 check box in the dialog box, click OK, type a file name, and select Save and then OK to return to the document.

If you already have a keyboard file loaded, you can skip the Create step, select *Edit*, click the Home Key Works Like DOS WP 5.1 check box, and click *OK* twice. From now on, *WordPerfect for Windows* will handle the <Home> key in the old familiar way.

Making WordPerfect Tables Grow

I often have to create tables using WordPerfect 5.1 for DOS, but now I've run into a puzzling problem. When I need to add a row to the table, the Insert command always inserts the new row above the row containing the cursor. I know that there must be a way to add rows to the end of the table, but I can't find it. Can you help?

A I'm not surprised at your problem, since the solution isn't at all intuitive. WordPerfect's table editing menu is somewhat confusing; however, there's an easy answer. Start with your cursor in any cell in an existing table, then press Alt><F7> to display the table editing menu. Now, instead of pressing Insert to insert a row, press \$ to change the size of the table. To add one or more rows, press \$, type the new total number of rows at the prompt, and press Enter>. The new empty rows will appear at the bottom of the table. Similarly, to add new columns to the right side of the table, press \$, then enter the new total column count. Finally, to return to the document, press F7>.

A Colorful Problem in WinWord

I'm having a problem with graphics in Word for Windows 2.0. My documents often need to include captured screens from graphics-based DOS programs, I run the DOS program full screen from Windows and capture the screen to the Windows Clipboard with the <Print Screen> key. I can then paste the image into my WinWord document using the Edit Paste command. But these images always have the same black background as the original and they look terrible when I print them. I can't seem to find a way to reverse the colors to make the screens look presentable. Can you help?

A That's a tough one, and there's no way to produce a negative image from the Clipboard while using Word for Windows. However, I've found an answer for you that employs a program you already have: Windows' Paintbrush. Besides solving your immediate color problem, this solution also lets you save your captured screens as files for future use. This trick will also work in other Windows word processing programs as long as you're working in 386-enhanced mode. (You can check if you are by clicking on the Help*About menu in Program Manager.)

before to capture your DOS program's screen. Now, instead of pasting the Clipboard image directly into WinWord, fire up Paintbrush (usually in the Accessories program group), and select Edit • Paste to paste the graphic onto the Paintbrush screen. You won't see the entire image, but don't use the Paintbrush scroll bars or give any Paintbrush commands other than the ones listed below. If you do, you'll lose part of the image.




FIGURE 1: WORD FOR WINDOWS OFFERS TYPOGRAPHICAL QUOTES courtesy of its SmartQuotes macro.

First, to reverse the colors, select Pick • Inverse from the Paintbrush menu. Once the colors have changed, select Edit • Copy To. Type in a file name without an extension for your screen shot, then select OK. This saves the image as a Windows BMP file. Exit Paintbrush, answering No when asked if you want to save changes.

Back in Word for Windows, select Insert • Picture, choose the file you just saved, and select OK. You'll see your screen shot appear in the document and its colors will be reversed. If you need the same screen later, you'll have it on your hard disk.

Smart Quotation Characters in WinWord

"True Quotes for WinWord." in your November 1992 column, demonstrated a way to insert true typographical quotation marks in Word for Windows 2.0 documents using macros. Your method works just fine, but isn't it better to just use the SmartQuotes

macro that is supplied with WinWord 2.0a or later versions?

Jasmine Goldstein, Los Altos, California

A Good question. I offered the macro technique because it illustrated the way to create a macro that would insert any special character. In addition, with individual macros, rather than the SmartQuotes macro included with Win-Word, you can use either typographical or keyboard quotes in the same docu-

ment without resorting to a menu. However, the SmartQuotes macro is exceptionally useful, and it also works with single quotation marks. Here's how to install and use this handy tool. (Check out your opening screen when you boot WinWord or select Help · About to determine if you are using version 2.0a or later; if not, you can contact Microsoft Corporation and request an upgrade at 206/462-9673.)

With Word for Win-

dows running, open the file NEW-MACRO.DOC (see Figure 1), which you'll find in the main WinWord directory. In the dialog box that appears, choose SmartQuotes in the Macro Name list box and then select Install. You'll see another dialog box. To install the macro into the Tools menu, choose Tools in the Menu list box and select OK . Cancel. To make the changes permanent, select File . Save All. You can then close the NEWMACRO.DOC file or take a look at some of the other handy macros that Microsoft included. To view a description of a macro, select the List Macros button, choose the macro, then select About. If you find other macros you want to add to your menus, use the Install button as you did with SmartQuotes.

Now, whenever you use WinWord, two new entries will appear in the Tools menu: EnableSmartQuotes and DisableSmartQuotes. To use the Smart-Quotes tool, select Tools • EnableSmartQuotes. You'll notice that, as you type, WinWord will convert normal single and double keyboard quotation marks to their typographical equivalents, and it will insert the proper left- or right-facing characters automatically. If you want to resume using normal keyboard quotation marks, select Tools • Disable-SmartQuotes.

Turning the Tables in Ami Pro

Or Eve switched to Ami Pro 3.0 from Word for Windows 2.0 and I'm having a minor problem with tables. When I try to import a WinWord document containing a table into Ami Pro, the data is okay, but there's no table. Is there any way to fix this without going back and retyping the data?

A While Ami Pro 3.0 can't automatically re-create tables embedded in an imported WinWord document, there's an easy trick to fix things, since Ami Pro imports WinWord table data with columns separated by tabs and rows separated by earriage returns. Start by importing the document containing the table, then select the imported table's data with your mouse. Make a note of the number of rows and columns, then select Edit•Gut to cut the data to the Clipboard.


Now, select *Tools • Tables*, set the number of rows and columns in the dialog box to match your data, and then select *OK*. Click inside the top left cell of the new table and select *Edit • Paste*. Your data will automatically pop into the table, with each entry in the correct cell. The entire job should take you just a few seconds.



Start Up Without StartUp

Is there a way to run Windows 3.1 and bypass launching applications in the StartUp group? Sometimes I need to access another application first, and with the StartUp group's apps loaded, there isn't enough memory.

Alan M. Cupps, Laramie, Wyoming

A To prevent applications in your StartUp group from loading, simply hold down the **Shift>** key as soon as the Windows logo appears.

Topsy-Turvy EPS

When I ran PageMaker 4.0 in Windows 3.0, I had no trouble printing EPS files on my PostScript laser printer. But now that I've upgraded to Windows 3.1, whenever I print landscape pages with EPS graphics, the pictures come

out upside down. How can I fix this? Buddy Petsco, Portland, Oregon

A You can correct this problem by adding a line to your WIN.INI file. First, make a backup of WIN.INI. Select File•Run, type WIN.INI. Locate the section that defines your printer's settings. The format for this is [printer.port], such as [PostScript, LPT1]. (Don't confuse this with the [PrinterPorts] section of the file.) Under this heading, add LandScapeOrient=270. Save WIN.INI, restart Windows, and your problems are over.

Change of Paste

I like the way Windows lets me paste graphics from one Windows application into another. But can I paste

> an image from a DOS graphics program into a Windows application? Ron Shapiro Reno, Nevada

A Yes, as long as your program uses a video mode that is compatible with your Windows 3.1 video driver. Start Windows and then run your DOS application full screen. Then press <Print Screen> to copy the entire screen image to the Clipboard. Switch to your Windows application and choose Edit • Paste. That's it.

If you want to copy only part of a DOS screen, press <alt>-<space> to wrap the program in a window, and pop open its Control menu. Choose Edit* Mark, paint out the area that you want to copy by dragging the mouse pointer or by using the

<Shift> cursor keys, and press <Enter> (or choose Edit • Copy from the Control menu). Switch to your Windows application, and paste the graphic.

Case of the Jumpy Cursor

When I'm printing, my mouse cursor jumps erratically around the screen, making it difficult to select a menu or click on an icon. I have an IBM PS/2 486 and a Hewlett-Packard LaserJet III with the WinJet 800 attachment from LaserMaster.

A Like all Windows programs, when LaserMaster's WinJet runs out of physical memory, it uses your virtual memory (the swap file on your hard disk). During such disk swapping, your cursor will become jumpy if you are using Windows 3.1's 32-bit disk access.

One way to solve this, then, is to turn off 32-bit disk access. Launch Control Panel, double-click the 386 Enhanced icon, click the *Virtual Memory* button, and then click the *Change* button. Uncheck the Use 32-Bit Disk Access box, then click *OK*, and follow the prompts to restart *Windows*.

If you prefer to keep 32-bit disk access (so that you can launch more DOS programs and get that extra bit of speed), consider printing your files to disk and then using LaserMaster's Win-Print Manager to print all the queued files while you're at lunch or after work. Consult your LaserMaster documentation for details.


Easy on the Icons

The icon labels in Windows 3.1 are hard to read, especially on a small monitor. Is there any way I can make these titles bigger?

A Sure 'nuff. Although you can't change this setting in the Control Panel, it's easily accomplished by fiddling with the WIN.INI file. First, make a backup copy of WIN.INI in

case anything goes wrong. Switch to Program Manager, choose File • Run, type WIN.INI and click OK. When WIN.INI opens in Notepad, locate the [Desktop] section and add the line lconTitleSize=10. This boosts the default icon title size from 8 to 10 points. You can set the default MS Sans Serif font to 8, 10, 12, 14, 18, or 24 points. To see this change take effect, save WIN.INI, then exit and restart Windows.

You can also change the typeface. To use MS Serif instead, for example, add the line IconTitleFaceName=MS Serif to the [Desktop] section. To employ a different typeface, simply substitute another font name for 'MS Serif.' You can use TrueType fonts or PostScript fonts installed via Adobe Type Manager, and you can pick any size from 4 to 126 points. Bit-mapped fonts like MS Sans Serif and MS Serif, however, are limited to a handful of specific sizes.

To make sure you get the font names right in WIN.INI, open Windows Write, select *Character • Fonts*, and examine the list of available fonts. Use the exact spelling and spacing shown or this trick won't work; font names are not case-specific, however.

Keep in mind that some *Windows* fonts are off limits. Among them: Wingdings, plus the vector fonts Modern, Roman, and Script, which are identified as plotter fonts in WIN.INI.

For a more elegant approach to modifying your desktop, see "Windows Toolbox" in this month's column.

Compressing your Typecases

In the December 1992 "Windows Toolbox," you said that *Typecase* from SWFTE lets you save space by compressing deactivated fonts. This is certainly news to me; I can't find any mention of this capability in the documentation or help file. How do I compress deactivated fonts? *David I. Gould, Toledo*

A Simple. In the main *Typecase* window, choose *Options • Other*, click the Compress fonts when deactivating check box, then *OK*. After that, *Typecase* will compress any fonts you deactivate.

Keeping dBASE III Unique

My dBASE III Plus database requires the user to input a unique ID number for each document logged. What can I do to prevent a user from damaging the database by inputting a number that is already present?

Connie Babore, New York

A dBASE, III Plus has no built-in feature to assign a unique ID number to each new record automatically. But with a short program and a line in CONFIG.DB (the file that sets defaults when you load dBASE), you can make dBASE enter a unique ID number in each new record.

Here's how: Create the program shown in Figure 1, in any word processor or text editor, saving it as an ASCII text file called NEWREC.PRG. To use the editor that comes with *dBASE*, enter **MODIFY COMM Newrec** at the dot prompt. Or you can download the file from the Featured in April folder on PC World Online.

NEWREC tells dBASE to go to the current data file's last record and read the value in the ID field. The program then adds a new record to the database,

A Better dBASE Subtotal

"Summarizing dBASE Data for Graphing" (Data Management, November 1992) included a dBASE program for copying subtotal information from one data file into another. As Neil Dunlop of Berkeley, California, and a few other readers pointed out, you don't need a program to do this. The dBASE TOTAL command will provide subtotals guite nicely for a database indexed on the field being totaled. For instance, to copy sales figures, subtotaled by Product, to a data file called SUMMARY, make sure you're in the sales database and that your Product index is active. Then run the command TOTAL ON product TO summary, dBASE will create SUMMARY.DBF with the information you need.

increases the value by one, and inserts the value into the ID field. To make the program work for you, substitute the name of your own ID field for the '1D' in the fourth and ninth lines of the listing.

A few caveats: This program assumes that your ID field is numeric—doing this sort of thing with text fields is considerably more complicated. Also, to make sure the record with the greatest ID number is always at the end, your database must be indexed on the ID field, and this must be the active index. A simple INDEX ON ID TO ID command will create the index, and if you always remember to open your file with USE filename INDEX ID, you will keep it up-to-date and active.

Now you have to make NEWREC run when you press a function key. The best key to use is <F9>, because this normally runs the APPEND command and is already associated with adding records. To set <F9>, add the line F9 = 'DO NEWREC;'-don't forget the semicolon-to your CONFIG.DB file. (If you don't have a CONFIG.DB file, create one that contains only this line.) Again, any text editor will do, and you can use the dBASE editor with MODIFY COMM CONFIG.DB. If you prefer to reset <F9> temporarily, use SET FUNCTION 9 TO 'DO NEWREC;' at the dot prompt. However you choose to set <F9>, you can always go back to dBASE's default with SET FUNCTION 9 TO 'APPEND'.

Once you've changed CONFIG.DB, the next time you start dBASE, NEWREC will be waiting for you. All you have to do is press <F9> at the dot prompt and you'll get a new record with the next unique ID number.

A Memo on Data Publishing

I'm using Alpha Four; and my database includes memo fields. I would like to use tabs, justification, and proportional fonts, as well as have the information snake from one column to another. I've tried exporting my data to WordPerfect, but I can't figure out a way to export the memo field text. Is there a way to export Alpha Four data and memos to WordPerfect? If not, is there another program that will format my report?

A Alpha Four's own reporting capabilities are far below your needs, and it can't export memo fields into WordPerfect. Luckily, Alpha Four uses the same DBF file format as dBASE, FoxPro, and many other programs, including several report writers. Most of the best data formatting programs available these days require Windows, a problem if you're not a Windows user.

The one non-Windows program I know of that can handle snaking columns and memo fields is DCS's dbPublisher Pro+. However, at \$495, it's not a cheap investment, and it's harder to learn than most of the Windows options I've seen.

The one program I know of that can import your data files, including the memos, to WordPerfect is InfoPublisher; a Windows program by PageAhead Software. Intended as a go-between from data sources to word processors and desktop publishers, PageAhead can export dBASE/Alpha Four data and memos to the DOS or Windows versions of WordPerfect.

Then there are the Windows-based report writers. As we go to press, Alpha Software itself is preparing to release

Rounding Currency Values in Paradox

I'm using *Paradox 3.5* to track and analyze sales and payroll figures. One of my calculations evenly splits the commission earned. My problem is with money values that have an odd number of cents. When these are divided in half, the result has three decimal places—not an accurate way to deal with money. I can get *Paradox* to

display the split commission with only two decimal places, but I know that the third decimal place is still there. How? Because if I press <Alt>-<F5> while editing the field, I get the full three-decimal number. And worse yet, it affects any further calculations. How can I make the rounded number the real one?

A You didn't say whether your calculation is done in a query or a script. In either case, you can use a short *Paradox* script to round your commission amounts to two decimal places. The script I've prepared for you assumes that you have fields in your table called Commission and Split; for each record in the table, it divides the value of Commission, rounds the result to two decimal points, and saves the final result in the Split field.

To get to the script editor from Paradox's main menu, select Seripts • Editor • Write. Enter ROUNDCOM as the name of the script, and type in the following text:

COEDIT "table"

SCAN

[Splin] = ROUND([Commission]/2,2)

ENDSCAN

DO_IT!

Put the name of your table between the quotes ("") on the first line, and change the field names in brackets ([]) on the third line to those you need calculated. When you're finished, press <F2> to save the script. Whenever you finish updating your commissions, use Scripts • Play • Roundcom to create your rounded split values.

Blazing Bullets With Microsoft Publisher

Q I use *Microsoft Publisher* to produce simple publications, but unfortunately *Publisher* can't generate bullets. The manual suggests using an asterisk or the letter *θ*, which looks amateurish, or using the drawing tools to create circles and squares, which is too much work. Got any better ideas?

There are plenty of easy ways to do A bullets, and they'll work with just about any Windows program. Most fonts provide special characters like bullets and copyright symbols as part of their extended character sets. To insert them into your Windows documents, you need to hold down the <Alt> key and punch in their ASCII character codes using the numeric keypad. For example, to insert standard bullets using Windows 3.1's Arial or Times New Roman fonts, move your cursor to where you want the bullet, turn on Num Lock, hold down < Alt>, and type 0149 on the numeric keypad.

But why settle for plain old bullets when you can set off your lists with fingers, arrows, clocks, and other symbols? Windows 3.1's Wingdings font features a variety of special characters that you can use with virtually any Windows application. The secret lies in using Windows' Character Map utility to copy symbols from your installed fonts and then paste them into your document. Here's how:

- With your Microsoft Publisher document already open, go to the Program Manager and open Character Map, which normally can be found in the Accessories group.
- Click on the Font box to view a list of your available fonts and select Wingdings. Character Map then displays a grid of all the available characters in the font.
- 3. Double-click the character you want to use as a bullet. The symbol will appear in the Characters to Copy box. Select Copy to copy it into Windows' Clipboard, and click Close.
 - 4. Return to your Publisher document

and insert the text cursor in the text frame where you want to add a bullet. Select Edit Paste Text to paste the bullet character from the Clipboard into your document. To add more bullets, just move the cursor where you want the character to appear and repeat the paste command.

Sometimes when you paste in a single character it switches to the default body font. Don't panic—simply highlight the character and select *Format*• *Character*•*Font* to change the font back to Wingdings.


Making the Ventura-Corel Connection

I used *CorelDraw 3.0*'s auto-tracing attility to convert a black-and-white scan of a business logo into an Encapsulated PostScript (EPS) file. But when I import the EPS file into *Ventura 4.1* and place it in a document, all I see is an empty box with an *X* in it. Although the document and logo print correctly on my PostScript printer, I'd like to be able to work with the logo on screen. Is there a way to do this?

A No problem. The reason your logo isn't displayed on screen is because EPS files created by *Corel*'s tracing utility do not include an *image header*. An image header is a bit-mapped version of the graphic that you can use to position, size, and crop the image inside a document. To add an image header to an EPS file, follow these steps:

- Open CorelDraw and select File • Import to open the Import dialog box. Scroll down the List Files of Type drop-down list, and select the Corel-Trace EPS format. Find the directory where your scanned logo file is stored, select the file, and click OK.
- 2. With the image of your logo selected, choose File Export to open the Export dialog box. Scroll down the List Files of Type drop-down list and select the Encapsulated PostScript format. Check the Selected Only box, enter a file name, and click OK.



 In the Export EPS dialog box that appears next, make sure Low Resolution is checked and click OK. (A low-resolution image header requires the least amount of disk space.)

 Exit CorelDraw. There's no need to save the untitled CorelDraw file, since you've already exported the EPS version you need.

From this point on you will see the image of your logo when you import the EPS file into Ventura as well as most other Windows publishing and presentation packages. However, there are a handful of Microsoft's Windows applications—such as Microsoft Publisher 1.0, PowerPoint 3.0, Word for Windows 2.0, and WordPerfect for Windows 5.2, for example—that can't import Corel-Draw EPS files with headers. If you use an application such as this, you will still have to use the EPS file without being able to see an image header.



Easy Graphics for Small Publishers

Ve started my own small desktop publishing business using Windows, and I'm looking for an easy way to create letter-heads, logos, and simple drawings. For example, I use PageMaker to produce a newsletter for a company that installs wheelchair elevators and van lifts, and I want to include an occasional line drawing of a van or bus. CorelDraw is just too complicated for me. Can you recommend a simpler graphics program, or should I just stick with any clip art portfolios?

Although there are plenty of excellent clip art collections available, you may not find one with the specific images you need. I'd recommend you saddle up a low-cost Windows draw program instead. A simple draw program gives you the flexibility to create images for virtually any kind of business publication, and most come with a herd of clip art images that you can customize. One of the best is Windows Draw 3.0 (\$149.95; Micrografx, 800/733-3729), which earned Best Buy honors in our roundup in this issue (see "Draw Programs for the Rest of Us").

Another good choice is Arts & Letters Apprentice 1.11 (\$169; Computer Support Corp., 214/661-8960). These easy-to-use draw packages come with scads of clip art, including wheelchair-access icons and images of transportation vehicles. After you modify the images to your liking or create your own, you can easily export them in a file format that PageMaker and other desk-top publishing applications can import.



Modeming Your Pager

Oo you know of any autodialers that can send text messages to an alphanumeric pager?

Mark J. Krisburg, Oceanside, California

At the moment, the only program I A know of that can do this is Borland's SideKick. By the time you read this, however, two snazzy Windows packages that offer this capability will be released. Notify will enable you to send messages from applications such as Excel and Microsoft Word to a pager. It's from Ex Machina; 800/238-4738, 718/832-5465 (fax). A DOS version will also be available soon. Both will list for \$149. The next version of The DeskTop Set will also be able to talk to your pager. It lists for \$195 from Okna Corp.; 201/460-0677. You can purchase it directly from Okna for only \$89.

Transferring Files Behind the Scenes

Ord like to be able to do file transfers in the background while I run other applications. Do you know of any utilities that will let me do this? I currently use *Telix*, and I don't want to use *Windows* or *Desquiew*.

A There are some memory-resident utilities that pop applications into the background, but none that will work if you try to coax your communications program to do a file transfer behind the curtain. You might consider switching your communications software to a program that can work in the background.

Crosstalk Mk. 4 from Digital Communications Associates is a good choice. SoftKlone's Mirror also has this talent, as does the plain-vanilla communications mode in the remote software Close-Up by Norton-Lambert.

One bonus of these DOS communications programs is, they'll give you much better speed and performance in background file transfers than *Windows* communications programs provide.

Troubleshooting in NRAM

What is my modem's NRAM? What can I use it for? Laura Borne, White Plains, New York

A Your modem's non-volatile random access memory, or NRAM, is a chip in the modem that stores configuration settings. Many modems will even let you store phone numbers in NRAM. A

Hayes-compatible modem will let you store multiple configuration profiles—usually two—in addition to the factory default profile.

In the early days of

9600-bps modems, owners swapped and compared NRAM setups with the zeal of custom Corvette owners. Tweaking the NRAM was what hotrodded the modem. NRAM is just as essential in 2400-bps modems, though they have fewer commands to set. Old

they have fewer commands to set. Old 1200-bps modems don't have an NRAM—their settings are controlled by DIP switches or the communications software.

Storing some of the initialization commands in NRAM is good housekeeping. It speeds up the modem's initialization process and makes the settings semipermanent. And because many communications programs send exotic commands to the modem, they may leave your modem catatonic and unable to dial out with another communications program. You may need to restore one of your modem's NRAM settings or return it to its original factory defaults (with the AT&F command).

Go to your communications software's terminal screen (the first screen you get when you load *Procomm*). Type the AT command that will display the currently active configuration on screen, followed by Enter. (You may have to hunt through your manual for this command.) In the case of a Hayes-compatible modem it's AT&V, but it may be different for your modem. The modem will display a list of settings. These might look like com-

plete gibberish at first, but don't be scared. There's a list of what the settings control in your modem's manual.

To change these settings, simply type the command and the new value on screen. For example, if call waiting is disrupting your modem's operation, you can instruct it to ride out the call waiting beeps: Increase the amount of time the modem waits after losing a remote car-

rier before it hangs up. That value is stored in the S10 register. To change the delay time to 10 seconds, type S10=100 and press Enter.

Once you've finished making changes, store the configuration by typing the command AT&Wn where n is the number of the configuration profile.

Go to your modem's setup screen. Erase any commands that you stored in NRAM from the modem's dialing and initialization strings. Add **Z** to the start of the initialization string to restore your modem to its customized NRAM settings whenever the software is loaded.

If your modem has DIP switches, there may be one to set the modem to load NRAM settings—rather than its factory settings—when it's turned on. Make sure that's in the correct position.





STAR-DOT-STAR TIPS

Floppy Disk Snoop

Ever need to check a floppy disk to see whether it's high density or low density? Or find out what operating system or utility was used to format the disk? Or want to know how many files will fit into the disk's root directory? Since DOS's CHKDSK utility does not provide all this information, I wrote a Qbasic program, BOOTREC.PAS, which reads the boot sector information from any standard DOS floppy disk.

To use this program, copy it into a text file and save it as DRIVINFO.BAS [Fig-

ure 1]. Then enter the command QBASIC /RUN DRIVINFO at the DOS prompt. The program displays the size and density of the disk, the number of bytes in each sector, the number of sectors in a cluster (the unit of space DOS uses to allocate space for files), the number of reserved sectors, the number of copies of the file allocation table (normally two), the number of files that will fit in the root directory, the total number of sectors on the disk, the name of the program used to format the disk, the number of sectors per FAT, the number of sectors per

track, the number of sides (heads), the number of hidden sectors, and the total number of clusters on the disk.

Editor's note: This handy utility gives you far more information about a floppy disk and how it has been formatted than DOS's CHKDSK command. As editor of this column, I often receive disks in unusual formats—including single-sided and 320K disks. If your machine balks at accepting such disks, or if you want to reformat them to allow

them to store more data, this utility will help you scope out the situation. According to Mr. O'Connor, the program also works on some hard drives; however, I had no success getting it to operate on anything but a floppy. I'd therefore recommend this utility for floppy disks only. DRIVINFO.BAS is available in PC World Online's Featured in April folder.

Delete to Order

In Word for Windows I often want to delete everything from the current insertion point to the next occurrence of a particular character, but not delete that character. This macro [Figure 2] lets

you do that, and if you assign it to a shortcut key, it does it in two key-strokes—a lot fewer than the <F8> Extend Selection command requires.

Abe Casper, San Francisco

Editor's note: This macro is handy for deleting to the end of a phrase, sentence, or paragraph. To do the latter, I press <Ctrl>-W (the key combination I attached to this macro), then press <Enter>. To delete a sentence, it's a simple <Ctrl>-W<Period>.

To create the macro, select *Tools* • *Macro*, type **DeleteToCharacter**, and select *Edit*. Enter the text of the listing into the resulting window. If you often need to delete to a character that isn't includ-

ed in this macro, you can modify it. Just add to the height of the dialog box by increasing the second number (182) in the third line, then add more push buttons to the dialog box and case statement. Or you can simply replace one of the existing buttons with a new one. An ASCII version of this macro, DEL-CHAR.WWM, is available in PC World Online's Featured in April folder.

Since the point of this macro is quick keyboard deletes, attach it to a shortcut key. Select *Tools* • *Options* • *Keyboard*. In the Macros box, select *DeleteToCharacter*; in the Shortcut Key box, type or select the key of your choice.

This macro should be much shorter and more powerful, but Word for Windows' macro language won't allow it. If WordBasic had a command that let you pause a macro until the user pressed a key, then returned that keystroke to the macro (a capability that WordPerfect for DOS' macros has), you could accomplish the same goal with a three- or four-line macro that could delete to any character.

The Pause That Refreshes

In the November 1992 Help Line column, reader Paul Hoffman asked for a way to pause his system during CONFIG.SYS processing. While PC World's suggested method, pressing the <Pause> key, does

work, I often find the messages scroll by so quickly that they're gone before I can press <Pause>.

The utility PAUSE.SYS lets you pause the display even if you don't have lightning reflexes. To pause the system at any point in your CONFIG.SYS file, insert the line DRIVER=C:\PAUSE.SYS in CONFIG.SYS where you'd like the system to pause. (If you put PAUSE.SYS somewhere else on your system rather than in the root directory of drive C:, be sure to modify this line appropriately.) The system will pause with the message 'Press any key to continue...'. Now you can pause CONFIG.SYS anywhere you want without missing important messages.

Editor's note: This clever driver, which duplicates a feature that comes with Novell's DR DOS, is a more flexible solution than the one we presented in the *Help Line* column. It's especially useful if your system uses the older IBM XT-style keyboard, which could pause output only with a finger-twisting two-key sequence (<Ctrl>-<Num Lock>). It's also handy if you want to

pause the system more than once during initialization-which requires dexterity even if you have a <Pause> key.

To create PAUSE.SYS, copy Figure 3 to a file called PAUSE.SCR. (If you're on PC World Online, you can download the file directly from our library.) Then type DEBUG < PAUSE.SCR at the DOS prompt. PAUSE.SYS will appear in the current directory.

Two caveats apply when you use this utility with a disk compression program such as Stacker or SuperStor. First, remember that the compressed drives on your system will not be accessible until the disk compression utility is loaded. You'll therefore want to put PAUSE-.SYS on an uncompressed drive so you can pause CONFIG.SYS before the compression software becomes active. Also remember that compression utilities usually swap the hard drive letters at boot time to make the compressed drive look like drive C:. (The utility that does this is often called DEV-SWAP or something similar.) If your system performs this drive letter swap, the correct path for PAUSE.SYS will differ depending on its position in the CONFIG.SYS file. In most cases, the uncompressed drive will be drive C: before the swap and drive D: (or higher) afterward. Both PAUSE.SYS and PAUSE.SCR are available in PC World Online's Featured in April folder.

Everything Must Go

It's amazing that MS-DOS still has no command for removing a directory that contains files or subdirectories. This simple Turbo Pascal program, DEL-SUB.EXE [Figure 4], solves the problem by removing any directory, along with its contents and subdirectories. Alex Lloyd, Shaker Heights, Ohio

Editor's note: This program addresses a serious deficiency in DOS. To create DELSUB.EXE with Turbo Pascal, simply copy it to an ASCII text file called DELSUB.PAS and enter the command TPC DELSUB at the DOS prompt (assuming that Turbo Pascal's BIN directory is in your PATH). This command will invoke the command-line version of the Turbo compiler and create the executable file in the current



directory. Move DELSUB.EXE to a directory that's in your AUTOEXEC.BAT's PATH statement. To use the program, simply type **DELSUB** at the DOS prompt; the program will ask you for a directory to delete. Both DELSUB.PAS and DELSUB.EXE are available in PC World Online's Featured in April folder.

I've added some code that keeps the program from deleting everything in the root directory (it can't, of course, delete the root directory itself). One exception: If you've used the JOIN command to turn one drive into a virtual directory of another, and you tell DELSUB to erase that "directory," it will erase everything on the attached drive. In this situation, DOS—and DELSUB—won't recognize the root as a root.

Alex Lloyd's program is a good example of recursion—a technique in which a procedure calls itself repeatedly to accomplish the same task on several levels. In this case, the DELSUB's WIPESUB procedure is invoked afresh on each level of the directory tree to remove all the files at that level.

Putting the Corporate Exec "On the Road"

y former client and longtime friend Jack was on the telephone, seeking some free advice: "I've got a new notebook computer, and I want to set it up right for travel—I'm even going to Europe in June. What computer tools do I need?" Jack is president of a company that for the past decade has built seats for U.S. fighter aircraft, a market no longer known for an upward growth curve. Years back, I'd helped him pick out his first home office PC, one that could handle connections to his firm's mainframe.

As part of his travel plans, Jack wanted to carry massive amounts of production data with him-more than he could store on the notebook PC. I recommended three products-Micrografx's ABC FlowCharter 2.0 to ease doing business in Europe, and MSI's Cachét storage subsystem and Delrina's WinFax Pro 3.0, both of which should make his business workday more productive in the firm's branch offices. As long as I was in the mood for recommendations, I suggested he check out SWFTE's Typecase II, an inexpensive way to make his printed files look better when he's completed a trip.

ABC FlowCharter 2.0

You may think of flowcharting as a task for electronic circuit designers or computer programmers, but it has far broader applications: It can be used to describe any process, from production to decision making. It's not scheduling or project management, but a graphical means of showing how actions are linked together to become a process.

And flowcharts are about to assume even greater significance. The European Community countries, in adopting quality-assurance standard ISO 9000 of the International Organization for Standardization, have stipulated that after

June of this year, any firm wishing to do business in Europe must be able to define its quality control procedures in clear, definable linkages. That's where flowcharting comes in.

Micrografx's ABC FlowCharter 2.0 provides all the graphical tools you'll need to lay out a flowchart for any series of actions or operations. Sample files included with the program show how


nodes (steps, tasks, events) on the chart can be linked and interrelated; one shows a simple "performance improvement cycle" of a process required for ISO certification.

Among FlowCharter's 16 palettes of shapes is a set of computer equipment images, great for charting a local area network. FlowCharter became a Foulks Favorite as I used it to chart my own LAN topology. Another palette contains office images—filing cabinet, clock, calendar—almost everything except a coffeepot (though if you have a coffeepot image in your clip art library, you can paste it into the file). Once you've charted your office paper-flow procedures, you can link that chart to the one showing your office LAN and draw the connections between related items.

Version 2.0 adds several new capabilities, including broader shape customization and the ability to draw curved lines. The new version maintains compatibility with files from Version 1. FlowCharter (formerly from Roykore, acquired by Micrografx last year) lists for \$495, but look for a street price in the \$325 range.

Cachét Optical Disk Subsystem

Convenient high-speed laser disk storage—more than 120MB of data on an



erasable disk the size of a 3½-inch floppy (but twice as thick)—has finally arrived. Magneto-optical (MO) drives are pricey, but new technology invariably is.

Software is what sets

MSI's Cachét optical disk subsystem apart from the dozen rewritable 128MB MO drives *PC World* reviewed last September ("Personal Rewritable Optical Drives: A World of Unlimited Storage"). Caching software developed by Maximum Storage for optical drives gives the Cachét an impressive data transfer rate of up to 7.25 megabits per second. In actual use, I was able to transfer 13.8MB (453 files) in just over 3½ minutes. That's faster than some older hard drives still in use.

Maximum Storage calls its system OptoCache. It is self-configuring as part of the system's installation, but you can customize its cache size (default is 256K), base or extended memory, and other options. A feature called Quik-Write lets you tailor the cache performance for maximum data-write speeds. Another Cachét feature, Auto-Init, formats optical disks as needed. The entire hardware/software package oper-

ates just like a standard disk drive, and its SCSI-2 interface board can be installed alongside existing HD controller boards.

Another well-designed software tool lets you lock the disk into the Sony SMO-P301 drive (so it can't be ejected manually while in use), and you can have Cachét erase the 128MB disk and simultaneously map out bad sectors.

A half-height drive plugs into your PC for \$2095, or you can pick up an external model

for \$2195. Both come with an Adaptec AHA-1510 interface board, all cables, and easy instructions. The M-311 disks list for \$75. I could put two of these units to use immediately.

WinFax Pro 3.0

My first reaction to Delrina Technology's WinFax Pro 3.0 was not favorable. "Uhoh," I thought, "here's a market-leading product that has been hit by featuritis." But

now that I've had some time to get better acquainted with Version 3.0, I have a different message for the thousands of WinFax users; Don't jump to hasty conclusions. This \$129 fax package is a powerhouse with many enhancements. They just take some getting used to.

As an example, the database files of fax recipients now contain 14 fields, a largesse that quadrupled the size of one of my fax phone lists. Version 3.0 automatically indexed that file five ways, producing seven files—and taxing storage capacity and file management. The files are XBase-compatible, in common DBF and NDX formats, but using an XBase manager to edit them separately is hazardous. Delrina's documentation does not cover proper index linkages, and a wrong guess will leave you with mismatched index files.

If you use a telephone credit card, you will probably need to tinker at length to set up the proper prefix and suffix dial strings. With Delrina's help, I set up dial strings for AT&T and MCI Vision cards, a feat I've not been able to accomplish with other fax software. (Users of Intel's SatisFaxtion modems, which use the CAS transmission standard, will find that their modem's setup program controls a number of WinFax dialing parameters).


Some users will appreciate the superbly comical set of customizable fax cover sheets, by cartoonist John Caldwell, that come with WinFax 3.0. But I don't want to bring a grin to the face of a client whose payment is overdue.

Such personal gripes, however, do not diminish WinFax Pro's functionality—from inside any Windows print application, you can fax near-laser-quality output to any fax device. This software does far more than simply send a printer file to a COM port; it is a full fax management system. It even transforms incoming fax image files into usable text.

The first WinFax was my first fax-modem software, and after trying out a lot of competitive products, I find the new version is still the standard by which all other fax software must be measured.

My friend Jack can put WinFax Pro 3.0 right to work from a minimal installation on a fax-modem-equipped notebook, leaving Caldwell's cartoons to entertain his stay-at-home staffers.

Typecase II

A chart entry in *PC World*'s January buyers' guide "The Complete Guide to Scalable Fonts" piqued my curiosity. SWFTE's *Typecase II* TrueType font pack lists an average cost per outline of 50 cents—a mouse, keeping company with a herd of elephants. Which, of course, raises the question, Can this mouse hold its own?

Typecase II contains 44 named font families. A few, like Cargo (imitating stencils on shipping containers), come in a single type weight. Others have multiple fonts; Garamand Classic, a knockoff of the popular PostScript Garamond, features six, from light to bold italic. Some, like Certificate (what you see on certificates in doctors' offices) are display faces with limited use. Others, like Empire Script (a BrushScript look-alike), are common.

So how do Typecase fonts print? Surprisingly well. I installed the full package, and—using Windows Write—ran amok among my new fonts, printing "The quick brown fox..." in varying point sizes on a 600-dpi printer. Then, in Word for Windows 2.0, using WinFax Pro 2.0, I sent the equivalent to a fax machine. In both cases, output was clean and sharp. Typecase II (and its predecessor, Typecase I) are true Foulks Favorite bargains.

Quick Fixtures

Maximizer for Windows (Richmond Technologies & Software) is a sales-oriented personal information manager with well-implemented features. You can categorize address list entries and deal with categories as groups. Maximizer for Windows also includes expense account tracking. This \$249 Canadian product is a definite challenger to higher-priced PIMs.

TWAIN isn't a product. It's an interface standard for scanners, and it is rapidly gaining industrywide acceptance. Confirming its arrival as a standard, three TWAIN-compliant products-Micrografx's PhotoMagic, Logitech's FotoTouch 2.1, and Delrina's WinFax Pro 3.0-surfaced in my in-basket this month. With TWAIN, I was able to scan an image of a canceled check directly into a Windows word processor document. It also permitted me to hook up color and black-and-white scanners to the same PC with no conflict in use. As PC World went to press, more than 75 companies were pledged to TWAIN support. Be sure to look for this new standard in the software and scanner you buy.



Creation and Other Recreations

f you have tendencies toward megalomania, SimLife, the latest "software toy" from Maxis, could be hazardous to your mental health. It gives you the power to invent worlds, create plants and animals from the genetic level up, design environments, simulate and control evolution, and even tinker with the basic physical nature of the universe.

You start out by naming your worlda treat in itself. Then you use your mouse and a series of simple menus to build terrain with lakes, mountains, and other geological features and place them where you want. Finally, you pick weather and other variables. Rainfall? Soil quality? Food sources? You decide.

You exercise the same detailed control over the plant and animal species. Start with fauna and flora or make up new ones. Ever wonder whether flying horses would be viable? Create some, and find out. You can adjust every variable imaginable-how much an animal eats, how often it mates, even what its on-screen icon looks like.

Once your world is set up, you start the clock-letting the animals and plants interact over a period of days, years, even eons. If you get bored you can poke around at a "running" ecosystem to see what happens: Introduce a flood, a famine, or a huge comet, or simply extend your godly finger and smite individuals of your choice.

How do you win? Well, since SimLife isn't really a game, the concept of winning is a bit vague. In one sense, you win if you have a good time. But I think a better way is to build a world in which your creations live long and prosper.

And make no mistake; that's not easy. Your first few tries at building a world may lead you to rename this toy "SimDeath," as you watch all your lifeforms perish from lack of food, too much rainfall, or insufficient offspring.


Combat Simulation for Business Warriors

The chessboard is the ultimate battlefield. Beneath its odd-looking pieces and stylized

moves, it's really savage combat, ideal for business warriors who want to hone their strategic powers and focus their aggression. Of course, it's also a swell way to blow off steam.

There are scads of chess-for-PC games around, but Battle Chess Enhanced CD ROM-a version that makes no bones about the game's frankly bloodthirsty character-is unique. If you have a multimedia PC (that is, a CD ROM player, a sound board, and Windows 3.1), chess will come alive in a series of highly realistic battles: Knights behead bishops, bishops levitate pawns and spin them in the air until they break apart. All the fighting is accompanied by martial music plus the clanks, grunts, and screams of medieval warfare. The animation is stupendously detailed, and the characters are lots of fun-including the sultry queens who swish around the board like Mae West.

At the heart of Battle Chess is the chess engine itself, and whatever algorithm it uses had no trouble beating me or my far more skillful friends. Yet Battle Chess seems aimed primarily at youngsters and beginners, not experienced players. The animated battles slow the game to a tedious crawl, and after you've seen all the combat variations (of which there are quite a few),



having to view them over and over is painfully boring. Moreover, the music stops for every capture, while the CD struggles to load a new batch of music and animation-slowing the action even further.

Nonetheless, chess neophytes will be captivated by the battles and the clever animated tutorials in which each piece

explains how it is best used. A DOS version is included; it's nearly as good, only the graphics aren't quite as slick.

Welcome to The Secret of Monkey Island, a charming Caribbean role-playing adventure from LucasFilm Games, newly upgraded for CD ROM and distributed by Software Toolworks. Among the new features are an improved point-and-click interface (no typing required), additional dialogue by

science fiction novelist Orson Scott Card (who also worked on *Loom*, from the same companies), and an exceptional music track that's heavy on sea chanteys and reggae.

As with most LucasFilm games, the story line and delightful dialogue are the strong suits. You start the game on Melee Island, somewhere in the Caribbean. You are Guybrush Threepwood, a young man whose biggest problem is his name-people are always making jokes about it. Your burning desire is to become a pirate, and to achieve this socially ambiguous goal you'll need to find some pirates, steal a sword, learn to use it, and pass three little piracy tests. But that just gets you in the door. Once you've quali-

fied, your adventures begin. The "secret" of the title is no laughing matter.

A good gaming interface should "disappear," leaving you to enjoy the adventure, and this one is very good. Once you get the hang of using letter keys (O for "open," T for "talk," and so on) along with mouse clicks for pointing, you'll find yourself

speeding along. And though the drawing and animation are a bit crude, the story unfolds with smooth, cinematic pacing.

Best of all, writer/director Ron Gilbert has infused *Monkey Island* with a delicious sense of fun. When you get to town, you'll find almost everyone in the place ready and willing to sell you a "genuine" pirate treasure map. And when you try to break into the governor's mansion, you'll discover that it's guarded not by pit bulls but by deadly Piranha Poodles. There's even an "advertising pirate" lurking in the darkest corner of the saloon, ready to hit you with . . . no, not a blackjack, a sales pitch for *Loom*.



GAMES BREAK TIME

If you crave even greater responsibility, you can take command of the entire surface fleet, on the German or British side. And if your interest lies in understanding the nature of this conflict, you'll find the game's historical overview and on-line briefings as enlightening as a textbook-and a lot more fun. All the battles are based on fact.

You'll need to master the gun turrets, navigation tools, ship-handling techniques, and other complex fighting systems of a WWII battleship. And you'll need to mastermind logistics, damage control, intelligence, and changes in tactics under the high pressure of an ongoing naval engagement.

If you elect the challenge of fleet command, you'll have to assign hundreds of ships, forming them into task forces, sending them out on patrols and combat missions, and maintaining a complex overall strategic balance. Playing on this level is probably the most fun, as you watch your task forces setting forth on their missions.

A mouse-based interface helps you navigate, but there are so many elements to control that even the most experienced games strategist will find Great Naval Battles a challenge. I wouldn't be surprised if naval warfare students at our service academies were training on similar software.

Unfortunately, the early version I tested had some problems. Not only wouldn't it use my sound board, but one of the "fatal errors" trashed the CMOS set-up data for my hard disk! SSI promises a fix by the time you read this-but you might want to call and make sure this bug has been swatted before you load the game.

Tools for Keeping Files Straight

ou know the routine: At 5 p.m., you copy some work to a floppy and bring it home ("Yeah, that's the file name"). Take it back to work in the morning and copy it again ("Did I get the right one?"). Make another copy for a business trip, then copy the changes you made on the road to your office and home machines ("Now did I copy it from the office to the notebook to the home or from the home to the office to the . . . ?"). It's simple—and utter chaos.

I've been there. I've wasted a lot of time—that ever-shrinking commodity—futzing with which file is where. And in the process, I undoubtedly wrote over some newer files with older versions. Luckily, I've found a few products that copy and track files for me, giving me more time to be productive—or have fun.

Home and Back Again

The best program I've found for tracking files across multiple computers is MBS Technologies' FileRunner: If I've got copies of this column on my home computer, my office computer, and my notebook (not an unusual situation), my FileRunner floppy knows when each of them was last copied to the other and which copies have been updated since then. I let the program worry about what's what because computers love that kind of work.

You install FileRunner on all your computers, tell it which files need to be transferred (by file name and directory, using wild cards), and start carrying around the floppy. You can stop worrying about writing over different versions of a file; FileRunner will alert you if the same file has been changed on more than one computer since the last transfer. You can get 400 files on a floppy (I should only be so prolific), compressing them if need be. The one deficiency? I

But there are times when I need to copy a lot of files from one computer to another. Instead of messing with floppies, my essential tool I use is Traveling Software's LapLink Pro, which links the two computers by cable. The software is easy to use—you get a split screen with each computer's files listed side by side. You can

perform the usual copy and move commands, use a single command to copy the entire drive, or have LapLink synchronize newer files across two machines. LapLink really came in handy when I bought a new computer and transferred every last byte from the old clunker before giving it to my brother-in-law. (If you're copying programs to another computer, make sure you abide by each program's licensing agreement.) The program discounts for about \$150 and comes with two cables, one for parallel and one for serial connections. My only wish is a choice of cables and a lower price. . Cable Ready

But what if all your ports are being used? Instead of crawling under the desk to swap cables, try Xircom's Parallel Port Multiplexer, a handy gadget that enables you to plug two devices into one parallel port, discounts for \$80, and is supported by LapLink Pro. Still not enough ports? For about \$230, Star Gate Technologies' One Slot will give you the PC's standard maximum of four serial and three parallel ports. • Parallel Port Multiplexer \$99; Xircom; 800/874-

Okay, so you don't want to mess with cables, or even carry floppies. There's another way to share files: Get a remote communications program to access your office system's hard disk directly. I use Triton Technologies' CO/Session because even though I'm mostly a DOS kind of guy, we're both compatible with Windows. In fact, if you leave your office machine in DOS, CO/Session will let you load Windows on it from home. What's really cool is, your home machine doesn't have to have Windows or support it-the setup will even work on my brother-in-law's sluggish 286. · CO/Session 6.1 \$179: Triton Technologies; 800/322-9440, 908/855-9440, 908/ 855-9608 (fax). Now I don't have to waste time keeping track of my files. This leaves me free for more positive pursuits, like helping my brother-in-law speed up his computer.


